## Horse museum lassos \$60 grand

### Patsy Cline production and silent auction packs in residents, visitors

Patsy Cline may have died more than 35 years ago but for those who attended two performances of "Always ... Patsy Cline" at the Museum of the Horse the spirit of the country singer lived on - if only for a couple of hours.

The production by the Amarillo Little Theater, which was performed Saturday and Sunday, along with a silent auction during the gala event on Saturday, helped raise more than \$60,000 for the Museum of the Horse, Bruce Eldridge, executive director for the facility, said.

"The money will go toward education programs and exhibitions of the museum," Eldridge said. "It was really excellent."

Eldridge said the event had been in the works for about six months but things actually began to come together two months ago through the efforts of the museum's board of directors, a committee dedicated to the event, volunteer groups, and museum staff.

"We had a very good group of supporters," Eldridge said of not only those who helped pull the week-end off successfully but of those who came as well.

Eldridge said education and exhibition programs at the museum run at about \$120,000 to \$130,000 annually, not counting administrative overhead.

"Always ... Patsy Cline," which is based on a true story, is about Louise

## Accusations of nepotism mar county's DWI program hirings

Contending politics and family ties led to the hiring of unqualified employees to run Lincoln County's DWI grant project, Ruidoso Magistrate Judge William Butts is threatening to pull out of the program.

Butts said Tuesday he has approached Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson about the village taking over responsibility for the \$117,000 grant.

"I told him that the city, Ruidoso Downs and the racetrack are responsible for most of the DWI (driving while drinking) offenses in the county and should handle it," Butts said. "The county has demonstrated they

can't oversee the program. They let (former DWI coordinator) Charlie White overspend and we ran out of program money some two or three months prior to end of fiscal year. Now they have hired two people with no experience, no knowledge of DWI laws."

One of the two is Johnny Montes, the brother of Commissioner Monroy Montes, who also sat on the advisory committee that review applications for the coordinator's post.

"I didn't know Johnny Montes was Monroy's brother until I confronted him Friday," Butts said. "I asked if they were related and he said, 'I'm his brother.' I asked how he was qualified for the position and he said, 'I am not, but I can learn.' That's when I left."

Mark Hanna, with the local gov-

ernment division of the state Department of Finance and Administration, said his office is looking into the situation.

"Our experience has been statewide that it's very important for a county DWI program to work closely and in a cooperative manner with the judiciary," Hanna said Tuesday. "In those counties where judges have been an active party, the programs seem to do much better than those where the judges are not involved."

Martha Guevara, acting Lincoln County manager, hired Richard Kloepfel for the job of DWI coordinator out of four finalists. Kloepfel then hired Johnny Montes, who Guevara said most recently worked in landscaping.

Kloepfel, a former state legislator,

has a good attitude, a background in the legislature and grant procurement and will be a good lobbyist for the county, Guevara said.

"This is a grant funded position and we have the right to hire whoever we want," she said. "We don't have to advertise, but we did. We all learn on the job and this county is so small, many people are related. That can't be a factor in hiring."

Guevara said she'll be disappointed if Butts withdraws from the program that offers assistance in monitoring DWI offenders to ensure they fulfill conditions of probation and receive counseling.

"We're doing a service to the judges, if they care to use it," she said. Commissioner Montes said Butts has a personality problem with him.

Butts was the judge who presided over initial hearings and setting of bail when Montes' son, Vincente Montes, was charged with armed robbery two years ago. His son subsequently was sentenced to 10 years in prison.

"I wasn't part of the hiring process," Montes said. "I was appointed to the selection committee that recommended for the coordinator. I was appointed by Chairman (L. Ray) Nunley, who was on selection board. I was told Mr. Butts declined to be part of the process. I don't think it's about the process, I think it's about the personalities. Judge Butts doesn't like me. That's fine, but he's allowing his

## Area rescuers find missing hikers

When Dianna Lansbury started a hike last Thursday with six other family members, she never dreamed that night she'd be huddled with her daughter and two nieces on the rim of the Sacramento Mountains, cold, hungry and in need of rescue.

Lansbury and her 14-year-old daughter, Holly Walker, were visiting her parents Clyde and Vona Chambliss, who are spending the summer east of Ruidoso Downs.

On the urging of her niece, Tiffany Sartane, 20, they decided to hike Trail 19 out of South Fork Campground near Bonito Lake. They left mid-morning, but her parents and her sister, Lydia Sartane

decided after three-quarters of a mile, to turn back. Lansbury, her daughter and two nieces (Courtney Sartane, 13 also was along) kept moving up the trail. Tiffany Sartane had hiked the route several times and knew it well, Lansbury said.

"The girls and I decided we'd go on," the 40-year-old Lansbury said Monday from her home in Forsan, Texas. "But I just got totally exhausted. My knees just gave out. I guess she (Tiffany Sartane) thought I was in better shape physically. We just hiked and the longer we went, the more tired I got. She kept telling me it would be fine, just 10 or 15 minutes more, and I thought, 'I can do this.'"

A little after 5 p.m., Lansbury finally told her 20-year-old niece she need-

ed to know exactly how much longer.

She kind of broke down and said four to six more hours.

"I told her I couldn't go on. I had turned my ankle early on the trail, but I kept thinking we didn't have much more and I could make it," Lansbury said.

They didn't know it, but family members already were concerned and looking for them.

It was about 5 p.m. and Lansbury knew there was no way they would make it back down before dark.

"We had come out into this open area and I decided we better call for help," she said. "I didn't want to get caught down in the trees at night. We didn't have any flashlights. We all had shorts on.

"I had my cellular phone with me, but the battery was low."

Lansbury, business manager for the Forsan Independent School District, wasn't too worried. She called 911 and Tiffany Sartane told the sheriff's office that they were on Trail 19 near its intersection with Crest Trail 25, the main route that rides the rim of the mountain range and intersects most of the other trails in the White Mountain Wilderness.

"They said to call back in 10 minutes and they might be able to tell us something for sure," Lansbury said. "We did and she said to give her five minutes more. It was nerve racking. We called back and she wanted to know how

## Ruidoso passes final \$24.9 million budget

• Budget expenditures include the establishment of a \$1.3 million garbage collection department.

Ruidoso village councilors on Tuesday passed a budget of almost \$25 million, a 7-percent increase from the \$23.2 million budget approved this time last year.

On the revenue side of the budget, the village anticipates receiving \$22.6 million, according to the prepared budget.

"As you can see, we are spending more than we have revenues for," Village Manager Alan Briley told the council. "And the explanation pretty much has to do with the bond projects (from the 1995 voter

approved bond). We have already received the monies ... We probably still probably have \$1.2 million or so from the money we received back in 1996 that we need to spend this year."

Another reason for the gap between revenues and expenditures is because the village dipped into a cash balance of \$9.4 million. Briley said at an earlier budget meeting. The village's adjusted cash balance at the end of the 1997-98 fiscal year was \$10.9 million, though all but \$4.36 million of that amount is restricted, or earmarked.

Another \$1 million is added to the budget after carryovers and encumbrances are added, according to the budget document. A carry-





over is a department's remaining budget at the end of the fiscal year on June 30, and an encumbrance is money designated for a particular expenditure in the past year that has not been paid yet.

Lorri McKnight, village finance officer, reviewed the budget with councilors, including increases to the \$23.4 million preliminary budget approved in May.

Village administrators last year had projected an annual drop of about 10 percent in gross receipts tax revenue, the village's largest revenue source, because Wal-Mart moved out of Ruidoso and into Ruidoso Downs.

However, instead of losing \$500,000 to \$900,000, Ruidoso this past year received \$6.39 million in gross receipts revenues compared to \$6.32 million the

previous year, according to budget documents.

Briley said the 1998-99 budget projects gross receipts revenues of \$6.2 million.

The single largest increase to the village's budget is the creation of a new position, community development, which is a new position over this year's collecting village revenues from the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

Another increase to the 1998-99 budget is a roughly \$200,000 cost for employee raises, based on a regional study of what people in certain jobs are being paid. The raises only applied to employees who were making less than the regional average for their positions, Briley has said.

short temper and arrogance to overflow into this process. That's unfortunate.

"It's not about the appointees," Montes said. "As far as qualifications, I think Mr. Kloepfel has good qualifications as a former legislator. He worked with the racing commission and has impeccable credentials and he plans to do school programs. My brother is a graduate of the Ruidoso school system. If he's not qualified to be a clerk, which is what that job entails, then I suggest we have a problem with the public school system."

"Obviously, these people are qualified to do this job. If Butts has a problem with the personalities, he should take care of that and quit trying hurt other people."

But Butts said that's not the situation. He pointed to the qualifications listed in the advertisement placed by the county.

"Must have grant writing experience, computer knowledge, knowledge of DWI laws, knowledge of district, magistrate and municipal court systems, be a self-starter, and be able to work with members of the law enforcement community...Must be able to prepare budgets, monthly and annual

reports for various agencies. Legislative and lobbying experience desirable."

"If either one was qualified and had the knowledge per the ad, I wouldn't be complaining," Butts said. "Political appointments and hirings are fine as long as the person is qualified to do the job, but neither one of these people are. I think they influenced Martha to hire these people."

He questioned whether the hiring of Montes' brother might be construed as nepotism. Although Commissioner Montes didn't hire his brother, the grant contains a clause that prohibits the grant holder (the county commissioners, their designees or agents) from benefiting from the grant personally.

County Attorney Alan Morel was out of the office Tuesday and could not be reached for comment. The state also is looking at that issue.

Montes and Commissioner Wilton Howell noted that Butts was first appointed magistrate judge after his father-in-law retired from the job.

"I guess he would be the one to recognize a political appointment, but unfortunately, he hasn't properly identified this situation," Howell said. "He has chosen not to go through the proper channels in this situation. (Butts had not called Guevara

as of Tuesday).

"I made the statement at the time we interviewed applicants that whoever was hired, I'd wholeheartedly support the manager making a change after six weeks, but only after we know what they can produce. These guys haven't even started yet," Howell said.

He said he also is bothered by Butts' decision not to participate in the hiring process, even though he is a member of the county DWI board.

"He refused to be part of the process and then wants to criticize the selection," Howell said. "We could use some of his energy in solving our detention facility problem. I've invited him on more than one occasion to participate, because we could use his expertise in designing the building. He has one more chance and that's Friday night (at 6:30 p.m. at the Ruidoso Convention Center)."

Butts defended his original appointment as magistrate judge, pointing out that his father-in-law was a Republican and then governor Bruce King was only inclined to listen to Democrats, which Butts was at the time. Another candidate was the step-son of the county's Democratic Party chairman. But while Butts served 25 years with the state police, he had been assigned as King's security

guard and they had become friends. He also earned a college degree and several other special training certifications.

"I feel because the governor knew I was honest and he could trust me to do a good job, I got the appointment," Butts said. He also was recommended by the secretary of state public safety department.

"I was very qualified for this position, contrary to these two they've hired," Butts said.

He's serious about exiting the program, if the village doesn't assume responsibility for the program, the judge said. Donaldson was out of town and could not be reached for comment.

"I have talked to the state and told them as long as program remains with the county, due to the fact that I have political hirings with totally unqualified people, I will not use the program," Butts said. "We survived without the program before we got the grant and we will survive with this court doing everything like it used to. These people work for the courts. Without me, they don't have a job."

A representative of the grant program from Santa Fe will be in the area Thursday among other things to meet with Butts to discuss the situation, Hanna said.

Segger, played by Cindi Bulla, a divorcee who is raising two children and becomes enamored with the voice of Patsy Cline.

Segger tells the story of how she gets a chance to actually meet the up-and-coming starlet, who is played by Tammy Hysmith, at a small bar. As she

tells her story about how her friendship with Patsy Cline strengthens over scrambled eggs and bacon and then through letters, her memories are replayed on stage in vivid scenes and stirring song.

While the play's theme is Patsy Cline it actually focuses on Segger, the "every woman" who comes face to face with a celebrity and finds out the two could relate to each other on

run-of-the-mill subjects, such as children and husbands, and talk to each other as if they were sisters.

Bulla reads an actual letter written by Cline to Segger toward the closing of the play.

The letter was signed "Love always...Patsy Cline."

Segger's brush with greatness tragically ends when Cline is killed in a plane crash in 1963. Cline was only 30 at the time.

The performance was extremely enjoyable with exuberance and sass pouring out of Bulla, who made it feel like the audience was meeting Patsy Cline, too. This was punctuated by hauntingly, uncanny voice of Hysmith that brought Cline

back to life.

The six-piece band, called the Bodacious Bobcats, also also found fans at the Museum of the Horse by providing a talented backbone to the entire play.

Songs featured in the performances included "Back in Baby's Arms," "I Fall to Pieces," "Crazy," and "True Love."

Allen Shankles, the director, said the group has been performing the musical off and on in Amarillo and the surrounding area since January, 1997.

"The two ladies are behind it really," Shankles said. "At the end of the first run they said 'Hey, we just really don't want this to end.'"

# Carrizozo residents continue push for jail

If Lincoln County Commissioners want to save the county taxpayer some money, the only logical site for a new jail is in Carrizozo, town officials contend.

Their point of view was backed Friday by about 60 residents who filled the commission hearing room in the first of two meetings on site selection. The second is set for 6:30 p.m. Friday at the Ruidoso Convention Center. Commissioner Monroy Montes urged Carrizozo backers also to attend the Ruidoso meeting to hear about any alternate sites that may be proposed.

With consultants from Rampar Development and Toby Michaels Enterprises taking notes, David Stevens, attorney for Carrizozo, checked off the advantages to building in the Carrizozo Industrial Park, two blocks from the courthouse and the sheriff, and close to the municipal airport.

"It will cost the same amount to build regardless of where it is constructed," he said. But the town will offer these incentives:

- free land varying in size from 3.4 acre lots to 12.1 acres in the industrial park west of 8th Street and east of the airport

- sufficient acreage to provide free land for housing employees or for future expansion of the jail
- a lower cost of living for employees.
- free utilities.
- water and sewer service that would be free for a period of years to be determined.
- He also listed advantages of choosing Carrizozo as:
  - immediate proximity to the courthouse, the sheriff and the assorted courts.
  - proximity to a health clinic, allowing the commission not to have to create an infirmary at the jail, saving some money.
  - located at the crossroads of two major highways and the airport, providing easy transportation of inmates.
  - fire danger lower than in Ruidoso.
  - the community's local economy is government-based and used to accommodating a jail compared to Ruidoso's economy, which is tourist-based - that may provide a better setting for work-release programs in Carrizozo using government offices, local businesses and ranchers.

Bottom line, Stevens said, Carrizozo wants it. Ruidoso might not."

# No appeal for proposed adult video store

Wendy Clark has changed her plans regarding a proposed adult video store on Sudderth.

Wendy Clark, who in early July announced plans to open an adult video store in Ruidoso, said Tuesday she would not pursue the venture.

"If I do try to do this again I will try to do it somewhere else," Clark said Tuesday morning from her home.

Earlier this month, Clark ran into considerable opposition to the store, which was

to be located in a vacant building at 1509 Sudderth Drive. Between 30 and 40 people attended the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission meeting on July 7 to oppose Clark's application for a conditional use permit, which was denied. About 10 people spoke against the shop and only one, Clark herself, spoke in favor of the business.

Clark had 15 days to appeal the commission's action to the Ruidoso Village Council. She did not file an appeal within that time limit.

"I was expecting some (opposition), but not that

much," Clark said. The adult video store would have been her first business venture.

Clark said she did not lose an investment in either stock or the building — "just the application fee," she said, referring to the \$200 fee paid to the village.

Under village codes, any business nature of a sexual nature must first acquire a conditional use permit. The permits are granted on a case-by-case basis by the commission. When considering the applications, commission members are to weigh the community's health, safety and general well being.

Denise Dean, president

of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, when asked for comment Tuesday, referred back to a statement she made before the Planning and Zoning Commission.

"Any business that is not of moral fiber and that tries to move into Ruidoso, then we will fight it," Dean said.

Betsy Seiler, a neighbor of the proposed adult video store, on Tuesday said she was pleased Clark had withdrawn her proposal.

"And that I wish her the best of luck at whatever she decides to do," Seiler said.

many of us there were and what we were wearing and then the phone went dead.

"That's when I first started to get scared — when the battery went dead."

When the rain started. "Then it rained we'd better climb up the mountain a little further and get under some trees to try to stay dry," Lansbury said.

It stopped raining and Lansbury hoped a helicopter might be sent in to take them off the mountain before dark. The dispatcher had told the group to stay where they were on the trail.

Meanwhile back at Bonito, an official search and rescue was activated by the New Mexico State Police at 6:33 p.m., with Robert Lathrop from Roswell as incident commander and a total of 36 volunteers from Alamogordo, Roswell and the White Mountain

team.

"When it started to get dark, I thought they probably aren't going to get us out. I decided we better find some place to get out of the wind," Lansbury said. Fortunately, they had packed water and some crackers.

They huddled in a trench-like area along the trail, which had high grass and offered some protection.

"I just stretched my T-shirt out real, real big and my daughter — she had on a sleeveless shirt, so she crawled up in under my shirt," Lansbury said.

"It wasn't very comfortable. We were lying in the mud and rocks. We just stayed there. It sprinkled on us a couple of times, but we were fortunate it didn't rain. I told the girls, if (rescuers) didn't come by daylight, we'd start

back down."

About 3 a.m., they heard a whistling sound.

"I kept thinking it was probably a bird," Lansbury said. "My daughter kept saying, 'Momma, maybe that's somebody.' I said surely they would call for us. We had been calling and calling until we couldn't call anymore."

"I stood up and we could see the flashlights. I tell you that was the greatest feeling I've ever had in my life. It really was."

Ruben Amezcua and Dutchover of the White Mountain Search and Rescue based in Lincoln County had been hiking for nearly six

hours up Trail 19 in the hope that Tiffany Sartane was right about the location and that the quartet would stay put. Other teams checked side trails at the chance they

moved or veered off course, Lathrop said.

"They made sure we all were OK, radioed back to tell everyone we were all right and got us warmed up," Lansbury said.

Using plastic bags, the men fashioned makeshift jackets for the women.

"We decided we didn't want to wait until the sun came up, so we started on back down the mountain. We had flashlights and stuff, but it took another six hours to get back down," Lansbury said.

They arrived at 8:45 a.m., Lathrop said.

Lansbury praised the effort of the searchers, but especially the two rescue volunteers who found them.

"I want everybody to know how wonderful those two guys with search and rescue were to us. They kept our spirits up. They were great," she said. "They got us down and took wonderful care of us."

Something of a love-hate relationship has existed in Ruidoso between the community and its hospital — Lincoln County Medical Center — in recent years.

We must record that fact for posterity, even as we salute Administrator Valerie Miller, who is preparing to leave for health reasons after eight eventful and productive years, for a job very well done.

They were years:

- during which an about-to-fail community hospital has been put on sound financial footing in association with Presbyterian HealthCare Services, even to the point—so rare in health care—of eliminating red ink from the bottom line;
- during which a team of health professionals put together a primary care health facility recognized far and wide as one of the best, regardless of size, in the country;
- during which vast changes have occurred in public health care, and even in emergency services;
- and during which the hospital's administration has won some and lost some in the arena of public opinion.

Through it all Valerie Miller, in her own crisp, no-nonsense manner (with a trace of a British accent) has exhibited a dedication to quality care, the well-being of patients, and fiscal integrity that few others ever equal, much less exceed.

Yes, there were legal battles and sometimes bitter debates over internal staff policy, governance of a publicly owned facility, the "loss" of volunteer emergency medical technicians as the hospital's affiliated emergency service unit took over rural services.

Sometimes the hospital was a winner, and it lost a few. So no wonder that love-hate relationship continues. A community's health care is of distinctly personal importance to young and old.

But who in this world doesn't have a love-hate relationship with something or somebody?

Those passionately interested in social issues can get mightily worked up by hard-hearted bureaucrats who don't bend the rules out of the good of their hearts—regardless of the law.

We're all susceptible to love-hate attitudes; it's part of being human. (Witness the old joke quoted at a Rotary Club meeting this week: "Marriage is the only war where you sleep with the enemy.")

And, of course, the only good public school is the one attended by somebody else's kids.

Nevertheless, Ruidoso and Lincoln County today have a hospital that meets a standard few communities can match. And most of that is because of the ability and dedication of Valerie Miller. We wish her Godspeed, and we thank her.

**Legislation protecting animals moves ahead**

To the editor:

I am very heartened by the response we have received so far to the animal welfare legislation that we are proposing for the 1999 Legislature. The proposal was well received by the Courts, Corrections and Criminal Justice Committee on July 17. Our legislators understand the gravity of this problem.

It is clear that public awareness has increased in the two years since we first put forth the legislation, and I am more hopeful than ever of its passage in 1999. I want to thank outgoing Rep. G. X. McSherry of Deming for his previous sponsorship.

Although the 1997 bill failed to pass, it had overwhelming support and resulted in greater awareness about the problems related to animal cruelty. Unfortunately, awareness has been heightened by tragic events during the past year. The most recent was the school shootings in Oregon. After the shootings, it was revealed that the youth who allegedly committed the crimes was an animal abuser. Unfortunately, this was not an isolated coincidence.

The purpose of this legisla-

tion is two fold: One, to protect animals from cruel treatment; and two, to intervene in the lives of people who display this kind of behavior before they begin to victimize other human beings.

As a veterinarian, I have seen animals brought into the veterinary hospital with burns, bruises and contusions. It is heartbreaking then to look up at the face of the woman, elderly person or child bringing in the animal, and they have the same injuries and look of fear in their eyes.

There will be, of course, abusers who cannot be treated, and for them the penalties would be elevated, up to a felony for repeat and serious offenses of abuse of animals.

As your State Land Commissioner, I feel responsible for all of the living beings on the state's lands. We can demonstrate our decency as individuals and as a community by adopting a stronger, better animal welfare laws next year.

Let us not forget that Capitan taxpayers also face the added tax burden of a new high school and new county jail. If these issues pass, and this municipal bond passes, what will our taxes be?

**Art, for the sake of everybody**

In spite of the recent fire that destroyed the art department at Ruidoso High School, the fine arts building will be ready for classes when school starts on Aug. 18. Since the fire, there has been a massive clean-up under way. The pain the fire caused students may not be so easily remedied.

Students involved in the fine arts program at the high school have felt the loss very deeply. "They treated our art as if it were nothing," said one. "It hurt pretty bad to think that someone would go in and burn my future," lamented another. And, "I really liked that one (the piece that burned). It was one of my better pieces."

"It made me so mad because they burned a part of me that I put so much work and time into."

Not only were the students' work destroyed, but also props used to create still-life models, including masks, plants, etc., along with the school's collection of art books.

The destruction of students' and teachers' art work and resource materials emphasizes the need for community support of the arts in education, including drama, dance,

visual arts, music, creative writing and journalism. Though the fire occurred at the high school, other arts programs (as well as other educational programs) in the Ruidoso schools need the help and financial support of the community.

Recent studies provide compelling evidence that the arts improve all students' performance in school, at work, and throughout life. Arts programs keep young people in school and reach at-risk students. These programs make education more interesting, and learning more accessible—to some students for the first time.

Participation in the arts strengthens students' language and interpersonal skills, emotional and social development, self-discipline, self-motivation and self-confidence. Arts programs teach highly valued workplace skills such as creativity, critical thinking, problem-solving, communication and invention. The arts also connect us with other people and encourage cross-cultural understanding, tolerance and appreciation of cultural diversity.

In addition, artistic endeavors continue throughout life, regardless of professional

or economic status, and regardless of age. Kids who participate in the arts later purchase books and works of art, attend museums, concerts, plays, theater and performances as adults.

Though these benefits more than justify inclusion of arts in education, art in any form also is a fundamental human expression. Art exists for its own sake and it must be taught as its own discipline. As we promote the arts and support artists in our area, let us also be advocates for our children. What we do for them benefits our entire community.

# The Disaster Report

This is the ninth installment in an ongoing educational column to help inform residents on how they can be prepared in case disaster strikes.

With the recent and continuous thunderstorms in the area, this column will give some tips on lightning, the myths about it and what to look for during a storm.

According to the American Red Cross, lightning kills or injures hundreds of people every year, mainly because the victims are not aware of the danger they face.

Here are some myths about lightning:

• "Lightning always strikes the tallest object." False! Lightning strikes the best conductor on the ground, not necessarily the tallest object. In some cases, the best conductor might be a human being.

• "A car's rubber tires give protection from lightning." False! Actually, the car itself is well insulated and offers more protection than being outside in the storm.

Of course, the exception to this is the convertible, which provides virtually no protection.

• "Lightning never strikes the same place twice." False! The Empire State Building, as an example, is struck by lightning many times every year.

People can take preparations for lightning safety by removing dead or rotting trees and branches that can damage your home in a lightning strike or in the high winds that may accompany a thunderstorm.

People can learn how to help in an emergency by contacting the American Red Cross for training in administering First Aid and CPR and for the treatment of lightning shock.

People should keep informed by tuning in to The Weather Channel or check the local TV or radio station before planning any boat trips or water-based events.

If you plan to spend the day outdoors, look for a place to take shelter if the weather turns bad. Monitor threatening thunderstorms.

**What to do:**  
• Lightning can cause power surges. Unplug all appliances, including air conditioners, before the storm hits.

• Listen for storm updates on a battery-powered radio.

• Avoid using the telephone. Telephone lines can conduct electricity.

• Metal pipes also conduct electricity. Stay away from faucets, sinks and bathtubs.

• Close the blinds and shades of your windows and keep away from them.

• Keep pets on a leash or in a carrier.

**Outside:**  
• Take cover in the best shelter you can find. If you are in or near water, go to land immediately and find shelter. If choosing between a building or a car, choose the building.

• If choosing between a hard-top and a convertible, choose the hard-top.

• If you're in a car, keep the windows closed.

If there is no shelter:  
• Find a low-lying, open place that is a safe distance from trees, poles or metal objects that can conduct electricity.

• Squat low to the ground. Place your hands on your knees with your head tucked between them. Try to touch as little of your body to the ground as possible. Do not lie flat on the ground, as your fully-extended body will provide a larger surface to conduct electricity.

• If you feel your hair stand on end in a storm, drop into the tuck position described above immediately. This sensation means electric charges are already rushing up your body from the ground toward an electrically charged cloud. Minimize your contact with the ground to minimize your injury.

This ongoing column also includes a Disaster-Supplies Calendar, which is intended to help prepare for disasters before they happen.

Using the calendar, people can assemble a disaster supplies kit in small steps over a five-month period. Remember to change and replace perish-

able items such as food and water every six months.

### Grocery Store

One can ready-to-eat soup\*

Liquid soap

Thermometer

Household chlorine bleach

One box heavy-duty garbage bags with ties

Antacid (for upset stomach)

Petroleum jelly or other lubricant

Also, saline solution and a contact lens case, if needed.

### To Do

Familiarize your network of neighbors and friends with any areas on your body where you have reduced sensation.

If you have a communication disability, store a word or letter board in your disaster supplies kit.

\* Purchase one for each member of the household.

## Alleged bank robber to undergo evaluation

A 20-year-old Albuquerque man charged with the 1996 armed robbery of a Ruidoso bank will be evaluated to determine if he is competent to stand trial, a district judge ordered Wednesday.

A request for a determination was filed by prosecutor Scott Klundt in the 12th Judicial Court in Carrizozo.

Judge Karen Parsons referred Rojas to state-sanctioned psychological services for an appointment.

Defense attorney Jacob Vigil of Albuquerque contends his client, Alberto Rojas, has the mental capacity of a 9-year-old child because of a head injury six years ago when he was 14 and was thrown from a pick-

up truck owned by the city of Albuquerque while working a summer job.

Vigil represented the Rojas family and successfully sued the city in that civil case.

Klundt, an assistant district attorney in the Carrizozo office of District Attorney Scot Key, said he wanted to cover the competency issue before the jury trial set for Sept. 1.

The evaluation will be used to determine if Rojas is able to stand trial and if he knew what he was doing when he allegedly robbed First Savings Bank on Sudderth Drive Nov. 4, 1996.

"Basically, a defendant has to be able to assist in his defense and understand the

nature and consequences of his actions," Vigil said. "The only problem is that the standard is very low. If he knows what a judge and lawyer are and where the courtroom is, he's called competent."

Rojas pleaded not guilty to the armed robbery charge.

Vigil has maintained that his client has been misidentified by the man who was bank manager at the time of the robbery.

Rojas turned himself in to Ruidoso police in early 1998 and was released to his parents' custody on a \$64,000 property bond.

A second defendant, Vincente Montes, pleaded no contest to the charge in late February and was sentenced to 10 years in prison.

**Recreation budget to maintain services**

Rafael Salas, Ruidoso Parks and Recreation Department director, has what he describes as "an operational budget" for the 1998-99 fiscal year.

"It's pretty good to keep our maintenance going," Salas said of the \$952,490 earmarked for the department by the village council.

That means residents shouldn't see a cut in recreational programs or services. Last year, the department's budget was \$809,356. The modest increase of \$143,134 can be attributed to a reappropriation of \$150,000 from the State Legislature for the redesign of the proposed recreation center, to be located at the White Mountain Recreation Complex, Salas said.

He also plans on using those reappropriated funds for an irrigation system for the east soccer field at the sports complex, landscaping of the complex and the extension of walking trails toward Hull Road.

Additionally, Salas will have \$108,050 to spend on capital outlay items that were nixed from last year's budget by Gov. Gary Johnson.

That \$108,050 will go to:

- Equipment: \$12,544 for trimmers, pruners, and a turf aerator, among other equipment.

- Park improvements: \$28,610 for a walking path at Schoolhouse Park.

- Walking trail improvements: \$30,000 for resurfacing about 1.8 miles of the fitness trail around the Links golf course.

- Trail improvements:

\$26,000 for improved paths in the Grindstone Lake area.

Holiday decorations: \$11,900 for Christmas adornments.

There is more to the department than just parks and recreation. Salas' department is responsible for recreation, the municipal pool, the senior citizen's center, building maintenance for all city buildings, and the Forest Lawn cemetery on Mechem Drive.

Socorro's senior citizens received the largest line item increase, nearly 43 percent. That bolstered portion of the budget will pay for converting and expanding the old public library into the senior citizen's center. The center formerly occupied a small portion of the building on Sudderth.

The budget also reflects increases in personnel pay, which rose 12 percent from last year. Salas said the budget for full-time employees increased by 7 percent.



On Hes My Dasher's last gallop before Sunday's Rainbow Futurity final, trainer John Bassett and the gelding's gallop rider saw a rainbow overhead just as they were heading off the racetrack.

Was it a sign of good things to come? Yes, indeed.

Gwendolyn Eaves' Hes My Dasher led from start to finish, despite a pouring rain and a lightning storm, to win the \$609,727 Grade 1 Rainbow Futurity Sunday at Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

The gelded son of Dash Thru Traffic out of Fortune of Delight beat his talented competitors by a length in a time of 19.84 seconds on a wet/fast track.

The victory was the first Rainbow Futurity triumph for Bassett.

"He does everything perfect. We really thought that we had the best horse but it takes a lot of luck. Maybe he's creating his own luck," Bassett said

of his charge.

Breaking from the four post position, Hes My Dasher broke slightly to the right, but quickly straightened out. With mild urging from jockey Joe Badilla, Hes My Dasher put his nose in front of co-fastest qualifier, Sunset Dash.

"The horse handled the track," said Badilla. "He broke a little to the right but was in front the whole time. He already acts like a mature horse."

Finishing second was Tiny Dash of Cash. Bill and Mary Ellard's Tiny Dash of Cash is trained by Russell Harris and was ridden by Larry Payne. Tiny Dash of Cash won her futurity trial impressively by 2 1/2 lengths.

Third was co-fastest qualifier, Sunset Dash, also trained by Russell Harris. Sunset Dash went into the Rainbow finals undefeated in three lifetime starts. Payne qualified both horses to the final but chose to ride Tiny Dash of Cash over Sunset Dash.

"That's a choice and it was a

really tough choice," said Payne. "They both were training excellent and it came right down to 15 minutes before the draw. I said flip a coin."

The remaining order of finish for the Rainbow Futurity was: Turf Cash, Fodice (DQ'd and placed 7th), All Dane, Cashington, Fast Debonair, Dash Free, For Jens.

**Rainbow Derby finals**

Dashin is Easy kept his stellar race record unblemished this year, with a win in the Rainbow Derby Saturday.

The 3-year-old is six-for-six, and he's the only winner of three Grade 1 stakes in 1998.

Finishing second was the filly Honor Base. Third was John Stinebaugh's trainee, The Casanova.

The remaining order of finish was as follows: Joanna Kate, Doctor Cheval, This Snow Is Royal, Legacy Special, Real Tucky Lady, Ja Sliding Nine and Wilks.

# Sighting in county of pigs in the 'wild' poses swine questions

• The wild around Ruidoso do mirror many species — but pot-bellied pigs?

On a route to a popular hiking trail near Ruidoso, motorists came to a sudden stop startled by the sight of two pot-bellied pigs, possibly a male and his mate, leisurely trotting across the road and then up a hill to disappear into the Lincoln National Forest.

Could they be renegade javelinas who somehow made their way north from Texas or east from Arizona, unlikely but then so is the prospect of pot-bellied pigs surviving — really thriving — in the high mountain climate of Ruidoso.

The animals could be part of a herd of domestic pigs gone wild, says Larry Cordova, wildlife specialist with the U. S. Forest Service.

"They" (the feral pigs) escaped in Nogal Canyon in the 1950s," he said. "They've been doing some damage to the for-

est all that time. They've already ventured into the Cedar Creek area, but prior to that they stayed around Nogal and Nogal Peak."

Feral pigs tend to do well in the forest, migrating to lower elevations during the winter. Because they do a lot of digging, destroying vegetation and causing erosion, especially around drainage areas, the hunting season on the intruders is open year-around. They like to stay near water, Cordova said.

Pigs from this herd sighted by hikers or killed by hunters are large, at least 150 pounds, said Sam Tobias, in charge of recreational lands in the Smokey Bear Ranger District around Ruidoso.

Game Warden Ron Moore said he's heard many different stories about how the pigs originally were released into the forest.

The angle that he doesn't like is the prospect of hunters with rifles traveling through the forest any time of the year when hikers and campers may

be around, he said.

"People were hunting them pretty hard for a while," Moore said. "Every weekend they'd be out there with rifles. I tried to talk them out of hunting. (The pigs) are domestic pigs gone wild and so they aren't under our jurisdiction. They're technically the property of the Forest Service, which owns the land. In other places in the state, it's an offense to hunt them."

The pigs seen by the motorist were smaller than regular swine and resembled the pot-belly pigs that were popular as pets in Lincoln County a few years ago.

"It's possible (if they are pot belly pigs) some strayed off of someone's property or were accidentally released," Tobias said. "If they were javelinas, they would weigh less and be fairly slender."

The pot belly breed, a dwarf swine, is known for its intelligence and personality, which probably has helped in its survival. The breed was developed in the 1980s and first introduced into the United

States seven years ago by Canadian Keith Cornell, who initially intended to supply pet pigs but was soon contacted by interested private buyers. The pet pigs initially sold for thousands of dollars, but the price then dropped to something more in line with other pet pig breeds.

Some people, however, didn't realize the impact the pot-belly pet would make on their lives and either discarded them in shelters or sent them to one of the few rescue centers in the United States, or simply set them loose.

While domestic swine might weigh more than 600 pounds, the pot belly ranges from 70 pounds to 150, averaging three feet in length and 18 inches in height. They can be solid black or white, or spotted.

Experts say both male and females make good pets, but only if they are neutered.

Javelinas tend to have longer legs than their pot-bellied cousins and they are night-time wanderers, although they may be found around foothill arroyos during the daytime.

They're common in Big Bend National Park in Texas.

The wild pigs are short-sighted. Although they have an odor similar to skunk, they do not use it as a defense. The aroma is part of their system of recognition and used to mark territory.

Javelinas are very curious and because of their poor eyesight, they may come toward a human who stumbles on a small band. But they're aren't like wild boars and they don't charge.

Domestic pigs come in a variety of colors and can grow to more than 1,000 pounds.

# Mountain lion spotted on road near Alto

As Ron Malczewski headed south on Old Fort Stanton Road near Alto at about 3:30 p.m. Saturday, he was startled to see something big crossing the pavement about 50 yards in front of his car.

"It was a 'goldish', yellowish color. It took about three leaps to cross the road and the other thing was this great long tail sticking up in the air," Malczewski said.

Malczewski guessed at what it might be and went to the library on Monday and looked up "mountain lion."

He was right; it was. "I had been visiting in Michigan and when I got back, I

read in the (Ruidoso News) about the dryness and all of the critters coming down the mountains, but I figured with all of the rain lately, they already headed back," he said. "But if they have, this one is lagging behind."

The articles published earlier dealt with other sightings of mountain lions on The Links golf course in Ruidoso Downs, as well as bear problems.

"I read in the articles that if a lion was in a certain posture, you should try to look big and carry a walking stick (for defense)," Malczewski said. "But when I saw the size of this thing even from 50 yards, if I've got myself a heavy duty walking stick, I don't think it would help me much, not from what I saw."

Malczewski, who moved to Lincoln County from Michigan last September, said the lion about a quarter of a mile south of Don Lincoln's llama farm on Old Fort Stanton Road. He called Lincoln to warn him and notified the Ruidoso Police Department, the Sheriff's Office and the game warden.

No action usually is taken with wild life unless a bear or lion becomes a nuisance or poses a threat.

Experts advise hikers to travel in groups, make noise, watch for signs of a big cat and be prepared to fight back. Keep children near you and if a mountain lion is sighted, pick up the children so they don't appear to be prey.



## Critically ill

### Home health and hospice services feel the crunch of the Balanced Budget Act of 1997

A third of the state's home health agencies folded in the past six months due to cutbacks in Medicare payments, said an administrator of Home Health Services of Lincoln County.

The Balanced Budget Act of 1997 reformed the Medicare program to prevent fraud and abuses but rural home health care organizations can't afford to operate under the new regulations, which base costs on 1994 levels, said Maureen Coleman, co-administrator.

"I planned my budget based on what my operating expenses were in 1996 and 1997 for 1998," she said. "We doubled our staff and our volume of services in 1996, so it's unrealistic to think I can be fiscally viable."

Valerie Miller, Lincoln County Medical Center administrator, said there hasn't been time enough to see consequences of the changes in terms of increased emergency ward and hospital admissions, but she is concerned.

"The effect of the Balanced Budget Amendment on home health is going to be very traumatic and I don't think we've even begun to see the effect," Miller said. "Candidly, I fail to understand the reasoning of Congress, why they would attack a much less costly way of providing care to the point that they jeopardize its viability in some cases."

Mike Holt, director of Frontier Medical, a for-profit agency, is feeling the pinch because, he said, "The new formulas benefit the older, established agencies that are the most inefficient and wasteful and had higher costs in 1994."

"We can't just go out and see the patient. We have really had to track, patient by patient. We have to watch the way we do business."

Coleman said what's threatening the home health industry is that there's a limit per year that clients can get from Medicare regardless of their diagnosis, or the intensity and complexity of their needs.

Because of budget cuts, this may mean dropping patients with more complex, expensive needs, said Holt, whose agency has picked up clients other agencies have "dumped," especially in Alamogordo.

The changes affect more than Medicare patients, explained Coleman.

"If we were to close our doors, there's 30 percent of the people who are new moms or people released from the hospital at age 40, people who've suffered heart attacks, that would not receive health care, because the hospital is not the place to convalesce."


She said the current system is intended as a gradual transition to a cost-based system that will take into account differing patient needs by 1999, but it isn't gradual for agencies like hers.

"By 1999, 50 percent of the home health organizations will have folded because of the economic pressure," Coleman said.

Another provision of the Medicare change is that home health care agencies must be bonded. Coleman points out that nonprofit organizations like her's are in a double bind: they can't get approved for a bond because they have no assets, and as nonprofits, they'd be in trouble if they did have enough assets to qualify for bonding.

This is unfair to companies that haven't had allegations of misuse brought against them, she said, "when roughly 10 percent of the companies are indicted with fraud and yet they're punishing the other 90 percent."

Also agencies are no longer allowed to make visits to draw blood of house-

bound patients for lab tests unless there is another medical purpose for the visit.

"Some clients have had to forego services," Coleman said. "We've repositioned services so there's a greater availability of private-pay help if people are able to pay for that. Others have to go into the doctor's office to get the blood work done, or the possibility of more trips to the emergency room. It hits the person that's least able to pay for minimal services in the home," she said.

Awareness is growing about the problems with this interim system and several members of Congress have written bills to fix them.

Sen. Pete Domenici, R-N.M., is cosponsor of the Home Health Access Preservation Act of 1998 (S.2323).

"The bill reflects a growing belief that the current (limits of the payment system) punish cost-effective agencies, reward wasteful agencies and create incentives for agencies to avoid patients with relatively serious health care needs," Domenici said in a news release.

Joie Glenn, executive director of the New Mexico Association for Home Care in

Albuquerque said that S.2323 appears to have the most support. "S.2323 is the strongest, but there are negotiations as we speak to incorporate aspects of some of the other bills," he said.

Selma Sierra, press secretary, and Michael Kozeliski, legislative correspondent for Rep. Joe Skeen, R-N.M., said Skeen "doesn't want to commit to any bill that could cause consequences as in the Balanced Budget Agreement and will wait until something surfaces that everyone can agree with."

Skeen is concerned with the needs of the health care delivery in rural areas, Sierra said, and has spoken to the chairman of the subcommittee so that it could be included in discussion.

"As a staff we are expecting something to happen this year," said Kozeliski.

The problem with that, Glenn said, is that Congress goes on recess in August and won't be back until September to deal with it. Implementation of any changes wouldn't happen until October and some agencies may not be able to survive that long.

## One family's story ...

Home health care and hospice have been a life line to the elderly, disabled and terminally ill for years. With cuts in Medicare many patients are feeling the blow — and so are their families.

Ruidoso residents Peggy McClellan and Dixie Sigler know all too well how cuts in the home health care budget can affect patients and their families. Their mother, Margaret Whiteley, became a patient of Lincoln County Home Health after a serious fall and continued to need care throughout a string of illnesses and injuries.

Margaret, while in continual physical therapy and exercise programs to recuperate from the fall, incurred internal bleeding, suffered a heart attack and then dealt with bouts of seizures and black outs. The family relied on Home Health to help with her daily care.

"She's always been there for us and we didn't want to put her in a nursing home," McClellan said.

After Medicare cuts, many Lincoln County residents suffered. With a tight new budget, many of the area patients were cut from home health services because of a lack of funding, including

McClellan's mother.

"It's been very difficult because I can't even leave home without having someone here for her. In order for me to work I have to have someone come and stay all afternoon and private care is too expensive," McClellan said.

She stressed that her mother is not one of the worse off. Many former patients don't have family to take care of them. McClellan has had numerous volunteers come and stay while she works, but there are those who don't have such help.

The services Home Health provided Whiteley included exercise and speech therapy that McClellan.

Thankfully, Whiteley's condition has slowly improved, after the initial difficult years she spent in home health and hospital care. Whiteley uses a walker and needs constant care in case of an emergency.

McClellan said she knows all the rea-

sons for the cuts, and feels badly not only for the patients who have lost their care, but for the health care workers who are struggling to keep the program alive.

"I know that they have to feed their families too," she said.

The advantages to home health care are obvious to everyone who works to give their ailing loved ones comfort and quality of life at home.

"We need to take a very strong look at the elderly and disabled and what we're doing for them. It's sad to see their needs not being met," McClellan said.

### ► Legislative relief?

Home Health Access Preservation Act of 1998 (S.2323)

The legislation would:

## Brave Lifesavers of Years Ago You Are a Surfman

Think back more than 100 years ago, before there were ...

- radios
- safety laws
- weather reports
- modern aids for navigation.

Imagine this ...



You are out on patrol. It is a dark and stormy night along a deserted shore. The winds are howling. The ocean is roaring. The pounding rain blurs your vision.

Your boots sink deep into the sand. You trudge on, with your eyes searching the ocean. You are looking for a glimmer of a ship in distress. You are listening for cries for help from terrified passengers and sailors who were bound for a safe harbor nearby.

Why might a ship be in trouble so close to shore?

- The fierce weather has hurled it toward land.
- It has been run aground by the crew on purpose so it will not go down in deep water.
- There is a leak or fire or some other problem on board.
- The captain is at fault. Maybe he has missed the warning of a lighthouse.

As a surfman, it's your job to save lives from shore. If you come upon a sinking ship, you rush to alert the other members of your crew, who live in a station that might be miles away.



A surfman on patrol at Virginia Beach, Va. Surfmen worked from September to April. They made about \$40 a month. The rest of the year they might be fishermen or even farmers.



A crew chief barks orders as the surfmen launch a surf boat and struggle to reach a ship before it goes down. Before launching the boat, they might have to pull it miles through the sand to the site of the wreck.



Sometimes the surfmen used a small cannon to shoot ropes out to a sinking ship. Survivors would be hoisted ashore one by one in something called a "breeches buoy."




Along with other members of his lifesaving crew, a surfman lived in a lifesaving station on the shore of a beach, lake or river.

You are a member of the United States Life-Saving Service. This service later became the United States Coast Guard.

## Life as a Lifeguard

Imagine you are one of today's lifeguards. You love the beach and being outdoors. You are a good swimmer and you want to help people who might get into trouble.

### How you got the job

You have passed the Red Cross test in Advanced Lifesaving. You also have taken courses in first aid.

Maybe you are a college student on summer break. Maybe you are a firefighter who lifeguards on his or her day off. Maybe you are a pro who works year-round on the job.

### Your day

You report for work at 9 o'clock in the morning. You and the other lifeguards drill to sharpen your skills. You also get your stand assignment for the day.

### From blow-up to blow-down

You climb up on your stand. Along with all other lifeguards, you stand up and blow your whistle at 9:30 sharp. This is called the "blow-up." It lets people know you are on duty.

You have a break in the morning and afternoon and for lunch. You do the same thing for a "blow-down" at 6 o'clock in the evening.

You watch for surfers and swimmers in trouble. If needed, you swim to the rescue. You blow your whistle to signal danger. You give directions. You answer questions. You tell people about the laws of the beach.

### Lost kids

You take a lost kid up on your stand. You radio the other lifeguards along the beach. You give the description of the lost child. You wait for a parent to come and claim him or her.

One of the biggest problems you have is helping lost children find their parents.

You wish that parents would make certain kids know exactly where the family settles down on the beach. Kids should know the nearest street name, and the number of the lifeguard's stand. You also want kids to know the hotel where they are staying, just in case they wander off.

1. ASK LIFEGUARD ABOUT WATER CONDITIONS.
2. OBEY THE RULES OF YOUR SWIMMING AREA.
3. LEARN TO SWIM.
4. NEVER SWIM ALONE. SWIM NEAR A LIFEGUARD.
5. DON'T DIVE. GO FEET FIRST.
6. IF IN TROUBLE, CALL OR WAVE FOR HELP.
7. PLEASE REPORT ANY DANGEROUS SITUATIONS.

## POOP SCOOP

I know I write about the connection between violence to animals and violence to humans, but the Humane Society of the United States has published some statistics that spell out the effect.

According to a summary of national cruelty statistics, dogs are the most frequent victims, targeted in nearly 50 percent of reported cases of abuse and severe neglect. They also were the most common victims of shooting and beating (60 percent), poisoning (71 percent) and crushing, hanging or choking (47 percent).

Those reports showed that 29 percent of the incidents involved crimes against people committed along with acts against animals.

Most (82 percent) were associated with intentional cruelty or torture than neglect (18 percent). Of those cases involving both animal and human victims, 87 percent involved male perpetrators.

Men were involved in 71 percent of the cases overall and 87 percent of the intentional abuse, including all of the reported cases of poisoning, stabbing, mutilation, beheading and dismemberment. Women were involved in 49 percent of

the neglect cases.

Of the cases reported, 16 percent were committed by adolescents or children and 84 percent by adults.

If those statistics weren't disheartening enough, of the 401 cases reviewed, only 62 (15 percent) were found guilty and sentenced, with 33 (8.2 percent) resulting in a jail term. Only one was given mandated counseling.

The Bureau of Justice Statistics estimated that more than 1.3 million Americans were treated for injuries caused by violence in 1994, with more than 240,000 injured in the context of an intimate relationship.

"Our data as well as other recent studies suggest that the abuse of animals often precedes or coexists with such violence and may provide a potent warning sign of troubled individuals or relationships," the HSUS concludes.

One of the ways everyone can help is to lobby New Mexico legislators for a change in law to make animal abuse and neglect a felony instead of the lesser crime of a misdemeanor.





# Beau Bridges is over the top in ABC's Maximum Bob

There's nothing halfway about ABC's summer series *Maximum Bob*, premiering Tuesday, Aug. 4.

Adapted from an Elmore Leonard novel, *Bob* stars Beau Bridges as bombastic judge Bob Gibbs, known for meting out extreme justice to the guilty. Behind the camera is Barry Sonnenfeld, director of *Men in Black* and the 1995 adaptation of Leonard's *Get Shorty*, starring John Travolta.

*Bob* is the kind of show associated with cable TV: It has ribald humor, politically incorrect attitudes and white-trash stereotypes. Yet it throws down the gauntlet to all those who have complained about stale summer reruns and timid networks sticking with safe, threadbare concepts.

"In some ways, this is a cable show," concedes writer-producer Alex Gansa (*The X-Files*). "At the same time there's something exciting about bringing something like this to a more mainstream audience to see if they respond. You're not tuning in to watch *The Practice* or *NYPD Blue*, but something that is 10 degrees off-center, sometimes more."

Filmed on location in Florida, *Bob* mixes backwoods culture with a subtropical climate and the gaudy, sun-drenched colors of *Miami Vice*. But don't expect to see the likes of Sonny Crockett in fictional Deep Water, Fla.

Instead, there's public defender Kathy Baker (Liz Vassey), a well-connected city girl looking to turn over a new leaf after leaving her philandering husband.

A lesser woman might be put off by a judge who gives her client the death sentence for drinking a beer. But Kathy decides she'll stay in Deep Water, where the sheriff (Sam Robards) takes tango lessons, a clan of inbred outlaws buys eyeglasses in bulk, and the judge's wife is a psychic ex-mermaid (Kiersten Warren) who's protected by the ghost of a black slave girl (Rae'ven Larrymore Kelly).

Among the recurring cast members are William Sanderson (*Newhart*) as redneck Dickie Crowe and Paul and Peter Allen Vogt as his sons, the Twee-

dleedee and Tweedledum of the Everglades. (The Vogts are locals who are holding on to their day jobs performing at Walt Disney World in nearby Orlando.) All this and a dog-eating alligator, too.

If *Maximum Bob* sounds like a low-brow *Northern Exposure* or a melted *Fargo*, it's supposed to. "The model for the show is *Northern Exposure*," Gansa says. "(The show) has a sweetness and, hopefully, an accessibility that's a little different from the novel."

While this may disappoint hard-core Leonard fans, it's a necessary step for the series, according to Bridges.

"I think *Maximum Bob*, as he's portrayed in the novel, might be hard to take for more than two or three visits," he says. "Yet even in the novel, as nuts as he is, you kind of like him because he's so outspoken. With *Bob*, at least you know where you are."

Some viewers, however, might not know what to make of the quirky judge. One thing's for sure: *Bob* definitely has orchids in his hothouse.

"*Bob* collects exotic orchids, and he speaks in a lot of analogies that have to do with orchids," Bridges notes. "It's a great counterpoint to his somewhat gruff attitude about justice."

"Now I'm totally consumed by orchids (too). I'm going to go home and build a greenhouse."

Like a strangely beautiful flower, *Maximum Bob* will bloom for a few short weeks. If viewers like it, it may put down roots.



## Stark women's filmmaking, viewer mail end *P.O.V.* season

PBS' anthology series *P.O.V.* ends its 11th season with three short films collected under the title *She Shorts*. Airing Tuesday, Aug. 4 (check local listings), the program closes with a look into the electronic mailbag.

Among the most challenging and provocative series on television, *P.O.V.* (for Point of View) returns each summer with an assortment of original documentaries. A *P.O.V.* selection often is the filmmaker's first long production, so production values vary, but the variety of subjects is heartening, from family reunions to AIDS and cowgirls to Carmen Miranda.

Each *She Shorts* film is made by and about women. Fans of Dorothy Allison's book *Bastard out of Carolina* and the subsequent feature adaptation will appreciate the brief portrait of Allison in the first offering, *Two or Three Things but Nothing for Sure*. Jane C. Wagner, whose writing credits include Lily Tomlin's one-woman Broadway show, produced the film with Tina Di Feliciano. In it, Allison shares de-

tails of her anguished childhood with a brutal stepfather, as well as the fulfillment she finds in her work.

*Cuba 15* is the cryptic title of Elizabeth Schub's crash portrait of a Cuban girl, Tzunami Ortega Coyra, celebrating her quinceanera, the traditional passage from childhood to womanhood as she turns 15. While her subject describes a new feeling of power, Schub's camera captures the fragile beauty of her hope and naivete.

Finally, charcoal pencil animation is the stark accompaniment to the voices of victimized homeless women in Ellie Lee's *Repetition Compulsion*.

The struggle for self-determination is a constant in *She Shorts*. Just a half-hour overall (and mercifully so - there is much pain here), the trio of films stays with the viewer long after.

During the second half-hour, viewers respond to past weeks' programs in *Talking Back: Video Letters to P.O.V.* Viewers may comment on *She Shorts* by telephone at (800) 688-4768 or via a camcorder, the Internet or old-fashioned mail.

The next editions of *P.O.V.* and *Talking Back* air in September.






