Don't bother to call the Lincoln County Sheriffs Office about stray daga and cats if you live outside a municipality.
Unless someone's life is in danger or the animal is dying, no deputies will respond to the call, Sheriff James Missioners lost weak

He noted that commissioners budgeted about $\$ 14,000$ to use the Lincoln County Humane Society'e animal shelter, since Fort Stanton has been closed. Animals preyious ly were kept in an unheated cage inaccessible to the general public to check for lost dogs.
The county is charged by state aw with providing a sheiter and necessary, a quarantine for strays control, McSwane said.
Commissioner Wilton Howell contended McSwane previously told commissioners any of his deputies would-act in that capacity when necespary.

## Conservation corps eyed for adult prisoners at fort

## Ruidoso Nows Staff Writer

A conservation corps camp for more than 200 adult minimum-security prisoners could be operating out of minimum-security prisoners could be operating out of place, a state forestry official says.
place, a state forestry offial says.
"It will be about a month before the governor makes a public announcement, but his reaction was very positive to the proposal to provide productive
work for this class of inmate and to put them in the work for this class of inmate and to put them in the type of work that would generally give public benefit,"
said Gary Blackwell, chief of forest management for said Gary Blackwell, chief of forest management for the state Forestry Division.
"Under our proposal, (inmates) would be under strict supervision instead of just turning them loose Blackwell added.

State officials plan to hold a meeting on the camp proposal sometime in August, probably at Fort meeting involving State Forester Toby Martinez. The division first met with county commissioners about two months ago about the proposal.
About 15 forest division employees and 15 Department of Corrections employees would operate the camp with a maximum 200 -inmate population, Blackwell said Monday.
Two financial scenarios are possible if the state Legislature supports the project
"They could put an emergency clause on it, which means we could start work on it within 30 to 60 days
after the Legislature finishes (in mid-March)" well said. Otherwise, the money would kick in July 1997, he said.
The forestry camp would be able to keep prisoners for a cost of $\$ 36$ per day per man, compared to the average of $\$ 50$ a day for other state-operated minimum security prisons in New Mexico, Blackwell predicted.
"We feel we can definitely house inmates cheaper in this environment," Blackwell said. "With some of the projects, we may be able to get federal reimbursecreat, and we would charge a daily stipend for the crew. I think we could probably return $\$ 250,000$ (a
year) per camp to the state." The two agencies are

If wild animals do aurvive in human roundings, they may become dangerous as they grow. Young buck deer may attack humans in rutting season. Mountain lion cubs and bear cubs are not as cute and cuddly when they grow up, snarl or hurt people, he said.
Disease is another risk. Common carriess of rabies include skunks, cayotes, fazes and raccats are not effective on wild apimals.
Most zoos already have a surplus of common wild animals and don't need ones that can mo longer he considered pets.

It is alarming that half of Lincoln County's residents cannot afford health insutance and don't qualify for Medicaid. And It's alaming that most of the burcen of free care is feft on the shoulders of privato heath care providers, as we reported in a recent issue. The local hospital alorie last year footed the bill for more than $\$ 1$ million worth of care for the incligent.

The Lincoin County Commission is in a perfect position to help these people and businesses, many of which are non-proiti. It already has an indigent heallh care fund (as required by state law) i but chooses not to use it to save taxpayers money.
In today's mobile socioty, it' is rare to find a family that personally cares for fis elderly or terminaily ifl members, because familles are spread out across the country. More and more of the elderly and terminally in people end up in nursing homes or hospices. Yei these places do not r
ment for indigent care.

If the county commission is worried about keeping taxes down (a noble effort in general), it should put this question to the electorate in November: are people willing to pay to care for those who can't cale for themselves? If they aren't, they are likely to find that without early preventative health care, indigent health care costs will rise and force caregivers out of business - so everyone has to leave the county for many kinds of health care, whether they can afford to recelve it or not.

Contact thellocal game warden, in this area, Warian Roin Moure of the state Game and Pish Division.

In any case, call for professional help immediately if sounds indicate an animal is in troable or trapped, such as persistent fluttering of wings or sexatching.

If halp isn't available, hang a heavy rope down the chimney top to help the animal dimb out.

If you must determine the type of animal and it is possible to access the chimney top, look inside with a flaahlight. But take precautions not to fall, because the animal may charge out of the chimney and ratch you off guard.

Some advice offered by The Shelter Advisor Magazine includes:

- don't open the damper to try to identify the source of a noise. Animala and/or their feces and nesting materials could fall into the home;
- don't start a fire, 'which could kill young animals unable to climb out and overcome adults that try to rescue thair young;
- don't cap a chimney until youtre sure all animals are out;
- and don't handle any animals.
