Canadian murder suspect busted in Carrizozo

A fugitive on the run for two years, wanted in the 1996 strangulation/mutilation death of a Canadian woman, was arrested over the weekend after trapping himself in the foyer of an electric cooperative office in Carrizozo.

Alan Charles Whitequill, 43, is wanted in Regina, Saskatchewan, for second-degree murder, said Staff Sgt. Gary Cross of the Regina Police Department. He is accused of strangling his live-in companion, Emma Littlelent, 52, with an electric cord on Oct. 21, 1996.

After she was dead, he chopped off her left hand with an ax as "a calling card," according to

Canadian media reports at the time of the crime.

"He was released by the courts to appear back for trial and skipped the country within two weeks," Cross said Monday. "He's been on the run since. We heard he was in Montana and then in Denver, heading for Mexico."

Jimmy Capps, assistant manager of Otero County Electric Cooperative, said Whitequill apparently broke the glass on two doors at the front of the building on 12th Avenue in Carrizozo Saturday. He entered the office, bypassing computer equipment and other valuable items, and headed for the kitchen.

"Being a transient, I guess he was hungry and found the smoked turkey in the freezer," Capps said. "He didn't know how to operate the

microwave and blew up the turkey.

"At that point, he walked out of the kitchen and the door locked behind him so he couldn't get back to the original office where he had kicked out the two glass doors."

Whitequill apparently ate too quickly, too much or had been drinking, because he became ill while trying to kick in a bathroom door.

"He went inside and tried to clean himself up," Capps said. "Then he saw the exit door, which has a bar across it. He apparently thought he could push the bar and open the door from the inside (to exit the building)."

"But this had a deadbolt. He goes out (toward the door with the bar) and the door (into the foyer) shuts behind him (and locks). He's in

a pickle."

The exit area is constructed primarily with sheet metal and Whitequill began kicking out the bottom.

Cooperative employee Rusty Silva spotted the broken glass doors about 7 a.m. while driving by the office. He stopped at a nearby business and called his area supervisor, Buddy Zumwalt, then returned to the cooperative.

"He was standing out front and realized that the interior door also was broken open," Capps said. "He went inside and at that point he heard the banging against the metal. He goes around (to that area of the building) and this guy's got

Ski Apache set to open Saturday

Ski Apache officials, local business owners and ski bums had plenty to be thankful for over the holiday weekend - namely a winter storm that on Sunday delivered 11 inches of snow to the formerly patchy slopes of Ski Apache.

Monday, general manager Roy Parker said Ski Apache will open the 1998-99 season Saturday with lifts 3, 4 and 5 carting skiers to seven of the area's 57 trails. Parker reported a base ranging from 12 to 24 inches on the open trails. The upper portion of the mountain will remain closed.

Until Dec. 18, lift tickets are \$29 for adults and \$19 for children.

Parker described the snow as "good, heavy powder."

It started snowing early Sunday morning and continued to snow throughout most of the day, Parker said.

Snow crews spent the day packing freshly fallen snow and then made snow Sunday night.

In addition, another storm was expected to move in late Tuesday or Wednesday.

"It doesn't count unless it's on the ground," said Parker, wary of the weather reports. "(But) it looks like

Ruidoso resident killed in accident

Carla Davies-Mancha, 45, a long-time resident of Ruidoso and mother of two, died Monday after her car apparently hit a patch of black ice on U. S. 70 near Apache Summit and rolled twice.

Capt. Alfred Lapaz, of the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Law Enforcement, said Davies-Mancha was ejected from the vehicle, which came to rest facing north on the eastbound lane on its left side, Lapaz said.

Riding with Davies-Mancha was her daughter, Andy, age 9, who was uninjured. Both were taken to Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) and flown from there to Albuquerque.

Davies-Mancha's heart stopped

when the helicopter landed in Albuquerque, according to her sister, Karen Anderson of Ruidoso.

The accident was reported to BIA Law Enforcement at about 8 a.m. Lapaz said it occurred just east of milepost 251 and Chato Drive.

"Once she hit that ice she just lost control and couldn't bring it back under control and rolled the vehicle," Lapaz said. BIA Law Enforcement still is investigating the accident and also is waiting for a report from the state medical examiner's office in Albuquerque.

"I cannot say how she received the injuries she got, if the vehicle rolled over her or not," Lapaz said. "We have witnesses but they left the scene...that might have been how it happened."

People from two cars behind stayed with Davies-Mancha's daugh-

ter at the hospital in the waiting room until family arrived, said Anderson.

Davies-Mancha, who has lived in Ruidoso off and on for 18 years, also had a son, Jesse Anderson, age 15.

She was a board member of Ballet New Mexico and on the production committee for Nutcracker '98. She appeared in the first Nutcracker, and Nutcracker '98 will be dedicated to her, said Margaret McDonald Lahey, outreach coordinator for the Spencer Theater.

"We were all blessed by knowing her and having her in our lives and we're going to miss her a lot," Anderson said.

Family and friends are rallying around the children and giving them

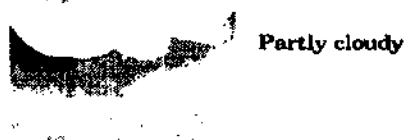

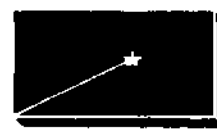

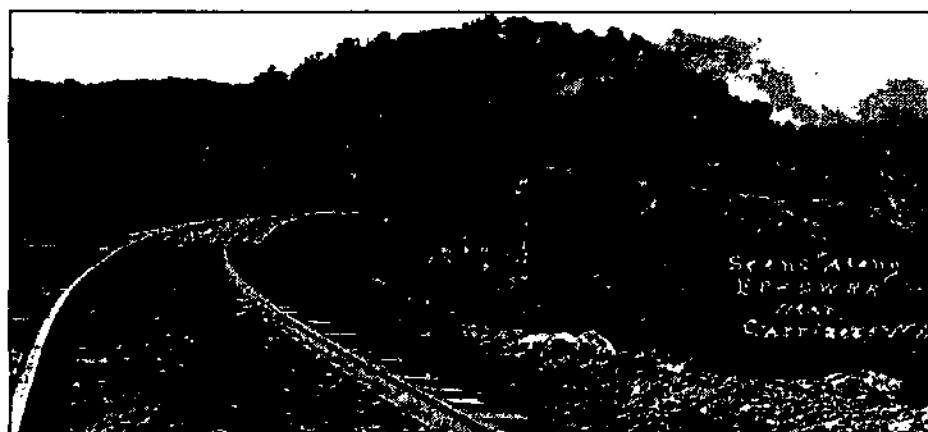

Today the moon is at perigee. On Thursday, the moon inches ever so close to the star Aldebaran in the early-morning sky. In fact, skywatchers on the west coast can watch as the moon passes in front of Aldebaran shortly before Aldebaran and the moon set. Aldebaran is the ruddy star standing just above the moon two or three hours before sunrise. Its full moon, called the Long Night Moon or Moon Before Yule.

White Oaks Eagle Dec. 6, 1900

Man uninjured in plane crash in Carrizozo

A Capitan man walked away with minor injuries Monday morning after his plane took a nose dive into the ground as he executed a forced landing in Carrizozo.

Conrad Curtis, 67, suffered cuts to his forehead and a broken nose when his plane abruptly landed on the ranch land of Bill Cooper west of the Carrizozo Airport at 8:08 a.m., according to a New Mexico State Police report.

Curtis was flying from Carrizozo to his office in Las Cruces when his 1949 twin-engine Cessna began to lose power, Carrizozo Police Chief Angelo Vega said.

He succeeded in temporarily restoring power, but lost it again. As Curtis attempted a landing at the airport, the plane's landing gear collapsed and the nose hit the ground, State Police Officer Jose Salazar reported.

24-hour road construction to start

Road crews are to start working 24 hours a day this

week on a segment of Mechem Drive from Cree Meadows to White Mountain drives, a project official said Tuesday.

Lights have already been set up for the night shifts, Jim Dickerson, project manager for Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc., said.

The 24-hour shifts are to continue for the next three weeks — contingent on good weather — to wrap this portion of the project by the Christmas break, Dickerson said.

"We were going to start it this morning and we already have had to cancel tonight's shift," Dickerson said, referring to a forecast for overnight rain.

Motorists should expect traffic delays, he said. At times, traffic will be limited to one lane, only. A "pilot car" will lead southbound traffic while northbound traffic is stopped, then will turn around and lead northbound traffic while southbound traffic is stopped, Dickerson said.

"We know there is going to be inconveniences — there is no way out of it," he said.

However, he added, most people recognize that traffic delays are part of a process that results in an improved roadway.

both arms and his head out. Rusty happened to be carrying a weapon (a firearm and a baseball bat) of his own and told him to freeze."

The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office dispatch relayed the breaking and entering call to the Carrizozo Police Department about 7:40 a.m., said Carrizozo Police Chief Angelo Vega. Carrizozo Officer Duane Vinson found Silva detaining Whitequill. State Police Officer Sam Houston and Vega assisted Vinson in the arrest, charging Whitequill with criminal damage to property (more than \$1,000) and aggravated burglary.

"He was a transient and I'm sure he was hungry, but why he picked an electric company, I don't know," Capps said, adding, "He's got to feel like a goof to get himself locked in like that. That's what you get for eating bad turkey."

Whitequill was handcuffed in the community room of the

cooperative, but didn't say much until he reached the jail, when he told officers he was wanted in Canada for second-degree murder, Vega said.

Cross said his office is preparing extradition through the Office of International Affairs, Criminal Division of the Department of Justice in Washington D.C., or may simply seek to deport Whitequill as an illegal alien, if that's faster.

"We definitely want him back here," Cross said. "We had a Canada-wide warrant for his arrest."

According to the police report on Littlelent's death, she was living with Whitequill, who was unemployed at the time, Cross said.

"A domestic argument set it off," he said.

Whitequill was arrested for the murder after he told employees at a detoxification center that he had killed Littlelent, Cross said, adding, "We opposed the release and told the court he would skip, but they didn't listen to us."

Lincoln resident makes speeders put on the breaks

Drivers who are used to zipping through the settlement of Lincoln at highway velocity received a jolt Tuesday as they saw their speeds posted on a solar-powered monitoring screen.

"It was wonderful hearing the big trucks put on their brakes," said John McGrath, a resident of the Lincoln community, who arranged the one-week demonstration.

McGrath said he was tired of hearing people complain, but not do anything about, vehicles speeding as they drove through the settlement, posing a danger to tourists crossing the road and to children playing nearby.

He contacted Precision Solar Controls Inc., of Longmont, Colo. Company officials agreed to set up a demonstration. If it proves successful and seems to slow vehicles, McGrath plans to ask the state Highway and Transportation Department to buy two \$7,500 monitors that would be mounted on poles at each end of the historic community on U.S. 380 between Hondo and Capitan.

At the same time, he'll look into financing the purchase and installation through a private grant, McGrath said.

"The one there now is just like the one in Ruidoso, more of a box sitting there," he said. "I got a kick when they were putting up the sign and the first thing I saw was a truck coming down the road at 49 miles an hour (entering the 30 mph zone) and he about stood on his brakes."

"Carla had many many friends," Nutting said. "Every

one of them loved her; she just touched people in a way. She always felt like she didn't have anything, but for someone who didn't have anything, she was able to give a lot. She was a wonderful person."

Judy Broersina, of Irvine, Calif., was another long-time friend who'll miss Davies. They met in 1975 and have stayed close-though far apart-ever since.

"She comes out here and I go out there," Broersina said. "We were just talking about the vacation we were going to take this summer to some fun tropical place."

She said Carla had opened a salon, Aesthetics by Carla, and built up her clientele and was just working on the finishing touches.

Not only was she an awesome mom and a special lady, said Broersina, "but she was the type of person that if you're a friend, you're a friend for life."

Cowboys, venues and Ray Reed's dream

Call it gentrification or whatever, but it seems inevitable that the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium is destined for greater, more urban things.

Ray Reed's vision of a celebration of cowboy culture came to fruition in no uncertain terms at the Glencoe Rural Events Center, and the center was a near-perfect venue for a good eight years. This October, however, the center's limitations became clear, as attendance at the four-day event almost doubled, to some 13,000.

One event, a salute to actor Richard Farnsworth, spilled over and filled the house at the Ruidoso Convention Center.

Moving the whole show to the Ruidoso Downs Race Track will be on the agenda today when the symposium advisory committee, in conjunction with the sponsoring Museum of the Horse discusses the matter.

Odds are, says Scott Wells, symposium director, that the committee will accept the race track's offer to be the scene of the growing event. Wells notes in a letter on this page that the entire focus will be on maintaining authenticity; that founder Ray Reed's concept was to develop an authentic celebration of cowboy music, poetry and culture. Indeed, Reed said in 1997, before his death, that he anticipated the need to move the venue, in light of the symposium's growing stature. His "Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium of the Air" is a weekly syndicated radio show that has reinforced the national prominence of the annual event.

There's just no way, it seems, that the Glencoe center can handle the crowds associated with the symposium. It's run short of vendor space, and especially parking space. Neighboring property had to be donated for the chuckwagon competition.

Nevertheless, a formal decision today to move the symposium to Ruidoso Downs most certainly will adversely impact the future of the county-owned Glencoe facility.

The symposium had evolved as the star in the Rural Events Center's crown. And the center and adjacent arena stands as a monument to the efforts of hundreds of people in the Ruidoso-Hondo Valley to create something that serves local residents and offers the potential for economic development.

A few months ago, the first of what supporters hope will be an annual arts fair was held on the banks of the Rio Ruidoso near San Patricio. Might the Glencoe center be the scene of that event in years to come? Is it feasible to establish a farmer's market at the center during the summer and fall growing and harvest season? Might the county's move to put governance of the center in other hands be seen as an opportunity to truly develop Glencoe as an asset for eastern Lincoln County and especially the historic valley communities?

The nurturing provided the cowboy symposium by the county's Glencoe center shows what dedicated people with an idea can accomplish.

There is no reason why other ideas, with dedicated supporters, can't make another success at Glencoe.

All for the cowboy way

To the editor:

In response to Kimberly Nosker's well-meaning letter concerning the possibility of relocating the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium (LCCS) to the Ruidoso Downs Race track, let me clarify some things.

First, a committee comprised primarily of volunteers from throughout Lincoln County works year-round on making the LCCS the nation's finest cowboy cultural event. All decisions concerning the LCCS are made by the committee, along with our sponsor, the Museum of the Horse, for the good of the event. Our commitment to authenticity in portraying the Cowboy Way is unwavering.

Whatever the decision of the committee and the museum, we have at least agreed on one thing — that the offer by Ruidoso Downs Race Track to

host the symposium is a generous one. The increased restroom facilities, increased food service facilities, increased parking space, increased staging and seating potential, increased vendor space and especially the proximity to town all add up to major pluses for the symposium and its patrons. Should the decision be made to relocate to the Downs, we would, in fact, be in keeping with a long cowboy tradition. Ray Reed and many other old-timers have confirmed the fact that the area which now lies in the infield of the tract was originally used as a meeting place where area ranchers, farmers, settlers and Native Americans met each summer for ranch rodeo events, horse races, music, dances and cultural exchange. In other words, if we do decide to fill the infield with chuckwagons, it won't be the first time there have been chuckwagons on that site. Miss Nosker's assertion that the customs of "trackers" will supplant the traditions of cowboys is simply mistaken.

The mission of the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium is

to preserve and to promote the cowboy's music, art, traditions and stories to as many folks as possible. The fact is that we have outgrown the Glencoe Rural Events Center, which has been a great place for the event thanks to the generosity of neighbors who have loaned us land for parking and for chuckwagons. However, if we are going to grow and bring in more people, we must find room for growth. Otherwise, we must abandon our efforts to make this a nationally recognized event, lessen our efforts to bring more visitors to Lincoln County, and raise the price for tickets, which is not in keeping with our desire to be an affordable family event.

As for Miss Nosker's concerns about the atmosphere of authenticity, I can assure her and anyone else that we intend to maintain the standards of authenticity that founder Ray Reed set out for us in the beginning. The Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium will be "pure cowboy" wherever it is held.

Esteban's 'cross as big as a man'

Like Columbus, Fray Marcos de Niza was an Italian. But at some point he moved west to Nice, France, known as "Niza" in Spanish. He was a priest, but if he wasn't simply a liar he was subject to some powerful hallucinations.

The good friar had come to the New World, where he was with Alvarado in Guatemala and the vicious Pizarro in Peru. He came to Mexico City in 1537, where the talk of the town was the recent arrival, after eight years, of four members of the Narvaez expedition to Florida.

The bishop introduced Marcos to Viceroy Antonio de Mendoza, who saw in him a way to explore the unknown lands to the north without appearing to be in search of treasure.

Mendoza sent Marcos north to look for the fabled Seven Cities of Gold, but his stated purpose was to seek out souls for the saving. With him went another priest, Fray Onorato, a number of Indian servants and guards, and, as a guide, Esteban, the Moroccan slave who was one of the four survivors from Florida.

What we know about Esteban from the writings of his comrades conflicts with what Fray Marcos wrote about him.

During the long journey from Florida, Esteban was essential to the others. He was very smart, and quickly learned enough of the languages of the Indians they met to act as the group's spokesman.

Now we see, through Marcos's report, another side of Esteban. If the accuracy of the priest's account of other matters is considered, we should take what he says about Esteban with a whole shaker full of salt. But here it is:

As the group proceeded north in 1539 and passed the fringes of civilization, Esteban was pleased to shed his Spanish clothing and play again the role of medicine man. He had bells hanging from his arms and ankles and he carried the ceremonial gourd rattle that had been given him years before.

Before long, Fray Onorato became ill and turned back. Marcos sent Esteban with several Indians to scout ahead. If he found anything important, he was to send a runner back with a white cross "a palm in length." If he found a land of great importance, he was to forward a cross twice that size, and if he found a country greater than New Spain, a large cross was to be sent.

Four days later a runner appeared carrying a cross as big as a man!

Marcos said the Indian told him of wonders he couldn't believe. There was a country to the north called "Cibola" in which there were seven cities of great wealth, the closest of which was a journey of 30 days.

(This word seems to have come from the Zuni word Sha-

wona, which means "Land of the Zunis." The American bison came to be called "vacas de Cibola," cattle of Cibola, and later the male buffalo was called "cibolo.")

Marcos was quick to follow Esteban, but he never saw him again. After 15 days, three of the Indians who had been with him came fleeing back, saying that Esteban and the other Indians with them had been slain by the Cibolans.

Supposedly, Esteban had angered the people by stealing from them and violating their women. It doesn't fit the picture of Esteban painted by his former colleagues, but we will never know.

We only have Marcos's account, which is highly questionable.

For now, Marcos said, he continued north and saw at a distance a great city — "a settlement larger than the City of Mexico." Because of the fate that had overtaken Esteban, he

made no effort to visit this vast city and encounter its people. Instead he erected a small cross in a pile of rocks atop a hill quite far from it, and claimed the land for his God, king and viceroy. Then he quickly returned to Mexico, where he had safety and leisure to write about the fabulous land he had seen, rich in gold and silver.

It is thought that if he actually saw a city, it was the Zuni pueblo of Hawikuh — an adobe settlement of perhaps a thousand people. It was a great disappointment to Coronado and the members of his expedition, who were soon to follow.

Elsewhere: While Fray Marcos was seeking the Seven Cities of Cibola in 1539, Michelangelo was busy replanning the Capitol in Rome.

Village manager reports garbage collection is receiving few complaints

Ruidoso's new garbage collection department is functioning well, says Village Manager Alan Briley.

He told village councilors Tuesday that he's not receiving many complaints about the service, which began in October, although the demand for special collections of pine needles and yard slash is heavy and the crews are about one month behind.

He's still having trouble with people who insist on putting their pine needles and yard waste in bags. The village wants the debris in piles that can be transported on a special truck directly to the area where it will be burned. When it is bagged, the plastic must be torn open to ensure that nothing is dumped that would be illegal to incinerate.

Residents also need to call for the village to pick up the piles of debris. If they leave it up to collection truck drivers or a roaming village employee to report, the piles may sit there for "a long time," Briley said.

When residents call, village employees will tell them the best places to put the debris they want collected, he said.

Briley said the village has not moved on taking over collection in pockets of county land around the village, because the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority has been doing a good job of keeping them clean or responding

Gas station burglarized

Principal Ron Hodges was contacted and assessed the damage at about \$2,000. It is believed that this occurred between 4 p.m. on Nov. 29 and 2:43 a.m. on Nov. 30.

Firearm accidentally discharged

About 5:30 p.m. Sunday a juvenile accidentally discharged a rifle in the parking lot of Furr's on Highway 70 and damaged the vehicle of the manager, the police said.

According to the police report, the juvenile and his father had been hunting and the juvenile was waiting in the car when his father went into Furr's to pick up a few items. The boy told police he got cold and was lying down in the truck, handling the rifle, with the barrel about an inch above the windowsill of the truck, when he accidentally pulled the trigger.

Police report that the bullet produced a one-inch hole in the fender of the manager's Silverado, entered and exited the heater core encasing, then lodged itself in the vacuum modulator, behind the carburetor. There were also cut wires in the route of the bullet.

quickly if there is a problem. The village had considered handling some county areas to ensure the appearance that the village was covered.

The two entities essentially will try a trade-off on authority use of the village garbage transfer station in exchange for village use of the authority's recycling bins.

"They don't necessarily want to haul all their garbage (to a regional landfill south of Alamogordo) in their collection trucks," Briley explained.

On his recommendation,

the board agreed to a \$4.50 per cubic yard charge for the authority that would allow the village to break even for the maintenance of a truck and transfer costs of handling some of the authority's garbage through the transfer station on Gavilan Canyon Road.

"In return, they will maintain their recycling program within the village and we will pay them \$4,200 a month for that," Briley said. "If the recycling bins overflow, the contract with the authority is performance based and we can get

out of it. We agreed to a 90-day term to pull out."

In other business, the council:

• Heard that although there is a waiting list of artists to display their work for two months each in village hall, several other buildings and areas are available that have not been requested. The library, convention center, the airport, the senior citizens building and village parks (for sculptures) could be used.

- Was told that state Sen. Pete Campos (D-Santa Rosa)

and state Rep. Dub Williams (R-Glencoe) will listen to capital improvement requests for state funding from village and county officials from 10 a.m. to noon, Dec. 4 in the commission room of the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

• Heard that at 6:15 p.m., Dec. 3, Mayor Robert Donaldson will flip the switch to light up the Christmas display in School House Park on Sudderth Drive near the intersection with Paradise Canyon.

"We have more lights than ever," Briley said. People will

congregate in the picnic shelter near the senior citizens center.

- Adopted a new village emergency plan designed to handle all types of disasters and put together by Thomas Chavez, Ruidoso's new emergency management coordinator.

• Was told a week-long Christmas Open House is set at the Ruidoso Municipal Library on Kansas City Street and Cree Meadows Drive starting Dec. 7 and sponsored by the library and the Ruidoso Woman's Club.

Fire destroys trailer in Downs

A stove fire destroyed a trailer parked in a pasture across from C&L Lumber at 2028 W. Highway 70 in Ruidoso Downs Thanksgiving afternoon, according to the Ruidoso Downs Fire Department.

The trailer was a 20-foot recreational vehicle owned by C.L. Wright and home to her grandson, Reese Garner, 27.

"It was fully engulfed when we got there," said fire chief Nick Herrera. The fire department was called about 5:30 p.m. Nov. 26 and worked to contain the fire and keep the pasture, owned by Bones Wright, from burning.

Ruidoso police controlled traffic so the Downs fire department could unroll 3,500 feet of hose across Highway 70, through a river and through another pasture to get to the trailer, Herrera said. There was an ambulance but no one

was in the trailer at the time of the fire.

It took approximately 3 1/2 hours to put the fire out and roll the hose back up, he said.

Reese's mother, Carol Ann Beechie, said Garner had left her house and went to the trailer to boil a pot of water, then went to the store for something. She said one of the boys across the street saw the trailer blow up.

"We're just grateful he's alive," she said. "It's sad to see something burn up and you lose all your possessions. We're just all so thankful that he wasn't there. Now he's trying to regroup. He lost everything he owned, it totally trashed everything."

Beechie said she appreciated the work the Ruidoso Downs Fire Department and the Ruidoso Police Department did.

"They are to be commended for their hard efforts," she said. "They just really put out their whole heart."

DOWN'S NEWS

The Ruidoso Downs Village Council took the following actions last week and in a special meeting Monday:

- Approved publishing proposed changes to the village's business license ordinance regulating temporary and seasonal vendors. A public hearing and vote on the changes will be at the council's Dec. 14 meeting. One proposed change would allow village administrators to issue permits rather than have each applicant go before the council.

- Approved publishing an ordinance to adopt state recommended building, plumbing, mechanical and electrical codes. A public hearing and vote on the ordinance will be at the council's Dec. 14 meeting.

- Adopted a resolution to request funding from the state Legislature for two 100,000-gallon water storage tanks, estimated to cost \$338,000.

- Approved a new full-time position with the Maintenance Department at \$7 an hour and hired a person for the position.

- Granted a sewer relief request from the North Central Trailer Park for \$150.

- Tabled discussion about creating a five-year strategic plan for Ruidoso Downs. The discussion was delayed until more information is available about the method to be used for creating the plan. Ruidoso Downs Village Clerk/Treasurer Leann Weibrecht said.

- Approved a request from Downs Municipal Court Judge Harrold Mansell to draft a

proposed domestic violence ordinance, which would allow more domestic violence cases to go to municipal court rather than state magistrate court.

- Approved a request from Fire Chief Nick Herrera to burn a donated home on North Central as a practice exercise for firefighters.

- Approved a request to create a new firefighter position at \$7.50 an hour. The position will be the village's second paid fire fighter on staff. Currently, only Herrera is on the village's payroll with the volunteer fire department.

- Approved a request from Building Code Officer Tom Armstrong for \$1,600 in computer software to allow his department to produce state standardized forms, as well as have automatic tabulation of information.

- Tabled a resolution announcing the village's position against splitting Lincoln County into two separate counties. Weibrecht said the council opted against the resolution until there has been a tangible effort made to split the county.

- Approved a request from Police Chief David Hightower to purchase four siren speakers for police cars. The four speakers cost a total of \$819.80, Weibrecht said.

- Approved a request from Weibrecht to purchase a new set of state statute books for \$620.

- Approved a resolution to pursue the condemnation of a

house close to Ruidoso Downs Village Hall.

During a public comment period, the council was asked whether the village would post a job description for the new fire fighter position. Village administrators said job descriptions

are posted for all positions.

Tabled a closed session discussion of pending litigation and the possible purchase or acquisition of real property because of a structure fire in the village at the time of the meeting.

RHS in title game — Bring on the Bulldogs

The wait is over for the Warrior football players.

They're in the show, the "big show" — the Class AAA State Championship title game.

"It's a dream come true. We've always wanted to be here," said senior Adrian Herrera after Saturday's 36-0 semifinal win over Raton before a full house of 2,000-plus at Horton Stadium. "We thought, well when we're seniors we'll do it, and we're doing it. Just one more game, one more step."

This Saturday will mark the first title game for Ruidoso in a decade. The Warriors lost the 1988 championship game to Portales. Their only Class AAA state title came in 1985 when Cooper Henderson was at the helm.

Now those reins are in the hands of coach Les Carter whose 11-2 Warriors host Henderson's two-time defending state champion Artesia Bulldogs (12-0) in a 1 p.m. game Saturday at Horton Stadium.

For many of the Warriors, the dream of playing in the state championship started when they suited up for little league football games, said senior Brett Meyer.

But belief in that dream came into focus as freshmen.

Senior quarterback Corey Saenz said that's when he and his classmates started believing, really believing.

"Just our team. Our unity. They way we played together," Saenz said explaining why the Warriors had faith. "I've felt it since then."

Such emotion and an intense desire to get another shot at Artesia — the team that has ended Ruidoso's season in the quarterfinal round the three of four years — were all the Warriors needed to propel them into the final. An injury-plagued Raton didn't stand much of a chance.

"We wanted it so bad — to get Artesia back," Saenz said.

It was evident on the field as well. Ruidoso never let the Tigers gain momentum, all the while starting an avalanche of its own.

The Warriors scored on their first three possessions of the game. The first was a time-consuming drive that was capped off by Meyer's 21-yard touchdown run.

After holding the Tigers to three downs and out, the Warrior offense launched another scoring drive that ate up the clock (4:53) and the

yardage (66). It ended when Herrera bulldozed in from the 1-yard-line.

Herrera saw his first action Saturday since Oct. 2 when he broke his fibula and tore some ankle ligaments in a game against Hobbs.

The senior fullback was Ruidoso's leading rusher at the time, and he fiercely rehabilitated the injured ankle in hopes of playing during the Warriors' playoff run. He could have returned for the quarterfinals, but Herrera said he decided to wait.

"It feels good, a little sore but it's been sore from day one so I'm already used to it," Herrera said after the game. Herrera finished with seven carries for 24 yards.

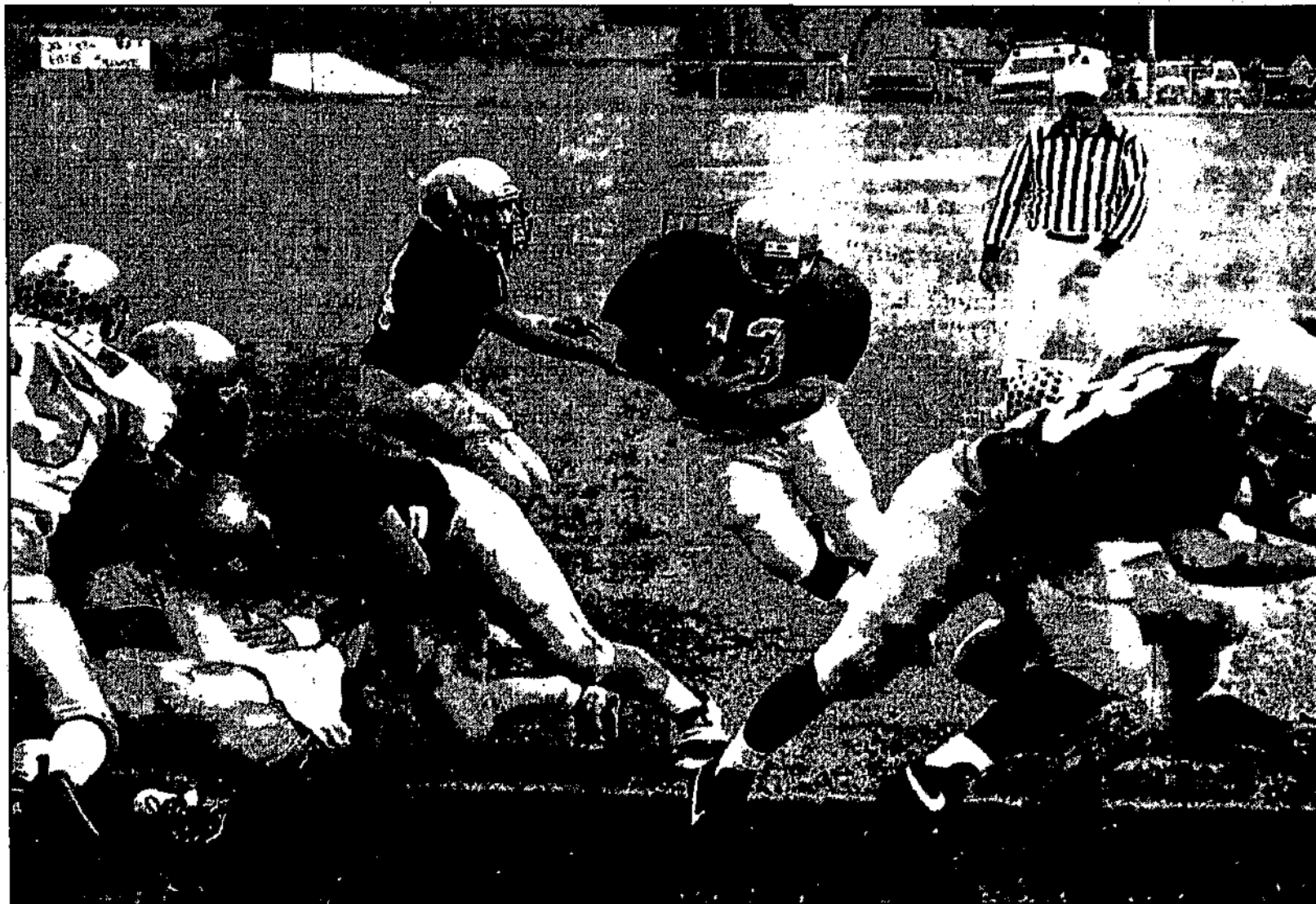
"I was conditioning the whole time I was rehabbing it. I felt good. A little winded here and there but not too bad," Herrera said.

On the ensuing kick off after Herrera's touchdown, the Tigers coughed up the ball, which Ruidoso's Keith Bassett recovered on the Raton 28. Three plays later, Saenz hit Frank Dorame on a slant pattern for a 28-yard TD strike.

In a matter of 12 minutes, eight seconds, the Warriors had put 22 points on the board, run 26 offensive plays to Raton's three and had possession of the ball for all but 1:33 of that time.

By then, Raton had lost its starting quarterback, Ned Naylor, who suffered a broken collarbone during the Tigers' first offensive series. Sophomore back-up Gabe Morales came in, and he and his center had their misfires with the snap.

"From there, we were in trouble because we were down to our third quarterback, and Gabe hasn't played much for us," Raton coach Tom Vertovec said. Morales is the Tigers' third-string quarterback behind Naylor and Chase Smith. Smith, who

injured his knee in a district game against Taos, is the Tigers' regular signal caller and starting linebacker.

"When you're down 15, 21 nothing and you've got a sophomore quarterback in there ... heck they just turned their guys loose. We couldn't even block them," Vertovec said.

The Tigers fumbled the ball six times in the second quarter, losing two of them. While the Raton offense sputtered, the Warriors continued their assault on the end zone.

Senior defensive end Garvin Grant intercepted a Morales pass around the 17-yard line and ran back for a TD. Then on Ruidoso's next offensive possession, Saenz eluded the Raton pass rush and scampered 38 yards for a touchdown.

Saenz's scrambling ability was all Vertovec thought it would be.

"His ability to do that early in the game and the crowd got really fired up — that was the difference," Vertovec

said. "I give those guys all the credit in the world. I'm not taking anything away from them. They've got a heckuva football team and we knew that. We just thought we'd get off to a better start."

It was the Warriors who got off to the quick start.

Ruidoso's Carter said it was simply a matter of being "ready."

"The kids played hard. They practiced hard all week. It was just a feeling like this was something we've got to do," Carter said. "We came out hard in the first quarter and I think it broke their backs."

The rash of early penalties against the Warriors concerned Carter, but it didn't slow down Ruidoso.

"More than anything else, the kids were anxious. They wanted to hit. They wanted to get after it," Carter said. "You know, I'd rather have them like that then sitting back on their

heels."

With the NMAA mercy rule — the game clock never stops when a team is ahead by 35 points or more — in effect during the second half, the clock served more as a countdown to a rematch with Artesia than an end to the game.

The Warriors had waited a long time for this, and the wait was over.

"They're a good ball team," Carter said of Artesia. "They do a lot of good things, but we want to play them again."

School officials scurry to prepare for sellout crowd at title game

If you thought Horton Stadium was full for Ruidoso's semifinal football game with Raton, just wait until Saturday, says Ruidoso Schools Superintendent Mike Gladden.

"I wouldn't surprise if we had five to 6,000 people for this Ruidoso/Artesia game. It will be standing room only," Gladden said of the Class AAA State Football Championship game slated for 1 p.m. Saturday.

To prepare for the predicted throng of fans, Gladden made arrangements Monday for an additional four bleachers to be brought in and placed around the football field. Those bleachers will add another 500 to 600 seats to Horton Stadium, increasing capacity from 3,200 to 3,800.

Ruidoso football coach and athletic director Les Carter said one set of bleachers will be located at the east end of the field near the ticket booth and the remaining three bleachers will be placed along the southwest corner of the field.

And, predicted Carter, "they'll be five-deep along the fence."

Complicating matters for Gladden and Carter is the construction of a new middle

school gymnasium at the west end of the field.

Gladden is keenly aware that the unfinished construction site poses a potential threat.

"We're looking at the security and with that many people here, of course, the construction. (We want to) make sure those boundaries are respected," Gladden said Monday. "We'd like for people to stay away and out of that building."

When it comes to parking, there isn't much Gladden and Carter can do, however. Parking is available in the lot in front of the Ruidoso Middle School buildings. There is also limited parking along the side streets near the field.

As of Monday, no plans were in the works to provide parking at an off campus site and then shuttle the fans to the field.

"I'm sure we'll just be parked all over this whole area,"

Gladden said that handicapped parking will be located near the ticket gate at the east end of the field. That area was filled last Saturday with cars long before the kick off, preventing officials from marking it as handicapped only.

The field has ample portable restrooms at the field, but school officials will add them if necessary, Gladden

said.

To avoid the rush for tickets, advanced tickets sales started Tuesday at two locations: the Ruidoso High School main office (125 Warrior Dr.) and the district's administration building, Central Office (200 Horton Circle). Tickets, which are \$5 for adults and \$4 for students, will be available from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. today through Friday.

Advanced ticket sales for the Ruidoso/Raton semifinal game eased some of the game-day rush last Saturday.

Still, fans started lining up at 10:30 a.m. Saturday to purchase their tickets, Gladden said.

In addition to preparing his team for the most important game of its season, Carter has several other responsibilities to take care of as athletic director.

"Once it becomes a state championship game, NMAA comes in and there's a lot of things they ask you to do," Carter said.

These "things" include everything from the public service announcements made during the game and a review of the rules for the sideline "chain gang" crew, down to game officials wearing the correct royal blue NMAA vests.

"It becomes a show, the big show," Carter said.

Joseph Ferm rediscovers a China boyhood

A 62-year-old dream became reality when Joseph S. Ferm travelled halfway around the globe from the United States to China to meet his childhood playmates in a country town in East China's Shandong Province.

Ferm was one year old when his missionary parents settled in Longshan. They left in 1936 when Ferm was just shy of 9 years old.

"All the nights that sleep did not come, I let myself drift on a river of old memories. Faces and places from my childhood lulled me," said Ferm, 71, a retired aeronautics engineer now living in Carrizozo.

"Now they are at hand. I cannot believe what happened to me," he said on the way from Jinan, capital of East China's Shandong Province to Longshan, a small country town 30 kilometres from Jinan.

"I will search for remnants of the gates and wall that once surrounded Longshan, my first hometown," he said. "I will meet with a dear friend who is a descendant of the 'Longshan Civilization' and perhaps walk down to the river where we once fished. My memories are vivid, but what my eyes cannot see, my spirit will reveal. Meeting those who remember me from many years ago will form the framework for everlasting, beautiful memories."

'I was uprooted...'

Years later he could still recall the scene at the railway station.

"I felt that I was leaving my home and playmates," he said. "I was uprooted from what was natural and common to go to an unfamiliar destination. I can still remember shedding tears as the train pulled out of the station in Longshan and the village disappeared soon afterwards over the horizon."

Ferm's Swedish father, Olof Ferm, arrived in China in 1924. He spent his first year studying Chinese and then in 1925 arrived in Longshan.

Being quite a diplomat, Olof Ferm soon gained the confidence of the village fathers and built his mission. When he left, he also left the town folks with a fond memory that has lasted until today.

"My father loved the Chinese people and shared some of my feelings," Ferm said.

Young Ferm's playmates still remembered him and his father, as they gathered around Ferm's car even before it came to a complete stop at the town's entrance.

Zhang Yuheng, 76, had waited for nearly an hour when he heard his childhood friend was coming back. They embraced and wept the moment they saw each other. And soon the memories came rolling back.

"Do you still remember one day when you were watching a performance, I opened the door behind you and knocked your head?" asked Zhang through a interpreter.

Ferm dried his eyes long enough to say: "At first glance, I couldn't recognize his face, but just at that moment, I was really touched by the rediscovered love for friends in my childhood."

Many aged villagers could still recall Ferm's family.

"When his father approached Longshan's gate, the children shouted, 'Yang Gui Zi Lai Lai' (foreign devils are coming)" recalled Wang Jing, 79, who could communicate with Ferm in broken English.

"I learned English from your mother," Wang told Ferm. "Your father liked to hold me on your bike and we children liked playing with your dog and three sheep."

The reunion was emotional for all.

"So many memories were vying for attention," said Ferm. "It was difficult to speak. We retraced the steps that took us apart, then brought us together. I lost control of my emotion."

The Ferm family left more than memories behind. They also founded a village school for girls that even now draws praise.

"Local customs at that time did not permit girls to be educated," Ferm recalled. "But my father convinced the village fathers that girls could be educated."

With their half-hearted approval, Ferm set up his school.

"Girls were very happy when they received pencils and books from the school," said Guo Shanchang, 75, whose neighbor once studied in that school.

"At that time, I heard that girls here could go to school," said Wang Xiushan, 76, who moved to Longshan from a nearby village after getting married. "We envied their good teacher."

Ferm was told that most of those female students in his father's school had passed away and the rest were in other villages.

Adobe bricks in China

Walking on the alleys of Longshan village, Ferm and his wife, Suzanne, could not contain their excitement.

"You should remember something like that!" Suzanne shouted excitedly when they saw adobe bricks and wall.

"No, it's still very modern," answered Ferm.

"It's old."

"But not old enough."

Their friendly quarrel drew laughter from the villagers.

"Hey! Is that the river we often swam and fished in?" Ferm asked when he saw a river on the east side of the village.

"Yes, and that's the same river you fell down into," answered Fu Zhihe with a smile. Fu, who often fished with Ferm, led his playmate to their former childhood paradise.

When the Fermes left Longshan in 1936, the family settled down in the north Sweden town where the elder Ferm was born. But one day in 1939 a

letter from the mission station in China arrived, Ferm said. "Please, Pastor Ferm, could you come out as soon as possible because we are having problems with bandit gangs from the province of Shaanxi."

Ferm's parents went back to Longshan and left Ferm and his siblings in Sweden.

"That year I was 11," Ferm said. "Our family's separation lasted eight years."

In 1948, Ferm's family was reunited in the United States.

Despite living in Sweden and America for more than 60 years, Ferm could not shake off his childhood memories of Longshan. As he grew older, his determination to return to his roots grew stronger.

Childhood's formative years

"My formative years were in China...that's why part of my heart remains there," he said. "It's just like some pages of a book have been gone and I have to find them."

In 1965 Ferm developed his own airport in a desert in California and operated it for 18 years, setting new safety and flight instructional records. Later, he retired to the small frontier town Carrizozo in the nearby state of New Mexico.

"So many years have passed and I can vividly remember the temple with its frightening sculptures guarding the Buddha, lying midway between the mission station and the railway station," Ferm said.

Back at the railway station 62 years later for his second departure from Longshan, Ferm stopped at a cypress tree and stood lost in thought.

"That cypress tree was where I departed China. In 1936, the train left and I am rather an old man today," he said and stopped mid-sentence. He pulled a small bottle from his pocket and cried. "I brought a little jar of soil from Carrizozo to Longshan. Today I want to sprinkle it in my first home town."

His wife turned over the soil with a shovel and then Ferm spread it around the tree.

Ferm would bring back a little soil from Longshan to his new home in Carrizozo.

"You may ask will I ever return to Longshan?" said Ferm. "Yes, not only in my dreams but perhaps one day beyond my lifetime. One-half of my ashes will be scattered in Longshan and the other half in the wilderness outside Carrizozo," he said.

"Only then will I have completed my final visit."

The bidding:

decided that his best chance of defeating the contract lay in assuming that his partner had the doubleton ace of spades.

Accordingly, he returned a low spade at trick two. West won with the ace and returned the jack, at which point declarer made the excellent play of a low spade from dummy rather than covering with the queen. But East, avidly pursuing his plan of attack, overtook the jack with the king and played a third round of spades.

It is hard to blame South for ruffing this trick high. From his viewpoint, he had the contract made if the trumps were divided normally — that is, 3-2 — while ruffing with the eight would mean instant defeat if West had either the nine or ten of

trumps. So South ruffed with the jack and East acquired a trump trick to put the hand down one.

In effect, East's line of defense created a situation that gave his side a chance to beat the contract that had not existed naturally at the start of the play. True, South could have saved the day by ruffing the third spade with the eight, but this play was much easier to make looking at 52 cards rather than at only 26.

Actually, had West's singleton trump been the eight instead of the deuce, East's method of defense would have been the only one to put the contract completely out of reach.

3 Tea and cookies



In the 1660s, drinking tea, coffee and chocolate became popular, and so did the cookies and crackers that were served with them.

4 The cookie barrel



By the 1870s, cookie-making machines were used. Cookies were packed in big barrels and sold in grocery stores. Customers ordered them by the pound and carried their home in brown paper bags.

5 The family package



The invention of family-size cookie packages changed the cookie and cracker business. Now they could be sold and protected. They would no longer be soggy and broken, and could be sold in supermarkets, as they are today.

1 In ancient times



The ancient Egyptians baked cookies in pottery baking dishes placed in hot ashes. They sweetened their cookies with honey.

The word "cookie" is probably from a Dutch word, "koekje," meaning small cake.

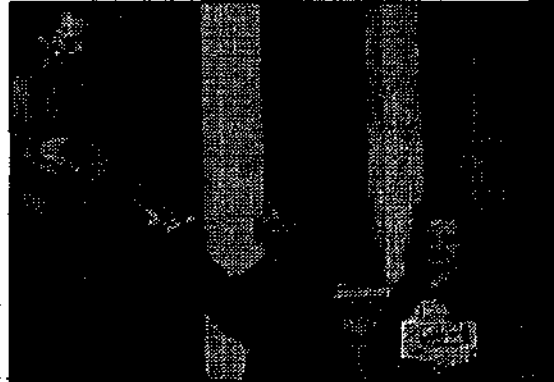
2 Crackers on board



When sailors and the early explorers went to sea, they shipped out with barrels of handy crackers on board. They were called sea or ship's biscuits. They were so hard they had to be soaked before eating.

The Girl Scout cookies



Today the Girl Scouts sell millions of their famous cookies every year. The money raised helps support about half of all of the Girl Scouting activities. This picture was taken in the 1950s. In 1912, Daisy Low founded the American Girl Scouts. Five years later, a troop in Oklahoma baked the first "Girl Scout Cookies." At first, the girls and their mothers would bake the cookies at home to sell in their neighborhood.

The Girl Scout cookie recipe

What to do:

Cream butter and sugar together. Add well-beaten eggs, then milk, flavoring, flour and baking powder. Roll thin and bake in quick oven. (A "quick" oven would be about 375 degrees for 10 minutes.) Sprinkle sugar on top. This amount makes six to seven dozen.

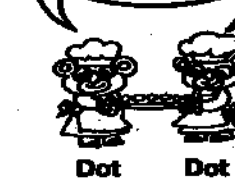

Original Toll House Chocolate Chip Cookies

One day nearly 70 years ago, Ruth Wakefield, an innkeeper in Massachusetts, ran out of nuts she needed for a cookie recipe. When she used bits of a chocolate bar instead, she baked a new treat she called Toll House Cookies, after her inn.

You'll need:

- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter, softened*
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups (12 ounces) Nestlé Toll House Semi-sweet Chocolate Morsels
- 1 cup chopped nuts

What to do:

Combine flour, baking soda and salt in small bowl. Beat butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar and vanilla in large mixer bowl. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition; gradually beat in flour mixture. Stir in morsels and nuts. Drop by rounded tablespoon onto ungreased baking sheets. Bake in preheated 375-degree oven for 9 to 11 minutes or until golden brown. Let stand for 2 minutes; remove to wire racks to cool completely. Makes 5 dozen cookies.

* The original recipe called for 1 cup butter or shortening, but the Nestlé Test Kitchen recommends butter.

Spice Cookies

You'll need:

- 1 box spice cake mix
- 2 cups whipped topping
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar

What to do:

1. Combine cake mix, whipped topping and egg in a large bowl. Mix well.
2. Place by teaspoonfuls 1 1/2 inches apart on a cookie sheet.
3. Sprinkle powdered sugar evenly on top.
4. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven 10 to 15 minutes. Makes about 3 1/2 dozen.

Gingersnaps

You'll need:

- 3/4 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup molasses
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger

What to do:

1. Mix butter or margarine and sugar in a large bowl until smooth and creamy.
2. Add molasses and egg. Mix well.
3. Add remaining ingredients. Mix well.
4. Roll dough into small balls and place on a cookie sheet.
5. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven 7 to 8 minutes. Makes about 5 dozen.

Potato Chip Cookies

You'll need:

- 1 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup potato chips, crushed
- 2 cups all-purpose flour

What to do:

1. Combine butter or margarine, sugar and vanilla in a large bowl. Mix until smooth and creamy.
2. Add potato chips and flour. Mix well.
3. Form into small balls and place on an ungreased baking sheet.
4. Press flat with the bottom of a glass that has been dipped in sugar.
5. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven 16 to 18 minutes. Makes about 2 dozen.

Shortbread Cookies

You'll need:

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 cups all-purpose flour

What to do:

1. Mix butter and sugar in a large bowl until smooth and creamy.
2. Add flour and mix well.
3. Place small balls of dough on a cookie sheet. Flatten with the bottom of a glass.
4. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 15 minutes. Makes about 2 dozen.

Cheating and succeeding: Record number of top students take ethical short cuts

'Who's Who' finds troubling trends, some good news in 29th annual survey of high achievers

LAKE FOREST, IL - Four out of five teens at the top of their classes say they got there the easy way, according to this year's poll of students honored in "Who's Who Among American High School Students."

A full 80 percent admit to having cheated during their impressive academic careers, the highest percentage in the 29-year history of the survey. Most students seem blasé about their own ethical slips (53 percent say it was "no big deal") and virtually all (95 percent) avoided getting caught.

Even so, nearly two times as many students this year than last year (46 percent versus 25 percent) point to "declining social and moral values" as the biggest problem facing their generation today.

Crime and violence came in a distant second place, cited by 15 percent.

"In all likelihood, when these kids look at the examples now being set by traditional role models - the president, business leaders, Hollywood stars, even the clergy - they have an easier time excusing their own behavior," said Joe Krouse, associate publisher of "Who's Who Among American High School

Students."

The increase in cheating - a four percent jump from last year's survey - was one of the findings of the 29th Annual Survey of High Achievers.

Among other disturbing results: large leaps in levels of prejudice against homosexuals (up 19 percent from last year) and against African Americans and Hispanics (both more than doubled, from 7 to 15 percent).

The news on other fronts was more cheering, including a sharp drop in those who mix their own driving with drinking (from 10 down to 4 percent) and a plunge in the number who have ridden with a driver who had been drinking - from 24 down to 9 percent.

These and other survey highlights:

• **Shaky values:** Almost half (46 percent) named a decline in social and moral values as the biggest problem facing their generation today; crime and violence came next (15 percent).

• **Cheating:** Four out of five (80 percent) admit to cheating on school work, up 4 percentage points from last year; a majority (53 percent) said the transgression was no big deal.

• **Sex:** Nearly one in five students (18 percent) has had sexual intercourse - the majority of them (84 percent) when they were 16 years old or younger.

• **Condoms at school:** Almost two-thirds of all sexually active students (64 percent) say they would be more likely to use condoms every time if the school distributed them.

• **Prejudice:** Tolerance is shrinking among the brightest: 48 percent say they are prejudiced against homosexuals - up 19 percent from last year; and 25 percent are prejudiced against African Americans and Hispanics - each up 8 percent.

• **Drinking:** Nearly one-half of the brightest teens (47 percent) say they have consumed alcohol, despite being underage; more than three-quarters (78 percent) say obtaining alcohol is easy or not very difficult.

• **Violence:** Sixteen percent of teens report gang fights occurring at their schools, and 22 percent say students have attacked teachers.

Cheaters DO Prosper

In high school, apparently even the academic elite take a ho-hum attitude toward cheating. Eighty-three percent say cheating is common at their schools, and this is one lapse they don't try to pin on the

other guy: a full 80 percent say they have done it themselves. More than one-half (57 percent) say it would be easy or not very difficult to obtain test questions and answers at their schools.

Perhaps lax enforcement of the rules is partly to blame: 95 percent of the cheaters were never caught. Silence might be another culprit: over one-third of top students (34 percent) have never heard anything from their parents about cheating. Parents seem unaware that cheating might be an issue their children are grappling with.

In fact, in a 1997 survey of

parents of "Who's Who" kids, 63 percent stated flatly that their children had never cheated; another 11 percent admitted they had no idea whether their youngsters had bent the rules.

"With such a casual attitude toward cheating on the part of so many parents and school authorities, it's no wonder more than half of the cheaters just shrug it off, saying 'it didn't seem like a big deal,'" said Krouse.

"If the folks in charge of moral guidance don't make a bigger fuss about ethical behavior, it won't be a big deal."

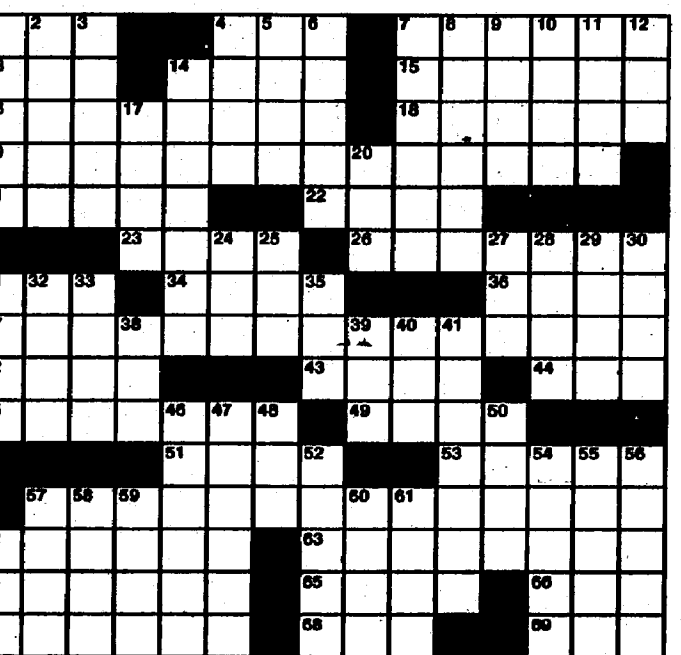

POOP SCOOP

Time for a reminder about the special dangers and enticements for your pets through the holidays.

The Humane Society of the United States offered some advice for pet owners including:

- The hectic holiday season is a bad time to consider adding a pet to any household.

The exception might be someone who will be spending the holiday alone and who would appreciate the companion now and for years to come.

But in general, the HSUS recommends waiting until after the holiday season to adopt a new pet, and allowing the potential pet owner to be fully involved in the decision.

For those contemplating pet adoption, great gifts could include videos and books on pet care, collars and leashes, toys, beds and other pet-related paraphernalia.

Many animal shelters offer gift certificates for pet adoption (approval of the adopter is required).

The local Humane Society of Lincoln County has gone a step further by agreeing to pay the cost of spaying or neutering a newly adopted pet during the month of December, reducing the adoption fee to about \$20.

Other holiday suggestions from the HSUS include:

- Keep holiday trimmings away from pets. Ribbons, tinsel and garlands can be swallowed, causing damage to a pet's stomach and intestines. Fragile ornaments, candles and electrical cords can cause injuries. Some holiday plants also can be poisonous to pets.

- Aspirin, often used in water for Christmas trees, is toxic to cats. Don't use it and cover the water with foil to reduce your pet's access.

- Don't share your holiday feast with your pets. Chocolate can be toxic to dogs and cats, turkey bones can cause choking and fatty foods lead to painful pancreatitis.

- Pets can easily become over excited or scared during a party and the food also may pose a threat. Move pets to a quiet room away from guests and noise.

- For holiday travel, leaving your pet at home may be the best option for the whole family. Hire a professional pet sitter to care for your pets while you're away. If you plan to take your pets with you, be sure it has a secure identification tag with your name and two phone numbers -- your home number and the one at your destination.

If you and your pet are separated, proper identification is your furry friend's ticket home.

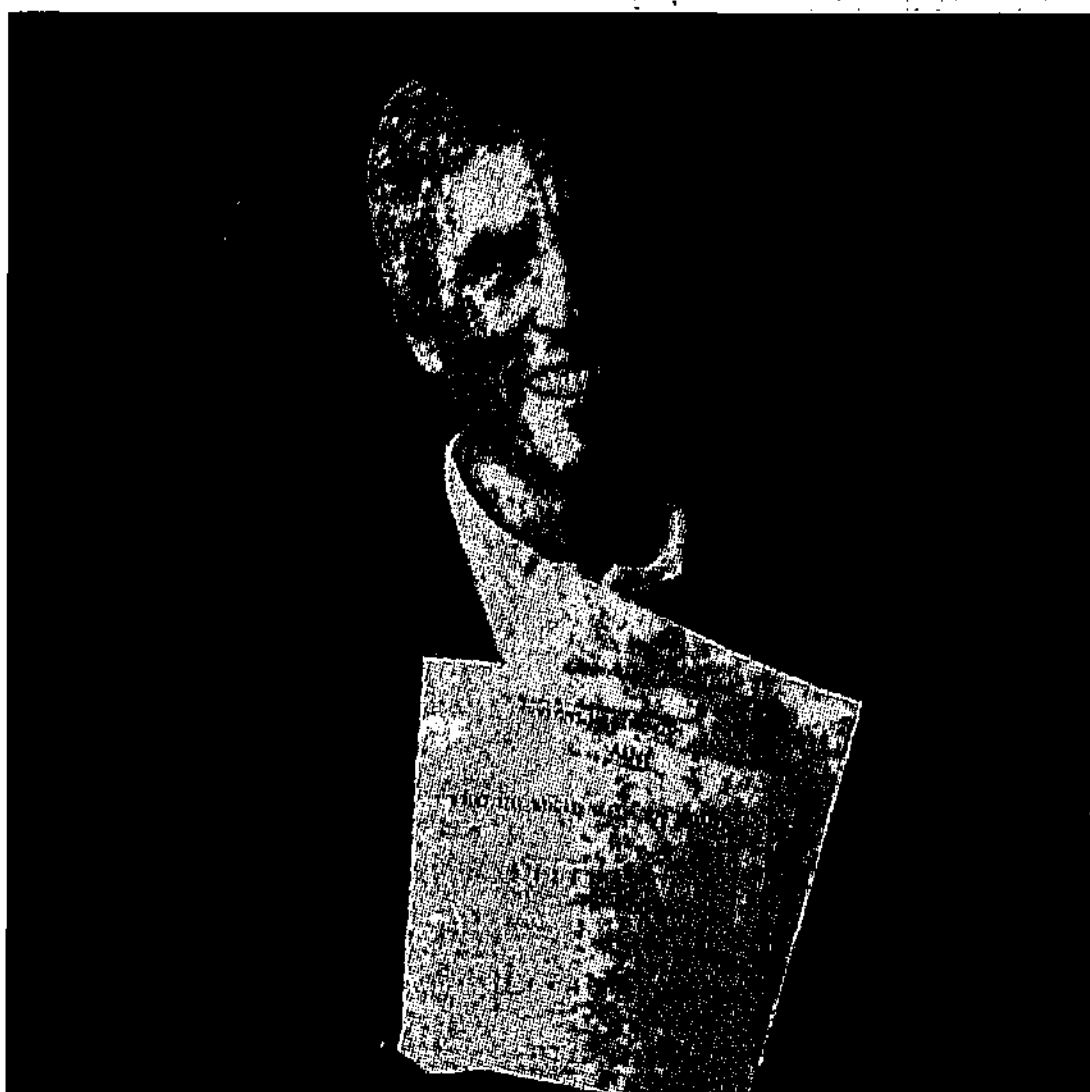

John Denver's legacy lives in 'Let This Be a Voice'

For a generation and a half, no poet drew inspiration from nature like singer-songwriter John Denver.

Millions heard their own love of the natural world expressed in Denver's words and music. For them, this week's edition of *Nature* is not to be missed. "John Denver: Let This Be a Voice" airs Sunday, Dec. 6, on PBS (check local listings).

The film is a notable departure for the series, which usually presents some aspect of the natural world through the eyes of experts. But this week's episode is a tribute to the amateur nature lover, a Pied Piper who cast his enchantment on others.

"I'm always amazed at the people who say they moved to Colorado because of (the song) 'Rocky Mountain High,'" says producer Sandy Ostertag, who began the film as a collaboration with Denver and had to finish it herself after his death in a plane crash last year.

"You run into these people fairly frequently," she adds, "which is pretty interesting."

But for those who soared on eagle's wings and crashed over ocean swells in awe and delight with Denver's music, it's hardly surprising.

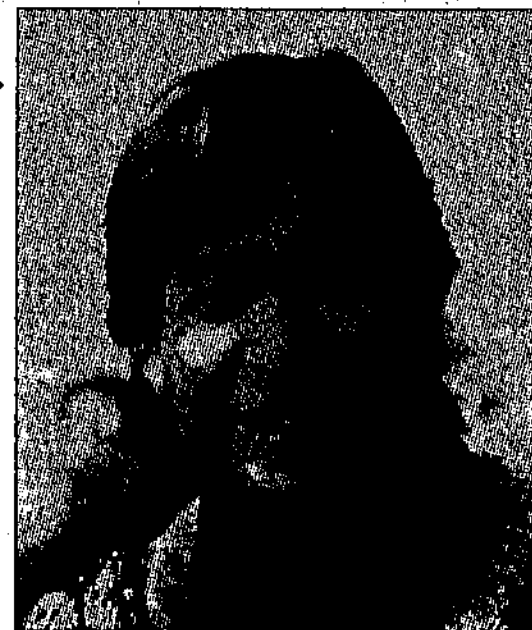
The son of a military test pilot, Denver saw a lot of the country during his childhood and spent much of his time on tour during his 1970s heyday.

"Let This Be a Voice" follows Denver to Idaho, Colorado, Wyoming, Alaska and Arizona. It recalls how he came to write "Calypso," "I Am the Eagle" and "Rocky Mountain High."

Footage from Denver's 1975 voyage aboard Jacques Cousteau's yacht *Calypso* was donated by the Cousteau Society, Ostertag explains, "in part, because when John wrote the song 'Calypso,' he donated all the proceeds back to the Cousteau Society."

Denver wanted to use his success to be an advocate for nature, and the film recalls how he helped pass the Alaska Lands Act, protecting 1 million acres of wilderness.

Inspired by the saga of the North

American wolf, Denver was writing a new song, "Yellowstone, Coming Home," especially for the program; the only sanctioned recordings of it can be heard here. (Denver performed the song at two concerts in the week before his death, and at least one fan's illegal recording exists.)

"I quite like this last song," Ostertag says. "I think it sums up a lot of who he was. ... 'Alaska and Me,' which is another one he sings in the show, captures the spirit of the frontier and of freedom that John was so good at putting across in music."

Some musicians require optimum acoustic conditions for recording, but not Denver, who in the special stops to sing whenever he isn't river-rafting with his children, photographing wildlife, flying over a glacier or — yes, once — saying, "Far out."

"The good part about recording John anywhere was that he had a fabulous voice, and he was rarely off-key," Ostertag says. "A lot of recording artists really aren't that good in person, but he wasn't one of them."

Not everything that was planned for the program was accomplished. A segment on horseback and a meeting with filmmaker Jim Dutcher (*Wolves at Our Door*) were never completed.

In the middle of the moving tribute, Ostertag slips in her friend's haunting words.

"If I come back," Denver says with joy, "I'll be an eagle. You can count on it."

All Dogs Christmas Carol 'scrooges' up Dickens classic

If you can't resist a candy cane or humming along with the Chipmunks' rendition of "Jingle Bells," then why not indulge in another prefab holiday confection?

An *All Dogs Christmas Carol* debuts Sunday, Dec. 6, on Fox Family Channel. The animated movie features the characters from *All Dogs Go to Heaven* and even begins with the haloed pups frolicking on clouds.

After that opening sequence, the film travels to the Flea Bite Cafe, where the dogs are preparing for a festive holiday celebration. But the dastardly Carface (voice of Ernest Borgnine) says, "Bah, humbug" over all the fuss and plans to ruin the yuletide.

With some divine help, Charlie and Itchy (voices of Steven Weber and Dom DeLuise) decide to teach the grumpy old dog some new tricks.

The film also features the voices of Charles Nelson Reilly and Sheena Easton. Bebe Neuwirth (*Cheers*) stands out as Annabelle.

Unfortunately, Neuwirth's performance is one of the sole treats in this very liberal interpretation of Charles Dickens' classic that is fraught with unnecessary and weird turns. Why set the film in San Francisco? Why have it snow on Alcatraz? Even if you accept the plot at face value, lapses in logic prevail.

Attempts to be clever fail, such as the offhanded reference to *It's a Wonderful Life* that goes nowhere. Finally—22 minutes into the presentation—*All Dogs* delves into Dickens' ageless plot, using strained devices to present the ghosts and show Carface what a lowdown cur he's been.

The film can't seem to decide if it's playing a trick on Carface or if it will tell the soul-searching tale Dickens wrote. Apparently, the intent here was to soft-soap anything that could possibly scare the kids or make them think too deeply.

Still, if you absolutely need that tinsel fix, and anything with a Santa hat and a sing-along will do, there are worse fates than going to the dogs.

EYE INJURIES & EMERGENCIES

On Tuesday afternoon I was splitting kindling for the fireplace and a small bit of wood flew into my eye. I brushed off the outside of my eye then rinsed it with some water. I thought the wood was gone and it didn't hurt any more. This scenario is heard all too often. Is there an eye injury? Is this an emergency situation?

Your eyes are very delicate organs. Damage to eyes, although superficial at first, can easily result in infection and recurrence of pain. Eye injuries such as blunt trauma, chemical burns, abrasions to the cornea or sclera (white portion of the eye) or a foreign body such as wood chips, metal shavings and sand should receive prompt attention from your eyecare professional. Even a torn or improperly fitting contact lens may cause irritation and an abrasion. Without prompt, effective attention, these conditions can result in scarring or, if left untreated, loss of vision.

Conjunctivitis, more commonly known as "pink eye" is another condition which, if left untreated, can result in serious damage to the eyes. In addition, this is a highly contagious bacterial infection requiring prescription antibiotics to eliminate recurrent symptoms.

At the first sign of any pain, swelling, unusual redness, mattering or crustiness around the eyes, flashing light or loss of vision, call your eyecare professional immediately. If, after the initial telephone consultation, the condition is determined to be a non-emergency, an appointment can be scheduled. If, however, immediate treatment is needed, your eyecare professional can determine the best course of action to prevent further damage to your eyes and begin treatment.
