On-site video slots sure bet for Ruidoso Downs

The Ruidoso Downs casino is back on track — literally. Mark Wilson, president of Hubbard Enterprises, confirmed Tuesday that a disagreement between the Ruidoso Downs Race Track and its landlord, Albuquerque attorney Charles C. Spann, has been settled, allowing track owner R. D. Hubbard to proceed with plans to build the casino near the grandstand rather than at an alternative site. Wilson said an agreement was reached about six weeks ago, but the details were worked out recently. "It's all taken care of and agreed to, and we

don't foresee any problems," Wilson said Tuesday. Wilson wouldn't disclose the terms of the agreement with Spann, or when exactly the agreement was reached. Spann, likewise, declined to specify details. "I don't care to comment about the contract except that we do have one," Spann said Tuesday. "We do have an agreement that permits them to go ahead (with the casino)." The 14,000 square foot facility will be built on the east end of the grandstand where a children's playground presently sits. Preliminary work on the architectural plans has started. "We're going through some fairly exhaustive work right now," said Wilson, noting progress has been made on floor plans, personnel and architectural plans. "All the so-called soft stuff is being

done right now." Ruidoso Downs Race Track General Manager Rick Baugh said construction work could begin as soon as the current race meet is over. The last day of racing is Labor Day, Sept. 7. Patrons won't be able to pull handles on the 300 slot machines, however, until early spring. The state gaming commission is busy putting together rules and regulations, determining who will win the central computer contract and hiring personnel to staff its office. All of that must be in place before anyone slides a coin into a racetrack's video slot machine. Baugh and Wilson both guessed either March or April as the earliest opening dates for the Ruidoso Downs Race Track casino. "That's realistic as far as I know, right now,"

Wilson said. "We should have the slots operating before the meet starts next year." New Mexico Racing Commission Chairman Eddie Fowler agrees. "I don't know if anybody can come out with specific time in 1999. I foresee it hopefully the second quarter of '99," said Fowler, noting it takes time to set up the gaming commission according to the specifications of the state legislature. The gaming control board is working as fast as it can, but it has to maintain its integrity to protect everyone, Fowler noted. Speaking to Ruidoso Rotarians on Tuesday, Baugh emphasized that the casino's focus will be in support of horseracing—to provide bigger purses and thereby attract more and better horses to the track.

Jail gets inspected by ACLU

A representative of the American Civil Liberties Union paid a surprise visit to the Lincoln County jail in Carrizozo. Michael Murphy said Tuesday the tour last week was part of an on-going investigation of jail conditions prompted by several complaints to the ACLU about treatment of prisoners. "I'll be reporting what I saw (Friday) to the ACLU in Albuquerque," he said, declining to comment in any detail. "They determine whether to go ahead with any action." Jennie Lusk heads the ACLU in New Mexico and reviews complaints with a board of advisors, which includes Gary Mitchell, a Ruidoso lawyer who often is appointed to represent defendants in cases that might result in the death penalty.

One of the complaints about the jail came from Hollyce Johnson, whose husband Ivan is serving a sentence for violation of a domestic violence restraint order.

Johnson brought a list of concerns to the County Commission two months ago, including her claim that her husband was denied medical treatment when he was ill.

Since then, she has collected complaints from many former and current inmates, who contend they also did not receive proper medical care, were not protected by guards and were beaten by other inmates and that the jail at one time was infested with bugs.

The commission is in the process of deciding where to build a new jail to relieve crowding.

The county has been cited by the state fire marshal for failing to comply with fire and safety codes in the old jail in the county courthouse complex.

Capitan residents to decide bond issue for improvements to water system

Capitan voters will be able to decide Sept. 15 if they want to continue to pay property taxes for improvements to their village water system.

A \$600,000 general obligation bond for water improvements was paid off July 1. The Board of Trustees sent nearly 700 questionnaires to residents asking if they're interested in approving another bond issue for any combination of three projects: water system improvements that could include storage tanks, drilling a well and buying a backhoe for \$515,000, heavy equipment for the street department at \$220,000 and remodeling and expansion of village hall for \$230,000.

"The response was pretty good," Mayor Norm Renfro said Monday. "We received about 350 back and only 35 didn't want anything. The majority were for drilling a water well."

Trustees unanimously decided last week to put the questions to village voters.

The total package would be \$965,000, about \$365,000 more than the recently expired bond issue. If voters approved all three, the amount of property taxes being paid by residents could go up 2.7 mills, Village Clerk Deborah Cummins said. But she emphasized that the board could decide only to do portions of the projects to keep the price down.

Property owners were paying 9.09 mills annually toward the repayment of the village debt and

1.42 mills for the operation of the village, Lincoln County Tax Assessor Patsy Serna said Monday. One mill equals \$1 for each \$1,000 of taxable property value. In New Mexico, property is taxed on one third of market value.

The owner of a home worth \$90,000, would have been taxed on a value of \$30,000 last year. He would have paid \$315.48 for village operation and debt, and a total of \$749.55 in taxes, including county and school district.

If the full 2.7 additional mills are imposed, that owner's taxes would go up by \$81 a year, Serna said. He would pay \$396.48 for the village's obligations and a total of \$830.55 for the total tax package, Serna said.

Alleged robber faces hearing on competency

A Carrizozo judge today is to decide whether an armed robbery defendant needs a competency evaluation, a prosecutor in the case said Tuesday.

Alberto Rojas, a 20-year-old Albuquerque man charged with the 1996 armed robbery of a Ruidoso bank, has the mental capacity of a 9-year-old child because of a head injury about six years ago, his attorney says.

"He was thrown from a (Albuquerque) city truck when he 14," said Jacob Vigil, Rojas' Albuquerque attorney. "He suffered a subdural hematoma and a fractured skull. He was in a coma for a week and he sustained permanent brain damage."







Commission to meet with judge on jail issue

District Judge Robert Dougherty wouldn't talk Monday about remarks by Lincoln County Commission Wilton Howell, but he's ready to speak directly to the commission at a public meeting.

Dougherty wrote the commission asking to attend a session with several other judges from municipal, magistrate and district court.

"I assume that (County Attorney Alan Morel) would be present to verify some issues of law that I wish to discuss with (commissioners)," Dougherty wrote.

"He doesn't like the side

I've taken that the administrator of the jail should determine who goes on radio monitor and work release," Howell said Monday. "But they've got to give us some leeway. The administrator knows more about inmates after seeing them for six weeks than a judge after six minutes."

"We need some help." The commission is in the initial steps of building a new jail. The public will voice opinions about possible sites at 6:30 p.m. Friday at the county courthouse in Carrizozo and again at 6:30 p.m. July 31 at the Ruidoso Convention Center.

But for the next 1 1/2 years until the new jail is completed, the county will have to juggle its inmate population to stay within mandates from the state fire marshal.

In his letter, Dougherty enclosed a transcript of a portion of the June 29 commission meeting that contained Howell remarks: "We have judges that if you have too big a facility, that are not going to look at alternate incarceration. They are going to go the easy way out and fill it up rather than look at drug rehab programs, alcohol rehab programs, or work release programs."

To generate more revenue for the jail, Howell also would like the state to pay jail fees for prisoners sent there by judges, "unless it's at our discretion," he said.

He would welcome a meeting with the judges, Howell said.

"We need to talk to them before we decide on the size of the jail and the type of facility," he said. "We also need their help to lobby the state Legislature to make some changes to help the counties and the court systems."

Five Ruidoso businesses cited in alcohol sting

Five businesses out of 28 sold Mickey's Malt Liquor to minors in a sting operation Thursday afternoon, said Todd Griffin, special agent for New Mexico Department of Public Safety's Special Investigations Division.

Pizza Hut on Sudderth failed to check I.D.'s and sold the alcohol to two 18-year-old volunteers. Circle K and Wal-Mart Super Center on Highway 70 in Ruidoso Downs, Allsup's at the intersection of Sudderth and Mechem, and Lincoln County Grill on Sudderth, checked I.D.'s

and sold the alcohol anyway.

This is the second offense for Circle K, Wal-Mart Super Center and Allsup's, according to the police.

Agents issued criminal citations to the employees and administrative citations to the businesses involved. Selling to a minor is a misdemeanor and carries a maximum penalty of \$1,000 and/or up to a year in jail.

For the businesses, a first offense could be fined from \$1,000 to \$2,000 and alcohol sales suspended for one business day. A second offense could be fined from \$2,000 to \$3,000 and alcohol sales suspended for seven business days.

The volunteers, who Griffin said "look very young," were carrying their own drivers' licenses that showed their true birth dates and a warning that they won't be 21 until the year 2000.

The sting team started at Circle K around 2:30 p.m. Thursday, and traveled to the other end of town trying to buy Mickey's Malt Liquor. They quit around 7:30 p.m.

"We have an agent in the store who enters before the girls come in and will stand over near the candy rack and observe what's going on, and we have a body wire on the volunteers," Griffin said. Then the volunteers pick up a 40-ounce bottle of

Mickey's Malt Liquor and take it to the counter and attempt to buy it.

In another alcohol sting operation conducted by Griffin Dec. 13, six of 17 Ruidoso establishments reportedly sold alcohol to an 18-year-old woman working with the Special Investigations Division. Griffin asked to prosecute but charges were dropped against the defendants because six months had passed before a trial, which violates state law.

This time, Griffin said he will refer it to the District Attorney's Office, which will decide how to handle the prosecution.

Annexation committee dissolved - for now

Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson has done away with, at least for the time being, the village's ad hoc annexation committee.

"Basically, the reason we dissolved it is because we have those (pending annexation) areas that are going to take 12-18 months and we feel that is probably enough (work) on the planning department as it is," Donaldson said recently.

"So, there really isn't any need at this point to look at the other areas until after we get the others finished up."

Ruidoso has sent seven annexation proposals to the New Mexico Boundary Commission for approval. Though the applications all must be filed with the state, the commission will only need to approve the applications in which the owners of more than

51 percent of the land oppose the annexation.

For more than a year, the ad hoc committee met monthly to consider annexation possibilities for Ruidoso. The committee's recommendations were passed along to the Ruidoso Village Council for final approval. Because of the informal status of the committee, no council action was needed for its dissolution.

Donaldson said the village's ad hoc annexation committee may be reinstated after the seven areas are incorporated. Eventually, future annexation targets may include Alto, he said.

"Everything in its own time. I've never run from the fact that I believe that Ruidoso Downs, Ruidoso and Alto all ought to be one community," Donaldson said. "And I think ultimately they will. But everything in its own time."

The incorporation of Alto

will happen because it needs to, he said.

"Ruidoso Downs is a different thing. I think it's very much a waste of taxpayer money to have two police departments, two city halls ... I think just the scales of economy dictate that the community should be one."

In October of last year, the village's ad hoc committee decided against proposing the annexation of Gavilan Canyon because of the potentially tremendous cost of providing village services to the roughly 300 landowners there.


Instead, the committee recommended the annexation of five "pockets" of unincorporated land inside Ruidoso as well as the Carrizo Canyon area and an area around Lookout Estates.

Cleatus Richards, director of the Ruidoso Planning Department, said the Boundary Commission usually takes about six months to act

on an annexation application. Landowners in the annexed areas would have 30 days to appeal any ruling. Additionally, the Ruidoso Village Council will conduct a public hearing before officially annexing the areas if the state gives its approval.

The following are the "pocket" areas up for annexation:

- About 40 acres above the Sleepy Hollow subdivision;
- About 55 acres which contain the Chateaux Village;
- An area of 34 acres including a Carrizo Road frontage area and the Camelot Crown Estates;
- About 7 acres of frontage road along U.S. Highway 70;
- And about 9.5 acres along Gavilan Canyon Road including some school grounds and ball fields as well as homes.

HEARING: The defense contends that there is a case of mistaken identity

Prosecutor Scott Klundt said his office filed the motion for the competency hearing scheduled at 10 a.m. today in the 12th District Court of Judge Karen Parsons.

Acknowledging that the action is one usually taken by a defense attorney, Klundt said Vigil may have not done so because he is a civil rather than a criminal attorney. Vigil successfully sued the city of Albuquerque for the Rojas family because of the man's head injury.

Klundt said the district attorney's office wanted to address the competency issue before the jury trial scheduled for Sept. 1.

There are two components of the competency issue, Klundt said — first, whether Rojas is able to stand trial; and second, whether Rojas knew what he was doing when he reportedly robbed the First Savings Bank at 2713

Sudderth Drive on Nov. 4, 1996.

Klundt indicated that his office was not sold on the idea that Rojas has the mind of a 9-year-old child.

"He can raise that (issue), but we can rebut everything he can raise," said Klundt, who has replaced retired prosecutor Viola Rhodes at the district attorney's office in Carrizozo. For instance, Rojas this year acquired a drivers license, he said.

Rojas, who as of July 6 has been released from the Carrizozo jail on a lowered bond amount, pleaded not guilty to the armed robbery, attorneys said.

A second defendant in the robbery, Vicente Montes, pleaded no contest to the charge in late February and was sentenced 10 years imprisonment.

In a videotape from the bank, two men can be seen, though their faces are covered. The bank manager at the time, Eddy Gibson, testified in magistrate court that he saw Rojas'

face before the man pulled down a ski mask, walked into his office, aimed an automatic pistol at his head and threatened his life.

Vigil, also at an April magistrate court hearing, contended that Gibson was too far away from the robber at the time and had only a moment with which to base his identification of Rojas. Furthermore, police reports of the crime did not say the bank manager had told police about seeing one of the robbers' faces, Vigil said.

He also discredits another prosecution witness who testified being introduced to Rojas by Montes the night before the robbery.

"I think the issue right now is one of misidentification," Vigil said.

Rojas turned himself in to Ruidoso police in early 1998. He was released to his parents' custody on a \$65,000 property bond.

Magistrate Judge William Butts at the April hearing found probable cause existed

for Rojas to be tried on the armed robbery charge. He bound Rojas over to district court for prosecution and he raised the bond amount to \$250,000.

Because Rojas' family could not make the higher bond amount, the defendant has been in the Lincoln County Detention Center in Carrizozo. On July 6, Parsons lowered the property bond to \$128,000 at the recommendation of the adult probation office, Vigil said. Since his release, Rojas has worked with his father in the construction industry, Vigil said.

Besides the motion for a competency hearing, Rojas will also be arraigned for a second time in Parson's court. Klundt said his office has amended its original filing against Rojas because of errors in the original complaint. For example, the date of the robbery on the complaint was listed as being in 1997, Vigil said.

"It's hard to say until the bond issue is approved; what the impact will be," Cummins said. "If they do one or the other, storage tanks or the well, the taxes could be less. If they do both, taxes could be a little more."

During a trustees meeting last week, Perry Baird, vice

president of municipal fixed income division of public finance for David Rauscher Investments, said the village wouldn't have to sell all of the bonds authorized by voters, if the issues pass. Trustees also could consider lease purchases of equipment as an option, he said.

While no limit is set by law on how much money could be

spent on water system improvements, only \$345,450, or 4 percent of the 1997 assessed value of the village, can be spent on general items such as the road equipment or expansion of city hall, Cummins said.

Although Capitan Trustee Leroy Montes said Monday he doesn't oppose the idea of approving another general obligation bond, he wants prop-

erty owners to be aware that their taxes may increase.

"I wanted to make sure they understand, if they vote for all three, they're going to get a tax increase on what we're paying now," Montes said. "We could go to \$770,000 before it would increase taxes. I want to make sure they understand. Because I don't want them to say later they didn't know."

County Solid Waste considers money-maker as Ruidoso exits

One of the areas where the Lincoln County Solid Waste can generate more money is the rental and servicing of large roll-off containers used at construction sites and other high volume waste generating businesses.

When the village of Ruidoso assumes responsibility for its own garbage, trash and yard waste collection Sept. 1, the authority board will need to have a plan for its future and that should include the 30 yard and 40 yard roll-off containers, said Monroy Montes, who represents the county commission on the authority board.

"This is a money maker and we should have done it long ago," Montes said Tuesday

in reference to the purchase of eight new containers for \$20,850 from Galbreath Inc. of Mansfield, Texas, the lowest of three bidders.

A customer pays \$50 for a roll-off to be delivered, \$200 every time it is emptied plus \$13.90 a ton for disposal of the material and a \$5 daily rental charge.

But authority general manager Jerry Wright said before the coalition buys more containers, it will need another truck to service them.

"Contractors fill them pretty fast," he said. Some place like Walgreens does it on a daily basis."

Another commercial hauler has several customers in town, Montes said.

"They're doing business we should be doing," he said.

"(Roll-off container service) is a money-maker, and we should have done it all along."

The coalition of the county and its five municipalities was formed in 1993 to collect and dispose of solid waste in the county and to build a landfill.

Following Lincoln's lead, Otero County also formed an authority and the two parallel organizations built a regional landfill southeast of Alamogordo, contracting with the city of Alamogordo to operate it.

But officials with the village of Ruidoso haven't been satisfied with the level of service and will begin a municipal operation in September, raising the monthly \$7.50 rates by

\$2 to cover pickup of yard-waste and 75 cents for a recycling program.

Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson, who serves on the authority board, said the village doesn't intend to offer roll-off containers.

"It's not our intent to get into roll-offs," he said. "We felt that was something the authority could do."

Although Wright presented a proposed list of dates for roll-offs to be stationed in different communities on a "dump-free" basis for homeowners to get rid of old furniture, appliances and other debris, board members mixed the schedule.

Donaldson suggested that each community be given a roll-off on the same day every month or two months. Otherwise, people will never know for sure when to expect the container to be there, he said.

"I think we need a regular schedule that people can depend on, even if it's every other month," he said.

He also urged Wright to add Cedar Creek as a monthly roll-off site, because it is heavily populated.

Montes offered a motion incorporating both of Donaldson's proposals and it passed

Growth puts more pressure on county waste authority

Since the holiday weekend, the amount of garbage being collected in Lincoln County has increased by a third.

Although this spurt probably is due to summer seasonal visitors, Jerry Wright said Tuesday that general growth in the county also is having an impact.

Wright, general manager of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, told members that he's seeing new houses go up in the College Hill area north of Ruidoso, in subdivisions around Alto, by Capitan and in and around the Ranches of Sonterra development on Sierra Blanca Airport Road.

He met with about 100 members of the Ranches Property Owners Association recently.

"They have 27 homes on the ground and expect 45 by the end of the year," he said. "These are people who can work out of their home and are coming from Dallas and Houston. They're not seasonal."

"I think they're shocked at the rate of the sales." Several other developments

are approved for around the nearly 500-lot Ranches subdivision, he said. Modular homes also are springing up all over the Rancho Ruidoso subdivision across the road, he said.

He's already having trouble providing enough service to the Capitan area, Wright said.

Authority member Monroy Montes, who represents the county commission on the board, and Mayor Robert Donaldson, who is one of Ruidoso's members on the authority, suggested Wright start charging new customers for the cost of the polycart used by residents in Capitan and in Ruidoso Downs.

If a person moves and takes the cart with him, fine. But if they leave it behind, the authority would come out ahead, they said.

Montes asked that the board put a proposed policy about paying for the carts on the agenda of the next authority meeting at 2 p.m., Monday, Aug. 17.

Donaldson said he's banking on the Census 2000 count to give a more accurate picture of the population of his village and the county as a whole.

"We could be as high as 10,000 in Ruidoso," he said.

unanimously. However, Wright said instead of beginning in August as planned, the change may delay the start of the program.

Montes said he wants to see a manpower and management plan for the authority at a special meeting before the monthly session in August. Employees need to know about their futures before Ruidoso breaks away, he said.

"We have a responsibility

to employees to have a plan," Montes said. "We need a special meeting to start talking about how we're going to reorganize. Employees need to know what we're going to do and how it will affect them."

The village will develop a complete list of all employees who will be transferring to the municipal operation, Donaldson said.

"The hiring will be taking place fairly soon," he said.





**First patience,
and now fortitude**

"The best laid plans of mice and men often go awry."

Robert Burns, Scotland's beloved poet, must have known something about road construction when he wrote that classic definition of what people later came to call Murphy's Law.

It's difficult to fault anyone for the current hiatus in road work on Mechem Drive; or, if there is, about all that can be cited is the messed up geology of our mountainous community. Messed up geology is what characterizes mountains; it's also the culprit behind our community's shortage of ground water.

Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc., workers ran into a major problem as they began excavating near the White Mountain Road intersection and found too much clay, where a more stable soil was expected. Clay, it appears, is a lousy base for a roadway; it slips and slides, sort of like Jello, and is the reason some of the existing roadway is so bad.

The State Highway Department, which did the design work on the three-mile stretch between Sudderth and White Mountain, was surprised, too. Advance soil tests hadn't been done everywhere. And to test it now, the existing roadway must be removed.

Contractor and State Highway Department people had a summit on the problem last week in Roswell, looking at alternatives ranging in price from about a half-million to a million dollars.

The good news was, as Meadow Valley's project manager noted, that the state highway officials "are not just closing their eyes to the situation."


The bad news for Ruidosoans is that the additional work will substantially delay completion of the project—possibly well into winter or next year.

That means the community's love-hate relationship with orange barrels will continue, alternative routes like White Mountain, Hull, Paradise Canyon and Gavilan Canyon will get even more use, and merchants along Mechem already impacted by the project will feel even more pain.

But all is not lost; some most essential infrastructure work (water and sewer lines) is continuing along the right of way.

A meeting about the Mechem project, and its next phase, will be conducted at the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce offices this morning (Wednesday), and some more definitive information may be forthcoming.

But, please, don't expect miracles; remember Bobby Burns and a guy named Murphy.

kle notes that the most important thing about a pet's safety is to keep an eye on them and on the neighbors. I personally think the most important thing is to keep your pet on your property.


I have never heard of a "border trained" cat and I really doubt if anyone has placed poison or antifreeze on Ms. Van Winkle's property.

A modern Green view of Trinity

On July 16, 1945, the United States government brought the nuclear age into existence with the world's first nuclear explosion.

The test took place near dawn, at 4:51 a.m. in a valley of "Jornada del Muerto" at the present-day Trinity Site in south-central New Mexico.

The scientists, some of the "best minds" in the world, drove down earlier on dirt roads from Los Alamos and finished the assembly of the components at a rancher's house close to the site. The assembly

process was referred to as "tickling the dragon," acknowledging the imminent danger of the nuclear material "going critical" while they fiddled with the innards of the device. When they had the bomb ready in its metal sheath, a mattress was put on the ground under it as it was hoisted up the firing tower, just in case it accidentally fell...

From a distance, the Manhattan Project team watched as the countdown took place. Earlier they had been wagering whether the test would work and, if it did, whether it would set fire to the atmosphere and whether, given the theoretical physics, the earth's protective shield would be destroyed. The odds against the worst case scenario taking place were more or less even, since the numbers seemed to go either way. The team had orders though to press ahead.

They did. The searing flash fused the desert sands and was described as being like "a thousand suns." The tower vaporized instantly, as "ground zero" became a chaos of mass, energy and radiation. The bomb's shock waves reverberated with concussive force across the same "Jornada of the Dead Man" that Conquistadors had traveled four hundred years

earlier searching in vain for Montezuma's gold.

As the mushroom-shaped detritus cloud rose up, the scientists and military men crouched in their distant bunkers and trenches. The head of the project, J. Robert Oppenheimer, was quoted as citing the Bhagavad-Gita:

"I am become Death, the destroyer of worlds." Bets were paid off and the scientists drove home to begin assembly of the weapon to be detonated at Hiroshima.

The pit created at Trinity was "turquoise blue," according to my dad, who shortly after

the test flew his B-17 up north from his air group's Texas training site to "take a look-see".

On July 16, 1998, the site was open for public inspection. The pit had been paved over. The blue fused earth is buried out of sight. Radioactivity remains, as it will for the millennia, and babies and children are discouraged from tour groups.

On this day, when the military opens Trinity and the White Sands Missile Testing Range to visitors... a day when one can stroll the sands and remember, we remember...

The Disaster Report

This is the seventh installment in an ongoing educational column to help inform residents how they can be prepared in case disaster strikes.

Are you ready for a flood or a flash flood?

Know what to expect.
 • If it has been raining hard for several hours, or steadily raining for several days, be alert to the possibility of a flood.

• Listen to local radio or TV stations for flood information.

Remember that floods can take several hours to days to develop. A flood WATCH means a flood is possible in your area. A flood WARNING means flooding already is occurring or will occur soon in your area.

Flash floods can take only a few minutes to a few hours to develop.

Residents need to prepare a family disaster plan, including checking homeowner's or renter's insurance to see if it covers flooding. If not, find out how to get flood insurance. Keep insurance policies, documents and other valuables in a safe-deposit box.

When a flood WATCH is issued move your furniture and valuable to higher floors of your home and fill your car's gas tank, in case an evacuation notice is issued.

Prolonged rainfall over several days can cause a river or stream to overflow and flood the surrounding area. A flash flood from a broken dam or levee or after intense rainfall of one inch or more per hour often catches people unprepared.

Regardless, the rule for being safe is simple: head for the high ground and stay away from the water. Even a shallow depth of fast-moving flood water provides more force than most people imagine. The most dangerous thing you can do is to try walking, swimming or driving through such swift

water. This ongoing column also includes a Disaster Supplies Calendar, which is intended to help prepare for disasters before they happen.

Using the calendar, people can assemble a disaster supplies kit in small steps over a five-month period. Remember to change and replace perishable supplies (such as food and water) every six months.

WEEK EIGHT

First Aid Supplies

- Scissors
- Tweezers
- Thermometer
- Liquid antibacterial hand soap
- Disposable hand wipes

- Needles
- Petroleum jelly or other lubricant
- 2 tongue blades

Also, extra eyeglasses, if needed. Put in first aid kit.

To Do

- Place a pair of sturdy shoes and a flashlight by your bed so they are handy in an emergency.

- If blind, store a talking clock and one or more extra white canes.

- If blind, mark your disaster supplies in braille or with fluorescent tape.

Area rancher chosen as new state Beef Council president

A Lincoln County rancher is the new president of New Mexico Beef Council.

Wally Ferguson, who has been ranching in western Lincoln and eastern Socorro County for 35 years, said Tuesday his goal is to educate consumers in New Mexico about the benefits of beef and to improve the market for ranchers in the state.

Part of that effort will be to ensure the continuation of the check-off dollar, he said.

"Some people are fighting our check-off dollar," Ferguson said. "Ten years ago, it was made sort of mandatory by vote, that anybody who sold a beef animal in New Mexico had to pay a dollar check off and that money went toward promotion of beef. But since then we've lost ground to chicken and pork. It's a tough battle to keep our prices stable. If I have a goal, it's to make the people of the nation, especially in New Mexico, realize we are providing a healthy product. The American Heart Association would verify that we need beef in our diets."

Many ranchers are being hurt by beef imports from other countries, he said.

"Some politicians and higher government officials are dedicated to having the cheapest products," Ferguson said. "But we're using less of our consumer dollars on food than anywhere in

the world.

"It's hard to compete (with imports) with our standard of living, taxes and complying with environmental standards. They (foreign countries) don't have to comply. They (cattle) can come in unhealthy or (import produce) with insecticides that are illegal in the United States) on it. They even use human waste for fertilizer in some countries."

One of the major competitors is Canada, he said. "They ship across the border to us and their government pays for the shipping."

Ferguson grew up in Capitan and earned a degree in agricultural education in 1959 from New Mexico State University. He taught school for four years in Capitan and worked for the U.S. Forest Service, before deciding to go into ranching full time with his wife, Anne.

"Between my wife and I, our families have been ranching here more than 150 years," Ferguson said. "We've been real progressive ranchers. We just had a controlled burn on this ranch and we've done grubbing (of one-seed juniper) in the past."

The removal of the water guzzling juniper and good management practices have allowed many of the natural grasses that once covered the plains of New Mexico to return.

Ferguson also was president of the Soil Conservation Southwest Central District, president and member of the Carrizozo School Board for 17 years and president of the White Sands Missile Range Ranchers.



Ruidoso's grip on late spring racing loosened

Ruidoso Downs' two-year monopoly on Memorial Day weekend horse racing could come to an end next year.

The New Mexico Racing Commission approved a spring race meet for the Downs at Albuquerque at its regular commission meeting Thursday. The exact dates of the approved 36-day meet haven't been set, but in all likelihood, the Albuquerque meet will overlap with the race meets in Sunland Park and Ruidoso Downs.

That's good news for northern New Mexico horsemen, who haven't had a spring meet in two years, and not-so-good news for those with ties to Ruidoso Downs.

"We would prefer there wasn't any overlap at this time," said Rick Baugh, Ruidoso Downs Race Track general manager.

Baugh cites these numbers as proof that overlapping meets is not in a racetrack's best interest. With no competing track open in the north this summer, Ruidoso Downs' total handle is up \$2.1 million to \$9.6 million.

Mark Wilson, president of Hubbard Enterprises, is more emphatic.

"It absolutely proves beyond doubt that the state of New Mexico should never again have overlapping race meets," Wilson said. "We ought to have one race meet operating at one time, at any time, in the state."

"We've got to make sure the overlaps don't come back and we've got to implement the gaming in a first-class, quality manner and that's something we're committed to."

Of the Downs at Albuquerque proposal, Wilson said he hopes the racing commission will carefully examine the proposal before approving overlapping race meets.

"The numbers speak for themselves," Wilson added.

Racing Commission Chairman Eddie Fowler of Ruidoso sees it differently.

"There are a lot of people in the southern part of the state who don't want overlapping, but there are a lot of people in the northern part of the state who haven't had spring racing in two years," Fowler said. "I understand both sides of it."

Fowler said the commission decided to not specify the dates of the Albuquerque spring meet just yet.

"There are great concerns about it. We've tried to do the best thing and that's the reason why we left it flexible. But we definitely feel there needs to be a 36-day spring meet in Albuquerque," Fowler added.

The onset of video gambling next spring at the state's four race tracks should help prevent problems, Fowler said.

Fowler also said horsemen can't wait to return to New Mexico to race their horses. The climate is better, and with gambling-supplemented purses the lure is greater as well.

"I think we're going to have the horses (to support overlapping meets)," Fowler said.

Five nominated to Ruidoso Hall of Fame

Five great runners from the past have been nominated to compete for induction into the Ruidoso Downs Race Horse Hall of Fame in 1998.

Each of the five nominees - Easy Data, Easy Speed, Easy Data, Easy Speed, and Easy Data - were selected through a nomination process which considered more than 30 past champions.

According to bylaws established by the advisory committee, a maximum of three nominees can be inducted this year. The inductees will be announced at the All American Hall of Fame night before the running of the 40th All American Futurity.

Thirty committee members of Hall of Fame donors were polled in the nomination process, and through the voting process they certainly selected five deserving nominees, said Sport Wells, chairman of the Hall of Fame and advisory secretary for the advisory committee.

Visitors to the Museum of the Horse, where the Hall of Fame is located, can vote for their choice.

"The committee will decide how much weight they want to assign to the on-site voting, but it will definitely bring the public into the process, which we feel is important."

Annexation and re-zoning request brings protest

Neighbors of two lots protested the annexation and rezoning request for a 3-acre area, saying the actions open the land to potential subdivisions.

The Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission on Tuesday approved both an annexation and a re-zoning request for two lots and an adjoining tract in the North Heights Park subdivision.

About seven neighbors of the lots opposed the new zoning, which will allow the construction of single-family homes on the area, about 9.5 acres. The land had previously been zoned for multi-family use.

An attorney representing

two of the neighbors said the new zoning would open the two proposed lots up to the possibility of future subdivision, which would increase traffic in the neighborhood and create the need for a new road.

"By putting a road through one or the other lots would seriously reduce the value of lot 81 (his clients' property)," said David Thomsen, one of three people to voice their objections to the commission.

Furthermore, said Thomsen, his clients received notice of the pending action on Saturday, which did not allow them enough time to prepare for the Tuesday vote on the issue.

Final approval of Ross's zoning and annexation requests will be determined by the Ruidoso Village Council following a public hearing. Cleatus Richards, director of the

Ruidoso Planning Department, said that hearing will probably take place at the council's Aug. 25 meeting.

David Ross, who filed the annexation and zoning requests, said he only intended to use the land for two houses — his own and one other. He told the commission he wanted the larger lot size so that his family may have more privacy.

Not only did he agree to the neighborhood's restricted covenants prohibiting subdivisions, but he said he would abide by conditions that would preclude further subdivision of the lots, Ross said.

According to village planning staff, any future subdivisions of the lots would have to be approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Fires started by lightning

Two fires caused by lightning burned 570 acres Saturday in northern and eastern Lincoln County.

"There have been lots of lightning fires," Lynn Hutchison of the New Mexico State Forestry Division office in Capitan said Tuesday. "Three or four occurred last night in Hope."

Crews from the state, and the Honda Volunteer Fire Department battled a 320-acre blaze called the Fresquez Fire for about 24 hours before they were able to leave the area on the north side of U.S. 70 near Picocho. The fire was reported at 5:20 p.m. Saturday and crews left at 5 p.m. Sunday. No structures were threatened.

Another 250 acres burned when lightning struck 18 miles north of the Transwestern pipeline plant in the north border of the county about 1 p.m. Saturday. State crews aided teams from the U.S. Forest Service and the Capitan Fire Department at the Hines Fire. No structures were threatened and they left the area about 10 p.m.

Swallows colonize Lincoln Tower

• A flock of cliff swallows have found a cozy new home on the walls of an uptown address.

They landed on the straight sides of the Lincoln Tower on Mechem Drive two weeks ago and began the job of building mud nests that now provide warm refuge from the weather, protected by the eaves of the three-story building's roof.

Attorneys John Underwood and Charles Rennick, and administrative assistant Margie Morales, enjoy their window view of the busy swallows, who seem to have suction feet as they cling to the side of the building.

Although barn swallows are the most common for the area, the white marking over the eyes of the birds outside the windows indicate they may be cliff swallows, who also range from Alaska to Mexico.

They cluster in colonies and build gourd-like jugs of mud under bridges, eaves of buildings or on cliff faces. Couples produce four to six spotted eggs.

Barn swallows show white tail spots and build an open mud cup lined with feathers under bridges, on beams of barns or in buildings. They produce four to six speckled eggs.

New Mexicans also see cave swallows around Carlsbad, where they nest in five caves in that region.

According to information in "A Guide to Bird Behavior" by Donald and Lillian Stokes and

"A Field Guide to Western Birds" by Roger Tory Peterson, the swallows may fly as much as half a mile to find a suitable source of mud with just the right consistency.

A telltale sign swallows are at work are small holes along the water's shoreline, created as the birds poke their beaks into the mud several times to gather a good load.

They may use grass to add strength to the nest and feath-

ers to line it. A good nest may be reused from year to year with some new mud and feathers added. Some nests may with time grow to a foot in height.

The couples use auditory instead of visual displays to communicate. The male may sing to the female as part of courtship. His song is a continuous twitter interspersed with a second or two of a grating sound.

The parents share incubation duties. The eggs hatch over

a period of three days and the fledglings are fed insects by both parents every 15 minutes. After trying their wings, the fledglings may stay with their families for several weeks, although the parents stop feeding after two. Then - just like human teenagers - the young birds gather to feed and perch together. The birds migrate in large flocks that may include several species of swallows and usually reach the southern part of the United States in April.

One dead in auto roll-over

One person is dead and two others injured in a single-car accident that occurred at around 11 a.m. Tuesday on U.S. Highway 54 south of Carrizozo, according to a state police dispatcher.

The state police reported that the deceased was not a Lincoln County resi-

dent. Officials are withholding the names until next-of-kin are notified.

Although details were not yet available, the passenger car apparently rolled over on the highway between Tularosa and Carrizozo, according to the police.

Wilderness Valley subdivision wins approval on split vote by county commissioners

In a 4-1 vote last week (July 14), the Lincoln County Commission approved the plat (layout) of Wilderness Valley subdivision.

The 191-acre tract originally was part of the ranch bought by Properties of the Southwest in the development of Ranches of Sonterra on Sierra Blanca Airport Road.

Commissioner Monroy Montes voted against the motion.

The tract developers, Michael P. Cowen and Bryant W. McGee, principals in Cowen-McGee Properties of Williams, Ariz., propose break-

ing the parcel into five lots of 33 acres to 44 acres in size.

The roads would be private. Owners would be responsible for digging their own wells, the developers is not guaranteeing water on the property, septic tanks will be used for waste disposal and a disclosure statement has been prepared.

In that statement, the developers say they owe \$960,000 on the land to Foothill Capital Corporation in Los Angeles, Calif.

As each tract is sold, the mortgage on that particular lot will be released, they say. They also owe \$287,900 on a real estate contract to William Exum and others of Ruidoso.

The lots can be divided again in seven years. The land lies west of Vista Rio Bonito subdivision.

Senior Center expansion brings expansion of interest

• By expanding into the former Ruidoso Public Library, the village's senior citizens' center has more than tripled in size.

Until recently, moving tables around at the Ruidoso Senior Citizen Center was an activity that proceeded just about any other activity.

Tables in the former one-room facility were squeezed together or folded away for exercise classes and dances. Later, tables were moved out for bridge playing or the Wednesday potluck luncheon.

These days, the tables stay where they are.

The seniors, however, step into the "dance hall" portion of the center — a wide, spacious room where until a few months ago thousands of books were shelved.

Renovation of the former Ruidoso Public Library into the expanded Ruidoso Senior Citizen Center has progressed to the point where several new rooms are being used by patrons, said Charlotte Seitz, one of several coordinators at the center.

"They're putting the finishing touches on this phase of the project," Seitz said, indicating the open room, where chairs line the walls and a jukebox and a stereo are set up.

Rafael Salas, director of the village Parks and Recreation Department, which the center is under, said those finishing touches should be done by about July 31.

A grand opening celebration, though not yet scheduled, will probably be held sometime in mid-August, Salas said.

For years, the Senior Citizens Center and its industrial-sized kitchen occupied the back rooms of the public library. But a \$1.6 million new library opened this year next to Ruidoso Village Hall, and the center inherited the library's former 6,000 square feet of space at the building at 501 Sudderth Drive.

"Everything is wheelchair accessible," Seitz said Monday

morning while walking through the building, pointing out renovation work. She indicates the new bathrooms and a ramp at the center's soon-to-be new main entrance with electric doors at the side of the building (formerly, the only entrances were either at the front or back of the building).

When completed, the center will have the atrium entrance, the dining room, a television room, the dance hall area, a small library section and a card/classroom area, where bridge players and watercolor classes are already meeting, Seitz said.

The center also comes with two kitchens, one industrial-sized and one, located off of the cardroom, household-sized.

Some of the rooms, such as the planned television room,

are currently filled with equipment and shelving, which Salas said will be removed or rearranged.

Pool tables, exercise equipment and additional television sets to fill the renovated center are currently in storage, Seitz said.

"And we will have table tennis set up," she said.

The renovation is currently budgeted at slightly more than \$100,000, Village Finance Officer Lorri McKnight said. Along with the new library, the project is paid for through a \$3.15 million general purpose bond election approved by voters in 1995.

Salas said while renovation work on the structure is near completion, there's plenty of work left for volunteers. In addition, donations also are being accepted — such as the air conditioner given to the center for its dining room area, Salas said.

The bigger space at the center is already translating into greater use of the center and its free offerings of classes, activities and occasional dances, Seitz said.

"Some days we are very, very busy," said Seitz, who is also the RSVP coordinator for the village.

For example, twice as many people now attend the "charobics," in which partici-

pants perform a lightweight workout using a chair. The line dancing class definitely has more people participating, since it only started June, Seitz said.

The watercolor class also is new, and coordinators are considering a class on stained glass art. And an available pottery kiln in the card room may be put to use with a class, Seitz said.

The center has already held barbecue dances with live bands at the expanded facility, Seitz said.

"For the last barbecue and dance we served about 145 people and most of them stayed for the dance," she said.

She doesn't have exact numbers on attendance at the center readily available. Sandee Jourdan, manager at the senior citizen center as well as the RSVP program, is on vacation this week, Seitz said.

"I can't give you a number," she said. "Eventually, as people learn about the center, I think attendance will become much, much greater."

Help to low-income families for heating, cooling available

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program will continue to accept applications, the Lincoln County Community Action Program, Inc. (CAP) has announced.

The program (called LIHEAP) is a federally funded project designed to help eligible low income families who have high home energy costs for heating or cooling. The program is funded through the New Mexico Human Services Department, which contracts with local CAP organizations.

Local CAPs take applications and verify information provided by applicants, then the Human Services Department processes the application and makes direct payments to the appropriate utility company on behalf of the client.

Priority is given to senior citizens and families with

infants or children. Anyone who received assistance for heating also may reapply for electric utility assistance for cooling.

Lincoln County residents wishing to apply may call the Lincoln County CAP at 257-6843.

In Chaves County, applicants may call 623-0014 or 623-0032.

Applicants, after receiving an appointment, must provide:

- Proof of income for the past 30 days.
- Proof of all members in the household, including children of 6 or under.
- Social Security cards or numbers for each member of the household.
- One month's bill from the electric company.
- A picture identification of the applicant.

This deal occurred in the match between France and Brazil during the world championship played in Taiwan in 1971. It's hard to believe that two very fine players — Jean-Louis Stoppa and Roger Trezel of France — could voluntarily bid a grand slam missing four aces, but they did.

Certainly, the first three bids were all reasonable. The trouble started when North, at his second turn, raised to three hearts instead of only two.

It is hard to blame South for investigating a slam by using Blackwood. From his viewpoint, a small slam could be made if his partner had three aces for the jump raise, and a grand slam could

be made if, perchance, partner had all four aces.

North responded five clubs, which in standard Blackwood shows zero or four aces. South found it impossible to believe that his partner had no aces, considering his three heart bid, so he leaped straightaway to seven hearts.

This naturally surprised West, who realized it was possible that either or both of his minor suit aces might not score tricks, but could not imagine how his ace of

trumps would get away.

So West doubled — which pleased East mightily, since he had an ace his partner knew nothing about. South eventually went down three — 500 points.

This contrasted greatly with the outcome at the other table where the Brazilian North-South pair managed to stop in four hearts, scoring 420 points, on the following sequence.

A Time of Change

The California Gold Rush

Gold

One hundred fifty years ago, a millworker discovered gold in California and changed America forever. So many people set off to seek their fortunes that in less than 10 years, the wide-open West was packed with settlers.

Gold discoveries in Colorado, Montana, South Dakota and Alaska all attracted rivers of people. But the biggest rush in history was the California Gold Rush.

The huge migration to the West lasted for more than 50 years, until the end of big gold discoveries in Alaska and its neighbor, the Yukon, in Canada.

The discovery


On Jan. 24, 1848, the lucky millworker, James Marshall, found a tiny nugget of gold near present-day Coloma, Calif. His discovery drew people from all over the world.

In December, President James Polk showed America a chest full of California gold dust, boasting the gold find was enough to pay for the Mexican-American War. It was enough to convince the unbelievers.

Nearly 100,000 gold hunters, the "49ers," poured into California in 1849. All endured danger and suffering to make their dream of riches come true. Few succeeded.

By 1855 most of the gold close to the surface had been prospected. After that, gold miners were forced to seek gold in underground shafts that were hard to mine.

Terrible cost

The Gold Rush opened up the West for America. It offered people a fresh start, and gave women more independence. Women took on more jobs, and they could own property.

But it also destroyed many lives. One out of five miners died from accidents or disease.

More than 100,000 Native Americans died in about 10 years. Sometimes they caught sicknesses from the newcomers. Many were murdered. Mining destroyed the Indians' food and water.

Mexican-Americans and foreigners were also especially mistreated.

Getting there

The journey to California was dangerous, hard and expensive. Fortune hunters who wanted to travel in the winter had to travel by sea. During the winter, land routes were impassable, and there was no food for the animals.

Sea travelers had two choices. They could take the long way around South America, which lasted about half a year. Passengers had to endure fires, disease, frightening storms, shipwrecks and crowded conditions.

The trip across Panama cost more but took less time. Prospectors might reach California in a month or two. They had to take a ship to Panama, travel across that country, and take another ship to California.





Travelers had to fit enough food and supplies to last half a year inside a covered wagon about the size of a small minivan.

By land, people suffered from drownings, heat, lack of food and water, disease, cramped living quarters and dangerous trail conditions.

Gold Fever

The Klondike Gold Rush

For about 50 years after the California Gold Rush, there were several smaller gold rushes in North America. The biggest and most important of these was the Klondike. On Aug. 17, 1896, three prospectors discovered gold near the Klondike River in the Yukon Territory of Canada. They found so much gold that it would be worth more than \$1 billion today. Their discovery set off the Klondike Gold Rush, the last big gold rush.

More than 100,000 prospectors traveled to the Yukon from 1897 to 1899. The journey was so hazardous that only 40,000 actually made it to the gold fields. Prospectors were killed by the cold, starvation, rushing water, avalanches, disease and gangsters. Many turned around to go home.

After all their struggles, only 4,000 people found any gold at all. Only 300 struck it rich.

Crossing the border

The Alaskan towns of Skagway and Dyea were two of the main stopping-off points before prospectors made the hard 600-mile journey to the Klondike area. Skagway and Dyea were lawless towns where gangs of criminals might attack anyone coming through.

The most dangerous part of the route was Chilkoot Pass, which led from Dyea over the mountains. Snow and ice covered the pass most of the year. In summer, it was slippery with mud and rocks.

It was too steep for pack animals, so prospectors had to carry their supplies on their backs.

Other riches

Although few people actually struck it rich by finding gold, many grew wealthy by supplying the huge numbers of people streaming into the area.

When gold was discovered near the Klondike River, the city of Seattle, in Washington state, was in the middle of a depression. There were few jobs and people were hungry.

Everything changed overnight. As soon as people heard there was gold, business tripled in Seattle. Thousands of fortune hunters needed to bring a year's supply of food and equipment into Canada, and they went to Seattle to buy it.

In less than a year, Seattle merchants had sold about \$25 million worth of supplies to hopeful miners.

Hunting for gold

Miners could search for gold almost anywhere. In Alaska and Canada, most of the area was open government land. In California, they could even prospect on another person's land. All gold hunters had to do was mark the spot they were going to work. Many marked their claimed area with wooden stakes, or "staked their claim." Whatever they found on their claim they could keep.

Miners often "panned for gold." They dug out dirt from a stream bed with their pans. They shook the pans so the heavier rocks such as gold went to the bottom. Sometimes miners dug for gold or shook dirt through a sieve.

POOP SCOOP

In the mountains and high elevation of Ruidoso, fleas may not present the epidemic they do in humid climate or the desert, but they still can be a problem for some animals in the summer.

The following methods may prove helpful.

A healthy cat is more resistant to fleas, which are parasites and looking for the most susceptible host. Supplements such as brewer's yeast and garlic added to your cats food may be a deterrent.

Frequent grooming and occasional bathing also are good defenses. Comb and brush your cat a few minutes each day. A fine-toothed flea comb will help detect the remove fleas. Part the fur with your fingers to find either live fleas, eggs or flea dirt, which looks like black commas, but gently is fecal cast.

A gentle but firm hand and a reassuring voice will help in retraining your cat.

Fill the sink with about six inches of tepid water. Put the cat in the water and cup liquid all over the fur to moisten it for shampoo. Keep water out of the cat's ears and eyes.

Start at the head and work toward the rear. Keep the process under 10 minutes.

Herbal formulas are a safer approach than the many chemi-

cal based insecticide shampoos and dips on the market.

They will not exterminate heavy flea infestations, but the cat can be bathed more frequently.

Murphy's Oil Soap or Skin-So-Soft bath oil diluted in water, and specially formulated shampoos containing eucalyptus, pennyroyal, calendula and rosemary have been reported effective by many cat owners.

Rinse the cat thoroughly from head to rear with a low-pressure spray nozzle. Towel dry and gently comb out with a large-tooth comb. Cats hate blow dryers. Vacuum your home frequently to remove eggs from carpeting. Dispose of the bags immediately.

Once a home is infested with flea, more drastic measures are needed, such as chemical foggers, bathing and dipping by a professional, and laundering all rugs and linens.

Flea powders are effective on shorthaired cats and can be applied weekly, but they tend to dull and dry the coat.

Cumulative toxic effects of insecticides should be considered. For example, organophosphate dips shouldn't be used in a cat wearing an organophosphate flea collar.



Mall terror is all wet in new Fox disaster flick

Last month, Fox changed the title of its \$5.5 million made-for-TV thriller about a flooded shopping center from *Disaster at the Mall to Terror in the Mall*. It didn't help.

The film, airing Wednesday, July 29, features Rob Estes (*Melrose Place*) and Shannon Sturges (*Savannah*), 396,000 gallons of water and a two-story waterproof set, specially constructed on the world's third-largest sound stage — which happens to be named for Marlene Dietrich and located in Berlin.

It's "wetter than *Titanic*," jokes Sturges, who suffered sinus and ear infections, hypothermia and a painful stubbed toe during filming.

The cast's other marquee player is David Soul (*Starsky and Hutch*), who left TV acting and the United States behind in the early 1990s. Soul now lives in London and has a thriving career as a European recording artist and West End stage actor. The most mature actor in the cast, he gives the film's best performance.

To ensure plenty of suspense, the plot combines a hostage situation with the worst flood since Noah.

On the eve of the opening of a new mid-American mall, a huge storm causes an old dam to collapse, engulfing the valley below — and most importantly, the mall — in a lake 10 feet deep and rising.

Viewers learn the water has forced subterranean methane gas above ground. The gas is collecting near the building's emergency generators, and if they kick on, the whole place will explode.


Sturges' character, a doctor who is married to the local sheriff, is trapped in the mall with a handful of others, including Estes and Soul.

Adding to the panic, the group learns from a radio message that one of its number is an escaped criminal.

It should be hair-raising, but it's all too improbable to be taken seriously.

How can a viewer suspend disbelief while questions keep bobbing to the surface like so many inflatable pool

toys? For instance, why isn't the order to evacuate the valley given sooner? Why would anyone try to go shopping in a mall that hasn't opened yet? Why aren't the people in the mall electrocuted by water coming into contact with power sources? Why is there a loaded harpoon gun on display in the sporting goods store?

There does seem to be an answer to at least one question: Why set the movie in a mall in the first place?

"Frankly, you can't have a hit on Fox without a large women's audience," says Gary Hoffman, who heads up Fox's TV movie and miniseries division. Was it Hoffman's theory that put a remake of *The Exorcist* and a comedy titled *Dumb and Dumber: The Early Years* in the works as well?

To help bankroll *Terror in the Mall*, Fox took on a German production partner in exchange for the right to broadcast *Terror* in Europe later this year. As Hoffman puts it, "Our tastes at Fox have worldwide appeal."

Yet, from the foreign location to the custom two-story set to the prune-fingered actors, it seems an awful lot of trouble to go to for a movie that sinks like a stone.

Executive producer Mark Wolper (*North and South, The Thorn Birds, L.A. Confidential*) reports *Mall* was the most difficult production of his career. "It's not *L.A. Confidential*," he says, "but it's a lot of fun."

Q: What happened to the actor who played Lamont on *Sanford and Son*? —Shawn in Alliance, Ohio.



"T.C. and Chris get married in the first new episode, and they soon learn that marriage is a complicated situation," Davidson says.





She has since married guitarist Richie Sambora, with whom she has a daughter, Ava.




