Aircraft do-icers - If you're planning to escape south this winter; rest assured chemists havie made your travels safer. Benteris such as chloride salts ate effective and popular for use
on roadwaya, but they are corrosive and prohibited for use on aircraft. Like automobile antifreeze, aircraft deicing fluids are aqueous solutions of glycol, according an article published in Chemical \& Engineering News, a weekly magazine published by the American Chemical Society. ice so it can be removed from crittcal surfaces - such as the wings, flaps, and fuselage - more easily. When a plane is held over for a longer period of time, de-icing is followed by tneatment with antiicing fluid, which, keepis water from freering or refreezing.

Powder for the slopes More snow falls on skì slopes today from snowmaking machines than from the sky. Real snow is formed when tiny ice crystals adhere to dusty particles in the atmosphere, acconding to a recent article in ChemiMatters.

When the particle becomes heavier than the buoygne rorce of the air holding it up, it falls to the
ground as snow. Snownalefing ground as snow. Snowmaking sendifing out:a spray of water, compressed piry and dead, honpathopenic bacteria for ice crystals to build on.
