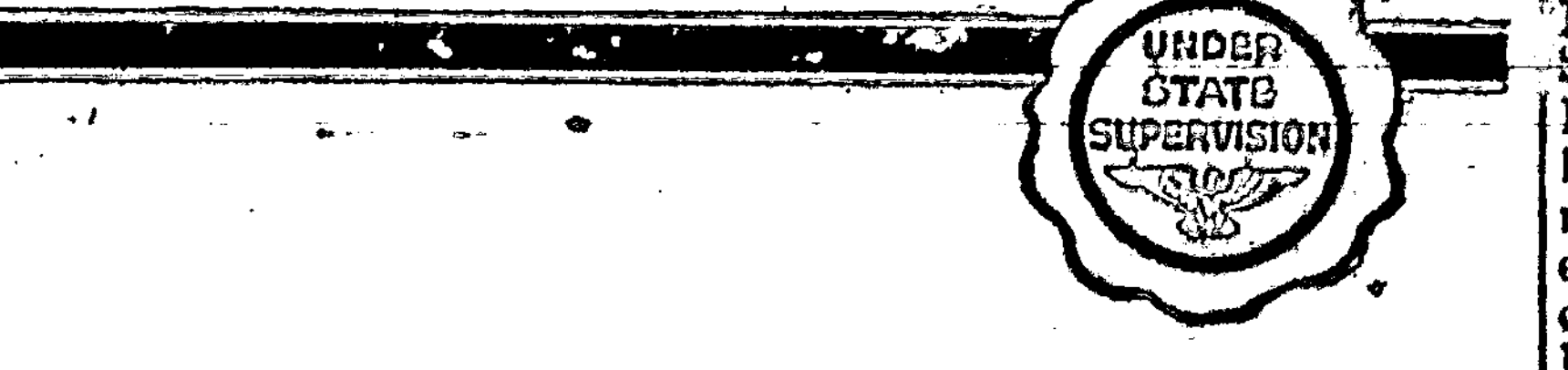

**New Thing in Diplomacy.**  
 Just recently, one of the allied pow-  
 ers, in the process of getting its house  
 in order, or, rather, going carefully  
 over the ground to see what needed  
 most to be set in order, tackled its  
 diplomatic service. It found many  
 things that were out of date, and  
 many other things that never had been  
 in date, and it determined to make  
 many reforms.

Perhaps the most significant was the  
 one which provided that in future a  
 working knowledge of geography  
 should be an essential part of the dip-  
 lomatic equipment. More and more,  
 as it being proved true that the  
 ambassador of the old order passed  
 with the advent of the telegraph and  
 telephone.

Some one once said, indeed, that dip-  
 lomats nowadays had become  
 clerks; an exaggeration, of course, but  
 the latest "requirement" lends color  
 to the view.—Christian Science  
 Monthly.

**Farm Gardens.**  
 The farm garden idea did not start  
 with our entry into the war, but had  
 its inception in 1914, when the Wom-  
 en's Farm Gardens association was  
 formed. At first the association had  
 itself to obtain permits for women  
 to farm and garden work. After we  
 got into the war and the dangers of a  
 food shortage threatened, the associa-  
 tion began work along the lines of the  
 department of agriculture in England,  
 which encouraged the raising of small  
 pieces of land, going as far as to give  
 out allotments to those who will till  
 them. The boys, scouts and other bod-  
 ies have done much this year along  
 the line of war gardening.

**English-Grown Belladonna.**  
 Belladonna, which before the war  
 came almost exclusively from Ger-  
 many, is now being cultivated at Dor-  
 set, on a scale that will prevent any  
 possibility of dearth in the future, and  
 dealers who previously discontinued it  
 may now preserve it as freely as  
 they did before the war, says the Lon-  
 don Times. The first of the working  
 quantities was started immediately  
 after the war broke out, but the dif-  
 ficulty of obtaining the seed, and espe-  
 cially the slow growth of the  
 plant, in its initial stages, prevented  
 the debt being produced in large quan-  
 tities until this year. Next year a still  
 larger quantity will be placed on the  
 market. Essentially the whole of the  
 quantities are on a scale which the  
 world can readily produce food. It  
 will need to come to the open, it takes  
 three years before it "bears" but can  
 be cut to make a large crop.

 Alaska is an organized territory,  
 controlled by the laws passed by the  
 United States Congress and its admin-  
 istrative and judicial officers, including  
 the governor, are appointed by the

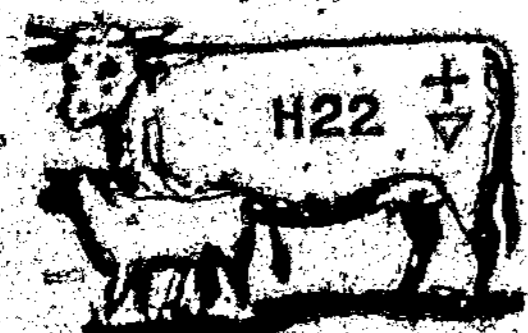
