An ATV valued at \$1,500 has been stolen from behind an Angeles Drive residence, Ruidoso police report.


The three-wheeled vehicle was discovered missing Dec. 23, police said.

## Ruidoso School District drops February mill vote

The Ruidoso school district won't be seeking voter approval for taxes this year after all.

The district was set to ask voters for a February election to approve a new mill levy. It must bring this tax to the voters every three years.

But the New Mexico Department of Education's finance division apparently gave the school district incorrect information when telling

the district to hold its triennial election in February 1995, said Superintendent Mike Gladden. The Ruidoso school district's financial consultant, Charles Casey, discovered that the three-year cycle was not up until 1996.

The Ruidoso Board of Education will now hold a special meeting at 11 a.m. Tuesday, Jan. 3, to cancel the mill levy portion of the election. New school board members will still be voted upon at the election.

Sam Chavez, county elections clerk, said the two mill levy amendment will remain on the Carrizozo School District's Feb. 7 ballot because its three-year cycle is up.

In 1994, the levy generated \$309,242 for the Ruidoso School District, said Glenna Robbins, financial accounting officer for the state treasurer's office.

"The two mill levy is extremely valuable to the schools," Gladden

## Regional officials seek local jail for young delinquents

With the number of juveniles being sentenced to the state detention center increasing every year, the pressure is on to come up with some regional solutions.

As many as 15 students from the Ruidoso school system currently are serving sentences at Springer and another 70 are at risk, according to reports from the school guidance counselor, related Marty Montes, chairman of the Lincoln County Commission.

"For a town this size, that's too many," Montes said. Ruidoso's current population is estimated at about 7,000.

Montes has been working with a regional board representing the counties of Lincoln, Dona Ana and Otero to decide what approach will work best in this three-county area. Montes hopes the appointment of a new secretary to head the state Department of Children, Youth and Families may be a plus.

Representatives from the region and the seven other regions that comprise the state met earlier this month in Las Cruces with state officials. His regional meetings that got together Thursday for a follow-up session.

"We haven't gotten a firm commitment from anyone that a

regional juvenile facility might be built here," Montes said Wednesday. "I think they know they have to regionalize. There can't be 33 counties with 33 different facilities."

Someone suggested that the new governor (Gary Johnson) who will take office next week) may be looking at a facility that would be like Springer, a juvenile detention center, but in the south.

Montes said McKinley County has received \$1 million to start building a juvenile facility. It's the home county of the legislator who introduced the Regional Juvenile Services Act in 1994 to foster the regional approach in an effort to pool resources and save money.

That county will ask for another \$2 million to fund the project, Montes said.

But that doesn't mean anything for the other seven regions," he said. He would learned at the meeting with the state that the Lincoln Otero and Dona Ana coalition will receive \$52,000 for the second half of the current fiscal year, that ends June 30. The money will be used by The Counseling Center, which is based in Alamogordo, but has an office in Ruidoso.

"Some of that money will be used for counseling and some for

## Prisoners suspected of credit card scam

Two Camp Sierra Blanca inmates on a work release program are suspected of stealing a credit card receipt from the real estate agency where they worked, then illegally charging more than \$1,600 on the card.

More credit card receipts were found in the men's Camp Sierra Blanca minimum security prison room, police say.

Police are still trying to sort through the incident. By presstime Dec. 30, the suspects had not yet been charged with any crimes.

The men allegedly bought boots

and clothes and gave a Ft. Stanton mailing address (where the prison is located), alerting the clothing company to check with the credit card owner. The owner then contacted police Wednesday.

At least \$1,600 in items were ordered through 800 numbers throughout a five-day period, police said.

The men were working at Century 21 in Ruidoso, police said.

State police took over the investigation Friday, and report the two suspects have been moved back to the Carrizozo County Jail.

## Vandals shoot windows

Vandals have randomly been shooting out residential and business windows with BB gun pellets over the past two weeks, say Ruidoso police.

More than a dozen windows, one worth approximately \$150, have either been pierced by the pellets or shattered since mid-December, police said.

The criminal damage, which has

taken place during late evening/early night-time hours, has been centered among mid-town businesses. But the vandalism has also afflicted individual homes throughout the community, police said.





# Daffy Duck, Bugs Bunny delight museum visitors of all ages

## Warner Bros. exhibition major coup for museum

If you "tawt you taw a puddy tat" and someone asks you, "What's

up doc?" you must be at the Warner Bros. cartoons exhibition at the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs. "That's All Folks!" features original artwork from the world of Warner Bros. cartoons and will be on display at the museum through Jan. 29.

At first glance, adults might think they should come to the exhibit only with children in tow. Not so, says Museum Director Jay Wright. "The Warner Bros. cartoons were not designed specifically for children," Wright said. "That's why so many adults come to the exhibit

and enjoy it as much or more than the kids." It's quite a coup for the Museum of the Horse to get this exhibit, Wright said. "This is a major exhibition which originated at New York's Museum of Modern Art," said Wright, who came on board at the museum this summer. "In its present expanded form, the exhibit has traveled to major museums across the country."

So how did it get to Ruidoso Downs? All of the Warner Bros. exhibit at the Museum of Modern Art came from the private collection of Steve Schneider. When the Museum of Modern Art's show was coming to a close, Schneider contacted Wright, who was then a private museum consultant, to help create a larger, traveling exhibit.

As co-curator of the exhibit, it wasn't hard for Wright to get the exhibit here at the Museum of the Horse.

"That's All Folks!" consists of more than 156 drawings, paintings, and cartoon "cels" used in the making of Warner's classic cartoons. It also includes six separate video monitors continuously

playing finished cartoons. A seventh monitor presents a history of Warner Bros. cartoons. "The thing I would emphasize is that it's an opportunity to see the actual animation cels that made the cartoons and then look at the monitors and see it on the screen," Wright said.

Using examples of Warner production art from the 1930s through the 1960s, the exhibit examines the creative process that supported the making of the classic Warner cartoons.

Warner Bros. created more cartoon stars than any other studio. Bugs Bunny, Daffy Duck, Porky Pig, The Road Runner, Elmer Fudd, Sylvester and Tweety...the list goes on and on. The studio's animation has garnered six Academy Awards since its beginnings in the 1930s.

Originally shown in theaters, the Warner cartoons developed new audiences with the rise of television in the 1950s, observed Schneider in his book, "That's All Folks! The Art of Warner Bros. Animation," available at the exhibit. Many people under the age of 35 have seen these cartoons literally hundreds of times as they were growing up. Yet most viewers are unfamiliar with the artwork from which they were cre-

ated. In 1930, Hugh Harman and Rudolph Ising founded what became the Warner Bros. cartoon studio when they signed with independent producer Leon Schlesinger, Schneider writes. Schlesinger arranged to have their cartoons distributed by Warner Bros., and "Looney Tunes" were born. A second series of cartoons were commissioned after Looney Tunes proved successful. They were dubbed the "Merrie Melodies."

Toward the end of the 30s, Ising and Harman left the studio and Schlesinger hired artists such as "Tex" Avery, Bob Clampett, "Fritz" Freleng and Chuck Jones. These artists worked during what was to become the studio's richest period of production.

Warner cartoons of the 40s transformed the tone of animation, Schneider wrote. Instead of attempting to use animation as an extension of live-action cinema, Warner shorts became brash, aggressive and confrontational, using adult themes. Parody was used to point out many of the absurdities of the real world.


By the mid 50s, various factors began to change the direction of the studio. Coupled with rises in production costs, the cartoons started to lose much of their previous spark. Production of the cartoons ceased in the 60s but now, thanks to television, the interest in the Warner Bros. cartoons has been rekindled.

For a holiday treat, "That's All Folks!" is an exhibition to bring delight and pleasure to young and old alike.

The Museum of the Horse is open every day from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. except Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, and New Years.

Admission is \$4 for adults, \$3 for seniors 65+ and \$2.50 for children 5-18 years old.

finding foster homes for kids who can't return home during the time they're waiting for trial or other court dates," Montes said.

In anticipation of what they will need for fiscal year 1995-96, members of the regional board will try to convince legislators during their session in Santa Fe next month to appropriate \$100,000 for analytical and planning studies.

A more substantial commitment also is needed from his home county, Montes said.

"From my standpoint, I think we in Lincoln County need to start to look at what we are doing," he said.

People are at odds about what to do with juvenile delinquents.

"Someone pointed their finger at

the judge (12th Judicial District Judge Richard A. Parsons) and I say 'Well, the judge has made a commitment that he's not going to tolerate juvenile delinquency,'" Montes said.

Montes was referring to several recent two-year sentences handed down by Parsons for juveniles convicted of breaking and entering; and one for assault involving a boy who allegedly was trespassing on school property and shot a teacher with a water gun.

Montes said the state needs to adopt a more even-handed approach in deciding which juveniles end up in a detention center and which ones stay on the street.

In Lincoln County, juveniles may receive a sentence for breaking

and entering and probation violation, while in Albuquerque, they may be charged with violent crimes and not be sent to a center, Montes said.

"Someone said because of the sheer numbers in Albuquerque, they can't send every violent offender to Springer or we wouldn't have enough room for them," Montes said. "In my mind, where is the standard?"

Montes said not enough money is spent on juvenile delinquents in Lincoln County.

"I don't think we have a big enough commitment in Lincoln County per se for the amount of kids we have involved," Montes said.

"I'm embarrassed to say that the

county spends \$8,000 (per year) to transport juveniles to either Alamogordo or Roswell or where space is available when we have to hold them for court. We hold them for 72 hours, bring them in front of the judge and that's the extent of Lincoln County government's involvement."

Another \$4,000/year is spent on an office in Ruidoso Downs for juvenile parole and probation officer Jane Paynell and her new school-based assistant.

"I think we've got a real shortfall in terms of what we are doing with the juveniles, not only in Lincoln County, but in the whole state," Montes said. "The state's got a big problem. We've got to be realistic about it, face it and do something about it."

"The Ruidoso school district is going to have to take a hard look at itself and say what are we doing wrong? We're suspending too many students."

"No one has a real answer for it, because no one has looked at it in a real way. They're still trying to solve 1990 problems with 1950 technology. It's no good."

Montes said he hopes that Heather Wilson, the newly appointed Secretary of the Department of Children, Youth and Family Services, may have some answers.

"Maybe we'll get some good things out of that. It sounds like she has the qualifications to go out there and get things done," he said.

According to a press release on Wilson's credentials, she is presi-

dent of Keystone International Inc., a defense business development and planning company based in Albuquerque.

Wilson served on the White House National Security Council staff in the Bush Administration and was Director of Defense Policy and Arms Control.

She is a licensed foster parent and is a member of the board of directors of the New Mexico Council on Crime and Delinquency. She's a Rhodes Scholar and earned a doctorate and master's degree in International Relations from Oxford University in England. Rhodes was one of two inducted into the New Mexico Women's Hall of Fame this year and received the Governor's Award for Outstanding New Mexico Women.



# Girls' team still learning

The learning process continues for the Ruidoso girls basketball team. At times it might seem slow to fans, but coach Janie Roland has yet to lose patience with her young Warriors.

Despite a 94-31 loss to Roswell, Goddard in the opening round of the Rockets' holiday tournament, Roland was optimistic.

"We saw a lot of little things that we've been wanting to see," Roland said of her players — such as freshman point guard Jana Morris recognizing when Goddard changed its defenses, and players helping and recovering on defense.

Roland said the Warriors are starting to learn the fundamentals and strategies of the game. The team did "lots of processing" after its contest with Goddard.

"They had some very in-depth insight about that game last (Wednesday) night," she said. "That means we have an interest, an enthusiasm and a little knowledge. We just have to be patient."

The Warriors seemed patient enough against traditionally-strong Goddard. While the Rockets shot off to a 23-8 first quarter lead, the Warriors worked on their defense and offense, incognizant of the score.

Goddard's impressive fastbreak built and maintained its lead. The Rockets released one of its guards every time Ruidoso put up a shot.

"Any time you've got the big persons to sweep the boards, you can send someone on the fly," Roland said. "Their offensive transition is

The Warriors knew what they were up against before the game, Roland said. Goddard beat Ruidoso 52-8 in a preseason scrimmage, and the Warriors were without three of their usual starters. Guard Chrystal Sumlin and forward Angelica Figueroa missed for medical reasons and forward Michelle Davidson moved back to El Paso.

The Ruidoso coach moved up four players from the junior varsity and freshman teams for the tournament — Morris, Denise Rodela, Kelle Lutterman and Bailey Bishop.

Varsity players Jazmin Fleharty and Angela Simms saw their first significant action. Both players had limited playing time coming into the tourney because of illness and injury.

"I saw no long faces on the bench or in the lockerroom," Roland said, describing the team's disposition during and after the game.

The first-year coach said this means one of two things. Either, the team is used to losing, or they have the attitude, "We'll take our lumps now and we'll come back later." She thinks her team has the latter, rather than the former, outlook.

Lindsay Willard led the Warriors with nine points. Morris added six in her first varsity start.

The Rockets got 19 points from Tami Stewart, 18 points from Jini Puma and 14 points from Jaime Nelson.

After the game, Roland acknowledged the sportsmanship of the Goddard coach.

"He could have pressed us and he didn't," she said. The Rockets took the game seriously and played with class, Roland added.

In their second game of the tournament, the Warriors fell to Riverside, 60-29, Thursday afternoon.

Roland said Ruidoso didn't have the focus and intensity from the night before. She attributed the lackluster performance, in part, to the short time in between games. Ruidoso played a late game Wednesday night and followed it with the first game Thursday afternoon.

"We finished the game at 9:30 p.m. and then were back on the bus at 10:30 a.m. (the next day)," Roland said.

"They have learned enough now to know when they don't play well," she said. "It was just one of those games."

The Rangers rode to a 17-0 lead early in the game and extended it to 27-10 by halftime. The Warriors never recovered from their slow start.

Genevieve Botella paced Ruidoso with eight points. Willard added six points and Morris had four.

Ruidoso, 2-5 overall, hosts Artesia Thursday, Jan. 5, in its first game after the new year.

# Skiers, holiday visitors flock to town

Excellent skiing conditions and tourists in town for the holidays have made for a busy week at Ski Apache and Ruidoso.

Ski Apache general manager Roy Parker said a season-high 6,200 lift tickets were sold for Wednesday.

Parker said skiers are enjoying

Surface conditions are groomed and packed powder. Each night, maintenance crews groom a variety of novice, intermediate and expert trails.

Seven inches of snowfall Tuesday improved the packed base midway on the mountain from 22 inches to 25 inches.

All lifts are open. Lincoln Double Chairlift #2 was down Wednesday and part of Thursday because of a mechanical problem. The breakdown resulted in longer lines for the novice skiers, Parker said.

The only two trails not open are black diamond runs, Trench and Oscar's. Both trails are deep and rough, requiring more snow to cover them. Parker said it was not unusual for these trails to be closed at this time in the season.

## Devalued peso not felt

The recent peso devaluation hasn't negatively impacted the number of Mexican nationals visiting Ruidoso and Ski Apache, officials said.

The peso fell in value from \$289.50 per 1,000 pesos Dec. 16 to a low of \$166.00 per 1,000 pesos Dec. 27. It improved to \$192 per 1,000 pesos Dec. 28.

"I can't say for sure if we would have had more (Mexican nationals) over Christmas," Parker said. "It might affect us later in the season." Businessman Ronnie Taylor, owner of Mountain Ski Shop, echoed Parker's assessment.

"I can't tell. Our shop has had more (Mexican nationals). It's been great to have them in," Taylor said. "We might feel the difference after the holidays."

Taylor, who has operated the ski

store for 18 years, said business has been "great, fantastic. We couldn't ask for a better Christmas."

Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce visitor coordinator Lisa Storey said any guess about the effect of the peso's devaluation is "speculation." "We don't know if it's directly related," Storey said. "We've got tons of Mexican nationals still calling for rooms."

Storey added that the visitors are not just skiers.

The Chamber is busy referring visitors to hotels, helping to book rooms as soon as cancellations come in.

"This rivals Labor Day. I really think this is the busiest week of the year," Storey said.

People have had a hard time finding hotel rooms on Christmas and New Years weekends, Storey said.

# CHS plans meeting to address hoops incident

Actions at the Dec. 20 Ruidoso/Capitan boys basketball game won't go unaddressed, Capitan High School Athletic Director Norman Cline said Wednesday.

Cline said a meeting with parents of boys basketball players is scheduled for 6 p.m. Monday, Jan. 2, in the high school gym.

Capitan principal Darrel Stierwalt will run the meeting. Cline, Capitan varsity coach Ron Becker and boys assistant coach Terry Cox will be present, as well.

Stierwalt said his talk with parents will re-emphasize the importance of good sportsmanship.

He said the schools hire coaches to coach the players and officials to control the games.

"We need to let them do their jobs and we really want the parents' cooperation," Stierwalt said.

At the Dec. 20 game, an angry Capitan parent came down out of the stands and accosted a Ruidoso player. When the parent was asked to leave, some Capitan fans cheered him. Cline said he notified the New Mexico Activities Association (NMAA) of the incident the following morning.

NMAA leaves discipline decisions regarding such situations up to the member school.

"They depend on the athletic director and administration to take care of that," Capitan prin-

icipal Stierwalt said.

Cline said he will also put up posters encouraging good sportsmanship for the Smokey Bear Tournament.

"I asked (the NMAA) for suggestions on how to alleviate (incidents like this) and I got some ideas," the Capitan athletic director said.

In addition to the incident involving the parent and player, allegations have been made that a Capitan fan or fans yelled racial slurs at a Ruidoso player.

Stierwalt said he has not been notified by Ruidoso school officials of that allegation.

"I'm not going to address that because I haven't heard anything about it," Stierwalt said. "If it's needed, we'll do that (address at the meeting) too."


Stierwalt said he hopes the incident doesn't jeopardize future scheduling of athletic competition between the two schools.

"I'd like to see us develop a good healthy rivalry — not one of animosity," Stierwalt said.

Ruidoso principal Ron Hodges hinted the competitions might come to an end when he said last week, "I think we're best served if we don't play Capitan."

Regardless of what is decided about the future of Ruidoso/Capitan athletic contests, coaches and officials from both schools are addressing the unfortunate incident.

"The main thing is trying to solve it constructively and hope something positive comes out of it," Cline said.

### Food Safety

When abandoned animals come into a shelter, workers usually have no background information on their past behavior or health.

Animals brought to the shelter sometimes appear to be convulsing or having uncontrolled spasms. After a brief period, many times the animal seems to be fine, said Jim Riggins, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society. For a shelter attendant, that period is tense, because the symptoms are found in several types of poisoning or advanced illness. The decision whether to euthanize the animal often comes right down to the wire, he said.

"Often in these cases when an owner comes to claim the animal, we learn that it is under treatment for a seizure disorder," Riggins said. "These are recurring conditions where the nervous system sends false signals from the brain to organs and other parts of the body."

The seizure syndrome generally can be divided into three distinct stages, he said. For up to two hours before a seizure, the animal will display nervousness, fear and may even hide.

The actual seizure may last several minutes and, if it involves the full body, may include arching, twitching, trembling or severe jerking, he said.

During the post seizure period, which may last up to several hours, the animal may appear restless, confused and may even suffer temporary or partial blindness.

A partial body seizure may entail chattering of teeth, swimming legs or behavioral responses such as fear, hysteria, anger or biting at imaginary flies.

Riggins said seizures may be caused by several different conditions including:

- infections such as distemper that cause neurological damage to the brain;

- liver dysfunction that can cause metabolic imbalances;

- poisons such as lead and pesticides;
- severe head injury.

"Your veterinarian usually can control these disorders with medication or treatment," Riggins said. "It is vital, however, that owners of these special needs animals take extra preparations for unplanned emergencies."

He suggested putting a tag on the animal noting the disorder, or at least be sure the rabies tag contains the number of the veterinarian who will have that information in his records.

"This information is vital should your pet get away and shelter workers are trying to make what may be a life or death decision," Riggins said. "There are companies such as 'Super Tags,' that let an owner design his or her own medic alert tag giving vital information. Mail forms are available at most animal shelters and veterinarians' offices."

He also advised owners to be familiar with all of the animal care and control agencies and facilities where they live, including knowing the hours of operation, how long

they will hold animals and their emergency or call numbers.

"Be ready to find your lost pet," Riggins said.

In the Ruidoso area, four agencies operate: animal control units for the village of Ruidoso, for Ruidoso Downs, for Lincoln County and for Capitan.

"These agencies impound animals at three different shelter facilities," Riggins said. "Owners of these special needs animals should be ready to contact the right agency the minute the animal is discovered missing."

Wal-Mart will move from Ruidoso to Corona and throw out a local hardware store owner who is trying to write down prices.


The president and Congress still won't figure out who makes up the middle class.

### Al Junge revisits the "Good Old Days"

Some of us have fond memories of what is now referred to as "the good old days." Having been a part of it, we are in a position to make a more accurate observation of a time in our lives which presented many advantages lost, long ago in what we have been led to believe is in the name of progress.

There was a time when the size of your car or bank account didn't mean much, simply because we had neither.

Most of us have forgotten what we considered happy — perhaps not full — but a contented life. We have forgotten in this new world of communication, finance, production, and bottom-line profits how the five-cent hamburger was possible. A penny — yes, just one penny — bought a candy bar. To ride a street car cost five cents. Not the best or most comfortable transportation but there were advantages: you met friends and others and all enjoyed the conversations during the bumpy ride, ignoring the drafty cold in the winter and the lack of air conditioning in the summer. No one seemed to mind and we were happy living in an atmosphere of non-existent pressure we are required "to enjoy" in today's world.

There was no instant reporting of the news through television, radio, or by the news media. We simply lived in a small world, never realizing how much we would improve our standard of living when the time arrived for us to be told that "we deserved much more" if only we would allow our government to "take care of our problems." The unraveling began at the time and what we conceived as being an ideal world soon became only a memory.

True, we earned only a meager living, but what we earned, we kept. Pearl Beer at 10 cents per bottle and 13 cents gasoline for a car, if we

owned one, made a small budget manageable. We paid our bills and had a little left over to save.

My first experience with a radio was when my dad built one using an empty Quaker Oats cereal box which he wrapped with copper wire. A "cat's whisker" was used to tune in our local radio station. The antennae was tied to our backyard grape arbor and a headphone enabled us to listen to our favorite radio programs. Now the simple radio takes a back seat to a myriad of all sorts of instant communication. Did we miss the advantages of instant news? Perhaps so, but not knowing what we were missing, we felt content with news gathered from our single radio station and from our local newspaper.

The fast pace of what is known as progress over the past several decades has had a profound effect on our daily lives, which gives thought to just what we have gained and how much we have lost.

The "Good Old Days" gave us very little worldly goods. But we did enjoy well-adjusted family lives without drugs or welfare or having to deal with a government which felt that what was being done in our behalf was for our own good, whether we agreed or not.

A weekend of relaxation might involve playing cards with the next door neighbor or a picnic in the nearby park, where the kids could play without fear of a stranger with an evil intent. We paid little attention to locking our automobiles and had no concern that our home would be vandalized while we were away.

There were no problems arising from the fact that we were of different nationality or the color of our skin. It simply was not a problem and we were all friends but the basis to this understanding and friendliness was soon to change as the years passed and the differences became newsworthy.

If the question was asked today, "Would you trade today's environment for what we enjoyed in the good old days?" the answer would be a resounding "no."

Today we earn more money, we own two cars in a two-car garage in an overpriced structure we refer to as "home." Our homes are protected by special door locks and security systems and outside lights to ward off robbers and worse.

We drive our children to school since buses are no longer safeguards from firearms. Schools with metal detectors are faced with students killing students. School curriculum has increased with declining grades and school dropouts.

Unwed young mothers, once facing eviction from home by family members, have increased to the extent that nurseries in schools are now provided for the care of infants while the mothers attend classes.

We have lost the family atmosphere enjoyed in our homes along with the love and respect of children for their parents. This simply disappeared as parental control of the children lessened over the years to a point where it no longer exists. This has become more apparent with the introduction of drugs and poverty into the family scene. Family values mean little and regrettably no one at the present time knows how to change or improve the basic problem which is undermining the very fabric of our society.

Find a way to reinvent the old-fashioned family and most of the ills facing this nation will fade away.

Somewhere along the way between the past and the present, we have lost many of the basic values so important in an ever-developing society.

## HOMETIME

Hosts Dean Johnson and Robin Hartl kick-off the ninth season of Hometown with a week-long Habitat for Humanity building blitz led by Jimmy and Rosalyn Carter. The Hometown crew head for Eagle Butte, a town of 2,500 in South Dakota, where they join the 1,200 other Habitat volunteers gathered to build 30 houses in just five days on the Cheyenne River Sioux Reservation. The reservation has approximately 15,000 residents and 3,000 housing units, many of which are bare, wooden shacks.

To say the construction schedule was ambitious is putting it lightly. According to Johnson, all the drywall was supposed to have been installed by the end of the second day so that a professional taping crew could come in and finish all the seams overnight. By 5:00 p.m. on the second day, they were nowhere near done. Carter then personally went to each of the 30 houses to explain to everyone that the drywall absolutely HAD to be finished that evening if the 30 families were to move in on time. Needless to say, they got the job done.

Next, Hometown features a nine-part miniseries on turning a 1950 salt box house into a prairie-style house, tackling demolition and the roof tear-off. Episodes cover electrical work, millwork, ceramic tile, cabinets, and final touches including light fixtures, window treatments, closet organizers, and door hardware.

Other new episodes give the average homeowner step-by-step advice and tips on the "Gas Fireplace," "Home Workshop," "Curb Appeal," "Home Office," and "Home Theatre."

Hometown is broadcast Saturdays at 4:00 p.m. on KENW-TV. The new season begins January 7th.
