Aliens detained after fatal crash

Sixteen illegal aliens, all passengers in a van involved in a fatal traffic collision on U.S. 70 last weekend, were apprehended about 4 p.m. Tuesday.

An anonymous caller spotted the men walking along the Rio Hondo, said Lincoln County Deputy Orlando Montes.

Three state police officers and three Lincoln County deputies chased the men to a barn and surrounded them, Montes said. They were taken to the county jail in Carrizozo, where Border Patrol agents took them into custody, he said.

"I questioned 10 of them and they all had the same story," Montes said Wednesday. "They were lying in the back on the floor of the van packed like sardines. They heard a bang, the van stopped abruptly and the two drivers from Arizona told them to run."

"They didn't know where they were."

The drivers have not been found, Montes said. The 1979 Ford van bore an Arizona license plate.

David Lucero, a 31-year-old motorcyclist from San Patricio, died in the accident Sunday. According to the state police report, Lucero turned into the path of the van on U.S. 70 about 20 miles east of Ruidoso. However, the case still is under investigation.

Race, military exhibits highlight anti-drug day

Big guns and big brass should guarantee big fun Friday during the annual Mescaleros Against Drugs Activity Day.

Sponsored by the Mescalero Health Education Department working with the Army National Guard's Drug Interdiction Program, the day has been set aside for drug education through the use of alternative activities, said Barbie Johnson, health education director.

At 8:30 a.m., a free 5K run will break from starting mark.

The National Guard will bring in artillery and offer rides on the big machines. Soldiers will demonstrate camouflage painting. A DWI (driving while intoxicated) van will show videos on substance abuse and simulations of how drinking can affect driving.

All events take place near the tribal grocery store on the south side of U.S. 70. Helicopter flights and rappelling instruction also will be offered.

Lincoln Days revive Old West

On April 28 1881, Billy the Kid shot his way out of the Lincoln County Courthouse and into "wild west" legend.

His spectacular jailbreak catapulted him from the status of a small-time cow thief with a cheery disposition and deadly trigger finger into what is, perhaps, one of the mightiest legends the world has ever known.

At the time of his escape, residents were accustomed to running for cover at the sound of gunfire. Consequently, there were few eyewitnesses to the Kid's most famous escapade.

But this weekend, any adult with \$3 (\$1 for those buckaroos aged 14 and under) can be an eyewitness to the escape without fear of injury. A time machine is not even necessary.

The 46th consecutive presentation of "The Last Escape of Billy the Kid" will be the fea-

tured event of Old Lincoln Days festivities Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The Kid, as portrayed by John Schrecengost, will be blasting his way out of jail and galloping out of town at 8:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday and again at 2 p.m. Sunday.

Onlookers can enjoy a parade at 11 a.m. Sunday led by grand marshal Betty Schrecengost. A bluegrass band performs Friday and Saturday before the "Last Escape."

A fiddler's contest is slated to start at 1:30 p.m. Saturday, and all of the museums will be open until 6 p.m. on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Vendors selling food, clothing and equipment identical to The Kid's era will line Lincoln's only street.

Latter-day mountain men offer "living history" demonstrations of what life was like on the Old West frontier all day Saturday and Sunday using authentic equipment.

"The Last Escape of Billy the Kid" will re-enact not only Billy's escape, but will also provide an encapsulated version of the Lincoln County War.

One of the events recreated from that deadly confrontation will be the gunbattle at Blazer's Mill in what is now Mescalero. The gunfight claimed the lives of Dick Brewer and Andrew L. "Buckshot" Roberts.

Glencoe's Dan Storm will play Buckshot Roberts, and no one is more qualified. As a young man, Dan was personally acquainted with former Regulators George and Frank Coe, who were both present that day at Blazer's Mill with The Kid, aka Billy Bonney.

The history of Lincoln County is not so distant as it might seem from today's busy, automated world when you visit the time capsule of Lincoln village, preserved as an official national landmark and county historic district.

New library could shelve problems

(This is third in a series of seven stories about proposed bond issues for the Village of Ruidoso Aug. 22 election.)

The Ruidoso library is so small and confining there's hardly room for its patrons, librarians say.

The inadequate space has prevented the library from adding new services, even when the money is available.

The Sudderth Drive building's shelves, aisles and floor space are crammed, says library director Nancy Osterberg.

And the popularity of Ruidoso's library — the only public library in Lincoln County — continues to grow.

The building was designed to serve 6,000 visitors annually, but now has 16,000 people passing through its doors each year, and an average of seven new library cards are issued each day.

About 50,000 items are shelved in the library, but the building was

designed to house 5,000 books, Osterberg adds.

There's room for about 23 seats in the library, and the staff says more are needed. Only four tables can fit into the two main rooms, often preventing those doing research from spreading out materials, Osterberg says.

"We're bursting our seams," Osterberg concludes. "We have arranged and rearranged, but we still don't have room."

A new library, twice the size of the present one, will be constructed if a \$1.6 million bond issue is ap-

proved by voters Aug. 22.

If the bond issue is approved, the present library facility will become a senior citizen's center (which currently occupies one room on the west side of the building). However, the library's foyer or part of a room would still serve as a drop-off area for the main library, Village Manager Gary Jackson says.

Expansion of the existing facility is not possible because the library is surrounded by School House Park, Jackson says, and adding another floor to the building won't

Ruidoso principal chosen as 'Zozo's new superintendent

Paula Papponi, Ruidoso Middle School principal for the past five years, has accepted the position of superintendent for the Carrizozo School District.

The Carrizozo School Board voted unanimously to hire Papponi at a special board meeting last night.

"We found out last Wednesday," said Mike Gladden, Ruidoso Superintendent of Schools on Tuesday. "The other principals reported today so we're going to have to move very quickly" to find a replacement.

The district already has received three applications for the job of RMS principal, but the position will be advertised and more applicants may apply, Gladden said.

Papponi replaces Elma Stowe, who has been hired as superintendent of schools for the Silver City School District.

Papponi's husband, Gabriel, is a teacher and the director of special education for the Carrizozo School District.

"I'm very excited," she said about her new job. "I think it's going to be wonderful."

During her years at RMS, a

sense of family developed between Papponi and her staff, she said.

"It's really hard to say goodbye because I felt that my staff and I were like a family," she said. "I want to tell you that I worked with the brightest and the best."

"It's been a real privilege to have been in Ruidoso and I appreciate having had the opportunity to serve as principal. I will miss the relationships I've had with the staff and administration but fortunately, Carrizozo is not that far away so we can still visit."

Papponi's first step in her new job will be to get to know her staff and the community.

"I need lots of community input and will look for direction from the school board," she said.

Papponi holds a master's in curriculum/instruction from New Mexico State University in Las Cruces; a bachelor's from Dowling College in Oakdale, N.Y. where she graduated summa cum laude in 1979; and an associate's from Suffolk County Community College in Selden, N.Y. where she graduated with distinction in 1977.

The new superintendent has recently selected by the National

work either, because there's no room for more parking.

"We have to consider the cultural aspects of life," Jackson says. "It's an important segment and aspect of living, and we feel the need to bring this (library issue) to the public to evaluate."

Officials are looking closely at building a 15,000 square-foot library on village-owned property between city hall and the Kansas City Drive county government building, Osterberg says, but they are still considering other locations.

If voters choose not to pass the library bond issue, renovations would still have to be made to the existing building because it violates federal guidelines for disabled patrons. Neither the shelf-lined aisles nor the restrooms allow for passage of a wheelchair, and the wood-lined sidewalks are a safety hazard, Osterberg says.

And the library staff will also be forced to take out all seating and operate as a "walk in, walk out" library if the bond issue fails, Osterberg predicts.

The lack of space has a domino effect on library services, Osterberg says.

"This year we received a \$20,000 state grant for books, etc., but according to fire and safety codes for this building, we can't add another shelf to the library to shelve the books," Osterberg says.

The library also has a new computerized circulation system — purchased with funds bequeathed by the late Mary Katherine Anderson Dean — but it lacks the space and electrical hookups to operate the unit near the front desk.

Despite a plan to be connected to Internet within five years, the present library offers no computers for patron use. Librarians cite inadequate wiring and electrical outlets as the root of this problem, too.

The public meeting room has al-

ready been converted into a storage area. The closure of the room also resulted in the loss of the only public typewriter.

Osterberg says a better library would create a better quality of life.

"I think a library is extremely important to a community," Osterberg says. "It's important to people's development; it's important to the education of people; it's important to the psychological makeup of a community."

"I don't believe a community can thrive without a thriving library. And in this day and age, a thriving

library is one that connects with the rest of the world.

"We want to see the library here in Ruidoso progress and serve its patrons. We try hard, but we're about 15 years behind in the computer age in this library."

The library bond issue can be voted on separately from the other six capital projects village officials have asked voters to authorize in the election. All seven bond issues have a total price tag of \$6.85 million, and would be paid off in seven years.

If the library bond issue passes,

it will cost property owners about \$46 per year if their property has an assessed value of \$60,000, and roughly \$69 for those with property assessed at \$90,000.

If all seven bond issues pass, the 9.619 mill levy rate will stay the same next year, and then begin to drop in 1997. Taxpayers with property assessed at \$60,000 would be taxed approximately \$192 a year, while properties assessed at \$90,000 would be taxed \$288.

Debt on the seven issues would be paid off by the village by the year 2003, Jackson said.

Passage of any or all the issues will not raise residents' property taxes, but replace taxes already being paid (because of retirement of existing bonds).

Film production group drops out of Fort Stanton bidding

A California-based film production company has withdrawn plans to bid on the lease of Fort Stanton, a former state hospital and historic fort 20 miles northeast of Ruidoso.

After bidders' first conference with state officials last week, Jordan Rivers of Brentwood Entertainment in Thousand Oaks, Calif., issued a statement saying the estimated \$2.4 million annual price tag for the fort's lease, upkeep and operation was too steep. Rivers had visited the site earlier in the year after the complex of 76 buildings was closed as a state hospital.

Rivers said two other factors besides price led to her decision not to compete: 1) the state's one-sided option to terminate a 25-year lease after a year's notice, without reimbursing the lessee for any improvements or money invested, and 2) up to 50 archaeological sites have been identified on fort property, where disturbance of any kind may be prohibited.

"It's a shame," Rivers wrote. "We really wanted to acquire the fort and were even willing to consider a profit participation with the state. But in my opinion, the state got greedy."

Lincoln County Commissioner L. Ray Nunley dismissed Rivers' remarks Tuesday. The state has established what it considers a fair market price for the unique complex, he said. Since the buildings represent 10% of the state's property, it has a substantial investment to protect, he contended.

At the bidders' conference last week, Rex Robberson, director of the state property control division, said he would try to modify the state's rule on the one-year cancellation clause.

Although she has discarded the idea of using Fort Stanton, Rivers said she's still looking for a site in Lincoln County for a smaller scale film production facility.

Skeen and Bradley support federal lands transfer to states

U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen (R-N.M.) said Tuesday, that action on a proposal to transfer federal lands to the state is long overdue.

Skeen said the transfer of Bureau of Land Management (BLM) property to states will bring decisions closer to local residents. He was testifying before the House Resource Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Lands.

The BLM controls about three times more land in New Mexico than the state's land office, but has nine times as many employees, Skeen said.

During the same session, New Mexico's Lt. Gov. Walter Bradley said the federal government's blanket management program for a state with New Mexico's diversity "is a bit like buying the same size shoes for everyone in your family."

The move to take back federal lands is backed by the state's ranching community, which opposes federal dominance.

Blazer's great-grandson recalls county war tales

Art Blazer calls Old Lincoln Days "good history."
He should know. One of the deadly gunfights that occurred about two months into the Lincoln County War of 1878-79 took place at a mill owned by his great-grandfather, Dr. Joseph Blazer.

The gun battle will be re-enacted in Lincoln at 8:30 p.m. this Friday and Saturday, and again at 2:30 p.m. Sunday during the 46th annual Old Lincoln Days festival.

It was on an April day in 1878 when Billy the Kid's band, called the Regulators, clashed at Blazer's Mill with a member of the posse suspected of killing Lincoln merchant John Tunstall.

When the smoke cleared, Regulator Dick Brewer and op-

ponent Andrew L. "Buckshot" Roberts were fatally wounded. Art's great-grandfather Joseph watched the gunfight from a safe distance near his home, while Art's grandfather, 13-year-old Almer, watched the deadly battle from up on a hill.

The Blazer's Mill area, acquired by Doc Blazer about six years before the 1873 establishment of the Mescalero Indian Reservation, contained the sawmill, an office for Doc Blazer (a former dentist), a trading post, post office, and an adobe boarding house.

"One thing I'm proud of is, the Blazers never got involved at all," Art says of the Lincoln County War. "They would feed both sides in the same day, and that's how it happened — they were feeding one when the other came in after their mail."

Buckshot Roberts didn't know

the Regulators were inside the boarding house eating when he rode in to check his mail, Art says.

Regulator Frank Coe told Roberts he had a warrant for his arrest. Then another Regulator, Charlie Bowdre, crept around the corner and ordered Roberts to stick up his hands.

"Roberts had hitched his horse, ran into the building, and they (one of the Regulators) shot him in the stomach," Art continues.

The wounded Roberts stumbled into the doc's office, propped the door open by pulling a mattress onto the floor, then laid on the cushioning after grabbing a rifle from above the door.

It was Doc Blazer's buffalo gun. "Roberts set his eyes on (a puff of) smoke above some logs. Brewer (who was ducking behind those logs) raised up and got shot square between the eyes.

"Grandpa says he must have been a terrible shot because the gun would never shoot straight. It was the reason it was up there (hanging as a display above the doorway), 'cause it never had shot straight."

Brewer died instantly. Roberts died the next day.

Both men were buried at Blazer's Mill. In his book "The Lincoln County War: A Documentary History," historian Frederick Nolan says it's ironic that no one can tell the graves apart because they were left unmarked.

Art Blazer continues to be annoyed by those who claim to know which grave is which.

"They dug a lot of graves up there and dug into graves. The graveyard was established before 1868," Art says. "In 1932 they put in some markers, but no one knew where (Roberts' and Brewer's)

graves were."

The old graveyard can still be found near the Blazer Mill ruins in Mescalero. Almer Blazer and Regulator George Coe were there when the crosses marking the graves for Roberts and Brewer were placed in the ground, but no one really knew where the graves were.

"Grandpa says they built two caskets for the men and dug one grave. They were stuck in the same hole, side by side," Art recounts. "The markers are 15 feet apart — there's no telling where they're buried."

Doc Blazer was buried there, too, around the turn of the century.

Art Blazer, now 73, lived at the mill until 11 years ago, when he retired from running a busing fleet and serving as a maintenance foreman for the Mescalero Reservation. However, members of the fifth, sixth, and seventh generation of the Blazer family still live near the mill.

Only two corners of the old house and a retaining wall from an old corral still stand at the Blazer's Mill site.

A few years back, a man who claimed to be Buckshot Roberts' relative wanted to see his grave, Art notes.

"There was a little diddly I pulled," Art admits.

Art pointed to a grave and pronounced it was Roberts'.

"He was tickled to death," Art recalls, his deep green eyes twinkling as he recounts the scene. "I thought he left a whole lot happier than when he came. I could have

been half right, who knows? What difference did it make?"

Art isn't sure what happened to the infamous buffalo gun. It may have been the gun Art lost as a boy.

"One time when I was a little 'ole kid, I took an old rifle and went hunting. I wasn't big enough to carry it and got tired, so I went and stuck it under a rock. Thought it would be there later. I never did find it again," Art relates.

Art now inhabits a new home in Capitan. The large, sunlit house is filled with Indian artifacts — much of it handed down from his great-grandfather.

A book Art's grandfather wrote in the 1920s about Mescalero Chief Santana is being published this fall.

"Santana was an old Indian chief who found my great-granddad trustworthy, wanted him to get the reservation established," Art says.

Much of Art's knowledge of the Lincoln County War and other legends of the West comes from his grandfather and father.

"I always wish I'd had sense enough to learn more about it — just never paid too much attention to it," Art says, but he's still a pretty good hand at spinning a yarn.

His grandfather's book, published years after his death, is entitled "Santana: The Last War Chief of the Mescalero Apaches." It contains 48 historic photos and Almer Blazer's first-hand account of life with the Mescalero between 1862 and 1880. It's being published by Clear Light Publishers.

Kachina Stakes boasts top young fillies

Saturday's rich Kachina Stakes and Sunday's \$10,000-added Zia Handicap for quarter horses headline the stakes action at Ruidoso Downs this week.

The four-day live racing stretch runs Thursday through Sunday with the first live race beginning at 1:16 p.m. each day.

The Kachina Stakes is one of the meeting's richest events for juvenile thoroughbred distaffers, and will be worth \$35,588 to the first filly across the wire. The six-furlong test is the third round in the rivalry between probable favorites Straight Sets and Mari Go Round.

Straight Sets, a member of the powerful stable of Margaret Bloss and Margaret Dupont, won her division of the Kachina Stakes trials on July 21, defeating My Sassy Ego and favored Mari Go Round, who finished third in the trial.

Doyal Roberts trains the Kentucky-bred Straight Sets, who has now won three of her six lifetime starts.

The Kachina qualifying trials was the second meeting for Straight Sets and Mari Go Round. The latter won the first encounter when she upset the favored Straight Sets to win the Petticoat Stakes at Santa Fe on July 4.

Roy Barrington conditions Mari Go Round, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Northern Dancer, who races for Lynn and Drew Alexander.

Another noteworthy Kachina qualifier is Jeffrey Philip's Forever Fern, who was first by a neck over St. Helen's Shadow in the second division of the trials.

The \$10,000-added Zia Handicap is Sunday's main event. Trainer Richard Fry, winner of the 1991 All-

American Futurity with Noblesse Six, has a quartet of nominees for the 400-yard sprint.

Fry's main threat will be Saucy Native, the high-weighted nominee at 125 pounds. Saucy Native will be trying for his fourth straight win. The 5-year-old has three consecutive stakes scores under his belt, with the Tall Cotton Handicap at Santa Fe his last victory.

This week's "Sunday Surprise" will feature the finals of the Hoof and Spoke Challenge. Jeremy Pinto, a 19-year-old student at the University of New Mexico currently residing in Ruidoso, won last week's bicycle time trials. On Sunday he will race a horse in a 60-yard dash in front of the grandstand between races.

OFFICIAL RECORDS

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past, compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from "A History of Lincoln County Post Offices."

Lincoln
Colorful, historic Lincoln was known until 1869 as "Las Placitas del Rio Bonito." An old census shows that there were about 1,000 people in and around Lincoln in those days, but the beginning of mail service is obscure.

The Murphy Store, which was built in 1874 and later used as a courthouse, probably housed the first official post office in Lincoln.

However, 24 years earlier part of the Tunstall-McSween store was built and a slot in the front was evidently used for mail. Old post office boxes used in the Tunstall-McSween Store were later used in the Murphy Store.

The post office was officially established in 1878 with John R. Bolton as the first postmaster.

The office was moved from building to building as postmasters changed, but most often it was found in some part of the Tunstall-McSween building where it is now.

Coloradan scores big slots payoff at casino

Robert Timm's tears yesterday signaled his incredulous joy. He'd just won nearly \$250,000 playing a "Quarter Mania" slot machine at the Inn of the Mountain Gods casino.

"My wife was crying, and I gave her a box of tissues," he said. "I was crying too."

Timm, a rancher from Ovid, Colo., had spent about \$10 playing the slot machine when the bells started ringing.

"Ladies were coming up and hugging me, and I didn't even know who they were," he chuckled.

Timm's take will be a total \$231,142.95, about \$4,000 more than the casino's last record payoff of \$227,136.81 on July 2, said casino secretary, Maddie Ontiveros.

Both wins were by Coloradans, and both were with 50-cent bets on the "Quarter Mania" machines. The machine pays when four reels match.

"The slot machine was only two or three machines from the other winner," Ontiveros said.

His jackpot money, which will be paid over a 20-year period in checks of approximately \$11,000, was verified by "Quarter Mania" officials last night, Ontiveros said.

"I'll probably pay some bills with it and use it for retirement," Timm said.

Timm and his wife played and stayed at the Inn purely by chance, he explained.

"We were in Hobbs visiting my daughter, who just had a baby boy July 10, and decided to stop on the way home," Timm said. "I'm glad we did."

Rotarians send medical supplies to Juarez

Coordination between the groups was arranged by local Rotarian Alberto Robles. Juarez Norte Club spokesman Dr. Javier Garcia Bobadilla said the donation will go to the Juarez Red Cross (La Cruz Roja) and the CECATA, a



You are not the only one confused, I told Barney. Our governor, Gary Johnson, is so confused that he signed a compact with the Indian reservations without checking with the Legislature, and now the court says the whole deal has to be reshuffled.

Why would he do that, Barney wondered, slugging back some more Jim Beam.

The guy is a little spacey, I explained. He kind of gets a glazed look in his eyes and goes climbing on mountains. There is some speculation his grandpa was piloting the alien ship which crashed near Roswell in 1947.

Slot machine wagering is totally different than wagering on a horse race. Slots take neither finesse nor skill.

The slots player merely sits there with a glazed look, much like you-know-who, and feeds coins into a machine. If he is energetic, he pulls a handle. If not, he just pushes the SPIN button. On occasion, the machine will spit a few coins back. This is the player's cue to squeal in the mistaken notion he will walk out of the casino with his shirt.

Slots is a most simple game. Hence, it is popular among Texans.

Barney was in an argumentative mood. So, he asked, why are the horses different from the slots?

Night and day, I told him. The horse player depends on a regimented routine, relying on razor-sharp skills and superlative wits to give him the edge.

It goes like this. The horse player gets up in the morning, drives to Allsup's, buys a racing form, program, and crucial research material.

Hold on there, Barney interrupted. What kind of crucial research material are you talking about?

Dum Dum's tip sheet, I said. But let me continue.

He spends the morning in intense study, dresses carefully in his lucky clothes — including

a shirt he has been wearing unwashed in four years since it won him a \$32.60 daily double — and heads for the track.

Once there, he orders a plate of nachos and prepares for his first wager by reviewing his morning's work.

He has studied the speed ratings of the various horses.

He has reviewed each entry's past performance history, including the distance run, the order of finish, the amount of the purse, and the condition of the track and the weather.

He knows the amount each horse has won. He knows what each had for breakfast.

He has memorized jockey standings and trainer performance.

Armed with this wealth of data, the horse bettor summons his courage and heads for the wagering window.

By now, Barney has become bored with my explanation. Okay, okay, I get it, he said. So now the guy has done all this study, and based on this information, he has chosen which horse to bet on?

Not really, I said. By this time he is usually in a state of total bewilderment and decides to bet on his lucky number.

That's it, Barney exclaimed? That's it! Everyone studies, studies, studies, then goes up and bets their lucky number!

Not everyone, I said. The truly advanced horse player will sometimes bet his favorite color.

Barney hung up on me. I was grateful.

Indian gambling not good for Ruidoso's economy

TO THE EDITOR:

In 17 years I have seen many changes in Ruidoso, but nothing as rapid and drastic as is being wrought by gaming on the Mescalero reservation.

Indian gaming is NOT good for New Mexico.

(1) The infrastructure which enables Indian tribes to conduct gaming is provided by tax dollars from village, county, state and federal governments, but those entities do not receive any tax dollars from Indian gambling enterprises.

(2) Ruidoso's economy relies on the tourist dollar circulating through the village, but income derived from gaming at the Inn does not circulate through Ruidoso.

The money is deposited in local banks in the morning, but by the afternoon that money is deposited in banks in other cities.

(3) A popular misconception is that "gambling at the Inn is a fad which will die as soon as the newness wears off." Las Vegas proves that gambling is not a fad; gambling at the Inn will only grow.

(4) Two other misconceptions are that "gambling is a year-round business which will benefit the village," and "gambling on the reservation will not hurt me." The little economic spin-off from Indian gaming is more than offset by: (a) increased taxes to provide the infrastructure; (b) the loss of business revenues in local businesses; and (c) the loss of tax base from the closing of local businesses.

(5) The state cannot regulate gaming on the reservations and the federal government has no desire to do so. Indians had illegal gaming facilities five years before the gov-

ernor signed a compact making gaming legal on reservations. Not a single Indian was arrested or fined. If a non-Indian opened a casino in Ruidoso, he would be arrested immediately. The Indians have ignored the recent Supreme Court decision which ruled the compact void and have publicly stated they will not stop gaming even though they have no valid compact.

(6) Horse racing has not survived head-to-head competition with gaming in any location in the U.S. Ruidoso must have horse racing or gaming to survive economically.

(7) Neither the federal government nor the state can require Indians to account for the income received from gaming. The income from gaming can be spent on anything other than tribal needs and its members, with no accounting.

The voters of New Mexico passed a referendum approving gaming in

this state in November, 1994 and the legislature ignored the referendum. The legislature has had sufficient time to pass legislation implementing gaming in New Mexico.

Ruidoso voters should come together in a united effort to get a bill passed enacting gaming, giving Ruidoso residents an equal opportunity with the Mescalero tribe to earn a living. All special-interest groups such as the racetrack, store owners, real estate brokers, motel owners, restaurants and liquor license owners should pull in the same direction, GAMING IN RUIDOSO.

I propose that we organize all supporters for gaming and support ONE gaming bill. If you agree we need to act with one voice at the next legislative session to get gaming for Ruidoso, give me call.





RESOLUCION NO. 1995-1 RESOLUCION AND PROCLAMACION OF 1995 MILL LEVY TAX ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Eastern New Mexico University Ruidoso Off-Campus Instructional Program, Lincoln County, New Mexico (the "Program") is a regularly established Off-Campus Instructional Program of Eastern New Mexico University; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an election held February 5, 1991, the Program has imposed an annual mill levy tax of \$1.00 per \$1,000 of net taxable property located in the Program district for the purpose of operating and maintaining instructional programs for the Program district; and

WHEREAS, the law of the State of New Mexico authorizes the levy of

such a tax for the purpose of securing funds for current operations and for the maintenance and capital improvements of the Program district; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby determines upon its own initiative to submit a vote at a special election the question of the imposition of a tax levy not to exceed an additional \$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of net taxable property allocated to the Program district under the Property Tax Code for the purposes specified as permitted by 1995 N.M. Laws, ch. 224, §11; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of New Mexico further provide that no such tax shall be levied until the imposition of such tax is approved at an election by a majority of the qualified electors voting on the issue; and

WHEREAS, no unsuccessful Program district tax levy election has been held during the two years immediately preceding the date hereof on the question presented in this Resolution and Proclamation.

PROCLAMATION

Section 1. All action (not inconsistent with the provisions of this resolution) taken by the Board and the officers of the Program, directed toward the project herein described in the proposed mill tax election question, and toward the imposition of such taxes for the purposes, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the holding of an election to authorize the imposition of a mill levy and any prior posting or publication of notices thereof is ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 2. A special mill levy tax election shall be held in the Program district on Tuesday, September 26, 1995, at which there shall be submitted to the voters of the Program district (i.e., the qualified registered electors of the Program district), the mill levy tax election question set forth in this Resolution and Proclamation.

"Shall the Ruidoso Off-Campus Instructional Program Board, the governing board of the Eastern New Mexico University Ruidoso Off-Campus Instructional Program, Lincoln County, New Mexico, be authorized to impose an additional tax of \$1.00 per \$1,000.00 on the net taxable value of all the property allocated to such Program district under the Property Tax Code for the purpose of providing for current operations, maintenance and capital improvements for the Program district?"

RSVP program celebrates first year

Ruidoso News Staff Writer Ruidoso's Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) recently celebrated its first year of operation, and officials are calling it an unqualified success.

"We've seen a marked increase in volunteers and volunteer hours," said program director Sandee Jourden.

RSVP operates from the Ruidoso Senior Center. Established nationally in 1971, the program is run through the Corporation for National Service and the National Senior Service Corps, and is sponsored by the village of Ruidoso.

Helping to keep older Americans active in contributing to their community through volunteer service is the goal of RSVP, Jourden said.

Funded by grants and fundrais-

ing, RSVP also receives technical assistance and training from the Corporation for National Service.

Volunteers for the RSVP program choose their assignments from many options.

"We currently have 30 host stations," Jourden said. "What we are in desperate need of are people who would like to work with the public school system."

School assignments could vary from tutoring a single student or a small group, to making copies for teachers, she said. Mentors for students and bilingual seniors are also needed.

"We have difficulty getting the volunteers we need for the schools," Jourden said. "It's frustrating because the children are America's future, and seniors can really help guide them."

Other available workstations include the Ruidoso Public Library, Lincoln County Food Bank, Meals on Wheels, the Humans Society of Lincoln County, the Ruidoso Senior Center and Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso.

"During the initial 12 months of the program, RSVP contributed a total of 2,365 hours to the different workstations in the area," Jourden said.

Currently, RSVP has 70 volunteers but more are always needed.

"We all feel like the program is really making a difference in the community," she said. "We hope seniors continue to volunteer."

The following is a general summary of the subject matter contained in the Resolution:

Preambles recite or include such matters as:

Sections 5 through 8 approve the form of the Agreements to be delivered by the Governing Body; state that the Agreements are a special limited obligation of the Governing Body and shall never constitute an indebtedness of the Governing Body within the meaning of any state Constitutional provision or statutory limitation; provide for the use of the proceeds derived from the execution of the Loan Agreement; and approve the deposit of proceeds of the Loan Agreement.

Section 11 through 17 authorize execution of other documents related to the obligation of the Governing Body in the taking of other acts related to the Resolution; delegate powers to the officers of the Governing Body to effectuate the provisions of the Resolution; provide for amendments to the Resolution; state that the Resolution is irrevocable; provide for severability and repealer clauses; provide an effective date for the Resolution; and provide a form for publication.
