Ski Apache opening delayed

Ski Apache will not open on Thanksgiving Day as planned, ski area officials announced late last week.

Below-normal snowfall and unseasonably warm temperatures are responsible for the delay, said Roy Parker, ski area general manager.

The new scheduled opening day has been delayed to Friday, Dec. 8, instead of Nov. 23 — unless a big snow falls before that date.

Ski area employees have been able to make snow on only a handful of nights, because they need temperatures of 29-30 degrees or lower, Parker said.

The ski area has received approximately six inches of snowfall so far this season.

The last time the ski area couldn't open on Thanksgiving Day was 1990, Parker said.

Ski Apache is operated by the Mescalero Apache Tribe on tribal and U.S. Forest Service lands. It is located about 15 miles northwest of Ruidoso.

Special commission meeting called

A special meeting of the Lincoln County Commission to deal with an ambulance rate increase and the future of Fort Stanton is set for 8 a.m. Tuesday at the county sub-office in Ruidoso.

Ambulance rates are proposed to increase from \$75 per run to \$150.

Commissioners also want to discuss the small response to a state offer to lease the former state hospital and historic Fort Stanton. Before being closed last March by Gov. Gary Johnson and the Department of Health, the hospital was the second-largest employer in the county with 200 employees.

Only one company bid on the fort lease.

SWA meets today with new manager

Corlis Dobson, manager of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority since Nov. 1, will attend his first official board meeting today.

The meeting begins at 10 a.m. in the administration complex on Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

Dobson previously was solid waste superintendent for the city of Lufkin, Texas.

Lone fort bid hopes to help juveniles

□ But state may shoot down dream for prison

Tracy Brannan said he's been trying for seven years to create a comprehensive treatment program for troubled juveniles.

He moved a giant step closer to his dream last week when he submitted the only proposal to lease Fort Stanton, a former state hospital in Lincoln County.

But his dream could be squashed, if the state prison chief has his way.

Karl Sannicks, secretary of the Corrections Department, said his agency is interested in using the fort for a minimum security prison. He proposed the idea earlier this year but state officials wanted to wait until lease proposals came in.

If Sannicks receives a green light on the prison plan, no local input is required, he said. However, as a courtesy, he could call a meeting to brief residents, he said.

The fort is about 30 miles northeast of Ruidoso, but only three miles from Camp Sierra Blanca, a minimum security prison. Several county commissioners object to adding more adult prisoners to the area.

A state legislative committee last week recommended holding off on plans to build new prisons in Santa Rosa and Hobbs while state leaders rethink possible solutions to inmate overpopulation at existing prisons.

Brannan's plans

Brannan is the executive director of New Mexico Outreach Inc., an Albuquerque-based company he incorporated in 1990 as the basis for a multi-approach treatment center for the envisions. That vision includes building horse-drawn covered wagons and taking juveniles on wilderness trips.

Up until now, the company has existed mostly on paper. But when he submitted a proposal to lease Fort Stanton, the organizational gears began moving, he said. Within the next two weeks, he will call an organizational meeting of board members, he said.


"Everybody on the board has some association with juvenile treatment, either professionally or as a civilian," he said.

Brannan was he grew up in the Artesia-Roswell area and has worked in sales and insurance. In 1989, he decided to dedicate his entrepreneurial efforts toward "helping kids in trouble," he said.

He is seeking non-profit status for the corporation. He hopes operational money will come from the state and federal government and private insurance reimbursement.

He must create a mix of treatment approaches to generate enough money to operate the fort.

Ruidoso's tree-cutting law upheld in court

While village officials gather comments on proposed changes to Ruidoso's tree-cutting ordinance, the legality of the existing code has been upheld by the municipal court.

Judge Mike Line ruled Friday the ordinance is constitutional with its "permissible goal of insuring and maintaining the beauty of the village."

He also fined Thomas Walsh of Lubbock, Texas \$600 for clearcutting 120 trees at his Ruidoso home without village approval.

On Walsh's behalf, the local law was challenged by attorney Gary Mitchell in July. He and fellow attorney Adam Rafkin argued against village attorney John Underwood, saying the law infringes on Walsh's

rights as a property owner and was a taking of property.

Mitchell said the ordinance, which prohibited Walsh from cutting sizable trees without a permit or site development plan, denied him the right to develop his property.

State and local forest officials have also proposed changing the ordinance, but for reasons of forest health and fire hazard reduction. They propose to allow cutting of overstocked, unhealthy or hazardous trees with 19-inch diameters or smaller without the need for village government permits.

Their proposal is available for public review at village hall. Village officials will be accepting comments about the proposed changes until Dec. 31, and will hold hearings on

any proposed changes early next year.

It was this past winter when Walsh was cited by code enforcement officers for chopping down the trees without P&Z approval. He was later fined \$5,000 by Line with \$4,400 suspended under the condition he submit a tree replacement plan to P&Z within 60 days.

In his decision to deny a dismissal of his previous judgment and sentence, Line noted Walsh hadn't bothered to take advantage of the P&Z hearing procedure or the appeal process before cutting the trees.

"Therefore (he) has no standing to complain of his due process rights being violated as a result," Line wrote.

Line found Walsh guilty of 120 violations of the tree ordinance, and for violating the requirement to file a tree replacement plan.

He ordered Walsh pay a \$600 fine to the village within 15 days. The sum reflects the \$5 permit fee he should have paid for each tree cutting. He must also pay \$50 within the same time frame for violating the site development plan ordinance, and he must present the reforestation plan to the court within 30 days.

If he fails to comply with Line's sentence, his suspended total fine of \$6,050 will be reinvoled. The fine represents \$50 for each tree, and an additional \$50 for not filing the replacement plan.

Alto resident back in jail after violating release for police attack

An Alto man charged with assaulting police had his freedom taken away Tuesday after he violated conditions of his release.

Judge William Butts was going to allow Steven Martinez to stay home and go to work until his preliminary hearing this Wednesday. The conditional release had been in effect since his Oct. 13 arraignment.

However, he was arrested Tuesday for violating the conditions of his release by drinking alcohol, and was returned to jail.

He was first arrested Oct. 12 after allegedly committing battery on a police officer, a fourth-degree felony. Police said he threw a boot at an officer's leg while being booked.

Martinez, 35, was also charged at that time with the misdemeanor

crime of assaulting police officers by telling them he was going to kill them, and resisting arrest for disorderly conduct on Sudderth Drive. He was highly intoxicated, police said.

The conditional release allowed Martinez to do most everything except drink alcohol or break the law while awaiting Wednesday's preliminary court hearing. When not at work, he was also supposed to be with his court-appointed custodian, Butts said.

But the conditional release was revoked by Butts Tuesday. Martinez, who was picked up by police around 1:45 a.m. Nov. 7, was allegedly staggering when hitchhiking on Sudderth Drive. He also allegedly smelled of alcohol, police said.

The officer had offered Martinez

a lift to the Allsups store at the corner of Sudderth and Mechem drives where he could call someone for a ride home. When giving him a ride, the officer learned Martinez was on a conditional release and had violated it by allegedly getting drunk.

Butts issued a bench warrant for Martinez's arrest Tuesday. Upon learning of the warrant, Martinez turned himself in at the court.

Since that time, he's been held at the Lincoln County Jail on a \$10,000 bond on the original charges placed against him and for violation of the conditions of his release.

If found guilty of all the charges placed against him, Martinez could be sentenced to a maximum 4.5 years in jail and a \$7,500 fine.

At the historic fort about 30 miles northeast of Ruidoso, Brannan is proposing to:

- turn Sierra Cottage into a 60-day or less alternative sentencing program, probably a boot camp;

- use Eddy and Hidalgo cottages for a long-term juvenile psychiatric treatment program (more than 60 days);

- use Lincoln Cottage for a transitional living experience for juveniles leaving the long-term care program;

- and turn Socorro Cottage into

a center for homeless veterans or those suffering from post-traumatic stress, because it is designed for less supervision. Job retraining could extend the regular 60-day program for some participants.

An integral part of his plan includes a wilderness experience for juveniles. Toward that end, he apprenticed under a master wagon builder with 80 years of experience. Under a grant from the New Mexico Arts Division, he built a covered chuckwagon and is currently working on a second wagon.

"The idea is to put juveniles in a

position where they have to make decisions, to build self-reliance and self-esteem," Brannan said.

If his proposal is approved, he said within 60 days he would move into the historic fort with 87 buildings and 1,200 acres. But Brannan said he is unsure when the complex would be ready to open for business.

The details of his proposal remain confidential until the state review committee reaches a decision to award the lease, to reject his offer or to negotiate for some different terms.

Small debris expected outside White Sands Missile Range; meetings scheduled this week

Expansion of restricted air-space proposed

A series of new high explosive tests at White Sands Missile Range could send some particles of crumbled aluminum hurtling toward communities outside the range boundaries, but officials say they'll only be the size of thumbnails.

Officials from White Sands and the U.S. Army Space and Strategic Defense Command (USASSDC) will meet with the public today in Carrizozo and Tuesday in Tularosa to discuss potentials impacts.

High-performance aircraft would be at most risk, said Jim Eckles, public affairs specialist with the missile range. The range is therefore asking for permission to evoke a restricted air space designation beyond the missile range during test days.

"We would be adding an additional 30 miles of restricted air-space east of the range," said Larry Furrow, chief of the White Sands public affairs office.

Aircraft could not take off or land in Ruidoso's air space east of the range for a period of about four hours on test days, he said.

"We would give plenty of advance notice prior to the days of the

tests," he said.

Range officials are planning for 11 tests within an 18-month period.

"If we perfect what we're after before that, not all the tests would be needed," Furrow added.

Tests will be conducted at higher altitudes than previous launches of missiles, Eckles said.

Objects exploded at higher altitudes with a easterly wind could drift beyond the range boundaries, he said.

"These are fairly small crumbled pieces of aluminum, about the size of a thumbnail," Eckles said. "The lighter they are, the further they may drift. All the heavy dangerous stuff will come down in the missile range."

"If the winds are too strong and high, we will not do the tests."

Although the potential for human injury is extremely small, it is not impossible, said Furrow.

"The risk is the same as we apply to our wives and kids who live on the range," Furrow said. "It's one in a million."

To attain the required high altitude for the tests, firing of the missiles will be staged on a 40x40-mile parcel about 15 miles southwest of Mountainair, Eckles said. The range has a contract with land-owners there.

Information sessions

During the Carrizozo and Tularosa sessions today and Tuesday, missile range and defense com-

mand representatives will answer questions concerning the potential for a small portion, estimated at less than 10% of the debris created from the missile-intercept tests, landing outside the range.

Although an April 1995 environmental assessment concluded all debris would land within the missile range and currently restricted airspace, an additional analysis came up with different conclusions. It concluded under certain wind conditions, debris could drift beyond the eastern boundary of the range-controlled area and currently restricted airspace.

Because of that possibility, a supplemental environmental assessment is being prepared, focusing on:

- the potential for and risks associated with debris landing beyond the eastern boundary of the range;

- and a request for additional temporary restricted airspace.

That study should be available during the public information sessions today and Tuesday.

Representatives also will discuss flight safety, on-going missile programs and the process for evaluating the environmental impacts of the programs.

The sessions at Carrizozo will be 3-5 p.m. and 6:30-8:30 p.m. at the Carrizozo Recreation Center near Spencer Park on U.S. 380.

The Tularosa meetings will be at the same hours Tuesday, at the Tularosa Community Center, 1050 Bookout Road.

White Oaks bridge in sore need of repair; work planned this month

The main support pillar of a bridge east of White Oaks is being undermined by water, but local agencies aren't in a hurry to replace it.

The bridge is more than 30 years old and has been on a list for replacement for several years, said Albert Hernandez, foreman of the Lincoln County Road Department. It poses no immediate danger, he contended.

About two weeks ago, a deputy called the Sheriff's Office dispatcher because he was alarmed about the deteriorated condition of the second bridge east of historic White Oaks. He told the dispatcher

the bridge was near collapse.

"I went out (Oct. 30) to check and it's not so dangerous that it will fall down unless a caravan of semi-trucks decides to go over it or the ground become saturated," Hernandez said. Neither of those scenarios is likely, he added.

"It's a U.S. Forest Service road that's maintained by the county," Hernandez said. "I told (Forest Service officials) I want them to furnish the culvert and we'll do the labor."

Sam Tobias of the Forest Service's Smokey Bear Ranger District said Tuesday agency engineers looked at the bridge Nov. 8 and he went out two days later.

"They don't feel it will fail in the

near future," he said. "They're trying to decide whether to reconstruct the existing type of bridge or to put in a metal culvert."

The two options for the White Oaks bridge were discussed during a meeting on another subject Tuesday between the Forest Service, Hernandez and state highway department officials, Tobias said.

"I don't believe a definite decision on design was made, but we know the county is ready to help us," he said. "First, an archaeologist has to take a look at the rock structure and determine whether there is anything of significance there."

He estimated the bridge could be replaced in less than one month.

Teachers, district reach salary agreement after long negotiations

During the last six months, negotiators for the Ruidoso Education Association (REA) and the Ruidoso School District hammered out details of a new collective bargaining agreement.

The results of their labors reached fruition Tuesday when they both ratified the new agreement.

The biggest point of dissension in the negotiations was teacher salaries. The district froze salaries earlier this year upon hearing the Apache Indian Reservation was expanding its school system to accommodate upper grade levels. The district feared the loss of students to the new school would result in a dramatic loss of funds.

The district lost 100 students to the new Mesalero school by the time the official enrollment count was taken 40 days into the school year on Oct. 18. However, enough new students had moved into the district to compensate for the loss.

The 40-day count showed 2,392 students enrolled in the district, up 3% from last year's enrollment of 2,324 students.

After originally asking for a 4% increase in salaries, REA negotiators accepted the district's offer of a 2% increase, retroactive for the 1995-96 contract year.

The salary increase will cost the district \$182,000 and will go to 172 district employees including

teachers, aides and custodians.

"We had held back some money in the emergency fund and in utility line items in the budget," Ruidoso School District Superintendent Mike Gladden said. "We transferred the money from those areas to cover the salary increase."

The REA can reopen salary negotiations if additional money comes into the district.

The new agreement specifies monthly meetings between the REA and the district will be scheduled to keep communication open.

"I feel like everyone put forth a

lot of effort and I'm pleased with the agreement," Gladden said.

The REA will also be consulted on development of new district policies and procedures. No changes in the agreement will take place without the mutual agreement of both the district and the REA.

"Overall, it's been a learning process and we've seen positive outcomes as far as working conditions and employee compensation," REA negotiator Cathy Jones said. "We hope that the process will continue to be a positive experience."

Terms of teacher agreement

The collective bargaining agreement between the Ruidoso School District and the Ruidoso Education Association resulted in several additions and changes, including:

— Grievance procedure: the new agreement replaces the school board grievance hearing with a mediation session attended by REA and district representatives.

— Transfers and reassignments: reassignment will be made only after a meeting between the employee and the superintendent, at which time the employee will be notified in writing of the reason. An REA representative may be present at the meeting if requested.

No employee may be reassigned in place of evaluation or disciplinary procedures. Reassigned

employees will be placed only in an equivalent position.

— Personal leave: definition of annual leave entitlement for employees and principals.

Employees will receive a summer payment based on the amount of accumulated unused leave at the end of the previous fiscal year.

Employees may contribute any portion of their accumulated personal leave to a sick leave bank for use in case of illness, accident, injury or pregnancy.

— Professional development: the district will now pay for tuition and fees for training. Mileage, per diem and transportation will be reimbursed to employees according to a set schedule.

New contract awarded for county gov't communications

Since A & G Southwest Co. withdrew its offer to service Lincoln County communication radios last month, county commissioners decided to go back to the lowest bidder for help.

At their meeting Nov. 7, commissioners awarded a service contract to Allcomm Communications.

But they directed County Manager Carolin Cooney also to look at the alternative of handling the repairs in-house. They asked her for a recommendation by the mid-year budget review.

Allcomm Owner Paul Keith filed

a protest in July after commissioners voted 3-2 to bypass his low bid in favor of A & G owned by Carl Applin.

At the time, some commissioners said they were concerned about Keith meeting Federal Communication Commission (FCC) licensing requirements. Keith countered that although no FCC license is required to work on the county's radio system, his employees are licensed.

Apparently, Keith wasn't the only person disturbed by the commission's decision to bypass Allcomm.

In a letter withdrawing his offer to service the radios, Applin wrote that the protest had put his business on hold for three months and that some county employees had shown animosity toward his company.

Man charged 6th time with drunken driving

A 38-year-old Mescalero man will appear at a Ruidoso Magistrate Court preliminary hearing Wednesday for his sixth driving while intoxicated (DWI) charge.

After the third count, a DWI charge becomes a fourth-degree felony in New Mexico. A conviction on the 4th DWI is punishable by a maximum 1.5 years in jail and a \$5,000 fine.

Arlington Palmer, who was arrested early Nov. 10, is being held on a \$8,500 bond at the Lincoln County Jail. Bond was set by Judge

William Butts after Palmer's Monday morning arraignment, Butts said.

State police arrested Palmer after he failed a field sobriety test alongside Carrizo Canyon Road.

Palmer's car had about 18 Coors beer cans inside when he was pulled over at 1:15 a.m., and he allegedly told police he'd drank three or four beers before driving.

He was asked to perform the sobriety test after officers learned his drivers license had been revoked, police said.

A footnote to death of outlaw Jesse James

Jose Chavez y Chavez was a Regulator who rode alongside Billy the Kid during the Lincoln County War. In the company of the Kid and several others, he escaped from the burning McSwain house during the climactic battle of the Lincoln County War on the 19th of July, 1878.

Unlike most of the Kid's cohorts, Chavez y Chavez was one of the few Regulators (along with the Kid himself) to go on to a career that was less than honest after the end of the war.

In 1885 he earned himself a footnote in the history books when he humiliated Bob Ford, the assassin of Jesse James.

Ford, it seems, considered himself a hero for ridding the country of its most notorious bandit, despite the fact that he was almost universally reviled for the manner in which he accomplished this dubious act.

Bob Ford shot Jesse James while the unarmed outlaw was straightening a picture in his living room, after Bob and his brother Charlie had been dinner guests in Jesse's home that evening. Jesse's wife, Zee, was in the kitchen when the murder occurred. There was even a popular song at the time describing Ford as "the dirty little coward... that laid poor Jesse in his grave."

Bob came west to New Mexico, settling in Las Vegas where he opened a saloon. Laboring under the incorrect notion that his reputation would attract customers, he presented a play: "How I killed Jesse James." Both the play and the saloon went bust.

By this time the citizens of Las Vegas had grown weary of Ford's endless boasting, and decided that he needed to be taught a lesson. When they looked around for someone to teach him that lesson, they found Jose Chavez y Chavez to be a willing volunteer.

Las Vegas Sheriff Cleofas Romero challenged Ford to a shooting match with Jose, to which Ford reluctantly agreed.

Followed by a godly portion of Las Vegas' population, Romero, Ford, and Chavez y Chavez went to the outskirts of town where the sheriff placed a coin on a fencepost and told Ford to go ahead and blaze away.

Ford did, but the coin was luckier than Jesse James: his bullet missed by a mile. Then Jose Chavez y Chavez swaggered up to the firing line, grinning. Suddenly jerking his pistol and firing, he hit the coin dead center.

It was at this juncture that Ford made a mistake and protested that the match was "unfair." Jose instantly challenged him to a duel, suggesting they use larger targets: themselves.

Bob Ford may have been a coward and a scoundrel, but he wasn't stupid. Rather than engage in a pastime as dangerous as the one proposed by Jose, he packed his bags and left town.

Seven years later, on June 8, 1892, Ford was running a tent saloon in Creede, Colo., when a James partisan named Ed O'Kelley walked into the place carrying a buffalo gun. And that was the end of "the dirty little coward."

On Oct. 22 of that same year, Jose Chavez y Chavez was one of three policemen in Las Vegas who, using their badges as cover for membership in a group known as "The Society of Bandits," lynched a man named Patricio Maes. Four months later they were involved in the death of their gang leader's brother-in-law,

Gabriel Banderas.

The gang leader was named Vicente Silva. When Silva murdered his own wife and ordered them to bury her, they suspected that they might be next on his list, so they beat him to it and buried him in the grave that he had dug for his wife.

A couple of murders later, Jose got to thinking that perhaps the time was right for a new career move. His assessment was correct. Shortly after his hasty departure from the Las Vegas area, his two fellow corrupt policemen were arrested and sentenced to life imprisonment.

Discovered working as a shepherd in Socorro where he was using the name Joe Gonzalez, Chavez y Chavez was arrested and tried in June, 1895 in Las Vegas, where he was sentenced to death. At this time he was considered to be an assassin for hire.

Much to the chagrin of the citizens of Las Vegas, his sentence was commuted to life by Governor Miguel Otero. In 1909, after assisting prison guards in a riot, he was paroled. He moved back to Las Vegas, where time had softened the opinion held by the local populace.

He remained a resident of Las Vegas for many years, where he delighted in amazing children with his marksmanship and extremely tall tales, one of which was that it was he and he alone who had killed Sheriff Brady in Lincoln on April Fools Day, 1878.

This is of interest because Billy the Kid was sentenced to death for Brady's killing. It is also interesting to note that Billy was the only participant in that deadly confrontation known as the Lincoln County War to be charged with any crime at all.

Jose Chavez y Chavez died peacefully (undoubtedly to the amazement of those who knew him in the "old days") in Milagro, N.M. on July 17, 1923.

Exercise immunity:

'Resistance training'

If you need another reason to stick to your exercise program, here it is: Regular physical activity appears to improve functioning of the immune system.

Recent research suggests that people who exercise regularly come down with fewer colds and flus than their sedentary friends. Regular physical activity seems to strengthen the immune system so that it is better able to fight the foreign invaders who would like to set up house-keeping in our bodies, and make us miserable in the process.

Like many physical attributes, the immune system is affected by both genetic and environmental factors. And like other factors, it changes as we age, becoming less effective in protecting us from bacteria and viruses, and less adept at recognizing and disabling cancerous cells. Age-related changes are why it takes older folks longer to recover from infections and infectious diseases, and why malignancies become more common with age.

The good news is that much of the immune system decline previously attributed to age is in fact influenced by lifestyle. Older folks are less likely to eat well or be physically active - factors that have a lifelong cumulative effect on immune system status.

What kind of exercise is best?

We still do not know exactly how exercise preserves immune strength, so it is really too early to say what types or amounts of exercise maximize immune function. The evidence so far suggests that moderately vigorous exercise appears to be the most helpful. One study compared elderly women (67 to 85 years old) who had been exercising for more than an hour a day for the previous five years. In laboratory tests, their immune response was stronger than that of older women who had only been walking for the previous 12 weeks, and almost as responsive as the immune systems of much younger women.

The immune response of the group that started a walking program did not improve over the course of the 12-week experiment, as measured in the lab. Twelve weeks may not have a very strong effect on an aging immune system, while a lifetime of physical activity can slow the aging process. But before you decide it is too late for you to reap the immunity benefits of exercise, consider this: The walkers still came down with fewer colds than a control group of healthy older women who remained sedentary. This suggests that even moderate exercise confers

important immune benefits.

And while vigorous exercise appears to be helpful, beware: Overtraining can decrease immunity. Exercising too much weakens many physical systems as your body becomes energy depleted. Frequent colds and flus are often a sign of trying to do too much.

Since exercise improves immunity, should you exercise if you are sick?

No. Exercise strengthens the immune system over the course of many years; one bout of exercise does not appear to enhance immune function, and may even make you sicker by drawing on your already exhausted energy stores. Some people seem able to exercise when they are only mildly sick, but in general, rest is what you need when you're sick. Sickness is your body's way of saying, "slow down!"

If the immune system becomes less effective as we age, why are my kids always sick while my parents hardly ever come down with a cold?

While the strength of an immune response declines with age, the memory the immune system retains of previous viral encounters does not. Each time your immune system mounts a defense against a bacteria or virus, it "remembers" and carries a record of what that invader looks like. The next time those bacteria or viruses get into your body, the immune system recognizes them as targets for immediate attack, and you don't get sick. Immune system memory is why vaccines work; your immune system learns to recognize viruses you have been immunized against, like polio, diphtheria and so on.

Scientists have identified more than 200 viruses that cause cold symptoms. A newborn's immune system hasn't learned to recognize any of them. Each time a new virus comes along, babies and young kids get sick. If we get two or three colds every year, by the time we are 60 or 70, our immune systems recognize many cold viruses, and unless we are run-down or have other health problems, we rarely catch a cold.

LINCOLN COUNTY YEARBOOK

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past, compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from John Haley's 1913 Lincoln County Yearbook.

Malvin Franks was elected county commissioner from the 2nd district of Lincoln County at the first state election in 1911. He was chosen chairman at the first meeting of the board.

Franks, a native of Texas, was born at Atascosa on Aug. 28, 1879. He was engaged in stock raising before coming to New Mexico in 1902. He settled 20 miles east of Corona, was unmarried and continued in the

stock raising business. William B. White held the office of county commissioner in 1910-1912, serving as chairman during a portion of the time. He came to Lincoln County on July 11, 1890, locating in the Nogal-Bonito area. He married Chloe Bourne. They did not have any children. White was involved in farming and stock raising and was also interested in mining.

White was born in Lawrence, Kan. in 1865 and went to Missouri at a young age. He attended public schools in Taney County. He attended Clark Academy in Arkansas.






"I feel we certainly made a giant step toward achieving these goals. I



Chamber calls on steady '95 increase

Calls to the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce continue to increase, Chamber Director Joan Bailey told the Ruidoso Downs Village Council Monday.

"We are seeing more and more people inquire about moving to the area," Bailey said while presenting her quarterly report. "And we are also seeing an increase in tourism inquiries, possibly because of the availability of air service."

Total chamber activity, including phone calls, walk-ins and mailings, is up 9% over last year during the January to October period. So far this year the chamber has answered 86,302 inquiries. Last year, 78,917 inquiries were answered during the same time period.

A steady rise has been noted this decade. Inquiries are up 47% from 1990 figures when the chamber fielded 45,732 questions about the community.

Bailey asked the Downs council to consider joining Apache Trails, a tourist organization promoting Lincoln and Otero counties. Because lodgers tax money would be used for any Ruidoso Downs Apache Trails involvement, Bailey was

directed by the council to meet with the lodgers tax committee.

Following Bailey's report, discussion centered on traffic access problems on Second Street.

It's hard for police and fire units to get through because people are parking on the street, Ruidoso Downs Fire Chief Nick Herrera said.

Downs Police Chief David Hightower told the council additional signs prohibiting parking are needed. He said he will also instruct police officers to step up citations of parking violators.

The council Monday also approved a resolution to apply for hardship funds from the New Mexico State Highway Department. They money would help buy used highway equipment.

If a municipality can prove financial hardship, it may receive up to \$25,000 towards the purchase of the used equipment.

"This may be the last year we are eligible to apply," Village Clerk Leanna Wehbrecht said.

The next regular meeting of the Ruidoso Downs Village Council will be at 7 p.m. Monday, Nov. 27 at the village hall complex. Call 378-4422 for more information.

Remembering the First Thanksgiving

This is being sent to you just before high noon on Nov. 16 and will reach you on Nov. 20.

Each new day of the thankful month has a charm all its own, a new message to us to be thankful for the new day.

This morning as the sun began to rise behind Sunrise Mountain, it set the trees on top aglow with silvery fire. The blue sky turned light purple above as the sun, now clearing the hilltop, shown down upon a vale all crystal white with frost.

All the cedars and pines on the hillside, the few good leaves on the apricot tree, and the stems of gramma grass were all traced in glistening white.

Under the sun's magic touch the frost soon faded away, and all the mountain world was warm and sunny.

Now at mid-day there is a sky of Indian Summer blue. The bluebird meadow shines under the bright sun, and you inhale the warm air fragrant with autumn leaf aroma and evergreen incense.

A blue jay, scrub jay and squirrel join the snowbirds feeding along the pathway. All through the mild and sunny air there is a mood of harvest time, and of thankfulness that the crops are gathered in for the winter.

Surely it must have been just such a day as this that our pilgrim forefathers in the Plymouth colony prepared to celebrate our first Thanksgiving in December of the year 1621.



Sheriff sued by deputy who was laid off with budget cuts

A former Lincoln County Sheriff's Office deputy is suing Sheriff James McSwane for wrongful breach of contract.

George Guimond, 28, was a deputy and drug enforcement officer from December 1994 through June 11. He was hired a year after working in Ruidoso as an undercover drug agent for the White Mountain Task Force.

He was let go before receiving certification from the state law enforcement academy, and he alleges McSwane told him several times the county would put him through the training.

The sheriff said Wednesday Guimond was basically a victim of budget cuts. He'd been the most recent addition to the office's patrol unit, and so was the first to go when funding was reduced.

"I'm just sorry I lost an officer and lost budget money," he said. "I feel like I'm out and the county's out."

McSwane said he is required to put officers through the academy within their first year.

"I recall telling him if you stay that long, you'll be certified in that

time period," McSwane recounted.

Guimond's attorney Gary Mitchell filed the suit Oct. 27, charging McSwane with wrongful discharge, or breach of an expressed or implied contract.

According to the suit, Guimond was fired not long after he relocated to Carrizosa and was told by McSwane he'd be sent to the state law enforcement academy. Academy certification makes an officer more employable.

Without certification, Guimond lost his ability to provide for his family or market his skills as a law enforcement officer, his suit charges.

"I worked way over the time limit to get certification," Guimond said yesterday, taking a break from his academy classes in Hobbs. He moved his family there this fall.

Guimond didn't want to discuss the suit without going through Mitchell first. But he did say McSwane put the sheriff's office at risk with the way he ran things.

"The liability was immense on my shoulders, on the county's shoulders and on the sheriff's office," he said.

Guimond said he asked McSwane about certification at the

academy, but the sheriff kept putting it off, saying there may be a shortage of funding for his office.

Guimond called the academy on his own and asked about costs. He learned there was no cost for classes, only for the physical exam.

But the physical and psychological exams cost \$900 to \$1,200, McSwane countered. Plus, training at the academy takes 13 weeks, and the sheriff's office must continue paying the officer's salary during that time, McSwane said.

His tight staff "couldn't do without the man," McSwane said. He said he was providing in-house training during Guimond's employment.

Guimond said after March and April passed without his being enrolled in the academy, he again asked McSwane about the academy in May. He said he was told the sheriff's office might have to lay off two deputies, depending on the status of a drug task force grant.

County commissioners told the sheriff in May they would not fund the match for the task force grant. He was allowed to reapply in June, however, after apologizing to commissioners for comments he made about them.

County 26th in ag, 3rd in sheep

New Mexico agricultural cash receipts decreased 1% in 1994 to bring the farm marketings total to \$1.82 billion.

Lincoln County was ranked 26th of New Mexico's 32 counties in all farm cash receipts, with \$15.4 million worth.

The top ag counties in the state in 1994 were Chavez with \$248.7 million in all farm marketings, Dona Ana with \$201 million, Curry with \$161.8 million, Roosevelt with \$101.7 million and Union with \$98.5 million.

Lincoln County has one of the

largest sheep populations with 61,000, ranking 3rd in the state.

Lincoln is combined with Torrance County in statistics for apples; the two combined rank 4th in the state (one higher rank has three counties combined; the others consist of one county).

Other Lincoln County rankings in the newly released ag stats for 1994 included:

— 20th of 32 counties in number of farms, with 338 farms (this is a

1992 statistic)

— 16th in acres of irrigated cropland (8,310 acres) and 26th in acres of dryland (300 acres)

— tied for 23rd in number of cattle and calves, at 13,000.

Cattle and calves remain #1 in production at \$674 million, with wholesale milk #2 at \$382 million. Hay is #3 in top producers at \$81 million. The top three ag-producing commodities did not change in 1994.

Mrs. Tippen died Thursday, Nov. 16 at Lincoln County Medical Center in Ruidoso. She was born April 22, 1911 in Wilbarger County, Texas. She moved to Ruidoso in April of 1994 from Paducah, where she had lived since the early 1920s. She was founder of the Federated Music Club, former board member of the Garden of Memories cemetery board, and a member of the First United Methodist Church in Paducah, where she served on various committees.

She married Jack Tippen on Dec. 25, 1931 in Wichita Falls, Texas, and he died on Jan. 8, 1982. She was also preceded in death by a brother, Richard E. Archer.

Survivors include a son, Kenneth Archer Tippen and his wife Glenda of Ruidoso; three grandchildren, Lynne T. Jones and her husband Russ of Houston, Texas, Lee J. Tippen and his wife Donna of Whitesboro, Texas, and Joanna H. Middleton and her husband Gary of Lubbock, Texas; and six great-grandchildren.

The family has requested memorials to the Garden of Memories Cemetery fund, or First United Methodist Church, both in Paducah.

Mr. Jay trained Go Dick Go, who won the 1966 All American Futurity.

He was born in Roswell on March 3, 1944. He was a heavy machine operator in Reno at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife, Kathy of Reno; his mother, Viola Jay of Midland, Texas; a brother, Tommy Jay of Midland; and a sister, Helen Jay of Midland.





Learned a lot about forest health needs

TO THE EDITOR:

I would like to take this space to commend and thank the folks who produced Public Awareness Day — Forest Health Conditions and Wildfire Hazard in Lincoln County.

They presented an excellent program that was extremely educational. I particularly gained useful knowledge from Ron Moody's presentation on fire in the ecosystem, and Bill Duemling's talk on building defensible space around your home and preventative tactics to take to protect your home before the event of a wildfire.

It is such a shame that more of the public, particularly landowners, did not attend this informative session. I know now what I need to do on my property to make my home defensible and to return my little acre of woods back to a healthy state. And believe me, it is going to take a lot of hard work and a long time.

And once I accomplish this task on my acre — what about the land surrounding me? It will still be in an unhealthy state. The majority of it is either vacant lots or vacation homes. Some of these people have neither the time nor the inclination nor an awareness of the need to return their land to a healthy condition. Will all my hard work be for nothing, because what chance does one cleared acre have against a roaring, crown-topping fire? Obviously we need to spread the word and start a movement to improve the health of our woods.

I moved here from Glenwood Springs, Colo. Ring a bell? Glenwood Springs was the site of the deadly Storm King fire the summer of '94. I have seen first hand the destruction of a wildfire in an unhealthy, overgrown woods (in this case mainly scrub oak and sagebrush). I witnessed the hysterics of homeowners whose houses were "urban interfaced" with the wilderness. I, too, felt the sadness and helplessness felt by the community from the loss of 14 firefighters' lives. And I watched the drama unfold as everyone tried to put the blame elsewhere for this fire and the loss of life (no homes were lost).

When you look at the beauty of the woods in our community, it is hard to believe that it is in an extremely unhealthy condition. Don't let a "Storm King Fire" happen here, people. When another Public Awareness Day is offered, GO, LEARN, DO. And to help the U.S.

Forest Service, write the congressmen. Congress tells the Forest Service what to do with the land. They aren't the experts. The national and state forest personnel are the experts when it comes to the health of our forest. We need to clear the forest of overgrowth and disease (by logging, etc.) and allow fire in the ecosystem for a healthier forest. The Mescalero Indians are doing it now and have a long-range plan for the future of their forests. And what about the spotted owl? Surprise! He also will benefit from a healthier forest. (Just another insightful fact gleaned from Public Awareness Day.)

Thank you, again, to all the fine folks and sponsors who presented this program. I walked away as an informed and more knowledgeable person because of you.

Preparation of the Theater Missile Defense (TMD) Flight Test Supplemental Environmental Assessment (EA)

AGENCY: Program Executive Office (PEO), Missile Defense

ACTION: Notice of Availability

SUMMARY: This Notice of Availability is for the preparation of the Supplemental EA for the proposed TMD flight test program. In accordance with procedural provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act (40 Code of Federal Regulations 1500-1508), Department of Defense Directive 6050.1, and Army Regulation 200-2, the U.S. Army Space and Strategic Defense Command (USASSDC) has been tasked by the PEO, Missile Defense to conduct a supplemental assessment of the potential environmental consequences of the TMD flight test program at White Sands Missile Range (WSMR).

The TMD Flight Test Environmental Assessment (EA), which resulted in a Finding of No Significant Impact on April 20, 1995, identified and analyzed the potential for environmental impacts resulting from TMD flight test activities at WSMR. The TMD Flight Test EA determined that all debris from missile intercepts over WSMR would be contained within WSMR-controlled areas, including the extension areas, based on planned intercept locations and mean annual wind conditions. However, as intercept parameters have been further defined, recent analyses by the National Range Operations Directorate at WSMR and independent analyses conducted by the USASSDC have shown that there is a probability that debris could exceed WSMR-controlled areas for Theater High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) intercept missions. It was stated in the TMD Flight Test EA that if a potential for substantially different environmental impacts was identified, then additional analysis or documentation would be required. Accordingly,

this Supplemental EA analyzes the potential environmental impacts as a result of intercept debris that could exceed the WSMR-controlled areas.

Flight preparation, launch, flight, and intercept activities for TMD intercepts were analyzed in the TMD Flight Test EA and the Extended Range Intercept (ERINT) EA. Only the extent of the debris dispersion has changed. This Supplemental EA analyzes potential effects from changes in debris dispersion predictions including the establishment of temporary restricted airspace adjacent to WSMR. The debris would consist primarily of steel, aluminum, glass, plastic, and graphite composite materials. Minor amounts of other metals may also be present; however, missile debris composed of these materials would be virtually inert in the environment. The environmental consequences of the No-action Alternative were analyzed in the TMD Flight Test EA, which concluded with a Finding of No Significant Impact.

FINDINGS: The debris that would land on WSMR-controlled areas as a result of the further defined flight scenarios will not result in any environmental concerns other than those already addressed in the TMD Flight Test EA.

Analysis of the missile intercept debris indicates that no short- or long-term impacts will occur to air quality, geology and soils, hazardous materials and waste, infrastructure, noise, socioeconomics, transportation, or water resources. Environmental resources that have a potential for impact were considered in more detail, the affected environment was described, and any potential for significant consequences was identified. The areas of environmental consideration analyzed in more detail include public health and safety, airspace, land use, cultural resources, and biological resources and are described below.

The analysis indicates that all proposed activities can be conducted in a manner which does not significantly increase the risk to public health and safety. Continued analyses will be conducted by WSMR flight safety at the time of launch. No launches will be conducted which

would present a risk of injury to someone on the ground greater than one in a million.

The establishment of temporary restricted airspace will be required for intercepts in which debris exceeds WSMR-controlled areas. This will eliminate any significant risk to aircraft. The temporary restricted airspace will limit civilian and military aircraft operations for a scheduled 4-hour period 2 days per month, resulting in temporary delays, but is not expected to have a significant effect on air traffic. In addition, airspace will be restricted to coincide with the northern boundary of WSMR-controlled areas to provide a safety buffer in the event of a flight termination.

The proposed activities are compatible with existing land uses and the activities associated with the uses will continue uninterrupted. The only historic property identified within the cultural resources region of the influence is the Three Rivers Petroglyph site. Debris dispersion modeling indicates the probability of this site being impacted is remote; therefore, no adverse effects are expected. Sensitive biological species populations in the area are widely scattered and individuals within the populations occupy small surface areas. Because of this, the chance of an individual plant or animal of a sensitive species being struck by debris is remote. No other potential effects to biological resources are expected to result from the proposed activities.

Evaluation of the areas of environmental consideration for which a potential for impact was posed has shown that no significant impacts would occur from the implementation of the TMD flight test program.



PEOP SCOOP

With the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays fast approaching, many Lincoln County residents will be leaving home for short or extended vacations.

Family pets often must be left behind in the care of family, friends or professional kennels.

Jim Riggins, director of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter suggested some precautions surrounding your pet's safety and care before heading out of town.

"Be sure to sign an emergency veterinary release form authorizing the person caring for your pet to seek emergency medical attention for the animal," Riggins said.

"Leave the phone number, hours and location of your veterinarian of choice as well as their on-call schedule or phone number for after hours."

Also posted in your home should be the phone numbers and hours of all area animal control agencies and animal shelters.

Give the person caring for the family pet documentation to prove the animal has a current rabies shot, license (if applicable) and showing whether

it is neutered. "This is important in view of local and state mandatory spay/neuter laws," Riggins said. "Without such proof, the person taking care of the pet may experience a delay in reclaiming the animal."

It also may be wise to leave money in case an animal gets loose and is impounded.

"Most shelters will not extend their holding periods when a caretaker is known and the animal is not picked up within the regular time frame," Riggins said.

If a boarding kennel is used, check ahead of time for the type of vaccinations that are required, Riggins said.

"Most will require a current full spectrum of vaccinations including rabies," he said. "Many kennels also require a bordatella vaccination against an infection commonly called kennel cough."

If the animal is taking medication, be sure there is enough on hand to last at least until a few days after you return. If the animal is not staying in its regular home, supply its regular food and note its usual feeding schedule. Send a blanket or old shirt with your scent on it with your pet to ease the stress of the time apart.
