

Now Thing in Diplomacy.

Just recently, one of the allied powers, in the process of setting its house in order, or, rather, going carefully over the ground to see what, needed most to be set in order, included its diplomatic service. It found many things that were out of date, and many other things that had never been in date, and it determined to make many reforms.

Perhaps the most significant was the one which provided that in future a working knowledge of geography should be an essential part of the diplomatic equipment. More and more, surely is it being proved true that the ambassador of the old order passed with the advent of the telegraph and telephone.

Some one once said, indeed, that ambassadors nowadays had become clerks; an exaggeration, of course, but the latest "requirement" lends color to the view.—Christian Science Monthly.

Form Gardens.
The form gardens idea did not catch with our entry into the war, but did its reception in 1916, when the Women's Form Garden association was formed.

At first the association held itself to obtain positions for women, after the war and the daughters of a good bearing threatened, the association began work along the lines of the department of agriculture in England, which encouraged the sowing of small pieces of land, going so far as to give out allotments to those who will till them. The boy scouts and other bodies have done much this year along the lines of war gardening.

English-Grown Belladonna.
Belladonna, which before the war came directly excreted from Germany, is now being cultivated at Dorcas on a scale that will prevent any shortage of demand in the future, and demand, this greatly decreased since they may prescribe it freely as did before the war, says the London Times. The first of the Dorcas plantations was started immediately after the war broke out, but the difficulty of extracting the root and more especially the slow growth of the plant in the initial stages, prevented the drug being produced in large quantities until this year. Next year a still larger quantity will be placed on the market. Practically the whole of the cultivation is on Dorcas ground, which can generally produce most. It will need to go to the open air where the sun can get to make a participant.

Made Pine Needles.
A discovery has been made which is of great interest and value to dentists in the textile industry. By the process patented there is obtained a useful substitute for cotton and wire from pine needles. The needles are first of all rendered chemically soluble and then thoroughly mixed by mechanical means, whereupon the thread material thus obtained can be spun on any ordinary cotton-spinning machine.

Alaska's Government.
Alaska is an unorganized territory, controlled by the laws passed by the United States Congress and its administrative and judicial officers, including the governor, are appointed by the president of the United States. There is no general legislative body, but the larger towns are allowed to incorporate and elect covering officials.
