

**Hearing on Downs  
at Santa Fe track  
lawsuit delayed**

The New Mexico Supreme Court will hear the merits of a lawsuit on May 1 that was filed against Governor Gary Johnson, instead of hearing it today as originally scheduled.

The lawsuit, filed by Victor Marshall's antigambling group, asks Johnson to direct the New Mexico Racing Commission not to grant a racing license to the Pojoaque Pueblo, which owns The Downs at Santa Fe.

Like Ruidoso Downs officials have stated at racing commission meetings, Marshall's group contends the state can't give a racing license to the Pojoaques because state law prohibits issuing licenses to those who operate illegal gambling activities. The two groups call the pueblo's casino illegal, because gambling compacts the governor signed to allow Indian casinos have been thrown out by the state Supreme Court.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track is not involved with the lawsuit, track officials confirmed. Hubbard Enterprises President Mark Wilson offered no comment about the lawsuit.

Racing commission agency director Julian Luna said the commission did nothing wrong in issuing a conditional license to PTE, Inc., the holding company of the Pojoaque Pueblo.

"The racing commission feels it has done everything it can in following the rules and regulations in the licensing of PTE, Inc.," Luna said.

The racing commission granted a conditional license to PTE, Inc. at its March 7 meeting, pending a background check which still hasn't been completed, Luna said.

In a related matter, Ruidoso Downs Race Track officials withdrew their request to send a simulcast signal to The Downs at Santa Fe until the legal opinion is clarified about PTE, Inc. operating the Santa Fe racetrack.

Ruidoso Downs had submitted its simulcast request at yesterday's racing commission meeting, then withdrew the request because of legal questions surrounding the compacts.

"Ruidoso Downs is one small fish in Mr. Hubbard's pond and we can't do anything to jeopardize any of his other licenses. It's nothing personal towards anyone. It's just what we've got to do," said track director of operations Rick Baugh.

**Judge upholds  
deputy indictment**

A motion to void an indictment against a Lincoln County deputy sheriff was denied Tuesday in district court.

Judge Sandra Grisham ruled against the arguments of defense attorney James Counts, who is representing Deputy Angelo Vega. The deputy is charged with extortion and intimidation of a witness.

Although no date was set for trial, Grisham said she will schedule it before Aug. 9 since Vega was arraigned Feb. 9 and he has requested a speedy trial within a six-month period. The trial will be conducted in Carrizozo. Counts and Klein said they would not seek a change of venue (trial site).

Vega is on administrative leave with pay. He has taken a job driving an activities bus for the Carrizozo School District.

Vega is accused of trying to turn two women into confidential informants by threatening to prosecute them on charges he knew already had been dismissed.

Using the municipal courtroom in Ruidoso, Counts argued the indictment is defective because the grand jury was not given proper instructions that there must be an intent to commit the crimes of extortion and intimidation.

"The grand jury needed to know he (Vega) was doing as he had been instructed to get them to be informants, not to violate the law," Counts said.

Those instructions came from Sheriff James McSwane and assistant district attorney Viola Rhodes, he said.

"I'm not saying anyone told him to threaten them with continued prosecution, but there was testimony that he was told to have a conversation with (the two women) and try to convince them to become informants," Counts said.

"That's legal," Judge Grisham said of the alleged instructions. "A threat to continue prosecution is what crosses the boundary."

"Without instruction on intent, we contend the grand jury could not properly evaluate (intent)," Counts responded.

But Richard Klein, an assistant attorney general from Santa Fe, said prosecutors followed the

specific guidelines of the Supreme Court in giving instructions to the grand jury. Counts had not asked for any other specific instructions to be given, Klein said.

Counts also contended prosecutors gave false information to the grand jury by indicating the court took part in dismissing the charges against the women. Actually, the judge only signed a paper indicating the district attorney had decided not to prosecute, Counts said.

Klein countered that prosecutors didn't say the judge had issued a ruling to dismiss the case. They said the women were unaware of the recent decision of the court and district attorney not to prosecute, before the women were asked to be informants.

Counts' third argument for squashing the indictment was that the grand jury had not acted as an independent body, because it approved one count that contained a typographical error in the form of an incorrect name. The jury probably didn't read the indictments, but just signed off on what the prosecutor sent, defaulting in their official capacity, he said.

But Klein said the grand jury was under no constraint to adopt the language contained in the indictment. He also noted that the same typographical error appeared twice in briefs Counts filed with the court.

"A typo is not enough to squash an indictment under the laws of New Mexico," Klein said.

While the state could put more thought into its grand jury instructions, Grisham said they did not contain false information and were not improper.

Judge Grisham took no action on a request by Klein that Vega be fingerprinted and booked on the intimidation and extortion charges.

"He should be treated as any other defendant," Klein said. "We can't look into the future whether he might become a fugitive."

But Grisham said Vega's fingerprints already are on file as a deputy.

"If you're asking me to issue an order, we will follow due process," Grisham said. "File a motion and cite an authority for me to order the defendant to present himself."

**Hiker dies in fall from cliff**

An Ohio man died after he apparently fell 130 feet from a cliff in the rugged Sacramento mountains east of Three Rivers Campground, about 30 miles south of Carrizozo.

Rescuers reached the body of Stephen D. Kerr, 43, Tuesday afternoon by rappelling down a steep cliff, state Medical Examiner Barbara Day said.

They encased the body in a bag to prevent damage from wildlife, but ran out of daylight before they could attempt to lift the body out of the rocky terrain where it was spotted earlier from the air.

A rescue team should bring the body out of the forest late today, Day said.

Kerr left Alamogordo Thursday for a two-day trip into the Lincoln National Forest, reportedly in search of discarded antlers.

When he failed to return by Monday, the campground host at Three Rivers radioed the Forest Service station in Capitan and said Kerr was missing, Lincoln County Deputy Charlie Engelking said. The Forest Service employee notified the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office and that dispatcher called the state police, the agency responsible for initiating search and rescue operations.

The search started about 4 p.m. Monday and enlisted the help of more than 50 volunteers and law enforcement officials, including the White Mountain

Search & Rescue crew from Lincoln County. Many were on horseback, while others were on foot.

Although the body was spotted Tuesday afternoon, the terrain was too rough for a helicopter to land and rescue crews tried to work their way into the site about two miles east of the campground.

According to the state police, Kerr's 1969 trailer or recreational vehicle was parked at the campground. Although it was registered in the state of Washington, Kerr's current driver's license listed his address as Maumee, Ohio.

He reportedly was familiar with the area, because he visited frequently to hang glide.

**Separate weekend fires likely  
caused by careless people**

Careless people apparently started fires that burned along U.S. Highway 70 Saturday and threatened a Ruidoso home Sunday.

A motorist reported one fire at the eastern edge of Lincoln County near Picacho Hill and Riverside about 1:30 p.m., said Bill Duemling of the state Forestry Division.

About four acres burned before the flames were extinguished. Smoke billowed across the highway, causing officials to consider closing the road at one point, Duemling said.

"It was at the height of the wind with gusts up to 35 mph," Duemling said. "It burned on the south side of the highway, jumped the road and continued burning for about one mile on both sides in a straight line."

The fire charred cacti and grass, he said. Units responding included two from the Hondo Fire Department, one from the Bureau of Land Management in Roswell, one from the state forestry and a hand crew and water tender from Fort Stanton.

The exact cause of the fire is unknown, but Duemling said it had to be man-made since there was no

lightning. It could have been ignited by a tossed cigarette or sparks from a semi, he said.

In Ruidoso, fire threatened a home on Granite Drive in White Mountain Estates about 1 p.m. Sunday, but 15 firefighters from the Ruidoso Fire Department successfully controlled the blaze.

"We were there within three minutes after receiving the call," said firefighter Harlan Vincent. "It took about 30 minutes to put out. It burned grass, underbrush and trees in a vacant lot between two houses."

Crew members checked the site. Please see Fires, page 3A

With the fire danger in the forest around Ruidoso teetering on the highest rating of "extreme," manning the fire tower at Monjeau Lookout is a priority. But money has been too scarce — until this week.

Someone was assigned that duty

Monday, now that the U.S. Forest Service has released \$2 million in "severity funding" to ranger districts in the Southwest region.

The money is to augment firefighting capabilities for what some experts predict will be a record fire season in the third year

# Mayor attacks running water rumors

Attempting to plug up some Ruidoso rumors, Mayor Jerry Shaw countered with some facts about village water supplies Friday.

"We still hear so many rumors" about water issues, Shaw said at the annual Community Update Luncheon at the convention center.

Unsubstantiated stories may have grown in frequency in recent weeks because of dire drought conditions, Shaw said.

The rumors exaggerate leakage problems at Grindstone Lake Dam; claim the village was "ripped off" with its purchase of the wellfield along Eagle Creek, and allege the village emptied Alto Lake so that it could build a water tower, Shaw said.

"A lot has been done (to increase village water supplies) over the years, and some things were not done," Shaw said.

The village had the opportunity to buy Bonito Lake around 1950 for \$35,000, but declined, Shaw said. It was purchased instead by the city of Alamogordo.

"It probably couldn't even be bought for \$35 million now," Shaw said.

## Grindstone Lake Dam

In the mid-1980s, the village built Grindstone Lake Dam, a project which had many opponents including the council at the time. Some disagreed about where the dam should be built, Shaw recalled. It also ended up costing about \$12 million, nearly double what was originally expected because the design was changed from an earthen dam to one of concrete.

"Now remnants of the opposition continue to exaggerate about the leaks in the dam, and recant stories of problems during construction," she said.

Other stories circulate about the original construction method being faulty and about leaks in the joints after construction that were never repaired.

After the initial construction of the dam, several of the joints leaked excessively and needed repairs, Assistant Village Manager Alan Briley said after the luncheon. Some Ruidoso firefighters were contracted to strip the rubber sealants, and repairs were done by professionals. Assistant Fire Chief Robbie Hall did seal one hairline crack on the backside of the dam which never did leak and which remains sealed to this day, Briley said.

With time and exposure, the joints (which naturally allow leakage of an average 200 gallons each minute) have deteriorated and

have progressively let more water leak than normal.

This winter, temporary seals were applied where the joints were leaking most. At that time, leakage was up to about 600 gallons a minute versus 400 gallons per minute in 1995. The temporary work reduced leakage to 300 gallons per minute. New sealants will be installed this summer, Briley said.

## Grindstone on-line

"Until 1993-94, nothing was done about using Grindstone Lake," Shaw explained. The council prior to hers made no effort to develop a water treatment plant at the dam for drinking water, she said.

That former council pushed fiscal conservatism by cutting the street department budget in half, among other department cutbacks, and ignored the needs of infrastructure, Shaw alleged.

Shaw's administration made water supplies and improvements to village infrastructures a priority, she said.

"Water was our number one issue and our number one water issue was getting Grindstone on-line," Shaw said.

In 1994, through the efforts of former state legislator John Underwood, about \$670,000 was acquired from the state, and \$1.2 million in village funds were used to build the plant. Construction began in January 1995 and was completed last June.

In August, a voter-approved bond issue for \$800,000 will be used to double the plant's treatment capacity to two million gallons a day. The plans have been submitted to the state Environment Department.

Alternative piping is also being added so the northern part of Ruidoso can be served by the plant, and the village is budgeting \$500,000 in the upcoming 1996-97 budget for a new 3.5 million gallon water storage tank at Grindstone.

## Wellfield not a rip-off

Stories are again being resurrected that the village got "ripped off" by paying \$1,129,600 for securing the water rights in the Eagle Creek wellfield, Shaw said.

"The naysayers say they're not producing much," Shaw related.

But these wells, purchased in 1984, give the village the legal right to pump nearly 1.825 billion gallons of water per year, she said.

Since 1988, the village has pumped 1.477 billion gallons from these wells.

The village experienced wet years in the late 1980s and early

1990s and received effluent credit with surface flows, which reduced the need to pump from these wells, she said.

"Please remember, when you hear criticisms about Grindstone Lake and Eagle Creek, that without them, we wouldn't be drinking water today," Shaw said.

The wells are now being pumped continuously and new, exploratory wells are being drilled to locate deeper and more plentiful underground water sources. Additionally, existing village-owned wells in the Eagle Creek field are being deepened and refitted for use.

## Lake not drained

Alto Lake is owned by the Eagle Creek Intercommunity Water Supply Association, Inc., (ECIWSAI) of which both Ruidoso and Capitan are members.

The ECIWSAI owned wells are separate from the village-owned Eagle Creek wells (newly named Thursday to Northfork Eagle Creek Wellfield to lessen confusion.)

Association members have planned a project to install an outlet water tower that will take water from more than one level in the lake.

The lake was not drained in the fall of 1995 so the village could do this construction work, but "emptied by the water users of Ruidoso," Shaw explained.

After consumers drained it, request for proposals were advertised for the tower construction work. However, no one bid for the work. Instead of putting the project back to bid, the association decided to

close up the dam and attempt to catch as much of the winter snow runoff as possible, Briley explained.

This has been the driest of winters in three consecutively dry years, and runoff from the snow-pack into the Eagle Creek is non-existent.

"The lake could be filled now if there was runoff," Shaw said.

## Conservation measures

Because Eagle Creek is dry, wells can't recharge and there's no runoff to refill Alto Lake, the village's strictest water conservation measure has been enforced since January.

"Everyone's panicking, thinking we're nearly out of water," Shaw said of phase three of the conservation plan councilors imposed in January.

The third phase forbids outdoor water use (including washing vehicles at home) and suspends water leak credits.

"Ruidoso is in a unique position. We need to supply water for 30,000 people some weekends," she said, not just "our 6,500 selves."

Some residents' water supplies come from private wells, making their water use exempt from the third phase water restrictions. Area golf courses also have a unique situation, Shaw said. Cree Meadows Country Club uses its own water rights and wells. The Links Golf Course also leased its own water rights from a private source and transferred those rights into wells, Shaw said. Both courses use untreated water.

# County's drought history runs deep

The current drought isn't the first time Lincoln County has suffered a water shortage, County Manager Frank Potter told the audience at *The Ruidoso News* Community Update luncheon.

But this time the village is better prepared and conservation restrictions may be enough to cover the problem, he said.

In the 1960s and following two decades, Potter was involved in securing additional water rights and drilling more wells for the village of Ruidoso. He served as deputy manager and then manager for the village.

"We were experiencing tremendous shortages and couldn't deliver to the 2,180 residents," Potter said.

Plenty of data on the area's ground and surface water supply already has been collected over the last few decades, he said, ticking off a list of studies conducted in 1948, 1963, 1971 and 1983.

Six wells dug in 1981 into the Mesa Verde underground formation produced water high in calcium sulfate, but they still are being used

today and account for the white residue around faucets, he said.

He displayed a geological hydrological map showing areas more likely to contain and hold ample underground water. At least one, composed of Dakota sandstone, has not been drilled for wells yet and promises to be a good source of water, he said.

When he was hired two months ago by county commissioners, one of their first directives was to determine the water supply available for development in the county.

He is seeking money from the Interstate Stream Commission for that work, but will draw heavily on the prior studies that also examine evaporation rates from surface water. Those rates are considerable in a dry climate, Potter said.

Water in New Mexico is a complicated subject that falls under federal and state laws, environmental requirements and private water right laws, he said.

## Pecos users interrelated

The last speaker of the afternoon was Fred Hennighausen, a water attorney from Roswell who represents the Pecos Valley Artesian Conservancy District.

All surface and groundwater in the Pecos water system, which includes the Rio Ruidoso, Rio Bonito and Rio Hondo, are interrelated. Therefore, water use in one area affect availability in another, he said.

That's why State Engineer Thomas C. Turney has looked at this area for younger water right priority dates to satisfy a water debt owned to the state of Texas based on a 1946 compact.

"But the last thing he wants to do is call on those priorities," Hennighausen said. "He's looking for all other solutions first."

Priority dates could determine how long people can continue to use water in a drought. Those who hold younger dates must relinquish use to holders of older dates if there's not enough to go around.

New Mexico is under a federal decree to deliver a certain amount of water each year to Texas, depending on climate factors established in 1947, he said. Last year,

# Chamber director challenges audience to meet challenges

the state had a credit of 32,000 acre-feet of water built up, but that dropped to 20,000 acre-feet this year. If the credit runs out, the state engineer will have to find other sources of water to fulfill its annual debt.

An acre foot of water equates to 325,851 gallons.

The shortage may be worse next year, and then water may have to be delivered to Texas, possibly by

buying or leasing rights," Hennighausen said. "That may affect this area."

The Carlsbad irrigation district closest to the Texas line has one of the earliest priority dates. If Texas demands more water than is available, the state engineer may have to shut down some water rights upstream, Hennighausen said.

He credited village and county leaders with foresight in developing wellfields and accumulating water

## EMNU thrives during other schools' drought

Grass may be struggling to rise out of the earth right now, but Eastern New Mexico University is thriving in Ruidoso.

of a drought.

The Forest Service previously indicated about \$100,000 was slated for the entire Lincoln National Forest, extending from Carlsbad to Cloudcroft and Ruidoso.

On Monday Dave Cummings, timber and fire management officer for the Smokey Bear District, said the district around Ruidoso will receive \$34,000. A portion will be released every 20 days, he said.

The money also will bring an extra fire engine to the district, beef up the dispatching staff, add staffing hours for all fire-related employees and extend a "hot shot" firefighting crew's time half a month through mid-September.

Three new firefighters will be added, bringing the on-site crew to 32 people, Cummings said.

Property owners who want advice on how to decrease the danger of fire around their homes may contact Bill Duemling with the state forestry division (364-2231) or a local tree care company, Cummings said.

"We weren't going to have any one there (at Monjeau) this summer full time, because of budget cuts," Cummings said. "The additional money will give us one month there starting right away."

The tower northwest of Ruidoso allows a panoramic view of the south side of the Capitan

Some immediate steps to take include pruning off dead branches, and removing diseased trees and smaller trees that could create "ladders" for fire to climb into the crowns of taller trees, he said.

Removing the diseased, weaker trees will leave more moisture for the healthy trees and better access to sunlight, he added.

"Cut away any branches overhanging your roof and clean the pine needles and debris off the roof," Cummings said. "Try to take out touching tree crowns, anything to break the path of a fire and stop it from reaching the tops of the trees."



## State is revising school standards

The State Board of Education is calling for public input on the revision of its "Standards for Excellence" document. In Ruidoso, a public hearing is scheduled for 6-8 p.m. Wednesday, April 24, in the board room of the Ruidoso Municipal Schools Administration Office.

The "Standards for Excellence" document tells schools what the state expects them to teach. It also identifies procedures for figuring out how well students are doing, and offers ways for schools to meet their education goals.

The "Standards for Excellence" tells schools how to fulfill a policy that calls for changes. This policy, called "Consolidating Initiatives for Tomorrow's Education," was drafted five years ago and establishes broad direction for improving public education.

"This regulation is considered a major document because it establishes expectations for successful New Mexico students and expected implementation procedures," said Dr. Bill Blair, an education consultant with the New Mexico Department of Education.

The revised "Standards for Excellence" is meant to clarify language and be more specific than the old version, according to Blair.

In part one, the document lists what students are expected to learn in school. The revised version condenses and re-words several expectations. For example, the language skills requirement currently reads as follows:

"A knowledge, understanding, and application of the structure and use of the English language as well as other languages."

The proposed revision calls for students to "demonstrate proficiency in the English language. Develop an understanding of other cultures, and become competent in at least one language in addition to English."

The revision committee also proposed changes to how the requirement for teaching history and government is worded. The current standards call for:

"An understanding of the historical evolution of the democratic principles of the constitutional government of the United States; an application of the principles and processes of our representative form of government and understanding how they affect individuals, communities, tribes, states, nations, and the world; an understanding of the differences among various forms of government."

The proposed revision condenses this requirement to: "understand and apply social sciences."

For a complete review of changes, call the New Mexico Department of Education at 505-827-8097 and request current and revised copies of the "Standards for Excellence."

Also on the agenda for the Ruidoso public hearing is a review of drafts of the "Mathematics, Science and Language Arts Content Standards and Benchmarks." These State Board of Education guidelines break down by subject area exactly what should be taught and what should be expected of students at various grade levels.

According to Blair, schools already follow general guidelines for setting student competency goals. New content standards further define competency requirements by defining "benchmarks," or student progress goals, at Grade 4, Grade 8, and Grade 12.

"Statewide committees are being formed for all instructional programs," Blair said.

"This was my first real writing job outside of college," she said. "I thought I was really hot stuff because I'd gotten a job in my field, while all the other English majors I knew were pumping gas."

Within six months of reporting for *The News*, Cromwell decided journalism was not her calling. She left the newspaper and took a random series of jobs in and around Ruidoso, the most recent of which was at Desert Sky Health Foods.

During the past two years Cromwell has also experimented with her writing career. She published an alternative health newsletter called "HealthWise," she freelanced for Ruidoso Lifestyles magazine, and she taught creative writing workshops.

Humphreys, who is no lean, long-legged trackster, still looks every bit of a high school boy when standing next to the muscle-bound Urliacher (what high school boy doesn't?).

A stiff tailwind helped Humphreys continue his assault on the Warrior track record books. The 23-2 mark is more evidence that Humphreys is one of the best long jumpers in the state.

The day belonged to Humphreys, who won three individual events, and the Ruidoso girls team, which nipped Lovington for the team title.

No one, however, wanted to lay claim to the weather, which should have belonged to the plains, not the mountains. Gusting winds and mostly sunny conditions left athletes and fans windburned and sunburned, but not so burned out that either group gave up competing or cheering.

The unfavorable conditions did hamper qualifying efforts for individuals and relays.

Coach Ronnie Maskew's girls team secured first place in the teams standings with its second-place finish in the final event of the

meet. The Warriors needed to take at least second in the event to win the team title, which they did.

The girls gave fans plenty to cheer about in the 1600-meter medley relay. Ruidoso's anchor runner, America Sandoval, had to make up at least 25 yards going into the final two laps. Sandoval made up all but 10 yards in the second-to-last lap and, by the final stretch of the bell lap, she caught both the Artesia and Lovington runners for first place.

Saturday's meet was the first state qualifier of the season for the Warriors, and several secured a trip to Albuquerque.

Humphreys qualified in the long jump. Senior Angelica Figueroa met the requirement in the discus with a toss of 117-11 1/2.

The Warrior girls 400-meter relay team of Mandi Lewallen, Priscilla Rojas, Lisa Lopez and Sherry Dockery posted one of the fastest times in five years and qualified for the state meet with a mark of 51.68.

"We were pleased with everybody's effort, and now some of our sprinters are coming along. The sprinting part of the girls team has improved as much as anything," Maskew said.

Lopez is one of those sprinters who has blossomed of late. In her 200-meter dash victory, Lopez was only 5/100ths of a second off the school record. She also took second in the 100, and ran key legs in the 400-meter and 1600-meter relays for Ruidoso.

Maskew also noted the improvement of sprinters Rojas and Dockery.

But the weather, no doubt, affected some if not all performances. "The wind hurt everybody. If it's behind you in the long jump, you

have a tendency to scratch. Now just in the 100-meter dash, sure it helps. But in the high jump, long jump and almost everything else, it's a detriment," Maskew said.

Ruidoso's boys showed improvements in the field events, as well as the middle distance and distance running events.

Extra Sandoval in the 800-meter run and Zac Pafford and Kody Sparks in mile and 2-mile races also caught Maskew's eye.

"You could sure tell in the way that they competed (that they have improved)," Maskew said.

Saturday's meet left Maskew with some concerns about the Ruidoso boys relay teams.

"We're going to have to work on our relays. We have to get out there and compete to the best of our abilities," Maskew said.

The Warriors attend their second state qualifying meet of the season in Artesia Friday. They will compete in the Class AAA division, which includes Lovington, Artesia, New Mexico Military Institute, and Portales.



## All four Tiger relays qualified

In keeping with tradition, the Capitan girls track team will send four relay teams to the state meet in Albuquerque.

Coach Bryan Massé's 400-meter and medley relays qualified for the state meet Friday at the Tatum Relays. The Tigers already had qualified their 800-meter and 1600-meter relay teams April 8 at the Roadrunner Relays.

Woman accused of attacking daughter

A Ruidoso woman who allegedly choked her 21-year-old daughter Friday was arrested on domestic violence charges, police said.

Janice Fraley, 37, attacked her daughter at their Laurel Drive home when the victim tried to stop Fraley from hurting herself, police said.

Fraley had been drinking and was suicidal, the victim told police. After grabbing her daughter, Fraley also chased a friend of the victim's with a knife, police said.

Fraley is being held on a \$20,000 bond at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of aggravated assault (a fourth-degree felony), battery and battery against a household member. The last two charges are petty misdemeanors.

Fraley pleaded innocent to the charges at Ruidoso Magistrate Court Friday, and awaits a preliminary court appearance, Judge William Butts said.

If found guilty of all charges against her, Fraley could be sentenced to a maximum three years in jail and a \$8,000 fine.

Police said after Fraley grabbed her daughter by the throat and tried to choke her, she broke out a window with a rock and cut herself with the glass. Then she grabbed a large knife and attempted to harm herself, police said.

Two friends of the victim tried to prevent Fraley from harming herself. Fraley chased one friend and tried to stab him, and she tried to choke the other friend, police said.

Man charged with driving drunk and hitting passing car

An intoxicated Ruidoso Downs resident alien slammed his Subaru into an oncoming pickup truck Monday, police said.

Nicandro Rodriguez, 38, was charged with aggravated DWI after he struck the pickup driven by Lari Palmer of Mesalero. She suffered minor head injuries and was treated at the Lincoln County Medical Center emergency room.

Rodriguez and Palmer were traveling in opposite directions on Gavelin Canyon Road around 9:15 p.m. when Rodriguez's car crossed the median line and hit the pickup, police said.

He was charged with five misdemeanor motor vehicle violations, including aggravated DWI, reckless driving, driving with an open container, driving without a license, and driving without insurance.

Rodriguez pleaded guilty to the charges at the Ruidoso Magistrate Court Tuesday. Judge William Butts sentenced him to 30 days in jail, with 240 days probation, \$150 in fines and \$215 in court costs.

Rodriguez admitted he drank six beers before driving his vehicle, and two cold half-empty cans of beer were found inside his car, police said.

This was the first DWI offense filed against him, Butts said.

When he gets out of jail Rodriguez must attend DWI probation school, Butts said.


