



# Lincoln County pay raises marred by confusion again

When Lincoln County Commissioners approved raises for all newly elected county officials last week, they thought they were giving about a 10 percent increase.

But they found out Monday the raise is higher. Instead of seeing the \$10,005 salary for commissioners go up by \$1,000, the three commissioners starting new terms in January will receive \$13,121 a year, a 31 percent increase.

"The percentages used in the chart given to commissioners contained some inaccuracies," County Manager Tom Stewart said.

County Treasurer Joan Park said the chart showed what other elected officials would earn at

76 percent of the maximum allowed under the county's new size and valuation classification. Under that same chart, commissioners were listed at a 67 percent increase, but that wasn't specified. The salary figures presented appeared to be lumped under 76 percent with other eligible elected officials.

She apologized Monday for the confusion the chart caused.

The maximum allowed for the treasurer, assessor and clerk is \$43,301, for the sheriff it's \$45,141 and for commissioners, \$17,264. The salary approved for the new terms of Park and County Clerk Martha Proctor is \$33,143, about a \$3,000 raise.

Stewart said he learned from the New Mexico Association of Counties that Lincoln is the only

county in the state that rescinded previous raises given to elected officials under a district court ruling reaffirming the need for equity in pay.

Last week, commissioners rescinded the pay increases given in July 1997, because the state Supreme Court in October overturned the district court ruling. The majority of the higher court decided the state constitutional provision against raising or lowering a county official's salary in mid-term took precedence over a state law requiring equity in pay for people doing the same job. The intent of the constitutional amendment is to ensure that county commissioners don't approve pay raises for themselves.

"Those actions (approving the raises in July 1997) were taken in good faith and the ruling (from the supreme court) was not to do that any-

more, but not to go back and demote people," Stewart said. "So that will be discussed at the commission's special meeting Thursday."

The meeting will start at 9 a.m. at the Zia Senior Citizens Center in Ruidoso Downs.

The 76 percent of maximum raises for the clerk and treasurer are the same as the 10 percent raises approved in 1997, then rescinded last week.

Commission Chairman L. Ray Nunley said Monday that even after a meeting with County Attorney Alan Morel, Proctor and Park, he's still confused about the situation. Morel last week had recommended rescinding the 1997 raises.

Nunley said at the meeting last week he

# Valley resident Dan Storm loses home to fire

It got pretty hot at Dan Storm's yard gate the other night.

Storm's home near the Rio Ruidoso at Glencoe burned to the ground in the early morning hours Tuesday. The long-time columnist for the *Ruidoso News* suffered smoke inhalation, but was not burned.

He was in stable condition at Lincoln County Medical Center late Tuesday, awaiting the arrival of his brother, Lynn, from Austin, Texas.

Storm in October marked his 89th birthday; he has lived in Glencoe since his family settled there in the 1920s, and has written regularly for the

*Ruidoso News* for more than 50 years.

State Policeman Jose Salazar, recently assigned to the area, found Storm huddled beside a tank outside the house about five minutes after a passing motorist, who had spotted the burning house from the highway, called the emergency phone number, 911.

Salazar was credited by one of Storm's friends, Diana Buchanan of Ruidoso, with saving Storm's life. "Another 10 minutes, and Dan might not have made it," she said at LCMC on Tuesday afternoon. She had spent the day at the hospital. She said neighbors are taking care of Storm's livestock. His big Chevrolet Suburban was not damaged by the fire.

Friends said another of Storm's brothers, Mark, of Houston, Texas, owns a house near Dan's place, and

# Propane spill closes U.S. 380

A tanker truck filled with propane gas overturned early Tuesday morning on U.S. Highway 380 about 10 miles east of Carrizozo, prompting New Mexico State Police to close the road for about 24 hours.

No one was seriously injured in the accident, in which the 18-wheeler driven by 74-year-old Benson Harrison went off the road at about 4:40 a.m. Tuesday and rolled in a ditch, said Lt. William Bower with the Department of Public Safety in Alamogordo. Harrison was taken to Lincoln County Medical Center for treatment of minor injuries and released Tuesday, Jule Sterchi, hospital administrator, said.

Police closed the road because the tanker's release valve was sheared off when it overturned, releasing vapors. The owner of the truck, Little Transport of Roswell, brought a replacement tanker to the site at about 9:30 a.m. but was

unable to transfer the propane.

At noon Tuesday, propane began burning off the 9,000 gallons of propane in the overturned tanker, a process expected to take 12 or more hours, officials said.

Details of why the accident occurred were not available by press time Tuesday, Bower said.

"All we know is that he lost control of the tanker and went off the road and rolled it over into a ditch," he said.

The tanker does not block the road, he said, adding, "Once the propane is burned off it won't take very long to get it out of there."

National Propane of Roswell owned the propane in the tanker. Dave Watson, a spokesperson for the national firm, said Tuesday the propane doesn't represent a health risk except as a fuel.

"Propane is not a toxic fuel," Watson said. "The danger would be from coming into contact with a heat source. But once it dissipates into the environment, there is no risk — it's a clean fuel."

# Arbitration 'pre-hearing' set for Jan. 6

A pre-hearing will be Jan. 6 for arbitration between the Mescalero Apache Tribe and the New Mexico Gaming Control Board regarding the tribe's refusal to pay mandated gambling revenues to the state, an arbitrator in the case said Tuesday.

"But we won't be talking about the merits of the case at all at that time," said Paul Bender, a law professor at Arizona State University and the third and neutral arbitrator chosen to resolve the dispute.

The tentative location for the pre-hearing, in which the arbitrators will decide the date for the actual arbitration hearing as well as other matters, has been stated as the Mescalero Inn, Bender said Tuesday from his home in the Phoenix, Ariz., area.

The arbitration process actually began in spring of this year. The Mescalero have refused to pay 16-percent of slot machine revenues from Casino Apache since the first quarterly payment was due in September 1997. The revenue share is mandated

in the gambling legislation that narrowly passed into law in the spring of 1997.

Former Mescalero President Wendell Chino, who died in November, said earlier that the percent was too high to be legal under federal guidelines for gambling compacts between states and tribes. The tribe signed the gambling compacts under protest.

Because the revenue sharing is state law, the three arbitrators in the case will not be able to reduce the percentage amount.

Two other tribes, the Taos and Acoma pueblos, are expected to join the arbitration process. Bender said part of the pre-hearing will be spent going over procedures with the two other tribes.

Another gaming tribe, the Jicarilla Apache, also has asked to be included in the arbitration. Because of objections from both the state and the Mescalero, the Jicarilla probably will not be allowed to join the process, state officials have said. The decision is up to the arbitrators, one of whom was selected by the tribe, another by

the state and the third, Bender, by the other two arbitrators. Fred Ragsdale, a New Mexico attorney, is the arbitrator selected by the state, and Glenn Feldman, a Phoenix attorney, is the arbitrator chosen by the tribe.

The entire arbitration process, slowed for months by many delays, recently was pushed back again. The previous pre-hearing date of Dec. 21 was changed to Jan. 6 because of both Chino's death and the resignation of Scott Spencer, acting representative for the Gaming Control Board. George McGeorge, an accountant for the state, has been named as Spencer's replacement.

"Both parties wanted us to put it off for a while," Bender said of the pre-hearing.

The trio of arbitrators were to decide Tuesday whether the pre-hearing will be open to the public. Bender declined to say Tuesday what that decision is because he had not yet been able to review it with Ragsdale.

Whether or not the actual arbitration will be open or closed to the public will be decided at the pre-hearing, Bender said.


### Dec./Jan. phases of the moon




### STARDATE

#### White Oaks Eagle Dec. 20, 1900

# County commission bumps up lodgers taxes

Although owners of lodging businesses in the unincorporated portions of Lincoln County nearly unanimously opposed the action, they will be paying double the amount of lodgers tax next year.

The County Commission voted 3-2 to increase from two percent to four percent the spe-

cial tax on motels, hotels, RV parks and bed and breakfasts. The money is used to promote the county through billboards and advertising of events that draw tourists to the area.

Commissioners William Schwettmann and Rex Wilson voted against the motion by Monroy Montes, who said he didn't consider the increase a hardship to the businesses. Voting with Montes were Commissioner Wilton Howell

and Chairman L. Ray Nunley. David Singletary, owner of High Country Lodge, said he may pay more lodgers tax than any other business in the county outside of municipalities.

He presented a petition against the increase with the signatures of 24 out of 29 businesses that pay the tax, which is included on room charges and passed through to the county.

He asked for an accounting of where the Lodgers Tax

Committee has spent the estimated \$21,000 annual budget, saying the group should focus on developing new events to generate lodgers in off seasons.

Paul Crown, chairman of the committee, said meetings are the third Wednesday of each month and are open to the public. He welcomes input from Singletary or anyone else who might improve their effort, he said.

voted against raising the salaries of three incoming commissioners (himself included) several thousands of dollars more than the two commissioners in mid-term. But he went along with the figures on the chart for 76 percent of maximum, because he thought it amounted to a \$1,000 increase - about a 10 percent raise.

"Alan still is sorting things out," Nunley said Monday. "I want to do what's right. We

need to fix it and be right and be fair in doing it."

Commissioner Wilton Howell said he doesn't like the idea of Nunley, Park and Proctor meeting with Morel behind closed doors.

"They continue to circumvent the process for self-serving reasons," he said, adding that at no time has he supported raises for any of the elected officials.

Howell and Commissioner Rex Wilson, Sheriff Tom Sullivan, Assessor Patsy Serna and Probate Judge Stirling Spencer are not eligible for the

new raises under the supreme court ruling, because they are in the middle of their terms. But they had received the 10 percent increases in 1997 when the board was acting based on the district court ruling. They lost those increases when the board rescinded them last week.

Sullivan warned commissioners that eliminating the raises violates the state constitution by lowering his salary in mid-term.

It's not his own situation that bothers him the most, Sullivan said. The undersheriff

in his office and the chief deputy in the assessor's office will see their salaries reduced with the rescinding of the 1997 raises, he said.

"My undersheriff and Patsy Serna's chief deputy make 85 percent of our salaries," Sullivan said. "By reducing mine, they did his - essentially demoting him. If they won't reinstate the raises, they could at least leave his salary where it was and take it out of what was budgeted for mine."

"That's my main concern. I can take the hit. I won't starve."

Dan will stay there after he leaves the hospital.

At about 2 a.m. Tuesday, the Ruidoso Downs Fire Department responded to a fire call in the Ruidoso-Hondo Valley from the New Mexico State Police.

Fire Chief Nick Herrera said the fire that destroyed the house apparently was started by one of several space heaters that were in the residence. He said the fire probably started in the living room of the house.

"It was a real old house, which caused it to be a very fast fire," Herrera said. "The house was made of solid wood ... (it was) just like gasoline."

The fire department fought the fire for about seven hours, Herrera said. It was a difficult fire to extinguish because of the lack of fire hydrants in the valley. And the fire was very hot.

"We couldn't get enough water on it fast enough," Herrera said.

Herrera said Storm had a number of magazines, notebooks and newspapers in the house that added to the intensity of the fire. "Newspapers are

very toxic and a fire hazard," Herrera said.

Friends have established accounts for Storm's benefit at the Ruidoso State Bank (account number 475-777) and Norwest Bank.

Kenneth Green, who owned the Ruidoso News from 1975 to 1988, said at his Artesia home on learning of the fire that "Dan's house was a remarkable place; he probably had a copy of

every newspaper that contained one of his columns."

Storm's newspaper columns, "The Dreamer" on Wednesday and "The Silver Lining" on Friday, frequently open with a report on the weather in his beloved river valley - often as not with a report of the temperature "at high noon at the yard gate." Cold turned hot at the yard gate at 1 a.m. Tuesday.

# Hubbard group to take over Lincoln Trust properties

Another private museum may step into the shoes of the Lincoln County Heritage Trust in the historic settlement of Lincoln.

Trustees are in negotiations with the Hubbard Museum (also known as the Museum of the Horse) in Ruidoso Downs to take over assets of the Trust after its dissolution.

The decision last week by trustees to move ahead with the dissolution of the Trust means members of the board must choose an entity with a similar purpose for transfer of the assets after all debts are paid, said member J. Robert Beauvais.

Trustees decided in October to close the visitor's center museum and the Dr. Woods House annex in Lincoln to give them time to assess the financial situ-

ation. They hoped to reopen in the summer, but decided that the Trust could no longer afford to absorb a \$50,000 loss per year. They sold the Wortley Hotel, using the proceeds to ensure that all debts are paid and the Trust has some money in the bank while negotiating.

A resolution of voluntary dissolution was approved last week by the four remaining members, Scot Schafer, Beauvais, Bob Boebinger and board chairman Frances T. "Dede" Freeman.

The Hubbard Museum Tuesday confirmed that it is discussing the Hubbard group's assumption of the Trust's assets. The Hubbard Museum also operates the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium and the Ruidoso Downs

Race Horse Hall of Fame. The Billy the Kid National Scenic By-Way, which has an interpretive center at the entrance to The Museum of the Horse.

"We think the assumption of the trust's assets by the Hubbard Museum is a logical extension for what we're trying to do in our mission to promote the horse in the American West," said Bruce Eldredge, Hubbard museum director.

Dede Freeman said she's delighted with the agreement.

"We trustees feel ... having them take over is the only possible for the continued operation of this museum," she said Tuesday. "Mr. and Mrs. Robert O. Anderson (one of the founders of the museum and

its major benefactor) are pleased with the merger. They will be changing the name of the museum to the Robert O. Anderson and Gaylord Freeman Museum."

Mrs. Freeman's husband, the late Gaylord Freeman, also was deeply involved in the development of the trust and its properties.

"Mrs. Freeman as chairman of the board has signed a letter of intent that we gave them saying that we want to work with them to assume their assets," Eldredge said. "It's not final until we determine all of the assets and where they are. At this point, we have an agreement that

says we will work together to assume their assets."

Eldredge hopes that by May 1 the visitors' center will be open seven days a week and that its hours will mirror those of the state Monuments Division properties.

"I'm not able to give a solid 'by this date' answer," for when the doors will be open again, he said. "We need to go in and look at the inventory records so we know what we're assuming. We then need to do work within the visitors center, sprucing up exhibitions, that sort of thing."

"...It might take 30 to 60 days to do all of the paperwork. During that time, we can go in and begin the work."

Eldredge said he has discussed the possibility of a joint ticket for state monuments and museum properties with the on-site state manager and with the state Office of Cultural Affairs.

The museum intends to assume all assets of the Trust, but specific discussions have occurred about the parking lot next to the Billy the Kid Pageant amphitheater and about water rights, Eldredge said.

"We will work with the pageant committee; we will allow them to use that property," Eldredge said. "We also have made a commitment to the Trust board we would work with the Lincoln Water Users Association on water rights."

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower in Seoul, Korea.


He returned from Korea in 1953 and married Wanda Autrey. Two weeks later he and his bride traveled across most of Texas with Standard Oil Company.

## Mechem road work near winter shut-down

Long delays on Mechem Drive because of one-lane traffic should be finished by the end of the week, a highway official says.

"We anticipate one-lane traffic all the way through the 18th. And that could be shorter or longer dependent on the weather," Ernest Sanchez, project manager with the New Mexico Department of Highway and Transportation, said.

Though most work along the \$8.4 million project came to a stop last week after a snow storm blew in, Sanchez was optimistic there would be enough good weather days this week to complete paving the northern half of the 4-mile stretch.

Sanchez, who oversees the work for the state, said the contractor will not be going back to 24-hour shifts on the project. "They may go back to 18- and 16-hour days for a while, though," he said.

The contractor, Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc., started round-the-clock work about two weeks ago in order to finish enough of the east lane from Cree Meadows to White Mountain Drive to transfer traffic to

that lane for the winter.

Kevin Clower, a Meadow Valley spokesperson, said when that work is completed, the company will move its paving equipment to Alamogordo, where the company has another state highway contract.

"Once we get the pavement buttoned up this week, things are really going to slow down," Clower said.

Temporary pavement is to be put down for driveway accesses and crossovers along the construction area for the winter, Sanchez said.

Concrete barriers will remain in place along the southern portion of Mechem Drive, from Sudderth Drive to Cree Meadows Drive.

Should the company miss the Dec. 18 deadline, work will be finished no later than 5 p.m. Dec. 23, according to Meadow Valley officials.

Sanchez said last week one more layer of asphalt needs to be put on the east lane before traffic can be diverted to it. Considering a good weather forecast, Sanchez said he believes paving and other work will be completed this week. Permanent paving cannot be put down unless the ground

temperature is 45 degrees and rising, according to road construction officials. Temporary pavement may be laid in colder temperatures.

"We just need some good weather to pave over the transitions — where the traffic shifts from the existing State (Road) 48 to the new State 48," he said.

Clower said some blasting was done earlier this week along Alto Hill to break up rock beds in areas where a replacement water line is to be installed. More blasting will be done if the subcontractor, American Mining, finds rock beds in the path of the planned water line trench.

A new water line is being installed because some of the larger blast sites for the road construction are too close to the current water line. The pipe carries water from Ruidoso's two primary tanks in Alto to more than half the village.

Though the explosions are small for the trench work, the road will be closed during the blasting. The road closures typically take place in the late morning or early afternoon and last about 15 minutes, Clower said.

**Politics and justice at the pinnacle of power**

Now, in the winter of our national discontent, despite economic prosperity, our elected House of Representatives seeks to impeach William Jefferson Clinton, the 42nd president of these United States, for high crimes and misdemeanors, in accordance with the Constitution.

The congressional vote on Thursday will be the third such proceeding since the nation's founding.

President Andrew Johnson, a Democrat, the 17th president, was impeached in May of 1868 and survived two votes in a Senate trial by just one vote. His impeachment, the history books state, came from a House discontented with his repeated vetoes of bills imposing harsh measures on the former Confederate states during reconstruction after the Civil War. Curiously, he had been selected by the Republicans to run as Abraham Lincoln's vice president, to bring "balance" to the ticket, and took office after Lincoln was assassinated.

Richard Milhouse Nixon, the 37th president, a Republican, resigned his office on Aug. 9, 1974, rather than face House impeachment and a Senate trial. It was the first such resignation in the nation's history. Nixon's high crimes were the use of his office to cover up a criminal activity, the break-in of Democratic national headquarters in 1972. The famous Oval Office tapes proved the case, and a "non-partisan" House Judiciary Committee moved on the issue.

The high crimes and misdemeanors to be considered by the House of Representatives in floor debate Thursday are much more complicated than anything facing Johnson in 1868 or Nixon in 1974. History's verdict on Johnson is that he had been targeted for purely political reasons. Nixon, simply and clearly, did attempt to use his office to avoid the consequences of the Watergate break-in—abuse of power.


The issue today seems to be in some middle ground between the blatant politics of 1868 and the outright abuse of power of 1974. Now we have a partisan drawing of lines over the issue of a president's shoddy morals.

President Clinton has admitted to lying to a grand jury, in a civil case. That is perjury. And he did use his office to avoid the consequences by feeding false information to staff members who relayed them to the grand jury; that is abuse of power.

Is all this sufficient for impeachment under the Constitution?

Clinton lied in a civil trial to conceal his own sexual misadventures; to protect his family and undoubtedly himself. But do these acts pose a danger to the nation? Many people think they should, even if the Constitution doesn't make it a requirement for impeachment.

"The system", it's said, worked with Nixon. Will it work with Clinton? Will history conclude that justice was done?

**By these names you will know us**

People who speak Spanish have lived in New Mexico for 400 years, and during that time they have given names to many towns, rivers, canyons and forests. These names tell a lot about the state, and those who don't speak Spanish often miss the little history lessons they teach.

Many of those names describe the vegetation in the area. For example, if you see the word "Alamo," you can expect to see cottonwood trees. "Los Alamos" means "the cottonwoods," "Alamitos" means "little cottonwoods," "Alamogordo" means "fat cottonwood," and "Alameda" means "cottonwood grove."

"Manzano" means "apple tree," and the village with that name is said to have been the place where the first apple trees on this continent were planted, by Franciscan friars in the early 1600s. That beats Johnny Appleseed (1774-1845) by almost two centuries.

"Nogal" means "walnut," and trees bearing that nut can be found in the town with that name. Similarly, oak trees — "encinos" — can be found in Encino and in 36 other places with variant names like Encinal, Encinos and Encinada.

Ranchers who build barbed-wire fences and those of us with wood stoves and fireplaces are familiar with several species of juniper, called "sabina" in Spanish. "Sabinal" means "place of the junipers." Some of these trees are also called cedars, although no true cedars grow in New Mexico. The village of "Cedro" reflects that confusion.

Just down the road from Cedro is "Escobosa," which means "thick with broom grass." And some 32 places in the state are named "Chamisa" or some variation thereof. The shrub those names refers to is not native to the Americas, but was brought here by the Spaniards. Soon many areas of northern New Mexico became "chamisa," or "overgrown with chamisa."

"Overgrown with scrub oak" is what the word "Chaparral" means, but it is also used to refer to our State Bird, the road-runner, which is quite adept at scurrying through scrub oak.

"La Tuna," in Doña Ana County, refers to the big prickly pear cactus that grows there. The flat, round leaves of this cactus resemble the fish, tuna.

There's one town in Socorro county called "Dusty" and another called "Polvadera." They both mean the same thing.

In Lincoln County, there is a town called "Alto," which means "high," and one called "Ancho," which means "wide." "La Bajada," the steep hill between Albuquerque and Santa Fe, means "the descent." Many Spanish names are

the three children of oil tycoon William Mitchell: MALcolm, JANet and MARGaret.

Exploring the names of New Mexico places is one of the best ways to learn about our state's history. And the best way to do that is to buy a copy of "The Place Names of New Mexico" by Robert Julian (UNM Press, 1996). It's an update and amplification of "New Mexico Place Names" by T.M. Pearce (UNM Press, 1965), and represents the work of a number of people going back to the New Mexico Writer's Project that started in 1936.

The best place for this book is in your glove compartment, where you and your children can get to it as you travel around the state. Write to Morrow Hall at P.O. Box 631, Estancia, NM 87016-0631, or e-mail: morrowhall@aol.com.

# Money matters expected to dominate county commission meeting

Money, money, money: discussions about the green stuff will dominate the Lincoln County Commission's special meeting Thursday as commissioners hash and rehash salaries for elected officials, sheriff's deputies and the assessor's chief deputy, and a proposed 10 percent raise for employees.

County Manager Tom Stewart also will review his plan to re-

organize the manager's office. The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the Zia Senior Citizens Center in Ruidoso Downs.

Commissioner Wilton Howell asked for a 10 percent employee raise to be put on the agenda, because similar raises were approved last week for some elected officials, he said.

"They (employees) have been told we'd discuss raises at mid-term on the budget (December)," Howell said. "They've been told we're tight on money and then

they see the elected officials getting raises. It's time we do something for them."

The county employs about 80 people. They received a three percent increase in July 1997, according to information from County Treasurer Joan Park. One-time merit increases were awarded in January of 1995 (\$484.83) and December of 1994 (\$275). Six percent raises were given in January 1994 and in October 1992.

Howell also wants to hear from Sheriff Tom Sullivan about

where he's getting the money to pay his deputies higher salaries than listed in the 1998-99 annual budget. If it's coming from the salaries of two unfilled positions, what will happen when Sullivan finally fills the jobs, Howell asked.

Sullivan said Monday that at that point he may have to increase his budget request.

Others followed that lead and asked for raises, Sullivan confirmed.

"It's perfectly legal," he said. "Deputies are not included in general raises for county employees. We're giving it to them according to the bargaining unit (procedures). All the commissioners signed off on that agreement."

The bargaining agreement contains a chart detailing what a deputy can earn based on the number of years of experience and advanced hours of study. To get to

the top (of the salary chart), you have to accumulate 110 months of experience and 500 hours of advance training. The experience doesn't have to be in this county, Sullivan said.

"We took the people who were eligible and sent in their payroll action sheets," he said.

To fund the raises, he's using the salary for two positions that have been vacant for the past 24 months. He is not taking the money from a Fast Cops grant he's applied for, Sullivan said.

# Area shippers gear to help Santa handle those holiday procrastinators

Last week, some local shippers said they wondered if people were procrastinating or cutting back on shipping presents to friends and relatives - but this week it is a different story.

Mail Depot at 2910 Sudderth was pretty quiet last week, but "next week, it'll be the disorganized people who'll start throwing Wal-Mart bags at you and tell you to wrap them," predicted Gwen Harrison, manager. She was right.

At the post office, employees said they are prepared for all the procrastinators.

They've adjusted lunches to make sure there are three window clerks available at all times, and on Dec. 8 the post

office started running an extra truck from Ruidoso to the post office in Carrizozo, which is a sorting facility, said Ruidoso postmaster John Quemada.

"Our clerks either have Christmas hats on or some type of decoration in their hair, and we have music going," he said, "so we're trying to lighten up the season."

Postal employee Pat Parham (sporting a Santa hat) said lines of customers were "out the door" most of the day on Monday, but they moved pretty quickly. She agreed with Quemada that customers are probably not waiting more than five minutes from the time they walk in.

Gloria Khazal, a clerk at the post office with dangling red and green gift ribbons in

her hair, said customers have been "fun," but pretty soon, last-minute shippers will feel the crunch.

"Their blood pressure is up, their bank accounts are down. They start acting really strange," said Khazal. "But they'll get over it."

Khazal said everything

should be mailed by Dec. 18 or 19.

"One of the reasons is that when they send it to their aunt in Washington and New York, they (relatives) have to find the time - because they're out shopping too - to go the post office to get it," she said.

It's already too late to send

packages to foreign addresses, she said.

For those who know they will be shipping at the last minute, Quemada said the post office has express mail with a second-day guarantee, and for most major cities, postal workers will deliver on Christmas day.

"They get paid more and

they get the joy of bringing a Christmas present on Christmas Day," he said.

During a momentary lull - when there wasn't a customer in sight - Khazal said it wouldn't last long.

"As soon as the parking lot clears at Wal-Mart, it'll fill up here," she said.

# Child care needs surveyed


Affordable childcare and other essential parenting information is the subject of a survey being conducted by Parents as Teachers and the First Christian Church.

The students will attend a State Board and Department of Education briefing on "Policymakers in the Policymaking Process" at 9:30 a.m. They will then meet with the State Department of Education management team and other staff for a question and answer session.

The 75 students are among those who have participated in forums this summer and fall before the Legislation Education Study Committee (LESC). The forums led to the development of the three student focus areas of teacher quality, student commitment and expanding opportunities for achievement. Following their morning meetings with the State Board and Department of Education officials, the students will observe and participate in discussions with LESC members.

# Downs council moves to zone residential and commercial areas

The Ruidoso Downs Village Council Monday requested the village attorney to begin work on a zoning ordinance to define the residential and commercial areas of the village.

The ordinance would help the village prepare for future growth and would better assist the village in determining what is needed in regard to water and fire safety issues, a village employee said.

"We need to regulate the growth of business because there is no handle anywhere on

it," Codes Enforcement Officer Tom Armstrong said.

Armstrong said the last zoning ordinance was written in 1988, and the definitions within the 1988 ordinance are unclear.

"All we have is a bunch of numbers that don't mean anything," Armstrong said.

Armstrong said the zoning regulation is needed so that industrial businesses will not be allowed to build within residential areas.

"You don't want a cement plant to be built beside a single-family home," Armstrong said.

Armstrong said that the village will be looking at each piece of property and will then define it on a map. Businesses and residential homes that are "grandfathered in" will be allowed to remain as they are as long as a change in ownership does not take place.

Village Attorney Dan Bryant said that "grandfather clauses" have traditionally allowed a business or residential area to remain legal, even though the business or residence may be in violation of the current zoning ordinance.

"As long as the existing business with the current own-

ership stays in place, it will be allowed to stay. If a sale takes place, the business will be subject to the new zoning ordinance," Bryant said.

With the anticipated growth of the village, undeveloped land will need to be defined as residential or commercial, which Armstrong said needs to be done now.

"We have undeveloped land that people are looking at, and we need to regulate it," Armstrong said.

Village Clerk Learn Weibrecht estimated that the village population has grown to approximately 1,250 people.

The 1990 US Census reported 923 residents in Ruidoso Downs.

In other village council news:

• The Business License Ordinance (No. 98-06) passed by a vote of 4-0. The Ordinance allows the licensing and regulation of certain businesses and allows licensing fees to be charged per day.

• The council tabled an animal control ordinance because a section stated that said "no person shall own or harbor within the village any cat or dog over the age of six months that has not been spayed or neutered, unless that person holds either a permit to keep an unaltered dog or cat or a

permit for breeding cats or dogs issued under section 6-9-22."

Trustee Judy Miller said the village council does not have the right to make people get their pet spayed or neutered.

"I don't see why everybody with an animal needs to be punished," Miller said. "Dogs are your property and it's going to far."

Village Attorney Dan Bryant said that the law is not designed to punish citizens, but is written to keep track of animal breeders.

"It's not to say that you can't have an unsterilized pet," Bryant said. "It's not across the board."

### Subdivision given green light by council

Ruidoso village councilors have overturned a decision by their Planning and Zoning Commission regarding street standards for a planned subdivision near Gavilan Canyon Road and Mechem Drive.

Rather than a 24-foot-wide paved road, developers of the Preserve must put in a 20-foot-wide road in the first, 50-acre segment of the subdivision, which eventually will encompass about 150 acres. The council also threw out the zoning commission's requirement for a turnaround on a 1,500-foot road.

Tim Collins, a local surveyor representing the subdivision owners, told the council the road would serve only 10 to 14 homes at the most. The extra road width and turnaround were unnecessary because the private road would have light traffic, he told councilors. The subdivision, when developed, may even be a gated community, Collins said.

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended the stiffer requirements based on the village's own subdivision standards and the possible future annexation of the subdivision. However, commissioners expressed some concern about which direction the council wanted to take regarding development outside the village and asked for a joint work shop on the issue.

Though the subdivision is outside village limits, it is within a 3-mile radius that by state law makes it subject to plat approval by Ruidoso. The 3-mile radius allows the village to have some control over development in outlying areas that might be annexed by Ruidoso.

The subdivision would not be subject to village approval if all the lots were greater than 5 acres and the subdivision as a whole is composed of 24 lots or less, planning staff said. The 10 lots in the first of three sections of the subdivision are composed of lots between 1.7 to 8.8 acres, Collins said.

### Local woman promotes area through radio, tapes

Sherry Barrow recently told Ruidoso village councilors about her recent efforts to document and publicize the history and attractions of the area.

Barrow has authored a touring cassette tape (and soon a CD) that motorists may listen to as they travel the Billy the Kid Scenic Byway through Lincoln County. The tapes and CDs are underwritten in part by Sierra Blanca Motors and Robertson Media.

Barrow also has segments airing on KENW/KMTH, the regional public radio station, at 91.3 FM. Her segment is called, "Listen in with Sherry Barrow," and may be heard at 12:45 p.m. Fridays. Eventually, the segments will air three times a week, Barrow said.

She told the council that requests for her audio tapes have begun coming in from all over the region. People want to have a reference for the area's history and attractions, she said.

Barrow encouraged the council in its strategic planning process to consider the creation of a museum for the area.

Mayor Robert Donaldson said perhaps a museum area could be included in the planned community recreation plaza in the White Mountain subdivision.

### Airport receives federal certification

The Sierra Blanca Regional Airport has received approval from the Federal Aviation Administration to operate as a commercial airport, though no commercial flights currently come into the airport, Ruidoso Village Manager Alan Briley said recently.

The FAA commended the village for maintenance, operation and personnel at the airport, which is managed by Tim Morris, Briley said.

### Pine needle pick-up

Ruidoso's Solid Waste Department has a 30- to 60-day waiting period for the collection of yard waste, such as pine needles, Village Manager Alan Briley said recently.

The new garbage depart-

ment is changing how it picks up pine needles from homes and businesses, Briley said. Instead of collecting based on the order in which requests are received, the department will pick up pine needles by area — a more efficient method, Briley said.

The department still requests that resident do not bag pine needles for collection.

### Village plans larger, fewer dumpsters

Ruidoso soon will replace old garbage dumpsters with new ones, and in many neighborhoods the new dumpsters will be larger but spaced further apart, Village Manager Alan Briley said.

Briley said it was inefficient for the village to have five to six dumpsters along a street that doesn't typically produce enough trash to fill one dumpster.

"This may involve getting rid of some dumpsters and requiring people to walk a little bit farther" to put garbage in the dumpsters, Briley said. "It's a convenience thing."



## RHS coach's fate announced today

Ruidoso Municipal Schools Superintendent Mike Gladden will release his findings of allegations against Warrior boys basketball coach Gary Grahn today, the superintendent said.

"We'll probably have something for you tomorrow (Wednesday)," Gladden told the Ruidoso News late Tuesday afternoon.

Gladden originally said a decision about the fate of the second-year coach would be made Monday, after his interviews and investigation.

"We're just not moving as fast as we wanted to, so we'll have something for you tomorrow," Gladden said.

Ruidoso senior Corey Saenz, a returning letterwinner, said the team is supposed to have a meeting today (Wednesday).

Grahn was placed on administrative leave with pay Wednesday, Dec. 9, after parent Tom Lutterman leveled charges that Grahn mistreated his son, Zak, a sophomore basketball player at Ruidoso High School.

Lutterman, whose wife, Susan, sits on the Ruidoso Municipal Schools Board of Education, alleges that Grahn

"harassed" and "picked on" his son.

"It's been constant harassment. It's been a constant 'I'll show you' type deal," Lutterman said. "For some reason he (Grahn) has selected Zak (to be) the example..." Lutterman said he got nowhere with Grahn and took the matter to Gladden.

Grahn has declined to comment. Assistant coach Barry Nelson took the boys team to the Artesia Invitational Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The Warriors lost the host Bulldogs, 64-63, Thursday. Scores for Ruidoso's other two games at the tournament were not available.

## Warriors aim to rewrite RHS wrestling history

The Ruidoso wrestling team finished fifth overall at Saturday's Belen Invitational.

Not bad, considering the Warriors had just three days of practice under their belts going into the tourney.

"We just need to tune-up and get in a little bit better shape," said wrestling coach Jerrett Perry. "We just got a little bit gassed. We figure that everybody else in the state has been wrestling for at least three weeks compared to us." That's because the many of the Warriors were busy playing for Ruidoso's state runner-up football team.

Ruidoso travels to Oñate for a dual meet Thursday and then takes some time off for the holidays. During that break, Perry

said the Warriors will work on conditioning.

Now in his third year at the helm of the program, Perry said he's starting to see dividends. Most of wrestlers are returning lettermen and are familiar with his system.

"It's really starting to pay off," Perry said.

Perry has 32 wrestlers in high school and about 50 in all, counting the middle school program.

He has set his team's sights on the district's top dog, Cobre, no less.

"We have two goals: one is to be district champs for the first time in Ruidoso High School history and the next is to place in the top five in the state. And those are realistic goals," Perry said.

The Warriors are capable of achieving these goals because not only have they learned wrestling

but also because they are a "team full of winners," Perry said.

Leading the Ruidoso charge is senior Jason Leadingham in the 189-pound weight class. Leadingham already is 5-0 on the season. He won his weight class at the Belen Invitational, defeating the defending state champion en route to the title.

Leadingham is the District 3AAA defending champ at 189. Ruidoso's, Richard Gray returns and was also the district's best in his weight class (145).

The Warriors strength lies in the middle to upper weight classes. For example, Perry is still looking for a wrestler in the 112-pound class and freshman Brian Irving is the Warriors' hopeful at 103.



### Picking up the stitches

Schearer returned to knitting thanks to one of Victor's short-term job tenures abroad.

"We happened to be in New Zealand for six months in about 1981. It was unexpected and we were stuck there for six months," Jean said.

She went shopping one day and came across a store that captured her fancy.

"I saw needlework in the window," she said. "It (the store) was ceiling to floor - I can see it now - wools of every description. There was Angora, shetlands, mohair. I was like a child in a toy shop."

Needless to say, Schearer bought a lot of wool that day. When the Schearers headed back to the States, the shop owner offered to send wool to Jean. And that's still where she gets her supply of wool for her sweaters.

"That was the start of my return to knitting," Jean said.

Schearer, who also counts crosswords, cooking and jigsaw puzzles among her hobbies, can knit a sweater in about 32 days. She particularly enjoys knitting Aran sweaters which have definitive patterns. They are among her best sellers at Mountain Ski Shop where Schearer displays her sweaters and sells them on consignment.

She has about 50 different-sized needles she employs - smaller ones are used for baby sweaters or children's clothing, larger ones for adult-sized sweaters and the like. Schearer

records the number of stitches of each sweater in pocket-sized notebook, so she has each pattern for reference.

Knitting uses two basic "stitches," the knit and the purl.

"As long as you've got healthy hands, there are really no tricks," Jean said and then suggested, "I suppose patience."

"I wouldn't be at all happy making a sweater in three days by machine. It helps my soul to create. I think that's something. You are creating something with your hands."

If there's one knitting knack Jean possesses it's the consistency of stitches.

"Apparently I knit to the right tension," said Jean, noting that her stitches aren't too loose or too tight.

But she gives most of the credit to the designers who determine the patterns of each sweater.

"These designers are painting pictures with wool," Jean said. "I'm just the ant."

## The Fireplace

The fireplace is a symbol of the holiday season. Just thinking about one gives us a warm, fuzzy feeling.

Even if you don't have one in your home, you know that Santa always finds a way!

### A place in U.S. history

Some early fireplaces did not have chimneys. They were made of twigs (wattle) and mud (daub). The smoke escaped through a hole in the roof.

The next step was to add a hood over the fireplace.

Finally, a chimney joined the fireplace to the hood.

This inside view shows the cabin's one room where everybody lived. The fireplace was the center of activity.



Wattle and daub chimneys often caught fire. Sometimes people assembled up on the roof to kick down a burning one. Ladders were always kept nearby.



The seat closest to the fire was saved for the most important person in the room. Kids usually sat farther back.

The custom of hanging stockings might be traced back to an old tale about daughters who needed money before they could marry. Santa threw a bag of gold down the chimney. The money landed in their stockings, which were hung by the fireplace to dry out.



### For fun

Gazing into a fire has always been fun. Sitting in front of a fireplace, watching the dancing flames and listening to the crackling logs, makes us all feel cozy.

### For heat

Warming pans were filled with hot coals from the fireplace and rubbed between sheets to make cold beds warm.

For hundreds of years, fireplaces supplied the only heat houses had. In colder areas, water would freeze in the unheated rooms. Having a fireplace in your room was a real luxury. This room is in Colonial Williamsburg.

### For cooking

Cooking with an open fire was hard work. Christmas was the time for feasting and preparing special treats. This kitchen is in Tryon Palace in New Bern, N.C. The palace re-creates life in North Carolina before the American Revolution.

### For Washington

The kitchen at Mount Vernon had a large fireplace for preparing meals for the Washingtons. It was the custom at Mount Vernon to eat the main meal of the day at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

Fireplaces often caused fires. Some kitchens in the South were in separate buildings, like the one at Mount Vernon.

### For Santa

"As I drew in my head, and was turning around, 'Down the chimney St. Nicholas came with a bound.'"

### For yule logs

The custom of the yule log goes back to Europe. Each family chopped down its own log, which had to burn for 12 days. It was lighted from a piece of the log burned the year before.

## POOP SCOOP

The top reason for turning an animal over to shelters is that the owner is moving, according to a survey of 12 metropolitan areas by the National Council on Pet Population Study and Policy.

Personally, I find that excuse one of the hardest to accept, because it relegates a pet to the status of furniture, instead of being a family member.

But I have seen a few cases where the choice was agonizing for a person, who faced entering a nursing home or leaving the area to live with a family member, and they really had no option.

Below are the top ten reasons given by people at those surveyed shelters for giving up their pets. Cat and dog owners gave the same first seven reasons, but the last three differed.

The first seven were:

- Owner moving
- Landlord does not allow pets
- Too many animals in household
- Cost of pet maintenance
- Owner having personal problems
- Inadequate facilities
- No homes available for litter mates.

For dogs, the last three reasons were:

- Owner has no time for a pet.
- Pet illnesses
- Biting
- For cats reasons eight through 10 were:
  - Allergies in family
  - House soiling
  - Incompatibility with other pets.

Other facts gathered in the survey include:

- The greatest number of surrendered dogs (48 percent) and cats (40 percent) were between five months and three years of age.
- Forty-five percent of the dogs and 35 percent of the cats surrendered had been owned for less than one year.
- Mixed-breed animals accounted for 68 percent of surrendered dogs and 93 percent of surrendered cats.
- Those surrendering dogs had spent an average of \$48.75 to acquire their animals; those surrendering cats paid an average of \$9.67. Six percent of the dogs and 15 percent of the cats had been acquired at no cost.
- About half the pets surrendered (43 percent of the dogs and 51 percent of the cats) had not been neutered.
- One quarter of the dog owners and one-fifth of the cat owners believed a female dog or cat should have one litter before being spayed.



## Concert on Fox Family stresses peace on Earth

Some of the biggest names in music — Elton John, Phil Collins, Shania Twain, Alanis Morissette, Andrea Bocelli, Enrique Iglesias and the Cranberries — perform in the *Nobel Concert for Peace*, airing Sunday, Dec. 20, on Fox Family Channel.

The concert was held in Oslo, Norway, on Dec. 11, one day after the ceremonies honoring this year's Nobel Peace Prize recipients, John Hume and David Trimble.

The two were chosen for their efforts to find a peaceful solution to the conflict in Northern Ireland.

The Norwegian Nobel Committee selected performers who have a connection to Northern Ireland or who incorporate a message of peace in their music.

Keller says the sets and staging are "spectacular" and "produced on the level of the Grammys or any other awards show that involves music."

The concert is the centerpiece of Fox Family Channel's holiday programming, which includes plenty of noble efforts.

*Like Father, Like Santa*, airing Wednesday, Dec. 23, stars Gary Coleman (*Diff'rent Strokes*) and Harry Hamlin (*L.A. Law*).

The TV movie is an acting comeback for Coleman, the former child star who has been employed of late as a mall security guard.

He plays Ignatius, the leader of Santa Claus' elves, who tries to stop San-

ta's estranged son, greedy businessman Tyler Madison (Hamlin), from stealing the top-secret "naughty or nice" list.

Complicating matters, the North Pole's postal workers are angry about their work conditions. Led by the power-hungry postmaster general (Roy Dotrice, *Hercules*), they take Santa and the elves hostage, threatening to ruin Christmas for everyone unless their demands are met.

Though it sounds very serious, the movie, which co-stars Megan Gallagher (*Millennium*) as Tyler's wife and Curtis Blanck (*Everybody Loves Raymond*) as his son, is a good-natured comedy.

## Chapman and Clapton head *Very Special* music roster

Tracy Chapman and Eric Clapton are among the musicians scheduled to perform during *A Very Special Christmas From Washington, D.C.*, a concert celebrating the 30th anniversary of Special Olympics.

Academy Award winner Whoopi Goldberg hosts the 90-minute program, which airs Sunday, Dec. 20, on TNT.

The performance roster for the evening, which also is expected to include Jon Bon Jovi, Run-DMC and Smashing Pumpkins, is made up of artists who contributed their efforts to help raise money for Special Olympics via the release of five holiday albums. Those albums have raised more than \$45 million to date.

Some 350 invited guests are expected to attend the dinner and concert, which originally was to take place within the White House, producer-director Joel Gallen says.

"We went down there and, lo and behold ... the White House's biggest dining room holds only 200 to 220 peo-

ple," he explains. "When you add the stage and cameras and stuff, it's down to about 140.

"So, in the middle of December, when it could be 20 degrees and snowing, we have to build this tent that's heated and will hold 350 people, along with our stage and cameras, and do what is still an intimate event—but outdoors! That will present a lot of challenges, such as the fact that we only really have a couple of days to put it together, stage it and rehearse it."

The mission of Special Olympics is to provide year-round training and competition in a variety of Olympic-type sporting events for mentally challenged young men and women. The program gives these aspiring athletes an ongoing way to achieve physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience satisfaction and pride, and participate in a sharing of gifts and friendship with their families and other athletes.

The event is part of a White House reception hosted by President Clinton and the first lady to honor Special Olympians.

Brooks also can be seen in the United Paramount Network movie *The Descendant* on Jan. 14.




