**Potter picked as
county manager**

Ruidoso Village Councilor Frank Potter was hired late Tuesday as Lincoln County manager.

Commission Chairman Monroy Montes said his board voted 4-1 to hire Potter out of a field of six finalists. Commissioner Stirling Spencer cast the negative vote.

He will resign his elected councilor position.

The Ruidoso mayor and council may appoint any qualified voter to finish the two years left in Potter's position, or call a special election at least 30 days after the already-scheduled March 5 municipal election.

**Early voting for

Registered voters can start casting their ballots now for municipal elections in Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Capitan and Carrizozo.

Early voting takes place in each village clerk's office through 5 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 29. Regular election day is March 5.

**Commissioners
dictate terms for
finding fort tenant**

A letter is on its way to Gov. Gary Johnson letting him know Lincoln County Commissioners want a free hand in finding a new tenant for Fort Stanton — or they don't want to take responsibility for the former state hospital.

"We decided to write Johnson to tell him we're not willing to take the liability with strings attached, and that we want to deal directly with him, not the state General Services Department selection committee," said Commissioner L. Ray Nunley.

"Anything less would be wasting their time and ours," Commission Chairman Monroy Montes said today. "We made an honest effort to work as partners with the state."

State restrictions created stumbling blocks that resulted in two failed attempts to find tenants to lease the historic fort about 25 miles northeast of Ruidoso, he said. The fort, the county's second-largest employer while operating, was closed last March by Johnson.

"If the state has a use for it, they better move," Montes said. "Their foresight is terrible. At one point, we had several regional groups interested, but after a year, it's difficult to revive interest."

Government won't shut down again, Skeen assures locals

Questions about the federal budget, health care and taxes were fielded by U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen (R-NM) at a town hall meeting in Ruidoso Saturday.

"We are here to gauge what you are interested in and what you think about what's going on at the federal level," he told the crowd of approximately 60 people at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

Skeen, who owns a ranch in the Hondo Valley, also talked about a more local issue, the future use of Fort Stanton north of Ruidoso.

"I understand a lot of people are interested in making it a museum or recreational area," he said. "We'll do what we can but the state's got to take the lead and decide whether they want to get in or get out."

Skeen assured the audience that the federal government won't shut down again because of budget differences between Congress and the president.

"We're making progress and we're not going to shut the government down again," Skeen said. "I think it's settled down and they're going to get the budget agreed upon."

The necessity for balancing the budget now is paramount, Skeen said.

"If we don't balance this budget and start paying off this national debt, by the year 2002 we're going to be in a position where we can't," he said. "Some-

thing has to be done and now's the time to face up to it, because we don't want to leave a mess for our children and grandchildren."

Ruidoso councilor J.D. James asked Skeen for an update about the health care debate on Capitol Hill.

"Health care is one of the most important topics under discussion, particularly when it comes to the elderly and people indisposed one way or another, and that's why a home health plan is one consideration that's in the mix," Skeen said.

Cutting Medicare benefits instead of investigating Medicare abuse was another topic addressed.

"If I pay the medical bill, it's ready when I go out the door," one person in the audience said. "But if Medicare pays the bill, I don't see the damn thing for six months and I don't know what's being charged for and what's not."

Skeen agreed and pointed out that some medical providers and pharmacies don't want people to

Time rapidly running out for gambling bill's passage

The issue of any kind of gambling in New Mexico hangs in the balance as the Legislature comes to a screeching halt at noon Thursday. As of Tuesday, no gambling bills were making any progress.

Of all the bills introduced, only a bill to allow video gaming at veterans and fraternal clubs and video gaming at racetracks seemed to be making any headway, although the headway it was making was into a stiff anti-gambling wind sweeping the Legislature.

Saturday, the bill made it out of the House Business and Industry Committee, but the House Taxation and Revenue Committee Tuesday refused to let the bill proceed.

Even if passed in the House, the bill would likely still face Senate committees and the Senate floor before going to the governor for his signature.

Gov. Gary Johnson announced

Monday he will not call a special session to deal with the gaming issue, even if the Legislature does not pass any type of gaming laws. Tuesday he said a special session may be needed, but for budget work, not gambling bills.

It is unlikely the Legislature itself could muster the two-thirds votes needed in both houses to call a special session for gambling.

State Horsemen's Association leader Mike Weatherly said late Sunday, "I could have stayed in bed" that day since the House Judiciary Committee did not discuss the bill Sunday as scheduled. The committee also failed to address the bill on Monday, but Weatherly said he was "in for the long run."

"I've seen it through this far," Weatherly said. "I'm not going to quit now."

Under the horse track proposal in committee, racetracks could have an unlimited number of machines, playable at least 12 hours a day. A

15% tax would be levied on the machines' gross revenue (the amount taken in, minus prizes).

The Business and Industry Committee voted 7-3 to approve the bill, sponsored by Majority Leader Michael Olguin (D-Socorro).

A committee member who voted against it, Rep. Ted Hobbs (D-Albuquerque), said he didn't believe there was time to properly handle gaming issues before the end of the session.

Many legislators here have expressed the opinion that the court should be allowed to settle a lawsuit brought against U.S. Attorney John Kelly. Then there will be a clearer indication of what is and is not legal with Indian gaming. The suit is likely to come to trial in June or July.

Once that decision is made, those legislators feel they can move on gaming legislation, but that means the subject would not be dealt with until the next legislative session in 1997.

Gas companies battle over which will serve Capitan area

A modern range war broke out last week around Capitan, as a small municipal gas association attempted to defend its territory from a large competitor.

Employees of Zia Natural Gas were ordered by District Judge Richard A. Parsons to stop laying pipeline around the village after a suit for breach of contract was filed Monday by the Capitan-Carrizozo Natural Gas Association.

But employees continued to install the line in violation of the order and were removed from the site on Landfill Road Wednesday, said J. Robert Beauvais, attorney for the municipal gas association.

"We served (notice of the injunction order to) David Hamilton's manager in Ruidoso Downs," Beauvais said. Hamilton is president of Natural Gas Processing, a Wyoming corporation and Zia's parent company. When Beauvais heard Zia workers were back on the job last Wednesday, sheriff's deputies went out and shut the work down.

"I'm filing a motion for an order to show cause why

they shouldn't be held in contempt for violating restraining order," Beauvais said. The hearing is set for today (Wednesday) in Carrizozo.

Zia submitted a motion to remove the injunction. The municipal association filed a breach of contract suit seeking a preliminary injunction against Zia Feb. 5 after negotiations broke down while the two companies were trying to settle a service area territorial dispute.

"They just went full speed ahead and went out there laying pipe like crazy all around Capitan," Beauvais said. "We also have action pending in front of the Public Utilities Commission, so we went ahead and sued them."

Parson's order stipulated that Zia should stop contacting people to hook up to their system.

"They're also trying to get a franchise from the city of Capitan, basically trying to break the back of the little (municipal) gas company," Beauvais said.

Dana Stevenson, division manager for Zia, told the Capitan Board of Trustees Monday the company still

Heavily armed man enters police department, is arrested

A Ruidoso man walked into the police department armed like Rambo Tuesday morning.

"It's very strange to me for a man to enter the police department dressed like that and armed like that," Ruidoso Police Detective Jim Biggs said. "But, basically, it seems he had voices in his head telling him to come in here and blow people away."

Julian Morales, 45, a Mexican National who works as a prep cook at the Great Wall of China in Ruidoso, was wearing a bullet-proof vest and carrying a loaded Chinese assault rifle and two handguns, Biggs said.

Detention officer Alan Hazel, who was manning the Ruidoso Police Department dispatch and jail,

saw Morales walk in at 6 a.m. wearing a camouflage vest and speaking in Spanish. Hazel came out from the dispatch area and then saw that Morales was armed with a SKS 7.62mm Chinese assault rifle with a 40-round banana

clip and bayonet attached.

Hazel grabbed the rifle and ran back into the jail area, behind a bulletproof window. He then asked if Morales had any more weapons. He did.

Morales lifted his shirt and allegedly pointed to a .357 revolver tucked in his waistband.

Biggs, who just happened to be in his office during the early-morning incident, heard Hazel call on the police radio for a Spanish-speaking officer to assist a man armed with a gun.

Biggs pulled out his 40 caliber Glock handgun, came through another door and surprised Morales, saying, "Que pasa?"

As Morales turned toward Biggs, Hazel started waving wildly from

Merritt is first to announce for sheriff

Ray Merritt is convinced his background in military intelligence coupled with proven management skills will translate to success if he's elected Lincoln County Sheriff.

The 48-year-old Republican is the first to declare officially his candidacy for the office of sheriff in the November election.

Incumbent Sheriff James McSwane has not returned phone calls about whether he will run for another term. He has served eight years and has been dodging political bullets for the past year.

Last week, Merritt resigned as manager of the garbage transfer station for the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority. His former boss praised his ability to organize the operation there.

"The Sheriff's Office needs direction," Merritt said. "I would provide leadership and work closely with other law enforcement agencies as well as communicate on a regular basis with the commission and the public."

"The first thing I would do is commission all other law enforce-

ment officers (from other jurisdictions in the county) to operate in the county with no question of liability."

He also would try to set up joint training programs with other departments and provide more training for members of the posse, Merritt said.

"I'd like to see a physical examination implemented for officers, plus an annual written evaluation to be done by their immediate supervisors," Merritt said.

Born in Wilmington, Del., Merritt joined the Army in 1964, served three tours in Germany, two tours in Vietnam, and one tour each in Panama and Honduras.

From 1990-93, he was senior air defense adviser, senior weapons adviser and security instructor for the guards of the royal family in Saudi Arabia.

"The military was the love of my life," Merritt said.

Since retiring from the Army, he was employed in the summer of 1994 as a security officer at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track, and

was hired the following October by the solid waste group.

Besides his years with the military police, intelligence and security, Merritt's law enforcement background includes serving as a reserve deputy for the Sierra County Sheriff's Office and for the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Department. He's been a member of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Posse for two years.

Merritt raised two sons on his own. He earned an associate's in applied science and has taken several courses in leadership.

Domestic violence charge a first

Ruidoso police scored their first conviction last week under a relatively new domestic violence law.

The statute makes violence against a family member a crime. In the past, domestic violence offenders could only be charged with general assault or battery.

In the department's first application of the law, they arrested Jay Glenn McClanahan, 29, early Jan. 17 for allegedly battering his wife and yanking a big clump of hair from her head.

McClanahan was kept at the Lincoln County Jail on a \$25,000 bond until Feb. 5, when he pleaded guilty in Ruidoso Magistrate Court to assault against a household member, a petty misdemeanor, and aggravated battery against a household member, a misdemeanor.

Judge William Butts gave McClanahan suspended sentences on both counts. He will be on probation for 180 days on the assault charge and 345 days on the aggravated battery charge. He was also told to stay away from his wife.

Although McClanahan's sentence is about the same as those before the domestic violence penalty took effect, the violence against a household member criminal statute carries a little more weight to it when victims suffer serious bodily harm, Butts said.

The new law increases the maximum penalty for aggravated bat-

teries from a fourth-degree felony punishable by up to two years in jail and a \$5,000 fine, to a third-degree felony punishable by up to four years in jail and a \$5,000 fine.

The new law also makes it easier for police to track the number of domestic violence incidents and be aware of annual increases or decreases.

Still, Ruidoso officers have been recording domestic violence crimes for several years, Born said. They made 24 domestic arrests last year.

Ruidoso police received 223 calls about domestic violence last year. The 24 arrests indicate physical violence occurred, said Cindy Green, recordkeeper for the police department. Calls that didn't result in arrest involved unfounded suspicions, peacekeeping or verbal assault.

Last year, the department made 21 domestic violence arrests out of a total 232 calls, Green said.

The old domestic violence statute did give officers the right to arrest someone without a warrant when they didn't witness the violence. All other crimes require officers in this state to obtain warrants for arrest if they aren't actual witnesses to the crime, Butts explained.

Like the new law, the old statute requires officers to protect victims, help them file a temporary restraining order, and help with shelter arrangements.

The new law recognizes

household members as spouses, relatives, parents, former relations and unmarried partners. Cohabitation isn't necessary.

Because of its recognition of significant others as household members, the new law also expands on the officers' right to arrest, Butts explained.

The violence against household members statute actually became effective July 1, Ruidoso Detective Wolf Born said.

However, the department didn't apply the law until after being notified by the District Attorney's office Jan. 8. The six-month delay is not unusual, Born said. During the six months, "kinks" in the law were straightened out, it as given a statute number, specific definitions were written, and it was printed.

The police department and the D.A. have just received the 1995 state criminal and traffic law manual with laws that were passed by the state Legislature last year.

No 1995 Ruidoso domestic violence incidents resulted in serious bodily harm, so none of the defendants could have been charged with the heftier third-degree felony charge even if the department was using the new law, Born said.

Even before the domestic violence law existed, Born said officers would note the domestic violence to let the judge know. Butts said he would then automatically increase the defendant's bond.

Skeen denounces nuke storage

Congressman Joe Skeen (R-NM) pledged to keep nuclear waste away from the Mescalero Apache Reservation during a Ruidoso town hall meeting Saturday.

"Not if I can help it," Skeen said when asked if a proposed nuclear storage facility would be built on the reservation. "Over my dead body."

The issue is a hot one with Skeen, who has a ranch in the Hondo Valley. Although the Mescalero Apache Nation has sovereignty, it is limited, Skeen said.

"Wendell Chino and I have been

nose-to-nose on this now for a long time," Skeen said, referring to the Mescalero Apache president. "We've got the (electrical) generating community coming up with big blocks of money, and don't think that's not important because Wendell knows how to make money."

"You can talk about reservation sovereignty all you want, but it's still a limited sovereignty whether China wants to admit it or not."

Unless the U.S. Department of Energy allows the transport of the spent nuclear fuel into New Mexico, the construction of a storage facility

here would be a moot point, Skeen said.

"We're still monitoring the situation very closely and we're going to get this thing shut down," he said.

Current laws dealing with interstate waste storage don't adequately address which state is responsible for the safety of repositories either, Skeen added.

Skeen said the U.S. military's WIPP site (Waste Isolation Pilot Project) in Carlsbad is different because it's low-level waste, while the Mescalero commercial waste would be high-level and more dangerous.

see the Medicare bill.

"A lot of criticism is leveled at Medicare benefit recipients saying that they never check the statements, but they won't give them to you," Skeen said. "We want that changed and it's part of upcoming legislation."

Most providers and pharmacies are honest but many are not, he said.

"If you go to a government program, it's a grab bag deal," Skeen said. "That's been unfortunate, and we are trying to reform this thing so that it gives true value, is more efficient and cost contained."

Without change, the system could collapse, leaving future generations without help.

"The baby boomers and the rest are about to hit," Skeen noted.

Taxes were the next item discussed at the meeting.

"The flat tax is being sold on the fact that taxes would hold at 17% or less," Skeen said. "Well that's wonderful, but I've gone to many presentations and I'm not really convinced."

Skeen received applause when he said he was behind a movement to do away with capital gains taxes and inheritance taxes.

"We're all interested in a more equitable tax system and want to stop this business of the federal government soaking up about 30% of the expendable wealth when we need to leave it in the private sector where you people take it and make it move," he said. "It's ludicrous to be taking that much money out of the private sector."

Noticing long-time neighbor Dan Storm in the audience, Skeen halted the meeting at one point to shake Storm's hand as the crowd applauded.

"You're lookin' good," Skeen told Storm, who turned 86 last October. "Nobody would believe you're only 35."

is interested in providing natural gas to areas that are not currently serviced. If the restraining order is lifted, company officials will be back to ask for a vote on a franchise, she said.

Beauvais pointed out that even if the issue wasn't in court, the board can take no action until it advertises for a hearing on a franchise ordinance.

"If you want to continue the process, you need to authorize staff to draft the ordinance, or you can hold it in abeyance," Beauvais said. The trustees chose the latter and voted unanimously to table the issue.

In the suit against Zia, the association contends the gas company violated the terms of a contract for the sale of an old Capitan-Carrizosa gas transmission line.

In return for the association selling the line to Zia, the gas company agreed to allow the association to continue to make connections off the line, Beauvais said.

Zia has refused to allow those connections, he said. "They're going out there and are trying to put in a competing gas company literally in our backyard and to fight us door to door for customers," Beauvais said. "The whole idea of protected territory is that service is not duplicated. The association is saying we're ready to serve (the same areas Zia is approaching)."

"When they get permission from the New Mexico Public Utility Commission to take over our gas line and install their new one, the order says it's for the transmission of gas. We specifically told the public utility commission we'd have a real problem if (Zia was) able to start hooking up service from that, and they assured us they wouldn't," Beauvais said.

Zia officials told the association the line would be used to run gas from an interstate transmission line near Corona to the company's distribution system,

Beauvais said.

"We're contending they are in violation and breached their agreement," he said. "You're going to see a real range war."

Hamilton could not be reached for comment Monday and other Zia officials did not return calls from *The Ruidoso News*.

But during the trustee meeting Monday evening, Stevenson asked to speak as a resident of Capitan. She questioned why the trustees would exclude competition in the community. She pointed out the cost would be less to residents if they hooked up to Zia and the company could serve areas not within the reach of the association.

"If Zia comes in and forces out the association, how long before it raises the rates to a higher level?" asked Jack Johnson, Capitan municipal judge.

"Look at what they did in Hobbs," Beauvais said. "They're entitled to a 12% return on their investment so they can ask for rates that will bring that return."

Zia is purchasing the assets of Hobbs Gas Co. and the city agreed to amend its franchise agreement to reflect that, Hobbs City Manager Bo Thomas said Tuesday.

"The Hobbs company hadn't increased rates since 1982 and (Zia) asked (the Public Service Commission) for a rate increase of about 30-32%," Thomas said. "The city filed to be a party to the rate/asset transfer case to ensure it could track all of the financial data presented."

"We were not saying they maybe were not entitled to some type of a rate increase, but we're not sure we're really agreeable to a 32% rate increase," he said.

Zia recently agreed to settle the asset transfer issue first and then revisit the proposed rate increase.

behind the bullet-proof window to indicate Morales had a gun in his pants.

Taking the cue, Biggs pointed his weapon at Morales' face and Morales lifted his arms in the air, revealing a holster in his pants.

Biggs grabbed the gun, then asked Morales if he had another weapon. Morales replied "Si," and bent his arm toward his back as if to reach for a weapon, Biggs said.

As he lowered his own gun

toward Morales' chest, Biggs grabbed Morales' arm, spun him around, and removed the third weapon, a 10mm automatic pistol.

Biggs later realized his Glock bullets couldn't have penetrated Morales' bullet-proof combat vest.

"That really got my adrenalin going," Biggs said.

At the time, however, Biggs said he didn't have a chance to be scared.

"You resort back to your training — like tunnel vision and away we go. Things are going to get west-

ern," he related.

said he found blood at his Mechem Drive home in Ruidoso and came in to report the suspicious circumstances, Biggs related.

Officers went to Morales' home and learned the blood on the counter was from meat Morales' children had left out on the counter, Biggs said. Two of his children, 10 and 14 years old, confirmed this to police, Biggs said.

Their mother was in Mexico visiting relatives and they did not know how to reach her, Biggs said.

Officers also interviewed

Morales' 18-year-old son at his place of work.

"He related that he didn't think his father was well, and had been saying someone was trying to kill him and started carrying weapons around," Biggs said.

Later, Morales also told police he thought someone was trying to kill him after he found the blood, his motorcycle moved and a window broken in his trailer. He would not accept that the blood on the counter was from grocery store meat, Biggs

said.

Morales was interviewed by Ruidoso Counseling Center counselors later in the morning. They were told Morales had been hearing voices for the last few months that directed him to come to the police department. He also admitted he had "homicidal thoughts against all the men who had abused his wife and family," Biggs reported.

"At this time, he does not appear to be competent," he concluded.

Councilors put garden plots on hold until drought is over

Although establishing a community garden in Ruidoso is a "wonderful idea," village councilors said they won't even consider one until significant moisture falls from the sky.

"We couldn't make a decision at this point in time because of the water situation," Mayor Jerry Shaw told a garden advocate Tuesday night.

Del Salai, representing the local chapter of the American Culinary Federation, asked the village to allow establishment of a community garden on land next to Fire Station #2 on White Mountain Drive.

Councilors tabled the request until the village comes out of its phase three water contingency plan.

"Our hands are tied for now," Shaw told Salai.

The third phase is the most restrictive on village books, and it

prohibits all outdoor watering.

Because of a lack of significant moisture, the village moved into the plan's third phase in January.

"We've been less than overwhelmed by the amount of snow coming down," Village Manager Gary Jackson said.

The snowpack helps to refill Alto Lake and wells, and as far as the village's water department director can evaluate, "the snow up there would (only) produce 5.5 inches of water," Jackson reported.

The garden would tentatively contain two plots, one 115 feet by 50 feet, the other 135 feet by 50 feet. It would primarily be used to educate school children on gardening, and would be developed with the help of the parks and recreation department. Additional plots would be leased to individual residents for gardening, Salai said.

Councilors questioned in December whether using the park as a fenced garden would be its best use,

and asked Salai to investigate other properties. She did, but the White Mountain Drive site appears best because it's close to the schools and receives substantial sunlight, she said.

Salai also asked Lincoln County officials for assistance, but was told the county couldn't help, she said.

Councilor Robert Donaldson suggested Salai try to get a pilot project going with the schools on a smaller parcel of land.

"Start small and build," he suggested. "Why take a prime piece of property and tie it up?"

In other business at the Feb. 13 Ruidoso Village Council meeting, councilors:

— scheduled three separate public hearings on the annexation and initial zoning of about 33 acres on upper Mechem Drive. The annexation area includes the Morgan tract, Montgomery tract 1&2, Fowler tract, Blagland tract 1&2, T.H. Thompson tract 1&2, Blagland tract 2, H.F. Investors tract 1-10, and Forest Lawn Cemetery in the northwest quarter of section 15T11N, R13E NMPM.

— approved publishing requests for proposals for the Municipal Code Legal Review and Recodification.

— and scheduled a public hearing on an ordinance to create the Scenic Byways Committee.

County government practice of driving vehicles home halted

Allowing Lincoln County employees to drive government cars home at the end of the working day is costly in extra miles, gas and maintenance, county commissioners say.

They decided last week to stop the practice and directed County Attorney Alan Morel to draft a policy. Tuesday, they approved the policy with a few amendments.

The policy designates which officials are exempt from the ban on driving county vehicles home. They include law enforcement personnel, the county manager, the director of county emergency services and disaster preparedness, and the road manager.

"Essentially, people in positions who are subject to call at any hour were exempted," said Martha Guevara, acting county manager.

The policy also prohibits passengers who are not employed by the county.

During the initial discussion last week, Chairman Monroy Montes asked for input from County Clerk Martha Proctor.

"The policy should be for the pro-

tection of the county, not for our convenience," she said.

"You figure 40 extra miles a day, 250 days a year and it's costing \$2,500 a year," said Commissioner L. Ray Nunley.

In contrast, employees in the assessor's office change the oil and wash the vehicles they use during the day and then park them at the courthouse at night, Montes said.

"Why should it be otherwise for the other departments, especially when the elected officials don't do it (drive county cars)?" he asked.

Driving a county car to and from work is a taxable benefit, Morel said.

Insurance companies also need assurances that the vehicles are being properly used by authorized staff with no unauthorized passengers, Morel said.

"This has been a very loose situation," Montes said.

In another vehicle-related issue, Laurie Ventura, administrative assistant to Sheriff James McSwane, asked commissioners for a budget increase to take care of patrol car repair and maintenance. She said

revenue expected from some federal sources has been delayed or frozen.

E.J. Fouratt, who has law enforcement experience most recently as a police officer in Capitan, suggested the sheriff's office sell a confiscated Ford pickup that has been stored at McSwane's home since August of 1994, soon after McSwane wrecked it while chasing some teens who flipped him off.

"Why not sell it and use that money?" Fouratt asked.

"I agree," echoed Commissioners Wilton Howell and L. Ray Nunley.

The court case involving the vehicle still is in progress, Ventura said. The truck is evidence.

"Contact the attorneys in the case," Howell said. "I see lots of cases where wrecks are sold for salvage. Or move the evidence to the (road department) yard, advertise it and sell it. Is there a problem with that?"

"No problem," Nunley said. "Tell the (county attorney) to contact (prosecutors) and see if there's any problem with that."

Commissioners tabled action on Ventura's budget supplement request.

Armed robbery charges filed

A 30-year-old Ruidoso Downs man just released from jail in December is back behind bars after allegedly robbing a woman at knife point Friday night, Ruidoso Downs police report.

Anthony Edward Estrada was arrested by warrant Saturday after the victim, Anne Sanchez, showed police photos of bruises on her side where Estrada allegedly struck her with his fist. Her friend, Nancy Aubrey, who was a witness to the robbery and is an acquaintance of Estrada, also identified him as the violent robber, police said.

Police charged Estrada with armed robbery, a second-degree felony; and assault with intent to commit a violent felony and aggravated battery, both third-degree felonies.

He was arraigned at Ruidoso Magistrate Court Monday and is being held at the Lincoln County Jail on a \$250,000 bond.

Estrada allegedly committed

the robbery while he was a front seat passenger in the victim's car.

Sanchez, who had driven to Ruidoso Downs from Hondo, had allegedly allowed Estrada to enter the vehicle after Aubrey saw him outside the Palo Verde Trailer Park and suggested they pull over to talk, police said.

After they did, Estrada allegedly requested a ride to the Circle K Store, and climbed in the front seat as Aubrey got in back, police said.

Once on the road, Estrada allegedly produced a switchblade and told Sanchez to pull over at a vacant lot behind Pappy's Diner, police said.

He then allegedly slapped her, pressed the knife against her throat and demanded Sanchez hand over her jewelry.

Sanchez told police she attempted to say something to Aubrey, and Estrada — still holding the knife to her throat — struck the side of her body hard enough to cause bruising.

The victim then handed over her gold bracelet, gold ring, charm bracelet and a ruby, police said.

Estrada was most recently held for six months at the county jail for the misdemeanor crimes of resisting arrest and assault, Judge William Butts said.

He was intoxicated during that incident, which took place last summer outside a Ruidoso Allsup's store, Ruidoso police said.

Butts said he released Estrada from jail in December so he could spend 30 days at a rehabilitation center.

When appearing before Butts Monday, Estrada pleaded innocent and said the two women had been drunk, Butts said.

A preliminary hearing will be set within 10 days.

If found guilty on the felony robbery and assault charges against him, Estrada could be sentenced to a maximum 20 years in jail and a \$20,000 fine.

Neighbors turn in man for alleged violence against wife

When witnesses on Allison Lane allegedly saw their neighbor Rodney Almanza throw his wife to the ground and repeatedly beat her with his fists Friday, they called Ruidoso Downs police.

Officers saw the red swelling around the victim's mouth and arrested the 28-year-old Almanza on a misdemeanor count of battery to a household member.

Upon detention at the Ruidoso Downs holding cell, Almanza was also charged with misdemeanor assault on a police officer.

Police alleged Almanza had threatened a detention officer's life and attempted, by leaping, to grab the officers' legs.

Almanza is being held on a \$15,000 bond at the Lincoln County Jail. If found guilty of

the charges against him, he could face a maximum two years at the county jail and a \$2,000 fine.

Almanza's wife Valerie, 27, was also arrested in the domestic dispute on a petty misdemeanor charge of battery to a household member, police said. Apparently, witnesses said they saw her chase and grab her husband after he kicked her vehicle.

Man charged with hammer attack

Homero J. Pacazo allegedly broke a man's hand with a claw hammer Sunday while intoxicated, and also caused more than \$1,000 damage to property, Ruidoso Downs police said.

Pacazo, 25, of Ruidoso Downs, was later arrested inside his trailer home. He was allegedly found intoxicated, wearing a blood splattered shirt and seated on a couch, police said. Officers allegedly found a bloody hammer on his kitchen

floor.

He was charged with aggravated battery, a third-degree felony; aggravated assault and criminal damage to property over \$1,000, both fourth-degree felonies; and criminal damage to property under \$1,000, a misdemeanor.

Police arrived at the Turkey Canyon crime scene after responding to a 911 call around 6:30 p.m. They were told by the Guillermo Quirantes family that Pacazo had

arrived on foot with the hammer and struck Guillermo Quirante, Jr., fracturing his hand.

Pacazo also allegedly attempted to strike Quirante's father (who is Pacazo's brother-in-law) and broke windows out of his trailer; and smashed windows to a car owned by Eddie Quirante.

Pacazo pleaded innocent Monday in Ruidoso Magistrate Court. He's being held in jail on a \$25,000 bond.

Kudos to school board for opening up public comment at meetings

We commend the Ruidoso School Board for giving impromptu public comment another chance.

The reasons behind the board's public comment ban in September 1994 were understandable. The dialogue sometimes became vehement and nasty, and ventured into the realm of personal attack. Some of those speaking probably deserved to be thrown out.

That's about all that can be done if public comment is indeed unfettered, in classic town meeting style: call the police, as the Ruidoso Village Council has done on occasion, to maintain public order. It's an effective deterrent.

We have no problem with either of these actions if the goal is to maintain public access, public comment, public participation—the very foundation of democratic government.

The school board need not fear that public comment will get them in trouble under the state's open meetings law; the board is required to keep certain personnel matters confidential. But there is something healthy, not to say informative, about sometimes angry exposition from unexpected quarters. For that a public board cannot be held liable; indeed, as policy makers they must listen to all views to do their job.

We've heard complaints about snowplowing crews, sanitation workers, the county manager...and teachers. They're all public employees, and responsible to the elected officials who employ them. All are in the same realm of public service.

In the end, democracy is a messy enterprise. But it's the American way, and the history of the 20th Century has revealed time and again that other governmental systems may be more efficient, but none is better if freedom is to be preserved.

New Mexico's highways in bad shape

A new study of New Mexico's roads, from the Washington D.C. based Road Information Program, finds that New Mexico ranks second in the country (behind Rhode Island) in the proportion of its major roads with badly cracked or broken pavement.

Last year, the Governor's Citizen Highway Assessment Task Force (CHAT) held over 17 town hall meetings across the state, to get the public's input regarding our highways. The public agreed that roads are the key to the growth of our state.

Overall, CHAT found that to bring New Mexico's highways up to speed, it is going to cost us approximately \$1.2 billion. We can do this without raising taxes! Bonds will be issued to cover the cost of completing the seven-year project.

Why do we need this project? New Mexico's investment in roads and bridges is not keeping pace with increased travel in the state, in part because of an eroding state motor fuel tax and an over-reliance on federal highway funds. We spend an average of \$25,656 for each mile of state-maintained roads, significantly below the national average of \$40,056. In the past 10 years, while programs like education, health & welfare have increased 80% to 240% in funding, we have only managed to increase our spending on highways by 50%. Actual buying power in the General Fund has increased by 35%, while the

By the year 2010, estimates show that vehicle travel in New Mexico will increase by nearly 85% based on projected population increases in the state. We currently have a backlog of \$6 billion in needed road and bridge projects that we are unable to fund. This is staggering!

Road Fund has decreased by 10% during this same period.

By the year 2010, estimates show that vehicle travel in New Mexico will increase by nearly 85% based on projected population increases in the state. We currently have a backlog of \$6 billion in needed road and bridge projects that we are unable to fund. This is staggering!

Additionally, we are not considering the economic or safety factors of improving our roads. For example, traffic fatalities in New Mexico are higher than the national average, in part because approximately three-quarters of New Mexico's major roadways (excluding Interstates)

are two-lane.

Highway travel on four-lane roads is twice as safe as travel on two-lane roads. In fact, projects to expand two-lane roads to four-lanes, and to add a median, have averaged a 71% reduction in traffic fatalities nationally. Not to mention that 96.8% of businesses surveyed said that they want to locate within two miles or 10 minutes of a four-lane highway. These long-awaited improvements simply make sense for the safety of our citizens and the continued economic development of our state.

Part of the problem here is that the Legislature's financial leadership has not committed to improving New Mexico's highways. The taxes that we collect for the Road Fund do not stay there. It is misleading to our citizens to let them think that the money that they pay in taxes to improve our roads actually goes for that purpose. It does not; this year, for example, Democrats transferred \$17 million to the General Fund to help pay for big government. And over the past 10 years, \$110 million has been transferred to the General Fund. The Road Fund has contributed to the General Fund for as long as we can stand it.

To accomplish these badly needed road improvements, you must call your legislator and urge them to vote for the Highway Improvement package. You can do this simply by calling (505) 986-4300. For our children and our economic future, we can't afford to fall any further behind than we already are.

Ruidoso school board allows public comments, seeks community input

Impromptu public comments will be allowed at Ruidoso School Board meetings for the first time in 15 years.

Spontaneous comments have not been allowed at board meetings since September 1994. The ban was implemented when the board decided public comments about a fired basketball coach were out of control and addressed personnel matters that should have been confidential.

Last month, board member Susan Lutterman asked the board to reconsider allowing the public to comment on agenda items.

After determining no official action was necessary, board President Ronnie Hemphill stated the board's public comment position for the record at last night's board meeting.

"We will open it up for public comment at the end of each agenda

item," Hemphill said.

Discussion will only be allowed on agenda items and no personnel matters will be discussed, he said.

Prior to last night's statement, people were only allowed to speak at board meetings by meeting with Superintendent Mike Gladden by the Friday before the Tuesday meeting.

"Partnerships" was the buzzword of the meeting. Ruidoso High School Principal Ron Hodges and director of instructional support Paul Wirth spoke about new directions for the district's vocational department.

"Ruidoso High has a beautiful vocational department, but it's not being used to its maximum capacity," Hodges said.

Determining how to improve vocational programs will require partnerships with the business community, he said.

"We want to find out the needs

of this business community so we will know what type of graduates we should put out and what marketable and entry level skills they should have," Hodges said.

Other partnerships that benefit the district include Lincoln County Cablevision helping bring Internet access to the schools, educational collaborations with the Museum of the Horse and a continuing strong relationship with Eastern New Mexico University, Wirth said.

Partnerships hit a snag on the federal and state level, Lutterman said in her report about a recent trip to Washington, D.C. and Santa Fe. Lutterman visited with lawmakers in her capacity as president of the New Mexico School Board, which picked up the tab for the trip.

Lutterman said that because of gambling issues and vetoes from last year, education has taken a back seat in the state Legislature.

Tigers taste sweet revenge, upset Bears

When the final buzzer sounded, all Chris Gonzales could do was hold her head in stunned disbelief.

With just 11 ticks on the game clock, Gonzales' two free throws provided the winning margin and lifted Capitan's girls basketball team to a 39-38 victory over Cloudercroft's Bears in the semifinals of the District 6AA playoffs.

It was sweet revenge for the Tigers, who were victims of a Cloudercroft upset last year. This time, Capitan victimized second-seeded Cloudercroft and ended the Bears' season.

Gonzales, one of two seniors on the Capitan team, blocked everything out when she stepped to the line with the Tigers trailing 38-37.

Everything except for one memory.

"I just remembered last year," Gonzales said, referring to Cloudercroft's stunning 43-42 win. "We've had such a rocky season; it was a big thing to get out of the district."

By virtue of their win, the Tigers play Dexter for the District 6AA title Thursday and are guaranteed a berth in the regional tournament.

"It was a tough one (to lose). I know how it is. I was in the same boat last year," Capitan coach Norman Cline said.

This time it was Cloudercroft coach Jimmy Swope's turn to find consoling words for his Bears, who finished the season with an 8-15 overall record.

"It's what high school athletics is all about," Swope said. "Both teams competed hard. They just had one point on us at the end."

Both coaches cited defense as the decid-

ing factor Tuesday.

"They put some pressure on us that we were expecting — we just didn't handle it so well," Swope said. "Both of our teams put defense before offense. You've got to hand it to them; they played tough defense all night."

Capitan's defensive pressure forced the Bears into a poor shooting night and kept Cloudercroft's stud muffin, Rustie Waldon, out of the paint where she is most effective.

"We kept Rustie off the box, which is real tough to do," Cline said.

Waldon finished with 11 points for the Bears.

Gonzales claims not to be a good free-throw shooter. She credited her gutsy FT shooting ability to a free-throw contest held in conjunction with the Smokey Bear


Tournament in early January. Gonzales won the girls competition and since then found new confidence.

Cline reminded Gonzales of that feat during the timeout just before the senior guard stepped to the line. "I told her, 'They're going to go in,'" Cline recalled. "Then we talked about what we were going to do defensively after the free throws."

Capitan advanced to Tuesday's game with a convincing 51-31 victory over Tularosa Monday. The Tigers led the Wildcats the whole game.

Robbins led all scorers with 16 points. Gonzales added 13 in the winning effort.

Tipoff for the District 6AA championship game is set for 7 p.m. in Dexter. The Blue Demons bring a 13-9 record to the contest. Capitan enters with a 10-15 mark.

Tigers split district games

Capitan's boys basketball team won the most important of two games over the weekend.

The Tigers earned their first boys District 6AA win, a 64-58 triumph over Cloudercroft's Bears Friday, but then ran into No. 3-ranked Tularosa the next night. Tulie broke away in the second half for a 90-60 win.

The weekend split gives coach Gerald Montes and his Tigers a 10-10 overall mark and 1-3 district record.

With the Friday win, Capitan has an edge over the Bears in the event of a tie for third place in the district. Ties are broken by head-to-head competition and then by point differential. Capitan and Cloudercroft split their district games. The Bears won the first contest by four points. The Tigers' six-point victory would put them ahead of the Bears — that means a first-round district playoff game at home.

"We did what we had to do. We had to win a district game and we did," Montes said.

The Tigers got off to quick start in Cloudercroft. Capitan's press helped set the tone and created some early turnovers which the Tigers turned into easy baskets.

"They (the Bears) came out flat, much like we did the first time we played," Montes said.

Capitan took a 35-29 halftime

lead and built it to a 14-point margin going into the fourth quarter.

The Tigers had a chance to put the game away early in the fourth quarter, but didn't, Montes said. Cloudercroft took advantage of several Capitan miscues and cut the lead to five points late in the game. Key free throws down the stretch iced the game for Capitan.

Cloudercroft's Joey Winkles led all scorers with 23 points. Jared Burnett added 16 for the losers.

Three Tigers scored in double figures for Capitan. Josh Peralta had 15, followed by Jon Ugalano's 14 and Neil Montes' 10. Ernie Trujillo added eight and Cody Turnbow finished with seven points.

The next night, Capitan played the best team it has faced all year, Montes said of his team's opponent, Tularosa.

"They live up to their ranking," Montes said.

The Tigers stayed with the talented Wildcats (19-2, 4-0) in the first half and trailed only 37-32. But that was as long as Tulie would let Capitan hang around. The Wildcats blitzed the Tigers 24-8 in the third quarter for a 61-40 lead going into the final eight minutes.

Tularosa wore down the Tigers inside, Montes said.

"We couldn't stop their big kids,"

Warriors beat Socorro for first time in 11 years

Ruidoso has proven it's a survivor among the contenders in the brutally-competitive District 3AAA boys basketball race. The Warriors rebounded from a disappointing loss to state-ranked Silver Wednesday with a crucial 66-64 victory over visiting Socorro Friday.

But the Warriors paid a hefty price for their first win over Socorro in 11 years. Senior point guard Cory Hood, who leads the team in scoring and assists, severely sprained his ankle midway through the third quarter and could miss the rest of the season for the Warriors.

Hood landed on the foot of teammate Joshua Hodges as both attempted to tip-in an offensive rebound. The senior guard left the game and headed for the Lincoln County Medical Center emergency room, but not before listening to his teammates pull out the exciting win, over the radio while waiting in the hospital parking lot.

Preliminary X-rays didn't indicate a break, but Hood saw an orthopaedic physician Monday. The ankle isn't broken and the ligaments aren't torn. Hood suffered a severe sprain and probably stretched some of his ligaments, Ruidoso coach Ben Sanchez said Tuesday. That means Hood could be back as soon as two weeks if rehabilitation goes well.

Right now, however, Ruidoso can't dwell on the loss of Hood. The Warriors are in the midst of a district melee.

"From a player's standpoint, they've got to be able to move on,"

Sanchez said.

From a coach's standpoint, Sanchez has his 11 other varsity players to prepare for Hot Springs on Saturday and what remains of the season.

Friday's win lifted Ruidoso to 10-10 overall and 3-4 in the 3AAA and muddied the district waters. Behind 3AA-leader Silver (16-3, 5-1) are Hot Springs (11-6, 4-2), Socorro (9-9, 2-3), Ruidoso (10-10, 3-4), Santa Teresa (8-11, 3-4) and Cobre (7-11, 1-5).

"With just three district games left, we could finish anywhere from second to sixth," Sanchez said.

That won't necessarily be an easy task, considering the improvement of 3AAA teams from top to bottom.

The gap between Silver and the rest of the district has closed, Sanchez said, as has the gap between Socorro and the district.

If the Warriors win two of their last three games, they can virtually guarantee themselves a first-round district playoff game at home.

Ruidoso's performance Friday night indicated it's a resilient bunch. Just two days earlier, Silver demoralized the Warriors, 86-68.

"We were very happy to be able to bounce back on Friday," Sanchez said.

The Warriors benefited from solid rebounding, shooting, and taking care of the ball. They out-rebounded Socorro, 37-25. They shot 51% from the field and committed only nine turnovers.

They also benefited from a last-second desperation shot that failed to fall in the basket.

With five seconds left and lead-

ing 66-63, Ruidoso fouled Socorro's Patrick Castillo while he was attempting the game-tying 3-pointer. Castillo made the first of three free throws, but missed the second. Sanchez called a timeout to warn his troops about Castillo purposely missing the last free throw attempt, which he did. In the scramble for the rebound, Socorro's Castillo got the ball and scooped it toward the basket. The ball rolled around the rim and off it, preserving Ruidoso's win.

Defensively, Ruidoso contained Socorro's duo of Eric Valencia and Steven Collis. Valencia and Collis combined to score 23 points — 23 points less than their output the first time the two teams met.

Ruidoso mixed it up defensively, which kept Socorro off track. Sanchez credited his team's interior defense as a key to the win. Defending the paint for the Warriors were Hodges, Jackie Roe, Byron Soules and Erik Padilla.

Hodges paced the Warriors offensively with 19 points. Rex Comanche added 16 and much-needed leadership down the stretch, Sanchez said.

Freshman Cory Saenz, who filled in at point guard for Hood, added 10 points. It's not a contradiction in terms to call Saenz a mature freshman. He plays beyond his years.

"Cory Saenz was a one-man press break," Sanchez said of his big little man.

Sanchez is confident Saenz can handle the point guard for the remainder of the season, if necessary. His concern now is depth at that position.

"We don't really have a true

point guard to back him (Saenz) up," Sanchez said.

The Warriors have a much-needed and well-deserved break this week, with only one game on the schedule. Of course, that happens to be the second-place Hot Springs team, which comes to town Saturday.

DRUMBEATS: In addition to leading the team in scoring (12.1 points per game) and assists, Hood also tops the Class AAA leader list for assists with a 6.7 average. Rex Comanche is the Warriors' second-leading scorer with an 11.2 average. Senior Joshua Hodges pitches in 10.2 points a game and grabs 8.4 rebounds a contest. Behind Hodges in rebounding are Hood (6.6), Jack-

ie Roe (5.8) and Erik Padilla (5.6)...The District 3AAA race could be a photo finish for second through fifth places. How does the district break tie? First, it considers head-to-head competition. If that fails to produce a decision, the district leaves the decision to probability — the toss of a coin. Sanchez calls the coin toss tiebreak "absolutely ridiculous." A better method would be to consider a team's record versus the team below it in the standings, Sanchez said. For example, if Socorro and Ruidoso tied for third place, then compare their records against the fifth-place team to determine who gets third place. Another tiebreak method is to compare the point differential in head-to-head competition, like the District 6AA does.


A couple of decades ago, the middle school tournament was a fixture on basketball teams' schedules.

The real beneficiaries of the event are the players themselves, who had the opportunity to play in Ruidoso's version of "The Pit" before family and friends.




Tiger James Robinson scores two of his team-high 16 points in Capitan's win over Ruidoso Middle School in the title game.





Seven dogs had to be destroyed last week in Chaves County, because they had been exposed to a rabid skunk and didn't have current vaccinations.

This is the first case of rabies in New Mexico this year. In 1955, a total of six laboratory confirmed cases of animal rabies occurred in the state. Five were bats and one was a fox.

"This unfortunate incident emphasizes the importance of having your pets, dogs and cats, vaccinated for rabies annually by your veterinarian," said Carolyn Hutchinson with the New Mexico Department of Health.

Lincoln County veterinarians and their staffs pitched in Saturday to set up reduced cost rabies

clinics to ensure the sad scenario in Chaves County is not replayed locally.

Fortunately, in the Chaves incident, no significant human exposure to the skunk occurred.

"It is very important that anyone who comes into contact with a potentially rabid animal report it immediately to their local health office and local animal control," Hutchinson said. If the animal tests positive for rabies or if the animal cannot be found, rabies treatment generally is recommended. Rabies treatment must be started within 10 days to be effective.

Rabies in animals can occur in any part of the state. People should avoid contact with wild animals, even when they do not appear sick, Hutchinson said.

MACULAR DEGENERATION

Think of your eye as a camera, the retina at the back part acts like the picture. Right in the center of the retina, its most sensitive part is the macula. This is what enables us to see fine detail when we look at something and to do close tasks like reading and sewing. The outer rings of the macula are less sensitive and can make only coarse visual distinctions.

In time, usually late in life, the macula may degenerate. Vision changes. There may be blurring or distortion--or actual blind spot. Colors may seem faded. The condition is the leading cause of legal blindness in the U.S., affecting 20 percent of the people over 75.

Most often, the early symptoms of macular degeneration are not obvious. Examining the retina can spot signs of the disorder in time for prompt treatment of the more serious "wet" form of the disease. Drs Gutowski and Sonnenmoser recommend annual comprehensive examination to maintain the health of your eyes.
