## Police say man used infant as fight shield

by KATHLEEN MCDONALD Ruldoso News Staff Writer A Ruidoso Downs man is being Charged with battering his wif saturday a shield, Ruidoso Downs po lice said.
George Padilla, 31, now face three third-degree felony child abuse charges as well as a mis demeanor count of battery against a household member. He's being held at the county jail on a $\$ \mathbf{5 0 , 0 0 0}$ bond. He was on parole at the time of the incident.
The victim's seven-year-old daughter and her seven-year-old friend witnessed the violence, police Th
The victim's daughter told Padilla had dropped the child twat Pading the beating, he said. The child apparently fell on his face at least once because he had dried blood around his mouth when police arrived. He was also crying un controllably, Terlecky said.
He took the child from his room and used him as a shield while striking his mom," officer Chris Condon said.

Padilla held the child as a shield, Terlecky said.
Police arrived soon after receiv ing a call at 9:36 p.m. Police heard the baby crying and mother Palo Verde Trailer Park home. Padilla was standing and holding the crying toddler while facing the victim, who was about three feet away on the floor.
The mother suffered an inchlong cut to her nose and her shirt was bloodied, Terlecky said.
Although the toddler was the only child to appear physically harmed, Padilla was charged with three counts of child abuse, one each for the baby and two seven-year-old girls. Anytime a child is put in a dangerous situation or at risk of injury, it's considered abuse or neglect, Terlecky said.

The baby boy was taken to the Lincoln County Medical Center and held overnight for observation. He was released to his mother the next day, police said.
Padilla, who smelled of alcohol during his arrest, had been paroled

Some businesses in Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs will be praing more each month for their garbage collection.
The staff of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority conducted an audit of commaercial accounts and found some businesses were billed improperiy acting authority members Mondey

Shopping centers were paying 854 a month when they should have been paying \$250, he said. Other businesses receiving two pick ups a week were only paying for one.
The changes have resulted in an additional $\$ 3,000$ of monthly income, Wright gaid.

The success of crate use depends on how it is introduced to a pet. Don't ever use it for punishg ment. When a crate is brought home, let the dog examine it. Put
a washable cotton blanket inside.
Thy baiting with a treat, but it still may take a few days before the dog ventures inside. Once it settles down, let the animal take a nap with the door open. In time, the door can be closed at the same time the dog is being praised for being good.

Before closing a dog inside a crate, be sure it has eliminated, then direct it to go to the "crate."
Don't forget the crate is a tool. not a way of liff. Your dog's favorite place is with you. Never put a pup in a crate and leave the room for a long time. Dogg are social creatures and pack animal. You are now the dog's pack.
In summor, keep the crate out of the sun and be sure there is plenty of air circulation.

A crate also is a handy tool when traveling with a dog, preventing windows from being licked and you from being distracted. In case of an accident, insteed of being thrown from the car or being hit running away on the highway, the dog can easily be removed in the crate.
Pups about aix weeks of age need to go outside about every four hours. That increages to five hours at eight weles and eight hours by $5-6$ months. They should be supervised when loose in the house.
