Utilities ask state to cancel briefing

An all-day state government review of the proposed Mescalero Apache nuclear waste storage project, scheduled for Friday in Santa Fe, was canceled at the request of the tribe's potential utility partners.

The utilities, led by Northern States Power of Minnesota, asked the state to postpone the review until an application is filed with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, an action not anticipated until December 1996.

The review was called by the nuclear project coordinator for the state to brief legislators, department secretaries and other state officials about the plan to store spent nuclear fuel rods from power plants.

Horse, carriage hit downtown Sunday

A horse and carriage were hit Sunday by a driver allegedly traveling 60 mph on Sudderth Drive in Ruidoso.

Braulio Cruz of Ruidoso was charged with reckless driving and possession of less than an ounce of marijuana.

Debi Jeter co-owns J&B Sleigh and Carriage Co., which offers visitors daily summer carriage rides on downtown streets. Jeter said Sunday night the carriage was demolished and the carriage driver, J.W. McCoy, 19, hurt his wrists and isn't sure what other injuries he suffered. The horse pulling the carriage is stiff and limping, but his injuries haven't been assessed either.

The carriage tipped over when it was hit about 5 p.m., and McCoy was dragged along the road as he tried to hold on, Jeter said. Pieces of the carriage were spread over a three-block area, she said.

Luckily, no passengers were on the carriage because rides were over for the day, Jeter said. McCoy was bringing the horse and carriage home and was only about a block from his destination.

"If there had been a group of people on there, he probably would have killed someone," Jeter said. "It's a scary thought."

The Jeters don't know if they'll be operating downtown in time for the Fourth of July holiday. They have no insurance to cover the elaborate replica carriage. They've been offering the downtown rides for the past four years.

State delays fort prison plan

State officials Friday postponed a decision about the possible conversion of Fort Stanton into a temporary minimum security prison, until they get input from Lincoln County commissioners.

But the last-minute delay didn't seem to soothe the ruffled feathers of Commissioner Wilton Howell.

"They put the RFP (request for proposals for leases by private companies) process on hold and want Lincoln County people to come up to Santa Fe Tuesday for a meeting," Howell said. "I've asked for the minutes of the meeting we had with those same state officials at Fort Stanton (earlier this year) to be transcribed verbatim."

"I believe we had a gentlemen's agreement to go out for an RFP and to look for private companies to (lease the fort and) benefit the county and its residents, and that we'd be partners in the process."

"Obviously, we're short one gentleman."

Without consulting local officials, Corrections Department Secretary Karl A. Sannicks has proposed to Gov. Gary Johnson that the former state hospital be used instead to alleviate prison overcrowding, until a new facility is built in Hobbs.

Howell pointed out that when Johnson closed Fort Stanton hospital in March, he said he wanted a private company to take over the expensive operation. At the same time, every major state department including corrections was asked to consider taking over the fort. All refused. They also rejected a county proposal for conversion into a juvenile detention and diagnostic center, something Howell says could lessen the need for adult prisons.

Because the departments said they weren't interested, several bills that had been introduced in the state Legislature also died. They included a proposal for a \$3-million conversion to a substance abuse center, a \$150,000 study of the possibility of an early intervention counseling and supervising center for young children, and a center for homeless veterans.

The state is obligated to exhaust all state options before looking elsewhere, said Carol Fittipaldi with the public affairs division of the state general services department.

"The goal of the state is that if a public agency or department can use a building the state owns, that comes first," Fittipaldi said.

"At the time they were working on an RFP, there was no agency or department that felt it had a need for the fort. Now there is a chance. They are looking at it and evaluating it. The situation has changed," Fittipaldi said.

Sannicks has proposed an initial 150-200 inmate population, growing to 300 by 1997. About 53 jobs would be created, but as many as one-third could transfer in from other prisons.

He proposes spending \$1 million to renovate and restore historic fort buildings with inmate labor.

The move would save the state \$400,000 over the cost of housing the excess inmates at out-of-state.

Chino denies resignation; vote reversed

Squashing rumors that he resigned as president of the Mescalero Apache Tribe, Wendell Chino presided over a special tribal council meeting Thursday.

The session was called by three council members to reconsider a resolution for the removal of Ed Little as acting superintendent of the Mescalero offices of the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA).

The resolution, supported by Chino but opposed by Vice President Fred Peso, who is Little's cousin, was rejected during a Tuesday meeting by a 5-3 vote, with one member abstaining, according to council secretary Sandra Platero.

The dispute over the future of the reservation of Little, who is a member of the Mescalero tribe, split the council at both sessions.

But in Thursday's vote, the council voted 5-2 to pass the resolution. One councilor abstained, Platero said, but she said she was not allowed to release how individual members voted during either meeting.

A Ruidoso News reporter was asked to leave the session before Thursday's vote occurred.

The council has passed resolutions before telling the federal government to transfer employees off the reservation and to posts elsewhere.

Some council members alleged Little needs more experience and needs to be more cooperative with other tribal members.

Tyrone Hoahwah, one of 30 spectators at the meeting, questioned why Little should have to leave his own reservation to gain that experience. Little could not be reached for comment.

At the Thursday session, Chino was accused by Hoahwah of trying to coerce votes to his side of the issue by threatening to resign at Tuesday's meeting.

"You all took the oath of office," said Hoahwah, who is part of the opposition movement against a plan to store nuclear waste on the Mescalero reservation. "Whether Mr. Chino follows the constitution or not, if this man (Chino) can threaten to quit depending on how you vote, I don't think he can say that."

He turned to Chino and said, "I think everyone heard you say you resigned."

"I differ with your opinion," Chino said. "At no time did I say I'd resign." Chino has served as president since 1965.

Chino also insisted he had not tried to in-

fluence council members.

"They voted as they wanted," he said. "If I had wanted, I could have gone to each one privately, but I chose not to. I have never asked anyone to vote my way. They vote their own discretion."

Those lining the walls of the conference room to watch Thursday's session included tribal housing director Fred Kaydahzinne, Mescalero nuclear waste storage project spokesperson Jennifer Byers, Apache STRONGHOLD representative Nettie Fossum, and Joe Geronimo. Geronimo and Fossum also are nuclear storage opponents.

Chino sat at the head of the conference table. Peso sat at the other end.

Council members Larry Peabyshea, Virginia Klinekole and Peso questioned the legality of the special session. They said the three councilors who called the meeting should first have asked the president call it, and failing that, to ask the vice president. That is the procedure required in the tribal constitution, they contended.

Peabyshea said if the meeting was challenged later and correct procedures hadn't been followed, it would come back to haunt the council.

Lightning sparks seven regional fires Friday

Seven fires sent air tankers with water into the skies above Lincoln County Friday, while ground crews and pumpers battled flames on the ground.

Lightning from thunderstorms Thursday evening started at least five fires on the Lincoln National Forest, said spokesperson Erin Connelly. Each burned 40 acres or less.

The same cause was listed for a fire at the eastern edge of Lincoln County that skirted the perimeter of television news broadcaster Sam Donaldson's ranch. Just a week

earlier, Donaldson fought a blaze on his own property.

That fire, on the former McKnight Ranch, was the largest of the seven fires. It was reported about 7 a.m. Friday, said fire management coordinator Bill Rogge of the state forestry division.

By the time that fire was declared controlled and contained on Saturday, 3,000 acres had burned, said Lynn Hutchison of the same agency. The area was checked again Sunday, but required no additional work, she said.

Air tankers and special "hot shot" ground firefighting crews concentrated on vegetation while

Hondo Valley Fire Department volunteers protected corrals and barns, Rogge said.

A 40-acre fire near Corona on the Rainey Ranch in northwest Lincoln County was manmade, Hutchison said, but she could not provide any details. It also was checked and declared inactive Sunday.

Rogge reminded residents and visitors that current restrictions imposed by the state include a ban on open fires, including charcoal grills. A similar ban is in effect on the Lincoln National Forest.

On the Lincoln National Forest, the two largest fires were in Otero

County, a 40-acre blaze about three miles southeast of Alamogordo, and one called the Bug Fire, covering about 25 acres near Scuffle Hill.

Neither fire threatened any structures. The Smokey Bear Hotshots from Ruidoso worked the Bug Fire Friday.

Both fires were declared contained by Sunday.

Lightning Thursday also started three other small fires, Connelly said. One was in the Capitan Mountains, one in the White Mountains and one near James Ridge in the Sacramento Mountains. No fires were considered active Friday.

Son allegedly stabs father with knife

A drunken rumble between a father, son and nephew at their home along Carrizo Canyon Road Thursday night climaxed when the son allegedly stabbed his father in the shoulder, police report.

It was the second time this week that a son was charged with stabbing his father in Ruidoso.

The victim, Augustin Apachito, 41, suffered a two-inch deep wound after a kitchen knife was plunged into his shoulder, police said. He was taken to Lincoln County Medical Center where he received stitches and was later released, police said.

His son, Shone Apachito, 18, was arrested and charged with aggravated battery. He is being held

on a \$10,000 bond and awaits a court hearing.

Chris Apachito, 24, the victim's nephew, is also being held on a \$10,000 bond for aggravated assault charges. He is currently on probation for burglary charges, and a court hearing will determine whether he will be held for the remainder of his previous sentence, police said.

Police said the group of men all live in the same 227 Carrizo Canyon Road house where they had been out in the yard drinking alcohol for hours with friends Thursday. Around 9 p.m. a fight broke out between Augustin, Shone, and Chris after a comment was made about a female, police were told.

prisons. It could result in an overall savings to the state of \$2.7 million, according to corrections spokesman Lee Thompson. No breakdown of that savings was available, he said.

Two hundred people lost their jobs or transferred out of Lincoln County when Johnson closed the state hospital. The county already

has one minimum security prison, Camp Sierra Blanca, two miles from Fort Stanton, and Howell says another one isn't needed in a tourist community.

"If there's a shortage of space, then put up some tents in Hobbs until they get the new prison built out there," Howell said. "The place that is getting the asset should take care of the liability."

Chino said he was on annual leave and unavailable to call the session. Peso said he was available, but was never asked.

"It would seem this provision (for three members of the council to be able to call a meeting) is there to cover situations if the president and vice president are not available," Peso said. "But without (requiring the procedure to be followed), anyone could call a meeting every week."

Councilor Bruce Kanseah said he and two other members called the session, because Chino wasn't available and Peso "already was moving in a different direction."

"I was in the office in the afternoon when this notice was put out and nobody asked and I did not refuse to call a meeting," Peso said. "According to the constitution, I should have been requested to call a special meeting, and as far as the allegation that I was going in a different direction, I don't know what the gentleman (is) talking about."

Council member Fred Chino said

he saw no reason to reconsider a legal decision of the council rendered at the previous meeting.

As for the petition, Fred Chino told Wendell Chino he didn't understand why it was being circulated. "You never resigned or left," he said.

Wendell Chino proposed that a motion declaring the session a legal meeting would cover the situation. It passed unanimously.

Geronimo warned council members that they must tread carefully to ensure that they uphold the tribal constitution. He became angry when the council, at the request of Kaydahzinna, voted to close the meeting to *The Ruidoso News*. He said the council members were violating the guarantee of freedom of the press in the tribal and U.S. constitutions.

Chino told *The News* reporter she would be invited back into the meeting when the time was appropriate. However, when the tribal offices closed about an hour later the meeting still was going on behind closed doors.

Ruidoso computer buffs seek out local Internet access line

You've probably heard the terminology — Internet, cyberspace, world-wide web, online services and the computer superhighway.

If dedicated Ruidoso computer users have their way, there will be a lot more local users caught up in the Internet web.

Thirteen people met Tuesday evening in Ruidoso to brainstorm ways to get local access to the Internet. Those attending included a real estate agent, a clinical psychologist, a surgeon, a high school teacher, a computer store owner, a representative from the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, a retired aerospace engineer and others.

"What we need to do is raise the funds to get Ruidoso a server of its own," said Ray Kappler, who operates a local computer bulletin board. "That would allow free public access to the Internet, 24 hours a day."

Because the movement to bring the Internet to the area is just beginning, its potential cost has not yet been determined.

Hardware and line access could cost approximately \$82,000, Kappler said. With that, up to 250 people with modems could have local access to the Internet at one time, at no extra cost. Currently, local residents have to pay about \$5/hour.

The Electronic Village

"I would like to see Ruidoso go on line like Blacksburg, Va. has," Ruidoso High School computer teacher Joe Avalos said at the meeting. "There's more and more cities getting the Internet connection."

Blacksburg, with a population of about 12,000, is what is known as an "Electronic Village."

The electronic village concept is sweeping the nation as more and more communities realize the potential, Avalos said.

Blacksburg has made it easy for visitors, tourists or potential new residents to learn about the village.

Log onto the Internet, type in Blacksburg and you will get a menu page for village information. Information ranges from the history of the area, to local government, to health care and museums. Simply click on the item you are interested in and bingo, you have information, sometimes with full color pictures.

"We are really hoping that the entire village gets excited about the Internet," Ruidoso Computer Store owner Joe Timmons said. "It could bring a lot of new dollars into the market."

Representing the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce at the meeting was accounting officer manager

Ginger Heath.

"The possibilities are phenomenal for what this small town could do with the Internet," she said. "I think the lodgers and other merchants are willing to listen to ideas like this and besides, it's not a matter of if this is going to happen, but when."

ENMU hosts Internet class

Eastern New Mexico University at Ruidoso is offering an all-day workshop, "Internet and Other Byways," from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, July 15.

"This class will give a working knowledge of important tools, including telecommunications software and hardware; accessing bulletin boards and on-line services; exchanging e-mail; and navigating the Internet," the class synopsis states.

The fee for the class is \$63 per person. On Wednesday, eight spaces in the class were still available.

Local Realtor Harvey Foster is excited about the possibility of Ruidoso as an electronic village.

"Letting people know about what our community has to offer is important," Foster said. "To be able to market the Ruidoso area over the Internet would give exposure and information to hundreds of millions

of people."

People on the Internet are normally upscale people who would be good prospects for skiing, gambling and shopping, he said.

"People who are home-based entrepreneurs and want a really nice lifestyle could conduct their business via the Internet," Foster added.

Large trees begin with small seeds, and the people who want to establish local access to the Internet are determined to water the idea until it grows.

The next Internet meeting will be at 7 p.m. on Friday at the computer lab at ENMU-Ruidoso, 1400 Sudderth Drive. Call Joe Timmons at 257-4466 for more information.

Internet has myriad practical uses

The Internet is not a computer service. It's a freewheeling collection of about five million computers around the world. If you want access to the Internet, all you have to do is get connected to one of those five million or so computers. Some of them are at corporations, schools, military installations and other organizations, and some belong to companies created with the sole purpose of selling access to the Internet. Those vendors that sell access to the Internet are called Internet Service Providers.

There are nationwide providers and local providers. Because there are phone charges for connecting to the provider, it costs less if you can find a local provider. Local access is where Ruidoso people who want to get onto the Internet run into problems.

"People in the area have been unable to connect with either the Internet or the service providers without paying expensive long distance charges," Zia Bulletin Board operator Ray Kappler said. "There is no local access to either the on-line services or the Internet, except in a limited way at the schools."

There are myriad practical applications when you connect to the Internet. You can shop, conduct business, send electronic mail (e-mail), access information at libraries throughout the world including the Library of Congress, contact federal and most local government offices, check out a vacation spot, play games, and on and on.

All you need is a computer with a modem (a device to transfer data through the telephone lines) and you'll find yourself in cyberspace (a term used to describe where Internet activity takes place).

Missing woman in Missouri jail

Police have located the missing Ruidoso woman whose local rental car was due back 20 days ago.

Pam Waters, 24, who was reported missing Tuesday by her mother, is in a St. Louis, Mo. jail. Police said she was arrested June 21 and is being held on a \$100,000 bond for alleged possession of a controlled substance with intent to sell.

The rental car she failed to

return June 13 was found by Lincoln County drug task force investigator Angelo Vega in El Paso Friday as it was being driven by a man identified as a green-card-carrying Mexican national, 25-year-old Arturo Saldana.

Saldana told police where they could find Waters.

Saldana was arrested with the help of El Paso police and federal

authorities on charges of conspiring to possess a controlled substance with intent to distribute, and is being held on a \$50,000 bond. He will be extradited later this week, Vega said.

Vega, who is a deputy with the sheriff's office, also said he is seeking the identity of another suspect, believed to live in Ruidoso, who may be involved in the drug transportation.

Now I Know wins Zia Futurity Sunday

The Lonnie Barber-trained Now I Know, sent off at odds of nearly 8-1, rallied late to score a 3/4-length victory over fellow longshot Dashing Departure in the \$118,764 Zia Futurity for New Mexico-bred 2-year-olds, Sunday at Ruidoso Downs.

The colt by Magnificence broke well from the gate in the 350-yard dash, but trailed early leader Dashing Departure in the early stages of the race. Midway down the straightaway, Now I Know pulled even with the leader under strong urging by jockey Duane Sterling. With less than 100 yards to the wire, the colt pulled away from Dashing Departure to secure the victory and stop the timer in :17.85 over a wet track.

"He got away a little tardy and I was afraid he was going to have trouble," remarked Now I Know's trainer Lonnie Barber, Jr. "He got pinched once or twice out of the gate, but he's big enough that it didn't bother him."

Sterling, who has guided Now I Know to three straight victories, was not too concerned when his mount trailed early on in the Futurity.

"The five horse (Dashing Departure) had us beat by a length and a

half out of the gate and we were halfway down the track before he started to run. When I got after him, he really came on strong."

The Zia Futurity was the third victory in four lifetime starts for Now I Know, and the \$49,018 winner's share boosted the gelding's earnings over the \$60,000 mark. Gerald Harper and James Isler bred Now I Know at their Grady farm.

"Before the race I thought we might have the best horse, but you've always got to have a little luck," Isler said. "His mare, Sip O Gold, has bred nothing but runners."

Immediately following the Zia, Harper, Isler and their trainer rushed to the in-house television screens to watch Now I Know's older half sister run in the Tall Cotton Handicap at Santa Fe. If I Knew finished out of the money in that 400-yard dash.

Dashing Departure nosed out fastest qualifier Moforce for the place position and earned \$22,408 for owner Frank Rivera of Los Lunas, trainer Mike Barber and jockey Victor Escobar. Moforce is trained by Mark Harper and was ridden by Bobby Don Harmon. Moforce is owned by Stephan Gray

Hibbard and Ray Starbuck. Third place was worth \$11,484.

Heavily favored and previously undefeated Run For Randi finished sixth.

NOTES: The Twin Trifecta Carryover now stands at \$36,245 for Thursday's program.

Harris said he really enjoyed coming back to his "old haunts," and commented on how great the town looked.





Casey Lambert piloted Set Records to a victory over Parentheses in the \$80,850 Ruidoso Budweiser Breeders' Cup Saturday.

Set Records takes Budweiser Breeders' Cup Saturday at track

Set Records returned to the championship form that earned him 1993 Horse-of-the-Year honors with his front-running victory in Saturday's \$80,850 Ruidoso Budweiser Breeders' Cup at Ruidoso Downs.

After breaking from the outside post in the field of 12 older handicappers, Set Records was pushed to the lead by jockey Casey Lambert. After dismissing a challenge from Parentheses, Set Records drew away from the field to finish 3 3/4 lengths in front of Mr. Listo. Lt. Roberts was a half length back in third, while the favored Misting Rain picked up the fourth-place check.

The Ruidoso Budweiser Breeders' Cup, was worth \$48,510 to Set Records, who was the Horse-of-the-Year after his undefeated 2-year-old season when he won five straight races for owners Margaret Bloss and Margaret Dupont.

"The partners bred and reared the 4-year-old at their El Paso, Texas farm.

"I'd have to say we're pleasantly surprised," said Bloss after the mild upset. "We almost weren't going to come up for the race because we had a lot of things to take care of at the farm this morning. I'd just have to say that this was just a super job of training."

Set Records covered the mile in 1:38 4/5, one second off the track record set by Last Don B. with his victory in the 1992 edition of the Budweiser race. Saturday's victory was his 10th lifetime win in 20 starts.

The second choice in the field of 11, Set Records returned \$10.80, \$5.40 and \$4.80. The Budweiser was his second win from two starts this year for trainer Doyal Roberts. Last year the Kentucky-bred displayed his connections with only two wins from nine starts.

"He had some problems last year as a 3-year-old," Roberts said. "We discovered that he had a breathing problem because of a soft palette. We took him home to the farm and had about six or eight inches of muscles in his neck removed."

Roberts added, "He came back to win at Albuquerque after that, and then in the Albuquerque Derby he developed a hairline fracture in his left knee. He was off from September to January, but I think he's come back real well."

Ruidoso Arts & Film Board plans survey

The Ruidoso Arts and Film Board focused Thursday on understanding the community's perception of arts and film.

The board was formed by Mayor Jerry Shaw in August to promote, sustain and expand cultural life in the community.

The committee wants the village to hire consultant David Eisler to do an arts and film needs assessment study for the area. Eisler is dean of the College of Fine Arts at Eastern New Mexico University in Portales. Half of Eisler's \$2,000 fee would be covered with funds from the village. The other half should

be covered by a foundation grant still being written, board chairman Jay Wright said. Wright is director of the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs.

The village council will respond to the request at its Tuesday meeting.

Eisler presented his ideas for the assessment survey to the Arts and Film Board Thursday.

"What we want to accomplish is the marketing of the arts," Eisler said. "To attract people to the arts, we have to satisfy their needs, and to satisfy their needs, we have to know what their needs are and that's why we're doing the needs assessment."

Determining the strengths and weaknesses of the arts in the Ruidoso area is the main focus of the survey, Eisler said.

"I hope that when we are done, we will have a registry of the arts organizations and artisans in the area," he said. "Ultimately, we want to know what is desired from the community and then target those desires."

Eisler presented a draft of 10 survey questions to the board. Draft questions included:

- What are the arts in our community?
- What art events have you attended in the past year?

- Are you personally involved in the arts?

- Who are the people involved in the arts?

- How are the arts supported?

- Are there significant developments in the arts?

- What are community art needs?

- How would you characterize the arts in the community?

Eisler told the board he hopes to compile the results of the survey by September.

The next meeting of the Arts and Film Board will be at 4:30 p.m. Thursday, July 21 in the Ruidoso Village Hall. The meeting is open to the public.

Local organizations awarded with arts grants

Lincoln County arts have received a financial boost from the New Mexico Arts Division.

The Arts Division provides financial support to folk artists, artists in education, culturally diverse arts, local arts councils and literary and media arts projects.

The Lincoln County Cowboy

Symposium received \$5,000 from the Arts Division.

Every October, hundreds of people converge on Glencoe for the Cowboy Symposium. The event brings artists, cowboy poets, chuck-wagon cooks and musicians from all over the United States to celebrate the art and culture of the west.

Ruidoso Municipal Schools

received a grant for \$5,000 to produce and perform plays, develop supplementary materials for teachers and conduct an inservice workshop.

The plays, "Choosing Sides for Basketball" and "The Rainbow Box," were produced and directed by Doug and Terry Webb. They

have been presented to school children in Ruidoso, Hondo, Capitan, Carrizozo and Corona.

The Museum of the Horse was awarded \$3,500 to host a touring opera. However, the opera company cancelled its tour so the museum received permission to use the money for several other upcoming events.



Teen charged with stabbing dad

A 17-year-old boy was arrested Thursday for allegedly stabbing his stepfather twice with a pocket knife six weeks ago.

Police said Chad Allen Drew was arrested for aggravated battery after his parents decided to pursue charges Wednesday.

He is being held at the juvenile detention facility in Alamogordo.

Drew's parents, Wanda Rodkey

and stepfather William Rodkey, told police Drew stabbed Rodkey once in the shoulder and once in the back with a pocket knife May 1. At the time, they chose not to file charges with hopes he would get a grip on his violent temper, police said.

However, Drew allegedly threatened his boss at Arby's Restaurant with a baseball bat ear-

lier in the week, and although charges were not filed, his parents contacted juvenile probation officers and counselors.

On Thursday, police said Drew's mother reported he was trashing his Butler Street cabin and waving a knife. Police found him unarmed at the cabin, and arrested him on the aggravated battery charge.

No charges for driver pointing gun

Police have decided not to file charges against a Junction Road man for allegedly pointing a gun at a Las Cruces couple who followed him to his house June 18.

The couple told Ruidoso police they were traveling down Paradise Canyon Road when a red car pulled up right behind them. For some distance, the car traveled closer than the length of a car, they said, before

passing and speeding away.

Soon after, they turned down Junction Road and saw the same car being parked.

The couple decided to stop in front of the suspect's house and confront him about his driving.

Police said they contacted the man, who admitted to reckless driving and yelling at the couple. He also said he had a stun gun, but

never pointed it at them.

Police declined to arrest the 22-year-old man because the couple followed him home and were on his property. But they told the couple they could pursue the reckless driving charges if they came and filed a report. The couple, who live in Las Cruces, have not pursued the charge, police said.

Call commissioner for entertaining ride to Santa Fe meeting

Some Lincoln County commissioners are fuming after learning that the state corrections chief wants to use Fort Stanton as a temporary minimum security prison, until a new prison is constructed at Hobbs.

They have a right to be upset. A request for proposals for private entities interested in renting Fort Stanton is ready for printing, and it's supposed to be distributed by July 1. It's a little late to be dropping that plan for several years in favor of a temporary solution for the fort's future use.

The corrections chief has been in office since Feb. 2, and he has been in the prison business much longer. When a new use for the fort was first being explored early this year, the corrections department said it didn't want to use the fort.

At that time, some county commissioners were supporting a juvenile corrections facility, which would result in many more jobs than an adult facility and likely employ more existing fort employees who wanted to stay in this area.

As Commissioner Wilton Howell puts it, if the state supported the juvenile facility, they might not have such overcrowded adult facilities. Howell suggests the state put up tents in Hobbs so residents there can get used to having prisoners nearby.

Howell isn't so sure residents in this county want another prison with "low-risk" inmates. To be sure, many people here still have a sour taste in their mouth about that "low-risk" terminology, since one inmate walked away from nearby Camp Sierra Blanca last August and proceeded to kill a Lincoln resident.

The state and county has a gentlemen's agreement to pursue a private entity, Howell notes. He has some harsh words for the integrity of Governor Johnson.

Howell is so steamed, in fact, that he's urging local residents to call him for a ride to a meeting in Santa Fe at 2 p.m. Tuesday with state officials. He says state officials were not thrilled that the corrections proposal got out to the public; if so, they'll really be thrilled if lots of county residents show up at Tuesday's meeting. So give Howell a call at 257-9802.



Tax revolt, anyone?

TO THE EDITOR:

Tax revolt, anyone? In 1993, both houses of our state Legislature passed property tax reform legislation: Senate Bill 10 and House Bill 25.

However, then-Governor Bruce King, in obedience to certain vested-interest political support groups, vetoed both measures.

The need for property tax reform and relief has not diminished or disappeared since Bruce King's Dastardly Deed. If anything, immediate property tax reform and relief has become more urgent and indispensable.

Consider Dona Ana County, where this year more than 22% of the newly issued property assessments have been officially protested and appealed. Why?

The "fox in the chicken coop" is our state-mandated "primary method" for assessing privately owned

real property for tax purposes: the "market value" approach.

It is an irrefutable and proven fact that, of all real property assessment methods ever devised, the "market value" approach is the most oppressive and least equitable for homeowners. Why?

"Market value," per se, has no basis on either fact or on equity. The alleged "property values," as derived by "market analysis," are no more than an assessor's self-serving assumptions and speculations involving hypothetical future sales of privately held properties (whose present owners may not even want, or intend to sell) to non-existent "phantom" buyers, at grossly exaggerated and unrealistically inflated prices.

However, the effect of every bi-annual reassessment of real property is both immediate and painful! Why? Because thereafter, and ad infinitum, all properties will be taxed on the basis that they had actually been bought or sold at these theoretical prices.

Fellow New Mexicans, how long are we going to tolerate this oppressive, inequitable, and eventually confiscatory state-mandated system for property tax assessments?

As with all things "politic," change occurs primarily as a result of massive citizen involvement. Therefore, phone, write, fax, E-mail, button-hole, publicize, editorialize, call or appear on local radio and television talk shows, and let your elected state representatives know that you favor and demand that the identical 1993 SB10 and HB25 bills be reintroduced and reapproved by this year's Legislature. Then similarly bombard Governor Johnson's office to immediately sign these measures into law.

In contacting Governor Johnson, remind him that he campaigned and won election on a platform that promised to reduce and/or eliminate taxes, especially those on "necessity items," of which housing is most definitely one such.

Or, tax revolt, anyone?



The Language of Life with Bill Moyers will be broadcast Fridays at 9:00 p.m. beginning June 23rd. The series repeats Sundays at 3:00 p.m. beginning June 25th. The first and last programs in the series are two-hours long.

Feline leukemia, cancer of the white blood cells, is a viral disease and infectious.

Sandra Ford, assistant director of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter, warned cat owners that the virus can be transmitted by direct contact. A mother cat also can transmit it to her young.

The virus, like most feline and canine specific viruses, has not been known to be transmitted to humans.

"Keeping your cat indoors, away from other strange cats roaming the neighborhood is one way to avoid exposing your cat to the virus," Ford said. "You can take your cat to a veterinarian to find out if it is carrying the virus. If the tests are positive, the prognosis isn't good.

"The condition is not treatable, but a vaccine is available that will prevent the deadly virus from taking the life of your cat.

"One out of four cats who are exposed may develop their own immunity and lead a healthy normal life. But they always will remain a carrier, able to infect any other cats they encounter."

For the three out of four who don't develop the immunity,

they most likely will die within about six months, she said.

"The most susceptible to the virus are young kittens," Ford said. "If you find yourself with a new young kitten this season, consider testing the animal and, if it is not carrying the disease, vaccinate it at the age recommended by the veterinarian.

Keeping pets cool

Because pets don't often complain when they're hot, sometimes owners forget they may be uncomfortable.

Dogs are very susceptible to hyperthermia (heat stroke), which can be deadly and occurs on hot days. Cats can tolerate higher temperatures than dogs, but also can become overheated.

Unlike people, who sweat to cool their bodies, animals rely on panting. Short-nosed breeds such as bulldogs and Pekingese are less efficient panters, because they have a smaller surface area for evaporation.

To protect your pet from the heat:

- be sure fresh water is available and;
- give dogs a short summer cut;
- be sure a shady spot is available outside;
- cut back on exercise and food.
