

Woman dies in riding accident

A Hondo Valley woman died Monday when her horse fell on her when she was riding in the forest.

Susan Hovland, 42, died at the scene, in Silva Canyon along U.S. Forest Service Road 120.

Her husband Jim, who is pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Ruidoso, was riding with her. He told sheriff's investigator Bobby Angermiller that his wife's horse slipped on a muddy hill and fell on top of her before dragging her along rocks for about 30 feet, Sheriff Tom Sullivan said.

Mrs. Hovland asked her husband to stay with her, so he didn't seek help for about two hours, Sullivan said. Officials said he did the right thing.

"It wasn't easy access, and it wouldn't have been easy to get her out of there alive," Deputy Medical Investigator Danny Slason said. Since she had minimal external injuries, an autopsy will be performed, he said.

Burglars steal pawn shop guns

A Ruidoso pawn shop was burglarized of four handguns at about 11:30 p.m. Sunday, Ruidoso police said.

Three .9 mm and one .45 caliber guns were the only items stolen from the Golden West Pawn Shop at 137 U.S. Highway 70, store manager Olivia Morehead said.

The guns, valued together at \$190 to \$290, had been in a display case with about 30 other guns. All the .9 mm guns were stolen, and one of two .45 was taken.

Response to river rescue encouraging

About 300 people responded to a call for help in restoring the Rio Ruidoso after reading an article about the effort in The Ruidoso News Jan. 1.

Jim Shoop, one of the organizers of the Rio Ruidoso Watershed Association, said the group was encouraged by the response that included many longtime Ruidoso residents looking for solutions.

Williams predicts expanded gambling

There's a good chance the state Legislature will legalize gambling at Indian casinos and racetracks this time around, says Ruidoso's state legislator.

While State Rep. Dub Williams supports these changes, there is fervent opposition that has prevented a majority support in the Legislature for the past two years.

"If the Legislature legalizes slots and casinos, it basically will be siding with the predators over the producers," said gambling opponent Guy Clark. The legislative session opened Tuesday.

But Williams says he may even personally introduce legislation to allow video gambling machines at fraternal clubs, charities and racetracks, plus work to get the Indian gambling compacts legalized.

Williams' legislation would reflect what Williams constituents say they want, he said.

It would also "reopen the door to renegotiate the compacts and get them out from under the court," Williams said.

All the gaming compacts signed by tribes and the governor have been ruled invalid by the U.S. Court of Appeals and lower courts because they were not approved by the Legislature.

Indian casinos are still operating because of a stay issued by the Court of Appeals, but the delay is contingent upon pueblos requesting and receiving a U.S. Supreme Court hearing. The appeals court decision also encouraged the state Legislature to resolve the issue.

Richard Hughes, the attorney for the Indian gambling pueblos, said the pueblos will likely wait to file an appeal to the Supreme Court until after the legislative session ends in two months.

The Mescalero Tribe agreed to abide by the Court of Appeals ruling, even though it has a separate case still on appeal.

Rob Burpo, legislative lobbyist for the Mescalero Apache Tribe, said he is "cautiously optimistic" that legislation supporting the Indian gambling compacts will be approved this year, and the "tribes as a group are very optimistic."

Ruidoso Downs Race Track owner R.D. Hubbard, who owns several racetracks around the country, has pushed for video gambling at racetracks since 1994.

He argues racetrack handles have dropped because of competition from Indian gambling, and has said the racetracks deserve "an equal playing field."

Ruidoso Village Attorney John Underwood has been hired by the village and racetrack to lobby for video gambling legislation for tracks.

The Downs at Albuquerque has announced it won't run live races in the spring, but will keep them for the summer and fall. Simulcast racing will remain during the spring.

Mescalero graduates sing praises of training

Funded by casino, leaders hope for a community college next

Shelley Belin was practically all thumbs five months ago when she started at the Mescalero Vocational School.

Today, the 27-year-old Mescalero woman is as handy with a hammer as a ratchet wrench in her new maintenance job at the Mescalero High School.

Plumbing problems sometimes plague the portable facilities, she explained, and the new skills she learned are quite useful in fixing the problems.

Belin is one of 31 tribal members who graduated Friday from the Mescalero Vocational Training School with new career possibilities and marketable

skills. The training is free to tribal members and funded by revenues from the tribe's Casino Apache.

It's the third class to graduate with certification from the 1.5-year-old training school — an educational program success that Mescalero Education Director John Shendo, Jr., hopes to expand later this year.

how, now I can do it."

Shanta can turn those skills into a career, too. She has been trained in electrical wiring, sheet rock and linoleum installation.

And Gervase Peso, Jr., 29, is considering moving from Bureau of Indian Affairs work into telecommunications and cable electronics for the Tularosa Basin Telephone Company, now that he has the training.

"I was looking for something as a career move, to go somewhere else. This opened up, with electrical, plumbing, carpentry," Peso said of the program. "It's hands-on work and you learn a lot, which is pretty cool."

Most of the training school's applicants have no background in the area, but that's OK.

"The majority are all thumbs when they start — basically have no experience whatsoever," Buchler said.

"But we like to have people with no experience at all," Shendo added. "They have the option of continuing into the next phase (after completing roughly 500 hours of training.) We try to

give everyone exposure to everything."

Building at home

Since the vocational school opened its doors in late 1995, a total of 83 students of all ages have graduated with certificates of training. All have been Native American and Mescalero tribal members, and a good half of the graduates have been females.

Sessions are about as long as a college semester.

The school is solely funded through Casino Apache gambling proceeds, officials said.

Students gain hands-on experience in construction trades, building new structures from ground up as well as expanding or renovating old ones at the request of tribal members.

They also have classes on CPR and the handling of hazardous materials, and invite guest speakers on subjects like firefighting and home finance, Shendo said.

Deputy Vega pleads guilty to lesser criminal charge

Lincoln County Deputy Angelo Vega pleaded guilty Thursday to a misdemeanor charge of attempted false imprisonment.

"It was a condition of the plea bargain that his plea had to be guilty," said prosecutor Kay Bird with the office of New Mexico Attorney Gen. Tom Udall. The state would not agree to a "no contest" plea that doesn't carry an admission of guilt, she said.

In exchange for the admission, felony charges of intimidation and extortion against Vega were dropped.

People convicted of felonies cannot be New Mexico law enforcement officers, so now Vega may be eligible.

"We were interested in not putting in a whole lot of time and resources" into retrying Vega, said Kay Roybal, public information spokesman for Udall.

Vega's trial last year on the felony charges ended when the jury couldn't reach a verdict.

"Whether he stays on or not as a deputy is up to the sheriff or the county attorney," Bird said. "The prosecutor on the case (Richard Klein) said if (Vega) serves the possible one-year sentence, he won't be doing much law enforcement."

A pre-sentence evaluation is being conducted and will be presented during a yet-unscheduled hearing in front of District Judge

"Another stipulation was that we can bring the conviction to the attention of the State Law Enforcement Agency, but we will not prosecute it there," Bird said.

Darrel Hart, director of the N.M. Law Enforcement Agency, said his office reviews felony and misdemeanor convictions of law-enforcement officers on a case-by-case basis. Hart could raise issues warning of suspension or revocation of an officer's law enforcement certification.

Vega was indicted by a grand jury last year after two women accused him of trying to coerce them into becoming drug informants.

Montes sues ex-sheriff over election

Lincoln County Deputy Orlando Montes is suing former sheriff James McSwane, charging him with smearing his name so he would lose the sheriff election.

The suit specifically charges McSwane with political retaliation and restricting Montes' right of free speech.

The chief deputy is asking for unspecified compensatory and punitive damages.

"It's the most ridiculous thing I ever heard of," McSwane said after hearing the suit had been filed. "I don't know how I retaliated against him."

Montes ran unsuccessfully for sheriff in the Republican primary in June 1996, but continued to work as a deputy.

In the suit filed on behalf of Montes in U.S. District Court in Al-

buquerque, Ruidoso attorney J. Robert Beauvais states that McSwane previously told Montes "he would take whatever steps necessary to prevent (Montes) election...including starting an investigation of (Montes) for alleged wrongdoing."

McSwane actively supported his undersheriff Bob Miller in the primary.

Montes contends McSwane, who did not seek re-election, needed Miller to be elected so he could continue to be employed by the sheriff's office. He knew Montes would not hire him, the lawsuit states.

In May 1996, one month before the primary, McSwane initiated a criminal investigation of Montes through the State Police. The agency looked into McSwane's allegations that Montes had signed another deputy's name to a subpoena.

Beauvais contends in the suit that McSwane "went to extraordinary lengths to publicly dis-

close Montes was being investigated and could face possible criminal charges. He provided information to local news media, an action that differs with prior policy not to publicly discuss internal investigations of employees."

Montes claims McSwane's actions caused him to lose the primary election by 10 votes.

The investigation ended shortly after the election with a finding of no criminal violation.

Montes claims McSwane started the investigation to harm his candidacy and with evil intent. He claims to have suffered mental and emotional distress and loss of reputation. He contends the sheriff denied him due process by failing to provide the deputy a chance for a fair hearing.

Gambling opponent plans to lobby Legislature heavily

Gambling opponent Guy Clark will be lobbying during the legislative session for his group, New Mexico Coalition Against Gambling, with about 12 other volunteers.

Predicting his group's success at the Legislature this year is a "toss up," he said.

"During the (November) election, we lost a couple (of anti-gambling legislators), but we also gained a couple," he said. "We're starting off with one or two behind, but we'll get more allies."

"We're pushing to keep gambling where it is," he said. "There should be no legalization of gambling of any sort. But, if they want to discuss compacts for what is already

legal, that's fine."

Those compacts would cover pull tabs, bingo, racetrack horse betting, and racetracks with bicycles. The latter is legal here, but not practiced.

If gambling is expanded beyond what is already legal in the state, it will hurt, not help, the economy, Clark said.

"I think the whole economy will take a hit," he said. "Already poverty went up in the state by 20% last year while it was down in the rest of the country, and I think a lot of that is attributable to casinos."

Clark, who said he got his figures from the state Tax and Revenue Department, added that state unemployment rose last year

while it dropped elsewhere, and state gross receipt tax collections also fell in 1996.

"The main thing is the \$400 million spent on gambling is not being spent in restaurants or stores," he said.

More gambling opponents will come from business groups that will speak out for the first time after having "bled" financially from Indian gambling last year, Clark said.

The state restaurant association is one group that decided this week to take a stand against Indian casinos, saying it can't compete with discounted food and drink prices at casinos.

Cancer support group needed, survivor says

Fear of the unknown can be the worst fear for people when they hear they have cancer.

So when a cancer survivor can tell someone what to expect, it brings comfort. Ruidoso cancer survivor Jane Yowell explains.

"People are terrified — it used to be a death sentence," she said. "It's real good to sit down and talk with someone who's been in your shoes and survived."

Now there's a local organization that can help bring these people together every month.

The organizational meeting will be at noon Thursday, Jan. 23, at the Lincoln County Medical Center conference room in Ruidoso. Organizers plan to hammer out the best time for future monthly meetings, said Yowell, who is also a nurse.

On average, about 65 Lincoln County residents are diagnosed with cancer each year, and about 30 die from some type of cancer, said Dr. Charles Key of the University of New Mexico Cancer Research Center. The deaths are below the national average.

The new support group is not

only for cancer victims but also family members.

"The family is usually as scared or more scared than the patient," Yowell explained.

An American Cancer Society program called Reach for Recovery helped Yowell through her rough times in 1981, but the county chapter doesn't take any more. In that program, cancer survivors refer out to newly diagnosed victims or their families on an individual basis. After Yowell's diagnosis, a woman came to her home and helped her get a grip on the unknown, she said.

"My biggest fear — I still find fairly young kids — was concern over family that I might leave behind," she recalled.

Yowell underwent a modified radical mastectomy at Lincoln County Medical Center, where she has worked as a registered nurse for 12 years.

Since then, life "has been great — even greater!" she exclaims.

Following her surgery, she joined Reach for Recovery, and although she has retired as a nurse, Yowell still helps counsel people at the hospital who have just been diagnosed with cancer.

Sonterra subdivision receives easy approval

Planners of Sonterra developers will have to spend time answering questions from state agencies on the latest section of land they subdivided.

By winning Lincoln County Commission approval last week under a new summary review procedure, Properties of the Southwest can move ahead on the sale of six,

20-acre tracts south of Sierra Blanca Regional Airport Road.

Properties representative Lott Phillips and surveyor Tim Collins requested approval of a Type Five subdivision, which can contain no more than 25 tracts, all more than 10 acres in size. If commissioners had refused to allow the application as a separate subdivision and included the new tracts within the overall Sonterra development, it

would have been reclassified as a Type One subdivision with more than 500 lots. That would have kicked in requirements for a water and sewer system, other improvements and more state reviews.

"This cleans up everything they own south of the river," Collins said, except for a five-acre tract separated from the development by Old Fort Stanton Road. Another 330 acres also are on the market to sell as one tract.

Another 1,500 acres of the original 4,800 acres of ranchland purchased by Properties of the Southwest lies north of the river, Phillips said. The company is six or eight months away from making a decision on what to do with the rest of the land, Phillips said.

Final approval of the new six-lot subdivision was based on requirements for privately maintained surfaced roads and no more lot divisions.

Watch those trial balloons; they're fraught with peril

Troublesome ideas come from all directions, and nobody can predict when they'll crop up, either. For a good many years now, our representatives in Washington have had a convenient way to do "progressive" things back home without having to take the heat for higher federal taxes. This procedure, which neatly shifted the blame from federal to state government, came to be known on Capitol Hill as "unfunded mandates."

Not really popular with the folks back home, once they figured out what was going on: Our congresspersons would make a law requiring that something be done (like environmental protection) everywhere in the country, then tell the states to figure out how to pay for it. Our oh-so-solid waste disposal system is a result of one of those unfunded mandates.

Now comes Peter Rahn, Gov. Gary Johnson's secretary of transportation, floating what we hope is a trial balloon. He says his department is about out of money, and would the counties please consider picking up part of the tab for maintaining roads.

Lincoln County Commissioner Wilton Howell spotted the idea in a publication of the New Mexico Association of Counties (NMAC) and alerted other commissioners about it last week.

Bill Schwetman, the county's representative to the the association, doesn't like the idea but says the state is in a financial bind. (Howell notes that there might not be a bind if the Legislature hadn't rescinded part of the state gasoline tax three years ago.) The other commissioners urged Howell to alert all the state's counties to the prospect.

Howell also has been wondering why the hired guns in NMAC seem receptive. We wonder the same thing. But we hope this really is no more than a trial balloon to get the Johnson administration, or maybe the Legislature, off an embarrassing financial hook.

Unless the state figures out a revenue stream direct to the counties to pay for the work, without putting counties in competition with each other for tourist dollars, that balloon should be shot down quickly.

BLM plans no 'police state'

TO THE EDITOR:

On Jan. 10, The Ruidoso News printed a letter from Annie C. McManus of Caballo, who asked why the secretary of the Interior was illegally establishing a police state within the U. S. by expanding the law enforcement authority of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

This assertion is untrue. What is being proposed is the consolidation of BLM's Code of Federal Regulations. The goal of this proposal is to make these regulations easier to find and easier to understand.

The proposal does not add any new law enforcement authority to BLM but seeks to clarify what activities are prohibited on public lands. The letter does not say that the proposal was released for public

Students this session constructed a new conservation office in Mescalero. In the next session they plan to remodel the old Mescalero Job Corps building into a permanent vocational school building. The tribe donated the building, which is about five miles southeast of the current vocational school at the Mescalero Community Center.

"Where I come from, a lot of people want to learn something like this, but they don't have the opportunity they have here," he said. carpentry student but also teaches his electronic skills to others, and hopes to be hired as a salaried instructor when the school expands.

College next

Students also are currently building a new cedar wood community church near the Mescalero Bingo Hall. Pastor Leonard Kansewah III has been providing the material for the non-denominational church, which students have been constructing for the last two years. The structure is 85% completed.

Tribal officials want to expand beyond vocational training this year, if possible. Shendo is working with Eastern New Mexico University in Ruidoso and the University of New Mexico in Highlands to expand curriculum beyond the trade skills to include courses in mathematics, computers, and English with both satellite and teacher based courses.

"As long as they supply the materials, we'll do it," said acting teacher and student Star Gutierrez, a licensed journeyman and electronic wiring man. "There's a lot of appreciation. The work's not being done outside, it's done by the people here."

"We will expand, hopefully in the fall of 1997," Shendo said. "In the future we'd like to see (this as) the Mescalero Community College. We've been pointing in that direction since 1990."

Gutierrez is originally from the Santa Clara Pueblo, but chose to move to Mescalero last year.

Currently, only 20 students are in school at any one time so the three instructors can assure safety as the students use dangerous power tools.

"I met a girl down here and so stayed," he said of his wife Evalith.

A good 40 to 50 people are currently on a waiting list for admission, Shendo said.

Gutierrez started with the program in July after being laid off from his job in Alamogordo. He is a

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX-REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Property which was valued in 1996 in this county by the county assessor is not required to be reported or rendered for 1997 or subsequent years, Except for:

1. mobile homes
2. livestock, and
3. land used for agricultural purposes

If, for any reason, your property was not valued last year and it is subject to valuation this year, you are required by law to report it to the county assessor on forms provided either by mail or at the assessor's office.

All nongovernmental entities (property owners) which claimed to be exempt from the property tax must report their property and claim their exemption for 1997 if the exemption was not claimed in 1996.

Reports for mobile homes, livestock, land use for agricultural purposes, property not valued last year and claims for exemptions by nongovernmental entities must be completed and mailed or delivered to the county assessor not later than the last day of February.

If you made improvements to your real property and:

1. the improvements cost more than \$1,000 and
2. a building permit for the improvements was not issued;

you must report the nature of the improvements and their cost to the assessor not later than the last day of February. These reports must be on forms provided by that assessor.

If you believe your property decreased in value during the preceding year, you must report, on forms provided by the assessor, a signed statement which:

1. describes the property affected,
2. states the cause and nature of decrease in value, and
3. state the amount you contend the value has decreased.

This statement must be filed with the county assessor no later than the last day of February.

If the veterans exemption was claimed and allowed in 1996 no new claim for that exemption is required to be filed! However, if that exemption was not claimed and allowed in 1996 and it is now claimed, claim must be made by the last day of February by filing with the assessor the form provided by the assessor.

If the head-of-family exemption was claimed and allowed in 1996 no new claim for that exemption is required to be filed. However, if that exemption was not claimed and allowed in 1996 and it is now claimed, claim must be made by the last day of February by filing with the assessor the form provided by the assessor.

Beginning in the 1982 tax year, taxpayers are responsible for declaring their property classification to the assessor, as residential or nonresidential. When the declaration is accepted by the assessor, it shall remain as such and need not be made in the subsequent years unless the classification changes. If a taxpayer has not declared their property to be residential in 1996 and desires that classification for 1997 they must complete a declaration of residential classification and return the signed declaration to the county assessor's office by the last day of February, 1997.

Certain mineral property and personal property of contractors operating in more than one county are required to be reported to the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division of the State of New Mexico in Santa Fe. Information about property to be reported to the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division can be obtained from the county assessor or the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division, Central Assessment Bureau, P.O. Box 630, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87509, Phone: (505) 827-0893.









Wrestlers' intensity overshadows their inexperience

A challenging schedule has banged up the Ruidoso Warrior wrestling team, but not bristled its intensity.

The Warriors scored their first dual meet win of the 1996-97 season Thursday with a 42-33 decision over Las Cruces Mayfield, a Class AAAA school.

First-year coach Jerrett Perry said his wrestlers are relying on enthusiasm when they lack experience against opponents. Eight of 14 Ruidoso wrestlers are either freshmen or sophomores. Of his six upperclassmen, only senior heavyweight Brad Beavers has extensive varsity experience.

"Our biggest asset is our intensity. They do not give up," Perry said. "I think we've made a lot of progress in the last couple of weeks."

That progress was measured in Thursday's dual meet victory. The Warriors took control of the match in upper weight classes, where they have their more experienced wrestlers. Pins by Jason Leadingham (171) and Brad Beavers (heavyweight) sealed the Ruidoso win, much to the delight of the vocal local crowd. The Warriors seemed to draw strength from the fans and vice versa.

"That's the most crowd we've seen in awhile. It helps us out. We appreciate that," said Perry.

them again," said Beavers, who owns an 8-5 record.

Nearly all of Ruidoso's matches have come against Class AAAA schools, and the invitations it has attended have been equally demanding.

The schedule has taken a physical toll on the Warriors, but not a mental one.

"We're getting to the part of the season where we're beat up,"

Perry said. "But overall I'm extremely pleased with how the kids are working, their motivation and their want to get better."

Four Warriors are nursing nagging injuries. Junior Jason Lopez has strained ligaments in his elbow. Edward Misquez reinjured his back Thursday, while Johnny Adams missed the Mayfield meet with a sprained ankle. Beavers is also hurting

with a sore shoulder.

Warrior cagers spook Colts with near-win in District 3AAA opener

The Ruidoso girls basketball team might not have picked up a "W" Saturday night, but it garnered a "R" — as in respect — from one of the district's top teams.

The Warriors put a scare in Silver's Colts for three quarters in the District 3AAA opener for both teams, before succumbing to the visitors, 57-37. Silver's record upped to 9-5, while Ruidoso's dropped to 3-10.

"The tank ran empty, with only 14 points in the second half," Warrior coach Dwayne Rogers said.

Ruidoso was running on just fumes in the fourth quarter when it managed only four points.

This was truly a case where the game was closer than the final score indicated. The Colts didn't pull away from the Warriors until the final six minutes of the fourth quarter, when Silver's Julie Whetten literally took matters into her own hands. Whetten triggered a 10-2 Silver run at the start of the final eight minutes that built the Colts' lead from 38-33 to 48-35.

Silver wasn't able to breathe easy until that point; the Warriors had given them a battle.

"For three and a half quarters we gave them everything they could handle," Rogers said.

Ruidoso consistently exploited the backside of Silver's man-to-man pressure.

"We tried to spread them out and then we were able to find the open person," Rogers said.

Numerous times the Warriors successfully reversed the ball through the high post, who either took an open shot or passed to an open teammate under the basket.

Junior forward Bailey Bishop had a field day against the Colts until her mouth got her trouble. Bishop picked up a technical foul in first quarter. In high school basketball a technical foul is a personal foul also. Ruidoso's best inside player had to take to the bench. She then picked up her

fourth foul with 2:45 left in the second quarter, keeping her on the sidelines for most of the third quarter as well. Bailey paced Ruidoso with 10 points in limited playing time.

The difference Saturday was not the Colts' defensive pressure, but rather their second-half adjustments, Rogers said.

"I don't think they wore us down. We missed some shots inside, and obviously we missed not having Bailey on the floor for significant minutes (because of foul trouble)," Roger added.

The biggest and most damaging adjustment the Colts made was putting the ball in Whetten's hands in the second half. She was unstoppable, driving to the basket for short-range jumpers. Whetten

finished with 19 points to lead all scorers.

Rogers isn't satisfied with the Warriors' moral victory, probably because he and his Warriors got a whiff of victory.

"We need to beat a good team. It sends a message that we are better than what we've been showing," he said.

That opportunity arises Saturday when the Warriors host Santa Teresa for another district clash. The Desert Warriors have a pair of speedy guards who can take the ball coast-to-coast, plus a big girl inside who burned Ruidoso last year, Rogers noted.

"When we give the effort necessary, we will win this game."

Ruidoso boys shut down Tularosa duo for victory

Going into Saturday's rematch with Tularosa, Ruidoso coach Ben Sanchez decided his Warriors would defend the Wildcats straight-up.

That was the Ruidoso game plan until the bus ride down the mountain.

Instead, a brainstorm produced the thought of using a gimmick defense to slow down Tulle's two best players, Cameron Sanchez and Silver High School transfer Jason Murrujo.

"We just kind of put it together on the bus trip over there," Sanchez said of the triangle-and-two defense the Warriors used to defend the Wildcats.

"It was kind of a gamble, and it paid off. It was a roll of the dice," he added.

The gamble paid off in the form of an 82-61 victory over the 'Cats in Tulle.

Ruidoso's defense held Murrujo and Sanchez 12 points below each of their averages. While their teammates played a triangle zone, guards Arthur Rojas, Corey Saenz and Scott Sebastian took turns chasing Murrujo and Sanchez.

"We weren't going to let Murrujo or Sanchez beat us," Ruidoso's Sanchez said. "We did a real nice job of making other players step up for them."

The Warrior offense got off to its quickest start of the season, racking up 33 points in the first quarter alone.

Rojas, a senior, was en route from beyond the arc, hitting three 3-pointers in the

first minutes. Rojas finished with a team-high 21 points.

As a team, the Warriors hit seven of their eight 3-pointers in the first period.

"It was just one of those games where everything came together," said the Warrior coach.

With the victory, Ruidoso climbed to the .500 mark at 7-7 for the first time in a month.

The Warriors jumped to a 33-13 first quarter lead, and maintained it for a 17-point halftime lead.

Tularosa fought back in the third quarter, cutting the lead to seven. But the handcuffed Sanchez and hogtied Murrujo never got off so much

as a shot attempt when the Wildcats needed a big bucket.

Sophomore post player Garvin Grant scored eight of his 14 points in the fourth period to rebuild the Warriors' advantage.

In early December, Tulle scored a 51-45 win over the Warriors on the Warriors' turf. Ruidoso returned the favor Saturday.

Five Warriors scored in double figures. After Rojas' 21 and Grant's 14, Saenz pitched in a dozen and post players Adam Windham and Erik Padilla scored 10 each. Sebastian finished with eight.

Ruidoso's 82 points is its highest output of the season.

"We just talked about looking ahead before the game," Sanchez said. "We attacked their press to score. We weren't passive."

Ruidoso travels to Santa Teresa Saturday.

One of the best ways to start the new year out right is to offer a home to an abandoned animal.

But choosing the right animal for your family should be a combination of attraction and some common sense.

Adopting a shelter dog always carries a question mark, because you don't know what experiences the dog had undergone and how they affected its temperament.

It also may require your presence in its new home or become anxious when left alone.

Experts caution that it could take from one to 12 weeks for the dog to adjust to your home. You should be patient and attentive during that time.

Advantages in selecting a shelter animal include:

- the initial cost of purchase is less and includes many shots, the license and the spay/neuter;

- most dogs from shelters respond well to loving care and attention and love being with you;

- some experts say mixed breed dogs are more even-tempered and less prone to medical problems;

- an adult dog probably is housebroken;

- locally, veterinarians provide the first check-up free, although any medication or medical treatment found to be necessary is

charged to the new owner.

Some suggestions offered in choosing a shelter dog are to:

- know the typical behaviors expected from the breed or breed mixes they are thinking about adopting;

- know the amount of grooming a breed will require and any special medical problems;

- assess whether your family can be patient while the dog adjusts and is trained out of any unwanted behaviors. Everyone in the household should take part in the training;

- determine if you have enough time and energy for daily activities. Surveys show that the average owner spends two hours a day to feed, train, groom, play, exercise and clean up after their pets;

- consider the costs involved such as toys, grooming, food, medical care and annual licenses and shots;

- be realistic and don't buy a dog or cat to teach a child responsibility. Caring for an animal is an adult's job. It sends a bad message to a child to return an animal, because it shows a responsibility can be discarded if it becomes inconvenient;

- obtain permission from your landlord first;

- and determine if you have enough space to house the dog.
