Rumors abound as search for murder suspects continues

• Allsup's increased a reward for John Deibler's killers from \$1,000 to \$4,000 on Friday, the same day family and friends mourned the convenience store clerk at private funeral services.

Ten days after John Deibler was brutally stabbed to death in a convenience store bathroom, Ruidoso police Tuesday continued searching for two murder suspects, a police official said.

"There are rumors everywhere," Police Chief Lanny Maddox said regarding stories circulating about the murder, especially one pervasive myth that a female suspect has been arrested.

"We certainly want the public to be aware the murder is still open, that we do not have any arrests relating to this murder, and to squash this rumor for once and for all."

Community speculation has been abundant since the robbery and murder on Aug. 29, when a man and a woman reportedly walked into the Allsup's convenience store on U.S. Highway 70 near Sudderth during the early morning hours armed with a knife. Besides taking several cases of beer, Deibler's wallet and \$487, the robbers forced Deibler to the bathroom where he was stabbed more than a dozen times in the chest and back, police said.

Deibler's family held private funeral services for the 48-year-old man Friday, the same day Allsup's officials announced they are increasing

the Crimestoppers \$1,000 reward by \$3,000.

"By increasing the the amount to \$4,000, you will be amazed by what starts coming out of the wood work," Rich Guffey, an Allsup's security official, said Friday from his office in Corrales.

The money is awarded for information, even anonymous information, leading to indictments. Anonymous callers are given numbers to claim the reward money.

Ruidoso police aren't as confident the increased reward will elicit information. "I think the majority of citizens out there who have information referencing this murder are going to call us whether it's a dollar or a million dollars," Maddox said.

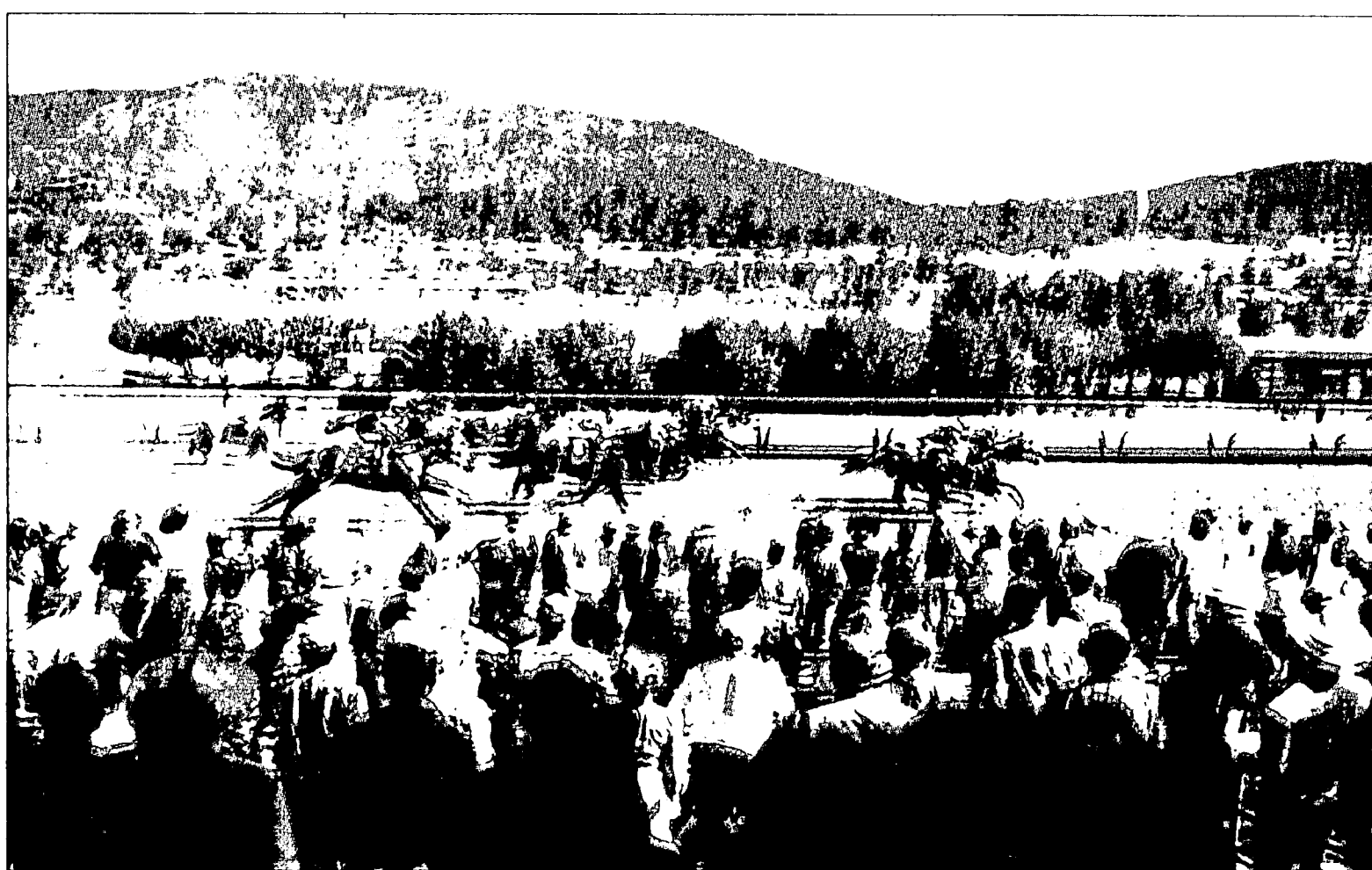
As of Tuesday morning, the department had received two Crimestoppers tips, said Lt. Wolf

Born, who is leading the investigation. Both were thin on information, such as a report that someone who resembled a suspect was seen at a local retail store, he said. People know what the suspects look like because drawings of them have been posted at most area businesses.

Police have two witnesses who saw the suspects in the store, Maddox said, adding that there may be more. One man who saw the suspects take cases of beer to a car, drove to another Allsup's store and called the police. Officer entered the deserted store at about 3:45 a.m. and found Deibler's body in the bathroom. Because Deibler received fatal stab wounds in the attack, Born said he believes the man died

Ruidoso council delays vote on DWI program

Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson isn't willing to guess when the Village Council will consider a \$111,000 state contract to manage a countywide program for DWI defendants.

"Well, it depends on what they pass in the resolution," Donaldson said, referring to Lincoln County Commissioners. "It has to be acceptable to us."

On Friday, Lincoln County Commissioners are to vote on a resolution to effectively relinquish control of the program to the village.

Donaldson on Tuesday told the village council his biggest concern about the resolution is whether it gives the village adequate control of the program. If not, Donaldson said, he was not in favor of taking the contract.

Last month, commissioners in a contentious split vote terminated their contract to administer the DWI program, which basically provides process-

ing and management of DWI defendants for judges in the county.

The intent of the program was majority was to give the village of Ruidoso to provide the contract and the program's management. For the past five months, the DWI program under county management has been beleaguered with fiscal mismanagement followed by allegations of nepotism and inadequate staffing. Commissioner Ron Wilson, who made the motion to terminate the program contract, said the program should go to the village since the county couldn't seem to be able to run it.

However, the county still retains fiscal responsibility over the program despite the terminated contract, and Nick Mandel, a project representative with the New Mexico Department of Finance Administration, who oversees DWI programs for Lincoln, Otero and other counties. Responsibility for the

No plans to shut down Fort Stanton post office

The post office at Fort Stanton is not being considered for closure or relocation, says the manager of administrative services for the Albuquerque district of the U.S. Postal Service.

Al Provencio said Tuesday that he received a letter dated Aug. 28 from the state assuring the Service that the post office operation will not be asked to move.

Jeffrey McFall of the property control division of the state General Services Department, wrote that the fort and the post office building are owned by his department, not by the Corrections Department, which leases the complex about 12 miles northeast of Ruidoso for a women's prison.

Warden Sandra McFadin notified the Service by letter dated July

24, that the post office building should be vacated. She contended that it presents a security risk, because it is close to the prison, but not under security supervision.

McFall wrote in his letter that a determination has been made that the Service will not be required to vacate, because GSD officials think the warden has other options to separate inmates from the general public than to close the post office, Provencio said.

"So we will continue to operate the post office at its present location," he said.

"I'd like to hear that directly," acting post master Willie Hobbs said Tuesday. "The news makes me very happy. My goodness, everybody says they don't want it closed. The need it too bad. It's too far to go to Capitan."

Mitigating mud and mudslinging

Standing next to an eight foot wide culvert along Deep Freeze ski run at Ski Apache, forester Sam Tobias said the installation is only one of the measures undertaken to reduce the likelihood of flooding and erosion in future heavy rainfalls.

He and Jerry Hawkes, head of the Smokey Bear Ranger District of the Lincoln National Forest, last week toured the ski resort's Apache Bowl area that was nearly washed away during two torrential rains in July and August of last year.

The Forest Service has a stake in the effectiveness of the changes, because the ski resort, although operated by the Mescalero Apache Tribe, sprawls across national forest land as well as the tribal reservation.

"A lot of work has been done," Hawkes said during a tour of the area Friday. "We've had experts here from the Rocky Mountain Research

Station, Environment Department, hydrologists, Ski Apache people and members of the Ruidoso River Association giving us ideas about what to do.

"But we seem to have one side saying it's a natural event and the other side saying the river is muddy."

To people living in Ruidoso, who still see mud in the Rio Ruidoso after rain, it may seem as if not enough has been done, Tobias said. But to prove his point that neither the Forest Service nor the Tribe has been idle, he compiled the dates of meetings on the issue and a list of some of the consulting experts.

The meetings started July 29, 1997, before the second heavy rain, with a visit by a state Environment Department official to assess the flood damage. Since then, 21 meetings or site visits by experts have occurred, including archaeologists, biologists and engineers.

In addition, either Tobias or forester John Brown visit the damaged section once a week or more.

A stabilization plan on forest land was approved by the district manager July 8, 1997. The Forest Service purchased the material and Ski Apache performed the earth work, which was wrapped up at Deep Freeze Hamden.

More than 200 feet of culvert was installed, as well as erosion control stabilization mesh mats and gabion baskets filled with rocks. Washed out areas also have been filled, leveled and covered with logs and brush material to hold down the soil and keep in the moisture. Some areas seeded last year, then installed this year in another place or corner, were seeded again, Tobias said.

A procedure also was approved by the Forest Service and Ski Apache staff for clearing out the pond on trail and near the resort buildings.

"Last year, most of the effort went into repair," Tobias said. This fall, Ski Apache worked with us to reshape major drainage areas and stabilize stream banks and minor drainage structures.

Part of the project is to

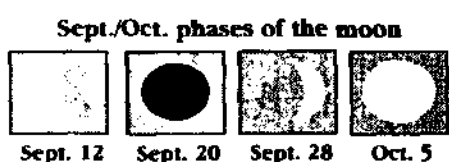

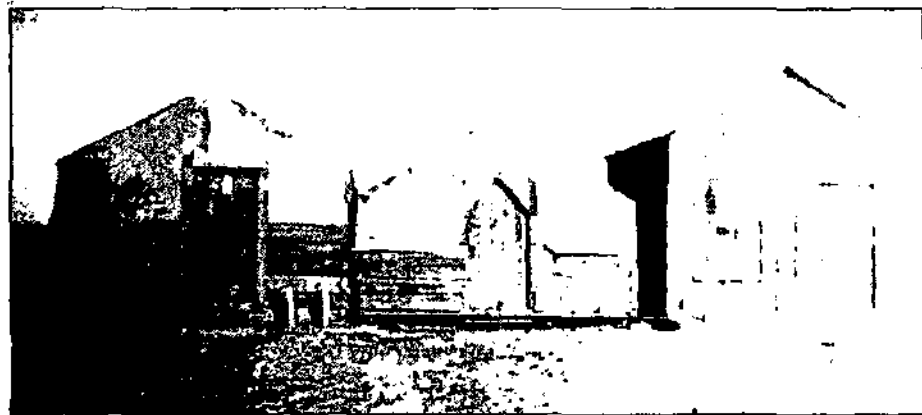

program would need to be formally handed to the village in the form of a resolution, Mandel said.

Mandel, speaking before the Ruidoso Village Council Tuesday night, said he saw no problem with Ruidoso assuming management of the DWI program.

"It certainly seems like the village has the technical competency and the personnel competency to take this on," Mandel told village councilors.

Ruidoso Village Manager Alan Briley said the county should still provide the 10 percent local match of \$11,000 for the grant.

Donaldson, following the meeting, echoed Briley's comment, saying the program, even if administered by the village, would provide a countywide service.

Rent on offices for the

recently terminated program should be adequate for the match, he added.

Magistrate Judge William Butts, who reportedly handles the most DWI cases in the county, on Tuesday urged Ruidoso councilors to take the program contract.

Without the program to reduce the workload of a judge's staff, DWI defendants cannot be adequately monitored and processed, he said.

Furthermore, the county has "failed to oversee this program, and they have blatantly failed to hire qualified people (to operate the program) which is of utmost importance," Butts said.

County commissioners Wilton Howell and Monroy Montes, who both voted against terminating the county's contract, have previously said Butts' objections to the county operation and staffing of the program are tinged by a personal dislike of Montes.

quickly.

Rumors that the male suspect was seen on video-taped gambling at the Inn of the Mountain Gods are groundless, Born said. So is a story that the police were tipped off about the male suspect's location but took too long getting there and the man escaped, he said.

"We are getting leads every day," Born said. "Some are dead-ends, others we are still looking into."

Despite apparent challenges in the case, Maddox expressed full confidence that the suspects will be found and arrested. "I think the investigation is in very capable hands, but again we need informa-

tion."

Though optimistic of solving the murder, Born didn't think the suspects were still in the Ruidoso area. "That's my guess. I can't see them being here. I personally don't think they are locals, either," he said, contrary to earlier police statements that the couple is believed to be recent transfers to the area.

Wherever they are, the suspects are probably spending coins. Most of the money stolen from the store was in coins, according to officials.

Clerks at Allsup's stores with time-lock safes keep only \$40 in the cash register during the graveyard shift, according to company policy. However, change may be obtained from the safe as needed by clerks,

Guffey said. A malfunction in the safe allowed the robbers to "drop" coins every 10 seconds instead of the customary 3-minutes, he said. The delay is designed to be a deterrent to robbers.

"Apparently they were able to get into the time lock and drop all of the rolls out of it," Guffey said.

To help its employees cope with the brutal murder, Allsup's last week provided area employees with counseling, called critical stress debriefing, Guffey said. All the stores closed during Deibler's funeral services so employees could attend, he said. No employees have quit or refused to work graveyard shifts since the robbery, he said.

Guffey said Allsup's will

pay Deibler's beneficiaries more than \$100,000 in compensation over the next 15 years because he was killed at work, based on state law. Deibler, who was divorced and lived alone, has three sons and a daughter, according to LaGrone Funeral Home. The family also received a \$3,000 immediate death benefit to help offset funeral costs, Guffey said.

None of Allsup's stores in Ruidoso have security cameras, and there are no plans to install them, Guffey said. Of the company's more than 300 stores, only a few in high crime areas have security cameras, he said, adding that cameras do not prevent robberies.

"It wouldn't have kept John from being killed," Guffey said.

old roads drained the water into Apache Bowl," the area from which a huge chunk of dirt was washed away in 1997 that had been used to fill the bowl years earlier, Hawkes said. Sliced by a yawning 15-foot gully created by a flood after about 2 1/2 inches of rain fell in one hour in July and by about the same amount in August, the bowl's interior was exposed.

Foresters could see old tree trunks apparently used as fill material four decades ago to round off the bowl for skiing, Hawkes said.

The drainage on the roads has been changed, in part by using more water bars, which consist of mounds of dirt that cut across a road at a 45 degree angle to divert water off the road.

New grass can be seen cropping up throughout the project from previous seeding. Stream banks have been restored and reshaped using larger rocks.

The most intensive work is concentrated on the steepest grades where the quantity and velocity of water would be the greatest, Hawkes said.

Culverts also should help prevent more erosion, he said. Structures such as gabion baskets have been inserted into the water channel above and below the culvert to slow the flow of water and catch silt, he pointed out.

Some roads also may be closed to reduce silt runoff.

"Most of Ski Apache is in pretty good shape," Hawkes said. But much of the natural drainage from the mountain top is channeled into the bowl, he said, motioning to the ridge that surrounds the Deep

Freeze ski run.

One of the major points of controversy between members of the Ruidoso River Association and Ski Apache surrounds two settling ponds on tribal land, used to make snow for the ski runs in the winter and to catch silt in water moving down the mountain.

Hawkes pointed out that the water entering and leaving the ponds was clear Friday.

"They'll always be some mud (after rain) from natural erosion and from so many dirt roads in Upper Canyon," Hawkes said. Silt deposits caught somewhere along the stream between the resort and the village also may be moving down the stream, the foresters said.

Last year, Ski Apache staff erred by cleaning out silt in the pond on a holiday weekend while it still was raining, he said.

This year, Denny Grover, who the foresters credited with doing the bulk of the planning and directing of the actual physical work on the project for Ski Apache, is creating a plastic-lined diversion canal that will allow him to reroute water around the

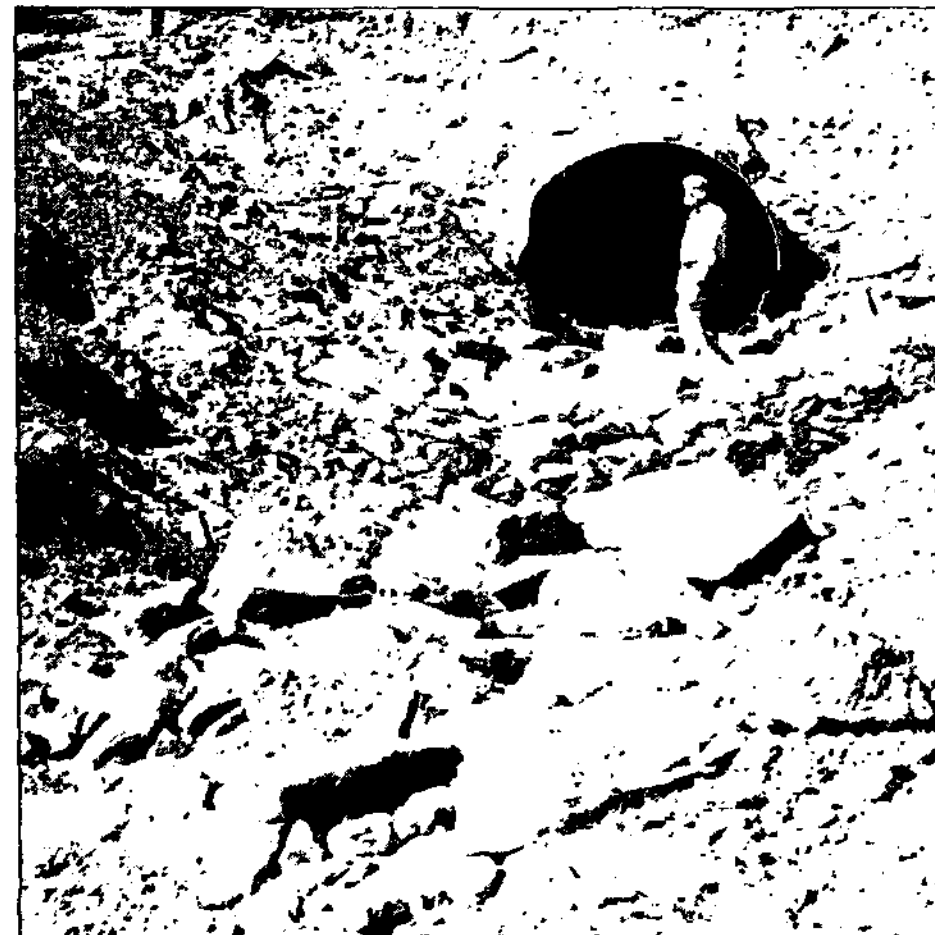
pond while the silt material is removed, preventing it from traveling down stream, they said.

"We're still thinking about what to do with the silt that comes off the Ski Apache parking lot and the silt ponds on the Reservation, but the first thing that had to be taken care of was the drainage," Hawkes said. "River association members probably would have liked to see (the parking lot and ponds) done first."

The Forest Service has spent about \$60,000 on material for the corrections and repairs, including \$17,000 for the culvert, Hawkes said.

That doesn't include the salaries of the expert consultants or what has been spent by Ski Apache, he said.

"I think the work has been pretty effective considering the complexity of the situation and the number of agencies and entities involved," Hawkes said. "We all want to keep the water as clear as possible. That's an impressive goal (declared by the river association). We just don't all agree we're doing it fast enough. You can't do it overnight. A lot of it is healing on its own."

Commissioners to review DWI program, jail issues, management

The Lincoln County Commission meeting room could sizzle Friday as the chief judge of the 12th Judicial District confronts Lincoln County Commissioners who have criticized the handling of jail sentences by district, magistrate and municipal judges.

The appearance of Robert M. Doughty is the seventh item on a 40-item agenda that will begin at 9 a.m. in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Doughty is expected to answer criticism leveled primarily by Commissioner

Wilton Howell during previous discussion of problems of overcrowding at the county jail and of alternative programs to jail time.

Commissioner Monroy Montes has asked for a discussion of the county's narcotics investigation unit. A resolution to transfer the county's DWI monitoring program to the village of Ruidoso will be considered, as will approval of the final layout of Los Chozas subdivision requested by Ron Green of the

Bonito Land and Livestock Inc.

Jim Stover is looking for commission approval of the transfer of land from Tinnie Baptists Church to the county to be used to build a new ambulance garage.

Other agenda items include:

- A presentation on financing for a new county detention center by Jon K. Zaman, director of Program Outreach for the New Mexico Finance Authority.

- A policy on the handling of inmate money at the jail, put on the agenda by Howell.

- A hearing to consider changes to the ordinances creating the Agricultural and Rural Affairs Advisory Committee, the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board and the Public Lands Use Advisory Council.

- An update on the Census 2000 Project by census coordinator Marshall F. Conover.

- Approval of a data processing agreement with Triadic Enterprises.

cessing agreement with Triadic Enterprises.

- Approval of a mental health services contract for the county jail by Mary Satonica, doing business as Better Days: Treatment and Crisis Management.

- Consideration of a county-wide property tax levy for Eastern New Mexico State University-Ruidoso.

- A discussion of roads that have been included in the design of subdivisions, but never built, put on the agenda

by Commissioner Rex Wilson.

- Selection of a project for a Community Development Block Grant.

- A discussion of the county's mileage and per diem policy, put on the agenda by Montes.

- Scheduling of interviews of finalists for the position of county manager and a discussion of compensation for Martha Guevara, who has been acting county manager since April.

SWA proxy policy meets legal challenge

A meeting to discuss the reorganization of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority was postponed last week after an attorney representing the village of Capitan challenged the legality of the proxy voting system of the board.

Authority general manager Jerry Wright said the special board meeting had been switched last week from Tuesday to Monday to accommodate members from Ruidoso, who are needed to create a quorum. The Ruidoso members will not vote on reorganization issues, because the village is pulling out of the collection

aspects of the operation.

He faxed notices of the change of dates, but for some reason Capitan representative Debra Ingle did not receive her notice at the same time as other members, Wright said. She was not able to attend and asked Capitan Mayor Norm Renfro to take her proxy and her place at the table.

However, Ingle was told that only another appointed member of the board could use her proxy, Renfro said Monday. "We didn't think that was in the best interests of Capitan," he said.

Capitan Village Attorney

Dave Thomsen challenged the authority's proxy system and board members decided to move the session to next Tuesday instead of risking an error. Authority attorney Don Dutton was unavailable for consultation, Wright said.

Representatives of Southwest Disposal, which collects some local commercial accounts and operates in Las Cruces and Alamogordo, were at the meeting to present a proposal to handle collection for the county and the remaining four municipalities in the authority, Wright said.

Firefighter killed in California accident

One Lincoln National Forest firefighter was killed and two others were injured late Friday, when they were involved in a five-vehicle accident west of Williams, Calif.

The accident occurred when a Ford pickup truck crossed the center line of the highway into the lane of two fire engines from the Lincoln National Forest, according to a California Highway Patrol news release.

Killed in the accident was Juan Manuel Hernandez Jr., 21, from Alamogordo, who was riding in the second engine. The driver of the pickup also died. Hernandez was in his second season as a firefighter for the Lincoln National Forest on Engine 239 based in Mayhill.

Gerald Simmons and Dirk Freed of the Smokey Bear Ranger District in Lincoln County, who were in the first fire engine, were not injured seriously.

When the pickup headed toward the first engine, the driver lost control and the engine ran off the side of the road, overturning. The pickup continued on the wrong side of the road, striking the second fire engine, which also ran off the road and overturned. The pickup then slammed head-on into a Toyota pickup.

Occupants of the Toyota pickup were injured and taken to local hospitals. The driver of another car collided into some of the disabled vehicles, but was not injured in the impact.

Paula Hendrickson and Jay Northcott, who were riding with

Hernandez in the second engine, were hospitalized. Hendrickson was treated and released, but Northcott suffered serious facial and body lacerations and a compound fracture to his wrist. He was released Sunday from Enloe Hospital in Chico, Calif., where he underwent surgery on his wrist.

Couple hit by bus

A Las Cruces man and his wife were injured Monday when their pickup was hit broadside by a tour bus.

Although the driver of the GMC 1994 pickup, David Vigil, suffered injuries to his lung and ribs, he was in good condition Tuesday and was able to talk about the ordeal.

"We had been fishing at Bonito Lake, but figured we couldn't get a room in Ruidoso, there were so many people, so we came to Carrizozo instead," the 35-year-old Vigil said. "We were headed out of town (Monday) and the parade was about to begin, but I took the wrong

turn toward Corona (north on U.S. 54)."

He turned around and started across the intersection when he was hit by a tour bus heading west on U.S. 380 and driven by Baron Ussery, no age or home town listed.

Investigating New Mexico State Police officers Paul Bryan and Rob Eshom wrote in their report that a citation is pending.

Vigil said his 13-year-old son, who was sitting in the front seat with his parents, was only bruised. His 11-year-old daughter was pinned in the extended cab of the pickup and had to be extricated with special equipment.

"They were amazed that she stayed so calm, especially because we already had left in the ambulance," Vigil said from his room at Gerald Champion Hospital in Alamogordo. "She just had a few scratches."

Vigil's wife, Laura, suffered five broken ribs and a punctured lung. The accident occurred about 10:05 a.m.



A good quote is worth repeating

There is nothing like a few good quotable quotations to start the after-Labor Day season off right, even if they did originate before the holiday. (A "good quotation" is one that not only sums up an idea, but garnishes it with some food for thought.)

After a years-long tug of war between land-using ranchers and air-using Air Force (U. S. and German) people over expansion of low-level flight training areas, the Lincoln Forest Permittees' Association has joined with the Otero County Cattlemen's Association in bringing a suit to block it.

An Alpine, Texas, rancher named Bryan Kelley, who has been leading the Texas side of the battle contributed a thought that sums up the feeling of many civilians in southeastern New Mexico: "We don't like to sue our own Air Force," he said, "but if they won't talk to us..."

In Lincoln County, where the county commissioners have provided more quotable quotes in the past few months than anybody else, at least three more were added last week about the county's 1998-99 budget, just completed.

Commissioner Rex Wilson — "I as one commissioner am not going to dictate changes to the finance department..."

Commissioner Bill Schwettmann—"A budget is nothing more than a calculated guess about how much money we will take in and spend."

Commissioner Wilton Howell — "If someone is to blame, I told (the commissioners) to look in the mirror."

The budget will be reviewed by the state's Local Government Division before it becomes final.

Perhaps the most quotable quote of all, coming three weeks after it was announced that Ruidoso Downs Race Track was changing its name, came from Rick Baugh, who manages the track:

"After 52 years of racing and 40 years of All American Futurities, we felt like the name should remain Ruidoso Downs Racetrack."

Ground will be broken for a new casino adjacent to the grandstand later this month, and eventually the signs on Highway 70 will state (maybe in Las Vegas neon?) "Ruidoso Downs Racetrack and Casino." Typographic and linguistic purists will note that "race track" has become one word in the new title.

But what's in a name? It's the tradition that counts, here summed up in a quotation worth repeating.

The erosion view from the mountain

Frankly, I'm disappointed...after reading your editorial regarding Ski Apache, and the lack of cooperation with the Ruidoso River Association. I take exception with your conclusions and fault you for only seeking one opinion.

The first point is for there to be a lack of cooperation there must be a plan, or suggestions, put forth by one group and ignored by another. The River Association has never put forth a plan other than suggesting beavers be reintroduced in the Rio Ruidoso—a project that is way beyond our scope at Ski Apache.

My involvement with the River Association goes back to...the heavy runoff after the first large storm last year. I received a call from the State Engineer in Santa Fe wanting to know about the dam breaching. Somewhat confused (as I was standing on the dam talking on a cell phone) I was told a Mr. Ben Mason had called him about the dam breaching. The water was flowing over the spillway as designed and the pond was catching yards of sediment. Mr. Mason had not bothered to stop and ask us, but had called the State Engineer...

The USFS brokered several meetings and tours of the ski area and flood damage in Apache Bowl. There were representatives of the...U. S. Forest Service, state and federal EPA, State Engineer, Corps of Engineers, State Fish and Game. It finally was agreed that the dam had not breached. Mr. Mason I guess forgot...

Over the past year we have

had many meetings with the various applicable government agencies and their individual specialists. These meetings were to come up with a plan for repairs for the short and long term. Because of the lack of experience and expertise in the River Association they were sometimes included and sometimes not. The Forest Service did take them on tours fairly often.

Short-term repairs were completed so Deep Freeze, Apache Bowl could be skied last winter. The erosion was dramatic; a gully 500 feet long and 30 to 40 feet wide and 20 feet deep. Water levels reached 8 to 10 feet up the Deep Freeze Canyon walls and deposited piles of rock and boulders up to 200 pounds (and) 5 and 6 feet tall. We contoured, water barred, and seeded the whole area affected and hoped El Niño would bring enough snow to allow skiing.

The spring brought more experts, and no one would commit to a plan. Ski Apache presented a program that was finally agreed upon as being the most likely to succeed, and it was approved. The plan was a composite of a great deal of input from agencies and our own sweat engineering.

The area was recontoured, much waterbarring added; geo fabric was installed where indicated, rock Gabion water drops made, 200 feet of 7-foot diameter culvert with inlet surface drains installed, geo fabric installed under rocks in the head of the creek and the whole area planted.

While the time element may seem long to people not familiar with government agencies (we had a bunch) it was in fact quite rapid. John

Brown and Sam Tobias of the Forest Service have our thanks for this support, coordination and cooperation.

In regard to the silt in the snowmaking pond: It has not been removed yet. If, we learned anything from last year's flood it was, don't mess with silt during the monsoons. The pond is not full of silt and is still capturing it. The method of removing it will be modified (as suggested by) the Corps of Engineers.

The roads and parking lots remain the same, with the exception of additional and larger waterbarring as suggested by USFS, BLM and the Mescalero EPA.

All of these things have been accomplished with a cooperative effort between Ski Apache and the various concerned government agencies. We may be guilty of not including the River Association in our planning or advising them of our actions. They, however, have taken an antagonistic position and have little to no experience or knowledge in the remediation of the problem.

The problem is a natural one: Erosion. I have never witnessed so dynamic and dramatic erosion of a protected slope in over 30 years on the mountain. The storms and flooding were not a product of Ski Apache and in some ways were mitigated by Ski Apache's presence. Yards of material were lost downstream; however, many yards were captured and removed from the river.

I cannot fault the River Association for their concerns. I do, however, give them failing marks on honesty...

In regard to the River Association's focus and their close working relationship with the

village, I would suggest...areas that would be appropriate:

- Develop a plan dealing with the runoff from all the unpaved streets in the Upper Canyon. I'm sure they represent many more acres than the ski area's parking lots. I know the gullies are deeper than in our parking lot, as I drive over them coming home.

- Develop a plan regarding the flow from the Grindstone Dam. That white stuff flowing into Carrizo Creek and the Rio Ruidoso, I'm told, is an environmental problem.

- Suggest to their membership a moratorium on the use of private wells for water, particularly during low stream flow. It doesn't take a mental giant to realize that that contributes to lowered stream volumes.

- Continue with their river clean-ups; that is a very worthwhile project, and they have my thanks. The volume of trash is unbelievable.

- They might also look at Cedar Creek, as it runs mud every time it rains. (Never mind; forget Cedar Creek, as they might conclude that the mud is from the old ski area which was closed over 30 years ago.)

Be assured that Ski Apache is a concerned tenant also. We spend a great deal of money and effort with our erosion control programs. We are probably unhappier than anyone when an incident such as last year's storm occurs. It makes a helluva lot of work for us.

I often think of the story of two businessmen sitting on the beach enjoying their insurance settlements from their business losses. The first man said he had a fire, the second said he had a flood; then the first asked, "how do you start a flood?"

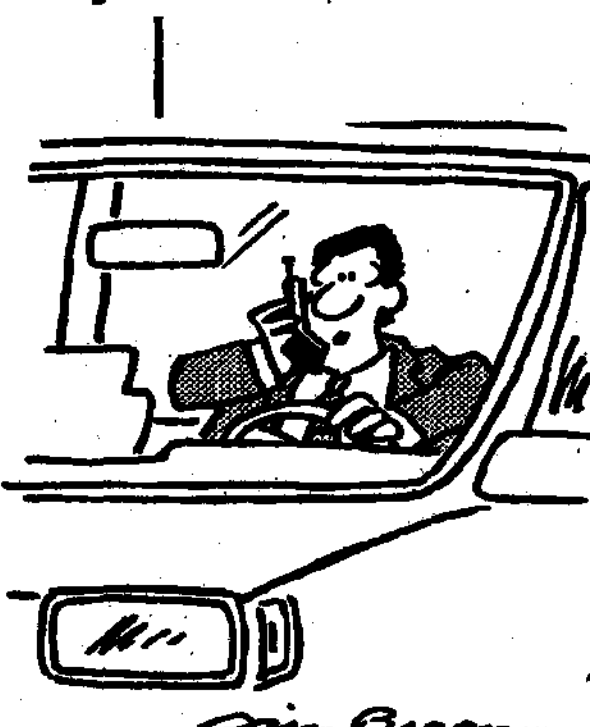

Controversial Los Chozas subdivision up for county approval

Although a criminal investigation of possible illegal lot sales still is underway, the Lincoln County Commission will have the option to approve a proposed subdivision east of Lincoln at its meeting Sept. 11.

District Attorney Scot Key and attorney J. Robert Beauvais, representing the Bonito Land and Livestock Company and its principals Max Kiehle and Ron Green, hammered out an agreement last week on

civil issues surrounding the Los Chozas subdivision.

The agreement specifically requires the developers to advise in writing people who have entered into written contracts to purchase land in the proposed subdivision about their right to void the contracts by executing and returning a notice of rescission.

The developers also will be required to return any money, property or other considerations paid to them by any purchasers who elect to rescind their purchase agreement.

Until the layout of the sub-

division, which is called a plat, is approved by the commission, the developers must stop selling, leasing, contracting or otherwise taking any action with the intent to sell or offer for sale land in the proposed 15-lot subdivision.

Beauvais noted that the agreement is not an admission by Green, vice president of the company, of any violation of law and does not preclude Key from pursuing criminal charges.

Key said last week he has not ruled out criminal prosecution, but should know by the

commission meeting if he will proceed. Special penalty misdemeanors are punishable by fines of up to \$10,000 and up to one year in jail, Key said.

At the same time the development was being put together by Green and Kiehle's company, the New Mexico Real Estate Commission was in the process of revoking Green's real estate broker's license.

The action does not affect the Los Chozas subdivision, said attorney William Lutz of Las Cruces, who represented Green at a commission meet-

ing last month.

A notice that Green's license was revoked was contained in the July 1998 list of disciplinary actions by the state commission.

The notice specified that Green did not contest the action. Attempts to reach Green for comment through Lutz and through Western Land Realty in Roswell were unsuccessful.

According to state commission records, the action was based on a complaint filed against Green June 9, 1997, by Douglass W. Kopp, who

accused Green of using for his own benefit some of \$25,000 in earnest money placed in a trust account, that he moved money around and "lied to the complainant when the complainant contracted to purchase a ranch located on the Hondo River."

Green had a previous letter of reprimand from the commission dated Aug. 6, 1993, for "fraud, knowing or willful misrepresentation or wrongful conversion of funds entrusted to him," according to the commission report submitted by investigator Ruth Argaud.

McGwire, in his second at-bat of the game, smacked the first pitch from Chicago pitcher Steve Trachsel. The 341-foot frozen rope cleared the left field wall at Busch Stadium.

McGwire sprinted toward first base as though he wasn't sure the ball would clear the fence. When it did, he raised his arms but missed the first base bag and had to go back and touch it before continuing his home run trot.

Maris hit 61 homers in the 1961. After breaking Maris' mark, McGwire hugged his son, Matt, his teammates, and fellow home run record chaser Sammy Sosa of the Cubs. Then he climbed into the stands to hug the Maris family. After about a 10-minute celebration and standing ovation, the game resumed.

Feisty filly foils the favorites in Futurity

• Brooks wins his seventh All American Futurity with a "stout, big" filly. Owners David and Susan Mackie's first venture into quarter horse racing pays off big.

Timing is everything when you're Falling In Loveagain.

Just ask jockey G.R. Carter, who's flipped over the 2-year-old filly, winner of Monday's \$1.9 million All American Futurity at Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Carter won his first All American aboard the feisty filly when she simply outran the field after getting away from the gates cleanly.

"There were a couple of others that might have broken with me," Carter said. "But about 50 yards into the race, she just hit a nice little spurt."

It then became a case of just looking for the wire, he added.

As promised, Carter dismounted in the winner's circle with a back flip off his new love.

For Falling In Loveagain trainer, Jack Brooks, the victory renewed his love affair with the All American Futurity for a record seventh time.

"This was one of the most exciting races for me because no one expected it," Brooks said. "This horse has been knocking on the door all year but has had some bad breaks at the gates."

Favorites at post time, Hes My Dasher and Old Habits finished fourth and second respectively. W.O. Bergeron's Party Girl Affair was third.

Old Habits beat Falling In Loveagain in the 18th futurity trial Aug. 20 by a 1 1/2 lengths.

But Brooks liked what he saw in that race.

"Take away Old Habits and I thought I had the second best horse," Brooks said.

She was the best the second time around, covering the 440 yards in 21.49 seconds — the second fastest time in the finals since Winalota Cash's 21.18 in 1995.

The filly's clean start from the No. 3 position Monday was the difference, said Brooks.

"This filly has always run big on the inside. If she stays on her feet, it takes a lot of horse to catch her," Brooks said. "If this filly gets on the lead ... she runs a bunch."

Old Habits jockey Dusty Stimpson found that out.

"He didn't leave like he usually can," Stimpson said. "He kind of stumbled away from the gate. They had us beat quite a ways, but he was making a nice run of it down on the end of it, so I think that stumble cost us."

Jockey Joe Badilla and his steed, Hes My Dasher, fell victim the same way.

"(Falling In Loveagain) outbroke us by about a shoulder, then she held me off," Badilla said.

"About a hundred yards from the wire, she kind of edged away from us and I didn't have any more horse," Badilla said.

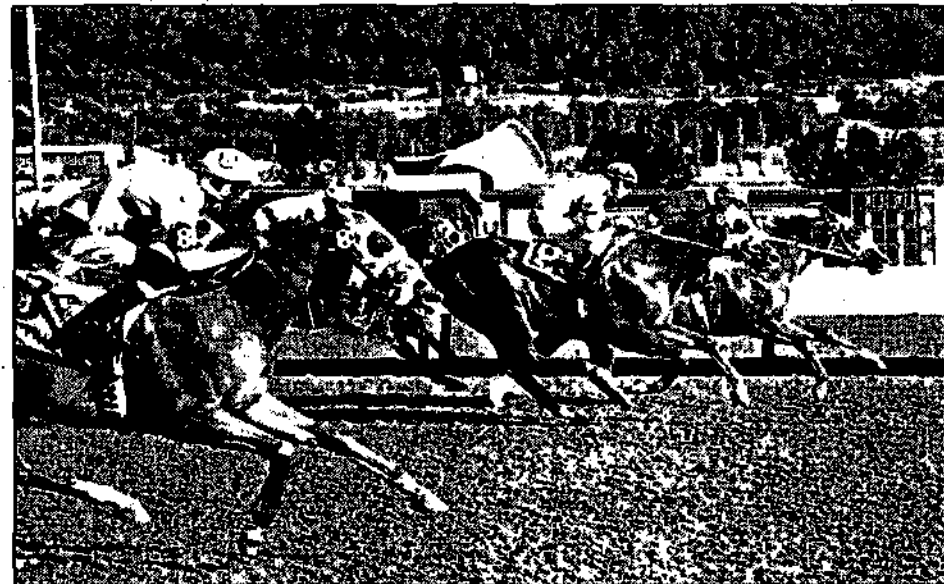
Brooks had plenty of horse. Leading up to the finals, Falling In Loveagain seemed to be reaching her peak, Brooks said.

She shook a virus bug a couple of weeks ago and continued to train well, he added.

The "stout, big" filly loves to train, Brooks said. "She trains like a stud horse — the best filly to train with."

Owner David Mackie said his first investment into quarter horse racing is "his (Brooks') kind of filly." Mackie and his wife, Susan, purchased Falling In Loveagain for \$92,000 at last year's Ruidoso Super Select Sale — the highest-priced yearling at the 1997 sale.

"It seemed like a pretty high price but it's looking good now," David Mackie said after the race.

Falling In Loveagain earned \$1,077,873 of the \$1.9 million purse. It was the second-highest purse in race history.

Just over 11,000 sun-

drenched race fans watched the last day of the 1998 race meet. Total handle Monday reached \$1.4 million, a six percent increase over last year.

Racehorse euthanized after breaking down

Both tears of joy and tears of sadness fell Monday after the 40th running of the All American Futurity.

While the winners celebrated their win, others gasped in horror when Futurity finalist Chicks Infinity broke down about a 100 yards after the finish line.

The 2-year-old filly broke her right front leg, causing her to somersault over jockey Eddie Garcia.

Garcia was thrown onto the track. Chicks Infinity, the final's second-fastest qualifier, regained her feet and limped away. She was later euthanized.

Garcia was transported to Lincoln County Medical Center where he was treated for a broken collarbone and broken ribs and released, according to track and hospital officials.

'All of this for a 22-second race'

The crew of 20 was up and at 'em before the sun crept over the mountainous horizon and started warming the crisp early fall air.

The immediate job before them: laying more than two miles of cable, positioning four television cameras and setting up a portable satellite dish.

They have about eight hours to get everything ready before broadcasting this assignment: the feature race at Ruidoso Downs Race Track, the 40th running of the All American Futurity.

Pete Finarelli, unit manager for Winner Communications, turns his troops loose before turning his attentions to the reporter shadowing his early morning moves.

"We started by coming to these tracks, putting together a show and

selling it to whoever wanted it via satellite," explains Finarelli. "Our company started right here in Ruidoso, doing quarter horse racing back in 1981."

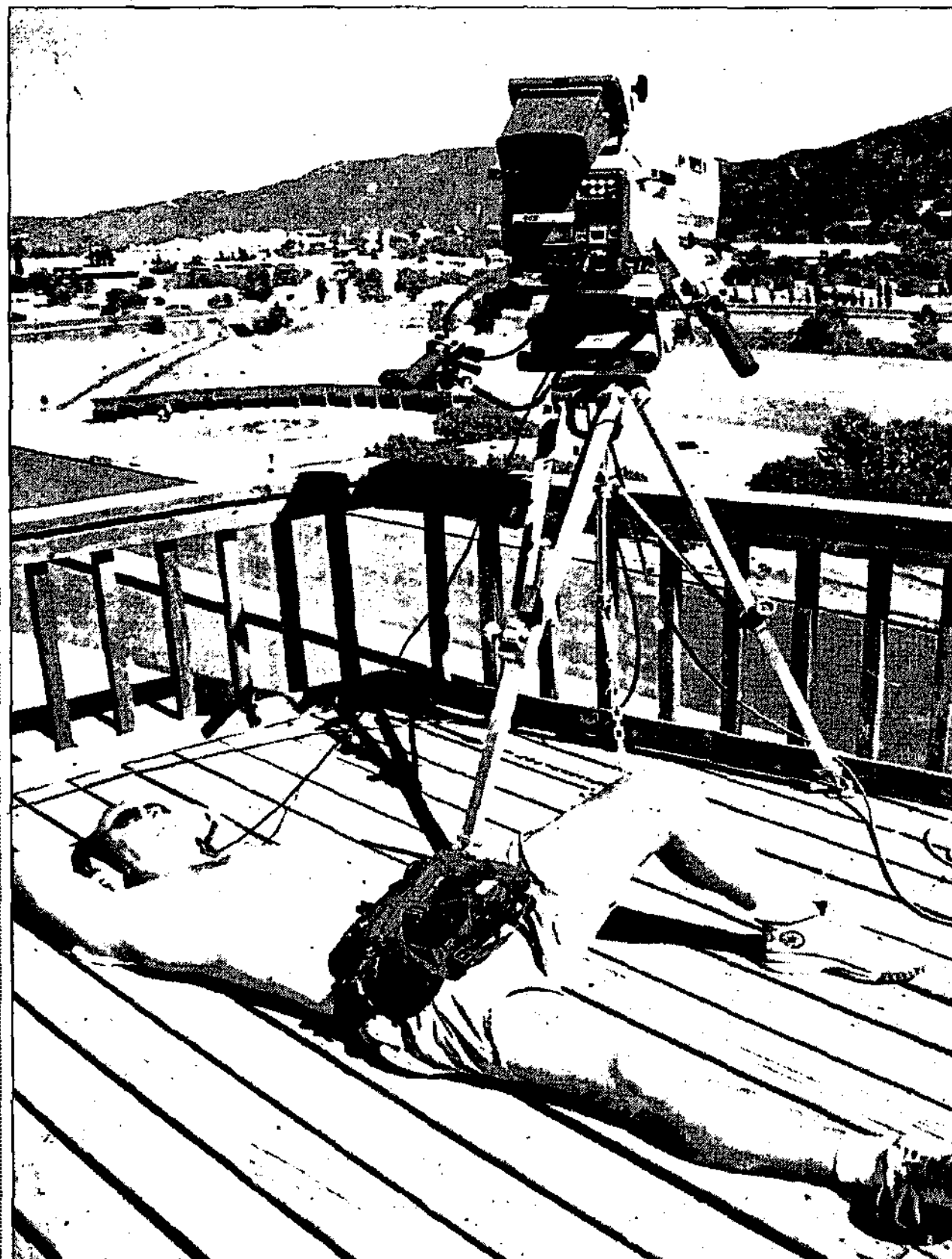
Now Winner Communications is ESPN's largest contractor for programming. Winner Communications produces shows featuring the thoroughbred Triple Crown, other top horse races, soccer games and rodeos, such as the national finals.

Monday's assignment is "small" compared to the crew's coverage of the Kentucky Derby. That involved weeks of preplanning and several days of on-site set-up for the 20 cameras and miles and miles of cable.

"Today, we'll be in and out," Finarelli says. "But it is a logistical nightmare."

The challenge for Finarelli and

The 'Downs' is not out for long Racetrack officials stick with traditional name

Tradition has prevailed, and so has Ruidoso Downs, the village.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track General Manager Rick Baugh said at Sunday's All American Ball that the track will not change its name to Ruidoso Racetrack and Casino, as earlier announced by Hubbard Enterprises, parent company of Ruidoso Downs Racing.

"After 52 years of racing and 40 years of All American Futurities, we felt like the name should remain Ruidoso Downs Racetrack," Baugh said Tuesday.

Three weeks after

announcing in a press release that it would drop "Downs" from its name and tack on "Casino," management switched to the more tradition-sensitive, Ruidoso Downs Racetrack and Casino.

What prompted the switch? Perhaps a little flack from Ruidoso Downs residents?

"No, not really," Baugh denied.

With the 1998 race meet in the books after Monday's races, Baugh now directs his attention to finalizing the plans for the casino which will be built adjacent to the track's grandstand.

"We hope to be breaking ground the latter part of this month," Baugh said.

show director Dorinda Ivey is that the Ruidoso segment comprised only 18 minutes of the hour-long show.

"In horse racing, post times can be held up. It's a timing nightmare," says Finarelli, an Alamogordo native, who got his start in broadcasting at a radio station in his hometown.

Ivey directs the show from a television production truck that is the size of a semi-trailer. Finarelli rented the truck from Southwest Television out of Phoenix. Contained in it are the sound room, a director's area, the tape room and a production room where the cameras' pictures are adjusted.

"This is a beautiful, beautiful facility," Ivey says.

Feeding the electricity to the trailer is a generator Finarelli rented from an Albuquerque broadcasting company.

His people operating the equipment come from across the country for these kind of assignments. "Most are freelancers that are proven to do a good job," Finarelli says.

Camera man Tom Stone, 35, is one of those freelancers. Stone, who lives in Tulsa, Okla., helps lay the camera cable and set up the camera he'll be using.

"It's easy except for three minutes. I have to be good for the three minutes (of the race)," Stone says of his job. "You've got to find the winner. But I make it look a lot harder than it really is," adds Stone with a laugh.

After all the equipment is in place and lunch has been consumed, Ivey talks to Stone about which horse he'll be focusing on.

"Your iso (focus) is the (No.) six (horse)," Ivey says to Stone.

She mentions some other

shots she wants of the race: dignitaries and the winner's circle.

Stone adds, "We just hope we get lucky in picking something that will be interesting — something that will tell part of the story."

At 3 p.m., the crew goes through a dry-run of the 18-minute segment.

Pre-taped features play, Stone follows a race for practice, audio and graphics are cued up and the satellite link is checked.

"We just stop everything at that point. We check all communications, all cameras, everything to make sure it's working properly," Finarelli says.

By 3:30 p.m., they are ready for the big race, which is still more than an hour and 20 minutes away. At 4 p.m., they begin their cut-ins to the main show and wait for their cue with live race.

When their portion of the broadcast is over, it will take the crew about two hours to break down the equipment and re-pack it. Then each of them will scatter like dandelion seeds in the breeze off to their next assignment or maybe home for a few days.

"All of this for a 22-second race," Finarelli says.

"I have to be good for the three minutes (of the race)."

Rio Grande 34, Ruidoso 33

The Warriors were their own worst enemy in a 34-33 loss to Rio Grande Friday in Albuquerque.

Ruidoso (1-1 overall) suffered its first setback of the season when it committed 15 penalties for 158 yards. The Warrior defense accounted for about 100 of the 158 yards.

"Four different times we continued their drive for them," Ruidoso coach Les Carter said. "Instead of doing the fundamentals, we were so keyed up that we over-reacted."

Rio Grande scored the go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter. Facing a fourth-down-and-16 deep in Ruidoso territory, Rio Grande tried to pass the ball, but threw incomplete. The Warriors, however, were flagged for illegal use of the hands, giving Rio Grande another shot at the touchdown. This time, the Ravens scored on Eloy Nevarez's 7-yard run.

Ruidoso nearly rallied when quarterback Corey Saenz found Josh Varnadore on a long pass play that would have given the Warriors field position inside the Rio Grande 20-yard line.

But the pass play was called back because of a holding call against Ruidoso.

Carter said the Warriors have to be mentally stronger.

"We just have to play above adversity. When situations are adverse, we have to rise to the occasion," Carter said. "We should have done the things we needed to, to win the ball game."

Ruidoso's passing game, which wasn't much of a factor in the season-opener, came alive against Rio Grande. Saenz finished 7-for-12 with three touchdowns and a pair of interceptions. The Warriors also gained 109 yards on the ground.

"We've put 77 points on the board in two weeks, and that's not too bad against two AAAA teams," Carter said. "We're OK. It's just tough to take a loss anytime."

Ruidoso's only casualty Fri-

day was defensive end Chris Parsons. Parsons bumped his head on the artificial surface during the opening kickoff. He suffered neck spasms and left the game. Carter expects Parsons to return to the lineup for Friday's duel with Socorro.

Fort Sumner 34, Capitan 0

The defending Class A champs, Fort Sumner, rudely greeted visiting Capitan Friday with a 34-0 blanketing of the Tigers.

"We didn't get off the bus. Mentally we just weren't ready for the ball game," Capitan coach Ed Davis said. "There's no excuses. We got our butts whipped."

The Tiger coach credited the Fort Sumner performance as well. "They have a good ball club," he said.

The Foxes forged a 14-0 halftime lead.

"As bad as we were playing there were sparks in our offense," Davis said.

Four times the Tigers penetrated inside the Fort Sumner 10-yard line only to come away empty-handed.

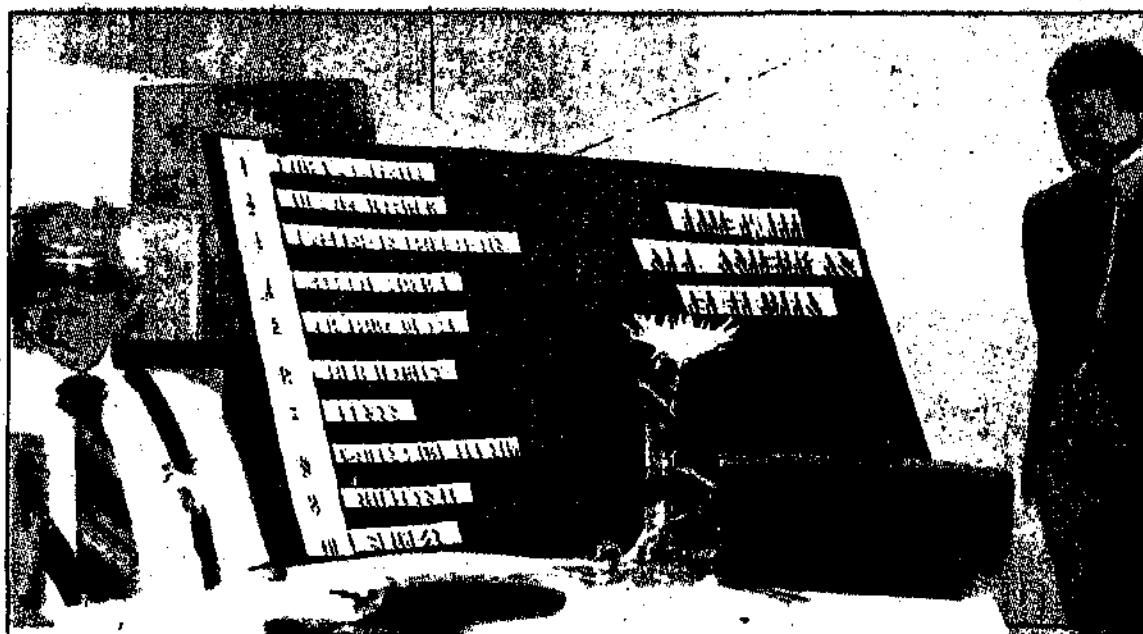

Besides the Ruidoso Valley, apples grow in the upper Bonito, the Mescalero Reservation and over around Bent, up towards Cloudcroft, in High Rolls and Mountain Park.

Apples everywhere, as the saying goes, are both medicine and food. Our high-altitude apples have certain health qualities all their own.

Getting back to Labor Day, it is a turning point in the year, quite aside from being a seasonal landmark.

Folks start leaving for the low country now that it is cooling off. And the people of the lower lands begin to look up this way as our Lord brings in his season of turning leaves, and then the falling snow.

Center serves up life by the slice

For Bill Chaney, the meals prepared at the Ruidoso Senior Citizens Center and delivered to a nutritious hot lunch can enjoy a nutritious hot lunch with his wife, who is blind, without having to tackle cooking in the kitchen or venturing out on the roads.

For W.C. Burton, an 82-year-old retired railroad engi-

near now living in Ruidoso Downs, the center offers a way to see his friends and to enjoy a good meal. He can be seen at the center off U.S. 70 nearly every day.

"I get lots of enjoyment there, because I visit with everybody and we have a good time, eating, playing pool or dominoes or sometimes, shuffleboard," he said. "It keeps me busy."

"If it wasn't for the center,

it would just be terrible. I just love it."

Tommy Hood, recently appointed site coordinator for the county, state and federally funded program in Ruidoso Downs as part of the Lincoln County Zia Senior Centers operation, said it's a privilege and pleasure to be there.

"It's a wonderful opportunity," he said. "You meet so many nice people."

Although Ruidoso has its own center on Sudderth Drive, that village's program does not include meals. However, the two centers cooperate in many ways; for example, drivers from Ruidoso help deliver Meals on Wheels along with volunteers from the Ruidoso Downs Center.

The meals go to Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs residents, just as some of those participating in the congregate meals or other activities at the center in the Downs live in Ruidoso. The Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) is based at the Ruidoso center, but members fan out to provide help in both villages.

Hood, who lived in Hobbs and traveled the state selling auto parts before joining the senior program in 1994 as a driver, said he always wanted to live in the Ruidoso Downs area. When his marriage ended, he made the move.

"The meals program started in July 1994," he said. "In the past four years, we've really grown. We served 2,500 meals inside the center in the month of August and delivered 585."

"Anyone 60 years or older can pay a \$2 donation and eat. If they're under 60, it's \$4."

Hood and four other employees run the program in Ruidoso Downs with the help of 20 volunteers, including Bobbie McDonald, Bessie Ellis and Neil Smith, who man the sign-in

desk and help with other chores, and couples like Gordon and Donna Strickler, who see a need and enjoy meeting a lot of different people.

The Stricklers were active

Mayor Joe Hayhurst, who eats there most days and has been one of the biggest political supporters of the program, along with his brother, Downs Trustee Ray Hayhurst, and

at a Barstow, Calif., senior center before they moved to Lincoln County.

"We learned to line dance in California and didn't want to forget what we learned," Donna Strickler said. "We started dancing at the Ruidoso Center. People watched us and decided they wanted to get into it. When they remodeled the kitchen in Ruidoso, we had so many people, we had to find more space and came to the Ruidoso Downs Center."

"It offers so much and everyone helps everyone. When the line dancers come in early on Monday or Friday and there's something that needs to be done, they'll wrap silver or clean the tables. It's almost like one big family."

The center is an especially valued outlet for elderly men or women who have lost their spouses, she said.

"They can come down here and dance and be with people - be part of us," Strickler said.

Another familiar face at the center is Ruidoso Downs

County Commission Chairman L. Ray Nunley.

The congregate meal program was started nationally two decades ago in an effort to provide a safe and comfortable setting for seniors to socialize and prevent them from becoming isolated as they age.

But Hood said the program also helps younger people whose lives are touched by the seniors.

"These are people who are willing to give you the benefit of their experience and to help you," he said.

Besides casual activities, the center stages shuffleboard, domino and pool tournaments periodically.

Line dancing is scheduled from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Monday and Friday, and blood pressure and blood sugar levels are tested every other Thursday.

But seniors who just want to stop in and read magazines or strike up a card game also are welcome from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays.

A very valuable convention

Here is a dramatic example of the use of the suit-preference convention, invented by Hy Lavinthal in 1933.

West leads the three of spades against South's four heart contract. Under most circumstances, with a spade holding including the A-K, East would win the first trick with the king. But in the present case, to show that he has only two spades, East reverses the usual procedure by winning the first trick with the ace and the next one with the king.

If West is paying attention, he should realize that his partner's high-low indicates a doubleton spade. West therefore plays his jack of spades on East's king!

West's startling play of the jack, clearly a suit-preference signal since he must have lower spades in his hand, directs East to lead a diamond, rather than a club, at trick three. This is because West's signal asks for the higher-ranking side suit to be returned; if West had desired a club return, he would have played the deuce of spades to

ask for a lead in the lower-ranking suit.

As a result, the contract gets slaughtered. West ruffs East's diamond return and plays a spade. When dummy ruffs with the queen, East overruffs with the king and returns another diamond. West ruffs and plays still another spade. When dummy ruffs with the ten, East overruffs with the jack to pay an end to the carnage and defeat the contract three tricks — 300 points! Note that if there were no such weapon as the suit-preference signal, East might very well elect to return a club at trick three instead of a diamond. This misdirected shot would turn out to be very expensive indeed. Declarer would score ten tricks instead of seven, and would finish 1,120 points richer.

With more students and more time to practice, the Ruidoso High School Band is hoping it will get more support and acknowledgement from the community this year.

Band director Robert Stephens said the "zero period," in which the marching band starts practicing at 6:15 a.m. each school day, as well as practicing at Horton Stadium on Tuesday evenings, lends itself to a better cohesiveness in the group when it's on the field.

Area residents will get a chance to see what the extra practice has been able to accomplish at the first Warrior home game on Friday.

Students say what also has helped is the consistent direction of Stephens, who is the fifth band director at the schools in eight years.

"With each change (of director) it destroys the foundation for the kids," Stephens said. "The kids have to learn a new personality and the director has to learn the community. It's like a football team or a basketball team; you can't build a program if

"There are about 40 student musicians that are not in the band," Eric Flores said.

Students said the lack of direction created chaos and a fracturing of the members.

But they also said the

improving. But outside, they're still skeptical."

While there is some nervousness about the first performance, because the group already has had a chance to take to the field, council members agree that those feelings should dissipate once the performance starts.

"I think people will start getting more comfortable once they're on the field," Eldredge said.

The support of the district has made striving and realizing the band's motto - "Taking Pride in Excellence" - easier, Stephens said.

"Now, all we need is the

support of the community," the band director said.

Students on the council said their love of music and the friendships established among band members keeps them involved in the group.

"I like to play," Eric Flores, who plays the snare drum, said. "My dad (Danny Flores) used to be the director here and I guess I picked up on it like him."

Currently there are more than 50 students in the marching band as compared to the 38 students last year.

But numbers don't matter much at this point, Stephens said.

"We're looking for quality, not quantity," Stephens said. "Once we get quality, the students will be banging down the door to get in."

The quality of the band will be put to the test at the Zia competition next month, which is a state-level contest that will draw high school bands from around the country.

While students are looking down the road at the competition, focus at this point remains on Friday's performance.

"Watch out," students said. "We're coming and we're going to rock the house."

Backpacks are an easy way to carry school supplies and other stuff. But it is important to follow these rules:

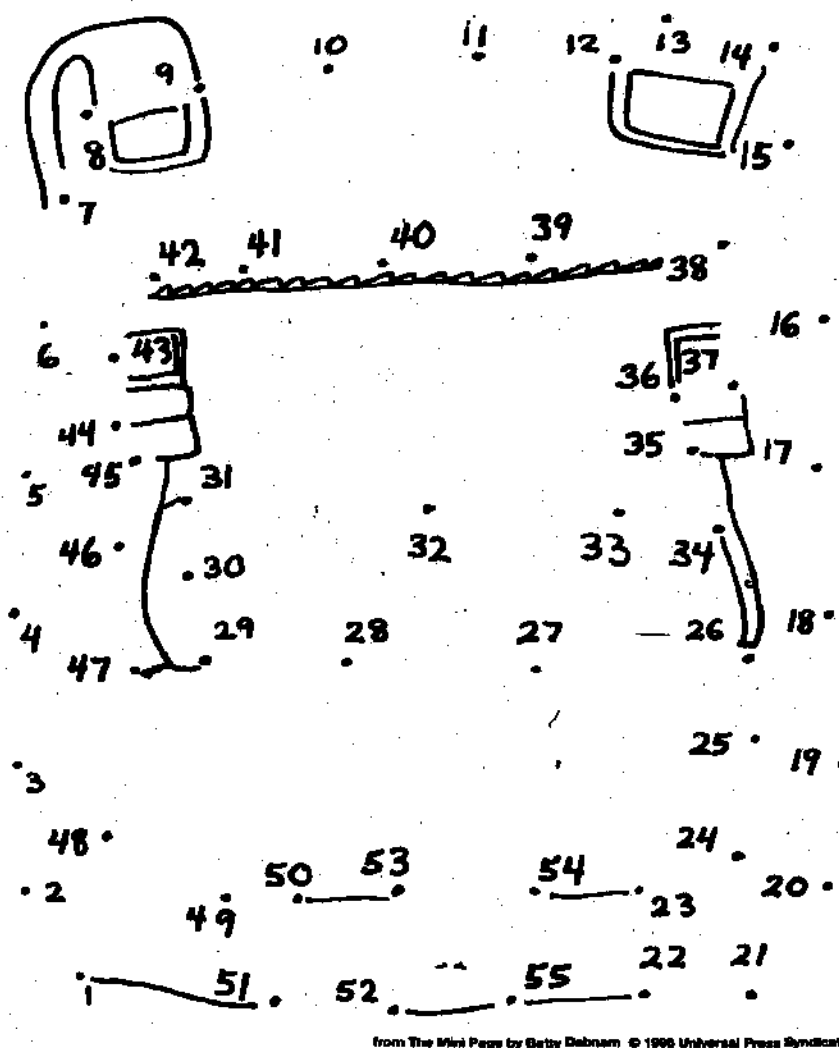
- Always wear both straps. Using only one strap can cause back and shoulder pain or posture problems.
- Be sure the straps have good padding.
- Adjust the straps so they are the same length. This way the weight will be spread evenly.
- Make sure your backpack is not too heavy. If you hurt when carrying it, lighten your load.
- Be careful when getting on or off the bus. Backpack straps can get caught on the handrails. If this happens, tell the driver at once. Then free the strap.

There might be smaller dangling straps used to tighten or loosen your padded straps. If they are longer than 3 inches, ask an adult to cut off the extra length.

History

Lead pencils do not have any lead. They are made from clay and graphite, a soft, shiny black substance. We still call the pencil core the "lead" because the ancient Greeks and Romans drew with thin sticks of lead. The people who first discovered graphite thought it was a kind of lead. Graphite was discovered about 600 years ago in what is now Germany. It gets its name from the Greek word meaning "to write." About 500 years ago, the English wrapped graphite in string to make an early pencil. In 1765 a German, Kasper Faber, began making some of the first modern pencils. He put his mixture of clay and graphite in a wooden container to make this now-common writing tool.

Eberhard Faber, Kasper's great-grandson, was the first person to mass-produce pencils in the United States, in 1881. Look on your pencils. His name might be stamped on the sides.

Making the lead

1. Clay and graphite are crushed and mixed together. The hardness of the lead depends on how much clay is put in the mixture. The higher the number on a pencil, the harder the lead. Most people use a No. 2 pencil.

2. The lead is pushed through molds, so it comes out in strings.

3. The strings are cut to the length of a pencil.

4. The strings are baked in an oven, or kiln, at 1,700 F. This melts everything together and gives the lead strength.

5. The baked lead strings are soaked in wax for eight hours.

Making the pencil

1. Slats are cut from cedar tree logs. These slats are as wide as 10 pencils and as long as one pencil.

2. Grooves are cut in the slat.

3. Pencil leads are laid into the grooves.

4. A second slat is glued on top of the slat filled with lead. This makes a pencil "sandwich."

5. Machines cut the sandwich into 10 pencils.

6. The pencils are painted.

7. A metal ring is clipped to the end of the pencil. The eraser is pushed into the ring.

Filmmaker finds common bonds in *Family Name*

As a boy, Macky Alston went to school in a small Southern town with a lot of other children named Alston. But they were black, and he was white. After he grew up and discovered the courage to tell his family he is gay, Alston says, he began to search his heart for other secrets he was "invested in keeping." Thus was born *Family Name*, a Sundance Film Festival selection airing Tuesday, Sept. 15, on the PBS anthology series *P.O.V.* (check local listings).

The Alston secret didn't start with Macky, nor is it an uncommon one in the South. In fact, it was right in front of him as he grew up — even down to the slave bell on his maternal grandparents' farm. But now he knows: The white Alstons of today are descended from slave owners, and the black Alstons are the descendants of slaves who adopted the name when emancipated. Yet Alston's journey surprised him in several ways.

"Some people turned me away and said, 'You come here and film, and

black people are going to burn our house to the ground.' You literally see (my grandmother) running away as I say, 'Didn't we own slaves?' She's a wonderful person, but all her life (she) has invested a lot of energy in putting this behind her and us.

"Others were surprisingly open. I really went out expecting very harsh reactions from the black side and from the white side: violence, shame, shut-down, silence. There was a lot of silence but many more openings than I had imagined, and a world of people who wanted to have these conversations but just didn't know how to start."

The result of the visits to strangers and family, courthouses and grave sites is a more confident man and filmmaker who has become the steward of documents and memories from Alstons to other Alstons, across boundaries of time and race. And everywhere Alston shows his film, from Colorado to Berlin, people respond with their own family stories.

"We are more connected," Alston says, "than we often think or take credit for (or) take responsibility for."

KIDS AND CORRECTIVE LENSES

Although most children between the ages of 3 and 18 receive some sort of vision screening through their school system, each child should be seen annually by a licensed Doctor of Optometry. While screening does provide an indication for corrective lenses, it does not tell about eye health, depth perception, color vision or comprehensive eye health and vision examination. Other conditions including strabismus (abnormal alignment of the two eyes or turned eye), amblyopia (poor sight in one eye) and emmetropia (good vision at distance but not at near) usually require corrective lenses. Children who have eye problems are occasionally misdiagnosed with Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) or other conditions that don't necessarily address their vision. Vision therapy such as eye exercises or vision training may help correct certain visual disorders and thus make visual tasks, especially reading, enjoyable.

Lenses for children are often made of plastic material. However, a polycarbonate lens is recommended since it is the most impact-resistant and thus the safest lens available. Glass lenses should never be used for children. Prisms can be a helpful tool for enabling a child who experiences double vision. Aspheric lenses can reduce the effect of magnifying the eye in high plus powers and make lenses thinner and lighter.

Conan O'Brien celebrates fifth anniversary of 'rocky start'

Late-night talk show host Conan O'Brien is celebrating five years and nearly 1,000 hours on the air.

But even though he's under contract at NBC to do *Late Night With Conan O'Brien* until 2002, O'Brien suspects no one will ever let him forget how hard it all was in the beginning, when he took over the post-*Tonight Show* slot from David Letterman.

"I've often thought," he says, "that if I explode an asteroid and save the Earth from annihilation, the headline is going to be, 'Conan saves Earth from asteroid after rocky start.'"

"(And the story will say,) 'Conan O'Brien has saved the civilized world from total annihilation, after a rocky start. (*Washington Post* TV critic) Tom Shales called him a bumbling boob who can't tie his own shoes. Many critics wished he would die. He received a medal from the president.'"

In a slightly more serious vein, he adds, "I'm not a slick professional. Though I wish things had gone smoothly (on the show) from the beginning, that's part of my story now, and I'm sticking with it."

O'Brien has been sticking with it since Sept. 13, 1993, when his only qualifications, other than being hand-picked by *Saturday Night Live* creator Lorne Michaels, were some clever scripts he had written for *The Simpsons* and 10 years of experience in improvisational comedy. He still doesn't put on a show for every taste, but at such a late hour he doesn't need to.

Viewers who aren't *Late Night* owls can sample the show in prime time Wednesday, Sept. 16, on NBC. *Late Night With Conan O'Brien Fifth Anniversary Special* includes many of the host's favorite clips from past shows, as well as some new comedy bits.

"This isn't testing the waters for anything," O'Brien says. "This is an opportunity for our show to be seen by people who are awake and fully alert."

"We want to show people who aren't able to be up (later) what we're doing, and we hope some of them will see it and say, 'Hey, that looked funny. I'm

going to start drinking a lot of coffee and watch this program."

Along with two or three guest interviews each night, O'Brien and sidekick Andy Richter indulge in racy, off-color or just plain tacky humor that pushes hard against the seams of the standards-and-practices envelope.

Acknowledging the adolescent larceny in his heart, O'Brien shrugs and admits many of the jokes are "impossible to defend." It's just that he finds them funny.

"We want to make sure we don't become this pleasant, smooth-running clone of every show that's out there."

O'Brien is grateful to NBC for sticking with him while he learned the job.

"I think, had my show been syndicated, it probably would have been off the air in a couple of months," he says.

"The thing about these shows is that it's every day. And you're only as good as your last show."

Still, he notes, "no one forces people like us to try these shows. We get paid a lot of money. I reserve my real sympathy for people with a disease."

And after five years, the critics are giving better notices. Recently Shales dubbed O'Brien "modest, wry, self-effacing and demonstrably the most intelligent of the late-night comics" and his band, led by Max Weinberg, "the best in late-night TV."

So, Conan, if you're thinking of saving the world, now might be a very good time.

Books by Ralph Hollenbeck

DANIEL DEFOE: The Life and Strange, Surprising Adventures, by Richard West (Carroll & Graf: \$26.00). The caption under the only picture of Defoe in this book sums up the elusiveness of the man in his time and the person who emerges from the pages of this fascinating biography: "As a man pursued by creditors and political enemies, Defoe avoided having his likeness portrayed." The irony of such evasiveness is that as a novelist, pamphleteer, and journalist, Defoe's narrations left little to the imagination. As Mr. West points out, "He was the first master, if not the inventor, of almost every feature of modern newspapers ... As a journalist, as well as a novelist, Defoe excelled in the art of telling a story. He ... was innately curious; got straight to the point; and never missed any quirky detail." Such attributes evidence themselves in his acclaimed

reportorial fictions, "Robinson Crusoe" and "Moll Flanders." However, Defoe was also actively embroiled in the religion-dominated politics of the later Stuart through early Hanoverian British regimes. He became as much a figure in the royal courts as his presence became familiar to gawkers at pilloried prisoners or prison inmates. Recurrent interest in Defoe's work has assured his literary legacy, but his lifetime endeavors gave little promise. Business failures, bankruptcies, public feuds, and the reclusivity of a secret agent added little to the Defoe persona. Yet the individual who emerges from the sparkling pages of Mr. West's history of an era and a man is worthy of a Defoe treatment a la his heroic transformation of the real Alexander Selkirk into the invented "Robinson Crusoe."

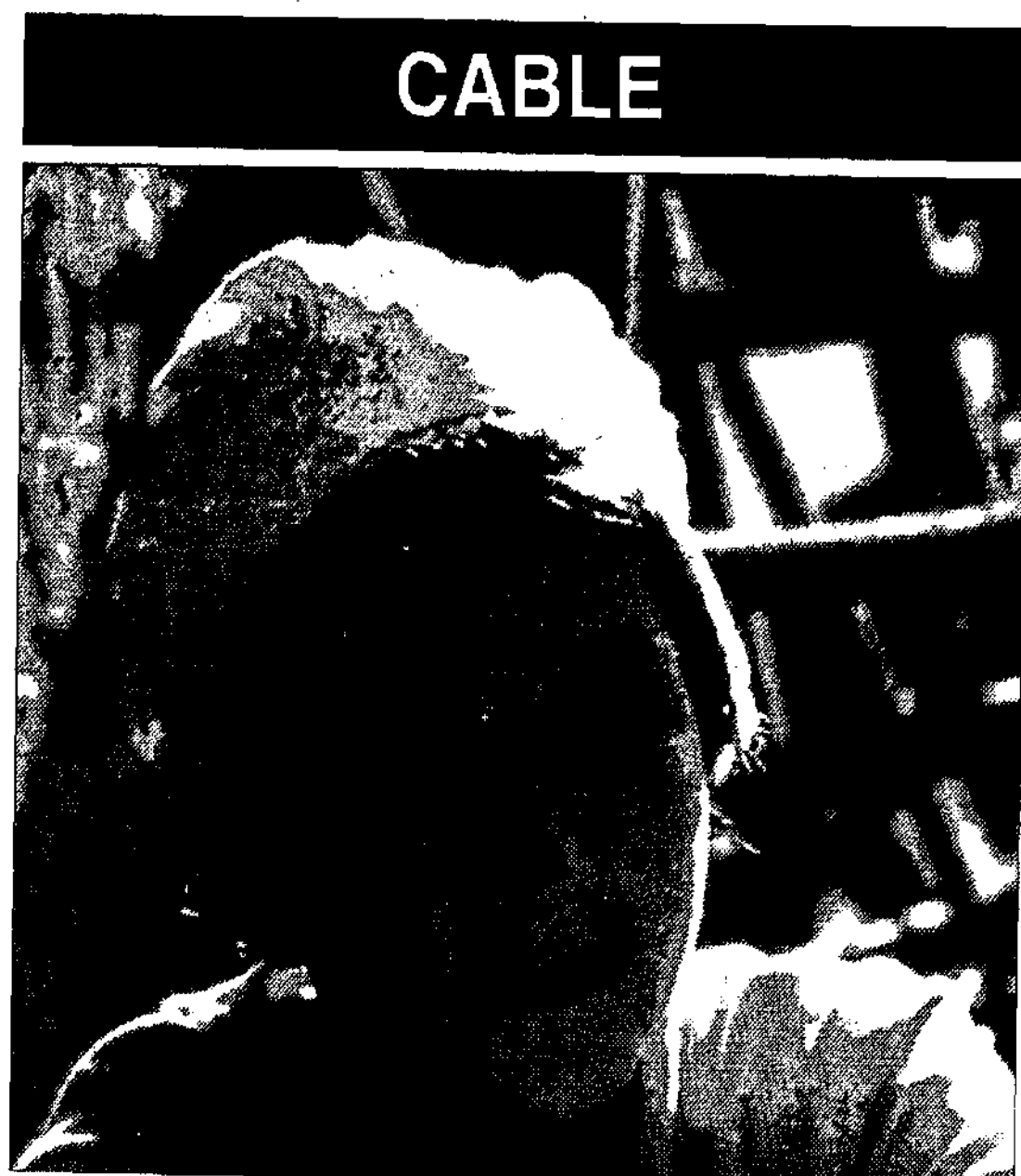

The U.S.-Mexican War (1846-1848), a four-hour documentary, explores the events surrounding conflict between neighboring nations struggling for land, power, and national identity.

This year marks the 150th anniversary of the end of the war that changed the boundaries of the two countries, with Mexico losing nearly half its territory— more

than a half-million square miles of land—to the United States, including the present states of New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, California, and parts of Oklahoma, Colorado, and Wyoming. The newly acquired land made the United States a formidable transcontinental power and heralded the youthful republic's coming-of-age.

During the U.S.-Mexican War, thousands of American troops were sent to fight on foreign soil for the first time. And when the battle pushed into the heart of Mexico City, it was the first time that American soldiers had occupied a foreign capital. From the battlefields of this war emerged a group of American military men who would later go down in history, among them Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson, Robert E. Lee, future President General Zachary Taylor and his rival, General Winfield Scott. Others, like the young Ulysses S. Grant, who was just two years out of West Point, had their first combat experience during the war, preparing them for their next major conflict, the Civil War.

Despite its enormous impact, the war is a chapter in history that few Americans know a lot about but that few Mexicans will ever forget. For the first time, the story of this significant encounter is told on national television from multiple perspectives, with prominent historians from both countries examining the conflict. The U.S.-Mexican War (1846-1848) airs in both the United States and Mexico, in both English and Spanish.

John S. D. Eisenhower, son of the former president and a retired brigadier-general in the Army Reserves, serves as one of the on-screen commentators. Voiceovers from Ed Begley Jr., Shelley Duvall, Ricardo Montalban, Dwight Yoakam, and other personalities bring to life personal letters, documents, and other published accounts of the conflict.

The U.S.-Mexican War was the first conflict to be brought to the entire country by the media. From newspaper accounts and books to lithographs and print music, graphic accounts of the war fed the masses with a romantic notion of a just war. Among the many writers of the times was Walt Whitman, the poet and editor of the *Brooklyn Eagle*, who fanned the flames of patriotic passion, asserting the United States' right to crush the enemy, while the then little-known writer Henry David Thoreau, in his famous essay "On Civil Disobedience," challenged Americans to follow their consciences and stop the invasion.

The U.S.-Mexican War (1846-1848) will air on consecutive evenings, Sunday and Monday, September 13th-14th at 8:00 p.m. One-hour episodes will air Saturdays at 10:00 p.m. beginning October 3rd.

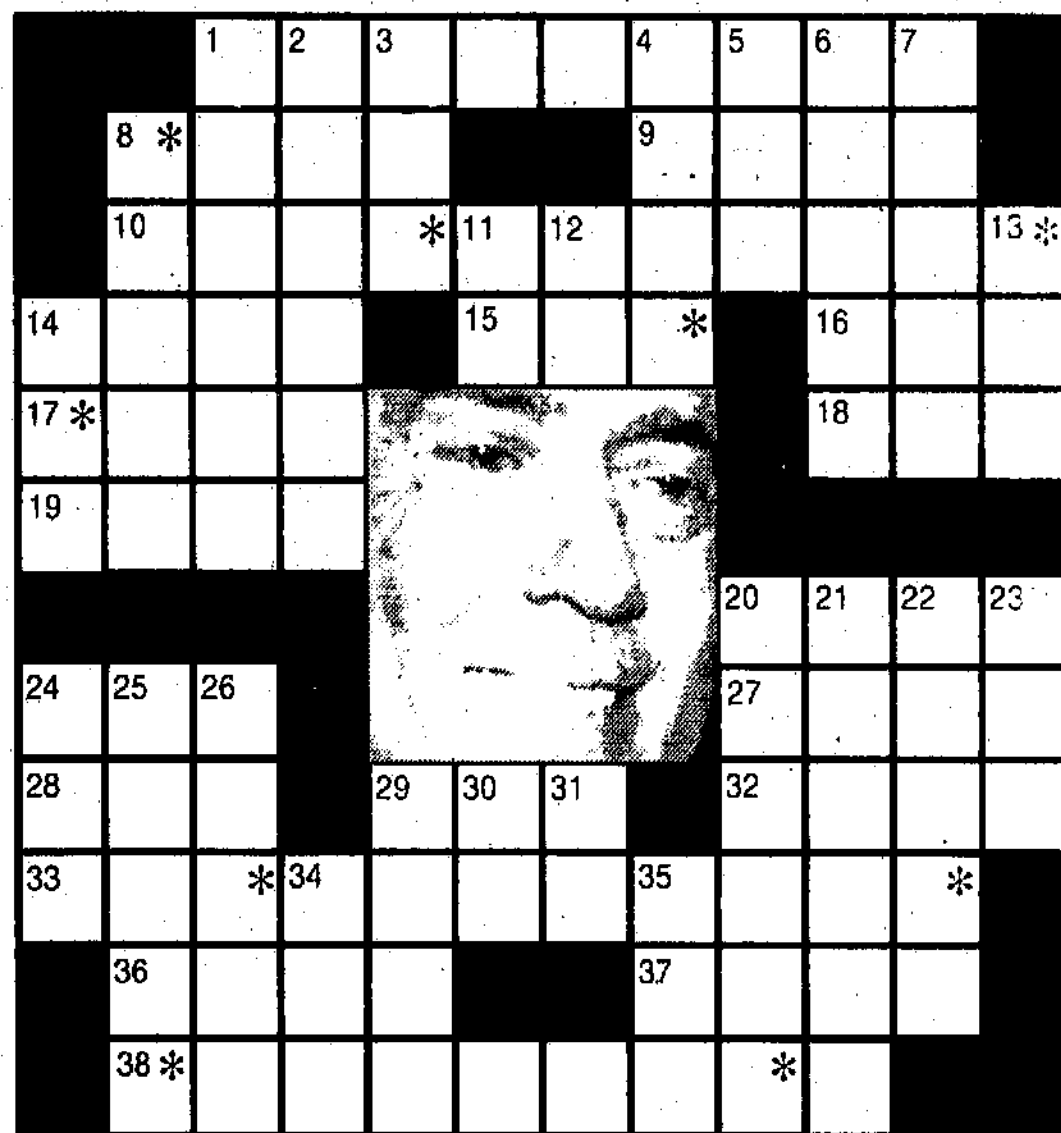

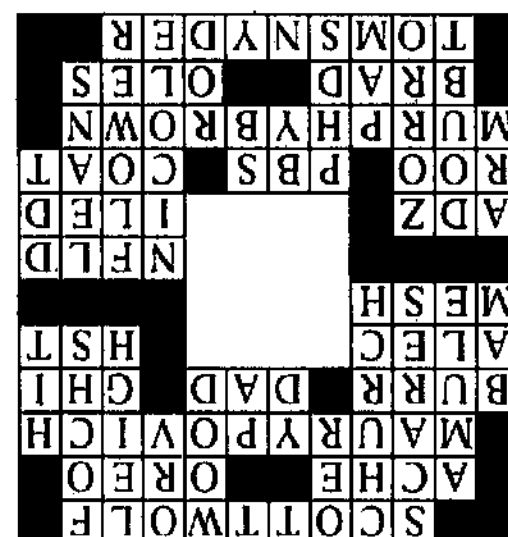
