## Second arsonist nabbed in Mescalero

A second member of the Mescalero Apache Tribe has been arrested for arson in connection with a rash of wild fires earlier this year.

Brian Klinekole, 26, of Mescalero, was indicted by a federal grand jury on five counts of willfully and without authority setting on fire timber, underbrush, grass and other flammable material on the reservation and in the national forest, and with one count of knowingly and willfully injuring property of the United States

— the timber in the Lincoln National Forest.

According to U.S. Attorney David Iglesias, Klinekole was arrested after an investigation by the Mescalero Wildfire Arson Task Force that includes special agents from the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the U.S. Forest Service, the FBI, the New Mexico State Police and the Otero and Lincoln County sheriff's offices.

The task force was formed May 1 by Iglesias to investigate 160 arsons committed over the last two years in the Mescalero-Ruidoso area.

The charges stem from The

Crooked Fire on March 12, the Peso One and Peso Two fires on April 20, The Chihuahua Fire on April 20 and The Palmer Tank 2 Fire on May 24.

Klinekole, who was employed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, faces a maximum possible penalty of five years in prison and a \$250,000 fine, as well as three years' supervised release for each count, according to information from the U.S. Attorney's Office.

The task force investigation earlier led to the indictment and arrest in June of Paul James "P.J." Valdez, 27, of Tularosa. His case is expected to go

to trial Oct. 12, according to Assistant U.S. Attorney Louis E. Valencia, who will act as prosecutor in the federal court in Albuquerque.

Valdez, who was a Mexican spotted owl counter for the Department of Resource Management and Protection on the reservation, was charged with committing an arson on an Indian reservation and furnishing false information to a federal agent. He is accused of intentionally starting a fire on the reservation June 1. If convicted, he could face a maximum of five years in federal prison on each charged count.

## Development OK'd by commissioners

A new subdivision north of Carrizozo called Windmill Ranches was approved earlier this month by the Lincoln County Commission, but only after hashing out a half-dozen issues, including who will upgrade a county road.

To win a 4-1 approval of the final plat of the 326-lot subdivision, Daniel W. Dattola, representing Southwest Properties of New Mexico, said he will upgrade about three-quarters of a mile of a public road from U.S. 54 to the northern tip of Tract One in the subdivision.

But he refused to redo four additional miles to the Homestead Well area proposed by Commission Chairman Rex Wilson, who voted against approval of the plat. Dattola pointed out that the road extension serves private ranchers and the company's 40 tracts of 140 acres each, which are exempt from county subdivision regulations.

"But that's part of what you're selling," Wilson said. "I look at it as (one) development. You look at it differently."

"Based on your regulations," Dattola reminded the chairman.

"I understand," Wilson responded. "I can't force you to do it."

"And I can't afford to do it," Dattola shot back. "I don't think that's reasonable."

In arguing for the road improvement,

Wilson told Dattola, "You come in and you're going to develop this property and then sell it. (The road) may be fine with you, but it's not going to be fine with people who are going to be driving on it every day. The best way to address it is up front. It would be my expectation that you develop the county road up to the standards of the rest of your roads."

Dattola pointed out that in five years, the county will have collected property taxes on the land in excess of \$100,000 a year.

"One thing we've learned is that you can't tax yourself enough to cover the impact of these subdivisions," Wilson countered. "The argument of saying our taxes are going to go up is not going to pay for the increase of infrastructure we're going to have to provide for these subdivisions."

The county road will see increased use because of the subdivision, Wilson said. Although Dattola contended the county would have to maintain the road whether a development was created or not, he agreed to improve the shorter distance.

He also agreed to post cash security equal to the cost of completing developer-improvements, such as 36 miles of private roads. His engineer will come up with the figure, which will be reviewed by the county's consulting engineer.

In voting for the motion, Commissioner Leo Martinez, who also

## Arabela man apparently killed in June flood found weeks later

■ Roger Buell, 53, was gone for almost a month before being reported missing.

The body of an Arabela resident, apparently caught in a flash flood in mid June, was found earlier this month about five miles south of where he tried to cross an arroyo in his pickup truck.

Roger Buell, 53, was reported missing early on July 4 by Betty Leininger, a friend who came to visit him.

"I could tell when I went into his RV that he hadn't been there," she said Tuesday.

She alerted the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, said Undersheriff Ricky Virden. Deputies, along with

officers from the New Mexico State Police and volunteers with White Mountain Search and Rescue searched that day and part of July 5 before finding the body, he said.

"Apparently, Mr. Buell was driving from Tinnie north on State Highway 368 toward Arabela and tried to cross a flooded arroyo and was washed away," Virden said. The date was established as June 13, he said. A spokesman for the Lincoln County Road Department said crews were out on June 14 checking possible flooding

damage in the Alamo Canyon area, south of U.S. 70.

Buell's 1995 Nissan truck was found about one mile southeast down the arroyo and Buell's body about five miles from the spot where he entered, the undersheriff said. The arroyo is about 10 miles north of U.S. 70.

"When the friend came to visit and was concerned, she called us and we retraced where he went," Virden said. "Our deputies were familiar with the area and checked the arroyo, although a lot of people wouldn't think to look there."

# Proctor graduated, state says

Officials with the State Supreme Court administrative division are satisfied that Martha McKnight Proctor graduated from high school in Hondo and can serve in the position of magistrate judge in Lincoln County.

Pamela Hall, who heads the magistrate division, said Thursday she showed a packet of letters and documents sent by Proctor and by former and past superintendents of the Hondo school district, to her supervisor, Gina Maestas, director of the administrative office of the court.

"She felt comfortable that Mrs. Proctor did graduate from high school, although we still haven't received a copy of the diploma," Hall said.

A spokesman for the state Department of Education said that office doesn't maintain records of high school diplomas in New Mexico, only for general equivalency diplomas. Each school district is responsible for keeping its own records, she said.

Proctor explained that she had to gather supporting information to verify her graduation when she ran for magistrate judge because her diploma burned in a house fire in 1986 and some district records were destroyed in a fire at the Hondo school complex in the 1970s.

"I had to figure out how to replace it for the state," she said. "Some records are there (at Hondo), but they're kind of crispy."

Former Hondo principal and superintendent Ernest J. Booky wrote a letter saying that he remembers Proctor at her graduation ceremony May 20, 1960. He confirmed that she completed the credits necessary for graduation.

Proctor was admitted to New Mexico State University in her junior year in high school, as reflected in a letter from Fermin Montes, who was school superintendent at the time. She also took correspondence courses from Oklahoma State University, but returned to graduate with her class, Proctor said.

Braulio Alvarado, Hondo school board president, also wrote the state, saying the district would issue a new diploma.

Denise Lamb, director of the state Bureau of Elections, said

candidates do not have to show a diploma when they qualify to run.

"When they fill out a declaration of candidacy, they are signing a sworn statement under penalty of perjury if they lie," she said. "The statement says they are qualified to run upon their election. They do not have to show a diploma."

Proctor will take office as interim magistrate judge Aug. 1 because Judge Gerald Dean Jr. is retiring before the normal change of guard in January. She was appointed by Gov. Gary Johnson.

Proctor will be sworn in at 2 p.m. today in the magistrate judge's chambers in Carrizozo during a retirement party for Judge Dean, who will administer the oath of office.

# Little conflict between Pearce, Smith in debate

Other candidates didn't sling much mud either at the forum.

If members of the New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau expected fireworks last week, they settled mostly for polite rhetoric as candidates for state and federal offices faced off in Ruidoso.

Democrat John Arthur Smith was described by the state party chairman as "down to earth and hard-working," always fair in the state Legislature and very intelligent.

Smith said in his past 14 years in the senate, he has worked with both sides of the aisle on legislation, and more recently, helped the agricultural community win a delay in a scheduled tax increase for ranchers and farmers.

"It's time we put partisan politics behind us," he said. "We have to work together. I want to be your representative in Congress. I'm a fiscal conservative and a responsible decision maker. I don't vote no on every issue. We have to work together to make the system work."

Smith said he will work to preserve water for agriculture purposes and will hold Mexico responsible for meeting its water debt to Texas.

Republican Steve Pearce said he was raised on a five-acre farm south of Hobbs with five siblings, graduated in 1970 from New Mexico State University and served 3 1/2 years in Vietnam.

"I understand the values in the 2nd district. I live there," he said. "I'm a life-long 4-H member, in 1960 was named the top in the nation and recently was inducted into the 4-H Hall of Fame, the only person from New Mexico."

"I was talking water when no one else thought it was a key issue. It's nice to have company in the swimming pool now."

The federal Endangered Species Act has been redirected to take private property rights away from agricultural users, especially water rights, he said, adding "I guarantee I will fight for your rights."

He wants to see valid science before declaring a species endangered, he said.

"Two things must be produced in the United States or our way of life stops, energy and fuel," Pearce said. "After Sept. 11, you saw fuel lines, not food lines and we want to keep it that way."

In the race for attorney general, incumbent Patricia

Madrid said she's a dues-paying member of the bureau and grew up in Las Cruces in the heart of the agricultural country. Ranching has been in her family more than 100 years and her grandfather fought against the federal government when it took land for White Sands Missile Range, she said.

"That's why I'm an advocate," she said, adding that she talks to supporters who are in the industry every year to find out their issues. She's fought to preserve state water rights and has faced off successfully against the federal government in court.

Madrid said she's running on her record, especially in the area of protecting water rights, noting that she has intervened in litigation by environmentalists.

Her opponent, Republican Rob Perry, former head of the state Corrections Department, said his first job after coming to Portales in the late 1970s was working on a farm. He learned the value of hard work, honesty and common sense.

He has the background to be an effective attorney general, who would fight any reduc-

tion in the number of criminal investigators in a state that is considered the third highest for violent crimes, is high in domestic violence and a joke when it comes to DWI sentencing.

"Catch and release is for the Game and Fish Department, not for criminal justice in New Mexico," he said.

Perry also pledged to fight unethical conduct by elected officials and not to tell people who refer complaints to him that he's too busy to investigate things like possible voter fraud.

"I won't be an attorney general come-lately, who waits to intervene in a case until election year," Perry said. "It's important to get out in front of a problem."

Running for Public Land Commissioner, Republican Patrick Lyons said he's the only true rancher on the panel

of candidates and that he did his early morning chores before cleaning up and driving to the debate.

"I know the issues of the land office," he said. "I've been in the senate the last 10 years representing an area from Clovis to Eagle Nest. I was the first Republican to represent Colfax County."

"I passed the water trust fund issue. It took 10 years and two droughts for the public to be aware of the water issue. I want to improve the watershed on rangeland too."

Democratic challenger Art Trujillo, former mayor of Santa Fe, said he earned a master's degree in urban planning and runs an architectural planning firm. In Santa Fe, he required development be tied to water availability.

"I understand politics and how to get things done," he said, describing himself as

straightforward, with the ethics of hard work and honesty.

"I feel strongly about education in New Mexico, and this office generates billions of dollars for education," he said.

Republican Sharon Clahchischilliage, running for Secretary of State against incumbent Rebecca D. Vigil-Giron, who was not present, said she grew up on Navajo land with a .22 rifle on her back, a BB gun on her saddle and a sling shot in her pocket.

The secretary of state must be impartial and trusted to be fair to elevate and improve on the current election system, she said.

"Because all candidates are very dependent on the office, you must have honest elections, you need good leadership, experience and character," she said. "Hard work is not a problem for me and that's necessary with this office."

What's the bottom line for the village?

An ugly case is settled under the television lights

So what lessons should we store away for future reference as a result of the settlement with the victim of that unfortunate holding cell incident?

Obviously — don't let it happen again. That means more training for law enforcement officers.

But the way the incident was handled by the village, once it broke out of the local pool and into the television news ocean, was less than stellar.

Instead of standing fast and taking the course set by the state's Risk Management Division, the village's insurer,

the village rushed to settle, stampeded by all that adverse publicity stirred up by a big-town TV reporter whose mandate is to expose warts wherever he finds them — especially if pictures are available.

The result: Risk Management pays big (if undisclosed) bucks to get the thing settled.

The policeman involved resigns, but still faces misdemeanor charges.

Everybody makes pious statements. A task force is formed to look into changes.

But what, really, did we learn? Only time will tell.

Let's stop bombing Texas

This column has been criticized for being unfair to Texans, and it takes this opportunity to apologize.

Still, there is evidence Texans can be picky. Take, for instance, the outrage of West Texans to the itsy-bitsy incident a couple of weeks ago when jets from Holloman Air Force Base in Alamogordo bombed Monahans and Pecos.

Hey, big deal! First of all, the bombs were fake. And the Air Force was just practicing, for heaven's sake. It was not just West Texas that was targeted, either. The thriving metropolis of Maljamar, New Mexico, population 3, was also the recipient of a little excitement.

The Air Force was quick to point out these were Dummy Bombs. West Texans were quick to point out these were Dummy Air Force Crews.

There is absolutely no truth to the rumor these bombs were but a "warning shot across the bow" to West Texans who insist on demanding their fair share of New Mexico water.

Reaction in Monahans ranged from the placid to the unhinged. The city manager called the bombing "an unfortunate incident," noted the country is at war, and said, "You've got to have these people training."

The county judge, on the other hand, went ballistic. In a letter to his congressman, one you would guess was full of exclamation points, the judge vented: "This is totally unacceptable. No excuses. This is just not to happen... We damn well do not need a cover up or glossing over by the Air Force. Whoever is responsible for such an absurd act should be prosecuted and punished to the full extent of the law."

And so on. The county judge is not a happy camper. "Maybe those folks in Afghanistan who say our forces are bombing civilians are telling the truth," he concluded in a Texas-sized leap of logic.

Bill Modisett, a fine gentleman and excellent newspaperman of my acquaintance, edits the Monahans paper. He, too, was most disturbed by the bombing.

However, Bill's uppity attitude toward New Mexico oozes from this quote:

"It's not that we aren't patriotic. In fact, I would venture to say the people in Monahans, Pecos and even Maljamar have some of the reddest blood and truest American spirit around." Catch that? Even Maljamar. Even those lowly New Mexicans are patriotic!

About 35 miles west of Monahans, residents of Pecos were also somewhat miffed about the bomb dropping on their town, even though, in their case, the bomb missed and hit a rural road rather than crashing through a bedroom as it had in Monahans.

In Pecos, Smokey Briggs, the publisher of the Pecos Enterprise, said the city immediately declared war on the United States, surrendered five minutes later, and is now seeking \$134 million in reconstruction grants. Smart move.

Personally, I think even Texans are good people and we should immediately stop all bombing.

That doesn't mean all practicing should stop. Without hurting a single individual or causing undue damage to property, what target might you choose for the Holloman jets? I'd like to hear your responses.

My suggestion would be the little computer box that allows the television industry to blast the commercials twice as loud as the regular programming. Bomb away.



What the ex-mayor knew about that lockup incident

I am offended by the fact that Ms. (Angel) Shaw is willing to make statements of fact as to what my actions were without ever asking me what I did or didn't do concerning the Officer (Alfred) Stinnett situation. It's unclear to me from whom she received her information; however, checking facts is clearly not a pre-requirement for her to write a letter to the editor.

For the record, I was notified the next day of an incident at our facility. I was told that management was reviewing the situation. Several weeks later, upon receipt of a tort claim notice from Gary Mitchell and his description of the incident, I went to the police department to review the tape. For the record, Gary Mitchell never contacted me personally. I reviewed the tape, not just the edited version. I found Officer Stinnett's actions excessive and abusive and stated so.

I made a number of recommendations at that time. First, I asked that this tape be shown to all officers. This was to show each officer what should and should not be done in a situation like this. Next, I viewed the holding area. I recommended that the area should be padded. From time to time an officer might be required to put an individual down to restrain them and injury to an individual or an officer should be minimized. These actions were taken immediately by the department.

While personnel matters are not normally within the Mayor or Council's authority, I informed those involved that in my opinion, Officer Stinnett should resign or be terminated. I was informed that the whole matter was turned over to the Risk Management Division of our insurance carrier, the New Mexico Self-Insurer's Fund, and that they were in charge of the situation. I was informed that the DA was also looking at charges against the officer and might convene a grand jury to look into the matter. I then recommended that if the officer was found guilty of a criminal action, he should then be terminated. I also recommended that the council view the tape and be kept abreast of what was occurring on this matter.

It is my understanding that Risk Management had a different view of the process and did not want any additional viewing of the tape because of pending legal actions. I had not heard anything else about this case until Gary Mitchell filed a civil rights lawsuit a couple of weeks ago. That is what brought all of this to a head now.

I am not aware of anyone trying to hide this incident. If there was, wouldn't the tape simply disappear or have technical problems? It was always destined to become public and in fact the incident was reported in the Ruidoso News just after it happened. The initial tort claim was public knowledge. The council and management must walk a fine line

when a village employee's actions create a lawsuit. They must make sure that the public is protected from recurrence of incidents like this, but they must also protect the taxpayer during legal negotiations on that specific lawsuit. Sometimes these might be viewed as diametrically opposed propositions.

There are no SOP's that will ever completely prevent an individual from making a wrong choice, unfortunately. Police officers, however, should be held to a higher standard than regular employees. That is what the new task force must change in the village personnel code. No one wants something like this to ever occur again. People do make mistakes and it is naive to think a village employee will never make another one in the future. What we must do is learn from those mistakes. They should, however, not be seen as opportunities by certain individuals or groups to push their own personal or political agendas.

 pushed for the developer to improve the county road, said, "Until this county decides it's going to have a master plan as to where developments are going to go and not going to go, we have no choice, as long as you meet the guidelines we have down. We failed in not having a master plan."

"It's going to have to be addressed by this county because you have urban areas like Ruidoso calling for zoning. Now I'm hearing ranchers start to say let's look at this again, because they see what's happening. Developers go out to ranchers who are willing to sell their property, but not willing to give up any private property rights. We've got a problem there."

The 19,000-acre Windmill Ranches is being created west of U.S. 54 at the turnoff to Ancho about 20 miles north of Carrizozo on what was formerly the Straley Ranch.

Fire fighting units will come from Corona, at the county's northern border. At the request of the state engineer, a 15,000-gallon water storage tank is being provided, Dattola said.

"A pumper can hook onto it," he said. "It's not a lot of water, but it could make a difference. We put that in the disclosure statement. It's always a risk."

Wilson said someday the subdivision's population probably will exceed that of the county seat of Carrizozo, which is about 1,000. Dattola said build-out may take 35 years. Initially, 8 percent to 10 percent is anticipated, he said.

Even that number will increase the danger from the intersection that lies right over a hill on U.S. 54, Wilson said. Dattola replied that he has asked for signage from the state Highway and Transportation Department warning approaching traffic. His engineer also is working on a better turnoff

design for the road.

"I'm not here to stop your subdivision," Wilson said. "I believe you have the right to buy the land and develop it, but as a commissioner, I think we're here to raise some questions."

Some of the items aren't included in regulations today, he acknowledged. "But these are issues that will come up. When all (of the new residents) get here, we won't be here anymore," he said.

The chairman also proposed voluntary metering and monitoring of all wells dug in the development, as suggested by the State Engineer's Office.

"I think we need to look at that in our subdivision regulations," Wilson said, but Dattola questioned who would monitor the wells and to what department they would report.

"The county doesn't have a method of monitoring. You don't have a water department," he said.

"By the time you're ready, we may," Wilson said. "That's the direction we're heading. It won't be the most accurate, but at least, it would allow us to develop trends in what our water is doing."

"I think it would be a big expense to lot owners," Dattola said.

No more than the cost of a water softener system and other utilities they will be required to install because the subdivider is not providing service, Wilson replied.

"This seems to lack some utilities normally associated with subdivisions," he said. "Some lots have no electric power and I don't believe telephone lines are provided to any of the lots."

Dattola said county regulations don't require developers to put in utilities and that lack of service is noted in the disclosure statement to prospective buyers. Most people have cellular telephones and all of the 326 lots have power, as well as about half of the lots that are exempt from regulation because of their size, he said. The disclosure statement also spells out that wells may fail and water may have to be hauled into the property.

Wilson said the subdivision's hydrology report also is suspect in his eyes, because it refers to "springs" in the Jicarilla Mountains and an average annual rainfall of 13 inches at the ranch.

"That borders on misrepresenta-

tion," he said. "You expect us to have confidence in the document when no one knows of any springs" and the annual rainfall is closer to 8 inches to 10 inches.

"That ranch hasn't seen 13 inches (annually) probably in 10 years," Wilson said.

Dattola said the statistics come from county data.

Wilson also expressed his doubts about the use of low-water crossings in some drainage areas, asked for a cooperative agreement between the subdivision's home owners association and surrounding ranchers on fence repair and to advise lot owners to consult the local agricultural agent to determine the livestock carrying capacity of their tracts.



**Students perform**

Two Capitan High School graduates and Alto residents earned Dean's List honors at Fort Lewis College for the Winter 2002 semester.

To be eligible for the Dean's List, students must attain a grade point average of 3.4 or better in not less than 14 hours of graded credit, and must have completed all work for which they are registered by the end of the term.

**Carrizozo schools biggest recipients of E-Rates**

Two New Mexico schools and one library have been selected to receive more than \$28,000 in discounts on Internet service through the federal E-Rate program.

The E-Rate program was created as part of the 1996 Telecommunications Act to enable schools and libraries to afford the ongoing costs of providing Internet service.

Carrizozo Municipal Schools was awarded \$22,068; Eunice Public Library was awarded \$874; and Maxwell Municipal School District was awarded \$5,126.

The funds will provide discounts of between 40 and 90 percent on telecommunications service, Internet access and internal connections. The money comes from the Universal Service Fund, an account supported by payments from telecommunications service providers. The account was expanded to include library and school Internet service in the 1996 Telecommunications Act. This is the same fund that enabled the creation of a national telephone network early in the 20th century.

**New dean at ENMU**

Eastern New Mexico University has hired Steven C. Russell, Ph.D. from Central Michigan University to be the

new dean of the College of Education and Technology. He begins on Aug. 19.

Russell is currently a dean over five departments and seven centers at Central Michigan, as well as being a professor of special education.

"We are very pleased and gratified to have attracted someone of Dr. Steven Russell's caliber to serve as the next dean of the College of Education and Technology at Eastern New Mexico University," said ENMU president Steven Gamble. **It's time to immunize**

The New Mexico Department of Health advised parents not to wait until the last minute to get children's needed immunizations for school.

With a national shortage of some vaccines that may be solved by late summer, parents still need to think about getting their children ready to attend school in the fall.

Now is the time to ensure that children's immunizations are up to date and meet school requirements. Both public and private medical providers in the nation have experienced manufacturing shortages of some vaccines. Other vaccines, including Hepatitis B, which are required for school entry, are readily available at doctor's offices and clinics.

"New Mexico's Vision of Health is for this state to be a healthy place in which to live and grow," Secretary Alex Valdez said. "We have lived with a vaccine shortage for months. Recently the Food and Drug Administration announced approval of a Canadian version of the vaccine for diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis. As of today, the state pharmacy has plenty of this vaccine available. Hepatitis B shots are required for all students entering kindergarten and the 7th grade and these vaccines are readily available.

"While chickenpox shots are required for children entering kindergarten and who have not had the disease, children who are unable to get this or other required shots due to shortages will still be able to attend school this fall. It is vital to return to your child's doctor when missed vaccines are available to catch up on these shots," he said.


Parents should plan a visit to their child's doctor in the summer and if some shots are unavailable due to shortages, ask to be put on a list to be called back when the vaccine is available.

Millie Aproda, R.N., public health nurse at the Ruidoso Public Health office, said the office has plenty of vaccine at this time. A walk-in Immunization Clinic is from 8-11 a.m. every Monday and will also give shots when parents need to help fit this into their schedule.

Call 258-3252 for more information or contact your private physician for an immunization appointment. The Ruidoso Public Health Office is on Kansas City Road, next to the Ruidoso Public Library and is open 8-12 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. Monday-Friday.

**RHS health center grows up**

Ruidoso High School's health center will more than double in space this fall — from one exam room with a shared bathroom to two exam rooms, a lab, two offices, a conference room and a reception area.

An additional portable building was set up in mid-July next to the old one and will be ready for business by the second week of school, said Celeste Franklin, coordinator of the School-based Health Centers in Region IX.

The new lab will allow staff to do urinalyses for sports physicals, blood work, immunizations and conduct the Well Child check-ups required by Medicaid and some private insurers.

Franklin will have an office there, as will the behavioral health provider, Paula Reynolds, M.S.W., who sees students for counseling. The primary care provider, a nurse practitioner or physician's assistant, will have the larger exam room as well as office space, and Kelly Shaw, coordinator of the Tobacco Use, Prevention and Control program, will have an office in the other exam room.

"Two years ago we outgrew the space we were in," Franklin said. "We had Paula in the counseling room, the library and finally in the old dark room sharing space with the police officer. Kelly (Shaw) was seeing kids wherever she could find space."

The clinic is available to handle medical emergencies as well as sports physicals and the routine check-ups on growth, immunization status, coordination, vision, hearing, exposure to sexually transmitted diseases and scoliosis (curvature of the spine).

"We do routine and acute health care for asthma, diabetes, obesity, nutrition. We offer all of those services, but we don't strive to become the only health care that the child receives," Franklin said. "We encourage kids to stay with their primary care physician and we fax or mail medical notes to the primary care physician when we treat kids. If a child shows symptoms of asthma, we send him to the primary care physician for their management plan and

long-term care plan and we help in the long-term care."

Along with the expansion in space comes an expansion in services that the health center will be able to provide, notably a pilot joint University of New Mexico-Department of Health Telemedicine Project that links the health center by television-conference calls with the Office of School Health and all medical schools of universities in New Mexico.

In addition, Franklin said, the Office of School Health asked the Ruidoso school-based health center to participate in the project on a higher level:

"They've provided us with equipment to do psychiatric evaluations with a child psychiatrist. We don't have one in Ruidoso and it's very difficult here with no psychiatrist, because they're going to Las Cruces or Albuquerque, which is a major financial issue for families. Lots of times the insurer doesn't cover it."

Franklin said she hopes to be able to begin doing psychiatric screenings within two months. Twice a month, for a few hours each time, the psychiatrist will be available to conduct psychiatric screenings of students, and the alternative weeks, she hopes that the psychiatrist will be at the clinic in person.

Another pilot project the Region IX School Based Health Services initiated last year is with the joint Columbia University/Department of Health Screening Project. Last year, Ruidoso's health clinic conducted 41 of the 75 New Mexico screenings for nutrition, mental health, diabetes, depression, suicide and risk-factor screening.

Joan Spencer, a retired school teacher, was hired to assist with the screenings 20 hours a week, but Franklin won't know until September if that position will be funded this year.

In February, money was received for a smoking-cessation program, and Shaw began classes during lunch hour with about 12 students who had indicated they wanted to quit smoking.

These classes lasted until the end of the school year. Shaw also gave a five- or six-session short course at the middle school when her presentation at an assembly

elicited interest from students.

The cessation classes will branch out to Capitan, Carrizozo and Hondo as well as Ruidoso, Franklin said.

Region IX has also applied for a \$1-million grant for a federal Safe Schools/Healthy Students program with the Juvenile Justice Division, the Department of Education and the Health and Human Services Division to hire outside contractors to develop policies for safe schools, educational reform, mental health and substance abuse services and early childhood services.

"What we hope to effect is positive behavior management system — a consistent system for discipline region-wide, with consistent consequences," Franklin said. "We'll train the trainers, who will train teachers and administrators."

The grant would allow Region IX to expand behavioral health services with more hours and equipment, along with the support from the telemedicine project.

Another feather in the cap of the Ruidoso High School health clinic is that it was the first school clinic in the state to start contracting with managed care organizations to be reimbursed for services offered to students — after three years of preliminary work.

"It's a huge deal for us," Franklin said. "It was about \$11,000 this year, which we have not been able to collect before. It helps with expenses."

This was through a Centers for Disease Control project, with Human Services Division, Medical Assistance Division, federal organizations that helped set up the negotiations between the Region IX School Based Health Clinics and the insurance companies.

Ruidoso's health clinic is open 22 hours a week — from 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. — and last year treated 505 students at the high school and 178 at the middle school during 1,219 visits.

"We open the doors and see kids waiting," Franklin said. "We're at capacity and have been limited by our facilities. If we get the grant money for the Safe Schools (program) in September, we will be open more hours per week. I would like to be open from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m."

**Football takes its toll, annual survey of schools reveals**

Seven lose lives in high school games in 2001; total deaths at 23 nationwide

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. — Eight young U.S. football players, including seven in high school and one playing in a Pop Warner league, died last year as a direct result of injuries suffered on the field, a new University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill study shows.

Three other players died of heatstroke during the 2001 season, and 12 others died in ways not directly tied to the game but more from natural causes provoked by vigorous exercise.

The UNC faculty member who led the study called the heat-related deaths "just unbelievable" because 20 young men have died in that manner since 1995. Last year, one occurred in high school, one in college and one in the National Football League.

"We are concerned about all these deaths of course but especially those that resulted from heatstroke, which are almost always preventable," said Dr. Frederick Mueller, professor and chair of physical education, exercise and sport science.

"Coaches, players and even parents need to remember how to prevent these tragedies, and that's not hard to do. The current rash of avoidable deaths is very

much like the toll we used to see years ago before managers and other helpers started giving players water any time they needed it."

Mueller, chairman of the American Football Coaches' Committee of Football Injuries, directs the UNC-based National Center for Catastrophic Sports Injuries. Every year, the center issues reports on deaths and severe injuries from amateur and professional sports.

Reports are based partly on newspaper stories from around the United States collected and submitted by about 150 volunteers who monitor sports accidents, along with information from the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the National Federation of State High School Associations.

Six of the "direct" deaths resulted from brain injuries, one from a fractured neck and one from a ruptured spleen. The study also revealed six cases of permanent paralysis from neck injuries, all among high school students, and two permanent brain injuries.

"Players need to be reminded often, especially by coaches, that the head has no place in football," Mueller said. "No player should make first contact with his

head when blocking and tackling. That's against the rules, but more importantly, it's dangerous."

In 1968, 36 young men died after injuries in practices or in games. Mueller said. The drop in deaths directly attributable to football resulted from rule changes adopted in 1976 that prohibited using the head as the first point of contact while blocking and tackling.

Shorter practices and non-contact drills during which players don't wear helmets can help prevent heatstroke and reduce accidents, he said. Players should be allowed as much water as they want, and coaches should schedule regular cooling-off breaks.

Coaches and trainers ought to keep a close eye on temperature and humidity, especially in August and September, Mueller said. Practices can be held early or late in the day, and if it is too hot, coaches need to consider canceling them for a day or so until temperature and humidity drop.

"Players must be encouraged to tell adults if they don't feel good," he said. "They should never ever be made to feel unmanly or weak if they are having trouble."



# Hot issues covered at convention

When the N.M. Farm Bureau rolled into town last week for the 2002 Summer Leadership Conference, a big ticket was promised for the three day event, and that's exactly what was delivered.

Merlin Bartz, special assistant to the undersecretary for natural resources and environment, USDA, spoke to the crowd that consisted of many farmers and ranchers from across the state after participating with many Farm Bureau members in a forest, grazing and fire management tour.

Bartz concentrated on many of the issues that are plaguing New Mexico Farmers, including the 2002 Farm Bill, a National Fire Plan and grazing.

The Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, more commonly known as The Farm Bill, was Bartz's main focus. The 2002 Farm Bill was signed by President George W. Bush on May 13. In an USDA news release dated May 14, Agricultural Secretary Ann M. Veneman said, "The new farm bill is very broad and contains many new programs to assist America's farmers and ranchers."

At the signing of the Farm Bill, Bush said that the bill will strengthen the farm economy, along with promoting farmer independence and preserving the way of life for generations to come. "It helps America's farmers, and therefore it helps America," Bush said.

According to Bartz, the bill consists of 410 pages and has 10 separate titles. "Implementation is a big deal," he said. "The purpose of the bill is to employ new ideas that will remove the red tape."

Bartz also addressed the ongoing forest fire issue. He said that this year America has had a total of 50,500 fires. The 10-year average is 50,000. The total amount of acres burned this year has more than doubled on average.

Bartz said that it was not just drought, but that forests are overstocked and dense, which is promoting more and more fires. "The big picture is forest health," he said.

The issue of grazing on public land is a big debate that Bartz mentioned in his speech. Members of the Farm Bureau clearly demonstrated that they were not too happy with the situation, which, according to one spectator, has completely removed grazing in some areas in New Mexico. "The situation of caring for the land and servicing the people has a really

fine line," Bartz said.

Following his speech, Bartz gave spectators the chance to present their concerns, ideas and questions so he could either answer them right there or take them back to Washington.

The summer conference rolled on with an update given by John Conner, chairman of

the New Mexico Farm Bureau's Priority Issues Committee. He spoke mainly about the endangered species act, along with other issues that his committee is working on.

The big-ticket day of the convention ended with a "top of the ticket" political forum, which was the first forum in

New Mexico for the general election.

The summer convention ended Thursday with the Annual Rattlesnake Open Tournament at the Links at Sierra Blanca. Next year's New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau Summer Leadership Conference is scheduled to take place in Taos.



## Nogal siblings cut their way to the top

Doug, Shayla Smith make their mark at National High School Rodeo Finals

FARMINGTON — Doug Smith of Nogal wades his horse into a herd of cattle and slowly separates one cow from the rest.

Eager to rejoin the herd, the cow starts to scramble, trying to get past Smith and his horse. But Smith and Desiresome Freckles will have none of that, darting side to side cutting off every dash by the cow.

Side by side, the cow dodges and scoots. Smith and his horse are waiting at every move to turn the cow back.

The horn sounds, Smith raises the reins and the horse stands letting the cow scramble past to rejoin the herd.

For his effort Friday morning, Smith and Desiresome Freckles earned a score of 215 in the second go-round. His 430 after two head put Smith in fourth place in the average after Friday morning's ninth performance. The soft-spoken, painfully polite cowboy from Nogal is clearly pleased with his score and the chance it gives him to finish the event Sunday with a shot at the national title.

The 18-year-old senior is a three-time qualifier to the National High School Finals Rodeo and a two-time state champion cutter. In 2000, he finished 12th in the nation in boys cutting and hopes to improve on that performance this time.

"I'm hoping for a top five if not to win it," Smith said.

Smith got his wish for at least a top five finish, taking second overall.

Smith has plenty of support in the cutting arena, with about 15-20 family members making the drive from south-central New Mexico. He also has company in the competition.

Doug's sister Shayla took first in the girls competition and his cousin, Cheyanne Goodloe of Capitan, also did well.

Shayla, 17, rode Dual Nurse to beat defending champion Ashley Smith of Hailey, Idaho, by a mere 1 1/2 points, scoring 221 points to win the final round on Sunday.

Goodloe took 16th in Sunday's final cutting session and finished 13th overall.

As a team, New Mexico finished fifth among the 44 teams competing with 3,940 points. It's the third straight year of improvement for the team after finishing 17th in 1999.

Cutting is as much art form as working ranch necessity.

The basic requirement is to separate a cow from the herd and then keep it away from the herd. But as usual, there's much more to the event than meets the untrained eye.

Part of the game is selecting a good cow, but competitors are judged on how they cut the cow from the herd.

Judging also looks at horse positioning and the style with which it works.

The cowboy's job is largely to

stay out of the way of the horse and stay in the saddle. With the horse bucking back and forth rapidly and changing directions sharply, it takes a good rider to stay in the middle.

"Getting the cow cut is difficult," Doug Smith said. "After that your horse is kind of on his own after you put your hands down."

Smith said he tries to help the horse by getting it in good position by using leg pressure.

"There are so many things running through your head," Smith said. "You have to help your horse to keep him in position."

One advantage Smith has is

his horse.

Desiresome Freckles is on loan from the Rocking 5 Ranch in Alabama. As one of the top cutting horse breeders and trainers, the horse's owners and the Smiths came together through a mutual friend.

Smith has only been on Desiresome Freckles for about a week, usually not nearly long enough to become familiar enough with each other to be making a run at the top of the national standings.

"You have to get to know each horse," Smith said.

The pair have already bonded, with Desiresome Freckles nuzzling Smith as he stood by her.

"She's real sweet," he said.



Fuentes began the day by riding Cherokee's Disco to a win in the Kachina Stakes, then turned around and won the Los Ninos stakes atop Roll Hennessy Roll.

## Soul amidst the suds and the schnapps

Were Damon Runyon writing this piece, he might have put it this way:

You have not really been to the track, Pal, without you have had consultation with Mr. Phil Doyle, the bartender and resident philosopher at the Horseshoe Bar in the Turf Club at Ruidoso Downs Race Track, which is somewhere west of New York City.

Doyle's customers and fellow workers would agree. People regularly check in with him during the course of a racing day to trade wisecracks, talk horses or chip off a nugget or two of wisdom from the substantial amount he's accumulated over the years.

"People come to the Turf Club because of Phil," says Audi Austin, a Turf Club waitress. "People leave if he's not here."

Doyle modestly counters that he doesn't believe that the world "revolves around me. But I love bartending because I'm at the center of things here and I can add to the enjoyment of the occasion. The people I work with and the customers are also my friends. We have fun here."

The fun is often caught on the run. Doyle serves not only the bar customers but fills the four waitresses' orders for the folks at tables on the floor or in the boxes. On a big day, he'll work 12 hours or more

and pop open 300 bottles of beer alone. Opening day this year — which featured 23 quarter horse trials — Doyle served up drinks and chatter for 14 hours.

A thin, wiry, sandy-haired man of medium height and middle age, Doyle has the energy of several more just like him. His sharp features and direct blue eyes suggest a williness that was earned the hard way. And it was.

After misspending his early adulthood, he awoke one day nearly 20 years ago hung over and way down and out in San Francisco — and not the one Tony Bennett sings about. He decided to change his life, sober up and fly right.

It may seem strange that an alcoholic would choose to make a living bartending, but it's not mysterious to Doyle. He's been tending bar most of the time since he was discharged from the Coast Guard in 1969. ("It appealed to my altruistic side: search and rescue, not search and destroy.") After he went on the wagon he worked for awhile in drug and alcohol rehabilitation, but then returned to bartending to stay.

"I missed bartending," he says. "I get to see it all in this business, great varieties of people and situations. I've participated in marriages and funerals as a bartender. The alcohol doesn't bother me. I've got nothing against it. I just can't drink it myself. And you know, the listening skills, compassion and tolerance that counselors practice are used in bartending

POOP SCOOP

A cat's ratio of brain weight to body weight, the often used measure of a species' evolutionary development and potential for intelligence, is greater than in most mammals, other than apes and humans. That information came from "A Primer of the Feline Mind," one of the chapters in the "Complete Guide to Cat Care," written by Wendy Christensen and the staff of the Humane Society of the United States. "His large, highly convoluted cerebral cortex is characteristic of intelligent, problem-solving creatures," they write. Coupled with a super sensory system, a cat is "a formidable presence in any environment," they say. Some other observations: • A cat needs to hunt, so engage him in vigorous play before breakfast and at dinner. The urge is instinctual and he'll look for a real kill if not satisfied in play. • Cats sleep a lot because they don't expend much energy

in securing food, even if they hunt outside, because they are so adept at dispatching prey. After sleep comes grooming. Then playing, eating and bodily functions. • During the winter, cats often sleep curled up with their tails over their noses. The posture serves a purpose. The tail reduces oxygen intake, allowing a quicker entry into the deeper, health-giving type of sleep, the authors write. • They say because of the cat's evolutionary heritage as a self-reliant hunter, he prizes a sufficient food supply, fresh water, warmth, privacy, space, exercise opportunities for his mind and body and "the ability to readily and independently remove himself from situations that displease or frighten him." • Any changes in a cat's safe and familiar environment translates to a potential loss of resources or the possible introduction of competitors for resources, the authors state. Misbehavior can result.

"Unfortunately, it's those very times when your life is busiest and most disrupted that you're most likely to overlook your cat's desperate need for routine, stability and reassurance," they write. • Always respect a cat's privacy and don't invade his places of escape. • Change and uncertainty can cause stress in a cat, which is the greatest enemy of feline health and happiness, they say. "No matter how much you love cats, don't make the mistake of adopting more cats than your space, time and financial resources allow," they write. • Establish daily rituals to share with your cat. "When you feed or groom him, repeat patterns of words in a soothing tone of voice," they advise. Engage in interactive play in the same part of the house and at about the same time every day and be sure to allow "snuggle" time. Next week, some more on how your cat thinks and reading a cat's body language.




### ***The Hubbard Museum of the American West***



## The Joy of Growing Up Italian

I grew up in New York part of a local "Italian" community made up of immigrant families and their offspring. Like most immigrant communities (regardless of ethnic origin) the common values of ours included a strong work ethic, hope for a better family future and grateful to America while holding onto traditional customs. Of course, I had been born in America and had lived in New York half of my life, but somehow as a child growing up with traditional Italian customs; it never occurred to me until much later into adulthood, that just being a citizen of the United States meant I was an American.

Americans were people who ate peanut butter and jelly on mushy white bread that came out of plastic packages. Me? I ate pepper and egg sandwiches on an Italian roll. I was Italian. For me, as I am sure for most first and second generation Italian-American children who grew up in the 60's or 70's there was a definite distinction drawn between "us and them". We were Italian. Everybody else — the Irish, German, Polish, Jewish, they were the "Med-e-gones". (An Italian word for American's) There was no animosity involved in that distinction, no prejudice, no hard feelings, just... well, we were sure ours was the better way. For instance, we had a bread man, a milkman, an iceman, a fish man, a fruit and vegetable man, a watermelon man, an egg and cheese man and we even had a man who sharpened our knives and scissors who all came to our homes, or at least our neighborhoods in Brooklyn. We would wait for their call — their yell. We knew them all and they knew us while Americans went to the store for most of their food. What a waste! Truly, I pitied their loss. When it came to food, they never knew the pleasure of waking up every morning to find a hot crisp loaf of Italian bread waiting behind the screen door, most of my "Med-e-gone" friends had to be satisfied going to the A&P.

It always amazed me that my American friends only ate turkey on Thanksgiving or Christmas or rather that they only ate turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes and cranberry sauce. Now, we Italians — we also had turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes and cranberry sauce, but only after we had finished the antipasto, soup, lasagna, meatballs, salad and whatever else Nonna (Grandma in Italian) & Mama though might be appropriate for that particular holiday. The turkey was usually accompanied by roast nuts, pastries, cakes and of course, homemade cookies. No holiday was complete without some home baking (none of that store-bought stuff for us!). This is where you learned to eat a seven course meal between noon and seven PM, how to handle hot chestnuts and put tangerine wedges in red wine. I truly believe Italians live a romance with food. Speaking of food, Sunday was truly the big day of the week! That was the day you'd wake up to the smell of garlic and onions frying in olive oil. As you lay in bed, you could hear the hiss as tomatoes were dropped into a pan. Sunday we always had macaroni and sauce, the "med-e-gones" called it pasta and gravy. Sunday would not be Sunday without going to mass. Of course, you couldn't eat before mass because you had to fast


before receiving communion. But the good part was we knew when we got home, we'd find hot meatballs frying and nothing tastes better than newly fried meatballs and crisp bread dipped into a pot of sauce.

There was another difference between "us and them". We had gardens. Not just flower gardens but huge gardens where we grew tomatoes, tomatoes and more tomatoes. We ate them, cooked them and jarred them. Of course, we also had something else it seemed our American friends didn't seem to have. We had Nonno (Grandfather in Italian). It's not that they didn't have grandfathers; it's just that they didn't live in the same house or on the same block. They visited their grandfathers. We ate with ours and God forbid we didn't seem him at least once a day.

I also remember the holidays when all the relatives would gather at Nonna and Nonno's house and there would be tables full of food and homemade wine and music. Women in the kitchen and men in the living room and kids, kids everywhere. I must have half a million cousins, first, second, third and some who aren't even related, but what did it matter. And Nonno, with his gallon jug of wine beside his chair, his glass of lemon water on the table, sitting there smoking his cigar in the middle of it all, grinning his mischievous smile, surveying his domain and proud of his family. He had achieved his goal in coming to America and to Brooklyn and now his children and their children were achieving the same goals that were available to them in this great country, because there were Americans.

When Nonno died, things began to change. Slowly at first, but then uncles and aunts eventually began to cut down on their visits. Family gatherings were fewer and something seemed to be missing, although when we did get together, usually at my mother's house now, I always had the feeling that they were there. It was understandable, of course. Everyone now had their own families, and some even now have their own grandchildren. Lots of other things have changed too. The old house my grandparents lived in is now covered with aluminum siding and the garden is gone. The last of the homemade wine has long since been drunk and nobody covers the fig tree in the fall anymore. The holidays have also changed. The quantity of food we once consumed without any ill effect is not good for us anymore. Too much starch, too many calories, too much cholesterol and nobody bothers to bake anymore... too busy and it is easier just to buy. Too much is no good for you.

The differences between "us and them" aren't so easily defined anymore and I guess that's good. My grandparents were Italian-Italian, my parents are Italian-American, I am American-Italian and my children are American-Americans. Oh, and I'm an American all right, and proud of it, just as my grandfather would want me to be. We are all Americans now—Irish, Polies, Germans and Jews. United States citizens all — but somehow I still feel Italian. Call it culture, call it tradition, call it my passion for food and wine, I'm not sure what it is, all I do know is that my children have been cheated out of a wonderful piece of heritage. They never knew my grandparents.
