## Ballard-Lankhorst murder trial begins in Alamogordo

- Friends of Charles Martinez testified Monday in his murder trial that he and they strangled a Ruidoso woman with her scarf and buried her in the desert.

Elizabeth Ballard-Lankhorst was
looking for revenge.
The 27 -year-old Ruidoso woman had been scorned by her boyfriend for a transvestite lover. She did not take well.
She followed the two men around town fock them publicly and told people the woman known as Eva was actually named Charles Martinez.

And on one night in March 1998, a drunken Ballard-Lankhorst went to the Ruidoso home of former boyfriend Chris Faviell. A month later, police buried in a shallow grave near Tularosa.

On Monday, prosecutors opened the first-degree murder trial of of Ballard- in the strangulation death prosecution's 33 scheduled witnesses in the five-day Alamogordo trial are friends of Faviell and Martinez. The defendants, who are being tried separately, reportedly confided in at least Ballard-Lankhorst with her scarf.
If found guilty, Martinez could receive a death penalty or life imprisonment. ## Tribe could call for June elections

The Mescalero Apache Tribe could see a special election in midJune in order to elect a new president and vice order to elect a new president and vice vice president said Tuesday.
Marc Prelo, attorney for Oliver Enjady, said a memo sent out by the tribal council to tribal members calling for a general meeting on June indicates the council may call for a special election.

Enjady and tribal President A. Paul Ortega were put on administrative leave by the council pending the outcome of a hearing scheduled for Friday.

The council say's it has found "credible evidence that the President Tribal Constitution by disregarding the tribal budget and authorizing the spending and commitment uf tribal spending and commitment of tribal flicts with the priorities, purposes and intents of the tribal budget, and in doing so have jeopardized the financial wellbeing of the Mescalero Apache

Tribe and the Tribe's ability to meet its existing financial obligations."
Enjady has denied the allegations since the outset. Ortega has made no comment on the matter.
Sara Misquez, the tribal council secretary and acting president of the tribe, did not return phone calls Tuesday.

Prelo and Enjady say such a council have the actions taken by the vice president. "Ive already been found guilty", Enjady said. "There is no due proces here. This letter (memo) has convicted me already.;"

The memo, signed by all the tribal council members except for Silas Cochise, who apparently has resigned from the council, further states that the actions against the two officials tect tribal assets and to safeguard the financial strength and future of the financi

Enjady said he did not want to comment on what he thought were
the council's motivations against him. According to the memo, the tribal
councils action was in strict accor-
dance with the provision of the Mescalero Constitution."

## A steady course often

 is the best courseAbout the only thing in common between hospitals and jails is that the inmates of both would prefer to be someplace else.

Put simply, both are critical in their own/way to keep our society (that's all of us) in good order

Everybody needs a medical facility available when the need arises - and the need does arise.

Society as a whole needs a detention facility available to house those who stray into anti-social behavior until ociety is satisued that jusice has bee sed

Lincoln County Commission members last week chose firm and steady course in deading with both of those social necessities. The county jail in Carrizozo has been a festering problem for years; at one time or another it has been overcrowded, out of compliance with state regula tions, a fire havard...and a new facility of some sort; somewhere, has become a necessity

The "somewhere" no longer is an issue, since the commission already has bowed to the politics of reality and agreed it will be built in Carrizozo's industrial park.

Everything else is up far grabs, but a course was set across that troubled pond with a unanimous decision to continue a contract with Corrections Systems Inc. (CSI) o operate the present fail. County Manager Tom Stewart pointed out that the county (in a tight budget year) could save something like a third of the annual cost of peration by hiring its own administrator; that is, save about $\$ 28,000$.

The commission listened to CSI's president talk about the transition to a new, bigger facility and all that would entail, and decided to forego the savings.

At the same meeting, the commission considered another option suggested by Stewart - selling the fincoln County Medical Center facility in Ruidoso to yaise Health Systems Inc., a for-profit operator of hospitals around the country (including Roswell and Deming) made his pitch.

That got short shrift; it might even be said that the commission gave Presbyterian HealthCare Services, the not-for-profit operator of LCMC, a vote of confidence.

Nor did the commission castigate its county manager for proposing two losing propositions. After all, it's the job of a hired manager to do the homework and propose options to solve problems as they occur. It's up to the options to solve problems as they occur. It's up to the elected com

## POOP SCOOP

An article in Animal Sheltering Magazine's March-April issue focuses on how training dogs at animal shelters can enhance. their chance for adoption and make the shelter staff's job a little easier.

Author Nancy Lawson wrote that first impressions can turn off a potential adopter, if a dog jumps all over the person, won't stop barking or gets so excited they wet.
"But aside from professional trainers, who has time to take dogs aside for a half hour twice a day and run through a traditional obe dience drill," she writes. "Not shelter workers, thats for sure:"

Trainer Sue Sternberg in Accord, NY., says she's found a better way, a method that take little effort and teaches dogs to transfer their good behavior from kennel worker to volunteer and eventually to potential adopter.
"There are ways to train dogs so they enjoy themselves so much that theyll go up to the next person, just walk right up to them and say, 'Hey, look at me. I can sit," Sternberg said.

With a tasty treat and a little time, a volunteer can make a dog more adoptable, she said.

Steinberg calls it environmentally cued training, or traiging that teaches dogs to respond to
common movements by people when they interact with animals, Lawson writes.

She cites an example of teaching a dog to sit at the sight of a person putting down a food bowl or placing a hand on a doorknob. Instead of receiving treats or praise as a lure to sit, the dog learns that the opening of the door is his reward

Thë shelter worker calmly tells the dog to sit and when the dog responds appropriately, he is immediately met with an open doorway and a bout of play outside," she told Lawson.

The exercise is repeated a few times and the dog learns to sit at all closed doorways.

Because the training mimics what shelter workers have to do on a daily basis, shelters of all sizes are finding ways to fit training programs into their daily routines, Lawson said.

Studies by the Humane Society of the United States have shown that many dogs are left at shelters and returned there not because theyre unattractive, but because of behavior problems.

Knowing a fancy trick or two can help a dog display his training potential; according to Kay Guyette, shelter manager at Monadnock Humane Society in New Hampshire.

## PROTECTING YOUR SIGHT

Whether you wear glasses，contact lenses or simply have satisfacto－ $\mathrm{r} y$ vision without any corrective evewear，you may want to consider the many new developments in eye protection．Although your eyebrows， eyelids，and the iris，or colored part of your eye，offer some protection added protection＇now available in both prescription and non－prescrip－ ion lenses can save your sight when engaging in high risk activities such as recreating outdoors in bright sunligh for operating power equip－ ment，like chainsaws or weed eaters．Other activities including pro longed periods of driving，working at a computer monitor and other tedious close work tasks can cause severe eyestrain resulting in headaches and eye pain．

Although prolonged exposure to sunlight may cause more serious problems，such as early development of cataracts，artificial lighting can cause eye strain which may result in headaches and increased irritabiti－ ty．Even facing oncoming headlights at night can result in discomfort blurry vision and headaches．Eye protection such as anti－reflective coat－ ings，photochromic lenses，polarized lenses and protection from ultravi olet radiation may be recommended．Anti－reflective coatings can improve night driping comfort by significantly reducing glare from oncoming triffic．During the daytime，anti－reflective coatings reduce glare from florescent lighting in the workplace and ease computer eye－ strain．Photochromic and tinted lenses are available in plastic，glass and safety materials．Photochromic lenses＇darken in bright light and clear nside offering a dual purpose advantage．Polarized lenses，available in both gray and brown，tame harsh glare and provide added comfort even in blinding light，fog，rain or snow．Protection from harmful ultraviolet radiation is available and recommended on all lenses．

Safety lenses made of impact resistant materials are required for many professionals such as logging，welding and electrical work．Safety glasses are available with prescription or non－prescription and offer added protection from flying debris，sparks or sudden impact．These lenses are also recommended for children involved in sports like base－ ball，basketball and hockey．Also individuals who have already had damage to one eye should protect their only＂good＂eye by wearing safety lenses．

## The Berlin Crisis

In June 1948，the Soviets surrounded Berlin，cutting off supplies of food and fuel．Already devastated by World War II，Berlin was starving．In the lirst major confrontation of the Cold War，the Allied Powers faced an agonizing dilemma：give the Soviets Berlin，or resist and risk World War III．The Berlin Crisis／a 90 －minute documentary，outlines the history of the Berlin Airlift－the deliveries of food，medical supplies，and fuel to the besieged city every day and night for nearly a year．．
In 1945，when World War II was over，the Allied Powers were concentrating on rebuilding a nearly ruined Western Europe．Newsreel footage captures scenes of a decimated Berlin，a city gripped by fear and deprivation．Because Joseph Stalin wanted to insure that Russia maintained a primary presence in Berlin，the Allies＇isolated western outpọsi in East Germany，the British，French，and Arnericans walked softly， knowing only too well what a confrontation with Russia could mean．
When the Soviets encircled Berlin，the city became a prison．British and American forces held their ground，but there was no way to get supplies：Since the Russians had little control over what happened in the skies，an air bridge seemed the perfect plan．England and America viewed the operation as a stopgap，expected to last only a week or so．The Berlin Airlift lasted 10 months and 23 days．

Stalin finally lifted the blockade－an act hailed by the West as their first victory in the Cold War．

Future uncertain after Deep Space Nine wraps

It's the end of an era this week Paramount's Star Trek: Deep Space Nine. the most popular program in syndication, comes to a close. Depending on your local station's preference, the final episode, "What You Leave Behind," will air either in two parts or as a two-bour special (check local listings).
Why would the creators of the popular space station and its multigalactíc inhabitants choose to jettison the series at the height of its popularity?
When 1 agreed to do Deep Space Nine, they said it would run for seven years, and nothing has changed," executive producer Ira Steven Behr says. The expense of new contracts for the show's internationally known stars wasn't likely to be attraclive to the studio. given what such a popular show can make - without any salaries or production costs - in renuns, he adds.
Unlike previous Star Trek projects. in which spaceships explore far-flung galaxies, the series takes place on Deep Space Nine, a space station anchored at a coveted "wormhole" - a critical shortcut to another galaxy. The station's mission, to help keep peace in the region and ensure the wormhole remains open to all travelers, is complicated by the inhabitants of the nearby planet Bajor, who believe the wormhole contains their gods, "the prophets."

Another complication was added when the captain of the station, Benjamin Sisko (Avery Brooks), was concacted by the prophets to be their human emissary to the Bajorans, putting the career officer in an uncomfortable lactical and spiritual position.
The concept of a space station allowed the show's writers to depart from Star Trek convention and create several lead characters who w/fre not directly involved with Starflee!
These interplanetary leads include Odo Ital (Rene Auberjonois, Benson), the station's chief of security, and the profit-obsessed Ferengi bar owner, Quark (Armin Shimerman)
Both Behr and Auberjonois call the
series the "darker, gritier" Star Trek spinoff, the middle child between Star Trek; The Next Generation, which left the air in 1994, and Star Trek: Voyager. currently airing on United Paramount Network.
In "What You Leave Behind," the war with the Dominion is resolved, according to Behr, though he won't offer many specifics.
"Those wanting a sense of closure will get that. It wraps up the major plot threads, and the major character arcs will be completed," he says. "The Dominion war will reach a conclusion; Sisko's story - as the Emissary and the captain - will reach a conclusion."
Beht adds that there even will be a song from Vic Fontaine (James Darren) the popular computer-generated holograph of a Rat Pack-era Las Vegas

lounge singer.
Auberjonois says he "can see the characters staying alive in some form," but hints that the final episode doesn't lend itself to a sequel.
Shimerman, who, like Auberjonois, spent at least two hours daily in the makeup chair to have his plastic prosthetics applied (including his trademark oversize Ferengi lobes), says he would welcome any film offers.
"I'm pretty sure I'd pull my ears out of mothballs if somebody asked me;" says the actor, whose Quark was the first character cast for the series. "T've always compared myself to lottery winners. It's the fulfillment of my fantasy."
