Candidates sign up for state offices

Incumbent State Senator Pete Campos (D-Santa Rosa) faces no opposition for re-election for a four-year term in District 8, which includes Lincoln County.

Campos was one of more than 240 candidates who signed up in Santa Fe Tuesday to run for state and regional offices.

Incumbent State Rep. Dub Williams, a Republican freshman from Glencoe, will face Democrat L. Ray Nunley, a Lincoln County commissioner, in the Nov. 5 general election. Representatives serve two-year terms.

Not all of the candidate figures had been tallied by Wednesday morning, but state elections official Larry Dominguez said the sign-up may be a record.

"It's one of the biggest I've been through and I'm going on my 10th primary," he said.

Twelfth Judicial District Judge Richard A. Parsons, who is asking for voters to retain him for another six years, said he was one of the first in line. But by the time he left, more than 60 candidates were crowded into the state office.

In the same judicial district, incumbent District Attorney Bert Atkins is running on the Democratic ticket for re-election for another four-year term. He will face the winner of the June 4 Republican primary between his former associate Scot D. Key, a Ruidoso attorney, and Darrell N. Brantley, an attorney from Alamogordo.

Fire crews contain Pinetosa blaze

Fire crews Tuesday were mopping up what's left of the 6,000-acre Pinetosa fire in the Cibola National Forest west of Corona.

The fire at the northern edge of Lincoln County was contained at 8 p.m. Friday, but will not be considered controlled until the mop-up operation is completed within the next few days, U.S. Forest Service officials said.

Structures were threatened, but none were destroyed by the fire that started out as a controlled burn in the forest and then leaped its boundaries when winds picked up.

The total cost of fighting the blaze is estimated at \$240,000. More than 160 firefighters and support crews were used at one time on the fire that started March 12.

Nine sign up for sheriff election

A final tally of eight Republicans signed up Tuesday to run for Lincoln County sheriff, a possible record for a primary election.

Only one Lincoln County official will waltz back into an elected seat this year without a battle. And another elected county official is running for election again, but seeking a different job. The slate of 17 county government candidates is dominated by Republicans.

A lone Democrat joined the sheriff's standoff. Democrat Ralph Romero, a member of the county planning and zoning board and a landscaper, will be waiting in the wings to battle the June 4 primary winner on general election day, Nov. 5.

"I think it's probably a record," said County Clerk Martha Proctor of the eight Republican sheriff candidates. "It's the most I've seen since I was first elected in 1989 or that I can remember in the past."

The Republican contenders are (in order of their names on the ballot):

— Larry J. Cearley, sheriff's deputy;

— Raymond D. Merritt, former solid waste transfer station manager and military intelligence officer;

— Orlando Montes Jr., sheriff's deputy;

— Johnnie Johnson, head dispatcher in the sheriff's office;

— Tom Sullivan, sheriff from 1984 to 1986 and second-in-command at Camp Sierra Blanca minimum security prison;

— Richard S. Swenor, former Ruidoso police chief;

— Bob A. Miller, undersheriff;

— and the lone woman, Connie Hopper, county emergency services

director and a former deputy.

Incumbent Sheriff James McSwane, a Republican, is not seeking re-election.

County Assessor Patsy Serna, a Republican, is unopposed for her third term in office.

Incumbent District 2 County Commissioner Wilton Howell, owner of One Stop Auto and Nursery in Ruidoso, will be pitted in the Republican primary against Ben L. Hall, a rancher and former state representative.

In the District 1 commission race, rancher Rex A. Wilson will run against sheriff's deputy Jimmy Luna Sr. in the Republican primary.

In an unusual switch, incumbent District 1 Commissioner Stirling Spencer, a rancher and engineer, is seeking another type of public service job. He qualified to run as a Republican for county probate judge.

He will face incumbent judge J.O. "Bud" Payne in the primary. The winner will be pitted in the general election against Democrat Jack E. Johnson, currently Capitan municipal judge.

Police say man used infant as fight shield

A Ruidoso Downs man is being charged with battering his wife Saturday while holding his baby son as a shield, Ruidoso Downs police said.

George Padilla, 31, now faces three third-degree felony child abuse charges as well as a misdemeanor count of battery against a household member. He's being held at the county jail on a \$50,000 bond. He was on parole at the time of the incident.

The victim's seven-year-old daughter and her seven-year-old friend witnessed the violence, police said.

The victim's daughter told Sergeant Dana Terlecky that Padilla had dropped the child twice during the beating, he said. The child apparently fell on his face at least once because he had dried blood around his mouth when police arrived. He was also crying uncontrollably, Terlecky said.

"He took the child from his room and used him as a shield while striking his mom," officer Chris Condon said.

The victim had attempted to defend herself, and that's why

Padilla held the child as a shield, Terlecky said.

Police arrived soon after receiving a call at 9:36 p.m. Police heard the baby crying and mother screaming as they approached the Palo Verde Trailer Park home. Padilla was standing and holding the crying toddler while facing the victim, who was about three feet away on the floor.

The mother suffered an inch-long cut to her nose and her shirt was bloodied, Terlecky said.

Although the toddler was the only child to appear physically harmed, Padilla was charged with three counts of child abuse, one each for the baby and two seven-year-old girls. Anytime a child is put in a dangerous situation or at risk of injury, it's considered abuse or neglect, Terlecky said.

The baby boy was taken to the Lincoln County Medical Center and held overnight for observation. He was released to his mother the next day, police said.

Padilla, who smelled of alcohol during his arrest, had been paroled

Motor oil drips lead to suspect

Ruidoso police followed a trail of motor oil to a suspected burglar Wednesday morning.

The burglar's attempt to steal a TV was boggled when he apparently ran out of energy after carrying it down a steep flight of stairs. The TV was found in the driveway near the start of the oil trail.

A Ruidoso Downs man was found asleep in his truck at the end of the oil drips a few homes away from the burglarized home. He was arrested.

Police "just followed the little trail of oil droplets and it led right to him," said Detective Jim Biggs. "I guess he needed money to buy oil, I don't know."

Adam McClendon, 24, was charged with residential burglary.

His truck was parked in the carport of a vacation home on L.L. Davis Drive just two doors down from the burglarized house, Detective Jim Biggs said.

Nothing appeared missing from the house but the 27-inch stereo Magnavox TV found in the driveway. McClendon apparently attempted to steal the TV but dropped it because it is so heavy, Biggs said.

"He said he dropped it and it broke," Biggs said of McClendon's confession to the botched thievery.

The TV, valued at \$2,400 when its owners bought it in 1987, was found by police laying next to the oil drips.

An audible alarm originally brought police to the house.

They found a burglar had smashed in glass panels on the

front door to the home. It is also a vacation home and its owners don't know McClendon, Biggs said.

An alarm sounded at the same house after a window was entered early the same Wednesday, just after midnight. But McClendon denied being the culprit in that attempted burglary, Biggs said. Police found nothing disturbed.

McClendon is charged with one count of residential burglary, a fourth-degree felony. He was arraigned at Ruidoso Magistrate Court and later released on a \$5,000 bond from the county jail.

If found guilty of the charge against him, McClendon could be sentenced to a maximum two years in jail and a \$5,000 fine.

County Solid Waste Authority finds firms are undercharged

Some businesses in Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs will be paying more each month for their garbage collection.

The staff of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority conducted an audit of commercial accounts and found some businesses were billed improperly, acting authority manager Jerry Wright told board members Monday.

Shopping centers were paying \$54 a month when they should have been paying \$250, he said. Other businesses receiving two pick ups a week were only paying for one.

The changes have resulted in an additional \$3,000 of monthly income, Wright said.

"We're still working on it," administrative assistant Beverly Foote said Tuesday. "Currently, more than 15 have been notified, but we have only covered Ruidoso Downs and some shopping malls in Ruidoso. There could be more than 20 businesses by the time we're finished."

The authority is a coalition of the county and its five municipalities, formed to collect and dispose of garbage countywide. Each entity is responsible for setting rates to cover the cost of its service.

But even with the boost from the additional commercial revenue, this year isn't going well for the authority. With 3.5 months left in the fiscal year, it has spent 67% of its budgeted money for expenses and has generated only 64% of the revenues expected, Wright said.

Revenue from providing service in the county seat of Carrizozo is off

budget by \$20,514, because the authority started collection there three months later than anticipated.

If the spending pattern is not altered, the coalition of government entities will end the fiscal year on June 30 with a deficit of \$14,217.

However, that figure does not include the beginning cash balance of \$107,000. That money must be kept separate to help satisfy the state requirement for a reserve of one-twelfth of the \$1.8 million budget, said administrative assistant Beverly Foote.

"We'll have a problem coming up with the full \$154,378 we need (for a reserve)," Wright said.

Employees on hold

Board members agreed Monday that future grievances could be handled better by a grievance board, instead of being heard by the full authority.

They are considering a grievance board with three employees from different divisions, with appeals going to the authority board; one elected official, one layman and one employee, followed by board appeals; five citizens with the only appeal to a civil court; or an advisory committee with the final decision by the authority board.

"It seems to me past grievances could have been settled at a lower level with a faster response time," said Authority Chairman Frank Cummins. Last month, the board spent hours listening to grievances by an individual employee and an attorney representing a group of employees.

Ruidoso Downs has three employees handling grievances.

Ruidoso Downs Mayor Joe Hayhurst said no grievances have ever been appealed to his council.

"The employees are right there," he said. "They handle it. We've never had one go further."

Job descriptions and a pay matrix should be ready by Friday for members to review, Wright said. Past employee complaints have centered around a lack of these items.

Wright has collected examples from surrounding counties.

"They vary quite a bit," he said. "I'll simplify the system. I thought at first I would need 13 different job descriptions, but now I think seven or eight will cover it."

Experience and years of service with the authority will be used to distinguish different pay levels under general headings such as sanitation worker, he said.

In attempting to diffuse complaints before they are magnified, Wright said he stays at the garbage transfer station on Gavilan Canyon Road each morning until 8:30 a.m. to catch the truck drivers as they finish their first run.

"I visit each day to prevent minor irritations from turning into major complaints," Wright said.

"I also try to fix anything not working on the trucks," he said. "Some of their gripes were about equipment, and we want to at least make them comfortable."

In other action, the board voted to change its meeting time and date from 10 a.m. the third Monday of each month to 2 p.m. the third Tuesday.

They said Monday is a difficult day for the staff and many holidays fall on that day. The hour of 10 a.m. also interrupts the work schedule of authority members, they agreed.

Robert Donaldson, newly appointed to represent the village of Ruidoso on the board with village manager Gary Jackson and Mayor Jerry Shaw, missed his first meeting due to the death of his grandmother.

Village corrects error, moves body

For 33 years, Eugene W. Newton rested in peace in Ruidoso's Forest Lawn Cemetery.

It turns out that Newton was taking his eternal nap in the wrong place.

Village of Ruidoso Street Department employee Johnny Salas discovered the misplaced plot last week when he was digging a grave for the recently passed away Olma L. Newton. Newton was to be buried next to her husband Eugene, who was buried in 1963.

But someone back in 1963 dug Eugene's grave in plot 3C instead of plot 7C. On Monday, village employees put Eugene in his proper place — about 15 feet

west and eight feet south of his original resting place.

Salas received the unusual work order Friday. It stated, "Please move Mr. Newton from 3C to 7C," and was signed by Debbie Jo Almager, Village of Ruidoso Parks and Recreation director. The village's cemetery falls under Almager's direction. It has been that way ever since the village created the parks and recreation department a dozen years ago.

When the error was discovered, village officials notified the Newtons' son Ken of Santa Fe, who OK'd the move.

Monday's job required the village employees to put aside their superstitions.

It wasn't easy. When the backhoe reached

the concrete vault encasing the casket, someone had to go in and sweep off the dirt.

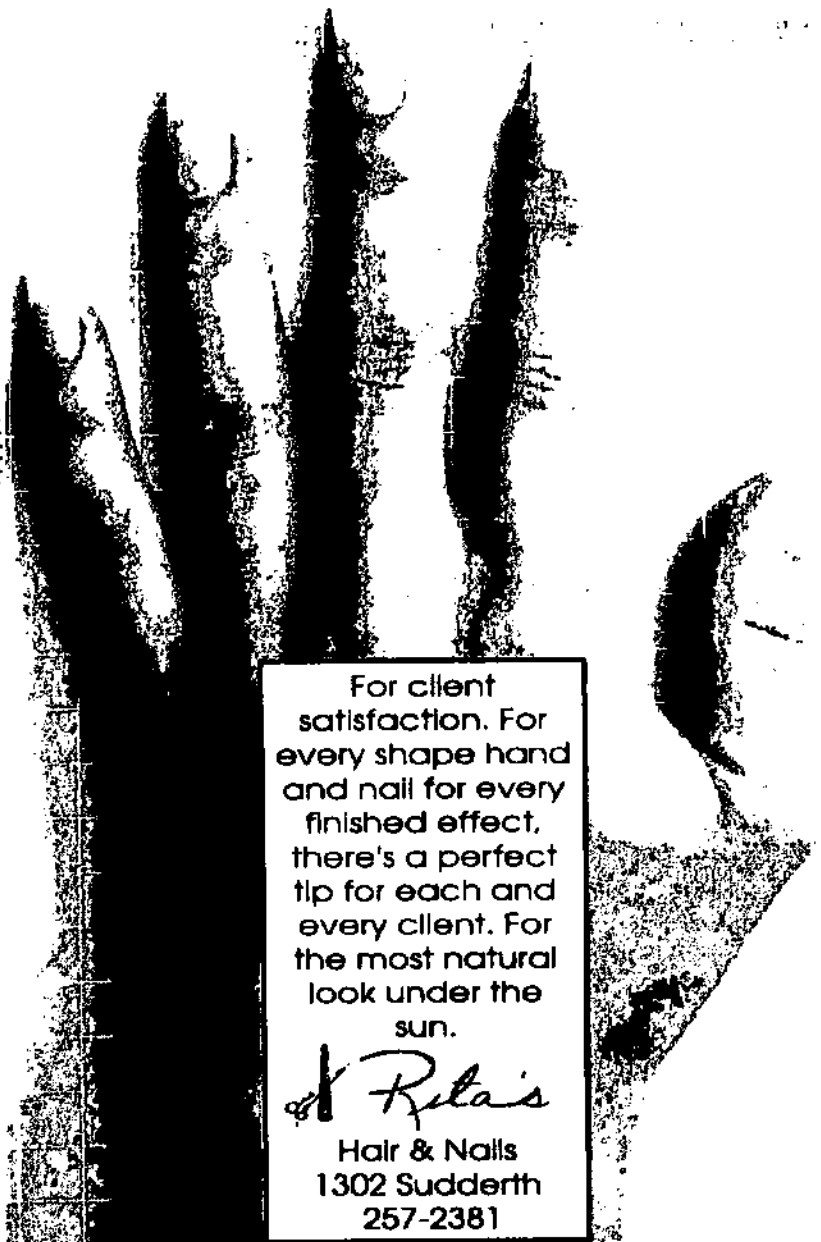
"I'm not going in there. I've got respect (for the dead)," Fred Montoya said. Montoya did lend a hand as the casket was lifted from the grave, but it was a tentative hand.

"If the casket doesn't give, we're all right," Montoya said as the backhoe lifted the casket from the ground.

It took Salas and his crew of five about two hours to successfully remove the casket intact, and the rest of the day to bury Eugene next to his wife.

By the end of the work day Monday, the Newtons were resting in peace forever — and, most importantly, together.

Ruidoso Village Council picks two, not one, mayor pro tems

Two Ruidoso councilors want to be mayor pro tem, so the council decided Thursday to let them both have the job.

Councilors Leon Eggleston and Frank Cummins will both back up Mayor Jerry Shaw — Eggleston from now until March 1997 and Cummins from March 1997 until March 1998.

"This way they both get to have fun," Shaw said at Thursday's council organizational meeting.

Also during the meeting, Village Manager Gary Jackson was reappointed to his contracted position for two more years. He has served for two years already.

"We thank you every day for being here, Gary," Shaw said. "If I'm a good mayor, it's because I have Gary as a good manager. He really makes a difference, always has information available."

Much of the council's organizational meeting is a formality. The mayor and councilors also speak of their aspirations. Such meetings are held after every municipal election to "provide for the continuity of government," Village Clerk Tamie Maddox said.

Eggleston, a past village clerk and finance officer, "has great knowledge of government from the other side," Shaw noted.

"After 12 years on the staff side, I've thoroughly enjoyed working on this side of the table," Eggleston said. "I've seen a lot of councils, and this has been a very progressive council."

Eggleston's fellow councilors unanimously voted him in as mayor pro tem until March 1997. Cummins was also unanimously appointed.

"I'm looking forward to continue team work we've had in the past," Cummins said.

Cummins, who was re-elected this month to his second council term, is now the council's senior member, Shaw said as she noted how "fast things change."

Until March 6, mayor pro tem J.D. James was the council's senior member, having served for the past nine years. He lost his incumbent seat to Bob Sterchi, a former planning and zoning commissioner.

"Of course, we'll miss J.D., but we are excited to have Bob with us," Shaw said.

"I think this is going to be exciting. I think it's going to be a lot of fun," Sterchi said.

Earlier in the meeting, Shaw gave a plaque of appreciation to James, thanking him for his years

on the council.

James was a dedicated public servant, she said.

from jail Jan. 27 on a fourth-degree felony DWI charge, Ruidoso parole and probation officer Shawn Day said.

The status of his parole, which is

scheduled to last until Jan. 26, 1997, "remains to be seen," Day said.

Padilla was arraigned at Ruidoso Magistrate Court Monday morning, and is being held at the county jail on a \$50,000 bond. A

preliminary hearing on the battery and child abuse charges is set for March 25.

If found guilty of all charges against him, Padilla could be sentenced to a maximum 13 years in jail and a \$16,000 fine.

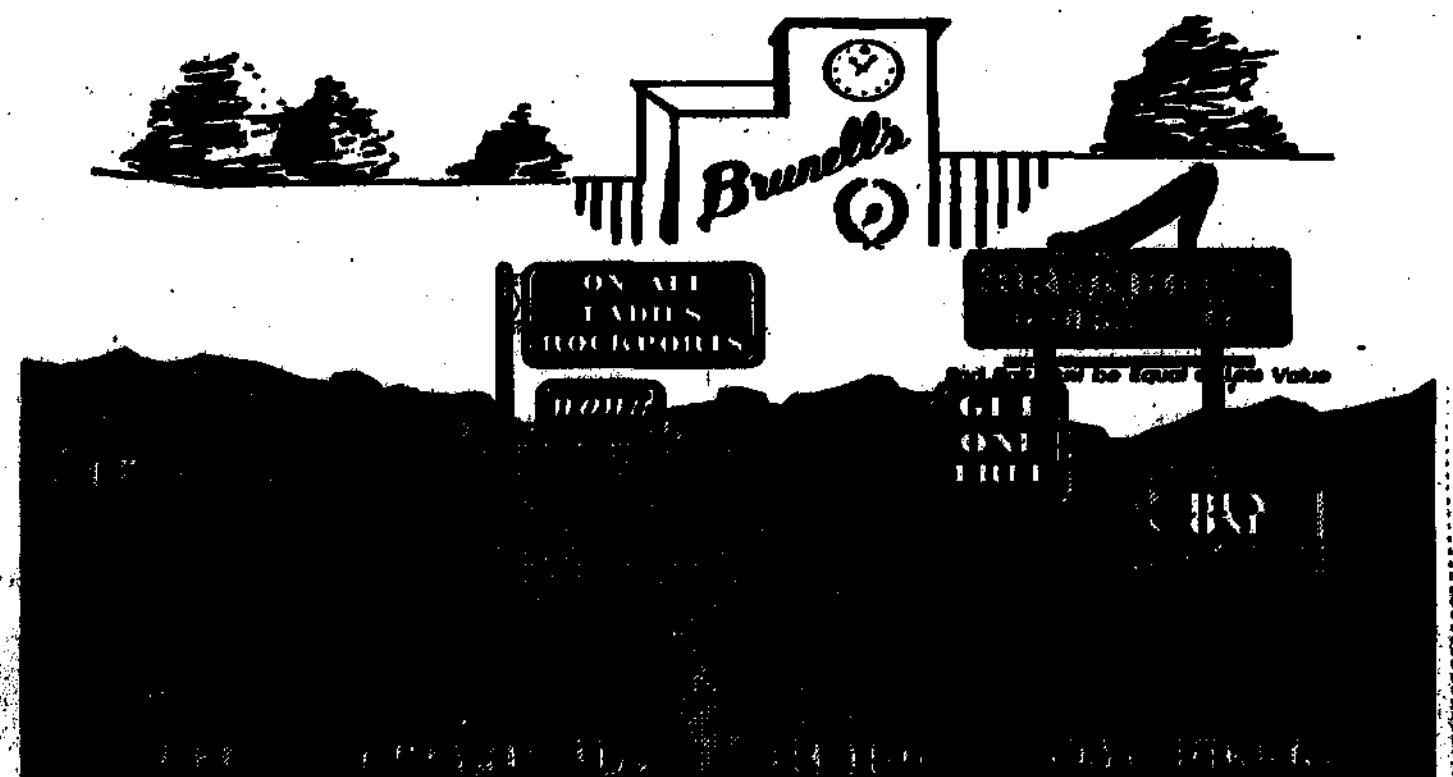

Flashbacks to last legislative session

Here we go again.

It seems our governor and legislative leaders learned little from their session earlier this year. Instead of putting the desires or needs of his constituents first, the governor has made up his personalized wish list of discussion items for the special session that begins today.

His list includes closing a loophole that would allow people on reservation and pueblo lands to sell gas without the state tax; create an extra reserve fund in the budget; get rid of a worker injury fund he says is obsolete; authorize hospital taxes in Cibola and Luna counties; and fund a wide variety of projects.

Basically, most of this stuff — and more — should have been finished in the first session. There never seems to be enough time, yet they joke that if they have more time, they still won't get anything done. Why didn't the governor just extend the original session? Did all these issues just occur to him later?

To top it off, the issues that some legislators admit voters said were the most important — especially gambling — are not on the special session agenda. If the governor won't add this issue to his list, the Legislature should call its own special session (although we're not going to hold our breath on this one).

I learned more in wrestling than in class at Ruidoso

TO THE EDITOR:

Many of us should be saddened to hear that as of this February 1996, Coach Gerald Ames will no longer be coaching Ruidoso's wrestling team. Ames spent a whopping 24 years with the wrestling team. What he coached and taught during that time was so vastly radical from any other person that students and wrestlers could not forget. In other words, they (the students) learned.

One of the most striking methods of Ames' was to tell people to "go out there and fail." He would continue to teach a person to succeed at failing for two reasons. One, it meant that a person was not giving up, and hopefully they would go out there and fail again. Two, it was easy to make a failure better than a winner because a winner often had that "fat head" on their shoulders.

The important concept to go along with this is that by going out and failing, the person must first have the true intention of succeeding. Like a ladder, failures are the steps to get to the top of achievement. Everyone who fails in whatever way, whether it be a minor calculation or a felony, should absolutely have the right to fail again, given a strong proven intention of getting better.

Even though they are made better, the wrestlers are still not perfect people. Sometimes, they screw up on the team's time and make the rest of the team look bad. As for the rest of the wrestlers, they learn the

same things as the delinquents. They are taught about values and priorities. Ames would tell us that we were always to put family, education and God (for those of us religious freaks such as myself) before we thought of wrestling.

I have to debate with the education part of that though, because I learned more in wrestling than I learned in all my classes put together. I learned a lot more than how to wrestle an opponent. Because of our priorities I learned to wrestle with life. Incidents would come and go. What mattered was how I (and we) dealt, or wrestled with them.

Another major reason why wrestling is an asset to Ruidoso is that some of us just can't play basketball.

Ames' expertise will be missed. He still has two years left as a teacher though, and if you have a child in his class and happen to run into Ames in the supermarket, tell him what a great job he does, because he is every bit as great a teacher as a coach. (If you happened to read the Feb. 9 issue of *Vamonos!*, you might understand what I mean.) The Ruidoso school system has many colossal teachers, and Ames is one of the more unforgettable teachers. Way to go coach!

As for the wrestling team, I am just asking that Principal Hodges, Athletic Director Les Carter, and whoever else is in charge of the politics of the wrestling team, please keep it going. I am currently paying \$4,000-plus per year to get my degree in college so that I might make both a great math teacher and create a wrestling team that Ruidoso can be proud of in the fu-

ture. Thank you.

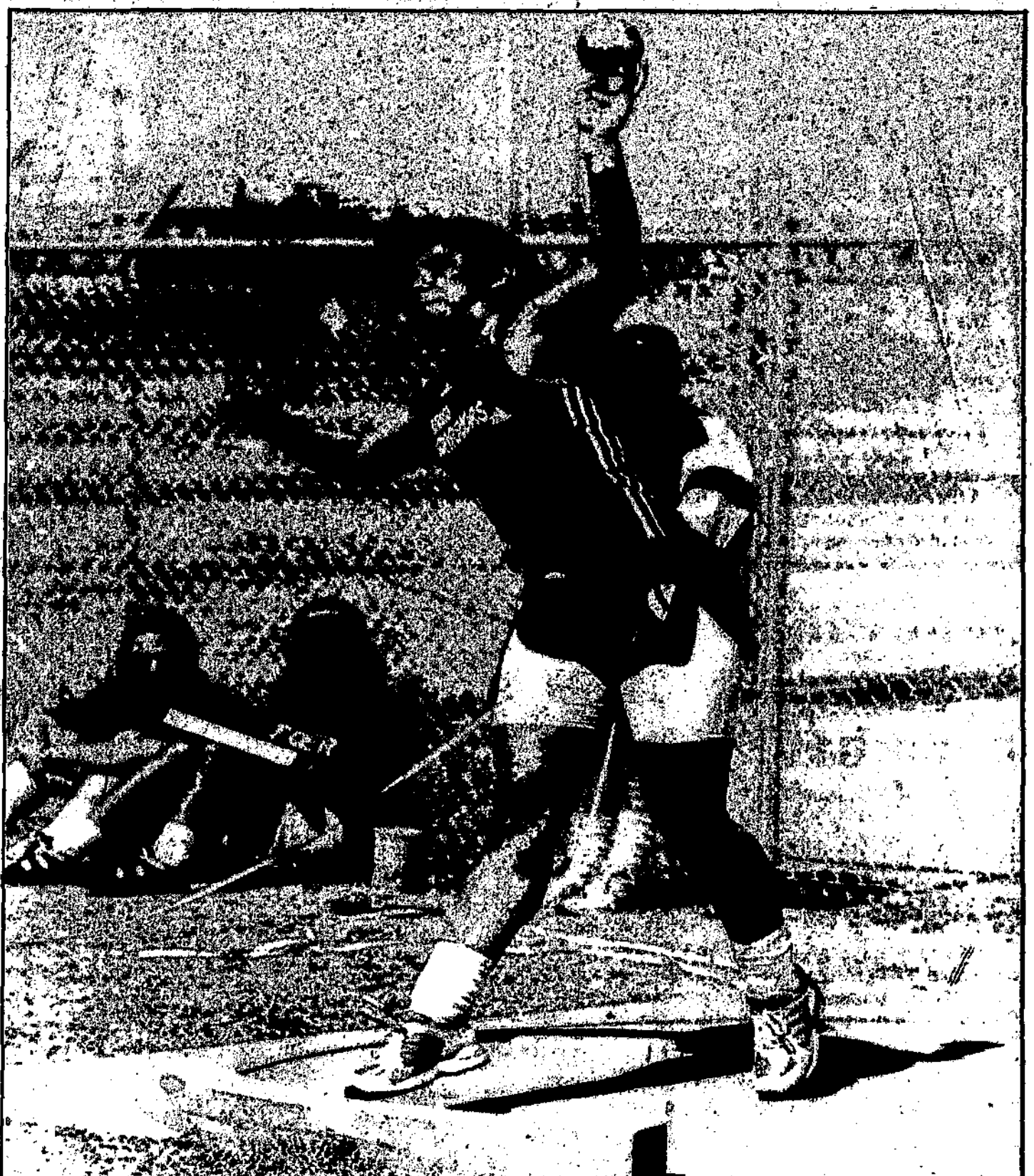

The second game was closer than the final score indicated. The Warriors were down only 8-1 going into the bottom of the sixth when the wheels came off the cart. The Rockets scored seven runs in that frame, padding their lead to 10-1.

They just started hitting Flores and seeing eye ground balls, Webb said.

The Boys of Spring take the field for the first time in years

It seems history does repeat itself.

Forty years ago Ruidoso fielded its first high school baseball team. The Warriors opened the season scrambling for equipment and a schedule to play.

Fast forward to the present. After being hired as coach around Christmas, Rodney Webb finds himself in the same situation — searching for equipment, ordering uniforms, putting together a schedule for his fledgling baseball team.

That's where Webb hopes the similarities between his 1996 squad and the 1956 Warriors end.

Webb will focus his efforts on establishing a program that won't die out after several years like the program of the late 1950s. With 31 players on his roster and most of them underclassmen, Webb sees a bright future for Warrior baseball.

"He's just knocking the cover off the ball," Webb said. "He's a model kid, a really good one to have around."

Kevin Pellman and Jesse Fromknecht are the only other seniors on



the team for Webb.

disposal.

Thanks to a strong summer Little League baseball program, Webb's team understands the basics of America's favorite pastime. The first-year coach has been busy teaching the subtleties of the game.

"Our baserunning is below aver-

age. It's not a matter of just being fast. It's a matter of knowing how to take a lead and when to break on a pitcher's move," Webb said.

Webb wants his team to get more aggressive at the plate. The Warriors make contact when they swing; they're just watching too many third strikes.

The Ruidoso coach's biggest concern, however, is developing pitchers. Because the schedule features doubleheaders, high school teams really need six good pitchers, Webb said.

"One thing we looked for was as many good arms as we could find," Webb said. Presently the Warrior

coaching staff is developing seven pitchers.

Ruidoso will play mostly freshman and junior varsity teams from established high school baseball programs this season. The Warriors aren't allowed to compete for district playoffs because this is their first year of competition.



Gifted education committee seeks hiring of second teacher

□ Board sets child abuse policy, next year's calendar

The Ruidoso School District's gifted education program has been so successful that a committee wants to add another teacher.

Members of the Gifted Education Advisory Committee told the school board last week about the progress of the program.

The program serves approximately 75 students and has one full-time teacher, Lisa Vasquez. She works with students in kindergarten through sixth grade. Middle school gifted students are taught in the regular class setting, and high school gifted students are taught by Bob Elder, explained district Director of Special Services Paul Wirth.

"Since the middle of the school year, we've had a significant increase in the number of kids qualifying for the gifted program and as a result we are looking for an additional teacher for next year," Wirth said.

Students are identified for the gifted program through various testing and screening procedures, including critical thinking, creativity and cognitive skills, he said.

"We are very sensitive about choosing the right tools or using alternative tools to determine how

a student is functioning, particularly for students from minority or different cultures," Wirth added.

Because of improvements in assessment tools, more students are being identified as gifted, Wirth said.

Referrals come from teachers, parents and even students, he said. "Referrals go through the Student Assistance Team and we ask for parent and teacher input," Wirth said. "Then we conduct an Individualized Educational Program (IEP)."

The state required the formation of the advisory committee about two years ago, he said. It includes about 12 to 15 staff members, parents and students.

Committee members make recommendations about possible improvements and directions of the program.

Students in the program are challenged in a variety of ways, Wirth said.

"I think that we are all in agreement that everybody likes the services being provided in the program, but we just need a second Lisa," Wirth said. "Our goal is to make the second teacher high on

next year's recommendation list to the school board and the budget committee."

Child abuse policy

At last week's meeting, the school board also approved a draft of a new child abuse reporting policy. Parents, teachers, Ruidoso Education Association members and the Children, Youth and Families Department were involved in creating the five-page draft.

"We had a policy but we didn't have the actual procedures," Wirth said.

POOP SCOOP

The ease or strain of housebreaking a dog can dictate the tenor of an owner's relationship with a new pet.

Crate training is one of many methods suggested for both pups, young dogs and even adults, who may need a reminder after a stay in a shelter or if they have been outdoor dogs.

The structure, whether its wood, wire or plastic, functions as the dog's den, room and safe house. The main requirement is that it is large enough for the animal to stand up when full-grown, turn around and lie flat on its side.

Remember dogs are den animals, genetically programmed thousands of years ago to seek safety from attack above or behind.

The crate is a housebreaking tool, because dogs will not soil their dens. It's a place comfortable for your pet when guests are in the house and for use as a retreat when the pet seeks some time alone. It is kept inside and is not a dog house.

The success of crate use depends on how it is introduced to a pet. Don't ever use it for punishment. When a crate is brought home, let the dog examine it. Put

a washable cotton blanket inside.

Try baiting with a treat, but it still may take a few days before the dog ventures inside. Once it settles down, let the animal take a nap with the door open. In time, the door can be closed at the same time the dog is being praised for being good.

Before closing a dog inside a crate, be sure it has eliminated, then direct it to go to the "crate."

Don't forget the crate is a tool, not a way of life. Your dog's favorite place is with you. Never put a pup in a crate and leave the room for a long time. Dogs are social creatures and pack animal. You are now the dog's pack.

In summer, keep the crate out of the sun and be sure there is plenty of air circulation.

A crate also is a handy tool when traveling with a dog, preventing windows from being licked and you from being distracted. In case of an accident, instead of being thrown from the car or being hit running away on the highway, the dog can easily be removed in the crate.

Pups about six weeks of age need to go outside about every four hours. That increases to five hours at eight weeks and eight hours by 5-6 months. They should be supervised when loose in the house.
