Richardson tops Sanchez

Early and absentee voting delayed final numbers Tuesday, but local voters appear to have gone against the grain in voting for John Sanchez.

BY DIANNE STALLINGS AND KEITH GREEN

Lincoln County's voters followed a long conservative tradition Tuesday as they handed winning margins to Republican candidates for seats in the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.

Of the 22 precincts, 19 were counted at press time, but the remaining votes represented almost half the total - early and absentee ballots. Hand tallying of absen-

tee ballots slowed the effort.

Unofficial county returns gave 75 percent of the vote to 30-year GOP incumbent U. S. Sen. Pete Domenici and 25 percent to challenger Gloria Tristani, granddaughter of former long-time Democratic Sen. Dennis Chavez. Statewide, Domenici had more than 60 percent of the votes with about two-thirds of the precincts report-

Republican Steve Pearce of Hobbs, the apparent 2nd Congressional District winner over Democrat John Arthur Smith of Deming, received 69 percent of Lincoln County votes to Smith's 31 percent. Both were seeking to fill the vacancy created by the departure of 22-year Congressional veteran Joe Skeen of Picacho, who chose

not to seek re-election.

In the race for the open governor's seat, Lincoln County voters gave 47 percent to to the state-wide winner, Democrat Bill Richardson, while Republican John Sanchez of Albuquerque received 48 percent of the votes. Running mates were Diane Dennish of Albuquerque, with Richardson, and Rod Adair of Roswell, with Sanchez.


Glencoe's State Rep. Dub Williams, an incumbent Republican, had a walk-away win over Libertarian challenger L. Richard Obergfell, with 84 percent of the vote counted in District 56.

Two Ruidoso Downs volunteer firefighters, Don and Jimmy Smith, were acquitted by a Lincoln County jury early Tuesday on all charges of accepting payments without delivering car-

against former fire chief Nick Herrera, but acquitted him on two of the 21 counts against him. Before the jury started deliberations at 4 p.m. Monday, Judge Frank Wilson dismissed two charges against Herrera, and earlier in the trial state prosecutors dropped one count because of lack of evidence, said J. Robert Beauvais, the attorney representing the three men.

"The guys are absolutely relieved. This just has been a living hell for them," he said Tuesday.

"Some things revealed during the trial were justoutrageous. I think the state would be foolish to retry Nick on the remaining counts because their theory was that the three men colluded. If two were acquitted, that would be hard to prove, but that's up to (District Attorney Scot Key)."

Hererra was charged with 10 counts of making or permitting false public vouchers and 11 counts of paying or receiving public money for services not rendered. The vouchers were submitted from

Feb. 9, 1999, to March 8, 2000, according to court documents.

'Don Smith was acquitted on 11 counts of paying or receiving public money for services not rendered and Jimmy Smith with 10 counts for submitting vouchers or being paid for services not rendered.

The trial of the three men in 12th Judicial The jury couldn't reach consensus on 16 counts District Court in Carrizozo lasted six days. The

jury received the case for deliberation about 4 p.m. Monday and came back with the verdicts at 12:30 a.m.

"Γm tired," Beauvais said. "We were there until 1 a.m. and I was facing two district attorneys and (Ruidoso Downs city attorney) Dan Bryant, who kept bringing things up to Scot while he was at the podium. I asked the jury in my closing if they found it offensive that the village attorney was trying to prosecute the case instead of the state."

Beauvais said a turning point in the trial may have been when an assistant of

Bryant's claimed that from November 1998 to April 2002, the men responded to only 46 emergency calls warranting compensation. "That was during the time of reconstruction on

"We've had so many returns since sending out the tax bills on Oct., 28," she said. "I suspect some trouble with the post office, but in any case I want people to know they should have received their tax notice by now if they own property in Lincoln County.

If they haven't seen a notice, they should call her office at (505) 648-2397, she said.

"According to law, our responsibility is to try to get the notices to them, but they are responsible for the tax whether they are notified or not,"



Democrat, with 61 percent to Cherry's 39 percent after about three-quarters of the votes were tabluated.

Rebecca Vigil-Giron, the Democrat incumbent, was reelected as secretary of state, but Lincoln County's vote went to Sharon Clahchischilliage, 51 to 48 percent.

In the state auditor's race, incumbent Democrat Domingo Martinez had the lead in the state-wide tally, but Lincoln County went for Tom Benavides with 64 percent.

Democrat incumbent Patricia Madrid was statewide winner over Rob Perry, and the early returns gave her 48 percent of the county vote to Perry's 47 percent.

Democrat Art Trujillo Jr. beat out Patrick Lyons for State Land Commissioner, but Lincoln County supported Lyons, by 60 percent to 40 per-

D. Shirley Baca, the Democrat, beat Harold "Chub" Foreman for the District 5 Public Regulation Commission seat.

Local races

At 10:30 p.m., 3,372 votes cast at polling places throughout the county were tallied, but 1,804 early votes and 1,284 absentee were not counted. Based on the machine figures, local voters were in a generous mood, approving four of five proposed bond issues, and six of

nine amendments to the state Constitution.

Running for the District 2 on the County Commission. Democrat Mike Runnels seemed close to pulling an upset over Republican Maury St. John, with 46 percent of the vote to her 45 percent and Libertarian Antoinette Fontaine's 1 percent. Party registration runs about twoto-one Republican over Democrat in the county, but Runnels, as head of Ruidoso planning and a former lieutenant governor, may have benefited from more name recognition than St. John, who serves on the county planning

commission.

In District 4, Alto resident Republican Earl Hobbs, who like St. John has been attending commission meetings for the past year, appeared to beat out former Capitan principal Darrel Don Stierwalt, a Democrat, and Libertarian Weslie B. Owen. Hobbs pulled 48 percent of the vote to Stierwalt's 44 percent and Owens's 7 percent.

Incumbent Commissioner Rick Simpson in District 5, a Republican, also looked to be a winner by a comfortable margin with 47 percent to Democrat Ralph Romero's 34 percent. Libertarian Bonnie B. Richardson chalked up an impressive total for a minority party with 18 percent.

Tammie Maddox, a Republican who already was appointed as county clerk by

a vacancy left by Martha Proctor, appeared to easily win with 74 percent over her Libertarian challenger Susan S. Ruch's 26 percent. In the race for county treasurer, Republican Beverly Payne-Calaway also seemed in a strong lead, pulling 82 percent of the vote, compared to

In the 12th Judicial District, all four division judges handily won their bids to stay in office, with voters in the counties of Otero and Lincoln giving them majorities of more than 75 percent for retention. The judges holding onto their positions are Jerry Ritter, Frank Wilson and James Waylon Counts in Alamogordo and Karen Parsons in Carrizozo.

Lincoln County voters approved a \$10.8 million bond issue for senior citizens center improvements, \$93.4 million for public and higher education, \$16 million for library and educational capital improvements and acquisitions and \$13.1 million for water rights purchases and projects. They rejected a \$6.6

million bond issue for state facilities and equipment by about 65 percent.

Local voters backed six state Constitutional amendments and rejected three.

They agreed with an increase in the current property exemption for veterans, to change language to allow more than eight judicial districts, to broaden the disabled veteran property tax exemption, to allow donations of state, county or municipal land, buildings or costs of infrastructure for affordable housing, to require a 10-year residency for Vietnam veterans eligibility for scholarships, and to change the name of the State Highway Commission to the State Transportation Commission.

They voted against lowering the voting age to 18, against allowing alien ownership of property, and against a new legal holiday in recognition of César Chavez.

about that (Witnesses) told the jury that sometimes there were as many as seven to eight accident calls a day."

Key said while it is premature to say whether his office will retry Herrera on the remaining charges, "We will do what we normally do, re-evaluate the evidence, look at what we learned from the jury members and at the defense's case.

"We have some wonderful ideas for reprosecution. I think it is safe to say we have evidence aplenty to find him (Herrera) accountable for bilking Ruidoso Downs."

Key said the jury apparently thought the Smiths did not knowingly receive stolen

money.

"I think they thought they were overpaid, but that the accountability lies at the top,"
Key said.

As for Beauvais's criticism of Bryant, Key said, "Obviously, the attorney for the city has an interest in the proceedings. I'd be shocked if it was otherwise."

Key said Assistant District Attorney Ken Wilson did a "wonderful" job of presenting the state's case, Beauvais did an "admirable job" in presenting his side and the jury showed dedication by deliberating eight hours into the early morning.



How can pictures be truthful in the computer age?

To the editor:

Re: The Fall American Photographic Competition at the Hubbard Museum of the American West .

Friday's opening reception for the annual photography show was very well attended. I hope everyone reading this has a chance to visit it during the next

What intrigued me, as art exhibitions in general intrigue me these days, was the number of photos that were designated as "digital" in origin. This is an allframed-print show and most of the photographs were of traditional subjects in several categories — people, architecture, landscape and open.

There was one photographer who had several prints that were labeled, "Slides converted to digital" and then printed. Apparently this indirect method allowed the photographer to do with the computer what cannot be done, or done with only great difficulty in the darkroom. I could see that the colors had really been "pushed" in his prints. The subject matter was conventional but the colors were

And I have to wonder at this trend in printing photographs. If there ever was such a thing as "truth" in photography, is that day now as dead as the Dodo? Weigh what has always been done to a photograph by pushing tonal contrasts, color balance, etc. in the darkroom against the far greater range of possibilities via the computer.

One clear example of computermanipulated imagery is a composition that is a collage of different elements with overlapping transparency that would be hard, if not impossible to achieve without using a computer software program.

What was NOT apparent in this show was whether any of the prints on display were printed with a computer printer laser, ink jet or otherwise. I would have liked to see a bit more about the process than simply the word "digital." Anyone buying prints today should be wary of the fugitive nature of some computer printer process colors, "giclee" included.

Availability of water

To the editor:

The availability of water is important to Ruidoso. Any action affecting our water is questionable.

The Grindstone project was built as a water depository to claim runoff from the Ruidoso River. It also serves as a means to divert a large flow of water which ends in the Pecos water authority in Texas. For many years, water has been diverted into Grindstone Lake by means of a 16inch pipe installed in the river. This flow enabled the lake to maintain a satisfactory level so that the filtration plant, located below the dam, could function normally.

This was changed when a decision was made by the Village Council to limit the volume of water flowing into the lake. Someone had decided that the depth of the river should be increased to promote fishing and the quality of the river.

A gauge placed in the upper Ruidoso River would control and reduce the amount of water into the lake. As a result, the lake level has been lowered to the point that the filtration plant closed down for lack of water.

Prior to the installation of the control gauge, the lake stayed at high levels and the filtration plant operated without interruption.

So why change a system that has worked very well for many years? For our council to agree to a plan that reduces the availability of water by allowing the water to flow into Texas is WRONG.

There was very little publicity about this control of water, and I suspect that very few of us know that the control plan is in effect.

As a member of the village council that planned and constructed the Grindstone project, I have seen the natural runoff to maintain adequate lake levels to work very well over many years, and to install a control over the natural runoff is a very poor decision. The control valve should be removed.

The Ruidoso News reported on Nov. 1 that the depth of the Grindstone lake was "at a historical high, and that THE DIVERSION (control) GATE ISN'T

FUNCTIONING PROPERLY." We should be thankful the control waan't functioning.

Commission to meet early; one-time raise on agenda

To comply with state law, the Lincoln County Commission will meet early this month to certify general election results within the three-day required time period.

The meeting will start at 8 a.m. in the commission chamber of the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

One of the issues on the 30-item agenda will be possible action on a one-time merit increase for 69 fulltime and 13 part-time county employ-

Sheriff's deputies will not be included because under collective bargaining, they received a \$2 per hour increase in April 2002 and cannot be considered for additional increases until June 30, 2003. Elected and appointed officials also would not be included.

In an analysis for commissioners, County Manager Tom Stewart said living index has average a 2.51 percent per year increase, with the high hitting 4.6 percent.

But county recurring expenses are projected to exceed annual revenues by \$125,936 for the 2002-2003 fiscal year. A step increase comparable to what has been given the last two years would cost the county about \$46,086 in recurring annual expenses, increasing this year's deficit to \$172,022.

taxable value only County increased 3 percent this year. Although tax revenue should increase next year with reappraisals countywide, the future is unpredictable, he said. He would not advise approving a recurring expense.

But he suggested the commission consider a one-time merit pay increase in line with similar increases approved in December 1989 and 1994, and January 1996.

The money could be pulled from a

that over the last 10 years, the cost of \$455,000 commissioner reserve, which was accumulated in part because departments spent only 89 percent of their budgets.

> The county treasurer also revised the amount of taxes expected to be collected this year by an increase of \$48,000. Juvenile detention expenses are lagging by about \$19,000. All together, the factors could add up to an operating reserve of about \$530,000, Stewart said.

He suggested a \$1,000 merit increase for full-time employees and \$500 for those who work part time, payable on Dec. 11.

Because it is not a recurring employee expense, the county wouldn't pay social security and Medicare matches. although a state retirement match would be required. The merit pay would be equivalent to a non-recurring 4.5 percent increase. It would cost the county \$61,898.75 from the general fund and \$19,377 from other funds.

If the commission granted a regular

step increase of the same percentage, the overall cost would be \$115,216, Stewart wrote.

A department that may need midyear help to cover the merit increase would be the Zia Senior Citizens

Capital outlay items totaling \$249.500 could be paid for through the county facility reserve and would include a replacement of an emergency services vehicle, purchase of two sports utility vehicles for the sheriff's office. road department equipment and two heavy-duty pickups, an ambulance intercept and a new detention center

Stewart said he would delay the purchase of the road roller for \$140,000 until next year and reserve the remaining \$205,500 as a contingency fund or for use at the detention center annex, if the state legislature doesn't approve some money for that project.

Other items on the agenda include:

 Further discussion and negotiations to improve communication capabilities in the Hondo Valley with two repeaters for vehicle radios and voting systems, which are relays for portable low-powered hand-held radios.

 Review and possible approval of an emergency services management contract. Stewart noted that Jim Stover, who manages the services for Ruidoso and the county, has asked for an increase to serve the Alto area from \$20,000 to \$28,000 per year, which could require asking for proposals for professional services. Stover also is asking the county to commit to a new ambulance for Carrizozo under the EMS Fund Act, and an Advance Life Support response unit by July 1, 2004.

 A report on legislatively funded projects that are completed or nearing completion, including water tank fencing in the settlement of Lincoln and a new building at the county fairground in Capitan.

Ex-prisoner settles beating lawsuit

A settlement was reached in a lawsuit filed by a Ruidoso man who claimed he was beaten while in a commons room at the Lincoln County Detention Center.

William Moody filed the suit against the county, county commissioners and Corrections Systems Inc. early in the year after showing up in the court of Magistrate Judge William Butts with bruises, a black eye and scratches. He told the judge he was beaten without provocation by other inmates and was not able to rouse any help from guards for several minutes, then only with the help of another prisoner.

In the suit, Moody contended that two correctional officers were responsible for the supervision of more than 100 male and female prisoners in separate living pods and separate cells.

"Due to inadequate staffing and control, it took approximately 10 minutes for a cor-

rectional officer to respond and come to Moody's assistance," the suit states.

He was booked into the county jail in Carrizozo at 8 p.m., Sept. 16, 2001, on a municipal court bench warrant for failure to pay fines. He was placed in a dormitorystyle pod with more than 21 inmates. "which provided no internal security to keep the individual inmates separated physically by any system or risk classification." the suit states.

On Sept. 4, Judge Lesllie C. Smith entered an order in U.S. District Court in Albuquerque dismissing the case with prejudice and noting the settlement.

Each side is to pay its own court costs and attorney fees, but the dollar amount of the settlement is confidential. The county and CSI did not admit to any liability in the

. Local attorney J. Robert Beauvais represented Moody. Michael S. Jahner from Butkus, Gay and Jahner in Albuquerque, represented the defendants.



NASA Johnson Space Center announced this week that Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso will receive \$60,000 for 2002 and the next two summers to continue its popular Summer Science Camp for middle school students in Lincoln and Otero counties.

Dropout rate drops

New Mexico's dropout rate for grades 9-12 declined to 5.3 percent in 2000-2001, the lowest rate in 15 years, the New Mexico State Department of Education announced Nov. 1. All grades, including grades 7-12, experienced a decline in dropout rates. District statistics will be compiled in the SDE's "Dropout Study 2000-2001," to be released in December.

Statewide statistics show that the number of students dropping out of public schools is

continuing its six-year decline. In 2000-2001, a total of 5,095 students out of an enrollment of 95,427 (or 5.3 percent) in grades 9-12 dropped out of school.

The SDE reported that Hispanic students in grades 9-12 had the highest dropout rate (6.7 percent), followed by Native Americans (5.9 percent) and Blacks (5.2 percent).

Dropout rates in New Mexico have fluctuated since the mid-1980s, but in recent years have remained well below the 10.4 percent high recorded in 1988-89.

N.D. McNeil is a member of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe and president of Sitting Bull College. and he is the great-great-grandson of Chief Sitting Bull. The board included TCU presidents, educators, and community and business leaders.

The president authorized the advisory board in July 2002 in an Oval Office ceremony and charged it to make recommendations to the White House and U.S. Secretary of Education Rod Paige on ways the federal government and the private sector can help tribal colleges strengthen and expand their resources, programs, facilities and use of

technologies. The board will also provide advice regarding the progress made by federal agencies toward fulfilling the purposes and objectives of Executive Order 13270, which aims to improve Native American education.






Commission wants large 'subdivisions' to act like smaller ones

Ranch-size lots are using the same resources as other developments, commissioners say.

Lincoln County commissioners say. They learned some hard lessons from Windmill Ranches, a development northwest of Carrizozo that mixed a subdivision with smaller lots and a section with lots that were exempt from county and state regulation because they consisted of 140 acres or more. Some commissioners were uncomfortable that they had little say about the possible impacts

involving roads, water supply and utility availability.

County Commissioner

L. Ray Nunley, during a meeting last month, asked County Attorney Alan Morel if he had made any progress on changing the way the breakup of ranches resulting in large lots

can be handled. The county can expect more ranches to be divided that way, he

Morel said he referred the issue to

the county planning commission more than a month earlier and members are talking to other counties to see how they are dealing

"But it appears it will take a change of state statutes (to give the county more legal input)," he said. "Lots of 140 acres are completely exempt from

the rules and criteria."

The county has no zoning in unincorporated areas. County subdivision rules approved by the county commission are restricted to the authority granted in state law.

We can't impose more restrictive laws?" Commission Chairman Rex Wilson asked. Morel replied, "Not on

Nunley said the board should consider asking the state Legislature to change the statutes next year.

"Ranching ain't what it used to be," he said. "Water is more valuable than the land it is on. I think this will be a continuing problem."

Wilson agreed, saying, "They need to call and treat it like a subdivision even though now they claim it's not."

In other action connected to subdivisions, the commission approved the nlat for The Preserve, a 15-lot development bordered by West Gavilan Canyon Road and SR 48.

Surveyor Tim Collins explained that the plat was approved in 1998, but never filed. All state agency approvals were secured. The developer has completed improvements, except roads, which he hopes to finish next spring, Collins said. The disclosure statement was updated, three lots were added to the initial plat, but all now are at least twoacres in size to meet current rules.

The surface of road pavement also was increased from 20 inches to 24 inches and a section adjoining SR 48 was not divided into lots.

The county planning commission approved the development at its last meeting with some water-related requests. The village of Ruidoso also must approve the subdivision.

'Zozo P&Z clarifies street names

Due to a county-wide 911 mandate, all towns in Lincoln County must do away with duplicate named and numbered streets. The Carrizozo City Council assigned the task to the Planning and Zoning Committee to make suggestions on removing the duplications and replacing the street names.

to learn the new names and for visitors to find streets, the street names are in "types" of trees, stones, railroads, Indian tribes, birds and animals. The streets in each "type" are in alphabetical order. In each case where the name was an old historical name, it was kept when not a duplicate in the county.







illage asks to know land value before vacating

Before Ruidoso village councilors decide whether to vacate a right of way along Cedar Creek Court, they want to know the value of the land, to see a more detailed survey and to lock in its future use.

They tabled action last week on a request from E.P. Scott to vacate 12,694 square feet. While recommending the action, the staff noted that it would create a half-acre lot with a view of the golf course. which might be worth more than the existing appraisal.

"The concern of the staff is less the vacation than the creation of useable property," said assistant village attorney Charles Rennick. "If you approve this, you should first obtain a full market value appraisal.

"My second concern is taking village property and enhancing a private lot. That sets a precedent."

A new survey also should be ordered to accurately reflect existing pavement and utility easements, he said.

Councilor Ron Anderson agreed with Rennick's comments about enhancing private property.

"That's nice property and it has a large church complex right next to it," he said. "Do we want it for green space? Or we may need to have a little off to improve the line of sight. I don't favor turning this loose at this time."

Deborah Councilor Marcum-Byars pointed out that a triangular piece of property at the intersection of Porr Drive and Sudderth

Drive was vacated and sold to the owner of a car dealership to be turned into Lazer Car Wash.

"We sold it to Johnny Durham for \$3 a square foot in 2000," she said. "I think it would have been much more needed as green space there.

"I think we need a more recent appraisal and to find out about the utility situation." Scott's offer to pay \$1.15

per square foot "seems lower than fair market value," she Councilor Bob Sterchi said

another option would be to retain village ownership, but allow Scott to plant a garden and maintain the property as if it were an extension of his own adjoining lot.

One neighbor said he objects to any action because,

as a neighbor in the area, he was never notified about the proposal and he'd like some input after living nearby for 25 years.

Rennick said if the village went out for bids on the purchase of the right of way, that action would create a new lot of less than an acre and would violate the village's own rule against splits.

Scott owns two lots in the area, with a house on one. His second lot cannot be used for building because setbacks can not be met.

He said he has followed all of the requirements for a vacation laid out by the planning department and didn't object to obtaining a new appraisal. He plans to keep the land, which adjoins his home, vacant, he said.

Plenty of road repairs planned for Ruidoso area

Two pages of construction listed for this year; road department's slate runs through 2005, includes drainage, chip-sealing

RUIDOSO NEWS STAFF WRITER

Drainage corrections in the Camelot subdivision, chip seal work on Mescalero Trail and repair of North Loop Road in Upper Canyon are three in a long list of road projects scheduled for Ruidoso this year.

Residents who wonder if their roads are in line for some work can check a five-year plan at the village street department office.

J.R. Baumann, head of the village road department, said he turns in an activity report every month, detailing patching, resurfacing and any other road work tackled during that period. But in April of each year, he sub-

mits a multi-year job list.

For the 2002-2003 Fiscal Year, Baumann's list covers two pages.

Already finished are drainage corrections and base course upgrades on Maple Drive, adding erosion control structures on a ditch along West Hull Road on Racquet Drive, correcting drainage from the condominiums on Racquet Place, and fixing a turnaround area on Ranier Road with millings and sand seal. A chip seal

surface cooperative project on overlay, then chip seal Keyes Drive, Meander Drive with the state transportation department was completed in the Palmer Gateway area.

Left to accomplish, Baumann list-

 Correcting drainage, repairing driveway entrances that extend into the right of way and trimming or removing trees in Camelot subdivi-

 Correcting drainage on Signal Peak Road and Glade Drive, chip sealing from U.S. 70 to Hill Road, applying an overlay surface on Hill to the RV park, and overlaying on Monjeau Drive, all in the Pinecrest

El Paso Road overlay surface.

• Sand seal Main Road, correct drainage along Mountain Breeze Drive, sand seal and add millings to the lower portion of 1st Street in the Upper Canyon area.

 Correct drainage, upgrade base course on Yule Drive, Maple Drive, Alonso Way and Atwood Street, Umbrella Drive in improve Ponderosa Heights.

· Align Evergreen with the Carrizo Canyon intersection and

Clover Drive and Clover Place off south Sudderth Drive.

 Correct drainage, add millings and sand seal on Signal Hill Drive, Rockmount Drive, Santa Rosa Drive, Drooping Juniper, Shadow Lane, Santa Maria Drive, Sandstone Place, Palo Alto Drive ad Santa Anita Drive.

 Tie-in the duffer drive into Course View Drive and pave, improve drainage in a low area on Upper Terrace Drive.

• Sand seal the entire length of Hull Road, fixing bad spots on Hull from White Mountain Drive to Paradise Canyon, which is under way.

 Overlay areas not previously done in the Innsbrook area of Cree Meadows Drive, fix sunken spots, potholes and street cuts on Innsbrook Drive, Saint Moritz, Geneva, Grenoble, Vienna Terrace, Cortina, and McKenzie streets.

• Fix sunken spots on White Mountain Drive and correct intersections coming into that street off Hull Drive, correct drainage at G.H. Stoneman and widen roadway and correct drainage on Valley View Drive from College to Scenic.

 Correct drainage at Chiricahua and Coconino. Fix turn-around on Ranier Road with millings and sand seal, clean out "dams" and correcty drainage on Mont Blanc Drive and fix sunken spots and sand seal on Catron Road.

Looking to Fiscal Year 2003-2004, more work is scheduled in the same areas - Camelot, Pinecrest, Palmer Gateway, Upper Canyon, Ponderosa Heights, South Sudderth, eight streets in the golf course and Paradise Canyon area, East and West Hull Road, Cree Meadows and Airport West.

Upgrading and paving of 3rd Street from 2nd Street to South Drive is scheduled, along with drainage corrections at the 3rd Street intersection and paving of Chelsea Street.

Roads singled out for work include Swallow Drive and Swallow Place, Cliff Drive and Mockingbird Lane, Reese Drive. Junction Road, Chelsea Road, Virginia Canyon, Juniper Road, Carrizo Canyon Road, Center Street, Bradley Drive, Ralph Drive, Walton Circle, Violet Avenue, Pearl Avenue, Phillips Circle, Leona Place and Lois Circle. Others are Lucille

Drive, Beulah Lane, Mary Drive and Shaw Lane, Willie Horton, Granite Drive, White Mountain Meadows. Leon Farrar, Del Norte and Sunny Slope. In airport west, base course upgrades are set for Tahoe Drive. Whitney, Cornudas Trail and Pikes Peak Road.

The now steep, dirt road called Foothills off Paradise Canyon will be reshaped, drainage corrections will be made and a base course laid.

For Fiscal Year 2004-2005, East Hull Road projects include correcting drainage, overlaying and fixing bad spots on Snowcap Drive, Snowcap Court, McBride Drive and Snowbird Court.

West Hull Road on Coal Drive, Coal Court, Marble Drive and Marble Court are scheduled for chip seal surfacing. Drainage corrections, chip seal and fixing bad spots is listed for Bonanza Drive, Mustang Drive, Queen Aire Court, White Mountain Drive, Skylane Road, Super Cub Drive, Waco Drive and Travel Aire Road.

The list for 2005 is the smallest. but as the time nears, many more projects inevitably will be added.





Warriors wrap up 3A playoff spot with win

Is this the biggest win ever for the Ruidoso High football team?

Nah, that distinction still goes to the Warriors 21-19 victory over Silver in the Class 3A championship back in 1985.

But this one definitely ranks Playing for their playoff

lives - and playing to prove something — the Warriors shocked the state football community by beating the Lovington Wildcats 38-24 Friday at Horton Stadium.

With the win, Ruidoso not only proved their worth against the heavily-favored Wildcats, they also secured a spot in this year's Class 3A playoffs.

What was so surprising isn't just that Ruidoso won the game, but that they won so handily and dominated the Wildcats so thoroughly.

The Warriors (5-4, 2-0 in District 4-3A) took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and never looked back, easily outdistancing Lovington in overall points, total vards gained (528-190) and first downs (19-6).

"This is probably one of the biggest upsets," said Ruidoso coach Ridge Bowden, who was an assistant coach for the Warriors back in 1985. "But we were expecting to win, it was just a matter of getting it done.

"Our kids were ready to play mentally," he added.

Ruidoso wasted no time in gaining the upper hand, drawing first blood on a 32-yard pass from Josh Adams to Chance Hooper just three minutes into the game, then padded their lead on a 24-yard

field goal by Dusty Bolden. Adams later added a touchdown on a 24-yard run and passed for six yards to Steven Stroup for another score, putting the Warriors up 25-10

at halftime. It really should have been 25-0, as the Wildcats (6-3, 1-1) got their first score on a 24vard interception return by Matthew Sydnor, then got another two points on a safety vhehra enap went over punter Stroup's head and out the back of the endzone.

"We gave them those 10 points in the first half," Bowden said. "It should have been worse for them, they couldn't get anything going on

The Wildcats' lack of offense was particularly manifested in their inability to hold onto the ball. Lovington lost three fumbles in the game, and every one seemed to come at a most inopportune time.


With less than two minutes left in the first half, Ruidoso was forced to punt, but the Wildcats fumbled on the play and the Warriors were able to recover at the Lovington 45yard line.

Less than one minute later. Ruidoso made the Wildcats payon Stroup's touchdown catch.

Lovington opened the second half on a 60-yard ramble by Chris Anderson with barely 13 seconds elapsed, and then had the ball at the Ruidoso five-yard line and were threatening to pull within one, when the Wildcats again fell victim to the fumble.


The Mescalero quartet's finish in the top 12 gave their team a point total of 68, good enough for third behind district champion Menaul and runner-up Hatch.


Gowen isn't too worried about her team's ability to win on a hostile floor, particularly if Capitan fans show the same support they did at Hatch.



LAS CRUCES - If the sounds of Bourbon Street sound a little bit louder to folks in Las Cruces, that's understandable. Even with the prevalent fears of a jinx in the air, a lot of people are giving voice to their hopes: a postseason for the Aggies.

New Mexico State's football team moved a step closer to its first trip to a bowl game in 42 years Saturday with a 24-21 victory against Middle Tennessee.

The Aggies are now 4-0 in the Sun Belt Conference (6-3 overall) while North Texas stands at 3-0 in the league. All other teams in the conference have at least two league

That means a showdown Nov. 16 in Denton, Texas, between the Aggies and the Mean Green will, in all likelihood, be for the conference championship and a trip to the New Orleans Bowl.

Even if NMSU would lose its last game at Idaho on Nov. 23, a victory against North Texas would leave NMSU at worst 5-1 in the Sun Belt with a head-to-head win against the Mean Green, and that would be enough to send the Aggies to the Big Easy.

If NMSU loses both of its final league games, though, and if North Texas would somehow find a way to lose two as well and Arkansas State or Idaho could force a three-

way tie at the top, then the New Orleans Bowl could choose whichever of the three it would want to invite.

The Aggies would undoubtedly be more inviting to the bowl than Idahe, but would NMSU get the call over a North Texas or Arkansas State? That's not as clear.

But the most likely scenario remains the one that crowns the winner of the NMSU-North Texas game the champ.

Oh by the way, NMSU travels to Logan, Utah, this week to tangle with the Utah State Aggies (or the UtAgs for short). The two teams used to be league mates in the Big West Conference and will again be conference foes — maybe as soon as next year when the UtAgs join the Sun Belt.

For this year, though, this game stands as an enigma on the NMSU schedule.

The Aggies have not lost since September and have a big head of steam heading into the stretch run of the conference race. Now they have to play a game on the road, against a program that has traditionally had NMSU's number (Utah State owns a 22-4 record against NMSU), and try to keep their momentum alive while staying

A three-phase capital improvement project aims at revamping the operation of the Ruidoso garbage transfer station on Gavilan Canyon Road.

Cleatus Richards, who heads special projects for the village and is acting director of engineering, said the compacting system at the station is nearly 20 years old and no longer produces the proper compaction.

"It's a long trip to the (regional) landfill (south of Alamogordo) for trucks that are short on weight," Richards said. "Even if they're just one ton off, that adds up in a year."

Instead of pouring more money into the aging compactor, village officials decided capital improvement projects

to redesign the entire operation to include a new building, crane to load, distribute and compact, scales at street level for trucks hauling to the landfill and scales above to weigh trucks bringing in garbage from other entities that will be charged.

One former

village councilor, Al Junge, who was on board when the compactor was bought, said adding scales to the system should be efficient enough to handle the village's garbage without all of the extra expense.

He also checked with El Paso, and their system still is being used, he said.

"When I was down in 1982, they were very proud then that the system was 17 years old," he said. "They told me the key was maintenance or the hydraulics would give them trouble. We've never had a good maintenance system. I've seen sofas and chairs in the compactor. We put anything in there. I protested, but I don't know if it did any

Junge contends that without compaction, two to four trucks will have travel down to the regional landfill in what should be only one truck trip.

Martine Valverde, route supervisor for the El Paso solid waste department, said Junge apparently is referring to the compactor that went into service in about 1963, long before he joined the department. With good repair, it still is in use at the Delta transfer station, he said.

The main plant recently switched to a new type of 31yard compaction and hauling truck, he said, adding that all solid waste equipment tends to be high maintenance.

Back in Ruidoso, Richards explained that the alreadycompleted Phase I of the threestage project covered construction of a retaining wall and

installation of the lower level scales using a \$200,000 grant from the state Environment Department and \$150,000 from the village's capital improvement section of the general fund.

Phase II, now under construction, will include the upper-level building with plumbing and electricity and the base for the crane.

Another \$200,000 environmental grant will help ease the financial impact on the village, but Richards said the final price tag for the second phase could run as high as \$400,000. The project, which should have been finished by now, he said, should be completed within the next 30 days.

Finding the money for the third phase, listed in a 2003

> list for the village \$559,000, could be more of a prob-Richards lem, said. That's why it was moved up on the village's priority list sent to the state Legislature.

"It may be more difficult because the governor dried up the environmental grants," Richards said. "I hope with a new governor,

we'll see a difference.'

He'd like to see the final phase completed in one large effort instead of piece-meal, he

Phase III would complete the office space north of the existing building with heating, would install the upper level scales, construct the approach slabs and buy the \$100,000

"The crane will ensure that the load is properly distributed," Richards said. "With scales, we will know the weight on each axle."

The timing on Phase III depends on what happens in the state Legislature next January, he said.

In action last week, the village council approved \$3,000 addition dollars for construction inspection for Phase I of the transfer station submitted by Smith Engineering.

The contract with Conlee Construction called for completion within 120 days from the notice to proceed, which was issued on Oct. 7. Delays in construction to date are due in part to adverse weather conditions. Conlee has requested consideration for 18 additional days, which extended the contract to Oct. 25.

Liquidated damages are assessed at a rate of \$300 a day for each day the project remains incomplete beyond the approved contract time and will serve to offset part of the additional inspection fees.

Another \$7,000 also should be saved from \$10,000 allotted by the village for testing, which only ran \$3,000, Richards said.



POOP SCOOP

An Emergency Pet Preparedness campaign was launched this month by the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. Actress Kim Cattrall from the HBO series, "Sex in the City," is featured along with a 1-year-old rescued Chihuahua mix named Shelby in a national print and television public service announcement campaign. The need to educate Americans about the importance of being prepared was brought home to ASPCA officials during the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attack in New York City. Employees and volunteers with the organization rescued hundreds of pets who were left stranded when their owners were forced to flee during the evacuation of areas surrounding Ground Zero.

"Although no one could ever have predicted or prepared for the tragic events of 9/11, the ASPCA wants pet owners to think about what they would do in a similar crisis situation," said Dr. Larry Hawk, ASPCA president and chief operating officer. "It is so important to have a disaster plan that includes our four-legged family members." The ASPCA's Web site details evacuation preparation procedures for pets, supplies that should be included in an emergency pet kit and how

to arrange a "safe haven" for pets. The ASPCA also is offering free pet emergency stickers that pet owners may obtain by emailing www.be prepared@aspca.org.

Besides directing the public to visit the ASPCA's Web site www.aspca.org for information on emergency pet preparedness, Cattrall urges Americans to adopt their next pet at a local animal

With more than 10 million animals entering shelters each year, close to 65 percent are euthanized because there are not enough loving homes. "I am a supporter of the ASPCA because they help to keep animals safe," she said. "Animals have always been an integral part of my life and there is no better friend

shelter."
Some of the specific disaster preparedness steps suggested by the ASPCA include:

than a pet from your local animal

ASPCA include:

• Using the rescue alert sticker to let people know that pets are inside your home, in case you cannot. It must be visible to rescue workers, listing the types and number of pets, the name of your veterinarian and the vet's telephone number.


• Arrange a safe haven. Do not leave your pets behind. Red Cross

disaster shelters will not accept pets, so you must prearrange an alternative that could include boarding kennels and the local animal shelter. The Humane Society of Lincoln County shelter on Gavilan Canyon Road took in dozens of pets when people were evacuated during the early spring wild fires in the Ruidoso area. Check ahead to find out what motels or hotels outside your area accept pets. Ask friends and relatives outside your area if they would be willing to take in your pet temporarily.

• Choose designated caregivers. In the event you can no longer care for your pet, finding a permanent home alternative ahead of time ensures your four-legged friend's safety and future security.

For an immediate response, you may need to ask a neighbor or relative who lives close by and would be home while you are at work or away from the area to rescue and then care for your pet if a disaster occurs while you're gone. You may be able to swap the responsibility for their pets when they are on vacation.
