Sunday Laws.
To the Editor--
Petitions protesting against the two compulsory Sunday observance bills that have been introduced into Congress for the District of Columbia are being forwarded in great numbers to our representatives in the National law-making body at Washington, D. C.

These bills are known as H. R. 4383, introduced by Congressman Zintman, of Maryland, S. 1943, introduced by Senator Myers of Montana.

Members of the Seventh Day Adventist Church are engineering the gathering of signatures against the bills. The Adventists say they see the danger of the National Sunday Law, should Congress enact such measures for the District of Columbia, and that is why they have been so active in arduous sentiment against these two measures.

Whereas there is a nationwide effort being put forth by certain religious organizations to Puritanize America, and revive the Sunday Blue Laws of Colonial times when the church and state were united, therefore, we are opposed to the Sunday Blue Laws because they are religious in character and contrary to the genius of the American system of government, in violation of the American principles of the separation of church and state, destructive of the first Amendment to the Federal Constitution, opposed to the best interest of both church and state, and above all they are manifestly un-American, un-Christian, un-Constitutional, partial, and a piece of pure class legislation, favoring certain sects and discounting others under duress or civil law.

Religious legislation, unchecked, knows no limitations and no mercy. The last step in that direction is the inauguration with all the horrors that bigots can invent. It is, therefore, necessary that we take alarm and raise our voices in protest against the first step leading us in that direction and the first encroachments upon our liberties. God made the conscience free in the realm of religion and no man have the right to enslave it.

Civil laws and carnal weapons were not employed by Christ to advance his cause. The church should employ only gospel means to advance the cause of religion. Let America be the home of freedom, an asylum for the oppressed, the dispenser of equal justice, the defender of the individual conscience and the cradle of liberty for all men of every religion and of no religion as long as they do not trench upon the same and equal privileges and rights of their fellow men.

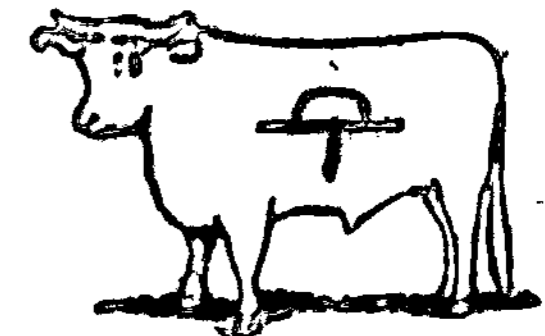

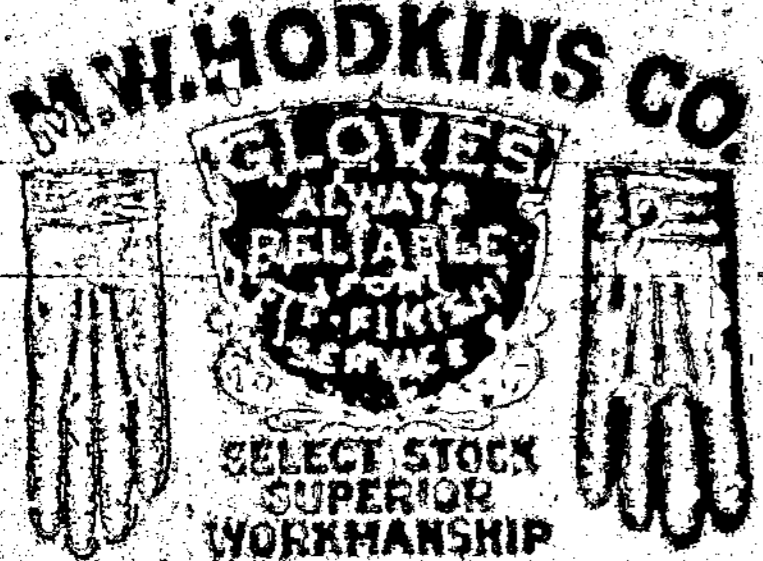
