## Official predicts light runoff from heavy snowpack

Winter brought more snow, but dry soil absorbing moisture

While snowpack statistics in the Sacramento Mountains compare well to long-term averages, Keith Kessler says he sees indications of poor runoff to feed Lincoln County's stream systems.

Kessler, who has monitored the snowpack for 14 years, usually takes his measurements on the first day of February, March and April, but wasn't allowed to go up Ski Run Road Sunday because of the Musketball Fire that burned more than 100 acres.

Although he couldn't drive to the 10,280-foot ridge to gather data from 10 measurement points like he did last year, he was able to walk in without snowshoes, Kessler said.

"There's no snow on the southern facing slopes and in some places, the ground is dry," he said. "You don't see a decent blanket of snow until you hit about 10,200 feet (in elevation). The ski area and the northern facing slopes look good."

"Whenever the southern facing slopes in April are totally devoid of snow and I don't have to snowshoe the road - to me, those are not really good conditions for this time of year. The only place I needed snowshoes was on the snowcourse itself."

Kessler is manager of the Bonito Recreation Area for the city of Alamogordo.

The average snow depth registered at 31 inches with a water content of 10.6 inches and a 34 percent density factor.

The lowest snow depth measured 22 inches and the same spot had the lowest amount of water at six inches. The greatest depth was 41 inches and 15 inches of water.

Those statistics are much better than last year when the average depth was 3.4 inches and water content was less than 1 inch.

While the average amount of water in the snow this year for April isn't far off the long-term average of more than 11 inches, Kessler said other indicators curb his optimism.

"The ground I tested was wet, but not saturated, which tells me the ground is sucking up the moisture," he said. "For runoff to the streams, that's not as good. I think we'll have a steady run-off that may then just quit like it did a few years ago."

In the late 1990s, stream forecasters were predicting a better than average run-off, but Kessler disagreed and turned out to be right. Many of the same type of signs he saw then he's seeing now, Kessler said.

## State halts open burning

The Musketball Fire prompted state officials Monday to cancel open-burning permits in Lincoln County.

The Musketball Fire erupted about noon Sunday after a permitted brush piles burn went out of control, spreading north of the Alpine Village subdivision on Ruidoso's north side.

"I feel like I did everything right," said Mark Mobley, who began burning a pile of cut timber just before noon. "It was circumstances beyond my control."

Appearing emotionally shaken by the resulting Musketball Fire, Mobley said he could not believe his brush pile "went up like a tinder box," and just four minutes after igniting the pile he was calling 911.

"I'm very sorry that it happened," Mobley said. "I feel horrible about it. I've thought about it hundreds, thousands of times since it happened and I honestly don't know what I could have done different."

The fire quickly moved north, prompting the Sunday afternoon evacuation of several neighborhoods.

By Sunday night those routed from their homes were allowed to return as the fire "laid down," nearly halting its advance, said Maria Garcia, fire information officer with the Incident Command Post established Monday at the Ruidoso Convention Center.

A shelter was set up by the Rio Hondo Chapter of the American Red Cross at Gateway Church of Christ in Ruidoso. In addition the Red Cross provided food and drink to firefighters.

Cost of firefighting efforts for Monday and Tuesday alone was estimated at \$217,000.

Initially firefighters from the Bonito, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Glencoe-Palo Verde, Fort Stanton, Lincoln, Dunagan,

Alamogordo and Alamo West fire departments, as well as crews from Mescalero Bureau of Indian Affairs, Capitan District of the New Mexico State Forestry Division and the U.S. Forest Service responded to the blaze west of State Highway 48 at Alto Crest.

The response grew to 290 command post and firefighting members, as a Type II Incident Management Team took over suppression direction Monday morning. At 6

p.m. today, local fire management officials, under a Type III team headed by the state Forestry Division located at Capitan, were to be given control, according to officials Tuesday.

A 6 p.m. Tuesday briefing at the Incident Command Post told of the Musketball Fire being "pretty much hammered" and into a

## Fort boosters set their sights on next year's Legislature

■ Supporters plan to bring legislators and influential figures to visit the 1855 fort.

Supporters of Fort Stanton seeking money to repair the 1855 complex walked away empty handed at the end of the state legislative session March 17.

But with some help, they've

positioned themselves for a big thrust in 2002.

They'll stay busy over the next year bringing legislators and other influential figures in state government to the historic fort 15 miles northeast of Ruidoso to see first-hand the need for repairs and the potential for economic development, say Sally Burkstaller and Dick Weber of Fort Stanton Inc.

Jose Cisneros, director of the Monuments Division of the Office of Cultural Affairs,

said last week he will be sending a team to Lincoln County within the next few weeks to evaluate the fort for possible inclusion as a state monument.

State Sen. Pete Campos, D-Las Vegas, also pledged to keep the issue of funding for the fort alive if a special session of the legislature is called by the governor. Meanwhile, he will meet with state General Services Secretary Steven Beffort to find out what that department wants

to see happen at the fort while its future is decided.

The monuments division is involved because of a house memorial introduced by State Rep. Dub Williams, a Republican from Glencoe, asking the cultural affairs office to evaluate the fort's eligibility as a possible state monument.

"Several standards must be met to evaluate it as a candidate," Cisneros said. "If it meets the criteria, whoever

After a noon to 1 p.m. lunch period, the groups will return and present their conclusions.



# SNOWPACK: Winter was good to Ruidoso but concerns persist

"Most of our water is being absorbed, which is good for recharge, but not for run-off," he said. "Warm days and high winds take a toll. With the Musketball Fire we just had, it's obviously already dry out there.

"Here in the mountains, there's still some winter left.

We need a good dumping of wet snow on top of what we have. That would really help. Once the ground is saturated, then the rest will run down hill."

But if the area goes without substantial moisture for 45 days, the runoff will run out, he predicted.

According to a weather summary from the U.S.

Department of Agriculture, the Ruidoso area at 2.01 inches, is running at less than half of its normal 4.24 inches of precipitation for the period of January through March. However, Carrizo is above average at 3.65 inches compared to the 2.10-inch average.

Kessler said the Bonito side of the ridge shows better

stream flow than the Ruidoso side. But both have decreased, instead of increased in the last few days.

"I think it's because of the past droughts," he said. "The ground is really soaking it up and so is the vegetation in all of these overgrown sections of the forest that haven't been thinned."

# FIRE: Musketball blaze to come under local control today

mop-up stage.

The fire, which moved through a part of Musketball Canyon around Snowflake Ridge, was declared 100 percent contained Monday, after a fire line was established around the perimeter.

While the size of the blaze had been estimated at 100 acres Sunday and Monday, the area was increased to 125 acres after Global Positioning Satellite measurements were taken Tuesday.

In addition to efforts to stop the spread of the fire Sunday afternoon, local firefighters had also been stationed at structures in the immediate path of the blaze. One residence, a mobile home, got a "foam-and-go" as flames advanced, said Chris Denne, chief of the Bonito Volunteer Fire Department.

The mobile home was damaged.

The blaze was also attacked from the air when a tanker aircraft from Fort Smith, Ark. arrived about 5 p.m. Sunday.

Crews, including three hot-shot teams from the Sacramento and Smokey Bear ranger districts of the Lincoln National Forest, and

Mescalero, worked fire line reinforcement, flare-ups, hot spots, and mop-up Monday and Tuesday, said Karen Lightfoot, a fire information officer.

During a 6 p.m. Monday briefing at the Incident Command Post, Matt Reidy, operations chief for the Musketball Fire, told crews heading out for overnight duty that the suppression effort "looked real good."

The Lincoln County burn permit prohibition, issued by Darwin Pattengale, manager of field operations for District 4 of the New Mexico Environment Department, halted the issuance of any new permits and canceled 43 existing permits.

Pattengale said the order was for two reasons.

"It gives us time to assess the situation," Pattengale said. "And all the resources there were tied up. God help us if we had another incident in Lincoln County. It was to protect people, to prevent anything that might occur."

Pattengale said those with existing permits were contacted about the decision.

Since July 1, 2001, the state Environment Department has issued 290 open-burning per-

mits in Lincoln County. The permit issued on March 28 to Mobley stated the authorization was granted for the prevention of a fire hazard on three acres of land in the Alpine Village subdivision.

On the permit application Mobley stated the burning was needed because of the fire danger present on the property.

He stated it was not feasible to haul off wood piles from the tree trimmed property because of vehicle inaccessibility.

Pattengale said the Environment Department does not send someone to a location to assess a permit request.

"We don't have an adequate staff to do that," Pattengale said. "We try to determine what the individual is trying to do and they usually are pretty straightforward and honest. We would like not to have to issue these. We would like the county to have an ordinance and issue permits. But Lincoln County doesn't, so we handle it."

Just hours after the fire broke out, Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson, observing from a command post near the Best Western-Swiss Chalet Inn, issued an emergency declaration, paving the way for

state and federal assistance.

Lincoln County Commissioners, in a 10-minute session Monday, declared the county a disaster area, citing fire damage to residences, ranch land and wild lands.

No structures were damaged in the blaze.

The resolution states that locally available public and private resources are insufficient to cope with the situation and invokes the commission's emergency powers, allowing the county to access relief and assistance programs.

In a second resolution, the commission declared Rosemary Gonzales-Hernandez, county emergency services coordinator, as the applicant agent for all financial assistance from the state.

Gonzales-Hernandez, who was hired less than two months ago, said before the meeting that she was supposed to attend a training session in Santa Fe Monday, but canceled because of the fire.

"I guess this is on-the-job training," she said.

## STATE BRIEFS

### Jury selection begins

ESTANCLIA — The much-delayed retrial of an Elephant Butte man on sex-torture charges got under way Monday when jury selection resumed after a four-month hiatus.

David Parker Ray is accused of kidnapping, raping and sexually torturing a 26-year-old Colorado woman near Truth or Consequences in 1996. He is being tried on 12 charges, including six counts of criminal sexual penetration.

His first trial last summer ended in a hung jury.

Jury selection for his retrial began in November but was delayed when the presiding judge, state District Judge Neil Mertz, died of a heart attack. The case was rescheduled for January, but was delayed again when two separate presiding judges were rejected — one by the defense and the other by the prosecutor.

District Judge Kevin Sweazea, named to replace Mertz, is hearing the retrial.

### Guns found at school

SANTA FE — A teen-ager brandished a handgun outside a Santa Fe school Monday and was arrested for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, while another teen was held in a separate case, police said.

Both pistols were unloaded, and neither student linked to the guns had any ammunition when arrested, Deputy Police Chief Beverly Lennen said.

The .44-caliber gun was brought to Capshaw Middle School between 8 and 10 a.m. Monday, Lennen said, while the second gun was brandished just outside the Public School

### Career Academy on Cerrillos Road shortly after 10 a.m.

In the latter instance, Steve E. Romero, 18, was arrested on the assault charge after allegedly pointing the gun at a schoolmate, the deputy chief said.

### 'Ref rage' new crime

SANTA FE — Attacking a sports official will become a separate crime subject to tougher penalties under a measure signed into law Monday by Gov. Gary Johnson.

Also signed by the governor were measures to allow federal judges to perform marriages in New Mexico and to impose a 51-cent-a-line monthly surcharge on cellular and wireless telephone customers.

The surcharge will pay for advanced 911 services that will display a caller's number and location to emergency dispatchers.

### Schools evacuated

TRUTH OR CONSEQUENCES — The junior high school and adjacent high school were evacuated Monday morning because of a bomb threat, school officials said.

School district officials say classes were canceled for Monday afternoon and police were searching the schools.

Officials say the threat came in about 9 a.m.

Students from Truth or Consequences Junior High School were sent to Sierra Elementary School in town for their parents to pick them up.

Students from the adjacent Hot Springs High School were evacuated a little later.

recommends its designation, also must make sure financing goes with it."

After his team, which will include a historian and historical architect, completes its evaluation, the information will be provided to Williams, he said. As he understands the situation, Williams plans to provide the results to Kells & Craig, a firm conducting a state-contracted study on possible uses for the fort.

Williams also has the option of proceeding on his own to seek a designation as a monument in the next legislative session, Cisneros said.

He'd like Steve Kells to come along on the evaluation tour of the fort, Cisneros said. The trip will occur in April, because the Kells study, paid for with \$50,000 from the governor, \$44,000 from a federal economic development grant and \$6,000 from the county, is due in June.

"The criteria of significance is sort of a given with the fort," he said. "But then we get into what it would cost and if being a state monument is the best use."

Burkstaller said in mid-March that lobbyist Gregory Green offered invaluable advice during the waning days of the legislative session. He overheard disheartened supporters talking about the fort and suggested introducing a bill calling for a House legislative interim committee to look at the issue, she said.

Once assigned, a report is assured during the next legislative session in January 2002, a 30-day, budget-only session, she said. The committee, after seeing the results of the Kells & Craig study, could recommend specific funding for the fort or other action. Otherwise, it might be two years before the legislature

looked at the fort again.

Williams introduced the memorial and it passed.

He was not supportive of multiple bills asking for more than \$1 million each for the fort and was critical of a new fort advocacy group that initially did not coordinate its efforts with the Fort Stanton Partnership and state property managers - a move he said offended some state officials.

County Manager Tom Stewart in an e-mail to groups working for the fort admonished supporters to set aside personal agendas.

"Efforts to go around the study and around appointed officials charged with managing the project, have caused nothing but hard feelings and misunderstanding," Stewart wrote. "We have a plan, which is this study. Those involved in separate agendas need to cease."

Williams said he preferred waiting to ask for money until the study is complete and a direction is selected. The only exception was a capital outlay request for \$193,000 to the state Veterans Affairs Commission that would return as much as \$2.7 million toward the expansion and improvement of the cemetery at the fort.

But Weber said roof repair is urgently needed and the property control division's budget for the fort stands at \$49,000 - about enough to pay for two plant employees. Unless other expenses are included under general headings, no money is set aside for repairs, he said.

While waiting on the studies, evaluations and recommendations, the fort partnership, which now includes the Bureau of Land Management, Fort Stanton Inc., Save Fort Stanton and the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, will continue setting up the muse-

**Historic property to remain closed for the coming year**

Lack of money and the failure of the state Legislature to authorize the state General Service Department to lease or sell Fort Stanton means the historic fort may be closed for the next year, state officials say.

"Things look grim," Lincoln County Manager Tom Stewart said Wednesday. "I talked to Les Swindle, head

of the property control division of the state General Services Department, this morning and he said nothing has changed. Unless the property control division finds some funding, no matter who takes responsibility for the fort - property control or the state Monuments Division -

at the end of the state legislative session March 17, Swindle said, "We don't have enough money to pay for those two employees even through the end of this fiscal year," referring to a maintenance crew that has tended the fort through several transitions.

"We received one-fifth of what we asked for in budget for the fort," Swindle

rehabilitation program that operates out of a portion of the fort. The state Public Safety Department also uses several buildings.

Although a study by Kells & Craig on future uses of the fort is due in June, even if nothing option is feasible, another could be done this year, Swindle said.

"We don't have any authorization to do anything with that property," he said. "We went to the legislature asking for that authorization this year and that bill was tabled in committee. Fortunately or unfortunately, that's the situation we've been put in. There's not enough money to operate and because of the lack of legislative action, there are no other options."

That issue was addressed at a meeting last night at the fairgrounds in Capitan, and from all reports it was a lively one — with proactive real estate people arguing with laissez faire activists (!), not to mention lawyers arguing with lawyers. We don't think, however, that anyone tried to give a name to what might happen. Capidoso? Ruitan?

## It's the fertilizer season

It is a rite of spring as sure as the snowmelt and the first pitch of the baseball season. The rural landscape comes alive with implements applying nitrogen fertilizer in preparation for planting.

They're appearing this year much as they have in other years, but this year, the commodity they carry is higher priced. The cost of nitrogen fertilizer is tied directly to the cost of natural gas, which is higher. That's been easy to notice because of higher home heating costs this winter. But natural gas is also used to manufacture anhydrous ammonia, a prime ingredient in nitrogen fertilizer. "For every dollar increase in natural gas prices, anhydrous ammonia goes up \$34 per ton," says Dan Kelley, chairman of the board and president of fertilizer supplier Growmark Inc.

There were also questions about the availability of nitrogen fertilizer after some interruptions in production. Although Growmark's nitrogen supplier did not suspend production, they could have made a larger profit by diverting their higher-valued natural gas supplies to sell on the open market. Fall weather also played a part in the springtime demand scenario for fertilizer.

Nitrogen isn't applied in the fall when the soil temperature stays above 50 degrees, so a warm October caused many producers to put off application until after the winter to avoid losing nitrogen into the air. "The demand for nitrogen this spring will be higher than it has been historically," says Kelley, "because we did not have as much applied last fall."

Natural gas prices spiked mid-winter and have since fallen to about double what they were a year ago.

Even though most farmers buy and pay for the season's fertilizer in the fall of the year, the price for nitrogen was already climbing when producers were making those decisions. "They would not guarantee us a price for anhydrous," says Bill Olthoff who farms in Kankakee County, Ill., "so I locked in a price on 28 percent nitrogen, which was higher than normal but not to the extent that anhydrous was."

When energy costs rise, the effects on farmers are rather far-reaching. The price of energy encompasses "everything from the fertilizer we use, to natural gas to run pumps, natural gas to heat greenhouses and energy to run tractors and combines," says Jon Doggett, an energy policy specialist with the American Farm Bureau Federation. "Agriculture is an energy-intensive industry and we need a dependable supply, we need an affordable supply of energy," he says. The cost of energy obviously has a large impact on a producer's bottom line. Olthoff, who grows corn and soybeans as well as onion sets, uses diesel fuel and propane to run his irrigation pumps. He dries his crops using propane and electricity, not to mention the fuel to power his tractors and trucks. "All those things add to higher costs for us," says Olthoff, lamenting the low market prices for farm commodities, "our prices aren't going to help recoup that."



## RHS golfers win Great 8 tourney

In their previous two tournaments, members of the Ruidoso High School boys golf team felt they had not played their best golf. They got a little closer Friday.

The Warriors won the Great Eight Invitational at the Inn of the Mountain Gods golf course, shooting a 314, six strokes better than Grants.

"The kids played very well, all of them," said Ruidoso coach Eric Eggleston. "We had to throw out an 86."

While the all-around performance by the Warriors was strong, Ryan Shaver and Colton English truly stood out individually, earning first and second place, respectively, at the tournament. Shaver was especially impressive, shooting a one-over, 73, after using 82 and 81 strokes at his last two tournaments.

English, usually the lowest scorer for the Warriors, finished at 75. Chris Duncan shot an 82, Todd Schrader an 84 and Jared Leadingham an 86.

Eggleston said there was still room for some individuals to improve, including senior Todd Schrader who has not shot his best round yet.

"He's still a little rusty," Eggleston said of Schrader. "He's going to come around. When it gets down to it, when it's time to go to state, he's going to be OK."

The Warriors now have some time off, as their next tournament is not until April 16. Eggleston said he thinks the rest will be beneficial to the boys, who played three tournaments in 11 days.

"The kids need some time off. The mental aspect of it is pretty rough," the coach said, noting the team's busy schedule.

The JV boys team also has some down time, as they won't play again until Monday, after taking third at its home tournament March 26. Colby Gibson tied for the individual lead there with a round of 80.

The next varsity tournament for the boys is the Leroy Gooch Invitational April 16-17 at the Alto Lakes and Links at Sierra Blanca golf courses. The tournament is one of the largest in the state as more than 20 teams will take part over the two days.

### Girls

Ruidoso High School girls golf coach Les Carter has seen his team get better with each tournament, so it was little surprise that the Lady Warriors finished third Friday at the Great Eight Invitational.

The girls shot a collective 409, ending up behind powerhouse Goddard (314) and Socorro (397). That score is 21 strokes better than they posted at Roswell just 11 days earlier.

The Warriors were led by LeeAnne Henson, who shot an 88, good enough for a state qualifying leg and the second-best score by a non-Goddard girl. Henson took eighth overall, while six Goddard golfers were in the top seven.

Carter was equally impressed with Landry Siddens and Courtney Gibson, both new to the team. Gibson shot a 109 at the Great Eight and Siddens had a 118.

Murder most foul at Ruidoso Middle School

## Did the librarian do it?

Ruidoso Middle School will need a new librarian, if the district attorney staffs are able to convince a jury that the current librarian, Jerry Kilmer, killed Cupid in cold blood on Jan. 30.

About 21 groups of D.A. teams began to present their cases to grand juries at the Central Administration Office March 27, and finished Tuesday, with mixed decisions by the grand juries, said Dean Hood, a thematic teacher acting as judge for the proceedings.

"Normally some groups try to indict different suspects," Hood said. "This year, Mr. Kilmer is the suspect for all of them."

So far, Hood said, the grand jury decisions have been about evenly split between indicting Kilmer and finding that the prosecution did not have enough evidence.

Superintendent of Schools Mike Gladden was not available for comment on the case, or on what the school district will do if Kilmer is found guilty.

All the members of the prosecution team started out as investigators in the beginning of the semester, as part of a multidisciplinary unit involving all eighth-grade students. As investigators, they learned in Becky Austin's science class to draw maps of the crime scenario (the school building and Dori Stierwalt's room, where Cupid was found), and to do forensics work: fingerprint analysis, tracking footprints, handwriting and blood analyses.

The Lincoln County Sheriff's office and the Ruidoso Police Department sent investigators to brief the students on methods and techniques for examining evidence, and Danny Sisson, field investigator for the Office of the Medical Investigator, briefed them on doing an autopsy.

Acting Chief of Police Stierwalt used her classroom (and the murder scene) as the crime lab, and she licensed students as investigators after then came up with 10 questions to start the investigation.

Students wrote newspaper arti-

cles about the murder, as well as obituaries and epitaphs in Debbie Harelson's class, and learned about the law and the Constitution from Hood's class.

Later, a trial will take place in the district or magistrate court, students will be selected to serve as prosecuting and defense attorneys, and volunteers will serve on the jury, Hood said. (The students' grades depend on his interpretation of how well they present their cases.)

"I'll select individuals to continue past this point — a prosecuting attorney, and the hard part, selecting a group of defense attorneys," Hood said. A local attorney or judge will talk to both of these groups about questions they can ask and how to prosecute or defend a case in court.

Most of the grand juries were eighth-graders, although two groups of seventh-graders also served.

"Put out of your mind anything you've heard about another case," Hood instructed a grand jury Monday morning. "Your job is to determine whether this group of attorneys is providing you with enough

information that the person they're indicting should be taken to trial."

Hood then instructed them that in the state of New Mexico, two-thirds of the members of the grand jury must find in favor of true-bill or no-bill (to send to trial or not).

The prosecuting team presented shoe prints of the suspect (the librarian) that they'd found at the murder scene, fingerprints on the doorknob to Stierwalt's classroom that match Kilmer's and an affidavit signed by Manuel Guzman stating that he saw Kilmer traveling east to west in the East Wing of the middle school about the time of the murder (between 7:30 and 8:10 a.m.).

The team also presented the grand jury with the broken arrow believed to have been used in the murder.

Matthew Miranda summed up the prosecution's case, saying that Kilmer was larger and weighed twice as much as Cupid, that Cupid had shot an arrow into Kilmer's bicycle tire earlier, causing him to wreck his vehicle, and that Kilmer sought revenge through murder.


That grand jury, however, decided that the prosecution did not present compelling enough evidence on which to indict Kilmer.

## Pioneer Women of the West

The Mini Page celebrates Women's History Month with a story about the pioneer women of the West.

### Who were they?



Many Native American women had been living in the West for generations before the overlanders arrived. This photo was taken on a reservation in Idaho in the late 1800s. Mexicans were in the West, too.

The women of the West also included Asians who came by ship and South Americans who came by ship and overland.



Women often held the reins and drove the animals that pulled the wagons. This is an artist's idea of what life on the trail was like.

Overlanders from many different backgrounds traveled overland on foot and in covered wagons. Like the men, women were seeking a better life for themselves and their families. Along the trail, they suffered from disease, hunger and other hardships.

### The Westward Movement



The Mississippi River was the dividing line between the East and West.

The movement from east to west in the United States started in the 1800s. The first arrivals were usually men. Gold was the big attraction between the years of 1843 and 1860.



The Great Plains is a vast area between the East and West. It includes parts of what is now Kansas, Nebraska, Colorado, North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, New Mexico, Texas and Oklahoma.

Land was the big attraction in the 1860s. In 1862, the U.S. government offered 160 acres to people who would settle parts of the West. They had to plant a crop, build a house and live there for five years before they could own the land. This was called "homesteading."

### Home, sweet home

The building materials that were close by determined in what kind of house the pioneer woman set up housekeeping.




If there were trees available, families like this one in Colorado built their home of logs. Notice that most of the girls are wearing clothes from the same bolt of cloth.



African-Americans also came west after the Civil War. A family poses in front of their sod home in Nebraska. Sod homes were made of packed dirt cut out of the ground and stacked like bricks.

Native Americans might have built their teepees of buffalo hide. Pueblo Indians built apartment-like homes of stones coated with a mixture of clay and straw. Other families built adobe homes of mud bricks that had been baked in the sun.

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
  - 1 teaspoon baking powder
  - 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
  - 1 teaspoon salt
  - 1 cup sour cream
- What to do:**
1. Combine all ingredients except sour cream in a large bowl. Mix well.
  2. Stir in sour cream. Mix to make a soft dough.
  3. Turn onto a floured surface. Knead about 2 minutes.
  4. Roll dough to about 1/2 inch thick. Cut out biscuits using a cookie cutter or drinking glass turned upside down.
  5. Place on a greased baking sheet. Cook in a preheated 400-degree oven for 12 minutes or until done.
- Makes about 1 1/2 dozen.

## Pioneer Women of the West

Pioneer women usually led isolated and lonely lives. Many of their journals are filled with stories of how they longed to have another woman to talk with. Neighbors often lived miles away. Before churches and towns were built, there were few places to gather. Women had to be very independent and able to survive with only the support of their family.

Many of the skills they had used keeping house back East came in handy. They also had to learn many new skills they did not know they had.

Mary Temple Smith was the wife of a minister in Golden, Colo. Most men and women dressed up when they went out in public. This photo was taken in the late 1850s.

We usually see photos of pioneer women all dressed up, posing for their portraits. There are few photos of women going about their daily chores. People thought these scenes were just too everyday to matter. Photographers were also just learning how to take pictures in the mid-1800s, and photos were expensive.

Women and children often gathered dried cow and buffalo droppings to use as fuel out on the plains where there were no trees. Native Americans taught the pioneers how to use these "buffalo chips" and "cow chips" as fuel.

Sewing the family's clothes by hand, pioneer women made use of every scrap of material.

Preparing and cooking food on an open hearth was a never-ending chore.

Gardening enabled families to have fresh fruits and vegetables.

Boiling a mixture of animal fat and lye (ashes from hardwood fires) made soap.

Getting water from a well or nearby river was a daily chore.

Getting in the harvest required the help of all the family.

Branding the cattle was one of many ranching chores.

Bringing up the children included being a doctor and a teacher.

Mothers taught children many skills. Families depended on help from the children to survive.



# Celebrating our 100th Anniversary 1901-2001

The month was May. The year 1901. The place was Dalhart, Texas. H.W. Galbraith had heard of W.L. Foxworth, "from Mississippi," he was told, "knew a thing or


two about the lumber business." Galbraith did. He'd worked for Burton-Lingo, learning the ropes. Now he and partner A.P. Jackson were running three lumber yards in the Territory of New Mexico. But everything changed in Dalhart on that Spring day in May: "Have found the man we have been looking for," wired Galbraith to Jackson. "Catch first train to Dalhart."

During the early 1900s, the young Foxworth Galbraith Lumber Company followed the railroads throughout the west: the Rock Island into New Mexico, and the Ft. Worth and Denver City through the Texas Panhandle.

In 1906, Jackson died and Galbraith's brother J.C. joined the company. By 1920, there were three "Districts", one each in El Paso, Amarillo and Wichita Falls. When the oil boom hit West Texas in the 20s, Foxworth-Galbraith was

there. Yards stayed open 24-hours a day to supply the demand for wood, oil derricks and pipe racks.


The 1930s and 40s were boom and bust times. First oil, then the Great Depression, next World War II, then recovery. One yard went without a sale for 10 days. But mining and oil field sales, repair work, and farm and ranch business gradually rebuilt the Company's momentum.



In 1948, W.L. Foxworth died, preceded by H.W. Galbraith in 1936.

J.C. Galbraith, last of the founding group, became president. Second, third and fourth generation family members continued then and work today for Foxworth-Galbraith.



The 1950s and 60s were decades of change and growth. Foxworth-Galbraith financed and built "Reliance" homes. Female and "do-it-yourselfer" customers were influential in the development of new customer services, expanded product lines, new locations,

increased advertising and improved convenience.

The 1970s, 80s and 90s witnessed bigger stores – stores for the "new" customer, with clean, sharp merchandising, quality merchandise and value. "Building Material Centers" were designed and built. Computerization, professional builder services and Associate Training were developed and refined. And acquisition continued to play a role in our growth with the purchase of several Copeland Lumber
