## Tighter water restrictions begin

The continuing drought, tenuous storage tank levels and the rapid consumption of water rights from the Ruidoso River watershed prompted Ruidoso officials to ban all lawn irrigation.

They took the action during a special meeting Friday. The prohibition took effect Monday.

Contributing to the recipe for crisis is the high number of residents who are ignoring existing restrictions, water department officials said. Big water users will be targeted by code enforcement checking for violations, they said.

Village manager Lorri McKnight said officers were scheduled to start patrolling

last weekend in the evenings to catch those people who are watering illegally. The penalty could be a \$500 fine and up to 90 days in jail.

During the special village council meeting, water director Larry Grasmick said while new figures he prepared show the village at 97.23 percent of the amount of water used at this same time last year, Ruidoso is consuming its water rights much too rapidly.

In the first 20 months of the five-year accounting period, about one-third of the time period, the village diverted one-half of its rights, he said.

"We can supply the water, but we are borrowing from our future," Grasmick said. "If we run out of water rights, in a

## Village vows stricter enforcement

No more Mr. Nice Guy when it comes to people who violate Ruidoso water restrictions, says village manager Lorri McKnight.

She told village councilors Friday that she met with code enforcement officers, meter readers, planning staff and water department staff because of the apparent lack of public awareness about the restrictions and the possible consequences of violations.

"I think we have been extremely lenient," she said. "We've issued lots of

warnings. I'm here to tell you we're done giving warnings. We will begin to cite for violation of the conservation restrictions and will step up efforts to find the violators with patrols after hours, driving down streets after dark.

"We're tired of people laughing at us when we tell them not to water. We're getting serious."

Finance director Elaine Beltran said 50 customers were identified who use 10,000 or more gallons of water per month, which equates collectively to about 500,000 gallons of water.

"These people aren't taking it seriously," she said.

## Official says the way wildlife is fed and hunted locally is an Unbearable problem

The frustration comes through in game officer Anthony Manfredi's voice.

He's irritable after a summer of dealing with people who leave out lures for wildlife and then complain when the animals wander up on their porches. He's peeved at the abuses by those who stake out dumpster bears instead of engaging in a true hunting challenge.

Every year, the New Mexico Game and

Fish Department staff warns people not to leave out garbage, pet food, hummingbird feeders and other items that might draw bears to their yards. But every year, they do.

Manfredi recently set a trap as a result of a complaint from an Upper Canyon couple, who insisted on leaving bird feeders out despite his recommendation they be removed.

"So now they've complained that this 1 1/2 year-old bear who weighs about

## Pearce talks forest health during visit

■ The congressman and other officials said inter-agency cooperation is key.

Standing behind the Smokey Bear Ranger District office with local officials and conservationists Monday, U.S. Rep. Steve Pearce knew he was talking to people who understand the problem of over-grown forest land.

They came to hear words of encouragement about continued federal funding for projects on public and private land aimed at reducing the threat of wildfire and restoring the Ruidoso watershed.

The congressman and his staff stopped in Ruidoso as part of a tour of his 18-county congressional district in Southeastern New Mexico during a hiatus in Congress. He spent the first few hours touring areas of the Lincoln National Forest and other land already treated, then viewed sections still untouched to contrast the overall conditions.

"I want to make sure our forests are around for a long time for the future," he said. "That's why I'm actively working on the forest health initiative."

His efforts started in 1999, when he introduced a healthy forest bill in the state Legislature,

about 18 months before the catastrophic fire at Los Alamos. The bill failed. He tried again in 2000 for a forest thinning demonstration project in Santa Fe. "Now you see them all around," he said. "But five years ago, the only example was in Mescalero."

Also speaking Monday were Ruidoso Forestry Director Rick Delaco, Lincoln County manager Tom Stewart and Barbara Luna, who heads the state Forestry Division based in Capitan.

They acknowledged that cooperation among federal, state, county and municipal agencies and entities marked the turning point for better forest management.

Five years ago, before a series of devastating fires throughout the West, including Lincoln County, internal policies and bureaucracy of the different agencies stood in the way of that type of cooperation, Pearce said. Now the entities have joined together to seek funding and to help private land owners, as well as treat public land, he said.

## State praises two area schools, puts two others on probation

■ Thirteen of the 18 area schools listed met standards, according to the State Department of Education.

Capitan and Carrizozo high schools exceeded standards of the state's accountability system, as did Cloudcroft Elementary School. All other schools in the area met standards, except Nob Hill Early Childhood Center and Sierra Vista Primary School in Ruidoso, according to ratings released this week.

Nob Hill and Sierra Vista Primary, with pre-kindergarten through second grade students, were rated as probationary schools even though testing does not start until the third grade.

The State Board of Education approved the use of third-grade scores for these younger grades at its meeting in June, Ruth Williams, public outreach director for the State Department of Education, said.

"We took school data from the third

grade, the feeder school, and looked at it going backwards," Williams said. "We assigned grade 3 data backwards because there wasn't any data."

Gail Wickstrom, superintendent of schools for the Ruidoso school district, said she was shocked by the probationary rating.

"Obviously these youngsters were not tested, so they took the third grade scores at White Mountain Elementary — and some of those kids haven't been there three years — and rolled them down to Nob Hill and Sierra Vista Primary, so Sierra Vista Primary and Nob Hill showed as probationary, whereas for White Mountain Elementary, they averaged third and fourth grade scores so they met standards."

She believes that the combined third- and fourth-grade scores should have been used for the rating of Nob Hill and Sierra Vista Primary because the district, unlike most in the state, has a structure of two-grade schools from pre-kindergarten through the middle school.

"We have exemplary students at Nob Hill

# County fair kicks off in Capitan

With the indoor project judging completed on Tuesday, the livestock portion of the 2003 Lincoln County Fair began at 8 a.m. today in Capitan with the Dairy Goat show. FFA and 4-H members representing Hondo, Corona, Carrizozo, Capitan and Camp Sierra Blanca will be competing with their projects throughout the week, culminating in the Junior Livestock Sale on Saturday.

receive sale slots determined by their placing in their respective divisions. "Making the sale" is often the main goal for a livestock exhibitor, giving him or her the opportunity to recoup some expenses in the cost and upkeep of the show animal.

Saturday's auction begins at 1 p.m. with auctioneer Rick Walters at the microphone. Each year the Junior Livestock Sale is made possible by the generous businesses and individuals who come out to the fair to support the agricultural youth of Lincoln County.

Numerous options are available for those wanting to help support the youth through the sale. First, people can purchase an animal for custom processing.

Often, friends, neighbors and families pool their resources and purchase an animal to share. Meat processing companies will be at the sale to take the animals to be processed for buyers, and return it cut, packaged and frozen to specifications.

A second option is for the animals to be purchased for resale to the packer. This means the purchaser pays the difference between the market price and the amount of the successful bid. It's a "cost-share" benefit to the buyer.

The "add-on" program is yet another way to help the youth. It is a lump sum gift designated to a particular exhibitor. There is no limit to the number of add-ons an exhibitor can receive.

For businesses and individuals who wish to help, but are unable to get to the fair in person or would like to donate indirectly, there is the Booster Pot. It is geared toward exhibitors that do not make the sale. Donations help support these kids, and the money is divided equally among them.

The sale will also feature a favorite purchase opportunity. The champion pie and cake is auctioned to the highest bidder. Last year's blue ribbon pie sold by Bailey Shivers brought \$550 and the championship cake made by Samantha Gomez of Hondo brought \$400.

"I'm filled with confidence that those in charge will protect the forest assets, and I can go back to Washington, D.C., and say, 'Yes, it can be done,'" the congressman said.

Experts have recognized that arid conditions dictate a lower tree count per acre to maintain the health of the vegetation and to allow natural springs to regenerate, he said. Fire used to be a naturally occurring phenomena about every eight years, he said. It would burn lower branches, brush and smaller trees, but not destroy the larger trees. With the previous fire suppression policy, fuel built up in the forest and today's fires often burn so hot they kill all the trees and scorch the earth, rendering it unsuitable for anything to grow for years, Pearce said.

"We have an estimated 1 billion too many trees," he said. "If each used a gallon of water a day (and some use much more), that much is lost to recharge the aquifer."

Anita and Ernie Powell, residents of Upper Canyon, queried Pearce on the status of money allocated to create evacuation routes. They told the congressman people living in Upper Canyon have only one viable way out. If a fire starts near the entrance to the canyon, they would be trapped.

County manager Tom Stewart said the money probably would flow through the county and state forestry, as it does now in grants for lot thinning projects.

Buck Sanchez, the new, Lincoln National Forest district ranger, said the U.S. Forest Service also would continue to work on that situation.

Pearce said decisions about routes should be a local process without federal interference.

"This is a critical priority - to get the most good from limited funds," Pearce said.

As far as access to the federal grant money, Stewart said non-profit property owner groups can apply for money to reduce the number of trees on private land.

year it could be illegal for us to supply water."

The village has no guarantee that it will be able to acquire more water rights or will be given more credits by the state for water returned to the stream, he said.

He recommended moving from Phase 2 of water restrictions, which allows irrigation of lawns on Tuesday before 10 a.m. and after 3 p.m., to Phase 3, which prohibits all outdoor watering except hand-held hoses, buckets or containers on flower beds and tree wells during those same hours.

Councilor Ron Hardeman offered the motion, which was seconded by Councilor Deborah Marcum-Byars. Councilor Bob Sterchi cast the only "no" vote.

Councilor L. Ray Nunley was not at the special meeting called on Friday.

"I know this is unpopular, but we don't have a choice," Hardeman said. "We just went through a record dry month and although there are chances everyday for rain, it rarely materializes. Until I see rain, I would rather be on the safe side."

Grasmick said by allowing hand watering during cooler hours, property owners can save ornament bushes and trees, which would be harder to replace than lawns.

Byars said just because less water is being consumed this year doesn't mean much.

"You need to look at the larger picture," she said. "We had a deficit last year (consumption compared to aquifer recharge). We still have one this year."

McKnight commended Grasmick "for taking a really tough stand here. I know this is not a popular suggestion and that you (councilors) face a difficult decision today."

Larry Wilt with the water department said the village is diverting from Grindstone Reservoir and the Hollywood well to keep the water levels up in the village's 5 million gallon storage tanks.

"When I first came here, Hollywood was just a backup well for emergencies," Wilt said. "Now we have to use it or the tanks will drop like a rock. When we stopped last week, they dropped 18 feet in three days."

Sterchi said from looking at reports submitted by Grasmick, the village can produce more water than is being consumed.

"The mountains look green," he said. "There's water up there. We may have to go to Phase 3 in maybe a month from today (if no rain falls), but not today."

Sterchi said he doesn't want to see the village "flip-flop" back and forth on phases because people will be confused.

Councilors nixed a compromise that would have allowed longer hours each day to hand water and would have included lawns.

They asked Grasmick to explore purchasing water rights now being leased and about the progress toward using an old well at the high school.

Grasmick said he's getting a cost estimate to drill a new well on the land owned by the school district, but that the water would come out of the same already overdrawn water rights pool.

# Stewart offers counter proposal to humane society

Responding to a request from the Ruidoso Village Council to reconsider a break with the Humane Society of Lincoln County for care of impounded animals, county manager Tom Stewart submitted a counter offer.

Mayor Leon Eggleston wrote County Commission Chairman Rex Wilson that council members are concerned about the resulting lack of services for the citizens in the county if the commission drops the society shelter and creates a kennel at the county jail only for animals picked up by the

sheriff's animal impound officer.

"As has been previously stated, the animals do not recognize municipal boundaries," Eggleston wrote. "We feel this should be a shared responsibility between all governmental entities within the county and would respectfully request that the county commission reconsider its decision."

In a letter dated Aug. 1 to Keith Adkins, executive director of the shelter operated by the society, Stewart proposed an alternate method of payment. The majority of the commission rejected the society's request to unfreeze its \$25,000 annual funding for the past three years and boost the

amount to \$40,000.

Stewart said he's placed the item on the agenda of the Aug. 19 commission meeting.

He's asked for more financial information to justify the \$40,000, plus projected increases to as much as \$60,000 in 2006.

The information includes:

- The results of the last annual audit to include the organization's current cash flow statement balance sheet, and profit and loss account or similar documents provided as financial statements.
- A consolidated and detailed budget for the society, including a list of

employees with their salaries and benefits, other expenditures and anticipated revenue by source.

- A list by position of activities performed by volunteers for the organization.
- Additional justification for the future year increases from the county.

He proposed to discuss an alternate approach to funding that would be based on the county paying:

- \$20 for any animal dropped off by a resident of the unincorporated area of the county
- \$65 for any untagged animal delivered by the county animal control officer to cover three days of hous-

ing and the cost of killing the animal, if required

- \$85 for any tagged animal delivered by the county impound officer to cover five days of housing and the cost of killing it, if required
- \$135 for any animal delivered by county animal control that requires quarantine and may later have to be killed.

"The (fees) would be paid on top of any fees paid or donations from citizens of the county," Stewart wrote, asking for comment from Adkins on the service concept.

Adkins could not be reached for comment late Tuesday.

## Brewer says tribes have unfair sales advantages

The concept of sovereign Indian nations creates unfair market conditions for competitors selling gasoline, cigarettes and liquor, says the owner of several local gasoline stations and convenience stores.

Don Brewer asked for help Monday from U.S. Rep. Steve Pearce during a stop in Ruidoso by the Republican congressman who represents southeastern New Mexico.

"The Native American tax issue has created a non-level playing field and it's an issue that needs to be addressed," Brewer

said.

He pointed out that at the new Mescalero Apache Travel Center and Casino on U.S. 70, gasoline sold by the tribe is not subject to the 18-cent state gas tax.

Liquor is sold in all of the casinos operated by tribes and pueblos in the state, yet they didn't have to pay \$250,000, as Brewer did, for a license to sell liquor, he said.

Cigarette taxes present another inequity, he said. A person pays \$3.89 for one pack of cigarettes at his stores and 29 percent of that price is a tax that isn't paid on reservations, Brewer said.

"It's hard to compete with people like that," he said. "The Native Americans are going to own the state of New Mexico unless we address the issue. They are not paying their taxes."

"Yet, I keep reading from (U.S. Sen.) Pete Domenici about grants that are awarded to tribes. I'd appreciate some for my company."

Pearce said he opposed the gasoline tax break for Native American groups when he was in the state Legislature, but now that's he's on the federal level, he's reluctant to become involved in a state issue.

Brewer said Congress is going to have to address the problem nationwide.

## DiPaolo incarcerated on probation charge

■ The teen was awarded \$500,000 last year after a federal lawsuit involving Ruidoso police.

Popping into the legal spotlight again, Suzanne DiPaolo was back in detention Monday after being charged with a probation violation.

Officials with the 12th Judicial District Court in Carrizozo said DiPaolo was picked up in Albuquerque for failure to comply with the conditions of her probation. At her detention hearing Monday, Judge Karen Parsons decided she would remain incarcerated.

The 17-year-old was awarded \$500,000 in July 2002 as a settlement of a federal lawsuit against the village of Ruidoso and two police officers. She accused one of the officers of throwing her to the ground while she was handcuffed to a bed in a holding cell. The incident was caught on video tape.

In November, she pleaded guilty to charges of receiving stolen property, forgery and stolen identification, and no contest to auto burglary, according to court records.

and Sierra Vista, and the (combined) White Mountain Elementary scores should be used as the scores for Sierra Vista and Nob Hill, not just half the scores ... We don't think these scores reflect our structure."

William Blair, deputy director of Accountability and School Improvement Services with the State Department of Education, said third-grade scores were

used because "those are the kids that were there the year before. The decision was made to use the third-grade scores because that's more reflective of what happened earlier by a year than if you combined third and fourth grade scores. Clearly the third-graders are the ones that had been at the other schools most recently."

Blair said that all tests are coded and that only scores of students who attended Sierra Vista Primary and Nob Hill were used

in the rating calculation.

Wickstrom plans to appeal to the state, viewing this as a flaw in the accounting system, she said.

"We believe the district has really wonderful programs, and this is the first year for this testing and next year there will be testing in Sierra Vista Primary. The rules keep changing."

Probationary status means the school has one year to "turn that around," Williams said, and if it doesn't meet standards the

following year, it will face mandated school improvement.

The State Department of Education has posted public school ratings on its Web site at [www.sde.state.nm.us](http://www.sde.state.nm.us). A total of 741 of the 750 public schools in New Mexico were rated, and 78 percent were rated as meeting or exceeding the state's accountability standards. Only 12 schools were rated as exemplary, 42 as exceeding standards, 523 as meeting standards and 164 as probationary.

## BEARS: Game officer displeased with hunting of bears around village

75 pounds is a threat to their lives," he said. "When I catch it, I have to destroy it. Every time the Game Commission looks at a report and sees I put out a trap because of a complaint, it perpetuates the impression created last year that bears are such a big problem."

"I get heartburn when people come up here three months a year with feeders all over the house and won't take them down, yet they're scared to death of a young bear. They make a mess and go home and we clean it up."

Bear complaints last year, mostly in northern New Mexico, prompted an earlier start to the bear hunting season this year and an expanded two tag limit per license.

"It's bad for the bears,"

Manfredi said. "The season started Aug. 1 and they're easy to spot because they're moving a lot trying to find water and food (to build fat for the winter)," he said.

He already cited a hunter last weekend for not having the proper tags and documentation. The man claimed the bear he killed with bow and arrow was shot in Flume Canyon and wandered into the village limits.

Manfredi isn't impressed with anyone hunting in the Perk Canyon and Flume Canyon areas because the bears there are nearly defenseless.

"They're hunting dumpster bears even if they're not right on top of the dumpsters when they kill them," he said.

People who feed bear and deer are robbing the wild animals of their instincts for survival, the game officer said.

"They both depend a great deal on their sense of smell to protect them against predation, but when the bear and the poor deer get used to the human scent and aren't harmed, they don't know the difference when hunting season starts. Someone could practically walk up to a deer that's been fed and shoot them point blank. There's no honor in hunting that way, but some people don't care how they get a trophy."

"It's like hunting an animal in a zoo. It's the same thing, but there are no bars. The zoo animals aren't afraid of people either. They've seen enough of them and they've been robbed of their natural fear instinct, which is the only thing that will keep them alive in the wild."

As long as complaints keep flowing from people who come to the mountains and the forest, then reject the wildlife that

lives there, the Game Commission will keep the longer hunting season in place, he said.

Both male and female bears may be hunted, although sows with cubs are off limits, Manfredi said. Unfortunately, hunters may not always be able to make that distinction. A mother with yearlings may not stay as close to her offspring, he

said. If she's shot, the young bears are left without the necessary education to survive in the wild and often become nuisances, he said.

"The vast majority of bears I have to kill are 2-year-olds that don't know better yet," he said. "I wish people realized that, when they come to the mountains, they need to be ready for mountain living."

## A two-edged sword hangs over Ruidoso

It's taken a while, but Village Hall is getting the message

Five years after the idea was approved, then dumped, Ruidoso's village council has decided development fees (earlier and more properly called impact fees) aren't such a bad idea after all.

But in the late 1990s, the pro-growth contingent was in fine fettle. The council recognized that something had to be done, but it didn't want to stir the ire of the subdivision developers or the real estate crowd, so it decided to amortize those carefully researched \$4,000 fees for new residences over 15 years. In all, it created a bookkeeping nightmare that generated negligible revenue.

The only impact, it turned out, was that new permits set a record, as builders rushed to get approval before the fees went into effect. Then the council killed the fees, and what followed was even more residential growth, one new motel after another, subdivi-

sions erupting, more demands on a shrinking water supply, more need for extended sewer lines — more need for infrastructure.

This summer, Planning and Zoning's Chay Rennick figured out that the village had foregone almost \$4 million in fees — money that would have gone a long way to catch up with growth that continued to surge.

Now the village has figured out how to reinstate the old ordinance, with in-place \$4,000 up-front fees, and start getting some revenue, while it gets a new months-long study started to figure out how big the fees should be now.

Maybe we have a bunch of slow learners at Village Hall, but finally they seem to be getting the message: Growth is inevitable, so figure out how to pay for it. Or maybe slow it down a tad, until more municipal water can be found.

## School uniform advocates address important issue

Scott Peterson will be named Husband of the Year before New Mexico schools adopt student uniforms.

Threatening New Mexicans with school uniforms is like telling a Ku Klux Klansman he has to wear a blue sheet. You might as well tell the president of the local NRA chapter he has to get a permit before he can buy a water pistol. It's like telling a bunch of Santa Fe activists, "O.K., gang, into the bus — we're going down to Carlsbad to help them get that bomb factory."

Just the mention of school uniforms unleashes a wide range of passions. Opponents reach deep to bolster their position. They cite all types of historical arguments, including this one by Benjamin Franklin: "Those who would give up essential liberty, to purchase a little temporary safety, deserve neither liberty nor safety."

That may be the biggest stretch since Elizabeth Taylor's last face job. I mean, I doubt school uniforms were within three time zones of Ben's mind when he said that stuff.

Another American statesman weighed in on school uniforms. In his 1996 State of the Union message — this was a period of history before presidents starting fibbing in their State of the Union messages — Bill Clinton said, "If it means that teenagers will stop killing each other over designer jackets, then our public schools should be able to require the students to wear uniforms."

No one is going to listen to

Bill Clinton, though, even if he is an intelligent man. That is because he did a very dumb thing. He got involved with Monica.

On the other hand, even though he wasn't talking about school uniforms, we tend to listen to Ben Franklin because the dumbest thing old Ben ever did was fly a kite in a thunderstorm.

Note that in Alamogordo, teachers will take a new dress code to school this month. No T-shirts, sweat pants, jogging suits, shorts, miniskirts, formfitting pants or clothing with inappropriate graphics. No tattoos or visible piercing except for ears.

Alamo's teacher code grew out of a parent's complaint that his kid was sent home for dressing pretty much like the teacher did. So be it. But, look, why shouldn't the schools be able to control what kids wear?

Here's the deal. Kids should not be allowed to get up in the morning and get dressed in an attitude. They should not be able to slouch their way onto the school grounds with baggy pants, wrong way hats, chains drooping from their waists.

Were it up to me, if a kid comes to school with a sartorial demeanor that tells the teacher, "up yours," send him home. The country has drifted far from the days when education was considered a cherished privilege. It needs to reverse the course.

School uniforms would accomplish that. Studies have proven uniforms increase discipline, reduce crime. Not going to happen, though. You might as well ask Larry King to give up his suspenders.





For those who have had the pleasure of living in Lincoln County you would have experienced torrent rains, hail storms threatening lightning and high winds for the last five days.

However, on July 11, upon entering the Ruidoso High School football field, not a cloud filled the sky, just a slight whisper of a breeze was found high in the pine trees, and there was little sign of the usual summer lightning storm far in the distance.

As the Relay For Life Lincoln County Ruidoso chairman surveyed the final logistics, keeping a eagle eye over the placement of the survivor tent which would greet 153 registered survivors, and strained to watch the Texas-New Mexico Power Company align the four United Rental portable lights (corporate sponsors), she sighed a big relief thinking the day so many in the community worked so hard for was really here!

As the first of the 24 teams arrived, preparing to host 648 excited team members, you would see a constant flow of tables, chairs, tent poles, sleeping bags, decorations, and food; oh my, so much food come through the welcome gates.

Already the sharp cries of the kids came across the field as they raced to see who would get one of the first Relay balloons; laughter and friendly smiles welcomed all the new participants and warm hugs and "So glad to see you again," was shared between the senior team members. "WHAT TIME IS IT," boomed from the voice of Mr. Relay "Harvey T" as he warmed the mic up preparing for the 6 p.m. opening ceremonies. This Relay warmed at the sounds of his deep, bear-like voice that carried a sense of love and compassion for what was about to happen.

As the wave of 58 survivors began flowing around the grand stand, preparing for the opening ceremonies, a young 15-year-

old (Sashay) waited in the wings, wide-eyed and nervous as she prepared to speak in front of an estimated 800 attendees. It never is easy speaking about one's trials in life, but Sashay had only started her battle against cancer in December and every emotion was taunt and tight, knowing tears were to fall as she shared her cancer journey with so many.

As the survivors stepped up to be greeted and welcomed by the 10 Ruidoso cheerleaders, on to the track for their honored Relay lap, there was a starched reminder cancer has no age preference. As walking directly behind the survivor banner, the first survivor was an 11-year-old boy and an 87-year-old man, walking hand in hand, wearing their survivor T-shirts and buttons proudly. Most had no idea, they were grandfather and grandson, both sharing a "Celebration of Life" only they could feel.

As the survivor cake was cut and the punch was pored. The 24 team captains proudly introduced their 648 team members, and began the march with banners, spirit wands, funky hats, horns and drums setting the pace for the 16-hour fight against cancer.

As dusk set, and the full moon slightly rose up behind the beautiful mountains the 1,000 luminarias began to take their place of honor, glowing in the dark awaiting the Luminaria Ceremony. As four youth ages 12 to 14 began reading "Hope," a creative poem outlining what "Hope" meant to a cancer warrior. The word HOPE softly illuminated the side of the football stadium with a goal of courage, compassion and faith that one day there would be a cure for cancer, and the hopeless became the hopeful. The moment was captured by the playing of Amazing Grace by the local police chief, who also had his own battle with cancer. Not a dry eye was to be found among the silence of the track.

As the night turned in to day, games, dancing and relay poker was but part of the

hours. Team members snoozed, ate and found comfort with new friends, while sharing their own personal cancer stories. As the sun began to shine and the dew on the grass slowly dried, we all ate a wonderful breakfast donated and hand prepared by the immediate care team. There is nothing like fresh fruit, bagels and cowboy coffee after a long night.

As 9 a.m. came, the final Electric Slide and Hokey Pokey was danced. We all prepared for the announcement of the elite "Relay Spirit Award" and of course the final figure of how much funding was raised. As Carole Benham, chairman, took the stage, her heart was full, and her eyes were glazed. She honored the Espranza family, who were 93 members deep, with the final count of raising more than \$5,000 for the American Cancer Society. There were screams, chants and hand-clapping thunder from the standing ovation of all the other teams as they recognized this family truly represented the spirit of Relay. As the hush fell over the field all eyes were on Carole. She took a deep breath and announced as of 9 a.m. Saturday morning the community of Ruidoso had raised \$23,764.45 toward the fight of cancer. Just short of the desired goal of \$27,000, she encouraged and reminded all much more money was expected from the Rotary's silent auction and some last minute sponsors.

It had been a special evening, of fun, food and festivities. However everyone would agree, it has and always would be a heart to heart event, which has become a tradition for this small community of 19,000. They all left planning Relay 2004... talking notes for the wrap-up party in two weeks.

Our final count is \$25,000.45 as of July 29. Thank you again for all your love and support. It has been a wonderful experience.

**Race turns into rage**

## New principals eager to start

White Mountain, Sierra Vista have new leaders

Both new principals at the White Mountain Schools complex come from out of state, and both were familiar with Ruidoso before they interviewed for the jobs.

Philip L. Parks is the new principal at Sierra Vista Primary School and Ronald D. Elkin the new principal at White Mountain Elementary School, hired to replace Danny Flores and Frank Cannella, respectively.

Born in Crane, Texas, and reared in Kermit, Texas, Parks' first degree was in journalism from Baylor University. He was managing editor of *The Winkler County News* for four years before being recruited to teach journalism, photography, English and yearbook at Kermit High School on emergency certification. Then he went back to school and earned two master's degrees: one from the University of Texas of the Permian Basin in secondary education and American literature, and the other from Sul Ross State University in educational administration/mid-management administrator.

Parks taught 17 years at Kermit High School, went on to become principal at Purple Sage Elementary School for seven years and was principal at Kermit Junior High School from 2001 until now. In both of these schools, he promoted and instituted conversational Spanish for students and faculty and improved the scores on standardized tests.

His students at Purple Sage Elementary School ranged from pre-kindergarten to third through fifth grade, and now he will work with first- and second-grade students at Sierra Vista Primary School.

"I'm going to love it," he said. "I already met with the kids twice. I walked into the summer school classroom and we introduced ourselves and told some jokes together. I can't wait for school to start."

Parks and his wife, Elaine, have been coming to Ruidoso for years, enjoying camping in the cool weather — and horseracing. One summer, he said, it was 113 degrees in Kermit when they had to buy coats to be comfortable in Ruidoso.

Elaine Parks is a native New Mexican who grew up in Eunice and whose brothers went to school with Mike Gladden, former superintendent of Ruidoso Schools. She went on to nursing school in Texas.

Parks took early retirement from Texas, and he and his wife chose a couple of places in

New Mexico to look for positions in schools, Eunice among them, he said.

Ruidoso won because of the climate and "it's a better school system and lower stress — Eunice was a junior high principalship. Here I won't have to worry about first- and second-graders bringing guns to school.

There they had metal detectors and some of the other school districts had more gang problems," he said.

Using his journalism training, he investigated the school district — even visiting the police department twice — and "found out nothing negative about the Ruidoso Schools."

Parks was a volunteer with the fire department in Kermit for 20 years and was president of the Texas Teen Age Baseball Association 10 years and a member of the sports and band booster clubs and the Kermit Rotary Club.


Elkin comes to Ruidoso from Rock Springs, Wyo., where he served as elementary teacher, director of media services and principal for 27 years. Originally from Pennsylvania, he received a bachelor of science degree in education from Geneva College in Beaver Falls, Pa., a master's degree in elementary education from Clarion University in Clarion, Pa. He taught fifth and sixth grades in an inner-city school in Warren, Ohio, for eight years, and at a rural elementary school in Pennsylvania for one year.

For the past 12 years, he's been the elementary principal for grades kindergarten through six.

Elkin established a curriculum-enrichment program of artists-in-residency called "Lincoln and the Arts," for his students at Lincoln Elementary in Rock Springs, was appointed by the governor to the Wyoming Arts Council in 2001 and served on the Community Fine Arts Board.

"It sounds like this (Ruidoso) district has a strong commitment to that," Elkin said. "I think that's important in educating the whole child."

People on the Community Fine Arts Board

told him "wonderful things about this community," he said.

While on the county fair board, Elkins ran quarter horse races for eight years at the county fair, and crossed paths with people from Ruidoso.

"I heard from people what a wonderful community (Ruidoso) was. When I had the opportunity to interview for the position, I loved it from the minute I hit town."

His wife, Merry, nabbed a position as special education teacher at Capitan Elementary School after 19 years of teaching.

Elkin said he sees his role as principal to work with staff, parents and students to make students feel safe and welcome, "and to emphasize how important this business of learning is, even at this early age. I want them to start thinking about becoming lifelong learners ... and ultimately, it's to nurture a caring environment for kids, an environment where parents feel that their children are receiving all the help they need to be successful."

He believes the biggest problem of schools today is trying to meet the demands of the federal guidelines. In the classroom, he wants to challenge students with "communicating, computing (math), and being able to put their thoughts down on paper, become expressive writers." These are areas the Ruidoso Schools have been emphasizing over the years.

He also feels it's his responsibility to remind parents that they are the primary educators of their own children and have the most influence over them.

"We're here to assist parents in educating the whole child. We can't do it without their support."

His first impressions of Ruidoso are that the community and parents are supportive and that the district has an excellent staff. He uses a three-legged-stool analogy for the ingredients of a good education: talented staff, committed parents and a community that values its teachers and backs its schools.

"That's what I've been used to ... and it's nice to make that transition to something that has similar high standards. We want to have high but achievable standards for kids."

## Capitan gives 'conceptual approval' to joint animal shelter

The Capitan Board of Trustees held a special meeting July 28 consider threatened litigation and joining with Lincoln County and Carrizozo to build a new animal shelter.

The primary reason for this meeting was an executive session to discuss threatened litigation dealing with property. After the executive discussion, the board returned to regular session and said they had decided to request that the village attorney, who was not in attendance due to illness, attempt to negotiate the property problem.

Lincoln County Manager Tom Stewart asked the village to consider joining the county and the town of Carrizozo in building and maintaining an animal shelter that would house stray animals picked up by animal control officers of the three jurisdictions. The board gave "conceptual approval to this plan."

Stewart said that this was necessary because officials with the Lincoln County Humane Society refused to

accept \$25,000 the county commission allocated annually for the past three years. They demanded the commission provide break the freeze and pay \$40,000, he said.

Stewart said that the county animal control officer delivered only 32 animals to the Humane Society during the previous year. If costs were calculated on a per animal basis, this would amount to \$781.25 per animal. That's more than the county pays for the incarceration of a juvenile offender, he said.

As long as it is possible to drop off animals when the shelter is closed, the staff cannot verify the jurisdictional origin of the animals, Stewart said. During business hours, people who leave animals must fill out paperwork pinpointing where they live or where they found the animals. That information, coupled with an estimate for after-hours drop-offs, was used last year as a basis for the society to claim the county is responsible for 600 plus animals per year, he said.

The proposed Lincoln County, Capitan and Carrizozo facility would meet all state

mandates for keeping animals for 72 hours if they were untagged and five days if they have identification, Stewart said. If an animal was not claimed or adopted within that period, it would be killed.

He said Carrizozo has hired a Community Corrections Officer who would supervise non-violent jail inmates in the day-to-day cleaning and feeding of these animals. The cost of veterinarian services was not covered by Stewart.

The county manager mentioned that a possible alternative to this plan might be the no-kill animal shelter that Emma Graham started in Arabela.

In a telephone interview, Keith Adkins, executive director of the Humane Society shelter, disputed Stewart's contention that the county only is responsible for the 32 animals delivered to it by the county animal control officer. Adkins said Stewart wrote in a letter that the county animal pound would be up and running on Aug. 1. Adkins said now that Lincoln County has its own facility, the Humane Society would no longer accept

animals from the unincorporated portions of the county.

The society shelter is under no obligation to accept animals from areas not under contract, Adkins pointed out. The Humane Society charter, by-laws and name do not require it to accept animals from jurisdictions that do not support them. In fact, he is considering asking that the board of directors rename the facility "The Ruidoso Humane Society," Adkins said.

The shelter will continue to accept animals from Capitan unless the board of trustees decides to lend its financial support to whatever facility the county operated instead.

Adkins said that statistics circulating about the percentage of animals destroyed at the shelter are outdated. The actual figure is 45 percent, well below the national average at shelters, he said. It breaks down from January through May 2003 and consists primarily of feral cats, sick animals, injured animals and animals that have severe behavior problems, he said. About 14 percent of the animals received by the shelter are reunited

with their owners; the adoption rate is up 62 percent and 25 percent fewer animals were put down this year than in previous years, he said.

Contacted by telephone, Graham, who currently lives in Lincoln, said that the temporary shelter she is operating in Arabela already has approximately 35 dogs, 35 cats and a number of larger domestic animals, including horses. She is attempting to purchase a large tract of rural land to be able to expand her facility to accept any and all animals and permit them to either be adopted or to live out their lives on the property.

Graham, whose operation is incorporated as a non-profit organization, also said that if the \$25,000 the county annually gives the Humane Society were given to her, she would be able to build pens and feed many more animals than are housed by the Humane Society.

Graham said that Capitan Veterinarian Becky Washburn was willing to offer a local drop-off point for animal owners who want to relinquish their pets or who find strays.

Stewart was asked by the county commission to find a cheaper alternative than the Humane Society for unwanted, lost and abused animals.

Unwanted, lost and abused animals are becoming an increasing problem for all of the jurisdictions in the county, humane officials have pointed out. If spay and neuter reduced-cost coupons no longer are available to animal owners in areas not under contract, the situation may further deteriorate, they warned. They have questioned the efficacy and humaneness of an animal pound that keeps animals for a statutory minimum amount of time and then kills them as opposed to facilities whose staffs attempt to reunite lost pets with their owners and allow sufficient time and advertising for animals to be adopted.

Additional business conducted at the special meeting involved the transferring of money from the general bank account to the solid waste bank account to pay for the roll-off dumpsters that LCSWA provided for Capitan's annual clean-up day.

## Capitan youths share friendship, 4-H experience

Wesley Hall and Keith Sultemeier are buddies. They are also Capitan 4-H members, home schoolers and experienced showmen in the dairy goat division.

Hall, 16, a senior, is the son of Robby and Kortney Hall. Robby is the battalion chief for the Ruidoso Fire Department and a tree cutter by trade. Those careers have been a factor in Wesley's passion for forestry. He's taken it as a 4-H project for six years and it will be his major in college. "I'd be in forestry this year but I have a sick horse to tend to so my time has been cut short for some other projects."

Sultemeier, 13 and an 8th grader, is the middle son of three belonging to Allen and Kristin Sultemeier.

"Each year the dairy goats and showmanship get easier. I get much more confident," he said. His first year in 4-H he showed a pig, chickens, and Dairy and Cabrito goats. Now in his fifth year, he and his younger brother Wade, 11, are showing 28 goats between them. Sultemeier also has 10 chickens to enter in the fair this week.

Liking the poultry competition, Sultemeier has learned to buy his own birds

and knows what to look for in a quality chicken. "Clean, no fungus in the comb and straight toes," he explains. Sultemeier also owns the Mini Nubian goat that has won Best Udder for the past four years. "Sugar" came from Kim Beauvais, whom both Sultemeier and Hall name as a major influence in their goat showmanship abilities.

Hobbies for Sultemeier include elk hunting in Colorado with an uncle and spending time at a family summer cabin in Ruidoso. "We just visit and play board games. It's a lot of fun."

Sultemeier feels 4-H has taught him respect for other people. He has also enjoyed the judging and has judged at county and district every year. He said he likes learning new things. He holds the office of reporter and recreation leader this year in Capitan 4-H.

Hall's seven years in 4-H have been an assortment of learning processes, showing everything from rabbits to horses. His first year he had gotten two goats for Christmas so he was in the goat business for 4-H. One week before the fair, one of the goats died from a rattlesnake bite leaving only one for Hall to show.

He likes spending time with his animals

the best. With all that he has to care for, it's not just what he's taking in 4-H, it's his hobby as well. Last year Hall's black Arabian gelding won the grand champion halter class at the county fair. S.B.L. Dull Shadow, "Shad" as Hall calls him, will show again this year at halter but also in Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, and Western Trail. In addition to his horse, this year he is showing 10 dairy goats, down from 32 last year, and five rabbits.

Hall just recently returned from the Arabian Youth Nationals where he placed in the top 10 in judging, competing

against 150 other youth. Helping other kids has always been part of Hall's 4-H career. It's how he and Sultemeier became friends. It's the kind of thing he has done for many others and will continue to do, including for his younger brother, Quade who is 8. This year he's the 4-H Junior leader in forestry and archery. He sees himself involved in 4-H at some level always, eventually giving back to the organization by becoming an adult leader.

Captain 4-H leaders for these boys are their moms, Kortney Hall and Kristin Sultemeier. It's been a good arrangement for them all that's propelled both boys into a responsible young manhood.

The family was ecstatic. He'd actually spoken a complete sentence. They all jumped around gleefully, and his father said, "Why haven't you ever talked to us before?"

Maybe your boyfriend will surprise you one day with a flurry of words, but I doubt it. You have four tennis balls in your hands, and you toss one of them to me. Instead of throwing the ball back, however, I hold it and wait for you to toss another to me. Eventually, all four balls are in my hands. We stand there looking at each other awkwardly and wondering what to do next. The game is over.

Good conversation is something like that game of catch. One person throws an idea or a comment to the other, and he or she then tosses it back. But if that second person doesn't return it, the game ends. Both players feel awkward and wish they could be somewhere else. Let me illustrate further.

Suppose I say to my son when he comes home in the afternoon, "How did it go in school today?" If he answers, "Fine," he has caught the ball and held it. We have nothing more to say to each other unless I can come up with another comment - another

"ball" to throw to him. But if my son says, "I had a good day because I got an A on my history test," he has caught the ball and thrown it back. I can then say, "Was it a difficult test?" or "Did you study hard for it?" or "I'll bet you're proud of yourself."

If my son replies, "Yes," he has wrecked the game again. To keep the conversation going, he needs to throw back something of substance, such as, "It was a tough exam, but it was fair." Then our "game" can continue.

As for your relationship with a future wife, it won't be enough to just throw the ball back to her. She's going to want you to be more intimate than that. She'll need to know how you feel about her, what you dream about, things that upset you, what you'd like her to do, etc. You can learn to put these thoughts into words, even though you will probably never be a big talker. I suggest that you push yourself in this direction rather than saying, "That's just how I am." Your wife will probably have to make some changes to accommodate you, too.


That's what a good marriage is all about.

After losing a family member, their dog and, most recently, their home, the Krattigers hope they've seen the last of their

## HARD LUCK

By the time David Krattiger smelled smoke it was too late: As if from hell below, flames were crawling from under the trailer and licking its sides.

Today that trailer — attached singlewides — sits charred and gutted on Biscuit Hill in Ruidoso Downs, while David and his wife, Beverly, who lost a home's worth of keepsakes, try to rebuild a life.

The April fire they claim was caused by arcing power lines that ignited a tree on a neighboring vacant lot. Three times, they say, they called Otero County Electric Coop about the "little popping noises" heard whenever the tree's limbs brushed the wires.

Otero Electric area supervisor Buckley Zumwalt said the company did respond but mistakenly investigated a tree near a different house on the same property. "We didn't look at the right tree," he said.

While acknowledging that a spark can jump a tree limb, Zumwalt asserts the company is blameless. "I think it's terrible that the house burned, but we don't believe that the power line is what started the fire.

"It was a green tree. The way green trees and electric lines work, there'll be enough [spark] that it will keep that tree burned off, but it will never start a fire." Regardless, the inferno concluded a bad spring for the Krattigers. If trouble does indeed come in threes, this was an unholy trinity.

David Krattiger, 49, left Roswell after high school to attend North Texas State, where he studied hotel management.

After working as an auditor in a Dallas hotel he moved to Ruidoso, where his grandfather owned a summer home. He eventually joined Wal-Mart when it

opened in its original location 17 years ago.

"I actually got to meet Sam Walton and his lovely wife," he says.

After a divorce in 1990 David met Beverly Brown one day at Funtrackers amusement park. They began dating.

Brown, 44, had recently left a "terrible" marriage, returning to her native New Mexico from Ohio while on the verge of a nervous breakdown.

She found work at Nazarene Campground in Alto and in 1992, the day after Valentine's Day, she and David were married there.

They made a home in David's trailer on his mother's property at Biscuit Hill, named for a former restaurant that served the best biscuits around. His mother and stepfather lived just up the hill in a white clapboard house.

When Beverly became pregnant with David Charles, or "DC," they added a trailer to make a doublewide. David's father, a carpenter, fashioned a common entry with French doors and painted the trailers in unifying pink and purple.

The home ran parallel to power lines perhaps 25 feet high. In between, across the property line, was an elm tree.

Beverly, too, found employment at Wal-Mart. Life was good. Then on March 3 David's father died following gall bladder surgery. A month later DC found the family's 7-year-old Siberian husky, Christy, lying in the yard immersed in a stretch.

She had been killed by a mountain lion.

"She was like 120 pounds," David says. "I picked her up by the collar and it was like picking up a puppy, that's how much it had gotten out of her."

They buried Christy in the backyard.

On April 29 Beverly reported to jury duty in Carrizozo at 7 a.m. By afternoon she was working the deli section at Wal-Mart. On his day off, David picked up family heirloom photos from Walgreen's.

The wind that day was blowing a spring gale. Around 5 p.m. David lay on the couch watching TV while DC played with a friend. DC saw the flames first.

David instinctively picked up the telephone. The line was dead. He ran to his neighbor's. Mr. Pior was home. The men accounted for everybody and called the

fire department, then Beverly.

She was almost by the eggs when Beverly heard a coworker, "Answer line 2! It's David, it's an emergency!"

"The trailers are on fire," the voice on the line said.

Beverly crumpled to the floor.

Back home David frantically searched in vain for his car keys. His '99 Chevy Malibu was blocking fire trucks racing to the scene. Thus unable to shift out of park, he and Pior chained the Malibu to Pior's 4-wheel-drive and yanked it from its moorings, bending the tire rods.

Meanwhile, Beverly was speeding from work four miles away, fumbling for the emergency flashers. Upon arrival it was all fire trucks and black smoke, the "blackest smoke you ever saw."

It was too much. Hyperventilating, her heart pounding, she was rushed by ambulance to the Lincoln County Medical Center. David followed — his life one siren-screaming emergency.

In ER they administered oxygen and an EKG. At 11 p.m. Beverly was released, and the dazed family went to a restaurant to contemplate their losses. Gone: David's grandmother's wedding picture from 1917 he had just picked up at Walgreen's. Gone: the collector-quality antique beer steins from Switzerland, the Moon Over Ruidoso painting, the Elgin floor clock, the new gas grill bought for Beverly's birthday, an entire wall's worth of family photos, the freezer, TV, stereo, cordless power tools, cookbooks and custom wooden furniture.

Gone were her crochet materials and her invaluable series of Precious Moments, handcrafted porcelain figurines that David always bought for her birthday and their anniversary and Valentine's Day. "The Lord is My Shepherd," one was inscribed.

That night they checked into the Ramada Inn with nothing but the clothes on their back.

"Is that all you have?" the clerk

inquired.

Next morning their family doctor put Beverly on medication for depression. The side effects were nasty. But after four nights at the motel they tasted the fruit of human kindness.

They had known Harvey "T" Twite, general manager of community radio station KEDU, from First Christian Church. Harvey and his wife Anne Wilson invited them to stay in the Wilsons' furnished but normally unoccupied trailer next door on Mustang Drive at \$200 a month.

The Red Cross intervened, and Wal-Mart collected donations. Fellow employees gave what they could.

Fire insurance should cover part of the loss, but without waiting for a settlement the Krattigers last week secured a mortgage on a new doublewide, which they hope to have on Biscuit Hill within weeks, after the property is cleared.

They've hired an attorney. Legal action against Otero Electric is a possibility.

Zumwalt says his company has talked to the Krattigers' lawyer only to discuss the cutting of the tree in question.

In their temporary home Beverly rummages through a small box of blackened, smoke-scented belongings. "I don't know if I can clean that up or not," she says of a muffin pan. A "Leaves of Gold" Bible appears salvageable.

On Biscuit Hill the trailer shells are a ghostly pile of char and rubble and blown-out windows. Shredded insulation and yellow "Do Not Cross" Sheriff's tape dangle idly.

There are small miracles. In the yard a blue spruce is only singed. DC's wooden monkey bars that David's dad built are untouched, as are a lawnmower and, inexplicably, two cords of firewood.

Beverly finds a shard of a Precious Moment, then a plastic container, which she tosses aside.

"I don't even remember what was in it."

Where do we fit in to all this, if we are not educators and we have no children in the schools? We provide the funds through taxes, school board members


through election, and support through encouragement and participation in school activities. We can attend games, plays, and concerts. We can help children read. We can mentor and tutor them.

"The girls got a lot out of it," Montes said. "We weren't sure how well we'd do at the beginning of the season, and suddenly we were someone to contend with. I knew we would accomplish some things, and they'll definitely want to go back again."

The world tournament began with three round robin games, all of which Diamond Pride lost. They then faced Eclipse from Moore, Okla., and took a 13-4 win. They then faced the Sooner Magics of Oklahoma, a team which hadn't lost in four years, and eventually won the world title.

Sooner Magics won 27-1, dropping Diamond Pride into the losers bracket in a game against Dream Team from Louisiana. Diamond Pride lost that game, 15-4, to end

their time at the tourney.

Still, Montes was proud of the effort put out by his team.

"All the girls really did well," Montes said. "I was really proud of both my pitchers (Tarah Denny and Andrea Montes). These teams were scoring 10-15 runs an inning, and they kept on pitching the ball in there."

Danielle Lugo did well at the plate, getting a rare inside-the-park home run against Eclipse, while Mandy Gardner surprised many by parking the ball over the fence in a home run contest.

### Other teams do well

Montes also trumpeted the accomplishments of two other Ruidoso youth softball teams, the 16U Diamond Pride and the 12U Lady Warriors.

The Lady Warriors were qualified to go to the 12U world tournament held in Georgia, but the travel was too far. Still, they ended up in the top 30 in the nation, while the 16U Diamond Pride team was a top 25 team.

"Our whole program is pretty good for the kids here," Montes said.

- On flat ground, extend thinning a MINIMUM of 100 feet. On steeper lots increase your defensible space: thinning to 200 feet.

**Minimize Flammable Debris . . .**

- Keep roofs and rain gutters free from needles, leaves and other flammable debris.
- Keep firewood and other flammable debris a minimum of 50 feet from the house. Locate this material uphill of the structure.
- Mow grasses to a height less than 6 inches within 50 feet of the home.

- Wood shake shingle roofs are highly flammable. Convert roof to Class A fire resistant materials such as fiberglass-asphalt, metal and tile.
- Construct decks and siding with non-combustible materials.

- Stay calm. Call 911 to report the fire.
- Cover all save and roof vents.
- Cover large picture windows with plywood.
- Close all windows and doors; open drapes.
- Evacuate to a safe location.
