Ruidoso seat belt blitz for two weeks

Better buckle up or be ready to pay a hefty fine, Ruidoso police say. During the next two weeks, Feb. 11-24, officers will be randomly checking motorists to see if they have fastened their seatbelts. If caught without the safety belts snapped in place, violators may be fined \$42 each adult violation and \$67 for each child violation, police say.

"We're trying so hard to increase seatbelt usage, because it has a direct impact on saving lives and reducing injuries sustained in traffic crashes," said Ruidoso Police Chief Lanny Maddox.

More than 50 state departments are participating in the blitz.

Program on tree planting Feb. 20

A free program on how to plant and care for trees and shrubs in New Mexico will be offered from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., Tuesday, Feb. 20 at the Chaves County Cooperative Extension Service.

The office is at Door #4, 200 East Chisum in Roswell.

All aspects of woody plant horticulture will be discussed, including soil, irrigation systems, weed barriers, windbreak design, wildlife, tree species selection, tree seedling quality and care, tree planting, maintenance and pruning, and insects and diseases.

Gambling legislation killed; both houses back at it again

The gambling issue in the state Legislature is like gum stuck to a shoe — and the Legislature just can't seem to shake it off.

The Senate worked on a gambling bill for five days, only to have the House unanimously kill it in less than a minute Wednesday. Senate Bill 701 would have opened up video gaming to almost anyone.

Once that bill was sent into oblivion, the Senate took up a bill sponsored by Sen. Gary Don Reagan that would have totally limited any expansion of gaming in New Mexico.

Reagan's Senate Bill 710 would have permitted only bingo, horse racing and bicycle racing, and done away with what is known as Class III gambling.

"Either we have something for everybody or we have none for everyone," said Sen. John Arthur Smith (D-Deming).

But after an hour of debate on the Senate floor, that bill also failed, on a 21-17 vote.

Although the bill was supported by senators Smith and Don Kidd (R-Carlsbad), the chairman and vice chairman of the Senate's Select Gaming Committee, it failed to garner enough votes to pass.

"This bill clarifies Las Vegas nights and what can be played on them," Reagan said.

Senator Leonard Tsosie (D-Crownpoint) argued that the bill was an attempt to limit what Indian tribes could call gambling.

Under federal law, only games played elsewhere within a state can be played on Indian land. The Indian tribes have taken the position that since several organizations had "Las Vegas Nights" with casino table games, they could offer these games at Indian casinos.

Tsosie claimed this bill was an attempt to limit what games could be played at the Indian casinos by outlawing nearly all forms of gambling.

Another possible drawback to the bill was that it was almost exactly like House Bill 29, which passed

both houses of the Legislature last year only to be vetoed by Gov. Gary Johnson.

Reagan acknowledged that the bill "does not create anything that's Class III" gambling and agreed that the present bill was much like the old HB 29.

Sen. Joseph Carraro (R-Albuquerque) asked how it would be enforced, and Reagan answered that it would be enforced by New Mexico law enforcement officers.

However, it is illegal for state law officers to enforce law on Indian lands, Carraro said. Reagan replied that could be left to federal officers.

It was also pointed out during the debate that no Senate bill yet seeks to ratify the Indian gaming compact.

All throughout the debate on Reagan's bill, observers saw the frustration that has taken over the Senate when it comes to the gaming question.

Sen. Mary Jane Garcia (D-Dona Ana) commented, "This is a circus we need to get out of."

Sen. Roman Maes (D-Santa Fe) added, "There are education bills piled up that need to be heard. We are not doing the people's business."

Nonetheless, when it came to a way out of the turmoil by voting for the Reagan bill, 21 senators voted against it and only 17 for it. Four senators had been excused.

Thus, the fight over gaming remains a question that observers now say won't be answered without a special session.

The House Committee on Business and Industry heard information about four gambling bills Wednesday, including the state Horsemen's Association proposal (House Bill 548). It is being sponsored by the majority floor leader, Michael Olguin (D-Socorro).

Others include the Gaming Compact Act (HB 692), Gaming Control Act (HB 735), and Video Gaming Act (HB 346).

The committee is scheduled to decide Saturday what to do with the bills.

Camp Sierra Blanca will house juvenile offenders

The conversion of Camp Sierra Blanca into a work camp for non-violent juveniles is part of a \$17.7 million package unveiled Thursday that expands New Mexico's juvenile justice system.

Johnson and Speaker of the House Raymond G. Sanchez (D-Bernalillo) announced their package at a press conference attended by six other legislators including State Rep. Dub Williams (R-Ruidoso Downs). The package is a combination of legislators' efforts and the Johnson administration's "Restoring Justice" package.

Funding includes \$787,000 to convert Camp Sierra Blanca into a work camp for 50 juveniles after it is closed as an adult minimum security prison this fall. Located about 25 miles northeast of Ruidoso, the camp is expected to employ 30-50 workers when it opens sometime after July 1997. The renovation probably will take three months.

State officials estimate they'll save \$600,000 by using the existing Camp Sierra Blanca, instead of building a new work camp.

Offenders will be trained in building trades, agriculture and historic preservation, said Children Youth and Families Department Secretary Heather Wilson.

"We have several programs statewide where kids in trouble are involved in restoration of old churches and work side by side with skilled and usually much older craftsmen," Wilson said. "When a kid restores something that's part of his own history and creates something beautiful, that really has a positive effect."

Her department is not interested in occupying the neighboring Fort Stanton. The former state hospital is too large for her programs, she said (please see related story).

However, the teens at the camp will play a part in the historic preservation of the fort.

Gary Morton, head of the New Mexico Office of Cultural Affairs, said he spoke with Secretary Wilson about the Historic Preservation Office working closely with the juvenile camp to help preserve Fort Stanton, an historic state property which sits empty next to the camp.

The fort is listed on both the State Register of Cultural Properties and the National Register of Historic Places.

Rep. Williams said he's pleased with the efforts of Children, Youth and Families (CYF) Department officials to find a use for the camp. He said he has worked closely with CYF officials since the camp closure was announced late last year.

"It will be rewarding for Lincoln County and will be helpful for the many juveniles in need," Williams said. "I think if we can intervene in young people's lives early enough, we won't have to spend money later on prisons."

Although non-violent, the juveniles confined to the camp will be serious repeat offenders. The program will be based on Last Chance

Ranch near Orlando, Fla., one of the most successful juvenile facilities in the nation, Wilson said Thursday from her Santa Fe office.

The proposal will have to be approved by the House and Senate, but passage is assured by the bipartisan agreement announced Thursday, Wilson said.

"It had been proposed in the governor's budget and we had been working with the Legislature for the past six months on a variety of things, including an environmental work camp in eastern New Mexico," Wilson said. "When Camp Sierra Blanca became available, Dub Williams suggested we send a team down and look at the site. It's too small for the Corrections Department, but exactly the right size for us." The state Corrections Department is abandoning the camp because it costs too much to house so few prisoners in one place.

Juvenile justice system reform plan

Most of the recommendations incorporated into the state's new bipartisan juvenile crime agreement came from the Legislature's interim Courts, Corrections and Criminal Justice Committee.

The juvenile justice system expansion agreement would provide:

- \$7.8 million in capital construction and acquisition money;
 - \$4.4 in operating money for the first year;
 - and \$5.5 in operating money for the second year.
 - From those amounts:
 - \$1.2 million would be used for community corrections programs to provide alternatives to incarceration and to encourage reintegration of juveniles into society;
 - \$1.15 million to hire more probation supervision officers for both intense and informal monitoring;
 - \$536,000 to hire another 21 juvenile corrections officers at the Youth Diagnostic and Development Center in Albuquerque;
 - \$250,000 for community and victim restoration programs;
 - \$521,000 for family preservation programs;
 - and \$137,000 to develop an urban construction corp program.
- The package is expected to provide intervention services to 900 more children involved in crime, especially after their first brush with the criminal justice system.

County Solid Waste Authority employees detail their grievances

Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority employees who staged a sick-out Wednesday were back on the job Thursday.

The authority board, all local government officials, will respond to the group's informal resolution as if it was a formal grievance.

The employees say the authority needs to hire more garbage collectors, it should buy newer equipment for the safety of workers, it

should adjust wages to reflect longevity on the job, and it should approve pay raises for those in the field and at the garbage transfer station. They contend they have worked as many as 96 hours a week without overtime pay.

"We just want equal treatment," one of the truck drivers said Wednesday.

"The money-making end of this business is garbage collection, but the higher salaries are in recycling," said Ray Merritt, who

resigned Tuesday as manager of the garbage transfer station but came with the employees Wednesday to *The Ruidoso News*.

"The truth of the matter is, although there may be numerous county or city employees who sit in offices or are police officers or such who are vastly overpaid, this crew is vastly underpaid compared to the governments in this county," said Gary Mitchell, a Ruidoso attorney

Commissioners want state to keep rules loose if county attempts to lease out fort

Unless the state loosens its grip on Fort Stanton, Lincoln County Commissioners say they can't fare any better finding a new tenant than the state General Services Department, which has failed twice.

The second and most recent attempt by the state to find a tenant crashed this week when a selection committee rejected all four lease proposals.

The major problem appears to be the inflexible stand the state has taken on some key points, such as a clause that allows the state to cancel a lease at any time without cause, Commissioner Wilton Howell said.

"I'm confused, because when only one company submitted a lease proposal the first time, GSD

Secretary (Steven) Beffort scolded some of the companies we were talking to for not submitting a proposal," Howell said. "He kept saying if they had submitted, then the department could have worked with them on these problem areas. But that apparently isn't what happened this second time.

"They simply amaze me. If they can't negotiate or soften the requirements for applicants, then how could we? We'd look like a fool if we leased the fort knowing they could take it away, and then we sublet it without that provision."

GSD officials are considering leasing the fort to the county, which could then lease it to a private entity, GSD spokesman Carolyn Jackson said Wednesday. That also would place the burden of more than \$1 million in annual fort

maintenance costs on the shoulders of the commissioners.

Commissioners say they need a free rein without worrying that half-way through negotiations the state will step in and say it can't be done, he said.

"We're going to need more than the 10 minutes the governor gave us to work on this thing," County Commissioner Monroy Montes added. "The state just has to maintain a receptive attitude and they can't limit us to just 90 days (to find a tenant)."

Although Montes said the county couldn't promise subsidies to a tenant, Commissioner Bill Schwetzmann said economic development incentives may be available.

While it was open, the fort was the second-largest employer in the

county, providing more than 200 jobs. Johnson said it was too costly to keep open.

"This is the governor's mess and he got there because he didn't look down the road when he decided to close the fort (as a state hospital in March 1995)," Howell said.

Commissioner L. Ray Nunley has been pushing for the GSD to turn the fort back over to the state Health Department, pointing to the need for care of the elderly.

But he's worried by the time a tenant moves in, the place will be totally gutted of all equipment.

"I'm bothered by reports that the fort is being stripped and all of the computers and other equipment are being moved out by the GSD," Nunley said Thursday. No one was available at the GSD to comment on those reports.

Expansion of Carrizozo health clinic picked for county grant application

Improvement and expansion of the Carrizozo Health Clinic was chosen Tuesday as Lincoln County's application for a Community Development Block Grant.

Mike McCan from the Southeast New Mexico Economic Development District said the state has received \$14.5 million this year from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development for grants.

On a motion by Stirling Spencer, the county commissioners approved applying for \$400,000, noting they set aside plenty of matching money to improve chances for the grant.

Currently, residents may have to wait up to four months for a regular dental appointment at the clinic. The money could provide space for a second dentist, Spencer said.

The commission tried unsuccessfully for a grant for the same project last year. The county's strong financial position lost it points. The method of awarding points has since been revamped.

Three locals among six finalists for county manager

Three of the six finalists who will be interviewed for the position of Lincoln County manager live in the county and have been active in their communities.

They are:

- Frank Potter, project coordinator for the Ruidoso Downs Race Track and a Ruidoso village councilor who used to be Ruidoso's village manager and airport manager;
- Richard Swenor, former Ruidoso police chief, who currently is employed with security at the racetrack;
- and Jerry Wright, former manager of KBUY radio station in Ruidoso and a member of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

Three other applicants from New Mexico also are scheduled for interviews Tuesday:

- Jack Fox, director of state programs for the Department of the Military;
- Barbara France, director of special projects and public affairs for the county of Los Alamos;
- and Michael Obrey, manager of the city of Raton.

The six were selected from among more than 40 applications for the job vacated last month by Carolin Cooney, who resigned to take a position with the county of Santa Fe.

Grindstone Dam leaks normal, official says

On an average, mild Ruidoso day, the Grindstone Lake dam leaks 200 gallons of water per minute.

This is completely normal, Assistant Village Manager Alan Briley assures residents.

The dam's leakage doubles during the winter, allowing losses of 400 gallons each minute, Ruidoso officials say.

But this winter, about 600 gallons of water is leaking from the dam each minute — a rate that is excessive. Officials hope to plug up the flow with temporary repairs until they can find the money for a more permanent stop-gap measure.

"The dam is not going to burst,"

Briley said.

The water gushing out of Grindstone dam right now is coming through the dam's joints and is caused by the natural contractions of concrete.

"All dams have leaks, but you design them with joints," said Briley, who is an engineer. "If it was totally impermeable it would float away; everything is either designed to leak or move."

After about six years of the concrete's temperature-caused expansions, the sealant between the joints starts to crumble and break away from the concrete, allowing much heavier leakage.

That's the present case with Grindstone Dam, which last had sealants replaced in 1988, Briley said.

Scuba divers arrived at the lake yesterday to evaluate the condition of the approximately 60 joints. Two joints let excessive amounts of water pass, Briley said.

Divers will put temporary sealant on the cracks, Briley said.

Major work on the joints — something that must be done every six to seven years — might be budgeted for the next fiscal year by

village councilors, Briley said. He estimated that work could cost around \$50,000.

The lake contains about 1,000 acre feet of water, about 10 times more than Ruidoso's other reservoir, Alto Lake. (There are about 325,851 gallons on an acre foot.)

Alto Lake's leakage is quite different because its walls are clay and when leaks occur, they spill under the dam, Briley said.

Meanwhile, Ruidoso receives effluent credits for the lost water. And a good portion of the leakage is necessary for the health of the Rio Ruidoso, Briley added.

"Because it was a stream, by law we have to release a certain amount of water," he said. "So our leakage is our release."

Lincoln's Birthday

This is being sent to you a little after high noon on a bright and sunny day on Feb. 7, five days before the birthday of Abraham Lincoln.

He was born in a log cabin in Kentucky on Feb. 12, 1809, and although he grew up on the frontier and had very little schooling, he became one of our greatest presidents and also a giant on the scene of world history.

At six feet four, he was a giant in physical strength — a champion wrestler of his region. To match this physical side, he was endowed with intelligence, honesty, compassion, and a deeply spiritual nature.

Lincoln taught himself to read and figure by the light of the fireplace in his log cabin home. At a very early age, he developed a great fondness for learning.

Books were rare on the early frontier, and Lincoln would walk miles to borrow a book. Before long he had read all the books in his neighborhood.

The books which influenced his early life were the Bible, "Pilgrims Progress," "Robinson & Crusoe," "Aesop's Fables," the poems of Robert Burns, Mason Weems' "Life of Washington," and an autobiography of Benjamin Franklin. His favorite was the Bible, to which he referred for guidance all his life.

"Honest Abe"

His honesty was known throughout his neighborhood, where he was known as "Honest Abe."

The story is told of how he walked several miles in a snowstorm to pay back a few cents

White Oaks Fire Department to start probation period

The newly-created volunteer fire department of White Oaks is ready to begin its one-year probation period before becoming an official fire district, said Jim Treharn of the state fire marshal's office.

It has satisfied the basic criteria needed, such as water source, sufficient volunteers and fire apparatus. Once it has successfully completed the probation period, it will be eligible for the lowest amount of reimbursement, about \$22,000 in state money, because it is starting at the bottom of the insurance-rating chart, Treharn told Lincoln County Commissioners Tuesday.

The insurance-rating chart ranges from one to 10, and the top ranking is one. In New Mexico, the highest ranking of a department is three, Treharn said. The insurance rating indicates how well a department is able to protect its community. The better the rating, the more likely fire insurance premiums will go down.

Ranches of Sonterra subdivision can reduce bond during road wear test

Developers of Ranches of Sonterra subdivision were allowed Tuesday to cancel \$2.1 million in performance bonds posted while improvements were being constructed.

The development is located along Sierra Blanca Airport Road.

Because the improvements were finished, Properties of the Southwest can post a maintenance bond of \$321,000 or 15% of its performance bond while roads undergo a two-year wear test period. This allowance is part of a recent change in county subdivision regulations.

Government official defends Ruidoso Planning Department

It's the bane of any community's planning department to be cussed by its customers, a Ruidoso official says.

But the Ruidoso Planning Department has been getting an unfair shake, said Assistant Village Manager Alan Briley at the close of a recent P&Z Commission meeting.

"I'd like to talk of positives and get rid of that buzzword 'user friendly,'" Briley said.

Batted around at least once in the meeting, the catch phrase 'user friendly' in reference to the planners has been mentioned by at least two village council candidates, incumbent Robert Donaldson and Planning Commissioner Bob Sterchi.

Sterchi used the phrase as part of his campaign platform, saying the department needs to be more user friendly. Donaldson said the village is in the process of making the department more user friendly, and he's proud of it.

The political planning department reference irked Briley and may have been the catalyst behind his comments at the meeting, he said later.

But the criticisms and negative perceptions — suggesting stalled approvals, preferential treatment, poor communication — aren't new, and Briley said he's starting to take some of them personally.

"We're doing just about everything we can do in our budget to give P&Z the tools it needs," Briley said.

Planning Department Director Cleatus Richards handled an ever-increasing load with just the aid of a secretary until August 1994. Since then the department has added an assistant administrator, secretary and four part-time code enforcement officers.

Briley said the department's personnel growth reflects its heavy workload:

- Since 1988, total building permit values have risen 345%;
- Since 1992, total building permit values have increased

92.4%, and the department's caseload has risen by 192%;

— and 1993 and 1994 state government Rural Economic Development Council studies show Ruidoso has the highest building permit values of all New Mexico non-metropolitan areas; nearly \$16 million in 1994 and \$13 million in 1993. In the 1994 study, the village is second only to metro Farmington.

Complaints

P&Z Commission Chairman Mike Radziewicz, who's also a building contractor, said most complaints refer to rigid codes and their enforcement.

"People say Cleatus Richards is difficult, looking up every code," Radziewicz said. "But he's doing his job — and that's where the difficulty arises."

Upon investigation, Briley said he learns most problems stem from a lack of communication. Much of the staff is new and still learning the codes and ordinances, he said. All but Richards were hired in 1995.

At times staff has misunderstood what some applicants say they want or the applicants aren't up front about their plans. And, because of his illness, Richards' expertise was missing when many in the department were new, Radziewicz reasoned.

Richards suffered a heart attack last spring and has undergone two heart surgeries since that time.

But staff is gaining confidence, Briley said, and learning how to direct people to the information they need. A procedural list is offered to help applicants, and many gain permit approvals in 24 hours because of the relatively new summary procedure process.

Gotta say no

Having worked with P&Z departments for the past 12 years, Briley contends it's the very nature of what the department does that spawns most criticisms.

"They're always the bad guy —

always behind the (planning) code saying, 'No, no. Don't hit me, but I have to say no.'"

Many, especially those with "big egos," don't like to hear that, he said.

"Some say we only see black and white when there's gray areas in the code," he said. "But it's not really our job to interpret what someone wants — there's codes written we have to work with."

Many of the codes were revised or adopted in 1988, soon after Ruidoso's last building boom. Some of the codes have been impractical, Briley said, and he assumed they were modeled after codes in other communities.

"People have said we're anti-development," he said. "We're not. The codes were written for controlled, consistent growth — not anti-development."

Planning code changes on the way

Revamping planning codes that are either antiquated or impractical is a goal of Ruidoso's Planning and Zoning Commission.

Mayor Jerry Shaw is planning a workshop with commissioners and P&Z staff to study planning direction, and improvements are slowly being made to expedite P&Z processes, Briley said.

Commissioners have agreed to list codes they think should be changed and send them to the village council quarterly. Candidates will be codes frequently coming before them for variances, like reducing the requirement for 34-foot-wide roads to 24 feet — the standard in most communities, Radziewicz said.

Unnecessary code subsections will also be reviewed by the P&Z Commission. For instance, the commission voted to recommend deletion of two paragraphs of a home occupation code that specifically prohibit some home businesses while allowing others with similar trades to operate.

Drug charges dropped for judge's secretary

All cocaine trafficking charges against a Deming judge's secretary were dropped at a preliminary hearing in Ruidoso Magistrate Court Wednesday.

Judge William Butts ruled the state lacked evidence proving Theresa Guaderrama, 36, was involved in the purchase of a kilo of cocaine in the Furr's parking lot on U.S. Highway 70 in Ruidoso on Jan. 10.

Guaderrama, who was released from custody on an unsecured bond the day after her arrest, is the secretary to 2nd District Court Judge Manuel Saucedo.

Guaderrama had been charged with being an accessory to trafficking cocaine and conspiracy to trafficking, second and third-degree felonies respectively.

Last week, Butts found probable

cause in the charges against Guaderrama's boyfriend, Roberto Carrillo, 44. He is charged with cocaine trafficking and conspiracy to trafficking, second and third-degree felonies respectively. He faces up to 16 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine. He had a previous drug conviction in New York, Butts said.

Carrillo is still being held on a \$100,000 bond at the Lincoln County Jail.

Carrillo allegedly purchased a kilo of cocaine from undercover state police officers inside an RV in the parking lot. He allegedly paid for the drugs with a fur coat, gold bracelet, pickup truck and Ford tractor — about \$12,000 worth of merchandise, police said.

Guaderrama had been seated in a pickup throughout the alleged transaction, but police testified they saw her pass the fur coat out

the window to Carrillo. Police also testified Guaderrama followed Carrillo from Deming to the parking lot in a separate vehicle.

Butts ruled the state police narcotics agent and the New Mexico Public Safety agent failed to present any evidence that Guaderrama had knowledge of the drug deal or helped negotiate it.

"It's certainly the state's burden to show she had knowledge of what was going on, but it presented no evidence that she did," Butts said after the 90-minute hearing. "Who knows what she thought was going on — she could have thought he was selling the coat."

Assistant District Attorney Roxanne Matise prosecuted for the state.

Guaderrama, who was defended by attorney Gary Mitchell, was not required to testify, Butts said.

hired to represent the workers.

"I don't think there's too much question that they do the nastiest, dirtiest work of any government employees and they're the lowest paid," Mitchell said. "Some are barely making minimum wage. If they had a union, they would have gone on strike a long time ago."

"They don't want to lose their jobs and they want to continue to do their work. They want to try to work within the system, but the system better not ignore them."

Mitchell doubts a "normal grievance procedure" can handle the problem.

"If it's typically the way they follow a normal grievance procedure, it means these guys are going to get screwed and I guarantee you these guys are not going to get screwed," he said. Authority board members "have a problem and they need to solve it, and they better not give us the bureaucratic run-around. They've known about it for years."

But Frank Cummins, chairman of the authority, said he had not heard some of the specific allegations mentioned Wednesday by the workers.

"These things have not been presented to us by prior management," he said. "It's hard for a group that meets once a month to know. We weren't aware if someone wasn't being paid overtime. As a board, we try to leave the daily operation up to the manager. We are trying to address budget problems and look at reorganizing."

Until next July, the authority has to work within the budget approved by the state and it's already marginal, he said. The board has no power to set collection rates. Any

increase to boost revenues would have to be approved by each of the governments that are members of the authority.

The coalition of the county and its five municipalities was formed four years ago to collect garbage, and to operate a regional landfill with a parallel organization in Otero County.

When the authority hired Corlis Dobson as the new manager in November, he was directed to put job descriptions, a salary schedule and replacement of aging equipment at the top of his priority list. But Dobson resigned after three months.

Former manager Joe Lewandowski resigned in May 1995 to run his own business and act as a consultant to other garbage groups, but he came into the office part time for six months until Dobson was hired.

Authority employees' wages compare favorably with other collections groups, Lewandowski said Wednesday. The authority budget always has been tight, because of the effort to keep monthly customer charges low, he said.

Merritt said it's time for the members of the authority to be more realistic about the cost of operation, and set residential and commercial rates accordingly. He'd also like government members to write off the authority's long-term debt on aging equipment purchased from two villages and the county. That would save more than \$100,000 a year that could be used to boost pay or add new equipment, he said.

"This doesn't pertain to me anymore, I'm out the door," Merritt said. "But I hate to see it fall apart."

When I came to the transfer station, these men were fighting each other and now they work together as a team."

The board didn't refuse to meet with employees before the sick-out, Cummins said.

"I didn't see the request signed by the men until after they didn't report to work," he said. "We will schedule a meeting by next Wednesday since we also have a budget-cutting session scheduled then and this is involved."

Authority employees' grievances

Some of the specific complaints registered by Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority employees include:

- past promises of pay raises or bonuses have not been kept;
- there is no consistency in employee wages, with new drivers being hired at higher salaries than long-time drivers;
- equipment is substandard and unsafe;
- they must work holidays when other cities simply postpone collections;
- they are not paid overtime;
- an incentive to finish routes faster and help out on other jobs was abolished;
- since Lewandowski left, repair of dumpsters has stopped;
- the workforce has been cut and should have been increased;
- and an indoor maintenance area is needed so the men do not have to work outside in cold weather.

New Mexico plan to reduce juvenile crime

The New Mexico Legislature has just one week left to come to grips with the tragic increase in juvenile crime which has broken hearts and shattered lives in every part of our state.

At stake is public safety, the first responsibility of government. At risk, too, is a generation of teenagers and our future as a society.

If you have not been touched by the violence that stalks big-city neighborhoods and rural communities alike, you would be touched by the anguished words of a mother who buried her son — the pride of her life — on his 14th birthday. If you looked into the eyes of a mother whose only son was shot to death a year ago, you could not escape sharing her grief which remains as fresh as her memory of his laughter.

Last fall, after six months of research and thoughtful development, Governor Gary Johnson and I presented a plan to reform the juvenile corrections system. "Restoring Justice" is based on key principles: holding kids accountable for their behavior and giving them a firm response at the first sign of trouble; giving priority to restitution and community service; requiring families to participate in the rehabilitation process; and expanding capacity to address a dangerous overcrowding problem. "Restoring Justice" emphasizes community-

based services to help kids get their lives on the right track to responsible living. We need to do a better job at early intervention to prevent kids from committing more serious crimes and falling deeper into the system. There's no real debate about these points.

But, there is a vigorous debate about one aspect of the plan: what to do about overcrowding and lack of segregation of violent kids from the non-violent.

I believe that with a 35% increase in juvenile crime in just three years, and a 47% increase in violent crime in just two years, and correctional facilities which are dangerously overcrowded, we have no choice but to expand the capacity of the system. To do less than that threatens public safety and limits our ability to turn kids' lives around.

The other side argues that early intervention alone is the answer, and that scores of juveniles have been locked up who would be just fine if they were sent home.

But when we scrutinized the files of more than 800 kids in our custody on Dec. 1, 1995, and gathered another 40,000 pieces of data about them by talking with the professionals who have direct, personal contact with each kid, we found that only 29 of 597 kids at the New Mexico Boys School, the Youth Diagnostic and Development Center, and the New Mexico Girls School could fairly be described as posing little risk to public safety.

By any reasonable standard, the facilities have 141 kids more than they were designed to handle, and 112 of those kids are too dangerous to be turned loose in your neighborhood.

New Mexico needs a 50-bed facility designed to handle the most violent juveniles in our custody. This will allow better management of the less violent and more workable kids we have at our existing open-campus facilities, and give them a fighting chance for rehabilitation.

We searched the nation for programs which work elsewhere and which are cost-effective alternatives to traditional correction programs. We want approaches that work, not just more of the same. New Mexico needs a leadership camp and two work camps, to build character and strong work habits in kids who have had little experience with structure and discipline.

We cannot afford to throw away our teenagers who are in trouble, nor can we continue to ignore the growing risk to public safety posed by kids with no conscience.

If you share my concern about juvenile crime, and you share my commitment to doing something about it, then please invest in a couple of phone calls to your state senator and your state representative, and tell them it's time to give our juvenile justice system the tools it needs to do its job.

That's the first step toward making our streets safe again.

Cigarette tax way to solve shortfall

TO THE EDITOR:

I would like readers to know

that an increase in our state's cigarette tax would be an excellent alternative to cuts in educational spending or increases in college tuition. An increase in New Mexico's cigarette tax rate would add tens of millions of dollars in revenue to the state's general fund, move New Mexico in line with other states' cigarette taxes, and save lives while preventing young people from starting to smoke.

An increase of 20 cents per pack would add over \$18 million of revenue to New Mexico. A 30-cent increase would create over \$26 million, and an increase of 40 cents would result in \$39 million for our state's coffers. We certainly have room for a tax increase on cigarettes.

Sadly, New Mexico ranks near the bottom when it comes to taxes on cigarettes. There are 35 states that have higher tax rates than New Mexico's 21 cent-per-pack tax. Increasing our tax by 20 cents would rank New Mexico 14th among industrial states. A 30-cent increase would rank us eighth. Incidentally, the highest cigarette tax in the U.S. is Michigan at 75 cents per pack.

Most importantly, increasing the cost of cigarettes is proven to motivate current smokers to quit, and young people not to start. That's a key point to remember when you consider that cigarettes kill more Americans than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, fires, illegal

drugs, murders, and suicides combined.

Please join me in calling upon our state's legislators to consider an increase in New Mexico's cigarette tax as a viable alternative to cuts in educational spending or increases in tuition. The lives we save could be our own, and the money raised could make our good schools even better.

Tobosa helps disabled to reach for the stars

Tobosa Developmental Services, a private, non-profit program dedicated to helping people with developmental disabilities (headquartered in Roswell, has expanded to serve the Ruidoso area.

Tobosa began as a grassroots movement in the mid-1960s, when a group of Roswell parents wanted to help a few "retarded" children. The program was originally called the Association for Retarded Citizens but changed its name to Tobosa in the fall of 1978. The name Tobosa, which is a grass that grows in the region, signifies the grassroots beginnings of the program and the growth it inspires.

"Tobosa's vision and dream for the future is that all people with disabilities will be able to have access to support and services to help them maintain a high sense of self worth and self esteem," program director Joe Madrid said. "We want to help people who have inadequate daily living skills to realize their maximum potential."

The majority of people who use Tobosa services have been evaluated as developmentally disabled, a severe chronic disability which is caused by a mental or physical impairment, Madrid said. "Most of those in Tobosa have disabilities that are expected to continue throughout their lifetime," he said.

Currently, Tobosa serves 130 clients in the Roswell area. Adult social skills, personal grooming, survival skills and money concepts are some of the things Tobosa teaches.

"Tobosa helps adults with functional limitations to learn basic living skills," he said. "We also provide a way for them to experience life in the community."

Another aspect of the Tobosa

philosophy is building self-esteem through work.

Tobosa clients work in several Roswell businesses, including Pizza Hut, Levi Strauss and NovaBus.

Tobosa also offers a variety of living arrangements for program participants, including:

- independent living with no staff supervision. Participants pay for their own housing expenses.
- assisted living with minimum supervision. Participants pay for housing expenses.
- supported transitional living with six to 16 hours of daily staff supervision. Tobosa helps with housing expenses.
- supervised living for participants who require 24-hour supervision. Living expenses are paid by Tobosa.

"We really place an emphasis on teaching life skills in all of the different living arrangements," Madrid said. "Our entire focus is to help keep developmentally disabled people living and working in the community."

"This means we only provide the necessary staff supervision and support, from one hour a month to 24-hour supervision."

Tobosa is funded from a variety of sources including local, state and federal funds; the United Way; individual and business donations; and service clubs.

"Although Tobosa contracts with the state for funding to provide services, we are not a state agency," Madrid said. "We look forward to a rich and fulfilling future in the Ruidoso area, doing what we do best: providing a necessary service to those in need."

Tobosa Developmental Services is nationally accredited through the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities. For more information about the program call (505) 624-1025.



Ames brings history to life in Ruidoso High classroom

For the last 20 years, Ruidoso high school history teacher and wrestling coach Gerald Ames has managed to make a dry subject interesting and a grunt sport glorious.

He is easily one of more popular teachers, not because he's easy but because he makes the subject come to life with the help of his unique teaching techniques.

"Mr. Ames gets students involved in conversation. It's not just a history class," says student

Natalie Stanaland.

Patricia Higginbotham agrees.

"This class is the only class I actually pay attention in because he makes you a part of the lesson; you're not just sitting in a desk," she says.

Ames aims to show students how history applies to them, how it affects them. It's a formula that seems to work.

"History is not boring because it's about people, and ultimately people are interested in people," Ames says from his classroom, which is covered wall to wall with historically-related posters.

Ames' interest in and appreciation of people came early in life. He also learned the importance of the adage "To thine own self be true."

"My mother had a stroke when I was born and she had another one when I was 15. Many of the rules that violate society, my mother violated daily. She slobbered. She couldn't talk. She was a cripple and yet, she did a tremendous job," Ames recalls. "I really have a problem with the way people look at people, and social values of what is good and what is bad. I grew up in a family that everybody pointed at in the store because my mother slobbered."

Ames' father was a geologist, and he grew up in New Mexico mining towns where a lot of his friends were immigrants.

"The Catholic-Spanish standard has been a part of my life as much as the Protestant-White, Anglo-Saxon types. A lot of those rules seem foolish to me," Ames says. "There's nobody I don't get along with. I don't have any prejudices — except for maybe the rich and wealthy," he adds with a laugh.

After graduating from Manzano High School in Albuquerque, Ames enrolled at the University of New Mexico in 1965. He held a full-time job while in college and that put him on the seven-year program. Ames graduated in 1972 with a bachelor's in university studies.

Ames claims he wasn't an active participant in the social unrest of the early 1970s, but being in school at the that time did lead him to conclusions about certain values.

"It allowed me to set my standards," Ames says. "And to realize that's OK."

Ames began his teaching career in Penasco where he taught for four years and coached football and wrestling.

"I was the social studies department," says Ames, who taught government, economics, world history and American history at the tiny school in north-central New Mexico.

From there, Ames came to Ruidoso in 1976 and he's been a fixture ever since. He arrived with wife Cathy, to whom he's been married 25 years, and an infant daughter named Sarah. They've had two more daughters since, Jenny and Melissa.

He wasn't hired to coach at Ruidoso, but by his second year Ames had the wrestling team.

"In some ways, it's not an attractive sport, a popular sport. It's a sport where, if you're good, you get the glory," Ames observes.

Ruidoso has never had a great wrestling team, but it has had its share of good individual wrestlers, Ames says. His best team was the 1985 group he describes as "nasty across the board."

That team should have won the district title, but a scorekeeping error sent the championship banner to Cobre instead. That team also produced two of Ames' finest wrestlers, Jeff Schmidt and Scott Yateman. Both Schmidt and Yateman recorded 35-5 marks their senior years in 1989.

Bubba Lane was Ames' first state champion, in 1989. Lane won the title as a junior in the 155-pound division. The next year, heavyweight McCabe Turner gave Ames another state champion when he defeated Belen's entry. Turner entered the state tournament with a record of 8-12. After defeating the Belen wrestler, who came with a 34-1 record, Turner ended his senior year with a 12-12 mark and state title.

At Manzano, Ames wrestled for only two years and played football for four years.

"I never did figure it (wrestling) out," Ames says, admitting his lack of success as a wrestler has resulted in a few limitations in his coaching.

"As simple as it is, it's so technical," Ames explains.

The sport attracts different students for different reasons.

"You have two types of kids in wrestling. You have those meanies that just like to beat on people and hurt people. And then you have the intellectual who likes the thousand

Students of today, yesterday not that different, Ames says

Gerald Ames, a student of history and a teacher for more than two decades, doesn't see a whole lot of difference between the teenagers of today and yesterday.

It's the public's "drive-by perception" that paints kids as being worse, Ames says.

"We had gangs before. There were car gangs and street gangs. In the '70s we had drugs and long hair. Today, we have kids doing drugs again. It's coming back.

"They're still kids trying to find their way. The world has changed. There are kids that push the edge. There are kids that try hard. There are kids that don't do anything."

The answer to the educational crisis isn't always at school. Real education takes place at home, Ames contends.

"The kids who do best in school have a lot of support at home," he observes.

Ames' father provided him that support. The television in the Ames household was shut off from Sunday evening (after "The Wonderful World of Disney") until Friday afternoon. There was no television viewing during the week because that was supposed to be a time for studying.

"The rule was, if you had straight As and Bs, then the TV could be on," recalls Ames, the oldest of six children. "The TV was shut off in 1961 when I started high school and didn't come on — except for on the weekends — until 1982 when my youngest sister graduated from high school, because someone

always got a C."

Ames had his share of failure in college, which helps him relate to both his students and wrestlers.

"I have nine hours of Fs on my college transcripts — six hours in French 101 and three hours in Spanish 101," he says. "I happen to believe in failure. If you're not failing, you're not trying much. You should be stretching and be trying to do things you can't."

Ames lets his students choose at what level they want to succeed. His grading scale lines up certain tasks and skills and associates them with a grade.

To earn a D, a student must attend class, take notes from Ames' lectures and organize the information. For a C, a student must complete the D level work, read the history text and outline the information for reading comprehension. B level students have a 70% average on tests, demonstrating an ability to regurgitate information. For an A, a student has to be self-motivated and complete four extra projects.

"If a kid gets a C, that's his choice," Ames says.

Is education today better or worse than yesterday? Is the world a better place today than yesterday?

Ames answers that question with some historical perspective.

"I always look at this: my grandfather got World War I for his graduation; my dad got World War II for his graduation; I got Vietnam, which was a real cool thing; and my children aren't having a war...."

moves and is a student of the game," Ames says.

"I have the kid who on weekends is at Springer, and the other kid who on weekends is playing in the band and is working on his AP (advanced placement) test," he adds.

To Ames, this is a healthy mix of students and part of the larger educational process.

"The purpose of schools is to integrate kids. We are not a monolith. We are a society of thousands of different ways of doing things and morals and values," Ames says.


"America is successful because it allows all these people to come together, and there's more than one

right answer. Then we get to choose the answers.

"School is a place where we can get together. Wrestling teams are a place where kids of all different types can get together."

That interaction with others gives people more choices, which is a main reason to get an education, Ames says.

As for history's connection with choices, Ames says, "It is just people going through, trying to find their path. History is studying that trail and trying not to make the same errors. The main reason to study it is to give you more than one answer. It behooves us to try to find a lot of answers."

PAST TENSE

Las Vegas (the one in this state) was a wild place

Las Vegas, New Mexico, was one of the wildest towns that the old west had to offer, but it is doubtful Hollywood ever has or ever will use its name in a film — for the simple reason that it would be confused by most filmgoers with its more famous namesake in Nevada.

However, back in the 1880s when today's gambling mecca was still the proverbial one-horse town, Las Vegas, New Mexico was booming. And it had more than its share of vice, gunmen, and violence. In January of 1880, the town was wracked by a spasm of violence that would rival anything that happened in, say, Dodge City.

Four would-be cowboy desperados drifted into town and began making the customary rounds of the saloons, gambling halls and brothels. While they were not particularly well-known in town, they would be within a few short days. Their names were Tom Henry, John Dorsey, Jim West and Wm. "Big" Randall.

On the night of Jan. 22, the four ne'er-do-wells entered the Close and Patterson Dance Hall in East Las Vegas, wearing their pistols in plain view.

Contrary to what most films tell us, it was illegal to carry firearms in nearly every town in the west, and Las Vegas was not an exception to this rule.

When the city marshal, a 40-year-old Tennessean named Joe Carson asked them to check their guns, they just snickered.

When he asked them again, they put their pistols on more prominent display than Joe had intended, and proceeded to ventilate him in numerous places. The marshal actually managed to get his gun out and get off a couple of rounds before collapsing to the floor a dead man.

But they were shooting at the wrong man.

At the far end of the bar, one of Carson's deputies was having a quiet drink when the ruckus started.

This particular deputy did not have the sort of appearance that would instantly cow anyone: At 5'7" tall, he was rail-thin enough to be confused with someone who had tuberculosis, or consumption, as it was known in those days.

His name was Dave Mather, and he was known throughout the frontier as "Mysterious Dave."

Dave lived up to his nickname, both then and now. The little we do know about him contains one fascinating fact: Dave was descended from Cotton Mather, the man who presided at the infamous Salem Witch Trials.

Back to the gunfight: even before Carson hit the ground, Mather had pulled his pistol and opened fire on the four killers. It was estimated that more than 40 shots were fired in the ensuing gun battle.

When the gunsmoke finally cleared, "Big" Randall lay on the floor, very dead. Jim West lay nearby with two bullets through his body, but still alive. Henry and Dorsey escaped out the back door in the confusion.

Henry had one of Mather's bullets in his leg, which slowed him down considerably.

Nevertheless, the two made it to a nearby corral where, at gunpoint, they ordered an employee to saddle some horses. Then they galloped out of town.

The next morning, the *Las Vegas Optic* commented that "Dave Mather is bulletproof."

The citizens of Las Vegas were outraged by the whole tragedy, and a manhunt for the two fugitives was initiated.

On Feb. 6, a posse led by Mather captured them in Mora, N.M., and promptly returned them to Las Vegas where they joined the dying, but still breathing West in the calaboose.

That night a mob, again led by Mysterious Dave (now living up to his ancestor's name), removed the fugitives from the jail and led them to the windmill in the plaza at the center of town. Before it was torn down, this windmill was to become an extremely popular place for impromptu

executions.

West (who had to be carried on a stretcher), Henry and Dorsey, all of whom were under 21, saw it coming.

West pleaded for mercy from people whom he had made merciless. Henry, apparently made of sterner stuff, commented, "It's pretty tough to be hung, but I guess I can stand the consequences." Dorsey's comments, if any, went unrecorded.

Apparently concerned that West might die of his wounds before they had a chance to hang him, a noose was fitted over his neck as he lay on his stretcher, and he was simply jerked into the air — "jerked to Jesus," they used to call it.

Unfortunately, no one thought to tie his hands, and he immediately slipped them under the rope and began screaming for his mother. Then, to add insult to injury, his pants fell down. "Please button my pants," he requested of no one in particular.

At this point in the festivities, Joe Carson's widow picked up a rifle and began shooting at the three doomed men. The other citizens joined in the fun and in no time at all the three killers lay riddled.

After all three were buried in a communal grave the next morning, the coroner noted that they had come to their deaths at the hands of "parties unknown."

It was not long afterwards that Mysterious Dave left Las Vegas to return to his old haunts in Dodge City, Kansas. Here, Dave became an assistant marshal and posed for his only known picture. He was shortly replaced by a man named Tom Nixon, and a feud began to fester between the two. Some said Mather was "hanging around" with Nixon's wife.

On the night of July 18, 1884, Nixon, who was passing by the foot of the stairs in the "Opera House" (a saloon), spied Mather standing at the head of the stairs. Drawing his pistol, Nixon took a shot at Mysterious Dave and missed.

Thinking that he had killed Mather, Nixon rushed outside to announce to all who would listen that he had just killed Mysterious Dave, and that "he was glad."

Nixon was promptly disarmed and escorted to his own jail, where legendary lawman Bill Tilghman told him, "You ought to shoot straight, or not at all, with a man like Dave Mather. Watch out, now. He'll get you."

Tilghman was right. Mather did indeed "get" Nixon. Three nights later, on the night of July 21, 1884, the two protagonists met again, and for the last time.

Curiously, the gunfight happened in exactly the same place as the last one. Only this time, Mather was at the foot of the stairs, and Nixon at the top. And this time, Mather shot first. Nixon was hit four times and died instantly.

The authorities began to drop heavy hints that it would be well if Mysterious Dave moved on, which he obliged them by doing in short order.

Mysterious Dave Mather was last seen in Lone Pine, Nebraska in 1887. After that, what happened to him is anyone's guess.

He wasn't known as Mysterious Dave for nothing.

C.W. Wingfield, county assessor spent several days in the city last week.





Nature Mini-series Airs Over Three Consecutive Nights

There is a world that exists alongside our own, but is only marginally visible to us — a place of indescribable strangeness, where creatures can freeze solid at night and thaw back to life again each morning; where life can exist in a blast furnace; where millions of combatants fight epic wars unseen by human eyes, and billions of messages travel daily along a communications network unintelligible to human senses.

Sandra Davis: a dream of holistic healing

Like many who first visit Ruidoso, it was love at first sight for Sandra Davis. Davis, a chiropractor, was enthralled by Ruidoso's small-town atmosphere and the area's clean air, clean water and nice people.

On her sister's advice, Davis visited in February 1991. Four months later, she opened her practice in a "tiny office" on Mechem Drive.

That tiny office has since grown into the Centre for the Healing Arts — a place where Davis made a home for other naturalistic health care providers. When she first envisioned it, she saw a place where alternative health practitioners could complement each other. And that's exactly what it has become.

"The massage therapists in town were starving to death and moving away. They didn't have the support and a place to work," Davis said. The Centre gave them that place.

At the Centre for the Healing Arts, located at 100 Lower Terrace, people can find alternative healthcare providers who offer acupressure, acupuncture, colon therapy, reflexology, nutritional counseling and rolfing (rolfing is a body alignment technique), in addition to massage therapy.

"We strive to have the best licensed, certified practitioners," Davis said. "We are writing, teaching and offering a free lecture series on the second Wednesday every month at the Centre."

She and others will also be hosting the third annual Alternative Health Fair in June at the Ruidoso Convention Center.

"We've had people from El Paso and Albuquerque who wanted to be exhibitors (at the health fair)," Davis said. Last year's fair drew 30 exhibitors.

Education has gone a long way to improve people's acceptance of alternative health practices, Davis said.

"It's a movement back to the basics which includes food, herbs and natural treatments. All we do is complement the body and the body heals itself," Davis said.

Davis' scope and influence reaches beyond her successful practice. The San Antonio native helps with Lincoln County Children's Outreach, a program that assists families with children who have learning and behavior problems. She's also trying to educate others about attention-deficit disorder.

Additionally, Davis is a supporter of the Museum of the Horse.

Gloria Flores nominated Davis for "Woman of the Year" because of Davis'





They'd met Roy and Mildred Crocker on their first visit to the village, and it was through Mildred that Edmonds was turned on to the Greeters.


"It added a new dimension to my life," Edmonds says. "I was doing things unlike what I had been doing."


