Three of four fort lease proposals tossed out by state

Three of the four proposals to lease Fort Stanton were tossed out Thursday by the state selection committee.

Carolyn Jackson, spokesperson for the state General Services Department, said she could not reveal which proposal still is under consideration, when a final decision will come, or how the three rejected proposals did not follow the guidelines of the request for proposals.

The deadline for choosing the winning bid was today.

"At this point, we're getting further clarification from the one still being considered," Jackson said. "We're trying to get the best possible tenant for the fort."

Proposals were submitted by groups hoping to use the fort for juvenile rehabilitation, housing for homeless veterans, military retirement, and residential treatment for emotionally-disturbed juveniles.

Eight gambling bills to Senate

Eight gambling-related bills were outlined to the New Mexico Senate Thursday. Wednesday was the deadline to submit legislative bills.

The eight bills include:

— Senate Bill 380, which would legalize video gaming at racetracks, charity and fraternal clubs and licensed liquor establishments;

— SB 381, legalizing video gaming at racetracks;

— SB 418, which legalizes video gaming at tracks and charitable and fraternal clubs, and ratifies Indian gaming compacts;

— SB 606 allows video gaming at fraternal and veterans clubs;

— SB 607 allows any 501C, non-profit group to have video gaming;

— SB 701 redraws present compacts to raise age limits, etc.;

— SB 710, known as a status quo bill, halts all gaming for one year at the level dictated by the courts so a task force can come up with a plan;

— and SB 806 proposes a joint venture between Indian tribes and the state.

About three or four other bills have yet to be discussed.

Ruidoso School District seeks tax renewal Tuesday

Voters will decide Tuesday whether to continue the two-mill tax levy for the Ruidoso Municipal School District.

The Public School Capital Improvements Act Levy must be renewed by Ruidoso voters every three years. Since 1974, when the act was originally implemented statewide, the Ruidoso School District's tax has been approved by voters in all seven elections.

At the last two-mill levy election in February 1993, only 10% of those eligible voted. Of the 4,094 registered voters, only 388 people marked their ballots. There were 298 voters for the mill levy and 90 against.

For this election 5,460 people are registered, County Clerk Martha Proctor said.

A person with a \$60,000 home with a taxable value of \$20,000

now pays \$40 a year for Ruidoso's mill levy, and that number would remain constant if the mill levy is renewed Tuesday by voters (in New Mexico, property is taxed on one-third of market value).

The Ruidoso Municipal School District receives money from the state government, but the two-mill levy is still vital to the school system, district business manager Caron Snow said.

House Bill Two contains school district educational funding and includes money for salaries, benefits, services, supplies, textbooks and utilities, Snow explained.

"That's distributed through the public school funding formula and becomes the operational fund," she said.

"The level of funding that school districts now receive (from the state) is much lower than it used to be," Snow added.

"Districts are leaning on capital improvements money (through local mill levies) much more than before."

Besides direct state funding, the school gets money through bonds, grants, an occasional special appropriation from the state legislature, and the two-mill levy.

Without the two-mill levy, the district would be forced to use state money meant for operations for capital improvements instead, she said.

"There would be less for salaries, benefits, classroom supplies and so on," Snow said. "I don't know what we'd do without the levy."

Ruidoso's two-mill levy revenue translated into about \$428 per student during the last three years, school district officials said.

Extortion and intimidation of witness charged

After listening to evidence for 1.5 days, a Lincoln County grand jury Wednesday returned four indictments against Sheriff's Deputy Angelo Vega.

The deputy, who has worked in law enforcement since December 1991, was indicted on two counts of extortion (third-degree felony) and two counts of intimidating a witness (fourth-degree felony). He faces a maximum nine years in prison and \$20,000 in fines, without aggravating circumstances.

Vega has been put on administrative leave with pay pending the outcome of the trial, according to a prepared statement issued by Sheriff James McSwane. Vega could not be reached for comment.

Two prosecutors from the office of New Mexico Attorney General Tom Udall presented the evidence to the grand jury in response to a request from District Attorney Bert Atkins, who employs McSwane's wife as a secretary and handles the sheriff's criminal cases in court.

Udall's office also will prosecute the case against Vega, said spokesman Kay Roybal, to avoid any appearance of conflict of interest on the part of the district attorney's office.

The five-page indictment states that on Sept. 28, 1995, Vega threatened Shelley Woods, 38, and Molly McBrinn Foster, 40, with prosecution of "meritless criminal charges with the intent to wrongfully compel (the women) to do an act against (their) will" as undercover narcotics informants.

Vega also pushed the women to sign an apology to the detention center administrator and sheriff's office saying they had been appropriately arrested, the indictment said. The move was an apparent attempt to prevent them from suing the county for wrongful arrest, according to court documents.

The indictment states Vega

knew that paperwork authorizing the dismissal of the charges against the two women was being prepared.

The women spent more than 24 hours in jail after being arrested Sept. 27 and jailed on a \$10,000 bond for invalid criminal charges filed by the sheriff's office, according to the indictment.

They were arrested for trying to smuggle contraband into the jail. At the time, Vega said the substance was suspected to be marijuana. It later was confirmed to be tobacco.

The indictment says Vega knew the two women were unaware of the court and district attorney decisions to dismiss the cases against them. Instead of informing the women, Vega threatened that unless they cooperated with authorities by working as narcotics informants, the pending cases against them would be prosecuted.

Attorney Gary Mitchell, who represents Foster, wrote a letter to the county commission in October about the alleged actions of Vega and possible involvement of Sheriff McSwane. One of the women said the sheriff questioned her about possible involvement in illegal drugs by county commissioners.

Vega was hired to work in the county detention center in December 1991, but soon moved into the position of animal control officer with the sheriff's office. He was promoted to a regular deputy and acted as head of a local narcotics investigation task force for one year until the task force was downsized and employees were forced into contract labor. Vega then moved back into the position of deputy.

An agent with the New Mexico State Police in Clovis headed the pre-grand jury investigation, within the parameters outlined by Atkins.

No date has been set for Vega's arraignment or trial, Roybal said.

Vega's will be the only case this grand jury hears.

"The grand jury must be disbanded because the attorney general requested (the grand jury) only for this very limited purpose," said 12th Judicial District Judge Richard A. Parsons.

Campos introduces legislative bill to fund Ruidoso projects

Sewer lines, youth center, pool would be funded

State Sen. Pete Campos has introduced legislation that would provide \$1 million through severance tax bonds for water distribution and wastewater system improvements in Ruidoso, \$534,000 to extend sewer lines in the Las Lomas subdivision in Ruidoso, and \$250,000 for a youth center and swimming pool for the village.

The legislation must first go through two hearings in committee and be reported out favorably before it comes to a vote in the Senate

and House.

The Las Lomas sewer line bonding measure, known as Senate Bill 312, must also gain approval from the department of the environment to certify the need for the project, the bill says.

That bill sets the end of fiscal year 1998 as the deadline to accomplish the project, or the authorization will be void.

In SB 314, the \$1 million for water and wastewater lines in the village must also be approved by the environment department before the bonds can be issued.

The finance and administration department must approve the money for the youth center and pool before it can be allocated, SB 314 says.

Ruidoso Downs listed as fastest-growing N.M. town

The Village of Ruidoso Downs is the fastest growing municipality in New Mexico, according to the most recent U.S. Census Bureau figures.

Almost 80% of New Mexico's 99 incorporated municipalities increased in population between the 1990 and the 1994 census.

Ruidoso Downs has grown from 920 people in 1990 to 1,300 people in 1994, a 41.3% increase.

"I think that we have a lot more civic pride now than we did four years ago," Village of Ruidoso Downs Mayor Joe Hayhurst said. "We have encouraged village clean-ups and it's exciting to be the fastest growing community in the state."

Population in Ruidoso also expanded. The population in 1990 was 4,600 but by 1994 that figure rose 19.8% to 5,502, an increase of 902 people.

"Personally, I think Ruidoso is just a neat place to be," Executive Secretary/Deputy Clerk Mary Maxwell responded when quizzed as to why people were moving into the region. "Blame it on the chamber of commerce for doing such a great job of

promoting the area."

Many people move to Ruidoso from other states because the cost of living is low compared to other parts of the country, Maxwell said.

"We are a fairly untouched mountain town with beautiful scenery," she said. "The weather is not too hot or too cold and it's a quite desirable place to live."

Other census figures show:

- Carrizozo — down 1.42% from 1,075 to 1,060;
- Capitan — up 24.70% from 842 to 1,052;
- Corona — down 21.86% from 215 to 168.
- New Mexico's population rose 1.8%, or 30,000, from 1.51 million to 1.69 million, ranking it as 36th in population nationally.

Track owners face criticism over bill

Some senators suggest track owners are trying to get a tax break with the legislation

Racetrack owners came in for some criticism during a marathon session of the Senate's Committee of the Whole Wednesday night.

Tracks were accused of trying to get out of paying existing taxes through Senate Bill 381, which they support.

The Senate adjourned its regular session about 3:30 p.m. and came back an hour later as a rare Committee of the Whole to hear testimony from more than 90 scheduled witnesses on the gambling question.

The committee heard from Indian leaders, gambling opponents, bowling alley operators, charitable organizations, restaurant and liquor establishments and members of the horse racing industry.

Mike Weatherly, president of the Horsemen's Association, testified on the need for video gaming machines at racetracks and the need for Off Track Betting (OTB).

"We want to see that the money goes to the horsemen and the breeders, not the tracks. They (track owners) are riding on your backs."

State Sen. Michael Sanchez questioned Weatherly about an accusation made Monday by Sen. John Arthur Smith, chairman of the Senate Select Gaming Committee. Smith questioned SB381 introduced on behalf of the Horsemen's Association, claiming it gave a tax break to racetracks the way it was written.

"I give you my personal assurance that won't happen," Weatherly responded Wednesday

on the tax break question. Under SB381, 10% of the "drop" on the electronic gaming machines would go to the state. The "drop" is equal to all money wagered minus all money paid in prizes. The 10% would cover the track's bill for gross receipts taxes owed the state, as well as contributions to programs to help problem gamblers.

"The balance," the legislation says, "shall be paid in lieu of all other taxes, including but not limited to income taxes."

Smith was concerned Monday that with SB381, tracks would pay the 10% drop on the machines, but no other taxes, either on machine income or income from their racing and concession operations.

"We're not asking for any tax break," Weatherly said during testimony Wednesday night.

He assured Sanchez the language of the bill would be changed if it appeared to give such breaks.

Racetrack lobbyist Robert Rivera also said earlier there was absolutely no intent to give a tax break to the racing industry.

"If the language is wrong, that will be fixed," Rivera said.

During the Wednesday night session, Sanchez accused racetrack owners of taking advantage of the situation and the horsemen.

"We want to see that the money goes to the horsemen and the breeders, not the tracks," Sanchez said. "They (track owners) are riding on your backs."

SB381 offers 25% of the drop to horsemen and breeders, with 4.8% to the breeders the balance to the horsemen.


The Senate was scheduled to hear even more testimony on the gambling subject, and then take the matter under consideration before acting.

As of Thursday, about a half-dozen bills concerned with legalizing video gambling or ratifying the Indian gaming compacts were on the Senate table.

Observers feel that if a gambling bill is passed, it may be an amalgamation of several bills.

On Tuesday, the Horsemen's Association began an advertising blitz, taking out full-page ads in the state's two biggest morning newspapers (The Albuquerque Journal and The Santa Fe New Mexican) and running ads on television touting the economic aspects of horse racing.

The ads say horse racing provides 10,000 jobs and puts \$175 million into the New Mexico economy.



Ruidoso tax revenues drop strangely

The first 11 months of Ruidoso's 1995 gross receipts tax collections are lower than previous years, prompting officials to forecast a zero-growth budget in 1996-97.

Village Manager Gary Jackson and finance director Lee Ann Nichols described 1995 tax revenues as erratic when reviewing the 1995-96 second-quarter budget (October-December 1995) with village councilors Tuesday night.

The gross receipts tax, collected monthly via retail sales, funds 60% of Ruidoso's budget. It pays for operations, capital purchases and bonded debt.

Past gross receipts tax collections in the 1990s increased an average of 10% to 15% over the previous year, setting a growth trend budget planners were able to track. But in 1995, tax collections only increased by 4.53%, Jackson said.

"We're seeing real anomalies each month," Jackson said, starting with May 1995.

May 1994 collections were up 15% over 1993, but May 1995 collections dropped 18% compared to May 1994.

But then June 1995 collections jumped 32% over June 1994, fol-

lowed by a 2% drop in July 1995 compared to July 1994, Nichols said.

The erratic numbers could be caused by inaccurate reports from the state government, Nichols speculated, such as cutting off May's numbers too early.

The state government collects the 6.8125% gross receipts tax each month from stores, then returns the village's share of 1.225% two

months later.

Another element that could be affecting numbers is a change in where taxes from real estate sales are sent. Until July 1995, those taxes went to the village where the real estate company held a business license, so taxes from the sales of many properties outside village limits came to Ruidoso. But since August, those taxes now go to the community where the sale took

place.

Village department heads are being asked to keep 1996-97 requests within 0%-3% of their 1995-96 budgets. Deadline for their 1996-97 budget requests is Feb. 16.

After department heads meet with Jackson, they'll hold a series of budget workshops with village councilors, tentatively on April 22-30, Nichols said.

Village prepared for tax drop

Despite recent erratic month-to-month gross receipts tax collections Ruidoso's government is still in good financial shape, said Village Manager Gary Jackson said.

Before the 1995-96 budget year began in July, officials conservatively budgeted a 2% increase in gross receipts taxes. Then in September, departments were asked to hold off on capital purchases.

Therefore, mid-year general fund revenues are at 47% of the annual budget, while expenditures are at 40%, he said.

Various economic trends emerging the past two years prompted

that conservative planning, he said: — a softening in the national retail market;

— the devaluation of the Mexican peso;

— the unknown impact expanded gaming would have on retail sales in Ruidoso;

— possible relocation of Ruidoso's Wal-Mart to Ruidoso Downs;

— uncertainty about whether Ruidoso Downs Race Track would close, and if it didn't, how long its season would run.

"This all has certainly affected receipts," Jackson told councilors

Tuesday. "Next year, I think we'll be facing the same issues."

"The reality is, I can't tell you in May what will happen in May."

Gross receipts tax revenues are paying for the principal and interest on about \$3 million worth of bonded debt this year — debt the village is committed to paying off on time. Overall, the village has about \$12 million in outstanding bonded debt.

By postponing some capital purchases, the village is able to tighten its fiscal belt without cutting jobs, Jackson said.

Task force warns of crumbling roads

Lincoln County and its five municipalities could collect \$2.6 million for local roadwork if the state Legislature and the governor follow the recommendations of a citizens task force.

The group is urging the state to issue \$1.2 billion worth of bonds to inject some cash into New Mexico's deteriorating roads.

State Rep. Lorenzo Larranga (R-Bernalillo) has introduced a bill that should accomplish that goal, based on funding recommendations from the task force.

State Rep. Ben Lujan (D-Santa Fe) introduced a bill Monday that sets its sights a bit lower. House Bill 531 would authorize up to \$250 million of extra bonding authority for highway improvement projects. The money would be earmarked for four-lane expansions on highly-traveled two-lane routes. About \$160 million in five-year bonds could be issued by pledging four cents of gas tax.

HB531 also would allow Gov. Gary Johnson to impose a one or two-cent highway bonding gasoline tax for more projects up to the \$250 million total.

Highways in the state are in critical condition, according to a report released by the Governor's Citizens Highway Assessment Task Force (CHAT). Information from that report was reviewed in the December edition of Traffic Safety Newsletter published by the New Mexico Traffic Safety Bureau and the Institute of Public Law of the University of New Mexico.

Without an immediate infusion of money into the state's highway systems, safety and economic development will suffer, the CHAT report stated. It pointed to 6,700 miles of deficient roads, nearly half of the state's highway system.

and many roads are reaching the saturation point, CHAT pointed out.

Appointed by Johnson in July 1995, CHAT conducted 17 town meetings throughout the state to gather public opinion on highway construction, repair and funding options. More than 700 people attended the meetings and an additional 500 returned questionnaires.

In its final report to the governor, CHAT recommended the highway department issue bonds for \$1.2 billion. Members contended the plan would not only meet the state's most critical highway needs, but also would return money to communities to allow them to determine their own transportation priorities.

From the \$1.2 billion, \$1.09 billion would be used on the state's highway system. The other \$110 million would be returned to local governments based on square mileage and population.

Out of 32 counties in the state, Lincoln County and its five municipalities would rank 13th in the amount of money that would be received. Bernalillo County and its four cities would be on top of the heap, collecting \$17.8 million.

Of the total amount to Lincoln, the county government would receive \$2.36 million, the village of Ruidoso would collect \$172,218, Carrizozo would receive an

estimated \$37,397, Ruidoso Downs \$33,243, Capitan \$32,571, and Corona \$7,748.

"We realized that recommending a gas tax would be controversial," task force member Dottie Hoxie told traffic safety bureau officials. "But we also recognized that a gas tax means that the users of highways would pay for their construction and maintenance. It ensures that tourists and others using New Mexico highways help to pay for them, instead of putting the entire burden on New Mexicans."

Lujan and the co-sponsors of the bill introduced Monday disagree with the task force recommendations.

Compared to the 20-year bonds

proposed by the governor, the five-year bonds will have significantly lower interest costs, Lujan said. The interest is estimated at \$35.6 million, while 20-year bonds would cost more than \$865 million in interest, he said.

The state highway and transportation department receives about \$180 million in federal funding each year, but that amount is expected to decrease to \$140 million in 1996. The amount of state funding has stayed level at \$186 million the past few years. But if inflation is factored in, that amount shrinks to \$167 million and must provide for construction, repair and maintenance on 11,600 miles of highways.

A national study released in 1995 says New Mexico reduced its investment in state highways by 30% from 1982-92, according to the newsletter.

"The message we heard over and over from the citizens of this state was that they would be willing to pay taxes for roads if the money was used for roads," said Tom Swistack, CHAT vice chair and mayor of Rio Rancho.

List of sources for highway funding

To secure the \$1.2 billion in 20-year highway bonds, an additional \$76 million in state money would have to be provided annually to the state highway department.

Possible sources for the additional \$76 million suggested by CHAT were:

— to restore to the highway department the existing 3% vehicle excise tax collected on the sale of all vehicles;

— to impose a one-quarter percent gross receipts tax and eliminate \$17 million in annual interagency transfers from the road fund;

— to establish a 5-cent gasoline tax, a 5-cent special fuels tax and eliminate \$17 million in interagency transfers from the road fund;

— and to utilize a combination of various new funding sources for the department to guarantee the bonds.

Real estate agents seek delay in new state subdivision laws

Local real estate agents and homebuilders want state officials to reconsider subdivision law changes approved last year.

Realtor Cindy Lynch is on the Lincoln County Commission agenda Tuesday to seek commission support for an effort to move back the effective date of the changes.

The meeting begins at 9 a.m. in the commission chambers of the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

"We want to open a discussion," Lynch said. "We feel it still needs work."

The approved changes were aimed at closing a loophole in the 1978 Subdivision Act that left unregulated the division of land into fewer than five parcels. The counties of Doña Ana, Bernalillo and Santa Fe are required to adopt the provisions by July 1 of this year. But other counties, including Lincoln, have until July 1, 1997.

"We think it needs more study and revision in the meantime," Lynch said. "My understanding is the State Engineer's office will have to hire extra staff to enforce the provisions. Personally, I don't think the county has looked at it closely enough as to what the role of the county commission would be. I feel it will be more than the commission is ready to bite off."

"This thing hit the real estate population like a bombshell last year. It was done, said and over with before we even realized what was going on. I believe it was too hastily passed."

At the request of Gov. Gary Johnson, State Sen. Skip Vernon (R-Albuquerque) last month introduced Senate Bill 476 that would extend the effective date of the changes one year.

A recently-approved revision of Lincoln County subdivision regulations did not contain any language to conform to the new state requirements, said county planner Patsy Sanchez.

The president of the Lincoln

County Realtors Association says the issue probably should have been voted on statewide.

"My thinking is that it is something that should have been put to the people. Our legislature is assuming that's what should be done," said President Linda Long. "It's a concern for everybody, not just Realtors, because it can affect anybody who wants to buy or sell if they're talking big land."

The act will interfere with personal property rights, Lynch said.

"If you have to go to all this extra expense to subdivide a tract of land, we'll soon be out of available tracts to sell," she said. "People will not be getting into the business of becoming subdividers."

"To keep going we have to have new development being considered at all times. There are some voids right now. There are no mobile homes lots, not to say we should have new subdividing just for mobile home lots, but it's an example of how you run out of things."

Since concerns about possible dwindling water supplies contributed to the push to limit land subdividing, the county Realtors association also is advocating a statewide water study.

"We need to determine once and for all what New Mexico has, before they force this on anybody," Lynch said.

Changes approved in the subdivision act last year include:

- redefining the meaning of "subdivision" to "the division of land within a previously approved subdivision into two or more parcels for the purpose of sale, lease or other conveyance or for building development whether immediate or future;"

- requiring a certificate on a final plat (layout) of a development stating whether a county commission has accepted, conditionally accepted or rejected an offer for dedication of roads for public use;

- requiring each county to determine the maximum annual water requirement of a subdivision under review, aimed at eliminating

"dry" subdivisions;

- making it optional to obtain water permits from the State Engineer for subdivisions with 20 parcels or more after July 1, 1997;

- setting an expiration time of 24 months with possible extensions up to three years on preliminary plat approvals and encouraging phasing of projects;

- excluding the act's oversight for sales of one parcel of 35 acres or larger agricultural, transfers among family members of one parcel per tract, and some donations to certain nonprofit corporations, trusts, schools, colleges, churches and religious groups;

- and requiring all subdivision developers to deliver disclosure statements to potential purchasers. Previously, this provision applied only to subdivisions of 25 or more parcels.

Other items on county commission's agenda

Architectural plans for improvements to the Lincoln County courthouse will be reviewed Tuesday by the county commission.

The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the commission room of the courthouse in Carrizozo.

Other items on the agenda include:

- approval of the county's quarterly Medicaid payment to the state;
- a discussion of Altima's health care needs assessment survey;
- a hearing at 10 a.m. followed by the selection of a project for a Community Development Block Grant application;

"The levy really allows us to make the schools a better place for our kids," Ruidoso Municipal School District Superintendent Mike Gladden said. "It means about \$350,000 per year for the schools."

The two-mill levy is designed for capital improvement needs, but it can also be used to subsidize bond money, and for land and buildings maintenance. The money is not used for salaries.

Future plans for two-mill levy dollars include purchasing additional computers for classrooms, grounds maintenance and roof and building repair, Snow said.

"Sometimes things just aren't anticipated, like a roof leak at one of the sites that needs to be repaired," she said.

Some of the programs funded in

the past with the levy are:

- land improvements including new sidewalks, trees, shrubs, sprinkler systems, a new running track, new bleachers, and landscaping at all school sites;

- building improvements including carpeting, gym floor refurbishing, telephone systems, heating systems and sound systems.

- increased handicapped accessibility;

- and equipment for curricular and extracurricular programs have been purchased, including nursing supplies, student desks and furniture, roof repair or replacement, lunchroom seating systems, activity vehicles, classroom computers, copiers, musical instruments and audio visual equipment.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to

7 p.m. Tuesday at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

All registered voters who live in the Ruidoso School District are eligible to vote.

"The district includes Ruidoso Downs and runs almost to the Glencoe Civic Events Center, then to the reservation line and just a little past Farley's," said Ruidoso Schools Superintendent Mike Gladden. "Rancho Ruidoso is in our district, but Alto is in the Capitan district."

Voters must have been registered by Jan. 9, said County Clerk Marsha Proctor.

"You have to have registered to vote 28 days prior to an election to be eligible to vote in that election," Proctor said.

New sign will hail convention center; hotel needed nearby

The four-year-old Ruidoso Convention Center will finally have an electronic sign marking its location for Mechem Drive passersby.

Village councilors approved \$55,000 for construction of a marquee sign for the convention center Tuesday. Different design options will be put out to bid, Village Manager Gary Jackson said.

The money will come from the village's \$110,000 common area improvement fund.

The benefits of the electronic message sign can't be underestimated, said Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce Director Joan Bailey.

"Not only does it give visibility,

it legitimizes the convention center," Bailey said.

The signage is part of the master plan for the convention and civic center complex. The plan also includes a hotel.

When a hotel is built, it too will appear on the sign, along with the Links Golf Course.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track owner R.D. Hubbard and business partner Ed Allred signed a 50-year lease agreement with the village in 1994 to build a \$15 million resort hotel with 162 rooms at the site, on village-owned land.

Construction was put on hold by the business partners early last year after the state Legislature failed to approve video gambling for

the state's racetracks.

Resort manager Jon Sherry has said construction hinges on expanded gaming at the track. Presently in Santa Fe to attend legislative hearings on gambling bills, Sherry couldn't be reached for comment.

The hotel lease requires construction to begin within a two-year period, and if it doesn't begin by next fall, the lease will be void.

Having a hotel within walking distance of the convention center is vital for the center's overall success, said Faren Merritt Selman, marketing director for the Ruidoso Convention & Visitors Bureau.

Without the hotel, marketing Ruidoso to large groups as a premiere convention site is dif-

icult, especially since the village has no public transportation system, Selman said.

"I see it hurting us not having a hotel here," she told the councilors. "We turn down an average two major conventions' each month, she said."

Lack of a hotel forces Selman to sell conventions for 3,000 attendees or fewer, since village lodges now have a total of about 2,200 beds.

"If we're serious about being in the convention business, we're going to need a convention hotel," Bailey later said.

About 100 conventions were booked at the center last year, and the village took in about \$20,000 in revenues.

Convention center bookings may

increase this coming year because of new special events planned by Ruidoso's new special events coordinator Anne Reveley.

Many of the events will center around Ruidoso's 50th birthday, she said.

"The '96 calendar has become full blown," Reveley said. "Our objective is to bring more visitors into Ruidoso."

Chief among those is the "Tunes and Tap" series of dance/concerts scheduled to run from Feb. 26 to April 6. Each of the six shows is expected to draw about 500 people.

Reveley has contacted Ski Apache officials to seek help promoting the series on show days, but she was told the concerts won't directly impact the ski area,

Reveley said.

Many people drawn to the village because of the concerts would also go up to the ski area, Reveley told the village council.

"I know some of the bands would be happy to go up there and play for an hour as a teaser," Reveley said.

Bailey also said the ski area and Ruidoso community should work closer on promoting events and attractions.

"We're listed on the Ski Apache brochure as their 1-800 number because they don't have one," Bailey said, and 50% of the chamber's toll-free phone calls on winter days are inquiries about Ski Apache.



Lost track jobs can't be replaced

TO THE EDITOR:

The anti-gaming talk has caused me to wonder what the government is going to do to make the payroll for all those displaced if the gaming situation isn't settled by the Legislature?

We have an interesting situation here. There is already a whole segment of state government trying to attract industry to New Mexico and a heck of a lot of chambers of commerce beating that drum. Has anyone told them it's possible massive

job losses are around the corner?

Will they look for jobs that make the payroll for horse racing employees?

What kind of incentives will it take to replace horse racing's \$367 million contribution to the state's economy? Who will the government find that brings a business big enough to create 10,000 jobs? I believe whoever it is will ask for a lot of tax breaks! There have been some sweetheart deals for jobs in the past, but replacing the race horse's rural to urban jobs ought to weaken the knees of any government setup charged with that mission.

The payroll has to extend to the auxiliary industries that serve racing patrons. After all, when horse race tourists come to New Mexico tracks, they are spending about \$120 million. Out-of-state racehorse owners are spending \$18 million. Can government "jobs for New Mexico" bureaus replace that outlay at the same time they replace the payroll for employees of horse racing?

You know as well as I, there is no such industry on its way to New Mexico. A \$367 million industry didn't happen overnight. It has been in the making for over 60 years.

Racehorse farms and breeding operations grew over time, also. They have an estimated value of

\$125 million in real estate. Their estimated annual operating costs are \$50 million and the value of their breeding and racing stock is estimated to be \$75 million.

Receiving money from these operating costs are all the alfalfa farms, feed blenders, feed dealers, veterinarians, and equipment and vehicle suppliers. They will need replacement income, too. The "jobs for New Mexico" searchers need to keep all the rural parts of this industry in mind.

It would be far better to have a legislative response to the horse racing industry that doesn't lose racehorse jobs or close any horse farms. It is far better to add electronic games at the horse races to keep purses growing, because the horse race purses pay a lot more people than just the betting winner or the horse owner. Electronic games at horse races will keep government from looking for a mythical industry for New Mexico that has 10,000 jobs, brings money-spending visitors and reinforces rural economies.

Call Santa Fe, tell them electronic gaming at live races will keep racehorse jobs in New Mexico. You'll be saving a government employee a terrible headache.

EMT training Feb. 15-May 21

An emergency medical technician (EMT) basic class runs Feb. 15 through May 21 in Carrizozo at the Otero Electric Building, 513 12th Avenue. The class will meet from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. every Tuesday and Thursday. The cost is \$75.

Kathy Williams, Emergency Medical Services training coordinator for Lincoln County EMS, will teach the class. Williams is an instructor through the University of New Mexico and the Emergency Medical Services Academy.

Lincoln County ambulances are stationed in Alto, Capitan, Carrizozo, Corona and Hondo. They are served by volunteers from those communities (who are paid for each run), but more volunteers are needed. Rio Bonito impoundment not hurting flow, BLM officials say

A small impoundment of water on the Rio Bonito in the Ranches of Sonterra subdivision is not damaging downstream flow, officials with the Bureau of Land Management say.

The BLM was asked to look into reports of a stream obstruction during a meeting in Lincoln several months ago, and then were reminded by Hondo resident James Sanchez in another Lincoln meeting two weeks ago.

Leslie Cone, BLM Roswell District manager, said she and a staff hydrologist last week examined the obstruction about two miles west of the boundary of Fort Stanton.

"It's a small diversion that created a pool, but water flows over and through it," Cone said. "The

hydrologist doesn't think it would influence the downstream flow." Sonterra spokesman Ed Libbey said the company did not create the impoundment and he was unaware of its presence on the river. Over the past three years, the BLM has acquired about 1,100 acres along the Rio Bonito and is developing a management plan with input from residents.

DWI blitz on; increase planned

The first DWI blitz of 1996 runs now through Sunday, Feb. 4 throughout New Mexico and Lincoln County.

The state is providing money to local agencies so DWI blitzes can increase to every month for the next two years, officials announced.

"The alcohol-related fatalities for 1995 are about the same as 1994, with 227 lives lost," said Pete Kahn, cabinet secretary of the New Mexico Highway & Transportation Department. "We need to double our DWI enforcement efforts in order to reduce DWI even further and to meet our goal of less than 180 fatalities by 1997."

"We are supporting New Mexico law enforcement agencies with more overtime and equipment so that Operation DWI blitzes can take place every month for at least the next two years."

Campos on Committees' Committee

State Senator Pete Campos (D-Las Vegas) was appointed last week to the Senate Committees' Committee, the leadership committee responsible for making committee assignments in the Senate.

The committees' committee is also responsible, in 30-day legislative sessions, for determining whether introduced bills are germane under the state constitution and can be considered during a short session, Campos said.

Campos is the majority caucus chairman and serves as the vice chairman of the Senate Ways and Means Committee. He is also a member of the Senate Conservation Committee and the Senate Select Gaming Committee. Campos has served in the Senate since 1991.

"I am honored that my colleagues in the New Mexico Senate have placed their trust in me by appointing me to this leadership committee," Campos said. "My commitment to the people of Guadalupe, San Miguel, Lincoln and De Baca counties will remain strong."






Pat Snyder's doctor told her a change of climate might be the best solution for her arthritis.

"So we sold our house in Brandon, Miss., bought an R.V. and hit the road in search of a new place to live," Snyder said. "We looked and looked but when we found Ruidoso, we knew that this was it."

Snyder and her husband Bruce moved to Ruidoso and recently opened O Look Creations at 2809 Sudderth—Suite 1A.

O Look Creations is filled with gifts and crafts, many made by Snyder herself. The shop also stocks a large variety of wood for use in craft projects.

Bruce Snyder is a barge captain for a company based in Philadelphia.

"He works three weeks on and three weeks off," Pat said. "Believe me, when he gets home, I have a 'honey-do' list for him."

Bruce is scheduled for retirement in two years.

This is not Pat Snyder's first business venture. She owned a gift shop in Carrabelle, Fla. in 1982 but the venture was unsuccessful.

"It was feast or famine and not really a tourist town," she said. "But I loved the business and always wanted another gift shop."

Craft shows became a major part of Snyder's life. She and Bruce, along with French poodle Charity, traveled from show to show, selling Pat's crafts and meeting people.

"I was at a craft show somewhere just about every weekend," she said. "For the last three years we sold wood for crafts at a flea market in Vermont."

O Look Creations stocks a large

selection of wood for crafts including eggs, dowels, apples, balls, wheels and shaker pegs in several sizes.

"We're hoping that the wooden craft supplies really catches on," Pat said. "The shop is a combination of gifts, crafts, and odds and ends."

Walking sticks from Vermont are even available at O Look Creations. Snyder sells the sticks for \$7.

Other craft items at the store include baskets, wreaths and more than 5,000 rolls of wrapping paper.

Hydrastone sculptures of Indians, cowboys and animals fill a wall at the new business.

"Hydrastone is similar to concrete but not as heavy," she said. "We get them from Belen and they have a very different and interesting look."

Prices of the sculptures range

from about \$18 to \$50, she said.

"What I want to have are things that everybody can afford," Snyder said.

O Look Creations also is filled with unique items like slate paintings, Valentine's Day gifts, chiles made from glass, cows holding eggs and pigs holding beans.

"Like pork and beans," Snyder said.

Snyder has taught crafting techniques and seems to have a knack for creative ideas.

"God blessed me with the talent to be able to do a lot of crafts," she said. "I've taught at senior citizen centers and at Gulf State College in Florida."

Capitan ranks 7th in growth

Capitan is one of nine cities in New Mexico that grew by 20% or more from April 1990 to July 1994.

It placed 7th, and outranked the village of Ruidoso, which posted a 19.61% population increase from 4,500 to 5,502.

The figures were based on data from the Bureau of the Census, compiled by Sunwest Bank's monthly business and economic publication *Progress* and summarized in the December issue of *The Municipal Reporter*.

Of Lincoln County's five municipalities, Ruidoso Downs, which abuts Ruidoso, placed on top of the county and on top of the state with a whopping 41.90% increase in population was from 920 to 1,300.

"I was shocked when I saw it," Village of Ruidoso Downs Clerk-Treasurer Leann Weibrecht said. "I can't think of any reason it would increase that much. I don't believe we've seen that kind of increase in water users we bill."

Capitan's 1990-94 growth statistics don't reflect the closing of Fort Stanton as a state hospital, because that happened in March of 1995. Long the county's second-largest employer, more than 200 people worked there, and Capitan was the closest community. Em-

ployees' jobs were either terminated or transferred out of the area.

"We have rebounded pretty well on that," said Capitan Mayor Norman Renfro. "It hurt for awhile, but I think we're attracting the retirement sector, as well as younger families."

"We've got 645 water meters and a recent water feasibility study shows an estimated 6% population increase per year."

Many of the retirees and families are fleeing crowding, crime, natural disasters and high taxes in Arizona and California, he said.

Capitan also is considered a bedroom community for Ruidoso, a place where families can be raised in a rural setting while one or both parents commute 25 miles southwest to jobs in Ruidoso.

On the minus side of the county ledger, the villages of Carrizozo and Corona both showed a loss of population. The county seat of Carrizozo dipped slightly from 1,075 to 1,060 for a 1.42% decline.

Attempts to attract industry to the county seat at the intersection of U.S. 54 and U.S. 380 for the most

part have been unsuccessful, said Town Clerk Carol Schlarb. Carrizozo's main source of jobs remains county government.

She speculated that some of those leaving were elderly who needed to be closer to special health care.

"A lot of people are coming into Carrizozo, too," she said. "Most are artists." Some have remodeled old homes to create studio-residences.

Corona registered a significant population drop of 21.86% from 215 to 168.

Mayor Ernest Luera disputes those figures.

"We're standing at 230 people right now," Luera said. "I don't know where they get that information. The El Paso Natural Gas plant closed two to three years ago, but they only had five families left anyway."

Since then, four or five new families have moved to Corona, an isolated village perched at the northwest edge of Lincoln County.

"A couple of the families are from Boston," Luera said. "I said, 'What in the world are they doing here?' One is from Chicago. I guess they wanted to get away from it all."



Police offer reward for dog killer info

Ruidoso-Lincoln County CrimeStoppers is offering a \$100 reward to find out who left a mother spaniel mix and her five puppies in a dumpster.

The tan and white mother had one eye poked out and showed signs of other abuse. She and one of her reddish-blond puppies did not survive the ordeal.

The litter was discovered early in the morning Dec. 13 by employees of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority transfer station and the nearby Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter off Gavilan Canyon Road.

"The point is not that the person wanted to dispose of the animals," said Jim Riggins, shelter manager. "We encourage people who don't want their animals to bring them to us. We have cages that are available for anonymous overnight drop-off. We're not in the business of judging or making people feel guilty. When they bring animals to us, they are giving them a chance for a new home."

The reason this case is being pursued as an animal abuse crime is that the owner apparently

abused the mother dog and then abandoned mom and her seven-week-old pups in a dumpster, instead of putting them into an overnight cage just a few yards away at the shelter, said Ruidoso Police Chief Lanny Maddox.

"Unfortunately, in this state animal abuse is only a misdemeanor," he said.

The reward is for information leading to magistrate bindover of the person who committed the crime, Maddox said. That means enough information must be presented to convince the judge there is probable cause to believe a crime was committed.

Forest Service pays county

The U.S. Forest Service earned \$140,507 in Lincoln County from users of federal lands in fiscal year 1995, and \$714 million nationwide.

The Lincoln County government receives 25% of the revenues collected here, or \$35,127. The Forest Service announced last week that the money has been distributed to states.

Lincoln ranks 9th of 32 New Mexico counties in payment in lieu of taxes (PILT) money from the federal government. New Mexico counties receiving by far the most money are Catron (\$228,559) and Rio Arriba (\$242,971).

New Mexico counties received a total of \$1,102,857 in PILT payments, ranking 25th of all the states in the amount of payment. Oregon, California and Washington top that list.

Revenues come from timber sales, grazing, recreation and other uses on the Forest Service's 191 million acres.

Local governments must use PILT payments for schools and roads.

Highway 48 plans discussed

Street lighting and turn lanes were suggested Tuesday as additions to an improvement plan for State Highway 48.

The suggestions were offered by some of the 15 residents who attended a public information session conducted at Alto Lakes Country Club by Keystone Environmental & Planning Inc.

Keystone spokesman Kevin Hammond said his firm is handling the environmental study for the northern section of the multi-phase project. The total project will run from Sudderth Drive to just north of the intersection with State Highway 37.

Previous sessions have been conducted on the other and more controversial phases closer to Ruidoso. After objections from business and landowners along the highway in those areas, plans were scaled down from the five-lane construction initially proposed by the state Highway and Transportation Department in sections through town.

It's not necessary to add turn lanes to the road design in the northern section, because climbing lanes are part of the design, Hammond said. Lights at intersections are not part of the current design and some were removed from other phases to cut costs.

Only two alternatives are being considered by the state: build or no build. The no-build alternative would consist of only minor road repair and no substantial improvements. The basic road alignment would not change in either alternative.

The northern section under scrutiny at Tuesday's meeting is narrow and winding with little or no shoulders, said Andres Aragon Viamonte, also with Keystone.

The bridge over the Rio Bonito is narrow and not up to current standards. Several curves don't allow adequate sight distance for drivers. The pavement on the road is rutted, cracked and needs restoration, he said.

The northern section of the project starts at Highway 532 or Ski Run Road and continues north for 4.1 miles as a two-lane road.

Construction work on that portion, estimated at \$5.61 million, could begin in 1998, according to project engineer Allan Whitesel.

- The proposed improvements would consist of:
- resurfacing and restoration of the roadway;
 - adding five-foot shoulders;
 - building 11-foot wide climbing lanes with four-foot shoulders along most of the project route;
 - replacing the bridge over the Rio Bonito;

— and reconstruction of the intersections of the highway with SH37, Sierra Blanca Airport Road and Fort Stanton Road.

"We haven't identified anything we consider of significant impact environmentally," Hammond said Wednesday from his Albuquerque office. "Some minor wetlands areas are involved, about one-tenth of an acre. The final environmental report is not due until end of 1997, but we've made good progress."



A pair of formidable foes visit Ruidoso for some District 3AAA boys cage action Friday and Saturday.

The Warriors' weekend starts Friday against Silver's Colts, Class AAA's No. 4-ranked team. The Colts bring a 13-3 overall mark and 2-1 district record to the contest.

"They are an awesome basketball team. They don't seem to have missed a beat from last year," Ruidoso coach Ben Sanchez said.

Silver did skip a beat versus Socorro's Warriors last week. The Colts stumbled to the Warriors, 55-53, in a shocker. Silver then bounced back to beat Santa Teresa, 93-66.

Ruidoso is trying to get back on the winning track, too. The Warriors are 7-9 overall and 0-3 in the 3AAA.

"We've got to find a way to get a district win," Sanchez said. "Before, we were finding ways to win when we didn't play well." The Warriors haven't been doing that lately.

"We'll have to play well. We've put ourselves in a position where we have to take care of every detail," Sanchez added.

Against Silver, Ruidoso must contain one of the state's best big men in senior center Andrew Wolthers. At 6-foot-8, Wolthers

averages double figures in both scoring (16-plus) and rebounding (10-plus).

The Warriors must limit what Wolthers is able to do, Sanchez said. It will be a tough task, considering Ruidoso's tallest player is 6-6 Joshua Hodges.

Another key will be shutting down the Colts' guard play. Silver's guards are not as strong as last year's crew, but they are solid nonetheless, Sanchez said.

Solid is right. Silver's Chris Perea leads the team with a 19 ppg average. Another Colt guard, Jason Marrujo, dishes out more than five assists a game.

Ruidoso counters with four Warriors averaging nine points a game

or better. Senior point guard Cory Hood leads all Class AAA players in the state with a 6.5 assists per game average. He also leads the Warriors in scoring at 13.1 ppg.

Hodges paces Ruidoso in rebounding with an 8.6 average. The senior forward scores 9.7 ppg.

After his 29-point effort at Hot Springs, senior guard Rex Comanche is second on the team in scoring with a 10.5 average. Junior guard Ryan Trout scores 9.1 a game.

Ruidoso's weekend doesn't get any easier when Cobre calls Saturday. The Indians have as much physical talent as anyone in the district, Sanchez said. Cobre is a more guard-oriented team and that should help benefit the Warriors, whose post players lack height but not heart.

Despite the team's 0-3 start in district play, Sanchez hasn't lowered his goal of finishing in the top two of the 3AAA — that goal is still within reach of the Warriors' fingertips. Perhaps a more attainable and necessary goal is to take third or fourth place at least. Either of those finishes would guarantee the Warriors a home game in the first round of the district playoffs.

Varsity tipoff both nights should be around 7:30 p.m. at the Ruidoso High School gym.



Opportunity knocked and the Ruidoso girls basketball team couldn't answer the door in its last home game of the season Tuesday.

Santa Teresa's Desert Warriors bested the local Warriors, 58-44, in a District 3AAA prep game. The loss leaves Ruidoso with an 0-16 overall record and 0-6 district slate.

Ruidoso trailed by only four points, 22-18, at the half and by seven after three quarters. But unforced turnovers, especially in the fourth quarter, prevented the Warriors from getting any closer.

"We had the opportunities. We

just didn't execute," Ruidoso coach Dwayne Rogers said.

Ruidoso showed improvement over the last time it met Santa Teresa, Jan. 20. In that first game, the Desert Warriors cruised to a 28-

point victory. This time, Ruidoso made STHS fight for a 14-point win.

"These girls have a lot of character because they've received some criticism. But they've been sticking together and not pointing fingers at each other," said Rogers, defending his troops. "By and large, we've stuck together."

Ruidoso will have its character tested again when it faces a tough road trip Friday and Saturday. The Warriors play Cobre Friday and then visit Silver City the next day.

If the Warriors start quickly against Cobre's Indians, they could

pick up their first win of the year. Cobre took a 63-59 victory Jan. 6 over Ruidoso. In that game, the Warriors busted loose for 27 fourth-quarter points and nearly won the game.

"I'm expecting us to go out and play hard early in the game. Their guards couldn't handle our full-court pressure. They wore down," Rogers said. "We're just going to try to take it to them early."

Moreno brings beauty of ballet to Ruidoso mountains

Little Victor Moreno was not a strong child so the family doctor recommended ballet as a way to strengthen his muscles.

The doctor could not have known that ballet would not only strengthen Moreno; it would become his life-long passion.

"We lived in Buenos Aires, Argentina and my sister was already taking dance with Francisco Gago," Moreno said. "Gago was an artist with the Buenos Aires Opera House and when I was about 12 years old, I began training under his direction."

Today, 56 years later, Moreno resides in Ruidoso and continues his ballet career as the artistic director and choreographer of Ballet New Mexico. He also owns and operates Ballet New Mexico School of Dance on Sudderth Drive.

Ballet became Moreno's passion, but it didn't happen overnight.

"I didn't like it at first because I saw all of these little girls and I was a little boy you know," he said. "Gago told me to behave or he would kick me out."

Moreno decided to buckle down, discovered that he liked ballet and soon progressed from being a rebellious student to teaching classes on his own.

"When I was 13, I progressed to the Corp de Ballet," Moreno said. "And when I was 15 years old, in 1944, I became a professional dancer."

As 'First Dancer' with the Teatro Colón de Buenos Aires in Argentina, Moreno became the youngest man in the history of his county to

receive the title of Premier Danseur. He was only 20 years old.

Moreno's eyes twinkle as he remembers his first public ballet appearance.

"It was a performance of 'Carnival' when I was with the Corp de Ballet," he chuckles. "And here I had this big lady that I had to lift."

His knack for learning ballet pieces quickly caused him to be in demand as a stand-in whenever another performer was unable to dance.

"They would call me because I knew the steps," he said.

Moreno's dedication to the art of ballet caused him some trouble with his regular studies, and even though he did graduate from high school, his marks were low.

"Fortunately, we lived next door to the library and I would just read books on my own," he said. "My real education was in ballet and opera because at the time, in Buenos Aires, we had the best opera singers and conductors in the world."

Moreno's sister Blanca also continued her ballet lessons, eventually becoming a ballerina.

"She retired about 20 years ago," he said. "She also studied music and painting and is very happy."

During his long love affair with ballet, Moreno has formed seven dance companies in five states, including the new Ballet New Mexico in Ruidoso.

"I've always loved to dance and to teach dance," he said.

The scene shifts to 1951. Moreno has decided to travel to New York city to audition for the Ballet Russe

de Monte Carlo. The audition is successful and it's not long before Moreno is named as the principal dancer for the company.

"At that time, Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo was very famous," he said. "We had the most fantastic performers in the world of ballet."

During the six years Moreno danced with Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo, he performed with such famous ballerinas as Mia Slavenska, Alexandra Danilova, Nathalie Krassovaka and others.

The scene again changes; this time to 1957 Los Angeles. Moreno has left New York and traveled to L.A. where he starts the Spanish American Ballet Company.

"Half of the performers were trained as Spanish dancers and the other half were American." Please see Moreno, page 6B

other half were trained in ballet," he explained. "We all worked together as a unit."

The Spanish American Ballet Company was only the first of many ballet companies that Moreno would start during his career.

Next stop for Moreno was the Lone Star State. From 1965 to 1969 he taught ballet at various universities including the University of Texas, Austin; Southwest University at Georgetown; Texas Christian University and others. He also served as the director of the New School of Ballet in Austin and the Edith James Ballet in Dallas. During this period he also founded the Ballet Theatre of Dallas.

"Then in 1969 I received a call from Mexico City," he said. "I became the artistic director of Bellas Artes de Mexico."

His previous affiliation with Bellas Artes continues to allow Moreno to tap into the world of Mexican ballet. He recently brought dancers Blanca Martinez and Eric Campos from Mexico to perform in the Ruidoso production of "The Nutcracker."

Moreno attended a summer workshop at the Denver Civic Ballet in 1971 and soon was offered the job as their artistic director.

"I was there from 1972 to 1974 and did very well," he said. "We toured all over the country and experienced great success."

Moreno packed his bags and headed back to California when he was offered the position of associate director of the California Ballet in San Diego in 1974.

After working with the San Diego company for about five years, Moreno formed the North County Ballet Company in the late '70s.

"I was also teaching at Mira Costa College in Vista, Calif.," he said. "That is where I received my Degree of Eminence in the Art of

Ballet which is a very hard degree to get."

"Many of the athletes would train with me," he said. "Basketball and football players discovered that dance training helped them develop their muscles and coordination."

Moreno knows personally the advantages of dance training. He is proficient in both karate and judo and even did some boxing in his younger days.

"In ballet you have to lift people, and I can still do those things, even in my old age," he said.

Moreno taught at Mira Costa College and directed his North County Ballet company for ten years, giving more than 400 lecture demonstrations and 240 main performances.

When government cutbacks of art grants in the late 1980's began affecting the number of performance his Mira Costa College students could do, Moreno began to look for other opportunities.

"I went to Philadelphia in 1985 and began teaching at Temple University," he said. "At the same time, I was teaching at Glassboro State

College in Glassboro, New Jersey. Just having two jobs wasn't enough for Moreno. He soon founded another dance company, Ballet South in New Jersey.

"Ballet South is still going strong," he said. "And in the summer of 1990 I was hired as artistic director for Ballet Lubbock."

After three years with Ballet Lubbock, Moreno left to form another company, Lubbock Ballet Theater, on whose board of directors he still sits.

Moreno was asked to come to Ruidoso to teach ballet workshops by a former dance studio owner.

"While doing the workshops, I decided that I liked the area," he said. "I moved to be closer to my children in California and because this is a beautiful place to live."


Ballet dancing and teaching has exposed Moreno to many areas around the country.

"I loved San Francisco, New York, Dallas and Austin," he said.

"And now I love Ruidoso."



remain as his permanent home base.

"As long as the region supports the ballet, I will stay," Moreno said. "Hopefully I am here to stay."

Moreno has three sons, but when asked about how many times he has been married, deftly danced around the question.

"This is a secret," he laughs.

"This I will tell to no one except to say that I divorced my last wife."

"Just say that right now, I am available."

He may not want to talk about his wives, but he is definitely a proud father. He brags about his son; one is a high school band director, one works with computers and the youngest will soon graduate with a degree in metallurgy.

"They are doing well," he said. "I

am proud of them."

That sense of pride is also obvious in Moreno's latest endeavor, Ballet New Mexico, a non-profit organization that last December thrilled Ruidoso audiences with a production of "The Nutcracker."

"Right now what I'm hoping for are more dancers so that we can do more productions," he said.

"We are going to be doing 'Peter and the Wolf' and hopefully 'Alice

and Wonderland' but I need dancers for the different characters." The productions are tentatively

scheduled for the last week in May, he said.

"In Lubbock in 1994, I had a dancer from Dallas who became sick during 'The Nutcracker,'" he said. "I had to put on a costume and dance 'The Waltz of the Flowers.'"

Moreno said that thankfully, one of the other performers took over later.

"I was tired because that dance is very strenuous, but I can still do some dancing and now I'm in better shape than I was two years ago," he said.

Ruidoso school ski program in limbo for 4th year

The Ruidoso School District ski program is still on hold, and school officials don't know when it will resume.

The last school ski program was in the 1991-92 school year, Gladden said.

The program was officially canceled last year by the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council. The tribe operates Ski Apache. A letter from Wendell Chino said Indian school-

children were being verbally attacked by non-Indian students about the tribe's proposed nuclear waste storage project, and not enough Indians were participating in athletics.

Since the cancellation of the ski program, the district hasn't heard from the tribe, Gladden said.

Mescalero officials were unavailable for comment about when or if the school ski program might resume.

After receiving Chino's letter a

year ago, Gladden decided it wouldn't be fair to allow handicapped students to leave during

school hours to participate in the Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers Association program, either.

The regular school ski program had from 300 to 500 students participating countywide, said Nob Hill school principal and ski program coordinator Roger Sowder.

The ski program usually starts two weeks after Christmas vacation and runs for four weeks, district superintendent Mike Gladden said.

"We're always interested in the opportunity to have a school ski

program," Gladden said. "It's good for the community and helps students who might not have the opportunity to ski otherwise."

Through the program, local ski shops rented equipment for \$5 and the ski area sold half-day lift tickets for \$2.

Former school ski programs ran about four weeks, Sowder said.

"For \$7 a day, a kid could ski once a week for four weeks," Sowder said. "The program generated a lot of community interest."

PAST TENSE

No good could be found in bad-guy Dave Rudabaugh

History is a funny thing. While many of the more notable characters of the Old West have been highlighted through the years (sometimes courtesy of Hollywood), others are all but forgotten.

In many ways, Hollywood has defined our perceptions of the Old West. As most of us have grown up watching Hollywood westerns, it becomes difficult to see the people as they really were. Not good guys or bad guys. Just human beings like the rest of us — with the capability of being both good and bad.

However, every now and then, you can come across an extreme case, where it is nearly impossible to find any redeeming virtue, and you really can put the character in question into the "bad guy" category.

Which brings us to Dave Rudabaugh...

Like many of his contemporaries, his origins are shadowy. He was probably born in Illinois in 1854, and came to Kansas with his mother and all the other little Rudabaughs after his father was killed in the Civil War.

Dave dedicated himself to a life of crime early, and in so doing, inadvertently helped forge one of the most famous friendships of the Old West.

Wyatt Earp was in pursuit of the 23-year-old Rudabaugh in 1877. When the trail led Earp to Ft. Griffin, Texas, he sought information about the fugitive and was directed to one John Henry "Doc" Holliday.

Wyatt never did catch up with Rudabaugh, but his conversation with Holliday led to a lasting friendship that has been immortalized in countless novels and films.

On Jan. 27, 1878, Dave was one of a gang that tried unsuccessfully to rob a train at Kinsley, Kansas. A few days later, Bat Masterson's posse caught up with him, captured him and incarcerated him.

When the case was brought to trial, Dave turned state's evidence and was released. As the *Kinsley Graphic* pointed out, "Rudabaugh...was promised entire immunity if he would 'squeal,' therefore he 'squealed.'"

So much for "honor among thieves."

In 1879, Dave shows up in Dodge City, supposedly looking for honest work, which, after studying his career, is kind of hard to believe. It was at this time that he formed a fateful friendship with a man named John Joshua Webb.

In the latter part of that same year, both Webb and Rudabaugh were employed as policemen in Las Vegas, N.M. What they were actually doing was robbing trains and stagecoaches and using their badges as cover.

Needless to say, such nefarious clandestine operations could not go undiscovered for long, and on Nov. 4, 1879, Dave and another man were charged with robbing stagecoaches. They seem to have greased the right palms, however, and as the *Las Vegas Gazette* pointed

out, they "...pled not guilty and in the absence of any prosecution were discharged. The case seems to be involved in mystery. The prosecution failed to appear, and the evidence was of such doubtful character that it was uncertain whether a case could have been made against them or not."

On 30 April, 1880, Dave, accompanied by a confederate, broke into the Las Vegas jail where his pal J.J. Webb was incarcerated for murder, under a sentence of death. In the process, they killed the jailer. Throwing Webb the keys to his cell, Rudabaugh fled into the night, shouting

at his friend to free himself.

Webb, curiously, did not avail himself of Rudabaugh's offer and was still sitting placidly in his cell when armed citizens rushed into the jail. His case was on appeal, and J.J. apparently figured that he could beat the noose legally.

However, he must have changed his mind about that, because in November of 1880 he broke out of the place without benefit of outside assistance, killing three men in the process.

By that time, Rudabaugh had already gone on to what he undoubtedly considered "greener pastures." He joined forces with Billy the Kid and was almost immediately involved in the killing of Jim Carlyle, a deputy from White Oaks.

It is interesting to note that Dave Rudabaugh was said to be the one man who made Billy nervous, and that the Kid was, in fact, afraid of him.

Dave was with Billy and the gang when Tom O'Folliard was killed at Ft. Sumner by Pat Garrett's posse. He was also present at Stinking Springs (modern-day Taiban, N.M.) when Charlie Bowdre was killed by the same posse. Dave, Billy and the rest of the gang were captured.

On Sept. 19, 1881, while awaiting execution in Las Vegas, Rudabaugh, his old pal J.J. Webb (who had been re-captured yet again) and several others tried to shoot their way out of jail with a pistol that had been smuggled in to them. They succeeded only in getting one of their number killed by an alert jailer.

However, "if at first you don't succeed..." In December, Rudabaugh, Webb and five others tunneled their way to freedom. At this juncture, Webb disappeared into the mists of history, and Rudabaugh apparently fled to old Mexico.

On 18 February, 1886, in Parral, Mexico, Rudabaugh finally met his richly deserved end.

In a wild melee in a local cantina, Rudabaugh killed two men and wounded another, and then was himself killed and decapitated by a mob of angry citizens. His head was paraded around town on a pole, with various members of the local citizenry posing for pictures with it.

In all that is written about Dave Rudabaugh, it is virtually impossible to find anything commendable to say about the man. And when you consider that over the years, various historians have managed to say something good about most of the "bad" men of the Old West like Jesse James and the probably psychotic Clay Allison, this is quite a feat.

And it places Dave Rudabaugh firmly in the category of "bad guy."



Local Scoop

Most people are familiar with what is commonly called mange, however the ailment takes several forms, and in nearly all cases requires vigorous treatment and contagion control.

The most common forms of mange are caused by several types of mites, said Jim Riggins, director of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

"In the case of Otodectid and Cheyletiella mange, the mites live in the ears and on the skin," Riggins said. "In the case of Sarcopic and Demodectic mange, mites burrow into the skin."

In all cases except Demodectic mange, the symptoms are:

- hair loss beginning around the eyes and tops of paws and progressing;
- intense itching and discomfort;
- skin rashes progressing to ulceration and deformity in advanced cases;
- and very pungent, yeasty smell akin to decomposing flesh.

"In those cases, treatment by your veterinarian, generally is topical (not ingested), eliminating the infestation and treating any secondary skin infections," Riggins said. "Treatment usually is lengthy."

"In all of these cases, the condition is highly contagious. All con-

tacted animals also probably will require treatment."

Humans can contract minor versions, but only with intense contact with infected animals, he said.

"In the case of Demodectic mange, puppies are infected within the first few days of life, but symptoms may not appear until the puppy is four months old," Riggins said. "This condition though similar in appearance, does not itch. It generally is regarded as a hereditary condition. Animals who are diagnosed should not be allowed to breed. The condition also often is extremely resistant to treatment."

However, don't despair. In a recent case, a local veterinarian feared a four-month-old puppy's immunity system was too compromised to fight the infestation. However, he gave the akita mix strong medicated baths once every two weeks for eight weeks, with the expectation that four additional baths might be needed or that she might not respond. To his delight, the initial treatment brought the infestation under control and a luxurious coat grew.

The mites are part of the normal skin fauna and do no harm in small numbers on a healthy animal. Sometimes, a dietary change is needed to encourage proper development of the immune system in young animals.


