Police suspect fall in Ruidoso death

William Scalf, 62, was found dead outside his Ruidoso home Tuesday morning, possibly having fallen off a balcony hours before, police said.

There is no sign of foul play in his death, but an investigation is still pending, police said.

Scalf, who had been at home alone for several days since his wife Joyce went visiting friends in Texas, was found around 10:30 a.m. Oct. 16 by a Zia Natural Gas Co. worker, police said.

Police suspect he fell from his balcony, which is about 13.5 feet above the ground. There was no sign of a scuffle, and the house did not appear to be tampered with, police said.

Scalf had been dead for at least a day before his body was discovered, detective Wolf Born estimated.

He likely hadn't been found earlier because his house is secluded and at a dead end street, Born added.

The family will determine whether an autopsy will be performed, police said.

UFOs identified

Strange lights near Sierra Blanca Peak were reported by several Ruidoso residents last weekend.

Barry Majjala, U.S. Forest Service law enforcement officer, was flagged down Friday by two women as he was riding with a Lincoln County sheriff's deputy.

"They said they saw a strange light over Sierra Blanca" and had videotaped the UFO, he said. Viewing the video, the object appeared flat on the top and bottom with pulsating lights, Majjala said, although some camera movement may have caused part of that effect.

Majjala was stopped later by a man who said he also saw a light through his telescope on top of the Capitan run in the Ski Apache area.

When Majjala drove to the ski area, he found an eight-foot high bonfire being attended by a group of people and a mercury vapor light in the ski area, possibly left on by a contractor. Those two sources, enhanced by their reflections on trees and rocks, probably are what residents saw, Majjala said.

Judge concludes evidence exists for murder charge

Jim Hare's widow and daughter dabbed tears and comforted each other four rows behind Steve Hernandez Tuesday as a judge ruled the state presented sufficient evidence to charge Hernandez with Hare's murder.

Hernandez, 33, is accused of striking Hare in the back of the head with a long-handled sledgehammer Oct. 6 at a roping arena in Hondo Valley.

Defense attorney Gary Mitchell argued that Hernandez acted in self-defense. If any charge is filed, it should be manslaughter, since the death was not premeditated, Mitchell said.

But Assistant District Attorney Viola Rhodes painted Hernandez as a man whose ego was bruised when he was bested in an earlier fight he started with Hare. She said he was a man who couldn't let it go, picked

up a sledgehammer and went after Hare again.

"There is no evidence of self-defense," she said. "An aggressor can't claim self defense and according to all of the testimony, Steve Hernandez began both fights."

"He comes after Jim Hare with a sledgehammer. Hare is trapped there and that's when he picks up a board, because Hernandez continues to advance."

"Gary Mitchell would have you believe that's mutual combat."

She acknowledged that a charge of murder requires deliberate intention to take a life after some thought, but added that intention "may be reached in a short period of time."

After the first fight ended, Hernandez had enough time to walk to where the sledgehammer was sitting and walk back toward Hare, Rhodes said.

"He made the decision to attack Jim Hare with a deadly weapon and struck him twice, once while Mr. Hare was on his hands and knees and the last time while he was lying on the ground," Rhodes said.

Hare tried to defend himself with a board — hitting Hernandez three times — only because he was cornered and could not escape, she contended.

In reaching his decision, Ruidoso Magistrate Judge William Butts said that he relied substantially on the only witness who hadn't been drinking the day of Hare's death, 16-year-old Jonathon Coleman. He was also the only other witness to the second fight, Butts said.

Coleman said Hernandez pulled Hare off a horse when the two men began arguing over training techniques. Arena owner Ralph Montes

Family, friends search for Ruidosoan

Ruidoso resident Mike Hough, 44, has been missing since Friday, Oct. 11 and his family has no clue where he is.

At the request of his loved ones, Ruidoso police are searching for Hough and welcome any information.

Hough, a builder, was last seen by his sons, Jon, 21, and Roy, 17, who were helping him at a Porr Drive job site, his mother-in-law Peggy McClellan says.

He left around 7:30 a.m. in his 1976 white Ford F250 truck to go to another work site at Ranches of Sonterra, and he hasn't been seen since, McClellan said.

Hough has been under a lot of stress lately, McClellan said, but disappearing is "so unlike him," she said.

No one saw him or his truck at the job site, she added. Hough was wearing jeans, a

white shirt with blue pinstripes over a white T-shirt, and a navy blue jacket, McClellan said.

Around 10:30 a.m. Oct. 11, Hough's wife Pam became concerned about her husband's whereabouts because he would always call around that time and hadn't, McClellan said.

By noon, when he hadn't been seen at the job site and still hadn't called, the family called police.

An organized search, including members of White Mountain Search and Rescue, began around 4:30 p.m. and it continued until Saturday night, McClellan said.

Much of the search was conducted by road and air, and it covered the Ranches of Sonterra and airport area, the Bonito basin, Nogal, Eagle Creek and Hale Lake, she added.

Friends and family outside the state have also been contacted,

McClellan said.

Anyone with any information about Hough's whereabouts is asked to call the Ruidoso police at 257-7365.

Clinton hears about woes at Casino Apache

□ Chino is apparently snubbed at tribal gathering hosted by president

If President Bill Clinton hadn't previously heard of the Mescalero Apache Tribe or its president Wendell Chino, he knows of them now.

Tribal members and laid-off Casino Apache workers rallied before Clinton after he arrived in Albuquerque for a three-day stay Sunday. A day later, Chino issued searing comments about Clinton's apparent snub of Indian leaders during a presidential reception.

Chino's comments possibly prompted a meeting Tuesday between Clinton and 21 state tribal and pueblo leaders who endorsed the president's bid for re-election.

At the meeting, Clinton was told by a reporter that Chino, who he called "the dean of tribal leaders" was not present, and that Chino has been calling for the removal of U.S. Attorney John Kelly for closing down the tribe's Casino Apache.

Clinton responded that the state's Indian gaming issue is in court and he can't comment.

Chino was the only Indian president not invited, his spokesperson Catherine Bedell Krall said.

The White House claims an invitation was sent to Chino, but Krall contends it "must have flown off the porch."

She worked in the White House for a previous administration and said, "if they want to find you, they can."

Krall said she was also told by other tribal leaders that they received calls that morning inviting them to the gathering, and that it was not included in Clinton's vacation schedule.

She said she suspects Clinton's meeting with Indian leaders Tuesday was prompted by comments Chino aired to the press Monday.

Clinton commented at the reception on the eve of Columbus Day, "We are all immigrants here, except for the Native Americans..." noted Chino.

"But those first Americans were noticeably absent from Mr. Clinton's staged event," Chino noted. No tribal leaders were included in the reception party for Clinton Sunday.

Kelly was invited, and state Congressman Bill Richardson was applauded for his work dealing with human injustices all over the world, Chino said in a press release.

"But why doesn't he come back to New Mexico to work on the undemocratic, illegal, unfair, discriminatory and unconstitutional treatment of the Mescalero Apache Tribe by the office of the U.S. Attorney," Chino asked.

Rally greets president
About 55 Casino Apache workers

and supporters rallied before President Clinton in Albuquerque Sunday.

"It was interesting, to say the least," said rally co-organizer Sandy Aschauer.

A day earlier, Oct. 12, a group of about 40 casino workers and supporters went to Alamogordo to protest the loss of their jobs to Gov. Gary Johnson, Cindy Parkinson said.

Johnson was in Alamogordo to celebrate the opening of a new supermarket by passing out hotdogs.

"The governor was very supportive of us, said he was behind us," Parkinson said. "He knows we're bummed out."

The governor spoke with the protesters for about a half hour, telling them the answer to the Indian gaming problem rests in voter changes to the state Legislative leadership, she said.

The Albuquerque protesters, who were mostly transported to the rally site by casino shuttles, were not allowed to carry in the anti-U.S. Attorney John Kelly placards they made.

So being resourceful, most of the protesters put the signs on their backs, Aschauer said.

"We were in the front line," she said. "He (Clinton) had to have been blind not to see our signs."

The signs said things like, "If you don't get rid of Kelly, we'll vote for Dole," "Kelly is General Custard reincarnated," and "500 years, you took our land and now you want our jobs."

Clinton took no questions during the rally, she said.

Aschauer, a former casino employee, said she found it important for the workers, tribal members and area residents to participate in rallies to get Casino Apache back open. The long-range effect of its closure will be even higher unemployment, she predicted.

The only good part, perhaps, is that people are becoming more politically aware of what is going on in the state, Aschauer said.

"We want everyone to know we're not something that's going to go away," she said.

Aschauer is particularly incensed by a U.S. District Court judge's comments earlier this summer. Judge Martha Vazquez said it would cause significant financial hardships to the pueblos if their casinos were closed, so she granted a request to keep them open while their case is being appealed.

But the same judge later told the Mescalero she had no authority to grant such a request from that tribe.

"So, we don't have financial losses? We're not a part of New Mexico?" Aschauer asked. "I don't understand the political double talk. We want straight answers."

Tribal judges say Mescalero were treated unfairly by being forced to close casino

A panel of judges from tribes around the United States concluded Sunday the shutdown of Casino Apache is unfair.

The four judges, representing tribes and pueblos in Arizona and New Mexico, were called together by Mescalero Judge Harrison Toclanny late last week. They met at Mescalero Apache Tribal Court for more than seven hours Sunday.

"The consensus of the other judges is that the Mescalero Apache Tribe is being singled out (by U.S. Attorney John Kelly), especially since the other (Indian) casinos are allowed to stay open," Toclanny said Monday.

Mescalero Apache Tribe President Wendell Chino was not invited to the closed, day-long session. Nor were tribal councilors, Toclanny said.

Tribal sovereignty is being disregarded and the Mescalero are being treated unfairly, the judges concluded in a press release issued after their meeting.

"We were just all here to discuss issues important to the tribe," Toclanny said Monday. "I felt like it was an important time to get these judges down here and get an unbiased opinion to determine if the tribe was being treated fairly like other gaming tribes."

Mescalero is the only tribe in New Mexico forced to close its casino, while 10 others are open.

The Mescalero tribe closed Casino Apache Sept. 24 after Kelly threatened to seize bank accounts and gambling machines. It then sought a stay against Kelly from the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals, but the same court denied its request at the same time it let the Jicarilla Apache Tribe keep its casino open. A U.S. District Court also allowed nine pueblos in New Mexico to keep their casinos open.

Three U.S. District Courts have all ruled that New Mexico's Indian

casinos are illegal. The pueblos' appeal is the first to be heard, on Nov. 20.

Since Casino Apache's shutdown, about 300 people have been laid off from their casino jobs, many of them Ruidoso residents.

Two petitions are circulating that demand action to let the casino reopen.

One of the petitions calls for the state Legislature to hold a special session to resolve the Indian gaming issue.

Another petition calls for a grand jury investigation of Kelly to determine if he's acted appropriately in his federal obligations.

The tribal judges who gathered in Mescalero Sunday are all members of the Region Eight Indian Court Association, which tries to meet quarterly to discuss issues affecting Indian nations.

Region Eight includes tribes in New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, and California, Toclanny said.

Those judges attending were: Alan Toledo, of the Taos Pueblo Court; Anthony F. Little, of the Acoma Pueblo; and Neil Flores, Sr., chief judge of the Colorado River reservation of Arizona, and Wilbert Naranjo, chief magistrate of the Fort Mojave Indian Tribe of Arizona.

Toclanny was also present, but mostly sat back as an observer as judges were briefed by tribal attorneys about the tribe's eight-year fight to legalize Indian gaming, he said.

"They (the judges) said they felt like we were being discriminated against," Toclanny said.

The judges also expressed concern about the state's apparent "disregard" of tribal sovereignty when dealing with Indian gaming, Toclanny said.

Because of the sovereignty brush-off, the "Indian tribes are not being given the benefit of getting tribal businesses going, especially where gaming is concerned," he said.

In comments he made after the meeting, Taos Pueblo Judge Toledo agreed with Toclanny's assessment of the sovereignty issue.

Under the federal Indian Gaming Act, tribal governments have the right to negotiate with the state government to allow gaming, Toledo explained.

State Attorney General Tom Udall authorized former Gov. Bruce King to sign gaming compacts, Toledo added Tuesday.

"So, for all intents and purposes, when the governor (Gary Johnson) signed the compact, the tribe had a legal compact with which to proceed. The Secretary of the Interior (Bruce Babbitt) also approved them," he said. "Kelly represents the U.S. government, and with the fact that Babbitt signed, I think Kelly should support the tribe."

Kelly misrepresented his intentions by comments he made earlier this year, both tribal judges commented.

Although a majority of their discussion centered on the gaming issue, the judges Sunday also talked about federal prosecution of crimes on Indian reservations, Toledo said.

"Sometimes the statute of limitations passes because the federal government is so slow to prosecute," he said, so the perpetrator is never punished.

In closing, the tribal judges spoke of ways to improve relations between federal and tribal governments, Toclanny said.

Some sections of federal law say tribal court remedies need to be exhausted before the state or federal courts are used, Toledo said. But like in the case of gaming, that hasn't been done.


"It seems like the tribal courts are treated like an orphan child," he said. "I feel like the tribe and the state should use the tribal courts more. After all, it's there, and it is the third branch of (government), the tribal judiciary."





Fort rescue plan draws variety of state officials to meeting

Buoyed by enthusiasm from state and federal officials at the first information meeting of the Fort Stanton Historic Foundation, Virginia Jones said Tuesday she's confident a better future lies ahead for the fort.

"Everyone said they could not be the solution, but might be able to contribute in-kind services and some money," said Jones, who heads Friends of Fort Stanton, the membership arm of the foundation.

The National Park Service and Bureau of Land Management were very interested, and their representatives pointed out different areas for grants. No one said, "We'll give you this amount of money," but all agreed that the fort should be served.

"Our next step is to keep channels of communication open now that we have started. We'll set another meeting while we work on a development draft and funding plan to present to the Lincoln County Commission."

Jones hopes to have the draft ready by December.

The strategy meeting Thursday was held to discuss methods of turning Fort Stanton into a living history museum.

"It was just a time to gather facts and introduce one agency to another, a get-acquainted situation," Jones said. "We showed Santa Fe we have a healthy interest in doing something to Fort Stanton, and that it would be a boost to tourism."

The fort, about 12 miles north-east of Ruidoso, already is on the National Registry of Historical Places, she said.

"We'd like it to have monument status," she said. "It also would make a wonderful national park. We need to start looking at the national level at least for a feasibility

The Friends group is looking for people with skills who want to get involved with the effort, she said.

The non-partisan, non-profit Fort Stanton Historic Foundation Inc. was formed by Michael and Barbara Bilbo, after the governor closed the fort as a state hospital in March 1995, citing high operating costs.

State officials have failed to find a new tenant and have threatened to board up many of the fort's 80 buildings to avoid paying half a million dollars a year in maintenance.

County commissioners are examining the possibility of taking over responsibility for the fort, with the state continuing some financial support.

The Bilbos began a letter writing campaign last year, contacting any group with an interest in history, Jones said.

The foundation is national in scope, she said. It's dedicated to establishing an appropriate use for

Fort Stanton as a state historical monument, a national historic site or a living history fort, administered by a yet-unnamed entity in partnership with the commission.

Incorporation papers for the foundation have been filled out and are being reviewed by an attorney, Jones said.

"We feel the sensible thing to do is to look for government support at all levels, but with the private sector involved," she said.

State Rep. Dub Williams (R-Glencoe) was at the Thursday meeting, along with officials from the state Department of Tourism, Highway and Transportation Department, State Engineer's Office, the Office of Cultural Affairs, historic preservation division, State Land Commissioner's Office, State Monuments Division, the South-eastern Economic Development Association in Roswell, the federal Bureau of Land Management, the U.S. Forest Service and John Bloom, past member of the board of directors of the Council on America's Military Past.

U.S. representatives Joe Skeen (R-NM) and Bill Richardson (D-NM), as well as U.S. Sen. Jeff Bingaman (D-NM) sent representatives to the meeting.

The foundation will convene a series of workshops to include citizens and professionals in drafting the management and funding plan, Jones said.

To help pay for the foundation's expenses, T-shirts are available showing a column of 19th century soldiers. Contact Jones at 354-2516 for more information.

The next meeting of Operation Fort Stanton, another group under the leadership of Sally Burkhalter and working toward a similar goal for the fort, is set for 7 p.m. Thursday in the Texas-New Mexico Power Company meeting room on Medchem Drive.

Ruidoso teachers pose questions to candidates for state representative job

Candidates for state representative jobs asked their philosophies, backgrounds and political promises last week to members of the Ruidoso Education Association.

Incumbent Dub Williams, a Republican from Glencoe and retired teacher, is trying for a second two-year term in District 56 that includes all of Lincoln County and portions of Chaves and Otero counties.

Ray Nunley, a Democrat from Ruidoso, pharmacist for Wal-Mart and a Lincoln County Commissioner, opposes Williams in the Nov. 5 general election.

"Dub and I are friends, we just have a different idea about how government works," Nunley said. Although Williams is a former teacher, the National Education Association chapter in Albuquerque endorsed Nunley's candidacy, the Democrat told the 25 teachers at the meeting.

ability to have collective bargaining. His decision will be based on how the bargaining is conducted and whether it deteriorates into a battle over money, he said.

The law allowing collective bargaining has a sunset clause, meaning it will automatically expire unless the Legislature renews it.

— supports slot machines at racetracks and for charities and fraternal groups;

— and disagrees with a state preference that school districts be bonded to maximum before the Legislature will give out critical capital outlay money.

"That's encouraging a district not to be frugal, and penalizes you for doing a good job," Williams said. Bonding in Corona would generate very little money, but would bring big bucks in Albuquerque, because of the different in the property tax base, he said.

Although the portion of state revenue dedicated to education has gone down over the past few years, it has been shifted to human services, which deals with trouble children, Williams said.

"Most teachers I ask tell me they would rather have discipline in the classroom than a raise, and that isn't possible with disruptive students, he said.

Williams said he wouldn't want to depend on lottery money for state government general operations funding.

The state average teacher's salary this year is \$30,017. That's \$4,000-\$10,000 behind salaries in some Texas districts, teachers said.

When Williams finished his remarks, he left before Nunley began speaking.

One teacher told Nunley she was bothered by Williams' answer that he would support collective bargaining if the process goes smoothly.

"If something is worth fighting for, it may not be a nice process," she said.

Another said she fears retaliation against those teachers who have been active in collective bargaining if that law is allowed to expire.

Nunley's stance

During his four years as a commissioner, Nunley said he has concentrated on people projects such as the Zia Senior Citizens Center. This year that program tapped state resources and required no county support, he added.

Nunley said he is choosing to leave his part-time job as county commissioner paying \$10,800 a year to take a job requiring triple the time and paying barely enough to cover the rent while in Santa Fe.

"I'll not tell you I know everything, but I will listen to you and I will vote for you," Nunley said.

And he will vote for economic development in the community, something that brings in more money for everyone, he said.

He read an excerpt from a speech by Republican Gov. Gary Johnson in 1994 saying the state should empower teachers to set their own priorities for education by giving them the means to

manage finances within their own communities, the ability to innovate and the flexibility to make improvements from the bottom up.

Nunley asked teachers if any of them had seen happen what Johnson advocated. They responded with loud "No's."

Nunley said he supports the expansion of fine arts in school, such as band and choir.

More respect is needed for teaching as a profession, one woman said.

"Children want to be doctors, lawyers or drug dealers, because that's where they can make big money," she said. "Kids don't want to be teachers and have to work second jobs. Teachers shouldn't have to beg for 1% to 2% raises each year."

"We want you to be pushy for kids and to call us when you want to find what's important to us," she told Nunley.

Teacher Gerald Ames complained that when more money is allocated to education, too much goes to administration instead of programs and classrooms.

"If I'm not willing to sit up there and fight on your behalf, you can get rid of me and get somebody else," Nunley said.

Pointing to his opponent's voting record, Nunley said Williams:

— voted against a bill allowing school districts to contribute up to 100% of insurance premiums;

— voted against amending teacher certification requirements;

— voted against the School Campaign Reporting Act;

— voted against a bill assuring federal education employees eligibility for unemployment insurance;

— voted against tutor assistance;

— voted against a family development program that promotes the involvement of low income parents in children's education;

— and voted against the state Department of Education establishing safety standards for playground equipment.

"I think how some of this happens, is that the leaders of both parties send down directives on how to vote," Nunley said. "Party politics is killing this nation."

Nunley is the only Lincoln County Democrat elected to public office in a non-partisan election. This county is heavily Republican in voter registration.

Ruidoso gets more time to protest Apache annexation

Village officials wanted more time to file a legal argument against a Ruidoso annexation by the Mescalero Apache Tribe, and they got it.

Wednesday, Oct. 23 is the new due date for a legal brief against the tribe's annexation of land and buildings on Carrizo Canyon Road, said Assistant Village Attorney Chay Rennieck.

The historic lodge at the site was renamed Mescalero Inn by the tribe in November 1995, and contains a restaurant and sports bar. Also along Carrizo Canyon Road on the property are a nightclub, meeting rooms and 12 tribal owned condominiums.

The Bureau of Indian Affairs will have 30 days thereafter to file its legal brief supporting the tribe's request to add the 7.5 acres of land to its reservation trust.

After the BIA files its brief, the village will have a 15-day response period. A decision on the annexation by the Indian Board of Appeals will follow, Rennieck said.

The Indian Board of Appeals, a branch of the U.S. Department of the Interior, granted the 30-day deadline extension to the village late last month.

It was based on the BIA Albuquerque office's failure to supply the village with 18 of the tribe's 40 annexation documents. All the documents were considered by the BIA when it made the decision in July to support the annexation, Rennieck explained.

In the village's first brief against annexation, officials argued the loss of the land will negatively impact tax revenues. Uncertainty about village water and sewer service to the property, as well as police and fire protection, also filled the brief.

Mescalero BIA superintendent Paul Brill filed an argument stating the tribe is a good custodian of land and business. He also said the tribe's Inn of

the Mountain Gods and other tribal economic ventures help support the village.

Brill also stated that businesses at the former Carrizo Lodge barely scraped by and eventually closed, the village's loss of tax income would be negligible, and the village is reacting to the land annexation like it is "property located in downtown Dallas."

Since the BIA approved the annexation in July, the tribe has connected the site with a water line to the Inn of the Mountain Gods, which is about 1.5 miles south, but the only thing disconnecting village water service is a valve, village officials complained.

"The valve on the city line could be opened at any time," Village Manager Gary Jackson said.

Inn of the Mountain Gods manager John McCullough said the tribe will also run a line from the Mescalero Inn to the tribe lagoons, but would prefer to pay the going rate for Ruidoso to treat the waste.

While filing the appeal this summer, village and tribal officials entered negotiations about the outstanding land concerns, and village officials said they would drop the legal appeal if a settlement could be reached.

But negotiations broke off in August after tribal president Wendell Chino complained about the involvement of attorneys and said the village was trying to tie the sale of water rights into the talks.

He said he'd be glad to continue negotiations with Mayor Jerry Shaw and one or two other non-attorneys, but no meetings have followed, Jackson said.

After finally receiving all the requested BIA letters and Mescalero memos, Rennieck described the information as "procedural," and said, "there was nothing especially out of the ordinary."

But, officials wanted all the materials they had a right to see, he added.

Clinton's actions don't bode well with locals

Thanks to the resourcefulness of Casino Apache workers and supporters, as well as Mescalero Apache President Wendell Chino, the word got out to President Bill Clinton this week: U.S. Attorney John Kelly has an image problem, and so do some federal judges.

Casino Apache has been singled out as the only Indian casino Kelly and a judge forced to close in New Mexico while tribes await rulings on their appeals. Clinton had a golden opportunity to address this injustice; instead, he turned his back on it.

Chino was the only New Mexico tribal leader not invited to a meeting with Clinton Tuesday. This was not a coincidence; Clinton was undoubtedly made aware of a letter Chino sent to him that demands Kelly's removal from office. And Chino made a public announcement attacking Clinton's Sunday reception, after Clinton talked about Native Americans on the eve of Columbus Day but didn't invite them to the reception, when New Mexico has one of the highest Indian populations in the country.

And as a reporter commented to Clinton, Chino is the "dean of tribal leaders." He was first elected to office before many other tribal leaders graduated from high school.


Ironically, the Indians' meeting with Clinton was likely prompted by Chino's criticism of the Sunday reception.

The Indian leaders at Tuesday's meeting endorsed Clinton. A day earlier, Chino questioned whether Clinton should be supported.

It's too bad Clinton didn't face the problem and seek to talk to Chino, instead of choosing to avoid him. For those of us in this region who have no personal contact with the president (i.e., just about all of us), his snubbing will stick in our minds for many years to come.

Perhaps it is time Indian tribes and leaders re-think their association and alliance to put their resources and support in the Dole-Kemp and Domenici camp. Mr. Dole is also coming to our state and he just might want to take a realistic look and approach to the late Richard Nixon did when he was president. No president since then has equaled and handled Indian issues and needs like he did. We must support our friends, not our enemies.

Hubbard, himself a partner on a 50,000-acre ranch at nearby Capitan, took the opportunity to pay tribute to all those who attended and competed.

"The way you all turn out for this event every year is just tremendous. You're helping preserve a way of life that's all American, and we're proud to be involved," Hubbard said.

Once again, the living legends of western swing music kept the crowds entertained with classic renditions and high-energy jam sessions. Outside the concert hall, Craig Cameron, the gentle horse trainer, amazed onlookers with his

talents for breaking wild horses. Mike Rayer and her paint mule Stormy, who came all the way from Egan, Mont., delighted fans with their bridle-less exhibitions of skill. Wes and Cindy Smith put on a display of cutting horse skill, and professional horseshoers demonstrated everything from forging shoes by fire to tacking on performance plates.

"There was certainly something for everyone," commented recently-appointed Museum of the Horse Director Bruce Eldredge, who joined the museum organization the hectic week before the event. 

Sophomore Corey Saenz took a pitch from Pascal Enjady and found a wide-open Ricky Pacini down the sidelines for a 67-yard pass play to the Santa Teresa 6-yard-line. Senior running back Arthur Rojas ran it in for Ruidoso's first touchdown. Rojas would go on to score three more TDs for the Warriors.

The Ruidoso defense then did its part. After yielding one first down to Santa Teresa on its first possession, the Warriors forced a punt. Saenz fielded the punt and dashed his way to the Santa Teresa 27-yard line, where the Warriors set up their offense again. Three running plays later, Rojas scored his second TD of the night and the rout was on.

"We felt like if we could get out on them early, then it would definitely be our plus," Carter said. "We contained their running back pretty well, so they were put in a situation where they had to pass the ball."

The Ruidoso defense took advantage of Santa Teresa's position and pressured Desert Warrior quarterback Raul Luevano with a strong rushing attack and blitzes.

Meanwhile, the Santa Teresa had little success stopping the Warrior offense.

"They had really worked hard to stop us outside and didn't really adjust to us when we were doing inside," Carter said.

What the Warriors were doing inside was running at will, thanks to their offensive line which tore open huge holes for fullback Brett Meyer.

Meyer had his best varsity effort on the ground, gaining 10 yards a carry, or so it seemed. Guards Chris Jones and Seth Bassett, tackles Brad Beavers and Matt Wharton and center Caleb Hull, cleared the way for the Warriors to gain a vast majority of their offense on the ground.

The Desert Warriors got on the board late in the first half, but senior Jimmy Stover kicked away any Santa Teresa momentum in the waning moments of the second quarter. He booted school-record 47-yard field goal for the Warriors, to give the home team a 37-6 halftime lead.

"Everybody did what we asked them to

do. That's a sign that we're getting better all the time. We were real pleased with that," Carter said of his offensive and defensive units.

Saenz, in his first varsity start at quarterback, was a magician with the pigskin. Saenz's slight of hand deceived the Desert Warrior defense. It was hard to tell just which Ruidoso runner had the ball. Meyer? Rojas? Saenz himself?

With the Ruidoso offense and defense clicking on all cylinders, Carter had the luxury of substituting freely, saving his starters for Friday's showdown with district heavyweight Silver.

For most of the second half, the Warriors' second defensive unit played. On offense, Carter put in as many subs as he could.

"It was a big win for us and gives us an up for Silver," Carter said. "Our young men know Silver is the power of the district, and we've got to play as well as we've played all year."

Tiger defense mauls Hatch for homecoming win

For three and a half quarters, the Tiger football team teased and flirted with its homecoming crowd, much the same way movie star Marilyn Monroe played to the camera.

Capitan then left no doubt who was the star in the final frames of the game, scoring two touchdowns in the last five minutes for a 20-6 win over Hatch Friday.

The victory improved the Tigers to 2-4 overall. Capitan opens district play at 2 p.m. Saturday in the far reaches of Reserve.

For head coach Ed Davis, the Tigers' performance was typical of a solid Capitan defense coupled with an offense that is still having trouble pinching it in the endzone.

"We've been playing good defense all season. We just haven't been able to put things together offensively consistently," Davis said.

The Tigers had three touchdowns called back because of penalties. In all, Capitan was flagged for 110 yards of infractions.

Twice in the second half, the Tiger offense had first and goal and failed to score. That left it

up to the Capitan defense, which responded.

Tiger Jeremy Hoover, who already had one fumble recovery to his credit, intercepted a Hatch pass and ran it back 20 yards for a touchdown with 4:28 left in the game for a 14-6 Capitan lead.

Hatch took the ensuing kickoff and failed to move the ball again. Hoover then set up the

Tigers' final score, a 15-yard TD run by James Robinson, with a long punt return to the Hatch 17-yard line. Two plays later Robinson scored, sealing the win much to the delight of the homecoming crowd.

The only offense Hatch could generate came in the first quarter. That's when running back Jeremiah Terrazas took advantage of a Tiger defense mis-

cue for a 64-yard touchdown scamper. After that, however, the Tiger defense put the clamps on the talented Bear running back. Terrazas, who came in averaging nearly 100 yards a game, was limited to 48 yards on the ground.

Capitan came back in the second quarter when Hoover scored from 12 yards out. Quarterback

Steve Wilson ran in the extra points for an 8-6 Capitan halftime lead.

Despite the narrow advantage, Davis said he was comfortable with the two-point lead. "I did feel confident because of the job our defense was doing. We were in control, if we didn't make any more mental breakdowns," Davis said.

While the Capitan defense held Hatch to 64 yards of total offense — the Bears didn't complete a pass against the Tigers — the CHS offense gained 255 yards of its own.

Senior Jonathon McCarty led a balanced Tiger offensive attack. He had 65 yards on the ground.

"Jonathon had a real good game on both sides of the ball," Davis added.

Red ribbons are more than fashion statement

Next week schoolchildren across the nation will don red ribbons, not as a fashion statement, but as a statement against drug abuse. New Mexico Red Ribbon Week is Oct. 23-31, part of a national awareness campaign that started in 1985 when a federal drug agent was tortured and murdered in Tijuana, Mexico.

The last drug-use survey in Lincoln County was done in 1993. Randomly questioning more than 25% of students at various grade levels, the survey inquired about student use of cigarettes, chewing tobacco, beer and wine, liquor, marijuana, cocaine/crack, inhalants, uppers, downers, hallucinogens, heroin, steroids, and other drugs.

At that time, a quarter of Ruidoso seniors reported that 86.6% of them used beer and wine regularly, and 90.5% experimented with beer and wine. Regular use of stronger drugs was dramatically lower.

Students were randomly surveyed at fourth, seventh, ninth, and 12th grade levels. In 1993, 28.6% of RHS seniors surveyed reported regular use of marijuana, and 31.8% reported experimenting with marijuana.

Slightly more RHS freshmen were smoking marijuana in 1993, but they were drinking less than the seniors. Of the freshmen surveyed (a quarter of the class), 75.8% reported regular use of beer and wine, and 36.4% reported regular use of marijuana.

At the lower grade levels in Ruidoso, alcohol was still the preferred drug, with 39.5% of seventh-graders and 26.8% of fourth-graders reporting regular usage.

Cocaine use registered a small percentage in the upper grades, with 1.6% of ninth-graders and

1.6% of 12th-graders reporting regular use.

Inhalants were slightly more popular than cocaine, especially with freshmen and young students. While seniors showed a 3.2% inhalant usage, ninth-graders came in at 12.1% and fourth-graders registered at 14.6%.

A follow-up survey to measure the results of drug awareness campaigns like Red Ribbon Week is unlikely, said Kathy Garrett of Region IX. According to a new law, state funds can no longer be used for surveys that ask about personal drug use, she said.

"They may connect with other agencies to do a household survey," she said.

However, Ruidoso High School has taken new action against drug use by starting mandatory drug testing of all student athletes this year. The first test took place before the sports season began in August. Out of 147 students tested, two tested positive for marijuana and one for cocaine.

These students were given a second test which came back clean for all three. The students had to meet with their parents, athletic director and school counselor.


Since drug testing at Ruidoso High School is meant to deter drug use rather than catch and punish drug users, a follow-up test is given as soon as possible after a positive result. A negative second test indicates that either the student stopped using drugs or the first test was inaccurate.

The next drug testing will occur sometime during the fall sports season, when 15% of the athletes will be randomly selected.

All athletes will be tested at the beginning of the winter and spring sports seasons, too. Then 15% will again be tested during those seasons.







Ruidoso Downs tries second time for help with sewer line work

The village of Ruidoso Downs is preparing to re-apply for a \$400,000 Community Development Block Grant for installation of sewer lines in the Las Lunas Subdivision.

The Downs applied for a CDBG last year, but the proposal was rejected.

At the regular council meeting Monday, trustees voted to put on 10% of the project cost, setting aside \$40,000 in matching funds.

Block grant proposals are scored by a committee called the Community Development Bureau Staff, and proposals can score a maximum of 75 points to qualify for a block grant.

"We rated low last year, which means we didn't make enough points to be considered," said Village Clerk Leann Weidrecht.

This year, the council is taking steps to increase the proposal's score. They committed other funds to specific uses to show block grant decision-makers that the Downs really does need the money. These commitments are:

- \$156,000 in general fund set aside for balloon payment on a street paving revenue bond;
- \$180,000 of a water certificate of deposit reserved for water system cooperative and General Electric Capital Corporation loans;
- \$25,000 from an infrastructure fund saved as an extra match for the 1995 block grant;
- and \$200,000 from the utility fund reserved for WSC and GECC loans.

In other action taken Monday, the Downs council voted to approve changes to the Village Personnel Manual, passing an ordinance that clarifies grievance procedures. For several years now, state and federal laws have entitled public employees to due process in matters of discipline and termination.

The Downs personnel policy was vague about how employees could protect their rights when a supervisor took disciplinary action such as demotion or suspension, village

attorney Bob Beauvais said. This lack of a clear written policy was not a problem until the village received a "furry of grievances," Beauvais said.

Three employees of the Downs Police Department, a dispatcher and two officers, were recently entitled to due process in order to handle employment issues. The first case was a sexual harassment complaint, the second was a challenge against demotion, and the third was a pre-termination hearing.

"We were negotiating grievances case by case," Beauvais said.

With an outdated personnel policy, these employees could bypass their supervisors and take complaints directly to the mayor. The new grievance policy strongly encourages employees to work on conflicts with their own supervisors first, then take the problem to a grievance board, Beauvais said.

The grievance board operates as a quasi-judicial proceeding, with each side allowed to call witnesses and have legal representation.

Other personnel action taken by the village council Monday was the official hiring of Robert Olshaskie Jr. to fill the job of patrol officer left open by the firing of Ray Montes. Olshaskie is a retired 20-year veteran of the Arizona Department of Public Safety.

When asked by Trustee Ray Hayhurst why he would return to police work, Olshaskie replied, "I found out it was in my blood."

and Hernandez brother Jim Hernandez stopped the fight. Coleman testified. But moments later, Steve Hernandez grabbed the mallethammer and advanced toward Hatz. Coleman said Coleman and two other witnesses testified that Hatz tried to step away from the dispute after the first battle.

It's the court's opinion that if it had been up to Hatz, the fight would have been over. Butts said in deciding to send the case as an open murder charge to the 12th Judicial District Court.

Tami Hatz said she was satisfied with the state's handling of the case involving her husband's death.

and that seconds after striking the fatal blows, as he watched Montes try to stem the flow of blood from Hatz's mouth and nose, Hernandez said, "What have I done?"

Jim Hernandez testified that Montes turned off the lights before the second fight occurred, because Montes wanted the men to leave and intended to head back to his home.

He also testified that as he

searched for his hat that was knocked off while he separated the two men moments earlier, he saw Hatz with the board. But he said he didn't see his brother with the mallethammer until Steve Hernandez handed him the hammer after Hatz was hit.

Montes said Hatz was mumbling as the arena owner tried to prevent the injured man from choking on his own blood. By the time emergency medical technicians loaded him into an ambulance, Hatz seemed to think he wasn't badly hurt, Montes said.

"He thought he was going to the hospital and they'd put a bandage on it," Montes said.

Hours later, Montes received a call from the hospital that Hatz's condition had worsened. He was transported to an Albuquerque hospital, where he died of a severe cerebral hematoma (blood clot).

Hernandez is being held in county jail in Carrizozo without bond.

The Grantee will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. White Mountain Search & Rescue volunteers hit the trail for training work

Volunteers hit the trail for a planned three-hour training hike on a recent weekend.

They started at Lower Eagle Creek and continued up the steep ridges to Monjeau Peak lookout in the Lincoln National Forest.

Seven hours later, they returned to camp. Their day off from work was used up marking hazards, landmarks and becoming familiar with the territory around Monjeau.

They were tired and hungry, but they weren't griping.

Training is necessary when you're part of a search and rescue team and this group is White Mountain Search and Rescue's finest.

They came in all sizes, shapes, ages and backgrounds — real estate agents, a carpet installer, a retired soft drink executive, a mountain biker. Many are from Texas or other states and volunteer whenever they're in town.

Staying at a mock base camp was Holly Johnson, who broke her back years ago and opts for the less physical aspect of the volunteer work.

Speedy response is an important ingredient to a successful rescue, she said. The ability to mobilize local volunteers and mesh them successfully with volunteers from other organizations, as well as law enforcement officials, was tested Oct. 6 when White Mountain participated in the search for a flash flood drowning victim near Capitan.

When the full crew is available, the goal is to set up a minimal base camp in five minutes and have all radios up and running in another five, she said.

"The 'hasty' teams have to be out as fast as possible," Johnson said. "We want them off on the trail with gear and radios. Then as soon as the main radio is up, we do a welfare check with each team."

Members are supposed to keep their backpacks ready to go at all times with trail mix, water, flashlight, waterproof matches, small first aid kit, an extra pair of socks, a blister preventive and treatment, a knife, snake bite kit, a whistle, rain poncho and aluminum safety blanket.

This was the second day of training for several of the members, who

spent Saturday learning CPR (cardio-pulmonary resuscitation). Included in that training was Dani Johnson, 13, daughter of Holly and Ivan Johnson. The enthusiastic teen hopes to become a member of White Mountain as soon as she reaches her 18th birthday.

A week earlier, 11 members of the 30-person group trained to become section chiefs, backup to a rescue operation's field coordinator. Six weeks ago, some took helicopter training. Others specialize in locating downed airplanes.

"We saw a few things that needed to be done here," Johnson said about the training of the White Mountain volunteers and mapping of trails. "The hike was planned to mark hazards and landmarks and for members to familiarize themselves with the trail. They may be out there at night, and there are places with sudden drop-offs and loose rock."

Within the next few months, maps will be prepared with hazard and landmark details added for each section of the forest, she said.

Most of the base camp equipment is packed in two emergency vehicles and a box trailer, which is owned by the volunteer group and also serves as headquarters during winter rescues.

Mountain climbing gear, a generator, tents, tables and chairs and

other special items also are in the trailer, including BART, the group's acronym for Big Awkward Round Thing: a wheel that attaches to a rescue stretcher basket used to bring the injured out of rough terrain or haul bodies.

Although teams trade off with BART on the way out of a wilderness site, it's difficult to manage at times and one of the roughest physical aspects of the job, Johnson said.

One of the toughest emotional aspects is dealing with missions that end with bodies instead of live people.

"This group is mostly new people and after two rescues (one in the Three Rivers section of the Lincoln National Forest and the other in Las Cruces) where the people were dead, it started to get to some of them," Johnson said.

The state rescue organization provides local counseling for individuals who are having trouble adjusting, she said.

All rescues must be initiated by the state police. Field coordinators can be picked from the local pool or brought in from anywhere in the state.

The coordinators and other volunteers serve 24-hour shifts and then are relieved to ensure thinking is unclouded by fatigue.

"Not any one person supervises more than seven people," Johnson said. Responsibility is broken up into teams under the direction of section chiefs, she said.


Usually separate section chiefs handle planning (who and what is needed for the rescue), operations (how the rescue will proceed) and logistics (warehouse and supplies) in the field. Another is responsible for finance and administration back in Santa Fe, Johnson said.

Local restaurants often help out with meals. McDonalds and Pizza Hut supplied volunteers with breakfast and lunch on the Capitan drowning search mission.

White Mountain needs financial support from the community and more volunteers, Johnson said. The Lincoln County Commission has cut its funding over the last three years, urging the group to seek contributions from community groups, businesses and individuals.

White Mountain is the only local search and rescue group. Members' knowledge of the territory gives them an edge when searching.

Volunteers are the group's lifeblood, Johnson said. The organization can't survive without people willing to crawl out of bed on a chilly night and head out into the wilderness in search of some lost hiker or hunter.



Hordes of little goblins and Mighty Morphin Power Rangers roaming the streets on Halloween might not scare you, but pets often find these strange sights a frightening experience, national humane society officials say.

"Keep your pets safely inside," advised Martha Armstrong, vice president of companion animals for the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS). "Dogs and cats are creatures of habit and are liable to become frightened or agitated by the unaccustomed sights and sounds of trick-or-treaters."

"And avoid the temptation to dress up your dog and send him trick-or-treating with the kids."

Instead, Armstrong suggests secluding your pets in a quiet room away from the Halloween activities. This will ensure your pets won't panic and escape when bell-ringing, trick-or-treaters arrive, nor will they become threatened or aggressive at the sight of costumed little people.

Halloween poses some other real dangers for pets, Armstrong said.

During the celebrations and sometimes for days before and after, pets often are the victims of pranksters' cruel tricks or worse.

Not quite so sinister, but dangerous nonetheless, is candy,

especially chocolate, which can be harmful, even fatal to some pets. Secure all candy safely away from pets.

Restrict your pets' access to jack o'lanterns and candles.

Decorations with live flames are obvious hazards, but cats also can get tangled in streamers. And dogs, who have a proclivity to chew just about anything, can become ill from eating holiday decorations.

Finally, some humane organization fear that certain pets, in particular black cats, are at risk of becoming unwilling participants in the darker side of Halloween activities.

Many shelters elect to halt adoptions of these animals until after the holiday.

Unfortunately, many incidents of satanic-type ceremonies involving animal torture and death have been reported over the years in the counties of Otero and Lincoln, putting pets at special risk.

Owners of all pets, but especially black cats, should keep a close eye on their pets around Halloween.

And be sure to save your cans, foil or other scrap aluminum for the Lincoln County Humane Society. They can be dropped at the shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road or left at the county recycling center in Ruidoso Downs in the shelter's name.

How Good Is Vision Screening?

Vision screening is a quick way to spot individuals with obvious problems and signal a need for additional examination and care. It's a low cost way for the motor-vehicle department to identify would be drivers who should not be allowed behind the wheel without glasses. Screening helps schools identify some children who won't be able to read the blackboard, and community screening is often invaluable in spotting amblyopia in young children.

But screening is not complete eye care. It cannot examine the total health of the eye to identify vision abnormalities. It takes a complete optometric examination to check eye coordination, side vision, tracking and other visual skills. Eye charts may help the school find those who are nearsighted, but not how nearsighted. And farsightedness and astigmatism are not checked at all.

Some screenings for senior citizens do check for glaucoma, but may overlook any other eye disease present.




