

Educator's death ruled suicide

A Mescalero Elementary School special education administrator and former Capitan High School teacher apparently committed suicide Saturday while on the Mescalero Apache Reservation.

Blane Miller, 40, died from a self-inflicted gunshot wound to his head, an Albuquerque medical investigator confirmed this morning.

Miller was found in his car by a passing motorist when parked on state Highway 244 in Mescalero, tribal police Chief Alfred LaPaz said. The car was close to mile marker 11, near the entrance to the Silver Lake Campground, LaPaz said.

Miller had been employed for the last three years as the special education director at the Mescalero Elementary School, said Bill Butler, Mescalero schools superintendent.

Several years ago Miller taught special education at Capitan High School, where he also coached football, track and basketball.

Miller lived close to Cloudfcroft off of Highway 244, police said.

Commissioners to meet Wednesday

A special meeting of the Lincoln County Commission is set for 6 p.m. Wednesday in Ruidoso, at the county sub office, on Kansas City Road.

The short agenda includes final approval of the county's \$8.5 million 1995-96 combined operational and non-discretionary budget, and a discussion about the possible amendment of county subdivision regulations on road construction and maintenance.

The grant will also help pay for a part-time extension program assistant.

Free Spirits at Noisy Water unveiled

 Eight horses with nostrils flaring and manes flying in the wind thundered into the hearts of those witnessing the unveiling of Free Spirits at Noisy Water Saturday.

More than 750 people attended the gala event at the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs to get a first-hand look at Ruidoso artist Dave McGary's monumental creation.

Free Spirits at Noisy Water is made up of eight running bronze horses, each 1.5 times life size. The monument measures 255 feet long by 36 feet high and is mounted on a man-made landscaped mountain containing 94,500 cubic feet of dirt.

Master of ceremonies for the 7:30 p.m. unveiling was ABC television newscaster Sam Donaldson.

"You're going to see what is truly going to be the world's most magnificent monument to horses, and we may decide that it's the world's most magnificent monument to anything at all," Donaldson said.

Donaldson then introduced Joan Dale Hubbard, who along with her husband R.D. Hubbard, commissioned the work two years ago. The Hubbards are the founders of the Museum of the Horse and own the Ruidoso Downs Race Track. Joan Dale Hubbard thanked all the people who worked up to the last minute to get the monument finished in time.

"This is an incredible moment for any artist," said its creator, Dave McGary said. "I believe that

R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard belong to the community of great art patrons and I think we all owe them a special thanks for their dedication to art that makes our world so much richer."

McGary described to the crowd how he developed the vision for Free Spirits at Noisy Water.

"When I heard about it, I knew right away what I would do," he said. "I saw these great creatures moving powerfully, swiftly and freely over the land, and in my mind they have always had dignity and grace.

"They have always had importance and beauty, they are a part of the natural world, and yet they occupy a special place in the lives of men and women."

Horses are a fitting topic for a monument and deserve to be larger than life, McGary said.

"For more than two years I have worked to put these important things into bronze," he said. "I have

visited horses and people who know horses, and I've had the generous help of specialists for each horse."

McGary said he has tried to produce a monument that people could stand close to, touch and experience again and again.

"My greatest reward will be if you take the time to walk up the path and just be there for a moment," he said. "Close your eyes, hear the horses coming off the ridge and feel the power and strength of the other horses running past you.

"They are free; no one is telling them what to do; they are being themselves; they are truly Free Spirits at Noisy Water."

One by one, the parachutes covering the horses were removed as Donaldson told a brief history of the seven breeds. After the introductions, musician Michael Martin Murphey sang 'Ponies.'

Spectators filed slowly past the massive horses, touching and being touched by the beauty and majesty of Free Spirits at Noisy Water.

Outstanding New Mexican Award given to McGary

More than 750 people attended the black tie celebration at the Museum of the Horse that followed the unveiling of Free Spirits at Noisy Water.

The rain held off for Saturday's unveiling of Free Spirits at Noisy Water, but returned with a vengeance Sunday for the open house. Despite the downpour, an estimated 2,500 people came to see the monument.

Guests at Saturday's party saw a video presentation of "The Making of Free Spirits at Noisy Water" before being entertained by cowboy poet Waddie Mitchell, cowboy singer Don Edwards and recording artist Michael Martin Murphey and his Rio Grande Band.

Three hit by lightning in Capitan park

Lightning struck three people Sunday in Capitan as they admired rose bushes near the grave of Smokey Bear.

Rob Leslie, 13, who was knocked down but not unconscious by the strike, said the lightning hit Sam Boyd, bounced to his mother, Evelyn Leslie, and then threw him to the ground.

"I saw the lightning," Leslie said Monday from his room at the Lincoln County Medical Center. "It was red. I guess it hit Sam's head and burned a hole in his hat. It just knocked my cap off. My legs were

numb, but I lifted myself up and hollered. Sam wasn't breathing."

By the time Eddie Tudor, an emergency medical technician who lives on the grounds of Smokey Bear State Park, reached Boyd, the injured man was frothing at the mouth, according to Connie Hopper, Lincoln County director of emergency services.

"Eddie was walking out to the car (at 12:25 p.m.) when he felt the charge in the air and dropped what he had in his hands and ran to get out of the way," Hopper said. "He heard a big bang and then yelling."

Park manager Larry Bandy was brushing his teeth at home when

the lightning hit.

"The crash made me jump," he said. "I knew it hit close."

Tudor alerted Bandy and called for an ambulance. All three victims were taken to the hospital in Ruidoso, where they remained Monday.

Boyd, 46, who lives in Capitan and was visiting Mrs. Leslie at the park, said he doesn't remember anything about the lightning.

"I woke up in the ambulance with a burned spot above my left ear and my hair singed, then I blacked out and woke up again in the emergency room," Boyd said Monday. "My legs are stiff. I'm sore

all over today. I can't get comfortable."

The sky was cloudy Sunday, but park technician Evelyn Leslie doesn't remember any lightning or thunder before the bolt knocked her off her feet.

"The next thing I knew I was lying on the floor in the (park station) lobby," Mrs. Leslie said.

The 43-year-old woman said she received burns to her legs and is sore from her waist to her head.

"It's kind of weird," Rob Leslie said of the experience. And when the next storm rumbles through Capitan, he intends to be inside.

Ruidoso may relax radio tower zoning

Amendment of a Ruidoso planning code may allow installation of radio and microwave towers in all areas of the village, while also closing the door on potential lawsuits.

Planning and Zoning Commissioners voted unanimously last week to recommend amendment of the current code that restricts towers to commercial districts.

Altering the code, which will be reviewed at a Ruidoso Village Council public hearing at 6:30 p.m. Aug. 8, would allow transmitting towers as a conditional use in all planning zones, commissioners said.

The amendment was prompted by a local cellular phone service provider, Cellular One, which seeks installation of a microwave tower in a residential area of Camelot. The tower is necessary to eliminate a cellular phone dead zone in a section of Ruidoso, Planning Director Cleatus Richards said.

Richards told the commissioners that with a conditional use amendment, planners would still have to review impact of the developer's proposal before granting the variance.

Assistant Planner Darrell Bremner said few commercial areas are found at the top of hills.

The cellular phone company is

asking planners to do "spot zoning," allowing the change of a residential zone into a commercial zone or vice versa.

But spot zoning goes against the village's master plan of development, Richards said, and leaves the city vulnerable to lawsuits. If a district were changed to commercial to allow installation for a radio tower, for example, commissioners could not prevent another business from developing in the area.

Commissioners said they will work on identifiable standards for tower installation, such as fall areas, height and landscaping, alongside the conditional use changes.

Also at Monday's meeting, commissioners:

— approved a minor commercial site plan for the Ruidoso Roastery at 113 Rio Street. Business owner Leland Deford sought a variance to construct an eight-foot lattice wall with vegetation to screen the coffee house from neighboring homes.

The ivy or honeysuckle-covered slats may also serve to absorb the sound of acoustic guitar players inside the business, which stays open until 10 p.m. on Friday and Saturdays

— rescheduled all 6:30 p.m. P&Z meetings to 2 p.m. for the remainder of the year.

Proposed Alto subdivision gains first approval

Plans for a sizable subdivision in the Alto area jumped a first Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission hurdle last week.

Developer Ronnie Paulger, president of Ruidoso Inc., submitted a sketch plan for "Kokopelli Mesa" to the commission and received a collective planning nod.

Although it is outside Ruidoso's zoning authority, the Village of Alto does fall within Ruidoso's three-mile planning jurisdiction and plans for development must be ap-

proved by the Ruidoso P&Z.

The sketch has already been reviewed and approved by the Extraterritorial Zoning Commission, P&Z Chairman Mike Radziewicz said.

Plans call for approximately 111 acres in the High Mesa area of Alto to be developed into 31 single-family homes, 76 multi-family units, and one commercial structure. Additionally, a 61.79 acre golf course is in the works on land adjacent to the Alto Lakes Country Club.

Before any construction or earth

moving is initiated at the proposed site, Ruidoso Inc. must submit preliminary and final plat plans to Ruidoso planning commissioners for approval.

The subdivision developers plan to get water from the Alto Lakes Water Corporation, and a sewer treatment plant would be built to serve all tracts not using septic tanks.

Negotiations are underway with Alto Lakes personnel for a club membership swap for land, Paulger added. Under his proposal, the club will develop and maintain the

Kokopelli land as a nine-hole golf course in exchange for perpetual club membership for Kokopelli Mesa home buyers.

Development of the golf course could be six years down the road, Paulger said. However, Ruidoso Inc. seeks to have plans completed for water, roads, utilities and liquid waste next summer.

Several variances for street widths and lengths will be sought during the preliminary plat phase of planning, construction agent Tim Collins said.

Honduran councilors learn from officials here

City council members from communities in Honduras were in Ruidoso Saturday to learn about the similarities and differences between local governments in their country and the United States.

The Honduran councilors, called regidores, met with local elected officials at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

The training program that began June 18 is sponsored by the Honduras Peace Scholarship Program (HOPS) and is designed to produce a lasting effect on social, economic and political development in that country, according to a news release. It focuses on agriculture, small business development, education and health care. It aims to improve the Hondurans' legislative

capacity and leadership skills, as well as foster a better understanding of democracy and a free market economy.

Monroy Montes, chairman of the Lincoln County Commission, urged commissioners last week to attend the session.

He noted that the translation for the Honduran councilor position, "regidor," was "to rule."

"But it carries the connotation of ruling from a royal standpoint," he said. "Our local government, the commission, receives its power from the people."

"What we take for granted, they strive to have in the middle of fighting and corruption."

"Our system has its flaws, but certainly, it's the best."

Comments sought on Hwy. 70 work

Residents will have their first chance Tuesday to preview plans and offer input for a proposed widening and realignment of U.S. 70.

The New Mexico State Highway & Transportation Department is conducting a meeting on the 5.5-mile project from 5 to 7 p.m. in Apache Treaty Rooms A & B at the Inn of the Mountain Gods.

The proposed improvements would run from the turnoff for the Inn on U.S. 70, on the Mesalero Apache Reservation, east to the junction with Sudderth Drive (State Road 48) in Ruidoso.

Barring major problems, the design should be completed by Sept. 4, 1996, said Don Ellis with the design firm of Leadhill-Herkenhoff Inc. The contract could be awarded by December of that year, he said.

"The project consists of expanding the highway from two to four lanes," Ellis said. "The alignment in

the portion (of the highway) on the reservation already is set and some straightening will occur. The right-of-way supposedly has been purchased."

The intersection of Sudderth and U.S. 70 is scheduled to be improved, he said. From the intersection west to the reservation, some right-of-way may have to be purchased.

No budget has been estimated for the project, Ellis said.

"The purpose of the meeting is to explain the design process and solicit citizen input on the problems and needs associated with U.S. 70 and its intersecting roads," Ellis said. "The proposed improvement is needed to increase the highway capacity, enhance safety and provide a continuous four-lane roadway section."

Topics may include alignment, intersections, drainage, environmental impacts and right-of-way.

GRADS gets high mark

A Ruidoso High School program to help teen parents in school was a big success in its first year, officials have concluded.

Last year was the beginning of the Graduation, Reality and Dual Role Skills (GRADS) program on the RHIS campus.

"We are extremely pleased about the results of the program," GRADS advisory committee member Paul Wirth said.

Wirth, who is also the director of instructional support for the Ruidoso School District, presented the GRADS year-end report at Tuesday's school board meeting.

GRADS is a program designed to keep pregnant and parenting teens in school.

"The goals of the GRADS program are to have teens remain in school through graduation, encourage good health practices, increase parenting skills and to help young parents set occupational goals," program director Gayla Stanaland said.

Wirth's report shows that of the 24 GRADS students at the beginning of the school year, 17 finished the program (seven graduated), three students transferred outside the district and four dropped out of school.

"As part of our goals for next year, we would like to initiate in-

creased counseling and home visits with parents and families, enhance public awareness and continue with various community partnerships," Wirth said.

The Ruidoso High School added an on-campus child care facility in January of this year. Although not officially a part of the GRADS program, efforts by the GRADS Project and local supporters of the Ruidoso GRADS have brought in extra money for the child care facility.

Wirth reported that 13 infants were enrolled in the program last year, with 16 infants receiving immunizations and 10 screened for developmental delays.

The child care facility received full state licensing May 18.

Sharon Waggoner, director of the New Mexico GRADS Project, said the state has tentatively set aside \$20,000 for Ruidoso's GRADS program and \$15,000 for Ruidoso's child care facility.

The GRADS program is overseen by Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) in Portales through the State Department of Education's Vocational, Technical and Adult Education Division. Last year \$18,750 was allocated for the Ruidoso GRADS program from ENMU, \$7,940 from the state Children, Youth and Families program, \$3,000 from a Department of Health grant and \$2,000 in private donations.

Commissioners nix proposed fire emergencies ordinance

Lincoln County Commissioners say they don't want the authority to declare a state of extreme fire emergency and to impose restrictions on the handling of fires.

State law already gives the state Forestry Division the authority to impose restrictions on most non-federal land in the county. A county ordinance would be redundant, commissioners concluded last week. They took no action on the proposed ordinance.

Barbara Luna, manager of the Forestry Division's office in Capitan, agreed that her agency's existing authority should be sufficient. The agency can impose different levels of restrictions on state and private land.

"How much should we be able to get into everybody's life?" asked Commissioner Stirling Spencer. He said he also objected because the term "reasonable and proper care" in handling fire was not defined and would be open to interpretation.

"This is paralleling what they have in the Village of Ruidoso right now," Commissioner Wilton Howell said of the proposed ordinance.

Because that village is heavily wooded and surrounded by a national forest, it may have more of a need for such authority, Commissioner L. Ray Nunley said.

County Attorney Alan Morel said the ordinance would give commissioners the authority to prohibit specific activity such as burning garbage in a barrel. If someone caused a fire, the person then could be criminally liable, he said.

At that Howell said, "I guess we talked ourselves out of that one. I can see the problems."

Judge gives teen break on marijuana charge

Ruidoso Municipal Court Judge Mike Line cut Abselin Chavez some slack Monday after finding him guilty of marijuana possession.

He told Chavez, who was arrested by Ruidoso police June 19 for a trace amount of pot, "I don't think there's justice in taking a 19-year-old man who has his whole life in front of him and branding him as a doper if you can take care of the problem yourself."

Judge Line deferred sentencing Chavez for a year, but told him "I'm going to be your probation officer" and ordered him to obey all laws and to consult with him in his chambers today.

The marijuana specks found inside a jar in Chavez' backpack had been identified after the police department's narcotic dog, Fanta, signaled she was in the presence of drugs, police said.

"If I catch you with marijuana (during the next year) or committing a petty misdemeanor, I promise you I will sentence you to the maximum penalty of a \$500 fine and 90 days in jail, and will brand you a doper," Judge Lines warned Chavez.

Chavez had pleaded not guilty to the possession charge, and indicated during the court proceeding that the jar might have been planted in his pack.

He asked Line, "If I had that

stuff, why would I give down to the police, why would I retrieve my stuff?"

Later in the proceeding, however, Chavez admitted, "I did have seeds in there, but I threw them all out."

The village criminal statute defining marijuana includes possession of seeds and stalks from the cannabis plant.

Police officer Douglas Sabo testified he found Chavez' backpack on a downtown sidewalk June 19 after receiving a complaint call about skateboarders. He took the pack over to the station, and in the presence of four state police officers, he searched the pack and found a small glass jar with what appeared to be marijuana inside it.

Later that evening, Chavez arrived at headquarters to retrieve his pack, and after being asked twice if all the items inside the backpack were his, he said "yes," Sabo related.

"He then became disorderly and tried to take the vial away from me. He claimed it was not pot," Sabo added.

Judge Line opened the jar and with a single whiff said, "I have no question that at one time there was marijuana in there."

But because there were only about "20 specs" inside the jar and the substance wasn't tested chemically, Judge Line said he was reluctant to penalize the defendant for life.

Town annexation work resumes after 3 months

After a three-month hiatus, the Ruidoso annexation committee is back in business.

Village Planner Cleatus Richards was directed Tuesday by the committee to take steps toward annexing Lincoln Tower and surrounding land.

Richards had been absent for several months after suffering a serious heart attack. The committee meetings were canceled during his absence.

The ad hoc annexation committee, appointed this winter by the Ruidoso Village Council, is charged with recommending the procedures for annexation of pockets of land in or surrounding Ruidoso. All the lands so far identified by the committee receive utility

services from the village.

Lincoln Tower is to be the committee's test model on how to proceed with more complicated annexations, committee chairman Robert Donaldson said.

The Mechem Drive commercial complex is surrounded by Ruidoso and is serviced by village utilities, but because it rests on county land it is not taxed by the village government.

Richards was also directed to contact owners of the land on both sides of the tower. These sizable parcels are not incorporated in the village, either.

If the owners of the properties refuse annexation, the committee may recommend the village proceed with forced annexation through the state's boundary commission, Donaldson said.



Jolenas High and Local Yokel take Sunday's features

The consistent performer Jolenas High broke right with the leaders then pulled clear in the final 100 yards to score a half-length win in the \$18,270 American Quarter Horse Association Challenge Claiming Stakes, Sunday at Ruidoso Downs.

The 4-year-old Texas bred gelding by On A High had a half-length lead over Golden Ending in the early stages of the contest under jockey Jerry Yoakum after breaking from the far outside post position.

Nearing the wire Jolenas High staved off a host of challengers including eventual runner-up Special N Classy for the win. The time was 17.78 over a sloppy track.

"He's just a nice horse that runs good every time," said Yoakum, who was the regular rider on the great 2-year-old Deceptively in 1992 and is now based in Texas. "Today's distance is really good for him, but he did run a little differently today. Before, he'd always break two lengths in front and they'd be catching him at the end."

The win was worth \$9,226 to owner Michael Taylor of Madison, Ind. and trainer Heath Taylor. Jolenas High has now won three of four starts this year while performing primarily at Bandera Downs near San Antonio, Texas.

Special N Classy was second while 19-1 longshot Say Burney completed the trifecta.

The talented 4-year-old thoroughbred Local Yokel blew past pacesetters Macho Ego and Boulderdash Bay in the turn for home, and then coasted down the lane under a hand-ride by jockey Todd Fincher to win the \$18,450 Land Of Enchantment Speed Handicap, the Sunday co-feature.

Owned and trained by Jo Ann Hitt of El Paso, Texas Local Yokel laid off the blazing early fractions of 21.3 and 44.4 set by favorites Boulderdash Bay and Macho Ego.

Midway through the turn, the tired pacesetters gave way to Local Yokel, who assumed command of the lead with a burst of speed.

Down the lane, the New Mexico-bred son of Full Choke was in complete control and went on to win by 3 1/4 lengths in a time of 1:11.1.

The victory was the ninth race won by Fincher this week and his second stakes win after he also captured the \$58,000 Rio Grande Futurity riding Full Connection on Saturday.

"I hated the number one post we were in, but we got lucky when the three and six horses went out to fight for the lead. As soon as I had him in the clear it was just a matter of when I was going to ask him," said Fincher, who currently leads the thoroughbred jockey standings.

The victory was worth \$11,070 to Hitt and bumped Local Yokel's career earnings to

nearly \$78,000. Macho Ego hung on gamely for second while Boulderdash Bay was 1 1/4-lengths back in third.

Runnerup Wampuscat was a half length in front of Id's Fizz, who hung on for third in the field of 11 state-bred juveniles. Second favorite Proud and Jivey was another length and three-quarters back in fourth place.

Todd Fincher has piloted Full Connection throughout his career.

"I might have moved him a little too early," said the jockey. "But he had the guts to hold on. Id's Fizz is a nice filly. She was with us the whole way, and we were rolling."

Full Connection picked up a check for \$29,000 and boosted his earnings to \$82,308 with the Rio Grande victory. The chestnut races for Richard Parrish of Meadow, Texas.

"I was a little worried when I saw how fast he ran the first quarter," admitted Parrish.

But trainer Roy Barrington didn't share his concern.

"My theory of training horses is that it's just as easy to relax out there on the front and instead of the back of the pack" Barrington said. "That also makes it a lot easier on me."

Full Connection returned \$5.40 \$3.80 and \$3.20 for the victory. Wampuscat, with Nicky Madrid aboard, paid \$10.80 and \$4.60 for place, and Id's Fizz, with David Mitchell Jr. aboard brought in a \$6.60 show payoff.

Fine Dance's running time eclipsed the former mark of 1:10.1 set by multiple stakes winner Last Don B. in the Mescalero Apache Handicap in June.


Bolero Blue rallied late on the outside to edge Show Courts for the place position.

Salamander study

The 10-member Share with Wildlife Task Force selected 18 projects for funding in fiscal year 1996-97, spending more than \$80,000.

One of the projects to be funded is a local study to determine the effects of forest cutting on Sacramento Mountain salamander populations and the long-term importance of ecosystem management practices.

The task force will fund \$2,500 of the \$3,413 requested to complete the Sacramento Mountain study. The project proposals must be approved by the State Game Commission to be included in the budget request to the 1996 State Legislature.

Share with Wildlife (SwW) Coordinator Claire Tyrpak said SwW will continue to fund ongoing projects and new projects as monies allow.

"However, contributions to Share with Wildlife have declined in recent years, and we have no new source of income, so we've had to cut requests for some projects to be able to fund additional projects," Tyrpak said.

Share with Wildlife funds are derived from contributions, primarily from a checkoff by New Mexico taxpayers of their state income tax refunds, but also from direct contributions to the program.

Horseshoe tourney

Fishing prospects slowed by weather

Hot weather has caused fish to head for deeper waters, and it has caused fishing enthusiasts to hope for cooler temperatures and more rain that will lure the fish back to the surface.

"If the conditions aren't just right, if the water is too warm, those fish just essentially shut down," said Miles McInnes, fisheries manager for the New Mexico Game and Fish Department's Roswell office.

McInnes said low water levels combined with daytime temperatures in the mid to upper 80s have warmed up the Ruidoso River waters to 70 degrees during the day. Trout can live in water that warm, but they become lethargic and seek deeper holes where the water is cooler.

"During the day, the fish just don't bite," McInnes said, adding the best time to fish is in the early morning or late evening. The best spot right now is Grindstone Reservoir, which is deeper than other lakes in the area.

The fish probably won't return to their regular feeding and activity levels until the usual July rains raise water levels and the temperatures cool off, McInnes said.

Local fisherman Jim McGarvey, who keeps tabs on fishing conditions in the area, agreed with McInnes.

"It's got to cool down," he said.

"The heat has driven them deeper."

According to the Game and Fish Department's July 11 fishing report, conditions in the Ruidoso area ranged from fair at Alto Lake and Grindstone Reservoir to good at Bonito Lake and the Ruidoso River.

The Game and Fish Department is still stocking lakes and streams in the area, except for Alto Lake, where water and oxygen levels are low. Those fish slated for stocking at Alto will be stocked at either Bonito Lake or Grindstone Reservoir. Last week, officers stocked 2,289 catchable-sized rainbow trout in Grindstone Reservoir.

McInnes said his department conducted a fish survey last Monday in the special trout fishing waters in the lower Ruidoso River. In the 320 feet of surveyed area, officers detected nearly 180 fish of various sizes.

"That's a lot of fish," McInnes said.

The Game and Fish Department also recently surveyed the Tularosa Creek. Results indicated plenty of water and fish in the creek, McInnes said.

The only real problem in the area is Three Rivers, McInnes said. Water flow is down to just several gallons per minute. McInnes and his crew relocated 200 fish to Sacramento Creek, fearing water levels wouldn't improve and the fish would die if they stayed in Three Rivers.

Outlaws barred from state

The Camp Sierra Blanca Outlaws softball team will not be able to participate in this year's USSSA Men's Class E state tournament as they had hoped.

The Outlaws request to play in the tournament to be held Aug. 11-13 in Clovis was denied by state correctional officials.

"The guys are really disappointed because we've worked so hard this year," said the team's co-captain Lance Johnston. "If there's any possible way, if we can work together on this we'd love to go."

But that seems unlikely.

Camp Sierra Blanca warden Sandra McFadden notified the inmates of the decision last Monday. She cited the distance to Clovis and the logistics of transporting, housing, supervising the inmates as the reason for turning down the inmates' request.

"It's in departmental policy that they cannot be gone from the institution more than 16 hours unless they are on a furlough," McFadden said. "This does not meet any of the qualifications of a furlough. We also don't have any means to house them or provide around-the-clock supervision. The department is not ready to answer for anything they may do when we throw 12 inmates into a com-

munity unexpected."

McFadden said furloughs are for the inmates to visit family, to prepare for parole or to get jobs. All the players on the team are eligible for furlough because they are qualified for community release activities. But furloughs are not for recreational purposes, McFadden said.

Two years ago a Camp Sierra Blanca team participated in the state tournament which was held in Roswell because the institution could bus the team back and forth between games, McFadden noted, but any tournament that requires an overnight stay is not possible.

The closest correctional facility to Clovis is 100 miles away, said Camp Sierra Blanca Captain Dee Standridge, who has sponsored the Outlaws throughout the season.

"In the event that something should occur - and the probability is very unlikely - there is not a penal institution of any kind, in any proximity to that particular city," said Standridge, who expressed his disappointment that the team could not go.

McFadden said, "I'd really like for them to be able to do this, but there are other tournaments."

Standridge added, "I was present when she spent four hours going to bat for these guys

trying every which way she could within her scope of authority to get them there, but she does have bosses too."

It's little consolation for the Outlaws who had already raised the tournament entry fee for the state tourney and feel they have proved themselves. Standridge and two of his security officers even volunteered to escort the team, but that wasn't enough to sway state officials in Santa Fe.

"They (state officials) felt like it wasn't a good idea because of the security risks involved, irrelevant of escort, anything can happen," Standridge said.

Team co-captain Jesse Churchman said, "We've played hard. We've tried to prove ourselves and got shot down. Our attitudes and conduct should account for something. We think we could do good if given the chance."

Just how good is something the Outlaws will never know.

"Minimum security inmates require no armed escort anywhere," Captain Dee Standridge said.

Looking Forward to Old Lincoln Days

Preparations are underway to welcome folks to the Old Lincoln Days, which will be held this year Aug. 4-6 in Lincoln.

In 1940, local celebrations were held all over New Mexico to celebrate our state's 400th birthday — going back to early Spanish days — or our "Cuarto Centennial."

Wilbur Coe, son of Lincoln County pioneer Frank Coe, was president of the Lincoln County Historical Society in those days. Wilbur and his wife, Louise, organized "A Day in Old Lincoln." The celebration was to honor the pioneers of Lincoln County, and of the southwest in general.

In those days, many of the men and women who had lived through the historical days of the 1870s and 1880s were still alive. These oldtimers gathered from all over the original Lincoln County, which encompassed seven present-day counties — the largest county in the United States, equal in area to the State of Indiana.

Lincoln was the county seat. It was a time for reunions and sharing memories of the early days, quadrille dancing, old-time fiddle and guitar music, and dinner on the ground.

The Historical Pageant

As a feature of that first year, Wilbur Coe presented a historical pageant, tracing the highlights of the Lincoln County War, entitled "The Last Escape of Billy the Kid."

Wilbur arranged for veteran Hollywood script writer Blanding Sloan and his young assistant Mark Hamilton to write a script for the

pageant.

For the first pageant, the street of Lincoln in front of the courthouse was the stage. There were ox carts, stage coaches, pack mules and burros, and horseback riders to add realism to the show.

Artist Peter Hurd, the first to act the part of Billy the Kid in the pageant, escaped from the courthouse as did the Kid in 1881.

The pageant became so popular that it is now presented the evenings of Friday and Saturday and in the afternoon on Sunday.

I forgot to say Old Lincoln Days were discontinued during World War II, and revived in 1949. Since that year, Lincoln Days have continued every year.

One of a Kind

The pageant is in a class by itself, being the only Western Folk pageant that takes place on the exact spot where the dramatic events of the early times were acted out in real life.

Also, the Village of Lincoln is little changed from its pioneer days.

Through the years, by talking with people familiar with the episodes of the historical days and listening to those who took part in

the early day dramas, the pageant has been reshaped and expanded to form as true a picture of early day Lincoln County as possible in a one-hour show.

People come from all over the United States, and also from across the water, to see the Lincoln Pageant.

July Full Moon

Well after dark on the evening of July 12, the full moon came up over Sunrise Mountain all round and pure golden, seeming very close in the dark blue sky and sending its golden rays and rainbow shafts down over the cedars and pines into the vale.

As it rose higher in the night sky, the moon became encircled by an orange fringe, then later by an airy circle of green, and finally by a large ring of purple. These colors were cast in a background of very light mist that made you think maybe this was the "Rain Moon of July."

This morning, the 13th, all the sky was overcast with clouds; and the east wind came and blew them all away, leaving a pure blue sky.

And now, just at high noon, here comes a pure white cloud over Storm Mountain, moving in against the east wind.

The thunder sounds over the hill to the west, and sure enough a purple-gray rain cloud is floating over the hilltop and the first drops begin falling into this green and happy vale.

Let us remember always to be grateful to our Lord for so many blessings bestowed upon us.

County government bidding process sparks confusion

The low bidder on a proposed county purchase of cattle guards has filed a protest over a Lincoln County Commission decision Tuesday to throw out all six bids.

Dave Strickland, who owns Capitan Welding, contends through his attorney, J. Robert Beauvais, that the commission failed to follow the state procurement code.

"They can reject all bids when it is in the best interests of the local public body, but they must state the reasons," Beauvais said Wednesday. "Based on the information I have, that was not done."

In the county bid specification documents on the cattle guards, the section dealing with the price allowed only one blank for the cost on two different sizes of cattle guards.

Four of the bidders wrote in prices for both sizes and two included only the price for one size, according to Kim Roper, road department secretary.

Commissioner Bill Schwettmann proposed tossing out the two non-conforming bids and voting on the remaining four.

"We have one low responsive bid that's well within the budgeted amount," Schwettmann said. "It's not fair to back out."

Strickland's bid of \$3,300 per 21-foot cattle guard was \$195 lower than the next responsive bid. He bid \$65 less on the 14-foot guard.

But Commissioner Wilton Howell offered a motion to follow the recommendation of the acting road department manager Albert Hernandez and reject all bids.

"The timing is not crucial," he said.

His motion passed with Howell, Stirling Spencer and Chairman Monroy Montes voting for passage.

Strickland and one other bidder have worked with the county before and were more familiar with the way bid documents are put together, Howell said during a break in the meeting. The bidders who misunderstood, because only one space was allowed, shouldn't be penal-

ized, he said.

But Strickland said bidders could have called County Manager Carolin Cooney or Hernandez to get answers to their questions.

"I feel I'm the low responsive bidder and this definitely puts me at a disadvantage now," he told commissioners. "I hope you reconsider."

Second surprise motion

A few items later, a vote on a county radio communications repair and maintenance contract confounded Schwettmann again.

Although Allcomm Communications, a Ruidoso Downs company, submitted the low bid, Schwettmann's motion to award owner Paul Keith the contract was defeated 3-2 with Howell, Nunley and Montes voting against it.

Without explanation, Nunley then proposed a motion to accept the bid of A & G Southwest Co. of Ruidoso, owned by Carl Applin.

It passed with the same 3-2 split.

"I'd like to know the reason," Schwettmann said. "Are they superior or do you know the people (who own the company)?"

"What's your inference?" Montes asked Schwettmann.

"You're ignoring the recommendation of management," Schwettmann replied. "You're always doing something in a small coalition. No one will justify why."

Nunley and Howell said they had no response to Schwettmann's remarks. Montes said that he voted in the best interests of the county and that the price was not significantly different.

During a break in the meeting, Montes said he was disturbed by All-Comm's lack of attention to details.

"Last time this went to bid, his license was not in order," Montes said. "The prices were so close, I felt this was the better option. The contract will be written so if we're not satisfied, we could get out in 60 days."

Nunley also brought up All-Comm's Federal Communications Commission licensing during the earlier round of bids on the contract.

"If you're going to be a duck farmer, you need to have ducks," he said. "I felt my decision was in the interest of fairness."

Keith said Wednesday that a technician is not required to have an FCC license to work on county radios. The bids didn't require licenses to be listed.

"The situation last time was that one of my technicians had not renewed his FCC license, but I still had one licensed technician," Keith said. "We're definitely unhappy with the outcome of (the vote), but we'll keep on going."

Cooney and Connie Hopper, emergency services director for the county, also were surprised by the commission's decision. Hopper said she had reviewed the bids at Cooney's request and recommended Allcomm, which has taken care of county radios for a portion of the year the county has been operating without a maintenance contract.

Cooney also pointed out several advantages to using Allcomm, such as no charge for the use of a snow vehicle during the winter to reach relay stations, and no charge for the removal of equipment not being used.

County Attorney Alan Morel told commissioners he is working on revising the county's procurement procedure, which has come under fire in recent months due to errors and misunderstandings.

He received commission backing to assign one existing county employee the additional job of procurement officer. Consistent handling and follow through are two of the major things lacking now, Morel said.

Region IX Cooperative awarded

Region IX Education Cooperative, headquartered in Ruidoso, has been awarded an Accreditation With Distinction.

Region IX received the accreditation based on a review of its programs and services conducted June 5-7 by professionals. It was presented by The Accreditation Council, a private national organization sponsored by nine advocacy and professional groups.

The council's experts also interviewed people receiving services, family members and staff, said the Accreditation Council's board of directors President Arthur Dykstra.

The Region IX education cooperative is one of ten Regional Cooperative Centers established throughout New Mexico in 1984. They were originally organized to provide supplementary special education services to local education agencies using federal funds, said Region IX executive director Sandy

"The role of the cooperatives has expanded under the authorization of the regional board of directors (composed of seven school district superintendents) to include a variety of other projects, both federally funded and funded from other sources," Gladden said.

Region IX serves the Ruidoso, Carrizozo, Capitan, Cloudcroft, Corona, Tularosa and Hondo school districts.

Region IX's statement of purpose says its objective is to provide services that help keep local education programs successful.

Region IX services and programs include the Drug Free School and Communities Project; programs for developmentally disabled children from birth through the age of two; preschool projects for developmentally disabled children; math and science inservice teacher training; operation of the Lincoln County Head Start program; computer

technology assistance; and a job training program for students with disabilities age 16 and older.

The award was announced at Tuesday's Ruidoso School Board meeting.

"Region IX Education Cooperative should be proud of its programs, staff and administration, as they have earned The Accreditation Council's utmost respect," Dykstra said.

LINCOLN COUNTY SCRAMBOOK

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from "A History of Lincoln County Post Offices."

Alto

"Alto" is Spanish for high. When the office was established in 1901, William H. Walker became the postmaster. He built the present office building and the log cabin next to it. Aileen Lindamood of Carrizozo retired as postmaster in 1975. Her grandfather, Frank Lesnet, came through Alto on his way to Ruidoso, where he operated a

store and became Ruidoso's first postmaster. Lesnet's son-in-law, John A. Haley, served as Carrizozo's postmaster. Lindamood is the third generation to serve the county in that capacity. Lindamood and her husband operated a store in connection with the Alto office. The office has been moved from time to time through the years but never very far away. It has been moved from the present building to the log cabin several times, depending on the whim of the postmaster. Author Eugene Manlove Rhodes was a teacher in Alto in 1891-92 before postal service.



The doctors, who had a practice in Tucumcari for the last 10 years, installed specialized equipment at their new facility for the removal of foreign bodies in the eye, and computerized instrumentation for the detection and evaluation of cataracts and glaucoma.
Gutowski received a Bachelor's of Science degree in biology from Emporia State University, Kansas. He also holds a Doctor of Optometry degree from Southern College of Optometry.
Sonnenmoser holds a Bachelor's

of Science in Nursing from Avila College in Missouri and a bachelor's and Doctor of Optometry degree from Southern College of Optometry. Both Gutowski and Sonnenmoser hold Fellowship Awards from the American College of Optometric Physicians.

Graffiti artist gathers his victims' comments about actions for judge

 A Ruidoso man who pleaded guilty in magistrate court to unlawful graffiti was sentenced Thursday to 30 days in jail after providing a list of comments from his eight victims.

Jaik Goff, 20, was arrested and charged for eight counts of unlawful graffiti May 16, police said.

Goff pleaded guilty to spray painting "JUKE" and "RIF" at his first appearance before Judge William Butts June 27. At that time, Butts ordered him to contact all his victims, ask them for comments about his crime, and to repair the graffiti damage.

He repaired and repainted most

of the graffiti, Judge Butts said, and gathered a docket of his victims' opinions.

Comments varied from, "You're a disgrace to the community," and "They should punish you like they do in Singapore," to a comment from McDonald's saying, "Thank you (for repairing the damage) and have a nice day."

When returning to court, Goff received a sentence of 364 days in the county jail from Judge Butts. He must serve 30 days and will be placed on probation for the remainder.

Goff was also sentenced to serve 60 hours of community service and he was required to pay \$31 in court costs, Butts said.

Special session needed to resolve gaming issues

New Mexico's Indian gaming compacts have been thrown into confusion since the state Supreme Court ruled Thursday they are illegal.

It would be too radical of a move to close down the casinos, even temporarily. An action like that would threaten the viability of those operations. They are a great economic enterprise for the Indian nations, as well as an added tourist attraction for this area.

This never would have been an issue if Governor Gary Johnson had consulted with the Legislature about the proposed content of the compacts, as we and others urged him to do. One reason the court cited for its ruling was the lack of the governor's consultation with the Legislature.

A special session of the Legislature needs to be called, so the governor and Legislature can find out where they stand on the content of the compacts. Obviously, the tribes and pueblos are happy with the compacts the way they are, so hopefully the Legislature could propose only minimal changes.

To be fair, gambling at racetracks should also be discussed in the special session. The Legislature should pick up exactly where it left off when it ran out of time during its regular session, and consider a law to allow video gaming at tracks before it's too late for these businesses to recover.



Jogging remains a popular form of recreation and exercise, with more and more pet owners taking their dogs with them.

But sometimes the practice can cause health problems for both human and canine.

Some of the most common problems reported by veterinarians are heat prostration, foot pad injuries, arthritis and heart problems. With older dogs, running over long distances and hard surfaces could speed the onset of arthritis, they say.

To maintain the companionship, but avoid exposing your dog to injury, start out with short jogs.

The length of the route can be increased gradually.

Avoid running on concrete, blacktop or cinders, which can injure a dog's pad, especially a dog used to being in the house.

Keep the dog on a leash. Stop for a breather occasionally.

Dogs don't have sweat glands like humans and need water and time to pant.

A veterinarian who jogged with his Labrador retriever 30 to 40 miles a week cautioned the owners of young dogs to be extra careful.

The bones of dogs younger than two years are not fused,

the point at which no more growth can occur. Running a dog prior to that time can result in bone damage, he advised.

Generally, working breeds such as huskies, malamutes, shepherds, collies, pointers, greyhounds, salukis and Labrador retrievers do better as runners.

Don't run with toy breeds.

Some other tips offered in recent animal publications include:

— check with a veterinarian to be sure the dog is in good physical condition. Any dog, particularly an overweight dog, should begin an exercise program gradually.

— trust your dog's judgment if it doesn't want to walk or run. Don't go too far or fast in the beginning.

— it's better for both to run early in the morning or after work or school, not in the heat of the day.

— try to run on soft pavement, grass or track. You may be wearing reinforced athletic shoes, but your dog only has two pair of pads.

— talk to your dog as you run. He'll enjoy the company. You'll enjoy getting your mind off running. It will help regulate your breathing and the experience will be more pleasant for both of you.
