## County drops DWI program off to village

*In a split vote, Lincoln County Commissioners terminated their contract to provide a DWI program for Lincoln County.*

Rick Koepfel and Johnny Montes are out of work today.

Following an hour-long heated debate peppered with insults, Lincoln County Commissioners Tuesday voted 3-2 to terminate the county's DWI program at noon today, effectively ending Koepfel's and Montes' positions as coordinators of the program.

By dropping the \$117,000 contract, the county opens the door for the program to be picked up and operated by the village of

Ruidoso for all of Lincoln County.

"If we have a program that has stopped functioning for whatever reason, whether it be personalities or whatever reason, then it's incumbent upon us to fix it. And that's what we are trying to do," County Commission Chair L. Ray Nunley said Tuesday, explaining his tie-breaking vote to terminate the contract for the DWI program. "Sometimes you make mistakes but I think we are right this time."

Joining Nunley in his opinion were commissioners Rex Wilson and William Schwettmann. Voting against termination of the contract were commissioners Monroy Montes and Wilton Howell.

An earlier motion by Howell to keep the program for a test period of 30 days was seconded by Montes but failed in a vote of 2-3, this

time with Howell and Montes for and Wilson, Schwettmann and Nunley against.

Nunley put the issue on the commission's Tuesday agenda, he said, because no clients were being referred to the program and it was not being used. Ruidoso Magistrate Judge William Butts, who said he handles 75 to 80 percent of the DWI cases in Lincoln County, stopped referring people with DWI convictions to the program about a month ago.

The reason, Butts said, is because Koepfel and Johnny Montes, the brother of Commissioner Montes, are unqualified for the positions. Koepfel, a former state legislator, had been a jockey agent at the racetrack, and Johnny Montes worked previously in landscaping, Butts said. Several times during the discussion Butts also brought up the issue of

nepotism in the hiring of the two men.

Koepfel was hired earlier this summer by acting county manager Martha Guevara at the recommendation of a selection committee. Koepfel, in turn, hired Johnny Montes as his supervising officer.

Montes has previously denied the allegation of nepotism and said Butts' refusal to work with the program is based on a personal problem with him.

Howell echoed Montes' statements when telling the commission the reason for his vote. At the request of Montes, all the commissioners explained their votes.

Butts, who spoke during the commissioner's discussion Tuesday and on occasion traded

## Citizens board gets support

*Though a recent lawsuit against the Downs Police Department served as the impetus behind a citizens advisory board, the complaint is without merit, a village attorney said.*

Downs Trustee Judy Miller said she didn't feel threatened by the idea of a citizens advisory board, and on Monday endorsed a proposal to create such a board.

"They might see something we don't see out in the community," Miller said of the proposed board of volunteers to review village operations.

Other village trustees as well as Mayor Joe Hayhurst echoed Miller's endorsement of the proposal presented by Bonnie Richardson. Trustee Margie Morales said she liked the proposal because village employees may feel more comfortable bringing grievances before a citizen board rather than to their supervisors.

Richardson, co-owner of Ruidoso Wholesales and a former council candidate, told village trustees her proposal was prompted in part by the number of lawsuits recently filed against the village.

"We need another kind of publicity in Ruidoso Downs," Richardson said. "The rest of the state knows we are here, but not for a good reason."

Besides three lawsuits filed against the Ruidoso Downs Police Department and another pending, Hayhurst has a lawsuit against the council, saying trustees did not follow personnel policy when firing an administrative assistant this spring.

Village Attorney Dan Bryant cautioned trustees that many questions would need to be resolved before a review board is created.

"One of the most important areas to deal with is what is the purpose of this board, what are they going to do, what are we going to have them look at?" Bryant said. "What will trigger the jurisdiction that we give them?"

## Fifteen apply for manager's position

Three county residents among applicants, but names withheld

Three local names are among 15 applicants for Lincoln County's top administrator, Martha Guevara, acting county manager, said Tuesday.

Applications for the position of Lincoln County manager have come from as close as Cloudcroft, Capitan and San Patricio and as far as Virginia, said Guevara.

Monday was the last day to apply for the position, left vacant in April when Lincoln County Commissioners in a split vote ousted then-County Manager Frank Potter. Commissioners at the time cited unspecified inefficiencies for the action.

The county advertised the position's opening a month ago in state newspapers, Guevara said. The ads netted four applications from Texas, nine from New Mexico, one from California and another from Alexandria, Va., Guevara said.

The applicants' names do not become public record until the commission narrows the field and begins interviewing applicants.

In a closed meeting Tuesday, Lincoln County Commissioners were to review the applicants for the first time, according to Guevara. She said the commission during the meeting may create a committee for the selection process.

County commissioners waited until late July before advertising the position so Guevara could consider taking the position herself, she said. Guevara, whose usual title is assistant county manager, has stepped in as manager five times since becoming a county employee in 1979.

Guevara became acting county manager when three other managers were fired — Suzanne Cox, Nick Pappas and Andy Wyman — and when Carolin Cooney resigned.

Though she feels confident with her ability to complete the duties of county manager, Guevara said Tuesday she decided against accepting the promotion.

"I have six years to retire and I want to retire from the county," she said. "As far as the work, I do it now. I've always done it ... But I would rather have a boss I can go to if I have a problem."

## Capitan community rallies in support Smokey Bear Park closure plan draws fire

*A state official's proposal last week to close the park and burial site of Smokey Bear has resulted in a flurry of community support.*

State forestry officials have been showered this week with letters of support for the Smokey Bear Historical Park in Capitan.

Last week, State Forester Toby Martinez reportedly said the park could be shut down if funding and community support is not found to turn the 2-acre park into the showcase it should be, a local forestry official said.

In response, Capitan residents and fans of the 20-year-old park have written about 300 letters proclaiming their support of the park and its significance to the village as well as to the area's tourism industry, said Barbara Luna, with the Capitan District of the State Forestry Division.

In addition, about 50 people attended the Capitan Village Council meeting Monday night to voice objec-

tions to the park's closure, said Capitan Mayor Norm Renfro.

"Actually, that would be a worst-case scenario," Luna said of the proposed closure, which is no longer a possibility in light of community support, she added.

Martinez made his announcement during a program review of the park, which is the only park operated by the State Forestry Division. It was transferred to the forestry division from the New Mexico Parks and Recreation Division several years ago because of its significance to forest fire safety, Luna said.

Smokey Bear was buried at park in 1976. The park itself was completed in 1979, Luna said. The park and its center is a tourism attraction for Lincoln County, with an estimated 30,000 to 35,000 people touring it every year, Renfro said.

However, "Since we have had the park, we have had a lack of funding for the upgrades and improvements that we would like to make," Luna said.

"What we are trying to do is gather community support."

More money is needed to make the park and its accompanying museum into the showcase it should be, Luna said. Currently, the park's budget of \$113,000 is enough to pay for three employees and utility costs. About \$2,300 is left for maintenance, Luna said.

The division intends to ask the state for an initial funding request of \$250,000 which would allow for an engineering proposal on how to turn the park into a showcase. The initial funding also would allow for some upgrades to exhibits at the park's center and improvements to a playground at the park, Luna said.

Other funding opportunities are being explored for future improvements, she added.

Renfro said state officials probably thought there was a lack of interest in the park because of poor turnout at meetings of the Friends of Smokey organization. But attendance is not always a good indicator of interest and support, he said Tuesday.





The Great Square, due east, is balanced on one of its corners, making it more of a diamond than a square. Bright Jupiter is rising earlier too; it's to the lower right of the Great Square. In late August it rises while twilight is still fading, and it's visible low in the east when darkness is complete.

# Baca volunteer charged with possession of marijuana

A Capitan woman who wrote press releases for congressional candidate Shirley Baca of Las Cruces has been arrested on charges that marijuana plants were found in her home.

Doris Cherry, a reporter for the Lincoln County News who also was under contract to write news releases for state Democrats during the legislative session, was arrested earlier this week on a misdemeanor charge of possession and a fourth-degree felony charge of contributing to the delinquency

of a minor. The misdemeanor possession charge represents allegedly having less than 8 ounces of marijuana.

Magistrate Judge William Butts has set a \$5,000 unsecured bond for Cherry, who said she was not held in jail following her arrest.

Cherry said Tuesday she has no comment regarding the charges. She has retained a local attorney to represent her in the case.

Frank Hooper, with the Lincoln County Narcotics Enforcement Unit, said agents found four marijuana plants

growing in Cherry's home during a search recently.

Live marijuana plants are typically valued at \$1,000 each by narcotic agents, Hooper said.

If found guilty on the misdemeanor possession charge, Cherry could serve as much as a year in prison and pay a fine of up to \$1,000.

If found guilty of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, Cherry could be sentenced to 18 months and/or fined \$5,000.

Baca, who is running against incumbent Republican Joe Skeen for the Second

Congressional District seat, said Cherry has been a volunteer for her campaign for the last three years.

"If the allegations prove to be true, it would be very unfortunate for her, for her and her family," Baca said.

The congressional candidate said she would never condone such behavior.

Baca said she recently stayed at Cherry's house while Cherry was at the opera in Santa Fe.

Baca also said Cherry has not written any campaign releases for her within the last six weeks.

insults with Commissioner Montes, told commissioners the DWI program was too important to be operated by people without any experience in court issues or DWI laws.

Another candidate, an Alamogordo man, did have the appropriate experience for the position and had been endorsed by a local prosecutor but was not selected, Butts said.

Montes said the Alamogordo candidate was unwilling to relocate from Otero to Lincoln County. Montes said he and others thought local officials and

county administrators should have access to the DWI coordinator

Howell gave several reasons why he was fighting so hard to keep the program in the county.

Emotionally, he told the commission about growing up as the son of an alcoholic

father. Later, both his father and a brother died from alcohol-related deaths, and another brother was killed by a drunk driver, Howell said.

Another reason he supported Koepfel is because Koepfel was the only job applicant to say he would push to bring alcohol awareness programs to county schools, Howell said.

Wilson and Schwettmann said they were for terminating the program because it wasn't effective.

Wilson also said the county had failed to manage the program last year, when funding ran out with two or three months left of the budget year.

"There are problems with

our management in the county," Wilson said.

"It isn't a management problem, Mister Wilson," Howell responded during his explanation. "It's a personality problem ... Mister Koepfel, welcome to Lincoln County. You didn't get much experience as a DWI coordinator but you got a taste of local politics, didn't you?"

Montes, saying if the county can't manage one grant program, then it couldn't handle others as well, asked that the county's contracts to manage both the Drug Task Force and senior programs be put on the commission's next agenda for consideration.

# BOARD: The review board would make village government more accessible

Trustees asked Bryant to research how advisory boards operate in other cities. Bryant agreed, but again cautioned trustees that they may be swamped in a "sea of paper" because of the number and variety of advisory boards now at work in American cities.

In Richardson's proposal the purpose of the review board would be to "provide efficiency, fairness, openness, accountability, harmony and accessibility between the areas of village government, law enforcement and fire protection."

She suggested that the village advertise for volunteers

to make up a board of five to seven people. Applicants would be screened to ensure they do not have ties that could lead to conflicts of interest.

Anyone interested in being a board member would fill out a card at village hall. The cards would be placed in a hopper and then randomly drawn to determine the board members, Richardson said.

The board, she said, would meet on a regular basis as well as when a special need arose. The meetings would be conducted in public and anyone would be able to attend and approach the board with a concern, she said.

"Hopefully, this will elimi-

nate some of the problems that we are having and promote efficiency in the government, both on a hiring level and on an operating level," Richardson told the council.

The police department's hiring practices came under fire in the most recent lawsuit filed against the village. In the lawsuit of Karen Denise Briggs, a former police dispatcher, she said supervisors told her women would never be hired as patrol officers over male applicants.

Bryant, who could not be reached earlier for comment about the lawsuit, on Tuesday said the village denies Briggs' allegations in the lawsuit, including statements that one

officer sexually harassed Briggs. He said the village had conducted a "full-blown" grievance procedure to address Briggs' complaints.

"That hearing officer found no harassment nor discrimination," Bryant said.

Briggs next filed a complaint with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. On April 28, the EEOC came back with a ruling of "no finding," which is not a certification that the village didn't violate Briggs' rights, only that the EEOC's investigation did not find any violations, according to the EEOC dismissal and notice of rights form.

# Good news: IRS sent county \$42,000. Bad news: it's going back.

Lincoln County commissioners are scratching their heads over the receipt of more than \$42,000 in refunds from the Internal Revenue Service.

But some research revealed the money must be sent back. "I still have no idea why (the checks were sent by the IRS)," said Commissioner Montroy Montes. "I think someone may have missed a deposit."

County Treasurer Joan Park notified commissioners of the situation in a letter dated Aug. 17, and also called their attention to a delay in her office receiving the checks from the county finance office.

Checks for \$1,495 and \$41,987.67 were received in the manager's office Aug. 7, but were not delivered to the treasurer's office until Aug. 14

to be deposited, she said.

"This is a clear violation of state statute and county policy regarding timely depositing of money received," Park wrote.

Being timely apparently also was a problem with the IRS. The federal agency deducted a \$181.54 penalty from the refund, because the county did-

n't deposit the correct amounts of tax on time.

Thursday, Park said she's tracking down why the county received the refund.

"I'm auditing the entire (payroll fund) for last year," she said. "Some reports were incorrect and resulted in the deposits (for IRS deductions) we make out of every pay period. Since the report didn't have the correct figures, the deposits were substantially over what the reports show, so the county

got notification we overpaid and this check followed."

"The county can't keep the money, she said.

"We will be sending it back, because in correcting the reports, we owe the money," Park said. "That's what I'm doing now. First we went through and audited the (payroll) reports to make sure where we stood on those and made corrections. Now I'm to the point of figuring out what we owe back.

"This is a situation that we've dealt with once before. It has some different twists, but I think it still goes back to some of the same problems that existed before."

Park was referring to a dispute a few years ago between the county finance office and the IRS that resulted in the county owing money and checks being sent from the county manager's office without commission knowledge to cover the debt and penalty.

**Cooperation soothes  
noisy waters**

Bridges over troubled waters make beautiful music, but as the water muddies up, the Environmental Protection Administration might get involved.

Look down at Ruidoso's primary river from the bridge at Mechem and Sudderth and note the roiling brown; lots of water, loaded with lots of silt. Take Main Road along the stream through Upper Canyon to the boundary of the Mescalero Apache Reservation. The Rio Ruidoso still is muddy. Sadly, it raises some questions about the new signs that have popped up at every crossing of the river this summer: "Rio Ruidoso, A cold water fishery."

Fish just can't survive in a silted stream. The mud wipes out oxygen; insects can't go through their cycle of life, and so there's nothing for the trout to feed on.

The Ruidoso River Association has been watching the river for sometime now, looking for solutions, pleading for cooperation between the community, the ski area and the U. S. Forest Service. That 600-plus member organization worked well with the village government in keeping the river flowing through a series of agreements minimizing water diversion.

The organization's focus now has shifted.

The muddy-waters problem took on new prominence last summer, when heavy rain washed out a major cut in the Apache Bowl at Ski Apache. That slumped into the Deep Freeze ski run, tearing up topsoil the length of the run, washing the silt downstream.

A parking lot, meanwhile, had been built on the site of the natural settling pond for sediment from the ski area. Holding ponds constructed by the ski area to contain water, and now making have become overloaded with sediment, and that has added to the downstream discharge during rains.

Ski Apache management has acknowledged a problem exists at the area, but insists that Upper Canyon and the rest of the village must share the blame. Maybe so, but the fact is that the South Fork of the Rio Ruidoso runs clear; the North Fork (running from the ski area) doesn't.

Perhaps it's time for the Forest Service and the Mescalero Apache government (which owns Ski Apache) to mount a concerted effort to repair the mountain that feeds the river. The Ruidoso River Association already has offered cooperation, and dollars, to help clean it up.

The Rio Ruidoso is our greatest resource, winter and summer. It hasn't met the state's water quality standards at least since the rains of '97.

If all else fails, perhaps the Environmental Protection Administration should step in, and start assessing fines.

**Reasons for maintaining the jail status quo**

Regarding the placement of the county jail, I would like to address several related issues which I have not heard mentioned in other presentations. These are:

- Infrastructural impacts
- Quality of life for residents and tourists in Ruidoso and Carrizozo.
- Commerce and total tax revenues for the county.
- Comparison to another resort town.

I request that you consider the total county—not simply our immediate neighborhood. I ask this because, according to my reasoning, the ramifications of the jail question are far-reaching and will produce a win-win or a lose-lose result for the whole county.

**Infrastructural impacts**

1. **Land.** Much of the attraction of Ruidoso is its lovely terrain. Because of its attractiveness, that land is capable of generating revenue. Likewise, because that land is a limited, non-renewable resource, its value is magnified. The employment of such a limited resource should be towards revenue generation.

When Ruidoso-area land is used for government buildings, that land is transformed from a profit center to a cost center. Not only does it cease to generate revenue, it becomes a burden.

Now, while it may be necessary to have government buildings, it seems prudent to locate them in a fashion which does not restrict the generation of that commerce upon which government...feeds.

Ruidoso's economy is largely based on tourism and a related resort community. I challenge the prudence of allocating land with such a high commerce and revenue-generating capacity to a non-revenue generating installation such as a large jail facility—especially in view of alternatives such as Carrizozo.

2. **Water.** As all New Mexico residents know, water is a precious resource. As most

Ruidoso residents are aware, water—both above and below ground—is often in short supply. And during the last drought, many residents of the Ruidoso area were forced to deepen their wells or drill new ones.

However, Carrizozo is part of a different water system—the Tularosa Basin. And even during the worst of the last drought, (the) State Engineer's test ... showed no changes in water level.

...I challenge the wisdom of removing water from the residents and tourists of Ruidoso to give it to prisoners, especially in view of alternatives such as Carrizozo.

Consider that a 100-man jail equates to about 30 families or a 50-unit motel. When the water runs low again, and you know it will, there will be no federal judge guaranteeing your family or the neighborhood restaurant has adequate water. But you know full well there will be a federal judge demanding that the jail prisoners get their hot showers.

3. **Power.** While Ruidoso has an abundance of lovely mountains and forests, Carrizozo has an abundance of sun. That sun can provide year-round hot water for free. Also, it can provide a substantial portion of a structure's heating requirement in winter.

4. **Road network.** Due largely to topographic features (mountains, hills, valleys and canyons), Ruidoso is aligned along N. M. Highway 48 (Mechem and Sudderth). While Gavilan Canyon, Hull, Paradise, Grindstone and Carrizo Creek Roads are important tributaries, at the present time travel through Ruidoso is constricted. In the area around Center Street, the congestion is arguably deadly.

These same topographic features will always channel the city's development. And while some roads may be widened, central Ruidoso will remain a choke point as long as its facade and focus remain the tourist trade.

In contrast to Carrizozo where government...is the

main business, for Ruidoso, whether a jail is placed off Grindstone or Airport Road, any Ruidoso locale, the addition of traffic related to jail business...contributes to congestion without contributing to revenue.

**Quality of life**

1. Water supply and traffic congestion are part of a larger issue: quality of life. It is the beauty and serenity of the Ruidoso area that draws affluent residents, wealthy retirees, and most of all the tourists who largely fund...the paychecks of Ruidoso citizens.

2. Will tourists continue to flock to Ruidoso if what awaits are water rationing and traffic jams? Can the ambience of central Ruidoso remain when a six- or eight-lane highway passes through? This extreme scenario is a projection which flows from the change in focus from quaint tourist village to multi-faceted metropolis.

3. All proper urban planning must revolve about the ultimate goals of a city. Does the new venture complement or contest with existing institutions?

In any contest for resources, does the new venture produce a higher or lower return on investment?

The question is: Why would Ruidoso desire to transform itself from a recreational site to a government center when the result is overall lowering of quality of life for all concerned?

**Commerce and total taxes**

1. Interwoven through all the previous discussion is money. The costs of land, utilities and structures for a jail are immediately apparent. But what of lost business revenue, property valuations and tax revenue. When the infrastructural strains on Ruidoso cause it to be less attractive to tourists, revenue will fall; the tax base will shrink.

2. If Carrizozo dies as a town, revenue will fall, the tax base will shrink. If these things happen, all of Lincoln County will lose!

**A comparison**

1. While it may not be immediately apparent (and they vary in scale), there are many similarities between Ruidoso and Waikiki-Honolulu. Both achieved economic greatness as resorts for tourists. Both have their growth restricted by limited usable land. However, Honolulu serves as both state capital and county seat. And it is in this conflict that Ruidoso can learn a ... lesson.

2. In the 1980s and 1990s, the severe congestion in Waikiki-Honolulu, on the southeast side of Oahu, forced the local government to buy land some 20 miles away... The purpose of this land is to house what they call "the second city," a collection of government offices moved from downtown Honolulu.

3. The current situation in Lincoln County duplicates the Hawaiian solution and thereby preempts the problem!

**Conclusions**

For authority for my conjectures, I refer to NMSA 4-34-1... that article speaks of jails four times...in every case the word "jail" is accompanied by the word "courthouse."

Thus, (I) followed the established pattern in our state law and include the obvious next step—relocating the courts, then all the county offices.

Let's not be naive, for that is what we're talking about, moving the county seat from Carrizozo to Ruidoso. And this is clearly a lose-lose proposition for both communities. On the other hand, the status quo only means more bail bondsmen and lawyers must drive a few miles (through some lovely country) to visit their clients.

Especially in view of Honolulu's lesson, I say we should be thankful that providence led us to the right arrangement, and we should not try to fix what ain't broke.

Leave the jail in Carrizozo. And I urge the citizens of Lincoln County to be suspect of the motives of those who advocate moving the jail from Carrizozo.

# The Disaster Report

WEEK 13

This is the 13th installment in an ongoing educational column to help inform residents how they can be prepared in case disaster strikes.

Chemicals are a natural and important part of our environment. Even though we often don't think about it, we use chemicals every day.

Chemicals help us keep our food fresh and our bodies clean. They help our plants to grow and fuel our cars. And chemicals make it possible for us to live longer, healthier lives.

Under certain conditions, chemicals can be poisonous or have a harmful effect on your health. Some chemicals that are safe, and even helpful in small amounts, can be harmful in larger quantities or under certain conditions.

A major chemical emergency is an accident that

releases a hazardous amount of a chemical into the environment.

Accidents can happen underground, on railroad tracks or highways and at manufacturing plants. These accidents sometimes result in a fire or explosion, but many times you can not see or smell anything unusual.

How you may be notified of a major chemical emergency

In the event of a major chemical emergency, you will be notified by the authorities. To get your attention, a siren could sound, you may be called by telephone, or emergency personnel may drive by and give instructions over a loud speaker. Officials could even come to your door.

### Shelter in Place

One of the basic instruc-

tions you may given in a chemical emergency is to shelter-in-place. This is a precaution aimed to keep you and your family safe while remaining in your home. If you are told to shelter-in-place, take your children and pets indoors immediately.

Close all windows in your home

Turn off all fans, heating and air conditioning systems

Close the fireplace damper

Go to an above-ground room (not the basement) with the fewest windows and doors.

Take your Family Disaster Supplies Kit with you

Wet some towels and jam them in the crack under the doors. Tape around doors, windows, exhaust fans or vents. Use the plastic garbage bags to cover windows, outlets and

heat registers.

If you are told there is danger of explosion, close the window shades, blinds or curtains and stay away from the windows.

Stay in the room and listen to your radio until you are told all is safe or you are told to evacuate.

This ongoing column also includes a Disaster Supplies Calendar, which is intended to help prepare for disasters before they happen.

Using the calendar, people can assemble a disaster supplies kit in small steps over a five-month period. Remember to change and replace perishable supplies (such as food and water) every six months.

The information in this column is provided by the American Red Cross.





## How to read between the lines of 'coachspeak'

**L**isten closely and you can hear plenty of reserved enthusiasm from Ruidoso football coach Les Carter.

It's early - the season begins Friday for Ruidoso and Capitan and in another week for Carrizozo, Mescalero and Corona - yet my ears can detect a healthy amount of high hopes and excitement.

Of course, a football coach can't gush forth a fountain of predictions for the 1998 grid campaign. To do so would be ludicrous - it might jinx any possibility of reaching the playoffs.

But on Tuesday, Carter had trouble finding something wrong with his War-

riors' scrimmage performance against Cobre in Bayard Saturday.

I asked Carter, "So, how did it go, Coach?"

"Our kids looked real good," Carter answered.

(Translation: The Warriors racked up nearly 400 yards in offense.)

OK, and ....

After a moment of hesitation, Carter added, "The competition wasn't real strong."

(Translation: Cobre managed only one first down the whole afternoon and that was because of a penalty.)

He qualified Ruidoso's performance as if doing so could hide this shy smile on his face.

It's OK to smile, coach. Your cup of talent runneth over.

The Warriors return nine starters to their offensive unit, including senior Corey Saenz (QB), junior Adrian Her-

rera (FB) and senior Brett Meyer (slot-back).

Saenz was in the top 10 in two categories last year in Class AAA ball for the state. He rushed for 871 yards (seventh) and passed for 1,322 (10th). Herrera, when not laying out defensive players with his blocks, rumbled for 502 yards on his own.

Saenz's favorite target in 1997 was receiver Josh Varnadore, who snagged 39 catches for 825 yards - the third-best in AAA. Saenz also has another familiar pair of hands to throw to in senior receiver Garvin Grant.

Defensively, the Warriors are solid, anchored by Meyer at linebacker and noseguard Jason Leadingham, who is a one-man defensive line. Three other starters return, as well as a number of players who saw playing time last year.

"So coach, what about your opener with (Santa Fe) Capital," I asked.

He replied, "We ought to be fine going into this game."

(Translation: No injuries - indeed, they ought to be fine (physically) going into the game.)

Finally, I pried more directly. "Are there any areas that really concern you?"

With an almost triumphant tone (he has finally thought of a "weakness"), Carter answers, "We always would like to have more depth."

(Translation: We only have two guys playing both offense and defense this year and more than two dozen seniors on the roster.)

Carter then brought the interview to a close.

"The kids are working real hard. Their attitudes are really good," he said.

(Translation: This team could be special, real special - just read between the lines.)

## The Casanova sails smoothly to Derby final

The Casanova was a smooth operator Friday at the Ruidoso Racetrack and Casino. William Dale's homebred earned honors as the fastest qualifier of six trials to the Sept. 6 All American Derby, which is worth \$258,808.

The gelded son of The Signature out of Ooh A Sensation covered the 440 yards in 21.57 seconds on track listed as good. The track condition changed to fast immediately after the first trial.

The Casanova overcame his typically bad break and left the gates just a head behind the leader, Streakin Jessie Gail. In mid-stretch he was running third and then, under urging by jockey Jacky Martin, exploded past runner-up Joanna Kate to win by a length.

"He is just a good colt. It took a long time for him to mature. It's starting to be fun for him. It was too much work for him as a 2-year-old," said trainer John Stinebaugh.

Dashin Is Easy, trained by Jack Brooks, was undefeated in six starts and the winner of three Grade-1 derbies up until the trials. He ran a disappointing fourth in the second trial.

Jockey G R Carter explained the loss. "Everything was rattling in the gate," Carter said. "He false broke about three times and it's hard for them to run down through there when they are dazed like that."

The 1998 All American Derby qualifiers and their qualifying times: The Casanova (21.575), Real Tacky Lady (21.630), Honor Ease (21.640), Memorize (21.650), Showcase Six (21.675), Deltas First Dash (21.715), Joanna Kate (21.715), Legacy Special (21.715), Te Amo Cigar (21.730) and Run-away Fortune (21.760).

**Jockey named a finalist for foundation's Sportswoman of the Year award**

Quarter horse jockey Tami Purcell is one of 10 finalists for the Women's Sports Foundation "1998 Sportswoman of the Year" award. The award, which was started in 1980, recognizes amateur and professional sportswomen whose performances over a 12-month period have been exceptional.

"I opened my mail on Tuesday (Aug. 18) and was elated to hear this news," Purcell said. "It's an honor to just be listed with such an elite group of women athletes."

Purcell, a resident of Ethel, La., accomplished a number of feats from Aug. 1, 1997 to July 31, 1998. Among them was:

- Becoming the first female jockey to win the All American Futurity, and;
- Becoming the all-time leading female jockey with 1,566 victories.

### Two fire stations OK'd for county

The State Fire Marshal has approved two of three projects proposed for county volunteer fire departments.

A substation at Ranches of Sonterra for the Bonito Fire Station received a nod with a recommendation that a new building be added to the site. The truck bay area is to be expanded.

A substation at White Oaks where volunteers have been aggressively pursuing improvements in fire protection for the past two years also was approved.

Approved was a request for a Class A pumper for the Home Valley Volunteer Fire Department, because the specifications were too vague. A major purchase questionnaire provided in the fire chief's handbook and required to be submitted for his review prior to approval was not received, the fire marshal said.

He asked the County Commission for the Home Valley Fire Chief, Modesto Chavez, fill out the form and submit it to his office. The request may be reconsidered at that time, if the language is corrected.

The commission has applied to the New Mexico Finance Authority for three low-interest loans to be repaid by the volunteer fire departments.

### VILLAGE BRIEFS

#### Planning & Zoning fee refunds considered

The Ruidoso Village Council recently postponed a decision about whether or not the Planning Department should refund various fees tied to construction if the projects don't gain approval.

Mayor Robert Donaldson said the idea of refunding fees to the applicants was initially discussed in council workshops for the 1998-99 budget. It was put on the Aug. 11 council agenda because of those discussions. However, he said recently, the issue needs to be studied by an advisory committee before a vote is taken.

"We really are in an order on this," Donaldson told the council last week. "It needs to go to Planning and Zoning (Commission) first."

A public hearing last week on the issue was continued to the council's Nov. 10 meeting. About 90 days will be needed for the issue to go through a council subcommittee, from there to the planning and zoning board and then back to the council, Cleatus Richards, planning director, told the council.

On Tuesday, the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission appointed member Leroy Nowell to join the council subcommittee.

Glen Barrow, commission chair, earlier had raised concerns about the proposal to refund planning fees, such as

those about zoning permit applications. Barrow, before last week's council session, said the issue should have gone through the planning and zoning commission before being introduced for a possible vote before the council.

"We think (the idea) is very bad. It could quadruple the load on the planning and zoning office," Barrow had said in an earlier interview.

Barrow said the planning department, whether an application is approved or not, still has to do all the paperwork for the application. The cost of the fees and permits offsets that work load, he said.

At an Aug. 4 meeting of the planning and zoning board, all the members said they did not favor refunding fees, according to a memo from Richards.

On Tuesday, that stance had softened for some. Rick Silva said he had developed "mixed emotions," referred to a recent failed application for an adult video store in which the applicant had to pay a substantial fee.

"She put in all that money and it was just shot out of the water," Silva said.

Nowell, also on Tuesday, suggested a compromise of refunding half a fee when a project does not gain approval.

Building application fees can range from \$25 to more than \$305 depending on the type of application and the amount of staff time required to prepare the application for considera-

tion, according to information provided by the department.

#### Lodgers plan delayed

A decision on whether to raise Ruidoso's lodgers tax from 4 to 5 percent was postponed recently for 60 days.

At the recommendation of Mayor Robert Donaldson, the Ruidoso Village Council last week continued a public hearing on the tax increase. The new date for the public hearing is Oct. 13, Village Clerk Tammy Maddox said.

Donaldson said a subcommittee appointed to study the possible tax increase should first meet with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce Board before a joint meeting with the council and the subcommittee.

Councilor Ron Anderson questioned Donaldson if the owners of lodging establishments in the village would be invited to one of the meetings and Donaldson said they would. That particular workshop discussion could be held at either

the council chambers at Village Hall or at the Ruidoso Convention Center, he said.

Donaldson said the subcommittee would set a date for the workshop at its next meeting.

#### Signs given okay

Four existing off-premise signs, which promote businesses at other locations, were approved by the Ruidoso Village Council last week.

One of the signs, for Cree Manor and located at Paradise Canyon and Sudderth drives, was approved on the condition that its appearance be improved within 30 days. Otherwise, the council will revoke a waiver which allows the sign to be larger than allowed under the village's ordinance for off-premise signs.

All four signs received licenses for use of the village public right-of-way. The other three signs are:

- A sign used by the Crown Point Home Owners Association and located at U.S. Highway 70 and Crown Drive;
- Two signs used by High Sierra

Condos and located at Camelot Drive and Warwick and at Guenivere and Excalibur.

#### Event funding

Last week, the Ruidoso Village Council gave two new special events a total of \$7,500 to offset expenses.

Using revenue from lodgers taxes, the council approved a funding request of \$5,000 from the Mountain of Blues Festival, held in June outside the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

Another \$2,500 will help out the Aspencaash Poker Run, a motorcycle rally to be held in the spring of 1999, and sponsored by the Golden Aspen Rally Motorcycle Association.

Both requests were previously approved by an advisory committee to the council, the Lodgers Tax Committee.

By law, the revenue from the village's lodgers tax of 4 percent must be spent on activities or organizations that promote increased tourism.



This is being sent to you an hour after high noon, and the sun is shining down through light misty clouds overhead, casting all the green vales below in a dreamy half-light.

The cows and calves, of all sizes, are resting in cedar and piñon shade, with the youngest ones half hidden in the tall grass, some of them stretched out asleep.

From half way up the thick-growing piñon and cedar of the hillside to the south comes the call of a lone Piñon Jay, sounding like a happy, cheerful human voice. Nearby the coo-oo of the dove reaches you from the lower branches of the large cedar tree at the yard gate.

The crow gliding motionless overhead sends down his calm voice in a fair-weather song. And all the mountain world is in a peaceful noon-time lull.

**The time of rainbows**

During the past few days and weeks, especially during the scattered light showers, nature's masterpiece, the rainbow, pride and joy of the summertime, has shown forth in all its glory.

**Animal control officer goes to dogs ... cats, pigs, bears, etc.**

She drives around in a 1988 Chevy 4x4 that has 170,000 miles on it, rescuing animals in distress, counseling animal owners, investigating poisonings, shootings and animal cruelty, working five days a week and is on-call on weekends — and seldom has time for lunch.

Peggy Williams, "dogcatcher," or, officially, "animal control officer" with the Ruidoso Police Department, is a blonde fireball who sees her role as peacemaker in the community.

She mediates between dog lovers who hate cats and cat lovers who hate dogs, bird lovers and the neighbor with a fishpond next door, owners of barking dogs and all their sleep-seeking neighbors, loose dogs and those who support leash laws.

"I'm a resource person to help people deal with problems," she said Friday, wheeling around town watching for animals in distress and waiting for calls to come in.

She has flyers and brochures she made up herself to hand out on barking dogs, why a pet was impounded ("to protect the pet from cars, poison, disease, and irate neighbors; to locate and protect you"), and products for dealing with specific problems that come up.

She carries updated information on influenza and diseases that can be transferred from animals to humans.

She put together an animal first-aid kit and paid for it out of her pocket. She invented her daily record sheet; before

Williams, there were no records.

And yes, she does give out tickets when warranted, but usually not before giving out several warnings and trying to work with the animal owner.

"I do everything on a case-by-case basis," she said. "I make up my own rules. For a mean, vicious at-large dog I give tickets on the spot. It could maul a child. And a dog playing in the ice and snow at Mechem and Sudderth got a ticket because circumstances warranted it, with all the traffic there." When there's property damage — like the time some puppies were playing on Paradise Canyon Road and a car ran into a house trying to avoid them — the owner gets a citation.

"When I give people a ticket, it's not like murder or rape or armed robbery. I like to work with people. The first time results in a \$25 impoundment fee. I won't add insult to injury and give a ticket, because if it's not licensed, it won't be released until it's legal-fixed and licensed. They're being penalized enough," Williams said.

Williams picks up 100 animals a month, on average, though many of these are wild animals she rescues.

It's sometimes a dangerous job. In 1994 she was bit by two dogs, one on each leg and she ended up with stitches and osteomyelitis because one bite went into the bone.

She carries plastic chaps for handling snakes, a tranquilizer gun for vicious animals that can't be trapped otherwise, and now has a blowgun that will allow her to tranquilize animals in a gentler way.

"It's like a bee-sting, and aesthetically, I like it better because it's not like a gun; I hold it up to my mouth and blow," Williams said.

"There's only one Game and Fish Department person in the area, so Williams ends up dealing with a lot of animals besides domestic dogs and cats.

She's rescued skunks with Danon yogurt cups stuck on their heads. Williams said releasing the skunks afterward was the scary part.

She also has nursed a baby bear that ran up an electrical pole and got electrocuted; she

captured a wild, pothellied pig with tusks; and she's rescued dogs attacked by porcupines.

The list of animals she has encountered includes squirrels, ferrets, snakes, snow geese, ducks, a bull, sparrows, and coyotes.

Williams may often be seen as just the "village dogcatcher" but the fact remains that she's much more.

She carries water and food for the neglected, and treats for those dogs or cats she impounds.

And, just as important for herself and for Ruidoso, she loves her job.



Williams' job is not just limited to cats and dogs. This is a pig that lives with an area resident that the officer sometimes checks in on.

**BRIDGE TACTICS**

**TESTING AN ASSUMPTION**

West dealer.  
 North-South vulnerable.

This hand occurred in a duplicate pair tournament, but the principle it demonstrates would be equally applicable in rubber bridge.



North elected to sacrifice against five diamonds, hoping South would go down only one for minus 200 points and thus prevent East-West from scoring 400 points for making five diamonds. The idea was good, and should have been rewarded, but South misguessed the trump situation and wound up going down two — 500 points — for a poor score.

West led a diamond and then shifted to a low club. East took the ace and returned a club, the jack losing to the king. West exited with the jack of hearts.

Declarer had lost three tricks and now had to make the rest to avoid a deadly score of minus 500. He won the heart with the king, cashed the ace of spades, ruffed a diamond in dummy, and then led a spade on which East followed low. The question now was whether to finesse or play for the drop of the queen. After considerable thought, South guessed wrong and went down

two. It is true, mathematically, that declarer is better off in the long run to play for the drop rather than finesse when he is missing Q-x-x of a suit. However, this was a special case where declarer should have finessed.

South's assumption, at the critical point, that West started with Q-x, is not valid because it means that West could not have made five diamonds, since he would have had to lose two spades and a heart. This in turn means that a score of minus 200 would yield a poor result.

Declarer must therefore assume that the spades are divided 3-1, and so must finesse to justify the sacrifice bid. He is bound to do badly if he plays for the drop, and can get a good score only if the finesse wins because West started with just one spade.

## POOP SCOOP

For years I've read about special collars that can discourage barking in a dog, but they always seems cruel, because they involved an small shock.

But when two of my dogs started going bananas when neighbors walked by or cars passed, not to mention the occasional evening visit by a bear or head of deer, I looked for help.

What I found is a collar called "The Silencer," which is consider humane by the Humane Society of the United States and most other animal rights groups.

It emits a high pitched sound that is unpleasant, but not painful to a dog. The goal is to interrupt a cycle of barking, not prevent it all together. That's a compromise for the owner who still wants her dog to be able to alert her to intruders or other situations.

A battery-operated device on a collar is positioned on a dogs throat area after being fine-tuned to prevent unnecessary beeps in reaction to other sounds.

The first day I used the collars, I was amazed. The barking stopped. At first, one of the dogs seemed a bit fearful, but she's gotten over that. However, she knows when I move to put on the collar, that's her signal to cool the barking. The directions say not to use it

all of the time. The dog should get the hint after awhile and it can be used again to refresh their memories when needed.

Judith Halliburton, author of "Raising Rover," a book I consult on many occasions, offers some other remedies.

First, she explains that barking can be a survival mechanism when a dog feels threatened, can be meant to alert or for protection, may be used for communication or when a dog feels isolated, or result from frustration or an attempt to protect territory. Or maybe, it's the breed or compulsive behavior.

Going down the list, she advises if the dog is barking out of a survival instinct, put yourself in the "head Honcho" position to relief the dog's feeling that he has to take care of himself.

When he begins to bark, get his attention and give him a command that means "stop barking." As you take over, the barking should decrease.

If barking is a result of the breed, such as shelties, beagles and Ihasa apsos, try to control, not correct it.

When the dog is a puppy, teach a command for "barking stops," an don't encourage the trait because the puppy looks cute doing it.

Next week, more on controlling or stopping unnecessary barking.





Bill Macatee is all set for a two-network volley of U.S. Open tennis when he calls the play-by-play for USA Network's and CBS' extensive coverage.

"It's exciting for me to work so much of the Open," he says, "and I'm looking forward to my first Grand Slam finals."

Macatee believes the U.S. Open, which begins Monday, Aug. 31, may

be the breakthrough tournament for Venus Williams to overcome defending champion and No. 1-ranked Martina Hingis and win her first major title.

"No one rival consistently steps up and beats Hingis," Macatee says, "but I'm looking for Venus to do it in New York, where the animated home crowd will help her and sister Serena. Venus has been on that stage before and loves it."

Macatee sees one dominant figure on the less-colorful men's side: four-time U.S. Open champion Pete Sam-

pras.

"I can't turn away from Pete. He reaffirmed his dominance at Wimbledon, but I believe he won't really be fully appreciated for his accomplishments until he's gone in five to 10 years. Then everyone will say, 'Wow, look at what he did.' He's not a showman - just the best all-around tennis player in the world."

Joining Macatee for USA's coverage from Arthur Ashe Stadium are lead analysts John McEnroe and Tracy Austin, Barry MacKay, Ted Robinson, and studio host Bill Patrick.

Michael Barkann provides features with often wild angles.

Catching the ball at wild angles is CBS' "Mac-Cam," which was named after McEnroe and reveals in slow-motion replay whether a ball is in or out after a disputed call.

McEnroe, who also is behind the mike for CBS, was known for disputing just about every borderline call as a player. Now he has the technology to show who's right.

Leading up to the U.S. Open, CBS continues a tradition of telecasting Arthur Ashe Kids' Day on Sunday, Aug. 30.

## Paxson launches nation's seventh broadcast network

Paxson Communications Corp., which owns and operates the largest group of broadcast television stations in the United States, is launching a new venture executives hope will place the corporation even closer to the television pinnacle.

Pax TV, which takes off Monday, Aug. 31, will be the nation's seventh broadcast network, available free of charge to broadcast viewers and cable subscribers alike.

The corporation has reached agreements with major cable operators, including TCI, Comcast, Intermedia and TCA, to bring Pax TV programming into virtually all major markets in the country - 88 stations reaching about 70 percent of American television households. Within a year, plans are to expand its cable agreements to reach 85 percent of that market.

According to Jeff Sagansky, Paxson's president and chief executive officer, the network will set itself apart from its competition by pledging not to air programming containing gratuitous sex and excessive violence.

In pursuit of this goal, Pax secured exclusive rights to rebroadcast *Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman*, starring Jane Seymour, and will air syndicated episodes of *Touched by an Angel*, with Emmy-nominated Roma Downey, and *Diagnosis Murder* with Dick Van Dyke.

Pax TV's exclusive rights to *Dr. Quinn* begin Sept. 14. Sagansky says he wants to run a two-hour promotional salute to the saga of the tough female doctor, but he says CBS is claiming Pax TV doesn't have the rights to the program. Sagansky disagrees.

"We're going ahead with it," he says, adding the network plans to air the special in October or November.

Pax TV retains exclusive rights to all the other syndicated programs it carries, with the exception of *Bonanza* and *The Love Boat*.

According to Sagansky, Pax TV's main viewing audience is expected to be women ages 25-54 and their families. "We are basically targeting family and inspirational programming, with strong positive role models," he says.

But "inspirational" doesn't necessarily mean "religious," he hastens to add.

"The values are family, friendship, community service, faith. People find faith in all areas in their lives, in their families and their friendships. This is nondenominational; that's why we'll succeed."

A furor arose in the media over an advertising campaign for the new network, which included an ad that said Pax TV would not peddle "alternative language and lifestyles."

Steve Sohmer, head of the marketing, promotion and publicity team for the new network, says the word "alternative" was intended to refer to promiscuous sex, not homosexuality.

Sagansky insists the questionable phrasing was "a mistake of language. 'Family' is pretty all-encompassing. It means people who care about each other and have responsibility for each other," he explains. "We're not saying it means a mother, a father and two kids at all. The whole notion of 'family values' has gotten politicized, and I want to get away from it. We mean the value of the family, however you define it. It's something we all need."

Sagansky says that unlike The Disney Channel, Pax TV isn't directing the majority of its programming at children; "*Diagnosis Murder* is not for kids," he notes. He's also not expecting competition for the family audience from such stations as the Fox Family Channel. "The audience is much bigger than that," he says.

In addition to its syndicated shows, Pax TV also will air original programming. The new shows include *Little Men*, a series based on Louisa May Alcott's sequel to the popular *Little Women*; *Flipper: The New Adventures*; *It's a Miracle*, exploring miracles in their many forms; *Neon Rider*, a Canadian show about a psychologist (Winston Rekert) who runs a ranch for troubled youth; *Woman's Day*, a daily dose of empowerment for women; and *Reel to Reel*, a movie trivia game show.

In the planning stage is a pilot for an animated series titled *This One and That One*, based on two children's books by Seymour, Sagansky says.

He is hopeful the mix will provide the right formula for a large viewing audience. "Because of the values and the language and the lack of exploitation, we want everybody to be able to watch," he says.



## Hunt is mad about the Bard in PBS' *Twelfth Night*

For Helen Hunt, apparently film and TV glory isn't as good as it gets.

The Oscar- and Emmy-winning actress (*As Good as It Gets*, *Mad About You*) has spent the summer on the boards of Lincoln Center, brushing up her Shakespeare as Viola in Nicholas Hytner's production of *Twelfth Night, or What You Will*. The production has received high marks from the critics, and its final performance airs on PBS on Sunday, Aug. 30, as part of the venerable *Live From Lincoln Center* series (check local listings).

In addition to Hunt, the cast includes theater veterans Paul Rudd, who previously teamed with Hytner for the movie *The Object of My Affection*, and Kyra Sedgwick (*Miss Rose White*).


One of Shakespeare's most beloved comedies, *Twelfth Night* mingles two bittersweet love stories with spiraling confusion over mistaken identities.

As the play opens, a devastated Viola reaches the shores of the kingdom of Illyria following a shipwreck that apparently has claimed the life of her twin brother, Sebastian.

To survive, Viola disguises herself as a boy, Cesario, and becomes an attendant to a handsome duke, Orsino (Rudd), with whom she falls in love. He, however, is in love with Countess Olivia (Sedgwick), and sends his "boy" to woo her in his stead. In a reverse *Tootsie*, Olivia promptly falls in love with "Cesario," thus forming a comic triangle: Viola, masquerading as Cesario, loves Orsino, who loves Olivia, who loves Cesario/Viola.

Matters become even more confused when Viola's twin, Sebastian (Rick Stear), returns alive — and is the very image of Cesario.

"The two things that I find extraordinary (about this production) are, first, you can understand what they are saying extremely easily," says John Gubernman, who has been the executive producer of *Live From Lincoln Center* since its inception 25 years ago. "It doesn't have that kind of stilted, otherworldly pronunciation that makes you not sure of what's going on.

"Secondly, it's just very, very funny. The comic bits are genuinely funny, so this is very accessible Shakespeare."

Gubernman credits Hytner's production skills for the unusual accessibility. "The concept is so extraordinary as to where this is happening and when; it's not modern dress, but it's not costume drama, either," he explains. "There's just a marvelous sense of otherworldliness, but always appropriate to the play."

In addition to the three celebrity leads, this *Twelfth Night* features other familiar faces from film and TV playing the characters who handle most of the play's more raucous comedy.

Tony Award winner Philip Bosco, who appeared as the father of the bride in *My Best Friend's Wedding*, plays Malvollo, and Max Wright, familiar to millions as the TV "daddy" of *ALF*, plays Sir Andrew Aguecheek. The mischievous Maria is portrayed by Amy Hill, who played the irascible grandmother on *All-American Girl*.

Small wonder that *Live From Lincoln Center* opted to present a play for only the second time in the history of the series. "With this I said, 'Let's just take a chance,'" Gubernman says. "It's got a great director, a great designer (Bob Crowley) and a terrific cast — and it's *Twelfth Night*! We'll make it work."

"The cast is really 'up' about doing this at their last performance together, which is usually something special. And they'll be performing for an invited audience. I feel very good about it!"




