

Forest may reopen to timber harvesting

The Smokey Bear District of the Lincoln National Forest may be reopened to commercial fuelwood cutters after an 11-month closure, if a court-ordered injunction is lifted.

Despite an announcement Friday by Regional Forester Chip Cartwright that logging operations would resume in national forests in Arizona and New Mexico, district ranger Jerry Hawkes said he had not received final word by Tuesday.

If and when he does receive word, the change won't have a huge effect on the Lincoln, he said. However, it will help out small operations that provide wood for

homeowners.

"We have no major logging in our district," Hawkes said. "Most of our people are commercial fuelwood cutters, about 30 of them."

The federal court-ordered injunction was in response to a suit filed by environmentalists to protect the habitat of the threatened Mexican spotted owl.

Those same groups have said they will continue fighting in court. They are expected to file a request this week before U.S. District Judge Carl Muecke of Phoenix asking for a review of the U.S. Forest Service action.

In a news release, Cartwright was quoted as saying he is confident the Forest Service and the

U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service have complied with Muecke's order asking for forest plans to protect the owl.

Amendments to all 11 forest plans in the region for the owl took effect June 14 and were judged by Fish and Wildlife Service officials to be in compliance with that agency's recovery plan July 2.

Hawkes said all critical habitat of the owl — essentially the entire 398,738 acres of forest around Ruidoso — had been shut down since August, except for areas where special projects were approved. Only several hundred acres are open to fuelwood cutters.

The lifting of the injunction would allow removal of hazard

trees at Ski Apache and the continuation of a project to build a 500-foot wide firebreak around Ruidoso, Hawkes said.

Merle Glenn of the Alamogordo office of the Forest Service said if the ban is lifted, a three to five-year project to remove diseased trees from the forest to improve its health will be resumed.

Only one commercial logger operates in the neighboring Cloudcroft District of the forest, which covers about 450,000 acres. Several smaller independent loggers have not been affected by the injunction, said forester Peg Crim.

Resumption of cutting also will allow power companies to remove trees potentially hazardous to electric lines, she said.

Local suicide note cites gambling loss woes

A Roswell man killed himself in a Ruidoso cabin early Thursday after writing a note saying he was tired of losing at gambling, police said.

Alex J. Hill, 36, had been gambling at the Inn of the Mountain Gods several hours before shooting a .45 caliber bullet into his brain, police said.

Still holding the gun, Hill was found by police on the living room floor of a former girlfriend's 131 Sleepy Hollow Road cabin around 1:50 a.m. He had been dead for about three or four hours, police said. Medical Investigator Danny Sisson concluded the cause of death was a single, self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Although a window to the cabin was broken, and Hill had complained to friends earlier in the day that two armed men abducted him, police said there was no sign of foul play in his death.

Hill borrowed the gun from two Tularosa friends Wednesday afternoon. He asked for the gun to protect himself, afraid of being alone at the cabin with bears around, Detective Wolfgang Born related.

Hill had been staying at the cabin by himself since Monday,

July 8. Police said he was unemployed.

His friends also said they lent him \$20, which was later found in Hill's pocket with a 50-cent casino chip, police said. Police didn't ask the friends how much money the man may have lost.

The two friends had picked him up at the Mescalero Apache Tribal Store where he went after he was abducted outside of the casino by two Mexican men, Born said.

Hill told his friends he escaped without his car, Born related. When his friends picked him up around 4 p.m., he asked them to drive to the

back of the tribe's bingo hall, but his yellow 1986 Chevy Camaro with black interior wasn't found.

Ruidoso and tribal police did not receive a report of a stolen vehicle or assault, Born related, and the keys to the car were found inside the pants Hill was wearing. Police are looking for the car, he said.

Except for the bullet wound, Hill lacked any marks or bruises on his body.

When his friends returned to Tularosa, they called Hill's sister and former girlfriend in Roswell to tell him they were uneasy, having lent him the pistol.

His sister called Ruidoso police around 11:30 p.m. and asked them to check on Hill. No one answered Sergeant Truman McBride's knock at the cabin door, and he left he saw the lights and TV on, Born said.

Police escorted Hill's sister and friend to the cabin around 1:50 a.m. after they arrived in Ruidoso. Inside, they found Hill's body and a note written on two paper plates. His sister verified his handwriting, Born said.

"I hate losing again and again; Every endeavor has failed," Hill's note read. "How could life (have) gone differently; 10K would have been a nice start."

Also in the note, Hill said more

could be learned from notes he left inside his car, but he didn't know where it was because he lost it.

"Buena suerte," he wrote in closing. That means good luck in Spanish.

To cover himself from a lawsuit for false arrest, Vega asked Foster to sign an apology acknowledging she was at fault for smuggling the tobacco, Klein said. She also gave a taped statement.

Klein said he expects to call 10 witnesses and introduce 20 documents in the state's case against Vega. The trial is scheduled to last through Friday in front of 12th District Judge Sandra Grisham of Alamogordo.

The only witness to testify Monday was Foster, 40, who also is suing Vega in federal court over the incident.

She and Woods were arrested on Sept. 28, 1995, when she slipped straws containing tobacco, matches and tobacco paper through a key hole on a door at the county jail in Carrizozo. The jail is a non-smoking facility.

Woods had nothing to do with the idea to sneak in the tobacco,

said Foster, who now lives in Roswell. Both Woods' boyfriend and Foster's husband were inmates at the jail.

Klein directed Foster to detail her previous work as an informant for Ruidoso Detective Pete Esquivel, which oddly led to her own arrest on a charge of possession of narcotics.

"I gave information to the officer that drugs were in my home," Foster said. "I felt my personal life was out of control. My husband was deep into it (drugs) and making me do a lot of drugs I didn't want to do. He was violent and I was scared."

"I thought if I could just get some dealers off the street, it might help."

About 1.5 hours before her release from jail on the charge of smuggling contraband into the jail, Foster met with Vega who asked her to sign an agreement that she would work exclusively with Vega as an informant.

"He said if I told anyone, he'd find out about it, and all deals would be off and I'd be arrested and both my husband and I would go to the penitentiary for three years," Foster said.

She was never told the charges had been dismissed, Foster said.

After her release from jail, Foster said she met Vega again, this time with Sheriff James McSwane present. They discussed how she should try to find a particular dealer and buy drugs from him.

When she tried unsuccessfully that night to fulfill her part of the deal, Foster was upset and called Esquivel.

Before Foster could relate what Esquivel told her, Grisham excused the jury for the day in response to an objection from Counts, who said the testimony would be hearsay.

When the jury was gone, Foster said when she talked to Esquivel, "I found out that what I had done, in fact, was not a crime."

"Living" fort idea proposed

If northwest Nebraska can draw 800,000 visitors three months a year to a fort that was scheduled to be demolished, Lincoln County can preserve Fort Stanton with a similar use, says Sally Burkstaller.

Through the efforts of state officials and volunteers, they turned around the fate of Fort Robinson and it now produces more than \$1 million to the state and provides employment," the Ruidoso real estate agent told county commissioners recently.

The Nebraska fort has a full resort program with trails, Jeep rides, a tour train to a ranch with a buffalo herd, history activities, a covered swimming pool, chuckwagon cookouts, rodeo events, environmental talks and two museums, Burkstaller said.

Commissioners encouraged Burkstaller to continue her efforts, offering their backing but not much hope.

"The state isn't interested in creating more state parks," said Commission Chairman Montroy

Montes.

"They're even thinking about privatizing some of the existing state parks," Commissioner L. Ray Nunley said.

"The budget is the problem," Montes added.

They suggested she contact New Mexico's representatives in Congress as well as state officials.

"So you're saying I should go above your heads," Burkstaller said.

"With our blessings," Nunley answered.

Fort Stanton was closed in March 1995 after 100 years as first a federal and then a state hospital, following its original use for protection against Indians.

Since it closed, the state has failed to find a new tenant. The latest proposal is for a minimum security forestry work camp for adult prison inmates.

Commissioners are trying to arrange for the fort to be leased to the county, but that process has dragged on for months. They are confident they can find a private

business to use all or a portion of its 80 buildings and 1,320 acres of land.

Noting that Fort Robinson is only open during the summer, Burkstaller said, "We could keep our fort open longer, but we need to have a flag carrier, an influential state senator to push for a designation as a state park."

Contacted in Nebraska, Jim Lemmon, superintendent of Fort Robinson, said the Army moved out of that complex in 1948. A beef research group took over, but began tearing down buildings.

From 1958 to 1970, the state slowly took over and restored portions of the fort.

Today, 120 people are employed and it operates on a \$1 million budget.

"Our state was poor too," Lemmon said. "But we break even or make money, and when it doesn't cost the state anything and brings in tourist dollars, we'd be one of the last things they'd close down."

The fort consists of 70 buildings dating back to 1874.

County accuses state official of misleading other department

Promoters of a public use for historic Fort Stanton may never have a chance to form a plan.

The state Forestry Division and the Department of Corrections are moving ahead with a proposal to convert the historic fort 12 miles from Ruidoso into an adult minimum security forestry work camp for 200 inmates.

County commissioners said last week Corrections Secretary Karl Sannicks misled the state General Services Department in a letter June 11 to GSD Secretary Steve Beffort.

"It says here that the department (corrections) will request an operating budget in January 1997 to open the facility," Commissioner L. Ray Nunley said. "He goes on to say that the program has received widespread support in Lincoln County and is strongly supported by the govern-

ment. I'd like to know where that county support comes from — certainly not from this board."

Mike Toms of the corrections department said Sannicks was unavailable for comment Tuesday.

"I suppose we could have assumed there was support for this project, because the commissioners wanted to create jobs," he said. "I think it is an excellent opportunity. I can't understand someone objecting to inmates performing services to protect the forest and the community."

Commissioners said they thought the GSD still was trying to find maintenance money for the county to keep up the fort until commissioners could line up a new tenant or multiple tenants.

Reflecting on what he characterized as a string of economic

blows and broken promises from the administration of Gov. Gary Johnson, Commissioner Wilton Howell said, "You've got to wonder if this administration ever told the truth when they lied to us once," he said. "If they can prove they haven't, I will publicly apologize."

"They said they would turn over the fort to us and they're not doing it. You can see the commitment to the forestry and corrections in the letter."

Since Johnson took office, the fort was closed as a state hospital, displacing and terminating about 200 jobs; corrections announced the closing of Camp Sierra Blanca as an adult minimum security prison, eliminating about 50 jobs; and commissioners recently learned a 4-year-old after-school child care program was dropped from a state grant program.

Colby.

A funeral service was held Saturday, July 13 at the Christ Community Fellowship Church in Capitan. Pastor Ed Vinson officiated.

Legislature needs to straighten out mess

Maybe now the state Legislature will do what it should have done a long time ago: approve compacts for Indian casinos.

U.S. Attorney John Kelly says he expects the tribes to just voluntarily close their casinos by July 27 — businesses that, for the first time for many tribes, are generating millions of dollars and dozens of jobs for tribal members.

On top of that, Kelly expects the Mescalero Apache Tribe to comply with agreements that the nine pueblos signed and the Mescalero did not sign.

The tribes should have been able to trust the governor when he said he had the authority to sign compacts without legislative approval. Yet it is the tribes who face the penalties from the governor's failure to educate himself about the law, and they aren't hearing the governor offer any ideas now in their time of need.

Will it take a confrontation between the U.S. Attorney and tribal officials at the door of casinos to spur the Legislature into action? Hopefully not. Legislative leaders need to call a special session now.

Maybe the upcoming election will be enough to spur the Legislature into action to help straighten out this mess — and solve it here in New Mexico, not in federal courts.

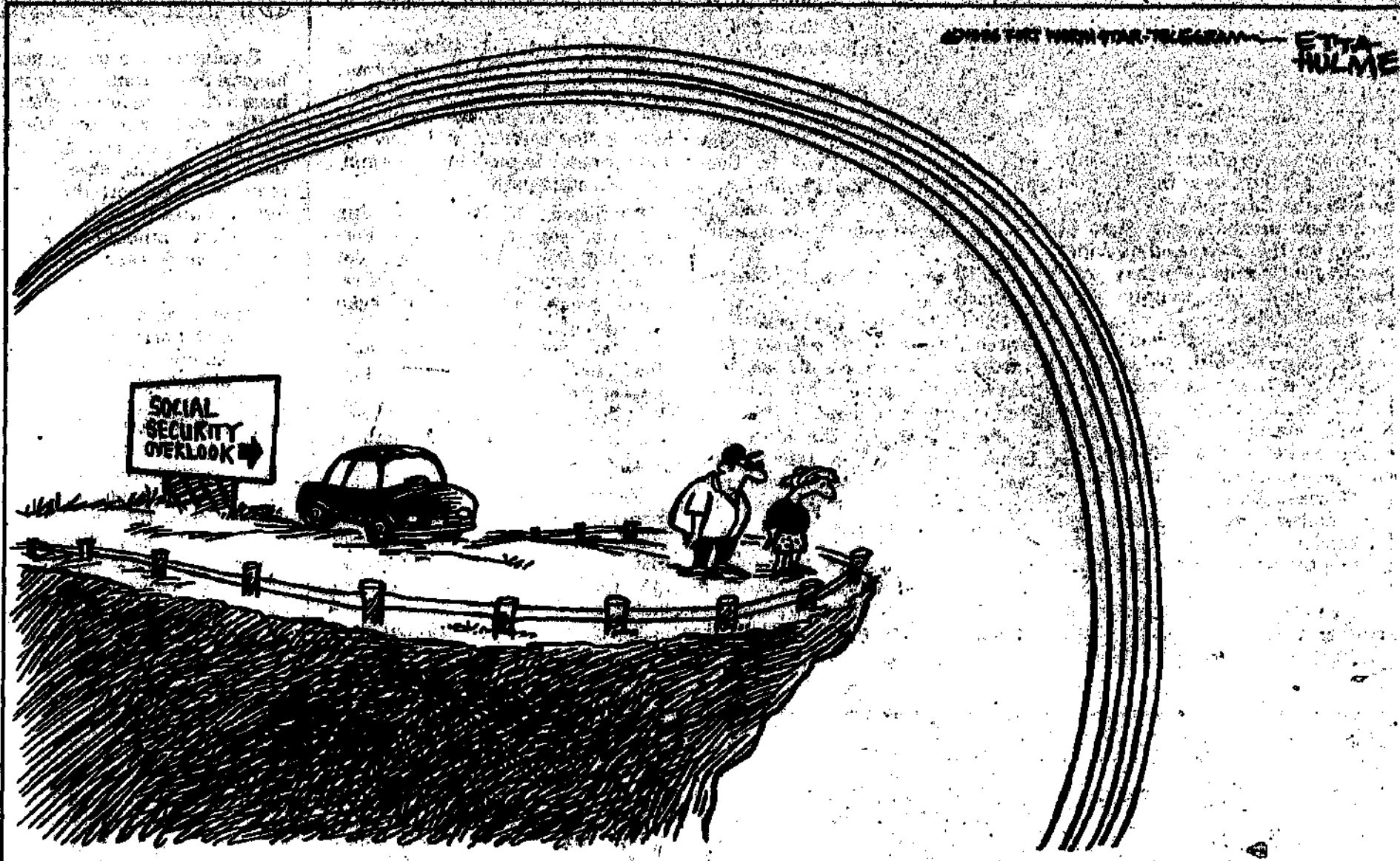

Irrigation district not best manager for Elephant Butte

TO THE EDITOR:

It is not surprising that U.S. Rep. Skeen's attempt to transfer ownership of federal lands around reservoirs — including Elephant Butte — to local irrigation districts has sparked such controversy. This legislation would have far-reaching effects on water resources and recreation throughout the West. State Rep. Shirley Baca should be commended for raising this issue publicly.

Here in New Mexico, there is absolutely nothing in Skeen's bill to prevent Elephant Butte Irrigation District from raising entrance fees or closing down New Mexico's largest state park entirely (as at least one EBID board member has suggested if liability and environmental issues grow too vexing). It will be entirely up to EBID's board to decide the future management of these lands.

Why then, are defenders of his bill so quick to dismiss the possibility that EBID might simply choose to shut down the park rather than deal with the headaches of managing a facility that becomes New Mexico's second largest (and least sober) city on holiday weekends? Indeed, it would be irresponsible of EBID's board not to consider closing the park if doing so were in the best interests of its constituents.

In addition to EBID, the bill

would give joint title over Elephant Butte lands to a Texas irrigation district, El Paso County Water Improvement District #1. I wonder how most New Mexicans would feel about a Texas quasi-governmental entity holding prime recreational property in New Mexico.

Mr. Skeen says a deal's a deal, and his bill is needed to make the federal government keep its end of a bargain made long ago with farmers. I suspect the matter is not so simple. In fact, the matter has been in court for several years and is still not resolved.

Everyone agrees the dam and reservoir were constructed with taxpayers' money and that farmers have paid back some of this amount, and had some of their debt forgiven. Whether they reimbursed taxpayers for all project construction costs is a matter of dispute.

Regardless of the original agreement, a substantial public interest has developed in the reservoir beyond its use for agriculture. Not only has it become one of New Mexico's most important recreational resources, it is also a key component of a water delivery system that downstream communities are counting on to meet their future water needs, including Las Cruces and El Paso.

The public should realize what supporters of Skeen's bill already seem to know — this legislation is not just about land ownership, but about who controls the future water sources for millions of people in New Mexico, Texas and Mexico, not to mention the health of the Rio Grande ecosystem.

Frankly, I think we are better off

if important public resources like Elephant Butte are managed by an entity answerable to all U.S. citizens, as Rep. Baca advocates.

Now is time to attack Dwarf Mistletoe

TO THE EDITOR:

This is a reminder to the folks living in these beautiful conifer forests that they can help preserve that beauty by eliminating the principle scourge of these trees — the Dwarf Mistletoe.

If this appears to be too overwhelming, a simpler solution is to use a pair of binoculars and identify the clumps of female mistletoe with berries and eliminate them. That will stop the spread and reduce the work to 1/20th.

However, if all mistletoe is eliminated, the following year 90% will be gone, and the year after that you will have only approximately 1% of the original infestation.

The mistletoe berries ripen, burst and spread in July and August. In still air, the sticky kernel can fly 20 feet. In a high wind, it can be carried 300 feet.

I have been pursuing this method for five years and now have an extremely healthy grove of Ponderosa Pine trees in a very heavily infested area. Presently there are no effective chemicals against this parasite. So work outdoors and enjoy and preserve our environment. Good luck!

The Ruidoso Bottling Company has been purchased by Mr. and Mrs. George McCarty.

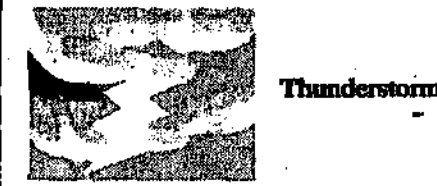

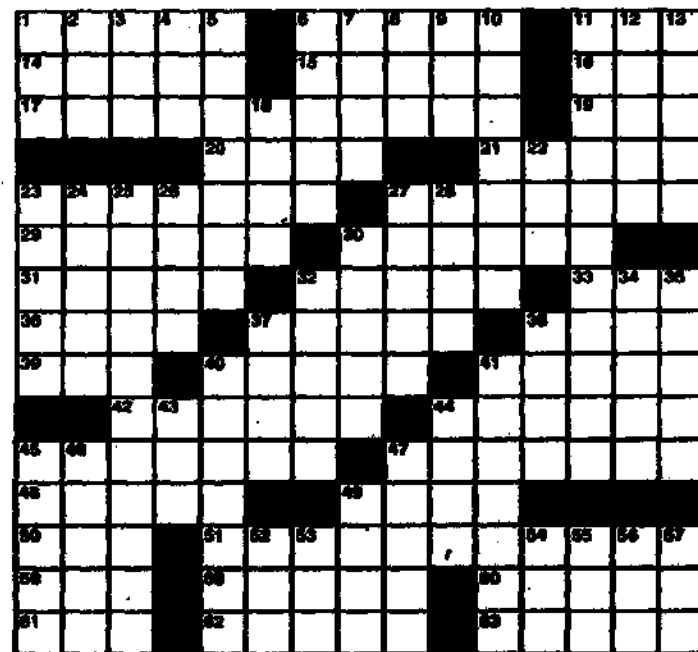

Top artists attract student travelers

Artists are typically people of vision, and many artists in the Ruidoso area see a great potential for arts education here.

Some of the top art teachers in the country already live and work in Lincoln County, including Paula White, Ben Koenig, Ken Homan, Ann Templeton, Linda Kyeer Smith, and David Smith.

These artists were part of the all-star faculty who once taught at Carlsbad Art School. Now they work independently, but Linda and David Smith would like to centralize art education in Ruidoso again.

The Smiths have recently set up shop again at the Stetson schoolhouse in Ruidoso Downs. The Stetson Academy of Fine Arts begins in August with five workshops in painting, etching, and sculpture. Classes cost \$560 and are scheduled as follows:

Mood Portraits in Oil, Aug. 5-8, 12-15; Still Life in Oil, Aug. 19-22; Pastel Portraits, Aug. 24-27; Sculpture, Aug. 5-8 and 12-15; Etching, Aug. 28-30; and Film Air Painting in Oil and Watercolor, Aug. 19-23. Call 378-8101 for more details.

Right now, the Smiths are the only instructors at Stetson and they are only doing regional marketing. If things go well in August, though, they will launch a national advertising campaign for next summer and slowly add instructors.

"Art classes and workshops are a growing part of the art world," David Smith said. "We're lucky to have artists with a national reputation already here."

Eventually the Smiths hope classes at Stetson will carry on during education credits.

Smith said Ruidoso is perfect for an art school because of its climate

and resort atmosphere. When it's in full swing, Stetson could bring 520 people to Ruidoso for a week at a time, people who otherwise wouldn't come here.

"It's great for the community economically," Smith said.

Paula White and Ann Templeton teach art classes at their private studios in Hondo and Glenora. The classes attract locals as well as people from around the country.

At Red Rose Art Studio and Artists' Retreat (505/858-4203), Paula White teaches ongoing classes in watermedia, china painting, and oil. Classes are \$25 for six hours on Tuesday (watermedia), Wednesday (china painting), and Thursday (oil).

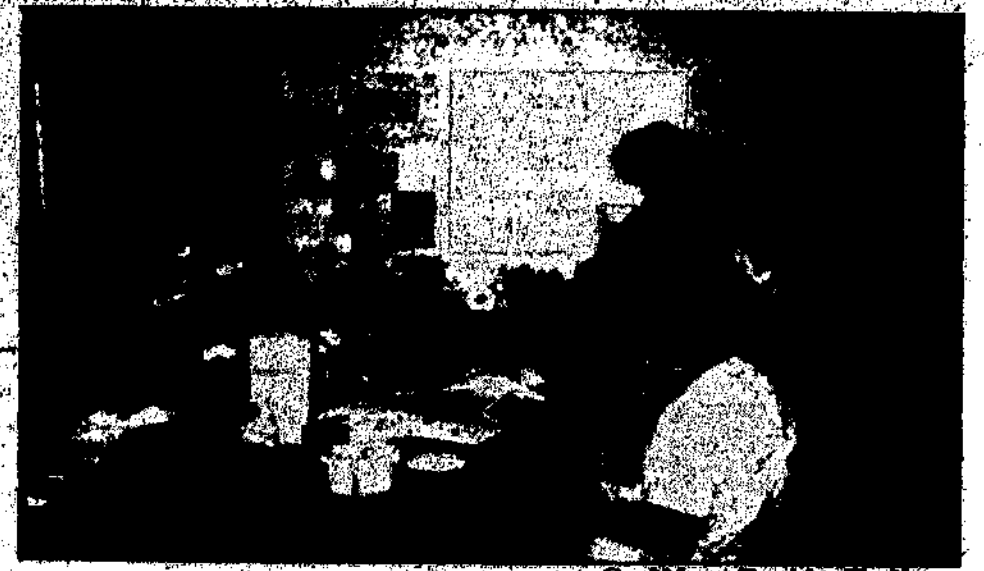
White is planning two special watermedia workshops for Sept. 16-20 and Oct. 7-16, the first emphasizing color and design, the second focusing on landscapes.

Ann Templeton (378-4262) starts her next oil painting classes Sept. 9-13 and 16-20, for \$250 per course or \$400 for both. Templeton expects 20 students in each course, some coming from as far away as Canada.

Ben Koenig is in his 25th year of workshops in Ruidoso, offering pastel and oil medium seminars at the Enchantment Inn. Classes meet July 28 - Aug. 2 and Aug. 5-9. Call 806-373-8458 or stop by Lacorture Fine Arts for a registration form.

Someday these artists may consolidate their curriculums again. The Stetson schoolhouse is a wealth of possibilities. In the off season, the Smiths would like to use Stetson as a retreat center. The facility includes two studio apartments where artists can live for a season.

Hondo schools win some and lose some in planning new year

Hondo Valley Superintendent Barbara Perez-Cassey has salvaged Hondo's bilingual program, securing \$14,900 in funding from the State Department of Education (SDE).

SDE officials cited Hondo's bilingual program last year for failing to meet educational standards, and they rejected an application submitted by former superintendent Margarito Uranga because those citations were not addressed.

Cassey rewrote the application after meeting with teachers and correcting the program deficiencies, and the state accepted it.

Although Cassey won back the bilingual program, she stands to lose seven students living in the Hondo district.

Hondo Valley school buses cannot reach these students, so Hondo may waive its boundary agreement with Capitan so the students can attend school there.

School board President Vicky Sanchez expressed concern that the impassable condition of certain roads in the Hondo School District is causing the district to lose students and the money that comes with those students.

"Six or seven students may not seem like much to Capitan, but to Hondo it's a lot," Sanchez told Capitan Superintendent Diana Bilinguay at Monday's Hondo School Board meeting.

The Capitan district pays parents a router fee for bringing their children to the Capitan district boundary, where the school

bus can pick them up on its regular route.

Capitan and Hondo renew the boundary waiver each year for students who cannot easily reach the Hondo school. One student this year would have to take a 90-mile route to reach Hondo.

Speaking for most of the parents requesting a boundary waiver, one parent at the meeting told the Hondo School Board that parents

The board will meet the third Monday of every month so the business manager will have time to reconcile the books and give an up-to-date budget report. The Parent-Teacher-Student Organization meets at 5 p.m. Monday, Aug. 19 in the school cafeteria. They will meet before every school board meeting throughout the year.

would not send their children to Hondo even if the waiver was not granted this year. Some are prepared to move out of district.

No action was taken on the boundary agreements Monday. Discussion will continue and a decision will be made at the next meeting.

Aug. 19. The Hondo district annually continues to lose money due to declining enrollment. The State Board of Education has told Superintendent Cassey the district cannot overspend its budget, or it won't receive emergency funding next year.

In the 1994-95 school year, Hondo overspent its budget by \$80,000 and was put on a three-year probation. This year, Cassey said, the state was pleased to see that Hondo hasn't touched the \$30,000 granted for the 1995-96 year's emergency fund.

Cassey is managing district expenses by tightening belts. She has started by limiting long-distance phone access, discontinuing lunchtime charge accounts, and securing donated materials to make improvements to the playground.

Both the playground and the vocational/agricultural building are in serious need of repair.

School maintenance workers have temporarily fixed a wall leak that was flooding the vocational building, but water still drips from the ceiling and runs behind electrical panels, making the conditions dangerous for students.

The building was last renovated in 1994, and it received a new roof then. However, the school took possession of the building before a final inspection was made, and officials had no recourse when flaws were discovered.

School board President Vicky Sanchez said the board will carefully guard against making the same mistake this time. The board voted to use part of \$300,000 worth of

bond money to renovate the building again this year.

The upper level playground has been declared unsafe by a playground expert who inspected the area at Cassey's request. Cassey is shutting down that playground and taking out the old equipment.

At a second playground behind the school, Cassey is replacing a slide that doesn't meet safety code standards, and is installing two swings currently in storage.

She is applying for a \$17,000 grant from the McCune Foundation to install new rides for disabled students and to meet Americans with

Disabilities Act accessibility requirements, plus add dome monkey bars and a seesaw.

About \$9,500 in wood chips have been donated to the school to build a playground perimeter.

Hondo is also receiving \$2,000 in general obligation bonds to buy library books.

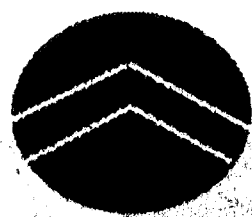

"The thing about it was that it showed us that we can throw the ball, which we weren't sure we would be able to do," Carter said.

The successful play of Enjady, Rogge and Saenz has put Carter in an enviable position of having three quarterbacks to choose from.

"All three keep performing real well," Carter said.

Novice starter posts Rainbow's fastest qualifying effort

On a picture perfect Ruidoso day, first-time starter Firebrand Streaker posted the fastest qualifying time for the \$375,664 Rainbow Futurity Friday. The finals for the Rainbow will be run Sunday, July 28.

Firebrand Streaker is a Texas bred by Streakin Six out of Shes Bad, and is owned by Linda Matthews of Dallas.

The sixth trial of the day was the sorrel gelding's first career trip down the lane, and was run rather impressively. Firebrand Streaker breaking from the five hole, settled about a length off the early leader, First By Far, then poured on the steam in the final 100 yards to win by three-quarters of a length. The Dwayne Gilbreath-trained runner stopped the timer in 19.755 seconds for the 400 yards under jockey Sam Thompson.

In the second trial of the day, Ruidoso Futurity winner Haulin Pass went to her knees at the start but recovered quickly. That stumble, however, looked to take something out of her as she tired toward the wire, finishing third.

That trial was won by Dean Miracle in 19.825 seconds. Haulin Pass' time of 19.930 was still good enough to qualify her for the consolation of the Rainbow.

Jockey Todd Fincher, second call rider at Ruidoso Downs for the ever-formidable Jack Brooks Stables, elected not to ride for Brooks in the second and fourth trial. Instead, he opted for Dean Miracle in the second and Calyx Shadow in the fourth. Both horses won and qualified for the final. Fincher did not ride another mount the rest of the day, finishing with two wins in two trips to the post.

The team of jockey Tami Purcell and trainer James McArthur had a great day winning three of the twelve trials. The jockey-trainer team won the seventh heat with The Converter, the ninth trial with Our Liquidator, and the eleventh with First Down Rebel.

Purcell also had three second-place finishes to go with her three trips to the winner's circle.

Reckless Roula closed out 1996 by running second to Winalota Cash in the Texas Classic Futurity at Trinity Meadows, and then winning the Grade 2 Breeders Juvenile Classic at Los Alamitos.

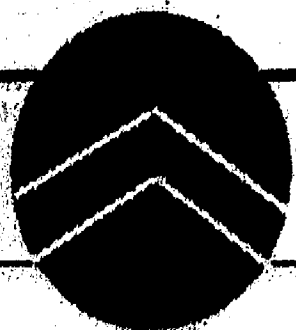

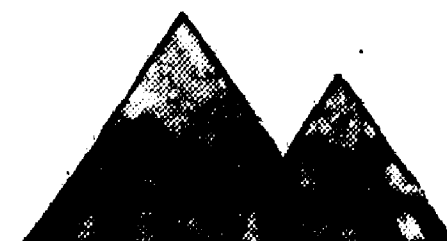

Strabismus, more commonly known as crossed-eyes, is a vision condition in which the eyes are not properly aligned with each other. For some reason, one or both eyes turn in, out, up or down. Coordination of the eyes and their ability to work together is a learned trait that develops within a child's first six years. Failure of the eye muscles to adjust properly can lead to crossed-eyes. It can also have a tendency to be hereditary. Children under six are the ones who are the most affected by crossed-eyes, but it often first appears between birth and 21 months. Although rare, strabismus sometimes occurs in adults, but this is usually the result of a stroke, tumor or other disease. A child will not outgrow crossed-eyes. In fact, the condition may only get worse without treatment. Some of the effects of crossed-eyes may be double vision. If you notice one or both eyes wandering on your child, make an appointment with your optometrist for a complete eye health examination as soon as possible.

Cézanne

Cézanne examines the art, life, and times of Paul Cézanne (1839-1906). The French postimpressionist painter's work and ideas had a profound influence on the development of 20th-century art. The one-hour program highlights the Cézanne retrospective, comprising more than 100 paintings and 68 watercolors, that opened May 30th, 1996, at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the only U.S. venue for the exhibition.

Cézanne wanted to "make Impressionism into something solid and durable like the art in the museums." He treated his figures like still lifes, and he painted his trees, houses, and mountains like rocks. He shifted his angles of vision and used pure color to express light.

Like many profoundly original artists, Cézanne faced great misunderstandings and sometimes outright hostility throughout his career. In 1864, he received the first of numerous rejections by the Salon juries in Paris, and when he decided to exhibit with the impressionists in 1874, he was dismissed by one critic as "an ignorant dauber." While the public or press might have attacked or ignored his work, Cézanne was always an artist's artist, and his contemporaries championed him, tirelessly. Later artists acknowledged their debt to his genius, recognizing him as the seminal figure in bridging the 19-century movements with 20th-century modernism. Picasso called him "the father of us all," while Matisse referred to him as "a kind of benevolent god of painting."
