**Another sign
of the times**

"Welcome to the homelands of the Mescalero Apache Tribe" announces a new sign on the north side of the Mescalero Inn in Ruidoso.

The billboard was erected 10 days ago, about the same time an application to add the 7.4 acres of land to the tribe's reservation trust was sent to the Bureau of Indian Affairs' Albuquerque office.

A BIA decision has yet to be made about the land, which village officials want to keep, but the sign went up anyway.

"We're aware of it and we're pondering it, among other things," said village planning director Cleatus Richards.

Permits are needed for business signs in the village, as they are for some political signs. The tribe's sign is considered political, he said.

Just how to deal with the premature boundary line sign is being looked into by the village attorney.

"This is a new body of law that the ink hasn't dried on yet," said Gary Jackson, village manager.

**Case closed on
death of Ruidoso
Downs woman**

A Ruidoso Downs woman died from a fatal mixture of drugs, the state medical examiners office reported May 30.

The New Mexico Office of the Medical Investigator determined Deeanne Perry, who died in February, suffered from the ingestion or injection of "combined morphine and ethanol poisoning."


Ruidoso Downs police officers Ray Montes and Alex Hinson along with medical personnel were dispatched to 206 South Parnell because Perry was not breathing at about 8:44 p.m. February 18. Perry was transported to Lincoln County Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead of unknown causes.

Without any other evidence concerning the case, the file on Deeanne Perry has been closed, said Chris Condon, Ruidoso Downs police detective.

Sullivan wins GOP sheriff's bid

By a slim 12 votes, Lincoln County Republicans picked Tom Sullivan Tuesday to run against Democrat Ralph Romero in the November general election for sheriff.

Because the wrong tally sheet was sent to County Clerk Martha Proctor in Carrizozo from a precinct in Ruidoso, the final total was delayed by about 1.5 hours while the top two candidates held their breath.

Sullivan was leading deputy Orlando Montes by four votes, but had been behind Montes at one point. The two emerged on top out of a crowded field of eight running in the primary.

"I'm a nervous wreck," Sullivan said after the final tally gave him 24% of the vote compared with Montes' 23%. "At one point I had a 100 vote lead, then Ruidoso Downs came in where I knew Montes would be strong."

He won't change his campaign strategy for the general election, Sullivan said.

"But I will be sure I contact a lot more people," he said. "I'm glad its over for now and I can go home and go to bed. I have to drive to Grants in the morning (where he works as corrections administrator)."

Sullivan served two terms as sheriff in the 1980s.

Montes said he thought his biggest opponent would be former Ruidoso police chief Dick Swenor.



"I never dreamed Tom would be my competition," he said. "I thought I would do better than that, but nobody went to vote. We tried. We chased a lot of people, but 12 votes is like 1,200 in the end."

Although tied for bottom of the pack with Connie Hopper, head sheriff's dispatcher Johnnie Johnson kept his sense of humor.

"In politics, you never know what's going to happen," he said. "Anything would have been a surprise with this many running. The only thing I wonder about is my 86 votes with 2,000 promises."

"It's been Tom and Orlando all night with Swenor and (Undersheriff Bob) Miller probably third and fourth. Tom's hair has turned gray just standing here."

Johnson said he's ready to try for public office again.

"I enjoy politics," he said. "I believe there are no losers, just some get more votes than others."

Connie Hopper, a former Roswell motorcycle police officer and

Lincoln County deputy, was the lone woman in the pack.

"I not sure what it was" that failed to draw voters to her candidacy, Hopper said. She'll continue with her job as county emergency services coordinator.

The final tallies weren't available until 10:15 p.m. because of the delay caused by the Ruidoso precinct. Despite that, County Clerk Martha Proctor said the election went smoothly.

Most of the telephone calls to her office concerned how to handle write-in candidates or questions about why voters, who didn't specify a Republican, Democratic or Green Party affiliation, couldn't vote in the primaries.

"A lot of them said they can mark 'decline to state' a party in Texas and still vote in the primaries, but New Mexico has a closed party system," Proctor said.

All votes totals are unofficial until they are certified Friday by the County Commission.

Howell pulls away in commission race

□ County Clerk calls
34% voter turnout
'pretty good.'

Republican voters returned incumbent Wilton Howell to the Lincoln County Commission Tuesday.

They nominated Commissioner Stirling Spencer to run for probate judge and chose political newcomer Rex Wilson to take his place on the commission.

The 34% showing of 9,803 registered voters in the county wasn't disappointing to County Clerk Martha Proctor, who predicted about 40%.

"I think it's a pretty good percentage considering there were few contested races in the Democratic party and this was the first time without a purge (eliminating non-active voters from eligibility rolls)," Proctor said.

Nearly 46% of the eligible 5,275 Republican voters cast ballots compared with 26% of the registered 3,400 Democratic voters and 11% of the Green Party.

Howell won a second term on the commission by collecting 60% of the votes in precincts six and eight, which make up District 3 on the commission.

His opponent, former commissioner and state representative Ben Hall received 166 votes or 40%.

"I feel like I won a combination of the lottery and a trip to Disneyland, because I enjoy being a commissioner," Howell said from a small celebration at Cree Meadows Country Club. "Hall is a formidable opponent. He's been here a long time and served as commissioner and representative."

"The last couple of years, I kept my feet on the ground, but now it looks like I will be more aggressive. I'm excited about the people supporting me."

At one point, Howell led by just one vote. During the evening, Howell and Hall swapped the lead several times in one of several cliffhanger races.

In commission district one, Republican Rex Wilson bested his opponent Jimmie Luna, a sheriff's deputy, with 65% of the vote compared with Luna's 35%.

A disappointed Luna said he has no plans to run for public office again, having lost a bid four years ago for sheriff and now his run for the commission.

"They know him and they know me and they just made the decision they felt was best," Luna said. "He's a nice man and I'll help him and the Republican Party any way I can."

Neither Republican winner faces a Democratic challenge.

In the race for probate judge, incumbent Republican J. O. "Bud" Payne and his primary challenger Stirling Spencer, a county commissioner, were tied two or three times before Spencer pulled away with 52% of the votes.

Spencer still faces a tough race in November when he will square off against Democrat Jack Johnson, who currently is Capitan municipal judge.

Contacted at his ranch in Carrizozo, Spencer said he had been out feeding cattle all day and hadn't seen the totals.

"If I wake up in the morning and I'm the man, I'll be out there campaigning to show people the interest I can bring the office and to

Judge deals Casino Apache a bust

Gambling at the Mescalero Apache Tribe's casino is illegal because state legislators didn't approve the governor's compact with the tribe, a federal court judge ruled Monday.

And because Johnson overstepped his authority, the compact is void, Chief District Judge John E. Conway ruled at the hearing in Santa Fe.

"The judge made it very clear yesterday (Monday) that the governor has no authority to bind the state of New Mexico with the compacts, and that the compacts are in nullity, meaning they do not exist," related state Attorney General Tom Udall.

The U.S. Attorney has the authority to shut the casino's doors unless the U.S. District Court grants the tribe a stay of enforcement, Udall said.

The U.S. Attorney "can have the FBI go to the reservation to seize the machines if he chose to," Udall said.

Gambling opponents who joined in the lawsuit as 'friends of the court' hailed Conway's ruling as a break

in the "log jam" of legal actions created by the federal government and tribes.

Monday's ruling only applies to the compact with the Mescalero Apache, but Udall said he wants it applied to identical gambling compacts signed by Johnson and 13 other tribes.

Arguments over whether those compacts are legal will be heard June 18 and 19 in a suit pending in U.S. District Court. That case was filed by nine other tribes.

"When the legal issues are clear, it will be up to the governor and the Legislature to deal with the political issue, or for the U.S. Attorney to enforce the law," Udall said.

U.S. Attorney John Kelly is waiting for the written decision before issuing a statement on how he'll proceed with the ruling, press secretary Ron Lopez said. Conway's ruling is expected to be put in writing at the end of the week, Udall said.

Marshall represented gambling opponents Guy Clark, Max Cole and George Buffet. They were also successful plaintiffs two other anti-gambling cases — a 1995 state Supreme Court case in which In-

dian gambling compacts were ruled invalid, and a 1994 suit that overturned voter approval of Amendment 8 for logging a state lottery question with video gaming.

The lawsuit was originally filed by the Mescalero Apache Tribe against former Gov. Bruce King for refusing to negotiate a gambling compact.

Gov. Gary Johnson approved a compact with the tribe two months after King left office. The state Attorney General's office then filed a counterclaim to the tribe's lawsuit, asking the court to clarify whether the compact is legal.

In his ruling, Conway referred to a July state Supreme Court ruling that Johnson lacked the authority to sign the compacts without the Legislature's approval. The judge also referred to U.S. Department of the Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt's comment that a compact is only valid if entered into by the appropriate officials. Babbitt signed off on the compacts between Johnson and New Mexico tribes.

After Monday's ruling, Mescalero President Wendell Chino told reporters the tribe would appeal. But when asked Tuesday if the tribal council plans to file an appeal, he said, "I don't know. The council hasn't told me anything, so that answers your question."

BIA favors meeting about annexation

Bureau of Indian Affairs officials want the Mescalero Apache Tribe and Ruidoso officials to hold a meeting about the tribe's proposed annexation of the Mescalero Inn property in Ruidoso.

"It would be nice, advisable, if the tribe wants to put the land in trust, to see if some of the objections can be addressed in some manner," said Parker Sando, a realty specialist with the BIA area office.

However, discussions aren't necessary for the annexation application to be approved by the BIA, Sando said, and the BIA's decision is expected by the end of this week. The application was filed about two months ago.

Ruidoso officials have asked Mescalero President Wendell Chino in writing for a meeting, but haven't received a yea or nay.

Village officials objected to the annexation proposal by filing a 16-page response with legal and jurisdiction arguments.

New BIA area director Rob Barker asked Sando to find out if

the tribe is willing to meet with Ruidoso officials, before the BIA issues its decision.

"Since (Barker) is new here, he wants to make sure it's all done right," Sando explained.

Other issues being analyzed are: — the proposal's compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act;

— village concerns about the Mescalero Inn's link to its water supply;

— and compliance with BIA regulations for land acquisitions.

The latter issue was raised by the village in its 15-page argument to the BIA against the annexation.

Ruidoso assistant attorney Chay Rennick cited a recent U.S. Court of Appeals ruling that Congress inappropriately delegated the authority to add land to an Indian reservation to the U.S. Department of the Interior.

To address that ruling, the Interior Department put out a new regulation in April that gives counties and villages involved in annexation disputes more time to argue positions, Sando said.

However, "That decision just ap-

plied to the Eighth District (Court of Appeals), which we're not a part of, so we can proceed," Sando said.

Tribal council representatives told Ruidoso officials that a revised utility plan for the Mescalero Inn property would be submitted to the village this week, Village Manager Gary Jackson said Tuesday.

The plan relates to the replat of the property, which the tribe had requested last fall. The replat was never reviewed by the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission

because the application was incomplete.

A replat is necessary because part of the land and utilities under the Mescalero Inn have common ownership with Carrizo Lodge Condominium owners.

The BIA is still trying to figure whether allegations the tribe is illegally selling alcohol at the Mescalero Inn would affect the annexation application. While another BIA official earlier said that isn't an issue, Sando said it might be.

Chino, Ruidoso officials respond via mail

Mescalero Apache President Wendell Chino didn't react fondly to the way his tribal council was invited to meet with the Ruidoso Village Council.

The village council asked its attorney to write Chino in April, requesting a meeting about the tribe's proposal to make the Mescalero Inn part of its reservation.

"If the village of Ruidoso wants to have a joint meeting with the tribal council, the mayor, being a representative head of the village,

should address a letter to me requesting a joint meeting," Chino responded April 24. "I believe this is how the world of diplomacy works."

He also stated, "We also noted from *The Ruidoso News* the Ruidoso City Council desires a meeting with the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council and this is fine. However, we do not believe that it is proper and professional to expect us to convene a meeting with you based on a newspaper article. Neither do we believe that the city's

legal counsel should attempt to convene a meeting with the Tribal Council."

Chino indicated he and tribal councilors would be busy until around May 7 dealing with issues surrounding recent wildfires on the reservation.

Mayor Jerry Shaw wrote Chino

back, stating, "Let me assure you that we meant no disrespect to you or members of the tribal council by our village attorney writing the letter requesting this meeting on behalf of our governing body."

Shaw suggested meeting around May 20, about the time she returned from a short trip.

Watering restrictions eased, but officials ask for discretion

Ruidoso residents with odd-numbered addresses can legally water their lawns between 8 p.m. tonight and 8 a.m. Thursday, for the first time this year.

But village officials are pleading with people to only use the water for two hours.

"If faucets run all night long through half the town, it will be a problem," Village Manager Gary Jackson said.

The watering is being allowed because the village has new wells, and a five million gallon water tank is back in operation after repairs.

Those with even-numbered homes will get their chance to water starting Wednesday, June 19

during the same hours.

The watering is being allowed under the new phase four of the village's water contingency plan. Councilors last week added two phases to the plan to create a total of five.

Water levels at the village's two reservoirs and at its two five-million-gallon storage tanks trigger the different phases. Wells and spring runoff into the Alto reservoir also are factors.

Phase four will allow outdoor watering at odd-numbered addresses on the first and third Wednesdays of the month between 8 p.m. and 8 a.m. on the second and fourth Wednesdays at even-

numbered addresses.

Code enforcement will be beefed up to make sure residents comply, officials said. If too many violations are recorded, the village will revert to phase five and no watering will be allowed, officials said.

Violations of the outdoor water use restrictions will result in citations and possible fines, upon the second offense.

The other new phase, phase three, allows outdoor watering once a week. Phase two allows watering every other day. Phase one allows watering at any time, but includes public education about water conservation.

A state of division

Mescalero Apache President Wendell Chino was a man of few words after Federal District Judge John E. Conway ruled Monday that casino gaming on the reservation is illegal.

Chino told reporters the tribe probably will appeal the ruling to Denver's U. S. Circuit Court because "once we get out of New Mexico, we have a better shot."

And nobody is surprised that at Casino Apache it was business as usual come Tuesday.

A legal appeal is a tried and true way to keep on doing whatever you've been doing while lawyers drum up more evidence in an effort to tip the balance.

Certainly New Mexico's record in dealing with the issue is nothing to be proud of, unless you love political gridlock and totally despise gambling.

Three governors ago, in 1989, the Mescaleros sought to negotiate gaming compacts with Gov. Garry Carruthers. Nothing happened, so electronic games continued at Mescalero and Sandia.

In 1991 the U. S. attorney threatened to shut down the electronic games, but didn't. Later that year, Gov. Bruce King was presented with negotiated compacts, but refused to sign.

In 1992, the tribe and Sandia Pueblo filed court actions because of King's refusal to sign, and Judge Conway dismissed them.

In 1993, a federal magistrate quashed subpoenas by a federal grand jury seeking seven tribes' gambling records.

In 1994, another U. S. attorney signed non-prosecution deals with eight casino gaming tribes, pending a resolution of the issue.

In 1995, Johnson signed compacts with 12 tribes, the state supreme court ruled them void under state law, Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt said he thought they were legal under federal law but the Justice Department was studying them, the tribes started lobbying the legislature, the U. S. attorney pushed for voluntary closing of the casinos and the tribes refused.

In 1996, the legislature spent most of a short session debating the issue without action, the U. S. attorney said the federal compacts remain in effect but the Indian casinos are illegal because state law doesn't permit them, the Jicarilla Apaches opened the state's 11th tribal casino, and Judge Conway dumped the Mescalero compact as illegal.

Are you surprised that Wendell Chino would want a new venue?



Ruidoso schools bid farewell to longtime employees

The largest group of retirees ever to leave Ruidoso Municipal Schools in a single year bid a bittersweet farewell to colleagues, parents, and students Thursday. Most of the retirees have served the district for more than 20 years.

Superintendent Mike Gladden

was master of ceremonies, thanking Ed Branch, Bob Arnett, Shirley Neuhaus, Judy Radtke, Kathy Weems, Donnie Weems, Eddie Parker, and Betty Day for their uncommon devotion to education in Ruidoso.

Ed Branch worked for five years as a head custodian, first at Ruidoso High School, then at Sierra

Vista Primary. Gladden commended Branch on taking pride in the school's image.

"Ed taught me that if you tape steel wool to the toes of your shoes, it's easier to get those black marks off the floor," Gladden said.

Bob Arnett worked seven years as head custodian at Ruidoso Middle School. Mike Gladden was middle school principal at the time

Arnett started.

"This is the man who was never unwilling to do anything," Gladden said.

Shirley Neuhaus is retiring after 15 years as a bilingual teacher in the district. Gladden applauded her for making a "tremendous impact" on the lives of students who couldn't speak English.

For 21 years, Judy Radtke was

the Ruidoso High School librarian. Gladden said Radtke was responsible for computerizing the school libraries and that her influence was visible in every aspect of RHS's library.

Husband and wife Don and Kathy Weems retired together after 21 years in the Ruidoso district. Kathy Weems has taught kindergarten, fourth grade, third grade, seventh grade, and eighth grade during her career.

"A good teacher can teach at any level," Gladden said, "and Kathy has proven herself an excellent teacher regardless of her grade placement."

Don Weems is probably the "most-transferred" educator in the district, having taught at White Mountain Elementary, then serving as principal at Nob Hill Early Childhood Development Center, White Mountain Elementary, White Mountain Intermediate, Ruidoso High School, and finally Sierra Vista Primary.

Gladden said Weems' motto is, "Wherever the district needs me, that's where I'll go."

Eddie Parker reminisced about episodes on student trips during his

22 years as marketing teacher and DECA sponsor at Ruidoso High School. Gladden said Parker's achievements were too numerous to name.

"Eddie Parker is a legend among DECA teachers in New Mexico," Gladden said. "No one has the record he has."

Finally, Betty Day crowned the list of retirees with 25 years as an art teacher in Ruidoso schools. She worked mainly with elementary students. Day is considered the expert in teaching art techniques, Gladden said.

"She is always extremely happy," Gladden said, "and I never heard a word of criticism from her."

At a dinner held in their honor at the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs, retirees accepted commemorative Nambé trays as gifts from the school district. Dinner was provided by Ruidoso Middle School FFA students.

Gladden closed the evening with thanks and well-wishing for the retirees.

"We are happy for the opportunity to be your colleagues," he said. "May social security remain solid, and may you sleep late on Aug. 19."

Summer class hits the trails Billy the Kid once rode

The infamous William Bonney and his gang of Regulators covered some pretty serious territory during the Lincoln County War. Part of that territory is covered again in Eastern New Mexico University's course called "High Country Trail-ride," alias, "The Billy the Kid Trail Ride."

The class is limited to 15 people, and you must furnish your own horse or mule. The ride begins Saturday, July 27, and ends Wednesday, July 31. Riders start off at Nogal Mesa and head west toward the Helen Rae Mine, then into the

White Mountain Wilderness.

During the five-day tour, students will not only learn the ins and outs of recreational trailriding, but they will also study history, pueblo archeology, botany, and geology. The class leader is Trail Boss Bill Thorpe.

Thorpe is a biologist, Lincoln County historian, and rancher. He'll show students how to identify wildflowers and rocks. He'll share native folklore and stories, plus the history of Native Americans and Western Americana.

Randy Bowen, veteran livestock operator, will assist Thorpe as

campfire cook and all-around handyman.

Students will also learn wilderness survival and proper use of public lands. The course includes brush and rock clearing as trail maintenance on ENMU-adopted Trail No. 64.

Riders will camp out in the wilderness and should prepare accordingly (pack toilet paper). All equipment and horse feed will be provided by the school. Cooking will be performed by ride participant teams; each will be totally responsible for kitchen duty for one day.

The average day's ride will be 12

miles. The base camp will be in the historic Totolita Canyon in the western end of the Nogal Mining District. Day rides will take you into high mountain meadows, beside rushing streams and into the sheerness of 9,400-foot Nogal Peak. Nearby is the lush Spring Creek Cabin area and the majestic 12,003-foot Sierra Blanca Peak.

Part of the history lesson includes learning about the mining districts, and you'll experience gold panning with your own pan and "poke sack." The trail takes you past the Helen Rae, Parsons, and Little American mines in Bonito and Nogal mining districts.







When a roofer shot staples from a high-powered gun into the eyes of a small dog in Ruidoso recently, it pointed up the need to require a meaningful punishment for anyone convicted of animal cruelty.

One top state official has joined the effort to change animal abuse from a misdemeanor to a felony under New Mexico law.

State Commissioner of Public Lands Ray Powell, a practicing veterinarian, announced last week he plans to ask the state Legislature to strengthen the laws on abuse of animals.

Besides upping the severity of possible punishment, in some cases, a court could bar a person from owning a pet under Powell's proposal.

"The proposal would apply to all animals," he said. "It would exempt legitimate animal husbandry and other agricultural activities, as well as rodeos and scientific and educational use of animals."

"I'm motivated to develop this proposal because of a generalized increase in violence. There is growing evidence that young people who are cruel to animals are more likely to display violent and antisocial behavior later in life, including abuse toward their spouses, children and the elderly."

He pointed out that recent studies show the cycle of violence of mass murderers often began with violence against a family or neighborhood pet.

"By apprehending and punishing the offender, and prescribing mental health treatment when appropriate, we will protect other defenseless animals and potential human victims in the future," Powell said. "The bottom line is that the violent criminal doesn't care how many legs his victim has."

Spaying and neutering of domestic pets must be encouraged to reduce the number of unwanted companion animals, he said.

Powell consulted several district attorneys and animal rights groups, including Kate Rindy of the Santa Fe Animal Shelter, and will be seeking sponsorship of the proposal for the 1997 legislative session.

"As a misdemeanor, animal abuse crimes don't get the attention from law enforcement they deserve and would if they are felonies," Powell said. A misdemeanor cruelty charge only carries a maximum \$500 fine and up to 90 days in jail. Felonies carry much tougher sentences.

ASTIGMATISM AND CONTACTS

The problem with the astigmatic eye is that it tends to be more oval than round. This makes it possible for those suffering from this condition to avail themselves of regular, spherical contact lenses. In the past, there was no choice but to wear spectacles.

Recently, there has been a breakthrough in the design of soft contact lenses for those with astigmatism. The new lenses are made to fit over the irregular curvature of the astigmatic eye. Like a raindrop, these are flatter in one direction than the other. They are also weighted slightly at the bottom in order to maintain alignment to the eye.

Naturally, since there are an infinite number of sizes, shapes and curvature of the eye, your eye-care professional will have to devote extra time and attention to prescribing a soft lens that is just right for you. But now, at least, those suffering from astigmatism can enjoy the advantages inherent in soft contacts.


