The Republican National Convention.

The Republican National Convention met in Chicago this week, and the temporary organization was effected by the selection of Senator Cabot Lodge, of Massachusetts, as chairman. His address to the convention was intended to sound the key note of the battle cry in the presidential campaign. The greater portion of the address was devoted to condemnation of President Wilson's policies, and course, and was received with great applause. But there was trouble in the camp over the peace treaty proposition. Senator Hiram Johnson, of California, one of prominent candidates for the presidential nomination, Senator Borah, of Idaho, and others strongly opposed the acceptance of the treaty and threatened a bolt in the convention should it be accepted. Finally moderation prevailed, and it was agreed that the treaty be accepted in the platform with certain reservations.

The selection of a presidential candidate is a puzzling question; the delegates seem to understand as little who will be nominated as the people out in rural districts. Gen. Leonard Wood, Gov. Lowden, of Illinois, and Senator Hiram Johnson, of California, have been and are still the leading candidates for the nomination. But it seems to be the general opinion coming convention that neither of these candidates can be nominated; that the nominees will evidently be some one who has not figured as a candidate, one who will be acceptable to all opposing elements. If such a condition of affairs are apparent when a few ballots have been cast, that Senator Knox, William E. Hughes or Governor Sproul, of Pennsylvania, may be brought forward and nominated. The disclosures made by the Senate investigating committee as to the vast sums of money expended in Wood and Lowden's campaign's have greatly injured if not totally destroyed their prospects of the nomination.

Later reports are that four ballots were taken yesterday afternoon, Wood leading on each, Lowden second, and Johnson third. On the fourth ballot Wood received 3141 votes, Lowden 289, Johnson 140, Johnson losing 7 votes on the fourth ballot.

Ernest Selege, salesman for the Capitan Mercantile Co., made a trip to the upper Bonito last Saturday afternoon where he has a number of friends, and on Sunday, in company with Mr. Tom Bragg and others, ascended the White Mountain, reaching its highest pinnacle. From there he got a prospective view of a considerable portion of New Mexico; he looked down on lesser mountains, some of them in the far distance, could see valleys and woodland scenery lying between the mountains, forming a lasting picture on the mind. Mr. Selege becomes animated in talking about his little outing and thinks it the grandest he ever made.

It has been reported that Hon. Oliver Lee, of Alpine, Colorado, will be candidate for the Republican nomination for State Senator in this district. Mr. Lee made an active member of the last Legislature and has the ability to make a useful senator.


