Wonderful Development Is Shown By Gendarmerie After Two Years' Coaching

FOUGHT FOE WITH WILD YELLS

Native First Aid to Be Taught How to Wink—Officer Is Eager to Bring His Marksmen to Compete in United States

Port-au-Prince, Haiti.—Haiti's first national rifle team, which recently left the island for the United States, not only showed the individual and team marksmanship of the Gendarmerie, but showed out shooting of an order that amazed those who two years ago saw the first efforts to train a straight-shooting soldier out of the most untrained material. To add to the interest in the matches, they were shot over a field that was previously used as a training ground for the many excellent marksmen who had gathered at the wrong end of the rifle.

Two years ago it is doubtful if there was a single marksmen in Haiti who could have hit the small target at 100 yards with a rifle. Within the Gendarmerie, the only marksmen were the American instructors in 1919, and came to the island with a band of about the same number of men, but with the difference that the latter had a few weeks of training in the United States before they came to the island.
