State asks court for Vega retrial date

Although Attorney General Tom Udall hasn't decided whether to retry Lincoln County Deputy Angelo Vega on intimidation and extortion charges, a court date in April has been set aside for the trial.

Prosecutors requested one week starting April 14, in the 12th Judicial Circuit in Carrizozo.

A jury failed to reach a unanimous verdict in the case last July.

"We are preserving all of our options by filing for a court date," Kay Roybal, spokesman for Udall, said Tuesday. "It takes a long time to get a court date."

She had no idea when a final decision may be reached.

Vega was accused of trying to coerce two women into becoming drug informants when he was a criminal investigator for the sheriff's office. He has returned to the sheriff's office, but has been assigned different duties.

Ghosts of history haunt historic Mescalero Inn

Buildings on the National Register of Historic Places naturally have a lot of history. At the Mescalero Inn, some of that history apparently wants to be alive.

For years employees have reported a long list of strange occurrences, especially after closing time: footsteps when no one is there, table settings (even with glasses filled with water) appearing on tables, bottle corks bouncing around, the volume on TVs going up and down, lights going on and off (especially in the women's bathroom), windows opening, and computerized food orders showing up in the kitchen when not placed into the computer (which employees thought to be impossible).

The events are commonly blamed on a ghost they call "The Colonel," referring to Colonel George Purington, who was the

first to gain title to the property in 1879. He was commander of nearby Fort Stanton.


Purington died in 1896, just one year after retiring from the Army. He never developed the property, which now lies on the Mescalero Apache Reservation next to Ruidoso.

"Whatever dreams he held were never realized," the late Herb Seckler wrote in a short history of the Mescalero Inn.

If one believes in ghosts, perhaps Purington has refused to leave his dream of a beautiful home on Carrizo Creek.

Only a handful of employees claim to have seen his ghost at the Mescalero Inn. Oftentimes it's the people who don't want to see it who do; conversely, those who call to him get no results.

His appearance left an indelible mark on those who were "graced" with it.

"People that have seen him quit," said waitress Valerie Safian, who said she tried to summon the spirit this Halloween week. He didn't appear, but the lights went

Prison chief wants fort for women inmates

The state Department of Corrections has officially requested use of Fort Stanton, after examining it earlier this month as one of two possible sites for a temporary women's prison.

In an attempt to ease prison overcrowding, David Harris, interim cabinet secretary for the department, wants to move 80-100 minimum security inmates to the historic fort 12 miles northeast of Ruidoso. He sent a letter to the state General Services Department (GSD) last week asking for authorization.

Carolyn Jackson, spokesman for the GSD, said Tuesday that Cabinet Secretary Steve Beffort favors the move, but no final decision had been made on the proposal.

Most of the women inmates currently are at Camp Sierra Blanca, a former men's minimum security prison about one mile from the fort. They must vacate the camp in December to make way for a juvenile offender environmental work camp operated by the state Department of Children, Youth and Families.

Officials from corrections and GSD have not yet set a date to work out details of the proposed fort arrangement and guidelines for the fort's use, Jackson said.

Michael Toms, corrections spokesman, said Harris envisions using the fort for 18 months to two years. As soon as a new prison in Santa Fe is completed, projected for 1998, the inmates will be transferred there, he said.

Some Lincoln County Commissioners say state officials have left them out of the loop on this discussion. And the leader of a citizens' group trying to convert the fort into a living museum is worried the prison use will cut off access to the fort and slow efforts toward that conversion (please see related story).

But the warden who would be supervising the women inmates says they will clean up, maintain and repair parts of the fort, which has sat empty for more than a year. The historic site will be better off when they leave than it was when they arrived, if the plan is approved, said Warden Sandra McFadin.

County not ignored

State officials contend they haven't ignored Lincoln County in their considerations of other uses for Fort Stanton, which was closed by Gov. Gary Johnson as a state hospital in March 1995.

Lou Higgins in the property control division of the GSD contacted County Manager Frank Potter Oct. 17, when corrections first indicated an interest in housing women prisoners at the fort, Jackson said.

Corrections officials then toured the fort and Higgins contacted the county again Oct. 22 after learning a letter of request was being sent to the GSD from Harris, she said.

"Our primary duty is to find space for state agencies, if it is

Local groups feel left out

If state officials would discuss with Lincoln County Commissioners some of their proposals for Fort Stanton before moving ahead on plans, they might find the board supports their efforts, says Commissioner Wilton Howell.

Finding out about plans after-the-fact is irritating and frustrating, he said Monday.

Howell said the news media was the first to tell him about the Department of Corrections' written request to use the fort.

"Why not call the commissioners or the state representative to alert them?" Howell said.

Commissioners thought negotiations were still in progress to transfer the state-owned fort to the county, he said. Commissioner L. Ray Nunley, who is running for state representative, agreed.

"The last I heard, the state was working on a memorandum of understanding with the county on direction from the governor," Nunley said. "But I'm not surprised (with the change), and I'll keep pressing forward to make (the fort) something economically beneficial."

"This is a heck of a way to break off negotiations," Howell added.

Sally Burkstaller, president of Operation Fort Stanton, said her group had hoped to have part of the fort operating as a historic interpretation center and elderhostel within one year.

"This is a setback," she said. "My concern is what type of access we will have to the fort if it is a prison. We were at the point to get into a study phase to determine the cost of repairs and concessions, and that means we would need people at the site."

"It also worries me that once the corrections department gets its foot in the door...."

Burkstaller said she's an idealist and believes in working within the system to get things done.

"But I'm very disappointed," she said. "We were told one thing and now it seems to me, that could be wrong. None of us were aware discussions between the county and the state hadn't been fruitful. We were charging ahead and all of the hours we devote to this are volunteer."

"We've been made to feel like unless you live in Bernalillo, the rest of the state doesn't exist."

Several times before, the state has dropped plans for the fort due to local opposition. This summer, the state Forestry Division considered putting a forestry work camp for male prisoners at the fort, but backed off after a public hearing.

"I'm looking forward to a public hearing on this," Howell said. "I've always been told by corrections people, they don't go where they're not wanted."

Legislators urged to solve gambling issues quickly

A member of the Mescalero Apache Tribe urged state legislators Friday to find a quick solution to the Indian gambling situation that forced the closing of Casino Apache last month.

Donalynn Torres told members of the Legislative Committee on Indian Affairs and the Commission on Indian Affairs that a petition drive is underway to show the support within the tribe and surrounding communities for resolving the issue and reopening the casino.

"I plead with you today to use your influence as commissioners to get the Legislature to have a session to resolve it," Torres told the two groups that were meeting at the Mescalero Inn on the border of the reservation with Ruidoso. "This is costing the state a lot of unemployment money with 500 (employees) laid off."

"The tribe has lost a lot of money from the first day of the closing. The casino brings tourism to the area. We have felt it (the closing), and Ruidoso has felt it."

Although the legislators promised nothing, State Rep. James Roger Madalena (D-Bernalillo), committee chairman, told Torres the meeting between commissioners and legislators was the place to come to talk about problems.

"Everyone is losing money, but only time will solve this," he said.

The casino, about two miles outside of Ruidoso on the neighboring Mescalero Apache Reservation, was forced to close Sept. 24 while New Mexico tribes wait for court rulings on the legality of their casinos.

In another matter, Capt. Alfred La Paz of the Bureau of Indian Affairs

law enforcement department in Mescalero, asked about the possibility of the tribe issuing its own driver's licenses.

When a tribal member is cited for driving while intoxicated (DWI), the state Public Safety Division asks that their licenses be sent with the citation to Santa Fe, he said.

He has been approached by the tribal court to see if all of the documents can be kept on the reservation, La Paz said.

Pam Ray, attorney for the legislative committee, said there is no legal requirement saying the state is the only entity in the state that can issue driver's licenses.

"I think the tribe could issue its own, just as one state can recognize the licenses of another," Ray said. "It could be that one was issued jointly, so that either entity could revoke it. We could look at a cooperative agreement so the tribe could do its own revocations in tribal court."

But for now, the documents should continue to go to the state, if the officer was enforcing state law at the time. If it was tribal law, the case could go to tribal court, Ray said. That also would save the officers driving time, because they wouldn't have to go to court in Alamogordo.

If tribal members were issued separate licenses by the state and by the tribe, and they lost their license on the reservation, they still could drive on the roads outside the reservations with their state license, said Torres, who is an advocate for defendants in Mescalero Tribal Court. Many other tribes have that arrangement, she said.

LaPaz told members he has no

jurisdictional problems with other law enforcement agencies, even though a major federal highway runs through the reservation and it borders the village of Ruidoso.

But federal budget cutbacks have hurt his department, La Paz said.

"I have vehicles that are way over (recommended) mileage, but I'm working with (BIA Supt. Paul Brill) and he's helping me a lot trying to get newer equipment."

"We're hurting for staff, because the population and housing is increasing," La Paz said. "I have just six officers to run a 24-hour shift."


The tribe also employs conservation officers with arrest powers, and Mark Chino is a criminal investigator, who reports to a supervisor in Albuquerque.

As a source of other revenue, La Paz asked the committee to consider allowing Mescalero to keep a percentage of the money collected from speeding citations on the reservation.

"We could use the money to buy citation books and other equipment," he said, adding that more than half of the citation fines are paid without contesting the ticket in court.

"We've been working on that for five years," Madalena said.

In other business, the com-

out in the women's bathroom and wouldn't come back on.

Dishwasher Rico Sanchez chimed in with his story of the TVs in the sports bar going on and off — even after the batteries were removed.

While The Colonel doesn't seem to start up his shenanigans until the customers are gone, at least one customer with psychic abilities couldn't help but notice him, employees recall.

The well-dressed Colorado tourist came in Oct. 15 and almost immediately asked employees whether spirits inhabited the place.

"I told her what we've heard from the servers and everything," said manager Caverly Smith. "She was coming to her."

As Smith related the story, he came to the sudden realization that Sammy H. must be Sammy Herzog, a Mescalero Inn employee who died about a year ago.

"We still have people coming here today asking for him," Smith said. "It was like his home" because he loved his workplace so much. "It was strange."

The story leads one to believe The Colonel may not be the only spirit who hangs around inside the Mescalero Inn. And security guards have reported a ghost who feels

more angry who hangs around outside. The Colorado visitor agreed a different spirit was outdoors, saying the harmless ghosts inside seem to focus on the area around the fireplace, stairs and downstairs.

The Colonel seems to feed off the energy of new people, the woman told Smith, which may explain why the strange activities were especially frequent when the Mescalero Tribe first took over the operations of the Carrizo Lodge late last year, remodeling parts of the interior and renaming it the Mescalero Inn.

Lights went on and off, the volume of piped music went up and down, and windows were left open, all on a frequent basis, Smith recalls.


Some employees take the odd events seriously enough to quit. Others are intrigued by it. Others laugh or remain skeptical.

"My personal opinion is, the cooks downstairs probably pulled a few tricks on the waitresses," said Dale Miller, who with his wife has collected a bit of history and stories about the Mescalero Inn. Smith tends to agree with Miller's assessment.

But even if Miller doesn't believe in ghosts, he believes others do.

"They were very sincere," Miller said of the storytellers. "They believed there was a ghost named The Colonel."



Las Cruces company picked to construct local athletic fields

Work gets underway next week

A Las Cruces company was selected Tuesday by a Ruidoso committee to construct athletic fields at the White Mountain school complex.

The committee members, which include Ruidoso school, staff, council, and park and recreation committee officials, unanimously recommended Highland Enterprises over three other firms. Its bid is \$810,000. With application of the state's 6.9% gross receipts tax, the work will cost \$872,000.

Village councilors later awarded the bid at their meeting Tuesday.

The village has about \$900,000 from a December \$1 million bond issue to build the playing fields on the 17-acre, school-owned site. The bid is for two 180x330-foot regulation size soccer fields for multi-purpose use; a smaller, 110x60-foot multipurpose field; a baseball field with a 50-foot fence, a backstop and bleachers; underground irrigation for all the fields and installation of an electrical transformer for the ballfield.

The work contract stipulates the baseball field must be ready for use by Feb. 1, 1997, and the soccer fields must be ready for the spring soccer season.

With that timeline, construction must begin by Nov. 12, Village Manager Gary Jackson said.

The lowest bidder was C.S. McCrossan, also of Las Cruces, at \$803,000. However, McCrossan failed to include its state certification number on its application, as

required by the state procurement code, Jackson said.

The other bids were \$980,000 from D.J. Pagan of Albuquerque and \$995,798 from Acorn Landscaping of El Paso, Texas.


In addition to the base bids, bidders submitted bids for seven related field projects the village also wants at the site. Village officials originally thought the \$1 million bond issue would fund all these projects. But because the base project will cost \$872,000, the \$28,000 balance will be used as the project's contingency fund.

The work contract stipulates the baseball field must be ready for use by Feb. 1, 1997, and the soccer fields must be ready for the spring soccer season.

Those alternative projects and Highland's bids include: a sodded turf for the baseball outfield (\$37,000); a baseball scoreboard (\$12,000); shrubs, trees and irrigation (\$63,000); restroom and storage facility (\$98,000); a concession (\$45,300); an additional multipurpose field on the property's east side (\$107,500); and pathway lighting (\$20,500.)

Councilors prioritized constructing the additional field, which can be done with village equipment and crews. Committee members will explore other ways to fund the other projects.

All the bidders exceeded the project engineer's original estimates for the base projects and the related projects. The higher prices could reflect a strong construction market, and the bidders expressed concern about the project's tight deadline and climatic conditions, Jackson said.

needed," Jackson said. "That's our statutory duty."

"The whole reason we looked at an REP (request for proposals) was that initially there was no interest on the state level."

The GSD sent out two requests for proposals to lease the fort, but came up without any acceptable responses. Commissioners have contended the lack of response was tied to stringent state requirements, such as the state's ability to cancel the lease without cause.

"This move is necessary to alleviate overcrowding at the women's prison in Grants," Toms said. "The location was selected over others considered due to the fact that the conversion can be accomplished while spending the least amount of tax dollars."

Little difference exists between handling men or women inmates at the minimum security level, McFadin said.

"Minimum custody inmates aren't as difficult to manage, because they have incentives and are near the end of their sentences," she said. "They have a chance to wear street clothes and don't want to lose that privilege."

The fort will not need any major renovations to accommodate the women, she said. No bars or fences will be added.

If the fort plan is approved, the inmate classification procedure will remain the same: inmates will not be accepted who have committed sex crimes, violence toward children or racketeering. They also must be able to work.

"Right now, we're doing the same things on the grounds (of the camp) as the men inmates did," McFadin said. "They've stuccoed a building and did a nice job. I'm very proud of them. They've cleaned and polished. They've already been down to the fort mowing the grass."

"If we go down there, we'll do everything we can to bring it up to snuff. I'm very conscientious about the historical aspects, but I believe more damage is occurring by allowing the fort to sit empty."



Lack of voters at polls is national disgrace

One of the most frustrating and perhaps the most unresolved problem in this country is the failure of registered voters to exercise their right to vote. As long as about one-half of the voters refuse to vote, true democracy is a myth. Selecting those to direct the functions of our government should rank high on our list of priorities, and while we fail to recognize this fact, those who study governmental operations continue to be frustrated without any idea of how to improve voting attendance at the polls. Registering to vote has been made very simple. Changes in the system of registering tend to make the task easier — not more difficult. Registering at the place you buy your automobile license is one example. An estimated six million voters were the result of this change. However, the question remains unanswered — how many of the six million additional voters will go to the polls and vote? To assist the voters, New Mexico and many other states are opening the polls as much as two weeks before the regular voting date to allow voting. This should eliminate those non-voters who explain, "I just didn't have time to vote." Many of the political polls being currently taken should incite voting interest, however, the multitude of these polls tends to obscure interest instead. One poll shows that voters, ages up

to 30 years of age, tend to vote only 22% of the time. This won't cut it! We should start at an early age in rearing our children to show the importance of being involved in the knowledge of politics. We do this by following an example of voting in all elections and by making politics a point of family discussions. It will work! "I am not going to vote — my vote won't count anyway." This remark is being heard a lot of late, and nothing could be farther from the truth. It has been reported that John Kennedy would not have been elected president if he had received one less vote in each of the precincts in his district. We have a case in point right here in Ruidoso. In 1984, Ben Hall ran for the post in the state Legislature representing Ruidoso. He was opposed and his opponent's chairman was Mrs. Esther Junge. During the campaign, Mrs. Junge died prior to the fall election. For several

years it had been the custom of Mrs. Junge and myself to escort an elderly couple to the polls to vote. In the aftermath, I overlooked doing this, and our two friends did not vote. Had they voted, Ben Hall would have lost the election. But when the final vote tally was completed, Ben Hall won the election by one vote. Yes, a single vote does count. For those of us who have been politically active over the years, it has been apparent that the interest in politics is on the wane. Why is this so? We are deluged daily with visual and written political opinions, often to the point that we "tune off." The person on the street, club organizations, even politicians themselves seem to have lost interest. During the past 10 years or so, I have run for public office on several occasions where interest in the elections has been on a high plain. During the 1980s, we experienced many political meetings, debates, and gatherings where issues were discussed and reported in our local news. As many as 20 candidates would run for few offices. Now, it seems few individuals are interested in running for a public office. It is much simpler just to sit and criticize those who put a lot on the line in running. Of all the rights guaranteed by those who fought to give us those rights, the most important is THE RIGHT TO VOTE. To that 50% or so who will find reason not to vote, I say: GET OFF OF IT — AND VOTE.

Cavalry at military institute makes last stand

In the Old West it was traditionally the cavalry who rode in and saved the day when Anglo-Saxon invaders got into trouble with the natives. But who saves the cavalry when they're outnumbered and overwhelmed by modern economic strife?

Only two military schools in the

nation still maintain traditional cavalry units. One is New Mexico Military Institute (NMMI) in Roswell. No one, it seems, will be able to rescue the Saunders Cavalry Unit from being discontinued after this year along with the rest of the equine program (the hunter/jumper team and the rodeo club).

The institute has been absorbing \$50,000-\$80,000 a year in losses in-

curred by the equine program since 1981, according to public affairs officer Major Nelson Miller. Over the past six years, the school footed an extra \$319,177 over what was budgeted for the cavalry, hunter-jumper team, and rodeo club.

In 1991, NMMI's equine program went over their \$69,358 budget by \$14,372. In 1995, the program's total allotment was

\$101,012, and the school lost an additional \$79,312 in equine expenses, Miller said.

With this extra expense coming out of a general activities fund, the Board of Regents felt the equine program was cutting into other programs they felt were more beneficial to the students, most of whom have urban backgrounds and held only a sentimental interest in the school's equine tradition.

"It's a very sentimental issue," Miller said. "It was not an easy decision for the Board of Regents because they are alumni, too. The decision was done with a lot of deliberation and public input."

Fiscal reality, however, won out over nostalgia — again. This isn't the first time NMMI has turned its horses out of the stables. The equine program was cut in the early 1950's, right after the polo team won the national championship.

In 1968, horses returned to NMMI when the rodeo club was formed. The Saunders Cavalry, first established in 1921, returned in 1978 under the direction of General Childress. In 1985, the hunter-jumper team was formed, and bene-

fits from an annual horse show helped fund the institute's scholarship program.

Cavalry coach Mike Meador, a racehorse jockey and trainer, is trying to save the cavalry by encouraging alumni and concerned citizens to ask NMMI's Board of Regents to change their minds.

Members of the Saunders Cavalry demonstrated maneuvers at the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs Saturday, and several local NMMI alumni contributed money to the cause.

About 20 students ranging in age from high school freshmen to through junior college ride in the Saunders Cavalry. During war time, these maneuvers were tactical movements developed for rapid fighting. Today's cavalry units are mainly first-attack armored vehicles, Miller said.

Now the Saunders Cavalry travels throughout the Southwest in its final year, performing exhibitions and musical drills to demonstrate the original drills.

"I hope the horses will come back someday," Miller said. "Historically, they have."







In the decisive fourth game, Ruidoso took a 14-3 lead. But the Tigers chipped away at the lead and eventually tied it at 14. The score stayed there for nine service rotations.

Fittingly, junior Bailey Bishop's kill ended the match for the Warriors. Bishop led Ruidoso with 11 kills and seven blocks. Senior Kelle Lutterman added nine kills, six solo blocks and six assists.

"Bailey's level of play took our team to the next level of play," said Ruidoso coach Jauna Sanchez, whose team is 4-1 over the last two years against Hot Springs.

"Bailey's been in a slump, hitting the balls to the walls," Sanchez added. "She didn't do that. She put them down."

Ruidoso has a week to prepare for the District 3AAA tournament, which starts Monday.





Capitan gets the Tiger by the tail with 22-0 win

Capitan's football team kept its momentum rolling with a 22-0 shutout of the Alamogordo sophomore team Saturday.

The Tigers extended their winning streak to three games, and now sport a 4-4 record heading into this week's contest against district rival Cloudcroft.

On the line Saturday in Bear country is more than just the district title and a first round home playoff game; bragging rights for a year are at stake.

"It's a dog fight when these two teams meet," Tiger coach Ed Davis said of the approaching Capitan/Cloudcroft game.

The Tigers and Bears will meet at 1 p.m. Saturday, instead of Friday night. That's because the game between Cloudcroft and Reserve was snowed out Oct. 26 in Reserve. The Cloudcroft/Reserve game was rescheduled and played Tuesday, giving the Bears only three days until the Capitan game.

According to New Mexico Activities Association rules, teams must have five days between two varsity football games, Davis said.

The Capitan/Cloudcroft game had to be moved back. NMAA waived the five-day rule and allowed the game to be played Saturday, even though that gave only four days in between, because the state playoffs start next week.

Some might think it's to Capitan's advantage that Cloudcroft played Tuesday, giving the Tigers three more days to prepare.

Not Davis. "It's kind of hard to figure out, but I don't think anything like this will come between this rivalry," the Tiger coach said.

"It's a rivalry in everything. I don't care if we went out there and played jacks; we would go out and meet them on the sidewalk and it would be a dog fight," he said.

Both teams get so emotionally high for the game that both become virtually numb to anything else.

"If you've got an ache or pain, I guarantee you won't feel it Saturday," Davis said.

While the Bears were turning around and heading home Saturday because of the weather, the Tigers were busy with Alamo's Tigers.

Capitan turned in another solid defensive

effort, coupled with an offensive performance reminiscent of Tiger glory years of one and two years ago.

Capitan put together a pair of long, time-consuming drives in the first half for touchdowns to gain a 14-0 halftime lead.

Quarterback Steve Wilson capped off the Tigers' first scoring drive with a 24-yard touchdown run. Capitan ate up nearly eight minutes of the first quarter with that drive.

The Tigers, who kept the Alamo offense in check, mounted another drive midway through the second quarter. Capitan drove 85 yards, gobbling up five minutes of the clock. Wilson found Shawn McEuen for a 19-yard TD pass.

In all, Capitan racked 397 yards of total offense. Running back Jeremy Hoover led the Tiger rushing attack with 131 yards. Justin Joiner added 45 yards rushing, Jonathan McCarty ran for 47, McEuen for 41 and James Robinson went for 28.

Wilson finished with 67 yards on the ground and 3-for-6 passing for a touchdown, and more importantly, no interceptions.

The Tigers have cut down on their turn-

overs, committing only one in the last two games, and that's been a big difference, Davis said.

Capitan closed out its scoring with a safety in the third quarter and Wilson's 2-yard plunge early in the fourth quarter. With a 22-0 lead, Davis pulled some of his starters to save them for the Cloudcroft game.

"They've come a long way," Davis of the Tigers. "We've played people pretty respectable defensively all year long."

It's just an inconsistent offense that has plagued the Tigers most of the season.

Capitan showed none of that Saturday against Alamo with its two clock-eating drives.

The Tigers emerged from the game healthy, and senior Jayson McSwain's knee held up while he played defense the whole game.

McSwain should play both offense and defense versus the Bears.

"I couldn't keep him out of there anyway," Davis said.

Kickoff in Cloudcroft Saturday is 1 p.m.

Clint, Hobbs run off with laurels

Top girls finisher gets lost along the way

Clint's Yvette Barrios had a good reason to wear a big grin when she crossed the finish line of the Ruidoso Invitational cross country meet.

Barrios claimed the individual girls title Thursday, easily outdistancing teammate Becky Perez by 23 seconds. That's a reason to smile.

The senior Clint runner led her team to the team title as well. Another reason to beam.

But more than anything, Barrios was grinning at her good fortune. Barrios took an early lead but then took a wrong turn on the course and got lost. By the time she corrected her mistake, Barrios found herself in 10th place with "The Hill" ahead, among other things.

"I was looking at people with a look of like, 'Where do I go?'" Barrios recalled.

Teammate Becky Perez tried to help.

"I called her name and then I got confused and didn't know who to follow," Perez said.

Fortunately for Barrios, she had enough of the course left to catch up. She was back in first place by the time she hit "The Hill" — the 175-meter long incline near the end of the 3-mile course.

This was the Texas school's first appearance at the Ruidoso Invitational, and Clint coach Sonny Pitts says his team hopes to return next year.

"The kids say they want to come back," Pitts said.

Pitts' boys team swept the top two individual places, but lost the team title to Hobbs.

"It's a great course. I thought it was going to be real cold and windy," said Clint's Joey Chacon, who took first.

Added Chacon's teammate Jesus Garcia, "This is truly cross country."

While the Clint team was singing the praises of the Ruidoso meet

and course, Warrior coach Ronny Maskew had his own kudos hand out.

"I thought they did real well. In the boys division, the teams that beat us ran really well and so did we," Maskew said. "Clint has some of the best runners in west Texas."

Thursday was the first time the Ruidoso boys beat Alamogordo and Carlsbad in awhile, Maskew also noted.

"The girls probably ran the best that they have run all season," the Warrior coach said.

Ruidoso's Erica Romero, Saily Sandoval and American Sandoval beat some runners they haven't beaten before this season, Maskew said.

"The girls have been running well, but we've got to get our number four and five runners up closer to the front," Maskew added.

Ruidoso will have an opportunity to work on that Friday, when it heads north to Albuquerque Academy's invitational.

From 30 to 35 teams will be at the academy meet, including many of the top northern New Mexico high school teams.

"We hope to see Silver and Cobre up there, too. We haven't seen them

yet this year," Maskew said of his team's district rivals.

The academy course features a lot of sand, which the Warriors haven't seen much of this year, and some good hills.

That should benefit Ruidoso, Maskew said.

To the victors go the spoils — a district championship banner for the players and a Gatorade bath for the coach.

The Ruidoso soccer team won the District 3A-AAA title outright with a 4-1 win over Silver Tuesday. The Warriors improved to 12-4 overall and finished with a 5-1 district mark.

"We didn't want a 'co' in front of our district banner," said Warrior senior Jimmy Stover, who scored three times versus the Colts.

The Warriors overcame first-half blizzards and then put away the visiting Colts on two second-half goals by Stover.

"You could tell it was a big game because our passing was

not as sharp as last," Ruidoso coach Sigurd Schmitz said.

Ruidoso took a 2-1 lead into intermission. Piper Adamian scored his 23rd goal of the season off an assist from Stover.

Then, Adamian returned the favor, setting up Stover for his first goal of the game.

"Stover and Adamian lead the state in Class A-AAA scoring with 25 and 23 goals respectively.

Afterward, the jubilant Warriors celebrated the victory by dousing their coach with ice-cold water from the Gatorade water jug, and talked about how to get the blue dye out of their hair.

Head and Shoulders will take it out, a helpful fan noted.

The Warriors dyed their hair blue as a sign of team spirit at the homes of players Max Beatty and Zach Carey Tuesday night.

At first, it didn't work, Adamian said. The dye turned their hair grey. But a dose of turquoise did the trick.

No one is more surprised at their success this year than seniors Adamian and Stover.

"I never expected it (to win the district title) — never once. We lost so many guys," Stover said.

The difference has been the Warriors' preparation, Adamian added.

"We have a better work ethic and a better practice program (than last year)," Adamian said.

Capitan spikers lie in wait

As far as Capitan volleyball coach Bryan Massé is concerned, his Tigers have district foe Dexter right where they want them as the postseason begins.

"I think we're better than Dexter now," Massé said. "I don't think it's going to matter whose gym the district championship game is in."

Dexter will host the District 6AA title match Saturday. The Demons await the winner of the semifinals slated for Thursday in Capitan; in other words, the Tigers will have to beat the winner of Tuesday's game between Tularosa and Cloudcroft before it heads to Dexter.

Massé's team put itself in position to win the district and the No. 1-seeding when it rallied from an 0-2 deficit to Dexter last Tuesday and beat the Demons, creating a tie atop the District 6AA standings.

The Tigers sealed up a share of the regular season district crown with a sweep of Tularosa Thursday.

Both the Tigers and Dexter finished with 5-1 records, but the Demons get seeded first in the District 6AA tournament and are guaranteed a trip to the regionals because of the tiebreaker.

The first tiebreaker is based on district record (both teams finished 5-1). The second is head-to-head matches (both beat each other

once). The next tiebreak is head-to-head-games in matches against each other (both needed five games to beat the other one).

The fourth tiebreak is win-loss record for all district games. This is where the Demons had the edge. Twice Dexter defeated Cloudcroft in three games. Capitan needed five games both times to down the Bears.

Tuesday's comeback win over Dexter has Massé confident. After losing the first game 16-14, the second-year Tiger coach expressed his displeasure to the team.

"I told them that I had enough of them giving games away," Massé said.

Capitan didn't respond at first, losing the next game 15-5. The Tigers then got their act together. They rattled off three straight game wins by scores of 15-11, 15-9, 15-4.

"I think with everyone being so hurt (physically), we just decided we had to play as a team," senior Mandi Aldaz explained.

The Tigers were coming off a rough match versus Cloudcroft the week before. In the five-game win, Capitan's Casey Cunningham suffered a bad ankle sprain, setter Andra Fish dislocated her wrist and Trisha Seidel tore ligaments in

her ankle.

"That would have devastated a lot of other teams except us, because we have a bench," Massé said.

Capitan still won the match, rode the ambulance home, and started to prepare for Dexter with familiar faces in different places.

Maybe it took them a couple of games to get used to the new lineup, or maybe the Tigers needed Massé's wake up call; regardless, Capitan rallied.

Before the Tigers prepare for their next showdown with Dexter, they have to get by either Tularosa or Cloudcroft Thursday. Capitan plays the Tula/Cloudcroft winner at 7 p.m.

Either team poses a threat. The Wildcats are young, but athletic.

"They're big. They're athletic. They're starting to come on," Massé said of Tula. "They could be the team to pull an upset."

Cloudcroft, on the other hand, hasn't won a district match but the Bears love to play Capitan, twice pushing regular-season matches to five games.

Aldaz knows who she'd rather face Thursday.

"Tularosa. Because Cloudcroft always gets up to play us," she said.

An Open Letter To The Voters of New Mexico From the Employees of Casino Apache & Gaim-Ko

On November 5th, 1996, you, the voters of New Mexico have a unique opportunity to correct an injustice. Since the last general election the citizens of New Mexico have voted for and voiced their support for legalized gaming in New Mexico. This support is evidenced by the passage of a constitutional amendment legalizing gaming in the State and numerous polls which show that the citizens of the State overwhelmingly support the right of people to engage in gaming activities. These people are not wealthy casino owners, but are housekeepers, clerks, cashiers, technicians, security officers and managers all legally employed. Many of these people provided the sole source of income for their families. These people represent our friends, our neighbors, and our family.

In addition to the human cost, the State of New Mexico must now pay an additional \$60,000 to \$70,000 per week in unemployment benefits. These are your tax dollars that could have gone toward improving schools, roads and libraries. This cost will soon total in the millions of dollars. The total responsibility for these costs falls on your elected representatives. Every elected official who voted against or failed to support Indian gaming effectively voted for an increase in unemployment, poverty and human suffering.

You, the voters, can right this injustice. You have the power to strike a blow for the victims of this legislative massacre. You can prevent a return to Wounded Knee.

On November 5th, vote for candidates who have publicly declared that they will support measures to ensure that Indian gaming compacts will be ratified in the next legislative session. Elect state Senators and Representatives who care about the lack of humanity shown by past legislatures. Vote for the economic welfare of not only Indian tribes, but the entire State of New Mexico.

They have taken our lands, our jobs and our dignity. Vote on November 5th to restore faith and pride in Indian people and the citizens of the State of New Mexico. **VOTE FOR JUSTICE AND EQUALITY FOR ALL PEOPLE.**



It's that time of the year again when people drain last year's antifreeze and fill their radiators with a new batch.

It's a time of year that poses a great threat to pets. As little as a few licks of spilled antifreeze can be deadly.

In America, more than 80,000 dogs and cats are reported killed from drinking antifreeze each year, said Jim Riggins, administrator of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

"Many more go unreported. For every domesticated animal killed, there must be more wildlife - deer, rabbits, rodents and birds that die," he said.

Antifreeze contains an antifoaming agent called Alcoanium that is sweet to the taste. But when the antifreeze hits the kidneys and bladder, it forms crystals, causing a very painful death.

"The poisoning strikes in minutes and most always is fatal," Riggins said. "I see the telltale green puddle (of leaking antifreeze) showing up in parking lots already. Some part-time homeowners also use antifreeze in their bird baths and toilets."

"I discourage this practice and advise them to turn off the water main, drain the lines and then flush the toilet."

When considering winterizing your vehicle, be sure the procedure is needed, Riggins said.

Antifreeze doesn't have to be changed every year. Home test kits are available and a local mechanic also can tell you if a change is necessary.

An environmentally friendly antifreeze called Sierra is on the market and can be purchased at Wal-Mart, Western Auto and some other places in town. It may cost a bit more than the least expensive antifreeze, but you don't have to worry about pets or disposal.

For those who don't want to change or who already have the poisonous type of antifreeze in their radiators, Riggins offered some advice.

"Drain all the old antifreeze into a container that can be tightly sealed," he said. "If flushing is necessary, all run off from the process also should be caught. Dispose of the materials responsibly."

Antifreeze-soaked soil poses a risk.

To dispose of antifreeze, absorb it with material such as kitty litter, then double bag it before putting it into a dumpster, Riggins said. If you see puddles on the street or in a parking lot, a wad of old newspapers will absorb most of the liquid.





Westminster Abbey

In Westminster Abbey, author Alan Bennett (shown above) goes behind the scenes to present a personal portrait of the history, beauty, and everyday life of one of Britain's best-known landmarks.

Mingling with the crowds of tourists, watching cleaners and tour guides at work, and eavesdropping on services, Bennett uses the Abbey to scrutinize the English and English history, as well as his own relationship with the Church of England. Spending a full day in the Abbey, he highlights three of its most famous features — the Coronation Chair and the Stone of Scone, the Tomb of the Unknown Warrior, and the Poet's Corner — providing anecdotes and background information.

As presented by Bennett, Westminster Abbey is a place of ironies and oddities. The resting place of "names," its most famous corpse is anonymous and honored in a way no one else is: visitors may walk on the gravestones of any of the regal, legal, and literary lions buried there, but no one may walk on the grave of World War I's Unknown Warrior.

On his tour of the tombs, Bennett discovers that many of the aristocracy occupied a number of different locations within Westminster, as successive kings and queens decided on a reshuffle to ensure "pride of place." In recounting some of the Abbey's more curious tales, he reveals that for many years, Edward I's coffin was opened regularly to display the body, preserved in oiled linen.

Westminster Abbey will be broadcast Monday, November 4th at 8:00 p.m. and Tuesday, November 26th at 1:00 p.m.

NATURE "Mask of the Mandrill"

The dense and uncharted rainforest of Gabon in west Africa has long been one of the last true wildernesses. Only in the past decade or so have intrepid researchers sufficiently explored the land beneath the dark canopy of tropical vegetation to encounter some of the least-known animals in the world.

One of the most fascinating of those creatures, the largest and most colorful monkey on Earth, is profiled in "Mask of the Mandrill," premiering on Nature.

Even though existence of the mandrill has long been known to researchers, its behavior had remained largely a mystery until now.

Marked with a bright red, white, and blue face and other exotic coloring, the mandrill is an awesome and imposing primate. Living in troops, its constant need to eat young, tender leaves compels the mandrill to live life on the move.
