

### Geronimo to face charge for outburst

Joseph Geronimo, long-time political opponent of Mescalero Apache President Wendell Chino, said Friday he has been charged with disturbing the peace because of his heated objection to the ejection of a reporter from a tribal council meeting.

He is scheduled to appear in tribal court on the misdemeanor charge today and intends to ask for a trial by jury, he said.

"This action violates my freedom of speech," Geronimo said.

The charges are tied to Geronimo's statements during a June 22 council meeting, when a reporter from *The Ruidoso News* was asked to leave and all others were allowed to stay.

Geronimo angrily told council members they were violating federal and tribal law, and then offered his opinion about their ethics and Chino's competency.

### Business owners to tour Fort Stanton

Businesses interested in leasing historic Fort Stanton, a former military complex and state hospital, are invited to tour its 1,240 acres Wednesday.

The state General Services Department has issued an invitation to view the fort. Officials hope the tour will encourage businesses to submit proposals for its use by the deadline of Nov. 13. A final award of lease is scheduled for Dec. 29.

## Sculpture draws crowds to museum

Young Cody Ward stood beneath the hooves of the Arabian, eyes wide and mouth gaping.

"It's really neat," the boy said. "I like the white one (the Arabian) best."

Cody was touring Free Spirits at Noisy Water, unveiled July 15 at The Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs, with his mother Sherry.

The Wards, residents of Amarillo, Texas, were visiting relatives in Ruidoso when they heard about the huge sculpture of eight running horses.

"I think they're simply beautiful," Sherry Ward said. "When we heard about them we just had to come and see."

Free Spirits at Noisy Water is 255 foot long and 36 foot high. Each horse is 1.5 times life size. The creation of Ruidoso artist Dave McGary, it is mounted on a man-made landscaped mountain built with 94,500 square feet of dirt.

### Huge visitor increase

The immensity of the sculpture has also created an immense increase in visitors to the neighboring museum.

Spurring an increase in museum traffic was the intention of McGary from the beginning.

"The Hubbards founded the Museum of the Horse and I realized that it was a real gem and that not enough people were aware of it," McGary said. "I told Mr. Hubbard that he needed something big!"

The plan apparently worked. "It's going to be a fantastic year," said director of retail operations Jay Chase. "The museum has always had a lot to offer, but Free Spirits at Noisy Water is bringing

even more people in.

"We've seen a definite increase in traffic," agreed museum director Jay Wright.

Before the unveiling of the sculpture, a good day's attendance at the museum was between 50 to 100 people, Wright said.

"We're running 300 to 400 people a day through the museum now," he said. "The monument is averaging about 800 people a day, so we are getting about half of them to actually come into the museum."

From Friday, July 14 to Thursday, July 20, a total of 7,412 people toured the museum. That's seven times more people than last year, when 1,076 people toured the museum from Friday, July 15 through Thursday, July 21, 1994. The increase in traffic means thousands of dollars more in admission sales each week.

Museum attendance for 1994 was 26,511 people. This year, 18,200 people have already passed through the museum's doors.

The Museum of the Horse is relatively new to Ruidoso Downs. Since May of 1992, the museum has been providing visitors with a look at a vast collection of fine art, Indian artifacts, wagons, carriages, saddles and a multitude of horse-related artifacts.

Museum officials are confident that because of Free Spirits at Noisy Water, more and more people will travel to this area.

"I think the economic impact of this is going to be great," Wright said. "I think it will continue to be a major attraction."

Because of the amount of press coverage throughout the Southwest, people will travel long distances to view the Ruidoso Downs monument, Wright predicted.

"We blanketed this whole region

with press," he said. "I think people are going to get in their cars to drive here and see it from all over West Texas, Albuquerque, Santa Fe and as far away as Denver."

"I think that the museum will probably not stay this high, but it will certainly increase."

### Economic boost

Funding for the non-profit Museum of the Horse comes mainly from admission prices, memberships and donations.

"We just kind of have to live on what we have," he said. "The influx of people because of Free Spirits at Noisy Water is going to help a lot."

Wright believes the sculpture will help the entire community's economy.

"I think the economic impact for the entire area is going to be significant," he said. "People visiting the monument and the museum are bound to spend money throughout the area."

Unfortunately, Ruidoso Downs Race Track has not seen the same kind of increase in numbers since the opening of Free Spirits at Noisy Water.

"People who are going to see the sculpture are going to see the sculpture," explained Jon Sherry, director of resort development for Hubbard Enterprises. "People who come to the racetrack come to gamble, and we've really seen no increase."

### Miniatures selling well

Museum visitors who can't get enough of the sculpture can buy miniature limited edition bronze versions called maquettes there.

"Dave McGary created the maquettes of each of the individual breeds," Wright said. "They are for sale exclusively by the museum and

have been selling extremely well."

Maquette prices range from \$450 for the quarter horse bust to \$30,000 for the Masterwork, which represents the entire sculpture. Only 15 Masterworks were produced.

"We've already sold eight of the Masterworks, 20 of the trio and we sold out of the paint mare and foal," Wright said.

Most of the maquettes sell for around \$1,750 but prices will go up Aug. 1, Wright said.

Proceeds from maquette sales also benefit the museum, and a six-month membership is included with each maquette purchase.

"So many people are picking up our membership brochures that we've had to have more printed," Wright added. "More and more people are starting to sign up and that's really good."

### Visitors Impressed

Hazel Young of Houston was visiting Free Spirits of Noisy Water with her husband Ed.

"It's amazing, just amazing," Hazel said. "It's really wonderful how they have the trail so you can walk around and see the horses."

Hazel was referring to the paved walkway that winds around the monument so people can get a close-up look at the horses.

"I can't believe how they have them mounted with their legs in the air," Ed said, referring to the engineering feat that has the horses leaping and running in the air. All of the sculptures except the Standardbred and the Arabian, which are mounted on their two back legs, are mounted on one leg. The paint colt's legs never touch the ground because it is attached to its mother.

## Racetrack in peril

With more than half the racing season over, betting and attendance figures at Ruidoso Downs Race Track have continued to drop in an ominous trend.

Track attendance is down 18.5% and the betting handle is down 31% from last year.

Racetrack owner R.D. Hubbard projects a \$2 million loss this year at Ruidoso Downs.

"I don't see how we can continue to operate the way we've been operating," Hubbard said.

Echoing his boss, track manager Scott Wells said, "If we don't get (expanded gambling) legislation passed in January, then we will definitely, definitely not be open next year. I couldn't even advise it (to Hubbard) — as much as I love this place — I couldn't even advise it. And he's too smart a businessman to do that anyway."

Wells, who just took an extended leave of absence late last week (please see story on sports page), described this year's trend as "alarmingly consistent" with the last two years at the track.

Heading into the weekend, 96,946 fans have turned the stiles at Ruidoso Downs this season. Last year at this time, 119,018 fans had spent a day at the races.

The betting handle is down \$2 million from last year. Total handle, which includes off track and on track wagering, was \$12,288,000 through July 19, and from that handle the track has paid out \$9,953,280 in winning tickets.

"After cutting several hundred thousand dollars out of the budget in the form of salary cuts and reduced spending and reduced hiring, we're on pace to lose \$1.7 million this year," Wells said.

But Wells added he was encouraged by a meeting with horse racing industry members and lobbyists about the state's horse racing industry held Wednesday morning.

"The general feeling is that something must be done to save racing, and something will be done," Wells said.

At the Free Spirits at Noisy Water sculpture dedication July 15, Hubbard said he would like to see a special legislative session this year to discuss Indian gaming compacts in light of a recent state Supreme Court ruling against the governor's authority to sign the compacts — with racetrack gambling tacked onto the agenda.

Hubbard said it would be "a very strong possibility" that racetracks would get some form of gambling from such a special session.

"It's an opportunity to get a level playing field — it's not just what the governor wants now, it's what the Legislature wants," Hubbard said. "We've got to have other forms of gambling, that's all there is to it."

Track officials blame gambling at the neighboring Mescalero Apache Reservation for their woes.

Wells predicted the track could double or even triple its purses with video gaming, "and that will start that very happy cycle of better purses equals better horses."

"Better horses equals better attendance and more handle. More handle then generates better purses, and you get into that win-win type of cycle."

# Lincoln County government faces four new lawsuits

The high cost of litigation irritated Lincoln County Commissioners while they reviewed the county's 1995-96 budget Wednesday.

They complained about past lawsuits involving the sheriff's department. An age discrimination suit filed by E.J. Fouratt recently resulted in a \$40,000 settlement against the department, they said.

And now the county is facing three more suits, Commissioner Wilton Howell said. In response to Howell's query on who is being sued, County Attorney Alan Morel said two are against deputies and the sheriff's office. The third concerns a traffic accident involving an employee of the assessor's office.

Commissioners didn't know it Wednesday, but a fourth suit also has been filed, this one in federal district court against the sheriff's department and deputy Paul Wersich.

"There's some talk that this (Fouratt age discrimination) case should be sealed," Howell said. "But I'm here to tell you when it costs the county \$40,000, people ought to know who caused it. I'm tired of trying to take care of and propping up people in the back room (closed executive sessions on litigation). I'm tired of financing deals on the backs of the taxpayers."

Sheriff James McSwane said Thursday that the commission in general and Howell in particular are being unfair in their criticism of his department.

"Other law enforcement agencies

in the state receive the same or more suits and it's not an issue," he said. "It just happens. Unfortunately, it's part of the job. In comparison, we're not served more than anyone else."

"I believe the commission has been on the receiving end of several suits themselves."

McSwane said he learns about commission dissatisfaction from the newspaper instead of from commissioners directly, and said Howell should check his facts before offering opinions.

"Obviously, the commission believes the public should know every allegation against the sheriff's department," McSwane said. "Other counties don't feel responsible to bring up pending litigation."

"I don't know anything about the last suit (against Wersich). I don't know much more (about the other suits) than, we'll go to court and see."

## Details of suits

According to a federal court clerk, a lawsuit was filed June 28 by Lucy Hahn against deputy Paul Wersich, the commissioners and three other men.

Hahn's attorney, Albert Rivera of Alamogordo, declined to talk about specifics in the suit. County Attorney Alan Morel said Thursday he has not received a copy of the lawsuit and was unaware of the basis for the case.

In a suit filed June 15 in county district court, Jerry Hugh Collins, a resident of San Antonio, Texas, alleged that deputy sheriffs Larry

Cearley and Trini Zapeda acted improperly when trying to evict him on Oct. 19, 1994, from a home he was leasing. He contended they acted without any court orders or legal authority and accused them of false arrest.

He further alleged they were abusive and humiliated him.

Collins stated his civil rights had been violated, and asked for punitive as well as actual damages.

In a suit filed June 22, Freddy Delgado, Victor Delgado and Samantha Seward sued deputy Angelo Vega individually, the White Mountain (drug) Task Force, the sheriff's department and the county of Lincoln.

The plaintiffs alleged their civil rights were violated, they were wrongfully arrested and should receive damages. They stated that on Oct. 20, 1994, Vega went to their home and harassed them without a warrant or probable cause.

The improper acts were conducted knowingly and maliciously, they contend. They're asking for actual and punitive damages for emotional distress.

Donald K. Edgar of Lincoln County is suing the county and Ronnie J. Beltran, who works in the assessor's office.

Edgar alleges that on June 30, 1994, Beltran while driving a county pickup was negligent in failing to yield the right of way and taking other steps to avoid hitting a car being driven by Edgar.

The suit asks for damages to cover medical expenses, to replace or repair the Edgar vehicle, and for other compensation.

# Nuke protesters pass through

One of the best ways to prevent a nuclear waste dump near Ruidoso or any other small community is to build coalitions, four visitors to Lincoln County said Friday.

It would have been difficult to overlook their visit.

They parked a mobile museum and a mock transportation cask for spent nuclear fuel rods in a parking area off Sudderth and Country Club drives and began handing out flyers. The literature urged families to buy a geiger counter and use it at home and when traveling, because of radioactive material that is being transported on the nation's highways.

The four represented three different groups that had come together at White Sands Missile Range July 16 to mark the 50th anniversary of the detonation of the world's first atomic bomb.

Lou Zeller arrived from the Blue Ridge Environmental Defense League in North Carolina.

Susan Lee drove up from Texas as part of the Earth and Sky Women's Peace Caravan. Susan Garland and Diane Harris represent the All Peoples' Coalition

headquartered in Albuquerque.

"We find ourselves working more and more in coalitions with other groups," Garland said. "We're here because we know people are very concerned. They need to understand that something can be done."

She was referring to a plan, already approved by Mescalero Apache voters, to haul nuclear waste from commercial power plants to the reservation that adjoins Ruidoso.

"Other communities have organized and done the same, defeated things like this, without money, just using the Bill of Rights," Zeller said. He worked with a group that was successful in Madison County, N.C., he said.

Garland said their ultimate goal is to force the nuclear industry to stop producing waste until scientists have developed a safe method of transportation, disposal or recycling of the by-products and spent fuel.

Even if the Mescalero site is never used and the proposed Sierra Blanca site near El Paso, Texas, is never opened, nuclear waste will be transported across state highways to the federal Waste Isolation Pilot Plant in Carlsbad or to other

disposal sites somewhere else in the West, Lee said.

"How much is being moved today without our knowledge?" she asked rhetorically. Her group alleges some truckers aren't even aware they are hauling radioactive material, and some of the material is not in lead-lined containers.

"We sympathize with the needs for jobs at Mescalero," Lee said. "But we believe the beauty of the land and the health of the Mescalero children should come first. We'd like to see the utilities finance work at the reservation on renewable sources of energy."

Mescalero tribal officials say the storage project is a chance to bring economic prosperity to the reservation and to provide better educational opportunities for the children. They say the nuclear storage industry has a record of safety and that exposure to risk will be minimal.

After their stop in Ruidoso Friday, the four new friends planned to drive through Mescalero Saturday and attempt to hand out literature there. They will stay together a while longer and then join up with others seeking the same goals.

# Grazing to be hot topic at Farm Bureau meeting here

Federal grazing legislation will be a hot topic at the New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau's Summer Leadership Conference this week in Ruidoso.

The conference will be held July 25-27 at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

"Under the current formula, there is no problem. But there are pending regulations that are to go into effect in August through the Department of Interior Secretary, Bruce Babbitt. The bill that Babbitt proposes is very extreme and it would be absolutely detrimental to our grazing lands and our state," said Norm Plank, executive vice president of the state's Farm and Livestock Bureau.

"We feel like Babbitt just has it in for the West," said Duane Frost, president of the Lincoln County Farm and Livestock Bureau.

The bureau is fighting Babbitt's proposal. Members generally support Sen. Pete Domenici's proposed grazing legislation, which has passed the Senate Natural Resources Committee. The New Mexico senator's bill will go to the full Senate either before or after the August recess.

"Domenici's bill is something we could live with," Frost said.

The farm organization feels

much differently about New Mexico's other senator, Jeff Bingaman, who proposed another version of new grazing legislation last week.

"The problem with Bingaman's bill is that it basically rehashes 'Rangeland Reform' that was proposed by Secretary of the Interior Babbitt about two to three years ago. It (Babbitt's reform) was widely criticized as being unworkable. This is that old stuff brought up again," said Erik Ness, director of information and public relations for the state Farm and Livestock Bureau.

Bingaman's bill would increase the cost of grazing livestock on federal lands so much that it would just put people out of business, Ness predicted.

Frost feels the rules and regulations proposed by Bingaman would hurt even more.

"He (Bingaman) would give Bureau of Land Management rangers and forest rangers complete dominance. Any decision they make would be immediate. If, for instance, they decided to get all your livestock off, you'd have to get it off and then you could appeal it. So you'd lose money until the appeal was settled or not," Frost said.

Another issue that will be a hot topic at the Ruidoso Civic Center during the next few days is the Endangered Species Act.

# Commissioners file complaint against former county attorney

A complaint against former county attorney J. Robert Beauvais is being sent to the disciplinary board of the State Bar Association by the Lincoln County Commission.

In a 4-1 vote during a special meeting Wednesday in Ruidoso, commissioners said they wanted the bar association to determine if Beauvais improperly divulged confidential information and has operated under a conflict of interest since leaving as county attorney two years ago.

Commissioner L. Ray Nunley voted against the motion. Commissioner Bill Schwetzmann was silent, but voted for the action. Commissioners Stirling Spencer and Wilton Howell and Chairman Monroy Montes said they strongly supported the move.

"I think anyone has a right to file a complaint and that's what the process is for," Beauvais said Thursday from his office in Ruidoso. "I certainly don't feel I have violated any confidences or performed in an unethical way. I think I was completely above board about it."

"There's a process set up to handle those matters and I don't have any problem with them raising that issue and dealing with it in the appropriate context."

In a letter to Virginia L. Ferrara, chief disciplinary counsel for the bar association in Albuquerque, commissioners cited several incidents they say may constitute violations of the rules of professional conduct.

On behalf the commission, County Attorney Alan Morel wrote that Beauvais had served as county counsel for two years, ending in February 1994. However, he retained several pieces of litigation, including defending the county against a former road department employee who sued the county over his dismissal.

Specifically, commissioners are questioning whether Beauvais acted properly by:

— appearing for Enos J. Fouratt before the New Mexico Department of Labor in a case against the sheriff's department while he still represented the county in the road department lawsuit.

Commissioners notified Beauvais of their belief that the action amounted to a conflict of interest in a letter dated Aug. 30, 1994, Morel wrote.

— publicly discussing advice he offered to the commission while employed as county attorney. Morel

cited a quote from Beauvais concerning his advice on front foot road assessments offered during a meeting Feb. 7, 1995.

Beauvais commented that the front foot assessment situation and his advice to the commission had been discussed extensively in public commission meetings long before the particular session cited by Morel.

— subsequently filing an age discrimination lawsuit against the sheriff's department on Fouratt's behalf in federal district court in late 1994. That case still was in progress when Beauvais represented the sheriff in a dispute with the commission over the fate of a drug investigation unit, Morel wrote.

Commissioners contend that Beauvais may have violated a prohibition in the rules of conduct that says an attorney may not use information acquired during past representation to the disadvantage of the former client, except when the information has become generally known or under other specific situations spelled out in the rule.

They also question whether Beauvais may have violated a prohibition against representing a client, if it will be directly or substantially adverse to another client. Morel wrote.

"It gives me heartburn, an attorney serving two masters at one time and then sending us the bills for both," Howell said.

# Hotel work halted by Ruidoso officials

A Ruidoso village official has ordered all construction to stop on the new Holiday Inn Express hotel on U.S. Highway 70.

The stop work order was issued after the hotel's architect and contractor allegedly failed to submit proper site development plans. The order will be discussed at the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission's 2 p.m. meeting today at city hall.

Village Building Inspector Larry Hill issued the stop work order to the hotel's general contractor, Gerhart Enterprises, after verbal promises of cooperation allegedly proved empty. Hill said in a letter he waited nearly two months for submission of revamped site development plans.

Changes to the original construction plans involved repositioning of the building, revised parking circulation, grading, drainage and landscaping, Hill's letter to the contractor stated.

the construction contractor's alleged failure to have the footing and slab of the building inspected prior to concrete being poured. This is a direct violation of the New Mexico Uniform Building Code and a village ordinance, Hill said.

With the July 13 stop work order, the previous approval of plans by the P&Z are "null and void," Hill said.

Hill said work at the site may not resume until a corrected site development plan is submitted; the architect provides certification that all work already completed complies with state and village building code requirements; inspection and test reports supporting the certification are submitted; and a full-time special inspector acceptable to Hill is appointed to provide inspection of all the remaining structural work.

Failure to provide certification that the already completed construction meets state building codes may require removal of completed work, Hill said.

### Late Spring and Early Fall

In all the years I have lived here in Storm Vale, I have never seen the children of Mother Earth bounce back from the drought after the rains the way they have this year.

The small apricot tree, after leafing out with very small leaves, now has close-growing large leaves, and in only eight or 10 days has put on a foot of new terminal growth at the ends of the branches.

The yellow roses did not bloom at their usual season in May, and some of the plants seemed dead. Yet new shoots came up from the roots of these, and the old stalks took on new life, sending out bright golden blooms in early July — two months late.

A little bush in the yard that is close kin to the Alaska blueberry, died down to the ground and then sprang up like magic from the roots after the rains.

Some of the lilac bushes have grown almost a foot taller.

Little herbs and wildflowers that haven't been seen in years have appeared all in a day. Tiny new plants of the wild grape have covered the ground under some of the river trees.

On the other hand, it is a surprise to see

the green wild walnuts already on the ground under the giant trees — here in mid-July.

Even the squirrels seem puzzled by the early falling of the walnuts.

On the large oak trees you can see the acorns already almost full sized here in July.

It seems that the late spring has overtaken a bit of early fall. This brings us wonderful weather here in our mountain land. It is a time of shining green on every pageant, and gold and pink and purple cloud rainbows.

The air is pure, washed by the rains and fragrant from spring and mid-summer flowers.

The nights are cool and the days just right, causing us to send up prayers for the folks up in the east and Midwest who suffered through the record heat wave.

### The Pageant and the Rain

The Lincoln Historic Pageant is held each year on the first weekend in August — right in the middle of the rainy season.

**Hollywood**

George A. Friedembloom became the first postmaster of the office established in 1926. He operated a store and had come from Hollywood, Fla. In 1932, E.E. Miller became postmaster and moved the office to the Miller farm east of the present highway. As the community grew, a highway was built and the office was moved near this highway. The Hollywood, N.M. office at one time had three clerks and a postmaster who copied with mail addressed to other Hollywood offices around the country. In 1971, the Hollywood office was combined with the one in Ruidoso. Had Friedembloom known of the other Hollywood offices he might have chosen another name. There are still 13 post offices bearing the name. The office served patrons well in the land of tall pines, cool summers and deep snows. Hollywood is now Ruidoso Downs.

# Street vendors may stage return here after court ruling

Street vendors may be able to return to Ruidoso, provided they comply with zoning codes.

About 10 vendors are cited each week for their illegal mobile vending, a village code enforcement officer said. Possible fine is a maximum 90 days in jail or a \$500 fine.

Two street vendors cited six times in the past three months won their day in court Thursday, after Village Attorney John Underwood moved to dismiss charges. Municipal Judge Mike Line granted the move.

"The written agreement of a property owner, agent, employee or subcontractor for the sale of goods (at the business site) will serve as a business license," Underwood said.

Vendors must also have written permission and access to restrooms and adequate parking, Underwood said. They cannot take any of the

necessary parking for the business and can not block public rights of way.

Underwood's opinion was based on a 1992 village code allowing businesses to conduct outdoor sale displays on their property for three days at a time, village officials said.

Caught off guard upon hearing of Underwood's outdoor sales code interpretation, Mayor Jerry Shaw expressed concern.

"It sounds like it invalidates the ordinance we wrote," she said, adding that Underwood was the village attorney when the council approved the vending ban Underwood now says may be unconstitutional.

"The village attorney is supposed to advise us to prevent this sort of thing from happening," Shaw said.

Mobile vending was banned by the Ruidoso Village Council last summer after merchants com-

plained the vendors were unfairly competing with their businesses since they don't pay gross receipt taxes, don't have business licenses and don't need Planning and Zoning Commission site development approvals.

Alan Morel, attorney for Ruidoso fruit vendors Elbert Dubose and Joe John Leverman, argued the blanket ban against mobile vending is unconstitutional. Underwood agreed the ban could be considered "an unconstitutional taking."

The two Ruidoso men, who work together, have been cited for mobile vending outside Wal-Mart and Rich Gas on Mechem Drive. Both business managers granted them permission to sell their fruit at the sites, Dubose said.

Rich Gas owner Bill McCarty told code enforcement personnel over the July 4 holiday he had not only purchased Dubose's cantaloupes and watermelons, he

had also hired him as an employee to sell the fruit. Dubose and Leverman were still cited, and his case went to court.

Only one mobile vendor is currently allowed to operate in town, selling roasted corn in front of the Ruidoso Store. P&Z officials said the booth was grandfathered before last summer's ordinance took effect, because they had been set up for months at a time in the same spot. The vendors will lose their license if they move away from the spot for longer than 90 days.

Dubose and Leverman have been selling summer fruits in Ruidoso for the past seven years, longer than the corn vendors, Morel said. The ban violates interstate commerce laws as well as his clients' right to equal protection and due process of the law, Morel said.

"Under due process my clients

should have the opportunity to be heard, but there isn't even a mechanism for them to go in (before the P&Z) and seek the grandfather clause," Morel said.

Alan Briley, assistant village manager, said products being sold outside must be covered under the license at the business site. For instance, a jewelry store owner with a license to specifically sell jewelry cannot sell fruit too. But licenses stipulating "retail sales" create a "gray area" for what can be sold, Briley added.

Village code enforcement officer Harlan Vincent said many of the vendors left litter in their wake.

"It looked trashy, had a carnival atmosphere," Vincent said of the vendors, who set up spot sales of fruit, cigars, hats, pottery, antiques and clothes. "Every weekend they still come into town and we run them off."

Dubose said after the court settlement that he gathers produce from McAllen, Texas, and then works his way through New Mexico farms as the growing season progresses.

"My stuff is fresh. I go to the efforts of waiting for the crops to come up — go directly to the farms," he said.

Mayor Shaw had an idea for an alternative way to sell fresh crops, but it didn't fly.

"I thought it would be a good idea to look into a farmers market," Mayor Shaw said. "I've seen them in other towns and they've worked well. But the vendors were not at all receptive to the idea and nothing more has been done about it."

Dubose said a farmers market is "too seasonal," and "it ties up property too long for one product — you can only get good produce two months out of a year."

# Ruidoso airport will upgrade pilot aid with new landing instruments

Pilots flying through rough weather will find a smoother approach to Ruidoso's mesa-top runway once improved landing instruments are installed at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

Formal acceptance of a \$283,496

federal grant, which will fund the purchase and installation of the instrument landing system (ILS), will be decided by the Ruidoso Village Council at its 6:30 p.m. Tuesday meeting in city hall.

The FAA has approved issuing the grant. The grant requires a 5% funding match from both the vil-

lage and the state. Approximately \$14,175 in village funds have been appropriated for the project.

The ILS is a sophisticated system run by the Federal Aviation Administration to help aircraft have precision approaches when weather or visibility is poor, explained Alan Briley, assistant vil-

lage manager.

Implementation of the system may also help lure larger carriers into scheduling commercial service here, village officials have said.

Councilors will also consider a \$137,235 bid award to Airport Systems International, Inc. for furnish-

ing and delivering the ILS during the meeting. The award will be funded through the federal grant. And the councilors will consider a \$75,350 bid from Current Electric, Inc. for installation of the landing instruments and construction of landing improvements.

Also at the meeting, councilors

will consider:

- a joint powers agreement with the Village of Ruidoso Downs for a police narcotics enforcement unit;
- a contract with the Lincoln County Humane Society for kennel facilities and humane care of stray animals.

## Feet Down First wins the Rainbow

Jockey Tami Purcell qualified three horses for the Grade I \$475,889 Rainbow Futurity in the July 6 trials, and had a difficult choice prior to the running of Sunday's 400-yard final.

The winningest female rider in quarter horse history chose fastest qualifier Feet Down First, and the 2-year-old filly made Purcell look like a genius as she broke out to an early lead and cruised home to win the second jewel of the Quarter Horse Triple Crown by 1 1/4 lengths. The winning time was 19.78.

Even-money favorite Run Em Up finished second, while Heavenly Note was third.

Ruidoso Futurity winner Real Six Time was denied a shot to join Special Effort as the second winner of the Triple Crown when he stumbled badly at the start and finished eighth in the nine-horse field.

"He just fell down," said Real Six Time's jockey Tame Green. "He broke real hard and the ground broke out from under him and then he was on his nose. It's just one of those things that happens sometimes."

The other two horses qualified by Purcell, Winners Dash and Temerity Wrangler, finished fifth and seventh respectively.

Purcell, who won her first Grade I race aboard Bullet Bullion in the 1993 Remington Park Futurity, said Feet Down First ran a nearly flawless race.

"She broke extremely well and ran really smoothly the whole way, which made my job a lot easier," said the 35-year-old Purcell, who joined Nancy Summers as the only other female to win two Grade I quarter horse races.

"It was a tough choice (to decide which one of her three qualifiers to ride), but I made the right one," said Purcell, who rode all three in the trials for trainer James McArthur.

McArthur, who has won two All American Futurities, added the Rainbow to his list of accomplishments when the Arizona-bred daughter of First Down Dash crossed the line first.

"The race came out the way I hoped it would," McArthur said, ad-

ding "but I'd been worried about Feet Down First because she had a foot abscess between the trials and the final and I was hoping she'd be all right today."

"Evidently it was healed and she ran a beautiful race. It looks like she's headed for the All American now," McArthur said.

Owned by Charles and Dixie Patterson of Wimberley, Texas, Feet Down First earned \$196,416 for the win. She will make her next start in the Aug. 18 All American Futurity Trials. The Pattersons also own Temerity Wrangler who ran seventh.

"It was hard to watch both horses in the race, but that's not something I'm complaining about," Charles Patterson said.


It was the first stakes win for Feet Down First, who has two victories from five career starts with earnings of \$205,000.

**NOTES:** The J.B. Montgomery-trained filly Three Runs shattered the 49-year-old track record for 220 yards when she ran the distance in 11.82 seconds in Sunday's ninth race. Ridden by Jerry Rodriguez, Three Runs won the \$3,700 allowance contest by a half-length over 9-5 favorite MD Hammetime. The previous record was set July 23, 1951 by Gingerbread B.

It was the second track record to be broken this week, and third this summer. Modern Woman broke the 330 yard mark on Friday, while Ole White Lightning established a new standard for 250 yards on July 2.

## New Mexico's top fillies qualify for Aug. 5 Kachina Stakes

Longshot My Sassy Ego was second. The second trial division was captured by 12-1 shot Forever Fern, who outbattled favored St. Helens Shadow in the deep stretch to narrowly win the six-furlong sprint by a neck. The time was 1:12.4, nearly two full seconds faster than Straight Sets' clocking of 1:14.3.

The first six finishers in each division qualified to the Aug. 5 Kachina. The following is a list of

qualifiers: Straight Sets, My Sassy Ego, Mari Go Round, Juanita J., Kelli Reed, Lady Voy, Forever Fern, St. Helens Shadow, Sasha's Pal, Most Photogenic, Set Values and Cookie Supreme.

The 330-yard track record of 17.00, set by Diamond Charge in 1960, was eclipsed Friday in the fifth race by the 3-year-old filly Modern Woman, who ran the distance in a blazing 16.86.

The New Mexico-bred filly by The Dash won the race by a neck over Casafull for her second

straight win and third career win in 18 outings. Modern Woman is trained by Gregg Sanders and owned by Patrick Brilliant of El Paso.

The former record-holder Diamond Charge was partly owned by Ruidoso Downs Race Track owner R.D. Hubbard and his mark at the time was a world record which stood for many years.

# A flurry of Evening Snow upsets the field

Trainer John Bassett capped off a three-win afternoon when he saddled 8-1 outsider Evening Snow for a victory in Saturday's \$85,300 Rainbow Futurity Consolation at Ruidoso Downs.

Evening Snow rocketed out of the gate in the field of 10 juveniles and, under the stiff urging from jockey Ken Hart, reached the end of the 400 yards in 19.89, a 1 1/4 lengths in front of Scarlet Oh.

Some Swinger was a neck behind in third place, while the crowd's favorite Willow Beda Chick was unable to overcome a troubled start and finished fifth.

Bassett, who won Saturday's fifth race with Legacy Elect and the sixth with Miss Jaclyn Jean, praised Evening Snow's speedy start.

"What's happening is that this horse is finally coming into himself. It's almost August, and I've finally got him to break out of the gate," Bassett said. "He had an injured hock last winter, and then some other physical problems right before the Ruidoso Futurity, and we were unable to work him out of the starting gate."

Bassett added, "His next start will be the All American Trials on August 18, and I think he'll be even better by then."

Abigail Kawanakoa, owner of Evening Snow, won the 1991 All American with A Classic Dash.

Bassett's consolation win took out some of the sting when he was forced to scratch Dash Back To Me, the filly he had qualified for Sunday's Grade I Rainbow Finals because of a fractured canon bone.

"This does help," Bassett said. "It's always hard to make the finals for a race like this, and it's even harder to win them."

Evening Snow's jockey Kenny Hart said, "Evening Snow broke real good this time. We had trouble getting this colt to break from the gate and John has done a great job because I think he's getting better. The two outside horses (Scarlet Oh and Some Swinger) were real close to us out of the gate, and halfway down they got even with us, but this colt came back on strong to overtake them at the end."

Jockey Billy Peterson, who piloted the favored Willow Beda Chick, didn't have the luck of Hart had at the starting gate.

"He dove into the five horse (Up Down Dash) really bad, and I don't know why, because he never broke bad like that before," Peterson said. "Then all the way down the track he started 'crossfiring' - switching leads, and never really got going."

Shaula and her husband, Dick, explained to me a problem that has developed concerning their Montessori School, which is a private education school in Ruidoso. They advised me that a regulation was established by the New Mexico State Legislature in 1987, to prevent private schools from educating children five years or younger, to just being taken care of. This regulation reduces all private schools educating children of this age to child care centers.

In my opinion, this is inconsistent. Reducing the Culls' high level of education to plain caretaking evidently was not even studied by the Legislature. The Culls were never notified prior to this regulation being instituted. This in itself is a violation of normal political discussion prior to voting.

I have no problem with New Mexico inspecting private centers to insure that they are safe and secure. As you may note, I am a Certified Protection Professional. But, the making of private educational schools into child care centers is definitely a combination of incorrectness.

I trust that as a professional, Ms. Wilson, you will have the New Mexico State Legislature correct this regulation.

### Visit school and see for yourself

(The following letter was sent to State Rep. Dub Williams and Heather Wilson, secretary of the state department of Children, Youth and Families. It was copied to The Ruidoso News.)

TO THE EDITOR:

This letter is written in support of the Starlite Montessori Preschool, which I understand is going to have to close unless they comply with the Child Day Care Regulations. Starlite Montessori Preschool is not a day care facility and to label it as such would discredit the unique learning experience offered by Shaula and Dick Cull.

My three-year-old daughter attended preschool at Starlite Montessori in 1991-1992 while I was a general medical officer in the Public Health Service at the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation.

Her days were spent learning about the world around her through hands-on activities. She learned about the alphabet, numbers, weights and balances, the concept of quantities, the bones and organs of the human body, the concept of time, days on a calendar, the months and seasons of the year, the structure and growth process of plants, the life cycle of butterflies and insects, and about numerous animals. She developed an appreciation for books and reading aloud.

The school is designed specifically to challenge and provide a learning experience for the child. My daughter participated in the care of the school pet, preparing snacks and cleaning up after her activities which helped develop her confidence, motor and social skills. There was no use of television to babysit or instruct the children. Starlite Montessori is a learning center (i.e., preschool) and not a day care facility.

Before the state bureaucracy relegates Starlite Montessori Preschool to the level of a child care facility, I strongly recommend you visit the school and see what a wonderful school Dick and Shaula Cull have developed over the last 12 years. I guarantee you'll wish you had a similar school for the children of your community. I know I do. When I moved from Mescalero, I placed my child in a day care facility. It was obvious, after a short period of time, she was bored. I consequently enrolled her into a private preschool. My daughter's verbal, motor and social skills were superior to her classmates, a testimony to the excellent academic foundation she obtained while at Starlite Montessori Preschool. I hope through my support that the necessary changes in state regulations will be made to allow Dick and Shaula Cull to continue their excellent preschool.

### Story of Egyptian fruit production

TO THE EDITOR:

I recently spent four weeks in Egypt as a delicious fruit production consultant in the Farmer to Farmer program under the sponsorship of Agricultural Cooperatives Development International.

In other words, I was in Egypt to help with peach, apple and pear production. Egypt has found that there is enough water in the Nile River and underground to irrigate 1,000,000 feddan (a feddan is 1.05 acres, so for all purposes I am going to use acres). The government has given this land to selected individuals in 6 and 10-acre blocks, but they have to develop the land in three years or they lose it. For this reason there are 300,000 acres of fruit trees, mainly apples and peaches, under five years of age. The farmers' problems are in production, harvesting and marketing. Up until now there has been a shortage of fruit and vegetables; now there is a surplus.

The production problems are emphasized by the highly alkaline soil, pH of 8.5 or higher.

They grow entirely different varieties of fruit than we do. Their majority apple variety is the Anna and the Florida Prince peach with the Early Grand in the Sinai area.

The Egyptians were very friendly and we were expected to drink hot tea before going into the orchard. They had many workers around to do the orchard work. The best I could understand was that they were paid two to four L.E. (Egyptian pounds) per day. Three L.E. are the equivalent to one dollar.

Harvesting of the fruit was in need of improvement. They would pack a box of fruit full and then put two more layers on top. They then used their feet to put pressure enough to get the top on lid on the box because the buyer wanted a full box. They were counseled to handle the fruit like eggs. The surplus of fruit and the need to develop an export market makes it imperative that the fruit be packed bruise free.

We spent a week at El Arish on the Sinai about 70 km. from Gaza. About 13 years ago the could not sell their almonds so they started grafting the almond root to peaches, mainly Early Grand. These peaches are grown dryland with no irrigation. I would not have believed it if I had not seen it with my own eyes. The only reason they can do this is that the orchards are on the Mediterranean coast where there is high humidity. There is such an excess of peaches that they need to develop methods of using the peaches, either dried, as nectar or other manufactured product.

By going to the Sinai we were in Asia; we were in Africa in the rest of Egypt.

# Nogal folks seek to save historic post office building

For the past 50 years, folks around Nogal have looked forward to stopping at their community post office to pick up their mail and the latest gossip.

But the future role of the post office as the social center of the settlement is in jeopardy. The U.S. Postal Service has scouted a new site and plans to haul in a modular unit to modernize the operation and meet a projected 20-year demand for post office boxes.

A group of community historians and members of the family that has owned the building for half a century are circulating petitions to stop the move. They want to keep the post office where it now stands on the main road through the settlement.

Jeff Harris, manager of postal administrative services in Albuquerque, said people are voicing their opposition late in the process, because a new site has been selected.

"They're running a foot race right now and they're running pretty far behind," he said.

## Postal history

Originally operated as a store, the old building doubled at times as a post office until the 1940s. The building's owner, Bob Stearns, estimates it was constructed in the 1930s and was modeled after a building that stood on that site in 1889.

"It depended on which political party was in power," said historian Johnson Stearns. "If it was the right party, the post office stayed here. If it was the other party, it was moved someplace else."

The late Pearl Stearns bought the building 50 years ago and went on to become the oldest active postmaster in the United States, retiring in 1962 at the age of 79.

Although the building's historic integrity has been compromised over the years, the growing group of petitioners think some restoration as well as preservation may be possible. The Stearns have held onto a rocker, an old potbellied stove and some other items removed during renovations. In a 1987 remodeling, old wooden post office boxes (originally used at the Capitan post office) were removed from Nogal and replaced with newer types. They have remained in storage, tagged to be shipped to an historic post office like the one in Lincoln, said current Postmaster Buddy Hill.

## Federal viewpoint

"We are in the process of upgrading the facilities in a number of what we would call smaller offices," Harris said. "About 38 have been selected for replacement. Nogal is one of them."

Buildings slated for replacement generally have no running water, no employee restrooms and have a waiting list for post office boxes, he said.

None of those conditions exist at the Nogal office, but Harris said the department prefers to plan for enough space to meet projected growth during the next 20 years. With the real estate and business activity around Ruidoso, that course seems especially necessary, he said.

"I understood the community had taken issue with the replacement, but I have yet to see anything in terms of a petition or anything like that," Harris said Monday.

"Generally, if I put it on a list for replacement, that truly means I intend to replace it. But there's a rare occasion where the community may be so against it, clearly it is not something we want to do," Harris added.

He questioned whether that's the case in Nogal, noting that at least four people offered sites as a replacement.

In some cases, an adequate replacement site is not available, but that's not the situation in Nogal, he said.

Property owned by Jane Kretzman of the Paz de Nogal Bed and Breakfast has been chosen. Although it is closer than the existing office to a significant curve on State Highway 37 as it descends the mountain from Ruidoso, the site should be safe, Harris said.

"We timed vehicles coming off of it. There's a possibility the state may have us do a deceleration lane," Harris said. "The curve was of great concern to us and caused us to eliminate two other contending sites. We felt that if vehicles rounded that curve at or near the posted speed limit, then everything would be fine."

The selection process has taken months and the Stearns were involved, submitting a proposal for expansion at the existing site, Harris said.

"It didn't appear to us it was a facility that we wanted to go into and expand," he said. "Sometimes what a community sees as historic, we see as a high maintenance building."

"We want to be responsive to the community, but we have taken the position that this building is one that should be replaced. Once I send staff and put a lot of work hours down the road to replacement, it takes a pretty hefty argument to undue that."

## Decision not public

The Stearns said they would have reacted earlier with petitions, but they didn't know of the agency's decision until they heard about it from a neighbor less than two weeks ago.

"These are confidential business dealings and we have to protect our own interests," Harris said. "However, I will say it surprises me that the people not selected weren't notified."

Kretzman said she is not pushing for the post office change, but neither does she oppose it.

"It's a wonderful place," she said of the old post office. "The building is a historical building and there are many other things that can be done with it. People have been talking about putting in a mercantile store or a deli, so the Stearns really need to look at other alternatives."

"One of the things they have been saying is that they would like it back the way it was with the potbellied stove. It's too late for that (if it remains a post office). The build-

ing already has been changed by the post office and they're not going to come back in and unchange it."

Sue Stearns said the family wasn't aware that it could have been pushed before a major renovation in 1987 for the building to be preserved as an historic post office similar to the 110-year-old hand-hewn log building at Luna or the post office at Lincoln.

"Judy Fletcher came in as postmistress and said it needed changes to meet new requirements," Sue Stearns said. The federal agency paid for the changes, she said.

Hill said he is staying neutral on the issue, although he admits the idea of a modern post office is appealing from his standpoint.

"This building is too small and

has had a lot of renovations," he said. "Fletcher" asked for a restroom, which it didn't have before. Now it's just a lobby and boxes, not much different from any other small post office."

But historian Dorothy Guck said visitors and residents are drawn to the building, because its exterior still reminds them of an earlier era.

"People stop here all the time and take pictures," Bob Stearns said, noting the old Coca Cola sign on the side of the building.

## Psychics hope to impart good vibes at local fair

Tired of all those so-called psychic phone lines?

Well, forget the long distance charges, because the Third Annual Psychic Fair is coming to Ruidoso.

The fair, sponsored by The Book Store, will feature not only psychics but also astrologers; tarot card, palm and rune readers; clairvoyants; numerologists; handwriting analysts; and energy channelers.

This year's Psychic Fair will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Enchantment Inn, located on Highway 70 near Wal-Mart on Sunday, July 30.

"Interest has been increasing since we began the fairs," Psychic Fair promoter and The Book Store owner Kate Winner said. "We are hoping to have 400 to 500 people attend this year."

This will be the first year that the Psychic Fair will be at a location as large as the Enchantment Inn, Winner said. Previous fairs were at The Book Store.

"We simply needed more space this year," she said.

At presstime, more than 25 different psychic-orientated services were scheduled to be offered at the fair.

Ginny Stern, who recently moved to Ruidoso from New Jersey, has been a practicing astrologer since 1981 and will be offering her services at the fair.

"It's paradise here," Stern said. "The energy is very high in Ruidoso, both with the river and the mountains."

Stern writes a newsletter for the National Council for GeoCosmic Research, an international company, and travels across the country teaching seminars.

"I teach and lecture all over the country," she said. "In addition to astrology I teach meditation and how to access your inner spirit and higher self, sort of like an empowerment that helps people to begin to pay attention to the inner self and inner voices."

Stern's clients at the fair will

receive information based on their birthdate, she said. She uses a laptop computer to formulate an astrological chart and then interprets the findings.

"It's kind of like a doctor showing a patient an X-ray and explaining it," Stern said.

Handwriting analysis by C. Adrian Messenger is another service being offered at the fair. Messenger, who has lived in Ruidoso for several years, is also an accomplished magician and has been involved in various forms of psychic phenomenon for more than 40 years. He is a member of the Psychic Entertainers Organization and The American Brotherhood of Magicians.

"I'm an entertainer and do stage acts demonstrating psychic phenomenon," Messenger said. "I do the readings because after I'd do a psychic presentation, everybody would come up wanting to know about different things connected with it."

Messenger will be focusing on handwriting analysis at the fair but he also is proficient in tarot, rune and psychic readings, he said.

"When I was about 12 years old, my family moved into a house that had a library in it," he said. "That library was full of books about this kind of thing and that's how I became interested."

Handwriting analysis is a graphic representation of the way someone thinks, Messenger said.

"Essentially what I do is interpret the stroke structure of the handwriting to determine the personality and character of the person," he said.

Messenger said he does not predict the future because the future is up to each person, but the handwriting analysis can make it easier to do and become what a person wants.

"Ideally they would come with a full page of handwriting that they had done at a time when they weren't aware that they were going to have the reading done," he said. "But we can still get an accurate reading, even from a signature."

Vendors will be selling crystals, jewelry and other items at the fair, and all of the various readings at the psychic fair will have one price: \$15 for 15 minutes, Winner said.





Volunteers, volunteers, volunteers: the key ingredient for a successful animal shelter.

"I've visited many animal shelters around the country and some foreign facilities," said Jim Riggins, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road. "Some are very good, others not so good. The one defining point of a truly dynamic program, besides adequate funding, has been a vigorous volunteer base, well organized with enthusiastic members.

"One of our goals for the local shelter is to build a strong volunteer program with local and seasonal adults and young people so that we can accomplish some things only numbers can do."

Currently, all adults and teens 13 years and older are welcomed as volunteers. Younger children are encouraged to visit when they are accompanied by a parent.

"We have a hand full of greatly appreciated volunteers including two R.S.V.P. (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) veteran dog walkers," Riggins said. "Without exception, volunteers gain a great deal of satisfaction from the vital help they give. Volunteering also helps people get over their

aversion to going to animal shelters. Many have seen deplorable conditions elsewhere or feel that it is a sad place."

That definitely is not true with the county shelter just outside Ruidoso, Riggins said.

Riggins and staff also have created a puppy area for visitors and a special get-acquainted section for potential new owners and pets to rub noses.

Basic duties for volunteers are walking, petting, playing with and in general spending quality time with the dogs and cats. The interaction is vital to keeping animals healthy and well socialized, and therefore, more adoptable.

"Volunteers also help with animal hygiene by bathing, brushing, clipping toe nails, blow drying and styling their coats. All to make the already adorable more adoptable," Riggins said.

"In the future, volunteers also will play a role in the humane society's fun activities, such as fund raising efforts, seasonal events and public outreach.

Anyone interested in spending some of their time at the shelter, contact Riggins or assistant director Sandra Ford from 1-5 p.m. Monday through Saturday for a quick tour.
