**Mix-up cuts Camp Sierra Blanca short**

A misunderstanding between state officials has resulted in a lack of funding for the juvenile correctional system.

Camp Sierra Blanca in Lincoln County was supposed to receive \$787,000 for renovations so it could become a juvenile boot camp this year when adult prisoners leave, but the mix-up left it with only \$100,000.

"We worked pretty hard on this. It's a good thing and something the Legislature worked on with us very well, so it's a little frustrating," said Eddie Bender, public information officer for the Children, Youth and Families Department, which runs the juvenile correctional system.

Bender said \$2.2 million was left in the general fund instead of being transferred for use in the juvenile correctional system.

"Somewhere along the line, somebody dropped the ball," Bender said. "I guess it was a misunderstanding." One part of a three-part money transfer process was left out; the Legislative Council thought the governor's lobbying group was going to wrap it up, and vice versa, Bender explained.

Since legislative approval is required to transfer money out of a fund, it's unknown whether the problem can be solved before next year when the Legislature reconvenes. State officials are working on resolving the issue, Bender said.

**State AG uses Mescalero lawsuit to fight gambling**

A four-year-old federal lawsuit filed by the Mescalero Apache Tribe against the state was unearthed this week by state Attorney General Tom Udall, who wants tribal casinos declared illegal.

By using the suit to file a counterclaim, Udall is seeking a ruling that the state holds no gambling compact with the tribe.

The Mescalero originally filed the suit against former Gov. Bruce King in 1992, accusing him of failing to negotiate in good faith a state-tribal compact allowing casino-style gambling.

It was left hanging after Gov. Gary Johnson signed compacts with 14 tribes early last year.

By summer, however, the compacts were ruled void by the state Supreme Court because they hadn't been authorized by the Legislature. The court also ruled all casino-style gambling is illegal in New Mexico.

**Council approves replacement**

Bill Chance, the chairman of Ruidoso's Lodgers Tax Committee, was unanimously approved by councilors last night to fulfill the remaining two years of Frank Potter's four-year Ruidoso Village Council term.

Chance, 46, looking dapper in suit and tie, took his place on the council dais immediately after being sworn in by the village clerk.

"He's a person who has shown a lot of interest in the community and serves on two committees," Shaw said.

Chance also has an excellent attendance record on the Lodgers Tax Committee and the Scenic Byways Committee — something Shaw gave considerable weight in her selection, she said.

"By being involved, I believe he'll make a good councilor," Shaw said.

Chance also served on the former ad hoc Convention and Visitor's Bureau committee (CVB) and the CVB selection committee.

Since his appointment, he will have to resign from the committees he currently serves, Shaw said.

The council selection wasn't one "picked lightly," she said, but involved "much soul searching and conversation with councilors."

All but Leon Eggeston, who was absent from the meeting, voted in approval of Chance.

The law allows the council to hold a special election to replace a councilor who has resigned, or else have the mayor appoint someone with the council's consent. The council and mayor chose the latter.

"As history has shown, we have always made appointments to fill a vacant place," said Mayor Jerry Shaw before recommending Chance to the council.

Chance was appointed after more than a week of consideration. Shaw opted to make the appointment before the March 5 municipal election because only four candidates are running for the three available seats. Shaw said she didn't want voters to think the election's lowest vote getter would be a council shoe-in and be appointed after the election, thereby interfering with voter choice.

Shaw originally considered about five potential candidates.


Shaw said last week she wouldn't consider nominating a person that the other councilors wouldn't support.

None of the councilors knew who Shaw finally decided on until she recommended Chance's name at the meeting, Shaw said. But they did know it came down to Chance and one other publicly unnamed candidate — both whom Shaw spoke about to each individual councilor before Tuesday's meeting.

Chance, a member services representative for the Otero County Electric Cooperative, Inc., said after the meeting that he was "kind of shocked" when first contacted by the mayor about the position. Working on the council will involve identifying challenges, remaining flexible and helping to contribute to solutions, Chance said.

Chance and his wife Janet have lived in Ruidoso for the past four years.

**Cost of seven fires may hit \$1.5 million**

A careless motorist's cigarette apparently ignited the biggest of the seven fires that burned 3,850 acres on the Mescalero Apache Reservation since Thursday.

The total cost of the effort to fight the Elk Complex Fires reached \$702,225 by the latest calculation at 5 p.m. Monday, and it could hit \$1.5 million before all the crews leave, said Peg Crim, fire information officer for the U.S. Forest Service.

The other six fires were ignited by long-burning embers in piles of chipped wood throughout the reservation, officials said.

The fires were 100% contained by Tuesday, meaning they won't expand. No structures were burned.

The number of firefighters has been reduced from more than 800 to approximately 215. A target date for putting the fires completely out has not been set. Firefighters are now churning and wetting down slash and chipped wood piles in the area.

Unusable wood from commercial timber harvesting is chipped, piled and burned on the reservation. When unusual 80 mph winds hit Thursday, they pulled out embers that had been smoldering for as long as six months, a highly unusual incident, explained Tony Urvina, the Bureau of Indian Affairs forest manager on the Mescalero Reservation.

"We have to re-evaluate the burning of those piles," Urvina said Tuesday. The BIA may stop burning the piles or spread them

out and wet them down after burning, but the latter may be cost prohibitive. Reservation officials already have stringent parameters they follow when doing controlled burns, and they don't light such fires on high-wind days.

Because of the unusually high winds, "I'm not sure what precautions could have been taken" to prevent the fires that started in old chipper piles, Urvina added. The winds were so strong that they threw debris and sparks up to a quarter-mile ahead of flames, he said.

Higher humidity levels and small amounts of snow Sunday and Monday helped firefighters' efforts, Crim said. So did a decrease in wind speeds, from 80 mph Thursday to 25-30 mph in later days.

"It didn't turn into a crown fire like it could have, and take out everything," said Stephaney Church, a Forest Service intelligence officer. The wind could have whipped flames into the top, or crowns, of the trees, causing fires to spread much more

quickly and severely, she explained.

Looking on the bright side, some of the fires were good for the dense forest's health and no commercial timber was destroyed, Forest Service and BIA officials agreed.

"If we had not already treated (the area of the main Elk Fire), we would have lost lots of commercial timber," Urvina added. Trees were recently cut there for commercial timber harvests as well as bark beetle control, he said.

Urvina said BIA firefighters were alerted to a small fire right along State Highway 244 on Wednesday of last week, and

concluded it was started by a motorist who threw a cigarette out the window of a vehicle. No chipper or slash wood piles were nearby.

That fire was put out, but not completely mopped up before the unexpected high winds hit Thursday, whipping sparks into nearby tree stands and starting the Elk Fire, Urvina said.

Bonito Fire Department volunteers also had to fight a smaller fire Thursday, when a 'controlled burn' got out of control in Angus.

# Four candidates compete for Carrizozo's two trustee seats

One incumbent and three challengers are competing for two seats on the Carrizozo Board of Trustees in the non-partisan municipal election on Tuesday, March 5.

People can vote early and avoid any potential lines, through Thursday, Feb. 29 at the county courthouse in Carrizozo. All municipalities in Lincoln County have the same schedules.

The two top Carrizozo vote getters will be paid \$10 per meeting and will preside over the village of 1,075 residents with two other trustees and a mayor. Terms last four years and the board meets at 6 p.m. the second and fourth Tuesday of each month.

Those running for office are:



**Eileen Martinez Lovelace**

Eileen Lovelace's public service hasn't been confined to the Carrizozo Board of Trustees where she has served for the past four years.

She has been a substitute teacher, is a business member of the Canyon Cowbells, a member of the Carrizozo Woman's Club and chamber of commerce. She serves on the Community Advisory Board of Norwest Bank, serves on the board of the Capitan-Carrizozo Natural Gas Association and is part of the Carrizozo Action Team Services, a beautification group.

She won a four-year term on the board in her first run for public office. She's hoping the voters agree to send her back for a second term March 5.

"I think I can be fair and not judge before I hear both sides," she said. "I feel I have helped some people feel better by explaining why we have to do some things, the rules and regulations we have to follow."

"I feel I'm dependable. If I say I'm going to do something, I will. People can trust me."

The major challenge facing the village board is to bring industry to the town, Lovelace said.

"There have been a lot of different attempts, but no successes, but we're not giving up," she said. "We should start with something small and clean, and grow slowly."

Born in El Paso, Texas, Lovelace was raised in San Patricio starting at the age of three.

After high school, she worked in many different jobs including bus driver, waitress, heavy equipment

operator and sales clerk. She currently is a nail technician at her shop called Eileen's Hair, Hands and Hoofs.

Lovelace, 47, and her husband, Gary, have four grown children.



**Wesley B. Lindsay**

Born and raised in the neighboring settlement of Nogal, Wes Lindsay says he knows Carrizozo's past and has hopes for its future.

No particular issue or problem prompted his decision to run for the board of trustees this year.

"I just felt it was time to try to help the community in this capacity," Lindsay said. "The trustees need harmony and to try to get along, instead of fighting among themselves."

This isn't his first run for public office. He was elected to the Carrizozo School Board in 1974 and served until 1980. He also was fire chief of the town from 1974 to 1976.

Lindsay attended school in Nogal until sixth grade and then began classes in the Carrizozo public school, graduating in 1955.

He was employed by Mountain Bell/U.S. West in August 1955 and retired from that corporation in January 1993. He has continued to work part-time for the company.

Lindsay is a past president of the Rotary Club of Carrizozo. He attends Carrizozo Community Church and is first vice chairman of the Nogal Ranchmen's Camp Meeting. He is a member of the Carrizozo Masonic Lodge and served as worshipful master in 1978 and 1990.

Married to Carrizozo native Margo Duncan, Lindsay has four grown children.



**Michael Cain**

Michael Cain, 44, was drawn to Carrizozo because of the small-town atmosphere, coupled with a wide choice of amenities.

"I moved here in December 1993 after eight years in New York," he said. "I was looking for a small

town in New Mexico and drove through here on my way to Ruidoso. I saw this large building and it looked perfect. It was amazing to see a golf course, a recreation center and an airport."

The large building formerly was occupied by one of the city's failed attempts to attract and hold onto business. The log processing plant went defunct.

Like its neighbor Capitan, Carrizozo has been hurt by the closing of Fort Stanton as a state hospital last March and the announced closing of Camp Sierra Blanca as an adult prison later this year.

"This town has so much, but nothing seems to be happening," Cain said. "I want to see the town offer some breaks to industry to help bring them in, and I'd like to see more retail operations. We have an industrial park just sitting there."

"I've always lived in larger cities like L.A. and Chicago, but I like it here and I want to stay here," he said. "I want to see it grow and develop."

Cain learned his craft from his father, who operated a trade school. By the time he was 14, he was producing art works. After graduating from high school, he enlisted in the Navy Seebies and served in Vietnam.

When he was discharged, he sculpted and also worked in welding at a jet propulsion lab in Los Angeles. In his Carrizozo studio, he fabricates large sculptures for other artists as well as his own work.

Born in Oklahoma City, Okla., Cain is single.



**Walter Lee Hill**

Born in Carrizozo in 1967, Walter Hill followed the lead of his parents and has been a lifelong resident.

Known locally as Junior Hill, He is the son of Wayland and Opal Hill and is a graduate of Carrizozo High School.

He was hired six years ago to work in the Lincoln County assessor's office as an appraiser.

For the past four years, he has volunteered for the Carrizozo Volunteer Fire Department and would like to continue serving the community by filling a seat on the town board of trustees.

"Carrizozo has many amenities for such as small community and I would like to see it preserved and maintained, not only for this community, but for the benefit of those from surrounding communities," Hill said.

"My wife, the former Becky Silva, and I enjoy the benefits of a small community and we wish to preserve and protect everything af-

fecting the town."

No particular problem prompted his first run for office, Hill said.

"It's nothing bad about the people in there," he said. "I just want to join the team. It's nice to see four people running. It shows

they care and in my opinion, that's great."

Hill, 28, often has attended city meetings on subjects ranging from the water rates to the future of the golf course and the bowling alley. He wants to help keep recreational facilities open and that's a struggle

for a small village, he said.

"We have well over \$1 million in facilities and the community is struggling to keep them," Hill said. "It's a great thing to have been given them by Mrs. (Jackie) Spencer and out of respect, we should do everything possible."

# Incumbent and competitor vie for Carrizozo judgeship

The election for a four-year term for Carrizozo municipal judge drew two candidates. The position does not require a law degree and pays \$200 a month.

The judge candidates will join the village council candidates on the Tuesday, March 5 ballot.

"Some friends who live in and out of Carrizozo talked about what I could do to serve the community, and this seems like the quickest way to get in," Hendrix said. "I'm a newcomer to the town and to political office, and I'd be new to the judicial system."

Hendrix was born in Maynardville, Tenn. He's married and the father of three children. He has two grandchildren.

His hobbies include golf, fishing, reading and remodeling older homes.

When he was appointed in June 1994, he had been in a courtroom only once in his life. Fortunately, the intensive training for new municipal judges began right away.

"The biggest challenge has been trying to decide what is best for the community at large and for the individual, while not infringing on individual rights, but trying to be fair and meet the requirements of law," he said. "So many things come into play."

Traffic cases constitute the majority of the cases before his court, Meeks said. Next come neighbor conflicts.

Born in Greenfield, south of Roswell, Meeks graduated from high school in Los Lunas. His father, a farmer, died when he was about 10 and he spent a great deal of time in Ruidoso with his grandfather Bill Sublette.

In 1955, he earned a bachelor's degree in geophysics at New Mexico Tech in Socorro. After only a few months with a geophysical company in Texas, he was offered a job at White Sands Missile Range, where he was involved in flight safety and honed his ability to work under pressure and make decisions, Meeks said.

Seven years were spent in Washington, D.C., and Alexandria, Va., while he was with the Army Material Command.

"It was an advanced think tank trying to design weapons for 30 years in the future," Meeks said. "Many were seen in Desert Storm."

He retired from the federal government in 1984 and moved from El Paso to Carrizozo in 1990.

Divorced after more than 30 years of marriage, he is the father of three grown children and has eight grandchildren.



**Alfred M. Hendrix**

A retired civil servant, 64-year-old Alfred Hendrix spent most of his adult life around airplanes.

He served seven years in the Air Force as a pilot. He put in 24 years with the Federal Aviation Administration Control.

For nine years, he was an instructor under a contract between the federal government and the University of Oklahoma, teaching air traffic control.

He decided to run for municipal judge as a way to serve the community. He moved to Carrizozo 16 months ago. He has never run before for public office, but decided this was a good time to take the

Appointed two years ago to fill the post of municipal judge when the incumbent winner died suddenly after the election, William C. Meeks has decided he likes the job.

"I retired to enjoy life, but I thought this would be a challenge and help ward off mental stagnation," Meeks said. "I had been tutoring high school students the past four years and this was a way of continuing serving the community."

mph in the area and a high wind warning, private workers burned brush on a vacant lot Wednesday apparently being cleared for construction in the Valley Heights Subdivision north of Ruidoso, said BVFD officials.

Neighbors concerned about the controlled burn called the sheriff's office, and a deputy was sent to talk to the construction workers.

No law exists to stop people from

burning during high winds, officials said, and the sheriff's office doesn't keep track of high wind warnings.

Still, the sheriff's office should be alerted when a controlled burn is planned, so it doesn't get a call from a neighbor and send out a fire department crew if it's not necessary, the deputy told the construction crew. In Thursday's case, however, a neighbor's 3 a.m. call to the fire department may have saved homes and lives.

Private property owners can be forced to pay fire department costs when they deliberately set fires.

Bonito Fire Department officials warned against private controlled burns until conditions improve.

"We've had no moisture in weeks and these high winds can quickly turn a warm fire into a hot one," one firefighter said. "If this flareup hadn't been spotted when it was, the entire subdivision could have been threatened."

# Ruidoso Downs man pleads no contest to charge of wife assault

A Ruidoso Downs man held at the county jail for 12 days after being arrested for allegedly beating his wife pleaded no contest in Magistrate Court Thursday to the petty misdemeanor charge of battery to a household member.

Rodney Almanza, 26, was released from custody after being issued a year of probation and a suspended \$1,000 fine by Judge William Butts.

An identical, concurrent sentence was issued by Butts on a second charge against Almanza — assault against a police officer. That misdemeanor charge was filed after Ruidoso Downs police were putting Almanza in a holding cell, just after his Feb. 9 arrest for battering his wife.

Almanza leaped at the detaining officers and attempted to grab their legs, police said.

He had been arrested earlier in the day after an Allison Lane neighbor called police. The neighbor allegedly witnessed Almanza

throw his wife to the ground and beat her with his fists.

Following Almanza's arrest, Butts set his bond at \$15,000. Almanza told Butts Thursday he would leave town if released from jail.

"I think moving to Roswell is a good idea," Butts said. Upon his release, Butts told Almanza to notify the police department and request they assist him in collecting his belongings from his household. He was also ordered to abstain from alcohol and drugs and to have no contact with his wife.

If Almanza stays in Ruidoso, he must get treatment for anger management and substance abuse, the judge said.

Almanza's wife Valerie, who was charged with a petty misdemeanor charge of battery to a household member after the couple's violent Feb. 9 encounter, pleaded innocent to charges against her.

Her case will be set for trial, Butts said.

# DWI blitz starts on Friday

Warm weather is already here in many parts of New Mexico. That means open containers of alcohol are much more prevalent.

New Mexico law enforcement officers will be out in force during the next Operation DWI Blitz, which begins on Friday, March 1, looking for people with open containers and drunk drivers.

The state's Open Container Law was adopted in 1992. The law says that no open containers of alcoholic beverages may be placed where they are in reach of the driver or passengers while the vehicle is moving. This includes any bottle, can or other receptacle containing an alcoholic beverage which has been opened, had its seal broken or

the contents partially removed. Opened containers may be stored in the trunk, pick-up bed or other out-of-reach storage areas.

"Many people don't need an excuse to drink and drive in New Mexico, but during the warm weather months, people are more likely to drive with opened containers of alcohol," said Tom McCalmont, DWI Coordinator with the New Mexico Traffic Safety Bureau. "For the last three years, there have been a total of 14,186 open container convictions in the state."

Restaurants, bars and retailers will be promoting the open container message during the month of March.

### Those who start wildfires can be held responsible for costs

The news that the Elk Fire on the Mescalero Apache Reservation was likely caused by a careless motorist's cigarette should be a wake-up call for all of us in this drought-stricken time.

It doesn't take much to start a wildfire these days — and if you're caught as the culprit, you could be held liable for the cost incurred in putting it out. Someone out there could be cringing in their boots at this thought — someone who remembers throwing a cigarette out the window while traveling down State Highway 244 on Wednesday last week. Although you probably won't get caught, it's sobering to think you've caused part of a \$1.5 million fire that could have killed someone, isn't it?

We tried to find out who it was that started a "controlled burn" on an Angus construction site during high wind warnings last week, too. We wanted to put their name in the paper, but it seems officials aren't sure who was responsible. Those in the construction business should have a way to keep track of high wind days if they're going to start fires.

Private individuals are supposed to call the sheriff's office if they plan to start controlled burns, too, so a fire department isn't sent out when worried neighbors call. It would be good if the sheriff organized a way for his people to know when high wind days are in effect, so dispatchers can warn people not to burn on those days.

Joe and Lynn were more than pleased with the deal. Buttermilk was a beautiful and intelligent roping and cutting horse Jim had ridden as a cowboy on the Flying H Ranch.

Joe soon became very fond of the horse, and Lynn gave his half-ownership of Buttermilk to Joe.

Buttermilk became Joe's pride and joy, and he made horseback trips among his friends throughout Lincoln County.

### Newspaper Career

When he began going to Austin in the

winters, Joe entered the University of Texas. Here he ran the mile on the track team, and was co-captain his last year.

In 1936 Joe was editor of the school newspaper, the Daily Texan. One of his assistants on the paper was Walter Cronkite.

Later, Joe was editor of the Sweetwater Reporter, and San Angelo Standard.

He worked in the Agriculture Department under Franklin D. Roosevelt, and before entering the Army in World War II published his own small crusading newspaper "Spade" in Washington, D.C.

While an Infantry Scout in the Timberwolf Division, Joe fell in battle Feb. 25, 1945.

His name is inscribed at Texas Memorial Stadium in Austin.



## 'Horns overwhelm 'Zozo

### Roy's playoff experience too much for Grizzlies

It didn't take long for an experienced Roy team to dash whatever hopes for victory Carrizozo might have entertained at the Class A Girls State Basketball Tournament.

The Longhorns stampeded to a 37-6 first quarter lead, en route to trampling the Grizzlies, 104-46, in the Class A quarterfinals played at Manzano High School in Albuquerque.

Roy might have won the game on the court, but Carrizozo won the hearts of some at the game with its gutsy play in the second quarter.

The Grizzlies put up a feisty fight in that period, despite trailing by as many as 43 points early in the quarter. Coach Kim Gremillion's five - comprised of an eighth-grader, two ninth-graders, a sophomore and a junior - outplayed Roy's second string and outscored the Longhorns 22-20 in the second frame.

Carrizozo sent a 'you-can't-demoralize-us' message to Roy

coach Rick Hazen with its play. And Hazen responded by rotating his top seven players most of the second half, even though the Longhorns maintained their insurmountable lead.

"It's the state tournament, and they're out to win. If you come that far, you don't show any mercy," Carrizozo coach Kim Gremillion said of Roy's 58-point win.

Other coaches might not have been as gracious as Gremillion.

The Longhorns' press and fast-break were too much for Carrizozo. Roy's twin towers of Kimberly Smith (6-0) and Sarah Lane (5-10) cleared the boards. Roy had a 47-28 rebound advantage. Smith and Lane triggered the Longhorns' fast-break. Senior speedster Venita Laumbach tracked down the long-outlet passes and converted them into easy layups. Laumbach finished 12-for-15 from the field, including 2-for-3 from 3-point range, to lead all scorers with 26 points.

"They were awesome. You could tell they had been there (to the state tournament)," Gremillion said

of the Longhorns. Carrizozo senior Naomi Vallejos sparked the Grizzlies in the first half with 12 of her team-high 19 points. Eighth-grader Renee Rael finished with 14 points in an impressive performance for a mid-schooler.

"She even hung in there with their top seven. If she keeps improving over the summer, she's going to be tough next year," Gremillion said of her eighth-grader.

The Grizzlies proved they will be a team to be reckoned with next year. Gremillion returns all five (Amber Vallejos, Naomi Vallejos, Mandy Baca, Renee Rael, and Cortney Maynard) who sparked the Grizzlies in the second period. Carrizozo will lose seniors Debbie Bond and Sarah Funk to graduation and junior Katie Hightower, who will study abroad as a foreign exchange student next year.

"I think it is a bright future for them," Gremillion said.

Down 57-28 at the half, Gremillion focused on what positives the Grizzlies had accomplished.

"I told them I was proud of them for the way they played in the second quarter," Gremillion recalled.

## Prieto, Espinosa pace Warriors at state tourney

A pair of seniors - one with lots of experience and the other with lots of muscle - led the Ruidoso wrestling team's efforts at the Class A-AAA State Wrestling Championships Friday and Saturday.

As Ruidoso wrestling coach Gerald Ames watched Warrior senior Jose Prieto whip his Los Alamos opponent Saturday, all he said to anyone who cared to listen was, "Where was he (Prieto) yesterday? Where was he yesterday?"

Prieto managed to make it to the consolation round of the Class A-AAA 119-pound division of the state wrestling meet.


But Ames' question also seemed to imply that Prieto could have been in the winners bracket heading into Saturday's final rounds. He certainly could have, had a flu bug not hampered his efforts Friday.

The senior Ruidoso wrestler came back Saturday and salvaged a Top 10 finish despite his illness. He was Ruidoso's top place finisher at the state tournament. The Warriors as a team ended in 21st place with 21 points. Prieto concludes the season with a team-best 35-13 record.

"He fought hard and was a real good leader for the team. He did a real good job," Ames said.

Another Ruidoso senior, 189-pounder Lalo Espinosa, led the Warriors in scoring. Espinosa and Prieto both finished with 4-2 records, but by virtue of Espinosa's three pins he paced the Warriors in scoring with eight points. Prieto earned seven points for Ruidoso.

Espinosa has wrestled for only 1.5 seasons. This was his first full

year on the mats. But his late-season peaking has some wondering just how good Espinosa could have been had he wrestled for the last four years.

The sculpted Espinosa is one of Ames' physically strongest wrestlers, but brawn doesn't necessarily translate into success in the wrestling room. Espinosa lacked the technical skills other wrestlers have at his age. It resulted in a 0-12 start this season.

"He just came on all year. He really had trouble figuring it out. Then about a month ago, he made things go his way," Ames said, calling Espinosa "the real hero of the weekend" for the Warriors.

Espinosa's record climbed to 4-

14, and he took a 5-17 mark into the state tourney. After his 4-2 finish at state, Espinosa finishes with an admirable 9-19 record.

Fortunately, the poorly-lit confines of Tingley Coliseum couldn't dim the excitement at the New Mexico State Wrestling Class AAAA and Class A-AAA Tournaments. Wrestlers from 48 teams vied for honors.

The Warriors pulled off a pair of big victories in two other weight divisions. Heavyweight Brad Beavers upset the tourney's No. 7 seed, Captain's Ray Sandoval. Beavers pinned Sandoval in Friday's first round matches. Senior Kody Sparks pinned his second op-

ponent for a couple of points for Ruidoso.

Ruidoso also had its share of tough draws. Senior Shaun Cobb lost to Bernalillo's Melven Lucero, and then had to face Silver's Ruben Turrieta, who was upset in the first round. The fighting Colt took out his anger on Cobb and defeated the Ruidoso wrestler, eliminating him from the fray. Sophomore Eric Russell took on No. 1 seed Toby Barrera of Astec. Russell rebounded from that loss to beat New Mexico School for the Visually Handicapped's Leonel Parks. But Helen's Jonathan Trujillo dismissed Russell in a one-point decision.

"Overall it was a pretty good

trip. It was a good team thing. The kids got experience and there's a lot of kids coming up for next year," Ames said.

Ames will lose five seniors to graduation, but welcomes his largest freshman class of wrestlers (10) since 1985, so all will be sophomores next year. Warrior freshman wrestling classes usually average about two, said Ames, who credited football coach/athletic director Les Carter for the big fresh numbers by encouraging students to join the team.

Five Ruidoso wrestlers weren't allowed to compete at state after stealing pillows from a hotel.

Have you received it in the mail yet? You know...your income tax forms. Most people will be trying to figure out if they are going to be lucky this year and receive a refund. When you are working on your taxes, remember the Share with Wildlife (SwW) program.

Near the bottom of your state income tax form you'll see a box for voluntary contributions. Share with Wildlife is the first fund listed. You'll need to fill out an additional form this year if you wish to make a contribution — it is the Pit D refund donation form. Share with Wildlife is the first one listed.

Share with Wildlife is a non-profit fund dedicated to the conservation of all wildlife in New Mexico. Although it is part of the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish, the program is supported entirely by voluntary contributions. Share with Wildlife funds research, habitat protection, wildlife rehabilitation and public education with a focus on projects benefiting wildlife which do not receive funding from any other source — mostly threatened and endangered species. This is what makes the program so important.

Since 1981, Share with Wildlife has funded such diverse projects as studying the rare and mysterious gla monster; Talking Talons, a

youth leadership program which combines education and conservation; HawkWatch International, a raptor migration study taking place in the Sandia and Manzano Mountains, along with helping to complete a Watchable Wildlife program, which will bring people and wildlife closer together.

Your contribution is more important than ever because of a decline in our donations. When SwW started in 1981 it was the only check-off program on the state income tax form. Donations to the program were strong and averaged about \$200,000 per year. However, two more check-off programs were added and contributions to SwW were cut in half. The program received another blow in 1990 when a change in the state withholding tax resulted in fewer people receiving a refund. Finally, in 1992 two more check-off programs

were added bringing the total to five. That's a lot of check-offs for a sparsely populated state like New Mexico, and donations have fallen to about \$35,000 per year.

To try to offset this loss, the Department of Game and Fish went to the State Legislature last year with a new idea to generate funds. They introduced legislation to create a "prestige" Share the Wildlife motor vehicle license plate with a wildlife motif. If it had been approved, a small additional fee for the special license plate would have been used for projects approved by Share with Wildlife. Unfortunately it was not approved so funding is still a problem.

You can make a difference, now more than ever. If you receive a refund, please donate whatever you can to help wildlife in the state. If you have an accountant prepare your income taxes, please tell him or her you want to "check it off" for Share with Wildlife.







# Judge forced to let robbery suspect out of jail because witness delays preliminary hearing

With a necessary witness to an alleged robbery missing from a Ruidoso Magistrate Court preliminary hearing Thursday, the judge had no choice but to drop a \$250,000 bond and let the defendant out of jail pending outcome of the case.

Anthony Estrada, held at the county jail since Feb. 10 on armed robbery charges, was released on his own recognizance and awaits rescheduling of the hearing.

"A necessary state witness, Nancy Aubrey, is a reluctant witness," the state's assistant District Attorney Viola Rhodes told the court. "I ask that the case be continued and I'll try to get the witness here."

The alleged robbery's other witness and primary victim, Anne Sanchez, was present, but was not asked to testify.

Estrada was released after Rhodes said she wouldn't object.

His conditional release — requiring Estrada to obey all laws, not contact the witnesses, and abstain from alcohol — is based on a defendant's right to a preliminary hearing within 10 days of in-

carceration. "I can't hold him in jail any longer without a hearing," Judge William Butts said.

Butts had already let Estrada out of jail in December, with the condition he complete 30 days of substance abuse treatment. Estrada had been serving five months at the county jail for assault and resisting arrest outside a Ruidoso Allsup's store last summer.

Upon completion of his treatment, Estrada's original six month sentence was served and no probation time was ordered, Butts said.

But after being identified Feb. 10 by Sanchez and Aubrey as the man who robbed Sanchez of her jewelry the night before, Estrada

was arrested and put back in jail.

Ruidoso Downs police charged him with armed robbery, a second-degree felony; and assault with intent to commit a violent felony and aggravated battery, both third-degree felonies. Butts had set his bond at \$250,000.

If found guilty of all charges, Estrada could be sentenced to a maximum 20 years in jail.

Estrada, 30, allegedly committed the armed robbery by holding a switchblade to Sanchez's throat and striking her, police said. The crime allegedly occurred inside Sanchez's car when she was giving him a lift to a store. Estrada made her pull over in a lot behind Pappy's Diner in Ruidoso Downs where he robbed her, police said.

# POOP SCOOP

Cruelty and abuse against animals can take many forms, from subtle neglect to outright beating, said Sandra Ford, assistant administrator of the Lincoln County Humane Society.

"It can range from torture such as kicking, using an animal for target practice and setting them on fire, to abandonment by dumping them in remote areas to fend for themselves," Ford said. "Others neglect their animals by leaving them days on end confined inside a home or garage, or on a chain in a yard without food or water."

A grizzly discovery this summer brought to Ford's attention a horrid case of neglect, but too late to help the animals involved.

"A distraught couple came to the shelter door asking advice about a renter they evicted," she said. "When they inspected the property, they found several chains attached to stakes and on the other end of the chains were the decomposing bodies of dogs."

"I advised them to call the sheriff's department since the property was in the county and to take photographs. I felt prosecution wasn't likely since the persons responsible for the crime probably were long gone."

As she watched the couple leave, Ford said she felt sick, sad and angry.

"I was left wondering, wasn't there a neighbor or someone who knew those dogs were there? A complaint could have brought attention to the situation before it became so abhorrent," Ford said.

Animal abuse happens in every city and county across the nation every day, Ford said.

"It's good to see some states are cracking down," she said. "In 1995, Oregon, Louisiana and Pennsylvania joined in making animal abuse a felony, bringing the total to 15 states."

To date, Oregon has the most rigid sentence of up to a \$100,000 fine and/or five years in prison, Ford said. In California, animal control officers are mandated to report suspicions of child abuse.

"It's well known that cruelty to animals too often goes hand-in-hand with other despicable crimes, such as child abuse. In the majority of cases of violent offenders, there is a long history of animal abuse," she said.

Education young children in school about humane treatment of animals is a start to the end of animal cruelty. But until humane groups can convince state legislators to pass stricter laws in New Mexico and even after, animals need human voices to bring attention to their suffering. Remember, such behavior can be prosecuted as a misdemeanor.


