House fire is controlled burn for firemen's practice

A house fire on Carrizo Canyon Road Tuesday was a controlled burn planned by the Ruidoso Fire Department, and not an alarm fire.

The fire was sparked strictly for department training.

Ray Eidson, owner of the 125 Carrizo Canyon house, provided it for the firefighters' training.

After the old house is completely razed, Eidson plans to clean the lot and use it for extra parking for his Funtrackers Amusement park, he said.

Test shows which brother shot teen, Ruidoso police say

A paraffin test determining which Dacanay brother shot a Ruidoso boy in the leg Oct. 30 has been completed, but Ruidoso police won't release the findings until later this week.

Detective Jim Biggs said he won't reveal the complete findings until he gets official documentation of the test.

Both Dacanay brothers, Jandy, 18, and Luckie, 16, initially claimed responsibility for the shooting. Police charged each of them with the shooting because witnesses said they couldn't tell the brothers apart.

The boys are accused of shooting another teenager in the foot in downtown Ruidoso Oct. 30. Police said it may be the first shooting in history between teenagers in downtown Ruidoso.

The brothers are each being held on a third-degree felony charge of aggravated battery, and a misdemeanor charge of unlawful possession of a handgun.

Since Luckie is a minor, he faces a maximum two years at the New Mexico Boys School in Springer. Jandy, an adult, faces up to five years in jail and a \$6,000 fine.

Biggs contacted the Albuquerque police lab Friday and was told by a secretary about the gunpowder absorption test results. The test was positive for paraffin on one hand of one of the boys, and inconclusive on the other. Results on the hands of the other brother were inconclusive on one hand and questionable on the other, Biggs said.

The 5'9" blue-eyed blond from Lovington is a third-grade teacher at Jefferson elementary. Her students may have had a hand in bringing her good luck by sending her a card before the final event.

Harris was surrounded by friends and family after she won, including her parents, Perl and Linda Harris. She promised to represent New Mexico proudly at the Miss USA pageant.

Miss White Sands Vivian Harding was second, followed by Miss Land of Enchantment Amber Jordan, Miss Zia Cheyenne Ward, and Miss Las Cruces Leana Lofland.

Coincidentally, seven of the 10 finalists were the only competitors

to wear white gowns. Four in white made it to the final cut of five.

Unfortunately, Miss Ruidoso Janice Kae Fine and Miss Valencia County Paulette Baca never got a chance to compete for the crown because they were suffering from migraine headaches Saturday, emcee Jeff Gates said.

Fine, 20, is a student at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces majoring in hotel/restaurant management. She was first runner-up in the Miss National Teenager Pageant in Albuquerque two years in a row.

"She was extremely disappointed because she worked very hard to get ready for it (Saturday's finals)," said Fine's mother, Kay Frezer. Fine has never missed a pageant in the past because of a migraine, but she's had the ailment for many years, Frezer added.

U.S. attorney advised tribe not to reopen casino

The Mescalero Apache Tribe's partial reopening of its gambling enterprise Friday was against the advice of the U.S. attorney's office.

But the U.S. attorney won't say what, if anything, he will do in response to the opening.

The U.S. attorney agrees with the tribe that the Class II table games being offered in the Ina Da Card Room are legal under federal law. The tables have outside bankers, and gambling machines at Casino Apache are still idle.

However, the gambling might be a violation of a 10th Circuit Court of Appeals order for the tribe to maintain its "status quo" of closure.

Meanwhile, the state Legislature and the governor are considering calling a special session to temporarily resolve the Indian gaming issue before the next regular session begins in January.

Mescalero President Wendell Chino has been in Santa Fe this week lobbying for such special session. Many legislators are there this week for western states conference.

The tribe reopened the Ina Da Card Room at the Inn of the Mountain Gods Friday because the type of gambling offered is legal, said Tom Gallagher, the Mescalero chief financial officer.

"Class II gaming is any non-banking card games, and we have no doubt this is class II," Gallagher said. "It's legal."

"No action has been taken (against the tribe)," said U.S. Attorney John Kelly's spokesman Ron Lopez. "It's class II gaming with people playing against each other."

But Lopez added that the U.S. attorney hasn't been able to monitor how the tribe has been handling the non-banking games yet. He had "no comment" about whether Kelly might take action to close it down.

Independent bankers buy the chips from the dealers for the blackjack games now in operation. Those bankers are responsible for all financial losses and rewards, explained Casino Apache blackjack dealer Jeff Meachem.

By charging players and bankers a fee of 50 cents per hand for bets under \$25 and \$1 per hand for bets \$25 or higher, the tribe is able to take in some money for its game provisions, but not nearly enough to cover the cost of personnel, Gallagher said.

The maximum bet on a single hand is \$100, Meachem said.

Six blackjack tables opened Friday with up to 36 players in the room at once so far, Meachem said.

"It's been a little slow, but hopefully the longer we stay open, we'll

get more of our clientele back and more of the dealers back to work also," Meachem said.

About 40 employees, including dealers, floor personnel, housekeepers and bartenders have been hired back. Most are working part-time during the card room's 6 p.m. to 1 a.m. hours.

"We're probably not going to be making money on this — it's not a revenue producer and is not enough to pay for employee wages, payroll benefits and taxes," Gallagher said. "The reason we did this is to keep the employees we could, provide jobs and keep them from moving on or taking other job offers."

A lot of money went into training dealers, he added. Gallagher was unsure how many dealers had been on the payroll when the full casino was open, but said about 400 Inn employees were laid off after the casino rooms were ordered shut Sept. 24.

The 10th Circuit Court of Appeals hears oral arguments today in nine pueblos' appeal of a ruling their casinos are illegal. A decision may not come until December, a Mescalero attorney said.

If the court upholds the lower court decision, the pueblos have agreed to close their casinos, unless they obtain yet another court-issued stay (delay) while they appeal.

Mormon Family History Center helps local residents trace roots

Many families pass down stories of being related to European royalty, an infamous pirate or a great explorer.

One way to check out if the stories are true is to trace the family tree back from the current branches for as many generations as records allow.

But where to start and how? The Family History Center at

the Church of Latter Day Saints on State Road 48 near Capitan is one of the best places locally.

And Eloise Lamoreaux is the volunteer who will sit down and walk a newcomer through all the necessary steps.

Using the church's facilities gains the novice genealogist access to the vast records of the Mormon Church collected in Salt Lake City, Utah.

The quest is not a chore for

Lamoreaux, who explains that it's a way to help unite family members in heaven.

"Our church believes we will live together in heaven as families, but we have to be sealed together on earth and genealogy is a way to gather the family and do temple work for them," Lamoreaux said. "We are a Christian church, not a cult, and we work on three principles: perfect the saints, proclaim

the gospel and redeem the dead."

Although the family history center is open only on Tuesday, Lamoreaux by appointment will meet at other times with people trying to trace their ancestry.

The process often becomes addictive, she said.

"You never finish," she said. "There's always one more name to check or lead to follow, even though you think you have finished. It's especially addictive when you see your own name on the computer."

"I'm doing cousins now and their children," Lamoreaux said.

Most families have some skeletons rattling around in their histories.

"Nearly every family has illegitimate children," she said. "There will be fathers who come out West and start a second family. Some will slightly change the spelling of their names."

That's why it may be necessary to check variations on spelling when checking to see if a family member is listed in the church's records, she said.

Although the church already was compiling genealogy records, in 1975 it officially asked each church member to chart four generations of his or her family. That was the start of the computer program, Lamoreaux said.

The church doesn't charge for the use of her time and it's equipment, but a user does pay for a computer genealogy program disk, which is IBM or Macintosh compatible, and for copies printed off records in the computer.

If special items are ordered, such as census information from a particular place and for a certain year, the participant also must cover that cost.

In exchange for the access to records, the church asks only that the researcher submits any information gathered on his or her family to the church to be added to its records, Lamoreaux said.

Lamoreaux recommends bringing as many original documents or copies of those documents on a first visit to the center.

"Each time you write something,

there's the chance that you may transpose the numbers in a date or the letters in a name," she said. "It helps you to put the information directly into the computer."

After an initial run at all readily available records, everything gathered is entered into the computer.

"We print it and it will show where you're missing information," Lamoreaux said.

The computer can set up a pedigree chart that starts with the researcher and works its way backwards, and family group sheets showing people with the same last name.

"We have 100 missionary couples who pay their own way and go around photographing records from parishes and any other records they can get," Lamoreaux said.

That information is sent back to the church headquarters.

"The church sends out records as fast as they are typed in," Lamoreaux said. "But 90% of the work is volunteer."

Lamoreaux moved to Lincoln County in 1988. It was a return to her roots, since the Hagee and Tolbert families on her mother's side homesteaded in the county in 1890.

"My first husband's family was named Avant and in the early 1900s, they homesteaded the area where the Ruidoso Downs Race Track now sits," she added.

Both sides came from Texas to Lincoln County.

The Latter Day church was built on the old Tolbert homestead after being sold to the Jones family in 1913.

But Lamoreaux's fascination with genealogy started long before she settled in Capitan.

"I started going to the Latter Day Church when I was 8 years old, and started gathering information in the 1940s," she said. "One daughter lives in Salt Lake City and the whole family is interested in it. She travels all over the country going to cemeteries."

"But we have four generations here in Lincoln County and three more that have passed on."

They have traced elements of the family back 15 generations to the

1600s.

Since moving here, Lamoreaux has been involved with other members in collecting data at local cemeteries and churches. They also have clipped obituaries, to compile a local book of reference and send the information to the church.

"This area has submitted nearly 40,000 names (to the church records)," Lamoreaux said. One enthusiast goes to Salt Lake City a couple times a year to turn in the material, she said.

From seven to 11 people gather at the family history center each Tuesday, looking into their own families or doing work for others.

When compiling a family history, the data doesn't have to stop with dates and names. The computer program allows the searcher

to enter interesting notes about the family to paint a fuller picture.

By examining property records and wills in probate court records, the searcher can tell if the person was wealthy, active in charities and other tidbits.

By listing a name and address on the records, others researching a branch of the same family may contact the searcher and information can be exchanged.

Because of federal privacy laws, names of living people are not listed in the print-out of a family tree, just the designation that they are living.

Don't worry about being computer literate. The program is simple and tells a user how to proceed step by step. Lamoreaux or other helpers will be on hand if a researcher hits a block.

Information abounds at Family History Center

Some of the avenues that can be researched through Mormon Church records are:

— the ancestral file on computer that contains genealogies of families from around the world. The information mostly is about deceased people, linked into pedigree charts to show their ancestors and descendants. The file contains millions of names.

— the international genealogy index (IGI) on computer and microfiche, which lists the dates and places of birth, christening and marriages for millions of deceased people who lived during the early 1500s to the early 1900s.

— family histories on computer and microfiche lists last names in the Family History Library Catalog. The catalog describes records from around the world. The church accepts or buys published family histories. The list contains about seven million books.

— biographies, genealogies and histories on computer file and microfiche also are listed in the Family History Library Catalog.

— original records including the social security death index, a computer file listing millions of people who died in the United States since 1962.

— and the death index for the Korean and Vietnam wars. Church members currently are compiling an index for the Civil War.

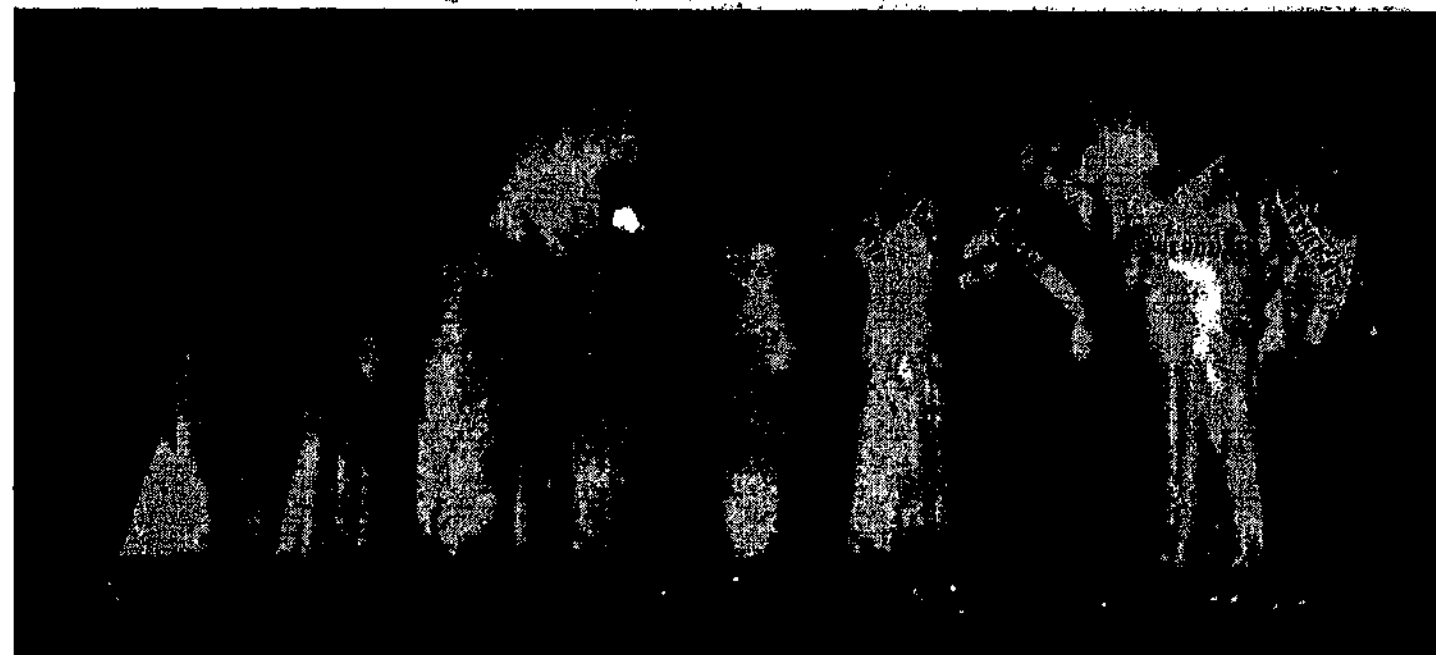

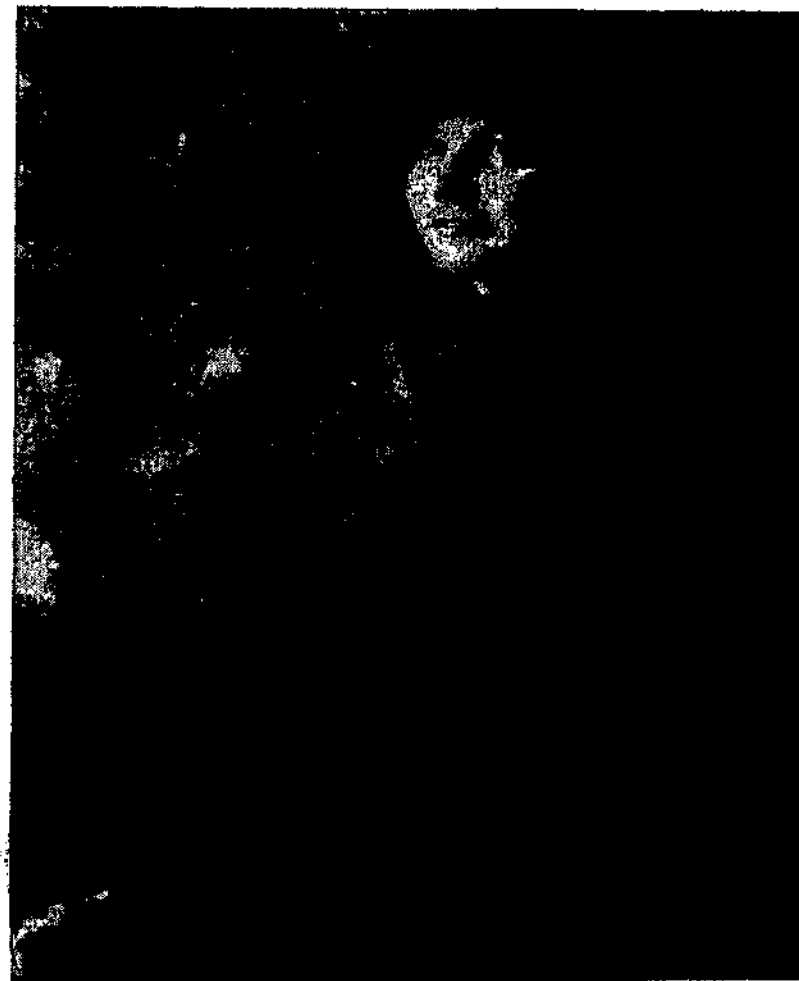

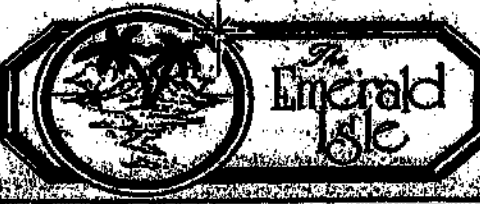

School district's videotapes reduce bus discipline problems

It's amazing how differently some children act when they know someone is watching them.

No wonder the song about Santa works so well on the little ones: "He sees you when you're sleeping. He knows when you're awake. He knows when you've been bad or good, so be good for goodness sake."

Ruidoso school officials have come up with a relatively inexpensive way to keep their eye on school bus troublemakers when Santa's off duty: videocameras, or rather, the possibility of videocameras.

The school district only has two videocameras, and they don't even operate all the time while children are on the buses, but the students don't know where the two cameras are, or whether they're turned on. They can't tell whether real cameras are hidden inside boxes (which are on every bus) or not.

The school board this week viewed a videotape of one bus that carried some troublemakers before the videotape box was installed. We're talking serious trouble — smoking, drinking alcohol and graffiti are on the list. But when the video rolled, there wasn't any trouble. There was hardly even any silliness.

Green Party proud of its accomplishments

TO THE EDITOR:

With the dust settling around the recent election, you may be wondering why the New Mexico Green Party is still walking around with grins on their faces.

For any who have worked on a campaign, you know the hours of endless dedication involved in running just one candidate. For a new party like the Greens, that process becomes multiplied by the lack of active campaign workers. A handful of people end up working day and night, not for just one candidate, but often for the whole group in order to consolidate efforts to offset the fact they are understaffed, and underfunded. That the Green Party retained Major Party status, is a tribute to the sacrifice of time and energy from about two dozen of the most dedicated people I have ever had the privilege to work with.

Having worked media for both Roberto Mondragon in '94 and in this year's election, I can tell you that every scrap of media we have been able to get for The Greens, was a battle. During the '94 campaign we were told that lack of media coverage was based on the fact that we were a minor party and as such did not warrant major media coverage, regardless of who was on the ticket. This election with Major Party status under our belt, you can imagine my shock when I was repeatedly told that we were still not considered a major

party, despite our ballot status.

If so many small independent news sources around the state had not been willing to pick up and print articles sent out by the Green Party members and a few of the editorial editors at the major news sources, we would have been little better off than in '94, despite our hard won ballot status, which we will carry again into the next election season.

Ralph Nader received 2.4% of the vote in this state and 13,000 nationally, despite the financial limitations he was faced with. I spoke to his lawyer, Thomas Linzey, while working to get Nader to visit the state. The \$5,000 campaign limit was enforced on Nader in order to retain the non-profit status of his six advocacy groups. It was not some random number he pulled out of the sky. Yet, Nader came in 4th in the presidential race with a campaign expenditure of \$5,000, not far behind Ross Perot who pulled 9% of the vote. How many millions of dollars did Perot spend? The Greens beat the Libertarians (who were on 51 ballots — The Greens on 22 ballots) by 100,000 votes. The Republicans and Democrats spent millions over their legal campaign budget limit.

As a new party, The Green Party looks at the overall picture and takes pride in accomplishments that are won despite all odds. As the newcomers that has held its place as a major party for the second major election in a row, they have a lot to be thankful for. Their accomplishments are reflective of a growing discontent with the status quo among this country's con-

stituency. Big money doesn't have the buying power it used to and the '96 Green vote proved that.

Glencoe Post Office stamps 95th birthday

Happy Birthday Dear Glencoe
Happy Birthday to You

On Nov. 14 the Glencoe Post Office was all dolled up with colored streamers, whistles, hats, confetti and tinsel as Postmaster Della Bonnell sent out invitations to all patrons to come and help the Glencoe Post Office celebrate its 95th birthday.

Coffee, punch and muffins were served in place of champagne.

Jasper N. Coe, the first Glencoe postmaster, sold his first stamps on Nov. 14, 1901, there on his ranch; now the Bonnell ranch, just across from Saint Anne's Chapel.

Before the Glencoe Post Office, travelers would go to Fort Stanton and pick up the mail and bring it back to the Jasper Coe ranch, where the surrounding neighbors would pick up their mail.

Beginning in 1901, the postmasters were as follows: Frank Coe, Jan. 22, 1902; Ula Gilmore, Dec. 5, 1910; Ora G. Tully, Dec. 1, 1913; Wade King, 1938; Buck E. Noster, 1941; Gladys Noster, Nov. 21, 1949; and Della Bonnell, Feb. 20, 1982.

Feb. 20 is also Della's birthday. All told she has spent 18 years in the postal service, going

back to the days when she helped her parents, Leo and Louise Joiner, at the Hondo Post Office. With a laugh, Della says, "I was born in the post office."

The Hub of the Community

Della mentioned that a small rural post office can give the same services as those offered by a large post office, and in addition with a personal touch — that the rural post office is the hub of community life.

Local news is exchanged and special messages are delivered, received and sent out. In countless ways the local postmaster touches the lives of the patrons.

As an example, I usually call the post office to see what mail I have. On the 14th I did not call, and Della became worried, and called

around to find out if I was all right.

She called my across-the-creek neighbor, Gerry Tully, and Gerry said, "He's all right. I saw him down at his corral."

Many of the 6th-generation descendants of the early postmasters and their patrons receive their mail today at the Glencoe Post Office.

David Bonnell, Della's husband, is the great-grandson of Frank Coe, the second Glencoe postmaster.

And so each post office has a character all its own, and we look forward to the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Glencoe Post Office in 2001.

On behalf of its patrons and the community at large, we wish the Glencoe Post Office many happy returns of the day and all God's blessings.

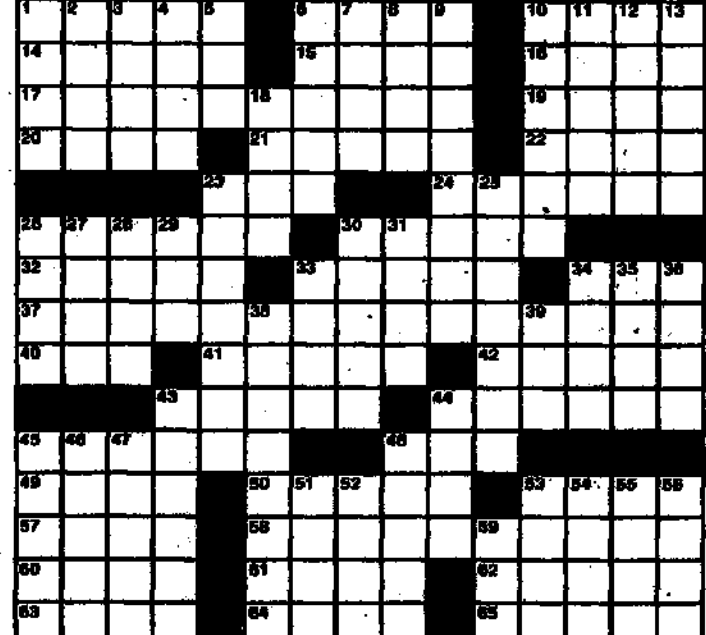

Federal Habitat Stamps Program helps Forest Service fund local improvements

The Forest Service is making great strides towards improving wildlife habitat thanks to the Habitat Stamp Program, officials say.

The Habitat Stamp Program funds improvements for wildlife every time sportsmen purchase a \$5 validation to hunt, fish or trap on Bureau of Land Management or U.S. Forest Service land. The habitat improvement projects are approved by a Citizen Review Committee in cooperation with the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish.

The Sikes crew, on the Smokey Bear Ranger District in Ruidoso, is funded by the Habitat Stamp Program as well as National Forest funds. It improves public land for game species such as mule deer, elk, antelope, turkey, dove, and

quail, just to name a few. Under the supervision of Wildlife Staff Officer Larry Cordova, the Sikes crew works from April through the fall or until inclement winter weather interferes with their project work.

The highest priority areas in need of improvement are the pinon-juniper woodlands. Over the years, pinon and juniper trees have crowded out valuable grasses, shrubs and other plants, causing erosion and deterioration of wildlife habitat, forest officials said.

In order to restore the habitat and increase forage production for wildlife, the Sikes crew does thinning and burning projects. These projects are done in phases. First, the trees are thinned to create fuels that will later carry a prescribed fire. Then, after a drying period of six months to a year, the area is

burned under carefully selected conditions. Fuel moisture, wind speed and humidity all play a key role in the success of a prescribed fire.

The results of the thinning and fire have been outstanding, forest officials said. The once dense, eroded, and non-productive pinon-juniper stands now produce a variety of plants attracting larger populations of big and small game, they reported. Other positive effects include reduced soil erosion and downstream sedimentation.

Other habitat improvement projects include the protection and improvement of riparian areas. A riparian area is a wetland, which could be a small spring, marsh, stream or other area of water. Fences are constructed around

riparian areas to only allow wildlife use. Trick tanks, or umbrella tanks, are constructed and installed in areas lacking year-round water. The tanks are used to increase big and small game populations and to spread the populations over a larger area.

Thanks to the work of the Sikes crew and the contributions made by hunters and fishermen to the Habitat Stamp program, wildlife use has increased dramatically, and the forest ecosystem is healthier, forest officials said. Populations of game have increased significantly in the areas treated by thinning and prescribed fire. The many benefits of the Habitat Stamp Program go beyond protecting wildlife, officials added; the whole ecosystem benefits.

Christmas tree permits available for Lincoln Forest

With the holidays just around the corner, the Lincoln National Forest is getting back into the Christmas tree permit program. From Nov. 4 through Dec. 24, permits may be purchased at all Lincoln National Forest offices. However, trees may not be harvested until Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 28.

Regular office hours are weekdays from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. In addition, the Sacramento Ranger District in Ruidoso is open from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Saturdays. The permits cost \$5, with over the counter or mail applications. Mail-in applications are available at all Lincoln National Forest offices; Chamber of Commerce offices in Ruidoso and elsewhere; and post offices in Alamogordo, Tularosa, and Carrizozo.

Maps and specific instructions are provided with each permit. Visitors are urged to call ahead for travel and weather conditions on the forest. No refunds can be given once a permit has been issued.

Police join in checkpoints to find lawbreakers

A consortium of local law enforcement agencies are teaming up again this year for a series of random checkpoints in southeastern New Mexico.

Law officers from the U.S. Forest Service, New Mexico Game and Fish, county sheriff's departments, and municipal and state departments will be conducting random checks for licenses, registration, proof of insurance, driving under the influence of alcohol, illegal removal of game and forest resources, and other violations.

"This year's checkpoints will be similar to those of the past," said Charles (Hoot) Murray, Forest Service law enforcement officer. "By teaming up we can be more effective and cover larger jurisdictional areas."

Murray said a particular enfor-

ment challenge this time of year is stopping the theft of forest products like fuel wood and signs from private and public lands.

"An estimated \$8 million worth of wood products are stolen from private lands in New Mexico every year. A state law requires individuals transporting these products to have either a receipt from a wood vendor, an official written consent form, proof of property ownership such as a tax receipt, or a permission statement from a property owner in their possession. This helps protect landowners from theft."

Prison officials mark inmate move to Fort Stanton

State Corrections Department officials are celebrating the government decision to temporarily use Fort Stanton as a minimum security women's prison.

They'll be entertaining employees, members of support groups for the fort and some local officials Friday at the historic fort.

About 80-100 minimum security women inmates are scheduled to stay at the fort for 16-20 months until a new prison is finished in Santa Fe. Those women are now housed at nearby Camp Sierra Blanca, but they must move out by Dec. 1 so the camp can be readied for juvenile offenders.

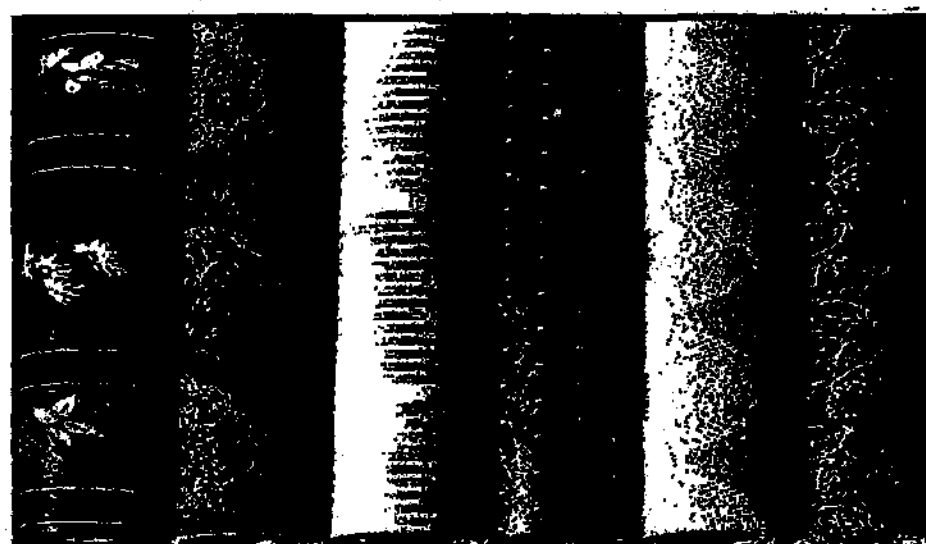

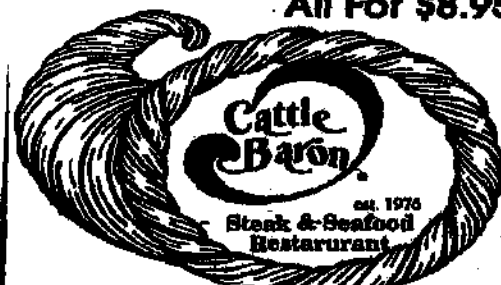

District struts its stuff for visitors

Ruidoso High School principal Ron Hodges wants to take accreditation officials to court — student court, that is, to show off a program that helps fulfill the district's Educational Plan for Student Success (EPSS).

The whole district is being evaluated this week by officials from the State Department of Education (SDE) and the North Central Association (NCA), an accrediting agency. These people are visiting every school site in Ruidoso throughout this week, interviewing students, parents, teachers and administrators to see how well Ruidoso is putting the EPSS into action.

This is the first time SDE and NCA have visited a school district at the same time to evaluate every school in the district, according to SDE team member Toni Trujillo. Ruidoso is also the first district in southern New Mexico to pursue district-wide NCA accreditation, NCA chairperson Kay Tenorio said.

The accreditation teams introduced themselves to school principals and other administrators at a meeting Monday, and they described the purpose of their visit.

Tenorio is here with a staff of 15 educators from southern New Mexico. SDE's assistant director of school program and professional development Michael Kaplan is here with five more specialists from Santa Fe.

The accreditation teams will review Ruidoso's curriculum and overall program, support services (such as nursing, counseling, and libraries), special education, vocational education, bilingual education, title programs, and management. At the end of the week, they will report the strengths and weaknesses they find in Ruidoso's school system.

"We'll be looking at strengths to build on, and if we identify something that needs modifying, it will be in light of the EPSS," Tenorio said.

Ruidoso's EPSS sets forth two main goals:

— caring for self and others;

— and developing strong communications skills.

In addition to meeting basic state requirements to operate a public school, the Ruidoso School District has chosen to go for an outcomes-based accreditation from NCA. Through the work of committees at all levels, the district developed a set of goals (the EPSS) that satisfies SDE requirements as well as NCA challenges.

Superintendent Mike Gladden asked each school principal to tell accreditation officials what's new, good and exciting at their schools. Nob Hill Early Childhood Center principal Roger Sowder invited officials to see the 8th Grade Buddies mentorship program in action and to attend a luncheon Nob Hill's parent council is giving the staff.

At Sierra Vista Primary, Danny Flores wants the team to visit during music class and to meet the school's new full-time guidance counselor. Holly Hawley is leading 13 counseling groups at Sierra Vista for problems like anger and divorce.

Frank Cannella, principal at White Mountain Elementary, wants visiting officials to see his young conflict mediators keeping peace on the playground.

White Mountain Intermediate principal Helene Kobelnyk said her school's Honors Discipline program and peer mediation have diminished discipline problems.

At Ruidoso Middle School, principal Sergio Castañon said RMS students who were part of a cultural exchange with Palomas, Mexico, could win an award for the project.

Ron Hodges also reported that fighting and suspensions at Ruidoso High School are considerably lower this year than in the past. Two new programs, Life Skills and Life Sports, give students personal tools and resources to continue learning beyond high school.

Accreditation team leaders said they are pleased to be in Ruidoso and look forward to visiting all the schools. Kay Tenorio and SDE team member Toni Trujillo said Ruidoso's school board is one of the best they know.

Parents tell it like it is

Parents and community members told accreditation officials what they like and don't like about the Ruidoso School District at a meeting in the high school cafeteria Monday evening.

After superintendent Mike Gladden and instructional support director Paul Wirth explained the Educational Plan for Student Success (EPSS), they asked for public comments on how well the schools are fulfilling two major goals:

— teaching children to care for themselves and others;

— and improving children's writing and technology skills.

The first parent to speak was the mother of a Sierra Vista Primary second grader. She said her son doesn't want to go to school because of fights, and other children pick on him.

The playground is supervised by a few parent volunteers, she said, who can't really keep an eye on 300 children. Her observation was seconded by another parent.

Two parents commended Ruidoso Middle School for offering so many ways to acknowledge students' academic achievements.

"It's wonderful to see the school board nod (in response), because some school boards don't have a clue," Tenorio said. "This board knows what's going on."

Nob Hill Early Childhood Center and Region IX were applauded by the mother of a 3-year-old developmentally delayed child. Having moved here from Dallas, the parent said her daughter didn't get half the attention in the city that she gets here.

School nurse Terrie Gillespie commended the district for supporting student health centers at the middle school and high school. A volunteer from Gavilan Canyon School thanked the board and community for supporting an alternative school in Ruidoso. She said the progress children make at Gavilan is amazing.

Parents had positive things to say about communications education in Ruidoso. One parent suggested that the district start teaching creative writing at the first grade and continue it consistently throughout the grades.

Another parent said White Mountain Elementary's writer's workshop is a great program. This method of teaching writing shows children how to brainstorm, create, and revise.

Accreditation officials will present their evaluation of the Ruidoso district at 10:30 a.m. Friday, Nov. 22 at the central office board room, 200 Horton Circle.

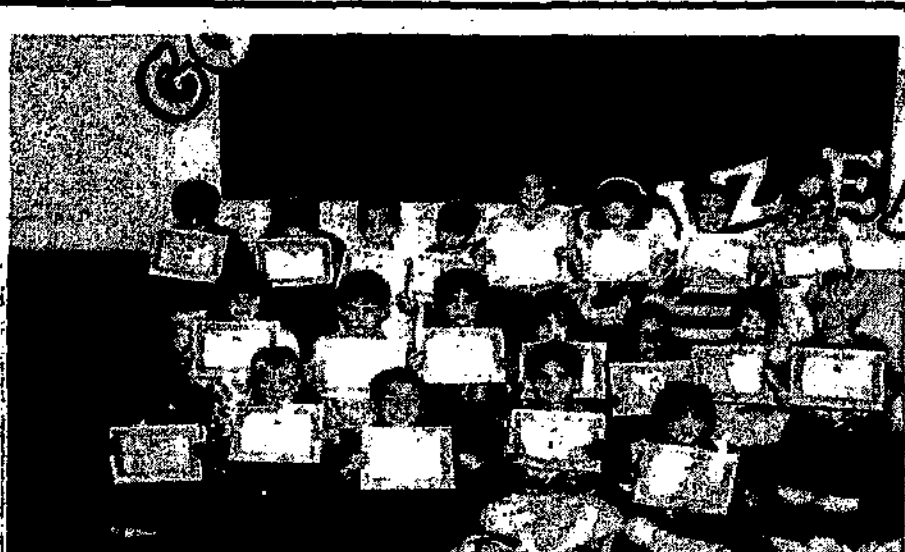

Schools call in their markers with state

New Mexico school districts are banding together in asking state legislators to put some money behind their statements that education is a legislative priority.

School administrators are passing resolutions and proclamations asking legislators to always consider the best interests of schoolchildren when passing laws and appropriating funds in the coming legislative session.

The Ruidoso School Board adopted a resolution to that effect at its Nov. 12 regular meeting.

All 89 districts in New Mexico intend a show of solidarity in their request for the Legislature's devotion. This is the second year the

schools have attempted a unified solicitation. Last year, though, not all the resolutions reached Santa Fe before the beginning of the legislative session.

"We're trying to get a jump on things this year so all 89 districts get in," said Ruidoso superintendent Mike Gladden.

The resolution asks that the state's 320,000 schoolchildren be the top priority for the governor and lawmakers. It also reminds Governor Gary Johnson of his commitment to education in New Mexico and calls for him to back it up with actions.

"The number of public education students and the cost of supporting public education for the 1997-98 school year are expected to grow,"

the resolution states in part.

"Now therefore be it resolved, that the New Mexico Legislature is encouraged to appropriate funds and the Governor is encouraged to sign legislation allocating the funds necessary to properly educate the public education students of the State of New Mexico," the resolution concludes.

In other action at the Nov. 12 meeting, the board proclaimed a Feb. 4 election to Positions #4 and #5 on the school board. Terms have expired for Jim Varnadore (vice president) and James Paxton (president), both of whom are running for re-election.

Anyone wishing to run for the school board election must file a

declaration of candidacy in county court on Tuesday, Dec. 17. All candidates must reside within the Ruidoso School District.

Third-grade teacher Alice Payne is retiring in January. The school board accepted her resignation last week.

The board approved the hiring of Kim Gibson to teach fifth and sixth grades at White Mountain Intermediate (WMI). With 206 fifth-graders and 174 sixth-graders, WMI had 54 more students this year than it had last year. Gibson's dual role will handle the overflow.

The board also approved the hiring of a new elementary bilingual teacher. Melvina Torres is filling the job left vacant by Molly Long.

THE WHY

One thing teens don't need is media pressure toward the pursuit of the perfect, thin body

It seems today that everywhere you look, on television and in magazines, you see specials and articles about how big the problem of eating disorders is getting, that it's plaguing America.

We're told about teenage girls and boys who are so burdened by their weight that they risk their lives to conform to the standards set by the modeling and movie industries. State warns Hondo to work harder at keeping standards

The Hondo School Board got a mild warning from a State Department of Education official and the board's own attorney Monday to mind its P's and Q's in order to keep a good accreditation status.

Department of Education official Sally Rynott and Hondo Schools attorney Frank Albetta traveled from Santa Fe to attend the Monday night school board meeting in Hondo.

Rynott will report to accreditation officer Toni Trujillo that the Hondo board has begun complying with state regulations, she said. At a Nov. 9 work session, it created a procedure for evaluating the superintendent. It is also addressing the problem of board absenteeism.

"I'm pleased that we have initiated these actions," Rynott said.

Rynott was especially concerned that school policy might continue to be developed without the input of the whole board, since it's not unusual for the board to be short one member at any given meeting. She also made it clear that board members are expected to attend training seminars that teach people how to be good board members.

Albetta agreed with Rynott that board members need to strengthen

their skills.

"Nobody's born knowing how to be a board member," Albetta said. "Trained and experienced board members are an asset to the community."

Albetta especially wants to see a more unified board, with everyone attending meetings, because of a lawsuit filed by fired business manager Abdel Ibrahim.

"Board participation is never more important than during litigation," Albetta said. "I strongly urge you to turn up your participation a notch if you can."

Though the board has seldom lacked a quorum at meetings, business is often postponed, Albetta said. He and Rynott are concerned that issues in the accreditation report are not being dealt with promptly.

Rynott also brought up the issue of board member residency, specifically the possibility that Jimmy Montoya does not live within the Hondo district. Montoya will work with Albetta to resolve this question.

"Statutory language requires residency of all board members," Rynott said.

Other action

With all members present, the

Hondo School Board voted to change its regular meetings from the 3rd Monday of each month to the 3rd Tuesday.

This should reduce the amount of absenteeism since one or two members have conflicts with the Monday schedule, said board president Victoria Sanchez.

The next regular board meeting will take place at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 17 in the library at Hondo Valley Schools.

The board approved the hiring of a new business manager to replace Abdel Ibrahim, whom they fired officially as of Nov. 15. Shirley Box, formerly the counseling office secretary at Goddard High School in Roswell, starts officially on Dec. 2. Box has some accounting experience.

Superintendent Barbara Casey said the hiring committee chose Box because she has worked with confidential records and they feel they can trust her. The hiring committee was school secretary Leslie Osborne, high school principal Sam Witt, elementary principal Omar Barragan, and high school counselor Jack Nelson.

Box will receive job training through Cooperative Educational Services in Albuquerque.

Fired employee waives hearing

Abdel Ibrahim, former business manager for Hondo Valley Schools, has decided to skip his termination hearing and move straight to suing the school board and superintendent for wrongful termination.

The board scheduled a hearing for Nov. 15, two weeks after Ibrahim said it should have taken place, but Ibrahim declined to take the hearing venue.

"We didn't feel he was entitled to it because he was not a certified employee, therefore they could not compel us to go through a system we didn't want to go through," said Ibrahim's attorney, Richard Hawthorne of Ruidoso.

Ibrahim instead filed a wrongful termination complaint in Lincoln

County's 12th Judicial District Court on Nov. 1. The school's attorney, Frank Albetta of Santa Fe, called Ibrahim's action a legal maneuver to avoid the termination hearing.

The board didn't schedule a hearing until Nov. 15 because schools Superintendent Barbara Casey continued to find new reasons for firing Ibrahim, the school's attorney Albetta said.

Hawthorne and Albetta agreed that since Ibrahim is a non-certified employee, he doesn't have to have a termination hearing if he doesn't want to. Ibrahim's lawsuit is based on the terms of his contract, which states he cannot be terminated except for just cause, Hawthorne said.

As of Nov. 15, Ibrahim was offi-

cially fired from his job as Hondo Schools business manager, transportation manager, and acting superintendent, said superintendent Barbara Casey.

The Hondo School Board first issued a termination notice to Ibrahim on Sept. 26, when it voted unanimously to fire him.

Casey and Ibrahim have accused each other of mismanaging the school district's money, but neither have made specific allegations of this mismanagement public.

Ibrahim is also involved in a separate criminal case with Casey's husband Frank. After a confrontation at Ibrahim's home, Ibrahim filed criminal trespass and battery charges against Frank Casey, and Casey filed a battery charge against Ibrahim. A Nov. 21 hearing is scheduled for both sides.

Cameras make bus rides better

It's amazing how one little surveillance camera can change a problem child into, well, less of a problem child.

Matt Bryant, transportation contractor for Ruidoso Municipal Schools, reported at the Nov. 12 school board meeting that the new cameras installed aboard school buses are already reducing the amount of discipline problems drivers must deal with.

Bryant showed the board a tape of one morning's bus ride, revealing typical school-bus silliness but no

major incidents.

This particular bus has a history of serious discipline problems, including graffiti, smoking, and alcohol consumption. Bryant was hoping to demonstrate the camera's effectiveness by catching some of that on film. Drivers who are having specific problems with students on the bus can ask that one of the contractor's two cameras be used on the route.

Of course, Bryant was glad that the threat of having one's actions caught on film was keeping students in line on this bus.

"This bus driver was ready to

quit," Bryant said. "We put in the box, and he said the difference was like night and day."

All of Ruidoso's school buses are now equipped with a camera box, though only two buses actually carry a camera at any given time. The boxes are rigged so that a small red light signals recording even when no camera is inside, and on an empty box a picture of a camera fills the window to fool anyone who tries to peek through.

Neither drivers nor students know which bus carries a camera on a given day.

Adopting from a shelter during the holidays may sounds like a warm and fuzzy idea, but it can be a traumatic experience for an animal.

Even animals already part of a family may find the holidays a strain.

The Humane Society of the United States offered a few tips to ensure a smoother celebration for both pets and owners:

— don't give pets as gifts.

Adopting an animal should involve a long-term emotional and financial commitment and the decision should come from the new owner. If someone is thinking about animal adoption, books and videos about animals and animal care are great presents.

The Humane Society of Lincoln County sells gift certificates for pet adoptions, which allow people the chance to wait until the right animal comes along. Prospective owners are welcome to visit the shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road and get acquainted with animals in a new outdoor pen.

— wait until, after the hectic holiday season is over before selecting an animal, or before bringing it home.

A new pet requires a great deal of attention and isn't likely to receive it with everything else going on at this time of year.

— be aware of special hazards some holiday decorations can pose to pets. Holly and mistletoe can be poisonous to animals. Garland, tinsel, glass ornaments and dangling electrical cords can be dangerous, even fatal, if eaten or chewed.

Burning candles can start fires, if pets upset them. Aspirin should not be used as a preservative in Christmas tree water, because it can be fatal to cats who might drink the water.

— be careful about sharing your holiday treats with pets.

Too much "people food" can make your pet sick, especially if it is not used to rich foods.

Bones from holiday leftovers can splinter and choke your pet and chocolate can be toxic to both dogs and cats.

— Don't insist that your pet attend your holiday party,

Most dogs and cats don't enjoy the disruption of their routine. It's better to give your pet a quiet room, away from the noise and strangers and unsupervised treat consumption.

— keep a collar and identification tag on your pet during the holidays when visitors increase the chances of a door being left open.

— give your pet the best gift, neutering, to end pet overpopulation. Choose toys and treats that are safe for pets.

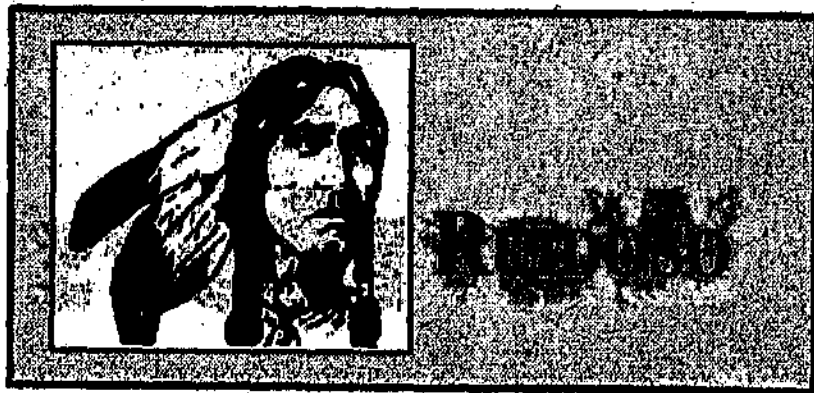

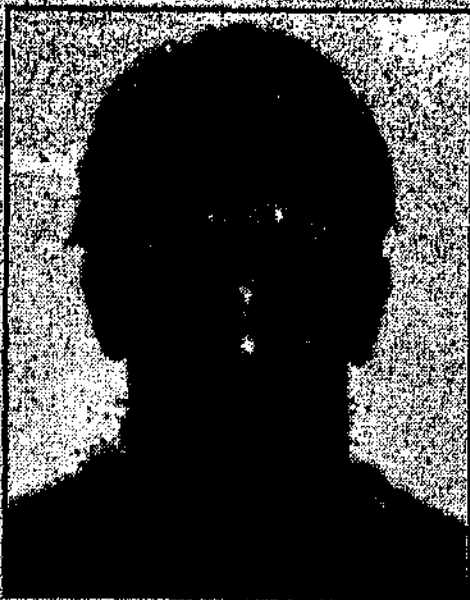

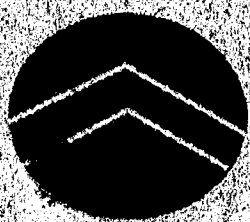

Ruidoso rallies, then holds on

Warriors withstand last-minute Cardinal drive to earn shot at No. 1-ranked Artesia

Time was an accomplice Saturday for the Ruidoso Warriors, who stole a Class AAA preplayoff football victory from visiting Las Vegas Robertson, 15-14.

"Someone had to end up with heartbreak, and it happened to be us," said a saddened Robertson coach Art Abreu, while comforting his teary-eyed son. "We needed five more seconds."

What the Cardinals really needed was a timeout. But they had none, and on fourth-and-goal from the Ruidoso half-yard line, Robertson saw its hopes to score the winning touchdown expire with the game clock.

Robertson nearly accomplished the improbable. The Cardinals, trailing 15-14 with 1:46 left in the game, took the ball from their own 2-yard line and drove it to the Ruidoso 5-yard line in just three plays. Senior quarterback Eric Garcia hooked up with receivers Niel Kueffer and Leonard Lucero for a pair of 40-plus yard catches.

With 44 seconds on the clock, the ball resting on the Warriors' five and the state's best rusher, Edmund Ekeoha, in the backfield, it seemed the Cardinals would pull out the win.

The ball was on the far-right hash mark, making it a tough angle to kick a field goal even if the quarterback had spiked the ball.

But Ekeoha had found plenty of daylight against the Warrior defense that afternoon, rushing for 126 yards. He did again on first-and-goal, driving to the 1-yard line. On the next play, senior defensive back Billy Rogge

knifed through the line and dropped Ekeoha for a two-yard loss.

Robertson was unable to stop the clock, and tried yet another running play. Ruidoso's defense held again, and this time Ekeoha's effort fell a half-yard short. The Cardinals desperately tried to line up for another play. QB Garcia attempted a pass to the far sideline, but it fell incomplete and the clock ran out, prompting a Ruidoso celebration.

Some Warriors hugged each other, while other Ruidoso players laid on the ground in disbelief. The dismayed Cardinals despondently stared at the Ruidoso celebrants.

"Just another day at the office, right?" deadpanned a relieved Ruidoso head coach Les Carter in between handing out hugs and words of encouragement to his Warriors.

But another day like Saturday could make an old man out of the third-year head coach sooner than he'd like.

The Warriors nearly self-destructed in the first half. Ruidoso coughed up the ball three times — one of which was returned for Robertson's first touchdown. Whenever the Warrior offense got started, a turnover or a Robertson defensive stand would put a halt to Ruidoso's progress.

Defense kept the Warriors in the ballgame. In the first quarter alone, the Cardinals drove into Ruidoso territory three times, but all three times, the Ruidoso defense held on fourth down.

Robertson went ahead 14-0 on Ekeoha's 10-yard scamper with 3:56 left in the half.

The Warriors responded with their best drive of the half. Senior quarterback Pascal Enjady, in for the injured Corey Saenz, drove Ruidoso to the Robertson 14-yard line. But the Warriors' third fumble of the half ended that threat.

A different Ruidoso team took the field for the second half. The Warriors

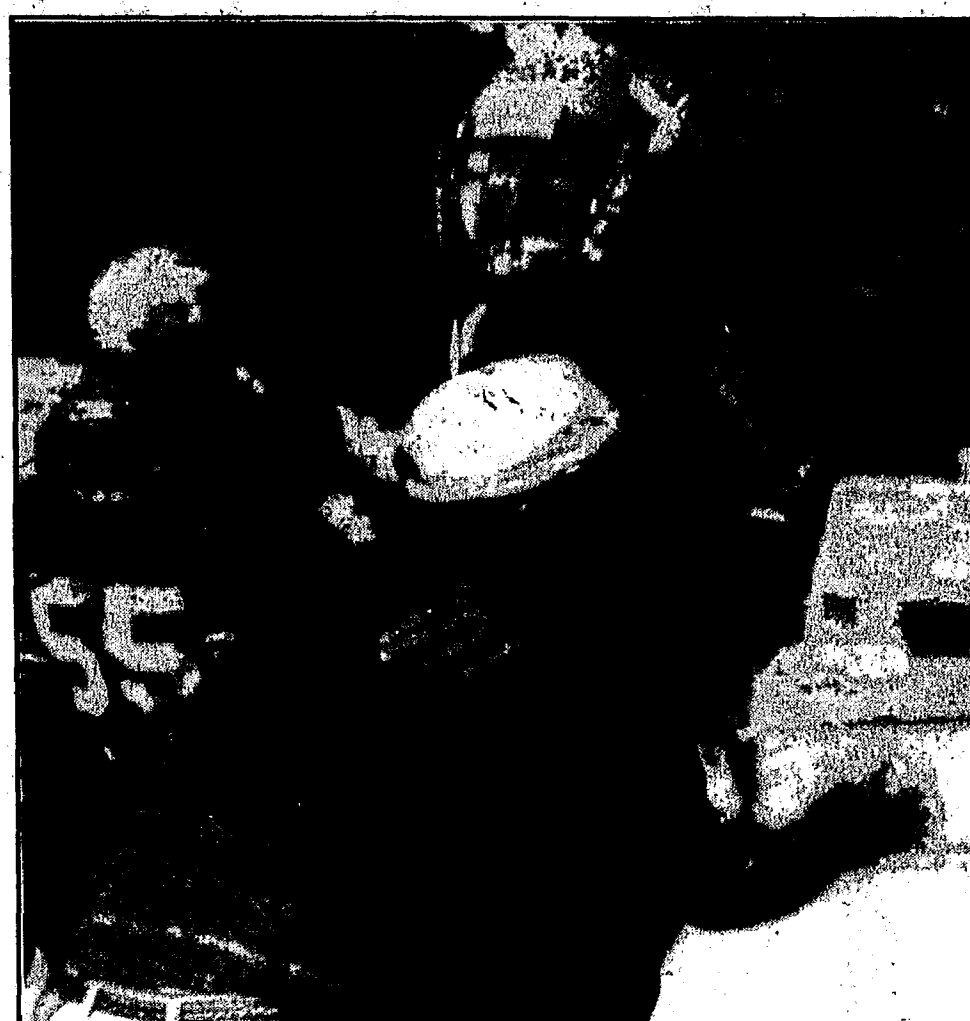

appeared fired up, raring to go.

"I just told them that we had a half left to play and they just had to do it," Carter recalled of his halftime speech to the Warriors. "We weren't going to try anything fancy."

What Ruidoso needed was something — anything — to change the tide of momentum, which was firmly in the Robertson camp.

Kicker Jimmy Stover started it with his perfectly placed pooch kick to start the second half. Senior Billy Rogge sacrificed his body to keep the ball in play, and junior linebacker Arthur Miller fell on the loose ball for the Warrior recovery.

Both coaches agreed that play turned "Big Mo" to Ruidoso.

"That changed the course of the game. We knew it was coming and someone made a great play," Abreu said.

Four plays later, sophomore Adrian Herrera scored Ruidoso's first touchdown of the afternoon, a 1-yard run.

On their ensuing possession, the Cardinals looked like they would answer Ruidoso's score. Robertson drove to the Warrior 36-yard line, but a fumble ended that threat. Enjady recovered the pigskin for the Warriors.

Ruidoso then launched a drive that set the tone for the rest of the game. Starting from their own 39, the Warriors methodically ran the ball down the Cardinals' throats. Senior back Arthur Rojas carried the load for RHS, rushing six times for 28 yards. On fourth down from the 3-yard line, Enjady rolled out and found a wide-open Rojas for a touchdown strike. That capped off a 15-play drive, consuming more than seven minutes.

The Warriors faked the point after and Enjady found Erik Padilla in the endzone for the two-point conversion, putting the Warriors ahead 15-14.

"We didn't see them do anything on the backside for the two-point conversion, so that's where we went," Carter said.

Robertson couldn't muster anything on offense after the Ruidoso kickoff.

The Warriors got the ball back, and that's when their offense became the best defense against Robertson. Ruidoso held the ball from the 10:40 mark of the fourth quarter until 1:54 remained in the game.

"We couldn't get that ball back," Abreu said.

When they did, the Cardinals had 1:44 on the clock and 97 yards to go.

Robertson covered 96.5 yards in that little amount of time, but it wasn't enough.

"We just have to stop them, that's all we talked about in the huddle," said Enjady, who prevented Ekeoha from scoring on third down.

That, and have time on your side.

Drag racing club concludes second successful season

The sensation of power and acceleration binds Morris Calkins to drag racing as much today at age 59 as it did when he was a young man.

Reaching speeds of more than 140 miles per hour, racers fly down the track at the Carrizozo Airport once a month, clipping off a quarter mile in a little more than nine seconds.

The Drag Club headed by Calkins has staged drag races at the airport for the past two years, once a month on Sunday. Members won approval last week for a third year at the airport, but only with a tie-breaking vote by Mayor Cecilia Kuhnel.

Two trustees argued against renewal of the contract. Drag racing is inappropriate at the airport and the club should find a permanent site elsewhere, they said. Supporters say the races don't harm

the airport and they bring business to restaurants and motels in the small community about 35 miles northwest of Ruidoso.

"The motion was to allow The Drag Club to renew its contract with the understanding that there was a 30-day termination clause in the agreement," Kuhnel said Monday. "I broke the tie with the full knowledge that we had that clause. Let's say if the FAA (Federal Aviation Administration) came in or the state indicated grant money was in jeopardy, we have the freedom to do that (cancel)."

The contract includes a payment for use of the runway based on how much the group collects in entry and concession fees, she said.

In 1995, the club paid the village \$1,002.11 from gate receipts and \$34.39 from concessions. This year, the club didn't collect enough to meet the fee

threshold, but donated \$1,000 to the village.

Trustee Ilene Loveless voted against the 1997 agreement. The previous two years when she voted for the contract, she urged the club to find a different and permanent site, because it couldn't use the airport indefinitely.

"It came up for renewal again and I felt it's been two years, nothing has been done," Loveless said, adding that drag racing isn't an appropriate use of an airport runway.

"We're trying to sign a contract with an airport manager and airport managers are not in favor of drag races, because the FAA isn't."

"We'd love a new permanent site," Calkins said. "We're trying to work with Sertoma in Tularosa to build a permanent one, but it will take a few hundred thousand dollars and that takes time to raise."

"When we raced at Holloman (Air Force Base south of Alamogordo), we made pretty good money, but at Carrizozo, it's a break-even deal. We're lucky if we don't go into the hole."

A racetrack must be 3,800 feet long, he said. Property is available at the Sertoma site where the Tularosa organization already operates a round track and motorcross, but those activities don't require pavement like drag racing. Calkins said, adding, "It's like we've got a wallet and no money."

At Carrizozo, club members have to set up the track each month with lights and lanes.

"At a permanent site, we could be ready in a half hour," said Calkins, who worked as a track official from 1970 to 1990 for American Hot Rod and helped write rule books.

The village also has received complaints about nuts and bolts left on the

runway and reports about drinking at events, Loveless said.

"Trustee Loveless says we're abusing the airport, but we're not," said club secretary Gordon King of Alamogordo. "We're putting black marks on the pavement, that's for certain, but it's not detrimental to the surface. She also says we did some unacceptable repair work. What we did was cut out old cracks filled with a soft asphalt material and replaced it with good solid concrete. We actually improved the situation and made it better."

No complaints have been received from residents by the Carrizozo Police Department about the races at the airport on the western edge of the town, a spokesman said. One complaint was called in anonymously Sunday to the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office when
