

Commissioners meet in Ruidoso

Lincoln County Commissioners will take one last look at their proposed 1995-96 budget during a special meeting at 8:30 a.m. today at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center. Other items on the agenda include awarding a contract for the annual audit, several requested replats of property and a discussion of predator control limitations on state-owned lands.

Nuclear storage deadline extended for second time

A Friday deadline, for commercial nuclear power plants to sign up for a waste storage project on the Mescalero Reservation by Ruidoso, has been extended. Northern States Utilities hoped to have a final list of participating companies Friday, up to 33 of them. But companies now have until the end of this week. The original deadline was May 3. Project Manager Scott Northard said this morning that he doesn't expect all 33 companies originally interested in the project to sign up. However, he expects to have enough to move forward with the project. He declined to release the number of utilities already signed up.

Woman charged with assaulting former husband's wife at work



State cuts back funding of Eastern N.M. State in Ruidoso

Ruidoso School District residents may be asked to vote to double their tax support of Eastern New Mexico University's Ruidoso off-campus instructional center.

The Ruidoso School Board votes in July whether to put the question on the ballot. If voters don't approve the increase, officials say funding of the school could drop from \$308,000 to \$50,000.

The reason for the vote is due to a newly passed law that requires more funding from school district residents versus the state's general fund, officials said.

The college taxing district for ENMU's off-campus instructional center is the same as the Ruidoso School District. The branch was solicited by the Ruidoso School Board several years ago, officials said. Therefore, the districts are the same and the branch is governed by the Ruidoso School Board and Eastern's Board of Regents through a joint operating agreement, said Everett Frost, ENMU president.

At the Ruidoso School Board meeting Tuesday, Frost said a major bill dealing with two-year post-secondary education was passed by the Legislature and signed by Governor Gary Johnson this year. House Bill 608 deals with many issues, including a new concept called the College District Tax Act.

"One of the things that was snuck in under the tax act was the notion of 'regularizing' the mill levy paid to the different two-year institutions around the state," Frost said.

Jim Miller, ENMU-Ruidoso director, explained "regularizing."

"A study committee last year suggested that there needed to be more consistency in the tax rates being imposed by the different in-

stitutions," Miller said. "The new law says that everybody (in various college taxing districts) now has to go to two mills of property tax or higher and that will make a regular consistency between all of the two-year institutions."

The ENMU-Ruidoso off-campus center will have to go to two mill levies in the future, or the Commission on Higher Education (CHE) can only recommend \$325 per full-time equivalent student funding instead of the present funding formula, Frost said.

Ruidoso School District voters may be asked to double their tax support of ENMU-Ruidoso.

Miller gave an example of the appropriations formula.

"Using this spring's enrollment figures as an example of the formula; 460 students divided by 15 hours, times \$325, would reduce the current appropriation by about \$250,000 or 1/6th of the current funding," he said.

One mill is equal to each \$1,000 of taxable property value. In New Mexico, property is taxed on one-third of the market value. For example, a person with a \$60,000 home, which has a tax valuation of \$20,000, now pays \$20 a year toward the campus operation. Should voters decide on the two mill levy, that same person would pay \$40 a year for ENMU-Ruidoso operations.

Voters approved the one mill levy in February of 1991.

Currently, the general fund appropriation for 1995-96 is \$308,000, Frost said. If nothing is done, the CHE would have to recommend less

than \$50,000, based on enrollment at the time of the recommendation.

Another option presented by Frost was to pass a resolution authorizing a vote for a second and third mill, providing a change from the current \$180,000 to \$540,000 in mill levy revenue for the ENMU center, allowing a growth in programs and services.

Another option not discussed at the school board meeting was posed to Miller after the meeting by *The Ruidoso News*. That option is, since ENMU-Ruidoso is used by the entire county, is to ask for county-wide mill levies rather than just Ruidoso, as is currently the case.

"Each school district in the county would have to pass a resolution for the college, take surveys and take the results to Santa Fe for their blessing," Miller said. "Or they could all get together and have a general school board meeting of all the school boards, pass the resolution, take a county-wide survey and go to Santa Fe, just as Ruidoso has."

Roswell's Eastern New Mexico facility has a joint board composed of representatives from four school districts, Miller said.

"In terms of timing, I know there's not enough time to do all of that," he said.

Because House Bill 608 becomes law on July 1, and no official action can be taken until then, the Ruidoso School Board cannot vote on any mill levy resolution until after that date, Frost said.

Should the board pass the resolution calling for a two mill levy vote, a special election will probably take place in mid-September or mid-October, Miller said.

After communications with the county clerk and businessmen, Miller said he has estimated the cost of the election to be around \$2,000.

"We've budgeted the cost of an election into the Ruidoso Center budget," Miller said.

Councilors say they won't pay for county users

Lincoln County residents outside Ruidoso will either start paying for Ruidoso services or not get them, some Ruidoso councilors advocated at budget hearings late last week.

"Are we the county seat or is Carrizozo?" asked Councilor Robert Donaldson on Friday. He was the most vocal criticizer of county officials at Thursday and Friday Village of Ruidoso budget hearings.

"Last year they gave us \$12,500; this year there's no money in the budget for us. It's not right for the mayor of Ruidoso to have to go to them with her hand out; it's obscene that they won't meet with us," Donaldson fumed.

The 1995/96 Ruidoso budget of \$17.5 million provides the county with its only library and animal shelter. It also funds regional sewage treatment, perpetual cemetery care, fire and police responses outside the village limits, and a popular swimming pool.

County officials don't plan to help fund these services, and county residents pay the same fee as village residents.

Last month councilors requested a meeting with the five-member commission to review potential money-sharing items. The commissioners declined to hold a special meeting with the council.

"We want people to understand why it costs us so much for these services," said Mayor Jerry Shaw last week.

Without some sort of contribution, the councilors said they will either impose higher fees on county residents who live outside Ruidoso, or refuse services to those patrons.

"The key word will be the non-Ruidoso, Lincoln County visitor. We would not want to charge tourists," Donaldson said.

The councilors will hold a workshop at their next budget hearing May 23 to structure a different fee base for county residents.

Animal Shelter

The Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter has consistently been operating in the red. While its contribution from Ruidoso will increase from \$30,000 to \$40,000 in the proposed 1995/96 budget, it still will face an operating shortfall because projected costs are at \$61,936.

Other local governments have not offered to contribute. About 35% of the animals coming into the shelter are from areas outside Ruidoso.

Jim Riggins, director of the non-profit facility, has estimated that \$12,387 of its costs are due to the 20% impoundments of animals from Lincoln County areas, \$4,336 is expended on the 7% from Ruidoso Downs and \$4,411 is spent on the 7.17% from Capitan. The budget projections are based on the average impounds of 120 animals per month.

Fire Protection

Ruidoso Fire Chief Virgil Reynolds detailed the department's (and its three sub-stations)

response to 32 calls in the past year of responding firefighters and the amount of time they spent dousing the blazes.

Jackson said the cost of responding outside the village was \$42,000, or 9% of the fire department's \$405,851 budget.

The Ruidoso Fire Department's proposed 1995/96 budget has increased 17% to \$527,819, and includes \$21,913 for a new firefighter.

Police

The Ruidoso Police Department is in a similar situation to the fire department, said Manager Gary Jackson.

"Neither Ruidoso Downs or the county has full coverage, and the only way they get away with it is because we cover for them," Jackson said.

Police Chief Lanny Maddox said his department responded to 50 calls outside its jurisdiction last year, costing Ruidoso taxpayers about \$51,000. Responses went down in the past year.

"The (lower) 1995 average reflects my concerns of assuming liabilities through the sheriff's reluctance to authorize full county commissions to the Ruidoso Police Department's officers, and that more discretion is being used prior to responding to calls outside our jurisdiction," Maddox wrote the council.

"The county's not funding us, and there's no way to put a service charge on people, so we just won't respond," Donaldson warned.

The Ruidoso Police Department's personnel cost in the proposed budget is \$1,467,954, or 7% higher than the current year. Combined salaries of all police department employees make up \$1,212,259 of the budget. Capital outlay, which will include three new 4x4 vehicles, totals \$1,467,954. Operating costs will total an estimated \$165,985.

The funding includes pay for a new corporal position (\$32,089 with benefits) and a new patrol officer (approximately \$26,700). An additional officer will be added to the department through a federal \$29,634 grant.

Sewage Treatment

Ruidoso pays for 92.2% of the operational costs of the Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant, while Ruidoso Downs pays the balancing 7.8%.

Village staff members have calculated that 36% of the septic sewage treated at the plant last year came from Ruidoso Downs, or 82,700 of the total 229,000 gallons received.

Treatment costs reached \$509,812 during this fiscal year and operations are budgeted at \$525,136 for next year.

Ruidoso Assistant Manager Alan Briley said the village's seven cents a gallon fee for septic sewage fails to cover costs.

Rates will likely rise, some councilors said.

Capital costs, which include \$30,000 for the raising of manholes the state paved over on Gavilan Canyon Road, are set at \$616,850 for the next fiscal year. Total department costs are projected at \$1.3 million, 23% higher than the current budget.

department duties along mainstreet.

The parks department also maintains and operates a public swimming pool, charging all guests a basic \$2.25 to swim, \$6 to swim and slide. In all, the department will require \$429,490 in transfers from the general fund this year.

Library

The Ruidoso Library is the only public library in the county and it's running out of functioning space.

"If the library did not have all the volunteers it has, it would really be in bad shape," Jackson said.

Because of service demands, the library requested funding for two new assistants. They are budgeted for one, at a cost of \$18,646.

Projected budget costs are 18% higher next year, at \$217,457. The county contributed \$4,000 to the library fund last year.

Library officials said nearly 40% of its users come from the unincorporated county, 15% from Ruidoso Downs, and 47% from Ruidoso.

Jackson said the library and neighboring senior center both need more space. It would make more sense to move the library to a new 15,000 square-foot building, he said, possibly between city hall and the county building. The present library would then be remodeled for full senior use.

Cemetery

A number of plots in the town's only cemetery, maintained by the Parks and Recreation Department, are filled by non-Ruidoso resident corpses. The plots sell for less than the cost to care for them, and Jackson said budget transfers are made annually from the general fund to cover expenditures.

The endowment fund stands at \$8,000 — \$100 for each plot — but operating costs are projected to be \$14,727, or 25% higher than current costs. Indigent burials, which Ruidoso officials say the county no longer pays for, (although state statutes say it is a county's responsibility), are budgeted at \$500.

"No more," said Donaldson of the burial of non-Ruidoso indigents. "We will dig them up and bring them over to Carrizozo."

A new \$20,088 position is being created so someone can maintain burial lots while still performing

Happy Birthday to the Arizona Kid

This is being sent to you a half-hour before high noon, on a still, warm and sunny day in the prime of springtime in our mountain land, and will reach you on May 15, two days before the birthday of Robert Lee Lambert, also known as "The Arizona Kid."

He was born May 17, 1909 in Ballard County, Ky.

When he was nine years old he and his mother set out for Arizona for his mother's health. On the train trip out, his mother had a conversation with a man who turned out to be Zane Grey, world-famous writer of stories about western America in Pioneer Days.

Bob's life in Arizona became a true story in the tradition of the great Zane Grey.

On a ranch near Fowler, Ariz., Bob's mother began working as a cook; and in helping his mother, Bob learned the art of cooking, which served him well later on as a cowboy and rancher.

Beginning Life on the Range

At the age of about 14, Bob began life as a cowboy. From this young beginning came his name, "The Arizona Kid."

He soon became a top hand and worked on ranches in the area of Seligman, Kingman and Prescott.

He says, "We were paid \$30 a month and chuck, and had the whole out-of-doors to sleep in."

One time Bob joined a cow outfit near Globe, Ariz. It was raining and snowing at the same time; the horses were crippled up from running through Lechuguilla; and worst of all there was no cook.

The boss pointed at Bob and asked, "Can you cook?"

"Sure I can cook," Bob answered. "I can

cook when there is nothing to cook with." What did he cook? Good old beef steak, taters, beans, rice and biscuits.

The Star of Good Fortune Shines Down on Bob

By about 1945, Bob had saved up \$1,000 with which he made a down payment on a ranch near Skull Valley, Ariz. Then his star of good fortune shone down brightly when on July 28, 1945, he was married to the former Betty Vyne.

They lived the happy life of ranchers, owning ranches in Northern Arizona for about 20 years.

Of his cowboy and ranching days Bob says, "It was a happy life among good people; and in this life out-of-doors, you could see the work of God every day."

In Arizona, Bob and Betty had met Bill Dick and Dude Browning, who had been raised in the Ruidoso Valley, which they spoke of as "God's Country."

In 1969 Bob and Betty moved to their present home two miles downriver from Fox Cave and established "The Canyon Trading Post."

They have said that the Browning boys were right in their description of the Ruidoso Valley: "God's Country."

Kind Words for Sheep Men From a Veteran Cow Man

Among Bob's Arizona neighbors were the sheep ranchers of Basque origin, sometimes called Bascos.

He described these neighbors as good neighbors — hard working, honest, the best of sheep ranchers, and devout Christians.

The Basques are the sturdy people who live in the Pyrenees Mountains on the border between France and Spain.

Friends of the Birds

The Canyon Trading Post is a welcome spot to all kinds of songbirds, among them sparrows.

One time a sparrow had broken its leg and was helpless in the yard. Bob made a splint for the bird's leg out of a popsicle stick, and nursed it along until the leg healed. They named him "Spare Ribs" and he became a great pet.

He spent the night in his cage, and in the day he came down perched on Bob's shoulder, while Bob read True West Magazine.

Every time I remember this I think of the old favorite song: "Rocked in the Cradle of the Deep."

"Rocked in the Cradle of the deep,
I lay me down in peace to sleep.
Secure I rest upon the wave
For Thou, O Lord has power to save.
I know that Thou wouldst heed my call,
For Thou dost mark the sparrow's fall."





R.D. Hubbard may be waiting to break ground on his planned resort hotel in Ruidoso, but other two lodging developers are moving ahead at warp speed.

TNJ Contractors from Albuquerque is building a Day's Inn on U.S. Highway 70 in Ruidoso Downs, next to the existing Budget Inn Motel.

Day's Inn will be a two story building with Santa Fe style architecture, said hotel manager Satish Bhakta. Day's Inn plans to open its new facility by the end of July, he said.

The motel will have 50 units (including a dozen suites), a sauna and an enclosed heated swimming pool, Bhakta said.

"We will have both king and queen size beds, handicap accessible units, a guest laundry room and a free continental breakfast," he added.

Bhakta is looking for someone to take over the empty restaurant, previously The Texas Connection, in front of the motel.

"We are completely remodeling the restaurant and hope to find someone who would like to lease it," Bhakta said.

Owner of the motel is Bhakta's relative, Hasu Bhakta, who also owns the Scottish Inns in Las Vegas, N.M.

Prices for the rooms have not yet

been set for the lodging establishment, Bhakta said.

Holiday Inn Express hopes to open its new 104-room Ruidoso hotel by September, said Tommy Buntyn, project manager for SDS Construction of Albuquerque.

Construction has recently commenced on the project, on Highway 70 across from Sierra Blanca Motels in Ruidoso, Buntyn said.

Holiday Inn Express will have an enclosed swimming pool and a continental breakfast room, he said.

Bob and Delores Gerhardt from Las Vegas, N.M. are the owners of the Ruidoso Holiday Inn Express.

Another lodging project, the \$15 million Resort at Sierra Blanca, backed by Ruidoso Downs Racetrack owner R.D. Hubbard, was initially planned to begin construction next to the Ruidoso Civic Center earlier this year. The project is now on hold because of uncertainty about the future of the Ruidoso Downs Racetrack.

"The capital involved in projects like Day's Inn and Holiday Inn Express is far less than what we have on the drawing board," said Jon Sherry, who was slated to be the manager of the planned resort.

"The demand has got to be there to support the kind of facility we were

planning." "The cost of their projects (Day's Inn and Holiday Inn Express) is substantially less than ours, which is sitting at \$15 million," Sherry said. "There's a big difference and we are just waiting to make sure we have the demand."

The Resort at Sierra Blanca would have about 152 rooms, two spas, an indoor pool, restaurant, bar, lounge and meeting rooms.

Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce data shows that the Ruidoso area has 1,208 rooms (enough to accommodate 5,400 people), including bed and breakfast establishments and The Inn Of The Mountain Gods.

Warriors pay a price for inexperience at state meet

The Ruidoso boys track team found out the difference between eighth and 15th place at the state track finals is nil.

All four of the Warrior relay teams finished in eighth place at Friday's preliminaries, which meant all four were left out of Saturday's finals. Only the top seven teams qualify for the finals at the state track championships.

It was a disappointing lesson for the Warriors, but one they can learn from, said Ruidoso coach Ronny Maskew. Of the 11 Ruidoso thinclads to attend the Class AAA-AAAA State Track Championships in Albuquerque this weekend, 10 are underclassmen.

"We gained a lot of experience in a tough situation," Maskew said.

The most important lesson for the Warriors: get to the finals. It doesn't take a whole lot of points to win the team championship, Maskew added.

As a team, Ruidoso tied for 11th with Artesia out of 30 teams. Los Alamos swept both the boys and girls titles.

Junior Kyle Humphreys led the Warriors at state with a third-place finish in the 110-meter high hurdles and a pair of fourth-place finishes in the long jump and the 100-meter dash. Senior David Hufstедler closed out his career with a third-place finish in the 300-meter hurdles and a sixth-place finish in the 110-meter hurdles.

Ruidoso had hoped to qualify at least its 400-meter and 1600-meter relay teams. Maskew said the 400-meter relay team missed qualifying by 8/100ths of a second, while the 1600-meter relay was a half-second out of qualifying.

Despite all their work on baton exchanges in the days preceding the state meet, the Warriors bobbed two handoffs in the 400-meter relay. It probably cost them a qualifying spot.

Maskew attributed the poor exchanges to inexperience, and the veteran coach shouldered some of the responsibility himself.

The Warriors, however, didn't lack effort.

"The kids ran as hard as they could, and we were happy with that," Maskew said.

Friday's preliminaries were run in less than ideal weather. Gusting winds across the track created miserable competing conditions for everyone.

Maskew, who has been to more than his share of state track meets, said the weather was as bad as he's ever experienced.

After one event on Friday, Maskew noticed the wind gauge that indicated 45 mph winds.

"And that wasn't as bad as it was at times," Maskew said. "It was one of the very worst days I've been to."

The crosswind yielded little advantage to anyone, and Maskew said it didn't affect the Warriors mentally.

"I don't think it did much to us psychologically, because every meet we've been in this year has been in bad weather," he said.

Senior hurdler Hufstедler proved his mettle by overcoming a disappointing finish in the high hurdles to take third in the 300 hurdles.

Maskew said he expected Hufstедler to finish in the top four in the 110s, but Hufstедler clipped a hurdle and was sixth.

"He just kind of made up his mind (going into the 300 hurdles).

He ran a very good race," Maskew said of his only senior boy on the team.

On Friday, Brandon Eamello gave the Warriors an early boost with his surprising finish in the shot put. He took sixth place.

Eamello didn't start putting the shot until just before the district meet May 5 and 6. He practiced all of one day before districts, and then went out and captured the district title. Eamello continued to practice last week in preparation for the state meet.

"He wasn't even ranked in the top 14 or 15 shot putters," Maskew said.

Eamello was consistent on Friday at the state meet, and that consistency earned him a medal.

"He'll be working on the shot put more next year," Maskew said. "He has a lot of raw strength."

Ruidoso's only girls competing at the state finals were discus throwers Angelica Figueroa and Monique Ramos. Neither Warrior girl made it out of the preliminaries. Figueroa recorded a throw of 105-10, and Ramos had a throw of 101-3.

Streakin Kas top qualifier in trials for Ruidoso Futurity

Streakin Kas rattled off the fastest qualifying time for the upcoming \$450,000 Ruidoso Futurity when he won the second division of the Ruidoso Quarter Horse Futurity Trials on Friday's opening day program at Ruidoso Downs.

Sam Thompson piloted Streakin Kas over the 350 yards in 18.22, fighting the brisk headwind that was present throughout the opening day program.

An on track crowd of 1,804 heralded the opening of Ruidoso's 48th racing season, which included 15 live Futurity Trials and a simulcast card of eight races from the Downs at Albuquerque.

Total handle for the day was \$329,630, a substantial increase from last year boosted by the increased simulcast wagering opportunities from other tracks.

"We paid out over \$200,000 in winning tickets to our fans on a day when strong winds kept lots of people in their homes," said Ruidoso Downs General Manager Scott Wells. "One thing is very clear - people are glad that the horseracing season is underway."

The 10 fastest qualifiers from the Futurity Trials will be eligible for the Ruidoso Futurity Sunday, May 29.

Following Streakin Kas in order were: Willow Beda Chick; Winalota Cash, Floyds Fortune, Strikin Dash, Heavenly Note, Just Luther, Bug N Bully, Real Six Time and Lynn Again.

Run Em Up, the early favorite to head the qualifiers for the Futurity, was knocked out of the picture almost instantly when he stumbled in the second stride out of the gate for the tenth division.

"I've never had anything like that happen before," said jockey Kenny Hart. "He was standing good in the gate, but the second jump out his legs just went out from under him."

Run Em Up had won the West Texas Futurity at Sunland Park in his last race.

Racing stewards monitor industry

OK, you've just bet your last two bucks on a 2-5 quinella ticket for the 10th race. As the race unfolds, you realize you might have a chance at winning this one.

The horses come around the final turn and head for home. There's some contact among the horses, but you don't care. Your picks, the No. 2 and No. 5 horses, emerge from the bumping in front. They stay ahead of everyone else and finish 1-2.

You've won! You've won! It's time to celebrate.

But wait: the racetrack announcer instructs everyone to hold all tickets. There's an inquiry.

Then in big red lights, "Inquiry" flashes on the board. It keeps flashing on the tote board until the track stewards make a decision about whether or not

one or more of the horses were fouled during the race.

The stewards reach a decision, and the order of finish on the tote board changes, and so does the value of your ticket.

Like some of the jockeys aboard the horses, you start cursing those darn stewards who spotted a foul on your horse.

Who are those guys anyways?

Considering the importance of their job, the stewards are relatively relaxed in their box at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track. It's a warm, breezy Sunday. The problem with one of their TV monitors is fixed two minutes before post time, and everyone is ready to go.

As the post time for the first race of the day arrives, racing stewards Jerry Nicodemus, Bob Bird and Bruce Brinkley settle into their positions. Brinkley and Bird focus their attention on the two monitors in the room.

Nicodemus adjusts a pair of binoculars and focuses on the starting gate. Also in the booth is placing judge Keith Hanson. He runs the tote board, announces the post time to the tellers and locks down the machine.

The Thoroughbred horses break from the gates cleanly for the first race. Everything is OK until the final turn of this five-furlong claiming race. Coming out of that last turn, four horses vye for inside position. Three of the horses bump into each other.

"Whoa, we're going to have hang this one," says one of the stewards.

Silent Attack goes on to win the race, followed by Big Talk and Shantac. But as soon as the race is done, the steward calls out to Hanson, "Inquiry is up. Inquiry is up."

Hanson flashes the "inquiry" sign on the tote board.

Behind closed doors for the next 10 minutes, the three stewards review the race on videotape. Three cameras, sometimes four, tape the race from two different angles - head on and the side. The stewards will replay the tape in slow motion, and view it as many times as is necessary to determine a foul was committed.

Brinkley, who was a jockey for 20 years before becoming a steward, says, "Each one of us will look at the film and we'll all three voice our opinion" before voting on a decision.

A two-thirds majority vote is required on all inquiries. If a horse fouls another horse or horses, he is placed behind those fouled.

"If we think the horse is bothered enough - if it costs him a place - then we'll take action," Nicodemus explains.

In the race in question, Silent Attack wavered into Shantuc as they came off the turn. Shantuc hit the rail and bounced back into Silent Attack. As a result, Silent Attack bumped Irish Challenger on the outside.

The stewards ruled Silent Attack "bothered" both horses, and moved him from first place to fifth place, behind Irish Challenger.

In Thoroughbred racing, it's common to have bumping in the turns when horses are changing leads.

"We do have a lot of infractions as horses head for home," Brinkley notes.

In quarter horse races, infrac-

tions occur most often at the start of the race.

"In a quarter horse race, just one inch can cost you a lot of money," Nicodemus says.

Nicodemus should know. He was a jockey for more than 30 years. Nicodemus hung up the stirrups in 1993, and he has no regrets.

"At first it's a little strange sitting on the other side (in the steward's chair)," Nicodemus admits about his newer job. "But I'm really enjoying it."

Nicodemus used to curse the stewards himself, along with other jockeys. Stewards meet with jockeys after races in which fouls have occurred. They review the tapes with the jockey, and then fine or suspend the offending jockey.


"The majority of the jocks know when they're in the wrong," Nicodemus says. "He can prevent a lot of it. He can read what's ahead of him. If you go in there where it's real tight, you can have some problems."

If the jockey made an effort to control the horse, Nicodemus says the stewards may not discipline him.

"A hundred and twenty pounds isn't much to try to control 1,000 pounds (of horse)," Nicodemus notes.

The stewards have a lot of administrative tasks to attend to on non-racing days. They approve licenses, handle disciplinary meetings, and troubleshoot.

"We have to protect the jockeys and the horses," Bird says. And, of course, the racing fan, he adds.

Ruidoso School Board responds to editorial

The Ruidoso School Board responded with a prepared statement May 9 to an April 24 editorial in the *The Ruidoso News*.

The editorial asked the Ruidoso School Board to examine its public participation and open meetings policy.

School Board President Ronnie Hemphill read the statement, printed on today's editorial page, at the school board meeting.

School board member James Paxton said he was a strong ad-

vocate of public discussion when he began serving on the board.

"It's unfortunate that you can't just have a time when anybody who has something that they've thought of while they were sitting here could talk," Paxton said. "I would like to potentially have it where somebody could stand up and make a comment, but the final conclusion, at least personally, is that in this setting, it's just not a practical procedure."

Because people want to get in discussions about political issues and personnel problems, the dis-

ussion policy should stand, Paxton said.

"There may come a point in time when the board changes its mind, and there's a good environment here and we can go back to that (public discussion)," he said.

"I think people forget that this is a business meeting," Susan Lutterman, board member said. "It's important for people who want to talk to get on the agenda."

Board policy concerning public participation at board meetings is printed on today's editorial page.

School board meets in Albuquerque

Local residents are invited to attend the Ruidoso School Board's annual planning retreat in June, but to do that, they will have to travel to Albuquerque.

"We will formally make this announcement and point out that if someone should want to attend the retreat, as in past years, they are certainly invited," Mike Gladden, superintendent of schools, said at the school board meeting on May 9.

Ruidoso school board members, school principals, Gladden, and business manager Caron Snow will be in the Duke City attending a school law seminar on Friday, June 9 and Saturday, June 10 at the Marriott Hotel.

Then from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, after the seminar, the Ruidoso School Board and school administrators will meet to discuss the next school year's goals.

"It's at this time that we begin discussing and formulating goals for the district for the fast approaching 1995-96 school year," Gladden said.

Reading from a prepared statement (see today's editorial page), School Board President Ronnie Hemphill said, "The annual retreat that the board conducts is held in compliance with all aspects of the Open Meetings Act. Action items are not presented, and the retreat

is conducted for the sole purpose of synthesizing input from community members, advisory groups, including students and staff, into a set of achievable goals for the coming school year."

The *Ruidoso News* contacted John Duran, an attorney for the State Board of Education, to see if the state board has a policy on retreats.

"It's a local matter," Duran said. "There is no state board policy that addresses out-of-town retreats or things of that nature. As long they are following the normal legal requirements, it's really up to the local board, and as long as those meetings are properly announced, they are probably within the strict guidelines of the law."

"It's up to the local officials to decide and then it's up to the public to react," he said.

Board member Karen Anderson asked if the four-hour session would be enough time to get everything done. Hemphill said it probably would not be adequate but they would schedule another four-hour meeting in the future.

Hemphill said he wanted to clarify that there is only one retreat per year and the Albuquerque meeting was the first time it was scheduled out of town.

"This will be the first time we've had a retreat that is significantly

out of town," Hemphill said. "We did go to the Willard Ranch for two years, then Mike's (Gladden) house in Glencoe. Those are technically out of town but I felt like they were accessible to most folks."

Paul Wirth, director of special services, said he attended the past two retreats and no one outside of the school administration attended.

"We've always followed the open meetings law by letting the media know about the meetings," Wirth said.

The school law seminar is sponsored by the New Mexico School Board Association and will cover such topics as current legislation, transportation, sexual misconduct and collective bargaining, Snow said.

Board members and administrators will receive the standard \$50 per diem for the trip, Snow said.

She also indicated that hotel accommodations and travel costs for the trip were budgeted last June and the group would probably travel to Albuquerque in a school vehicle to save on expenses.

The National School Board Association's 55th annual conference in San Francisco was the last out-of-town event attended by the board.

All five school board members and Gladden attended that conference from April 1-4 at a cost to the school district of \$6,607.



Some solutions to graffiti problem


It seems the most workable solution to this community's graffiti problem is to get rid of the graffiti as soon as it is drawn, to discourage the taggers by immediately eliminating their work.

There are several things people in the community can do. Calling CrimeStoppers anonymously when they see a tagger creating the graffiti is one line of action. If you see the graffiti after the fact, call the police anyway so the government is aware of the graffiti, and then get rid of it immediately if it's on your property.

If it's on public property, the government often finds people who are willing to paint over the graffiti. As for the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, its employees try to paint over graffiti on trash bins as quickly as they are notified. If you want to do it yourself, matching paint is available at local stores.

It's sickening that some graffiti taggers are now even making their mark on nature's rocky cliffs. For this we can only hope that nature will wash it away, or that the taggers will realize that God's work is much more beautiful than their own and they should keep nature off-limits.

CONTRIBUTED COMMENTS

(Following is the Ruidoso School Board's written response to a Ruidoso News editorial calling for more open discussion of policy during meetings, and calling for the allowance of public comments in their meetings without the need to get on agendas before the meeting.)

Pursuant to Ruidoso Municipal School Policy Manual, District Code 2.13, the Ruidoso Municipal Schools Board of Education desires and solicits public input on all issues affecting the effective and productive programming for children and the administration of the school district.

As stipulated in the policy, procedures that are easily understood and easily accessed are available to all community members. These formal procedures (a simple oral or written request to the superintendent three days prior to the meeting) are entirely reasonable and provide the parameters for any educationally relevant issues to be placed on the agenda and discussed.

The formal policy encourages productive discussion of controversial issues or the expression of criticism of school programs or operations. It does not prohibit, in accordance with the Open Meetings Act, the discussion of personnel or other persons at a public session.

Policy adoption, as discussed in the policy manual — District Code 2.17, is a process that is typically developed over time and typically involves several board meetings.

The initial first reading or discussion step of the process involves presentations by the superintendent or designee; depending upon the complexities of the issue, the item may appear on the next agenda as an action item or may require further discussion prior to final adoption.

At that point in a board meeting when policy/program action is accomplished, board members have been the recipients of formal presentations at previous meetings, have received input from various advisory groups (YES, Drug Free Schools, Parent Advisory Councils, etc.), and have been the recipients of unlimited amounts of informal input from community members and students.

The annual retreat that the board conducts is held in compliance with all aspects of the Open Meetings Act, action items are not presented, and the retreat is conducted for the sole purpose

of synthesizing input from community members, advisory groups, including students, and staff into a set of achievable goals for the coming school year.

One of the efficiencies of being part of a small community is the "informal" accessibility of every school board member and member of the administrative staff of the district. On a daily basis, and in every setting imaginable (the grocery store, church, sporting events, concerts, etc.), members of the community openly and freely share their input and advice with those persons they have elected to represent them.

The editorial presented in *The Ruidoso News* recently was written by an editor who, to our knowledge, has not taken the opportunity to become a productive participant in the educational programs for our youth by attending a single advisory group meeting or board meeting. We sincerely invite the editor to attend her first board meeting and become familiar with the educational programs of the Ruidoso community on a first-hand basis.

To correct inaccuracies in the editorial, it is important to note that meetings are not held and decisions are not reached prior to the official meetings. Development of the agenda and distribution of necessary documentation is conducted in complete compliance with all provisions of the Open Meetings Act and with local policy. Superintendent Gladden delivers large packets of information to individual members at their home or work place in time for them to review and study the documents prior to the meeting.

As board president, I (Ronnie Hemphill) would have been careful to provide more clarifying information and documentation to the editor had I known her inquiries were going to be summarized in an editorial. As board members, we will continue to solicit input through those formal and informal processes that are available to all community members. We encourage community members with valid issues in need of discussion to follow the very simple process of securing an item on the agenda of board meetings.

District Code 2.13
Public Participation at Board Meetings

The Board desires citizens of the district to attend its sessions so that they may become better acquainted with the schools and so that the Board may have opportunity to receive public input.

To permit community members to be heard, and at the same time to conduct its meetings properly and efficiently, the Board establishes the following procedures for persons wishing to speak before the Board:

1. The person should inform the superintendent of his/her topic, and any group he/she may represent at least three days before the meeting.

2. The individual will be allowed five minutes for his/her presentation, although an extension of time may be granted by the superintendent in scheduling the presentation on the agenda, or later by the Board as it hears the individual.

3. Speakers may offer objective criticism of school operations and programs, but the Board will not hear complaints about school personnel or other persons at a public session. Other channels provide for Board consideration of complaints involving individuals.

The president will have authority to terminate the remarks of any individual who does not adhere to the above rules. Persons appearing before the Board, action — and the answers to many questions — must be deferred pending Board consideration.

District Code: 2.14
Board Policy Development

The Board reserves to itself the function of providing guides for the discretionary action of those to whom it delegates authority. These guides for discretionary action constitute the policies governing the operation of the school district. They will be recorded in writing.

The formulation and adoption of these policies will constitute the basic method by which the Board exercises its control over the operation of the school system. The study and evaluation of reports concerning the execution of its written policies will constitute the basic method by which the Board exercises its control over the operation of the school system.

The formal adoption of policies will be recorded in the minutes of the Board. Only those written statements so adopted and so recorded will be regarded as official Board policy.


