## Drainage problems surface on Mechem

 MY TON K. LAXSONHeavy rains Friday and Saturday caused some drainproblems along the path of road construction on Mechem Drive.

Water draining off the street prompted an advocate of the Rio Ruidoso to question whether Meadow Valley Contractors inc., the company hired by the state for the $\$ 10$ the silt screens currently in place.
"It isn't screening it (dirt carried by the water into drainage that feeds into the river)," said Dick Wisner, presdent of the Ruidoso River Association. "There won't be a ive fish from here to Roswell ... This is going to go on all ummer until somebody does something about it."

Wisner indicated two places where water was entering drainage to the river near the Abode Plaza just north of ong incline of road and a large pool of water had collected by Friday afternoon.

In one location, across the street from the Adobe Plaza, water had reached the top of a silt fence, the black mesh fences placed along the path of road construction. The with rainwater.
On the east side of the street, next to the plaza, a silt fence covered a drainage opening and basically screened dirt from the water entering the drain. However, water

Two Mescalero Apache Tribal Council members will face each other in an Aug. 9 special run-off elec ing to unofficial results of Friday's primary election.

Sarah Misquez, acting Mescalero president, and Arther "Butch" Blazer, with the U.S. Bureau of Indian he five contenders in the primary with 481 and 328 votes, respectively.
In the primary for vice president Freddie Kaydahzinne and Frederick Chino Sr. will vie for votes in the Aug 9 election, winning with 369 and 324 otes, respectively

Candidates who win the Aug. 9 lection might serve only a few November, when a new president and ice president will be elected for two-year term.

Misquez and Blazer have been viewed as political allies in the past but the race between them should not challenge that alliance, Blaze aid Tuesday.

## Keeping our vulnerable treasures alive and well

## Give the mayor the benefit of the doubt.

It's clearly a gamble, wiping out all but two of the marked crosswalks in the heart of the village, All the extra "caution" signs warning pedestrians to be careful crossing busy Sudderth Drive between Country Club and Center might keep somebody from being killed; a marked crosswalk certainly didn't save a Roswell woman who was run over while crossing a year ago.

Mayor Robert Donaldson has argued from the day he took office that crosswalks simply give pedestrians an unfounded feeling of security, and had talked about elini nating them when an additional traffic signal was installed on Sudderth at/Center (the street leading south to the police station). He chose to have village crews wipe gut the crosswalks just prior to the Fourth of July holiday. There's no evidence that the move wasn't efiective, at any rate, nobody was run down during the lohg holiday weekend.

It's true that when the crosswalks were in play; many people still "jaywallned" wherever they chose. Now nearly everybody jaywalks, between Center and Eagle Drive And between Eagle and Country Chub. And between Cen ter and Chase. They simply want to get to the shops or estaurants or whatever on the other side of the street and going to midtow's sole traffic signal sometimes is quite a detour

Part of it, of course, is the mindset of people on holiday in a resort area. When the visitors outnumber the locals, it has something of an empowering aspect that "whatever we want to do is alright."

The village has come a long way to reduce the probability of pedestrian accidents in midtown in recent months - convincing the state to cut the speed limit from 30 to 25 mph, putting up radar speed monitors as a reminder to drivers, and now adding many pedestrian caution signs.

But Sudderth remains Ruidoso's "main drag" and it remains a state highway. That means big trucks do come through. And, because service roads or alleys in midtown are non-existent, service trucks do (by ordinamce) block a
lane of trafic as they stop to pick up or deliver. Driving lane of traffic as they stop to pick up or deliver. Driving sharing some chomracteristics of a military obstacle course.

Ruidoso's village government, at least, recognizes the problem and is trying to do something about, it.

The best /hing the rest of us can do to help is to ignore the speed limit, go much slower than 25 mph , and treat our visitors as the fragile treasures they are.

## Education, race basically ignored in local TV reporting, survey shows

- National survey finds local 1

EVANSTON, - Ill. - A survey of ocal news programs in eight television markets conducted by Northwestern University and seven other universities found that education and race relacal issues facing Americans - ar all but ignored in local television news coverage.

On average the survey by the Con sortium for Local Television Survey (COLTS) found that a meager two per cent of local TV newis coverrage was devoted to education and an almost nonexistent 1.2 parcent
"Our study demonsfirates that local aews is moving away from difficult issues and issues importantito our com munity. Instead of doing complex sto ries, local television news focuses on easy-Lo-cover storing pa weather on breaking nerys, says Patricia Dean, cast journalism at Northwestern University Medill School of Journa isim. "Unless there is a crisis or national celebrity gets involved, we
see Iittle coverage of education or see Iittile cove

Conducted by university researchers during a four-month peri od, the coLis survey is the first content of television newscasts on a national sceale. Researchers intend to continue their random surveys of tole-
vision markets in Los Angeles, New

York, Chicago, Mjami, Syracuse, Austin (Texas).
The survey confirmed that local TV is fascinated with crime-related stories which, on national average, consumed
almost 30 percent of the surveyed aimost 30 percent of the surveyed one the six other news categories studied by the researchers.
Government and politics - once the mainstay of local television news - on average was found only to account for 15 percent of the time devoted to new coverage. In the four largest market Chicago and Miami - government and politics was allotted even less aov erage. Smaller markets Eugene and Austin, in contrast, devoted an average of 28 percent. In the eight markets sur veyed, calamities and national disas ters on average accounted for 10 per accounted for almost nine percen while health and medicine coverap accounted for almost seven percent

In Chicago, coverage of crime and criminal justice at 10.8 percent was national average of 20.3 percent. How over the relatively low dimount o for coverage of either education or rac relations. Chicago's coverace of edircation accounted only for 2.5 per cent while race relations coverage amounted to 1.3 percent.

The Humane Society of the United States devotes an entire page in its latest"Wild Neighbors News" to bats.

According to the article, bats only bite in self-defense. Baby bats cling to their mothers until they are old enough to be left in a nursery colony. Bats have been known to adopt orphans, and have been seen risking their lives to share food with less fortunate bats.

Sounds like attributes Pd like to see in more people.

The only flying mammal, bats come in various sizes from the bumblebee bat that weighis less thlan a penny to Lyle's flying fox with a wingspan of nearly six feet.
"Bats may resemble rodents,
but scientists believe they are more closely related to primates," the author writes.

The common brown bat in North America boasts the longest lifespan for a mammal its size 32 years.

Beneficial effects from bats listed in the article include:

- Eating night time flying insects. A single small brown bat can eat more than 1,000 mosquitoes in one hour. A colony of 150 big brown bats can protect local farmers from as many as 18 mil lion rootworms each summer.

Bats help with seed dispersal fand pollination for barianas, breadfiruit, mangoes, cashews,
dates and 'figs, and 'are essential for those functions in rain forests. - Desert ecosystems rely or nectar-feeding bats as primary pol finators of giant cacti such as the organ pipe and saguaro of Arizona

The only flying mammal, bats boast 40 species in the U.S. and 1,000 specials worldwide, but because of their slow reproduc tion cycle - producing one off spring each year - they are espe cially vulnerable to extinction. More than 50 percent of American bat species are in severe de cline or already listed as endangered, the author wrote.

When the bats decrease, insect and pest control falls to chemical pesticides, which en dangers the ecosystems of other animals and plant species

To help bats, the HSUS en courages homeowners to create a backyard that provides resting areas during seasonal migrations. However, the author cautions that while watching bats at dusk, never try to touch them. Bats that allow a touch may be ill. If you find a bat on the ground, call the local health department or animal control agency, the HSUS advises. Never disturb hibernating bats.

## Brooks welcomes chance to expand range in GvsE

If Earth had a creator，he or she must have a sense of humor．How else could we explain the platypus，artichokes or plaid wall－to－wall carpeting？
That sense of humor－and the fact that humans tend toward avarice－are linchpins of the new series GusE，pre－ miering Sunday，July 18，on USA Net－ work．The title is shorthand for＂Good vs．Evil，＂and each episode pits right against wrong．
In the premiere，we learn that the world is inhabited by＂morlocks＂who have sold their souls to the devil to get what they want on Eaith
The Almighty（the show does not mention the name God）．sends an army of people called the Corps to fight the good fight and hunt down the mor－ locks．
The morlocks are a scary bunch． Some resemble vampires in desperate need of a dentist others have horns they can grow at will．
It＇s litule surprise that all of this is set in Los Angeles．Where elsé could so many freaky people go about undetect－ ed as they steal souls？
The＂big boss＂，is played by Deacon Jones，a former defensive end for the Los Angeles Rams（1961－71）and San Diego Chargers．（1972－73）before he re－ tired from the Washington Redskins in 1974．It＇s the resonant tone of Jones you hear in the show＇s narration
The big boss is assisted by Ford and Decker（Marshall Bell，Googy Gress），
whic operate out of what resembles a cheap motel office circa 1962 It night be hard to belieye the Almighty would do his good works with these two characters working from a room with a rotary phone and caulk－ ing smears，but if you agree the Almighty has a sense of humor，then go with it．
Clayton Rohner plays Chandier Smythe，a self－involved tablopid re－ porter．Leaving a sleazy bar in a seedy part of town，he stumbles to his car at the head of an alley．As he fumbles with his keys，he becomes aware of some nefarious deed going on in the alley．
Does he hop in the car and look for a cop？Not our＇hero．He approaches the scene，where some creature appears to be killing another，and finds a man with his guts tom out－and Chandler is the next victim．
When next we see him，Chandler is in the no－frills office．Ford and Decker tell him he＇s dead，but having lived a selfish life，he is not on his way to be reunited．with his deceased wife．How－ ever，if he joins the Corps and fights to save souls，he might earn his way out of limbo．
There aren＇t many career opportuni－ ties for the undead－even those who worked for the New York Post－so he joins and is partnered with Henry Mc－ Neil（Richard Brooks．）
Brooks，who played straight－laced prosecutor Paul Robinette in the early years of NBC＇s Law and Order，is hav－ ing à whole lot of fun as Henry，who
has been in the Corps for 20 years．He sports an Afro，grooves on some decent ＇70s R \＆B music and drives＇an orange Volvo－hence the title of the premiere episode，＂Orange Volvo．＂
This＇show doesn＇t take itself too se－ riously，＂Brooks says on a break from filming．＂It has a lot of pop references that make it contemporary，and the writing is so funny．＂
In the opening show，as Chandler is shown around，he spots the＂Top 10 Most Wanted Morlock＂list．On it are Don King，Sen．Onin Hatch of Utah and ex－Love Boat captain Gavin MacLeod．
Brooks says he was surprised that the creators and executive producers of GvsE，twin brothers Jonas and Josh Pate，who made the independent movie The Grave，allow actors to ad－lib on the set．As an actor，he＇s having a wonder－ ful time．
＂This was a chance to do some action comedy and redefine my range as an actor，＂Brooks explains．＂I wanted to have a show where I could do all of the things I can do．＂
That includes sing and dance，he says． In a future episode he breaks into song， a la Barry White，as he seduces a lady． Although the first rule for memibers of the Corps is＂no sex，＂he says，Henry and his partner try to get around it．
The show，which pinpoints scenes with typewritten notes explaining the time refnd place in X－Files style，has some of that show＇s sensibility，in that anything imagined is possible－partic－ ularly if you strike a deal with the devil．

Not all the photos dwell on humanity at its worst．Sometimes the most heart－ wrenching images are the ones that viewers can relate to，even when they don＇t know the subjects．
＂With the（returning）POW，＂Rubin says，＂Lt．Col．Robert Stirm＇s face has never been seen．The picture was taken at an angle where it was the back of his head with the family running to－ ward him．He became the icon of all returning prisoners because there was no face to it．＂

When the photographers flash back， emotions take over as they realize they were merely observers in time，record－ ing images of events most will never experience firsthand．
Just ask Tom Kelly．Ont of sheer in－ stinct，he snapped what turned out to be the biggest shot of his carear．
＂Anything could have happened when Greist broke loose and was run－ ning toward Kelly，＂Rubin says of the farmhouse photo．＂（Kelly）was so shattered emotionally．To this day，he doesn＇t remember taking that picture．
＂I hope viewers can understand both sides of the photograph－the photog－ rapher and the people（within），＂Rubin says．＂Photojournalists have made us cognizant of what can happen in a split second．＂

The con is unlikable and mean，but Spenser is determined to find out if he is guilty as well．Racism and elitism play heavily in the carefully crafted plot．
Parker，who wrote this screenplay and others，as well as 33 books－for which he has developed an international fan base of devoted readers－is a remark－ ably down－to－earth fellow．He＇s pas－ sionately in love with his wife，Joan， whom he met when they were 3 ，and they have been＂honeybuns since we were 17, ＂he says．
Speaking from the Cambridge，Mass．， home the Parkers share with Pearl the Wonder Dog and Rosie the miniature bull terrier，the writer discusses the movie－and his screen debut．
Lowering his voice to a movie an－ nouncer baritone，he says，＂Robert $\mathbf{B}$ ． Parker is Ives，＂referring to his brief role as a CIA agent．Acting was tough，he says．
＂First of all，I have to remember the lines，which becomes increasingly diffi－ cult as time ticks away＂Parker，66，ex－ plains．＂There＇s a certain amount of pressure on amateurs with 40 people standing around a cold set．You＇d like to do it well，and you don＇t want to make a bigger public fool of yourself．＂
Parker＇s ability to tum a phrase shines throughout the movie．
