**All campfires outlawed in forest**

Citing increasing fire danger, the Lincoln National Forest issued a total campfire ban Saturday, including organized campgrounds with grates.

Smoking restrictions have also been expanded. Smoking or enclosed structures is prohibited.

The forest has had 30 continuous days of extreme fire conditions and there is no relief in sight, officials said. Fuels such as logs have less than 6% fuel moisture.

"The Lincoln is in a more severe fire danger compared to last year at this time," said assistant forest staff officer Bob Pena. Last year, the Bridge fire torched more than 5,000 acres and threatened the community of Timberon, and several other fires occurred on the forest.

**Jury request delays elk shooting trial**

A trial scheduled for Thursday for Jeff Morgan, 30, has been postponed.

Morgan is charged with killing an elk out of season, and discharging a firearm within city limits last month.

Morgan, a Ruidoso resident, requested a jury trial just days before the scheduled trial by judge. A new date has not yet been set by Magistrate Judge William Butts.

Asking for a jury when the charges are misdemeanors is unusual, said Assistant District Attorney Viola Rhodes.

## Skateboard debate returns to Ruidoso council tomorrow

The debate over attempts to close Ruidoso's downtown streets to skateboards returns at Tuesday's council meeting.

Downtown merchant Ann Bolton, owner of J. Robert's clothing store, has asked the council to consider an ordinance prohibiting skateboards, roller blades and other self-propelled wheels on the sidewalks.

Her request will be considered at 6:30 p.m. at city hall.

Two merchants at an April 29 meeting requested a similar prohibition, arguing the skateboarders were a nuisance to pedestrians. They said they fear a lawsuit if one of the skateboarders

or pedestrians is injured in front of their store.

Councilors unanimously voted against the request at that meeting, noting the sidewalks were public right-of-way on a state highway, and they are the only place for youngsters to sport on the rolling boards.

With their decision to not write a new ordinance, the council formed an ad-hoc skateboarding committee that is trying to designate a safe and desirable place for the youths to skate.

Also at Tuesday's meeting, councilors will vote on a Convention and Visitors Bureau contract with the Chamber of Commerce.

And they are scheduled to vote

on a resolution to hold a village-wide election Aug. 22.

Proposed projects to be funded with the issuance of bonds include: \$2 million to construct, improve and enlarge the village water system; \$1.5 million to construct, improve and enlarge the village sewer system; \$1.6 million to construct a new library; \$100,000 for a senior citizen building remodeling; \$350,000 for a village hall addition; and \$1 million to build and improve athletic fields.

Councilors will also vote on a federal grant application for a Billy the Kid Loop scenic byway.

## Bureau of Land Management, cavers debate changes Thursday

Cavers and Bureau of Land Management officials will try to work out disagreements about a proposed new direction in cave management Thursday.

At issue are BLM proposals to begin charging fees for entering 13 caves on BLM land in the Roswell resource district, and a plan to allow commercial guided trips into some of those caves.

The meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in the Roswell district office conference room, 1717 W 2nd St., in Roswell.

Steve Peerman of the Mesilla Valley Grotto in Las Cruces said he expects more than 20 cavers and some representatives of the National Speleological Society to attend the session.

"The cavers feel there are a number of flaws in the proposals the BLM has made, and I think the caving community would ask the BLM to take a step back and rethink what they're asking to do,"

Peerman said.

"We feel there are some things the BLM needs to think about in this proposal," Peerman said, referring to commercial guided trips requested at Fort Stanton Cave in Lincoln County.

Commercial trips with tour groups could overly stress a cave, putting too much pressure on the resource, he said.

"I think they were a little hasty in presenting the proposal and that they didn't give the caving community very much time to react to it," he said.

In general, caving groups do not support any commercial activities in caves, he said.

The BLM proposals were published in the Jan. 19 edition of the Federal Register and written comment was allowed until April 19.

"We do understand BLM is obligated to come up with policies to deal with commercial caving if there are requests and there were," Peerman said. However, "The

cavers were not consulted at all to my knowledge until the policy was issued in what appeared to be a fairly final form."

The fee issue, on the other hand, had been debated.

"There had been quite a bit of discussion, but the BLM had not seemed to welcome much relevant discussion among cavers," Peerman said. "They asked what the caving community thought and when (cavers) came back with, 'Well, we're not too thrilled with it and we'd like to talk about it,' there was not much indication the BLM wanted to talk about it until this time."

"Personally speaking, it's not so much the implementation of a fee, it's the manner in which the BLM wants to collect the fees and the manner they are choosing to recognize the contribution of the caving community."

The BLM doesn't want to exempt people working on cave

## Former governor, others honored by county Democrats

Democratic leaders past and present joined former Governor Bruce King and former Ruidoso legislator John Underwood at an appreciation dinner Thursday night in Ruidoso.

"If we had held another election like we have held the neighbors did, all would have been re-elected," King jostled about the Mescalero Apache Tribe. Indian tribes and pueblos generally supported Gov. Gary Johnson, who agreed to sign gaming compacts.

The dinner at Cree Meadows Country Club was a party reunion of sorts, hosted by the Lincoln County Democratic Party. More than 100 Democratic leaders representing Ruidoso and Santa Fe plus Lincoln, Santa Ana, and Otero counties gathered to cheer their former leaders who lost re-election bids last November. They also heard about plans for the future of the party.

Ruidoso Mayor Jerry Shaw gave the welcoming address and Lincoln County Commissioner L. Ray Nunley served as master of ceremonies.

"How is Ruidoso doing? Well, not quite as well as when you were there," Shaw said to Underwood and King when opening her address.

Underwood, who served two terms as a state representative, said he is unsure whether he will seek re-election in 1996. A bid will depend upon the support he finds, he said.

"I did everything I knew how to make this county, this state better," Underwood said. "I tried to bring some of Santa Fe to southern New Mexico."

Thus far, Governor Gary Johnson's decisions will have "a long-lasting, deleterious effect on the life of this state for all our lives and our children's lives," Underwood said.

King, the only state governor to hold three terms in office, said he's enjoying life back on the ranch. Retirement is where he's at, and he has no desire to return to the campaign arena, he said.

Hearty laudations and standing ovations, which helped stretch the buffet dinner into a three-hour revelry, were also extended to former first lady Alice King and former state representatives David Townsend and Mariano Torrez.

"The media gave the governor a hard time for being a good ole boy," said Mrs. King. "The nation wanted change, the state of New Mexico wanted change. We got that change and have to work within it."

After noting he only lost his 1994 re-election bid by two points, Torrez of Alamogordo announced he would seek office again for the next term in District 51.

Townsend, who represented District 53 and is also from the Alamogordo area, suggested the Republicans who won office were unprepared and found governing a lot more difficult once they arrived at the capitol.

"The Republicans were not ready to win," he concluded.

Also feted was new state Democratic Party Chairman Earl Potter, local state Senator Pete Campos

## Judge quits Dem party

Noticably absent from Thursday's Democrat appreciation feast in Ruidoso was local magistrate court Judge Bill Butts.

Butts was the only incumbent Democrat in Lincoln County to be re-elected in November.

"I wasn't there because I was not included in the program," Butts said. "I received an invitation a couple of weeks ago saying who was to be honored. It didn't mention Bill Butts."

"As the only Democrat to win in Lincoln County, I had my feelings hurt because I wasn't included."

The same day the Democrats' dinner was held, Butts switched to the Republican Party. His wife Roxanne also switched parties. They sent the change by mail a few hours before the dinner.

Butts declined to elaborate on his decision.

Butts, a former state police officer who handles about 2,000 felony and misdemeanor cases a year, has never had a decision overturned by the district court.

"I feel like I'm an excellent and dedicated magistrate, that I give it everything I have to offer, and when it comes to being a judge, I feel I'm totally fair and non-partisan," he said.

and state House Speaker Raymond Sanchez.

Campos affectionately called Underwood "Mi hermano, my brother and always my brother."

Potter said the party will be drafting a vision statement to help better communicate Democrat party virtues to voters.

Work on the statement began Saturday, and other meetings will be held this summer to craft a solid platform message, Potter said.

He added that the Democratic Party is one which is compassionate, strongly supports educational initiatives and embraces diversity among people.

Sanchez, the House speaker since 1987, said the Democratic party is one which believes in "the equitable distribution of benefits and burdens."

But this principle has been lost in the state government since King, Underwood, Townsend, Torrez and others lost their seats, he suggested.

"I miss them. The character has changed (at the Roundhouse) because the people have changed. Who are they?" Sanchez asked.

Sanchez said Governor Gary Johnson is a novice at politics and has acted to the "detriment" of the state by signing poorly structured gaming compacts with Native American tribes.

"We have in the Legislature people who know no more about state and local government than do children," Sanchez added. "Knowing the system is so much more important."

### Transients accused of burglary

Two transients allegedly burglarized a Brady Canyon home shortly before noon Thursday.

The men, Timothy Nila, 20, of California, and Joe Perez, a.k.a. Marino, 18, of Texas, were arrested and charged with burglary and larceny about 30 minutes after neighbors saw them carrying a microwave, oven and vacuum into the woods, Sergeant Robert Achterberg said.

The two men, who police say have been living in Ruidoso for about four weeks, are being held at the county jail on \$10,000 bonds and await court hearings.

Nila and Perez were fairly easy to catch because a heavy trail of blood was found from the Ponderosa Drive burglarized home to the trailer at 105 Oak Drive where the men lived, Achterberg said. One of the suspects was allegedly found in the house with a bandaged hand and blood up to his elbow, apparently after busting a window with his fist.

The stolen items were found in the woods, some with blood on them.

### Plan to attract film industry to Lincoln County is outlined

A three-year plan to attract the film industry to Lincoln County received non-financial support last week from the county commission.

Stan Monks of the Ruidoso Arts and Film Commission said he obtained a 1986 study by Milton Forman of Los Angeles, Calif., for the New Mexico Film Commission.

Out of eight sites examined, the study ranked Ruidoso right behind Santa Fe for film industry suitability. The area has a wide variety of scenery, many hotels and restaurants catering to the tourist industry, excellent weather, excellent lighting, a willing government and a small group of film industry personnel available for consultation, the report said.

The estimated direct economic impact to a county for four to six weeks of film shooting is \$50,000 to \$100,000 a day, but the study concluded the filming also attracts tourists and produces other benefits, Monks related.

An important ingredient is a sound stage, which costs up to \$100,000 to build, he said.

"Without it, they can only do location filming," he said. He asked commissioners to appoint someone from the county to work with him in developing a packet to attract moviemakers and to move ahead with the three-year plan. Commissioners said their staff is overworked, but they would write letters of support for Monks' effort.

### Commissioners say bidding procedures need fine-tuning

Technical errors threatened the outcome of two out of three bid openings for the purchase of county government equipment last week.

"Maybe it's time we ask the county attorney to review every bid specification that goes out," said Commissioner Wilton Howell. "This is wasting money, our staff's time and the time of the bidders."

Three bids for radio communications and related equipment maintenance service were thrown out when commissioners learned that one bidder had not received the last page of the specifications. The bids specs will be reworked and sent out again. The county has been without a contract for the past year. Paul Keith, one of the bidders under the name of All-Comm Communications in Ruidoso Downs, has been providing the service as needed.

Despite objections from Fort Stanton Volunteer Fire Chief Barnie Mancha, commissioners awarded a contract for a new pumper to Independent Fire Equipment, as the low bidder at \$127,282 with a 90-day delivery date.

Mancha wanted to go with the second lowest of the five bidders, but the county attorney advised that there was no legal basis. Mancha objected to the steel body supplied by Independent, but a company representative pointed out the type of body was not specified as aluminum, because a "no exceptions" clause was eliminated from the bid language.

The third bid procedure went smoothly, with Desert Sun Motors of Alamogordo being awarded the contract for 1995 Chevrolet pickup trucks at a price of \$18,488 for one or \$55,484 for three. The company was the lowest of four bidders.

### Three local caves included in fee plans

Three of the 13 caves proposed for entrance fees by the local Bureau of Land Management district are located in Lincoln County.

The BLM is proposing a \$5 application fee plus a \$3 per person permit fee paid at self-service stations.

Local caves are Crocket Cave, eight miles west of Carrizozo; Fort Stanton Cave, five miles southeast of Capitan; and Torgac Cave, 50 miles northwest of Roswell.

BLM spokesman Paul Happel said Fort Stanton is the longest cave of the group, with 11 miles of

trail. It also has easy access and can be walked relatively easily in the first half.

Crockett, part of a 640-acre block of land, is the smallest and hard to access, he said. About 3,800 feet long, it goes to a depth of 80 feet.

A BLM agent is required to accompany people entering Torgac. It contains some classic gypsum formations. It has been designated a National Natural Landmark, runs about 2,820 feet in length and is 75 feet deep.

The other 10 caves, situated in some of the eight other counties in the Roswell Resource Management District, are Crystal, Doc Brito, Endless, Wind, Algeria Blossom, Jarrigan No. 2, Lost, Little Manhole, McKittrick and Sand.

The BLM expects the policy to result in fewer "no shows," people who obtain a free permit and cancel the date assigned to them to enter the cave, Happel said. BLM em-

ployees have to guide some trips and unlock gates for others.

Volunteers could have fee waivers, BLM officials said.

Fee money could pay for projects such as gate replacement, environmental studies, clean up work and management, Happel said.

If the fee reduced the number of users, it could reduce the wear and tear on the caves or spread use to other less-used caves, BLM officials noted.

The fee is in line with the federal government's "pay as you go" approach being used elsewhere, Happel said.

Bureau officials hope to generate a total of \$4,950 from the expected 250 applications and permits (three-person average) issued in one year.

Overall use won't increase with commercial tours, Happel said, because 20% of the maximum allowed use of a cave would be allocated for commercial tours.

projects from fees.

Cavers understand that the caves must be protected and access must be monitored, Peerman said.

"The BLM is obligated to manage the caves on BLM land and part of that is access restriction," Peerman said. "The organized caving community understands that. We don't necessarily welcome further restrictions on access, but in some cases we realize that needs to be done."

Cavers throughout New Mexico are concerned about the new proposals, Peerman said.

"The caving community has worked with BLM for a number of years, at least the 20 years I've been caving, worked with the BLM in developing and implementing cave management policies. We want to continue to work with the BLM. I think that's the spirit we want to go into this meeting with. I think that's the attitude of the caving community."

# Carpport variance prevents tree cutting

Rather than allow a grove of old trees to be cut, the Ruidoso Planning & Zoning Commission granted a North Loop Drive resident a variance to build a carpport 10 feet from the road.

But the approval came in a split vote, with Chay Rennick and den Eckersley voting no.

"While I'd rather see the forest maintained, we have to have a reason for the village to grant a variance," Rennick said.

Homeowner Ben Mason gained the variance by arguing the building site is already clear, the trees provide him privacy and the carpport would free him from shoveling car out of snow in the winter.

Mason also alleged that his

street was a "hotbed of non-compliance" and that a number of his neighbors had carpports built beyond the required 20-foot setback line.

Rennick replied that a number of those carpports were grandfathered because they were constructed before the commission existed.

Also at the meeting, the commission unanimously approved:

- a handicapped accessible drive-up automatic teller machine at the midtown Ruidoso State Bank.
- the replatting of three lots at the Sunny Slope subdivision to include a fourth. The changed property lines create "better building sites," land surveyor D.T. Collins said.

# Police intervene after second suicide attempt

Police busted in the door of a 36-year-old Ruidoso man and transported him to the hospital after he allegedly threatened suicide and swallowed a bottle of pills Thursday morning.

The man, Mark Clark, is the same person who held police in a negotiating stand-off for five hours April 10 after he called the department and threatened to kill himself. Officers were staged outside 422 Del Norte Drive home for hours as police Chief Lanny Madrox coaxed Clark, during their five-hour phone conversation, not to

harm himself and to go outside.

This time, police spent less than an hour talking with Clark on the telephone. His mother happened to be at the police department filing a domestic violence complaint against her husband, Darvin Clark, when Mark called. Officers in dispatch talked with him for nearly an hour, police said, until they heard his police get groggy.

Police then went to the house and busted in the door with the mother's permission. Clark was later taken to a state psychiatric hospital.



## Post time moves up to 1:15 p.m.

Beginning Thursday, Ruidoso Downs will start its first live race at 1:15 p.m. for the remainder of the 1995 racing season.

The starting time for Thursday and Friday has been moved up from 2:45 in response to numerous requests by the track's frequent patrons, officials said.

"Since we opened the season on May 12, we've received a lot of input, pro and con, about the weekday starting time," explained Ruidoso Downs General Manager Scott Wells. "We feel that starting our first live race at 1:15 on Thursdays and Fridays will better accommodate our regular fans as well as weekend visitors to Ruidoso Downs."

The 1995 racing season will run through Labor Day with racing Thursday through Sunday and special holiday programs on Monday, July 3 and Tuesday, July 4.

Action this Thursday will be headlined by seven trials for the Zia Futurity, one of the season's richest events for New Mexico-bred quarter horses. The 10 fastest qualifiers for the 350-yard trials will be eligible for the \$189,400 Zia Futurity on Sunday, June 24.

Sophomore stakes hopefuls will be in the spotlight this Friday, with the Rainbow Derby Trials at 440 yards and the Zia Derby Trials for New Mexico-breds as the day's featured events.

In addition to its live racing programs, Ruidoso Downs presents a full slate of simulcast seven days a week, featuring tracks from around the country beginning by 11 a.m. every day. Belmont Park, Calder, Aksarben, Hollywood Park, Retama Park and Arapahoe Park are among the tracks on the simulcast menu. Call (505) 378-4431 for complete information.

## Last Don dominates Mescalero Handicap

The hard-knocking gelding Last Don B. captured the Mescalero Apache Handicap for the third time in the last four years when he defeated a tough group of older sprinters by three lengths in the \$8,375 contest Saturday at Ruidoso Downs.

Ridden by Manuel Ortiz Jr., Last Don B. laid just off the quick early pace of .22 seconds flat set by B.G.'s Drone and Set Records. Entering the turn for home, Ortiz angled the 8-year-old to the outside and Last Don B. blew past the tiring pacesetters to take the lead for good. The final time was 1:10.1, the fastest time of the meet for six furlongs.

The Mescalero Apache was Last Don B.'s 30th career win and the eighth in 13 starts at Ruidoso for the Lynda Tanner-trainee. Seven of those wins have come in stakes.

Last Don B. made his seasonal debut here in the May 27 Governor's Handicap, but came up a little short and finished second.

"Last time it was just the high altitude and he proved that today. He hasn't worked since that race and hopefully he'll keep getting better and better," Ortiz said.

Tanner also seemed relieved that Last Don B. made up for his runner-up performance in the Governor's.

"Things went perfectly in the race and everything came together exactly the way I envisioned it," Tanner said.

The victory was worth \$5,000 to Phoenix-based owner Leonard Monti. Set Records was second, 3 1/2 lengths in front of B.G.'s Drone.

## Jockey Nicky Madrid wins four in row

Jockey Nicky Madrid has been riding at Ruidoso Downs three years and says he's won three in a day "a lot," but he can't remember four consecutive wins.

From the top of Sunday's lineup, he swept the first four races with Brit's Boy, Babe Cannon, Blast of Ice and A Western Special.

It had been a bad week up to then.

"I only hit the board once, since Thursday," he said, referring to not having any horses win, place or show on the tote board until Sunday.

Then Sunday, there was barely a race when Madrid's mount didn't show up in one of the pay-off positions.

His love for horse racing was passed down from his dad, jockey Ignacio "Shorty" Madrid, who retired in 1980 after 18 years on the tracks and now works as agent for his son.

In 1987 Madrid began his apprenticeship as a jockey. He had some problems keeping his weight down, so he mostly galloped horses for others until 1992, when he came back home to the Southwest. Now his career has improved every year.

Madrid, who rode eight of 10 races Sunday, said he thought he'd "hit the board" but he didn't imagine winning four in a row — a feat yet to be duplicated in this season's racing action by any other jockey.

How do you win four consecutive races?

"It's luck and livestock: the horses looked good today and were in the spots where they belonged," Madrid related. "All I did was hold on for dear life!"

His luck has been holding steady in other ways that matter, too. On July 9, he'll wed Monique Figueroa, who also works at Ruidoso Downs, in the stewards' office. The event is to be held at Cree Meadows in Ruidoso.





## May building activity stats

Ruidoso issued 4% more building permits in May 1995 than in May 1994.

A total of 56 building permits, including alteration/addition permits, were issued by the village this May, versus 54 permits issued last May.

Single-family home building permits numbered 19 this May, a 27.08% increase over last year.

For the January through May period, 61 single family home permits have been issued versus 48 permits by the same time last year.

Figures indicate that three commercial building permits were issued this May. Last May only one commercial building permit was issued.

Following is a breakout of May construction activity figures:

— New residential construction: \$2,270,184, a 24.69% increase over May 1994;

— Residential alterations/additions: \$265,753, a 21.24% decrease from May 1994;

— New commercial construction: \$218,000, a 100% increase over last May;

— Commercial alterations/additions: \$25,194, a 66.92% decrease from May 1994;

— Other miscellaneous construction: \$6,299 this May, a 100% increase over last year;

— and demolition activity for May was \$2,000, the same as last year.

Overall, construction activity for May of 1995 was \$2,787,430, a 24.65% increase over May of 1994.

# Beer-producing microbreweries are coming to Lincoln County

Outlaws Brewing Company, a microbrewery producing ale beers, received a license Tuesday from the Lincoln County Commission.

The brewery will be installed in the Riverside Rancho building about 11 miles east of Tinnie on U.S. Highway 70, at the eastern edge of the county.

The company, Riverside Rancho Inc., was represented by Gary Shewan of Alamogordo at the county commission meeting. The company won't have to pay a fee for its Tinnie license this year, because no legal mechanism is in place, said

County Attorney Alan Morel. By next year, a resolution should be in place providing for a \$125 fee.

The Riverside Rancho property includes eight acres, and a 6,000 square-foot restaurant and bar facility, Shewan said.

"We already serve hamburgers and steaks at the restaurant," Shewan's wife Lorraine said.

Although the actual microbrewery in Tinnie will not begin producing beers for about three months, the restaurant serves beers provided by other New Mexico microbreweries.

The same company plans to open two other breweries in this area by the end of the year.

Another microbrewery, Kegs, located in Alamogordo, is scheduled to be fully operational by July 1.

A third is being installed at the former Y-Knot amusement park at the intersection of U.S. 70 and Sudderth Drive in Ruidoso. That brewery, which will also have a restaurant facility, is still awaiting final state approval and could be fully operational by the end of the year.

## Coffee paradise at Ruidoso Roastery

Leland DeFord jumped from the fire into the roasting pan, in a manner of speaking.

DeFord is the owner of Ruidoso Roastery, the only coffee roastery in southern New Mexico.

"Before I moved to Ruidoso I was with the fire department in El Paso," DeFord said. "I've had a long running love affair with coffee all my life, and I guess it's a natural offshoot of that love that I got into this business."

Ruidoso Roastery opened in March at 113 Rio Street. Besides roasting green coffee beans from all over the world, the roastery also has an espresso bar and serves pastries. Within the next two weeks the business will begin serving soups, sandwiches and salads, DeFord said.

"We serve all kinds of espresso-based drinks, drip coffee and iced, carbonated Italian sodas," DeFord said. "In fact we have 32 flavors of

Italian sodas and a daily drip coffee that varies from day to day for 75 cents for all you can drink."

Ruidoso Roastery can seat 24 people inside and has a large outside area with tables, chairs and umbrellas, plus an outdoor stage where musicians entertain on Friday and Saturday evenings.

Ruidoso Roastery brings in green coffees from around the world and roasts them in-house.

"We buy coffee from everywhere through coffee brokers," DeFord said. "We keep coffees in stock from African nations such as Ethiopia, and Kenya; coffee from Java, Sumatra, and Central and South America."

DeFord has three employees, including his nephew Bill Watrous, who help with the roasting process.

Roasting the green coffee beans only takes about 20 minutes, but the process is extremely labor intensive, DeFord said.

"It's not an automated process," he said. "It requires constant attention."

Ruidoso Roastery packages its coffee under the name Caffe Montagna, Italian for "Mountain Coffee," and also DeFord's mother's maiden name.

"Maybe that was some kind of omen," DeFord said.


The business ships the roasted coffee to wholesale and retail accounts all over the country.

"We can custom roast as little as one pound," DeFord said. "People can special order coffee roasted to order and we do custom blending of coffees for customers."

Ruidoso Roastery's coffee prices range from \$5.45 for a pound of Guatemala coffee to \$9.35 for a pound of Blue Sumatra coffee.

Ruidoso Roastery is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday through Thursday, and 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

# Skateboard committee braces for second banning attempt

Some Ruidoso skateboard committee members anticipate a larger antagonism of downtown merchants opposing skateboarders than before, at Tuesday's council meeting.

The ad hoc committee was created to find a suitable site for skateboarders after two downtown merchants complained about the skateboarders to the Ruidoso Village Council April 29.

At the second skateboard committee meeting Thursday, Village Assistant Manager Alan Briley predicted more downtown merchants would show up this time.

"Two letters that were sent to the editor of *The Ruidoso News* have 'added gasoline to the fire that is already burning downtown,'" Ruidoso Planning Commissioner Chay Rennick said at Thursday's committee meeting.

"I've had comments from several councilors that the skateboard issue has received the most calls of anything we've ever been involved in at all," Briley said.

Councilor Robert Donaldson predicted the pressure would work for the skateboard committee.

"We're going to have political pressure on us to get rid of skateboarding downtown, but that same pressure is going to be there for us to do something for the kids. There will be pressure on the committee to do something as soon as possible to create a skatepark," Donaldson said.

Though an indoor park was preferred by local skateboarders,

some said it would cost too much. "That would be ideal in a world where we had lots of money, which we just don't have," Donaldson said.

The committee identified a couple of sites for an outdoor skate park. One was North Park, behind fire station #2 at White Mountain, and the other was Schoolhouse Park, near the library on Sudderth Drive. The committee wants to proceed with the North Park area. The size of the park would be approximately 20,000 square feet.

As a beginning, the park would need a concrete or asphalt slab to skate on and lights, committee members said. Donaldson suggested a fence to protect the park from automobiles, bicycles, theft and vandals.

An asphalt slab without lights or a fence would cost about \$20,000, while a concrete slab would cost \$40,000, Briley estimated.

The next skateboard committee meeting will be held at 5 p.m. Thursday, June 22 at the Ruidoso Parks and Recreation Department building near Grindstone Reservoir.



# Ruidoso School Board reviews next year's budget Tuesday

The Ruidoso School Board will review its 1995-96 tentative budget tomorrow night.

Also, bids from private food service companies will be opened at the meeting.

School officials have been studying the feasibility of having a private company take over cafeteria operations because of increasing overruns in operations costs.

Last week, Superintendent of Schools Mike Gladden and several cafeteria workers traveled to Moriarty schools, where a private system is in place.

"I was very impressed with the operation," Gladden said. "They (the private companies) claim that they can keep costs down because they buy in bulk."

Deadline for companies to submit bids was 4 p.m. Thursday, June 8.

Board members will also vote on approval of a joint powers agreement (JPA) between the Ruidoso school district and Hondo Valley schools. The JPA will authorize Ruidoso schools to provide special education services to Hondo students who may not be able to receive adequate help in their own district.

Other agenda items include: — an update on the school district's technology plan by Director of Instructional Support Paul Wirth. A task force has created a plan to develop computer networking between schools in the district. — announcement of the results of bids on playground equipment for

Sierra Vista Primary School; — presentation of the monthly Friend of Ruidoso School Award by board president Ronnie Hemphill and Gladden;

— and recognition of the Ruidoso Education Association employees of the month.

Personnel items include a recommendation to hire Margaret Hornsby as special education teacher at White Mountain Elementary School, and the resignation of Sierra Vista Primary School Secretary Diane Newsom, who is moving because her husband has accepted a job in another area.





### Domenici is on a roll

With the new Republican majority in Congress and our Sen. Pete Domenici chairing the Senate budget committee, Domenici is in the position to have a major influence on the U.S. government process.

Domenici is taking full advantage of this turn of events, we're glad to report. In a state such as New Mexico, outnumbered in Congress, it's important that our few congressmen have power.

He has been a strong leader in efforts to reduce the federal deficit, and now, he is chairing the conference committee that's trying to resolve differences between the House and Senate versions of the new budget.

Domenici is taking a view of the "budget world" similar to the world view of Native Americans, who generally have a philosophy of considering the effect of their actions on future generations.

Domenici recently quoted former Sen. Gaylord Nelson: "The ultimate test of a man's science is his willingness to sacrifice something today for future generations whose words will not be heard."

Then Domenici said, "The ultimate test of our leadership is whether we are going to place burdens on them financially that they do not deserve, and which will limit their capacity to grow, to be free economically, and to prosper. Our challenge is to get rid of deficit spending and try to do that permanently so that we don't rob the future generations by borrowing from them to pay for today."

Hurrah to those comments.

Domenici is again proving that he is a man of principled compromise, by sponsoring a bill that is an alternative to Secretary of Interior Bruce Babbitt's Rangeland Reform. The alternative must be a good compromise if it proposes to raise grazing fees, yet local ranching leaders still support it.

Domenici's proposal lets ranchers own their improvements on public lands, keeps water on federal lands under the jurisdiction of state law, and keeps local people on local public lands advisory committees. These are all good, fair ideas that repair problems with Rangeland Reform.

What amazes us most at this point in time is, how did Domenici find the time to work on the grazing proposal when he was in the midst of budget hearings?

Like the rest of us in our busy lives, we guess he made the time, because he felt this was an important issue. This demonstrates that, when an issue is important to his constituents, Domenici will address it without saying he's too busy. That's the kind of person we need in Washington.



### Day care center controversy needs quick resolution

TO THE EDITOR:

This letter is in response to the rumors concerning the potential closing of the Starlite Montessori School due to bureaucratic hassling and harassment by the New Mexico Children, Family, and Licensing Bureau.

I am a self-employed mother of one with a thriving photography business. I am also Montessori trained and know first-hand the enormous benefits of this early education.

He counted to 50 yesterday...I was stunned!

The atmosphere is loving and caring, and the education is outstanding. If he stayed home all winter, he would have occupied himself with books and trucks; and that gets old. Ruidoso is so fortunate to have the expertise and experience of Shaula and Dick.

Now, to address the issues that the NMCFLB has brought up: for one thing, do they think that we would be paying that amount of tuition for three hours a day for DAY CARE? Not likely.

Also, there are countless studies that show the potential babies and children have for learning. Their brains certainly don't begin to learn at the age of five. The younger the child, the more open he/she is to learning. They are absolutely absorbent...thirsty little sponges. By the age of five, children are already past their sensitive periods for learning the basics, and it becomes harder to learn and concentrate. With a Montessori foundation, children advance with ease. They have a love of learning because it comes naturally to them.

The children aged three to five clearly benefit one another in a learning environment. The younger ones learn from the older ones who, in turn, help and protect the little ones. Then as they grow, the little ones do the same for the younger ones. It is all about helping each other and growing together. It is all about life the way it should be.

Unfortunately, the ignorance of some bureaucrats on the subject of early child development is causing us a lot of headaches, time, and money. How dare they attack a successful, established school for 13 years and try to call it a day care...and thus made to be licensed as such. We are appalled. BUT, if they are looking for trouble, surely they will find it when they threaten the most important thing that parents have — their children and their children's educational rights. ### Open bidding needed for Navy

TO THE EDITOR:

Although I live in — and love — this landlocked state of New Mexico, as a retired Navy captain, I have a heads up on it.

This, briefly, is: the Department of the Navy is seeking more than a billion dollars for fiscal year 1996 for work on a new class of nuclear submarines called the New Attack Submarine. The program eventually would cost \$60 billion.

Putting aside the question of whether we need a new nuke sub, the Navy intends to award the contract to the Electric Boat Division of General Dynamics without competitive bidding. That means the Newport News Shipbuilding division of Tennessee, a highly-qualified nuclear submarine builder, will have no chance to offer to build the subs at lower cost.

The Navy's argument is that Electric Boat needs the contract if it is to survive and "preserve the industrial base." Indeed? And if Newport News' sub division goes under, a not unlikely event if Electric Boat is handed the contract, how does that "preserve the industrial base?" The logic eludes me. Furthermore, my argument is that we are in a time of budget cutting and deficit

reduction, and it makes no sense to put aside those worthy goals by granting noncompetitive awards in the billions of dollars.

It is tantamount to taking out a help wanted advertisement stating that only one person may apply. I urge the New Mexico Congressional Delegation to support an amendment to this year's appropriations bill to require open competition on this important project.

**Launches Eighth Season**

"The first time my mother asked me, 'How exactly is it that we're related?' I was shocked," says filmmaker Deborah Hoffmann. In "Complaints of a Dutiful Daughter," a tender exploration of the tenacity of love and the meaning of memory, Hoffmann chronicles her growing understanding of her elderly mother's struggle with Alzheimer's disease. Nominated for an Academy Award, the film will launch the eighth season of P.O.V., television's only continuing forum for independent non-fiction film.

Shaped from Hoffmann's honest, witty confessional-style narration, the film examines a timely subject: as Americans live longer, more and more people are faced with the life-altering challenge of caring for an elderly parent.

As their former relationship is irretrievably obscured by memory loss, the two women forge a new friendship, based not on a shared past but on an abiding love that transcends long-forgotten particulars.

Next on P.O.V., "Satya: A Prayer for the Enemy" portrays the tremendous suffering the people of Tibet have experienced during decades of Chinese occupation. Since the Chinese invasion of Tibet in 1959, Tibetan Buddhists have been systematically persecuted. Their leader, the Dalai Lama, has been exiled. Over 6,000 temples have been destroyed. More than one million people have been tortured, executed, or starved to death. "Satya" means truth, and the film focuses on the true-life stories of a valiant group of young nuns who have devoted their lives to the nonviolent struggle against Communist repression.

On the same program and half a world away, a 10-year-old Seattle girl, shuttled between homeless shelters and cheap motels, yearns desperately for the stable, happy family life she's never had. Like 25 percent of all American children, Barbara Fay Wilson lives below the poverty line. In "No Place Like Home," filmmaker Kathryn Hunt documents eight months in the daily life of Barbara's family: ex-con mother, runaway teenage sister, high-school dropout brother, and phantom absentee father. Stretching welfare checks, the family bounces between shelters and motels, and then finally lands in a cramped apartment. Barbara, tired of moving, tired of packing everything, sounds resigned beyond her years.

Finally this month, "Uprising of '34" asks how such a pivotal moment in American history could be kept a secret for 60 years. In 1934, half a million overworked and underpaid Southern textile workers walked off their jobs in the largest single-industry strike in the history of the United States. For a brief moment, these new union members stood up for their rights, and organized labor became a force to be reckoned with in the South. Barely publicized, rarely acknowledged in history books, the General Textile Strike of 1934 remains a stirring yet amazingly forgotten chapter in Southern history. P.O.V.'s "Uprising of '34" examines the hidden legacy of the labor movement in the South and its impact today.

P.O.V. airs Tuesdays at 10:00 p.m. beginning June 13th.

POOP SCOOP

Losing a dog is a heart-breaking experience — not knowing whether the pet is safe in another home, has been injured or even stolen for sale to a laboratory.

The American Kennel Club (AKC) has announced plans for the nation's most encompassing animal recovery program.

AKC Companion Animal Recovery will serve as a national data base for all animals and help in the recovery of lost animals, according to Suzanne Lustig, director of public relations for the AKC.

As data base manager, AKC will provide a 24-hour-a-day 800 number service for recovery. The system also will be accessible by FAX or E-mail. Individuals, animal shelters and animal control departments finding an animal may call the 800 number to see if it is enrolled in the program.

The caller must give an identification number that would come from a microchip, tattoo or other form of permanent positive identification. If the animal is enrolled in the program, AKC Companion Animal Recovery will be able to tell an owner if his/her pet has been located.

All companion animals with a form of positive identification, whether they are

purebred or mixed breed dogs, cats or other species may be enrolled. The AKC also has joined forces with Schering-Plough Animal Health and its Destron microchip Program, "HomeAgain," which requires a scanner to read the I.D. number.

Enrollment forms for the AKC Companion Animal Recovery Program will be included in the Schering-Plough microchip package available through veterinarians. Enrollment forms for those animals with other types of identification will be available after June 1.

"We are very excited to introduce this service to the public," said AKC's new president, Judith V. Daniels. "Over the last few years, we have seen the introduction of many identification programs, but there has never been any central clearinghouse to process the information. Recognizing this need, the AKC decided to take the lead so that the public could get the most benefit out of a recovery service."
