# District judge faces off with commissioner

Judicial objectivity and county commission sensitivity seemed to be lacking Friday as Commissioner Wilton Howell and 12th Judicial District Judge Robert Doughty butted heads.

Doughty, flanked by five other judges, had asked to be put on the agenda to respond to remarks by Howell about the role of judges in filing the county jail in Carrizozo. The jail, which fails to meet several fire and life safety code regulations, and has exceeded its maximum number of inmates, is due to be replaced by a new jail/court complex within the next 18 months.

Commissioners are worried about the esti-

mated \$1.8 million annual price of operating a new 100-bed jail. Howell and Commissioner Monroy Montes have urged judges to participate in developing alternative programs to jail time and in promoting legislation that would place the financial burden on the state, instead of the county, for prisoners housed in the county jail by action of state probation and parole officials.

But the discussion got off to a rocky start Friday as Doughty was recognized by Chairman L. Ray Nunley.

Howell interrupted and asked to make some opening remarks to detail his position and why he invited the participation of the judges. The commissioner then read a six-page, type-written statement that, while critical of some current practices, emphasized he

is seeking cooperation.

But Doughty apparently saw the statement as an attack and said Howell sounded like a proponent of a defense attorney's point of view, a possible reference to Howell's friendship with Gary Mitchell, chairman of the county's jail advisory committee and a well-known attorney often appointed as public defender in death-penalty cases.

"Is that what you called me here — to dress me down?" Doughty asked Howell.

"Judge, I'm not here to argue with you," Howell replied.

"Yes, you are," a steaming Doughty shot back. "You invited me here. I stood up and you took over. This is incredible."

"I came here today as a peacemaker to offer a plan. I don't know now if I'm being

called the pig or the hog," he said in reference to Howell's remark that judges would fill up every available jail cell if allowed.

Doughty said Howell apparently was upset when he threatened to fine Otero County \$1,000 an hour if a juvenile offender wasn't handled properly. Doughty then told Howell not to worry about a fine for Lincoln County.

"If I ever hold them (Lincoln County) in contempt, I'm going to look for a way to put you in jail," the Alamogordo-based judge told Howell.

He came to the meeting with some proposals on work release and radio monitoring of inmates, but in the current atmosphere, they would "be counter productive to offer," unless

## County debates drug money

A Lincoln County Commissioner on Friday called a high-dollar undercover vehicle a waste of money that could better be spent on building a new jail.

Sheriff Tom Sullivan called it an efficient use of money that must by law only be used in the fight against illegal drugs.

At the heart of the dispute was the seizure fund of the sheriff's office, created and fed by money generated from the sale of houses, cars and other items forfeited through courts by drug dealers and users.

The discussion began with a motion by Commissioner Monroy Montes to turn over to the Ruidoso's Police Department the operation of the county narcotics investigation unit and the grant that funds it.

The move would be in line with a recent decision to hand the county's grant-financed DWI program to the village, he said. He claimed 80 percent of drug cases originate in the Ruidoso area and also reminded commissioners that personnel problems, one lawsuit and some glitches with the handling of the grant have dogged the program since it started eight years ago under the title of the White Mountain Drug Task Force.

But his suggestion hit a wall with Commissioners Rex Wilson, William Schwettmann, Wilton Howell and Chairman L. Ray Nunley, especially after they learned the village hadn't been approached officially about taking over the program. A motion by Howell to contact the village failed 3-2 with Montes and Howell voting for it.

Libertarian Party county chairman Tony Seno urged commissioners to drop the narcotics program entirely, contending that citizens who use small amounts of illegal drugs are targeted instead of dealers and drug sources.

"The war on drugs has become a war on the people," Seno said, calling the program a failure and claiming that the drug supply remains constant.

Sullivan disagreed with Seno's premise that the anti-drug

## Guard says Payseno admitted to murder

A jail conversation only recently reported by a former guard challenged the core of Terri Payseno's claim of self-defense Tuesday in the killing of Sonia "Sonny" Kirkwood Sept. 13, 1997.

It was the first direct testimony in the murder trial, which began Monday, contradicting the 41-year-old woman's version of events the day Kirkwood was shot once with a 38-caliber Smith & Wesson double action revolver and her body was hidden in a horse trailer.

In his opening statement, defense attorney Gay Mitchell said Payseno was confronted by a gun-toting, intoxicated Kirkwood after taking her daughter to spend the night at a friend's house and returning to the ranch the couple shared in Alamo Canyon near Hondo.

Kirkwood, 58, was upset over the imminent breakup planned by Payseno and shot at her younger companion, Mitchell said. But she stumbled over the open ramp of a nearby 38-foot horse trailer and Payseno seized the gun, which Mitchell claims belonged to Kirkwood. By that time, Kirkwood picked up a pitchfork and was advancing toward her, Mitchell contended.

Payseno fired once into the ground to warn her former lover, but Kirkwood kept coming. The next shot hit her left breast, killing her, according to Mitchell.

Justin Burks, now a Capitan police officer, but employed as a guard at county jail in Carrizozo from December 1997 to May 1998, said Payseno told him a different story late one evening when he was alone at a desk opposite her one-person cell.

He said Payseno was complaining about not being able to see her first-grade daughter.

"I asked her what she'd done to get arrested," Burks testified. "She showed me some newspaper clippings. I asked her if she had shot her and she said everybody already knew she had shot her."

Payseno then told Burks that she (Payseno) was tired of looking at her, took the gun away and "just shot her," Burks testified.

Mitchell, irritated that the testimony was allowed, questioned why Burks didn't report the conversation earlier. He suggested Burks was trying to impress some other law enforcement officials at a lunch after a class on arson. He objected to Burks being allowed to refer to a copy of his sworn statement.

"It was written several months (after the conversation), so it's no different than your ability to remember today," Mitchell said, asking if the officer had a defective memory.

He also contended Burks may have a grudge against Payseno, because she complained about the treatment of another inmate.

Burks said he reported the conversation to a superior within a few days, but was told it was nothing new. He brought it up again at the lunch with an assistant district attorney and other officers, because he heard them discussing witnesses in the case. He wanted to refer to his written statement, because when he wrote it, he tried hard to remember exactly what was said, Burks testified.

District Attorney Scot Key contends Payseno did not react on the spur of the moment under any scenario. She sent her daughter away from the ranch that day, because she

# State gives county jail a reprieve

Report on location of new facility coming Thursday

A written agreement is being worked out between the State Fire Marshall's office and the Lincoln County Commission, setting forth the minimum standards that must be met by the county to continue to operate the old jail while a new one is being built.

State Fire Marshall George Chavez and inspectors James Trehern and Paul Linville were part of a group of state officials who inspected the jail in Carrizozo Friday with Commissioner Chairman L. Ray Nunley.

They have indicated a willingness to work with the commission as long as it moved forward with plans to construct a new jail.

Commissioners will hear site, size and operational recommendations for a new jail from a consulting group during a 6:30 p.m. meeting Thursday in Carrizozo. Also on the agenda is the setting of the 1998 tax rate.

Linville said Monday he's in the process of putting together the agreement and could not comment on specifics, other than some restrictions will be placed on the old jail's operation. Chavez was not available for comment.

During a commission meeting Friday, Nunley told other commissioners that although the jail was built to house about 47 prisoners, individual space requirements for inmates will limit the occupancy to 35. More staff will not have to be hired, but shifts will be staggered differently, he said.

"They had a notebook full of things to check as they went through the jail," Nunley said. "They were pleased with the effort and will allow the jail to continue to function. We need to send a letter acknowledging that this is a temporary measure and giving them a target date for completion of the new jail. I think 16 to 18 months is realistic."

He thanked the state officials for their cooperation.



# Breast cancer: the national facts and figures

The Altrusa Club, a local civic organization, with Lincoln County Medical Center will provide mammograms at a reduced cost throughout the month of October, which is national Breast Cancer Awareness month.

Breast cancer is a survivable disease if detected early and experts agree that mammograms can provide that early detection.

According to the National Alliance of Breast Cancer Organizations, an estimated 178,700 new invasive cases have occurred among women in the United States during 1998. About 1,600 new cases of breast cancer will be diagnosed in men in 1998.

After increasing about 4 percent per year in the 1980s, breast cancer incidence rates in women have leveled off in recent

years to about 110 cases per 100,000.

The fatality rate of breast cancer nationally is estimated at 43,900 deaths (43,500 women, 400 men) in 1998; in women, the second major cause of cancer death.

According to the most recent data, mortality rates continue to decline with the largest decreases in younger women—both white and African American. These decreases are likely due to earlier detection and improved treatment.

**Signs and Symptoms:** The earliest sign of breast cancer is usually an abnormality that shows up on a mammogram before it can be felt by the woman or her health care provider. When breast cancer has grown to the point where physical signs and symptoms exist, these may include a breast

lump, thickening, swelling, distortion, or tenderness; skin irritation or dimpling; and nipple pain, scaliness, or retraction. Breast pain is very commonly due to benign conditions, and is uncommonly the first symptom of breast cancer.

**Risk Factors:** The risk of breast cancer increases with age. The risk is higher in women who have a personal or family history of breast cancer; biopsy-confirmed atypical hyperplasia; early menarche; late menopause; recent use of oral contraceptives or postmenopausal estrogens; never having children or having the first live birth at a late age; and higher education and socioeconomic status.

A majority of women will have one or more risk factors for breast cancer. However, most risks are at such a low level that they only partly explain the high

frequency of the disease in the population. Although women may not be able to alter their personal risk factors, maintaining an ideal body weight and reducing alcohol consumption may offer some reduction in breast cancer risk. Early detection is the best opportunity to reduce mortality.

Those women who want to participate in the Altrusa Club's mammogram program, which costs \$55, should call Majel Powell at 257-5783 to set up an appointment.

To be eligible women must be over 30 and under 65 and living in or seeing a physician who is practicing in Lincoln County.

he could find a commissioner with whom he could work, Doughty said.

Magistrate Judge William Butts, based in Ruidoso, dittoed Doughty's remarks.

Carrizo Municipal Judge Charles Rominger reminded Howell that his village pays \$65 a day to house their prisoners in county jail. Howell said he would not

apologize for his remarks and that it's unfortunate the judge couldn't take constructive criticism.

After the meeting, Howell said he read his statement before Doughty's presentation because he doubted he would be allowed to respond after the discussion began.

"I'd been warned that they planned to hammer me and then walk out," he said. Montes told Doughty the

appearance of the judges at the meeting amounted to a historic moment and that he didn't see Howell's remarks as confrontational. He suggested both sides observe a cooling off period and come back next month to discuss the proposals. The judges should not be dealing with one commissioner. They should deal with the whole board, he said.

Oscura resident Jerry Carroll said, "What I'm seeing

here is no cooperation, especially from the judicial.

"Fortunately, the county judicial is excellent, but you need to get together (with the commission)," Carroll said.

His efforts to ask the judges to reaffirm that they took an oath to uphold the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights was cut short by Nunley, who gaveled him down and ended the discussion by declaring a 10-minute break.

war is a failure.

"We made 98 arrests last year and brought 182 charges," he said of the program overseen by his department, handled fiscally by the Tatum town government and supervised by the state. "We lead the state in the number of marijuana plants confiscated and we have filed for (court-ordered forfeiture of) \$438,000 in property seized from (people in connection with drug offenses).

Although a few clerical problems in the administration of the grant have occurred, the program itself

has completed successfully its annual audits, Sullivan said.

Howell said he didn't want to give up the program, but thought it should be handled by the agency governing the area where most of the related crime originated.

He then questioned why the sheriff bypassed the commission for permission to purchase an undercover narcotics vehicle for \$27,713. Instead, Sullivan went through District Judge Karen Parsons, who declared it an emergency.

Howell read off the extras included in the four-wheel drive vehicle, such as a CD player and air conditioning.

"What happens when this

vehicle becomes known, and that will happen after it's driven down the street a few times?" Howell asked. "Do you trade it in for another new one? I'm not against the war on drugs. I'm for the war on waste. You're willing to spend \$27,000 in seizure funds (for a car), but not willing to spend one penny of the seizure fund for a new jail that will (financially) break this county."

Sullivan explained that seizure money can't be spent on a jail — only for things related to drug investigations. He said the unit needed a certain type of car and he picked it out, noting that the deal was good in view of the original sticker price of more than \$31,000.

"I know what to do and how to do my job," he told Howell, adding that he discussed the situation ahead of time with Nunley

The chairman confirmed the discussion and added that Howell's remarks had ruined the effectiveness of the secrecy maintained by going through Parsons instead of the commission.

"Now, you've blown the cover," he said.

Parsons also was dismayed Sunday about Howell bringing up the issue.

"We do it this way to protect the undercover officers and this type of public exposure could endanger his life," she said, adding that sometimes expensive cars are needed to aid in creating a identity for an agent.

But Howell contended at the Friday meeting and then again during a break that the purchase was not a secret.

"The boy who washed the car on the lot knew about it before the commissioners," he said.

was thinking about doing something, he said.

Payseno and Kirkwood met in a Colorado gay bar in 1992 and later moved to a place near Roswell, Mitchell said.

In May 1996, Payseno began serving a 352-day sentence in a federal prison for illegally selling steroids owned by a feed lot where she worked, he said.

While Payseno was in prison, Kirkwood moved to the ranch in Alamo Canyon.

The owner of Tinnie's Silver Dollar Restaurant and several ranchers testified that Kirkwood was anxious for Payseno to return after serving her sentence.

Kirkwood even asked about staging a "commitment" party on the restaurant veranda.

But shortly after Payseno was released from prison, the couple began arguing, in large part because Payseno admitted to forming a strong emotional attachment to another inmate while in prison, Mitchell said.

Their arguments were witnessed at the Tinnie restaurant, where the two spent less time together and more time stopping by separately, restaurant owner Salem Sager testified.

During one conversation, Payseno told him, "That old lady is driving me crazy," Sager said.

Mitchell contends that after Payseno shot Kirkwood in self defense, she removed the dead woman's glasses and gloves while attempting to find a pulse and then put the body into the trailer, because the couple's dogs wouldn't leave it alone.

She intended to call authorities, but had second thoughts, because of her daughter, he told the seven-

man, seven-woman jury that includes a former social worker and an employee of a local juvenile offender rehabilitation camp.

While trying to come up with a plan to take care of her daughter, Payseno took several Excedrin P.M. tablets, fell asleep on a blanket near the fireplace and didn't wake up until hours later when the blanket caught on fire, Mitchell said.

By then, too much time had passed to call authorities, Mitchell said his client thought.

Payseno set about selling off livestock and withdrawing money until two weeks later when, after confessing to her sister, Kim Dooper, the sheriff's office was contacted about 11:15 p.m. Sept. 25.

Bert Eldredge of Roswell, who had known Kirkwood for about 1 1/2 years, saw Payseno at a horse sale about a week after the shooting.

"I asked why they were selling that good buckskin horse," Eldredge said. "That was Sonny's favorite horse."

Payseno said she needed the money, Eldredge testified. When he asked Payseno where Kirkwood was, he said Payseno told him she was in Florida taking care of her sick mother.

Payseno also showed up at an ATM machine at the Inn of the Mountain Gods, according to a sworn statement entered into evidence.

It was one of nine times she received money using Kirkwood's ATM card.

Twice she was refused, because the daily \$500 limit had been exceeded, according to Ruidoso State Bank records.

The camera showed Payseno using Kirkwood's card. Cross-examining Lincoln County Deputy Orlando Montes, Mitchell pointed out that Payseno didn't try to conceal her face.

He has maintained that the couple shared money and possessions, although Kirkwood paid Payseno a weekly check to satisfy conditions of her probation.

Dr. Marcus Nashelsky, a forensic pathologist with the New Mexico Medical Investigator's Office, testified that the fatal bullet entered Kirkwood's left breast, passed through her rib, heart, diaphragm and came to rest in her liver.

The trajectory of the bullet was slightly downward and slightly left to right, he said.

No gun powder residue was found on the dead woman's clothing around the wound, indicating the shot was fired further than two or three feet away, the doctor testified.

Depending on where Payseno was standing, Kirkwood could have been sitting or could have been slightly bent over and turning toward Payseno, he said.

Although the alcohol level in the dead woman's blood was .132 percent, in excess of the legal limit for intoxication of .08 percent, that could have been all, or in part, caused by the decomposition of the body, which ferments normal blood sugar, he said.

When deputies responded to the call from Dooper, Payseno came out to meet them, told them where the body could be found and indicated the direction of where she hid the gun under a rock.

Deputies also later found four cartridges from the gun, three fired and one live.

Payseno does not face a possible death penalty, if convicted.

Key said he expects to call about 30 witnesses in the murder trial that is scheduled to continue into next week.



## A reputation worth keeping

Kathy Osborne, who lives in Ruidoso and is a self-confessed Harley-Davidson motorcycle enthusiast, forwarded the following brief article from the current issue of Cycle World Magazine:

"What if you gave a Harley rally and nothing rowdy went down? That's exactly what happened at Harley-Davidson's 95th Anniversary Reunion, held this past June in Milwaukee.

"In all, more than 100,000 bikers rode into town, 50,000 of whom participated in the Reunion's Saturday morning parade to the shores of Lake Michigan, in what was surely the world's largest motorcycle procession. Despite the influx, problems were very few during the event's four days and only a handful of arrests were made, all for minor offenses.



## With risk comes responsibility

Ski resort operation is no bed of roses. Big, expensive equipment is required — lifts, gondolas, snow cats, excavators, dozers, and cranes. Extremes in temperature, precipitation, and altitude make operations doubly hard.

It is a business for risk-takers, and the world is better and happier when risk-takers come forward to drive this kind of enterprise. Risk-takers make errors, which is fine if admitted and corrected.

Ski Apache took a big risk when it installed a vast contouring project, chair lift, ski trail, and maintenance roads in the Apache Bowl. Forest Service archives are full of warnings, one stating flatly that "No earth moving or earth disturbing project should be undertaken in the 'Apache Bowl' erosion area."

Errors were made: roads

not waterbarred, contouring and plantings more compatible with skiing than terrain preservation, still seemingly a manageable risk.

Then a horrendous flood brought down much of the Apache Bowl like a house of cards (but not the Forest Service side of the Bowl where terracing and planting remained undisturbed).

The resort took two more risks when it built dams on the North Fork. The newest, constructed of dredged sediment, was immediately breached and destroyed when the flood came. The older dam should never have been built, certainly not on its chosen site. Its position made it elevate the flood water level, diverting it to cut out the canyon wall, tumbling tall trees, and bypassing the spillway. Whether that constitutes a dam breach is a matter for hairsplitters.

The risks taken and the mistakes made did not cause the tragic erosion, but they did

worsen it. The River Association knew the extent of the disaster and was dismayed when a flurry of press statements indicated that everything that happened was an act of God, never happened before, all would be fine.

Knowing the history of the Bowl, we had little confidence that all would be fine. We called in outside agencies and asked the Forest Service and New Mexico Environmental Department to monitor the situation and provide whatever help they could make available. As things turned out, the outside assistance was crucial. Money, materials, and expertise contributed by the Forest Service have been essential in commencing remediation.

Two conflicting agendas should be clarified. The Ruidoso River Association is in business to restore and preserve the quality of the river. It does not set dreamy, unrealistic goals; just compliance with mandated state water stan-

dards.

Neither does the ski resort set dreamy goals. It is in business to sell lift tickets. The river that runs through it is no asset but rather a liability that generates costs — a big bill every year and a huge one this year. Our agenda and that of the ski resort are obviously on a financial collision course; getting their river discharge into compliance with the Clean Water Act can wreak short term havoc with their bottom line and consequently, we are seen as enemies.

We regret hard feelings, but we do know that our agenda — a clean, noisy river — is also the agenda of the Mescalero Apache Tribe, and we can't help but work things out in the end.

## A century of water from the Sacramentos

Sierra Blanca — the White Range — dominates the landscape of southeastern New Mexico. Its highest peak crests at 12,003 feet and snowfall is in excess of 60 inches a year. It is home to the Mescalero Apache tribe and its Mountain Gods, and along with the Sacramento Mountains to the south provides a wet oasis in an otherwise arid area.

these mountains did not go unnoticed by those who lived nearby, and about a hundred years ago the first of several projects to move that water to where it was needed was begun.

In 1897, rancher Oliver M. Lee, who is famous for having been accused and acquitted of murdering Col. Albert J. Fountain and his son, constructed an 11-mile ditch from 1,000-Mile Canyon in the Sacramentos to a reservoir on his vast ranch. It was the first diversion of these mountain waters.

Soon thereafter, gold was discovered near Orogrande, an arid place southwest of the Sacramentos. Water was desperately needed to work the mines, and the Southwest Smelting and Refining Company turned to Lee to provide it.

Lee sold his water rights and ditch to the company in

1905, reserving enough of the flow for his own uses. Southwest built a 27-mile-long cast iron pipeline to Orogrande, where it constructed a smelter.

It wasn't long before the gold ran out, and the mining company's mortgage was foreclosed in 1908.

The El Paso and Northeastern Railroad acquired the water system to refill its steam locomotives and provide water for its employees.

By this time, the railroad company had already started another pipeline system to divert water from Sierra Blanca. The first section was 53 miles long. The pipes ranged in size from six to 18 inches, and were constructed of tongue-in-groove pine slats wrapped with flat steel. Not surprisingly, the pipeline was subject to frequent leaks.

This pipeline took water down the mountains to Carrizozo, where the railroad used it to replace highly mineralized water from deep wells that had clogged the innards of its locomotives.

In 1909, the line was extended a staggering 107 miles from Carrizozo northeast through Corona and Vaughn to Pastura, only a few miles southwest of Santa Rosa and far from any view of Sierra Blanca. This pipeline was made of redwood wrapped with wire.

As the need for water increased, the railroad built another pipeline in the Sierra Blanca to divert water from Eagle Creek. This line was made of steel.

When the Eagle Creek water was added to the original

supply, a nine-mile spur was built to serve Fort Stanton.

In 1924, the Southern Pacific bought what had been the El Paso and Northeastern system and decided a new dam and reservoir were needed to increase the water supply. The proposal met with opposition, and it was several years before construction started on what is now Bonito Dam.

In 1941, 28 inches of rain fell in the area, severely damaging the dam and flooding the canyon. The dam was rebuilt, 26 feet higher.

Albert B. Fall purchased the one million-acre Tres Ritos Ranch west of Sierra Blanca in 1900. Fall, one of the lawyers who got Oliver Lee acquitted, later became a U.S. Senator and then Secretary of the Interior under President Harding. During the Teapot Dome scandal he was accused of taking a bribe. Fall built a concrete

ditch across the Mescalero Reservation to provide water to his ranch; and this later became yet another pipeline for the railroad.

The railroad company was very generous with its water. At many points along the routes of the three pipelines, towns and ranches were allowed to tap water for their own uses. The systems were kept in working order until the 1950s, when diesel-electric locomotives began to replace steam engines and the need for water for Alamogordo and Holloman Air Base changed the balance of power.

Next week: Redistribution of the mountain water.

Elsewhere: Johannes Brahm died in 1897, the year Oliver Lee built his ditch.

## Los Chozas project gets county OK, but district attorney will sue developer

District Attorney Scot Key says he plans to file criminal charges in connection with the developers' handling of Los Chozas subdivision, but commissioners approved the 15-lot development anyway.

County Attorney Alan Morel said Friday developers Ron Green and Max Kiehle of Bonito Land and Livestock Co. have met all of the county's

requirements and no reason remains for denial.

Key and Green worked out an agreement taking care of the civil side of what the state contends amounted to prior sale of lots before the subdivision east of Lincoln was approved. The conditions include allowing people who want out of the contracts to get their money back. One person decided to take that course, Morel said.

He reminded commissioners if

they took no action, the subdivider could give a 30-day notice of demand for approval.

Tim Collins, a local surveyor representing the developers, asked commissioners to spare them the expense and trouble of going to court to force a decision.

Mike Leineweber, who said he is waiting to buy one of the lots in the subdivision, urged approval of the development so that he can proceed with his plans. He said the subdivi-

sion with acreage lots is a better alternative than chopping up the land near the historic McIntyre settlement into smaller lots.

Norbert McIntyre said he had problems with the accuracy of surveys involved in another project by the developers. He had to go to court because he couldn't get title insurance, he said. He claimed the surveys encroached on his property and that of several other property owners in the area.

## Vendor law passage in Downs blocks planned 'adult toy' sales

• The Downs council's decision to charge some temporary vendors \$700 in fees for three days apparently prompted a vendor of adult toys to withdraw her application.

D'Lynn Rudd and her fiancée walked out of a special session of the Ruidoso Downs Village Council Friday night, saying they intend to add to the village's growing pile of litigation.

"They (changed village vendor laws) at the time she made her application," said Martie Sires, Rudd's fiancée. "She has a lawyer and she will be contacting him."

Rudd was awaiting permission to sell adult toys from a temporary roadside stand during the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally.

She had been scheduled to make her request to the council on Aug. 24, but Rudd, of Albuquerque, was unable to attend that meeting and the request

was tabled. At the Aug. 24 meeting, trustees asked Village Attorney Dan Bryant to draft an ordinance for the regulation of itinerant vendors.

Bryant said the ordinance and Rudd's request for a permit were discussed in a special meeting at 5:30 p.m. Friday because Rudd would not be able to attend the council's regular Monday session.

Rudd, who withdrew her application before walking out of the meeting, said the fees in the ordinance were too high for her or other temporary vendors, despite being lowered in the proposed ordinance from \$1,100 to \$700 for three days of operation.

She told the council Friday, she would rather be among other vendors at the Ruidoso Convention Center, where the rally site is located. However, she said, organizers told her all the slots had been filled and 50 more vendors were on the waiting list.

Bryant, who repeatedly asked trustees as well as audience members to propose alternative fee amounts, at one point

directed the question to Rudd. She referred to the village's previous fee schedule for temporary vendors of \$100 for the first day and \$25 for each subsequent day.

Fees in the ordinance vary based on the type of business applying for a permit. For example, a for-profit carnival will pay \$500 a day, and a fortune teller will pay a one-time fee of \$100. A seasonal vendor, who sets up business for more than 72 hours up to six months, will pay a one-time fee of \$250. Bryant said existing seasonal vendors will not be required to pay the fee until next year.

General temporary vendors will pay \$300 for the first day of operation and \$200 for subsequent days. The council dropped the fee from a proposed \$500 for the first day and \$300 for subsequent days. Most non-profit organizations that apply for a temporary permit will only be assessed a \$5 fee, according to the ordinance.

Unlike standard business permits, temporary and seasonal permits will, according to the

ordinance, must have Village Council approval.

Downs trustees gave several reasons to warrant the new fee amounts. Temporary vendors don't pay gross receipts taxes. And some, such as a circus, represent additional costs to the village because of increased demand on the police department to monitor traffic. Additionally, temporary vendors can take business from the permanent companies, trustees said.

"I think we have brought it (the fee for general temporary vendors) down quite a bit," said Trustee Judy Miller, the most vocal trustee at the public hearing. "To be fair we need to set a fee that is comparable to what (permanent businesses) pay into the village," she said.

Bryant on Friday told the council the village actually could not permit temporary and seasonal vendors because Ruidoso Downs didn't have an ordinance specifically for those categories.

Bryant said a previous Downs Council did away with regulations for temporary and seasonal vendors in 1991 or

1992. The draft he presented to the council Friday was the same as the prior law, with only the fee schedule changed.

The proposed fees in the draft represented the average amounts charged by area communities, he said.

The new ordinance becomes effective today, five days after the council approved it on Friday. The five-day waiting period was not mentioned before Rudd left the meeting.

If Rudd does file a lawsuit against Ruidoso Downs, the litigation will join at least four other legal complaints already filed against the village.

## Ruidoso romps past Socorro, 47-13

The Ruidoso Warriors answered a question recently posed by the Albuquerque media.

"Is there life after Damien," asked the Albuquerque Journal in its Class AAA football preview capsule about the Socorro Warriors. "Damien" refers to Socorro's talented quarterback of 1997, Damien Ocampo, who now wears a red shirt for the New Mexico State Aggies. Ocampo led the Warriors to a 12-1 record and the state semifinals a year ago.

Ruidoso's collective and resounding answer to the question: "No."

The Ruidoso Warriors, donning a darker shade of blue (navy) and a shinier gold, trampled the visiting Warriors before a boisterous home crowd, 47-13, Friday at Horton Stadium. Ruidoso improved to 2-1 overall, while Socorro fell to 1-2.

Ruidoso was so good, so early in the contest, its efforts seemed to take the home crowd as well as the opponent out of the game.

The Warriors scored on three of their first four possessions, five of seven in the half. After the first quarter it was 22-0. By halftime, the demoralized Socorro Warriors trailed 33-0.

Ruidoso then left little chance for a second-half Socorro rally. On consecutive possessions, Ruidoso quarterback Corey Saenz scampered around the right side, weaving his way around the Socorro defenders to paydirt. Saenz's 41-yard touchdown run at the 8:32 mark of the third quarter extended the Ruidoso lead to 40-0. Then, his 37-yard TD jaunt four minutes later upped the Warrior margin to 47-0.

At that point, Ruidoso coach Les Carter started substituting freely.

It was only then that Carter found something to constructively criticize about his Warriors performance.

"We want to be able to get to the point where when we put in our second group we can score points," Carter said. "There's going to be a difference, but we don't want to see a big difference."

Ruidoso's clean play kept the flags in referees' pockets. The Warriors committed one penalty compared to 15 the week before in a 34-33 loss to Rio Grande.

"We made an advance in that area, but we need to keep working on the mental aspects of the game," Carter said.

Meanwhile, the Ruidoso offense smoothly slipped into third gear Friday, racking up 463 yards of total offense. Saenz had his best game of the season, completing 14-of-19 passes for 173 yards and three touchdowns. He rushed for two scores and 120 yards.

Senior receiver Josh Varnadore hauled in seven receptions for 106 yards and three TDs.

"We threw to six different receivers," Carter said. "We were able to throw to who we wanted to."

When the Warriors weren't passing, they were running over and around the visitors from Socorro.

As for Ruidoso's unheralded defensive unit, Carter said, "We've got two sophomores in Nathan Standland and Chris Parsons who are doing just a great job. We're just solid in those defensive line positions. As a unit, they are tough, and they're going to get better with more experience."

Ruidoso returns to action at 7:30 p.m. Friday when its hosts Class AA Tularosa.

# Federally assisted senior housing gets P&Z clearance

Construction is to begin in November on a federally assisted senior housing complex in Ruidoso that should be finished by June, but the developer is looking for occupants now.

"We are starting our leasing efforts today. We are not waiting until the project is completed," said Michael Hornbrook, an attorney for the development company Tierra Realty Trust. "We have already received 20 or 30 inquiries."

La Tierra Senior Apartment Homes, a 60-unit complex on 6 acres

off Jack Little Drive, received unanimous approval for site development Tuesday from the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission. Another 1.6 acres of the 10-tract is to be a private park for complex residents, and the remaining land is to be rezoned for single family homes, said developer Stephen Crozier.

In a public hearing before the commission's vote, former opponents of the project became proponents. That was attributed to the developer trading his previous plans for low-income family housing for senior housing instead.

"Mister Crozier has met with us and eased our concerns," said John

Morton, who in February first presented the Ruidoso Village Council with concerns about the project's potential impact. "He has spent a tremendous amount of energy and resources and has delayed his project for some time ... I feel a lot better about the project than when it was first presented."

Crozier in April withdrew his previous project, said to cost about \$4 million, so he could modify the plans. The revisions changed both appearance and use.

The project, built through a federal tax credit program, now targets tenants 55 years of age or older with low incomes. A qualifying couple

could have a combined income of as much as \$14,760, Lynn Wehrli, an official with the state agency that oversees housing development, has said.

The development will consist of 10 one- and two-story buildings including a clubhouse with a kitchen, laundry room, exercise room and a library.

The architecture uses stucco and wood trim. Half of the apartments will be one-bedroom and the other half two bedroom.

Crozier said Ruidoso's demographics showed a significant number of senior citizens who would qualify as tenants — specifically a

large population of widowed women. Furthermore, he will advertise for tenants statewide, Crozier told the commission.

Scott Miller, representing a nearby neighborhood association, raised several questions, including whether there was any new information about the project's impact would be on neighboring property values.

"If anyone has driven up Jack Little Drive they can see all the for-sale signs," Miller said. Morton later told the commission he sold his home on Jack Little Drive for reasons other than the pending housing project.

# 'Family' party Friday to honor retiring Ruidoso police sergeant

The longest serving employee of the Ruidoso Police Department is retiring and his "family" invites the public to his retirement party Friday.

The man known variously as Mac, Tj, Jimmy, Truman, and Sgt. McBride is retiring after 27 years of service in Ruidoso and three in Alamogordo. Not only is he the longest serving employee, said Lanny Maddox, police chief, he's also only the second person to retire from the department.

While McBride attributes his longevity to knowing when

to keep his mouth shut, Maddox said it's his patience, knowledge and ability to enhance his relationships with the citizens.

"He talked to me about retiring last year and I asked him to stay, not only for his knowledge and ability, but to share some of that with the

younger officers," Maddox said. "He could've retired anytime. He stayed because I needed him to stay."

Betty Bennett of Bennett's Indian Shop worked

with him as dispatcher about 20 years and said he'd go out of his way to talk to people who were in major crises in their lives.

"He's talked several people out of suicide; he'd take the time to sit down, let them relax and talk. He has saved many lives."

But watch out for his sense of humor, she warned. If people didn't keep their shotguns clean, they'd find them with flowers growing out of them.

Although he doesn't have children of his own, he's taken half a dozen young people under his wing and kept them out of trouble, said Jane Parnell, a juvenile probation officer who's worked with him since 1975.

She tells of some parents worried about their son's drinking who called McBride when the son and his friend came home very drunk and

sick. They wanted them put in jail, so McBride made them clean up the mess, and then he locked them up and lectured them.

"I never officially saw the two young men," Parnell said. "As far as I know, they didn't get in trouble as adults."

McBride came to Ruidoso in 1971, after three years in Alamogordo, where he was born. There wasn't much to do here in those days besides "write a ticket, catch a burglar."

There were only three police cars and officers worked nine-hour days, six days a week, often one to a shift. There wasn't a traffic light in town and only one four-way stop, at Sudderth and Mechem. Bars closed

between 10:30 and 11 p.m. during the week in the winter.

"I've seen (Ruidoso) go from a little bitty place to four to five times the 1,000 year-round residents there were then," McBride said.

"I rather enjoyed it most of the time," he said. "I always liked the mountains, and being in the environment I wanted to be in."

Dispatcher Edie Rooney said McBride's retirement party will be a Mexican food potluck from 5 to 6 p.m. Friday at the Municipal Court.

"We'd like anybody and everybody to come and wish Mac a happy retirement, and say thanks for what he's done for this village," she said.



# Aspenfest '98

## Aspenfest welcomes back the locals

• Because of road construction, the parade this year will start lower on Sudderth Drive and continue longer than usual, a coordinator said.

A 30-year tradition, Aspenfest on Oct. 3 and 4 is the village's one event that brings out the most local residents — some in clown costumes.

"Octoberfest draws a lot of locals but Aspenfest draws more," said Aspenfest coordinator Lisa Muhn. "Aspenfest is the big local event ... It couldn't happen without the locals."

One reason is because so many year-round residents are a part of the biggest event of Aspenfest — the parade, Muhn said.

Usually the parade has more than 100 entries and at least three times that many participants, said Muhn, who coordinates the festival for the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce. Then there's about 5,000 to 8,000 people who come to watch the parade as it winds down Sudderth Drive.


About 10,000 people will attend some part of the Aspenfest celebration during the Oct. 3 and 4 weekend, she said.

Aspenfest, which began about 30 years ago as part of a motorcycle rally, is more than a parade. A chili cook-off, a hot rod show and an arts and crafts show are part of the celebration as well.

Aspenfest got its start with the Aspencade rally, which about 15 years ago became the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally, said Joan Zagone, chamber director. Now, the events are held on different weekends. The rally is this weekend.

Muhn said coordinating Aspenfest, which she does in conjunction with event Chairman Bob Lacouture, isn't as overwhelming as it could be. All the activities have different sponsors and coordinators. For example, Paul Crown and the Ruidoso Rotary Club put on the chili cook-off, and the Ruidoso Gymnastics Club sponsors the arts and crafts show, she said.

The hot rod show, called the Rod Run, fea-

tures about 350 classic and modified cars. It is sponsored and coordinated by a car club out of El Paso, Muhn said.

The logistics of organizing the parade itself are considerably eased because of assistance from village personnel such as Ruidoso Fire Chief Virgil Reynolds and Code Enforcement Officer Thomas Chavez, who coordinate the parade line-up, Muhn said.

"The fire and the police departments are incredible," she said. "And the thing is, they love it. They don't just do it out of obligation. They do it because they really enjoy it."

Road construction will affect this year's parade to some degree in that participants won't

be able to line up on Mechem Drive as in past years, Muhn said.

"It's going to take a little bit of concerted effort this year," Muhn said. "It's going to be different."

Participants will line up on upper Sudderth, but not on Main Road because the street is not wide enough, she said. The parade will probably have to start lower on Sudderth, most likely in the vicinity of the Lincoln County Grill, she said.

Because of this, the parade route will extend further down Sudderth than in past years, Muhn said.


At the grave side at Forest Lawn Cemetery, the Reverend Mr. Jordan read again selections from the Epistle of the Apostle Paul to the Corinthians.

The Hensley family has been a close neighbor for many years during the early days since the first we arrived in the Ruidoso Valley in 1925.


Lottie during here 97 years of life here among us has brought many blessings into the lives of all of us, which will remain with us always.

**Apple Crisp**  
 1 cup sugar  
 1 cup flour  
 1 egg  
 1/3 cup melted butter  
 6 medium-size tart apples such as Winesap  
 1 teaspoon baking powder

Set oven at 325 degrees. Slice apples and place in greased baking dish. Mix together sugar, flour and egg. Stir with a fork until mixture is crumbly and sprinkle over apples. Pour melted butter over all and dust with cinnamon. Bake about 40 minutes until brown and bubbly. Serve hot with whip cream or ice cream.

**Sugar-Free Apple Sauce**  
 12 Golden Delicious apples\*  
 Water  
 Cinnamon (optional)

Wash apples, remove stems, trim bottom and cut into thick slices. Leave the skin on because it adds vitamins and coloring to the sauce. Place the apples in a pressure cooker and add at least 1/4 cup water.

Bring pressure up, cook for 3 or 4 minutes and turn heat off. Let the mixture set for 3 or 4 minutes. Place cooker in cool water to reduce pressure before opening. Press cooked apples through a colander to remove skin and solids. Add a small

The local apple harvest is underway, and many area

cooks say they pick their own before whipping up favorite apple dishes, some of which have been handed down from one generation to the next.

These women and others have generously shared some of their apple recipes with our newspaper readers — from apple bread to apple candy.

**Apples - versatile to the core**

amount of cinnamon, if desired, at this time for a spicier flavor. Sauce may be canned, frozen or eaten fresh.

\*If another variety than Golden Delicious is used, add sugar to taste after the apples are pulped)

**Apple candy**

2 cups Sugar-Free Apple Sauce (see above)  
 4 envelopes unflavored gelatin  
 4 cups sugar  
 1/8 teaspoon salt  
 1 1/2 cups walnuts or pecans pieces  
 2 tablespoons lemon juice  
 red food coloring  
 powdered sugar (optional)

Cook first four ingredients on low heat in a heavy sauce pan to a boil. Boil for 20 minutes, remove from heat. Add lemon juice and cool pan in cold water.

Stir mixture until very thick and cool. Add nuts and red coloring to desired hue. Pour into a 9 x 9 x 2 buttered pan. When set, cut candy into squares and cover with wax paper.

Powdered sugar may be sprinkled on top of candy or individual squares may be rolled in powdered sugar. Store in refrigerator. Makes about 20 squares of soft candy.

Ruidoso Downs Trustee Margie Morales doesn't like raw apples, but she loves them in this recipe given to her by a friend.

**Apple Bread**

3 cups flour  
 1 teaspoon baking soda  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1 1/2 cups vegetable oil  
 3 large eggs  
 2 cups sugar  
 2 teaspoon vanilla  
 3 cups diced apples  
 1 cup pecans

Set oven at 350 degrees and grease a tube pan. Sift flour, soda, salt together. Mix separately oil, eggs, sugar and vanilla until fluffy. Stir in flour mixture. Add apples and pecans. Bake for about 1 hour. Pour melted margarine on top of cake.

Cathy Annala, wife of Dr. Ron Annala, is known for her apple butter recipe, which she has made for many years.

**Apple Butter**

apple mixture  
 1 peck apples, preferably Winesap or Jonathan  
 (8 quarts or about 24 apples)

To make apple mixture, peel, core and quarter apples. Stew or simmer in a large pan with a small amount of water until tender, about 30 minutes. Put through a colander to remove solids. Then use the following proportions:

4 cups of apple mixture  
 3 cups sugar  
 2 tablespoons cinnamon  
 1 teaspoon allspice

1 teaspoon cloves

Mix ingredients and cook over medium heat in a heavy sauce pan, stirring often. Cook 1 hour to 1 1/2 hours until thick and bubbly. Be careful to not be burned by splatters from the mixture. Larger batches will need to cook longer. Apple butter is done when it reaches the consistency of a thick gravy. Apple butter may be put into sterilized jars and sealed or it can be refrigerated.

For the past three years, Amelia Trujillo has won awards for her apple pie, most recently at the Arts in the Orchard celebration. She uses Stayman Winesap apples.

**Apple Pie**

a double pie crust  
 sliced apples (enough to fill a pie pan)  
 1 cup sugar  
 2 tablespoons flour  
 2 teaspoons cinnamon  
 lemon juice  
 butter

Set oven for 350 degrees. Line pie pan with half pie crust. Peel and slice apples.

Mix with sugar, flour, cinnamon and pour on top of crust. Squeeze lemon juice over apples and dot with butter before putting top crust over apples. Cut vents in crust. Bake for about 1 hour.

**BRIDGE TACTICS**

**A stitch in time saves nine**

East dealer.  
 Neither side vulnerable.

There are many deals where declarer tries to shape his play so that a particular defender does not gain the lead at a critical time. For example, take this case where West leads a spade against three notrump.

**NORTH**  
 ♠ A Q 10  
 ♥ 7 4 3  
 ♦ K 10 8 5 2  
 ♣ K 9

**WEST**  
 ♠ J 9 7 6 3  
 ♥ K 8 2  
 ♦ Q  
 ♣ 10 7 6 4

**EAST**  
 ♠ 4 2  
 ♥ J 10 9 8 5  
 ♦ A J  
 ♣ 8 5 3 2

**SOUTH**  
 ♠ K 8 5  
 ♥ A Q  
 ♦ 9 7 6 4 3  
 ♣ A Q J

The bidding:  
 East 1NT South West North  
 Pass 1NT Pass 3NT  
 Opening lead — six of spades.

When the deal occurred, South won the spade with the king and, since he couldn't make nine tricks without attacking diamonds, next led a diamond toward dummy. West's queen was covered by the king and ace, whereupon East returned the jack of hearts.

Declarer was now a dead duck regardless of what he did. In practice, he finessed the queen, losing to West's king, and won the next heart with the ace. A diamond was then conceded to the jack, but East cashed three more hearts to score a two-trick set.

South's undoing came at trick two, when he covered West's queen of diamonds with the king. When the queen appeared, he should have realized that he could guarantee the contract 100 percent by playing low from dummy!

If West had the Q-J doubleton, East would have to win the queen with the ace, establishing dummy's remaining diamonds. If West had the A-Q doubleton,

the queen would win, but West could not then effectively attack hearts from his side. This would be equally true if West had the A-Q-J.

Finally, if West had the singleton queen, as in the actual case, no harm could come from playing low, but the contract might be lost by playing dummy's king, since this would allow East to take the ace and return a heart before the diamonds were established. Thus, every threat could be defused by withholding the king, leaving the defense helpless. Note that East could not afford to overtake the queen with the ace, as this would establish the diamonds.

While it's true that the recommended play would lose a trick if West had the A-Q doubleton, this is of very little import. As always, the object is to make the contract, and declarer should take every step necessary to achieve that goal.

## School Board discusses construction, athletics

Ruidoso Municipal School District building projects were delayed by the rain this summer and by an accident at White Mountain Middle School, but progress is being made, the superintendent of schools told the school board Sept. 9.

Mike Gladden explained that the slab for the gymnasium at the stadium of Ruidoso Middle School was poured Sept. 3 and metal framing for the walls and roof of the Ruidoso Middle School gymnasium was to start toward the end of last week. The roofing should be completed within the next three weeks, he said.

Gladden updated the board on other building projects. Lighting for the area behind the high school was to arrive Sept. 11 and to be installed by Texas New Mexico Power Company this week. Paving at Nob Hill Early Childhood Center has

been completed.

The old concession stand with restrooms was torn down to build the new gym, so a portable concession stand and portable toilets were lined up for the home games.

Ron Hodges, principal at the high school, told the board that the New Mexico Activities Association interviewed students, parents, coaches and athletic programs to evaluate the school for gender equity. The report he received suggested encouraging more female participation in football, hiring more female coaches, and creating office space and storage for female coaches.

"Many areas have already been addressed," Hodges said. This year a female coach was added to the volleyball program and office and storage space is in progress.

The board decided to make the first of their monthly visits to the schools on Sept. 24 to Nob Hill Early Learning Center.

## Road rules

### Area children learn bicycle safety

Kids got the chance Saturday to check their bicycling skills, trade in outgrown helmets for new ones, and learn what it takes to ride bikes safely on the streets.

Children as young as three brought their bikes to the annual event sponsored by the Optimist Club to teach bicycle safety.

The Ruidoso Police Department painted lines on the parking lot of White Mountain Elementary School to simulate streets, crosswalks and hairpin turns, and used orange cones to form obstacle courses.

"This is a national program that Optimist International recommends that each club do every year," said acting president Phil DiPaolo. "We feel it's real important to teach them the rules of the road and to wear helmets."

Usually about 30 children show up, he said, but this year 61 ran their bikes through obstacles courses, safety inspections and participated in a drawing for two new bikes and 20 other prizes.

Sylvia Wilson, family service coordinator with Headstart and a member of the Optimist Club, coordinated the event, while DiPaolo set up the obstacle course with the Police Department, and passed out

prizes.

Joel Salas, a third-grader from Ruidoso, and Morgan McMakin, a third-grader from Capitan, won new bikes in the main drawing.

Wal-Mart and Lincoln County Medical Center donated the helmets, and Crimestoppers and Wal-Mart each donated a bike for the drawing. The other 20 prizes included pads, water bottles, and air pumps, and were donated by the Optimist Club. The first 40 cyclists to arrive got free helmets by trading them in for bigger ones, and the old ones were also given away. Refreshments were donated by McDonald's and Furr's.

The Ruidoso Police Department lead the children through obstacle courses on a simulated street — going around in a circle four times, staying within parallel lines a foot apart, signaling at crosswalks, stopping at stop signs, taking curves, riding as slowly as possible, and starting and stopping on a 60-foot stretch.

"The biggest problem is the kids don't understand that they have to stop for stop signs and obey all the traffic laws," said Eric Woods of the Ruidoso Police Department. Although there is no law requiring the wearing of helmets, he said that's a problem. "All the bike accidents I've

seen have been usually the result of a bicyclist not obeying a stop sign and slamming into the back of a car," he said.

The bike inspections were thorough. Woods checked spokes, tires, chains, the "wobble" of the bike and overall stability.

He also wrote down the serial numbers of the bicycles for participants to take home and keep in case of loss or theft.

"Don't let her ride this bike," he told a nine-year-old's aunt. "The spokes are loose, the tires are loose, it's got a bad tire, and if she got going fast down hill, she could get hurt."

"I've been telling my mom I need a new bike," she said.




## Father of Our Constitution Great James Madison



THINK BACK IN TIME MORE THAN 200 YEARS, TO THE SUMMER OF 1787.

The Constitution is our plan of government. This most important document was written at a special meeting held from May to September of 1787. The meeting was held in Philadelphia in a building that we call Independence Hall.



James Madison of Virginia was 38 years old when he attended the convention. As a child, he had been frail and sickly. He spent his time reading.



At just over 6 feet tall, James Madison was a little man. The picture is a life-size model of him shown standing next to a chair. He spoke with a soft voice, but people usually listened to him. Although very timid, he rose to speak 150 times during the convention.

More than any other delegate, James Madison influenced what went on at the convention. He is called the Father of our Constitution.

Madison got many ideas from books. He was the kind of person who always did his homework and tried to be well-prepared. He arrived 10 days before the convention started so that he could be ready. He had a plan in mind. Many of those ideas were adopted.

### The Constitution


Madison's writings are the best single record of what went on at the convention. He did not miss a day of the meetings. He sat on the front row for as long as six hours at a time taking notes. Each night he wrote a complete report of the events.

After the signing, Madison was one of the authors of a series of newspaper articles in favor of the Constitution. This series gives us a good idea of exactly what the signers were thinking.

### The Bill of Rights

Madison served as a member of the first Congress to meet after the Constitution was approved. He proposed amendments, or changes. These first 10 amendments are called the Bill of Rights. These were adopted by the states in 1791.

The week of Sept. 17 through 23 is Constitution Week.



Fifty-five delegates from 12 states attended the convention. Madison is shown to the right of George Washington, who served as president. The Constitution was signed on Sept. 17, 1787.

## James Madison and His Wife, Dolley



Philadelphia, Pa., was the biggest city in the United States in the late 1700s. It was a busy river port city with more than 40,000 people from all over the world. It was also a center of power. Congress met there.

### Hello, Dolley

Dolley Payne Todd was a beauty with black hair and blue eyes. She and James Madison were the same height. She was 26. He was 43.



While serving in Congress, James Madison met a young widow, Dolley Todd. Her husband, her youngest son and thousands of others had died in a yellow fever epidemic that spread through Philadelphia the year before.

"Aaron Burr says that the great little Madison has asked to be brought to see me this evening," she wrote a friend.

James and Dolley got along very well. They were married later in that year, 1794. Dolley was warm and friendly. James was quiet and shy.

The couple moved to James

Madison's Virginia plantation, Montpelier.

Thomas Jefferson chose James Madison to be his secretary of state to handle the new United States' dealings with other countries. The Madisons moved to Washington, D.C. Thomas Jefferson's wife had died, so Dolley



Madison was elected our fourth president, and he and Dolley moved into the White House themselves. She decorated it with great taste. She loved to give parties and people loved to be invited. Throughout their marriage, she was a great help to him.

Dolley had been a member of the Quaker religion before she married Madison. Quakers wore plain clothes. After she married Madison, she dressed in bright colors. This model is wearing one of her dresses.

In 1814, while James Madison was president, the White House was burned by the British. We were at war with them because the British were interfering with American shipping. Dolley fled the White House just before the British arrived.



She took this portrait of George Washington with her. It is the one item that has been in the White House since it was built. It is a great national treasure.



The Madisons had no children of their own. Dolley had one living son, Payne, by her first husband. Madison treated him like he was his own. Payne was a great disappointment to them. Dolley was forced to sell Montpelier to pay some of his debts.



The U.S. Treasury will issue a new \$1 silver Dolley Madison coin in January 1999. It is a collector's item. It is valued at \$1 but will sell for \$30 to \$37. A part of the funds it raises will help support the upkeep on Madison's home, Montpelier.



Madison outlived the other signers of the Constitution. He died in 1836 at the age of 85. He is pictured here in a cap men often wore around the house in the winter.



Dolley often wore turbans. After Madison's death she moved from Montpelier to Washington. She died in 1849 at the age of 81.

I forgive them for the way they treated me, but my heart is heavy with sadness for all the dogs who live and die on a chain.

(Signed) A lonely dog.

Not everyone can have a fenced yard and people have to work during the day, so many dogs spend time on cables or chains.

But when an owner comes home from work, any dog trainer will tell you how important it is to bring the pet inside and allow him or her or them to join the family "pack" and their alpha leader - you.

As you may have guessed, I have more animals that I planned, through adoptions and rescues. Several spend their days on cables. Being social animals, I always try to have at least two out together so they are not alone.

When I come home, the first thing I do is greet them warmly and bring them inside. I sleep surrounded by the "herd" and try to share as much of my time with them as possible, while also being with other family members.

On weekends, I try to walk each dog and when I get a break, I take those in good enough physical shape on two or three hour hikes.

Pets like children deserve your love, care, attention and protection.

## The Farmer's Wife on PBS is week's best soap opera

Forget *The Young and the Restless* and *All My Children*. The best soap opera on TV this week is a PBS *Frontline* miniseries airing Monday through Wednesday, Sept. 21-23 (check local listings).

While it has most of the elements of a commercial soaper, however, *The Farmer's Wife* - filmmaker David Sutherland's three-part, six-hour-plus documentary on the life of a Nebraska farm family - is all too real.

The title "character" in *Wife* is Juanita Buschkoetter, a sad-eyed brunette struggling to keep her family and marriage together in the face of what may be hopeless economic hardship.

Her marriage to Darrel, who is a few years older, never has been a day at the beach. From the beginning, Juanita's white-collar family has viewed the union with mild disapproval.

Her mother even offered to pay to have Juanita's crooked front teeth fixed if she didn't marry Darrel, and

she remains convinced that her son-in-law is not a good provider.

And Darrel has issues of his own. His taciturn, aloof farmer father hasn't done much for his son's self-esteem, leaving Darrel feeling increasingly depressed and defensive as an early frost has a devastating effect on his crops and puts the farm in jeopardy.

Darrel even becomes paranoid about his loyal wife, fretting that she is being unfaithful and that any outside activity, including school, will lead her to leave him.

As a result, much of the responsibility for keeping their three children happy and the creditors at bay falls on Juanita's slender but steely shoulders.

Watching the personal challenges and, ultimately, the victory of this farm family makes for addictive television - especially given Sutherland's painterly eye with his visuals, which often look like an Andrew Wyeth canvas. You won't soon forget a shot like the one in which a violent thunderstorm churns on the horizon, about to sweep down like the wrath of God.

## New female characters join three NBC dramas

When NBC's *Law & Order*, *ER* and *Homicide: Life on the Street* begin new seasons this week, three new female characters join the fray.

Wednesday, Sept. 23, in *Law & Order*, Angie Harmon introduces Assistant District Attorney Abbie Carmichael, whose independent style rubs womanizing colleague Jack McCoy (Sam Waterston) the wrong way. But with a 95 percent conviction rate at her last job, Abbie is a hard woman to argue with.

"She has a lot more strength than the past two characters I've done," Harmon says, referring to her roles in *Baywatch Nights* and *C-16*.

"She's used to (prosecuting) drug dealers. She's used to working on her own and getting the job done."

If there is any doubt about Harmon's suitability for a spot in the cerebral drama, executive producer Dick Wolf has a ready response.

"This woman is a terrific actress," Wolf says. "Holding people's previous credits against them, in this business, is pretty risky."

Besides, Wolf adds, "There is a wish-fulfillment factor (for female viewers) when you put an attractive woman in a situation where she is doing real, adult stuff and doing it with obvious intelligence."

Wolf's wish theory must be contagious, because a beautiful woman is one of two new characters joining the *Homicide* team when it returns Friday, Sept. 25.

In the wake of last season's squad room massacre, Lt. Giardello (Yaphet Kotto) welcomes Detective Rene Sheppard, played by Michael Michele, who had a recurring role in Wolf's *New York Undercover*.

A former beauty queen, Rene can handle her caseload perfectly well, thank you, and won't let her good looks be held against her. It seems a good bet Rene will have a juicy role in the next *Law-Homicide* crossover story line, coming later in the season.

Also new to the show is FBI agent Mike Giardello (Giancarlo Esposito), the lieutenant's estranged son, who

transfers in from out of town to work in tandem with the homicide squad. Though he won't report to his father, the close working relationship will give viewers a window on Giardello's home life, a previously unexplored arena.

Overall this season, Tom Fontana, the show's executive producer, says viewers should expect a broader focus for *Homicide*, unlike last season, when Andre Braugher's Frank Pembleton was the centerpiece.

On Thursday, Sept. 24, *ER* welcomes Kellie Martin (*Christy*, *Life Goes On*) as third-year medical student Lucy Knight.

Martin says the name Knight is appropriate for her character, as she thinks she is going to save the world.

"She is a big screw-up, though. That's the big shocker," the actress says. "She's a straight-A student in the classroom, but when she gets into the arena and she actually has to put in an IV, she doesn't know what to do."

In fact, Martin says, her character is turning out to be a bit of comic relief for the show. "She doesn't threaten anyone's life with her blunders. That wouldn't be funny, obviously. But (her antics are) really funny right now. She's just mangling everything."

For those wondering how George Clooney's character, Dr. Ross, will exit the show at season's end, producer John Wells says he's worked it all out with Clooney, but for now at least that bit of medical information will remain confidential.




