



Ruidoso's effort to take over garbage collection stalls

The departure of the village of Ruidoso from the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority will be delayed until Oct. 1, to coincide with the end of the first quarter of the fiscal year.

The authority board also agreed Monday to accept an offer from Southwest Disposal, a private garbage collection company, to prepare an analysis of the authority's situation, routes and equipment, with recommendations for its reorga-

nization.

The report is free and due within the next three weeks. Southwest already picks up some commercial accounts in the county and serves Las Cruces and Alamogordo.

Authority manager Jerry Wright said he met with Ruidoso village manager Alan Briley before the meeting and they agreed Oct. 1 is a more realistic date for the separation.

The village doesn't have its transport equipment yet and has not hired personnel.

"They originally were shooting for Sept. 15, then Sept. 20, but it

doesn't make a lot of sense for us in this office," Wright said.

Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson, who represents the village on the board along with Briley, Councilman Frank Cummins and Ross Dingman, said Sept. 8 was the first target date.

"But Jerry brought it to our attention that within 21 days it would be the end of the quarter," he said. Trying to pro-rate fees would be a hassle.

"It might be easier from a financial standpoint to do it at the end of the quarter," Donaldson said. "As it is, it works in our best interests to

have additional time to do some things, and also for the authority to deal with employees, this board's reorganization and what jobs are going to Ruidoso and what jobs are staying here."

Authority vice chairman Monroy Montes, who also is a county commissioner, said Ruidoso made a commitment to take certain employees when members of the coalition agree to the split.

But Briley said the joint powers agreement between the village and the other authority members states only that authority employees will be considered for hiring. The village

will add nine people to help with the extra responsibility of running the garbage collection department, he said. Not all will come from the authority.

The authority, a coalition of the county and its five municipalities formed in 1991 to handle garbage collection and disposal, operates with 28 employees. Wright is estimating at least 14 are needed to run the authority after Ruidoso leaves.

"Fourteen people to run half the organization," Montes said.

Nunley cleared of accusations

District Attorney Scot Key says his investigation of Lincoln County Commission Chairman L. Ray Nunley's possible conflict in the hiring of deputy Chris Rutten failed to reveal any credible evidence of wrongdoing.

His report to County Attorney Alan Morel dated Tuesday concludes that Nunley did nothing improper in presenting a motion asking the entire commission to create another deputy slot.

"I conclude that deputy Rutten's subsequent marriage to an employee of Wal-Mart (where Nunley is head pharmacist) and under the supervision of Nunley is neither a conflict or a perceived conflict of interest and would not have required him to abstain from making the motion or subsequently voting on creating the deputy position," Key wrote.

Nunley asked for an investigation by Key after Commissioner Wilton Howell brought up the creation of the deputy slot during a discussion of a controversial hiring in the county's DWI program.

"I think it's a shame that any commissioner has to respond to unfounded allegations that take his mind off the work at hand," Nunley said. "There's enough for us to do as commissioners, as citizens and husbands and wage earners without being distracted by unfounded remarks and I'm disappointed it happened the way it did."

Responding to Key's report, Howell said, "It's unfortunate Nunley decided to take my remarks and distracted him from the job he needs to be doing, instead of seeing between two commissioners."

In his conclusion, Key wrote that, "Neither logic or reason would have allowed Commissioner Nunley (when he made the motion Sept. 9, 1997) to look into a crystal ball to know that Chris Rutten would have applied for the position nor that a three-member oral board would have independently and unanimously graded Rutten higher than the other candidates."

"The evidence is very clear that (Nunley) properly responded to the Sheriff's Department's complaints that they were extremely understaffed. The decision to hire Chris Rutten rather than any of the other applicants was entirely in the hands of the sheriff."

FORT STANTON

New sign at prison 'has no teeth'

A sign posted outside the Fort Stanton minimum security prison for women that prohibits photographing the historic fort has no legal teeth, says the spokesman for the state Department of Corrections.

"The signs were put up for security purposes," said Mike Toms. "It's like the signs telling people not to pick up hitchhikers around a prison, it's not a state law, but it's darn good advice."

Lincoln County Sheriff Tom Sullivan said he received several complaints about the signs, one of

Workers on Highway 48 to 'blast' forward

Road construction on Mechem Drive may continue into the winter and will include blasting in some areas, a project manager said this week.

"Our plan right now is to start blasting in September," said Bill Loomis, project manager for Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc., the Phoenix firm hired by the state to complete four road construction projects in the area.

As for construction overall, "Depending on what kind of winter it is we may keep going,"





White Oaks Eagle

Aug. 23, 1900

Gov. Otero has pardoned Will H. Hightower, who, little over two years ago, was sentenced from this county to 18 years imprisonment in the penitentiary for the killing of James Meggs.

The killing took place on Eagle Creek near Hightower's

home, and was the result of frequent quarrels between the two men over the ownership of a mining claim.

The majority of the people of this county have always felt that Hightower was justifiable in taking the life of Meggs, and that it was necessary in order to save his own.

Hightower had always borne an excellent reputation, being considered a leading citizen of his community.

GARBAGE: Further review of operations and employee status will be made

Wright said that's because the organization has separate operations such as recycling and commercial roll-offs as well as regular garbage collection. People also are needed to take over pick-ups on holidays and to cover for employees on sick leave and vacation, he said.

Authority members met in a closed-to-the-public executive session during the meeting to decide how to handle the employees no longer needed for the authority and not hired by the village.

When they came back into the open regular session, they directed authority attorney Don Dutton to prepare notices for employees of their status with the authority.

Some trade-off of services also may be considered between Ruidoso and the

authority, Wright said.

That could include swapping the use of the authority's recycling services by the village for use of the village's garbage transfer station by the authority, he said. The village has budgeted about \$50,000 toward recycling costs, because that's about the amount of the operation's annual deficit.

"But we haven't had any time to crunch the figures yet," Wright said.

Without figures about the amount of garbage processed through the transfer station and recycling, "how can we plug in revenues and costs on that?" Montes asked.

Briley said the next month should give him and Wright time to come up with some estimates.

Wright said the village also may accept responsibility for collection on some key

streets such as Cedar Creek Drive that, although they are in the county, impact on the overall look of the community.

"It may be easier for us to be sure it's clean," Donaldson said. "Maybe we can do a tradeout."

The village will be re-examining its routes to look for maximum effectiveness, he said.

In a related matter, Dutton advised that until Ruidoso separates, its four members on the board will retain their voting power, except in matters dealing with the authority after the village separates.

One village representative will stay on the board after the split and will continue to vote on issues related to the regional landfill south of Alamogordo, because the village will remain a partner in its operation.

Wright recommended that the authority continue with polycart collection in the villages of Ruidoso Downs, Carrizozo and Capitan.

The service is paying for itself, he said. Only a few disappear each year and that cost can be absorbed, he said.

Authority members decided for now to continue charging \$1.50 for disposal of car tires, \$5 for truck tires and \$20 for tractor tires at the recycling center. Tires were being accepted without charge at the debris landfill, which is being closed and cleared of tires.

Although much higher rates are being charged for disposal of tires across the country, Donaldson said a change in rates should be based on actual expense experience, and not be "plucked out of the air."

Loomis said.

Explosives will be used in road work at the northern edge of Ruidoso, Loomis said. The blasting is needed to remove rock and large portions of dirt in the second phase of the project to widen Mechem. That section starts at White Mountain Drive and ends at the turn-off to Ski Run Road.

Loomis said four blasting sites have been designated on Mechem Road, beginning north of White Mountain Drive and ending before the top of the hill commonly referred to as Alto Hill or Swiss Chalet Hill.

The company will give the community as much advance notice as possible before explosives are used, Loomis said. All the blasting will be done during the day and is expected to hold up traffic for intervals of 15 to 20 minutes, he said.

A subcontractor for Meadow Valley, American Mining Services, will conduct

the blasting using an explosive called ammonium nitrate. The substance is considered stable until detonated, Loomis said.

While work on the first phase of the Mechem construction project will add a turn lane, sidewalks and, in some segments, four traffic lanes, the second phase to a large extent will chart a new path, resulting in a much straighter road. Combined, the cost for both phases of the Mechem Drive road construction comes to more than \$15 million.

Based on blueprints for the second phase, the new Mechem Drive will veer as much as 160 feet from the existing road. The road also will be lowered in some areas by more than 45 feet, construction officials said.

For example, at the top of Alto Hill, the road's center line will move dozens of feet to the east, drop significantly in height and will become four-lanes, according to blue prints.

Though the state right-of-way actually touches one corner of the Best Western Swiss

Chalet where the front desk is located, blueprints for the new road show only a few feet of the new road will extend past the existing western lip of the road.

Steve Tally, manager of the Swiss Chalet, said he hadn't seen the plans for about a year, but does not anticipate any problems.

"I'll know more when they start getting out here. So far, it hasn't affected our business at all and I don't expect it to," Tally said Tuesday. "I do hope that they will design it so that the turn-in to the Swiss Chalet will be safe — safe and easy," he said.

Tally already has been working with Meadow Valley regarding fill dirt left at the hotel and said the company has been professional and easy to work with.

"Minor inconvenience now, and a great road when it's finished," he said of the work.

Roy Parker, manager of Apache Ski, echoed Tally's statements, saying the construction may slow down traffic

to the ski resort during the winter, but that the finished road will be a benefit in the long run.

"And it's got to be done so there's not much we can do about it," Parker said.

Loomis said crews are already at work creating detours for motorists to drive while road work is under way on the second phase. Because the planned road is often different from the existing roadway, many segments will not require detours.

Currently, crews are clearing hundreds of trees from the road's right-of-way along the second phase of the project.

"We hope to have most of it cleared by the second week of September," Loomis said.

Marketable lumber will be sold by the foreman of the project, and unmarketable lumber will be chipped and disposed of either at a landfill or at Sierra Contractors, a local firm licensed to burn wood refuse, Loomis said.

which is nailed to a power pole on the easement for State Road 214.

"The signs say no parking and no photographing, but that's a public road and the fort is a historic site, you can't tell people they can't take pic-

tures," Sullivan said. "The sign is unenforceable. I certainly am not going to enforce it and I don't think the guards there are going to be handing out tickets."

"People have called me to complain and I've told them to take as many pictures as they want of the fort. You can't stop

people from taking pictures of prisons either."

Warden Sandra McFadin, who heads the women's prison, referred all questions to Toms. After checking with the warden, Toms said new signs will be posted giving a telephone number for people to call who would like to photograph the

fort 12 miles northeast of Ruidoso that dates back to the mid-1800s.

But Toms acknowledged that no legal action can be taken against anyone who chooses to stop and take photographs of the fort from the state road.

Roswell man killed in crash

A 19-year-old Roswell man was killed Saturday when he was ejected from a 1993 Saturn as it flipped five times.

Milton Madril, who was driving the car, was not wearing seat belts and was thrown from the car on the second flip, according to witnesses, said Lt. William Bower of the New Mexico State Police, the agency that investigated the accident near Riverside at the eastern edge of Lincoln County.

Liquor was involved, making the accident the fourth fatal in the county where someone was driving after or while drinking, Bower said.

"Some of them were

multiple fatalities," he said. "We've been running extra patrols up there since May trying to get the alcohol accident and arrest rate down. It was a 12 percent then. Our computer is down and I don't have what happened in June and July yet."

Madril's passenger, Evan Reed, 29, was wearing a seat belt and survived the accident with minor injuries.

The accident occurred about 12:18 p.m. as the car driven by Madril was heading east on U.S. 70 at a high rate of speed, Bower said. Madril apparently entered the west-bound lane, over-corrected and the car flipped.



Promises to keep, prisoners to house

The messy business of locking people up just got a bit messier at Fort Stanton, and that doesn't bode well for those people who would like to turn the fort into a living museum.

The charming old former military installation was once commanded by Gen. Black Jack Pershing; in the last century it was the station of the storied Buffalo Soldiers. Over the years at various times it was a POW camp, sanitarium, hospital and men's prison. For the past couple of years it has housed minimum-security women prisoners who are looking for a way back to life outside the judicial system.

It's getting messier now because the next batch of convicts headed for the fort are not of the "minimum custody" variety. According to the Department of Corrections, the 30 due transfer to Fort Stanton in the next few days will be so-called "minimum restrict" prisoners.

Spokesman Michael Toms said "they will be screened very closely and they will have a record of clear conduct and be on the verge of being made minimum custody." We take his word for it; they may be perfectly decent people who messed up worse than the others and need closer watching.

Besides, Toms points out that the problem is the surge in the female inmate population all over the state. The facility in Grants, where the state incarcerates its female prisoners, is running out of space.

That's fine; no argument.

Now it's August, 1998, approaching the time the Department of Corrections was to end its occupation of the state-owned property, after doing a lot of improvements on buildings at the fort as a "thank you."

Such were the promises made many times over during meetings prior to opening the fort to women prisoners. Those were the promises that prompted two different county groups seeking to create a permanent attraction for history-oriented tourists to step back, and put their plans on hold—but not their planning.

It must be acknowledged, of course, that the state owes the Fort Stanton property; that many, many factors impact how property is used — like an escalation in crime around the state and the need for prisons.

Nevertheless, the drift appears to be in the same direction that Uncle Sam took during World War II, when promises were made to the ranchers of Otero and Socorro County that they would get their land back "after the war."

That land became White Sands Missile Range, and the struggle by the ranchers to reclaim their land has ended; all the ranchers whose land was given to the government in a patriotic moment are dead and buried.

Rob Perry, who heads the Department of Corrections for Gov. Gary Johnson, will be at Fort Stanton Friday at 10 a.m., along with the corrections board, to participate in a training program for prisoners.

It's reported that he will be available for questions during his stay.

Maybe he will explain how promises made to the people of Lincoln County two years ago will be kept, perhaps in the next millennium.



Restore the forests

To the editor:

Last year the number of people visiting national parks rose to 279 million, from 266 million in 1996.

Visitations are expected to reach 300 million by the year 2000, putting an even bigger strain on wilderness areas. In addition, Congress has slashed funding for the parks. Even so, the solution is simple: create more wilderness.

This can be done if Congress passes the National Forest Protection & Restoration Act (HR 2789). This bill, sponsored by Jim Leach (R-Iowa) and Cynthia McKinney (D-Ga.) would transfer the nearly \$1 billion in subsidies the timber industry now receives annually. These subsidies would, instead, be redirected to restore forests through revegetation, harmful road and dam removal and alternative fiber products for paper and building supplies.

The bill also creates more jobs and would save \$300 million in taxes the first year, as well as creating healthy and plentiful forests for everyone to enjoy, now and in the future.

With less than 5 percent of our national forests remaining and more and more people visiting them, preserving them isn't enough. We have to start the rebuilding process.

Inconsistent Gavilan

To the editor:

I tried to contact the state Highway Department today, both by the Alto telephone number and the Capitan telephone number. I called at 3:30 p.m. There was no answer at either number. I guess they're at the (county) fair or on vacation. I am concerned about the absence of logic or enforcement on the roads around Ruidoso. I have no one to talk to, so I've chosen to write to the newspaper.

My family and I live on Eagle Creek Canyon Road. Earlier this year, the state Highway Department posted a 25-mile speed sign on Eagle Creek Canyon Road going east about a half-mile from the Gavilan Canyon Road intersection. There was a 35-mile sign there last year and if you come westward on Eagle Creek Canyon Road towards Gavilan Canyon, the speed limit is 35 miles per hour.

Similarly, going north-northwest on Gavilan Canyon Road from Sudderth, the speed limit is 25, then 30 miles per hour. There are no yellow lines, no indication of passing or no passing zones, and very little left of the white lines indicating the shoulder of the road. Coming south-southwest on Gavilan Canyon Road from Mechem towards Sudderth, the speed limit is 30 miles per hour, then 25 at the turn by Hull Road, 35 miles per hour above Warrior Road, then drops to 30 and 25 along by the Animal Shelter and the more populated area near the Rio Ruidoso. Again, there are no yellow lines, no white lines, and no passing lanes indicated along Gavilan Canyon Road.

The inconsistencies in speed limits on Eagle Creek and Gavilan Canyon roads, currently depending only on the direction

you're heading, makes choosing a speed to travel quite a chore. I drive to and from Sudderth on Gavilan Canyon Road on a daily basis. I travel at 30 to 35 miles per hour, except by the residential area near Rio Ruidoso. I am regularly passed by people going much faster than that on stretches of road that have the vaguest remnant of double yellow lines. Similarly, I see people driving very fast along Eagle Creek Canyon Road, clearly in violation of the eastward 25 mile per hour speed limit or the westward 35 mile per hour speed limit.

I would like to see rational speed limits consistently posted on these two roads. There may be other problem areas in the county with varying speed limits, but the problems with these two roads are the most familiar to me. And, if the state chooses to post a speed limit, (it) should either enforce or it get rid of the signs altogether. It's quite frustrating to obey the law and either get tailgated for three miles on Gavilan or have to forbid my children from riding their bicycles on Eagle Creek because some yahoo wants to drive 60 miles an hour along a beautiful and otherwise quiet road.

Don't get me wrong. I want to go to and from work as quickly as the next person, what I don't want is to play by the rules and get harassed or my children mowed down because someone else thinks the rules don't apply to them.

Can the state Highway Department and the state police go out to review the roads for such glaring inconsistencies, and then spend a little effort to correct them? Can we have the yellow and white lines repainted every few years and repainted on the newly repaired sections of roads so we can safely pass slower vehicles like road equipment? How about some input from the community on appropriate speeds for various roads? A 30-mile-per-hour limit on much of Gavilan Canyon Road is not really necessary, in my opinion, and is not enforced anyway. How about a little help from the state folks responsible for the roads and speed limits? I wonder how many other people share my frustrations.

All American Futurity trials draw 180 hopefuls

• D. Wayne Lucas returns to his training roots by entering one of seven supplements to All American Futurity trials.

The dash for \$2 million in cash begins Thursday at Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

In all, 180 2-year-olds will compete for 10 coveted spots in the world's richest quarter horse race, the All American Futurity, at Ruidoso Downs Race Track. This year seven supplements at a cost of \$50,000 per horse will push the total purse to more than \$2 million. The All American Futurity finals will run on Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 7.

Gwendolyn Eaves' Hes My Dasher will try to capture the third jewel of the Quarter Horse Triple Crown. The gelded son of Dash Thru Traffic romped to a one-length victory over a talented field in the Rainbow Futurity July 26.

Despite a rain and lightning storm, Hes My Dasher remained calm, broke right on the lead, and under jockey Joe

Badilla sprinted past his competition in 19.84 seconds on a track listed as wet/fast. By capturing the second jewel of the Triple Crown, Hes My Dasher pushed his earnings to \$270,000.

Challenging Hes My Dasher is Old Habits, trained by Los Alamitos all-time leading jockey Danny Cardoza. Owned by a syndicate of 10 women known as "The Girls," Old Habits set a stakes record time when he posted a victory in the Governors Cup Futurity at Los Alamitos. The gelded son of Apollo (TB) should be dangerous at the All American Futurity distance of 440 yards. Old Habits breaks from the No. 8 post position in the 18th trial.

Owners of some of the most accomplished and talented horses competing for the 10 spots in the final paid the \$50,000 late penalty to supplement their horses into the trials.

D. Wayne Lucas, one of thoroughbred racing's leading trainers, paid \$50,000 to supplement Drop Your Socks. Drop Your Socks finished third in the Governors Cup Futurity to Old Habits. Lucas is returning to quarter horse racing with a vengeance. He

recently paid \$580,000 for six yearlings at the Vessels-Schvansvold Sale in Bonsall, Calif.

Gol is considered the leading 2-year-old in training. He has two Grade 1 victories to his credentials, including the Heritage Place Futurity and Retama Park Futurity. Gol, conditioned by Francisco Gonzalez, boasts race earnings of \$338,510.

Flying Dino is another stakes-winning supplement to the All American trials. Flying Dino is owned by Southern Rose Ranch and is trained by Donnie Strickland. The owner-trainer team combined to win the 1996 All American Futurity with Streakin Flyer. Flying Dino is undefeated in two lifetime starts and was victorious in the Grade 1 Remington Park Futurity.

Party Girl Affair and Streakin Screwball are two more supplements that made their way to the mountain with All American Futurity dreams.

The most exciting and competitive trial should be the 11th heat. Hes My Dasher, Gol and Flying Dino will be vying for the win and should set a scorching time.

Post-time Thursday will be noon to accommodate the 18 trials on tap.

Track changes its name

Hollywood Park veteran to oversee casino operations

A new addition to Ruidoso Downs Race Track has resulted in a name change for the 50-year-old racing oval.

Ruidoso Downs Racing, Inc., is now Ruidoso Race-track and Casino. Hubbard Enterprises President Mark Wilson announced in press release Monday. The new name incorporates the track's casino which is tentatively set to open in the early spring of 1999.

Wilson also named Bruce Rimbo president of the restructured entity, which is a subsidiary of Hubbard Enterprises. Rimbo comes to Ruidoso from Hollywood Park where he served as racetrack and casino executive.

Rick Baugh, current general manager of the Ruidoso Downs racetrack, will continue in that capacity.

"Rick's done an outstanding job at the racetrack," Wilson states in the press release. "He'll only benefit from his working relationship with Bruce. Together those two will further strengthen an already strong management team."

Rimbo and his wife, Toni, and their family will move to Ruidoso in early September, according to the press

release.

"I'm excited to come back to New Mexico," Rimbo said. "I've always loved Ruidoso and the state. It's a special place that's great for family and a superb professional opportunity to help further develop Ruidoso as a national caliber resort community."

R.D. Hubbard, chairman of Hubbard Enterprises, and Wilson praised Rimbo's decision to relocate to Ruidoso.

"He has gained tremendous casino experience working for Hollywood Park over the last four years," Hubbard stated of Rimbo in the press release. "Bruce has literally done it all, from managing racetracks to starting Native American gaming projects in Washington."

Among Rimbo's duties will be overseeing the building of the racetrack's casino which will be located on the east end of the grandstands. The casino will have 300 video gambling machines. Workers could break ground on the project as soon as September with completion in early 1999.

Rimbo will also make additional hiring decisions for the executive management positions over the next four to six months.



Subdivision developers don't fare well in dealing with county commissioners

Sonterra's roads on hold for maintenance; Los Chozas plat questioned

Two developers left the Lincoln County Commission meeting Tuesday without the approvals they wanted.

Ranches of Sonterra, represented by project manager Lonnie Phillips, asked for acceptance of 3.1 miles of roads in Unit II of the development on Sierra Blanca Airport Road.

Ron Green of the Bonito Land and Cattle Co. wanted approval of the plat (layout) of Los Chozas subdivision planned for an area east of the historical settlement of Lincoln on U.S. 380.

But Green's request was put on hold until a special meeting at 6 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 25, in Carrizozo, and the roads in Sonterra will have to wait another six months for a vote on county acceptance of maintenance.

While commissioners agreed that Phillips and Tommy White of Ruidoso Paving had corrected every deficiency and complied with every recommendation by county road superintendent Albert Hernandez, they still were hesitant.

Commissioner Monroy Montes asked for a guard rail on steep San Mateo Road, repair of a "washboard" area on Picacho Road and further clearing of areas leading into culverts there. Phillips agreed.

But when Montes questioned whether road shoulders were chipping in places, White explained that the roads were one to two feet wider than the required 24 feet of driving surface, in addition to the shoulder areas, to allow for some deterioration that occurs with a chip seal road. Chip seal is a less expensive surface than asphalt—a mixture of rock and an oil applied in layers.

"As you know, it's been my recommendation and now the county has adopted a triple (layer) chip seal," White said. "We've been going on the assumption that a double seal would last two years without repair and I'm not sure that's true. I expect to have to do some repair."

Commissioner Wilton Howell pushed for a six-month extension of the wear period so that Hernandez could examine patched areas after the winter

to determine if they held up.

E.J. Fouratt, Captain, urged commissioners to hire an engineer from out of the area who could render an independent opinion on road design in subdivisions and on road construction.

"We need an engineer to look at these before they are approved," he said, recalling a time when he served on the county planning and zoning board and an engineer was used. "This comes up in nearly every large subdivision. If you had a competent engineer, you wouldn't be here trying to negotiate (with a developer)."

Commissioner Chairman L. Ray Nunley voted against Howell's motion for the six-month extension, saying Ranches has more than complied with regulations, yet commissioners are constantly delaying approvals. Commissioner William Schwettmann left the room for the vote, because he was an engineer on the project.

Howell said his job as commissioner is to protect the public. "I think six months is reasonable," he said.

White suggested that in the future, commissioners convey their concerns to Hernandez so that they can be considered before coming to a meeting for a vote.

"We assumed Albert Hernandez was speaking for the county," White said. "We assumed when we completed his list, we were in total compliance."

Commissioners agreed he had a good point. Montes added that Ranches has done everything asked by the commission, which has been harder on the development because of its impact.

"They stepped up to the line while others have tried to circumvent the process," Montes said.

Approval of the 15-lot Los Chozas subdivision was delayed by a unanimous vote in part to give District Attorney Scot Key time to determine whether any laws have been broken by the developer in accepting seven contracts for sale before receiving commission approval.

At the last meeting on Los Chozas, commissioners asked Green to make all roads in the development of five-acre tracts private, to remove references to

being able to subdivide the lots further and to include a warning that any attempt to subdivide would fall under county subdivision requirements and commission review. A reference also was included in the disclosure statement that no water rights come with the property, but can be purchased.

Howell questioned construction standards and the sizes of culverts to be used with a low-water crossing that cuts across the Bonito River at a point where the banks are 20-feet high or more.

James Sanchez and David Stevens of the Lincoln area voiced concerns about the impact of the subdivision on downstream land owners because of septic tanks and domestic wells being drilled.

Jim Collins, whose firm surveyed and designed the development, said a 100-foot buffer zone in the land covenants prohibits any septic tanks from being close to the river. But land covenants are only enforceable by neighboring land owners willing to go to court, one person noted.

Montes wanted water users above and below the development, who have rights to water from an irrigation ditch that also crosses the subdivision, to sign off as approving the development. Green and his attorney pointed out that's not required by county law.

The big stumbling point seemed to be the possibility some lots were sold in advance of county approval. Green contended seven sales are contingent on county approval and haven't been closed. County Attorney Alan Morel said he sent the information to Key for a determination and was told an investigation has been started.

County planner Patsy Sanchez noted information submitted to her by Green that the subdivision appeared to be in substantial compliance on July 27. Morel said the commission must vote on the subdivision within 30 days of that date.


Green's attorney reminded commissioners that the county's legal remedy for an "illegal" subdivision is to comply with the subdivision law, which is what Green has done anyway in asking for approval of the development.



As the summer comes to a close

The sun gives the rain a rest

This is being sent to you one half hour after mid day on Aug. 16, with the bright sun shining down upon a mountain world turning greener still before your eyes after three and a half days of sunshine following heavy rains, which have fallen at just the right time of year.

Out at the yard gate it is a relatively cool 82 degrees and yet out in the sun it seems stinging hot.

The Ripening Rays

The reason it feels hotter than it really is, is that what we call "the ripening rays" are well underway.

The sun has begun to travel lower, closer to the horizon, on its daily journey through the sky.

There the sun strikes slant-wise, at an angle, causing us to feel its heat; and bringing color to the apples on the orchard trees.

The Apple Pictures

Appricots, berries and peaches have had their day earlier, and soon it will be the turn of the apple, crown jewel of the Lincoln County orchards.

Word comes from San Patricio that the apple crop in the Ruidoso-Hondo Valley is especially good this year.

The Ruidoso River runs from Mount Sierra Blanca to what used to be the village of Hondo, where it is joined by the Bonito River to from the Hondo, Spanish for "Deep."

Therefore the stream that runs from Ruidoso through Roswell, and joins the Pecos, is known as the Ruidoso-Hondo River.

To get back to the apples, let us go over the main varieties in the Lincoln County orchards. Double Red Delicious, a favorite for eating out of the hand and for salads; the Golden Delicious, an all-purpose favorite, especially for pies and cobbler; several kinds of winesap, a late ripening variety, and a great keeper through the winter; the Rome Beauty, especially good for baking; and a long-time national favorite, the Jonathan.

Other long-time favorites such as Black Twigg, and Shenango and Arkansas Black are to be found scattered out in the Lincoln County orchards.

An early fall?

It has often seemed that following a rainy summer we have an early fall, since the process of ripening is speeded up.

In just the week following the full moon, on the 8th of August, the New Mexico grama grass and the viney mesquite have already headed out. And several of the other favorite grasses are coming into ripeness.

Whether early or late, the fall in several ways, is our "Golden Time" leading into the year's high point in our Mountain Land: Indian Summer.

But let us not jump ahead but rather enjoy each day and be thankful to our Lord for the great abundance of our blessing.

Run for the BEACH gets its second wind

The four-women team behind the local non-profit organization plan year-round for the 5-kilometer run and three other events that pay for free mammograms.

Last year's naysayers were wrong and Cathy Krugjohann and her friends are ecstatic about it.

"You know what they told me last year ... they said we would be lucky if we got 50 (participants)," said Krugjohann, one of the four women behind Run for the BEACH.

"They didn't believe us last year. We had to prove it."

Run for the BEACH — an acronym for Breast Cancer Education, Awareness, Cure and Hope — had about 175 people turned out for last September's 5-kilometer run. The silent auction also did very well as did the gala, the golf tournaments and a college course about the Internet, they said.

In all, the organization netted almost \$8,000 last year, said Becky Watson, one of the four volunteer coordinators. The money is used to provide free mammograms to Lincoln County residents — more than 100 so far, Watson said.

Lincoln County Medical Center and Dr. Donald Wolfel, a radiologist with the hospital,

offer the mammograms to the organization at a reduced cost.

"The goal of Run for the BEACH is to remove any financial obstacle that may keep a person, including a man, from having the screening done in a timely manner, say Krugjohann, Watson and their two partners, Trudy Alexander and Barbara Crane.

"You don't have to be in poverty to get qualified. Anybody can do it," Crane said. "Because we could do this a lot of people's minds were put at ease." Now, with the second 5-kilometer run a little more than a month away on Sept. 26, the four women have increased the number of their organizational meetings from about two or three times a month to weekly.

Expectations for this year's run are high. Though it doesn't raise the most money for the organization (the silent auction and golf tournaments both produce more), this is the organization's biggest event of the year, Krugjohann said.

"And we would like between 300 and 400 (participants) this year," Krugjohann said.

The foursome has made quick work of the learning curve regarding both the marketing and logistics involved with the run.

Registration forms for the event have been available for months, T-shirts have been designed and printed, and jew-

elry pins for the winners have been crafted.

A web site created by Dave Schultz promotes the run and links it to Ruidoso's web site. All the necessary permits are acquired or in the process of being acquired. Donated refreshments are lined up. A slide touting the 5-kilometer run is being shown at the Sierra Cinema. A bank challenge is being set up by Megan Stephens at First National Bank of Ruidoso. And so on.

"We've even got port-a-potties this year," Krugjohann said.

"Actually, I think we are ahead of schedule," Alexander said of the preparations. "We have had really good community support — and not just from the walkers and runners."

Registration forms for the race through downtown Ruidoso are already coming back, Krugjohann said. The forms will be printed in the Labor Day issue of the Ruidoso News and also are in the Summer Visitors Guide.

Forms also may be picked up at several locations, including the Village Buttery, Ruidoso Village Hall, Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and Alexander Mortgage.

The women also are willing to mail forms to people requesting them.

One aspect of the race they want to emphasize this year is

that walkers are welcome, as much as runners.

"Last year, we didn't advertise the walking part of it enough and there weren't that many walkers," Alexander said.

This year's race will honor one of last year's walking partic-

Community Education offers a dance class you can 'count' on

Carol Ann Clark used to be jittery about dancing. Now she teaches the jitterbug and other social dances.

A dance teacher for more than 20 years, Clark has been teaching noncredit classes for the Community Education Program of the Ruidoso Instructional Center of Eastern New Mexico University since last spring.

"I was one of those people that never had danced, and I was scared to death of social situations where there was dancing," she said. "My husband was climbing the career ladder and we were at

least twice a year at a company function where I was expected to be able to dance and I didn't know how."

What did she do? She went to Fred Astaire's in Houston in "self-defense" and took a beginning social program. Then she realized there was a lot more to it than she'd thought—and it was a lot more fun. One or two parties a year wasn't enough, so she went into teacher training to keep on dancing.

Since then Clark has taught at Fred Astaire's, the University of Houston, in her own studio, and, last spring and this summer, through the Community Education Program of the Ruidoso Instructional Center of Eastern New Mexico University.

She teaches all the variations of "swing," which she said is an umbrella term for the jitterbug, East Coast swing, the hustle, the shag, the whip, the push, the Western swing.

Clark said most of them are regional, but the East Coast swing originated in New York and is the parent of the rest. It's versatile and popular because it can be danced fast or slow and it can be done on a small floor.

The jitterbug evolved out of the Lindy hop, a dance of the late 1920s and early '30s named after Lindbergh's transatlantic flight. The '30s

and '40s brought faster music and "someone saw the kids doing this 'new dance' and said it looked like jitterbugs," Clark said.

She'll be teaching jitterbug for the first time this fall at ENMU, but already more than a dozen people have enrolled. Luckily, there's no limit to the number of students because classes are in

the large cafeteria-activities room-auditorium of Nob Hill Elementary.

Children as young as four or five, teenagers, whole families, and older people all learn the dances together in one class; Clark's method makes age and physical condition irrelevant.

"You don't start out being able to do it expertly," she

said. "I show you one step at a time, exactly how to do that, and when everybody is doing that, then we do it to the music, and then to a little faster music ... and we add some basic turns, some other movements. Young people can do that and old people can do that."

Which dance would be best for getting in shape or for los-

ing weight? She said it depends more on what each person puts into it.

The waltz can be more strenuous exercise than the jitterbug if the waltzer is exerting more energy and the jitterbugger is holding back. That's why her classes are suitable for any age and physical condition.

"I just like teaching dance. I know that it makes a difference in people's lives. I know that no matter what your age is, if you've never danced before you don't know how much fun it is and how easy it is to do. And once you've started in a class, your self esteem is better and your confidence is better."

What if you have two left feet? "That's what everybody says, that's how everybody feels."

What about rhythmically challenged people? "If you can count, you can dance. You can count to two and step on two."

ENMU-Ruidoso offers law school for everyone

The Advanced People's Law School at Eastern New Mexico University isn't just sufficient for senior citizen law, although people up to age 85 may enroll—as well as people as young as 12.

It's the advanced version of the People's Law School, which is offered every spring in Ruidoso.

Listed as Criminal Justice 268, the Advanced People's Law School is a series of lectures on legal topics given by local members of the Lincoln County Bar Association. It meets eight Thursdays from 7 to 9 p.m. in Room C203 of Ruidoso High School, beginning Sept. 8 and ending Oct. 22. This is the first time the advanced version has been offered.

"Some of the subjects are of very current interest to a lot of people in our region," said James Miller, director of the

Ruidoso Instructional Center of ENMU. "This is a course to get to know the subject and then to get to know some of the attorneys and judges with whom people will deal, so they get to know personalities and topics at the same time."

Miller said there is no required readings and no tests; just come, listen and ask questions of the attorneys and judges. Then after the eight sessions are over, those who've attended them all will receive a Law School Diploma from the People's Law School and, if registered, one hour of college credit.

"They've been rather popular, and it's because they want to see various attorneys they know because in the beginning class we have attorneys like Gary Mitchell, Judge Parsons and Judge (Gerald) Dean (Jr.) ... Don Dutton and others that are popular local Bar Association members," Miller said.

Find out how the court system works in the first session with Judges Karen L. Parsons

and Gerald Dean, Jr. Juvenile law, probation and parole are topics of the second session with attorney Beatrice Brickhouse, and juvenile parole and probation officers Jane Paxnell and Sandra Medina-Baca.

Attorney Charles E. Hawthorne will discuss personal injury law on Sept. 17, and domestic violence, abuse and neglect will be the topic the following week, with Domestic Violence Commissioner Darrell N. Brantley and Rebecca Liggett, an attorney with the Children, Youth and Families Department.

Adoptions and guardianship will be attorney Pamela Beckman Dobbs' topic Oct. 1, and bankruptcy will be Richard A. Hawthorne's the following week. District Attorney's Office Investigator Leandro Vega will discuss criminal investigations on Oct. 15, and pleadings and legal forms is the topic of the last class on Oct. 22 with attorney Richard J. Valle and trial court administrative assistant Clydene

Hull. Commencement exercises will be at 9 p.m. that day.

The fee is \$20 for all sessions. To enroll, contact the Ruidoso Instructional Center of ENMU at 257-2120, 709 Mechem Drive, Ruidoso, N.M. 88345.

The payload collected flight data and stored it in its memory. Upon recovery, the teams linked the payloads to a computer and downloaded the data for analysis.

Stephen Horan, professor of electrical engineering at NMSU, developed the curriculum and the payload design for the institute.

The Disaster Report: Remember to look out for your pets

This is the twelfth installment in an ongoing educational column to help inform residents how they can be prepared in case disaster strikes.

Our pets enrich our lives in more ways than we can count. In turn, they depend on us for their safety and well-being. Here's how you can be prepared to protect your pets when disaster strikes.

The best way to protect your family from the effects of a disaster is to have a disaster plan. If you are a pet owner, that plan must include your pets. Being prepared can save their lives.

Different disasters require different responses. But whether the disaster is a hurricane or a hazardous spill, you may have to evacuate your

home. In the event of a disaster, if you must evacuate, the most important thing you can do to protect your pets is to evacuate them, too. Leaving pets behind, even if you try to create a safe place for them, is likely to result in their being injured, lost or worse. So prepare now for the day when you and your pets may have to leave your home.

Red Cross disaster shelters cannot accept pets because of states' health and safety regulations and other considerations. Service animals that assist people with disabilities are the only animals allowed in Red Cross shelters. It may be difficult, if not impossible, to find shelter for your animals in the midst of a disaster, so plan ahead. Do not wait until disaster strikes to do your research.

Contact hotels and motels outside your immediate area to check policies on accepting pets and restrictions on number, size and species. Ask if "no-pet" policies could be waived in an emergency. Keep a list of "pet friendly" places, including phone numbers, with other disaster information and supplies. If you have notice of impending disaster, call ahead for reservations.

Ask friends, relatives, or others outside the affected area whether they could shelter your animals. If you have more than one pet, they may be more comfortable if kept together, but be prepared to house them separately.

Prepare a list of boarding facilities and veterinarians who could shelter animals in an

emergency; include 24-hour phone numbers.

Ask local animal shelters if they provide emergency or foster care for pets in a disaster. Animal shelters may be overburdened caring for the animals they already have as well as those displaced by a disaster, so this should be your last resort.

You should also assemble essential supplies for your pet such as sturdy leashes, harnesses and carriers to transport pets safely and ensure that your animals can't escape. Current photos of your pets in case they get lost, and food, potable water, bowls, cat litter/pan, and can opener.

Transport cats in carriers. Don't leave animals unattended anywhere they can run off. The most trust-worthy pets may panic, hide, try to escape, or

even bite or scratch. And, when you return home, give your pets time to settle back into their routines.

This ongoing column also includes a Disaster Supplies Calendar, which is intended to help prepare for disasters before

they happen. Using the calendar, people can assemble a disaster supplies kit in small steps over a five-month period. Remember to change and replace perishable supplies (such as food and water) every six months.

Deadline for area artists' directory draws near

The deadline to be included in the Lincoln County Arts Council's official directory of writers, artists and people in related creative fields is Aug. 31.

Compiler Virginia Jones said this is a book that will be available in the county for several years before being updated. It is hoped the book will become the central reference for people interested in the creative arts.

"Anyone living within close proximity to the Hondo Valley, Lincoln County, New Mexico is aware that Henriette Wyeth and Peter Hurd, two of American's premier artists, made their home on the Sentinel Ranch in San Patricio," Jones said. "While this area has long been noted for a distinct regional identity, those involved in the arts have never been brought together in a single volume."

The directory will present one-page profiles of those associated with the arts in the county,

but will have a far greater distribution than within its borders, she said.

"Art magazines and newspaper editors, arts organizations, museums, libraries, lodging businesses, restaurants, chambers of commerce and tourism offices both statewide and nationally, will receive copies," she said. "The book will be handsomely designed and printed in black and white."

A minimum of 100 participants in the directory profile pages will defray only a portion of the cost of printing and distribution, she said. An initial printing of 3,500 books is anticipated. A \$5,000 grant from the R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard Foundation will help, but donations and commercial advertisements are needed from individuals, businesses and civic groups to cover the total estimated cost of \$15,000, Jones said.

People working on the project are not paid.

"It takes the entire community to sustain the arts," Jones said.

To date, less than one third of the arts community has furnished information for the directory.

"If we expect patrons for our work, we must also be patrons," Jones said.

To be included, submit a color slide, which can be of an artist's work or the person; a narrative profile of the professional career and a \$60 check or money order payable to the Lincoln County Arts Council. Museum staff, directors of arts organizations and gallery owners are urged to participate. Galleries may include a list of artists represented.

the opponents' cards are divided has a great deal to do with how well declarer fares in a given hand. Consider this deal where South distinguished himself in the play and brought home a well-deserved slam.

South made a good decision when he overcalled East's four club bid with six diamonds. It was not what could be characterized as a scientific bid — South had no way of knowing whether he would make six diamonds, seven diamonds, or go down one — but it seemed to him, on balance, that six diamonds was a good shot.

West led the four of clubs, obviously a singleton. South won with the ace, cashed the A-K of diamonds, and exited with the three of diamonds!

West was pleasantly surprised to win a trump trick with the jack, but his joy was short-lived. It didn't matter what West played next, a heart

return would give declarer two discards on the A-K of hearts; a spade return would give declarer access to dummy and produce the same result.

So South made six diamonds because he was clever enough to lose a trump trick that he didn't have to lose. He would have gone down one, assuming correct defense, had he not played the hand the way he did.

The unusual, low trump play was sure to succeed. Declarer realized that West would be forced to lead a spade or a heart after winning the trump trick, because West could not have another club. In effect, East's opening four club bid boomeranged, not so much because it made the slam easy to bid, but because it pointed the way to the winning line of play.

POOP SCOOP

The image of a big burly unshaven man in white cap and overalls charging out of a truck and chasing down the street after a sweet scared dog should have been dispelled long ago in Ruidoso.

Our local animal control officer is Peggy Williams, an attractive and vivacious woman, who has compassion for the animals she picks up, yet is tough enough to do the job.

She's at the forefront of the effort in New Mexico to humanize the image of impounding officers, encourage more interaction with the media and more positive public relations.

That position is being encouraged nationally, according to Animal Sheltering magazine's July/August issue.

"By professionalizing the look of their uniforms, softening the appearance of their vehicles and most importantly, making positive adjustments to the way they approach people, many field staff have altered the public mind set," the writer of an article in the magazine states. "After all, who would you rather have approach you about curbing your dog or vaccinating your cat - an armed officer in full military garb with reflective

sunglasses and a book full of tickets in hand, or a field staffer in professional, yet friendly attire, with a pile of educational brochures and a genuine willingness to help?"

Field personnel in Lubbock, Texas, show their commitment to improving the lives of animals and people by education whenever possible, says Nancy Hickman, manager of the Animal Services/Animal Rescue Kennels.

"They carry equipment with them to help people with their pets, the magazine writer stated. They'll repair broken fences to keep dogs safely confined and will distribute collars to owners whose pets are running loose.

"My philosophy is public service," Hickman says. "When we do (encounter) neglect, or what we perceive as someone not taking care of an animal, we educate and help them change rather than removing the animal. That would be our last resort."

In Toronto, field staff started eight years ago riding through city parks and rewarding responsible pet owners with commendation certificates and issuing friendly warnings to those who failed to clean up after their animals or allowed them to run free outside of off-leash areas.

Face-to-face conversations, getting to know pet owners and talking to them when their dogs aren't in trouble also helps.



Fox hopes viewers catch *Holding the Baby* after football

The first new Fox show of the fall TV season is a groundbreaking one for the network.

As Fox Entertainment Group President Peter Roth puts it, *Holding the Baby*, premiering Sunday, Aug. 23, "introduces a single dad into the Fox mix."

That's right: family values and diaper jokes. Could the network of the Gen-X male be ready to settle down?

Jon Patrick Walker stars as Gordon Süles, a young advertising exec whose wife leaves him, uh, holding the baby. Up to his neck at home and work, he hires a beautiful graduate student (Jennifer Westfeldt) as part-time nanny.

Series creator Howard J. Morris (*Home Improvement*) says his latest effort is about taking responsibility and growing up. "I tend to write about guys who need to be redeemed," he explains.

Responsibility and redemption have not been hallmarks of the network that gave the world Al Bundy, Martin Payne and Homey the Clown. As for any hopes of a steamy relationship between the newly jilted husband and the nanny,

"What we really want them to be is great friends," Morris says. After a long afternoon of football, is that what Fox's viewers want to see?

There is also the downer of a premise: a mother abandoning her 6-month-old. Gordon will deal with his emotional trauma in the third episode, Morris says. But after that, "the show is about the people left behind."

That would include Gordon's bachelor brother Jimmy (Eddie McClintock), who provides the show with a studly point of view. Other regulars are Emmy winner Ron Leibman as Gordon's workaholic boss and Sherri Shepherd as a brassy secretary; they can (and do) run rings around colorless schllep Gordon.

As Kelly the nanny, Westfeldt, who glowed last spring as girlfriend Melissa in *Two Guys, a Girl and a Pizza Place*, hasn't burned any bridges. "I'm not sure if I'll go back there (to *Two Guys*) or not," the actress demurs.

Asked if the show will change its name if it lasts a few years and the baby grows up, Morris says he thinks not. Surely he knows the title is the least of his problems.

IRA men and their families are put *Before Your Eyes*

Before Your Eyes: Don't Take My Daddy, the fifth in the series of award-winning *Before Your Eyes* CBS news specials, presents the stories of three American women who face the difficult choice of raising their children alone in America or leaving their homes and relatives to be with their husbands. The special airs Monday, Aug. 24.

The women are married to Catholics from Northern Ireland — one a convicted murderer — whom the American government is trying to deport for their Irish Republican Army activities. The contrast between the lives of the men on the two continents is striking and immediate.

The three women "would not live happily ever after," says narrator Roma Downey (*Touched by an Angel*).

Little Matt Morrison, a 9-year-old picture of all-American boyhood, looks at the camera and explains solemnly that his father, also named Matt, "tried to shoot a Brit, but he missed."

The elder Matt Morrison spent 10 years in Irish prisons after being arrested for attempted murder. He now lives in St. Louis with his wife, Fran-
cie, and two children.

His compatriots are Noel Gaynor, who spent 14 years in prison for killing a British police officer in an IRA ambush, and Gabe Megahey, who was caught trying to ship weapons to Northern Ireland from New York. He spent four years in a U.S. federal prison.

Each family tells its story, mostly through the eyes of the wives, of the pain and frustration they feel at what they see as the government's betrayal.

Each wife believes her husband has paid his debt to society and deserves to live a full life with his family. The men believe they did nothing wrong in lashing out in a society they considered to be at war. The Royal British Constabulary in Northern Ireland was a legitimate enemy in their eyes.

"If someone wants to treat you as a second-class citizen, you have the right to resist," Megahey says with conviction. But the camera also zooms in on the faces of the widow of the policeman Gaynor's group killed, and the immigration official who is convinced the deportation law against terrorists is valid and must be upheld.

Nothing the wives do changes the men's fate; that's up to Gerry Adams, the leader of Sinn Fein, the IRA's political wing.


Adams negotiated a political deal for a peace agreement that included no deportations; however, the fate of the three families is left hanging.

Although the camera records the joy and disbelief they experience when the historic Irish peace accord is signed, elation turns to confusion as the families learn they remain in "legal limbo." They are allowed to stay in the United States for now, but their "files remain open," according to the immigration official.

"Given how the story changed over time and the geopolitical cast it gained at the end, I couldn't speculate what happens next," says Mary Murphy, executive producer of the program.

"Our goal was to tell a really good story, and a story about how you define justice," Murphy says. "The goal of *Before Your Eyes* has always been to take deeply felt personal chronicles and show how they interact with larger issues."

"It's hot and heavy, and it's going to go on through the year," Cooper says. "After being on the show for 24 1/2 years, I had forgotten what it was like to really buckle down and work on something like this."

As tough as her new schedule may be, Cooper is happy the writers are giving fans what they want.


"The audience truly loves for them (Jill and Katherine) to be at odds," she says. "Everyone likes to predict who is going to come out the winner."
