#### Juvenile plan topic of CYF head's visit

The public will hear Thursday from the architect of the state plan to create a juvenile environmental work detention center at Camp Sierra Blanca.

Secretary Heather Wilson of the state Department of Children, Youth and Families, will be in town to meet with elected officials and the public about the camp. It could be operating as early as September.

Wilson is scheduled to talk to Lincoln County Commissioners at 3 p.m. Thursday at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center. At 5 p.m., she will tour the camp, which is being phased out as an adult minimum security prison because of high costs.

Wilson will meet the public at 6 p.m. at Fort Stanton, about 12 miles northeast of Ruidoso and less than a mile west of the camp.

#### Mescalero man killed in July 4th highway accident

An 18-year-old Mescalero man was killed about 6 a.m. Sunday in a two-car accident on U.S. 70.

It was apparently the only fatality on New Mexico's highways during this holiday weekend.

According to information from the state medical investigator, Jeremiah "Miah" Martinez of Mescalero was killed when the pickup in which he was a passenger was struck by another pickup on U.S. 70.

The driver of the other vehicle was Tully Linkin, 48, of Gallup. The case still is under investigation by Bureau of Indian Affairs law enforcement. A spokesman for that office said he could not release any information.

Martinez was employed at Ski Apache and was a popular player on the Homeboys softball team based in Mescalero.

New Mexico State Police officials were unaware of the accident when they announced Monday that no one died on the state's highways over the July 4th weekend, said Lt. Bill Bower in Alamogordo.

By Tuesday, his office still had no details about the accident that sent seven people to the hospital in Ruidoso.

"We usually find out eventually, but if an Indian is involved and (the accident) is on Indian land, it's their jurisdiction as a sovereign nation," he said.

## County won't handle calls about stray pets

Don't bother to call the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office about stray dogs and cats if you live outside a municipality.

Unless someone's life is in danger or the animal is dying, no deputies will respond to the call, Sheriff James McSwane told county commissioners last week.

McSwane tried unsuccessfully to convince commissioners to reinstate an animal control officer deleted from his budget last month. He noted that commissioners budgeted about \$14,000 to use the Lincoln County Humane Society's animal shelter, since Fort Stanton has been closed. Animals previously were kept in an unheated cage inaccessible to the general public to check for lost dogs.

The county is charged by state law with providing a shelter and if necessary, a quarantine for strays. It also is required to provide animal control, McSwane said.

Commissioner Wilton Howell contended McSwane previously told commissioners any of his deputies would act in that capacity when necessary.

But only Charlie LaBelle was certified to administer the lethal drugs to kill the strays, McSwane said.

"Charlie put down a considerable number of dogs that tried or did destroy livestock," he said, estimating about 500-600 dogs and more cats had been killed. Without an officer assigned to animal con-

trol, McSwane said the county will see more livestock attacked by wild dogs.

Jim Riggins, humane shelter director, said Tuesday the numbers quoted by McSwane seem too high based on his experience. However, whatever the number destroyed, those animals had no chance to be adopted under the county's previous system.

That's one of the reasons the commission now uses the humane shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road, where there is no set time limit on how long a healthy animal can be held, Riggins said.

McSwane told commissioners his office is receiving more general crime calls, yet with 12 positions, he is operating with fewer deputies than he had in 1989.

Commission Chairman Monroy Montes said most of La Belle's work was as a regular deputy, not in animal control. He also enforced county ordinances, including the one against illegal dumping of trash, McSwane replied.

Commissioner Stirling Spencer suggested the county look at requiring all dogs to be licensed. This would generate money to offset the cost of the state requirements, and also help track ownership of loose dogs. The county already has a leash law.

"Livestock and dog owners should bear some of the responsibility ourselves," Montes said. "I have 25 sheep and if I see a dog on my land, I handle it."

## Conservation corps eyed for adult prisoners at fort

A conservation corps camp for more than 200 adult minimum-security prisoners could be operating out of Fort Stanton early next year if all the pieces fall into place, a state forestry official says.

"It will be about a month before the governor makes a public announcement, but his reaction was very positive to the proposal to provide productive work for this class of inmate and to put them in the type of work that would generally give public benefit," said Gary Blackwell, chief of forest management for the state Forestry Division.

"Under our proposal, (inmates) would be under strict supervision instead of just turning them loose," Blackwell added.

State officials plan to hold a meeting on the camp proposal sometime in August, probably at Fort Stanton. Blackwell anticipates an early afternoon meeting involving State Forester Toby Martinez. The division first met with county commissioners about two months ago about the proposal.

About 15 forest division employees and 15 Department of Corrections employees would operate the camp with a maximum 200-inmate population, Blackwell said Monday.

Two financial scenarios are possible if the state Legislature supports the project.

"They could put an emergency clause on it, which means we could start work on it within 30 to 60 days after the Legislature finishes (in mid-March)," Blackwell said. Otherwise, the money would kick in July 1, 1997, he said.

The forestry camp would be able to keep prisoners for a cost of \$36 per day per man, compared to the average of \$50 a day for other state-operated minimum security prisons in New Mexico, Blackwell predicted.

"We feel we can definitely house inmates cheaper in this environment," Blackwell said. "With some of the projects, we may be able to get federal reimbursement, and we would charge a daily stipend for the crew. I think we could probably return \$250,000 (a year) per camp to the state."

The two agencies are looking at Los Lunas for a second inmate camp program, using a farm already developed there, he said.

The state hospital in Los Lunas faces the same situation that forced the closing of Fort Stanton in

March 1995, following a court order to remove developmentally disabled patients and place them in community settings.

Blackwell said he sees five positive elements in the plan. They are:

- the camps could save the state money;
- the camps could return money to the state for special projects;
- public projects would be accomplished;
- inmates would be under constant supervision on projects;
- and some inmates will acquire skills to help them get jobs later.

"We're working very closely with the Corrections Department and U.S. Forest Service for a demonstration project in the Manzano-Sandia Mountain area this fall," Blackwell said.

The pilot program would involve a series of four or five projects between September to November with just one prison crew, he said.

Plans for the Fort Stanton camp call for 10 crews of 23 prisoners working in the field each day, Blackwell said.

Selection for the conservation corps crews would be the same as for Camp Sierra Blanca, the minimum-security adult prison near Fort Stanton being closed by the Corrections Department this fall because it is too small to be cost effective.

"They would be selected from non-violent convictions, no sex offenders, and there would be drug screening," Blackwell said.

The forestry division also is working with corrections, the state General Services Department and the Lincoln County Commission to secure adequate maintenance money for the historic fort.

"Even if we don't use it, someone has to take care of it," Blackwell said. "It's a neat facility."

"My feeling personally is, if we do take it, I envision having at least one crew dedicated to doing nothing but maintaining the integrity of those facilities. There would be about 20 people out of 200 doing nothing but upgrading and maintaining those facilities. It would be a disgrace if we didn't."

The fort isn't suitable for many private commercial uses, he said.

"Where it's located is out of the way, off the commercial pipeline," Blackwell said. "It never will be a Disneyland."

## All fire restrictions lifted on Lincoln National Forest

All fire restrictions were lifted on the Lincoln National Forest Tuesday.

Campfires, smoking and the use of equipment like grills, stoves and candles are once again allowed at all campsites on the forest.

Fire management officials said six to eight inches of recent rain has reduced fire danger, and the moisture has been stabilized by sporadic monsoonal rains. Other

government agencies in New Mexico have also lifted their fire restrictions within the last week.

"As a prevention measure we kept the restrictions in place through the busy 4th of July weekend, but the potential for large fire activity has decreased and fire conditions are now moderate across the forest," Assistant Fire Management Officer Bob Pena said.

Pena attributes the success of the restrictions to the cooperation

and acceptance of the public.

"Thanks to everyone out there, the fire closure was very effective," Pena said. "We have not had a single person-caused fire since April 18. This is very significant, as April through early July is the season when we have most of the person-caused fires. This year the forests were plagued by drought and a historic period of extreme fire conditions. People became aware and took care of their public lands."

# Leave cubs, fawns alone, officials warn

Seeing a fawn or bear cub in the forest without its mother doesn't mean it has been abandoned.

Officials with the state Game and Fish Department cautioned well-intentioned people not to remove the young ones from their habitat and from a mother who probably is out hunting food.

A recent incident that almost cost a young bear cub his life, and definitely has endangered

his future, illustrates the dangers to the animals and humans, said Jerry Maracchini, director of the state game and fish department.

A seven-year old Pinos Altos girl "rescued" a cub and was taking the five-month-old cub home May 6 when it bit her on the hand, he said. She released the animal. Officers found a cub they believed to be the one who bit the girl and it now is confined at the wildlife rehabilitation center in Espanola.

Since a positive identification was impossible, the girl chose to undergo a series of seven expensive rabies shots instead of having the cub destroyed to run rabies tests on its brain.

While the girl's unselfish choice was covered by international news organizations, that coverage overlooked the element of luck for the bear, Maracchini said.

"If it had been positively identified as the biting animal, it would have been killed as required under state Department of Health laws, and tested for rabies, regardless of the girl's preference," he said.

While the cub was allowed to live, its story isn't happy, he added. It was taken from its mother, from its inherent territory and may not survive when released into another territory to compete with resident bears.

The cub will have little or no contact with human beings at the rehabilitation center to prepare him for release into the wild next winter. His best chance for survival in the woods is to have a fear of man, Maracchini said.

The cost of keeping the cub throughout the year will be several thousand dollars. The shots will cost the girl's parents about \$650.

"The incident is the classic example of why

wildlife should be left in the wild and why each spring, the game and fish department advises everyone to leave the young where they belong," Maracchini said. "To take an animal home is not only illegal, it nearly always results in sickness or death for the animal."

"People who violate the law prohibiting the possession of live game animals or fur bearers face a fine of up to \$500 and six months in jail."

It's natural to see young animals unattended, wildlife biologists said. Deer and antelope fawns and young rabbits are left hidden by their mothers for extended periods of time while the mothers search for food.

Elk calves were born last month and antelope and deer fawns will be born this month. This also is the time of the year for quail and grouse to nest.

Even when they are carefully tended by a human, in most cases, a wild animal does not receive the correct nourishment, Maracchini said. A bobcat fed only domestic cat food or a fawn given cow's milk probably will become sick and die, sometimes from shock, and in many cases from diarrhea and dehydration, he said.

If wild animals do survive in human surroundings, they may become dangerous as they grow. Young buck deer may attack humans in rutting season. Mountain lion cubs and bear cubs are not as cute and cuddly when they grow up, snarl or hurt people, he said.

Disease is another risk. Common carriers of rabies include skunks, coyotes, foxes and raccoons. Vaccines developed for domestic dogs and cats are not effective on wild animals.

Most zoos already have a surplus of common wild animals and don't need ones that can no longer be considered pets.

Wells impact the water table, and the village should be able to supply drinking water to all consumers during a drought, Village Attorney John Underwood said.

Even if the village doesn't impose regulations, the state engineer might, Underwood added.

"The state was 13.5 million acre feet short in its delivery of water to Texas under its compact" in 1995, Underwood said. "We all might have calls upon us to reduce usage."

The Hondo River Basin may also be declared a critical water basin, Underwood related. If this happens, everyone will likely be forced to reduce consumption.

"If nothing else, wells should be metered," said Mayor Jerry Shaw prior to the meeting. "At least if

they're metered, people wouldn't be excessive — or let's say some will have to be more reasonable — in usage."

Shaw received a slew of "hate calls" after the council added domestic wells to its water contingency ordinance late last month so well owners couldn't water lawns when others couldn't. But Shaw also received an ear full from others who said "It's about time," and accused well owners of making no attempt to conserve water.

Two state statutes allow municipalities to control use of cisterns and wells, but don't address whether regulations can be applied retroactively to existing wells.

After the council made its water contingency plan apply to domestic wells, Underwood issued an opinion

saying that particular ordinance could only be applied to future domestic wells, not existing ones.

"There's never been a court case deciding whether a local ordinance can be applied to existing permits," Underwood said.

If councilors want to regulate existing wells, they need to pass a separate ordinance, Underwood said, "so when this goes to court we'll have a stronger argument, because in my opinion this issue will go to court."

This spring and summer, the state engineer has received 20-25 applications from Ruidoso residents for domestic well permits, an office spokesperson said.

The state engineer has suggested amending the blanket approval process for domestic wells. Public hearings on the matter will

be held during the next six months. As a result, he might decide the allowance to pump three acre feet of water a year should be reduced, Underwood said.

The need to change the statute has been underscored by the drought, a subsequent surge in applications for domestic wells, and downstream water compacts, Underwood said.

The blanket approval of domestic well applications is based on an antiquated, 1931 state law designed to lure people to New Mexico when the arid land was still being homesteaded, Councilor Robert Donaldson said.

But the pumping of wells by those without purchased water rights contradicts the state constitution, which says purchased water rights should be favored, Un-

derwood said. All water rights in New Mexico have either been sold or adjudicated.

Before a code is drafted, Donaldson said he'd like to have a professional hydrologist and the state engineer address the matter of domestic well impact on the water table and indicate where the aquifer is, he said.

Well users have complained to him in recent weeks that domestic wells don't affect the water table supplying Ruidoso's municipal water system.

Following is the action taken at the regular Ruidoso Village Council meeting held Tuesday, July 9 at village hall.

**PUBLIC HEARINGS**  
— Forest protection code. Councilor voted to continue the hearing until July 30 to consider amendments.

**REGULAR ITEMS**  
— Approved a preliminary plat and final plat making two tracts in the southeastern quarter of section 25 along U.S. 70. One tract will contain 54,400 square feet and the second

contains 115,900. Applicant Redding Investment Ltd. wanted the property divided to allow separate ownership of the four existing commercial businesses.

— Approved vacation of 490 square feet of public right-of-way in lot 90, block 7 of Ponderosa Heights Subdivision. Lloyd Davis, Jr. applicant. The vacation, costing Davis \$245, will cure the encroachment of an existing building that projects three to 10 feet into the road.

— Denied a lease request from Al Adams to construct sun/shade bungalows at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

— Councilor approved building a visitors interpretive center for the Billy the Kid Scenic Byways at a half-acre plot donated for the project from the Hubbard Foundation, but the award is subject to resolution of two questions raised by Hubbard personnel about the land transaction and center operations. Staff expects the answers to come within the next couple of weeks. The center will be next to the Museum of the Horse, along U.S. 70.

Councilor also awarded a proposed scenic byways corridor management plan to Seely and Associates — the only entity to submit a proposal. The award is contingent upon resolution of the questions regarding the interpretive center. A U.S. Department of Transportation \$328,000 grant will be used for the center's construction and for the corridor management plan.

## The Rain Takes a Break For a Few Days

As if to catch its breath, the rain clouds have not appeared over Storm Vale for a few days, although you can see rain falling not very far away, from time to time.

Yet the sun — which works in partnership with the rain to bring life to the world — has been doing its work.

All the different kinds of grass, flowers, herbs and weeds which have been biding their time during the dry spell have sprung up, making up for lost time.

One type of grass that you are always glad to see — I have heard it called "Viney Mesquite." It is a sort of healer of the land. From its first clump of grass it sends out runners along the ground, and then striking roots forming a new bunch of grass blades, and then move on.

# Suicide victim's DNA doesn't match robber's cap

A deceased Ruidoso man suspected of robbing an Allsup's store Jan. 11 may have had his name cleared by the state crime lab, police said.

A DNA blood sample from the body of Aaron Bishop does not match a hair found inside a ski mask thought to be worn by the lone Ruidoso Allsup's robber, Ruidoso Detective Robert Layher said.

"However, we're not ruling him out as a suspect," Layher added. "His physical description and the description of the robber matched closely."

"We don't really know where the

ski mask came from — he could have borrowed it from someone," Layher said, and therefore it may have had the owner's hair in it, police said. Only one hair was found.

The 25-year-old Bishop shot himself in the head April 22 when surrounded by Carlsbad police, who were called when Bishop was arguing with his girlfriend in a school parking lot about items he took

from the girlfriend and her parents' house. Relatives said he was distraught about his relationship and under the influence of alcohol.

Ruidoso police obtained a blood sample from Bishop's body and sent it to the state crime lab with the hair.

The hair was found inside a blue and black polyester ski mask police found on top of a building about 75

yards from the Allsup's crime scene, Layher said. It was along the same path the suspect took when fleeing the robbery scene.

Victims of the robbery identified the mask as one worn during the hold-up. About \$300 was stolen.

The unsolved case is now closed, Layher said, unless new information comes forward. No arrests have been made.

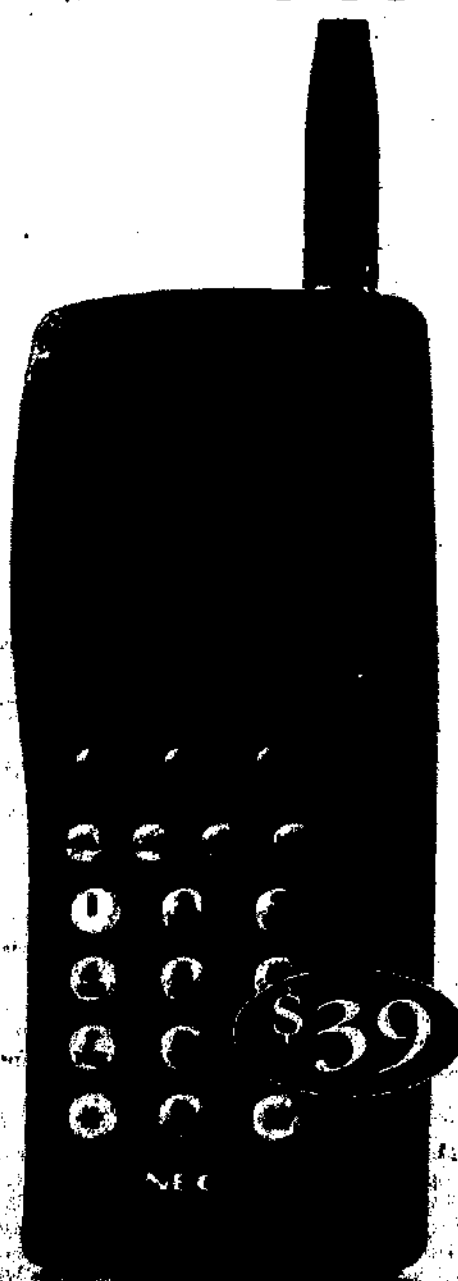

## County needs funding for indigent health care

It is alarming that half of Lincoln County's residents cannot afford health insurance and don't qualify for Medicaid. And it's alarming that most of the burden of free care is left on the shoulders of private health care providers, as we reported in a recent issue. The local hospital alone last year footed the bill for more than \$1 million worth of care for the indigent.

The Lincoln County Commission is in a perfect position to help these people and businesses, many of which are non-profit. It already has an indigent health care fund (as required by state law), but chooses not to use it to save taxpayers money.

In today's mobile society, it is rare to find a family that personally cares for its elderly or terminally ill members, because families are spread out across the country. More and more of the elderly and terminally ill people end up in nursing homes or hospices. Yet these places do not receive government reimbursement for indigent care.

If the county commission is worried about keeping taxes down (a noble effort in general), it should put this question to the electorate in November: are people willing to pay to care for those who can't care for themselves? If they aren't, they are likely to find that without early preventative health care, indigent health care costs will rise and force caregivers out of business — so everyone has to leave the county for many kinds of health care, whether they can afford to receive it or not.

## State's juvenile delinquents not wanted here

TO THE EDITOR:

As a resident of Lincoln County and a parent of two teenage children who attend Capitan schools and community activities, I am vehemently opposed to Camp Sierra Blanca becoming a work camp for incarcerated teenagers.

My first concern is the fact that my community was "forced" by governmental bureaucracy to accept this situation. From the people I talk to here, they don't want juvenile offenders in our community. Why should we welcome more young criminals in our area... we already have some! If our community doesn't want the work camp, how well-received will these kids be? If they are not wanted here, how effective will their rehabilitation be? And, why should we be saddled with the possibility of their recidivism?

I would like to see a show of hands of how many people in this room would welcome these young criminals into our community when they are released. Is it our responsibility to try to rehabilitate them? I do believe we have a responsibility to work with our own kids right here in our own community, but just because the state of New Mexico has a problem with overcrowding of prisons, that should not mean that some government bureaucrat can point to a spot on the map, and turn a beautiful community into a haven for young criminals without the consideration of the effects on the community.

I have had first-hand experience at this type of coercion by the state upon a small community. Under the title of "Job Corp," the state of Arizona forced my hometown in the '60s into accepting the same kind of program. I was in high school at this time, when the work camp was bused into town on weekends. Even though our town was made up of a mix of different races, when these kids stepped off the bus, they were not welcome. Racial tensions increased, fights broke out with chains and knives, rapes occurred, and the overall crime rate increased.

Is this what we want? Why would it be any different now? To put it bluntly, these boys got off the bus looking for drugs and women. The teens in my town, and I was one of them, were not willing to share our women with outsiders, let alone criminals. The "bad" kids in our small community remained bad. Only the kids that stood up to protect their girlfriends, family and friends were the ones that got hurt the most... I know... I was there!

When we consider that most of these teen offenders have spent a lifetime getting that way, do we really believe that a one-year commitment here will make an comfortable when they are introduced into our community?

The responsibility for rehabilitating these kids should rest on the area in which they live. As far as I know, we didn't ask for these prisoners. We did not make the offer to try to help these kids. If we had, you would not hear all of this discussion. Most of us moved here to get away from this kind of criminal influence. Why would anyone think that we would welcome them with open arms?

Thank you for hearing me out.

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce certainly needs much more before they start looking for funds to build a bigger playground. Better yet, maybe it's time to give serious consideration to creating a not for profit, non-political Tourist Development Council.

# Massage therapy institute begins this fall in Ruidoso

Massage therapy is an increasingly popular career in Ruidoso, and now naturopath and massage therapist Beatrice Barnett is opening a new school of massage therapy here.

The Southwest Therapeutic Massage Institute begins Aug. 9 and continues through three semesters, meeting every weekend for 20 hours. In total, students receive 661 hours of training and education.

Educated in Switzerland and Germany, Barnett is known internationally as an authority in alternative medicine. She has lectured extensively in India, Europe, Central America, the Caribbean Islands, and Canada, and she has written five books on alternative healing.

Barnett is teaming up with Albuquerque naturopathic physician Dr. Ted Barnett (no relation) to teach 200 hours of anatomy and physiology, in addition to about 800 hours of massage techniques.

"We have a more involved curriculum than many schools," Barnett said. "We cover spa therapy in depth, business, special massage applications, energy work — it's a lot."

Barnett emphasizes many areas that other programs only touch on. For example, students spend 25 hours of training on lymph drainage, 50 hours in Eastern medical therapies such as acupressure, and they practice Tai Chi and meditation.

Barnett also walks her students through the business aspect of massage therapy, showing them how to write business plans, estimate operation costs, file insurance claims, and so forth. Students spend 20 hours learning business, plus 14 hours on ethics and communication.

New Mexico has some of the highest standards in the country for licensing massage therapists, Barnett said. Students need to know all the state laws regarding massage therapy practice, ethics, and recordkeeping in order to receive licensure.

To get a New Mexico license,

therapists must have at least 650 hours of training and certification by the National Board of Massage Therapy.

The Southwest Institute also operates in Carlsbad, where a course is now in progress. The Carlsbad students range in age from 19 to 50, and they come from a wide range of backgrounds. Some are therapists renewing their licensure, while some are from Texas, where training requirements are much lower.

A career in massage therapy appeals to the person who wants to be self-sufficient, work with people, and make a decent living in a resort community like Ruidoso, Barnett said.

"Massage therapists can work anywhere — hotels, cruise ships, sporting events. Some people add massage therapy to a business they have already, like a salon or fitness

center," Barnett said.

Massage therapy is also an ideal career for people with disabilities, such as blindness, cerebral palsy, or confinement to a wheelchair. Barnett said a disability is often not a handicap in massage therapy.

There are a few openings left for this year's institute in Ruidoso (maximum count is 20). Barnett is expecting students from outlying areas such as Alamogordo, Nogal, Carrizozo, and Carlsbad, as well as Ruidoso.

"We have some Albuquerque students coming here because the schools there cost almost twice as much," Barnett said.

Tuition at the Southwest Institute is \$3,952 and includes textbooks, handouts, the CPR certification course, and other materials. For more details about the institute and registration, call Beatrice Barnett at 258-3046.

Under regular rider, Joe Martinez, Soiree was sent to the lead early which surprised many. The Ray Cardale trained filly proved she can run both on the lead and come from off the pace. The final time for the six furlongs was 1:12.2.

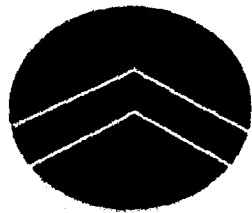

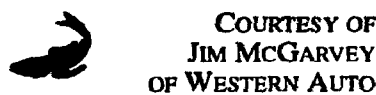

# Rains revive fields, but sideline the players

Mother Nature has washed out three nights of men's league softball games, leaving players salivating to get back on the field.

The rainy season has arrived with a flourish, dropping more than five inches of rain on the Ruidoso area since June 21. Softball fields at Eagle Creek Sports Complex have desperately needed the moisture, but the large amounts of rain in a short period have left the diamonds saturated, and at times unplayable.

Three more nights were postponed this week because of the tragic death of Jeremiah "Miah" Martinez of Mescalero. Martinez was killed in an automobile accident Sunday. He was a popular member of the Homeboys, a men's softball team based out of Mescalero.

Games for Monday, Tuesday and today were canceled so friends and family could attend funeral services, as the Mescalero,

Ruidoso and softball communities mourned the loss of the 18-year-old Martinez.

The softball coordinator for the village's adult recreation softball league, Kathy Luevano, has had to reschedule 24 men's games and six women's games and push back the start of the women's season-ending tournament.

"Due to the rains, which we needed anyway, we've had to do a little rearranging in the schedule. Hopefully, it doesn't inconvenience anyone," Luevano said Tuesday.

Men's game slated for June 27 have been moved to July 26, with the same game times and fields. The men's July 2 games were rescheduled for two different nights. Field A games will be played on C field July 16 (same game times), and field B games move to C field July 23 (same game times). The July 3 schedule of games will be played July

31. July 9 games have been moved to Aug. 5.

The women's league games slated for July 8 are moved to Wednesday, July 17, thus pushing back the opening rounds of the season-ending double elimination tournament. The tourney will start Monday, July 22 (instead of July 17) and conclude Wednesday, July 24, as planned.

"So far we've had enough time to reschedule, but hopefully we won't use any more slots. A lot of teams don't like to use C field, but I don't see a choice," she added.

Because field C has a shorter outfield depth than field A or B, the men aren't allowed to hit a home run.

Despite the rescheduling, Jim McGarvey of the men's league-leading Merchants team thinks the rainfall is more important, especially in this drought-stricken year.

"It's a good tradeoff. I'd rather have the rain and try to save them (the fields), than play on them and ruin them," McGarvey said. "But I'm dying to play like the rest."

The outfield grass (what remains of it) on the three diamonds at Eagle Creek is just now showing signs of greening up. The rains have packed down the infield and revived the outfields, Luevano said. "I think the players will really like the field conditions," she added.

Even though everyone is itching to play, "everybody's been real cooperative about the rescheduling," Luevano said.

If the rains continue to drown out game nights, the league's softball coordinator said she would consider a one-pitch format for games, if necessary. In the one-pitch format, players get one pitch to hit.

Luevano would like to finish both men's and women's league and tournament play before the state tournaments. The women's class B, C and D state tournaments will be July 27 and 28 in Alamogordo. The men's class D and E state tourneys are set for Aug. 10 and 11 in Albuquerque and Las Cruces.

When 2-year-old quarter horses get together and attempt to run in a straight line, things don't always go as planned. Such was the case in the Zia Futurity Saturday at Ruidoso Downs, which could have been named more aptly the "Zig-zag" Futurity.

Tommies Better, the fastest qualifier for the Zia Futurity, was also the fastest finisher in the final. However, after ducking in immediately after leaving the gate and then ducking out, first place became last place.

Because of that interference by Tommies Better, the stewards saw fit to disqualify him and place him last.

The win then went to second-place finisher Namehimastreaker. The bay son of Mitbestreaker out of Everyoneknowsname, steered

clear of much of the bumping to cross the wire second. By moving up to the win position, trainer Fred Danley and jockey Russ Vicchilli scored a double, winning both the Zia Futurity and Zia Consolation.

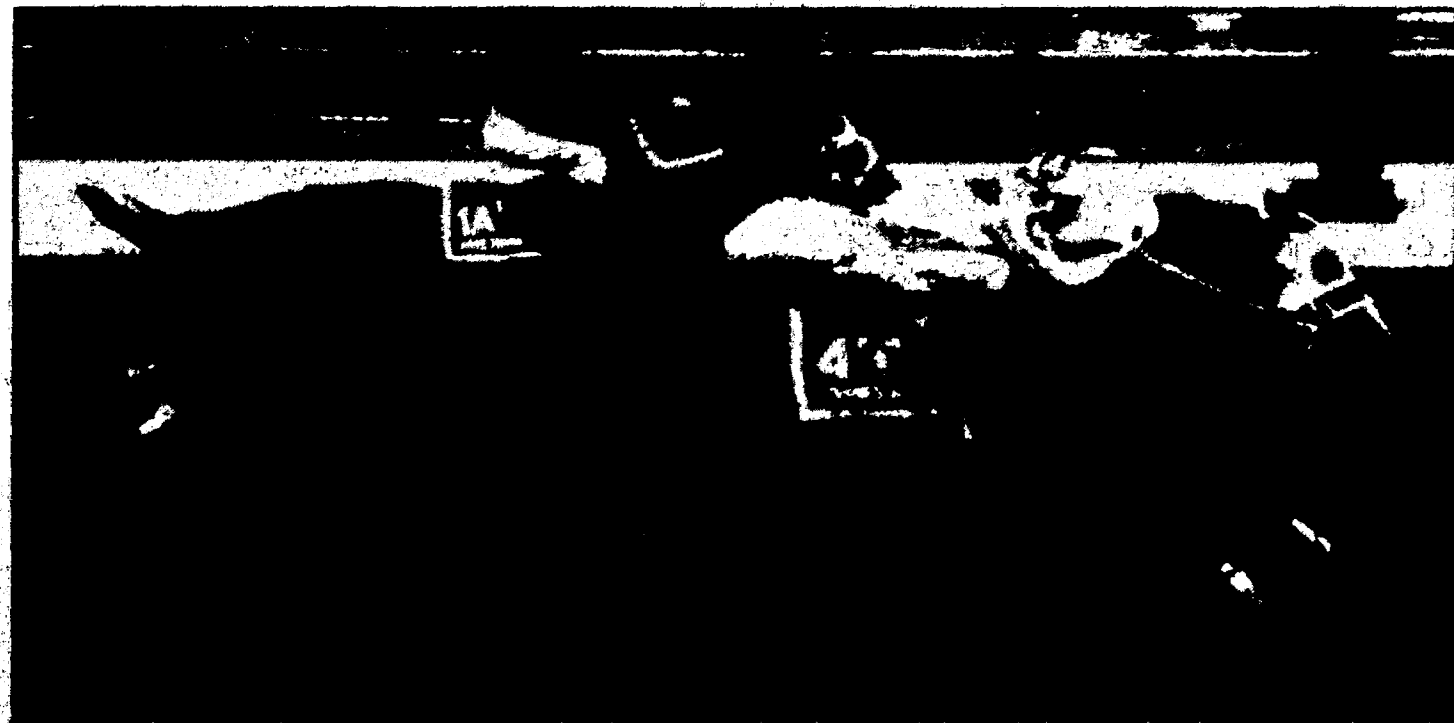
"It's a shame we had to win that way," Stradley said. "But if we hadn't been bothered and run straight, we might have beat that other horse anyway. This way we'll never know."
