
Braving cold winds and the specter of a long wait at the border, volunteers from the Episcopal Church of the Holy Mount in Ruidoso loaded their vans Saturday with boxes of toys.

Led by Carol Marsh, church secretary, the three teams headed for Juarez to deliver their holiday cargo to children at six church missions.

"This is an ongoing project," Marsh explained. "About five years ago, our parish adopted a cluster of Episcopal missions in the colonias of Juarez. The cluster has grown from three to six."

Their contact in Mexico is Padre Federico Zuniga, his wife, Magali, and daughters, Yaneer, and Yaell.

Usually, the main gift is a check from

the women of St. Anne's Guild. This year, in addition to the \$1,200 check, piles of toys will be given, donated by a representative of a toy company through a church member.

The project is a joint effort of the church, the guild, Christians in Action, which is a church youth group, and the Society for the Promotion of Christian Knowledge, of which Marsh is the diocese representative for the Rio Grande area.

"We had planned on taking the members of Christians in Action to Mexico for

a big Christmas party, but that was canceled after Sept. 11 with the border restrictions," Marsh said. "But there will be a second trip, a followup, in February when Bibles, prayer books and Sunday school materials will be delivered."

Helping Marsh with Saturday's trip were Alan Miner, church youth director Cindy Reidhead, her parents Bert and Sarah Jane Reidhead, and Charlotte Schaefer, 15, president of Christians in Action, the group that bought all of the batteries needed to operate the toys.

Democrats seek political balance in redistricting

Plans to be available to review at Thursday meeting

Representatives of Lincoln County's Democratic Party have proposed that one county commission district be designed for better political balance.

During a public hearing on redistricting last week, an action mandated every 10 years in line with the latest national population census, county Democratic Party chairwoman Doris Cherry and former chairman Charles Rennie submitted a plan that might allow for the election of a commissioner from their party.

Currently, all five commissioners are Republicans and that party dominates the registration in every precinct.

Overall registration in the county stands at 12,387 voters and reflects the lopsided political affiliation with 3,890 Democrats, 31.4 percent; 6,521 Republicans, 52.6 percent; 38 Green Party, .3 percent; 364 minor party members, 2.9 percent, and 1,574 people who decline to state a party, 12.7 percent.

Sam Chavez, deputy clerk in the office of County Clerk Martha Proctor, said voter rolls

were purged last year for the first time in about five years, dropping 187 Democrats and 331 Republicans.

A dozen people, in addition to county officials, attended the redistricting hearing in Ruidoso to offer opinions and review the latest proposed plan.

Rod Adair, the state senator from Roswell hired as a demographic consultant to help the commission, was absent, but he sent two new maps based on suggestions from the last redistricting workshop.

Plan F seemed to satisfy some of the commissioners, but numbers weren't available.

Commissioner William Schwettmann said they will be available at the commission meeting Thursday in Carrizozo.

The proposal brings the population in District 3, represented by Leo Martinez, within the 5 percent plus or minus of the ideal number as required by law, and keeps Martinez's home within the district lines.

However, the villages of Ruidoso Downs, Capitan and Ruidoso would be split between two districts.

Downs looks to water future

The village of Ruidoso Downs is in the process of adopting a 40-year water plan, which would include acquiring more water rights to accommodate an expected population increase.

John Waters, village administrator, said the plan has been in works for more than two years.

German Andrade of ASCG Inc. made recommendations to the village council at the regu-

lar meeting last week.

He said the village currently uses 270 gallons of water per person per day; however, this includes the people who only come in for the racing season.

"People in the village use water wisely," Andrade said of the people who live in Ruidoso Downs year round. The estimated use is 130 to 140 gallons per day.

Among the recommendations were those to implement a water conservation program, reduce water losses from

Griffith Spring - a major source of water - and identify and acquire new water rights.

Waters said some information for the water plan is still missing.

A public meeting will be held for people who missed the council meeting to discuss the proposed plan at 6 p.m. Thursday.

Raising ground a solution for too-tall fence

A fence just built by businessman R.D. Hubbard is 8 inches too tall, and the village Planning and Zoning Commission approved a variance but said he'll have to add soil around it to bring it within the 8-foot maximum.

Gary Thompson, a neighbor, told the commission Tuesday he had measured the fence before it was completed and found it too high. He said he alerted village officials, but they did not

respond.

"Why have a variance when the fence has been completed," Thompson said.

Commissioner Bill Hirschfeld said the code enforcement should have informed the staff of the problem before construction was completed.

Village planner Darrell L. Bremner said code enforcement had not measured the fence but took the word of the owner on the measurements.

"I really feel that code enforcement dropped the ball," Commissioner Rick Silva said.



That's the same scenario under the current district lines for all but Capitan.

"This latest plan seems to answer most of the questions I have and is the least disruptive for groups with common interests," said resident Jim Slocum.

Under the plan, Sun Valley stays in the same district with Alto. Capitan would be split between District 1, represented by Chairman Rex Wilson, and District 5, represented by Rick Simpson.

To comply with federal requirements, precincts within a district must be contiguous and lines must follow precinct or sub precinct lines, and include unfragmented census blocks, County Clerk Martha Proctor said. They also should share history and like interests and contain reasonable sites for polling places.

Cherry and Rennick said they came up with an alternative after Adair, a Republican, commented that in Lincoln County, the Democratic numbers are too low to worry about political affiliations as "like interests."

They suggested removing precinct 7 from District 2, represented by L. Ray Nunley, and adding precincts 9A, 11A and 10, Ruidoso Downs, into his

district. "That would give minority parties more of a voice and joins a socio-economic segment (working class and Hispanic)

together," Rennick said.

Ruidoso Mayor Robert Donaldson said he would oppose any plan that split his village among three districts. It currently falls within districts 2 and 3. He also reminded commissioners that under some of the state plans circulating, Lincoln County would be splintered into three different state representatives' districts instead of a falling as one entity within District 56, represented by Dub Williams, a Republican from Glencoe.

One consideration should be trying to align ballot issues, he said.

Proctor said commission districts won't have any bearing on state and federal representation. She'd like to have the lines in place by the end of January to know how many more voting machines to order.

Donaldson said creating new sub precincts means finding more places to vote, but Proctor said different sub precincts can vote in the same building.

The Ruidoso convention center will not be available as a polling place for the 2002 primary, the mayor said.

County commissioners to review legislative wish list

Priorities Lincoln County commissioners would like the state Legislature to consider during its January 2002 session will be reviewed Thursday during the monthly commission meeting.

The session starts at 8 a.m. in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Topping the list is a request that the Legislature again approve two special appropriations passed last year, but lost when Gov. Gary Johnson didn't sign the capital appropriations bill. They are \$100,000 and \$96,750 for the county fair-

grounds in Capitan.

County officials want to add wording to allow the money to be used for construction as well as renovation of facilities, rings and lighting, electrical and water lines.

A broader definition of use also is being requested for \$65,000 and \$20,000 previously designated only for a sprinkler system at the New Horizon residential center for the developmentally disabled. Center officials would like to repair a portion of the roof and a boiler with money in excess of the system's \$43,496 cost.

The amount was lower because of outside assistance on the project.

Under new money, \$175,000 is being requested for updated sheriff's dispatch equipment and \$166,000 for construction of a detention center annex for non-violent offenders convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol.

Another \$105,000 could be used to renovate the old county jail space to provide more county administration area, County Manager Tom Stewart wrote.

Under non-money requests in order of priority, Stewart listed authorization to move ahead with a business plan for implementation of the results of a study for future uses of Fort Stanton.

Commissioners also are ask-

ing that the state not sever water rights connected to the fort and its land; that the magistrate court in Carrizozo not be turned into a circuit court; that power to regulate fire-works during periods of extreme drought be left with the county; and that the amount of money that can be reimbursed to members of county road review committees be increased from \$5.

Commissioners also want to see more money returned to counties from the state Fire Fund and the Small Counties Assistance Act.

Stewart noted that 60 percent of money collected through insurance premiums and

designed to improve fire services, reverts to the state general fund. More than \$2.7 million reverted to the general fund from the small counties assistance tax. Lincoln County didn't receive anything, Stewart wrote.

The county's legislative delegation is scheduled Jan. 3 to hear about requests firsthand in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Other items on the commission agenda include:

- An update on the U.S. 70

improvement project east of Ruidoso Downs by consultant Dave Pennington and project engineer Luis Alba from the state Highway and Transportation Department.

- A 9 a.m. public hearing to consider the transfer of an existing liquor dispenser's license from Brewer Oil Co. to State Highway 48 at Ski Run Road where a new convenience store and gasoline pumps are being built.
- A public hearing to consider revisions to the county's road cut ordinance.
- A resolution in support of a re-evaluation of prayer in public schools, passed by the Ruidoso School Board.
- A report by County Treasurer Joan Park on the fiscal condition of the county.
- A report by James Gibson on the county-owned Lincoln County Medical Center.

Alzheimer's conference turnout small

Ruidoso is a tough nut to crack for Alzheimer's Association staff members who set up conferences, such as the one Dec. 14 with Danielle Trujillo, MSW, and educational coordinator for the New Mexico chapter of the Alzheimer's Association.

Only six people attended the conference Friday on "Coping with Memory Loss," compared with 60-80 attendees at conferences held in Roswell.

"Ruidoso is very hard," said Angelle Clair, who set up the conference and conducted one a year and a half ago with simi-

larly poor attendance. "People are so active, they think it's never going to happen to them - memory loss or related dementia."

Trujillo and Clair both pointed out that although a healthy lifestyle with a low-fat diet and plenty of exercise is recommended to delay or avoid Alzheimer's, President Ronald Reagan suffered from the disease in spite of leading a very active life.

Clair's office works closely with the Heritage Senior Program at Lincoln County Medical Center.

Trujillo described the stages people suffering from

Alzheimer's undergo as their altered mental functioning impacts their lives to a small group of caregivers at the Ruidoso Convention Center.

"With each loss, you grieve over that loss, grieving over the person they were," Trujillo said.

The conference offered participants approaches to use when helping with personal care, activities that use the strengths and skills that remain, and issues of communication and behavior.

Another conference will be held in Ruidoso in the spring, Clair said, with training for police department staff.

History group needs members

Organization doubles its ranks in last three years

Officials with the Lincoln County Historical Society hope to dig up some new members this holiday season, as well as remind existing members it's time to renew.

Program director Lynda Sanchez said the only secure source of income for the group is membership fees and donations.

"We now have more than 300 members," she said. "That means in the past three years we have doubled in size."

"We're very proud of our tradition of representing the entire spectrum of individuals who reside in the county. Our mission always has been to help preserve, enhance and interpret regional history, as well as foster a love and respect for the fragile remnants of the past."

During the past year, the society added Hollis Fuchs and Marilyn Burchett as new board members, continued work on an oral history project through a new grant, obtained more photos, documents and books for the group's Johnson Stearns Reading Room and offered assistance to help members of the Carrizozo Women's Club preserve their WPA-built

clubhouse.

Tentative programs for next year will include Karl Laumbach on "When History, Legend and Archaeology Meet" in April, a wood restoration workshop in Lincoln, a field trip to area churches and a tour of the Human Resources Archaeological Laboratory, a presentation on guns of the West and another on music and history.

Best wishes to Ruidoso Downs

The growing village has hired a new police chief.

In this season of goodwill, the appointment of a new police chief for the village of Ruidoso Downs is good news indeed.

Charles Anderson, chief at Sunland Park (the New Mexico racetrack town just outside El Paso, Texas) for the past 12 years, will start his duties in the Downs on Jan. 2.

The new chief's background also includes service as police chief in the community of Hatch, Doña Ana County, and as a Sierra County undersheriff.

Ruidoso Downs administrator John Waters noted that nine of the 28 people who submitted applications had been interviewed in arriving at the final choice, and that Anderson had accepted an annual salary - \$44,000 - somewhat less than that of former chief Eddie Lerma. (Two other applicants, includ-

ing the former Albuquerque police chief, withdrew after applying.)

The village of Ruidoso Downs, which grew immensely during the decade of the 1990s, unquestionably will pose a challenge to the new chief. His prior experience dealing with racetrack and casino issues should prove helpful.

Actually, based on history, anyone agreeing to tackle the job of police chief in Ruidoso Downs must be admired. That department in recent years has been fraught with controversy. Anderson is the third chief in the village in as many years. The village's legal problems involving officers for a time seemed endless.

In the midst of a holiday season that follows one of national trauma, it is nice to receive a piece of good news from our neighbors.

Drinking and disability go hand in hand

DURHAM, N.C. - Men and women over the age of 50 are more likely to be disabled if they have a persistent history of problem drinking, according to a new study.

"A history of problem drinking, especially when combined with recent heavy drinking, is associated with greater prevalence and incidence of limitations in home and/or work tasks in a near-elderly population," say the study authors, Jan Ostermann, Ph.D., and Frank A. Sloan, Ph.D., of Duke University.

They found that problem drinkers were nearly 33 percent more likely to report any limitation in their ability to perform work or home functions, compared with those who did not have a history of problem drinking.

The study, published in the December issue of the *Milbank Quarterly*, is based on data on nearly 10,000 participants in the Health and Retirement Study. The six-year study began in 1992 and included men and women between the ages of 51 and 62.

Because data on the participants were collected at four time points over the six-year study, the researchers conclude that the increased incidence of disability was most likely a product of problem drinking and not vice versa.

"We found no evidence that people increased alcohol consumption in response to anticipated disability," Ostermann and Sloan say.

The researchers distinguished between participants with a history of problem drinking and heavy drinkers, those without a problem history but who had three or more drinks a day. Those identified as heavy drinkers at the beginning of the study were 20 percent more likely to report a disability by the end of the study period.

They also found that problem drinkers who were not disabled at the beginning of the study were more likely to become disabled over the course of the study.

"Much disability occurs before age 50, and disability, especially when broadly defined, was associated with heavy alcohol use and a history of problem drinking," say Ostermann and Sloan.

The study was funded in part by a grant from the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism.

ADA enforcement stifled by lack of funding

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - When it passed in 1990, supporters hailed the Americans with Disabilities Act as the most significant civil rights law ever enacted for people with disabilities and the most important civil rights legislation since the Civil Rights Act of 1964, a University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill researcher recalls.

Trouble is, employment provisions of the act, which many people view as its most important provisions, have never lived up to their potential for ensuring fairness, says Dr. Kathryn Moss. That's because Congress has never funded the Equal Employment Opportunities Commission (EEOC) well enough to ensure that employers and others abide by the act, she says.

"Over the years, there have been some politics and some management problems at the EEOC, but by far the biggest problem has been money," said Moss, research fellow at UNC's Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research and senior research fellow at the School of Social Work's Jordan Institute for Families. "The EEOC has had only one budget increase to speak of in the past 20 or so years."

A study Moss led of the act, also known as the ADA, appeared in the latest issue of the *Kansas Law Review*.

Co-authors are Scott Burris, professor at Temple University's Beasley School of Law and associate director of the Center for Law and the Public Health at Johns Hopkins and Georgetown universities; Michael

Ullman, former research associate at the Sheps center; Dr. Matthew Johnson, associate professor of psychiatry at the University of Massachusetts; and Dr. Jeffrey Swanson, associate professor of psychiatry at Duke University.

"Under Title 1, the employment provisions, of the ADA, if you feel you've been discriminated against by an employer because of a disability, you can file first a complaint and then a lawsuit," Moss said. "The *Kansas Law Review* article addresses the extent to which people benefit from filing complaints and factors affecting why people benefit."

Moss and colleagues had access to all computerized data on complaints filed with the EEOC, which has enforcement responsibility for the act. They also visited 10 EEOC field offices, reviewed 782 files, interviewed more than 50 EEOC field office staff and interviewed Washington, D.C. EEOC officials several times. They also tapped data from state and local fair employment practice agencies' records. "What we found basically is that the EEOC has never been funded to do thorough investigations of each discrimination complaint," Moss said. "The commission, which is responsible for other discrimination laws as well, wasn't funded well enough in the first place, and when the ADA was passed, it got no additional resources."

Since the mid-1990s, however, the commission has taken two positive

steps to stretch its scarce resources, she said.

"First, it instituted a kind of triage system called the priority charge handling procedure, which involves interviewing for two to three hours people who want to file a charge and then dividing cases into three categories of the highest, medium and lowest priorities - A, B and C," Moss said. "As a result, that reduced the time it took to process ADA charges quite drastically, cut the backlog of cases and increased the percentage of cases believed to involve discrimination."

Second, the EEOC instituted a mediation program that has made a big difference, she said. That program resulted in a huge percentage increase of complaints being settled by employers - 62.2 percent between Jan. 1, 1999 and June 30, 2000.

One problem with the priority charge system the researchers identified was that complaints given medium priority too often are not investigated, Moss said.

Cases in the highest priority category usually do result in a reasonable investigation, Moss and colleagues found.

"I think they also do pretty well in identifying charges that really are baseless," she said. "It is the way and extent to which mid-level charges, which are the majority, are handled that is problematic. If your case is prioritized as 'B,' you don't have a very good shot..."

500 receive their flu vaccinations

The Health Fair was a success Dec. 14, with 500 flu shots, 200 cholesterol and glucose tests and 25 prostate cancer screenings administered.





POOP SCOOP

My alpha female, Goblin, a white-eyed, merle Australian shepherd, picked up a lot of weight a few years ago. Not to say that any of my four females are thin, but she was exercising as much as the rest and still gaining. My veterinarian diagnosed her with an underactive thyroid and we began trying different levels of synthroid, the same type of medication used for humans whose thyroids become sluggish. While she's still over weight, she hasn't gained any more and has taken off a few pounds - plus her energy level is back to the normal Aussie hyperdrive. Apparently, we caught her condition before any real damage occurred. But in the latest ASPCA Animal Watch publication for Winter 2001,

Dr. Arnold N. Plotnick, a veterinarian, wrote about seeing a 7-year-old cocker spaniel who was drooling out of one side of its mouth. Everything else checked out fine, but when he stepped back to look at the animal, he noticed the dog's lips on the right side also hung down farther than on the left. He touched the corner of the dog's left eye and the animal blinked. He touched the right, but received no reaction. A test showed that the dog's thyroid hormone levels were extremely low. The diagnosis was hypothyroidism with secondary facial nerve paralysis. Hypothyroidism is the most common glandular disorder in dogs. The thyroid gland, due to inflammation or atrophy of unknown ori-

gins, becomes incapable of producing an adequate amount of thyroid hormone. Plotnick wrote. More on this condition next week. Before signing off, I wanted to remind everyone about the Christmas Drive for the animal shelter operated on Gavilan Canyon by the Humane Society of Lincoln County. Most needed is puppy and kitten food, although adult pet food always is useful. Toys and treats and old soft blankets also are needed. The items can be dropped off at the shelter or at the society thriftshop in Pine Tree Square on Suddeh Drive.

Mescalero football will step up to 11-man game

When Rodney Wright was hired on to be Mescalero's head football coach earlier this year, he planned on making some changes. A big one was made official this week.

The Chiefs will step up to the 11-man game in the 2002 season, a move Wright said he hopes will increase interest in the program.

Wright said with all the changes for the better, he hopes Mescalero kids now attending school off the reservation will come back home. More than 600 Mescaleros are attending school in either Ruidoso or Tularosa,

Wright said. And while the coach said that he has enough participation to fill an 11-man roster right now, he could always use some extra numbers.

"Hopefully, we can draw back some of our student-athletes from Ruidoso and Tularosa, especially at the younger levels," he said.

In addition to getting kids back, Wright said the improved athletics program will help keep the younger ones around. He pointed out that Mescalero's little league football team won a state championship this year, and that it will be his job to lay the foundation for those children to become Chiefs a few years down the road.

School officials are not planning on adding any more sports right away, Wright said, but "as our numbers increase, we would be able to add more sports."

It will take some time for the team to learn a new offense and defense, the coach said, but he thinks it will be competitive very quickly. Several Chiefs played the 11-man game in junior high, giving them an advantage.

"When we start the season, the goal is to win a state championship, but more importantly, it's to get better each week," Wright said. "We're making a good step in the right direction. Now you've got to raise up the sleeves and get to work."

Ruidoso fishing report, Dec. 19, 2001

Ruidoso River - The flow rate on the river is nearing a seasonal low. We are still below 2 CFS and really need a bunch of moisture to get the river flow rate up. If you plan to fish the River, we suggest you concentrate your efforts below the confluence of Carrizo Creek downstream to the Gavilan Canyon Bridge. The fishing in this stretch of water has been outstanding. The water flow in this part of the River is about normal for this time of year, but is dropping due to lack of rain. The River was stocked last week with about 900 Rainbows. Large Stoneflies are abundant in the river now. Rock Worms are declining in size and quantity, and Scuds are still on the increase in the waters. Tie a dry fly on as a lead fly then tie a nymph dropper about 12-18 inches behind. Use the lead fly as your strike indicator. This is an effective and fun way to fish small waters. Wear layers of clothes as the temperature near the water changes quickly.

South fork - Southfork is about done until Spring. The water flow rate is at a trickle. **Bonito Lake**, Bonito Lake is closed until April 1.

Eagle Lakes: Eagle Lakes are closed for the season.

Grindstone: Not much change from last week. Still no skum

ice on the lake surface. Grindstone continues to offer spotty fishing. Seems to have no rhythm. Woolly Buggers and Zonkers fished fairly deep have produced fish this past week. For spin casters, tie on an Olive or Black propeller fly behind a bubble rig and enjoy catching fish. Please remember to squeeze the barbs down on all hooks; this will reduce injury to any fish caught and returned to the water.

Lake Mesquite: The lake level is quite low, but is fishing well. Dark woolly buggers continue to take fish late in the day. A few folks have been successful with Parachute Adams, Mosquito, or Hendrickson patterns and casting to rising fish. Remember to get your day pass at the front desk.

Lobos manhandle Aggies for series sweep

The New Mexico Lobos opened the second half with a 17-4 run to blow out in-state rival New Mexico State 70-49, in front of a sold-out crowd of 18,018 ecstatic fans at The Pit Sunday.

The 21-point margin is UNM's largest over the Aggies in 24 years, since a 106-78 triumph in The Pit on Dec. 21, 1977. It also enabled New Mexico to sweep the season series against NMSU for the first time in four years.

UNM improved its record to 6-3 and has won four in a row. The Aggies fell to 4-4. New Mexico won its 100th game in the 97-year history of the fierce rivalry. The Lobos have a 100-88 lead and have captured three of the past four.

Leading just 26-25 at halftime, the Lobos took advantage of the Aggies' poor shooting and sloppy ballhandling in the first eight minutes of the second half to take command of the game. The Lobos hit 8 of their first 12 shots from the floor to start the second period. Meanwhile, NMSU missed 5 of its first 6 attempts and turned the ball over eight times, giving the Lobos several easy transition baskets. Seven different players scored during the decisive run as UNM grabbed a 43-29 advantage with 11:38 left. New Mexico State finished with 20 turnovers.

New Mexico State head coach Lou Henson was ejected from the game with 8:11 remaining after being whistled for his second technical foul. The second technical was called when Henson stood up and clapped when Aggie center Chris Jackson was fouled. He received his first for complaining about UNM's frequent trips to the free-throw line.

"It's the first time I've gotten a technical for applauding a good play by one of my players," Henson said. "I guess he assumed I was cheering the call. And if so, what's wrong with that?"

Tim Lightfoot's two free throws on the technical pushed the Lobos' margin to 53-33, capping an 8-0 run with all of the points coming from the line.

The Lobos took a nine-point lead on two occasions in the first half, the last coming at 18-9 on a short jumper by Marlon Farmer with 10:09 to go. UNM went stale the rest of the half, however, missing eight straight shots at one point and making just one field goal in the final 11:38 of the first peri-

od. The Aggies' only lead of the game was 25-23 when Kelsey Crooks made two free throws with 1:59 left before halftime.

Eric Chatfield led a balanced Lobo scoring attack with 12 points. Patrick Dennehy chipped in with 10, all in the second half, while Ruben Douglas added 10 as well.

UNM shot just 42.9 percent (21-49) from the floor, including 2-of-10 from 3-point, but made 26-of-41 free throws.

New Mexico held the Aggies to just 29.8 percent (14-47) shooting. New Mexico State was 0-of-8 from beyond the 3-point line.

The Lobos held Aggies' guard Eric Channing to a season-low four points. Channing, who came into the game averaging a team-high 13.7 points, was 1-of-4 from the floor in 27 minutes.





Spring classes open new vistas at college level

New classes at ENMU-Ruidoso afford students a chance to study printmaking, death and the heavens, among other things.

New credit and noncredit courses are scheduled for the spring semester at Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso, as well as established favorites in the Community Education and degree programs.

Artist Laura Flynn will teach a beginning printmaking class in the art program, and students will learn to do beginning linoleum and woodblock printing, a first for ENMU-Ruidoso, said college director Jim Miller.

Another new class is Thanatology, or Psychology 262, for the associate degree in psychology. This course (the study of death) is a required class for the psychology degree and one of the basic courses prenursing students take. Miller said another reason for offering the class is because the topic is of national concern in the aftermath of the Sept. 11 tragedy.

The astronomy class, Physics 141, isn't new, "but how we're doing it is new," Miller said. "It'll be taught online for the first time. The instructor, Dr. Dennis Cravens, a physicist who lives near Cloudcroft, has lined up the NASA telescope that the class will use, called the NASA Orbital Debris Telescope, the largest liquid mirror

telescope in the world."

Students will take their classes online except for three observation classes from 6-9 p.m. to gaze at the stars. The three-meter telescope is the largest of its kind in the world, and NASA uses it to track junk in space, Miller said.

Issues in Indian American Education, another new online class, will be taught by Benjamin Atencio, Ph.D., a member of Santo Domingo Pueblo who works for the Bureau of Indian Affairs in Albuquerque and with the Mescalero tribe. This class will review issues facing Indian educators and Indian children and will be of interest for people thinking about working with Indian children on or off reservations.

The other new education class is Education 268, Information Resources for Education, taught by Jim Pawlak online.

Sue Martinez is taking her conflict resolution class online for spring. Martinez works as a mediator and teaches classes all over southern New Mexico in mediation and conflict resolution. Miller said this class is good for educators, counselors and anyone who works with people in conflict. Other online classes include Internet Technology, Medical Terminology, Human Sexuality and Spanish for Native Speakers.

A beginning algebra class will be taught in Mescalero and in Hondo — a first for Mescalero, Miller said. Also new is a professional development

class for firefighters, EMS 107 First Aid and CPR for Firefighters. Firefighters can take the course and get recertified at the EMS conference in the spring.

An array of new classes is offered through Community Education, starting in late January and finishing late April or early May.

One of the new classes is a series of cooking classes for those interested in exotic cooking and eating. The classes are Tuesday evenings at Sierra Dove Center for Healing on Fort Stanton Road and include Cajun cooking, French-country, Italian, sushi, Ayurvedic spices and Chinese stir fry.

The ABC of E-Business is another new class, a collaboration between the New Mexico State Cooperative Extension Service in Las Cruces and ENMU-Ruidoso, Miller said the extension service created several modules last year to educate people in rural New Mexico about the Internet and this course will begin using those materials. The class is designed particularly to teach business people how to use the Internet.

Andrea Reed has added the Hustle to her social dance classes, for those wishing to learn disco dancing. Classes in two-step, waltz, polka, salsa, and California two-step (cumbia) will also be offered again.

Ugo Didio, director of the ENMU-

Ruidoso Orchestra, will teach two new music classes: Rudiments of Music Theory and Beethoven the Titan. The Beethoven class examines the life, times and music of the composer and his influence on symphonic form and future composers. The music theory class is "designed to give anybody who has no music background at all a fundamental knowledge of music theory," Didio said.

A string class will be offered in the summer, Didio said, but anyone interested in taking the class sooner can contact him at 257-4979.

For creative people, several new classes will be offered at Fruit of the Trees Studio in Lincoln this spring. Mita Saldana will teach a class in the Concertina Book, accordion-like books with pamphlets sewn in separately, useful for scrapbooks, journals, photo albums and guest books. Saldana will also teach a class on Ribbon Bound Book, single-section binding for hard cover books.

Beverly Wilson will teach a class in Paste Paper, or finger painting for adults: making patterned paper with paste and pigments for bookbinding or as backgrounds for calligraphy. Wilson will teach Batik Paper, wax-resist designs on paper by spattering drops, streaks or brush marks with hot wax over layers of water colors.
