#### Governor vetoes county projects

Two years of community projects approved by the state Legislature have been vetoed by Gov. Gary Johnson.

The actions of the governor Monday have confused many legislators, including State Sen. Pete Campos (D-Santa Rosa), who represents Lincoln County.

"Everything just caved in on all of us," Campos said Tuesday while trying to explain what had happened to projects in Lincoln County that had been allocated money by the Legislature in 1995 or during the legislative session last month in Santa Fe.

Johnson vetoed \$57.8 million worth of construction projects across the state to be paid for with severance tax revenues from oil, gas and minerals, or from the general fund in 1996. The capital outlay projects were contained in House Bill 13.

Johnson also vetoed Senate Bill 686, which was designed to close out the state's books for the fiscal year and unfreeze \$32 million in projects approved in the 1995 session. The projects were frozen when the state ran out of money in one fund mid-year.

But the Legislature would not have made the 1995-approved money available until April of 1997, and Johnson objected to the delay.

He indicated Monday that if the Legislature finds a way to release the money for the 1995 projects earlier, he may sign a duplicate of the public works bill he vetoed Monday. That chance may come during the special legislative session he has called for March 20.

Projects in limbo in Lincoln County include \$20,000 for improvements to the Eastern New Mexico University instructional center in Ruidoso, \$20,000 for sidewalks in the settlement of Lincoln, and \$100,000 for the conversion of Camp Sierra Blanca from an adult prison to an environmental juvenile treatment center.

#### Corona re-elects council incumbents

Two uncontested incumbents were re-elected to the Corona Village Council Tuesday. Lincoln County's northernmost village had the only county election without competition.

Turner Wilson and A.J. Gibbs each received 22 votes, representing an 18% turnout of the 122 registered voters in town.

## County may get fort plus state camp

Lincoln County soon may own both Fort Stanton and Camp Sierra Blanca.

The county might not only get the \$12 million fort for \$1 — it may essentially be paid a half-million dollars to take the state-owned fort, because county commissioners don't want to pay for the fort's upkeep until a tenant is found.

State General Services Secretary Steven Beffort outlined for county commissioners Tuesday the steps needed to transfer the historic fort and the nearby prison camp from state to county ownership.

After a brief meeting behind closed doors in an executive session, commissioners agreed to follow the path detailed by Beffort.

They will ask State Rep. Dub Williams (R-Glencoe) and State Sen. Pete Campos (D-Santa Rosa) to submit a joint memorial authorizing the ownership switch, during the special legislative session starting March 20.

The legislators also will submit a bill asking for \$500,000 to maintain the fort for a year, and affirmation of \$900,000 previously allocated for restoration and renovation of buildings in the historic fort complex.

"I'm really tickled with this action," said Commissioner Wilton Howell after the meeting. "We still are in touch with some companies that were interested in leasing the fort, but were turned off by some of the state requirements. It may be too early to be excited, but I am."

The state/county change of ownership could be accomplished in a sale for \$1 if the governor approves, Beffort said.

"It's a \$12 million asset, but just sitting there serves no purpose," he said of the fort, which lies about 15 miles northeast of Ruidoso. Fort Stanton was closed as a state hospital by Gov. Gary Johnson in March 1995, because of the high cost of operation.

In its regular session last month, the Legislature did not approve Johnson's budget request for \$500,000 to maintain the fort for one year, Beffort said. Without more money, state resources will run dry by July 1, he said.

Before a scheduled March 22 meeting between the county commission and the governor, Beffort will try to persuade Johnson the plan for county ownership is workable. By the time they see Johnson, commissioners also must map out an aggressive plan to attract potential lessees, Beffort warned.

The best approach would be to transfer the fort and Camp Sierra Blanca to the county at the same time, Beffort said.

The camp is being closed as an adult minimum security prison in September, but the state Children, Youth and Families Department (CYF) wants to convert it into an environmental work camp for juvenile offenders.

In its regular session, the Legislature accidentally did not approve the full budget requested for that conversion and operation, because

## Voters throw out Capitan incumbents

Zoning continued to be a divisive issue in the village of Capitan Tuesday, with the majority of voters turning their backs on two incumbents trustees and the former chairman of the planning and zoning board.

Instead, voters chose John Whitaker and Alfred Montes.

In Carrizozo, voters picked Wesley Lindsay and Eileen Lovelace.

John Whitaker, retired from the Air Force and a familiar face from behind the cash register at the Capitan Shell station, was the top winner in Capitan's non-partisan race for trustee. He drew 142 votes or 33% of the ballots cast for the two, four-year terms available.

His approach toward zoning has been conservative, but his overriding campaign theme was to reunite factions to work together for the betterment of the community.

"I think that there's a movement toward moderation," Whitaker said from his home in Capitan Tuesday after the vote was certified. "The whole difference is that I work in the store and know a lot of people. I also ran for municipal judge last time (1994) and they remember that. I only lost by 12 votes."

"This time, I won by a good margin. I would say that's a mandate."

Alfred Leroy Montes won the second seat on the board. The former trustee, who stepped down from the board in 1994, works for the Alto Water Association. He feels he represents the interests of average working people who make up the majority of village residents.

Montes pulled 27% (117) of the votes.

Incumbent Gordon Ross, who was on the board during two hearings on zoning, narrowly lost his bid for re-election, drawing 26% of the vote. He was followed by Capitan businesswoman Debra Ingle with 24% and Bernhard Reimann, a biologist, community volunteer and former planning board chairman, with 23% or 100 votes.

Of the seven candidates running for the two seats, construction worker Alex Trujillo collected 19% of the vote and former firefighter Michael Romero pulled 8%.

Incumbent L.C. Cozzens, a former superintendent of schools, was defeated for a two-year term by real

estate broker Lamoyne Carpenter, who was running for the seat vacated by his son. Carpenter won 207 votes or 58% compared to Cozzens' 42% and 152 votes.

A total of 359 people marked the ballot in that race.

However, 433 voters or 56% of the village's 768 registered voters cast ballots for the two, four-year terms up for election. Of that number, 99 were absentee ballots.

Two years ago, 63% (407 voters) came to the polls to elect trustees and a mayor. The number of registered voters in Capitan increased by 15% (from 646 to 768) since the last election in 1994, but the percentage turnout dropped by 7%.

Village Clerk Deborah Cummins was planning on a heavy turnout based on the absentee count.

"We usually have about 10 to 12," she said. "A lot of the interest seems to go back to planning and zoning. I don't know if people think it's just time for a change."

## Ruidoso hit with high voter apathy

Voter apathy seemed to rule Ruidoso yesterday as a mere 14% of the village's 4,148 registered voters came out to the Civic Events Center to cast their ballots.

It was the worst turnout of the five municipal elections in Lincoln County Tuesday. Capitan had a 56% showing, the best turnout and the most competitive race. Corona, with an uncontested race, had more votes cast than Ruidoso.

Only 562 voters came to the polls, casting the most votes for in-

cumbents Frank Cummins and Robert Donaldson, and challenger Bob Sterchi. Incumbent candidate J.D. James received the fewest votes, losing his bid for another four-year term.

Compared to the last municipal election in 1994 when 47% of voters cast ballots, yesterday's turnout was a big drop.

"I think maybe it's the wind that's keeping the voters away," Civic Center superintendent Nelson Eldred said.

# Incumbent James lone Ruidoso loser

After two terms on the Ruidoso Village Council, incumbent candidate J.D. James lost his council seat to new challenger Bob Sterchi Tuesday.

"I think it's term limits that did it," James, 76, said from his home after votes were tallied. "I guess people thought it's time for younger blood."

Two other incumbents, Robert Donaldson and Frank Cummins, held onto their positions. Four people were running for a total of three seats.

Sterchi will begin serving his four-year term after being sworn in 5 p.m. Monday at village hall.

Of the total 562 ballots cast by resident voters, James received 287 votes in the non-partisan election. Sterchi, a Planning and Zoning Commissioner, was just above James with 332 votes.

Top vote getter was incumbent Frank Cummins with 432 votes, followed by incumbent Robert Donaldson with 399 votes. Only 18 people took advantage of the opportunity to vote early.

Together with Sterchi, Cummins and Donaldson will serve the council until the year 2000.

The three winners were out celebrating with food and drink soon after learning the election results.

"I'm excited and am looking forward to working with the council for the people of Ruidoso," Sterchi said from Wayne's Place Lounge, adding, "I feel the community owes a debt to J.D. James for what he's contributed to Ruidoso, because he has contributed a lot."

The freshman councilor said he plans to ask James for his help and advice.

Although James wanted to win, he said he's not disappointed in his loss.

"I'm relieved, to tell you the truth," said James, the mayor pro tem. "There's places my wife and I wanted to go and now I can fill the car with gasoline and go!"

If he's sorry about anything, James said he wished more people had come out to vote.

"I really appreciate all the voters who voted for me and supported me," he added.

## Lovelace, Wesley top race for Carrizozo village council seats

Eileen Lovelace and Wesley Lindsay beat two other candidates Tuesday for a seat on the Carrizozo Village Council.

The campaign was dominated by a push to keep the community center open, and even expand it.

Eileen Lovelace won re-election to her seat as trustee as the second-highest vote getter in the non-partisan election. She pulled 50% or 117 votes. She has been a strong supporter of an expanded rec center.

"I feel satisfied with the vote," she said. "At least half of those voting thought I am doing a good job."

The top winner was Wesley Lindsay, retired from Mountain Bell, who came in first with 60% or 140 votes. He didn't attribute his win to any one issue.

"I just think that the people know me and that I will work hard for Carrizozo," Lindsay said after the vote was tallied. "They know who I am and what I stand for. I hadn't taken a stand on the rec center, but at a candidates meeting

(last week), I realized there is a lot of concern."

"I'm for keeping it opened and trying to make it as important in the community as it once was for young people. I think it could be great again."

The center now primarily is used for bowling league competitions.

Walter Hill, who works in the Lincoln County assessor's office, lost his bid for the board with 106 votes, as did sculptor Michael Cain with 72 votes.

Not every voter who turned out for the election cast a ballot for one of the two men running for municipal judge in Carrizozo.

Incumbent Judge William Meeks received 142 votes or 66% of the 216 persons voting in his race against challenger and former Federal Aviation Administration air controller Alfred Hendrix, who received 34% of the vote.

"It feels good to know I have the backing of the voters and they apparently approve of the job I've been doing," Meeks said from a celebration at his home in Carrizozo.

He was appointed two years ago after the unexpected death of the winner of the 1994 election.

A total of 233, or 39% of the 594 registered voters, went to the polls in the non-partisan election. That compares to a 60% response in 1994, when 366 of the 538 voters registered cast ballots. Eleven of the ballots were absentee votes.

City Clerk Carol Schlarb had predicted a heavy turnout and was disappointed.

"This is lower than two years ago and it surprises me," she said. "The candidates were all running on a platform of keeping open the community recreation center, but some have different opinions on how that should be done, and on the future of the golf course and economic development in the community. I thought that would draw voters, but I guess it wasn't as strong an issue as I thought."

Several incumbent trustees currently on the board who were not up for election oppose expanding the use of the center and re-opening a snack bar there.

## Hayhurst easily beats trustee Craig

Village of Ruidoso Downs incumbent mayor Joe Hayhurst handily defeated challenger Charlotte Craig in Tuesday's election race.

Craig had decided not to run again for her council seat, so she could face off against Hayhurst.

"You always sweat," Hayhurst said after the votes were tallied. "I must admit to having some butterflies in my stomach."

Hayhurst received a total of 157, or 84% of the votes cast, versus Craig's 29 votes.

"I honestly didn't expect to win by that much," Hayhurst said. "But I'm thankful for the confidence that the voters have shown by allowing me to serve as mayor of Ruidoso Downs for another four years."

A total of 24%, or 186 of the 772 registered voters, turned out to cast their ballots. The only contested race was for mayor.

Judy Miller ran unopposed for re-election to the office of trustee. She has served as a trustee for the past four years.

"I'm glad to hear that the election turned out the way it did," Miller said. "I want to thank everyone for their vote of confidence."

Jacquelyn Branum was also running unopposed for trustee. Branum will replace Craig.

Branum served on the Ruidoso Downs Village Council for 12 years ending in 1992. She recently returned to the village from a teaching job in Texas.

Ruidoso Downs Judge Harold Mansell was also running unopposed. Mansell, who has been the judge in Ruidoso Downs for nine years, received the strongest vote of confidence among unopposed Ruidoso Downs candidates, with 95% taking the time to check off his box.

"We are taught at Judge's College that as elected officials, when you get 90% of the votes or better when running unopposed, it means the public thinks you are doing a good job," Mansell said. "I sincerely hope that's what they were telling me by voting for me."

The official swearing-in ceremony for the newly elected candidates will be at 6:30 p.m. Monday, March 7 at Ruidoso Downs Village Hall.

Voter turnout during the 12 hours of polling was "better than a trickle, but there certainly hasn't been a landslide of people running through the door," Eldred added.

"I don't know why there was such a low turnout," James said. "Apathy's the word, I guess."

Village Clerk Tammie Maddox, who reported the unofficial vote count around 8 p.m., attributed the low turnout to a possible "lack of issues."

"Or maybe it's because people are happy with things," she said.

The contest's candidates offered similar insight.

"I like to be optimistic and think people are pretty satisfied with the way things are going," Frank Cummins said.

Still, Cummins agreed the number of voters was disappointing.

"I like to think we're governed by a majority of voters," he said. "My primary disappointment was that more people didn't run for office."

Donaldson spent part of election day calling businesses and reminding people to go out and vote, he said.

"Not necessarily for me, but I just reminded them to vote," Donaldson said. "I find it embarrassing for such a small percentage of registered voters to vote."

"Even though there's no controversy, it's just not right."

Some of the apathy may be due to state municipal elections in communities with populations under 10,000 being non-partisan. Candidates win by receiving the most votes, not by running for a specific seat, he said.

"It doesn't lend itself to running against a particular person," Donaldson said.

Instead of campaigning on a personal record and answering directly to the public, candidates run "more on the accomplishments of the council," he said of the election process.

Fewer people may have ventured to the polls because this wasn't a mayoral election, Sterchi surmised.

"Just think of how many only vote during presidential elections," he said.

The lack of controversy and the day's blustering winds may have also kept people home, Sterchi added.

"I could hardly stand up in the wind," he said.

## Fort lease regs fewer for county

Twice the state Department of General Services (GSD) has failed to find a tenant for historic Fort Stanton.

Now it may be Lincoln County's turn to try. County Commission Chairman Monroy Montes said Tuesday that state officials have realized their system is flawed and almost destined to fail with the conditions that were tied to the state lease.

GSD Secretary Steven Beffort and Santa Fe marketing consultant Bill Conway said if the county owns the fort it will not be subject to several troublesome restrictions, including:

- a provision allowing the state to cancel a lease without cause with one-year's notice;
- a restriction against leasing portions of the fort to different tenants;
- a prohibition against private companies getting outside financing to remodel and repair buildings for their use;
- and strict historical preservation requirements for the buildings. Preservation and restoration requirements are tougher if the state is occupying the fort than if a private entity leases or owns the fort, Beffort explained.

Another advantage to the county would be the transfer of about 140 acre-feet of water rights, a valuable commodity by itself, Beffort said. However, those rights could be lost if the water is not used on a continuing basis, he added.

Whatever the reasons for the past failures by the state to find a tenant, "the bottom line is that we need to move forward," Beffort said.

Conway, who contacted the commission about helping to market the property, estimated it may take 18 months to two years before a new tenant is found.

He said the fort complex would make a spectacular destination resort.

of a mix-up. But a spokesman for CYF said Monday that department officials hope the additional money will be approved in the special session.

CYF Secretary Heather Wilson has said the fort is too large for her needs, but the camp is the perfect size.

"The governor has determined that it is too costly for any of its agencies to operate the fort and that includes CYF, the Health Department and even the Corrections Department," said Commission Chairman Monroy Montes.

The commission wants to be the vehicle for finding a new fort tenant, but only under certain conditions, he said.

"We will not jeopardize the

financial stability of this local government long or short term to alleviate the state's problem or to provide 200 jobs," Montes said.

"I certainly support the idea that Lincoln County is the best place for the effort (to find a tenant)," Beffort said.

Although the county would not be saddled with some of the state's requirements, it would have to follow the same procedure of requesting proposals for leases, Beffort said.

"What if (a transfer and more money) isn't approved in the special session?" asked Commissioner Bill Schwettmann. "Where does that leave us?"

"We'll bring it up again next year," Montes said.

"Some of the buildings could be boarded up," Beffort said.

## Plans for microbrewery stalled at Y Knot Park site, owner says

A 50-year-old covenant forbids alcohol brewing and sales in Ruidoso's Palmer Gateway Subdivision, but the owner of the former Y-Knot Park still wants to open a microbrewery.

"We do still plan on it," said Gary Shewan after Monday's Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. "But, it's just one thing at a time." He wouldn't say how he planned to overcome the covenant.

Last summer, Shewan said he would open the microbrewery by the fall of 1995.

The delay in setting up the brewery is not because of the subdivision's 1946 "no alcohol sales" covenant, but because it is taking longer than Shewan expected to receive a state brewer's license, and longer than expected to renovate the former arcade building, he said.

He expects the state brewer's license to be granted within the next month, and for building renovations to be completed in eight to nine months.

Shewan's application for a microbrewery at the intersection of U.S. Highway 70 and Sudderth Drive was first approved by commissioners nearly 17 months ago.

No public comments about the possible violation of the covenant were aired at the 1994 public hearing on the application, Planning Director Cleatus Richards said.

But even if Gateway residents and businesses had spoken out about the covenant, commissioners still could have approved the building's proposed use, Richards said.

"As far as our zoning regulations are concerned, a brewery is a legally permitted use in that area," he said. "We don't enforce covenants; we did make Mr. Shewan fully aware that the covenant existed and has been fully maintained."

Shewan said he has "no comment" about the covenant which was drafted by the subdivision's developers, Dolcie and Joe Palmer, Virginia and M.S. Hamilton, and George and Lucille McCarty.

If there is no precedence of alcohol sales within the subdivision, one or more property owners has the right to sue Shewan if the brewery is established, Richards said.

At Monday's meeting, P&Z commissioners approved changing the zoning of Shewan's 42,000 square-foot building from heavy industrial to commercial retail. This will allow Shewan to more easily lease large portions of the building to tenants.

Shewan already has one brewery, the Alamogordo Brewing Company in Alamogordo.

Following is the action taken by the Ruidoso Village Planning and Zoning Commission meeting at 2 p.m. Monday, March 4 at village hall.

### PUBLIC HEARINGS:

— Approved Tent Amendment 96-001 — Home Occupation code. Deleted section 10-7-4, which gives examples of uses that frequently qualify as home occupations; and section 10-7-5, which lists prohibited home uses. Without these sections, the ordinance still specifies the character of the residential district can not be altered by the business, utility usage can't be increased by more than one additional vehicle at a time.

P&Z's recommended approval will be passed on to the village council, and the ordinance changes are subject to its approval.

— Approved Zone Amendment 96-002 — Zone map amendment — Lot 6 & tract F, Palmer Gateway Subdivision; Gary Shewan, applicant. Shewan wants to change zoning from C-4, which is for heavy industrial businesses, to C-2, commercial retail. P&Z's recommended approval is subject to council approval.

### NEW BUSINESS:

— Approved Plat Revision 96-008 — Replat — South half of lots 8&9, block 4, Ponderosa Heights unit 1 subdivision. Replat allows applicant Luis Rodriguez to create one lot to be known as lot 9a to contain 7,200 square feet.

— Approved Planning Variance 96-004 — Variance — Lot 11, block 1, Cherokee Addition subdivision. Variance allows applicant Ramon N. Pagan to enclose a 190 square-foot front deck.

— Approved PVC96-001 — Vacation of public right-of-way — Lot 3, block F, Ruidoso Springs Subdivision. Vacation of 1,493 square feet for payment of \$746.50 allows applicant Don Rieppert to prevent encroachment by proposed construction.

P&Z's recommended vacation is subject to council approval.

## Random audit reveals underpaid Ruidoso lodgers taxes

A random audit of Ruidoso lodgers turned up one business that underpaid worse than any others in four years, officials said.

That lodging establishment under-reported profits by nearly \$16,000 in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, officials said. The owner is disputing the audit.

"He had no documents to support his verbal explanation," auditor Ronnie Hemphill said.

"We'll follow up with bills to the lodging establishment," Village Manager Gary Jackson said. "If we're not successful, we'll go through small claims or seek a legal judgment."

The fiscal year 1994-1995 audit, conducted by Certified Public Accountant Ronnie Hemphill, revealed the lodger under-reported revenue in the amount of \$15,956. Because of this under-reporting, \$510 more in lodgers taxes were due than what the lodger had paid,

and \$1,087 more in gross receipts, Hemphill said.

Ruidoso's lodgers taxes are used to promote the village and its special events. The village collected \$382,626 in fiscal year 1994-1995, about 17% more than it collected in FY1993-94 (\$317,560).

Village councilors initiated the 4% lodgers tax in 1974. The state began requiring random audits in 1992. The village pays for the audits, which cost \$1,228 this year.

All 68 of Ruidoso's lodges were eligible for the pick except for those audited within the last two years.

Eight lodgers were audited this year. One under-paid, four paid the right amount, two made payments late and one ended up not owing anything, Hemphill said.

The late payments brought penalties of \$1,460 and \$258 against the two businesses, Hemphill said.

One lodger at first didn't clearly

identify deposits for short-term rental receipts versus long-term, month-to-month rental receipts, Hemphill said. Other records later indicated his business had only monthly rentals in FY1995, which are not subject to the tax.

The names of the audited businesses are confidential. Only Hemphill, Jackson, Village Clerk, Tammie Maddox and state Department of Finance and Administration officials know their identities.

## Ruidoso's voter turnout was pitiful, at best

One could argue that Ruidoso faces more (and more complicated) issues today than ever before. One could also argue that, as the largest community in Lincoln County, Ruidoso has more issues than other communities in this county.

Why, then, did it have the worst voter apathy yesterday of any Lincoln County municipality? Village Clerk Tammie Maddox doesn't ever remember such a poor turnout (to be fair, voters' names aren't purged as quickly from the rolls these days).

Even tiny Corona, with two trustees running for two positions, had a better turnout (18% of the registered voters) than Ruidoso, with four people seeking three positions.

Ruidoso's voter apathy may have had something to do with candidate apathy — people didn't think there was enough competition to bother to go to the polls. But again, we point to Corona.

Ruidoso's candidates didn't seem anxious to point out their differences this year — maybe none were substantial. Ironically, Ruidoso voters turned out in droves when there was more controversy. We hope that's not a requirement in the future.

Until the next election, if you have a complaint and you're among the 86% of Ruidoso registered voters who didn't bother to exercise your rights, we don't want to hear it.

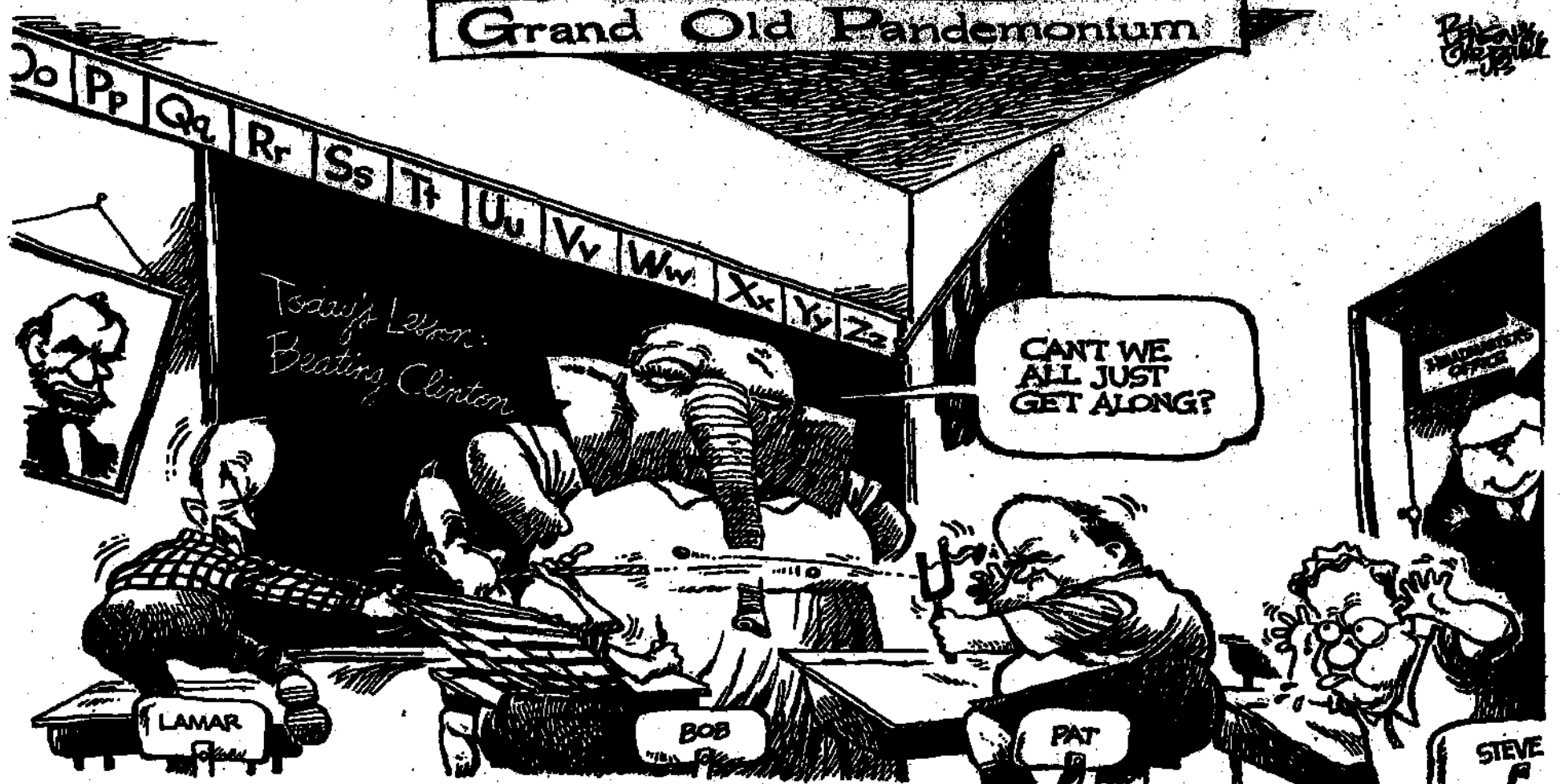

## Criminal case handled unfairly

TO THE EDITOR:

I am writing this letter in regard to the article "Police Arrest Springer Runaway after alleged fight and fight" by Kathleen McDonald.

After reading this article I felt it was somewhat biased. For example, the verbs "big" and "slammed" in reference to the statements "Put up a big fight," and "...slammed Officer Robert Achterberg in the head with a chair." I do however have to agree with the use of the verb "force" in the statement "...Arrested with force." I might add the adjective "excessive" to that statement, considering that during the course of the arrest I was allegedly choked and threatened by Officer Achterberg while I was pinned face down.

As a result of being denied the ability to breathe, I swung at Officer Achterberg in self-defense with a bar stool that was in reach, grazing the left side of his face. The force of the blow apparently was not very strong at all, considering Officer Achterberg was not in any way disfigured. In fact, Officer Achterberg allegedly stated at the scene that he did not feel that there were any grounds to file battery charges.

It is true that I was wanted on a

warrant for escaping from the New Mexico Boy's School, but the reason I was sentenced to the Boy's School was not in the article either. I was charged and found guilty of assault and battery on a school personnel for squirting a middle school counselor with a Super Soaker water gun. I was sentenced to two years in the NMBS on Oct. 28 of 1994 by District Judge Parsons with the recommendation of Jane Parnell the juvenile probation officer and Viola Rhodes the Assistant District Attorney.

At the time of my sentencing I was a senior in Ruidoso High School, living on my own and supporting myself with a part-time job. I had a lot of things going for me, and I was looking forward to graduation.

As a result of my sentence, I now have a GED in place of a high school diploma, not to mention a violent felony on my permanent record even though my crime was hardly violent.

I could go on and on about the many ways my case has been wrongfully handled and about how this has, and will continue to affect my life, but I am not writing this for sympathy. I am writing in hope to open the eyes of the people of Ruidoso, especially the parents.

The Ruidoso Police Department is blowing small problems and minor infractions way out of pro-

portion. The people of Ruidoso, especially the parents, need to think of what they want for their children. Does Ruidoso want to send every kid with a squirt gun to juvenile prison for two years? Do you want your children put into an environment with murderers, real gang members and other violent criminals? It happened to me and it could just as easily have happened to your kids as well.

Now here I sit almost six months after my 18th birthday in Lincoln County Jail. I have been waiting to go to court for over four months now for the charges listed in the above named article.

About three months ago an 18-year-old from Ruidoso was hooked in here for unlawful taking of a motor vehicle. He had stolen a car from Sierra Blanca Motors and fled to Texas, where he was arrested and extradited here. He was my cell mate for two days, then he went to court in front of Magistrate Judge Butts. He was convicted, got probation and was asked to pay restitution to the dealership. He was released to the custody of his father, Sgt. Robert Achterberg.

I hope that this will inspire the people of Ruidoso to take a closer look at the Justice System of Lincoln County and the procedures of the Ruidoso Police Department, because there are definitely a lot of changes that need to be made. If for

any reason, do it for the youth of Ruidoso, do it for the children.

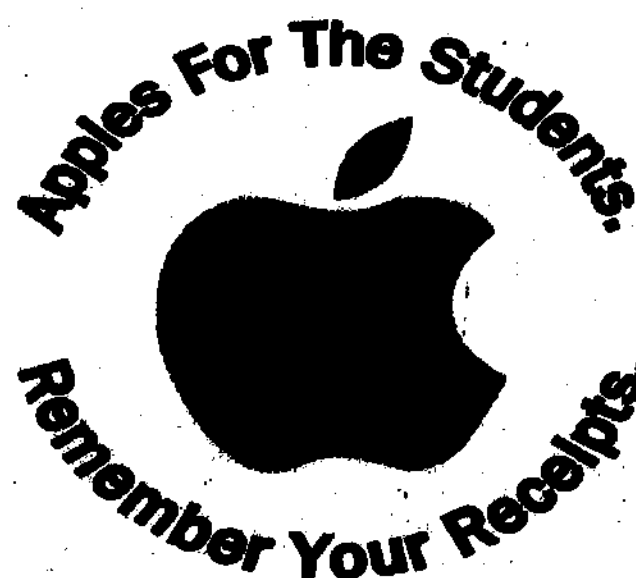

## Commissioners to decide race meet dates

The horses will go to the gates this summer - but just when and where they'll race will be decided in today's New Mexico Racing Commission meeting in Albuquerque.

Commissioners will devote their attention to the sole issue of determining the 1996 race dates for the state's five horse racetracks. The issue is the only item on the commission agenda. Track officials will lay out their formal race schedule requests at the meeting.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track will ask for a 49-day race meet starting Friday, May 24 and ending Sept. 2 on Labor Day, said Rick Baugh, director of operations for the track.

"The commission will assign days. At this point, we don't have an exact feel as to what they're going to do," Baugh said Tuesday. "We're trying to be as cooperative as possible."

However, Baugh hinted Downs track man-

agement would like "to see a few things straightened out" before it agrees to the racing schedules for all tracks. Baugh wouldn't elaborate on just what those conditions are, but he is fairly sure each track will ask for relatively the same schedule as last year.

New Mexico Racing Commission Chairman Eddie Fowler said he is most concerned about doing what's best for racing in New Mexico.

"We've got to maintain racing in New Mexico. And we have to forget about any type of (expanded) gaming. We've got to focus ourselves on horse racing and how we're going to survive and how we're going to make the best product for our people out here," Fowler said Tuesday.

Fowler doesn't appreciate the "I'm-going-to-take-my-marbles-and-go-home-argument."

"I can't stand this 'If we can't have this, then to heck with it and we're going to shut

down," Fowler said. The tracks should be doing what they can for fans and owners who have supported the industry through the years, he added.

All New Mexico's racetrack owners have met together twice since the last commission meeting, in an effort to figure out racing schedules that work for all five of them.

Nothing conclusive came from the meetings, Baugh said.

But Fowler disagreed, saying track management had the opportunity to communicate and bat around ideas such as circuit racing. In circuit racing, only one track operates at a time.

Circuit racing could work in the winter, but not in the summer, Fowler said. There are too many owners who want to run their horses in the summer months.

"They love to come to New Mexico to run their horses. They love to come to Ruidoso to run their horses. They love to go to Santa Fe

and run horses," Fowler said of the popularity of New Mexico racing.

The commission meets in executive session at 2 p.m. today, followed by an open session at 4 p.m.

**HOOFEATS:** All American Futurity nominations have increased compared to last year at this time, Baugh said. Twenty-five more racehorses are nominated for the race, bringing the total to 575 vying for the world's richest quarter horse race run at Ruidoso Downs Race Track. Unfortunately, the Kansas Futurity (to be run at Texas' Trinity Meadows in late May) has drawn horses away from the first two jewels of the quarter horses' Triple Crown, the Rainbow Futurity and Ruidoso Futurity. Nominations are down 10% for those two races, Baugh said. New Mexico tracks should attract horses from Phoenix and Oklahoma City when those respective tracks close their race meets in May.

Eagles ready to soar

A senior-laden Fort Sumner boys basketball team ended Hondo's season with a 64-48 Region D semifinal victory Friday. The win sent the Foxes to the regional title game and earned Fort Sumner a spot in the Class A State Boys Basketball Tournament this weekend in Las Cruces.

Omar Barragan's junior and sophomore-dominated Hondo team fell behind 8-0 and never quite recovered. The Eagles trailed by nine at the half, and made a couple of runs at the Foxes in the second half before falling.

Hondo's turnovers and the Fort Sumner full-court, man-to-man press proved too much for the Eagles to overcome, said Barragan, who is in his first year as varsity coach for Hondo.

The Eagles, who finished with a 16-7 overall mark, return their starting lineup for next year, including leading scorers Jorge Ontiveros, Joshua Candelaria and Anthony Hernandez. Barragan will also welcome junior-to-be Jeffrey Sanchez, who missed the season recovering from a knee injury.

Barragan is in his second year at Hondo after a teaching and coaching stint in Dexter. He coached the Hondo junior high boys basketball team before taking over the varsity job this year.

Friday's game marked the first time since 1965 the Eagles played in a regional tournament.

Needless to say, the Eagles' hopes for next year are already soaring in the Hondo Valley. Hondo returns its three all-district selections (Ontiveros, Hernandez and Jared DeBaca) and honorable mention choice Adam Herrera.

"We're looking forward to it (next season). We're disappointed about this (loss), but we've already set some goals for next year," Barragan said. "I'd really like to thank the Hondo fans for their enthusiastic support at home and on the road."

## Effort pleases Sanchez

Ruidoso boys cage coach Ben Sanchez said he has no complaints about the Warriors' efforts this year.

"We wanted to keep playing and get close to that district final, but I'm very proud of their effort," Sanchez said. "They couldn't have given me more than they did."

Despite losing seven seniors to graduation, Sanchez will return a strong core of players for the 1996-97 season.

The groundwork for rebuilding Ruidoso's program is there, said Sanchez, who is in his first full year as head coach of the Warriors.

"We're getting there in terms of laying the foundation. It takes a year or two to get the instinctiveness within the system we have. They (the players) know our system, and now they need to take their basketball instincts and marry the two together," Sanchez said.

Underclassmen like Cory Saenz and Scott Sebastian saw quality time on court in varsity games for Sanchez. The Warriors also return junior post player Erik Padilla and junior guards Ryan Trout and Arthur Rojas, among others.

But the Warriors lose playmaker Cory Hood, who led the state in assists at the Class AAA level with 6.8 a game. Also graduating will be 6-6 Joshua Hodges and post players Robert Guardiola, Byron Soules and Matt Norbury. Three-point specialist Rex Comanche will be gone, as will the versatile Jackie Roe.

"The seven seniors we will lose are going to be difficult to replace. They provided us with a core of leadership all year long," said Sanchez, whose team finished 10-14 overall.

**DRUMBEATS:** The state's leading assist man, Ruidoso's Cory Hood, returned to the hardwood for Ruidoso's final three games. Hood severely sprained his ankle Feb. 9 and missed one game. Even though he wasn't at 100%, Hood took the floor. "He gave us everything he had," Sanchez said. Hood and Hodges are being recruited by Culver Stockton, an NCAA Division III college in Canton, Mo.

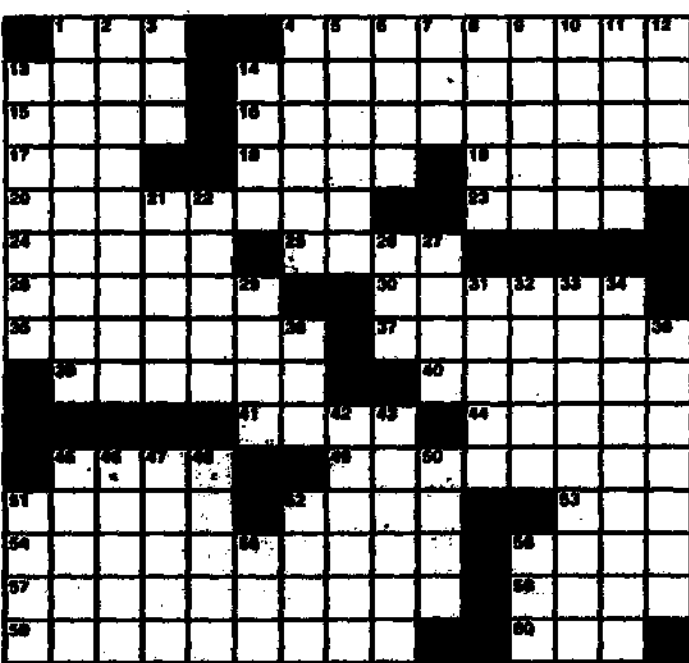

## POOP SCOOP

Ten years ago, writers for the Humane Society News optimistically pointed to increasing awareness of the connection between cruelty to animals and disregard for human life.

"Scientists and lawmakers are beginning to acknowledge the humane movement's long-held position that society's treatment of animals is inseparable from its treatment of human beings," wrote Dr. Randall Lockwood and his colleague Guy R. Hodge.

They lamented the mild punishments for those convicted of animal abuse crimes, and applauded what they considered mounting public sentiment for stiffer sentences.

But 10 years later in New Mexico, animal abuse still is a misdemeanor.

Several humane groups across the state will meet later this month in Albuquerque to work on a strategy to convince lawmakers that it's time to follow the lead of 10 other states and change animal abuse from a misdemeanor to a felony with much stronger penalties.

The Lincoln County Humane Society will be represented at the meeting by Sandra Ford, assistant director of the society's animal shelter.

"There are no defined laws on what people should do in animal abuse cases," Ford said. "Where is the line drawn? Is it all right for a female dog to be tied up day after day and unable to get away from males who wander in and mount her? Is it all right for dogs to become tangled in their chains?"

"Right now, if a dog has food, water and shelter, most law enforcement agencies won't get involved. If cruelty was a felony, there would be more impetus for prosecution."

Many neighbors also are worried about reporting abuse, because they fear retaliation, Ford said. Their fear may be well-founded since violent offenders don't discriminate whether a victim has two or four legs, she said. Some abuse complaints may be registered anonymously.

In the humane society article, Hodges and Lockwood wrote that the evidence is compelling linking serial and mass murderers with acts of cruelty to animals.

Those criminals are involved in significantly high numbers of cruelty incidents, usually prior to the age of 25, they wrote.

Animal abuse rarely involves a single act of cruelty against one victim.

"It is a part of a complex net of disturbed relationships that we are just beginning to understand," Hodge and Lockwood wrote.
