Feds help with Mescalero flood repair work

The Mescalero Apache Tribe will get \$7 million in emergency federal funds to help it recover from flooding that ravaged parts of the reservation this summer.

The funding is included in the Omnibus Appropriations Bill that incorporates six appropriations bills. The House of Representatives, Senate and president have all approved the omnibus measure. The bill is for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1.

Sen. Pete Domenici, a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, said the bill includes \$7 million for the Bureau of Indian Affairs for emergency stabilization of two dams, emergency road repair, and other flood-related emergency expenditures.

"This is an important appropriation for the Mescaleros. I am pleased that my colleagues have agreed to provide this funding," Domenici said.

New Mexico Indian tribes are also included in the request for \$5.6 million to respond to fire damage earlier this year. Tribes in Arizona, California, Colorado, Minnesota, Montana, Oregon and Washington will also be eligible for this assistance.

Children can still sign up for parade

The Aspenfest parade steps off at 10 a.m.

The children participating will exit the parade at the Ruidoso State Bank on Sudderth. Parents should pick up their children at the Ruidoso State Bank parking lot.

Next DWI blitz starts Friday

The next Operation DWI blitz begins on Friday, Oct. 4, and continues through Sunday, Oct. 13.

The just-completed blitz in September netted 87 DWI arrests out of 45,484 vehicles passing through 45 checkpoints and 34 saturation patrol areas, officials said.

Casino workers meet today

□ Tribe still awaits court decision on request to reopen Casino Apache

Unemployment options will be laid out today in a meeting for approximately 270 Casino Apache employees.

The workers — including dealers, security officers, bartenders and housekeepers — have been jobless since Sept. 24, when U.S. Attorney John Kelly forced the casino to shut down. The casino lies a few miles up the road from Ruidoso at the Inn of the Mountain Gods, and many of the people who were laid off live in Ruidoso.

The U.S. Court of Appeals Tuesday still had not ruled on a week-old request to let the casino reopen while the tribe appeals a court ruling that the casino is illegal. A court clerk said it's impossible to tell when the ruling on the tribe's emergency motions will take place.

A number of usual daytrippers to the mountain resort have vanished during the past week, Inn of the Mountain Gods manager John McCullough said.

However, the hotel hasn't experienced "any huge drop" in reser-

ations for the 253 inn rooms, he added.

"We always get quite a few groups in the fall," he said, "and it's still been a pretty busy time for us."

If the motions are approved early today, McCullough said he thinks the tribe could reopen the casino tonight.

"If we're able to reopen, we'll put them all back to work just like it was last Tuesday."

"If we're not able to reopen, then others will be laid off. It's already the slow season, and now with no gaming...."

"We've been hopeful (for a decision) every day. I wish we'd hear so these people can go back to work and we can get back to business as usual."

State Department of Labor personnel from Alamogordo and the Ruidoso suboffice will be at today's meeting to take collection claims and distribute information about workers' rights and collection responsibilities.

"What we hope is that when we get there at 8 o'clock we'll hear they got a stay," said Eddie Beagles, the director of the workforce development center, on Tuesday.

If not, casino employees can expect to get a maximum \$212/week in unemployment, Beagles said.

Still waiting for ruling

A federal Court of Appeals clerk said Tuesday from Denver she

receives several calls every hour from people waiting for a decision on the Casino Apache motions.


"The emergency motion is in front of a panel of judges," she said for the umpteenth time when another call came in. "When they'll make a decision, there's no way of knowing."

No hearing about the motions is scheduled, the clerk added.

The Mescalero Apache Tribe motions ask for stays (delays) on the U.S. attorney's forfeiture and closure orders. The motions were filed Sept. 25 in the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver, the same court that granted a similar stay for the Jicarilla Apache Tribe's casino on Sept. 24.

In the motions, Mescalero Apache Tribe president Wendell Chino said the tribe would abide by the Court of Appeals' decision on a similar case appealed by nine New Mexico pueblos. That appeal will be heard Nov. 20.

While U.S. Attorney John Kelly forced Casino Apache to close by threatening to take its machines and freeze its bank accounts, he agreed to let the pueblos' casinos stay open because they signed a court agreement saying they would close if they lose the appeal. The Mescalero and Jicarilla Apache tribes did not sign such a court-approved agreement with Kelly, so Kelly is fighting their attempts to stay open.

County will help do village projects

Ruidoso village and school district officials won the cooperation of Lincoln County commissioners for two construction projects Tuesday.

But cooperation carried a price tag.

Commissioners agreed to allow a 50x100-foot strip of county land to become part of a proposed continuous parking lot linking village hall to a new public library and to the county's sub-office on Kansas City Street.

In exchange, Village Manager Gary Jackson said he will recommend the Ruidoso Village Council waive a \$500 per month rent currently being paid by the county to house a juvenile probation office at the police department.

Commission Chairman Monroy Montes asked whether the village had established the value of the county land.

Commissioner Wilton Howell jumped into the conversation, noting that county residents will use the new library and that visitors to the health office also might benefit from the larger parking lot. Then he suggested the village could sweeten the offer by waiving the probation office rental in exchange for the value of the land.

The motion to approve that part of the agreement passed unanimously after Commissioner Stirling Spencer was assured the names of all three

agencies would be included on insurance coverage in case an accident occurs in the parking lot.

The village will bear all construction costs, Jackson said. The new \$1.6 million library is being built between village hall and the sub-office, currently the home for the county health nurse and a second base for the sheriff's office.

The second part of the village's request took longer.

Jackson said the village and school district need county help to provide access to a \$1 million, 17-acre sports field complex being built at the White Mountain elementary and middle school compound.

More than 1,000 children attending the three schools there as well as other groups would benefit from a soccer/multi-purpose field, Jackson said. A varsity baseball field also will be created, allowing the district to participate for the first time in baseball competitions.

The county is needed to create a 1,200-foot-long access road into the field complex from the west and a 640-foot road from the east, each six feet wide, said Alan Briley, deputy village manager and project director. In addition, the two boards would like the county to create a 280x170-foot parking lot and to grade one of the small fields.

He didn't have an estimated cost of the work. Commissioners

Hospital seeks county aid for expansion, remodel plans

Hospital officials asked Lincoln County commissioners Tuesday for \$1.7 million toward remodeling and additions at the county medical center in Ruidoso.

Construction won't begin until July 1997, and may take three years to complete, she said. Remodeling will have to be accomplished with minimal disruptions to departments, she said.

Hospital board member Gary Mitchell reminded commissioners the \$2.35 million project will benefit the public in more than improved medical care since the 39-bed hospital belongs to the county. Presbyterian HealthCare Systems based in Albuquerque is the management company.

The hospital also is a major employer with an annual payroll of \$5.3 million, Mitchell said.

While Commissioner Wilton Howell said the project would be an appropriate use of \$800,000 the commission has accumulated in its facilities fund, he was critical that the plan lacks community health clinics. Clinics were requested by outlying communities in a recent health assessment survey, he pointed out.

Mitchell said several of the projects are tied directly to prior surveys, which showed the public wants expanded 24-hour medical services and more doctors in different fields.

Commissioner Stirling Spencer wants to see some of the money collected by the hospital each year from a special property tax levy used on the remodeling project.

"If we use the county's facilities' money on the hospital, we remove it from our other facilities and we have buildings all over the place," Spencer said.

Commission Chairman Monroy Montes told Mitchell and Miller to come back in 30 days with some alternative methods or combined methods of funding, and more detailed construction figures.

Hospital auxiliary representatives said they raised \$150,000 this year for the hospital and would dedicate future fundraising to the construction project.

About \$390,000 of the voter-approved special tax levy each year is used for operation of the hospital and \$410,000 is supposed to go for capital outlay, Miller said. But for the past two years, the hospital has used \$278,000 of that capital outlay money to pay the county's Medicaid contribution.

Increased volume, new hospital building codes, as well as needs expressed in community surveys dictated the improvements needed, Miller and Mitchell said.

Emergency room visits rose 88% from 1990 to 1995, from 5,040 to 9,472, according to a breakdown presented by Miller. Radiology procedures increased 58% to 13,080 per year during that period; laboratory visits were up 55% to 9,422; surgical suite procedures jumped 74% to 1,207; and physical therapy visits increased 55% to 6,558.

New construction will add 3,454 square feet to the hospital and remodeling will affect 8,890 square feet.

- connecting an out-building containing the CAT-scan to the hospital;
- moving physical therapy to a portable building with a separate parking lot and entrance that are more accessible for those using crutches and walkers;
- moving the pharmacy from its existing cramped quarters to the old physical therapy site;
- enlarging the recovery room;
- and relocating medical staff lockers.

Ruidoso sends list of projects off to state

Ruidoso officials sent a wish list to the state government this week. The 1997-98 capital improvement plan (CIP) includes \$13.1 million in village projects; \$235,044 worth of park and rec projects were the last to be added. The list was sent to the state Department of Finance Administration after it was approved Sept. 24 by village councilors.

With the CIP plan, the village has a better chance of receiving state funding for projects, officials explained. "Certain legislators frown upon any funding of any items for a (government) entity not participating in the CIP," village manager Gary Jackson told councilors said last week. "They look at the needs of the community and see if we're doing any advanced planning."

Ruidoso officials work to incorporate as much of the CIP into village budget as possible, and annually make requests for some state funding by prioritizing two or three items. At the top of the 1997-98 CIP list is \$1.2 million for water distribution, wastewater collection and wastewater treatment improvements. Similar water items headed the list last year.

Park improvements rank

seventh on the 17-item CIP list for fiscal 1997-98, with \$235,044 worth of projects for 1997-98, \$1.18 million during the next five years.

Parks rose on the list from number 12 to seven after councilors reviewed a 10-year park growth schematic plan at a Sept. 18 workshop. They met with Parks and Recreation Department Director Debbie Jo Almager and parks and rec committee members.

At the workshop, committee members called parks and rec a quality of life issue, and councilors agreed. Jackson said the village should explore working closer with the U.S. Forest Service and the Mescalero Apache Tribe to develop recreational opportunities, and councilors suggested more funding for future projects could be found by hiring a grant writer.

Almager compiled a three-year schematic plan to analyze village recreational demands, budget constraints, ways to implement projects and funding prospects.

Ruidoso currently has six parks: Two Rivers Park; School House Park; McCarty Park (behind Marie LaVeaux Restaurant); Northpark; Wingfield Park (at the parks and rec office on Grindstone Road) and Grindstone Lake. The parks and rec department also maintains Forest Lawn Cemetery.

The plan envisions the addition

of play and picnic equipment at each of the parks. Grindstone Lake Park would be fully developed with trails, picnic grounds, lighting and RV camping.

Adding RV hookups to Grindstone Lake park at the edge of town would generate fees for the village and would also lure shoppers downtown, officials said.

In the past, some have argued that adding RV camping at the lake would be unfair competition for private Ruidoso businesses, but it would really only be in competition with Alamogordo's Bonito Lake, Councilor Robert Donaldson said.

The parks plan also calls for construction of a fourth softball field at the Eagle Creek Sports Complex. It would cost an estimated \$40,000 to build, but could help draw another tournament to Ruidoso, resulting in an estimated \$116,000 in annual economic impacts.

The village currently hosts five annual softball tournaments. In

1995, Almager estimated these tournaments — each allowing about 20 teams — fueled Ruidoso's economy by about \$90,000.

Also in the conceptual parks plan and number 14 on the 1997-98 CIP list is construction of a \$7.7 million recreation center, with another \$3.5 million needed for the addition of a pool a year later.

Village officials have twice requested legislative funding for the rec center, and so far it has received \$160,000 for architectural designs.

Councilors will later consider whether to request more money this year from the Legislature for the rec center, and whether or not to scale back the scope of the project.

The only imminent parks improvements are new baseball and soccer fields at the White Mountain School complex. They are being funded with voter-approved Ruidoso bond issues.

Parks and rec plan details

Ruidoso's capital improvement plan for village parks in fiscal 1997-98 calls for:

- \$15,000 for a School House Park Fitness trail;
- \$2,000 for a water fountain and \$4,000 for recreation enhancements at Two Rivers Park, plus \$76,069 in grants for overall park improvements;
- \$5,000 for a new softball field design and plan at the Eagle Creek Sports Complex, plus \$2,250 for a deck concession stand and \$2,500 for picnic tables with shelters;
- \$106,350 for Grindstone Park area projects, including \$10,350 for development designs; \$40,000 for construction; \$10,000 for utilities;

- \$40,000 for park equipment, and \$5,500 for trail and forest clearing;
- \$5,000 for swimming pool area locker room remodeling;
- \$3,500 for bench shelters along the village fitness trail;
- \$6,500 for McCarty Park projects, including \$4,000 for benches and tables and \$2,500 for a water fountain;
- and \$9,875 for cemetery projects, including walkways and \$7,950 for road improvements.

Actual funding of the projects won't be known until early 1997 when village revenues are known, and councilors start work on the 1997-98 village budget that goes into effect July 1.

delayed the discussion until later in the meeting to allow county road superintendent Albert Hernandez to check the site and come back with an estimate.

During the afternoon session, Hernandez returned with an estimate of \$38,006, including \$10,151 in culvert pipes and base course for the roads. The rest of the cost is in manpower and equipment.

The west road shouldn't be a problem, Hernandez said. But the road from the east is right in the middle of a swampy area, he said. Large rocks and other substantial fill will have to be used there instead of topsoil, he said.

The village and school district should not hold the county responsible if the road falls apart from water damage after it's completed, Montes said.

The sports complex is scheduled to be finished by Feb. 1. Commissioners agreed to put in a basic road from the west to ensure access for the contractor, but will do the rest of the work when spare time is available, which may not result in a continuous schedule, Montes said.

Commissioner Stirling Spencer said county road crews already are overtaxed trying to do regular projects and clean up from a late summer flood.

He cast the lone vote against the agreement.

Jackson thanked commissioners, saying the agreement worked out was a model of cooperation among government entities.

State engineer changes water right protest procedure

From now on, protests against applications to the State Engineer's office for water rights will have to contain specifics.

General objections will no longer result in a hearing.

Protests will have to show how the opponents will be "substantially and specifically affected" by a new water right, said State Engineer Tom Turney.

The new process should end irrelevant protests and speed up the state's handling of applications, he said.

Previously, anyone who wanted a hearing on a water right application only had to send a single-sentence letter stating the proposed water right would impair an existing right, the public welfare or water conservation in New Mexico.

That flexibility is at an end, because it often resulted in hearings on trivial issues already answered

in routine reviews by his office, Turney said.

In the future, his office will use a state interpretation of state law and require protesters to list specifics and show they would be substantially affected, he said.

The state engineer is responsible for keeping track of all New Mexico water rights, transferring those rights and issuing new rights. In New Mexico, a person, business or town cannot consume more water than the rights they own on paper.

Other recommendations from a review team that the State Engineer's office is considering are:

- a statement in public notices for water right applications the office already reviews the impact of proposed water rights on existing rights, the public welfare and water conservation;

— charge a fee for filing a protest;

— create a hearings bureau that would report directly to the state engineer;

— and initiate a computer tracking system for water rights applications using bar codes similar to those used to price items in grocery stores.

The number of applications being processed by the state engineer's office increased from 10,000 in 1990 to 15,000 in 1995 without an increase in the number of employees, he said.

"The workload is staggering now — and what happens when the number of applications increases to 20,000 a year?" Turney said.

That number is possible since a new state subdivision law took effect in July. It requires developers to secure water rights before beginning work.

Deputies need election to bargain

Lincoln County sheriff's deputies apparently forgot to conduct an election designating a collective bargaining unit.

County commissioners thought the election was staged last year. The commissioners had formed a labor board and had begun initial bargaining sessions. But when the county's negotiator asked for documentation of an election, none could be found.

Commissioners declined Tuesday to recognize the Lincoln County Sheriff's Association as the bargaining unit, since there is no proof of an election.

Association spokesman Paul Wersich said he couldn't remember if there had been an election. He said he will call a general meeting of 13 deputies and seven dis-

patchers sometime in the next month to elect the bargaining unit.

Sheriff's employees are the first in county government to pursue collective bargaining since a state law allowing such action was approved three years ago.

Downs council makes firing decision legal

The Ruidoso Downs Village Council voted in open session at its regular meeting last week to terminate Corporal Ray Montes from his job as police officer, with Trustee Margie Morales casting the dissenting vote.

Trustees had previously taken the vote in closed session, in violation of the Open Meetings Act. Village attorney Robert Beauvais advised them to vote again in open session.



Two examples of accomplishments through cooperation

The county government has agreed to help the village of Ruidoso and the Ruidoso School District with construction of athletic fields by using its road equipment to build roads. Several groups are helping the Ruidoso School District get Internet into the classrooms: Eastern New Mexico University, the Hubbard Foundation, the Museum of the Horse, the schools' Region IX, and Lincoln Cablevision.

These projects may never have been accomplished without such cooperation. At the least, they will come on line much sooner and be able to help children who might have graduated before they could have been completed by the village or schools alone.

Talk to persons working in the criminal justice system. Most hold the opinion I do, but are reluctant to express themselves publicly for obvious political reasons.

Waste disposal contractor not getting rich quick

TO THE EDITOR:

In response to a letter to the editor in Wednesday, Sept. 18, Ruidoso News:

Earlier this year with the closure of the Capitan Landfill at hand, no viable solutions on handling brush, pine needles and other wood products had been discovered.

At that time, we put together a means for disposal for this type of debris. Sierra Contracting, Inc. was awarded the contract by Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority in June. Sierra is not subsidized by L.C.S.W.A., the county or the villages of Ruidoso or Ruidoso Downs.

We are a stand-alone private enterprise. Our pricing contract calls for \$6 per cubic yard to the general public, however when we opened our facility, we voluntarily lowered the price.

Making the comparison between Alamogordo and Ruidoso so far as the amount of this type of material is not reasonable. Chipping is very labor intensive and the equipment is costly to maintain. This still leaves a by-product which most Ruidoso residents have in their yard already.

As for the getting-rich-quick at the expense of the taxpayer, we are not the recipient of any tax dollars! Some would say we are getting rich providing this service. Let's look at some figures. We are required to carry \$1 million in liability insurance. We purchased a five-acre tract of land at \$12,000 close to Ruidoso Downs to be convenient to our customers. We purchased over \$170,000 in equipment needed for the business. Excavation of the property, well drilling, power to the office, fencing, fire protection equipment are not included in that figure. After three months of operation, this venture is far from making anyone rich! We will wait many years to realize a return on this substantial investment.

We now have many customers who thank us for providing an easy and economical way to dispose of their green waste, saving the approximately 70-mile one way trip to Otero/Lincoln County land fill near Ogranda. As a matter of fact, in Durango, Colo. it costs \$16 per yard to dispose of this same material. Resident taxpayers need to know we do not get any of your tax dollars! We do appreciate your business and will continue to provide an

economical a service as business allows.





RUIDOSO MUNICIPAL COURT

Robert Dutchover, 48, of Ruidoso Downs was sentenced to a year in jail Sept. 18 for battering his wife.

Dutchover is appealing the guilty verdict. He was released from the county jail Sept. 19 on a \$1,000 bond.

Judge William Butts found him guilty of aggravated battery to a household member and resisting arrest — both misdemeanors — after a trial the same day.

Dutchover will have to serve the entire year, without the possibility of time off for good behavior, because he threatened officers again while he was being taken out of the courthouse after sentencing, Butts added.

Dutchover's wife told police on Sept. 18 that, after a long absence, her husband came home drunk that day and was belligerent. After accusing her of being unfaithful, he hit her and "busted" his wife's face, deputies reported.

Deputies said they saw the left side of her face was swollen, her left eye was black and her lips were split, court records said.

A warrant was issued for Dutchover based on the complaint, and he was arrested Aug. 4 while at the Old Lincoln Days pageant, and resisted the sheriff's deputies by fleeing and then threatening them, court records said.

Derrick Bowen, 31, of Ruidoso, was sentenced to one year in jail and a \$1,000 fine Sept. 18 after

pleading no contest to charges of battering his pregnant girlfriend, her sister and their mother May 22.

A total \$1,750 in fines were suspended.

Bowen, who is out on a \$1,000 bond, will start serving the time at the county jail Oct. 4, Judge William Butts said.

Bowen pleaded no contest July 31 to three petty misdemeanor counts of assault to a household member, two misdemeanor counts of battery to a household member and one misdemeanor count of aggravated battery to a household member. The Sept. 18 sentences on all the counts add up to 3.5 years, but the judge will let Bowen serve them concurrently, adding up to a total of a year in jail.

According to court records, Bowen came home drunk around 2 a.m. May 22 and began yelling at his sleeping girlfriend. Her mother and sister, who were in Ruidoso for a visit, were also sleeping in the same room, court records said.

Bowen told his pregnant girlfriend to get out of the house, so she and her family packed bags. But before they could get into the car and leave, Bowen hit the mother in the face and threw her to the ground. He also struck the sister on her ear, making her fall and hit her elbow, and slammed the car door on his girlfriend's body as she tried to get in the car, according to court records.

Officers could see the elbow and face injuries.







"When we're fresh we can do it, but on the other hand we've got to learn to win when we're tired," she added.

Cross-county foe Capitan needs to learn how to finish off its opponents, said Tiger mentor Massé.

Capitan nearly squandered a match to San Jon after winning the first two games in relatively easy fashion.

It's going to be a little harder to pass the General Education Diploma (GED) test as of January 1997.

The minimum passing score will be raised from 40 to 45, and people will have a maximum of three years to complete all five subtests.

About half of New Mexico's population never finished high school, a local college official says. But a growing number of high school drop-outs are taking the GED test to make up for lost time and lost opportunities, said Jim Miller, director of Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso.

In September, 16 people took their GED exam in Ruidoso. Now almost 20 more people are attending GED instructional workshops. "Interest is growing," Miller said.

Not only are some people trying to pass the test before the standards rise, but the New Mexico Department of Labor will soon be sending welfare recipients into GED prep classes.

The Department of Labor announced Tuesday it is implementing Phase I of welfare reforms approved by President Clinton on Aug. 22. As of Oct. 1, Project Forward AFDC applicants are required to register for Job Search activities at the Department of Labor, according to a release. Some of these

people will be referred to GED programs to help them get a job.

The states are under pressure to get a certain number of people of welfare within the first year of reform, Miller said. "One way to do that is to provide training for people who haven't finished high school."

In Lincoln and Otero counties, New Mexico State University of Alamogordo administers all GED testing and instruction. The coordinator for the Ruidoso office, housed by Eastern New Mexico University, is Dinah Hamilton.

The GED is comprised of five subtests — writing, skills, social studies, science, interpreting literature and the arts, and mathematics. These subtests can be taken individually or all in one sitting at ENMU. ENMU offers the tests the second Friday of every month.

Starting in January, any test scores more than 3 years old will be thrown out, Hamilton said. This includes tests taken before January.

Currently a 40 average on the GED is enough to pass. Come January 1997, the requirement will be a 45 average with no score below 45 on any of the subtests. The highest score possible on the GED is an 80.

"The scoring is based on the number of high school seniors who could pass the test," Hamilton said. "Currently it's set so that 30% of high school seniors could not pass it."

With more adults wanting their high school diplomas, ENMU is expanding its GED program. Preparatory classes are offered on nights of week 5:30 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday at Ruidoso High School. Hamilton, the class is held from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday at Carrizozo High School.

Hamilton is developing a schedule for daytime classes as well.

"This is for homemakers who have kids in school, for people who are between jobs, home-schooled kids ready to take the test, people with night jobs," Hamilton said.

Anyone interested in taking a daytime GED "prep class" should call ENMU at 257-2120 and suggest a day and time for the class.

GED instruction is free, and students may sign up at any time, GED instructor Randall Robbins began meeting with diploma-seekers on Aug. 27, but new students enter the class all the time, Miller said. Classes function in large groups, small groups, and one-on-one settings.

Students do not have to register at the ENMU office; they can sign up at the class.

"The instruction is individualized," Hamilton said. "So if you're a whiz in math, there's no need for you to work on the math part."

ENMU offers continuing support after students pass the GED.

Hamilton will help these people make use of their diplomas, helping them find jobs or start college.

ENMU has at least four college scholarships targeted specifically for GED graduates, Hamilton said. Miller said many GED graduates go on to take college courses because they are excited about education.

"They're on fire," he said. "They want their GED and they want to start college tomorrow."

While many high school drop-outs are pursuing their education, many more find it hard to come forward because they're embarrassed about not finishing high school, Miller said.

Friends and employers need to be supportive and encouraging," Hamilton said.

Wal-Mart, for example, pays all expenses associated with the GED, such as books and testing, to encourage their employees and employee spouses to take the GED.

Hamilton and Miller are doing all they can to make it easy for people to get a GED, including searching for child care so single parents can take the prep class.

GED preparation is part of the Adult Basic Education program at Eastern. This program also includes citizenship classes and classes in English as a Second Language.

Local businesses, organizations help bring information highway to schools

Cyber-education is arriving in Ruidoso. By January 1997, children at White Mountain Elementary and Intermediate will be logging onto the Internet for "surfing" lessons and access to information from all over the world.

Eventually, every school in the Ruidoso district will be networked and connected to Internet through Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso. The district-wide hook-up is made possible by a \$55,000 grant from the National Science Foundation and the cooperative efforts of several private and public entities.

Along with Eastern New Mexico University (both the Ruidoso and Portales campuses), the Ruidoso School District is teaming up with the Hubbard Foundation, the Museum of the Horse, Lincoln Cablevision, and Region IX.

"This is a unique partnership," said Paul Wirth, director of instructional support for Ruidoso schools. "I believe that's why the NSF grant is so much. The usual NSF grant is about \$15,000."

Lincoln Cablevision is hanging more than 17 miles of fiberoptic cable to improve cable television service to its customers, said manager Gene McKinley. This cable can also be used for two-way transmission of data. The school system will

use the fiberoptic cable free of charge, McKinley said.

"The fiberoptic cable allows us to use the telecommunications field more," McKinley said. "It's immune to outside interference and it's more reliable."

The Museum of the Horse will also be connected to Internet, and the Hubbard Foundation made a \$20,000 contribution to the project.

It will cost about \$9,200 per school to create five "subnet" locations that will tie into ENMU's computer system. Each of these "hubs" will then access Internet through ENMU's twin 56kbs frame relay connections.

"This is state of the art for the Southwest," Wirth said.

Allowing children to tour the Internet could be a little more educa-

tional than some parents would like, with access to pornography and other adult matter. To protect children from that kind of exposure, school computers will be equipped with "Net Nanny," Wirth said.

"This program filters access to Internet, so we'll be venturing only partway into cyberspace," Wirth said.



Warm days, but cold nights and mornings catch many people by surprise, often resulting in chills that set them up for infections.

Working in offices, viruses will spend from worker to worker.

The same is true for pets. In any kennel situation, the possibility of animals contracting kennel cough is high.

Fortunately, the infection usually is not serious.

About this time each year, calls begin flooding the shelter from owners who recently purchased animals from pet shops, breeders or shelters, said Jim Riggins, director of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road.

Kennel cough is a viral upper respiratory infection that lasts from seven to 21 days, Riggins said.

"Dogs usually show a persistent, sometimes dry cough," he said. "Usually, there's some clear nasal discharge along with it."

Similar to the common cold in humans, the infection can be just as elusive to treat, he said. No cure has been found. Only the symptoms can be treated.

"No preventative vaccine has been developed," Riggins said. "Some bordatella vaccines are effective in early stages of symp-

toms, although their effects are slow.

"Kennel cough is a fairly minor and non-lethal infection. As with the common cold, however, it can open the door for more dangerous conditions such as viral pneumonia."

Many veterinarians recommend a course of antibiotics as a precaution, he said.

"There also are other conditions such as distemper, with similar symptoms at the onset," Riggins said. "See your veterinarian for a correct diagnosis and advice."

Some additional steps an owner may take to keep a pet comfortable and aid its recovery include:

— keep them warm and inside, if at all possible;

— keep them quiet. Agitation, running or barking prompt the coughing and can delay recovery.

Reminders

Although the rainy season is over, owners should think ahead for next year and prepare alternatives to chaining or enclosing their dogs in low-lying areas that could be swamped by water, putting animals at risk of drowning.

Be sure to bring your dog inside when you return home from work. Dogs are pack animals and need the group interaction.

"TR, The Story of Theodore Roosevelt"

Theodore Roosevelt embodied America at the turn of the century: the confidence, the exuberance, the aggressiveness — it was all there, all in him. Cowboy, soldier, explorer, scientist, a world authority on large mammals and small birds, the author of 36 books and 150,000 letters, he was president by the age of 42.

Roosevelt's diverse experiences, magnetic personality ("a steam engine in trousers," someone called him), and genius for publicity made him a legend in his own time. Challenging the stereotypical image of TR as a comic figure, "TR, The Story of Theodore Roosevelt" portrays him as a deft politician and skillful diplomat. It reveals his key role in creating the modern presidency and shows how he used the office to increase the federal government's power to regulate big business, leave a permanent legacy of national forests and parks, and accelerate America's rise to world power. It also reveals the human side of the man. Shadowed by illness, haunted by the deaths of those most dear to him, he learned early that life was "one long campaign where every victory merely leaves the ground free for another battle."

"TR, The Story of Theodore Roosevelt" on **The American Experience**, a two-part special, will air Sunday and Monday, October 6th and 7th at 7:00 p.m.

FRONTLINE

In October, **Frontline** opens its fifteenth season on PBS with "The Choice '96," a dual biography of the 1996 presidential candidates, Bill Clinton and Bob Dole. Interweaving their public careers and private lives, the two-hour report offers an illuminating portrait of each candidate's record and, most important, his character, to help voters understand what kind of president each might be in the next four years.

Next, **Frontline** examines the Navy after Tailhook in "The Navy Blues," an investigation of the seismic shock caused by the sex scandal involving naval aviators five years ago and its continuing impact on the Navy. The film explores the controversy over the post-Tailhook mandate to introduce women into combat roles and positions of greater authority.

Also in October, **Frontline** offers "Why America Hates the Press," a tough, insider's examination of the culture and tactics of the national press corps. **Frontline** follows the nation's top political journalists along the 1996 presidential campaign trail and behind the scenes of the weekly talk shows where reporters are transformed into celebrity pundits.

Frontline airs Tuesdays at 8:00 p.m. beginning October 8th. It repeats Saturdays at 10:00 p.m.

Aspenfest parade

About 15 of the "oldtimers" are expected to be on a float.

Having the multiple marshals is a break from tradition, but "turning 50 only happens once," Anderson says. "We'll probably do it on our 100th anniversary too!"

Prizes will be awarded to the best floats, pets, bikes and bands. The top float gets the traveling trophy (on display at Wal-Mart, which won last year), and the top three receive \$100, \$50, and \$25, respectively. Pets and bikes winning 1st through 3rd place awards get

savings bonds or gift certificates, and six awards will be donned on bands, which will be judged as they pass by the Gazebo shopping center.

Bands will also gather at the Ruidoso Middle School's Horton Field around 1 p.m. for a "Battle of the Bands," Anderson says.

Lisa Muhn, who's helping promote the parade through the 55-year-old Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce, says about 10,000 people are expected for Aspenfest.

"You wouldn't believe the number of people who come from Texas just for the parade," says Muhn, the chamber's administrative assistant. "It's one that still has that small-town atmosphere that people just love."

This year Bill Stroud is sure his team has come up with a recipe that will win the Annual New Mexico State Open Chili Cookoff in Ruidoso, Oct. 5.

Armed with the Mexican heritage of team member Albert Robles and outdoor cooking knowledge of member Mark Williams, Stroud said his team has the right combination for its "Slick Willy Chili."

Cookoff organizer Paul Crown said about 104 cooking teams have registered for this Oct. 5 Aspenfest event, from as far away as Oregon and Louisiana.

It's the 15th annual chili combat in Ruidoso at the Tall Pines Trailer Park on Sudderth Drive.

The rules are simple: no fillers like

beans, rice or macaroni — just meat. And it can't be marinated. Cooking can begin any time after the cooks' conference ending about 9:30 a.m., Crown said. But some teams wait until an hour

before the start of judging at 2 p.m., he said.

Winners are announced at 4 p.m. Trophies go to the 10 best chilis and first through third for the best state chili and best showmanship.

Visitors who pay \$2 admission can sample the pots for 25 cents a scoopful starting at 2:15 p.m., but the supply is limited. A "People's Choice" award will be given based on how many people taste a chili within an allotted time

frame. To cool palates between sips, visitors can pause to listen to the music of The Lone Star Express.

While the Western melodies are strummed, Stroud's team will be busy over its pot of chili, which the Ruidoso resident describes as flavorful, but not the kind that sizzles the eyeballs.





"We use basic spices," Stroud said. "We've always had lots of good comments on our chili. It was popular. Now I've changed some of the ingredients and have it down to perfection."

The "Tres Amigo" team has been competing since 1994, Stroud said.

"I had attended the chili cookout since the 1970s and just decided we needed some local competition," he said. "We put our heads together and decided it was the thing to do."

"It's mainly my recipe with a tremendous amount of assistance from my wife, Jamie."

The trio cooks about five gallons of chili at a cost of \$40 to \$50, he said. They start cooking as soon as the cook's conference is over.

"Teams spend as little as \$5 for a pot of chili or as high as \$75 for things like ribeye and spices," Crown said.

This year Lincoln Cablevision, where Crown is manager, will compete.

Crown won't be judging.

"I don't eat the stuff," he said.



Last year's chili judges had to keep drinks close at hand as they tasted the cookoff entries. This year's competition will run through 80 judges in its quest to find the winning recipe.

"Although I taste the winning pot."

Started by a former chamber director to benefit the local community promotion organization, the cook-off was handed over to Crown and two friends after the first two years, because of the work involved, he said.

Crown took over completely after his two friends dropped out, and for the

last five years, proceeds have been donated to the Rotary Club Scholarship Fund, \$4,200 in 1995. Ruidoso State Bank and Budweiser co-sponsor the event, which winds down about 5 p.m.

The rules are written by the Chili Appreciation Society International in Texas. The director of that group will be cooking "Bounty Hunter" chili at the

cook-off, Crown said.

"We will run through 80 judges Saturday," Crown said. "To win, you have to please five people at that table. It can't be too hot or taste like too much tomato. Weird flavors never win, because people can't relate to them. We've had chocolate and coffee chili, but shrimp chili was the weirdest."

Aspenfest rings golden in the ears of arts and crafts aficionados as the autumnal celebration brings the 11th Annual Ruidoso Arts and Crafts Fair.

Many local talents display their wares every year at the arts and crafts fair. Dina Ortega returns this year with dried florals. Billie Ensor is also back with T-shirts and unusual candles.

Something of a homemade oil lamp, the candles are made out of decorated bottles filled with oil. Ensor adorns the

bottles with flowers and installs a wick that sticks out at the top.

"I'm also offering tie-dyed T-shirts at close-out prices this year," she said.

Olga Sulak has been attending the Aspenfest arts and crafts fair for five years, ever since she moved to Ruidoso from El Paso. Struck by the versatility of the beautiful pine cone, Sulak gathered them from her yard to make wreaths.

"They're very popular," Sulak said. "I wish I had more time and patience to make more of them."

The pine cones are affixed to straw wreaths, sometimes painted festive colors, and Sulak adds yucca blossoms and dried wildflowers gathered from this area.


The Southwestern pine cone wreath includes dried corn and chili peppers.





This German celebration of fall runs from 5 p.m. until noon on Friday, Oct. 18, and from noon until midnight on Saturday, Oct. 19.


