Mescalero arbitration with state delayed again

• For a year, the Mescalero Apache tribe has refused to send state payments on gambling revenues, saying 16 percent of slot machine profits is too high.

As far as H.L. Lovato knows, the Mescalero tribe has never sent money to the state, as mandated in both past and current gambling compacts.

"They haven't paid it to us, and we're the banker for the state so we would know," said Lovato, a spokesperson with the New Mexico Treasurer's Office.

Mescalero President Wendell Chino, who is out of town this week and could not be reached for comment, has in the past described the 16-percent revenue share requirement of the current gambling legislation as extortion. He signed the tribe's gambling compact with the state under protest, Chino has said.

The tribe has not submitted any of the past four quarterly payments to the state nor any of the regulatory fees, Lovato said. But the tribe never made payments to the state under the 1995 gaming compact, either, when the revenue share was 5 percent, he said.

"We have not received any kind of money from the Mescalero," Lovato said.

The Mescalero tribe is one of two in New Mexico that have not submitted payments under the current gaming compact. The other is the Jicarilla Apache tribe, Lovato said. Meanwhile, the remaining gaming tribes in the state have paid in a total of \$26.5 million, according to information provided by Lovato. The next payment is due Oct. 26, he said.

Scott Spencer, the gambling representative for the state, said four of the remaining tribes have reverted to paying 5 percent of their revenues from

slot machines, rather than 16 percent.

The Mescalero tribe and the state have been in the process of resolving the dispute of the tribe's refusal to pay revenue shares for more than a year. Under the gaming legislation that narrowly passed the legislature in the spring of 1997, a tribe has 90 days after receiving notice from the state before the arbitration process begins. The state gave Chino that notice on Nov. 13 of last year, about two weeks after the tribe failed to send its first payment under the new legislation.

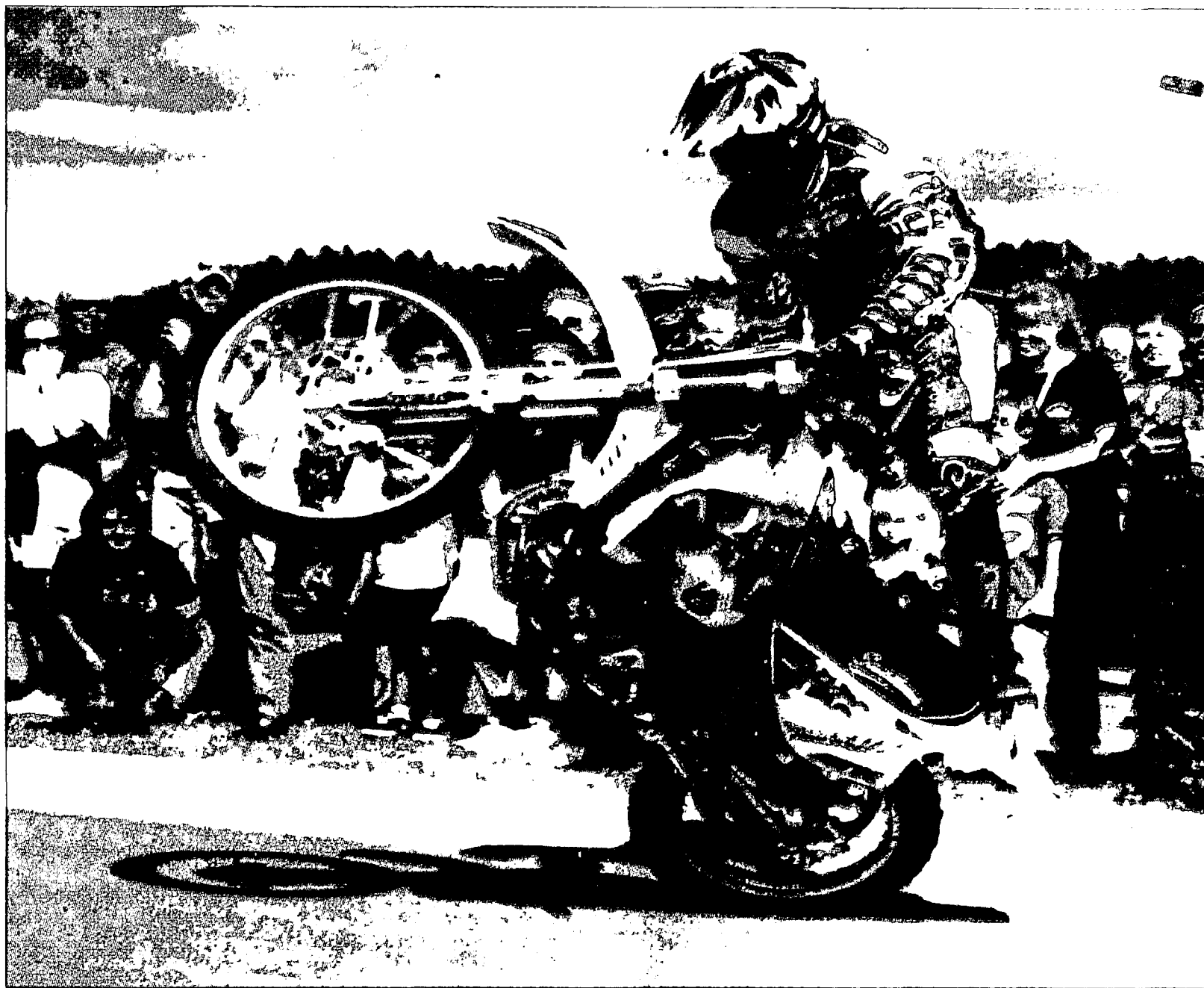

'I think they were a little disappointed,' says owner

Eleven officers close in and close down adult toy shop

• An out-of-town vendor selling adult paraphernalia, videos and lingerie had set up business from a house in the Ruidoso Pine Lodge subdivision.

One day after opening for business, Nancy D'Lynn Rudd was confronted Friday with 11 law enforcement officials who ordered her to shut down.

Rudd, owner of Tasteful Treasures by D'Lynn in Lovington, was selling adult paraphernalia, adult videotapes and lingerie from a house she rented at 537 Second St., said Thomas Chavez, Ruidoso village code enforcement officer. Rudd also was giving beer to customers without a liquor license, Chavez said.

Rudd on Tuesday said she will seek litigation against Ruidoso

because of the action.

"I don't even know yet if I have a case, but I am talking to my lawyer," Rudd said from the beauty shop she operates in Brownsville, Texas. "Yes, what I'm selling is controversial, but it's not illegal ... It was like a raid, or something. They shut down the street ..."

Rudd said she applied for and acquired a business license from the village of Ruidoso the day before she was shut down. She indicated on the application that the business would be in-home sales, along the lines of Tupperware parties, Rudd said.

"And they gave me my permit anyway," she said.

Rudd also has said she intends to pursue litigation against Ruidoso Downs. Earlier this month, Rudd withdrew her application for a business license from that village after trustees passed an ordinance regulating tempo-

rary and seasonal vendors. Under the law, temporary vendors are assessed \$300 for the first day of operation and \$200 for each subsequent day. Rudd contends that the village created the ordinance as a direct effort to keep her from operating her temporary business there.

In Ruidoso, Chavez said village regulations prohibit retail sales in residential areas; businesses with sexually oriented products are subject to more restrictions.

"Especially in a neighborhood," Chavez said. "You don't want that in your neck of the woods."

Businesses that sell sexually oriented materials must acquire a conditional use permit from the Ruidoso Planning Commission prior to opening for business, according to village regulations.

Chavez and other law enforcement officials learned about the temporary

business after Rudd and her associates dispersed about 500 flyers at the Ruidoso Convention Center, the location of the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally, he said.

The flyers not only invited people to bring beer to the house but advertised that unspecified demonstrations would be held in the evenings. Rudd said the demonstrations referred to explanations of some of the products.

"Several of the products I sell, they need to be explained because otherwise people aren't going to know what they are," Rudd said.

At Chavez's request, two undercover State Police officers went to the shop Friday night and purchased items for evidence. Chavez said there was a total of six people at the house besides the officers. One of the under-

Payseno cleared of murder

Prison time due on other counts

A Lincoln County District Court jury deliberated about six hours before acquitting Terri Payseno of murder in the shooting death of 57-year-old Sonia "Sonny" Kirkwood in September, 1997.

But Payseno, who in the summer of 1997 completed a year's sentence on another felony, will see the inside of a prison again for her other actions in connection with the killing.

She was found guilty of one count of a felon in possession of a firearm, two counts of tampering with evidence and 12 counts of illegal use of a cash or credit card. Each count is a fourth degree felony and punishable by up to 18 months in jail and/or a \$5,000 fine. Her prior conviction will translate to one more year on her sentence as a habitual felon.

Jurors contacted after the verdict Friday said they thought they must acquit her, because the state failed to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that she wasn't acting in self-defense.

However, they convicted her of tampering with evidence, because she admitted moving Kirkwood's body and hiding it in a horse trailer, then removing her glasses and possibly her gloves. Payseno, 41, also testified she moved the gun the next day and that she later hid it under a rock off the Alamo Canyon ranch property she had shared with Kirkwood.

She was convicted of a charge of felony with a gun, not in connection with the actual shooting, because that could have been a reaction to the situation, jurors said. They said she was guilty of the charge, because she touched the gun the day after the murder and again when she hid it.

Payseno testified she withdrew from Kirkwood's accounts about \$2,100 in the two weeks after her companion's death. Jurors said no proof was presented by defense attorney Gary

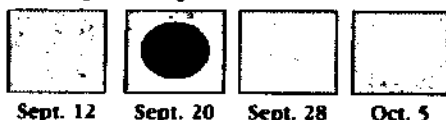

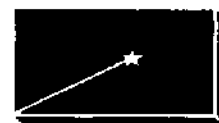

VERDICT: Jurors say state couldn't prove case

Mitchell that the two women had an agreement for Payseno to use the cards or that in fact, she had used the cards at any time before Kirkwood's death.

"What it boiled down to was we didn't find enough evidence" to convict for murder, one of the seven women jurors said Monday. "She still possibly was acting in self-defense. We couldn't convict."

"We all definitely believed there was no intent. We thought it was either voluntary manslaughter or self-defense. Some felt she was provoked and acted accordingly, but there was nothing to back it up for sure."

Although no registration was presented, testimony was offered that the gun belonged to Kirkwood.

Several of the jurors also said the fact that Payseno didn't clean out all of Kirkwood's accounts—which totaled more than \$240,000—and flee the area indicated she intended at some point to turn herself into authorities and that she never meant to kill Kirkwood.

"It was just a lucky—or unlucky—shot," one juror said.

All of the jurors interviewed asked that their names not be used.

The jury didn't dwell long on the gloves Kirkwood was supposed to be wearing, because they were never recovered or tested.

"There was nothing we could do with it," a juror said.

Jurors didn't find out until after the verdict that Payseno never mentioned the gloves to authorities until just before the week-long trial and therefore, they were not held as evidence or tested for gun powder residue. No residue was found on Kirkwood's hands.

Members of the jury considered that Kirkwood's heavy drinking, as reported by at least two witnesses, could have led to erratic actions on the older woman's part

as she faced a break-up of a three-year relationship with Payseno.

The shooting occurred the evening of Sept. 13, 1997, as Payseno returned from dropping her daughter off at a friend's home near Hondo. She testified that as she got out of her truck, Kirkwood called for her to come to the barn area. She assumed Kirkwood was going to divide the tack. But at some point, Kirkwood—who Payseno said had been drinking—fired a shot at her, then stumbled and fell, dropping the gun.

Payseno testified that she picked up the gun, which she said she had never handled before, and shot once after Kirkwood came at her with a small pitchfork. When Kirkwood didn't stop, she fired again, fatally wounding the woman in the heart.

The death was not reported to the sheriff's office until 13 days later. Payseno told her sister about the incident and that the body still was in the trailer. Her sister, Kim Dooper, insisted on calling the sheriff after attempts to reach Payseno's probation officer and counselor failed, Dooper testified.

"We weren't convinced at all (in her plea of self-defense)," said one male juror. "We felt she could have stopped once she had the gun. But unfortunately, legally, we couldn't find her guilty, because the state hadn't proved it."

"I felt bad for (District Attorney) Scot Key. He did the best he could with the evidence he could present."

The jury never considered letting Payseno off on the ATM-related charges, because there was nothing to show Kirkwood ever allowed her to use the cards, he said.

One juror said he didn't buy Payseno's story that she withdrew the cash, because she was collecting money she might need to help send her 7-year-old daughter home to her father. He thought she was gam-

bling at the Inn of the Mountain Gods, where the money was withdrawn, because she hoped to hit it big.

"I wouldn't have felt like gambling, if something like that had just happened to me," he said.

"I thought for sure when the judge read the instructions, it was manslaughter," a juror said. "There was no intent, so it wasn't murder one and she probably didn't plan anything. But when we broke down the instructions step-by-step, we saw we couldn't do manslaughter."

Based on the instructions given to the jury, a first-degree murder conviction required proving intent and second-degree murder required killing without being sufficiently provoked. To convict on voluntary manslaughter, evidence must show a person kills as a result of sufficient provocation, which can be any action that arouses anger, rage, fear, sudden resentment, terror or other extreme emotions.

"The provocation must be such as would affect the ability to reason and to cause a temporary loss of self-control in an ordinary person of average disposition. The provocation is not sufficient if an ordinary person would have cooled off before acting," according to the instructions.

Several jurors said they weren't convinced of the accuracy of a conversation a former jail guard reported having with Payseno in which she said she shot Kirkwood because she was tired of seeing the older woman drunk and waving the gun around. Now a police officer with the village of Capitan, he testified that he called the conversation to the attention of a superior immediately, but didn't mention it to prosecutors until shortly before the trial months later.

"I thought—if we could only have believed the cop from Capitan—but we couldn't," one juror said.

Are apologies in the offing?

An apology to the public should be offered by Lincoln County Commissioner William Schwetzmann for language he used during a commission meeting Thursday, Commissioner Monroy Montes says.

"I've asked that an item be put on the agenda," Montes said Monday. "I was offended, not because I don't know the words, but never in my eight years of political life have I seen an outburst like that. It really caught me off guard and made the office less than it is."

Schwetzmann was speaking about the selection of a jail site and was criticizing the quality of a study exploring options when he became upset with Commissioner Wilton Howell. He said Howell was mumbling,

fanning himself and smiling in a ridiculing manner.

Schwetzmann paused in his remarks, turned to Howell and told him he was a rude "son of a bitch."

"He owes the public an apology, not Commissioner Howell. That's between the two of them," Montes said. "We all know that Wilton can be abrasive."

Schwetzmann said Monday that he acknowledges the remark was a "bad choice of words."

"I don't know if I'll say anything (if the item is on the agenda)," he said. "I will ask some people who were there (for their impressions)."

He pointed out that the remark received some applause.

"Very frankly, I've let a lot of stuff go by in the past" against him, Schwetzmann said. "You move on."

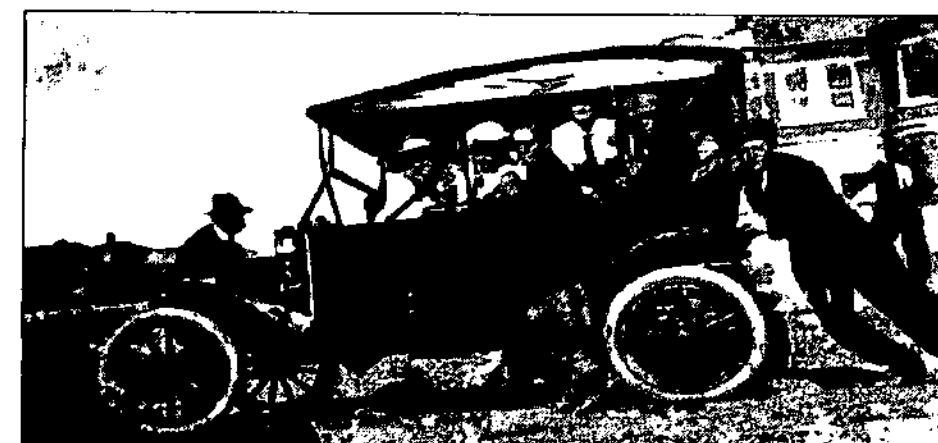
cover officers took a free beer from Rudd and her associates, and one officer received a back rub, Chavez said.

After the undercover officers returned with evidence, Chavez asked Ruidoso police to assist him in shutting the business down. Six police officers, four State Police officers, including the two that had gone to the shop posing as customers, accompanied Chavez to the house, he said. The number of officers was warranted because alcohol was being served at the house and the situation could have become confrontational, he said.

Todd Griffin, a special agent with the State Police and one of the undercover officers, issued Rudd a written warning about the beer handed out earlier, Rudd said. Chavez gave Rudd a verbal warning regarding the operation of her business in a residential area, she said. No charges were filed, Chavez said.

Rudd described the action by law authorities as an over-reaction.

"They raided it, I think, hoping to find a bunch of naked people ... I think they were a little disappointed," she said.

Since then, the process has been slow and is ongoing, according to information provided by Spencer.

"I have been predicting (the arbitration will occur) before the end of the year," he said. "It may not, though."

Both the Mescalero and the state have appointed arbitrators in the dispute, but those men have not selected a third arbitrator, according to Spencer.

"Their last deadline was Aug. 31," he said. The two arbitrators received a 30-day extension of their first deadline of July 31. The men reportedly did

not like the list of recommended arbitrators submitted by the American Arbitration Association.

Fred Ragsdale, an arbitrator for the state, could not be reached this week for comment about the selection of a third arbitrator or when final arbitration may occur. The location of the arbitration has been set for the Mescalero Reservation.

Glenn Feldman, a Phoenix attorney selected as an arbitrator by the tribe, said Tuesday he did not know when the third arbitrator would be chosen.

"It's hard to say, although we're working on it as quickly as we can," said Feldman, who

has represented Indian tribes for about 20 years. This is his first time to act as an arbitrator and his first time to act for the Mescalero, he said.

The outcome of the arbitration will be determined by two of the three arbitrators. However, they do not have the power to change the contents of the gambling legislation.

Spencer believes they won't need to, if their decision is that the state revenue share is too high.

He is optimistic that a legislative committee established to study the gambling bill and its components will submit new legislation that changes the 16-percent revenue figure.

Oct. 31, 1997 — State sends Mescalero President Wendell Chino a letter regarding the tribe's failure to submit payment

Nov. 18 — The state serves the tribe with a formal notice

Nov. 20 — The tribe responds in a letter saying U.S. Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt didn't approve of the 16-percent revenue share

Jan. 16 — Meeting with Chino and state officials in Santa Fe to establish procedures for the arbitration process

Feb. 6 — Another meeting to establish Feb. 14 as the deadline for the tribe to make payment before the arbitration process begins

Feb. 25 — Tribal attorney Grego-

ry Quinlan in a letter agrees to the dates

March 2 — State sends tribe a letter saying either agree to arbitration process or shut down gambling operations

March 9 — Tribe, in a letter, notifies the state that the arbitration process will be invoked

March 30 — Tribe files a claim for arbitration

June 26 — State unsuccessfully seeks postponement to arbitration process to allow the fledgling gambling commission time to organize; postponement is opposed by the tribe

Now, look very closely at jail financing

Maybe Carrizozo is the best site for a new Lincoln County jail, or "detention center," the politically correct name these days. Maybe not.

It doesn't really matter now, after the abrupt decision made by the Lincoln County Commission last Thursday that places the new jail in Carrizozo, most likely in the community's industrial park.

The report on the jail, perhaps flawed as one commissioner claimed, was made available to the commission last Wednesday, a day before the commissioners voted.

It never was made available to the public — not to the majority of the public in a reasonable fashion anyway.

What's the point of spending \$10,000 of the public's money on a report when the public is not allowed access to the report until it is too late to serve any informational purpose? Yes, they are under pressure from the state for jail non-compliance...

Perhaps our county fathers, the same ones who haven't been able to conduct a meeting in the last few months without embarrassing someone (frequently themselves), know better than the people they were elected to represent.

This casts no aspersions on Carrizozo's people; they mounted a major lobbying effort to keep the jail, fearful that separation might in the future lead to loss of the courthouse, too, and the study concluded theirs was the best site.

The elected leaders of Ruidoso are not without fault however. Council members and Mayor Robert Donaldson should have expressed more interest in the facility, because something as major as a new jail facility inevitably will impact Ruidoso no matter where it is built — and especially so when financing is considered.

Although financing of the \$4 to \$5 million project has been worked out, that consultant's study recommends a one-eighth percent increase in the gross receipts tax, which the commission could add without a vote. The consultants note that 80 percent of the tax would be generated in Ruidoso and that "transients" (read tourists) would pay some 60 percent of the total. But no assessment was made of the impact on tourism or other business development in the county as a result of a higher tax.

There are other options, and we hope the commissioners take more time to consider these than they did the report.

Meanwhile Commissioner Monroy Montes is asking for an apology from Commissioner William Schwettman for calling Commissioner Wilton Howell a "rude son of a bitch" in a commission meeting.

We ask the Lincoln County Commission as a whole to apologize to the public for its past and present handling of something as important as the county jail.

NAFTA should be replaced

On Monday, July 13, the United Steelworkers of America, joined by the Made in the USA Foundation, filed suit in a federal court seeking to void the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

Our legal position rests on the foundation and bedrock of our republic, the Constitution...which clearly requires that "two thirds of the Senators present (must) concur" with any treaty negotiated by the executive branch of the government.

Had NAFTA been considered by our founding fathers, there is little doubt that they would have considered it a treaty, since "it's a major and enduring commitment to elaborate mechanisms of mutual enforcement."

But, contrary to the explicit procedure specified by our

Constitution, NAFTA did not receive the required approval by two-thirds of the senate, and should therefore be declared null and void.

NAFTA did not receive that necessary approval for a very good reason—because it is not in the best interests of the American people. In fact, NAFTA has been an unmitigated disaster for working people in Canada and Mexico, as well as in the United States.

The so-called "free trade" system that NAFTA established across North America has given predatory corporations a license to hunt for the cheapest labor and the lowest environmental and safety standards on the continent. To make matters worse, the twisted logic of the treaty encourages even socially responsible corporations to join this hunt in order to remain competitive.

No working person — U. S., Canadian or Mexican —

should be forced to trade hard-earned economic security and occupational safety for the "opportunity" to work harder and longer for less. And no community should have to accept lower environmental standards or imports of tainted food for the chance to keep some of its citizens working. But that kind of blackmail is what NAFTA is all about.

NAFTA is about giving Wall Street investors and giant multinational corporations complete freedom to ravage workers and communities across the continent. It's about creating a global economy that pits workers in all three countries against each other, telling us that we have to work for less if we want to work at all. And it's about forcing us all to worship at the altar of greed, and to forget about values like loyalty, fairness and patriotism.

As a result of NAFTA, thousands of companies have

moved their U. S. operations to Mexico. They include many familiar and prominent names: RCA television sets, Oshkosh overalls, American Standard plumbing fixtures, True Temper hardware products, Fruit of the Loom t-shirts, Farah pants, Woolrich coats, Smith Corona typewriters, and Goodyear tires.

Even the Energizer bunny has become a contestant in this race to the bottom of the economic ladder, and by the end of this year he will be riding south on a Huffy bicycle.

For working families and communities, NAFTA has failed, and not just in the United States, where we've lost nearly half a million good paying jobs and seen our trade deficit with the treaty countries balloon by \$22 billion. It's also failed in Mexico, where

workers have seen their wages drop by at least 27 percent since the treaty was implemented. And it's failed in Canada, which has lost more than 137,000 highly paid industrial jobs as a result of NAFTA. North American workers, and our communities, deserve better. We deserve a trade treaty that recognizes working families and communities as central to the economy and that actually buy the goods they produce.

We believe our lawsuit will succeed and, as a result, NAFTA will be off the books, but, whether the lawsuit succeeds or not, the steelworkers union will continue the fight to repeal NAFTA and replace it with a treaty that will serve the interests not just of Wall Street and the bond market, but of working families and communities throughout North America.

We appear to be in a headlong rush to create a global economy. The issue that we as a nation need to address is what kind of global economy we want.

Do we want a global economy that feeds the insatiable appetite of Wall Street and giant multinational corporations, who owe allegiance to no flag but the almighty dollar; a global economy based on reducing our wages, working conditions and environmental standards down to the lowest level possible?

Or should we create a global economy that works for working families and communities, raising wages, working conditions and environmental standards for us all?

In this fight, the United Steel Workers Union is standing up for workers and their communities in all three nations of North America. Which side are you on?

County construction boom raises taxable property value by \$20 million

• A construction surge raises property values (and property tax income to the area) substantially.

Construction remains a strong economic force in Lincoln County, boosting the taxable property value from 1997 to 1998 by \$20 million.

"It was not a reappraisal year, but our tax base increased from \$406 million to nearly \$427 million," County Assessor Patsy Serna said Monday. "The highest percentage of new residential

value was in the Alto/Capitan area at \$5 million."

That area also includes the Ranches of Sonterra subdivision, which contributed about \$1 million toward the increase because of a change in the rate of assessment tied to state law, Serna said. When more than 50 percent of a subdivision is sold out, the low rate of assessment given to a developer is replaced with a more market-based rate, she said.

New residential construction in Ruidoso proper accounted for \$4 million of the increase. Areas around the village contributed another

\$1 million and Ruidoso Downs posted a \$2 million increase on the commercial side with the opening of a Wal-Mart Super Center.

"Throughout the whole county we saw values increase, except in Corona where they knocked down an old commercial building and where they lost value because some of the big utility assessments (for example railroad and telephone) had their values lowered by Santa Fe—and we have no control over that," Serna said.

The bottom line for most taxpayers is that their tax bills won't change much from

last year. For instance, plugging in the 1998 tax levies, the owner of a Ruidoso home assessed at \$35,000 (one-third of market value) would pay \$6.72 more.

That includes a slight decrease in the municipal levy of 11.881 mills from 11.939 mills last year, as well as all of the state, school, hospital and college tax levies, Serna said.

That same owner in Capitan would pay \$316 less, because a \$600,000 bond issue was paid off this year and, with the defeat last week of another proposed bond issue, the village is debt-free.

Capitan's total residential tax rate will go down from 24.986 mills to 15.948 mills. Of that, the village accounts for 1.361 mills compared to 0.516 mills last year.

Ruidoso's residential rate in 1997 for all taxing entities was 31.689 mills. That will increase by less than 1 percent this year to 31.881 mills.

Capitan's overall residential taxable value jumped from \$5.7 million to \$6.5 million. Areas around the village, including Alto, went up from \$82.4 million to \$87.67 million. Ruidoso's residential values were \$153,839,347 in 1997 and hit \$157,904,683 this year.

Settlement appears near in LCMC negligence suit

No one is mentioning the exact number, but a monetary settlement appears to be in the offing for a local family that has sued Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC), alleging neglect of a toddler after an immunization.

Presbyterian Healthcare Services, Inc., the parent company of LCMC, is negotiating a settlement amount in a lawsuit filed by Melissa Silva, according to attorneys.

"I have agreed to confidentiality and I don't want to go back on my word," said Steven Schonberg, Silva's

Albuquerque attorney, regarding the aspects of the proposed settlement and its amount.

Carroll Gunn, with Presbyterian Healthcare Services, also declined to talk about the settlement.

"Basically all I can tell you is the same thing—that we don't comment on cases that are being negotiated. But it is my understanding that they have a settlement and are very close."

The lawsuit, filed Dec. 8, 1997, in the Second District Court of New Mexico, claims LCMC employees and associates acted negligently when Silva's infant son's leg became infected after an immunization shot. That infection was then mis-diagnosed by David Vity, a

physician's assistant at the hospital on Oct. 11, 1997, and the child was sent home, according to the lawsuit.

Vity had ordered X-rays of the child on Oct. 11. He interpreted the X-rays as normal, though they showed the infection, the lawsuit states. The infection, if it had been caught at that time, could have been treated, the document said.

"As a result of the defendants' negligence, Angelo spent approximately three weeks in the hospital and underwent several operations on his left hip," the lawsuit states, adding that it is unknown whether the child will suffer permanent bone damage.

In Presbyterian's response to the lawsuit, the hospital admits that Vity

saw the infant on two occasions on Oct. 11 and that X-rays were taken of the child, but denies allegations that the hospital or the staff acted negligently.

Schonberg said Presbyterian made a settlement offer before the discovery phase of the lawsuit had been completed.

He also is pursuing compensation for the family under the Federal Vaccination Act, Schonberg said. The act provides a pool fund that covers children who have had adverse consequences to immunizations.

The family may seek compensation against the medical technician who administered the vaccine, which the family says is the source of infection, Schonberg said.

Pass-happy Bulldogs next test for Tiger gridders

What used to be part of the preseason becomes the regular season when the Artesia junior varsity football team pays Capitan a visit Thursday for a 7 p.m. tussle with the Tigers.

In the past several years, Capitan scrimmaged the Bulldogs junior varsity team as part of its preseason tune-up. Not any more.

The Tigers, who are 2-2 overall, will have to find a way to at least slow, if not stop, the pass-happy Bulldogs.

Defending the prolific Artesia offense represents a departure for the Capitan defense, which has spent most of its time this season stopping opponents' running games.

"That's about all we've seen this year - people lining up and running at us," Tiger coach Ed Davis said.

Capitan can't just worry about the Artesia air attack; it must remember the Bulldogs can run as well.

"They'll run traps, sweeps and

options," Davis said.

All are keys to a sophisticated offensive attack.

In addition to execution, the Tigers have to be mentally sharp.

"We've got to eliminate mental lapses that we're having," Davis said. "Good football teams just don't make those kind of mistakes. We've got a lot of guys playing positions that they've never played before."

And don't think that just because the Class AAA Bulldogs are dropping down a class to play the AA Tigers that they'll be any less serious.

"They're bringing 56 kids, so they have a lot to choose from," Davis said.

Capitan 26, Cloudcroft 14

The Capitan Tigers are back on the winning track after dismissing longtime rival Cloudcroft, 26-14, Friday on the Bears home turf.

Capitan improved to 2-2 overall. Two losses after a season-opening victory had derailed the Tigers. A shaky first quarter against Cloudcroft made it look

as though Capitan was headed down south again Friday night.

But the Tigers exploded for three touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 20-7 halftime lead. They then held on for the win, matching Cloudcroft's lone TD in the second half with one of their own.

"We made a lot of mistakes and we're still able to do what we did," Tiger coach Ed Davis said.

Capitan capitalized on several Cloudcroft mistakes in the second quarter, and clamped down defensively to slow the Bears.

Junior running back James Robinson got the Tigers on the scoreboard with a 74-yard touchdown run to start the scoring. Capitan's Raymond Harris broke free for a 50-yard paydirt scamper, and then James Tacey got in on the scoring act with a 38-yard touchdown run to cap off the Capitan flurry of second quarter points.

The Bears made a game of it when they launched a scoring drive that consumed most of the clock in the third

quarter and cut the Capitan lead to 20-14.

But at the close of the third period, Tiger Darrin Sedillo scooped up an errant Cloudcroft snap on a punt and raced 20 yards for a Capitan touchdown, pushing the Tiger lead to 26-14.

Three Capitan drives in the second half stalled because of penalties or other miscues.

Both teams featured running attacks that racked up more 550 yards combined.

Cloudcroft's Michael Bowen and Graham Gilbreath rushed for 214 yards.

"We couldn't stop their running backs. They've got two good ones and they were running over us," Davis said.

But the Tigers were even better. Three Capitan runners passed the century mark. Harris led all rushers with 132 yards, followed by Robinson's 128 yards and Tacey's 111 yards.

In all, Capitan gained 420 yards in offense. Senior quarterback Justin Joiner was 4-for-7 passing for 56 yards.

— Stephen Shutt, manager of Colorado City, Texas

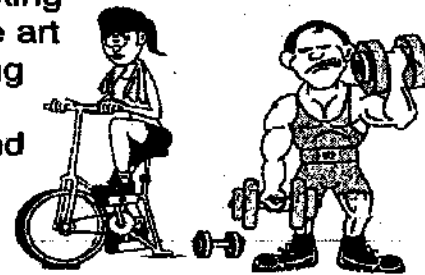

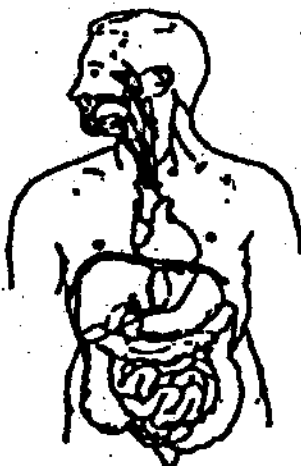

Established local jeweler in annual show

Six years ago, Joe Madrid brought his 24 years of experience in crafting jewelry and several of his Navajo silversmiths with him when he moved to Ruidoso and left a high-stress large manufacturing operation behind.

But this will be his first year as a participant in the Aspenfest Arts and Crafts Show, set for Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 3-4, across from the Gazebo Shopping Center on Sudderth Dr.

"We were always too busy here (at Apache Silversmiths in Four Seasons Mall) with all of the people in town, but now our son is working with us and can help out and give us the time," Madrid said.

With his son, wife and three other jewelry artists, Madrid selected Ruidoso, because he always enjoyed the area on vacations.

The staff works in gold and silver and cuts stones, creating a variety of styles, from traditional Navajo to Southwestern. Madrid can cast or hand-form jewelry. The shop also handles much of the jewelry repair work for other stores in town, he said. To keep busy after the summer season, the business also sells wholesale.

Madrid will be one of 80 artists showing their work this year at the arts and crafts show sponsored by the non-profit Ruidoso Gymnastics Association for the past 13 years. The show is a major source of income to pay for the gymnastics building and for equipment, said organizer Bonnie Richardson.

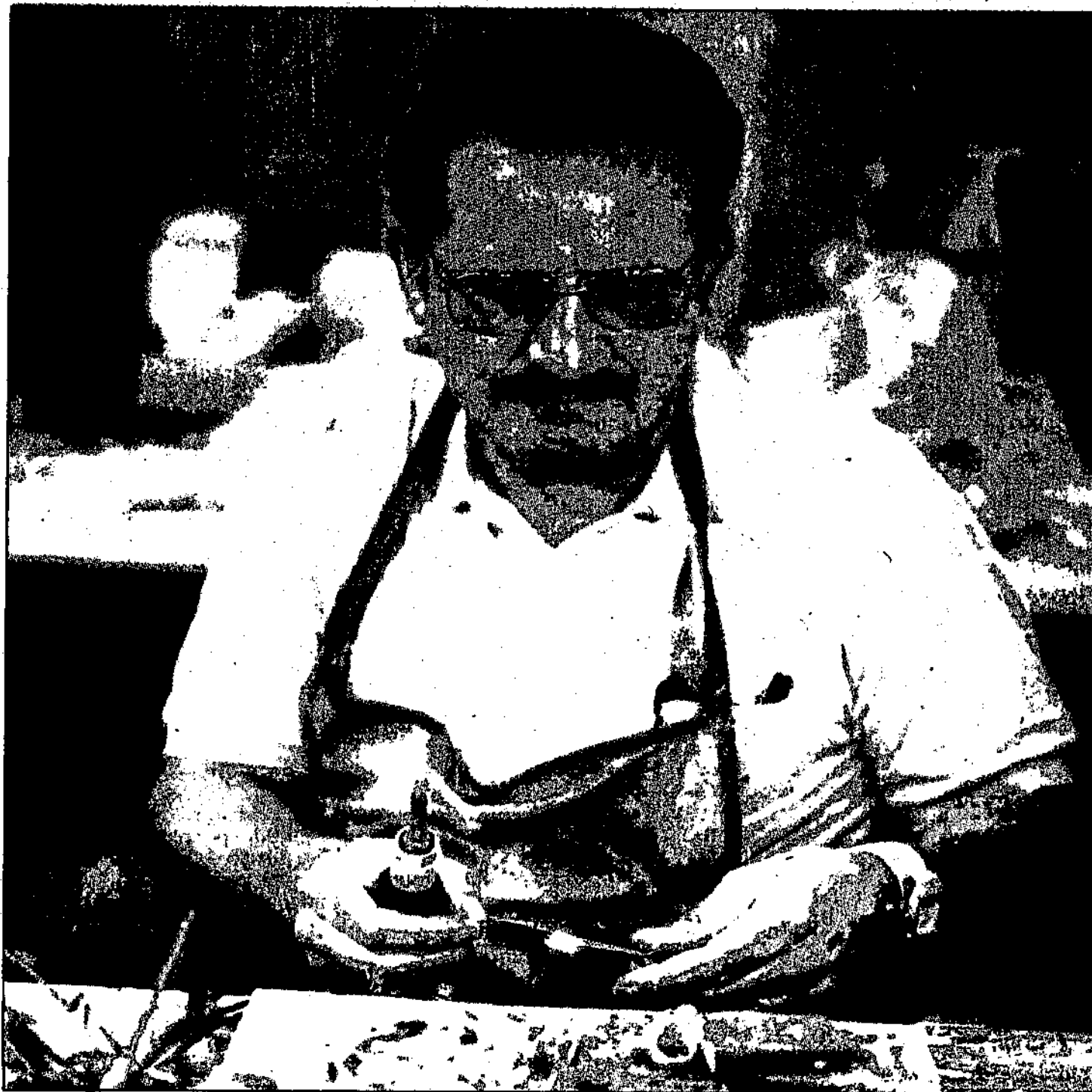
"The show is strictly items made by the artists, nothing manufactured," Richardson said.

AN 'ANGEL' LANDS IN LINCOLN COUNTY

Volunteer pilot will transport those in need to medical facilities for treatment

Al Ackerman of Alto is a lone angel in New Mexico, lending his wings to people who need to travel for medical diagnosis or treatment and lack the financial means for transportation.

Ackerman volunteered his flying skills and his airplane — a 1995 A36 Beechcraft Bonanza that seats five and is fully equipped with state-of-the-art avionics — to Angel Flight Inc. three months ago.

The organization started in 1991 with 39 flights, and will have logged 600 to 700 flights this year flown by about 400 volunteer pilots. Angel Flight Inc. covers a 12- to 13-state area, which includes New Mexico, Colorado, Kentucky and Mississippi.

Ackerman's first assignment is to pick up an Alamogordo resident Oct. 6, fly her to Midland, where she will continue to Houston for medical treatment. Then pick her up from Midland when she's done Oct. 9 and bring her home. (Another "angel" will fly her from Houston to Midland.)

Judy Mueller, who will be Ackerman's first passenger, has gone to Houston's M.D. Anderson Cancer Center since January for cancer treatments and clinical trials. She heard about Angel Flights from a woman in her Alamogordo cancer therapy group.

"It's really what these guys do," she said. "I wish I could give them all a purple heart, every one of the pilots. They take the money out of their pocket and they pay for the flight, gas and everything. They're just wonderful, they're so nice and friendly, and some of them have wives that have gone through cancer."

Mueller's husband accompanies her because after the chemotherapy treatments she said she feels like she's on a 12-day drunk.

They're all small planes, Mueller said. "They're basically like riding a Volkswagen Beetle in the air ... but I'm not scared, not with these guys."

One time, she said, the weather was so bad they couldn't take off, so Angel Flight put Mueller and her husband up for the night in the Hilton.

Ackerman, who's been flying since 1961, retired here two years ago from San Antonio, where he had an aircraft sales company specializing in jet aircraft. He and his wife, Deborah, had spent time in Ruidoso in their vacation home for the previous six years.

"I've known about Angel Flight for some time," he said, "and I just decided that since I was retired and was blessed with a successful aviation career, I would give something back to people who need air transport. I've talked to other guys who have done this and

it's gratifying when you take some poor little sick kid that couldn't afford to get there otherwise."

Angel Flight does not qualify patients, either medically or financially, said Peggy Goll, vice president of operations in Dallas, Texas.

A physician, caseworker or clergyman must inform Angel Flight that a patient needs transportation. Because this is not an air-ambulance or emergency medical service, patients must be able to get in

and out of the aircraft without assistance.

According to information provided by the organization, most of the requests for missions come from social service workers or discharge planners at hospitals and health care agencies, as well as charitable organizations such as the American Cancer Society and American Heart Association.

Sometimes patients are accompanied by a nurse, sometimes by a canine assistant. Goll told of transporting a seeing-eye dog along with a

patient.

Then there were the four Doberman puppies donated to be trained for the seeing-impaired. Angel Flight flew them to North Carolina for training, since they had a plane going there to pick up a patient.

Other people transported by Angel Flight are those with conditions that make it difficult to travel by other means, such as allergies, or family members needing to help maintain a 24-hour vigil for an AIDS patient. Sometimes it's tissues or corneas, supplies, or medical personnel that must get to a destination.

Goll said most of the 400 pilots they have are in the Dallas and Houston metropolitan areas, while the patients needing transportation come from rural, outlying areas.

Ackerman is the only Angel Flight pilot in New Mexico, and Texas and Arizona pilots have done the flying for the state.

"We've had a tremendous problem of getting pilots in West Texas and New Mexico," Goll said, "and it means we have to turn a lot of people down in New Mexico." She attributes this to pilots not being able to afford it. All expenses for the flights are donated by the pilots: gas, maintenance and inspections.

"It costs between \$100 and \$135 an hour — an average we go by," Goll said. "And every mile they fly the patient, they have to fly that again to go home."

Situations occasionally arise during the play where your only hope of making a

contract, or defeating one, lies in persuading an opponent that a condition exists which, in fact, does not exist.

It doesn't matter whether you classify this type of warfare under the heading of deception, deviousness, or falsecarding; what matters is whether you succeed in selling your adversary a bill of goods.

Here is an unusual case where West cleverly defeated a contract that declarer, against normal defense, would very likely have made. It seemed to West that a heart lead offered very little chance of collecting four tricks, so he started the ball rolling with his singleton club.

East took the A-K and returned a club, which West ruffed with the king! As a result of this extraordinary play, South went down one.

Declarer won the heart return with the ace, led a spade

and finessed the nine after East followed low. West took the setting trick with the ten, and that was that.

If West had ruffed with the ten, as any less imaginative person would have done, declarer would probably have made the contract. West by this time would have become firmly marked by the bidding with the king of spades, after East had already shown up with the A-K of clubs, and declarer would presumably have nailed the king by playing the ace instead of attempting the finesse.

Ruffing with the king was a most effective way of selling South the idea that West could not have the jack or ten. Perhaps declarer should not have fallen into the trap, but who can argue with success?

Return to Space

John Glenn Talks to Kids



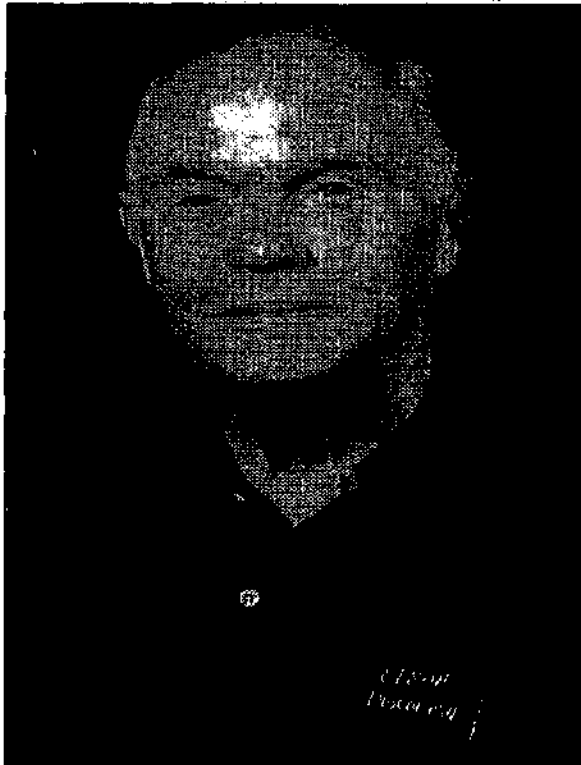
In 1962, John Glenn became the first American to orbit the Earth. Now he is about to make history again. John Glenn, age 77, is scheduled to become the oldest person in the world to fly in space on Oct. 29. Senator Glenn wrote about his adventures in space especially for Mini Page readers:

by Astronaut and Senator John Glenn

When I was growing up no one took space travel seriously. We dreamed of flying airplanes and exploring faraway places on Earth, but adventures in space were only talked about in fantasy and fiction — in fact, the word "astronaut" did not even exist.

Once the possibility of going into space became a reality, I wanted to go, and I was excited when I learned I was going to be one of the first people in space. I looked forward to learning new things and going someplace no one had ever been before.

The name of my spacecraft from 1962 was Friendship 7, and it actually was very small. At that time, we were not even sure if human space travel was possible.

During my flight, I stayed strapped into my seat because of the weightlessness. Contrary to the predictions some of the scientists made before the flight, I found weightlessness to be very pleasant.

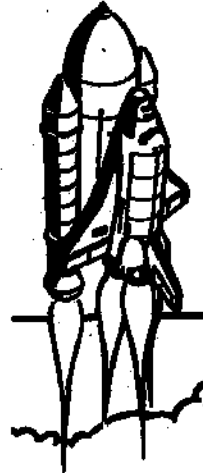
Later this year, I will be flying on the space shuttle Discovery as a subject for experiments on the effect of weightlessness on the body of an older person. I will be 77 years of age.

My age will not be the only difference from the first flight. The inside of Discovery is more than 60 times larger than Friendship 7. That's a lot more room to move around in!

Plus, I will be flying with six other astronauts this time, and I will be in space for nine days, as opposed to just under five hours in my original flight.

I do not think any of us realized how advanced the space program would become when we first began. I believe someday, perhaps within your lifetime, space flight may become as common as flying across the country.

You may even go into space, and perhaps explore farther than I did or will do. As long as you continue to study and work hard, I believe you can achieve anything.



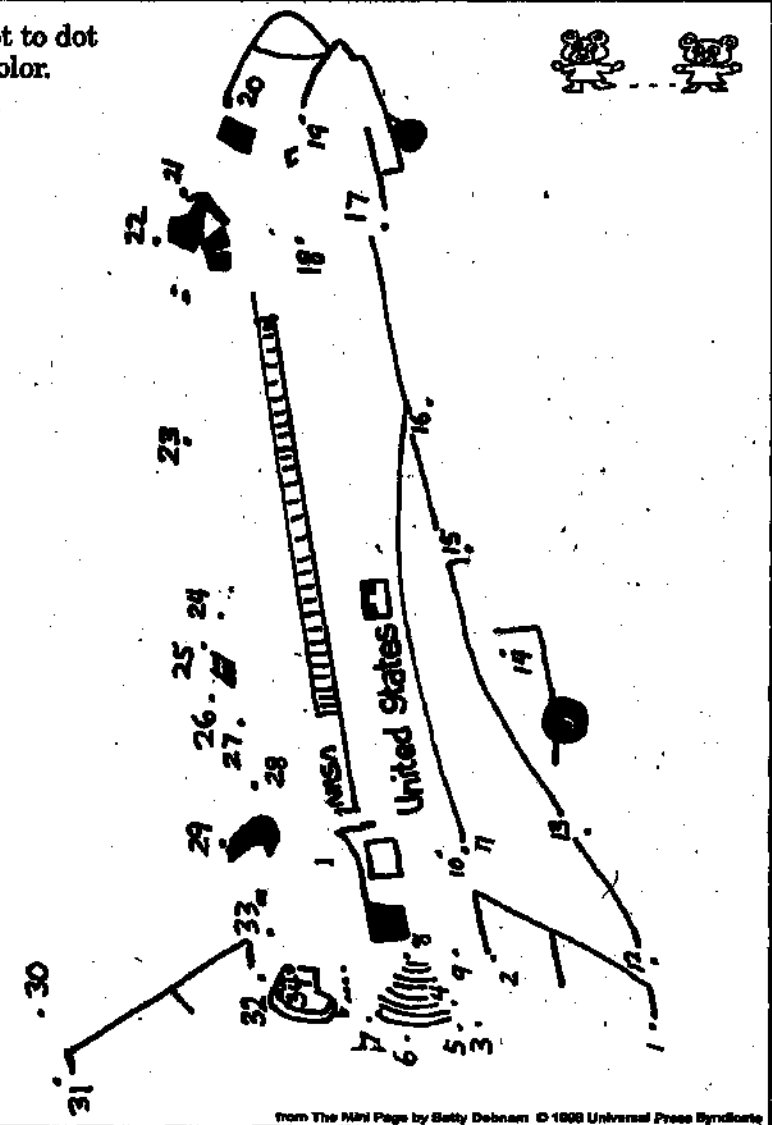
The space shuttle

Meet Astronaut John Glenn

Personal

John Glenn was born in 1921 in Ohio. He earned his degree in engineering. Nine other colleges have presented him with honorary degrees.

He was a Marine fighter pilot in World War II and Korea, winning the Distinguished Flying Cross six times. He still flies his own plane.

He served as an astronaut from 1959 through 1964, retiring from the Marines in 1965 with the rank of colonel.

John Glenn was an executive in a soft drink business until 1974, when he was elected to the U.S. Senate from Ohio. He is retiring from the Senate this January.

He is married to a childhood friend, Anna Castor. Both grew up in New Concord, Ohio. They have two grown children and two grandchildren.

When he first went into space, their son was 16 and their daughter was 14. When he goes into space this October, it will be their grandsons who are 16 and 14.

Look through your newspaper for articles about John Glenn's upcoming flight.

The beginning

When John Glenn orbited the Earth on Feb. 20, 1962, our country breathed a sigh of relief. The United States had finally caught up with the Soviet Union in the space race.

Glenn's flight also excited the world because it was one of the first times humans had ever left our home planet. His flight marked the dawn of a new age.

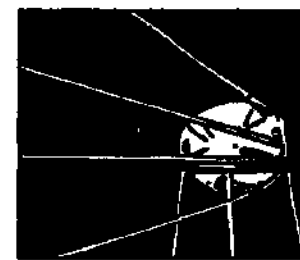
At that time, relations between the United States and the Soviet Union were strained. The threat of war was very real. The United States and many other countries were worried. They feared the Soviets might use their leadership in space in case of a war.

We were lagging way behind. Glenn's successful flight came five years after the Soviets shocked the world with the launching of the first artificial satellite, Sputnik I, in 1957.

On April 12, 1961, the Russians scored another space victory. The cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin became the first human to orbit the Earth.

The United States finally got its man into space a month later. Astronaut Alan Shepard went up and came back, but did not orbit.

Glenn's successful flight gave the whole country a boost!

The dangerous adventure

In 1962, U.S. scientists did not know exactly how dangerous space flight would be. As John Glenn pointed out, some scientists were predicting weightlessness might cause serious problems. Astronauts might:

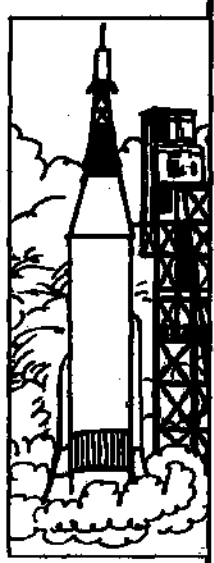
- be horribly sick to their stomachs the whole time;
- have vision problems;
- be too dizzy to function.
- be unable to swallow food or water.

They also worried that the heat shields might not stay in place, and astronauts would burn up in re-entry.

When John Glenn first went up, his spacecraft did have a lot of trouble. When the automatic controls failed, he had to fire the jets by hand to keep the capsule stable. There was not even a computer on board to help him.

Later, Mission Control thought the spacecraft was about to lose its heat shield. They had to work with Glenn to overcome the problem so he could return safely.

Return he did. Now he is going up again. Good luck!

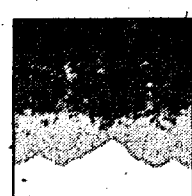

POOP SCOOP

The fate of wild horses removed by the Bureau of Land Management from public lands in New Mexico and other parts of the West has caught the attention of the Humane Society of the United States.

In the society's Summer 1998 magazine, the author of an article on the issue said reports of their treatment are grim and include allowing horses to die of thirst and starvation.

"BLM records for 32,000 adopted horses in the Adopt-A-Horse program have been lost," the author writes. "Thousands of horses have been sold to slaughter."

The BLM has struggled since the passed in 1971 of the Wild Free-Roaming Horse & Burro Protection Act to fulfill the mandate to keep public lands healthy while protecting the wild horses, other wildlife and livestock, according to the article.

Under the adoption program, BLM employees and contractors drive the wild horses into corrals on the open range. Some eventually are released back onto the range, but others are trucked to holding facilities for adoption by private individuals, who are suppose to be screened and educated to ensure they can humanely care for the horses.

Since 1992, the HSUS has worked with the BLM to slow the growth rates of western wild-horse herds using immunocontraception. The shot can be administered by hand injection quickly and cheaply to mares and the society hopes it will reduce the need for roundups and the number of horses entering the adoption stream.

Three field projects were begun in 1997-98 in Oregon and Nevada to test a new version of a one-shot, one-year vaccine and to demonstrate that population control can be achieved.

HSUS Senior Scientist Allen Ruthberg has been appointed to the BLM's Wild Horse and Burro Advisory Board, according to the article. The board is charged with recommending to BLM director Pat Shea on a range of issues.

"The HSUS is committed to helping the new, reform-minded BLM directorship to change fundamentally the structure and culture of the BLM wild-horse program, restore public rangelands, secure a fair share of the land's resources for wild horses and burros and ensure a decent life for animals, who must be removed from the range," the author wrote.

KIDS AND CORRECTIVE LENSES

Although most children between the ages of 3 and 18 receive some sort of vision screening through their school system, each child should be seen annually by a licensed Doctor of Optometry. While screening does provide an indication for corrective lenses, it does not tell about eye health, depth perception, color vision or comprehensive eye health and vision examination. Other conditions including strabismus (abnormal alignment of the two eyes or turned eye), amblyopia (poor sight in one eye) and emmetropia (good vision at distance but not at near) usually require corrective lenses. Children who have eye problems are occasionally misdiagnosed with Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) or other conditions that don't necessarily address their vision. Vision therapy such as eye exercises or vision training may help correct certain visual disorders and thus make visual tasks, especially reading, enjoyable.

Lenses for children are often made of plastic material. However, a polycarbonate lens is recommended since it is the most impact-resistant and thus the safest lens available. Glass lenses should never be used for children. Prisms can be a helpful tool for enabling a child who experiences double vision. Aspheric lenses can reduce the effect of magnifying the eye in high plus powers and make lenses thinner and lighter.

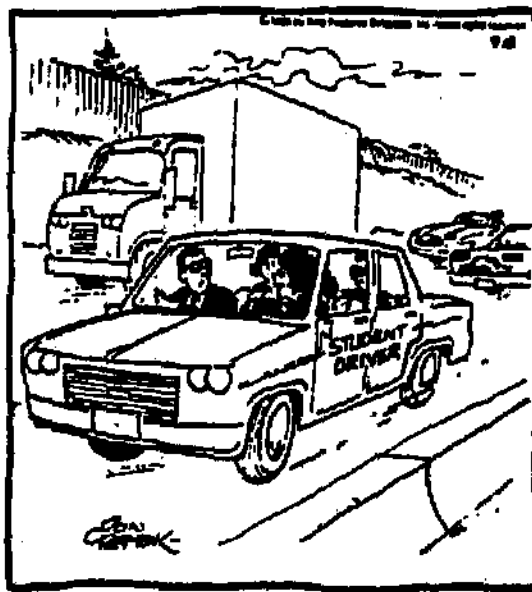

To Have & to Hold vows to be romantic ever after

There has been an explosion of shows about big Irish-American families on TV this fall, but *To Have & to Hold* is surely the most romantic.

Debating Wednesday, Sept. 30, on CBS, *Have* stars Jason Beghe and Moira Kelly as a couple about to begin the rest of their lives together in the most romantic way: by getting married.

"It seems like, on television, if you're married, sex stops, romance stops," executive producer Scott Shepherd observes. "And what we're trying to say is that, basically, marriage is a very romantic thing."

In the pilot episode, public defender Annie Cornell (Kelly) is putting the last touches on her plans to marry Boston police detective Sean McGrail (Beghe), whom she has known since childhood. In fact, Annie's older sister, Carolyn (Colleen Flynn), already is married to Patrick McGrail (Stephen Lee), one of Sean's brothers.

Since the couple will remain in the neighborhood where they grew up, their romance has a communal side as well as a private one. They know everyone on their block, and everyone knows them.

The driving force behind *Have* is writer Joanne Waters, a daughter of the Irish working-class neighborhood where the show is set.

"I only write about what I know about. I'm not going to write about a farm family in Iowa," says Waters, who spent several uncomfortable weeks last winter trying to fit into the writing staff of *Dawson's Creek*.

"I'm not into the Sturm und Drang drama aspect, and I'm not yucking it up (with this show), either," she says. "I think that life is humorous and tragic at the same time."

After writing *The DoYLES*, a family drama that almost made it onto CBS' schedule last season, Waters hit pay dirt when she reworked the concept to focus on romance.

"It's not the type of show where (you wonder,) 'Are they going to get married, or are they not going to get mar-

ried?' It's sort of how two people join together and try to get to the same goal," Waters says.

"And then we have the couple who has children and who are dealing with all those kind of issues."

In the tradition of "women's movies" of decades gone by, *Have* promises never to turn into a cop show. It isn't about an exclusively Irish experience, either, Shepherd explains.

"We see it as a relationship show about a marriage and this couple and their family. The themes that go through it should be universal."

"We try to start with something that's going on between the two of them in their relationship," he continues. "And then we try to find the cop-and-lawyer story that will give us the playground, basically, to explore those themes. (Sean and Annie will) talk about the case, which is a way for them to work out what's going on between them."

Sean and Annie's relationship is definitely a passionate one, both when they're enjoying marital bliss and when they're butting heads in disagreement. It all seems completely natural to Waters, who grew up in a community where even the girls had fistfights.

In the end, though, love will conquer all. Romance, as Shepherd defines it, is "what couples do for each other when they love each other. And that's what we're trying to (show) every week."

Windsor guides PBS viewers on tour of British realm

PBS viewers have an unusually qualified guide to English historical sites as *Crown & Country*, a series of six half-hour programs, begins with a two-hour special on Sunday, Sept. 27 (check local listings).

"We found such a mass of wonderful stories, which were slowly whittled away either because they couldn't be illustrated or simply because, in 30-minute programs, we didn't have time to include them," he says.

As a result, each program is lean and packed with information. Regardless of whether you breathlessly follow the Windsors or your interest in royalty begins and ends at Dairy Queen, *Crown & Country* will hold you.

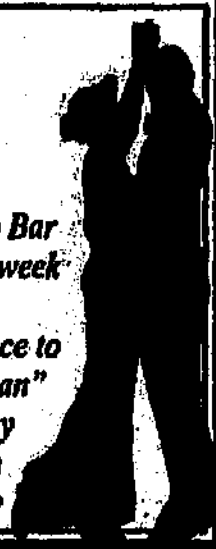

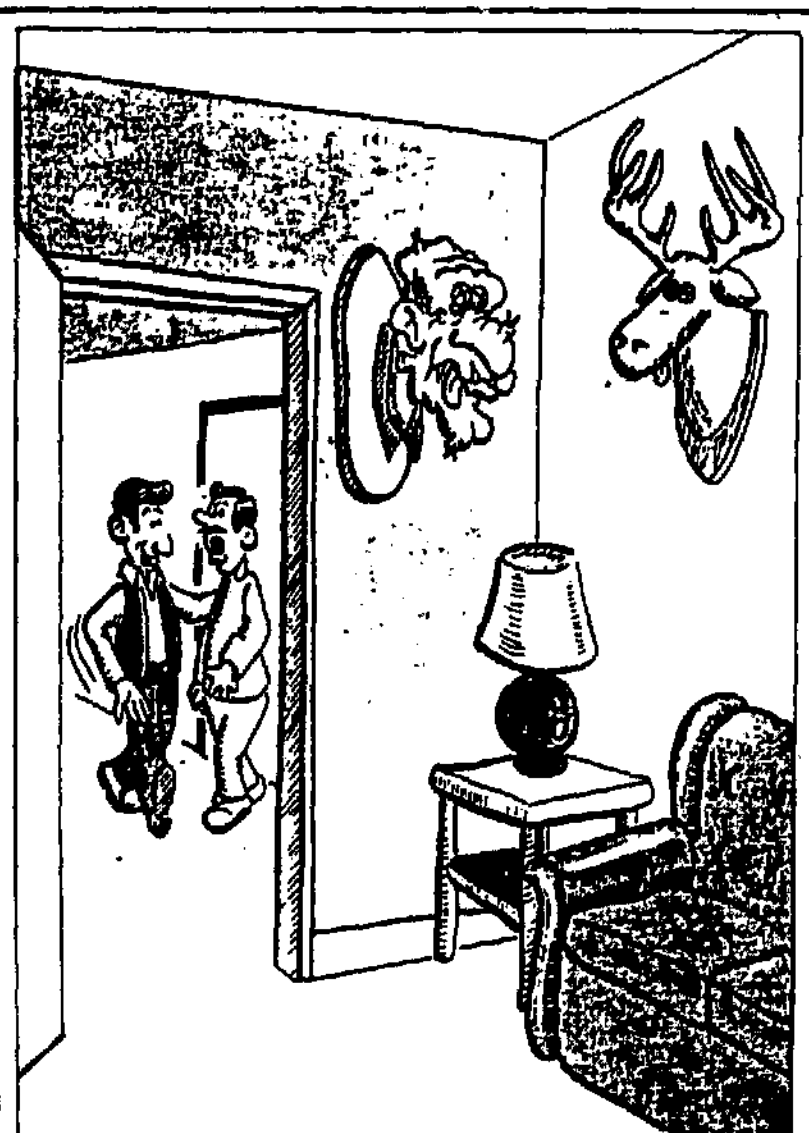

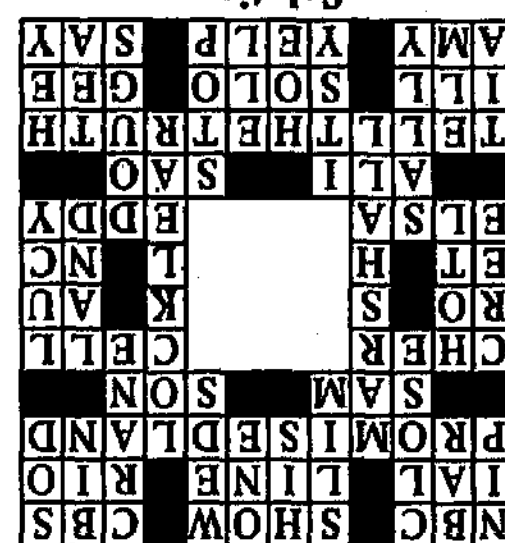
