County officials mull over the future of Fort Stanton

This time when Fort Stanton is shut down by the state, county officials hope they can come up with a plan that will ensure the historic fort's future as a museum and will put some of its buildings to practical use.

Commissioner L. Ray Nunley will be looking for some federal help, while Commissioner Wilton Howell says the fort can fulfill some immediate county needs, such as a county road yard, a garbage transfer station and a place for minimum security county jail inmates, who would contribute their labor to needed repairs and maintenance at the complex.

A discussion about the fort is listed on the county commission agenda for its 9 a.m. meeting Thursday in the Ruidoso Convention Center.

State Corrections Secretary Rob Perry announced last week his intention to close the fort as a minimum security prison for women, beginning with the transfer of inmates to Santa Fe in August.

The last time it was closed in March 1995 as a state hospital, the county didn't have a plan ready to go or the money to accept responsibility for the fort. After sitting unused for more than a year, it was leased to the Corrections Department by the state General Services Department, which handles all state properties.

Situated about 12 miles northeast of

Ruidoso, the fort was established in 1855. When its usefulness for protection passed, the complex became a U.S. Marine Hospital for tubercular patients. After 92 years as a health facility, most recently a state hospital for the developmentally disabled, the fort was shut down in March 1995 by Gov. Gary Johnson.

He cited the high expense of operation, which was the main reason Perry emphasized in his decision to end his lease of the complex.

State Rep. Dub Williams, a Republican from Glencoe, would like to see the Merchant Marine and Military cemetery at the fort declared an official state veterans' cemetery. The Fort Stanton Reserve, some of which is managed by the federal Bureau of Land Management, con-

sists of about 2,700 acres and contains many prehistoric Indian settlements.


Nunley said he will work with U. S. Rep. Joe Skeen and U. S. Sen. Pete Domenici toward finding a permanent use for the fort.

"I intend to make a strong effort," Nunley said. "I think the state dropped the ball on this this. I want to see the state work with us and we will with Skeen and Domenici."

Although he would like to see the fort become a living museum and convention center as proposed by a group called Fort Stanton Inc., "At this point, I don't honestly know what the use will be," Nunley said.

County asks for input on paying for needed services

Few people dispute the need to establish a county fund for the medically indigent and to build a new jail, but Thursday Lincoln County Commissioners will hear from the public on whether those projects are worth paying more taxes.

Hearings on a proposal to impose a 1/8th of a cent gross receipts tax for the indigent fund and another 1/8th to cover annual payments on a jail construction debt are set for 1 p.m.

The commission meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the Ruidoso Convention Center.

The hearing will be the third public forum on the indigent proposal and will include a presentation by Gilbert Perez, former director of the indigent hospital claims program for Doña Ana County. Advocates contend that under the current system with the county hospital handling all claims, patients cannot access some services outside the hospital, or if they do, those ser-

vices cannot receive reimbursement.

During the hearing on the jail tax, Jon Zaman from the New Mexico Finance Authority will discuss how the debt could be handled. Commissioners are anticipating building a 100-bed new jail in Carrizozo to cost about \$5 million. They are looking at alternatives, including a build-and-manage option.

Gross receipt taxes are being considered, because commissioners say tourists and seasonal residents will share in supporting the programs, and because the county currently only imposes a 1/16th of a cent environmental gross receipts tax to pay for a regional landfill. However, while the county has one of the lowest gross receipt tax records, the village of Ruidoso has one of the highest and its residents would be impacted by the addition.

Rain not enough to quench fire danger

Spotty rain and cloudy skies over the weekend kept tougher fire and water restrictions at bay, but didn't deliver enough precipitation to significantly affect overall fire danger conditions, say state and federal forest officials.

Although some residents in the Alto area reported several showers and some hail Saturday, gauges at Sierra Blanca Regional Airport collected only ten-one hundredths of an inch of rain and nothing was picked up at the Ruidoso Police Station gauge, spokesmen said.

"The rain was very spotty. It rained on one side of the street and not the other," a U.S. Forest Service representative said Monday. "We're still in extreme fire danger."

"My viewpoint is that the rain allowed us to stay at the same level

of restrictions instead of going up, but it doesn't take long for things to dry out," said state forestry district forester Barbara Luna.

Campers may use propane stoves to cook in the Lincoln National Forest, but are not allowed to have campfires except in supervised campgrounds.

The village of Ruidoso's "moderate" water rules and extreme danger fire restrictions remain intact, a village employee confirmed Monday. Watering is restricted to before 10 a.m. and after 5 p.m. Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Smoking is confined to enclosed cars or buildings and no charcoal cooking is allowed.

The Lincoln County Commission Thursday may approve a 30-day extension of a resolution that would continue a ban on all open flames and on fireworks displays in unincorporated areas of the county.

Willie Nelson to play at racetrack

Plans for Ruidoso's biggest name concert began in March when Dave King received a call from an old golfing buddy.

Today, that old golfing buddy, Willie Nelson, is to sign a contract with the Ruidoso Downs Race Track for an Aug. 15 concert.

"I expect to hear from Willie here pretty soon," King said Tuesday afternoon at his business, Sierra Blanca Water Company, on Mechem Drive.

Though still waiting Nelson's signature on a contract, King has no doubt that the concert will happen.

"All I have is a handshake from Willie and that's all I've ever had," said King. "And Willie has always shown up on time."

King, who first met the country and western star at a golf tournament in Rio Rancho in 1971, has coordinated other Willie Nelson concerts in New Mexico, but none in the past 10 years or more, he said.

Rumors about the concert started

circulating in April, but King has been reluctant until this week to go public confirming it. Nelson, however, has not been hesitant. The Ruidoso concert date has been on his Internet website since April, King said.

He receives daily calls from people from as far as Spokane, Wash., who see the website and want to buy tickets, King said.

Plans for the concert location and sponsorship have changed some since April, but now a deal with the Ruidoso Downs Race Track and Billy the Kid Casino is on the verge of finalization, King said.

"We want to bill the concert as 'Billy hosts Willie,' with the Billy the Kid Casino as the sponsor," he said.

Bruce Rimbo, who oversees both the track and casino, was out of town Tuesday and could not be reached for comment about the pending concert. Other track officials also were unavailable for comment. King said the track is preparing a press release, which is to be distributed after contracts are signed and plans finalized.

Many details of the Nelson concert still are being worked out, such as the start time, ticket prices and the logistics of putting a stage on the track after Sunday races, King said.

Concert tickets are to go on sale July 1, and will be available at both the track and at Sierra Blanca Pure Water, located at 710 Mechem Drive. Other ticket locations will be announced later, King said.

Ticket prices will vary, but King expects to offer the majority for \$20, with some higher priced tickets. King is not sure whether the better seats would be those in the grandstand or in the boxes and inside the Jockey Club and Turf Club.

Coordinators intend to give free tickets to all the employees of the villages of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs as well as Lincoln County. Based on the \$20 ticket price and a total of about 250 employees, those donated tickets will add up to roughly \$5,000. Hopefully, those employees will buy more tickets and take their families, King said.

King said the racetrack and casino will promote the concert throughout southeast New Mexico. Part of that promotion will be paid with \$6,000 from lodgers tax revenues contributed by the villages of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs as well as from Lincoln County. By state law, governmental entities must spend lodgers tax revenues on activities or events that increase tourism.



Group sets out to preserve the history that is Fort Stanton

A partnership with state and federal agencies, and corporate America will be needed to preserve historic Fort Stanton, says Dick Weber, newly elected president of Fort Stanton Inc.

The group formed in 1995 after Gov. Gary Johnson closed the fort as a state hospital. The aim is to establish the fort as a living museum with demonstrations, based on Fort Robinson in northwest Nebraska.

Lincoln County Commissioner L. Ray Nunley visited the Nebraska fort in 1996. Although that state invested money to rehabilitate the fort, it now generates about \$1.3 million each summer and is visited by about 400,000 people, even though it is difficult to reach and not near a destination point such as Ruidoso, Nunley pointed out.

"We have a much better situation," he said. Many of the original buildings, a granary and stables still stand at Fort Stanton.

The fort is notable as the county's stopping place for General John J. "Blackjack" Pershing in 1887, as a duty station for the famed Buffalo Soldiers and for its role in the infamous Lincoln County War that spawned Billy the Kid.

One of the first post offices in the area, it served the communities of No. 1, Lincoln, Ruidoso, Little Creek, Upper Penasco, Parsons, Bonito, South Fork and Seven Rivers from 1864 to 1897.

"I am writing a one page synopsis of our plans to the New Mexico Preservation Alliance and then I will see what part they can play," Weber said Monday. "We're trying to put together partnership for preservation of the fort. We hope we'll be able to make some headway

and bring new people with expertise into the group.

"Fort Robinson proved that concept works. We should be able to stay open more based on our climate, but I think it's a good model."

Weber sees partnerships with agencies such as the Bureau of Land Management, which manages some of the fort's land, as essential to a successful future.

The non-profit fort group is working to create sources of income for the property. Under discussion are a catalog sales organization to market memorabilia, such as replicas of buttons worn by different units stationed there, items used by the famed Buffalo soldiers or the mohair pants worn by Billy the Kid, to be sold through a catalog or a retailer, with the fort receiving a percentage.

Unlike some names in American history, those associ-

ated with the fort are less visited, yet historically important, Weber said, such as rancher John Chisum and Susan McSweeney, who later became a cattle baron.

"This is literally a gold mine of history," Weber said.

He supports uses that will keep the fort open while the long range plans develop, because it should minimize theft, Weber said.

"The place was pilfered and a lot of artifacts were stolen last time," he said. "So much left the property. We hope that never happens again. Having an interim user there with some regularity should help."

The fort is too expensive for the state to operate, but if repairs aren't finished soon, some places will be lost, he said.

FORT: Officials say the facility could be an answer to some county problems

A spokesman for the GSD last week said his department has no definite plans for the fort and its 80 buildings, but will look at the needs of other state departments first.

Howell said if the county is allowed to manage the property, the Capitan school district also will benefit.

"The school board just passed some construction bonds, but the school property is landlocked," he said. "They could use

the county's existing road yard for expansion. We could move our yard out to the fort."

The Lincoln County Medical Center, a county-owned hospital in Ruidoso managed by a private not-for-profit company, is looking for a place to set up a health clinic. The fort already has an infirmary, he said. The county also needs a garbage transfer center for collection from northern communities, Howell said.

Probably the most controversial proposal is to divide the county jail inmate population.

Instead of spending \$5 million to build a new jail, the county could remodel the existing jail to handle 10 to 15 maximum security prisoners, keeping current employees. Minimum security prisoners, possibly limited to those enrolled in drug and rehabilitation programs, could be moved to the fort to provide maintenance and to continue restoration work, he said. They could work with the fort group or the county Historical Society to develop the complex into the living museum.

"I'm not challenging Carrizozo (as the site for a new jail)," he said. "We'd remodel the existing jail, put in electronic doors and redo the ventilation system."

As for the cost of repairing the 1947 boilers at the fort, Howell said he consulted a mechanical engineer, who said it would be less expensive to install central heat and air conditioning in each unit.

"I hope commissioners are willing to look at other alternatives," Howell said. "I'm kind of excited. It could be the solution to several county problems."

White Oaks Eagle June 8, 1899

Col. T.W. Heman's testimony in the Fountain murder trial was admitted as evidence. The Alamogordo News says: "T.W. Heman, who was the foreman of the grand jury in Lincoln in January, 1896, the last session of court attended by Fountain before his disappearance, testified, that at this session indictments were

found against Lee and Wm. McNew for larceny of cattle. The witness stated that these had been obtained chiefly through the efforts of Fountain. The attorneys for defense objected strenuously to the introduction of this latter evidence as showing a motive for the alleged crime; and they tried to keep it from the jury. Judge Parker, however, overruled the objection."

Roswell woman's midtown crosswalk death leads to damage suit

The family of a Roswell woman killed as she tried to cross Sudderth Drive on a designated walk way, is suing the village of Ruidoso, Lincoln County and the state Highway and Transportation Department for unspecified damages.

In the wrongful death suit filed in Lincoln County District Court late last month, Kerry C. Jones Sr. contended the three government entities acted negligently in maintaining the street,

in the placement of signals and signs, in their failure to adequately warn of the dangerous cross walk and in their failure to install traffic control devices to protect crossing pedestrians.

Deborah Jean Jones, 41, the mother of four minor children, was killed on May 22, 1998, when she was struck by a 1986 Subaru hatchback driven by a 15-year-old Ruidoso girl.

Attorney Michael T. Worley, who represents Jones, contended in the suit filed May 21, that the young driver did not apply her brakes. Vehicles in two other lanes of traffic had

stopped and Deborah Jones was hit by the left front of the Subaru as she cleared the cars halted in the other lane. She was thrown into the air and fell on the road about 64 feet from the cross walk, according to information in the lawsuit. She was taken to Lincoln County Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead.

The negligence by the three government entities was by omission and commission, Worley contended.

Jones is asking for compensation for the loss of his wife's future earnings, to pay for medical and funeral

expenses, and "for the inherent or hedonic value of the life of Deborah Jean Jones."

Within days of the accident last year, Mayor Robert Donaldson urged the village council to move ahead with requests to state highway department for lights at the intersections of Center Street and Eagle Street on Sudderth Drive.

To speed up the process, the village agreed to pay for the two lights, estimated to cost more than \$200,000, but to date the state has approved only the light at Center, Donaldson

said Thursday.

"We've gone through the design, but it probably will be fall before the light is installed, because we can't tear up the sidewalks during the summer," he said.

Warning signs also are being replaced, he said.

County Attorney Alan Morel was out of town Thursday and couldn't be reached for comment.

Village attorney John Underwood said Ruidoso's insurance carrier is handling the case.

District judge dismisses contempt case against Downs trustees, attorney

A motion to find Ruidoso Downs village trustees in contempt of court was dismissed Tuesday.

In less than 30 minutes Tuesday morning, District Court Judge Jerry Ritter dismissed a question of whether Ruidoso Downs village trustees and Village Attorney Dan Bryant should be held in contempt of court.

While attorneys presented their points during the short hearing in Carrizozo, Ritter flipped through the court case of a lawsuit filed last year by Ruidoso Downs Mayor Joe Hayhurst and his council regarding the dismissal of an village clerk.

After listening to informal arguments for about 25 minutes, Ritter on Tuesday looked up from the file to say he did

not see any pleadings entered in it by Bryant or his law firm after June 17, 1998, the deadline for Bryant to have withdrawn from the case as the council's attorney.

"And under that I don't find any substantive violation of the order," Ritter said, adding that the motion for a contempt of court finding was dismissed.

The motion by Hayhurst's attorney, Robert Beauvais, contended Bryant and the Ruidoso Downs Council violated Ritter's orders in June 1998 regarding Bryant's involvement in the lawsuit.

As village attorney, Bryant represents both the council and the mayor; and to represent one against the other would be a conflict of interest. Bryant, who made an initial appearance for the council in the lawsuit, withdrew as its attorney following Ritter's orders. However, he has since billed the village for some work by his law

firm on the case. Beauvais contended that work represented a violation of Ritter's order.

Following Ritter's decision Tuesday, Beauvais said he and Hayhurst would not pursue the matter, saying he was satisfied, "if the court is satisfied." Hayhurst said he had no comment on the decision.

At the beginning of the hearing, Bryant stood up and told Ritter he could not really participate in arguing the facts of the issue because it would violate the canons of attorney ethics. He would be put in a position where he would have to cross-examine his own client (Hayhurst), Bryant said.

"There is virtually nothing I can do in this proceeding," he said. "This matter should be dismissed without putting us into an ethical dilemma."

He and his associate, Sean Baker, also a legal adviser to the village, asked Ritter to consider the previous findings of

Beauvais argued that the disciplinary board's actions did not preempt the court proceeding.

None of the Ruidoso Downs village trustees attended Tuesday's hearing, but their attorney in the matter, Jeff Rhodes of Alamogordo, questioned why the council was involved at all.

**Inventory storage
in the prison system**

The on-again, off-again adventure of keeping historic old Fort Stanton alive is on again.

Thanks to too-expensive operating costs, the Johnson Administration's Corrections Department will pull the plug on the fort's use as a women's prison, sending prisoners first to Santa Fe then, perhaps next January, to an enlarged women's prison in Grants.

According to the governor's corrections officials, the move will save money for the taxpayers, cutting the cost-per-day rate from about \$64 per prisoner to from \$45 to \$53. For the 136 or so Fort Stanton inmates, some calculation indicates a savings of around \$800,000 annually.

Clearly not to be sneezed at. Corrections Secretary Robert J. Perry sees more savings to the state — some \$5 million per year total — with the ultimate switch of male prisoners in Santa Fe to a private prison near Estancia in Torrance County.

Every sort of operation, public and private, seeks to lower the cost of inventory storage. Gov. Gary Johnson has made it a priority to reduce the cost of storing prisoners by letting private enterprise take over the chore, through such companies as Corrections Corporation of America (CCA) and Wackenhut. It's CCA that is running, and adding to, the women's prison in Grants; it also built and operates the Estancia men's facility. Those have turned in a reasonable record. Wackenhut, running the Hobbs facility, the state's newest, has been in the news recently with prison riots and labor problems. That company also has a lawyer named Manny Aragon (the state senate's president pro tem) on retainer.

All of which is background music for the play being written by the County Commission: Some commissioners see opportunity in expensive-to-operate Fort Stanton. They'd like to use it as a minimum-security jail to take the heat off the troubled, over-crowded jail in Carrizozo until a new facility is available.

Meanwhile, maneuvering no doubt, is under way by the group called Fort Stanton Inc. toward turning Fort Stanton into something of a living museum. The last time the fort was in hiatus, that idea got a lot of attention in the area. But, of course, the state — which owns the fort — said it needed a women's prison for awhile.

The state's General Services Administration (think of it as the landlord) apparently hasn't given a thought about what it might do with that magnificent, history-filled facility — dating from the 1850s — in one of the most beautiful spots in the state.

Letting it deteriorate again would be a terrible waste.

The challenge of zoning, rights, and responsibilities

Some things can sometimes come back to haunt us.

A few years back in Capitan there was some rumblings from village leaders about the need for zoning.

Zoning! And give up the right to do whatever I want to do with my property? Never!

But now, with the eminent installation of a mobile home park, zoning in Capitan is not sounding like such a bad idea.

"Zoning is a real touchy subject," Capitan Mayor Norm Renfro has said. "But I'm hearing a change of opinion on that now."

The controversy surrounds mobile home park developer Gary Caughron, who works for Pine Mountain Realty.

The mobile home park to be constructed in two phases will be called Capitan Estates Mobile Home Park and will feature 3/10th of an acre lots (80x170 feet) with plenty of trees, Caughron has said. Fifteen spaces will be created in

the first phase, with five to a septic system. An additional nine or 10 mobile homes will be added later on the total 18-acre tract.

Detractors say that a mobile home park could breed crime, falling property values, and become a strain on the already struggling water system of the small village.

Caughron said he's sorry people are worried, but thinks some good may come out of the controversy over his park.

The "good" that may come is zoning, something stricter than the non-existent regulations.

Zoning, especially in New Mexico, always has been a sticking point. And it's about to come to a head not just in Capitan but on the outskirts of Ruidoso as well.

People who are pushing for a continued lack of zoning in that one-mile strip around Ruidoso, also known as the ETZ, are probably or should be taking notice about what is taking place in Capitan.

Property owners, without zoning laws, can do pretty much whatever they want to with their land.

But so can your neighbor, like it or not.

There needs to be some mid-

dle ground between the "wild, wild West" and draconian regulations that call for everyone on the block to have the same kind of mail box.

But who's going to define that middle ground? The Extra-Territorial Commission and the Extra-Territorial Authority, made up of county and village representatives, are supposed to come together with some kind of definition.

But, because these bodies are somewhat political in nature, it will be hard for them to move in any direction without stirring up

some kind of controversy.

So perhaps, as in Capitan, the burned hand learns best. Perhaps it will be that controversy will be stirred before community leaders make a move.

Once again it boils down to having rights. But also acknowledging those rights by being responsible. Unfortunately, not everyone who enjoys these rights realizes the social contract that also is involved.

There will be zoning in Capitan and there will be zoning in Ruidoso's ETZ. How far and to what extent remains to be seen.

Tide may be shifting to favor zoning in Capitan

CAPITAN About four years ago, a vocal opposition group drowned out efforts to establish zoning here, but a mobile home park development under construction in the village now has some residents rethinking their positions.

"If we could have gotten any kind of zoning, we would not have the problems we're having today with this mobile home park," said Capitan Mayor Norman Renfro. "I hope our planning commission comes back with a recommended ordinance and regulations."

"Zoning is a real touchy subject, but I'm hearing a change of opinion on that now." Planning commission president Greg Hausler remembers, "There was lots of opposition then (in 1995 to zoning), but this has folks stirred up. People, especially in the subdivision area, are worried about the effect on their water."

Mobile home park developer Gary Caughron, who works for Pine Mountain Realty of Ruidoso, said Thursday he's sorry people are worried, but thinks some good may come out of the controversy over his planned park off Aspen Drive.

"The only thing I see as a good thing, it's brought up zoning and that's something Capitan needs," Caughron said. "But I see some overkill, people going from one extreme (no zoning) to the other, talking about restricting commercial requests to a case-by-case consideration. That's not good for Capitan."

"I've been in real estate for 21 years and see zoning as a good thing as long as people don't get carried away and turn it into a police state. I want to see growth, but with direction."

Lonnie Lippmann, a business owner in Capitan, said he opposes Caughron's plans and not just for environmental reasons, although water and possible pollution are considerations.

"My primary objections are aesthetic and that's not defined legally," he said, adding that he doesn't want to see "an old ragged rental mobile home park."

But Caughron says the only thing being leased will be the land. People will supply their own mobile homes and will have to follow rules that include building a deck, age restrictions and installing skirting around the bottom, he said.

"It was never our intention to bring in our own trailers," Caughron said.

The development to be constructed in two phases will be

called Capitan Estates Mobile Home Park and will feature 3/10th of an acre lots (80x170 feet) with plenty of trees, he said. Fifteen spaces will be created in the first phase, with five on each septic system. An additional nine or ten later will be added to the 18-acre tract, he said.

"My wife Carol and I are doing this under our own corporation as a long-term project for our retirement," he said. "Our intentions are not to build and sell. We want to keep it in the family and want to do a nice development to be proud of."

Most of the utility lines will be underground, parking areas will be designated and each unit will have some breathing space, he said. "The political part of this caught me off guard," Caughron said. He contends opponents are a vocal minority and that most people see the need for a mobile home park in the area. But Lippmann said the development is being built on "trash property" at the end of the village's water system where houses already are experiencing water pressure problems. Magado Creek is at the north end of the park, which

drains into the Bonito stream system, Lippmann pointed out. Any pollution from the septic tanks could impact downstream, he said.

The county Environment Department agent who is handling the review of the project was away from the office last week and could not be reached for comment. The state official who supervises his work also was unavailable for comment.

The village may have to live with this mobile home development, but officials and residents should learn a lesson from this situation, Lippmann said. The village needs land use regulations and to establish a three-mile extraterritorial zone around Capitan just as Ruidoso officials did around their village.

"I've heard rumors about a junk yard coming in; things like that will drive down property values in Capitan," Lippmann said. "I'm concerned about the future of the village. With a land use ordinance, everything existing would be grandfathered in. It only would affect land not yet developed." Until then, state officials should stop taking the word of developers and become more active in reviewing projects, he said.

"At least this has galvanized some property owners who are upset about the terrible destruction of the trees," he said.

Caughron said village officials initially tried to stop the project by saying Capitan could not provide the size of meter specified, then tabling the request.

"We felt there wasn't adequate water pressure for a two-inch meter," Renfro said.

"Now we have advertised for an engineer and have a loan to build a storage tank. We asked him to wait."

But Caughron dropped the size to a three-quarter-inch meter and then nothing stood in the project's way. However now Caughron wants to drill his own well and sent for a permit from the state environment department.

"I hope to drill it early (this) week," he said. "If it's good, I will supply the lots with that water."

If not, he will split the supply between the well and city water on a three-quarter inch meter, he said.

Village Attorney Dave Thomsen said if Caughron had proposed a subdivision, a review by the planning commission and vote by the trustees would have been required, but no rules exist governing a mobile home park. Hausler said his board had no choice but to point out to the trustees that nothing in village law prevents such a park from being built.

Downs officer takes his case to district court

A Ruidoso Downs police officer is asking the Lincoln County District Court to review administrative disciplinary action against him connected to a speeding incident and a disagreement with another officer.

Officer F. Grant Lipscomb was accused of speeding in a village vehicle and of contributing to problems that disrupted the operation of the Ruidoso Downs Police Department.

After a grievance hearing in April, a three-member personnel board dismissed the second charge and modified the course of discipline recommended by Police Chief David Hightower on the speeding charge.

In the action filed June 3 in district court by Officer Chris J. Condon on behalf of Lipscomb, the officers contend the board's decision was "bias, arbitrary and capricious (sic) incorrect as a matter of administrative law."

Lipscomb has the right to a judicial review, because he has exhausted all administrative remedies, Condon contended.

Sean Baker, a village attorney, said last week he has not seen the lawsuit.

"But we're confident on our actions and

also confident based on the standards of review for these types of cases," he said.

Hightower proposed a discipline for Lipscomb of a 14-day suspension without pay, coupled with the loss of the privilege to drive a patrol car to and from home.

Lipscomb previously pointed out that a fine for speeding would have been \$170, but the suspension would cost him \$1,200.

In the request for judicial review, Lipscomb stated he was not advised of his constitutional rights at a March 23, pre-disciplinary hearing when he was facing six violations.

Hightower dismissed all but two by the time of a grievance board hearing April 27. The speeding incident occurred on the way back to Lincoln County from a training session in Roswell, Lipscomb told the grievance board.

The other charge stemmed from a confrontation Feb. 10, with police Officer Ken Arther that centered on reports to Arther of critical remarks by Lipscomb about his overtime.

The discussion began in a back room, but spilled over into the dispatch area of the police station where it was picked up on an audio tape.

Played at the hearing, the tape showed Arther becoming agitated, abusive in his language and loud.

At the hearing, Hightower contended he fully investigated the accusations lodged by Arther against Lipscomb, and didn't use the names of two firemen who repeated Lipscomb's remarks, because they didn't want to come forward at that time.

However, one of the firemen, Jimmy Smith, testified at the hearing no one asked him about his conversation with Arther.

He characterized Lipscomb's remarks as general conversation, "not a stab in the back."

He also said he never asked to be left out of the discipline report.

Twelfth Judge Karen Parsons withdrew from the case because Ruidoso Downs attorney Dan Bryant and she worked together in the same law firm.

The judge cannot hear any cases involving former law associates for five years.

A new judge should be appointed to the case within 10 days.

No court date for the case has been set.

CAPITAN - The Capitan School Board has set a deadline of June 25 to receive applications for the board

vacancy resulting from Jack King's resignation.

Anyone interested in applying can mail, fax or drop off a letter of interest and resume to the Capitan Administration Building,

P.O. Box 278, Capitan, N.M. 88316, fax 354-2240, said Superintendent of Schools Diana Billingsley.

Billingsley said board members during a June 10 meeting also approved a list of projects for spending the two-mill levy funds from the 1997 election, totaling about \$250,000. The money will be spent on a new storage building, a fire alarm system for the high school and Traylor Gym, a heating system for the high school, a computer lab for the middle school, a fire alarm system for the vocational agricultural building, and equipment for the cafeteria.

In addition, \$21,495 will go with the \$64,485 approved by the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department to pave Yard Road behind the school for safety and to improve drainage.

The bonds approved in the May 11 election for \$2 million were sold to invest company Dain Rauscher at 4.68 percent interest, Billingsley said, which she said is a good rate. There is a 30-day protest period for anyone with concerns about the sale to inform the school board.

The money will be used to build six elementary classrooms, an elementary library and a music room, and a bus route drop-off. Architects are working on preliminary drawings for drainage, topography, and soil samples, and, Billingsley said, people are waiting to get paid for their work.

Ground work on the bus lane and new parking areas is scheduled to start July 1 and to be completed by the time school starts.

The next meeting of the school board is July 8 at 6 p.m.



The more the muddier

The Billy the Kid Cup bike race brings in more riders despite the weather

FORT STANTON — The second annual Billy the Kid Cup mountain bike race was a dirty affair Sunday, not because of participants' actions, but because of the weather.

Rain and hail Saturday night and a constant drizzle Sunday left the Fort Stanton course, and the riders, covered in mud from helmet to toe clips. But the weather didn't keep the racers from doing their best, and no one seemed to mind too much.

"Overall, I think everybody had a good time," said race organizer John Parker. "The mood of the crowd was just great."

In the pro/expert race, the finish came down to a flat tire.

Tim Bolton and Mick Harris were one and two after the first 10-mile lap. Bolton retained the lead going into the third lap, trailed by Damien Calvert, last year's Cup winner. But Bolton flat-tired just short of the 27.4-mile finish, giving Mike Chapman of Santa Fe a chance to edge Bolton, Calvert and Harris.

"I had a good last lap, and unfortunately Tim, who was winning most of the race, flat-tired, and I caught him," Chapman said. "I was duking it out with Mick for most of the race, with Damian a little ways up in sight."

Kendra Ley of Albuquerque took the women's pro/expert title for the second time.

"I won (last year), but I was the only one who showed up, so it's nice to have some competition this year," she said.

The number of women competing in the pro/expert class tripled, with three on the course.

Scott Long from Alamogordo was the top finisher in the sport master class.

An Olympic-hopeful in the marathon, sponsored by

Power Bar, Long has a stress fracture, and can't run. He rides to keep in shape, so was surprised with the victory.

"Last year, when I did this course, I didn't have such a good time," he said. "It was hot and I just really didn't like it. This year, it just seemed to go well from the start. I just moved up and stayed out front once I got out front."

Denny Newell of Los Alamos, who was riding in only his second race, was also surprised when he won the beginner's category.

"During the beginning there were a lot of people coming off their bikes and a lot of mixups," he said. "I was way near the back in a lot of the climbs, but I guess I caught them all."

Except for Chapman, who said he liked riding in the mud, the others agreed the course was a little sloppy.

"I went down a couple of times in the mud, especially the second time around," Long said. "It was nasty in places and I went down. But I held it together and got back up and rode on."

"The mud was kind of tough," Ley agreed. "The mud clogged up my derailleurs and it stopped shifting towards the end."

"The downhill, the road part, the rain was helpful, but some of the uphill track got a little muddy, so I got bogged down going up some of the climbs," Newell said.

But despite the mud, Mother Nature seemed to be the only one not having a good time.

"Overall, I think it went really well," Parker said. "The new course changes were received really well. The rain didn't help, didn't hinder. It made the course a little bit more challenging."

This year's event also featured a kids race, for riders under age 11, and a bike toss, in which contestants vied to see how far they could toss a donated, beat-up mountain bike.

Sonora Dodd of Washington is credited with first having the idea of "father's day." She thought of the idea while listening to a Mother's Day sermon in 1909.

Dodd wanted to honor her father, William Smart, who was a Civil War veteran and a widower. His wife had died while giving birth to their sixth child, and Smart was left to raise the newborn and his five other children on a rural farm in eastern Washington.

After Dodd became an adult, she realized all her father had done for her and her siblings. Her father was born in June, so she chose to have the first Father's Day celebration in Spokane, Wash., on June 19, 1910.

In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day. But it didn't officially come about until President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the third Sunday of June as Father's Day.

William and Carol Ayres claim that Brady Baxter, and his father, Robert P. Baxter, breached their contract with the couple, failed to make payments on a debt and fraudulently transferred assets to a "shell" trust.

They are asking for an accounting of records, including those of The Hondo Trust, Baxter's development company for 10-lot subdivision to be called The Preserve. Also named as a defendant is W. Scott Epley in his capacity as trustee of that trust.

The 50-acre subdivision on the crest of a hill is already approved in the Extrater-

restrial Zone around Ruidoso and will feature private roads, domestic wells and septic tanks.

"We dispute the allegations contained in the pleadings as being inaccurate," Brady Baxter said Thursday, speaking on behalf of the three defendants. "We're in the process of having the litigation transferred to federal court in Texas where the matter belongs."

In their suit filed May 26, the Ayres claim that they invested \$185,870 with the Baxters to drill gas and oil wells in Duval County, Texas. They also loaned the brothers \$25,000, initially unsecured, then later secured with a deed of trust on the wells to be dug or put into production, they state in the suit.

The two men paid \$3,000 toward the interest on the loan, but nothing since then, the couple contend.

The Ayres say the money they gave the two men was used on wells not included in

their agreement. They claim drillers on the proposed well weren't paid and no financial statements or accounting on the investment have been given to them.

The Baxters "admitted using the money on property not covered by the original investment and in which the plaintiffs have no investment," the Ayres state in the suit. The money was diverted contrary to the agreement between the two parties, the couple claim.

The father and son transferred the money to other property in an attempt to defraud, the Nevada couple contend. The Ayres stated that the Hondo Trust is the alter ego of the Baxters, "a mere shell and sham," used to avoid individual liability. The Ayres are asking the court for an injunction against the further sale or disposition of property, the appointment of a receiver and financial compensation and payment.

'Impact' school effort launched

WASHINGTON - The Federally Impacted School Improvement Act, recently introduced by bipartisan members of Congress, would authorize \$50 million a year for the next five years for Impact Aid school construction and repair. Almost 350 school districts nationwide would be eligible for funding should the bill become a law.

Forty-five percent of the funding appropriated under the bill will go to school districts on or near federal property or those educating students from Indian lands, another 45 percent to districts educating children whose parents are in the military, and the final 10 percent is reserved for Indian land schools that are facing dire emergency situations. School districts would be

required to match every federal dollar except for the 10 percent reserved for emergencies. The bill also limits to \$3 million the amount an individual school district can receive in any five-year period.

The Senate bill was introduced April 1 by Sens. Max Baucus (D-Mont.) and Chuck Hagel (R-Neb.), and is co-sponsored by Tim Johnson (D-S.D.), Conrad Burns (R-Mont.), and Daniel Moynihan (D-N.Y.). The House bill was introduced May 18 by Reps. Earl Pomeroy (D-N.D.) and J.D. Hayworth (R-Ariz.).

"We appreciate the interest these Senate and House members have in school construction," said John B. Foyenbrock, NAFIS executive director.

The Child Abuse Prevention Task Force is opening up a way for Ruidoso residents to help local children get needed school supplies for the next school year.

The task force met on Friday to discuss plans for their school supply drive. Members of the task force include individuals from Raindancer Youth Services, Children's Medical Services, HeadStart, and the Community

Mental Health Counseling Center in Lincoln County.

"Our belief is that if we help take some stress off parents they will feel better about themselves and this is good for their kids," Katherine Cooper, clinical director of the Community Mental Health Counseling Center in Lincoln County, said.

The task force plans to set up drop-off boxes in commercial businesses where people can donate school supplies for needy children in Ruidoso, Merriken Bryant, treatment coordinator for Raindancer Youth Services, said. Bryant said the school supply drive is scheduled to start in mid-July and last through the first week of school.

The task force will then, Bryant said, hand the materials over to the schools. Teachers can then distribute the necessary supplies to those children who they notice don't have any, Bryant said.

Accepting cash donations was also discussed at the meeting. Then if a teacher saw a specific need in one of their children, the funds would be available to meet that need,

Bryant said. The money could also be used to buy additional school supplies, Bryant said.

Instructions on where to send cash donations will probably be posted near the drop boxes, Bryant added.

Fliers and signs around town will announce the details of the school supply drive, as the time for the drive approaches, Bryant said.

The task force also will send a letter to Ruidoso service clubs and to churches to let them know about the school supply drive, Bryant said.

"There are diverse professionals who are available to go out into the community and spread the word about the drive and about child abuse prevention," Bryant said.

"I'm willing to speak to any groups that might want to hear me," Julie Sands, supervisor for Children Protective Services, said.

RHS seniors would continue drug testing for athletes

Seniors surveyed at Ruidoso High School said they believe the school should continue drug-testing of athletes, but they don't think the policy was a deterrent to drug use.

The results of a senior survey on drug testing policy at the high school were presented to the School Board of Education June 8.

One hundred seventeen students (of 144 graduating seniors) responded to the survey administered on a Friday morning toward the end of the school year, said Paul Wirth, director of instructional services.

Another survey patterned after the Benson Asset Survey

was returned by about 30 seniors attending the senior banquet and by 71 juniors as part of their final exam in English class. History teacher Gerald Ames questioned the validity of the surveys since, in the case of the seniors, only about 25 percent of the class attended the banquet and they are "participants."

Sixty percent of the seniors and 49 percent of the juniors responded that they feel adults value them (individually). Thirty-seven percent of the seniors and 41 percent of the juniors said they did not feel adults in Ruidoso value them.

Also at the school board meeting, Caren Snow, business manager for the district, announced that the first meet-

ing of the State Department of Education for the district's budget for the 1999-2000 school year will be June 16 in the Ruidoso Middle School library, and the public is invited. The school board approved recommendations by Mike Gladden, superintendent of schools, and Wirth for hirings of Bill Green for the position of high school principal and Ronald Bennett for Ruidoso Middle School principal. Green has been principal of Quemado Independent School District,

and Bennett has been principal of Truth or Consequences Middle School.

Also approved by the school board were hirings of Kief Johnson as a high school special education teacher, Angela Coleman as Sierra Vista Primary teacher, Suzanne Leland as Sierra Vista Primary and White Mountain Elementary nurse, and Denise Dorn as special education instructional assistant.

Three or four more positions will be filled through the summer, Wirth said.


The school board adjourned for a closed session to review personnel evaluations.


Land of Infinite Variety South Dakota From A to Z



South Dakota
The Mini Page visits South Dakota, the geographic center of the U.S. (including Alaska and Hawaii). It is known for its scenic beauty, from the beautiful Black Hills to the rugged Badlands to miles of open prairie. The Mount Rushmore state is also known for its harsh weather that includes drought, floods, blizzards, bone-chilling cold and tornadoes.



Mount Rushmore is one of the largest sculptures in the world. Sixty-foot-high faces of four presidents are carved in this mountain in the Black Hills. They are: Washington, Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Lincoln. Sculptor Gutzon Borglum and 400 workers spent a total of 6 1/2 years on the giant sculpture. After Borglum died, his son finished it in 1941.



The Missouri River divides the state almost in half. Most of the crops are grown in the eastern farmlands. To the west are most of the livestock ranches and the mountains. Agriculture and related businesses are very important. About 90 percent of the land is used for farming or ranching.



Banking and manufacturing of goods such as computers are also big businesses.



The **Badlands** is an eerie area of jagged rocks and gullies, full of fossils.

Deadwood was a booming Wild West town, where Calamity Jane lived and Wild Bill Hickok was killed.



Evans Plunge in Hot Springs is the largest natural indoor warm-water pool in the world.



The **Black Hills** are covered with so many pine trees, the hills look black from a distance.

The western **Frontier** and pioneer life are important parts of the state's heritage.




The **Corn Palace** in Mitchell is covered with giant artworks made of thousands of bushels of corn.



Crazy Horse, a Lakota Sioux leader, helped defeat Custer. His memorial is being carved in the Black Hills a few miles from Mount Rushmore.

The **Great Plains**, flat grasslands, or prairie, stretch over about two-thirds of the state.

More About South Dakota

Homestake Mine in Lead first opened in 1876. It is the longest continuously operated gold mine in the world, and the largest gold mine in the U.S. Thousands of settlers rushed into the area after gold was discovered in 1874.

Needles Highway, a winding, narrow, 14-mile scenic road, runs through granite tunnels and rock formations in the Black Hills.

Tourists play a big part in the economy. About 3 million people visit Mount Rushmore and the state's scenic wonders every year.

Oats are a major crop. South Dakota is the country's second-largest producer.

Urban, or city, populations are small. Over half of the people live in rural areas. The largest city, Sioux Falls, has a population of about 100,000. The state's population is only about 700,000.

Pierre (PEER) is the state capital.

Vermillion, site of the university, also has the Shrine to Music Museum with more than 5,000 rare instruments.

Jewel Cave is decorated with beautiful crystals. The caves in the Black Hills make up the second-longest cave system in the world.

Reptile Gardens, near Rapid City, has the largest living reptile collection in the world.

Wheat is one of the state's main crops. Other top crops include: corn, flax, sunflowers, barley, rye, sorghum, alfalfa and soybeans. Cattle, hogs, sheep, chickens and turkeys are raised there.

At the Keystone gold mine, visitors can still pan for gold.

The Sioux, the Dakota and Lakota people, were pushed onto reservations when European settlers moved into the area. Two of the biggest Indian reservations in the U.S. are in the state. The state gets its name from the Dakota Sioux. "Dakota" means friends.

Clark Lewis and Clark passed through the area in 1804 and 1806.

Lead (LEED) is the home of the Black Hills Mining Museum. There visitors can tour an exact replica of an underground gold mine.

Mammoth Site in Hot Springs holds fossils of about 100 mammoths that died 26,000 years ago.

Sturgis is the yearly site of the world's largest motorcycle gathering, or rally.

Clark Lewis and Clark passed through the area in 1804 and 1806.

Yankton, on the Missouri River, was once the capital of the Dakota Territory.

"WiZard of Oz" author L. Frank Baum lived in Aberdeen. In Storybook Land amusement park, popular fairy tales, including the Oz stories, come to life.

Evening at Pops still snaps, crackles on PBS


Boyish Keith Lockhart couldn't have been out of knee pants when the Boston Pops Orchestra started its summer TV concert series on public television. Today Lockhart is conductor of the orchestra (only the third in its TV history), leading *Evening at Pops* into its 30th season on the air. Anyone who wants proof that *Pops* is still fresh, inventive and a whole lot of fun can

check out the season debut, "Brush Up Your Shakespeare," Thursday, June 24, on PBS (check local listings). Tapping into the zeitgeist of the Bard, Lockhart invited Shakespeare & Company, a Massachusetts repertory troupe, to join the Pops and special guest Claire Bloom for an evening of scenes, songs and silliness. The performers, usually deployed on the apron of the Boston Symphony Hall stage, literally upstage their hosts at times, taking to an elevated platform at the

back of the stage. The dual performance area is put to excellent use during a segment that juxtaposes a scene from *Romeo and Juliet* with a duet from Leonard Bernstein's score for *West Side Story*. Other music includes the concert's title tune from Cole Porter's *Kiss Me Kate* and a selection from Verdi's *Otello*. Another highlight is a scene between Macbeth (wonderful Jonathan Epstein) and his lady (regal Corinna May). And Lockhart is pressed into comic service as Wall in a scene from *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Upcoming concerts include "Swingin' at the Pops" Thursday, July 8, featuring singer-songwriter Ann Hampton Callaway (theme for *The Nanny*). Thursday, July 15, Nathan Lane (*The Birdcage*, Timon in *The Lion King*) joins forces with the Pops in a concert honoring the career of Danny Kaye. "Strangers in Paradise," on Thursday, July 29, is a collaboration with filmmaker Barry Levinson (*Homicide: Life on the Street*) saluting European emigres who composed music for Hollywood films. Violinist Itzhak Perlman and singer Vic Damone perform the music of Max Steiner, Kurt Weill and many others.





Keeping the Pink Out

Conjunctivitis, also known as "Pink Eye" is the most common disease of the eyes. Your eye care professional can determine if your symptoms are caused by a bacteria, a virus or an allergy. The condition may affect one or both eyes and, depending upon the cause, may be contagious. Symptoms may include redness, inflammation, sensitivity to light, watery or mucus-like discharge, itching or burning sensation. Tearing and irritation may also be present with complaints of eyelids sticking together upon awakening.

It is very important to keep eyelids and lashes clean and free of debris, and use all medication for the full course as prescribed. Failure to follow your doctor's instructions precisely can result in recurrence of your infection. The secondary infection is usually a more resistant strain and will require a change in medication and treatment duration. Never use medication prescribed for one family member on another without first consulting your doctor. Symptoms may appear similar, but the cause may be quite different and require different treatment.

Another World soon to be just another memory

When Christopher Goutman joined *Another World* as executive producer seven months ago, he was determined to turn the show around.

For years, *AW* had struggled in limbo, going through a series of writers and producers with little continuity. Goutman found himself with a talented cast involved in muddled story lines.

"I was very confused when they brought me on," he says. "I knew if the stories were confusing to me, the viewers were suffering as well. I wanted to bring back the elements that had made the show so great in the mid-'80s when I was directing there. I wanted the characters to do what they did best."

When he streamlined the stories and concentrated on the relationships among the characters, some of the fans' favorite actors were persuaded to return. The 35-year-old soap appeared to be on the comeback trail.

Unfortunately, Goutman arrived too late to save *AW*. NBC's longest-running serial airs its last episode on Friday, June 25. The network canceled the low-rated daytime drama to make room for a new soap opera, *Passions*.

In many ways, *AW* set the standard for daytime serials. "The show has always taken risks," actress Linda Danon (Felicia) says. "It was one of the first daytime dramas to go to 60 minutes.

We were also never afraid to tackle important social issues.

"I think one of the running comments about the show is that we have always had the best actors in daytime," Danon says. "A lot of our actors come from stage and Broadway. When Paul Rauch was the executive producer, he would go to a lot of theater. He would find someone in a production he loved, and he'd bring them on. He really helped set the standard for our show."

Anne Heche, Ray Liotta, Morgan Freeman, Susan Sullivan, Charles Durning, Faith Ford, Thomas Gibson, Kelsey Grammer, Billy Dee Williams, Luke Perry, Marla Maples, Brad Pitt and Kyra Sedgwick are just a few big names who are *AW* alumni.

"Anyone doubting the popularity of the show's characters need only note that four of them - Jake, Vicky, Cass and Lila (Tom Eplin, Jensen Buchanan, Stephen Schnetzer, Lisa Peluso) - will soon be jumping not only shows, but networks," says Richard Simms, executive editor of *Soaps in Depth* magazine. "They will be appearing for at least a limited time on CBS' *As the World Turns*. Ironically, since *ATWT* airs in the same time slot *AW* did, characters from the show which NBC canceled could in effect draw viewers to CBS."

Some have speculated that the demise of *AW* could mean the end of soap operas, but that isn't likely. Two new soap-opera cable networks will

launch in January 2000, and USA Network is making its first foray into the genre with *The Avenue*. The world of soaps may simply be in a transition period.

"There were many folks who believed soaps would never make the transition from radio to television," Simms says. "That was then; this is now. There is no reason to believe that pulling the plug on *AW* will result in soaps going down the drain."

That said, the goodbyes on *AW* will still be difficult for fans, as well as members of the cast and crew. But Goutman promises to leave fans with a smile. "I want to celebrate the show in every aspect," he says. "It will be happy endings for everyone, and a sense of completion for fans."


