Fireworks display set for theater site

Lincoln County residents are invited to view a fireworks display at sunset on Tuesday, July 4 from the grounds of the Performing Arts Theater for the Planned Spencer.

The event is scheduled to celebrate the holiday and the imminent groundbreaking for the performing arts theater. It is being funded by philanthropist Jackie Spencer and her husband, Dr. A.N. Spencer.

It is the only public fireworks display in Lincoln County for the holiday.

The grounds are on the Sierra Blanca Airport Highway and will be clearly marked.

Some campfires restrictions lifted

In time for the July 4th holiday weekend, restrictions have been lowered to allow open fires in grills and government-constructed fire pits in local developed campgrounds and picnic sites.

The state forestry service and the U.S. Forest Service announced that the less restrictive rules will take effect Friday and continue until conditions change.

Fireworks are illegal in the forest and in Ruidoso.

State police plan holiday roadblocks

Drivers beware: state police officers will be out in record numbers on the highways in Lincoln County over the July 4th holiday weekend.

They will be setting up roadblocks to see if seat belts and child safety restraint seats are being used.

Although the roadblocks are not sobriety checks — which by state law require prior notification of time and place — officers could act if a driver appears impaired.

New crime laws take effect

Stiffer penalties for graffiti will take effect July 1, and Ruidoso Police Chief Lanny Maddox told the village council Tuesday his department is ready to enforce them.

The crime of graffiti will be elevated from a misdemeanor to a fourth-degree felony when at least \$1,000 worth of damage is inflicted.

"A can of spray paint can (easily) do \$1,000 worth of damage," Maddox said.

The chief's line, "If you do the crime, be prepared to do the time," was modified somewhat by village attorney John Underwood: "If you use the spray, be prepared to pay."

A fourth-degree felony is punishable by 18 months in prison and/or a \$5,000 fine.

A conviction under the modified law will also require the criminal to perform 160 hours of community service within eight months of sentencing. The criminal must also make restitution to the property owner for damages, as a condition of probation or parole.

Grffiti artists and taggers have been prolific in Ruidoso in recent months. Tuesday night alone, 13 more areas were smeared with

graffiti in the Midtown area, police report.

Another crime-related law that goes into effect July 1 requires convicted sexual offenders to register with the sheriff's office in the county where they reside.

Registration must occur within 30 days after the convict is released from custody, or when placed on probation or parole. The law also applies to convicts relocating from other states.

The legislation enacting the new law says sex offenders have a significant risk of repeating their crime. It also contends law enforcement agencies' efforts to protect their communities from sex offenders have been impaired because of a lack of available information about convicted sexual offenders living within certain areas.

A central registry for sex offenders will be compiled, according to the new law.

Additional laws going into effect July 1 include:

- assault against a household member, battery against a household member, and aggravated assault or aggravated battery against a household member. Previously there were no domestic

violence charges in the state's criminal codes, only charges of assault or battery.

The new assault and battery charges against household members are petty misdemeanors, punishable by up to six months in jail or a \$500 fine. The aggravated assault charge is a fourth-degree felony, and the aggravated battery charge is a third-degree felony punishable by up to three years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

The law describes a "household member" as a spouse, former spouse, or family member; they don't have to live in the same place. — stalking, defined as knowingly pursuing a pattern of conduct that poses a credible threat to another person.

This new misdemeanor law further defines stalking as following a person, placing a person under surveillance and harassing a person. The stalker can be punished by up to a year in jail and a \$1,000 fine. Third and fourth convictions will elevate the stalker's behavior to a fourth-degree felony.

Tornado rips off roof of store

Marky Sturges was working in the second floor office of Sturges Market in Carrizozo Sunday when she heard a loud roar and saw the roof being lifted from the walls.

Plaster and tin were flying through the air while Sturges made her way downstairs and outside in time to see what looked like a tornado funnel cloud weaving its way toward Capitan.

"We watched it and it looked like a tornado to us," Sturges said. The tin from the roof hit and

dented vehicles in the area, she added.

Before striking the market along U.S. Highway 54 about 5:12 p.m., the funnel peeled off part of the roof of Joe Hooten's Ranchers True Value Hardware Store on 12th Street.

Hooten said he was at his home outside of town when he received the call about his store.

"A man down the street said it definitely was a funnel," Hooten related. His store suffered roof and

water damage. No repair estimates were available Wednesday.

On its way out of town, the funnel hurled tree limbs into the air on 10th Street. They landed on some parked vehicles, according to a report from the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office.

The funnel also broke the welds on the communication antenna on top of the sheriff's office roof, and blew the structure over. It tore down a sign at the Chevron station on U.S. 54 North.

Nuclear storage site attracts 23 utilities

Twenty-three power companies, representing 75% of the nation's 110 commercial nuclear power plants, have signed up to bring their spent nuclear fuel rods to a temporary storage site on the Mescalero Apache reservation.

Sixteen of 33 plants by the Nuclear Information and Resource Service as paying a fee to investigate the storage site did not sign on by the May 19 extended deadline. However, six new companies appear on a list released by the tribe Monday afternoon.

Reasons cited for not joining the project centered mostly on financial feasibility. Some power companies' spokespeople said they had less expensive storage options.

A few said they are still evaluating whether to join the coalition, which plans to build the nation's largest central storage site for spent nuclear fuel rods.

"We have assembled a strong group of some of the country's top nuclear utilities," said Jim Howard, Northern States Power Company chairman, president and chief executive officer, in a news release. "We and the Mescalero Apache Tribe already are at work making this project a reality."

Northern States in Minneapolis, Minn., has been the lead utility in the coalition.

Work on the project is underway in several areas, including environmental assessment, facility technical design and the writing of detailed contracts that will govern the construction and operation of the site, Howard said.

Northern States officials said financial details of the agreements will not be released to the public.

A permit application isn't expected to be submitted to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission

until December 1996, according to Scott Northard, lead manager on the project for Northern States. Construction won't start on the site at the western edge of the reservation in Otero County until 1999, he said.

The first spent nuclear fuel rods are planned to be received at the Mescalero plant in 2002.

To ensure the financial feasibility of the temporary storage operation, enough power plants had to sign on to guarantee at least 20,000 metric tons of spent nuclear fuel would be committed to the Mescalero site, Northard said. The license application will be for 40,000 metric tons and storage for up to 40 years.

"We are very pleased with the number of utilities that will be joining us," said Mescalero President Wendell Chino in a news release. "It is estimated that the project will generate \$2.3 billion in revenue over 40 years, making it the largest rural economic development program in New Mexico."

Such development is needed on the reservation, because one in three tribal members is currently unemployed, Chino said. Tribal officials expect the project to create hundreds of skilled, well-paying jobs during both the construction and operational phases of the facility. They also hope the project will lead to development of other tribal business opportunities.

"New Mexico is a poor state and sadly, Indian people are among its most disadvantaged citizens," said Silas Cochise, spent fuel storage manager for the Mescalero, in a news release. "The spent fuel storage facility will help the economy of our tribe and this entire region."

Tribal members rejected the storage site in a Jan. 31 election. But after a petition campaign

Companies back out for economic reasons

Detroit Edison and Duke Power Co., two of the 16 utilities that dropped out of the Mescalero Apache nuclear waste storage project, cited economic reasons.

"We are not an equity partner, because we have other less expensive options open to us," said Lewis Layton, nuclear information officer for the Detroit utility that operates one nuclear power plant serving five million people in southeast Michigan.

"We are re-racking our spent fuel pool, which should provide storage through the year 2018," Layton said. "Our plant is fairly new, opened in 1988. Many of the other utilities have been stockpiling spent fuel for 20 years and have a lot more."

"We strongly support the creation of the Mescalero facility, because it preserves a different option."

Joe Maher of the Duke Power Co. in Charlotte, N.C., said his company also has other more cost effective options.

"We have the capability of on-site storage at each (of the company's seven) nuclear plants," he said. "That appears adequate until the federal (permanent) repository is ready."

It's not unusual for the company to not contribute financially to initial investigations of other options, Maher said.

Boston Edison spokesperson Peggy Markson said her company still is evaluating the options.

Scott Northard, Northern States nuclear storage project manager, said the dissension over the Mescalero reservation over the storage project, and the fact that a second vote overturned the first, haven't spooked the utilities.

Companies contacted Wednesday agreed. "They're used to controversy in this business," Northard said.

While 16 of the companies originally listed as interested in the project dropped out, six new ones signed up.

State must compete for fort as prison

The state Department of Corrections will compete with other groups interested in leasing Fort Stanton, Lincoln County Commissioner Wilton Howell said Thursday.

Corrections Secretary Karl A. Sannicks submitted a proposal to Gov. Gary Johnson to turn the historic fort into a minimum security prison. A decision was due last week, but when county commissioners strongly objected to the idea, state officials decided to take a different approach.

Yesterday, state officials decided Sannicks will have to submit a lease proposal like any other bidder.

When the fort eight miles east of Capitan was set to close in March and commissioners were scrambling to find a new tenant, corrections department officials said they were not interested in the fort. At that point, Johnson said he was more interested in a private company taking over.

Commissioners and the General Services Department (GSD) spent several months and thousands of

dollars drafting a request for proposals (RFP). The RFP is to be sent to companies that express an interest in leasing the former hospital. It outlines what the state wants in an agreement.

Sannicks' proposal put the RFP on hold until Johnson and his cabinet decided whether to chuck the past work and go with the prison idea.

The county commission has focused on replacing as many as possible of the 200 local jobs lost when the historic fort was closed by Johnson.

The prison would fall far short of that goal, with only 53 jobs. The county already is home to Camp Sierra Blanca minimum security prison, two miles away from the fort, commissioners have pointed out.

Howell, along with county lobbyist H. John Underwood and State Sen. Pete Campos, met Tuesday in Santa Fe with officials from corrections and GSD.

Interviewed Wednesday, Howell said tempers flared during the two-hour session.

He said he emphasized the county commission's disappointment at being left out of discussions about the proposed temporary minimum security prison. When Johnson first proposed closing the fort, the county commission pushed for a juvenile diagnostic and treatment center, which is more labor intensive and attacks the problem of crime at a stage when rehabilitation is more likely, commissioners contend.

While Sannicks has been referring to the prison as temporary, during the Tuesday meeting he said it would operate as long as necessary, Howell said.

"That really made me nervous," he said.

Howell said he picked up a state employee magazine that featured photographs and a story on Fort Stanton.

In the magazine, Johnson is quoted as saying, "State government needs to have the people affected in the end involved in the process," Howell said. "I said they haven't been following the governor's own philosophy."

Corrections representatives said

they were not interested in creating a prison in a community where they were not wanted, Howell said.

He assured them they were not wanted in Lincoln County. But he proposed conducting a series of meetings in the county to allow residents to speak for themselves.

Howell said he found out Wednesday that cabinet officials decided Wednesday morning to move ahead with the RFP process.

"Beffort told (county manager) Carol Cooney that they would go forward with the RFP and there would be no public hearings," Howell said. "Corrections will be allowed to participate in the RFP process. If they follow the format we agreed upon, I can't see that their offer would be accepted. The RFP was designed for private enterprise, to best meet the needs of the state and to create the best economic impact and long-lasting solution for the county."

The GSD will advertise the RFP nationally, said Carol Fittipaldi of the GSD. "We will evaluate the lease proposals based on the best possible use of the fort," she said today. "We're giving everybody an opportunity."

called for reconsideration, the plan was approved 593-372 in a second vote on March 9.

During an interview in Ruidoso last week, Northard said pending Congressional legislation to construct temporary government storage sites in Washington and South Carolina doesn't put a damper on the Mescalero plan.

"We totally support that effort, as do the Mescalero," he said. The tribe has offered its land to fill an

existing vacuum that has been created because power plants are running out of on-site storage space and the Department of Energy isn't ready to accept responsibility for the fuel, he said.

Even if the government moves ahead with the two above temporary sites — or a possible third near the proposed permanent repository at Yucca Mountain, Nev. — the Mescalero storage plant could be used for five years or more as an interim measure, Northard said.

"We just got lucky," he said. "We're awaiting lab results before we release any names or press charges."



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Skateboard hearing July 11

The fate of skateboarding and in-line skating on downtown Ruidoso sidewalks may be determined at a July 11 public hearing.

Ruidoso village councilors voted 6-1 Tuesday to schedule a public hearing for 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 11 despite some concerns that the draft of the ordinance is not specific enough.

The ban affects sidewalks within a two-by-three block mainstreet area, as attorney John Underwood was directed to draft following a June 13 council motion. The prohibition also includes in-line skates and bicycles on the same downtown sidewalks.

"I think it's harsh," said Councilor Leon Eggleston, again the lone dissenter in a skateboard vote. "I don't think it should be published (as is) for a public hearing."

But the majority vote approved a hearing on the ordinance as drafted, without making any motions for changes.

Eggleston requested discussion on the draft ordinance, rather than wait for a public hearing. He said councilors should have input on village ordinances drafted by the attorney before a public hearing is scheduled, to more closely reflect council ideas. Councilor Robert Donaldson agreed, but neither one of the councilors made a motion for discussion.

"In the past, the council did get to draft ordinances before they were scheduled for public hearings," Eggleston complained.

Donaldson said he felt the in-line skate ban was extreme. He said a problem exists with skateboarders, but "Why ban something there is not a problem with?"

The ban area in the draft is bound by and includes El Paso Street to the north, Wingfield Street to the south (which would include two blocks each of the north/south streets Center Avenue and Eagle Drive, and the east/west streets of Texas Street and Butler Avenue), Fern Street on the west and Country Club Drive to the east.

Besides Sudderth Drive, Central Avenue is the only street bound by the described area that has a sidewalk.

Village Planning and Zoning Chairman Mike Radziewicz reminded the councilors that some street names have changed, El Paso Street is now Rio Street and Fern Street is now Grindstone Canyon Drive.

Councilor Potter said he is satisfied with the draft, noting he has received numerous calls from constituents supporting the ban.

Councilor Joe Gomez has also received a slew of calls, but for different reasons. He said a number of people have questioned the rationale of the council's proposal to build a \$20,000 skateboard park at North Park, behind fire station #2 on White Mountain Drive.

"We're going to go spend taxpayers' money for a place that may be abandoned" if skating is a fad, Gomez said he was asked. "The whole thought is, where is this going to stop?"

Gomez said callers suggested the skateboard park money could be better used for roadwork or other projects benefiting taxpayers.

Gomez said he personally has trouble with a construction remedy for the skateboard craze. "Then, there will be another toy, and we'll go build another park," he predicted.

The village can't go wrong pouring some asphalt for a new park, Donaldson interjected, because the site could easily be used for another sport. Councilor J.D. James said the area will be very much like a

park with landscaping and benches. Donaldson said if the park is not pursued by the council, he cannot support the ordinance.

"I have trouble with taking rights away from a group and not giving back something in its place," he said.

Mayor Jerry Shaw said she, too, has received countless calls regarding the skateboard park.

"The calls came about after we set the site for the skateboard park," she said, indicating there was a bit of not-in-my-backyard, or NIMBY in the works.

"Where does it stop?" Eggleston asked. The kids don't seem to be wanted anywhere, he said. "I feel they (skateboarders and skaters) have the right to use the sidewalks as anyone else."

Santa Fe councilors just adopted a similar skating ban for that community's plaza area June 14, Village of Ruidoso Attorney John Underwood said. Their ban includes the foot bag game of Hackey Sack.

"We should have added joggers (to the motion) — they're dangerous too," Mayor Shaw said facetiously.

Shaw said she learned skateboarding on downtown sidewalks is a problem affecting every town in the state, when she attended a Municipal League conference in Santa Fe last weekend.

Also at Tuesday's meeting, councilors:

— approved a new ordinance prohibiting new connections or extensions of water or sewer services outside Ruidoso's incorporated city limits.

The annexation ad hoc committee voted March 28 to recommend the ban after concluding the current doubled fee for homeowners outside of town doesn't cover costs incurred by the village.

— approved contracts with a financial advisor and a bond counselor for their assistance with a \$6.5 million bond issue election Aug. 22.

— give water department director Richard Sanchez, one of the village's 158 employees, with a plaque honoring him as "Employee of the Month."

Ruidoso woman 103 years young

Velma Stanley Holloway Johnson insists that she will be 103 on Saturday, July 1.

"I ought to know how old I am," Johnson said.

But her daughter, Caroline Leasure, says her mother will be 102.

"I suppose that after you hit 100, it really isn't that important," Leasure adds.

When Velma was one year old, in 1893, Thomas A. Edison gave his first public showing of his motion picture machine. When she was 10 years old, in 1903, Orville and Wilbur Wright made the first successful mechanically propelled airplane flight at Kitty Hawk, N.C. When she was 24 in 1917, the United States formally joined World War I.

Reminiscing about her long life, Velma says she still remembers when cars were called horseless carriages and looked liked boxes. She remembers the first airplanes buzzing overhead, at a time when people thought dirigibles would

revolutionize the world.

Velma was born in Itasca, Texas, the youngest of six children. The Stanley family moved to Midland, Texas in 1900, where Velma grew up and eventually married Carroll Holloway. He died in the 1918 flu epidemic in New Orleans.

Velma married Harold Johnson after moving to El Paso, Texas after World War I. She has three children, Carroll Holloway, Jim Johnson and Caroline Leasure.

Velma was a poll attendant for the 1920 presidential race when Warren G. Harding was elected. She drove a two-ton garbage truck at Fort Bliss, Texas while her sons were serving during World War II, and learned to swim after she was 40 years old.

Moving to the Ruidoso area, Velma and her husband lived on First Street in Ruidoso for decades. Even after her husband died and she turned 100, she was living in her own home. In 1972 she was selected as Worthy Matron of the

Ruidoso Order of the Eastern Star.

Velma now resides at the Ruidoso Care Center, but she still holds on to her indomitable spirit.

When physical therapist Adam Martin showed Velma how to use her new Merry Walker, she called it a "PVC contraction." The first time she used the walker alone, she shouted, "Look out world, here I come!"

Senior certified nursing assistants Bernardo Mancha Jr. and James Ray Walker have become special friends to Velma.

"It makes her spirit soar when it's time for their shift, and she is delighted in being able to introduce them to her family and friends," Velma's daughter said. "She still sweet talks the staff into extra servings of food or any leftovers any time she can."

To celebrate Velma's birthday, a barbecue is planned for 5 p.m. Saturday at the care center.

Velma said she plans to just keep going until she makes 110.

"Getting old is not for sissies," she said.

Ruidoso Middle School Principal Paula Papponi has received numerous awards during her career, and now she has been selected to represent New Mexico in Washington D.C.

Papponi has been chosen as the 1995 National Distinguished Principal representing the state. She will travel to the nation's capital in October to attend a special awards celebration.

Principals were judged on criteria including the ability to articulate and instill in others a strong sense of purpose, exceptional communication skills, ability to motivate others and effective management of resources.

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
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Roswell hosts first UFO Festival July 1-2

UFO discovery on Lincoln County ranch remains headache for Brazel

Having reporters and ufologists call his home "day and night" with redundant questions about what appeared in a pasture 48 years ago has been anything but fun to Bill Brazel.

"It's been a bad experience," Brazel snapped on the phone from his Capitan ranch. "Like a headache, but only worse."

The "Roswell Incident of 1947" occurred at the Foster Ranch near Corona where Bill Brazel's father, William Mac Brazel, was the foreman 48 years ago this July.

This weekend marks the first Roswell UFO Festival to commemorate the event. The "Roswell Incident" has gained notoriety among ufologists because the military originally issued a press release saying a UFO had crashed.

Alien bodies were allegedly found at the same time as the flying saucer, about 20 miles southeast of the Foster Ranch near the Pine Lodge settlement on the northeast side the Capitan Mountains. Both sites are here in Lincoln County.

The bodies and flying object pieces were supposedly transported to the Roswell Army Air Force Base in neighboring Otero County, and later dissected by military personnel.

"It's all speculation" about how the materials and bodies appeared at different spots, said Max Littell, of the International UFO Museum and Research Center in Roswell. The museum is co-sponsoring the UFO commemorative bash this weekend.

"The only thing we're positive about is, something happened that the military is covering up," Littell said.

William Mac Brazel went out riding that early July morning in 1947 to check his sheep when he found a considerable amount of un-

usual debris scattered across the pasture.

"I saw some bits and pieces of it of the object that crashed," Bill Brazel recalled this week. He was 23 at the time of the crash. His father showed him and several friends the strange material before contacting the Roswell sheriff who, in turn, called the Roswell Army

Air Field. Air Force officials retrieved the wreckage.

"There were no people on the object that crashed," Bill Brazel emphasized before saying he no longer wanted to talk. He also noted his father had been a "truthful and honest person."

The material Bill Brazel described years later to his son Jim was "like balsa wood — very light and very strong."

And beneath the fallen debris, through the cover of sage and scrub brush, a bit of a burn area was also found, Jim said.

UFO Festival material describes how Major Jesse Marcel, an intelligence officer at the airfield who was involved with the retrieval of the material, said the debris was very light, thinner than the tinfoil in a cigarette pack. He also allegedly said he tried to bend the material, but failed. Nor could he make a dent in it with a 16-pound hammer.

A Roswell nurse, who was a friend of Lincoln County resident Glenn Dennis, drew sketches for him of autopsies on "several small non-human bodies" she said she attended before leaving the country days later. Dennis is a former mortician who was allegedly called by airfield officials around the same time. Officials allegedly inquired about the availability of small, hermetically sealed caskets.

The so-called Roswell incident was suspected by some to be a military conspiracy after the morning of July 8, when military commander Colonel William Blanchard of the 509th Bomb Group issued a press release stating the wreckage of a "crashed disk" had been recovered.

A second press release was issued within hours from the office of General Roger Ramey, Commander of the Eighth Air Force at Fort Worth Army Air Field, that rescinded the first press release. The second message identified the wreckage as a "crashed disk" from a weather balloon. Historic accounts suggest witnesses of the crash and events surrounding it began to disappear.

Jim Brazel said his father never spoke of the incident until the 1980s. His grandfather never spoke of the crash remains either, possibly because the military asked him not to after searching the ranch with "a fine tooth comb."

Jim Brazel wasn't born until a decade after the incident. His grandfather died in 1963.

"Those who knew him knew he had the highest integrity. If the Air Force asked him not to say anything, then he wouldn't," Jim said.

Jim said the incident was not spoken of until the writer of "The Roswell Incident" called on his father in the early 1980s.

"He took a liking to him," Jim recalled, and granted the writer an extensive interview for his book. Thereafter, in bits and pieces, he

shared what he knew.

"A lot of different things have happened in my family over the years, but this one was definitely out in left field," Jim said of the revelations.

The family was rather satisfied with the novelist's story and research, and has since allowed others — even a Japanese film crew — to interview Brazel about the encounter.

But when a recent movie "Roswell" aired, which was based on the writer's book, the family became disenchanted with what the film writers had spun together. They said the depiction of Mac Brazel, played by Dwight Yoakum, was incorrect.

"We weren't real pleased with it," Brazel said. "My grandfather never cursed."

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Mescaleros Celebrate Apache-style

A four-day celebration with dances, a rodeo, a cross country run, a parade and rite of passage ceremonies should keep visitors to the Mescalero Apache reservation busy over the July 4th holiday.

The activities begin Saturday in Mescalero, about 20 miles west of Ruidoso on U.S. 70.

Participants in a cross country run can register at 7 a.m. in front of the tribal store on the south side of the highway in Mescalero. The starting gun will fire at 8 a.m.

Organizer Harry Wheeler said participation is free and the 6.2 mile race up and down Tularosa Canyon is open to everyone.

Runners will just have time to catch their breath before the start of the 16th Annual Mescalero Celebration Parade, starting at 11 a.m. with the theme of "New Horizons."

Participation is free. Each entry must be at the assembly point below the rodeo grounds on the north side of the highway by 10 a.m. Saturday.

Trophies will be presented to the winners during the evening events at the ceremonial grounds.

The deadline for parade entries is 4 p.m. today (June 29). Any entry received after that time will be placed at the end of the parade. Applications are available at the tribal

offices, or call Naomi Sainz during the day at 671-4494, ext. 216, or Jonelle Geronimo at 671-4441, ext. 114.

For each of the four days of celebration, Saturday through Tuesday, a free lunch and supper will be served at the ceremonial grounds, also on the north side of the highway. An entrance fee of \$5 per adult and \$2 for children 12 and under will be charged to enter the ceremonial grounds. The lunches will be ready starting at 12:30 p.m. and dinners will be served from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.

The ceremonial grounds also will be the site of the passage into puberty ritual of five Apache maidens. The ceremony begins at daybreak and continues all day (please see related story).

Man meets bull at 1:30 p.m. each day as the Mescalero rodeo begins at the rodeo grounds. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$2 for children 12 and under.

Competitions will include team roping, bare back riding, calf roping, barrel racing and bull riding, as well as other games and entertainment.

Traditional Mescalero dances will be staged throughout the afternoon each day, beginning about 1 p.m. on the ceremonial grounds. Colorful dances to be performed include the dance of the Apache maidens and the dance of the Mountain Gods.

Elder women reminisce about own rites

For Ceda Shanta, preparing her daughter's coming-of-age ceremony carries a special satisfaction.

Her family didn't plan a ceremony for her, and it's rewarding to have watched three of her other daughters and several goddaughters go through the ritual.

"It's something for them to remember. It's something sacred to me and something I enjoy doing," she said recently, as five young girls who will take part in the July ceremony gathered at the Mescalero Apache tribal headquarters for a photograph.

Ceda Shanta's daughter, Betty Hazel Shanta, 12, will be one of the five maidens who will perform the rite of passage into puberty July 1-4.

Jackie Lester, mother of 14-year-old Heather Rocha, said she remembers feeling relieved when she successfully completed the rite.

The ceremony is a time for family to draw together, she said.

"It's such a family thing. Everybody helped," Lester said. "My grandmother made my entire outfit."

She's nervous for her daughter, she said; "I already have butterflies in my stomach."

For Marilyn Blaylock, step-mother of Brandi Leigh Blaylock,

13, the ceremony was a personal spiritual experience. Now on the other side of the picture, she understands the immense amount of preparation, she said.

"It's taken about 1.5 years to get everything together," Blaylock said. The last day of the celebration will be doubly important to Brandi, because she was born on July 4th.

The actual counseling of the girls for the ceremony and the passage into womanhood is handled by the godmothers and by the medicine man/godfather, who talks to them about right and wrong, the mothers said.

To prepare for the four-day ceremony, plants, fruits and other items are gathered all year long. Teepees must be built for each of the five maidens. A feast is cooked throughout the four days of the ceremony, for friends and relatives who stop by to receive blessings from the girls. The rituals begin at daybreak each day and continue until evening. At several points during the ceremony, the maidens bestow blessings on visitors.

The maidens participating this year are:

— Betty Hazel Smith, 12, daughter of Joseph and Ceda Shanta. She will attend 7th grade this year at Mescalero Elementary.

She enjoys traveling to different

pow-wows to compete in the junior girls' fancy shawl dance competitions. She also swims and plays basketball.

Her grandparents are the late William and Betty Magoosh and Joe and Hazel Shanta. She is the great-great-great-granddaughter of Chief Scout Magoosh of the Lipans; the great-great-granddaughter of Naiche; and the great-great-great-granddaughter of Cochise, the famed Apache chief.

Her godparents are Wade Comanche and Zeldia Yazza.

— Heather Rocha, 14, daughter of Jackie Lester and Mike Rocha. She attends Tularosa High School. She enjoys basketball, volleyball and skiing.

Her paternal grandparents are Ricardo and Clarice Rocha and her great-grandmother is Edna Teenah Comanche.

Heather's maternal grandparents are Baldwin Lester and June Herrera. Her great-grandmother was the late Neva Guitier.

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

Children inspire Smokey Bear personas

It's the children that inspire Bill Duemling and Bill Tucker to keep donning the Smokey Bear costume.

"I like it when the little kids recognize Smokey and their eyes light up. They start running over and put their arms out and give you a big hug. That's the best part," Duemling said.

"He rates right up there with Santa Claus," Tucker said.

The story of Smokey Bear began at the tail end of World War II. There were concerns that attempts to shell the west coast would cause a fire in the forest or rangeland, so a program for fire prevention was started.

Bambi was actually the first fire prevention mascot, but the lease on Bambi ran out, so a new character, Smokey Bear, was created.

Smokey began as a cartoon. Then in 1950, a live bear cub was

found in the Capitan Mountains after the Capitan Gap fire. He was found clinging to a charred tree. The cub became the living symbol of Smokey.

Duemling and Tucker do not know when foresters first began donning the Smokey costume and educating the public about fire prevention, but both have been working as foresters for over a decade and they say it began way before their time.

When they're not in a Smokey costume, Duemling is a forester for the New Mexico State Forestry and Tucker is a forestry technician with the local Smokey Bear Ranger Station for the U.S. Forest Service.

Duemling and Tucker visit schools often, to educate children on fire prevention and forest conservation. Children often come up to Smokey and ask him questions.

Smokey does not talk in person, the men said, so he always has a

uniformed escort to speak for him.

"Ira Caster of Smokey Bear Ranger Station was an escort at a presentation and one little fella asked Ira how he could understand Smokey when he couldn't. Ira's comeback was, 'I was raised with the bears so I can understand them,'" Tucker said.

Only one Smokey is allowed at any particular event because children believe Smokey is a real bear and they don't want to ruin the mystique, Tucker and Duemling said.

"Invariably, in almost every program, there will be at least one or two little ones who just will not want to let go of the bear. They just want to hug him and love him. You can just feel the love they have for Smokey," Tucker said.

Of course, Smokey is an invaluable educational tool because he is recognizable throughout this country and many others. The latest re-

quest for literature on Smokey came from Ghana, Africa, local officials said.

No training is required before donning the Smokey pelt, but a special attitude is needed, Duemling said. Patience and a love of children are a must.

Tucker said the least favorite part of the Smokey job is the heat. Duemling is also bothered by the heat, but it's a challenge to see how long he can stay in the suit.

"It's not too bad. If you've ever been in a sauna, you know what it's like," Duemling said.

The state and federal philosophy about fighting forest fires has changed in recent years, but Smokey still fits in, Duemling said.

There are still "good" and "bad" fires — those that are natural, and those that are started carelessly by people. Smokey discourages the latter when he says his famous line: "Only you can prevent forest fires."

In the summer of 1925 we arrived here in the Vale, and mother said:

"I have traveled over half the world. I love it here and I am going to stay."

Memories of Mescalero

George Catlin in the mid-1800s lived for many years among the Plains Indians, painting pictures and taking notes so the appearance and customs of these people would be "Saved from Oblivion."

In later life, he wrote of these Indians, "I love a people who always made me welcome to the best that they had; who are honest without laws; who have no jail and no Poor House. Who never take the name of the Lord in vain, and who never fought a battle with the Whites except on their own homeland."

I often think of Catlin's words when I remember back to 1926 when we first met the Mescalero Apaches.

We started out from El Paso in a 1917 Velie automobile with me driving — the first time I ever had hold of a steering wheel. We wandered throughout the sand dunes between El Paso and Alamogordo, like lost pilgrims in search of the Promised Land.

We arrived at Mescalero the second day of the tribe's maiden coming of age celebration, July 2, our mother's birthday. Our car broke down and we stayed all four days, during which time the Mescaleros (in Catlin's words) "made us welcome to the best that they had."

Besides Indian fried bread, coffee, and beef there was ice cream, cream puffs, melons and bananas. We played all kinds of fun games: watermelon-eating contests, sack races, and egg-in-a-spoon races. A friendship was begun which has lasted to this day and hour.

Like George Catlin, after 69 years, I cherish my friendship with the Mescaleros.

Another big hail storm struck the vale on the 25th. When I thought it was about over, I stepped out the door.

Here came suddenly out of a clear sky a volley of golf-ball sized hail onto my head.

Just then lightning flashed and the thunder boomed down, much as to say: "How do you like them apples?"

I answered, "Just fine."

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

Inside the Outdoors

Driving the roads of New Mexico after a summer rain shower, you are likely to see one of our slower critters. Often, rain showers stimulate activity in the ornate box turtle. These desert dwellers are found everywhere but the northwestern part of the state, and are probably the turtle most encountered by New Mexicans. They are, however, only one of 10 different turtle species found in the state.

The ornate box turtle is the only terrestrial (land) turtle in the state; all others are associated with water. The box turtle is also unique in that it has a double hinge on the lower half that allows it to completely close its shell. This is probably a great defense against predators like coyotes, badgers and dogs.

Box turtles burrow into the ground at night and are most active catching insects in the morning and evenings. Thousands of box turtles are captured every year and sold as pets or to control garden pests. This practice is not illegal, but is discouraged by turtle biologists.

Another very common turtle in New Mexico is the yellow mud turtle. These turtles prefer, as their name implies, stock tanks and small, muddy ponds that have abundant aquatic vegetation. They are found in the eastern part of the state at elevations of less than 5,000 feet.

Yellow mud turtles are small; adults reach 5 to 6 inches in length. Their cousin, the Sonoran mud turtle, is much the same size, but is found only in the southwestern part of the state. The Sonoran mud turtle prefers cool, clear water rather

vicious temper when caught on land and should be considered dangerous, especially since they can weigh as much as 50 pounds. Softshells are very carnivorous and sometimes are even caught by anglers. They should also be handled with care; they can deliver a nasty bite. The spiny softshell is common along most drainages in the southern part of the state, but the smooth softshell is rare and confined to the Conchas Reservoir on the Canadian River.

Also confined to only one area of the state is the Big Bend slider. This turtle has been found at Elephant Butte Lake and possibly inhabits Caballo Lake. The red-eared slider is found in the Pecos and Rio Grande drainages. Both these turtles can be identified by patches on the side of their head. The patch is red or scarlet on the red-eared slider (of course) and orange on the Big Bend slider.

The western painted turtle is found in the San Juan, Rio Grande and Pecos river drainages. This turtle prefers lakes and large rivers with muddy bottoms and slow moving water. It is a notorious basking and will only be found in areas that have logs or floating vegetation.

Biologists studying turtles have found something very disturbing. Lots of turtles are being shot along waterways in New Mexico. To some folks they seem to make interesting targets, but wouldn't it be more sensible to shoot cans or paper targets?

These turtles are very shy, but are seen congregated on mud banks or overhanging vegetation.

Other turtles found in the state are the common snapping turtle, Western painted turtle, red-eared slider, Big Bend slider and the spiny and smooth softshell turtles.

Care should be taken around the snapping turtle and softshell. Snapping turtles have a

than muddy ponds, like the Gila River and Wall Lake. Probably the most beautiful turtle in the state is the river cooter. It is also the rarest turtle and is listed as an endangered species in New Mexico. River cooters are found along the lower Pecos River drainage, including the Black and Delaware rivers. There are also historic records of river cooters at Bitter Lakes National Wildlife Refuge, but biologists have been unable to find any.

Ruidoso officials ask for holiday water conservation

The Village of Ruidoso is bracing for what is traditionally its highest weekend of water use, the Fourth of July weekend.

Officials are asking residents and visitors to use water wisely this holiday weekend. Last year, the village's average daily water use of two million gallons tripled to six million during the weekend near July 4th, using up much of the village's stored water.

This situation can lead to low water pressure, and reduce

storage water below levels safe for fire emergencies.

Conservation tips

— Water during the early morning or late evening, and never on windy days.

— Avoid watering sidewalks and driveways.

— Use a broom instead of a hose to clean driveways and sidewalks.

— Keep showers short. Try taking showers "The Cowboy Way" because water is scarce out

there on the range. Turn water off while soaping and shampooing.

— Use dishwasher only for full loads.

New Mexicans use more than 4 million acre-feet of water per year for everything including agriculture, industry and domestic use. That's nearly 1 million gallons of water per person.

Rio Grande livestock restricted

New Mexico Livestock Board officials announced Tuesday the creation of a restricted zone for the movement of livestock affected by vesicular stomatitis.

No cases of this livestock virus have been reported in Lincoln County or surrounding areas, but officials are still advising caution.

The virus has primarily been a problem for horses in New Mexico since late May, but it now has been diagnosed in cattle.

"Two separate premises with cattle in the Belen area tested positive to the disease, and the home

premises of the affected animals have been placed under quarantine," Dr. Phil LaRussa said in a news release.

LaRussa is director of the U.S. Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service's Livestock Disease Investigation Unit.

The 100-mile restricted zone is 10 miles on either side of the Rio Grande River, and it extends from State Highway 44 near the town of Bernalillo (northern boundary) to U.S. Highway 380 at San Antonio (southern boundary), officials said. San Antonio lies about 100 miles west of Ruidoso.

"There is to be no movement of

livestock from the restricted zone, either intrastate or interstate, and all events in the restricted zone where animals would congregate are canceled," the release said.

As of Friday, June 23, 105 investigations were ongoing and by yesterday, 122 investigations were being conducted. So far, 51 cases of the disease have been confirmed, with 41 of the cases in the restricted area.

Livestock owners are advised to immediately report any suspected cases of the virus to the Livestock Disease Investigation Unit in Las Cruces at (505) 647-1615.

Clerk charged with embezzlement

Wealth was short-lived for a Ruidoso Downs Circle K clerk who allegedly took \$11,735 in money orders and cash, then tried to buy a motorcycle in Albuquerque.

Ruidoso Downs Police Officer Ray Montes responded to a call at 1:22 p.m. Friday from a customer who complained that Circle K was open, but no one was working there.

"I went to that location, went inside and found that there was not anyone in the building," Montes' report said.

Montes found no signs of foul play and called the manager. After

performing a cash register audit, the manager concluded \$10,800 in money orders were missing, along with \$935 in cash. The money orders were made out in denominations of \$300 and \$500.

After running a check on the missing clerk, Darryl Hendrix, 26, police discovered that he was wanted in Taylor County, Texas on a forgery charge. Surrounding areas were advised to be on the lookout for Hendrix, and less than six hours later he was jailed in Albuquerque.

Albuquerque police motorcycle officer Michael King arrested Hendrix at 6:35 p.m. on Friday

after police received a call from Chick's Harley Davidson. The motorcycle dealer had become suspicious when Hendrix allegedly attempted to purchase a Harley with the money orders.

"Hendrix said that he wanted to buy the Harley so he could go visit his son," King said.

Hendrix was booked on both probation violation and forgery charges. Because of the alleged probation violation, he is being held without bond.

The money orders and cash were recovered, police officials said.

Circle K officials could not be reached for comment by press time.



Democrats oppose nuclear storage plan

Approximately 30 Lincoln County Democrats reviewed plans for the summer during their pot-luck dinner and meeting June 15 at the home of Precinct 4 chairmen Bob and Thelma Stephens near Capitan.

There have been 93 new registered Democrats in the county, reported county chair Cece Griffin.

A county party resolution approved last month, taking a stance against the proposed nuclear waste storage by the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council, will be added to the state Democratic platform.

1996 will be an important election year, the Democrats agreed, with some county offices, state representative and senate offices, U.S.

congressional and presidential offices open. Members discussed the county offices that will be open next year — commission District 1 (now held by Stirling Spencer) and commission District 3 (held by Wilton Howell), assessor, sheriff and probate judge.

A county selection committee is seeking potential candidates for the offices.

Because some elected officials have changed their party membership in mid-term of their office, members asked Griffin to discuss with the State Central Committee (comprised of all county chairs) some type of legislative action to prevent this. Such a legislative action cannot happen because it is

unconstitutional, Griffin replied. Instead, Griffin said the county search committee could discuss the situation with potential candidates, and seek their affirmation to retain their party membership.

Honesty and integrity will be needed in the next election, members agreed, because many voters are disgruntled with politicians in general. Members concluded that local candidates will need to be public servants to the people of Lincoln County.

Griffin told fellow party members that the party has decided to become more visible in the press, and unlike past years, to make positive response to negative publicity, including letters to the editor. "We

will answer letters and articles," Griffin said.

Members gave approval to send a letter to the editor in response to an article about Lincoln County Magistrate Judge William Butts changing party membership from Democrat to Republican. A published article quoted Butts saying he changed party membership because he was not honored during an appreciation dinner on June 8.

The dinner was held to honor former state elected officials. Also noted was newly elected state party chairman Earl Potter.

Approximately 115 people attended, representing most areas of Lincoln County.

Lincoln County Democrats will have a food booth at the Ruidoso Arts and Crafts Festival July 28, 29 and 30, and will sell barbeque sandwiches, hot dogs, caramel apples, and soft drinks.

The next meeting of the Lincoln County Democrats will be 6:30 p.m. Thursday, July 20.
