Holloman AFB commemorates National POW/MIA Day

Holloman Air Force Base commemorates National POW/MIA Day Thursday, Sept. 26. Events begin with a 24-hour candlelight vigil at Heritage Park. The vigil begins at 12:01 a.m. Sept. 26. Participants from virtually every unit on base will stand at attention in shifts at the POW/MIA Wall in Heritage Park to pay tribute to those still missing in action.

A commemorative ceremony will be held in Heritage Park at 2 p.m. Sept. 26. Brig. Gen. Dennis R. Larsen, 49th Fighter Wing commander, is scheduled to give remarks at the ceremony. The observance will also include music by the Alamogordo High School Band and a 21-gun salute. The commemorative ceremony is open to the public.

The 49th Materiel Maintenance Group is hosting the POW/MIA activities.

A presidential proclamation urges all Americans to join in honoring former POWs as well as those service members and civilians still unaccounted for. The proclamation also encourages the American people to express their gratitude for the extraordinary sacrifices made on behalf of this country by the families of POW/MIAs.

Local DA chairs Prosecutors Section for bar

District Attorney Bert Atkins of the 12th Judicial District (Lincoln and Otero counties) has been chosen as the next chair of the Prosecutors Section of the New Mexico State Bar.

Casino Apache closed

□ Chino wonders why U.S. Atty. Kelly decides to shut down tribe's casino at this time

Wendell Chino, the Mescalero Apache Tribe's president, was clearly distressed as he asked "why now?"

His question, expressed during an interview with *Ruidoso News* reporters last Friday, related to U.S. Attorney John Kelly's sudden order to shutdown the tribe's casino by 5 p.m. Tuesday.

The closure was forced just a day before the first Indian Gaming Summit was to convene.

"What is he really trying to influence?" Chino asked. "The upcoming elections? Sabotaging the Indian summit?"

"Why can't he wait another week, another month?"

Gov. Gary Johnson called for the summit so that tribal, state and legislative leaders could hammer out acceptable content for all Indian gaming compacts.

Consensus on the compacts is necessary so that the gambling issue can be resolved during next year's legislative session, Chino said.

Johnson signed 14 Indian gaming compacts last year without legislative approval. Three federal courts have since ruled the 11 active compacts invalid.

Closure of Casino Apache could impact the livelihoods of 2,635 people employed by the tribe, Chino said. Many of those employees' jobs are associated with gaming operations.

At the Inn of the Mountain Gods alone, there are 514 employees, 391 who are Ruidoso residents.

If they were to lose their jobs, it would be difficult for Ruidoso's economy to absorb them, and unemployment compensation wouldn't come through for from four to six weeks, Chino, his spokesperson Catherine Bedell, and attorney Gregory Quinlan agreed.

"If anyone is going to get hurt it will be the people here and the people of Ruidoso," Chino said.

As a percentage, the closure

would impact Ruidoso's economy in the same way 100,000 lost jobs would hit Albuquerque, he said.

The temporary injunction sought by Chino Tuesday morning to block Kelly from acting was denied by federal Judge Martha Vazquez. (See related story.)

"If he freezes the bank accounts, there's question of whether there

□ Appeal process to continue in Denver, Chino tells supporters

Casino Apache workers were told to go home Tuesday afternoon after a federal judge denied a motion requested by the Mescalero Apache Tribe's president that would have kept them on the job.

The casino shutdown could be long term, or it could be as short as two days, the tribal president said, minutes after the 5 p.m. closure deadline.

"As the representative of the Mescalero Apache people, I don't intend to knuckle under to the strong arm of the federal government," Wendell Chino declared to the large crowd of employees and supporters gathered outside the Inn of the Mountain Gods.

He said he planned to continue fighting Kelly through the court system, and was encouraged by the stay granted earlier in the day by the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals to the Jicarilla Apache Tribe.

The stay allows the Apache Nugget Casino to stay open pending appeal.

"Tomorrow morning, I'm sending our tribal attorney to Denver to get the same kind of stay," Chino said to the cheering crowd.

Chino described the events leading to the casino closure, which he

blamed on U.S. Attorney John Kelly's "forked tongue" and breach of trust to the tribe.

Chino had just arrived from Santa Fe where he sought the temporary injunction before federal Judge Martha Vazquez.

Chino said he sought to protect jobs and to stop Kelly from shutting down the casino. Kelly had warned Chino last week that he would close it.

Judge Vazquez concluded that "she doesn't have the jurisdiction to do it," according to Robert Gorence, first assistant U.S. Attorney.

"It's one of those little fundamental things with separation of powers — the judge can't say how to enforce the law," Gorence said.

But as Chino later complained, if Vazquez didn't think she had jurisdiction, "Why hold a hearing?"

The same judge did grant a stay in July that allows nine state Indian pueblos to maintain their gaming operations. The Mescalero Apache and Jicarilla Apache tribes were not party to that lawsuit, so the Apaches were not covered by the stay.

However, Chino said he was led to believe Casino Apache was protected by the stay pending the

Fort Stanton's future rests in legislature's hands

State and Lincoln County officials failed to reach agreement last week on the future of historic Fort Stanton.

Although they didn't agree on a lease, attorneys for both the county commission and the state are drafting a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to cover key points.

But the final decision will rest with the state Legislature in January.

To move forward with a transfer of ownership of the historic fort from the state to the county, legislators must approve the arrangement and come up with some money.

After a two hour conference call with state officials Friday, "It became obvious, they're very protective of their turf and representing their departments and their people and we are likewise," Commissioner Wilton Howell said. "And that may be well

be the reason we can't settle our differences very easily in a lease.

"I think an MOU is a legitimate thing to do. All along, I just wanted the state to assist us in going to the legislature and displaying the support for turning the fort over to Lincoln County," he said. "In the past, it's been hard to determine their direction."

Another approach being considered is a joint powers agreement between the state and county. The county would be the caretakers of the fort, but still use some state money, Howell said.

Gov. Gary Johnson closed the fort as a state hospital in March 1995 and the state has been unsuccessful in finding a new tenant. Johnson is backing a county take over of the fort and a limited sharing of risk by the state.

Two citizens groups have formed, pushing for the fort to be converted into a state or

federal park mixing history with resort activities.

County Commissioner Bill Schwettmann, County Manager Frank Potter, County Clerk Martha Proctor and County Attorney Alan Morel drove to Santa Fe Friday for the meeting with Secretary Stephen Belfort of the state General Services Department (GSD). Also at the meeting were officials from the property control division of the GSD, who are responsible for the fort located about 12 miles northeast of Ruidoso.

Howell and Commission Chairman Monroy Montes stayed in Lincoln County on the other end of a conference call.

Howell and Schwettmann agreed that state officials appear to want to transfer ownership of the fort to the county.

"Apparently, the governor had told them to work out some sort of lease with us, but they were using the same formal lease and

there was just no way I could see we could execute that thing," Schwettmann. "We would be 100% responsible for maintenance, insurances, employees and yet we had no real assurances the legislature would approve the transfer."

"After a couple of pages, it just looked like there was no way we could go into that type of situation. We could break the county."

Items of contention between the state and commissioners included:

- who would be responsible for closing down the landfill the state runs on fort land;
- who pays the utilities until a new tenant is found;
- who would be responsible for repairs and improvements to the sewage plant;
- how water rights connected to the fort will be used;

pueblos' appeal. It will be heard by the 10th Circuit in November.

Chino said he believed the stay protected his tribe's operations because of comments Kelly made in the months following a federal court's June ruling.

That ruling invalidated the tribe's compact, as did one against the nine pueblos and another against the Jicarilla Apache's compact.

State Labor Department representatives are to be at the Inn starting today (Wednesday) to take applications for unemployment compensation, Chino added.

One casino worker, dealer Cindy Parkinson of Ruidoso, said later "This does not only affect the Indians, it affects Ruidoso. Unemployment will not pay what I make here and I've worked very hard...it's the first time in two and a half years that I've had insurance, security, and he (Kelly) has yanked it all away."

And, before Chino's late afternoon arrival, county commissioner L. Ray Nunley commented that "public opinion is solidly behind the Mescalero."

"This does not only affect the Indians, it affects Ruidoso. Unemployment will not pay what I make here and I've worked very hard...it's the first time in two and a half years that I've had insurance, security and he (Kelly) has yanked it all away."

Kelly should have allowed the legislature to handle the gambling situation, Nunley added.

"I believe we could have, and would have, without all this trauma," Nunley, a legislative candidate, said.

The rulings, made by separate federal courts, all decided that Gov. Gary Johnson overstepped his authority by signing gaming compacts in 1995 with 14 state Indian nations. Legislative approval was necessary, the judges said.

To what extent Chino would go to keep Casino Apache open was questioned all day. Last week during an interview with he said he

"would not do anything rash as long as we have an opportunity for justice."

And during Tuesday's press conference he said, "I'm a law-abiding citizen and will comply with the order of the judge. But that does not mean I will lay over dead; we'll continue to fight!"

Earlier, Kelly spokesman Ron Lopez said Kelly was not concerned about a confrontation on the reservation "because he has not heard anything to that affect to cause concern."

Chino said the only reason the tribe was abiding by Kelly's order was that he didn't want gambling machines to be confiscated.

would be money to open Ski Apache by the winter season," Quinlan said.

Chino said he only planned to block Kelly's order through the court process and would not consider violence to keep the casino open.

Chino commented that Kelly was "digging in" right before the November political elections, and he questioned how much President Bill Clinton's reelection bid filtered into his appointee's sudden push to close casinos.

Chino also questioned Kelly's stance just before the validity of gambling compacts is reviewed by the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals in November. That appeal, which the Apaches are not party to, was filed by nine state Indian pueblos. They won a stay and kept their casinos open.

A federal court ruled in June that the Mescalero compact was invalid, and another court made a similar ruling in July about the compacts held by the pueblos. Kelly had deferred action against the Apaches. His office said at the time he would wait until after the pueblos' appeal was decided.

At the Ruidoso meeting last week, Kelly appeared with Ron Dick, an FBI agent. This was a deliberate act of intimidation, Chino said.

"The Mescalero Apache Tribe has attempted to settle the

(gaming) matter in court for eight years," Chino said. "After all this time, Mr. Kelly wants to provoke a confrontation between the tribe and his office."

"I'd like to see him use the courts instead of this," Chino said.

According to the Indian Gaming Act, Kelly, as the tribe's federal trustee, could sue the state of New Mexico and demand mediation for failing to negotiate the compact with the tribe, attorney Quinlan noted.

"He has swung too far over to the state of New Mexico," Chino said. "He has become too comfortable to use the avenue available to sue the state of New Mexico on our behalf...because of sovereignty issues."

"He is not without options." "Kelly's approach is discriminatory," Chino concluded, "and politically motivated in this election season. He's also negligent of his duties as a federal employee, and his trust obligations to the tribe."

Kelly's spokesman Ron Lopez noted that this is not the first time Kelly has taken action to close down casinos after the higher courts ruled on the legality of gambling in New Mexico.

Lopez also said that Kelly is on record urging the legislature, the government and the tribes to resolve the issue.

"He's expressed his concerns to them personally," Lopez said.

— and what happens to a GSD commitment to the state Department of Corrections to use eight houses in the fort complex. Corrections wants the units for employees while women prisoners temporarily are housed at nearby Camp Sierra Blanca.

About 50 women are expected to arrive in October and stay five months until the minimum security prison is scheduled to be converted to a juvenile environmental work camp.

said, "I feel confident GSD and governor's staff is going to try very hard to lobby the legislature to turn this facility over to Lincoln County."

"Effort said we need to make a financial commitment. I told

him that until I see direction the state is going, I'm not going to spend 15 cents of taxpayers money. I'd just as soon take a quarter million dollars of tax money to Allsup's and buy a handful of lottery tickets."

"I feel pretty good about it. They started the meeting being real bullish, but it didn't take long to figure out that we were fixing to take a walk."

The fort and terms of the MOU will be reviewed at the commission's Oct. 1 meeting, he said.

The state could issue up to 50-year leases of the fort to the county, Schwetmann said.

Things might have been different, if only...

Speculating about who the ultimate winner will be as the doors clang shut at the Mescaleros' Casino Apache is about as futile as using a dart board to pick a trifecta at Ruidoso Downs.

The facts are simple: Casino Apache management, under court order, stopped operations at 3 p.m. Tuesday, and by so doing avoided a confrontation with federal law enforcement officers.

A last-minute effort to obtain a stay pending appeal of an order to seize assets had been refuted by Federal District Judge Martha Vazquez in Santa Fe earlier in the day.

Despite his fiery rhetoric, tribal president Wendell Chino bowed to the law, as he said he would do on numerous occasions. Not once has he hinted that he would resist the court with force; indeed, he has said frequently that he would use the justice system to achieve his ends: Jobs, and equitable treatment, for the Mescalero people.

Chino had said that closure of the casino would directly affect many workers, including many non-members of the tribe, who live in Ruidoso; he compared full closure of tribal operations to the loss of 100,000 jobs in Albuquerque.

But the casino was closed, not the neighboring Inn of the Mountain Gods or the other tribal enterprises. Indeed, other new enterprises are on the drawing board. Nevertheless, the tribe's Ruidoso neighbors are wondering what the impact will be; when village attorney John Underwood told Ruidoso Rotarians Tuesday that the appeal had been denied, the silence was deafening.

And moves already are in the works to appeal Judge Vasquez's stay refusal to the 10th Circuit Court. After that: The 10th Circuit's finding in November on the appeal of nine New Mexico pueblos. Then: The January legislative session.

The sad part of this story is that it need not have happened at all, if the legislature had done its job a year ago, or a year before that. Indeed, it would not have happened if U. S. Attorney John Kelly had chosen another course. The federal Indian Gaming Act provides for mediation between states and tribes to settle gaming compact issues. We have to wonder why the government did not go that route.

To be good to my gift — if I don't create these paintings, nobody is going to do them for me.





Warriors tame Tularosa's Wildcats, 29-13

Ruidoso got what it expected Friday night — a cat fight from a young Tularosa football team. The Warriors managed to shake off the upset-minded Wildcats, however, and post a 29-13 homecoming victory.

"Tularosa played very well. And we made too many mistakes — penalties and missed assignments — that kept us from having a real good game," said Ruidoso assistant coach John Roberts, who filled in Friday night for head coach Les Carter. Carter missed the game to be with his wife, Susan, who had surgery in Albuquerque Monday.

"Down through the years, the Ruidoso/Tularosa game has always been a game that defied rankings. Forget about records or which team

is the biggest. Both teams are going to play hard," Roberts said.

The Warriors also shook off the distractions created by homecoming festivities.

"It's always nice to win especially with it being homecoming — credit the players who were able to put aside the distractions of the whole week," Roberts said.

Ruidoso broke open a 7-7 halftime tie in the second half. The Warriors scored 22 straight points.

Roberts didn't resort to any special motivational speeches at halftime. He left that to the Warriors.

"We went over with them the things we needed to — no major adjustments. Here's what they're doing and here's what we need to do," Roberts said. "Some of the players were a little vocal, challeng-

ing each other."

Ruidoso used a pair of long runs to get its offense going. Sophomore Corey Saenz ran a bootleg for 47 yards and a touchdown in the second quarter. Then, senior quarterback Pascal Enjady scampered 60 yards on a keeper, setting up another Warrior score in the second half.

"We were able to get outside on them," Roberts said.

Saenz, for the second week in a row, provided some key plays for the Warriors. The sophomore safety prevented a Tule touchdown when he tackled the Wildcat player, forcing a fumble. He then pounced on the loose ball.

Saenz also took some snaps at QB in the second quarter.

"He's got good quick speed and operates in the open field real well,"

Roberts said.

Ruidoso, 2-2 overall, will face its third major test of the season Friday when it travels to Portales to take on the Rams.

Portales is the first of two tough opponents the Warriors will face. After playing the Rams, Ruidoso takes on Carlsbad, a 9-7 winner over defending state champion Lovington a couple of weeks ago.

"That's OK because I think our kids are going to respond to it," Roberts said.

After looking at the videotape of the match, Sanchez saw that her team did a better job of covering dinks. Still, there is room for improvement, Sanchez added.


The Warriors open district play the next day, Saturday, against a scrappy Cobre team. Not blessed with many tall players, the Indians rely upon their defensive hustle.

School, village agree on playing fields plan

The construction of new athletic playing fields in Ruidoso moved a step closer to starting Tuesday with the necessary nods from governing officials.

The new baseball field will be ready for play by Feb. 1, 1996, and multipurpose fields will be ready for soccer games by the spring season, officials said.

Two separate votes held by village councilors and the Ruidoso School Board unanimously adopted the field designs sketched by Design Architects of Albuquerque.

Building new playing fields is the result of a joint powers agreement made by school and village officials last year.

Ruidoso schools owns the 17-acre site where the fields will be built (next to the White Mountain School complex at Hull Road and White Mountain Drive), and the village sold \$1 million in bond issues for the fields' development.

With that money, the village can build two, 180 by 330 foot regulation size soccer fields for multipurpose use; a smaller, 110 by 60 foot multipurpose field; and a baseball field with a 400-foot fence, designed for adult and youth play. The baseball diamond would also include a backstop 60 feet from the home plate and bleachers.

"It will be the nicest field outside of Duke Stadium (in Albuquerque)," Design Workshops architect Mimi Burns said.

All the fields will be irrigated, lined with drainage swales and sodded with natural grasses. Although tight funds don't allow installation of ballfield lighting, the infrastructure will be in place for the future addition of lights, Burns said.

Mike Lynch, organizer of Ruidoso youth soccer, said the program is likely to grow beyond its current 325 participants and field lights will be necessary.

With the infrastructure for electrical hookup in place, the playing fields wouldn't have to be closed and dug up when it's needed.

Mountainair's strong first half too much for Carrizozo's Grizzlies

Mountainair quickly built a 22-0 first half lead, and then held on to defeat Carrizozo in six-man football, 38-20, Saturday.

"You have to play 40 minutes. They came to play in the first half and we didn't. They hit us and we didn't hit them," said the Grizzlies' head coach Gerald Horacek.

Willie Silva led Carrizozo in rushing with 10 carries for 100 yards. He also caught four passes for 60 yards and scored two touchdowns. Bud Maynard tallied four catches for 50 yards and a TD.

Carrizozo's schedule doesn't get easier this week. The Grizzlies take on Ramah at 2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 28, in Ramah.

Ramah is the defending six-man state champion, and still the team to beat in Horacek's opinion.

It's an important game for the Grizzlies, but not nearly as important as Carrizozo's foe in two weeks.

"We really need everyone healthy for Floyd rather than Ramah because its our first district game," Horacek said.

Carrizozo girls stay unbeaten in volleyball
Coach Kim (Gremillion) Padilla took advantage of the opportunity to play some of her younger Grizzlies last week. Carrizozo played a pair of inexperienced volleyball teams in Corona and New Mexico Military Institute, which allowed Padilla to put her underclassmen on the court.

Carrizozo rolled past Corona Thursday, 15-2, 15-1, 15-0, and then swept NMMI Saturday, 15-8, 15-10, 15-5. The Grizzlies are now 7-0 overall.

Before heading up the road to Tiger country for the Capitan Tournament Friday and Saturday, the Grizzlies travel to Mountainair Thursday for their second District 3A match of the season.

The Capitan Tournament is coming just at the right time for the Grizzlies, Padilla noted.

"We're finally going up against some teams that can hit it down our throats — it's going to be tough."

time to install lighting, Burns said.

Now that the joint powers approvals are in place, the request for bids to build the fields will be advertised beginning Oct. 4, with an Oct. 22 deadline set for acceptance of bids, Assistant Village Manager Alan Briley said.

Councilors will then award a construction bid Oct. 29, which allows 75 days for the field construction.

"Unfortunately, there's only so much money and only so much time, and we've needed to do this for such a long time," Mayor Jerry Shaw said.

Plans also include cutting a 50-foot easement through land owned by Bill McCarty to allow access to fields directly from Warrior Drive, and the grading three small fields at the southern end of the land tract.

The joint powers committee has asked Lincoln County Commissioners to grade the fields and roads with county-owned equipment and in-kind services. Some commissioners offered those services last year.

"I, as a commissioner, support

anything we can do to enhance this project," said Wilton Howell. But because 90% of the county's roads are gravel, just when the county's machinery will be needed is key, Howell said.

Exactly what the joint powers committee wants the commission to contribute to the project "is ambiguous," complained commissioner Bill Schwettmann, prompting Howell to suggest that village officials clearly lay out their requests before the commission's Tuesday, Oct. 4 meeting.

Before the village and school officials voted to put the project to bid, school board members Ronnie Hemphill and James Paxton queried about field maintenance costs.

Hemphill suggested the schools be responsible for field lighting and maintenance costs during the academic playing season, and the village handle the field costs during the Park and Recreation Department's use.

Those matters will be discussed at future joint powers meetings, councilors said.

Ruidoso teachers received a 2% pay raise for this year. The raise goes into effect in December, and teachers will receive a bonus check for the retroactive amount, said Dora Lee Stierwalt, head of this year's negotiating team for the Ruidoso Education Association (REA).

"We have a good contract," Stierwalt said. "This is the third consecutive year Ruidoso teachers have secured a raise through collective bargaining. It is REA's third year of operation."

"Several times in the past we've been frozen on the salary scale," Stierwalt said.

Superintendent Mike Gladden said the raise depends on continued good enrollment.

"We should be able to maintain enrollment," he said. "It looks good."

Over the past three years, Ruidoso teacher pay has increased about 6%, Stierwalt said. The Ruidoso district's pay rate is ranked fifth highest in the state with starting pay at \$22,000.

"Of course, the state ranks in the bottom 10 in the nation," Stierwalt said.

The 2% raise goes to all employees, including principals, except the superintendent, Gladden said. Gladden received a one-time raise of 5% last year, because his salary was not comparable to that of other superintendents in the area, he said.

When the school board renewed Gladden's contract in February of this year, they stipulated that he would receive no pay increase until other staff members got their raises, Gladden said.

Some teachers will receive an additional bonus in June if they save up their sick days. Teachers who accumulate 120 or more days of sick leave will be receive a \$600 check at the end of the year, Stierwalt said.

"We want to keep our certified teachers in the classroom as much as possible," Stierwalt said. "We're trying to shift money from the substitute line to give teacher bonuses."

Teachers receive a bonus of a different sort with written procedures for site-based decision making.

"We got bottle-necked last year," Stierwalt said. "We couldn't agree on what teachers should have input about. Now teachers have a big say in how things are done."

Stierwalt said school administrators seem to welcome sharing the responsibility for decisions at their individual sites. Site-based committees help administrators manage building needs, budgeting, curriculum and district policy.

REA has revamped its collective bargaining agreement with the Ruidoso Municipal School District every year for three years. This time the agreement will stand for two years, though some teachers are not entirely happy with the progress of Stierwalt's negotiating committee, she said.

"Some people don't like my style. They think I should be more aggressive and hard-line," Stierwalt said. "But we addressed everything that was brought to us and with good results. It's not a 'me' thing, the way REA goes at it (negotiating). It forces positive dialogue."

Gladden said the REA's collective bargaining agreement is excellent.

"I appreciate the professionalism that was demonstrated throughout the process," he said.

One remaining sore spot with many teachers is that contracts are not finalized until the beginning of the school year or even later, Stierwalt said.

"Next year's goal is to have contracts in place by May," she said.

The National Education Association uses the Ruidoso collective bargaining agreement as an example contract, Stierwalt said.

Budget squeezes out art program

Budgetary restrictions are putting the squeeze on fine arts at White Mountain Elementary (WME) school. Superintendent Mike Gladden said he decided not to replace art teacher Betty Day when she retired in May. The elementary art program has temporarily dissolved, said WME principal Frank Cannella.

Cannella is sending letters to parents of third- and fourth-graders notifying them of the program cut. At least one parent, Bobbie Graham, has already heard, and she is angry that her fourth-grade daughter will not have the benefit of a formal art class.

"I think art is very important, especially at that young age," Graham said. "The younger they are, the more capable they are of learning."

White Mountain Elementary was one of the few elementary schools in the state with an inde-

pendent art program, Cannella said. At most schools, children learn art from their regular teacher, Cannella said, and that is how students at WME are now getting their drawing lessons.

"The kids are disappointed, and I'm disappointed," Cannella said.

The program cut will not affect WME's literary magazine, which includes student drawings, Cannella said.

Superintendent Mike Gladden said money for two unfilled jobs, Betty Day's at WME and Pam Robinson's at Nob Hill, was put back into the budget to make it balance. Some of that money is being used to add another teacher at the fifth-grade level, Gladden said.

"We want to be sure we don't over-commit," Gladden said. "We

will do everything we can to put (the art program) back in."

Cannella tried to redistribute Day's former duties to other instructional assistants already employed at White Mountain Elementary, he said.

"I tried to do it with the staff we had, but we just couldn't do it and still do a good job with basic skills like reading and math," Cannella said.

Ruidoso's school board recently made a fine arts curriculum one of its primary goals. Board member Karen Anderson said she believed this program cut is a temporary setback and that everything will work out after the 40th school day.

Cannella also said he hoped to reinstate the program after the 40th school day. Enrollment numbers are up this year and could generate enough state funding to reinstate an art teacher at White Mountain, Gladden said.



Piles of pizza boxes at Ruidoso police station indicate how slow the weekend was for law enforcement officers, unlike years past.





Ruidoso winters may not be as harsh as states further north, but the mountains can surprise pet owners with strong winds and sudden drops in temperature.

Even dogs with undercoats and reputations for faring well in cold conditions need some extra attention during these periods.

"Animals can suffer greatly in cold weather," said Jim Riggins, administrator of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road. "Lower body temperatures also make animals more susceptible to viral infections such as kennel cough and distemper."

Whelping mothers or sick animals should never be left outside. In fact, the humane society encourages pet owners to bring their animals into the house at night for protection and to assure them of their place in the family "pack."

But even if they are outside only during cold winter days, they should be provided with protection.

Riggins recommended a water and wind proof shelter with ample room for the animal to move, but small enough for body temperature of the animal to warm the interior.

Wind proofing is easily and inexpensively accomplished by cut-

ting a piece of carpet, conveyor belt or heavy fabric, just slightly smaller than the door opening. Create a flapper-type door by nailing it to the opening top.

Some dog houses come with a wind break partial wall just past the entrance.

An ideal shelter also has an air space between the floor and the ground, creating a barrier to the cold, he said. Face the shelter away from the direction of the prevailing wind.

Removable roofs that can be secured against the wind are convenient for cleaning. Bedding should be changed or washed frequently.

Plenty of food should be provided. Like humans, animals burn more calories in cold weather. A higher quality diet is preferable to simply feeding more of a lower quality food, Riggins said.

Water dishes should be changed frequently. An animal can't drink a frozen chunk of ice.

Riggins uses the following guide to gauge whether an unsheltered animal is suffering in cold weather.

"Simply picture yourself spending the same time outdoors as the animal knowing that the dog's fur coat offers it 10 degrees more of protection," he said. "If you would suffer, chances are the animal will suffer."
